













TOP TEN PENDON FACTS

- **1** Despite its quintessential 'Englishness', Pendon was actually the brainchild of an Australian.
- 2 Having arrived at Plymouth in the late 1920s, Roye England fell in love with the landscape of English villages as he travelled up to London through the Vale of the White Horse by GWR train.
- **3** During his time in England he saw, first-hand, the destruction of many fine old buildings in the villages he visited, including the replacement of a pub's thatched roof with pink concrete tiles. As a result, he began to measure and photograph threatened buildings and to build models of them.
- 4 His model of that thatched pub became the Waggon and Horses and was destined to be the first model on Pendon's Vale Scene. Since then dozens

- of modellers have worked on different aspects of the museum.
- **5** As a museum of miniature landscape, Pendon began life in a disused Nissen hut behind a Youth Hostel in Long Wittenham, Oxfordshire. The present building was constructed over it and then the Nissen hut was demolished.
- **6** Pendon now houses three historic layouts: John Ahern's 'Madder Valley', which is generally considered to be the first fully scenic British model railway; the Dartmoor Scene, the centrepiece of which is Guy Williams' scale-length Brunel viaduct; and the Vale Scene, begun by Roye England, which occupies the entire upper floor.
- **7** The locomotives and most of the rolling stock on the Vale Scene and Dartmoor Scene are scratchbuilt.

- Many of the locomotives were made by Guy Williams, who also built the museum's one and only aeroplane - a Westland Wessex in joint GWR/ Imperial Airways livery.
- **8** Roye England added the 'e' to his first name to make it appear more English.
- **9** In the early days, human hair was used for thatch on the model roofs, but more recent models have used plumber's hemp thatch. The walls are made from card, with stonework individually painted.
- **10** Model Rail's Chris Leigh made a small contribution to one of the buildings. He drew the artwork for the cast iron brackets (based on Culham) which support the canopy of the station building.



FIRST LOOK AT DAPOL'S DIESEL-ELECTRIC DUO



apol has revealed the first engineering prototypes of its 'OO' gauge Class 21 and Class 29 diesel-electrics. Both are long-awaited - Dapol announced its intention to produce these locomotives in 2011 (MR152).

The 58 North British Type 2s, famed for their spoked wheels, were not a successful design. To improve their performance, the original MAN engines were replaced with Paxman power units. The MAN-fitted machines became Class 21 and the rebuilt versions Class 29. There were detail differences between the two.

Dapol's new models use its excellent Class 22 tooling, as the Class 21/29 shared the same bodyshell as their diesel-hydraulic cousins. Running numbers and liveries have yet to be confirmed.

TWEAKED 'J70' NEARS PRODUCTION STAGE

Rapido Trains has produced a revised sample of our 'OO' gauge LNER 'J7O' O-6-OT.

It's not a production sample and has been assembled from assorted components, but allows us to check that corrections - such as the footsteps and sandbox dimensions and interior features - have been made. Some minor tweaks still need to be undertaken.

Computer artwork files have been signed off. Once decorated samples have been approved, production will begin. Delivery is expected Q3/Q4 2018.




■ GWR outlines HST changes

T'B1' goes back to black



owards the end of their maximum potential eight years in office, US presidents tend to give a great deal of attention to their legacy. I'm inclined to the view that if their legacy isn't obvious after several years in office, then whatever they do in the final six months isn't going to make much difference. Those of us who build model railways or collect model trains (or both), however, are likely to leave a very definite legacy, in physical terms.

In my case, it falls into two categories: things I've made and things I've bought. Within those categories, there are books, photographs, models and items of railwayana. It's probably a pretty typical collection for someone of my age, and just recently I've been helping to dispose of a collection which a friend had assembled. I'm occasionally asked to assist a family with the disposal of a deceased relative's collection, and it reminds me how difficult a task it is for those who don't have any interest or experience in the railway hobby, and sometimes even for those who do.

It makes me acutely aware of how much my own family will need to be assisted in disposing of my 'clutter', because of the sheer scale of a lifetime's accumulation by someone who worked in the hobby and was reluctant ever to dispose of anything: "I know if I get rid of that, I'll soon find that I had a use for it after all," was my usual reasoning.

I have a tendency to volunteer my services and then, later, to wonder what I've let myself in for, as was the case with the subject of spring cleaning (p50). When Richard suggested the topic for this issue, I promptly offered to prepare a feature based around tidying up my layout. "It'll give me an incentive to tidy up," I said. I was also thinking that, if I did so, I might find one or two rather special items that had been missing for a long time. After all, tidying up and cleaning has to be good, and it can't do any harm... can it?

Getting started was not easy but, having said I'd do it, there was no 'opt-out clause'. But I didn't have to do it straight away. I could leave it for a while. In the end I left it until the Easter break. I don't work here at *Model Rail* on Thursdays or Fridays, so my Easter break was a full five days. Layout tidying is one of those jobs that gets worse before it gets better. I began by trying to unite models with their boxes, which worked for a while. But before long I had models with no boxes and boxes with no models. I re-boxed the 30-plus banana vans that I'd had out for a load

haulage test with the Model Rail 'J70', but I quickly ran out of shelf space upon which to store them.

Eventually the pull of doing some 'proper modelling' proved too great. I needed to find a home for the new and improved Oxford Rail station that I had just finished detailing. One location was obvious – on the layout. My secondary station, 'Bolventor', was intended to be a minor SR station but I was never happy with it. I'd mixed several resin buildings – Medstead, and bits from Sturminster Newton – with a Colonel

Stephens-style building converted from a Hornby cricket pavilion. As an enthusiast of GWR and SR country stations, what was I doing with a nondescript S&D-esque station?

I began stripping everything from the platform – Bachmann S&D buildings, Ratio fencing, Mike's Models lamp posts, milk churns, vehicles and a phone box. Pretty soon the airfield end of my layout had become a scrapyard of station fittings. It reminded me of Honeybourne station yard after the Beeching closures, when large amounts of

material from Worcester line wayside stations had accumulated there.

When I tried the new station building in place, it showed up how uneven my platform surface had been, so that came off too. What had started as a spring clean had become a major rebuild of the Up platform, and what should have been progress had actually gone backwards.

I have several more weekends of work to do but the end result should be a better looking station on a neat and tidy layout... for a while, at least.

Tales from the miniature world.



A new friendship helped to rekindle **Kelly Harding's**

love of model railways.

y interest in trains started at an early age, mainly due to being dragged around by my father to preserved railways. He had a rule that all holidays should feature two things: 1) at least one good book shop, and 2) a preserved railway within a short driving distance.

However, I didn't really take much interest in model railways at that time as I was more interested in computers and model aircraft. Indeed, for several years following university I didn't pursue either modelling interest. However, after moving to the Midlands I met Natalie Jones, who quickly became my best friend. Having previously worked for BR as a signaller, she had a long-standing interest in railways, especially signalling systems.

Sure enough, Natalie's enthusiasm served to rekindle my own love of railways and thoughts soon turned to building a layout together. My interest in electronics led me to join MERG (the Model Electronic Railway Group), allowing me to take advantage of their excellent range of kits and expertise.

Additionally, a visit to Scalefour North convinced me that 'P4' was the way to go. One of the main attractions was the improved appearance of the trackwork and I've been a Scalefour Society member ever since.

GETTING INVOLVED

For many years, I'd been aware of the DEMU group (Diesel and Electric Modellers United) and, not long after joining, I heard that a new editor for the society's UPDate magazine was being sought. I duly volunteered and am now onto my fifth issue as editor.

This quarterly journal continues to improve, with the help of material submitted by DEMU members. Feedback has been very positive, which is immensely rewarding.

Having settled on 'P4' as our preferred gauge, we decided to build a simple 'shunting puzzle' style of layout, which would act as an introduction to the art of track building. Plenty of thinking and research was carried out, before Natalie suggested looking to the Harton Electric Railway for inspiration.

We've considered plenty of possible prototype locations, initially looking at the North Kent Lines – where I grew up – but that was discounted on the grounds of space and complexity, especially considering that this would be our first 'serious' layout.

Instead, we were attracted to Shepperton station as a basis for a layout. By taking this location's track layout and adding material derived from old maps of the area, we've been able to formulate a plan, which we've




Patience Prevails

Can you tell that it took Farnham & District Model Railway Club several years to decide on its next exhibition layout? 'Wickwar' is proof that the best things do come to those who wait.

Il modellers plan their layouts. Some will spend a few minutes, whether it's scribbling ideas down on the back of an envelope or by positioning a few bits of track and some cardboard boxes on a baseboard. Others will spend ages poring over books, finessing here and there, checking everything. An investment of days, weeks or even months in the planning stage will reap benefits later on.

Farnham & District MRC took the planning stage to the extreme – it took five years to get from talking about a new project to 'Wickwar', the wonderful 'N' gauge layout you see here.

"Our previous club layout was nearing the end of its life, so we began to discuss a new one in 2007," explains Noel Leaver, one of the members leading the project.


Club members spent 2008 setting out what they wanted to achieve from the new 'N' gauge project,

fitting it around work on existing 'OO', 'P4' and 'O' gauge layouts. By 2009, the club had started to think about track plans and potential locations to model.

"This went on until 2010," Noel recalls, "because no sooner did we think we'd got to the end of the proposals when another ten or so would be submitted. Eventually it went to a club vote and 'Wickwar' narrowly won. Many years down the line we have now reached a point where it's more or less finished."

BRISTOL FASHION

Wickwar is a real place, north of Bristol, on the Bristol-Gloucester main line. It's an almost perfect location for a model railway, with a tunnel at one end to form a scenic break, a compact station with goods shed (the station closed in 1965 but the goods shed still survives) and an impressive brewery between the railway and the road.



What makes this layout great?

If anything really shows off the benefits of 'N' gauge, it's 'Wickwar'. By pushing the track to the back, in front of the backscene, you get a real sense of space and depth, despite the scenic section being only a foot or so deep.



Away from the rails

"As a club we feel that cameo scenes are overdone so we've avoided them on 'Wickwar' but we have other things on the layout to catch people's eyes.

Our signals move automatically using a train-ontrack detection system and we use the Faller car system for moving vehicles. There is also a figure of a lady who puts her arm out for the bus as it approaches."



LAYOUT WICKWAR

Having settled on this delightful South Gloucestershire station, the team spent 2012 building baseboards, designing the trackplan and making mock-up buildings to ensure that the view-blocking was right.

The Farnham & District MRC team feel that they have achieved most of those aims on the list that they painstakingly compiled. First and foremost, they've built a high-quality exhibition layout. Then there was the small matter of building a layout that was easy to erect and dismantle.

"Our previous layout took 90 minutes to put up and then the same to take down," says Noel. "Two or three people can put 'Wickwar' up within half an hour."

SHUNTED OUT

"[The layout] had to be an accurate model of the location with a continuous run and shunting capabilities. Sadly we were unable to achieve shunting as it became apparent that it would be too difficult for the operator to see the lines accurately. It also came to light that there was only one locomotive that did shunting per day, blocking all the lines as it did so.

"We spent 2013 completing the electrics and the scenery, with the layout's first exhibition taking place in 2014 while it was still in an incomplete state. By the spring of 2015 the layout was more or less finished although, as everyone knows, a layout is never truly completed!" [63]




Running at night

"We can switch from day to night with the lighting to add extra interest at exhibitions. For daytime running we have both strips of LED lights on, a warm glow in the centre and a bright white at the front, removing the warm glow strip for night-time running to give the effect of a soft moon glow. There are 24 trains on the layout with eight of them able to run in our nocturnal setting, so no matter what the time of day something is always moving."









BEHIND THE SCENES •

Erecting 'Wickwar' is a well-rehearsed process and two or three club members can set it all up in about half an hour.

The club transports the backscene in a roll and simply unfurls it on location, then inserts it into its dedicated slot behind the scenic section but in front of the automated fiddleyard, hiding it from view.



Building from the ground up


"I made quite a lot of the buildings," says Noel. "They are all scratchbuilt and quite easy to do. I printed them out and assembled them just as you would a downloadable card kit.



Factfile: Wickwar

Wickwar station was built by the Bristol & Gloucester Railway, which appointed Isambard Kingdom Brunel as its engineer.

Sitting firmly in GWR country, it was controversially built to broad gauge. The station building was designed by Brunel and is narrower than the others on the line. This is because at Wickwar the line passes through the middle of a valley and, to avoid costly excavation works, it was decided that the station was to be made narrower.

The GWR operated the B&GR and was expected to absorb the line. In the end it merged with the Birmingham & Gloucester Railway and, to cut a long story short, eventually gave the Midland Railway access to Bristol.

Wickwar station closed in 1965 but the line is still open.

e railway modellers can be very particular about certain facets of a layout, such as region and period, yet we seldom invest as much effort into portraying a particular season as we do ensuring that a locomotive is in the correct livery.

Unless covered in snow or featuring striking autumnal trees, most layouts offer a superficial impression of summer. Green grasses, trees in full leaf and bright blue backscene skies hint at idyllic summer days.

But look closer and we realise that most of the buildings feature closed windows (as do the railway carriages and road vehicles) and some of the miniature human figures may be wearing clothing more suitable for the winter months.

Fields of lush, green grass can also be misleading. Moisture is essential for grass to flourish, so is it a wet summer? If so, shouldn't the roads and paths appear damp and muddy? If not, the fields ought to be pale and parched, and streams and ponds almost dry.

Gardens, allotments and farm fields differ in appearance over the months, as certain flowers bloom, fruits ripen and crops mature. Some animals, especially cattle, are kept under cover during winter, while sheep will be joined by lambs in spring and be sheared in summer.

Portraying seasons accurately requires plenty of thought and observation of those essential, smaller details that are easily overlooked. They are vital, especially if you're aiming to portray a particular moment in time, such as the last few months of a branch line or the final days of steam operation in a particular area.

HUSTLE AND BUSTLE

Spring is certainly an exciting time of year, as rising temperatures and longer days transform the drab winter landscape with vibrant colours. Early spring flowers, such as daffodils, primroses, crocuses and snowdrops, add colour to roadsides, linesides, gardens and wooded areas, followed later by bluebells, daisies and red campion.

Hedgerows become covered in blossom, as do fruit trees, while fresh green shoots appear everywhere. Streams and rivers remain high as April showers add to the groundwater levels.

The fields are busy as farmers begin planting their summer crops and there will be more people out and about in towns and villages than during the winter months. Cyclists are more common and on sunny days some motorists can be seen braving the elements in their convertible vehicles!

While a keen eye is needed to plan scenic additions that are appropriate, portraying a spring-like atmosphere is easy, with plenty of scenic products available. Now's the perfect time to get out and about with a camera, recording the sight of nature waking up from her winter slumbers.



Gaugemaster's Static Grass Starter Kit includes a plastic 'puffer' bottle, a bag of light green grass fibres (perfect for a spring landscape) and a small bottle of adhesive.



Empty part of the bag of static grass fibres into a bowl and grab a handful, separating any solid 'blobs' in the palm of your hand before use.



With a finger covering the top, shake the bottle vigorously for a few minutes. This action applies the necessary electrostatic charge to the fibres. In this instance, 1.5mm grass fibres are being used.

Tools needed

- Knife
- Tweezers
- Scissors
- Electro-static grass tool

Spring greens



An inexpensive way to start planting static grass is to use a Gaugemaster or Noch 'puffer' bottle, which is ideal for smaller areas. They're easy to use, especially with the shorter grass fibres that are so well suited to spring landscapes.

For 'OO', fibres up to a maximum of 2.5mm in length are recommended (1.5mm for 'N') and there's plenty of choice from the likes of Noch, Peco and WW Scenics, each offering suitably vibrant spring colours.



Gently push the diffused static grasses into

compress them too much in the process.

When about half full, fit the perforated lid.

the 'puffer' bottle, taking care not to

After painting white PVA-type glue onto the area to be treated, hold the bottle about 8cm from the surface. 'Puff' the sides of the plastic container until the fibres begin dropping into the wet glue.



Allow the glue to dry fully before adding a second layer in the same manner. This second application provides a more convincing result, especially when combining different lengths of grass.



When adding areas of more dense foliage, 'leaf effect' packs are ideal. These are also available in suitable spring colours and from a range of sources, including Noch, Polak and Treemendus.



Woodland Scenics' Poly Fibre offers a great means of creating hedges. It needs to be teased out into thin layers, and stray fibres to be trimmed with a sharp pair of scissors.



This scene includes foliage created from teased-out Poly Fibre, secured with PVA glue. After spraying with hairspray, light green leaf effects are sprinkled onto the tacky surface.



Verdant shades of green beside the line, crowned with bright wild flowers, create the ambience of a sunny spring scene.

SPRING FLOWERS

Hedgerows, meadows and fields are a riot of colour at this time of year, providing the ultimate inspiration for seasonal layouts.

Snowdrops are easy to create by adding a little white paint to the tips of grass fibre tufts. Any excess paint can be removed with a paper tissue.



Allow the paint to dry fully before planting the snowdrops into a bed of PVA glue.



Daffodils epitomise the arrival of spring. An easy way of recreating them is to use a pack of WW Scenics' ready-made daffodils, branded for use on 4mm scale layouts.



Use a small pair of sharp scissors to cut bunches of daffodils into smaller clumps and then peel them away from the backing paper. With a set of tweezers, press the flowers into a blob of PVA glue.



An alternative is to create your own grass tufts using the WW Scenics Pro Grass Box. Brush PVA onto a sheet of greaseproof paper and hold it over a pile of static grass fibres laid out on top of the tool.



The fibres then 'jump' upwards and fix themselves to the blobs of wet glue. When dry, more PVA can be brushed onto the tops of the fibres and allowed to turn slightly tacky.



Yellow scatter material, as produced by Model Tree Shop, Noch and others, can be harnessed to represent the flower heads. Simply scatter over the grass tufts while the glue is tacky.



The homemade daffodils look effective and, when the glue has fully dried, the tufts can be gently peeled away from the greaseproof paper backing, ready for planting.



Place small blobs of PVA glue into the scenery and, with a set of tweezers, plant the daffodils carefully.



suitably spring-like, it's also important to choose appropriately clad figures.

Heavy overcoats, hats and scarves are more suited to winter, while vests and shorts suit high summer.

Much depends on the layout's period, as fashions have changed drastically over the years. However, generally speaking, spring's fluctuating temperatures and frequent

a practical proposition. Lighter fabrics and shorter-tailed jackets are the thing, and springtime fashions are often brighter than winter clothing. The more sensible people would be carrying an umbrella, just in case!

There's certainly plenty of choice from figure manufacturers, including Preiser, Dart Castings, Falcon Figures and Mike Pett, to name but a few.

Scenic expert **Peter Marriott** gives a root and branch selection of the best model trees on the market, and shows you how to improve their realism.

he production and retail of miniature trees is, if you'll pardon the pun, one of this hobby's growth areas. There are so many manufacturers out there offering such a huge choice that it's difficult to know where to start looking when you're ready to start developing the greenery on your layout.

Budget plastic trees can look quite toy-like but don't dismiss them; they're a cheap and effective way to bulk out a forest or wooded area towards the back of a layout. At the other end of the spectrum are the high-quality specimen trees, which might set you back £50 but you only need to buy one or two for the foreground.

There are many manufacturers who sit neatly in the middle, with a good range of budget trees and an equally good range of economic specimens. All have roughly the same strengths and they will usually have the same weaknesses too.

Can't see the moulded plastic wood for the trees? Then worry no longer, because here is a selection of my top five trees that will suit almost any layout.

9 TIPS FOR BETTER TREES

- **1** Remember that trees are not all of the same size! You don't need to stick to your chosen scale to find the right tree for your layout: a 25cm model tree could represent a 40m tree in 'N', a 20m tree in 'OO' and an 11m tree in 'O'.
- **2** With this in mind, make sure that you plant trees of varying heights. An internet search will reveal which types grow tallest.
- **3** Vegetation is never uniform in colour. Pick trees that are slightly different shades to the rest of your scenery in order to inject a little variety into the landscape.
- **4** A really good, high-quality tree in the foreground will create the impression that the rest of the layout is just as detailed!
- **5** Plastic tree trunks are always too shiny and need to be toned down to reflect the shades of real, weathered, moss-covered wood. Either repaint the whole trunk or dry-brush on some subdued shades to improve the look.
- **6** Storms and high winds damage trees. Don't forget to model broken branches, fallen trees and stumps. Small twigs from your garden can be used to represent all of these things.
- 7 It's an easy thing to overlook but make sure that you study the types of tree that grow in the area you're modelling. The trees in a South Devon valley are very different to those that populate a Scottish mountainside.
- **8** You don't have to stick with off-the-shelf trees. There is an equally large range of kits with metal or plastic trunks and branches with which you can customise your own trees by covering them in suitable flocks or scatters.
- **9** People spend vast sums on getting the right locomotive or coach for their layout. Why not do the same with a tree? If there's nothing commercially available for the tree you want, there are plenty of tree builders out there who would be happy to build them for you.

1. MODEL TREE SHOP

PETER'S CHOICE: 200mm DECIDUOUS TREE



The Model Tree Shop makes a huge range of trees from a number of different materials (plastic, brass etch and twisted wire).

My favourite is the 200mm Deciduous Tree, even though it has a few faults: the trunk is shiny plastic, the joins are too visible, the roots look unrealistic and the foliage is far too dense.

The reason why I like it is that with just a few minutes' work you can turn it into a really good-looking tree. What's more, it's an absolute bargain at just £6. With a bit of tinkering, you can turn it into a model of a real-life specimen that looks more expensive than it really was!





Pull away some of the foliage with your fingers to reveal the trunk and branches beneath.



Fill between the trunk and the main branches with Deluxe Materials' Create and Shape.



Use acrylic paints to blend in the Create and Shape and to tone down the trunk's shiny plastic finish.



Discard the moulded plastic root section - it isn't very realistic.

2. FALLER

PETER'S CHOICE: PREMIUM CHERRY TREES

German manufacturer Faller is arguably best known in Britain for its huge range of plastic building kits and accessories. However, its Premium tree series is an often overlooked gem.

You can buy Premium trees in packs of two, three and five, depending on the type of tree and the size. The Premium collection includes horse chestnuts, pollard willows, rowans, maples, alders, ash and Lombardy poplars. The trees vary in height from eight to 20cm.

Premium products come nicely packaged and the trees are protected within plastic domes. All the products' packages b are easily identified by the deep red background colour and

the use of Faller Premium branding. I like the Premium Cherry Tree pack because you get two good-sized trees for not much money.

Faller's 181190 Premium Cherry Tree, fresh from the box but on a layout.





Cut off the unrealistic base with a pair of sprue cutters.



Repaint the plastic trunk with acrylic paint.



Spray the tree with unscented hairspray and sprinkle on some additional foliage, such as Noch Leaves.

3. GAUGEMASTER

PETER'S CHOICE: TREE PACK

Gaugemaster's range of deciduous trees is aimed at the budget end of the market, but they can be effective when used towards the rear of a layout. The trees are sold in packs of five or ten, of up to

The trunks are moulded in plastic and finished in matt paint, but a bit of dry-brushing on the trunk brings out a little more of the moulded detail. The foliage is multicoloured, but it can be improved further by using a squirt of hairspray and a few more slightly different coloured leaves. Each tree works out at about £2 apiece. These are a really quick way to add background trees to an 'OO' gauge layout, or foreground trees in 'N'.

The tree straight out the box. At £2 per tree they're the cheapest in this round-up, but also the smallest.



Using a flat paintbrush, gently drybrush a little grey acrylic paint onto the tree trunk.



All of the foliage is the same colour so paint some darker green to the underside of the leaves on the branches.


4. NOCHPETER'S CHOICE: CHESTNUT TREE

Noch has dedicated 30 pages of its 2018 catalogue to its model trees, which range from its economy tree packs to the high-quality Profi models. The trees come well packaged and I have generally found their Profi trees to be almost 'plantable' straight out of the box. Sometimes the foliage colours are a little too bright, but this can be toned down by adding a thin sprinkling of different-coloured, more subdued leaf-effect scatter material. The trunks on the more expensive trees look very good, although the bases need to be cut off (a 30-second job). In this round-up I found the Noch trees to require the least work to bring them up to scratch.





There were some excess leaves on the branches and trunk which needed to be brushed off with a hard paintbrush.





The tree came with a large base that needed to be removed. I used sprue cutters to reduce the size of the base, piece by piece. It is made from very tough plastic!



This is the trunk without any extra detailing. Of all the models examined here, it was the most realistic trunk out of the box and needed no attention, apart from chopping off the base.

5. WOODLAND SCENICS

PETER'S CHOICE: MEDIUM GREEN TREES



The Woodland Scenics range of over 600 scenery products from the USA is well known in railway modelling circles. The firm's products are generally of good quality and provide an excellent scenic backdrop to our model railways. The Premium range is a little more expensive than the regular trees but they offer foreground-quality models. Many of the trees are suitable for the UK, including the Scottish Highlands, the Devon coast or London suburbs. Birch, sycamore, oak and poplar trees are common in the UK and these deciduous trees are ideal for UK layouts. Their Classic and Ready Made Realistic tree ranges provide a variety of good-looking trees (after a little work) at reasonable prices.

Pull away the base to reveal a useful 'plug' After: The Woodland which you can use to plant the tree into the Scenics Medium Green





The bark is nicely textured but it's a little too shiny. Remove the mould lines and then tone it down with some suitable shades of acrylic paint.



Give the tree a good spray with some extra-hold hairspray.



With the hairspray still wet, sprinkle on some light green Noch leaves (Laub).

Need to create a a lot of trees in a hurry? **Paul Marshall-Potter** knows a few shortcuts through the forest of options.

needed to make a sizeable area of woodland for my new project 'Shelfie 2'. It depicts a loading dock and sidings set in a Northumberland woodland (somewhere near Guyzance). The yard is surrounded by woodland.

The fastest method that I've found to make trees is to use Woodland Scenics Deciduous Tree armatures for the core structure. These are relatively small, about 7-8in tall, so they don't overpower the scene. What they lack in height can be balanced against the fact that I can make a denser covering over a given area.

This technique is effective and quick for making a large number of trees. The key to getting a realistic overall effect is not to put too much foliage on the trees, otherwise you'll end up with something that looks like green candyfloss.

Go for colours and shades that will ensure your trees don't stand out, but instead look a natural part of the scenery.



The armatures are flat mouldings and each pack contains three distinct shapes. The same technique is employed, regardless of which shape you use. To plant them, bore a small hole in your baseboard, drop in some PVA glue and place the trunk into the hole.

Buying the fibre

I used a North American poly fibre product from Micro-Mark for the basis of the foliage. It's dark brown/black, which suits the colouring on the layout and scenery well and is far easier to blend into the foliage. I've found that Woodland Scenics' green poly fibre isn't as effective in this regard.

Micro-Mark Poly-Fiber used to be stocked by Model Junction of Slough but it isn't available in the UK anymore. You can order it from www.micromark.com/Black-Poly-Fiber-12-oz_2

There are several substitutes. You can buy postiche, which is used for wig-making (www.banburypostiche.co.uk). Peter Marriott has found that Finest-Filters replacement Aqua One Aquis 1200/1250 and 1000/1050 pond pump filter material works the same way (www.amazon.co.uk/Finest-Filters-AquaOne-AQUIS-White-Filter/dp/B007PFZ03A).

The first job is to cut away the base from the tree. Clean the mould lines with a file, just as you would with any other plastic kit. Study photographs of real trees to form an idea of how you want your finished model to look.



The plastic is quite soft and pliable for twisting into shape. However, gently heating it with a hairdryer makes this job much easier and safer. Twist the armature into a three-dimensional tree shape.



To make each tree unique you can add or remove branches. To remove a branch, cut it away with a razor saw. To add a branch, remove one from a donor armature and twist it to your desired shape.



File a flat section into the trunk and fix the new branch using cyanoacrylate. Hold the branch in place and use an accelerator so the glue cures in seconds. You can then use cyano as a filler to blend the new branch with the trunk.



Your armature is ready for painting. Apply a mist of grey primer. This ensures that the trunk is no longer a solid block of colour. Add matt black and Gunship Grey to give a tonal variation across each tree trunk.



The trick with this technique is to use both fibre and leaf cover sparingly. Too much of either and the tree will lose that see-through quality. Tear off a small piece of fibre and tease it out into a fine, wispy section.



Drape the fibre over the ends of the branches that you want to cover. Glue it in place. Once the tree is covered, get your scatter materials ready.



Gently spray Peco glue across the tree, rotating it as you work. When it has an overall coating of glue, scatter the leaf materials across the tree and some will stick.



Gently shake the tree to remove any material that hasn't stuck and repeat the process until you are happy with the density of the foliage. Your tree is now ready for planting.


Scatter materials

When applying the fibre to the tree armature, I find it easier to start at the bottom and steadily work upwards. It's important to choose a leaf cover that matches what you've used on your layout. Go for colours that are quite muted, mixing autumn and winter ones. The foliage and grass also need to be consistent in the colour tones used. I made my own blend from four different manufacturers. If you want to copy my trees, you'll need the following:

SPRING-CLEAN YOUR LAYOUT

He's not the tidiest person in the world, but **Chris Leigh** has resolved to turn over a new leaf and start by organising his railway room and his layout.

'm not a tidy or organised person. My colleagues, George, Chris and Richard are. But I lurch from one project to the next, often without pause for breath, never mind stopping to tidy up.

But there's no denying that a project goes more smoothly when you're organised, your workbench is clear and you know exactly where all your tools and materials are. Of course, the particular requirements of working for *Model Rail* produce pressures which other modellers don't have. I currently have no fewer than seven *Model Rail* projects in progress, plus a number of other projects which are not for the magazine and mostly concern my Canadian layout.

I suspect most modellers fit into one of two categories, either the 'neat and tidy' like my colleagues, or the 'untidy and disorganised', like me. One of the problems with being untidy and disorganised is that the amount of modelling 'kit' that one has grows exponentially. I noticed this as I built 'Polwyddelan', my 'OO' gauge Cornish harbour layout. As the need arose to find certain materials, accesso-

ries and scenic items, my experience varied. For instance, I have a storage drawer for boats and harbour-related items. This includes lots of Harburn Hamlet detail items, plus small details such as anchors, fairleads and bollards and lengths of chain and thread in varying sizes and colours to represent rope. As a consequence, the harbour construction and detailing was an easy and enjoyable job.

SCATTERED MATERIALS

On the other hand, my much larger collection of station parts, details and accessories is spread all over the place - some in my modelling room, some on the workbench, some outdoors in the shed.

I knew that I had such things as Ratio GWR spear fencing but when I came to need it I couldn't find it, so I bought more. A week later, guess what I found?

Multiply this across the vast range of 'OO' accessories and it is no wonder I have boxes and drawers full of the stuff, none of it organised. Well, I exaggerate slightly. I have organised my stocks of styrene sheet,

Evergreen and Plastruct styrene strip, decal sheets and brick paper so that I know what I've got and where it is. I only did this after years of frustration at not being able to find things when I needed them.

I have items for 'OO' British, 'HO' Canadian, and 'O' gauge British, and as readers of MR246 will know, I'm now venturing into 'N' gauge too. I try to keep all the items in their own scale-specific storage 'bins'.

I have organised my tools in a similar fashion as I have three toolboxes - one for cutting tools, files and drills, another for painting and finishing tools, and a third which is kept upstairs beside the layout so that I don't need to keep going up and down the stairs to fetch tools for routine maintenance, tracklaying, and for hanging up my latest railwayana purchase.

I do a lot of model making, but I suspect my output is nowhere near that of George Dent or Dave Lowery. I've seen their tidy workbenches. Mine is so cluttered that I can't use it, and I do most of my modelling on the dining room table. I eat meals on a tray, on my lap!

Making a start

My spring clean is going to be a marathon! I need to make a start and draw up a plan. Here are some random thoughts which I've tried to put into a logical order, because untidiness is a vicious circle and we have to break it somewhere.

- Create space.
- Eliminate heaps of stuff on the floor.
- Put things away after use.
- Create special storage where necessary.
- Remove extraneous models and tools from the layout.
- Dispose of surplus models and materials.



Start a programme of repairs and finishing of incomplete parts of the layout. Have a deadline or, at least, a target date, for completion.

After that it is really just a case of biting the bullet and getting on with it. There are a couple of areas on my layout where I have yet to create the scenery, and these have become dumping grounds for models, tools and clutter. However, I soon found that once they were cleared up I had a much greater desire to get on with completing the scenery.

CREATING SPACE

I decided that I needed to create storage space. I have two large IKEA shelf units which are almost completely full. In order to temporarily store models and materials I obtained some stackable plastic storage boxes from B&Q. Rather bizarrely, these are sized by volume in litres, rather than showing their dimensions. I needed to look at them in order to decide which size I needed and I selected the 35I size, which measures 15in by 13in by 10in (internal) and is therefore large enough to take most Hornby or Bachmann boxes.

At the same time, I needed the crates to be small enough to lift single-handed

When preparing items for disposal I label boxes so that I don't have to keep opening them to remind myself what is inside.

when full, as I already have one such storage box which, when full of drawings and paperwork, I can't lift.

Provided they are not over-filled, these crates can be stacked with their lids on. I would not go above four crates high, however, and keep the heavier ones at the bottom.

DISPOSALS

At least one of these crates will be used for disposals. I already have a box of kits and other items obtained for projects but not assembled or used. I intend to have a clear-out of my models, particularly duplicates of locomotives. I also have some GWR locomotives and stock to sell for the widow of a former friend.

I tend to put disposals on eBay from time to time, but photographing, uploading, monitoring and then despatching them by post is quite a time-consuming job. To give you an up-to-date view of eBay sales, I put three models up for sale in March this year - an Airfix '14XX', a Lima 'Western' with Ultrascale wheels, and a limited edition Lima Class 156. The old '14XX' did better than expected, at £26, but the two Lima models were disappointing. The limited edition realised less than £30 and the 'Western' hardly covered the original cost of its Ultrascale wheelsets. On that basis I would suggest that disposing of unwanted models on eBay is a good way to free up space, but the money that you receive may not seem worth the effort.

TOP TIP

In railway modelling, the need for storage comes in all shapes and sizes. These plastic mini-drawer units, intended for small nuts and bolts, are ideal for all manner of small detail items and parts such as track pins and rail joiners. Labels are essential!

But, view it positively; at least you've created a little more shelf space.

Over several years I have sold a couple of dozen models this way, and only had one instance where an eBay purchaser failed to pay. I did not send the goods. I did lose out in the sense that I now have to pay again to re-advertise the model. There are alternatives. eBay has a system for reporting non-payments and you can take the next-highest bid, if there is one.

If you have enough models to make it worthwhile, try asking your local model railway club about having a second-hand sales table at their next exhibition. You will have to pay a charge, and you may get beaten down on price for anything you sell, but at least it is cash in hand.

At least two of Britain's major retailers, Hatton's and Rails of Sheffield, offer a simple purchase service for your unwanted locomotives and stock. All you have to do is list them, send in the list and then await the offer. Various other shops also buy used items - Trains4U in Peterborough accepts buildings and accessories as well as locomotives and stock, for instance.

FILLING A VACUUM

Once the clutter has been cleared it is inevitable that a certain amount of debris will be revealed. Even in the cleanest locations, there will be some dust in the atmosphere. In my layout gallery, which has laminate floors, there is no carpet or upholstery to create dust. Nevertheless, I find that smooth, flat areas such as roads and station platforms accumulate a very fine coating of dust after a while. I'm allergic to house dust, so this needs to be removed with minimal disturbance and I find a vacuum cleaner essential.

I use a Black & Decker rechargeable Dustbuster for small jobs around the layout. Its 'nozzle' is actually quite large and care is needed not to cause damage on the layout as the nozzle is rigid plastic. My weapon of choice is the household vacuum cleaner - an elderly Dyson - which

has a small brush-type nozzle attachment for its hose. The brush is quite soft and gentle on layout details, while the cleaner itself has enough suction to do a good job. I just need to be careful not to suck up loose figures or other details!

I did buy, on eBay, a very small battery-operated vacuum cleaner for use on the layout, primarily for tidying up scenic scatter and ballast, but it wasn't up to the job.

DAMAGE CONTROL

There's no better way to spot areas of the layout that need repairs than when you are cleaning it. As you vacuum, inch by inch, it's inevitable that you'll notice things which need fixing. Loose street signs and figures can be glued back in place but chipped scenery, or bald areas where the scatter is worn away, will also be highlighted. Make a note so you can attend to them later.

Among the issues that I spotted were:



When cleaning a layout, areas that need repairs soon come to light. Fallen trees, chipped scenery and spots where the scatter has worn away are typical examples of the problems encountered.



Small housefly bodies are a hazard on my layout. Their bodies are difficult to spot on the track and can easily cause a derailment.

- ◆ Loose low-relief buildings, one of which was falling over.
- ◆ Chipped-off bits of plaster, particularly from road surfaces.
- ◆ Several fallen trees.
- ◆ Incomplete or damaged platform surfaces.
- ◆ Damage to the vulnerable edges of the layout around the central operating space.

FOREIGN BODIES


Depending on where your layout is situated, you may experience problems with 'visitors'. In garages and sheds there may be a problem with spiders or even mice, while lofts in older properties can harbour a nasty surprise in the form of wasps' nests. My particular problem is a type of common small housefly. I suspect an underlying reason for this is because of the rural surroundings, as I know other properties in the village also suffer from such insect incursions.



It doesn't look good and it doesn't do the layout any good. A clutter of locomotives and stock fill an unfinished corner of the layout - there's even a box on the track.



A tea tray is a useful means of carrying models and tools as they are cleared off the layout to a place where they can be sorted and put back in their boxes.



If you have younger family members who enjoy playing with your layout, you are likely to find some unlikely 'passengers' riding on any flat surface. Watch out for the ones that have fallen off, too.



Models which have been left standing on the layout for a prolonged period will have acquired a coat of fine dust. Brush this off with a soft brush before putting the model away in its box.

The flies seem attracted to light, bright, areas and my gallery, with its white ceiling and large skylights, seems to offer them the perfect environment to escape the autumn chill and come indoors to die. I find their corpses all over my layout but they are not easy to see on the track, so careful attention with the vacuum cleaner is the best way to ensure the track is clear.

Confederate soldiers can also be

a problem on my layout, together with zoo animals and various other loose figures! These are the result of my grandchildren's games, and my grandson in particular makes much use of the American Civil War figures which his dad and I cast many years ago. It does no harm to tidy them away once in a while, but I would never stop children playing with the layout. Modellers of the future should be encouraged!

Suck it and see




Black & Decker's Dustbuster is very handy. It needs to be left on charge when not in use, and if used with powdery materials, the filter will need frequent cleaning.



My weapon of choice for clean-up jobs on the layout is this brush attachment to the hose of the household vacuum cleaner. It has a soft brush and plenty of suction.



A cheap battery-operated mini-vacuum that I bought off eBay. I'm thinking of exchanging it for something more useful... like a chocolate teapot.



Thanks to the local housefly problem, I find that my track needs vacuuming a couple of times a year. Occasionally this may lead to the need for localised re-ballasting.

HOW TO

BUILD A WINDMILL

A purchase based on nostalgia and curiosity led Chris Nevard to build this 60-year-old kit.

bought this kit at the Warley show last year. I was curious to see what a kit released around 60 years ago would be like, compared to modern standards. I've often eyed up Dapol's windmill kit over the years but have always dismissed it, thinking that it was little more than a toy.

What would a kit designed in the late 1950s be like to build today? Having discovered that the ex-Airfix kit is based on a real post mill, I could resist no longer. This plastic kit can now be found in the Dapol range, along with several other 'vintage' designs inherited from Airfix.

It's strange to think that this kit dates from a time when the steam locomotive reigned supreme on BR, but it still builds into a model suitable for 21st-century layouts. There is quite a bit of flash to remove because the moulds have aged, but the parts themselves are still lovely and crisp.

This bargain-priced model is highly recommended for rural layouts. I can already envisage it on a layout featuring Model Rail's forthcoming 'J70'...


Factfile: Post mills



The post mill design dates back to the 1600s, if not before. The mill pivots on a central post which allows it to be manually rotated to face into the wind. Pitstone Mill in Hertfordshire (pictured), Saxtead Green in Suffolk, Outwood in Surrey and Rolvenden in Kent are fine examples of preserved post mills.

Post mills also offer an advantage to modellers - they're relatively small so they won't dominate even the most modest of layouts.

The parts are supplied in a clear bag and are all easily recognisable. The exploded diagram instructions are easy to follow. Give the parts a wash in soapy water to remove any grease and allow them to dry thoroughly.



The window frames are quite thick so ignore the instructions and apply them from the Inside to make them less prominent and more refined. Glaze with clear plastic film, or do as I did and leave the apertures empty.



Take two side pieces, hold them together and run some liquid solvent adhesive along the Inside of the join. Repeat and then bring the two halves together to complete the structure. Allow enough time for the solvent to cure.



Fit the floor piece to the main body and glue in place. Test-fit the body to the base but don't glue the plastic securing washer yet - waiting until after each section has been painted will make life a lot easier.



Be prepared to remove quite a bit of flash (liquid plastic that has escaped because the moulds are worn and don't sit flush together). Trim the bulk away with a knife or snips and then tidy the edges with files or sanding sticks.



If the rear door doesn't fit snugly in its aperture, don't worry. Take a sheet of plastic card, cut a piece that's a little bigger than the door and glue the two together. When cured, glue the plastic card to the inside wall.



Fit the base doors, gluing them from the inside. Assemble the base in the same way as the main body. You might find a small 'lip' where the pieces meet. Wait until the glue has hardened and run a file or sanding stick over it.



The next stage is to assemble the staircase, its handrail and the awning above the door. These moulded parts had quite a lot of flash on them, so take extra care because they're delicate and easily broken.

Humbrol 103. The conical roof was painted with Humbrol 27, with

Humbrol 120 for the doors. The main body was painted in Humbrol 147, with a little Humbrol 27004 applied randomly to darken some areas, especially those in shade.

Don't worry if you cannot obtain these exact colours. They're only a personal choice and a rough guide; my best advice is to avoid any garish bright colours.

Painting - the Nevard way

When it comes to painting, my usual method is to mist on a blend of Halfords red and grey primers and a little matt black. This provides a good key for dry-brushing on the top coats.

You'll need to get down to your local Halfords and pick up some aerosols: matt black, red primer and grey primer.

Remember only to use aerosols outdoors and to wear a mask. It's also worth covering the hand that you'll be holding the model with - a plastic bag is ideal for this. From two to three feet away, mist on each colour in turn, allowing the previous colour to show through, and allowing each coat to dry. As a rule of thumb, spray the darker colours from below and the lighter ones from above.

Motorise or not?

It should be possible to motorise this model in order to add a bit of extra movement to a layout. I model the 1950s period, however, when most mills of this type would have been out of use - well, that's my excuse anyway for chickening out of motorising it!



In its final week No. WD300 completed short runs between Longmoor and Oakhanger before being withdrawn on Saturday, September 27 1958.






reating a realistic weather setting is an important part of any layout. Making sure that one season looks correct can be a challenge, but John quadrupled his workload by covering all four!

John began by outlining some of the visual challenges of depicting such an ambitious layout.

He said: "I had to think about a lot more for each scene other than just the obvious sky and trees. I also had to consider the different shades of grass, people (how many of them there would be, and their attire), choose the correct plants for each season, pick appropriate seasonal activities, plus alternative backscenes, and then figure out how to achieve a phased transition throughout the year.

"The layout is a freelance design influenced by the Cambridge area and the Bletchley line. The baseboards are made from chipboard, with the higher level boards made out of Sundeala and plywood. I've used Peco Code 100 Streamline track on a base of cork and DCCconcepts' PowerBase to enable the trains to climb the 1-in-25 slope to the higher level terminus. I control the locomotives from my DCC Gaugemaster Prodigy, but prefer to operate the points and signals with analogue levers as a signalman."


Each of the seasons on John's layout blend together seamlessly, giving you a real sense of travelling through the year as you observe different sections of the railway. From the cold December evening at Drayton station to the bright summer's day in the village of Coxbridge, each section is different enough to be distinguishable but similar enough to create seamless transitions.

"With trees you must consider not only the leaf colour, but at what time of the year there are no leaves at all. The shade of green or brown on grass varies significantly throughout the year and it is important to mix more than one colour. You need to know which plants are appropriate for the time of year and the months in which they flower and grow. People wear different clothing at different times of the year, and the backscene has to reflect the season as well."

SPRING

"Spring is full of new life. In the river is a family of swans, and the riverbanks are covered with Gaugemaster's Spring Grass Mat, on top of which I've added some static grass. The plants, from K&M Countryscene, are gorse, which flowers in April. It was trimmed and teased out to remove the blocky effect.

"The building site is protected from the railway line by a blackthorn hedge with white blossom. Across the railway is a wood of trees with suitably coloured leaves, but also one or two trees which have yet to sprout leaves. All leaves and blossom are from Green Scene. The backscene is from Peco. I made it years ago, before photographic backscenes were commonplace."







SUMMER

"The summer scene consists of Coxbridge. The grass is now a less bright green colour than it was in the spring and the trees are in full leaf. Residents' allotments and gardens are full of fruit, vegetables, flowers and climbing roses. The allotment is a mixture of off-the-shelf plants and scratchbuilt items made out of string and tissue. Buddleia plants are a common sight by the railway, which I have imitated here. People are dressed in light clothes, children are playing in the street. The ice cream van is parked and doing good business. Coxbridge signal box has its windows open and customers are sitting out in the pub garden."

Immersed in his pastime, the fisherman is oblivious to the Class 47 passing overhead.

AUTUMN

Nearer the golf course the year moves on to September, and John reckons that this may well be the hardest season of all to model effectively.

"The cottage has an apple tree with ripening fruit, but I added some green paint to the red apples to give a more realistic effect. The Wills greenhouse has been cleared and logs are stored in the shed ready for the cold weather. Over the road the farmer is ploughing the stubble, followed by some grateful seagulls. The half of the field that's been ploughed is corrugated cardboard painted brown and covered in dried tea leaves (I use them a lot to model earth and soil). The other half, which is still stubble, is made from 2mm straw-coloured static grass. In the barn at the farm is the stored harvest, which is made out of a carved polystyrene block covered in straw-coloured static grass.

"The golf course in the corner of the layout is in full autumn colours, replicating October and November. The trees are made from seafoam and covered in brown and yellow leaves, with some scattered around on the ground. The backscene is a Gaugemaster Valley photographic backscene, which I thought was suitable for autumn due to many of the trees and bushes having no leaves and the yellowing grass in the foreground. I've also used computer printouts to achieve a 3D effect. In the future I'm going to try to simulate frost on this side of the layout by spraying it lightly with white and light grey paint."

WINTER

"Finally, the high-level terminus Drayton is set on a winter's evening. I have simulated moonlight with a row of blue LEDs under the overhead shelf. Somewhat traditional for a winter's night, I've set it just after a rainstorm, which is achieved by painting satin varnish over the roads, pavements, rooftops, platform canopies and exposed parts of the platforms.


"As it's a winter's evening, there is plenty of lighting: buildings, platforms,

streets, buffers, yard lights, a diesel fuelling point and Belisha beacons. The lights are amber and warm white to create the correct effect for the 'late crest' era. The locomotive drivers are gathered around a brazier at the engine sheds. There are a few people in the wrapped up in coats and scarves. The trees are bare and I've used Potentilla twigs which, usefully, have a fine bark. The backscene is from Townscene and I've cut it

trying to achieve a 3D effect similar to Paul Bambrick's methods. The sky is grey instead of blue and it is my intention in the future to introduce light snowfall."

With more detailing and an extension of the Coxbridge bay platform to form a branch line to the coast yet to come on John's layout, there's plenty still to do... although he has now run out of seasons to model! MR



SPRINGTIME IN THE FIELDS

If your layout is set amidst grazing land, populating the fields with sheep and lambs is a great way of portraying an archetypal spring landscape. GEORGE DENT offers tips on improving your miniature sheep.

pring is easily my favourite season. There's real excitement in watching the barren winter landscape being swept away. Empty trees begin budding, primroses and daffodils bring colour and the meadows come alive with rabbits and other wild animals who have been laying low during the colder months.

The arrival of the first lambs is also thrilling. Having watched my sheep neighbours growing larger by the week, the appearance of new bundles of fleece each day is a real treat - and no doubt a great relief for the ewes.

The sight and sound of sprightly, gambolling lambs is certainly life-affirming. Farmers may plan for lambing between February and May, depending on the region, breed, or farming processes, but the presence of lambs is one of the simplest means of placing a model railway within the spring season, especially when backed up with the appropriate flora.

As modellers, we can benefit from looking a bit closer at the woolly animals in our midst. Lambs invariably appear cleaner and brighter than their mothers and may mirror certain features, such as black faces and legs on an otherwise pale body. Also, while lambs tend to follow their mothers

around for the first week or so, they soon find the confidence to congregate with groups of other lambs, even appearing to 'play' together.

Another useful bit of sheep trivia concerns their tendency, when grazing or resting, to martial themselves in such a way that individual members are facing every direction. Some ewes instinctively take on the role of sentinel, warning their comrades of impending danger - or announcing that the farmer is arriving with fresh feed!

How to: Create lifelike miniature sheep



While this set of 'O' gauge sheep from Langley Models has been finely cast, there are still a few areas of excess metal to be carefully filed away, especially on the animals backs and legs. Use the point of a blade to reinstate any missing surface relief in the fleece.



Temporarily fix the sheep with a tiny drop of cyanoacrylate glue to a block of wood, using the cast mounting lugs where provided, drilling suitable holes. A few light coats of white primer, preferably from an aerosol, can then follow. Be sure to wear a face mask.



Placing lambs in a field with sheep is a simple way of suggesting that a layout is set in the springtime. GEORGE DENT

When the primer is fully dry, build up a few coats of the desired colours. Combine several similar shades on a palette in order to create an authentic appearance rather than a 'flat' colour. Pick out ears, faces and hooves in contrasting shades, adding subtle variety to your 'flock'.



KNOW YOUR STUFF





Leave the paint to dry overnight before coating the sheep with weathering washes. I used a brown shade for the lower areas and neutral - a grey shade - for the upper body, allowing them to blend into each other. Dab away any excess with a cotton swab.



Once the wash layers have dried, we can add any colour identifying marks or numbers. Blue, red and green are popular colours, usually applied in real life with aerosol dyes, so the colours need to appear diffuse.

A stippling action, with only a trace of paint, can be effective.

Technique of the month

DIY chain link fencing


Maquett, an innovative Dutch brand, offers some highly useful plastic sheet, tube, rod and sections, as well as a number of other useful aids for scratchbuilders. Sheets of PVC mesh are a great example, allowing for the creation of fencing or grilles. Unlike metal mesh, Maquett's flexible plastic version can be cut with scissors and bonded easily with poly cement, cyano glue or impact adhesive.

Maquett offers a choice of straight or diagonal PVC mesh patterns. With gaps of 1.2mm, the mesh looks at home on either 4mm or 7mm scale layouts and is supplied in A4-sized sheets.



Strong poly cement is required to bond the PVC mesh to styrene, such as Mr Hobby's Mr Cement S. The long tail end of each fence post will permit a more secure bond into the baseboard.



The fence was left to set overnight before spray-painting with an aerosol. When dry, the posts were fixed into holes drilled into the baseboard.



CREATE REALISTIC LOG LOADS

I'm thinking of using real twigs to recreate wagon loads of tree trunks, chained to LMS bogie bolster wagons. I assume that I'd need to dry them out first. How do I do it? Mark Walters, Twickenham

George says: There's nothing quite as lifelike as real materials, especially when portraying natural elements like wood or stone. I've used hawthorn twigs and branches to create realistic wagon loads for modern and steam-era vehicles, as the colour and texture of the bark looks at home in a small-scale setting.

Much depends on the bush or hedge that you have access to, but hawthorn branches tend to run fairly straight, which is helpful, although the presence of thorns demands careful handling. A sharp set of secateurs is essential for achieving clean cuts.

Drying the twigs is essential. First, cut the wood into rough lengths appropriate for your wagons and then leave them somewhere warm and dry, such as an airing cupboard or window ledge. Do not wrap them or place them in a container, as air needs to circulate around them to prevent mould growth. It will



take a few weeks for them to dry this way, but the risk of cracking is greatly reduced. Baking in an oven, on a very low setting, is possible, but not something I'd recommend, not least because of the risk of the wood catching fire!

Fine brass wire can be used to secure the logs on steam-era wagons. Choose a pre-blackened chain, or paint them *in situ* to tone down the bright appearance. Chain is available from Langley Models.

PLANT RIDGE AND FURROW CROPS



How can I create a realistic ploughed field, complete with crops?



Dave says: Layouts aren't all about tracks and trains - the scenery is an equally important element. Central to the foreground of my 'P4' layout, 'Bevet', is a crop field. This was created with a piece of finely corrugated paper, painted in earthy-toned watercolours before installation.

Once dry, a thin coat of PVA glue was spread along the ridges, before greencoloured flock powder was sprinkled over. When this layer had dried, the surface was re-coated with glue and a further layer of flock was added.

The process can be repeated, tailoring the amount of layers and flock colour to suit your desired crop. Allow the whole thing to dry overnight before laying your crop field onto a bed of PVA, fixing randomly shaped pieces of card - of various thicknesses - between the baseboard and the crop layer. This will create a realistically uneven surface and avoid a flat, uniform appearance.

Finally, blend the crops with the surrounding land with a thin coat of plaster, covered with a light sprinkling of scenic flock.



PATCHWORK OBA

Fulfilling BR's need for a general-purpose open wagon, a fleet of 800 air-braked vehicles was built during the late 1970s.

Similar to a preceding design (OAA), the OBAs boasted a 32T capacity and featured four sets of drop-down doors on each side. Steel ends, lined internally with plywood, stood slightly higher than the sides, with some batches having the ends extended further to help with the transit of certain cargoes.

Commonly employed for brick, concrete block, pipe, roof tile, newsprint and metals traffic, many were later cascaded into Departmental use, lasting well into the privatisation era. In later years survivors wore a cornucopia of colours, as liveries faded and timbers were replaced with unpainted or recycled material, providing an interesting modelling challenge.

Models are available from Bachmann ('OO') and Graham Farish ('N').

HOW DO I CONVERT MY 'USA' TANK TO DCC?



Is it easy to convert Model Rail's 'USA' O-6-OT to DCC control? Is the body easy to remove and what are the

extra bits in the bag? Bob White, by e-mail.

Chris Leigh says: Model Rail's 'USA' 0-6-OT is manufactured by Bachmann and comes with that firm's new-style, comprehensive instruction sheet, which should answer all of your questions. You will need to remove the bodyshell in order to access the DCC socket, but this simply involves removing two small crosshead screws.

As the instruction sheet illustrates, the screw beneath the cab end is accessed by removing the coupling and mounting socket first. This can be achieved with a small flat screwdriver blade inserted horizontally between the top of the coupling and the chassis. A gentle prising action will lift the coupling socket out of its recess, revealing the screw.

With the screws removed, the body can be lifted straight off the chassis. The main circuit board stands vertically, in front of the motor, and a small horizontal blanking plug is pre-fitted into the six-pin DCC socket. This needs to be pulled out and a suitable decoder slotted in its place.

However, before any DCC conversion, you should check that the model runs correctly on an analogue layout or test track.

You'll need a Bachmann 36-568 six-pin decoder and be sure to check that Pin 1 lines up with the corresponding number on the socket. Push it home carefully so as not to distort the connector pins.

Before reassembling the model, give the chassis a thorough test run on a DCC-equipped layout. When happy, re-fit the body and screws, pushing the cab-end coupling back into its socket.

There have been questions about the plate supplied with some of the SR and BR-liveried models. This was hinged and dropped down to enable easier cleaning out of the smokebox. You can glue it in place either up or down.

Brake and steam-heating pipes are also supplied with SR and BR models, for fitting into pre-formed holes in the bufferbeams. The instruction sheet shows where these fit and a drop of liquid polystyrene adhesive will secure them in place.

Two screws must be removed in order to release the bodyshell, one between the cylinders and the other beneath the cab. The latter is revealed by lifting out the cab end coupling and its mounting socket.



The six-pin decoder fits horizontally into the same socket. Ensure Pin 1 of the decoder slots into the corresponding hole on the circuit board, as shown on the instructions.



Gently pull the blanking plate (the green horizontal circuit board) away from its socket. Take care not to distort the sharp pins and keep the socket safe in case you need to replace it at a later date.



Once the decoder is fitted the chassis can be tested on a DCC-equipped layout before re-fitting the bodyshell, checking that all of the functions operate correctly.



AVOID RUSTY OVERHEAD LINES



I was impressed by Peter Marriott's new layout in MR246, although the catenary system wasn't mentioned. Has

Model Rail tested the Peco catenary system yet? I'm tempted to try it, but am worried about the need to solder the wires. Paul Craven, by e-mail.

George says: Peter used Peco catenary for much of his layout, but has also employed elements of the Viessmann and Electrotren ranges. And yes, we tested the Peco catenary system extensively in 2016, with a full installation demo featuring in MR225 (call 01858 438884 to order a back issue).

I really enjoyed installing the Peco system and, although it took a little time to assemble the first few sections, work soon speeded up as familiarity with the components developed.

Soldering is not essential for the overhead wires if they're to be for cosmetic use only (with pantographs posed at a fixed height, avoiding contact with the wires). Indeed, Peter employed Woodland Scenics' Scenic Glue on his catenary, making it easier to remove or replace in future.

However, I decided to solder the wires on my diorama, which produced a surprisingly sturdy network of wires. The soldering process was fairly straightforward, ensuring that the iron was hot, the surfaces clean and an effective flux employed. I used DCCconcepts' acid-free Sapphire flux in the main. However, for the first couple of bonds, I tried an acid-based flux paste, thinking that the thicker medium would cling to the wires more effectively. In the end, the liquid Sapphire flux worked just fine but I must have forgotten to clean up the other soldered joints of excess flux.

The result? A thick layer of corrosion on the registration and cantilever arms of the masts and the overhead wires. This only manifested itself a few months later, after the layout had been stored in the garage over winter.

Any *in situ* repairs are likely to be fiddly, so I'm more inclined to replace the affected masts and wire sections, taking care to use the Sapphire no-clean flux this time.





Paul A. Lunn composes layout concepts that evoke his holiday memories of the '50s and '60s.





SCARBOROUGH


Scarborough station opened on July 7 1845. The resort's popularity forced the North Eastern railway to expand its facilities so much that a second station for excursion traffic opened in 1908, a year after the massive 120-lever frame Falsgrave signal box opened.

Both layouts are designed for those who love watching trains and shunting trains. The Falsgrave layout depicts the fascinating station throat arrangement. To do it justice, you'll need a further 2ft at the Belgrave Terrace end, for a 180° turn, creating an oval format with a fiddleyard on the opposite side.


Scarborough Central Station baseboard, at 13ft long, includes all the salient features of the steam era, with nine platform faces. The longest is

approximately 6ft 6in. The rising 1-in-36 gradient from Y to Z gives a clearance of 8in between Gallows Close Goods Yard and fiddleyard. If that's not to your liking, Gallows Close Goods Yard can be substituted with a section of coastal line to Whitby and Middlesbrough, with or without a station.





Much of the original George T. Andrews station building remains, and while a number of 'modern' structural features have been added, it would be relatively easy to survey the key elements. The clock tower was added in 1884.








The York to Scarborough line was one of BR's 'steam approved' routes and has carried many preserved locomotives since 1972. There was LNER superpower at Scarborough on April 21 1973 with 'A4s' Nos. 4498 Sir Nigel Gresley and 60019 Bittern. Both were used on Scarborough Railway Society's 'Scarborough Flyer' trains.



Belgrave Terrace Bridge and the accompanying shallow cutting, with its impressive stone retaining wall, are an essential feature. The beautiful sand-coloured housing, on the far side of Westwood (road), was reluctantly omitted to provide a clear view of the line.



I decided to visit Falsgrave signal box and the famous signal gantry before it was demolished. The bricked-up tunnel portal is where the line to Whitby diverged.


BRIDLINGTON

The York & North Midland Railway's station at Bridlington opened in 1846. It became a through station when a link was built via Filey to connect to the YNMR's York to Scarborough line. Bridlington's station can be split into two key sections and both, as I've shown, make effective 'OO' gauge layouts.

You can choose between the station throat and depot in a 10ft long space, or the station and goods yard in 10ft 6in. You could even join the two together to make a room filler. In this case, you'd need an extra 2ft either side to get the curves in. Alternatively, you could join them end-to-end to make a 20ft exhibition star attraction!





Be aware of modern modifications when studying the real railway for inspiration. The brick supports are likely to be original - the concrete deck is not.






Bridlington station's appearance changed dramatically with the demolition of platforms 1-3 in 1983. What remains has changed very little. On the extreme left is Platform 4 with station buildings. Platforms 5 and 6 retain their original canopy. The excursion platforms are to the extreme right and the listed goods shed is to the rear, behind a solitary tree.

WHITBY

This Yorkshire location provides us with an opportunity for a unique 'N' gauge layout. I've managed to join the Esk Valley line and the high-level Scarborough-Whitby West Cliff lines with a prototypical incline. The gradient and different routes are not easy to build but your efforts will be rewarded with a really striking layout.

At low level we have a reverse 'S'-shape track plan curving alongside the River Esk, with Whitby at one end and a fiddleyard at the other. Almost central along the route is Larpool Viaduct, which carries the high-level route. There's a Proses helix at one end and a simple curve at the other, together with turning facilities to ensure that all locomotives point the correct way.



The original George T. Andrews overall roof was removed by BR in 1953. There were originally four platform faces but only two survive today. Platform 2 was reopened in 2014 to serve trains for the North Yorkshire Moors Railway.

This view remained fairly consistent until quite recently. It shows tracks leading off to the quayside and the edge of Bog Hall Junction signal box to the extreme right; eagle-eyed readers might be able to make out Whitby Abbey.




The gradient post between Bog Hall and Prospect Hill Junctions is lost in the vegetation. In model form 1-in-30 would be acceptable, but you'll need DCCconcepts' PowerBase to lend a hand.


BLACKPOOL NORTH

The famous seaside town of Blackpool had two stations in the town centre, both built by the LYR/LNWR Joint. There was Talbot Road to the north and Central to the south. The Beeching Report recommended that one station be closed and the town council voted against Central, because although it was positioned closer to the town centre, it offered greater potential for redevelopment.

Talbot Road was rebuilt in the 1970s. The bulk of the station closed but the former excursion platforms were transformed into the new Blackpool North station, which opened in 1974. It's still a vibrant place from a railway point of view and it only recently gave up its semaphore signals and signal box.

It's easy enough to swap eras on this layout, using the Talbot Road baseboard expansion area, shown in blue, if space allows. I had hoped that someone, somewhere might make a model of the famous Blackpool Tower, but there's nothing. Therefore, it's included as part of the backscene.

Whereas other designs here have unique physical features, Blackpool's uniqueness came with the number of trains that arrived here. Summer was obviously the busiest time but there was considerable winter traffic when it was time to switch on the famous illuminations.


The view from the top of Blackpool Tower is of immediate benefit to modellers! In fact it was invaluable in designing this layout as it enabled me to exaggerate the curve between station and carriage sidings to create an 'L'-shaped format.

Originally named Blackpool Talbot Road A, Blackpool North No. 2, a Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway 'box, once had a 120-lever frame. There's much here to stretch modelling skill in terms of surfaces and textures and the contrast with the uPVC windows, fitted in 2000. Sadly, the 'box was demolished in 2017.




Morecambe had two termini. There was the LNWR's Euston Road and the Midland Railway's Promenade. To model Euston Road (finally closed by BR in 1972) in 'OO' will require a 16ft-long space to include the 180° curves to all the fiddleyards. Alternatively, if you keep the Lancaster Green Ayre and Heysham lines as static features, Euston Road, arranged in a 'U' shape, will fit into a 14ft by 11ft space.

Morecambe Promenade in 'OO' requires a space 12ft long and 7ft wide to incorporate the Midland Hotel to the right. The board can be suitably arranged in a 'U'-shaped format by adding a further 2ft at the left-hand end for a semi-circle of track leading to a fiddleyard opposite the Promenade Goods Yard.








Euston Road shows the track layout between platforms 1 and 2 and the relationship with the neighbouring gas works and terraced housing. Morecambe

SOUTHPORT

I use several different approaches to layout design. When it comes to small layouts, I start by working out the operational dimensions to ensure that the result is going to be interesting to play with. Therefore, everything in this 'OO' gauge design - the platform, the sector plate and the maintenance shed roads - can all hold a two-car DMU. The remaining platforms and non-scenic storage sidings can even hold two two-car units each.


With that sorted, I start to focus on the visuals. I masked the platform ends with Southport Chapel Street's overall roof. The sector plate is disguised by a full-width bridge and 'L'-shaped high-level warehouses and the rear with a row of low-relief warehouses and hoarding, masking the joint between layout and backscene. If you've got an extra 1ft available, you could get away with a 3ft sector plate, a longer shed and increased platform length.



Class 507 and Class 508 EMUs are available in kit form in '00' gauge from Ayjay Models (www.southernregionmodels.co.uk). 507011 awaits departure from Southport's Platform 3 on July 28 1992.



Southport station's train shed is a spectacular structure. To reduce the amount of scratchbuilding needed on the model, I've reduced its length to an absolute minimum.



Loco Spotlight

STROUDLEY'S 'TERRIERS'

The tale of William Stroudley's masterful 0-6-0Ts was given an extra twist when they were sold to other railways. **Chris Gadsby** investigates.

he lives and careers of William Stroudley's 'Terrier' 0-6-0T are complicated enough, but the tale is made even more complex by the fact that the London Brighton & South Coast Railway soon realised that it had a locomotive on its hands that others wanted to buy. It's a story unlike any other in the annals of British railway history. Two even ended up in South America.

The 'Terriers' were victims of their own success. The popularity they brought to London led to the expansion and upgrading of many of its lines and stations, which meant that they could no longer cope with traffic demands. The LBSCR's Locomotive Committee decided, in 1899, to reduce the fleet to just 15. The plan was to withdraw the locomotives when they required an overhaul. But the committee had overlooked the saleable commodity that the 'Terrier' had become.

THE PENNY DROPS

Pioneer 'Terrier' *Fenchurch* was the first to be sold. Newhaven harbour was the LBSCR's premier port and it competed with Dover and Southampton. It was, due to legal issues, an independent company and it bought No. 672 in 1898.

It was only when the Isle of Wight Central Railway had to almost beg to be allowed to buy a 'Terrier' that the LBSCR finally realised that the class could find buyers on other railways.

A staggering 21 'Terriers' were purchased by other operators between 1898 and 1920. Here's how their individual stories unfolded.

A locomotive with more owners than a 1970s Ford Cortina...

No. W8 Freshwater was sold by the LSBCR to the LSWR, which sold it back to the FYNR. It then became part of the Southern and BR fleets and, after being owned by a brewery in the 1960s, is now back on the Isle of Wight. THOMAS BRIGHT/SR





Newhaven Harbour Company

No. 72 Fenchurch was the first 'Terrier' to be sold by the LBSCR when it was bought by the Newhaven Harbour Company in 1898. The Southern Railway bought NHC in 1925 and Fenchurch became part of its fleet, gaining the number B636 (later 2636). As BR No. 32636, it left Newhaven in 1955 for Fratton shed after a period on the KESR.



'A1X' No. 32636, formerly *Fenchurch*, makes a return to Newhaven in 1958. It was bought by the Bluebell Railway in 1964 and, although rebuilt as an 'A1X', has been backdated to an outwardly 'A1' appearance. COLOUR RAIL

Kent & East Sussex Railway

The Rother Valley Railway (later called the Kent & East Sussex Railway) bought 'A1s' Nos. 70 *Poplar* and 71 *Wapping* in 1901 and 1905 respectively. They became Nos. 3 *Bodiam* and 5 *Rolvenden*.

Both became life-expired in the 1930s so they were combined into one good locomotive in 1932, which returned to service as No. 3 *Bodiam* and was

fitted with a unique bunker. It lasted until 1943 when it was fitted with an 'A1X' boiler and smokebox at Rolvenden shed, retaining 'A1' splashers. It became BR property when the KESR was nationalised, being numbered 32670. Transferred to the Hayling Island branch when the KESR closed, it was withdrawn in 1963 It is now preserved at the KESR.

London & South Western Railway

The LSWR bought Nos. 46 *Newington* and 68 *Clapham* for use on the Axminster-Lyme Regis branch in 1903. They were not a success on this tightly

curved branch but the LSWR found its two 'Terriers', numbered 734 and 735, so useful that they were fitted with new Drummond boilers where their old ones needed replacing.

No. 734 was transferred to the Isle of Wight in 1914, while No. 735, the erstwhile Clapham, became part of the Southern Railway fleet in 1923 before it was withdrawn in 1937.

Pauling & Co.

Contractor Pauling & Co. bought 'A1s' Nos. 36 Bramley, 39. Denmark, 49 Bishopsgate, 52 Surrey and 57 Thames in 1902 for use on the construction of the GCR/Met Joint Line between High Wycombe and London Marylebone. Three were scrapped in 1909 when the line was completed but two were rebuilt into tram locomotives for La Plata Tramways in Argentina.

South Eastern & Chatham Railway

'A1' No. 54 Waddon was sold in 1904 for use on the Sheppey Light Railway. It had been built by Colonel Stephens but operated by the SECR. The purchase was a strange choice, given the strong rivalry between LBSCR and the SECR

Waddon, as SECR No. 751, retained its Stroudley 'A1' smokebox when it was fitted with a new boiler to Harry Wainwright's design.

It became Southern Railway property in 1923 and, from 1932, was used as a works shunter at Lancing, until being withdrawn in 1962.

The Admiralty

The Admiralty bought five 'A1s' for £1,200 each at the conclusion of the First World War in 1918, for use at its Scottish bases. Nos. 37 Southdown, 81 Beulah and 83 Earlswood went to Inverness, while Nos. 38 Millwall and 79 Minories travelled further north, to Invergordon on the Cromarty Firth. Nos. 38, 81 and 83 were sold to the Shropshire & Montgomeryshire Railway. Southdown was last recorded in the Grangemouth area circa 1920, while Minories ended its days at Chatham in 1933.

Shropshire & Montgomeryshire Railway

The Shropshire & Montgomeryshire Railway opened in 1911 and bought Nos. 38, 81 and 83 from the Admiralty in 1923. They became SMR Nos. 8 *Dido*, 7 *Hecate* and 9 *Daphne*, respectively. They remained in 'A1' condition, although *Dido*, at least, received larger diameter buffers and a larger bunker.

Both *Dido* and *Hecate* were cannibalised in 1934 to keep *Daphne* running. However, *Daphne* was sold to the Southern Railway in 1939 as a source of parts and was finally scrapped in 1949.

Ryland & Smith

The final 'Terrier' sold by the LBSCR was 'A1' No. 67 Brixton, which was sold to Messrs Ryland & Smith of Sheffield in 1920 for £1,500. It was resold to Grassmore Collieries at Chesterfield, which renamed it Ashgate. It was scrapped in 1935.

Weston Clevedon & Portishead Railway

The Weston Clevedon & Portishead Railway bought two 'A1Xs': No. 43 *Gipsyhill* in 1925 and No. 53 *Ashtead* in 1937. They became No. 2 *Portishead* and No. 4 respectively. The WCPR closed in 1940 and the GWR took possession of its assets. The GWR renumbered them

Nos. 5 and 6.

Edge Hill Light Railway

This intriguing railway was another part of the Colonel Stephens empire, which also included the KESR, the SMR and the WCPR. It was two miles long and linked the Stratford-upon-Avon & Midland Junction Railway with an ironstone quarry and opened in 1920.

The ELR bought 'A1X' No. 673 Deptford in 1919, followed by 'A1' No. 74 Shadwell a year later. Both of these locomotives were abandoned in 1925 when the line closed.

They languished for 21 years, even surviving the Second World War scrap drive, until they were finally broken up circa 1946.

The Isle of Wight

The railways of the Isle of Wight were a microcosm of the railway system on the mainland, and the way both networks evolved bore similarities. Within the island's 146 square miles, 55 miles of railway were built by three different companies: the Isle of Wight Central Railway, the Isle of Wight Railway and the Freshwater, Yarmouth and Newport Railway.

The Isle of Wight Central Railway was responsible for the Cowes-Newport-Ryde main line, the Newport-Sandown secondary route and the branch to Ventnor West. It was desperate for new but cheap motive power and wrote to the mainland railway companies to see if they had any locomotives going begging. The LBSCR declined to sell a 'Terrier', but the IWCR persisted, presumably aware that the LBSCR wanted to reduce its 'Terrier' fleet

Success came in 1899. The IWCR bought No. 75 *Blackwall* for £800, which it renumbered as 9. This was followed by No. 69 *Peckham* a year later, also bought under a hire purchase agreement. Two more came to the island in 1902/03.

The IWCR operated the FYNR's line from Newport to Freshwater until the relationship broke down in 1913. The FYNR needed locomotives and stock urgently and managed to acquire LSWR


No. 754, along with some ex-Great Central Railway coaches.

The island's railway system became part of the Southern Railway's network at the Grouping in 1923. The SR settled on three 'standard' classes for the island, the ex-LSWR 'O2' 0-4-4Ts, the ex-LBSCR 'E1' 0-6-0Ts and, of course, the 'Terriers'. The SR brought more 'Terriers' to the island

and they gained island-appropriate modifications, names and numbers.

The last 'Terriers' returned to the mainland in 1949 and were given numbers in the 326XX series - their past exploits clearly evident from their extended bunkers. Happily, the Isle of Wight Steam Railway is home to two of Stroudley's little masterpieces.



t'll have to be very special indeed if it's going to better Minerva's model."

That's how we concluded our review of Minerva Model Railway's 'O' gauge '57XX' O-6-OPT back in November 2017's issue. It was a cracking take on the classic GWR pannier, and it seemed to render Dapol's take on the subject - then still under development - redundant.

But Dapol's pannier is now here, some six months after Minerva's. And, boy, is it special.

Remember how Dapol's 'N' gauge models were a revelation when they first appeared on the scene and then seemed to get better and better with every new release? Well, the same looks set to be true regarding its 'O' gauge range. The first few models, it's probably fair to say, took a bit of a beating from the critics. Now Dapol's design team, ably led by Richard Webster who has one of the hobby's most impressive CVs - and Andy Forty, continue to push boundaries with 7mm:1ft scale models that combine superb looks, refined detail and innovative technology. Its last 'O' gauge locomotive,

the LMS 'Jinty', that we reviewed

Sprung buffers

in January's issue (MR243), was impressive, with its moulded inside valve gear and removable section of cab roof. Well, a few issues later and we have the '57XX' with its working inside valve gear and a cab roof that comes away completely.

First and foremost, Dapol's model looks every inch the GWR '57XX'. It looks right from every angle. The classic GWR smokebox door has the right amount of 'dish' to its shape and the distinctive curving bunker – another Swindon style – is also beautifully captured.

There's lots of very fine detail, from the sandbox linkages to the tank filler lids. Handrails are plastic, but they're very fine. As you'll see, Dapol has really done its homework, with every detail carefully considered. It seems churlish to criticise the lack of rivets on the outside edge of the front spectacle plate, and the

fact that the



steam heating pipes along the running plate valance just end in mid-air, with no attempt to route them underneath anywhere.

The cab is excellent, with a roof secured by two tiny magnets. Pull it away and you get to enjoy a wealth of footplate detail. All fixtures and fittings are present and correct and there's even a small pile of spilt coal on the floor.

But that mixture of chequer plate and wooden planks would really benefit from some coal dust and, of course, a crew. The mounts that hold the magnets are not prototypical, but are not

visible from normal viewing angles. It's a shame, therefore, that the moulded roof ventilator is a little crude.

GEARS IN MOTION

What really grabs the attention is the working inside valve gear. It's rendered in self-coloured red plastic and is wonderfully subtle in its movement. What's more, the crank axle is sprung, offering a degree of compensation.

Equally subtle is the firebox glow, visible through the open firehole door.

If the pannier has one flaw it's that it isn't easy to dismantle - or

rather, it's easily damaged when dismantled. Remove the eight screws and the boiler/tank and the cab assembly comes away to reveal the vertically mounted motor and flywheel, 21-pin decoder socket and factory-fitted sound speaker.

You need to take great care with the body at this stage - the safety valves came out of the bonnet (the paint of which was also easily chipped), a handrail knob popped out of its socket and the injector pipework came off.

Dapol models have sometimes suffered with their decoration,

but there are no big issues with the pannier. The mid-chrome green is well applied, with a pleasing finish. The 1930s 'Great Western' lettering looks the part, although the green showed through in places, which spoilt the effect slightly. The bufferbeams are perhaps a little on the pink side, but the numbers have the correct weight and colour. However, the choice of brown/beige for the firebox and ashpan is questionable!

The blue power and weight restriction code is spot-on and there are some wonderful

Factfile: No. 5700

George Jackson Churchward did not include a shunting locomotive in the standardised range of designs he put together for the Great Western Railway. Instead, his successor **Charles Collett inherited** a mixed bag; six-coupled pannier tanks of Victorian vintage to various diagrams, many of which had been rebuilt from saddle tanks.

Collett selected the best boiler, the biggest cylinders and the wheelbase of the most successful and blended them together to form the '57XX' 0-6-OPT. The design, with its bulbous dome, might have still looked Victorian but it perfectly suited the GWR's needs. It was an ideal shunter, could handle quite lengthy passenger and goods trains and had a fairly wide route availability. It was so successful that 863 were built, with the biggest change being the more modern cab introduced with No. 8750 in 1933.

Pioneer No. 5700 was built by North British (which built a batch of 50) in 1929. It went new to Banbury shed and spent time at Leamington Spa and Tyseley before being withdrawn from Oswestry in March 1956.

The cabside numberplates are a treat, too. They protrude just enough from the cabside and the amount of relief is just right.

Minerva's pannier is excellent, there's no denying it. But Dapol's offers a little extra finesse. Factor in the removable cab roof, firebox flicker and working valve gear and it definitely has the edge.

But the factor that clearly makes the Dapol model the winner is its price. At £265, Minerva's model is good value. So, you'd think that with all these extra features Dapol's would be more expensive, but it's not it's actually £30 cheaper.

Bachmann Class 70 (modified)

t's strange to think that since the railways were privatised in the mid-1990s only four new diesel-electric locomotives have been introduced to the UK. English, Welsh & Scottish brought the Class 66 and 67 from General Motors EMD, Direct Rail Services took delivery of the Class 68 Bo-Bo from Vossloh and Freightliner ordered the Class 70 'Powerhaul' Co-Co.

'Powerhaul' was a collaboration between Freightliner and General Electric of Erie, Pennsylvania, to produce a modern, powerful and environmentally friendly alternative to the EMD 'JT42CWR' (Class 66). The first in an order of 30 arrived in 2009 and their looks immediately divided enthusiast opinion, being a blend of angular North American 'hood unit' and British crashresistant cabs.

That order for 30 was curtailed at 70020, but it didn't stop Bachmann from working with both Freightliner and GE to produce a superb '00' gauge take on the subject. On its 2011 release it was lauded as Bachmann Branchline's finest diesel outline model to date. Some seven years later, it still holds its own in terms of looks, detail and finish.

So why are we looking at

a seven-year-old model? Because another operator decided to take up the 'Powerhaul' option. Colas Rail ordered ten 'Powerhauls', including a Turkish-built demonstrator, and they arrived in the UK in 2014, followed by a further seven in 2017. Colas Rail's Class 70s were numbered in the 708XX range and this has led to them being described as Class 70/8, but the whole class is officially still Class 70/0.

RETOOLED

It was great news for Bachmann because it means that its excellent model could be offered in Colas' distinctive yellow/ orange/black livery. But it caused a problem because these new locomotives had a modified air intake arrangement. As this arrangement was retro-fitted to Freightliner machines, Bachmann decided to re-tool its '70'.







The re-tooled '70' has, unfortunately, been rather a long time coming, as it was originally announced in May 2015. The wait, however, is now over.

Received for review is 70015 in Freightliner's distinctive green and yellow colour scheme. First impressions are difficult to judge, because the new model looks very much like the original!

Everything that made the first model great has been carried over: great shape, impressive detail and superb printing. The only disappointment is that the yellow lacks opacity and the green base coat can be seen in a few areas.

Performance was impressive and 70015 made light work of

a 14-coach train of Bachmann and Hornby bogie coaches. There is a 21-pin decoder socket and exterior and interior lights, controlled by small slide switches underneath. You can tell, however, that this model is essentially seven years old. Dismantling it to access the decoder socket is not easy, with screws tucked away and obscured by wheels and bogie frames.

And what of those all-important detail differences? At first glance these are limited to the raised intake boxes on the bodysides. They compare well to photographs of the real thing.

Other changes are more subtle. Bachmann has tweaked

the cabsides. Freightliner's 70001-70006 had panel lines on the cabsides, which were not present on its 70007-70020, even from new. By removing these Bachmann can produce more Freightliner '70s' than was previously possible. There's also a revised grille just behind the cab door, and one of the bodyside door windows is in a different position.

Times have changed since Bachmann's '70' was first released (its RRP was just £94.95!), but the model is as good today as it was in 2011. The detail tweaks have added another couple of strings to an already impressive bow. (RF)

Biffa Class 66

nother month... and another new livery for one of GBRf's Class 66s!
Red 'Sheds' are not unusual on our network but not even DB's livery is quite as eye-catching as this one.

GBRf cemented links with waste management specialist Biffa in March when 66783, now bright red with large Biffa logos, was named *The Flying Dustman* at York station. The name, chosen by Biffa staff, was unveiled by GB Managing Director John Smith and Ian Wakelin, Biffa CEO.

66783 was one of the ten '66s' that GBRf bought from DB towards the end of 2017. It


The guest chairman

Alan Morton, chairman of the Leicester Model Railway Group, tells readers about the oldest organisation of its kind in the region.

he Leicester Model Railway Group is the oldest model railway club in the area. We were founded in February 1949 and over the past 69 years we have had six clubrooms in the city, moving to our present one in Cossington in June 1999.

Between 1949 and 1981 we held 20 week-long exhibitions during the August school holidays. We also exhibited at Central Hall, Westminster and the Corn Exchange, Manchester.

Between 2007 and 2015 we held our successful 'Cossrail' exhibitions in Barrow-upon-Soar but due to a rent increase we have been unable to hold any more and have found it difficult to find another suitable venue. The group and individual members exhibit layouts at events all over the country.

The club currently has four layouts and a test track for 'O', 'OO' and 'N' gauges. Our largest layout is 'Stacton Magna' which runs down one side of the clubroom and is

connected to the 'O' gauge section of the test track. It was started in 2001 and depicts the station and junction with two engineering yards and connecting railways. It was designed as a multi-level layout but initially comprised just eight straight boards in order to fit into the clubroom. A later addition was the installation of a DCC test track with trailing and facing points.

Our 'N' gauge layout 'Cossington Junction' is a three-level walk-through layout. We also have two 'OO' layouts: 'Cossington Vale' is a Code 100 track layout that was originally controlled with analogue but is currently being converted to DCC, while 'Stonesby Manor' is our new layout which is currently under construction using a MegaPoints controller and servo-operated points.

On the upper level of our clubroom you'll find our 'Pullman' tea and coffee bar next to our extensive reference library. The library covers real and model railway subjects from the early days to the present.

Coupling concerns

I live in the USA but was born and raised in the Liverpool area. I am building a model based very loosely on the Mold &



Denbigh Junction Railway in the steam era. Having visited layouts belonging to railway modelling friends over here, I am convinced that (correctly mounted and maintained) Kadee couplings are better for operation and close coupling than tension lock couplings – and both look equally 'unprototypical'. I have purchased several

models produced by
Oxford Rail and overall
have been extremely
satisfied with the quality of
the modelling, finish and
running qualities.

However, I have one 'auibble' with both of the 'Toad' models. The couplings provided with these do not conform to the 'NEM' standards as I know them. When I tried to replace the supplied tension lock couplings with Kadee Magnematic couplings, I found a dimensional discrepancy in the length of the NEM box. When I mounted the Kadee NEM couplers, they slid back and forth, and to correct this, I had to glue the Kadee couplings in place, which makes them a permanent attachment. **Neville Parry**




GWR alive and well

If there's a locomotive that you think needs to be offered ready-to-run, here's the place to voice your opinion...

Locomotive: Class 104 and 110 DMUs

Proposed by: Michael Grange, County Durham

What is it?

I may be being greedy here but I think there's a case for two DMUs. It's been about a decade



since Hornby's Class 110 was last on the market, and it can still fetch a healthy price second-hand. Sadly, the '110' really lags behind Bachmann's Class 101, 105 and 108, so I propose a new version. But with today's model-making technology, surely it would make sense to offer the Class 104 as well?

What would make it viable?

Birmingham RC&W's 57ft 6in DMU was introduced in 1957 and was offered in two, three and four-car sets. Production ceased in 1959 after 302 vehicles had been built. What would become Class 104 under TOPS was mainly allocated to the North West, with some

transferred to the North East to replace withdrawn Tyneside electric EMUs. Scotland famously received '104s' and the final units were withdrawn from the Greater London area in the 1990s.

A further 30 sets, based on the same design but with a modified nose with headcode boxes, were introduced in 1961 for use on the trans-Pennine Calder Valley lines. They also sported powerful Rolls-Royce engines and were configured as two and three-car sets. They became Class 110 and the last were withdrawn in the late 1980s.

The Class 104s were first built with headcode panels on the nose, which were later removed. Between the classes there are numerous liveries to offer, Including BR green, plain blue, blue/grey, white and blue, Network SouthEast, MetroTrain, Departmental and the 'Mexican bean' maroon and white applied to 104325 for the Crianlarich-Oban shuttles in the late 1980s.

Can I see a real one?

There are 13 Class 104 vehicles, spread between Churnet Valley, Llangollen and Telford Steam Railways, but only five

Class 110 vehicles: the Wensleydale Railway and Lakeside & Haverthwaite have a two-car set each, and the Churnet Valley Railway is home to Trailer Second Lavatory 59701.


