The arrival of Kernow Model Rail Centre's Bulleid diesel 10203 meant that I had to dig out the Modern Locomotives Illustrated (MLI) issue dedicated to BR's prototype designs (issue 185) and reacquaint myself with this particularly fascinating period of railway history.

What must it have been like to see LMS 10000 for the first time? And with the end of steam in 1968, it's easy to forget that a good many BR prototypes were withdrawn or scrapped half a century ago this year, too.

It's the 'what might have been' aspect that I find so interesting. Had the railways not been nationalised, what might the 'Big Four' of the 1950s have looked like? Bulleid diesels in Malachite green with 'sunshine' lettering on the Southern, a fleet of diesel electrics of different sizes for the LMS - and just what sort of names would the GWR have applied to its gas turbines?

MLI issue 185 was interesting in other ways, too. I had no idea, being 12 at the time, that gas turbine 18000 had been cosmetically restored at Tinsley depot after its return to Britain from Switzerland. And what a good job depot staff did too – it looked splendid on display at Willesden depot in 1994.

It's also interesting from a modelling point of view. The issue dates from 2010 and, if you wanted a Bulleid diesel or LMS 10000, you had to build a kit. Now you can buy them off the shelf. Surely the time is right for an RTR gas turbine 18000 or 18100?

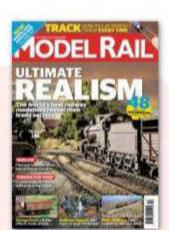

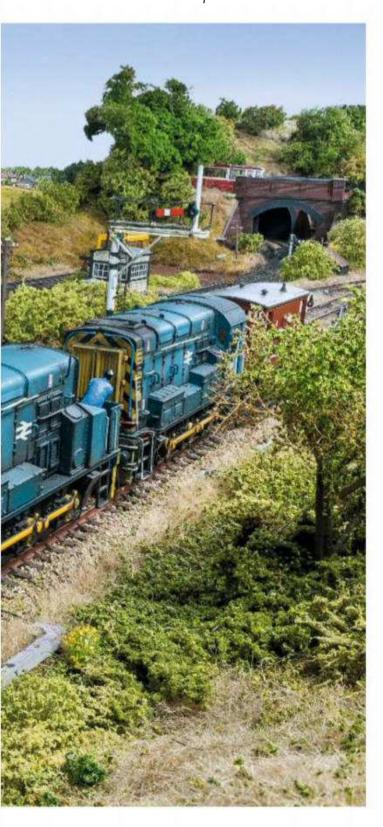

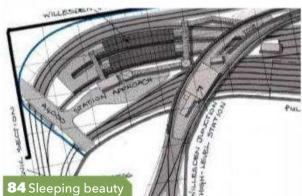

REVOLUTION REVELATION

evolution Trains has unveiled plans for FOUR new 'N' gauge models: one new railcar and three new wagons.

Leading the line-up is the Gloucester Class 128 diesel parcels unit. It is anticipated that Revolution's proposed model will cover key nose variations between London Midland and Western Region '128s' but it will feature directional lighting and a new low-profile chassis. Revolution is to explore the possibilities of adding sound.

Liveries and guises have yet to be confirmed but should feature all key colour schemes that M55987-990 and W55991-996 carried between 1959 and 1991. Guide price for this model is around £125.

The IPA-A car carrier 'twins' are some of the oldest wagons still in frontline use on Britain's railways. They were built in 1952

for use in France but were modified by automotive distribution specialist STVA for Anglo-European traffic through the Channel Tunnel. Classified IPA-A on TOPS, modifications included reducing the width and permanently coupling two wagons together.

They are still used, either in open form (for use with commercial vehicles), with side protection staves and screens or as fully covered, the latter a common feature on Jaguar/Land Rover export traffic. The models will be designed to be used with 1:148 scale road vehicles from the likes of Oxford Diecast. Guide price is around £40 for a pair and £120 for a triple pack (three pairs). Design work has started.

Revolution has joined forces with Accurascale to offer its forthcoming 'Cemflo' PCV cement wagon in 1:148 scale.



These wagons were built for Associated Portland Cement Manufacturers' Anglo-Scottish traffic and lasted in service from 1961 until 1988.

Guide price is £25. Design work is due to start soon.

All three models are to be crowd-funded and will only appear if sufficient subscribers sign up. The order book for all three will open soon - see www.revolutiontrains.com

The fourth model is not crowd-funded. The 'Vanwide' VEA van is being produced by

new Chinese manufacturer Sonic Models, with Revolution effectively acting as UK agents, as well as assisting with research.

Over 500 12t vent vans were rebuilt with air brakes and improved suspension in the 1970s for use on military traffic. They lasted into the 1990s.

The Revolution Trains/Sonic Models VEA will feature high levels of detailing, including a chassis with the correct air brake equipment, NEM couplers and fine metal door handles. Three liveries are planned - BR maroon, Railfreight red/grey and RfD yellow/grey. Weathered models are also proposed. RRP is £19.50.

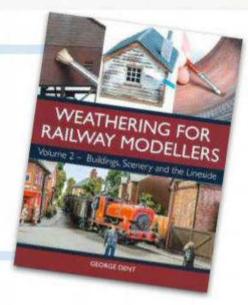

DAPOL BOLSTERS ROLLING STOCK RANGE

Dapol has unveiled four new items of rolling stock in three different scales. New in 'O' are the 'Bogie Bolster E' and the YCV 'Turbot'.

BR built 1,200 'Bolster Es' between 1961/62 and their bogies gave them a higher payload than their four-wheel contemporaries. With the decline in their regular traffic,

BR fitted hundreds of 'Bogie Bolster Es' with dropside bodies in the early 1980s for ballast and spoil duties. These rebuilt wagons became 'Turbots' (YCV on TOPS).

Dapol promises that both new models will sport such features as posable bolsters and stanchions, separate counterbalance springs and

door arms and working Instanter couplings, as well as pin-point axles, metal wheels and sprung buffers.

Having hinted at a 'OO' gauge 'Bogie Bolster E' at the 2017 Warley National Model Railway Show, Dapol has now confirmed prices and guises for its new model. This model will also feature

an impressive spec list, including working Instanter couplings.

Last but not least is a new variant to its extensive range of 'N' gauge Mk 3 coaches: the sleeper. The new coach should match the high standards set by the rest of the Mk 3 range and will be launched in five liveries.

TOOLING UP FOR A NEW HST

Dapol will produce its proposed 'N' gauge prototype HST - but only if enough modellers sign up to the scheme. What makes this announcement more significant than the aborted 2015 prototype HST power car launch (MR215) is that Dapol plans to produce the full 12 cars.

The train will be split into four 41001 and 41002, will come as a pack, with one powered and one

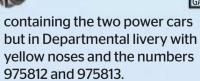
unpowered. They will feature controllable lights and a Next18 DCC socket. The powered model will feature Dapol's Supercreep motor.

Dapol will produce all-new tooling for the four Trailer First and four Trailer Second coaches. They will feature recessed door handles, correct windows and roof and will lack the door locking indicators of distinct packs. The two power cars, the contemporary Mk 3 range. The Mk 3s will come in two packs: one pack contains TFs 11000 and 11001

and TSs 12000 and 12001 and the other will include TFs 11002 and 11003 and TSs 12002 and 12003.

The final pack will contain Trailer Buffet 10000 and Trailer Kitchen 10100. However, due to the costs involved, these will be standard Dapol Mk 3 buffet cars finished in prototype HST livery.

A fifth pack will be available



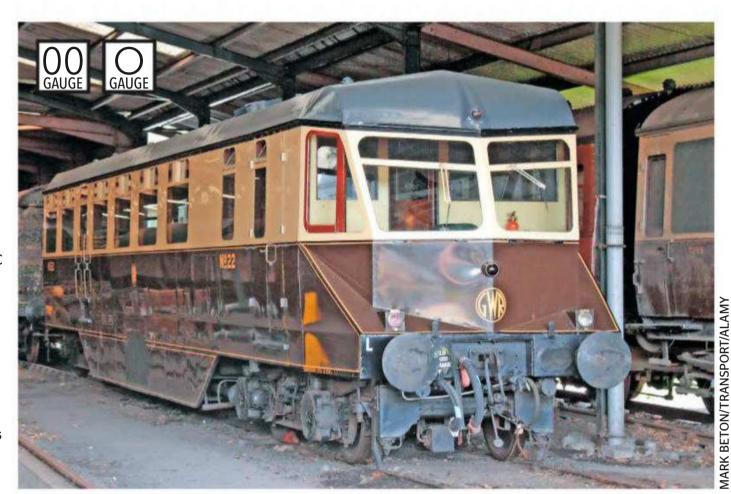
This model is only available to order via the Dapol website (www.dapol.co.uk) and will only go ahead if enough orders are placed. Prices have yet to be confirmed.

RAILCARS IN 'O' & 'OO'

eljan is to produce the GWR 'razor edge' railcar in both 'O' and 'OO' gauges. The GWR built a number of different railcars between 1934 and 1942; Heljan has chosen Nos. 19-33, which featured a distinctive angular body built at Swindon Works in 1940/41 with 9.25-litre AEC engines.

Heljan's 'O' gauge model will boast fine detail, discreet mechanism, external and interior lights, sprung buffers and easy DCC conversion. Six liveries are planned - two in GWR chocolate and cream, two in BR crimson and cream and two in BR green. Prices have yet to be confirmed.

The 'OO' gauge version should consign Hornby's old Lima model to the archives. Heljan promises a similar specification and choice of liveries to the 'O' gauge model as development work will follow the larger model. Delivery dates and prices have yet to be confirmed.

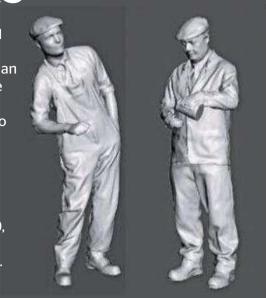

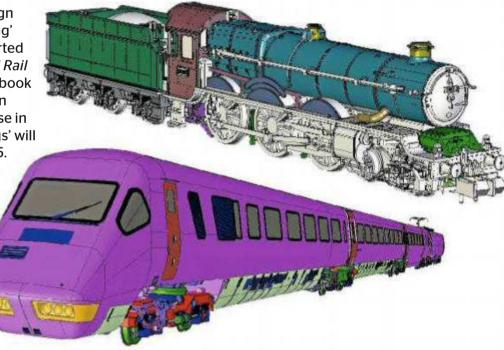
Six times '73'

RRP is £99.95 and each is limited to 200 pieces.

DJMODELS CADS COMPLETE

DJModels has completed design work on its 'N' gauge GWR 'King' 4-6-0. Tooling was to have started by the time this issue of *Model Rail* hit the newsstands. The order book for the first five models, with an RRP of £135.50, was due to close in early September. Further 'Kings' will be produced, albeit for £169.95.

GO WITH THE 'FLO'

Manufacturer Accurascale has allowed customers from a recently closed model railway factory to share space within the factory it uses in China. This will delay production of its 'OO' gauge 'Cemflo' wagon, but the model will now be slightly cheaper.

RRP for a single wagon is now £24.95, while a triple pack will cost £69.95. Those who have already ordered will receive a refund. The 'Cemflo' is now due in April 2019.



FAR EASTERN PROMISE

achmann Europe plc recorded a loss in 2017/18 due to what Public Relations

Manager Dennis Lovett described as a "slower than normal influx of new products across various sectors". However, Mr Lovett told the assembled model railway press on August 31 that parent company Kader has worked hard to resolve the supply situation.

The biggest indicator of Kader's investment is a new factory in China that it's built in the town of Gaobu, which complements existing factories in Shenzen and Dongguan (all in Guangdong province) but is

dedicated solely to model railway production. Its location means that it is less likely to suffer from one of the major problems that affect existing factories, where staff are headhunted by larger electronics manufacturers.

The news was announced during Bachmann's mid-year press event, held this time at the

Churnet Valley Railway's
Kingsley & Froghall station.
Also revealed at the event was
information about Bachmann's
new computer system, which will
go live in January. This will
include a new website and dealer
portal which, Bachmann claims,
will offer many benefits to its
dealers and stockists.

Bachmann has announced the first Exclusive First Edition 1:76 scale bus to be produced under its ownership. The Volvo Olympian, with Northern Counties Palatine I coachwork, will be offered in London Central, London **Central Docklands Express** and Metrobus liveries. The new bus will be available in 2019 but prices have yet to be confirmed.

Bachmann is also to tweak the EFE Leyland Atlantean in order to produce the Devon General 'Sea Dog' variant. The new top deck tooling will be mated to the existing EFE Atlantean.

Four existing EFE buses are planned but in new liveries: Bristol RELL with ECW body as Devon General NBC red (POD 825H); Leyland National Mk 1 in London Transport Golden Jubilee livery (THX 194S), London Transport RT on Route 75 to Catford Garage (LLU 652) and RT KLB 596, as preserved in Brown's Blue livery.

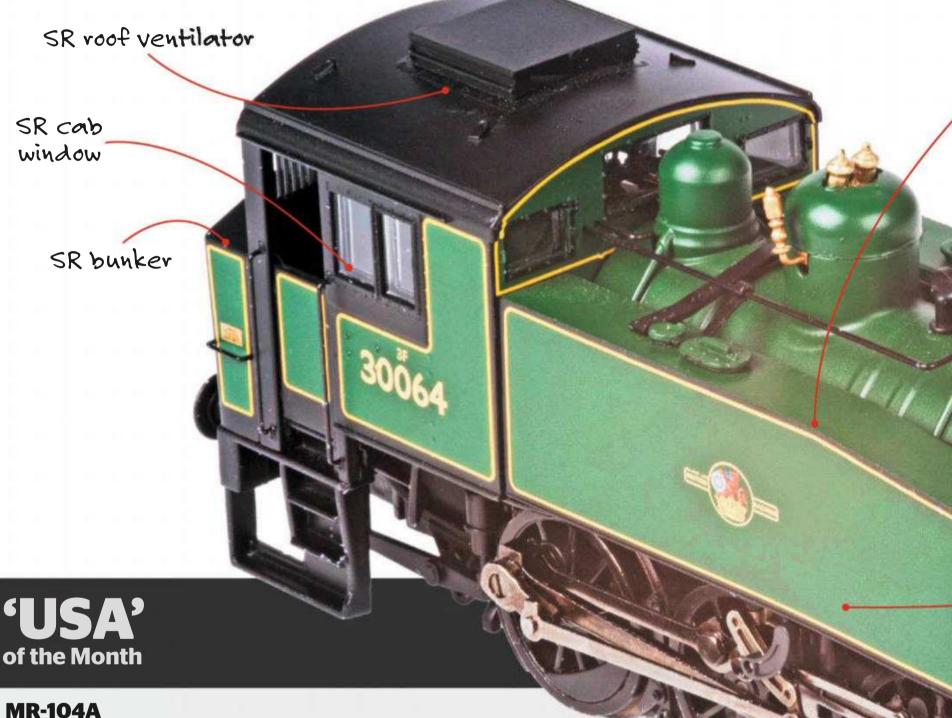

Exclusive Rail Model Rail's BR lined green 'USA' 0-6-0T, produced exclusively by Bachmann, is a beautiful representation of the real thing and a worthy addition to your collection.



'USA' 0-6-0T No. 30064, in BR lined green

Built at the Vulcan Ironworks in 1943 as USA Transportation Corps No. 1959, it was in service with SR in June 1947 where it became No. 64. It spent much of its life in and around Southampton docks.

At nationalisation, it became No. 30064 but remained on the south coast, apart from a brief spell at the Meldon Quarry in Okehampton to the West of Exeter, when it was needed to cover for repairs to No. 30062. Although No. 30064 remained there idle for the duration, the quarry

closed soon after and it was returned to Eastleigh. Despite being noted as dilapidated, and withdrawn in October 1962, it was repainted in green in February 1964, together with No. 30073, and it became a popular choice for railtours in the late 1960s.

It was withdrawn on the last day of Southern Region steam, on July 9 1967. It is now part of the collection at the Bluebell Railway.

According to Chris...

His grandchildren call him 'Granddad Trains' and he's been a dedicated railway modeller since the 1960s but, despite popular legend, Chris Leigh doesn't remember when dinosaurs roamed the Earth!

his summer's Canadian holiday was even more of a railway indulgence than in the past, if only because I had just over two weeks and a lot to cram in. Here's a brief trip report.

No stay in Toronto would be complete these days without paying a call on Rapido Trains. It's a half-hour trip from downtown to Markham, curiously operated by train in the morning and bus in the afternoon. Company President Jason Shron was away on holiday, so I had lunch with the rest of the team – takeaway fish and chips in the 'board room'. Since my previous visit, three more staff have joined Rapido and two of them have specific responsibility for warranty repairs.

We talked a lot about the current situation with Chinese-produced ready-to-run models, quality control and deliveries, particularly in light of the closure of one factory and the wild

rumours and alarmist nonsense which had promptly circulated on the forums. The closure resulted from the owner's retirement and has affected several US customers but not Rapido or any of the UK model companies.

One of the pressures which is affecting deliveries of models from China is the delay in moving containers from Vancouver. Most of these come over the Canadian National route, many simply using Canada as a land bridge and being reloaded onto ships in

east coast ports such as Halifax for the Atlantic crossing to Europe. CN is short of capacity and containers can now take several weeks to cross from Vancouver.

Among the items I was able to examine was the 'J70gti', the first sample of our 'J70', which was too high geared. I also saw samples of the Canadian Pacific 'Royal Hudson' 4-6-4. This mighty beast is Rapido's first large steam locomotive. It boasts a weighty die-cast body and geared drive to all six coupled wheels, which should make it immensely powerful.

Later in the week I took the bus out to Mississauga, to visit the Credit Valley Railway Company, which is a model railway store in which I can easily lose myself for hours. My credit card took a beating! I bought a DCC sound-equipped 'FP9' locomotive which they not only tested for me (returns can be expensive when you're this far away) but also changed the decoder address. We then agreed that neither of us liked the horn sound, so that

got changed too, a job which I still consider to be beyond my DCC skills.

After Toronto, I flew to Sudbury, where the line to White River begins, as featured in Chris Tarrant's *Extreme Rail Journeys* on TV. While in Sudbury, I took the bus to Capreol and the Northern Ontario Rail Museum.

Among the exhibits here is 'Bullet-nose Betty', CNR 4-8-2 No. 6077. Apart from the Chinese 4-8-4 No. KF7 at the National Railway Museum, this must rank as the largest locomotive I have ever seen.

On a very hot afternoon I took the advice of the museum staff and went across to their Heritage Centre, where I was shown a splendid vintage fire truck and asked, "Would you like to see our model railway?" I was

taken down into a basement where a local group has built a splendid permanent 'HO' layout. This display had taken a mere 18 months to build, using mainly commercially available models and kits. It is amazingly detailed and 'busy' and yet operated by conventional analogue control.

ind a job you love and you will never work another day." We may not know who first uttered this phrase but I can say, in my case, it's almost 100% true. Almost!

My job at Hatton's is one that most readers would probably love to do. But how did I manage to get such a good job in an industry that is also my hobby?

It started on my fifth birthday, when I was given my first miniature train. Unusually, it wasn't a train set but a Hornby Pullman Car. The reason behind this unusual gift was that my Uncle was (and still is) managing director of a premium railtour company. The Pullman Car sat on the top shelf of my room for a couple of years, in the 'look but don't touch' area, until I was deemed old enough to have a train set. This arrived one Christmas and, instead of the wagons, the first thing to run behind the little 0-4-0 was my Pullman.

One afternoon, my friend suggested we visit a model shop nearby and, as he lived in Allerton, anyone who knows Liverpool's geography will recognise this as being just a stone's throw from a well-known retailer's original premises.

I, like countless others, walked through the door of that diminutive shop front to be confronted by wall-to-wall railways; everything a youngster could imagine. The dusty old boxes contained real pocket money treasures and we soon walked out with our prized purchases. This was to be my first experience of Hatton's, but not my last.

During High School, we had to do two weeks of work experience at a local business.

In spite of the teachers trying their best to persuade me to go to the local solicitors or primary school, I managed to stand my ground and was elated when I received a letter from Hatton's, agreeing to take me on.

I found myself walking into a muchchanged store, by now a little further up Smithdown Road and with more of an emphasis on the mail order side of the business. I thought I would be helping customers in the shop but, instead, I was tasked with packing parcels. Not exactly what I had expected, but at least I was working with model trains!

In the second week a number of staff went on holiday, so I was 'promoted' to the tills and I loved it. So much so that, when my 16th birthday approached, I applied for a parttime job. I still remember now, walking through High School and getting a call from Richard Davies on my mobile. Dare I risk answering it when phones were banned in school? Of course I did – this was my dream job and I didn't want to lose it!

Walking back into the store as a paid employee, I knew what I would like to do, but I also knew that the job I had applied for was... packing parcels. After a few weeks of packing – and nagging Richard and Keith – I was trained on the tills. This was it, I was there for good!

I spent a good few years helping

customers in a shop that never stood still, as it evolved in line with customer and business needs, constantly expanding with more staff, more stock and larger premises. The longer I was there, the more hands-on I became in the running of the business. In 2010, Richard asked if I would like to help with the development of the Class 14 project. This was followed by the LMS 10000/10001 and the Class 28 Co-Bo. By the time the LMS Beyer-Garratt was mooted, I'd been nominated to lead the development – what a locomotive to have as my first 'project'.

After the Garratt, I was officially recognised as the exclusive commissions manager and this has been my job ever since, leading the projects, working with manufacturers and now our own factories. To be able to hold something and know that you've been instrumental in its design and production is something else. It's also a great opportunity for more 'first' experiences and these keep coming. Even as I write this, I'm preparing for my first live online interview about the upcoming Class 66.

I've been with Hatton's for 15 years now and I struggle to envision myself anywhere else. I see people changing jobs and sometimes wonder what it would be like but, for the time being, it's an idle curiosity, because making trains is far too much fun to ever think about trying to work for a living!

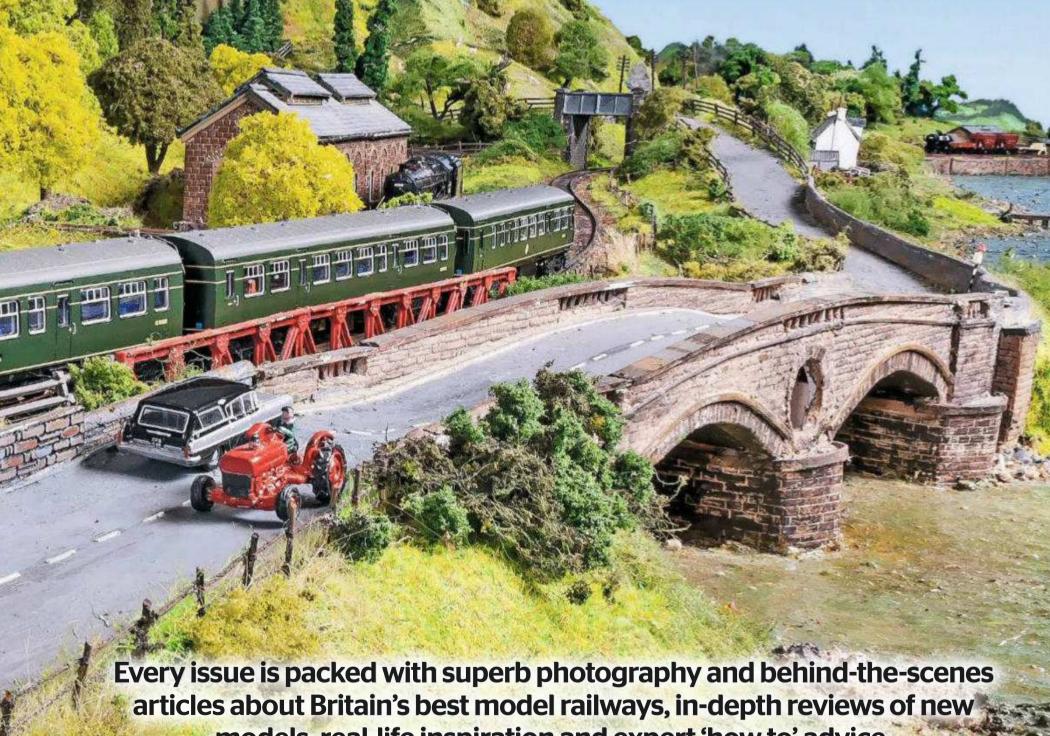

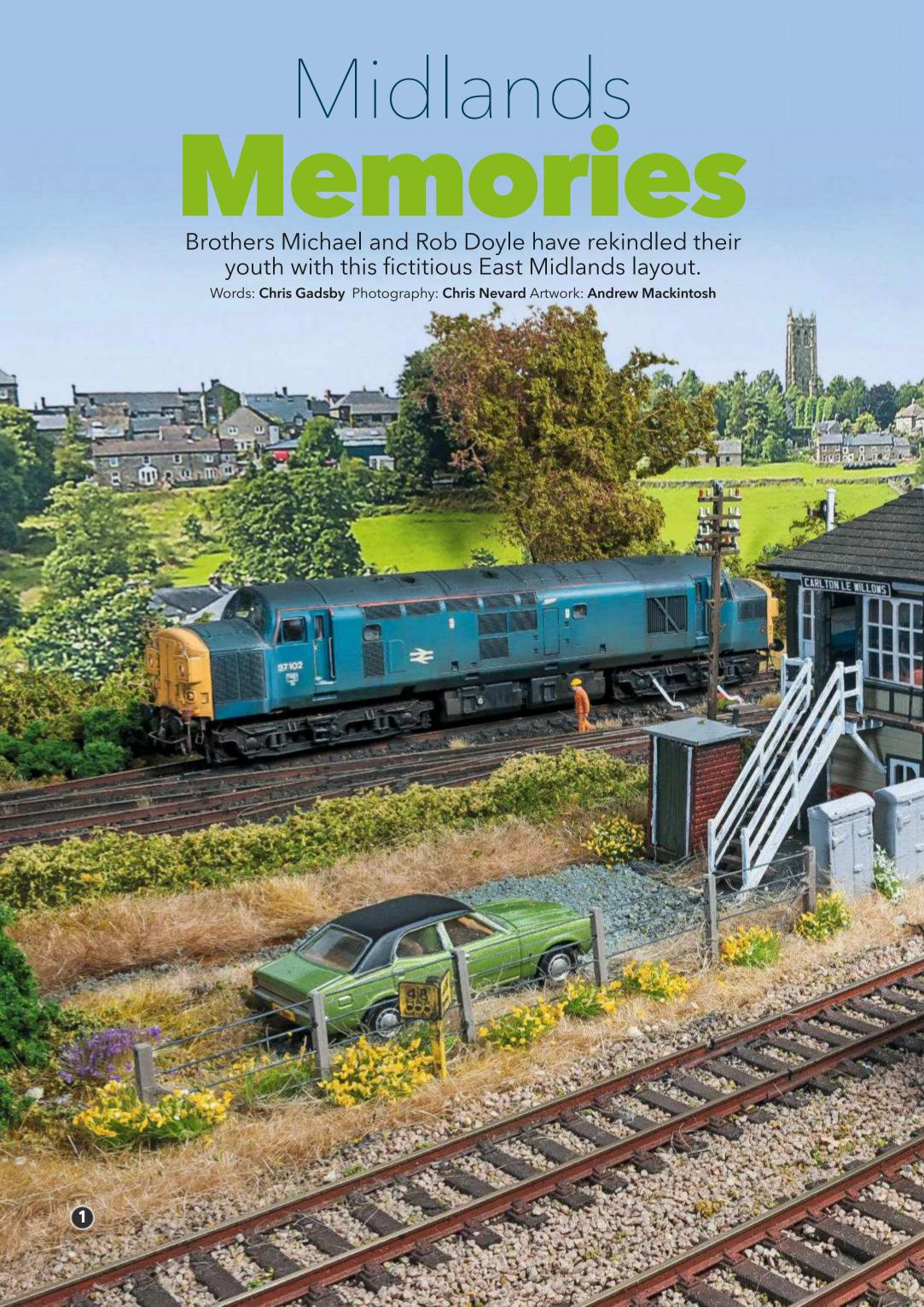

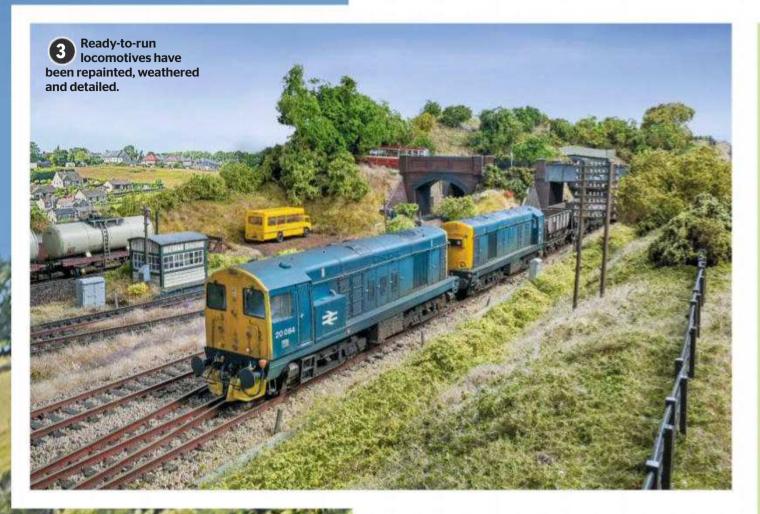

layout should be fictitious because our memories weren't perfect and the track plan certainly isn't accurate to the prototype."

The whole layout is 16ft by 10ft and scenic section baseboards are only 2ft 6in deep. 1970s Nottingham is a world away from the vast open countryside and rolling hills of 1930s Vale of White Horse but Pendon Museum's 'Vale Scene' has inspired the brothers' use of some clever tricks to make the layout look much deeper than it is.

"The main line is raised 2in above the baseboard level and the relief lines are lower, so you get a small but subtle perspective. The backscene is from ID Backscenes, as recommended by our friend Neil Mason from the Little Loco Company, and the rolling hills of the countryside also help with that perception of depth. Upon first glance the layout looks quite flat, like the nature of the landscape, so we've placed the focal point right in the centre to give a sense of undulation from the sides into the middle of the layout."

The lack of buildings actually heightens the sense of space. There's no station so it's left to a single signal box to act as the focal point.

"I built the signal box from a Ratio kit," explains Rob, "and then we placed it right in the centre of the layout to give it the maximum impact possible. We like to go into the finer details with our models so I added the Ratio plastic lever frame to the inside and used the option of leaving one of the windows open, as that is how we remember it being on hot summer days. For the nameboards 'Carlton-le-Willows' wasn't an option, of course, so we went to Scale Model Scenery and got them to make them."

Pendon has also inspired Michael and Rob to modify proprietary items to their personal specifications.

"All the signals have been heavily kit-bashed to the point that they are almost scratchbuilt," says Rob. "Using Ratio's kits as a starting point, I modified them with anything I could find out of the scrap box – other Ratio parts, items from the Model Signal

What makes this layout great?

Sometimes it can be difficult to create something unique with such a small space to work with, but Michael and Rob have combated this with their collection of unique locomotives that you won't find anywhere else.

Engineering range and even bits from various model engineering projects.

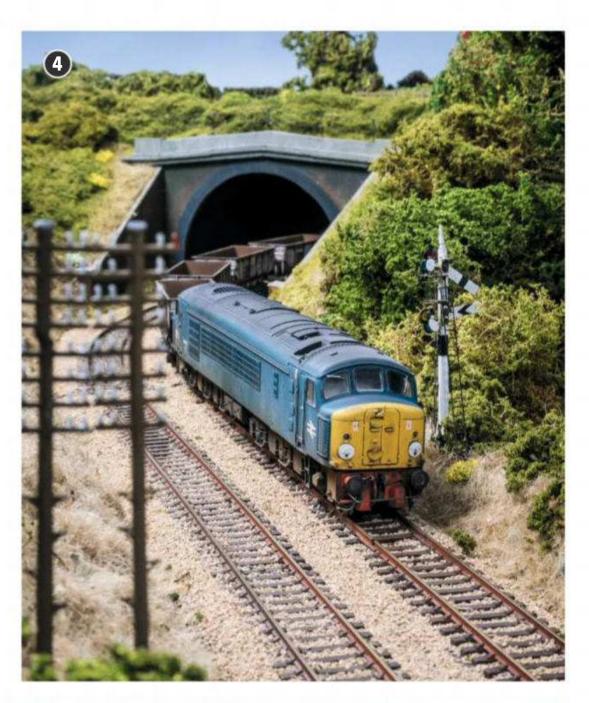
"The only signal that hasn't been scratchbuilt is the colour light signal, which we bought from Traintronics. That was around the time that our friend Tom Hunns came on board and did the wiring on the layout, as his electronics skills are far greater than ours."

The bridges and tunnel portals are Wills kits, apart from one tunnel portal on the main line, which was scratchbuilt. It's based on Manton tunnel in Rutland and Rob built it using South Eastern Finecast and Slater's Plastikard embossed sheets. The railings were made from wire soldered to dressmaker's pins.

"We've also used trees to block the view and to cover the transition between backscene and scenic section. With model railways being such an expensive hobby we've been doing everything we can to cut the costs. Rather than use static grass, which can get quite expensive if you're covering a large area, we elected to use hanging basket lining at a fraction of the price. The trees are copper braid armatures with sea foam depicting the leaves."

Michael and Rob have the advantage of not being tied down to a particular era, which allows them to run whatever they like. As with many modellers, they run what they remember from their youth, predominantly the BR blue era from the 1970s through to the 1980s.

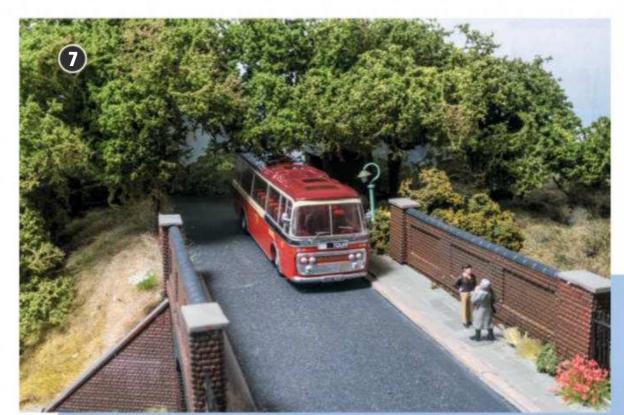
"We aren't the sort of modellers who insist on everything being perfect. If we see a locomotive that we like and we want to run it then we will run it. We don't mind if it's a few years out from what would be prototypical."

Keeping the main lines prototypically close together has caused a few issues when it comes to train set corners.

"The [end] curves were easily the most difficult part of the layout because they had to be so close together in order to make the 90° corner," says Michael. "The problem we have now is that we can't have two trains passing each other on the curves because the tracks aren't far enough apart to avoid fouling. This has meant that we had to shorten the length of trains from what we would perhaps like.

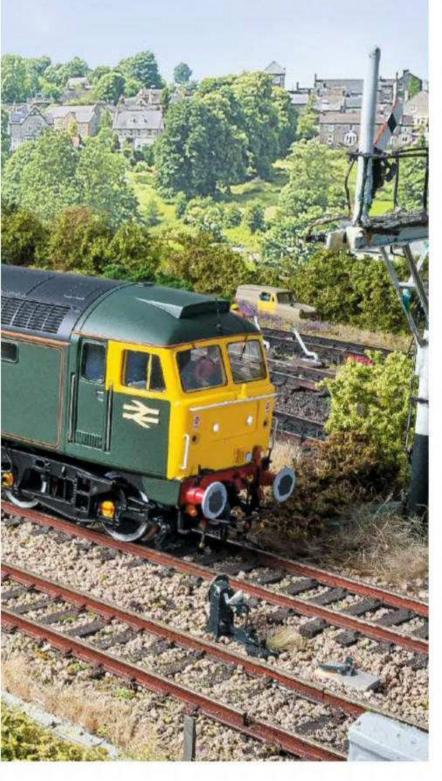
"Everybody in modelling has to make compromises because it's simply not viable for

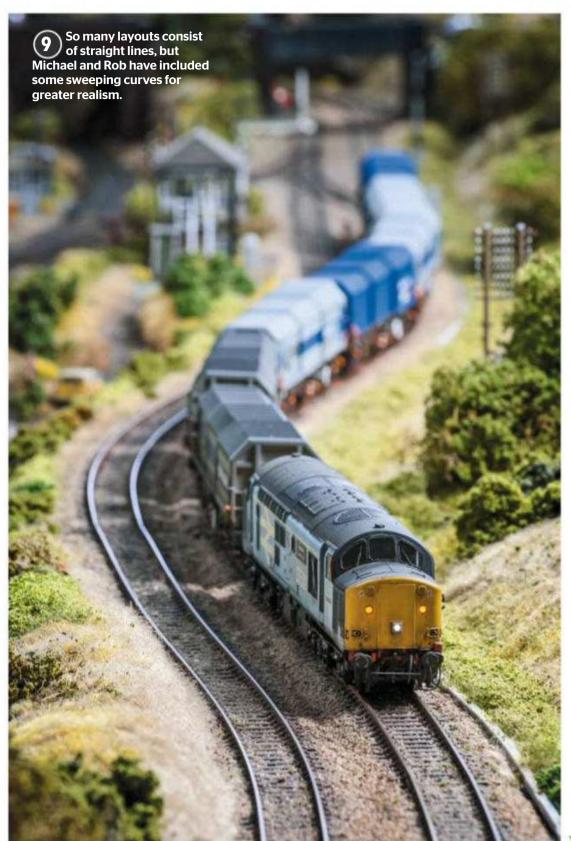


manufacturers to produce every single livery variation. Being able to make the alterations to them means that we don't have to miss out on a particular model and it also allows us to personalise them further."

It has taken three years for the trio to get 'Carlton-le-Willows' to the standard that they wanted and their hard work has paid off. It's clearly proven popular with Michael and Rob's fans, for it has already gained almost double the number of Facebook followers than 'Grimsby Town'. And the beauty of 'Carlton-le-Willows' is that you can see it in action yourself!

Class 47 47501 has been finished in GWR150-style green with Robert J. Edgington nameplates. "It's named after our late stepfather, without whom we wouldn't be in the position we are now."

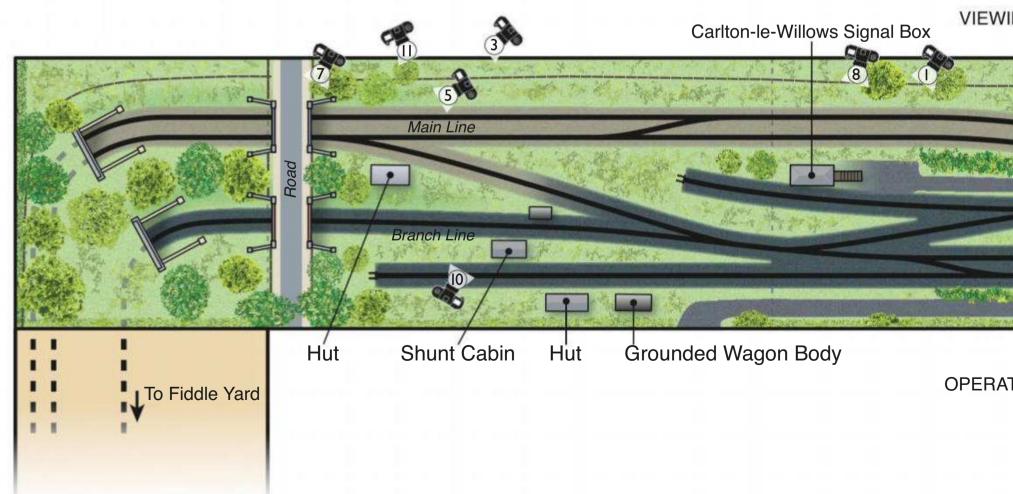

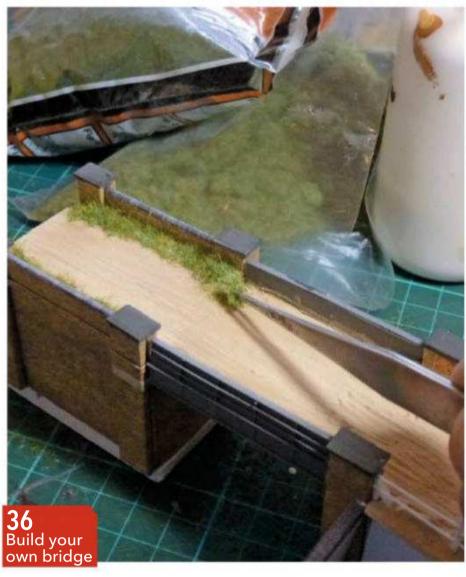

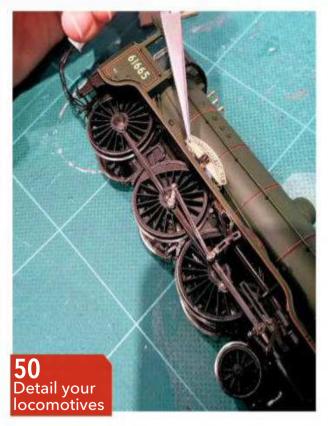

HOW TO

PERSONALISE YOUR 'TOADS'

Chris Leigh offers two ways to bring individuality to the GWR's classic brake van.

he 'Toad' brake vans were as distinctive a part of the Great Western Railway as brass safety valve bonnets, copper cap chimneys and chocolate and cream coaches. At first glance, their looks remained constant - verandah at only one end, lack of duckets - but there were many different diagrams built from 1894 until the early BR period.

Consequently, the 'Toad' has been

a popular subject for 'OO' gauge model manufacturers. Hornby offered two models: its own 1976 model plus a 1977 Airfix 'Toad' that it acquired from Dapol. Bachmann Branchline's own 'Toad' has just such elderly origins: it was originally produced in 1978 for Mainline.

There has, however, been an influx of new 'Toads' in recent years. Hornby replaced its 1970s models with an all-new Diagram AA15 in

2017, whileOxford Rail followed this with two new 'Toads' a year later: the six-wheel Dia. AA1 and four-wheel AA3.

Combined with Bachmann's 'Toad', which is still a good model, there are plenty of different 'Toads' to choose from to bring some variety to your layout.

You can, however, bring even more individuality to your GWR goods trains with these two simple tweaks.

Project 1 Change the name

'Toads' were often allocated to specific places and had the name painted on the sides. Changing the name to something more personal to you or to a location not previously offered ready-to-run is easy, thanks to Cambridge Custom Transfers' decal sheets. The following technique can be applied to Hornby, Bachmann or Oxford, or indeed a Ratio kit-built model. Scroll down the website (setrons org w/) to sheet 166

Oxford, or indeed a Ratio kit-built model. Scroll down the website (*cctrans.org.uk*) to sheet 166 where you'll find around a dozen sheets to choose from, with the names listed alphabetically. Changing the name is easy, regardless of which model you use.

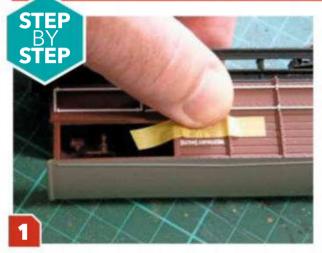

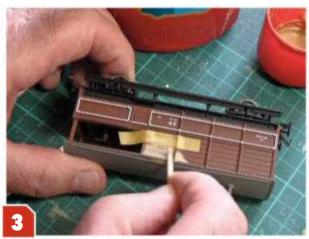

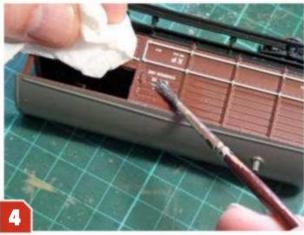
Choose the right BR 'Toad' brake van as a basis. Check whether you need a vacuum-braked vehicle (bauxite) or an unfitted (grey) van. Place masking tape over any lettering that you wish to preserve.



I retained the 'RU' (restricted use) lettering but there's no need to do so as it is included on the CCT sheet. A spot of T-Cut car finish restorer on a cotton bud will soften the printed lettering.



Give it a few minutes to soften and then help it on its way with the tip of a cocktail stick, worked in a circular motion. Don't use anything metal or you'll risk scratching the paint.



Remove the residue of the lettering and the T-Cut with a paintbrush and clean, cold water. Mop it off with a soft tissue and make sure all of the original lettering is gone.



Cut the decal from the sheet and soak it in lukewarm water until it is movable on the backing sheet. Do not allow it to float off the backing sheet under any circumstances.



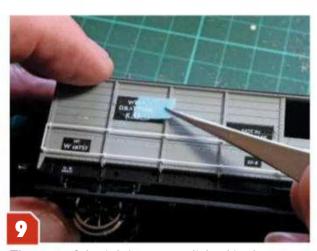
Use a pair of tweezers to extract the decal from the water, still on its backing sheet, and transfer it to the model. Use a cocktail stick to slide the decal off the backing paper and into position.



Blot any excess water off the decal, very gently, with a tissue. I used Micro Sol decal setting solution to soften the decal and settle it down into position.



If your 'Toad' is grey with black panels, you can paint out the original lettering with matt black, instead of removing it with T-Cut. Mask up to preserve the straight edges.



The rest of the job is accomplished in the same way but, in this instance, I used more of the supplied decals, including the 'RU' lettering and - of course - the appropriate number.

Project 2

Correcting Oxford's ends

Oxford's two 2018 'Toads' are, generally, very good models but there are a couple of problem areas. Happily, it doesn't take much work to correct them.

Firstly, all Oxford's versions of the 'Toad' have a window in the van end which was not there in service. Also, all Oxford's 'plated' examples have the lower part of the sides plated, but the ends planked. On the so-called 'plated' examples the lower sides and ends were made of steel.

An afternoon's work is all that is needed to make the changes, and you'll have a neat 16-tonner to add a bit of variety to your fleet.





Dismantle the van by pulling out the buffers. Grip the buffer shank in pliers and pull gently. I found that two of mine would not budge, but so long as you can release one end the body will come off. Then pop out the glazing



The van end of the 'Toad' had a planked wooden hatch which could be opened to reach the middle lamp bracket. The window frame needs to go, so snip out the horizontal glazing bar.



You will now need to remove the three sides of the upper window frame by filing them back until you have a plain rectangular opening. Be careful not to be too vigorous with the filing or you'll remove more than is needed.



I used Deluxe Materials Perfect Plastic Putty to fill the planking detail on both ends. It is easy to spread it with a craft knife blade and does not need to be smooth. Leave it to dry for a couple of hours.



The same blade can then be used to shave back the surplus filler until the plank faces are clean and only the recesses filled. Be super-critical and repeat the filling and shaving process where necessary.



The ends can then be painted with RailMatch BR freight stock early light grey, which is a pretty good match to Oxford's BR grey. Freight stock was often patch-painted and a little weathering will hide any discrepancy.



I filled the end window opening with a small piece cut from a Parkside 'Mink' van side, but Evergreen planked siding styrene sheet could be used. Alternatively, a small piece of scribed plastic sheet will do the job.

HOW TO

BUILD YOUR OVIN BRIDGE

Need a specific bridge to suit a specific location? Chris Leigh shows you how to build it.

Imost every stretch of railway had its own obstacles that resulted in a number of key identifying structures - bridges, tunnels and so forth - that you need to model in order to capture the character of the line. Even the West Drayton-Staines West branch, which I'm modelling in 'N', had a number of overbridges, which I must include in order to recreate key scenes and to get the railway looking right.

My layout will include three significant bridges and in true railway fashion I've numbered these in 'route' order. Bridge No. 1 is the cattle bridge, an accommodation bridge which provides livestock access to the free grazing on Staines Moor. It is a small metal girder span over the railway. Bridge No. 2 is the twin arch bridge which carried the branch over the Wyrardisbury River. This was built of yellow bricks which, reputedly, ended up as hardcore under the M25 when the bridge was demolished.



The third bridge is the girder span which carried the branch over the Southern Region line to Windsor. Like much of the branch, this bridge was built for double track, although only one line was ever laid. Bridges Nos. 2 and

only one line was ever laid. Bridges Nos. 2 and 3 were demolished in the 1980s, and while bridge No. 1 survives, its surroundings are now so overgrown by large trees that taking photographs would be impossible.

I was particularly pleased to find that I had taken a series of good colour prints of the railway part of the cattle bridge when the railway was disused but before it became overgrown. I refer to the 'railway part' because the cattle bridge was, in fact, three different bridges joined end-to-end. When the Staines to Windsor railway was built in the 1840s, it seems that the engineers diverted

the Wyrardisbury river from its winding course to run in a straight channel beside their railway. Forty years later the line from West Drayton was laid on the opposite river bank, providing two railways and a river to be crossed for access to Staines Moor. Accessing the moor from Moor Lane, over the bridge, one crossed first over the GWR branch by a metal girder span, then the river by a two-arch yellow brick bridge, and finally, the SR lines by a single red brick arch. The narrowness of my shelf arrangement means that I only have space for the metal girder span. Like much else on this layout, it had to be scratchbuilt.

Readers may notice another pink brick over-line bridge in the background of some of the photographs. This was built around 1960 to carry the A30 Staines bypass over the line. I've always considered it ugly and uninspiring so, as it's my layout, have simply omitted it.

Among my research photographs I had a good, square-on view of the metal span over the branch. I scanned it and reduced it to scale size, with an estimated span of 50mm (25ft in full size) as it was built to accommodate double track.



I started with the larger brick pier which would form the rear support for the span. Two walls were cut from 2mm mounting card and brick-papered with Scalescenes London Brick in 'N', as used for the station building (MR249).



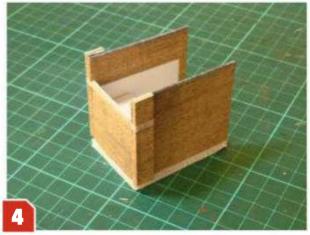
The walls were assembled into a box shape with the mounting card roadway set at the correct level and a gap left where the girders and their roadway would fit. It was then tried in place on the layout.



The other pier was much less substantial but boasted large wing walls to hold back the artificially created bank that leads up and over the bridge. Again, it was made up from 2mm mounting board.



I then mounted the printed photograph on card and cut it out. A test-fit on the layout followed. In later years the track had been slewed towards the Up side of the bridge, having originally been towards the Down side.



Two extra thicknesses of mounting card were glued together and brick-papered to form the buttresses. Girders are usually set on a 'pad stone' and I replicated this with a strip of paper, painted in concrete colour.



This section was then detailed with Scalescenes blue brick capping to the brickwork and mounting board caps to the buttresses. The brick relief strip was added with brick-papered postcard.



The deck of the bridge is made of large 'U'-section metalwork to produce a 'corrugated' effect. I added strips of postcard to the 2mm mounting board to create the corrugated appearance.

Only in its later years were the railings on the bridge boarded on the inside and even when

I first knew it, one panel of the railings was still open. For ease of modelling in styrene strip, the boarded area was treated as a single piece of styrene sheet to which all the plastic rod railings were attached for support, reversing how it was on the real thing.

Sign of the times



Today, the cattle bridge has a weight limit of only 7½ tons but this was the original GWR cast iron weight limit sign, removed when the 9-ton limit was reduced. It is reproduced slightly larger than scale size on the model just so that my inkjet printer could cope with it. It is just visible on the nearest, right-hand buttress of the bridge, its location on the real thing, where the bolt holes can still be seen!



The bridge girders were made out of styrene sheet and strip. The railings were boarded over in later years, and this made it easier to assemble, with the vertical ribs and railings all glued to the same 30thou sheet.



After finding a photograph of the view looking over the bridge I printed a scaled-down version and positioned it to give me a general idea of how I will need to paint the backscene in due course.



Where necessary, the ground under the bridge piers was packed with mounting card or foam board to bring it up to the desired level. I then decided to do scenic work on the bridge deck before fixing it in place.



The road over the bridge is a sandy, gravel farm track. I used Woodland Scenics Smooth-It mixed with a little of the same brand's Earth undercoat to colour it.



Using a brush damped with water I brushed the surface out as smooth as possible, remembering that this is 'N' gauge and not one of the larger scales that I'm used to thinking and working in.



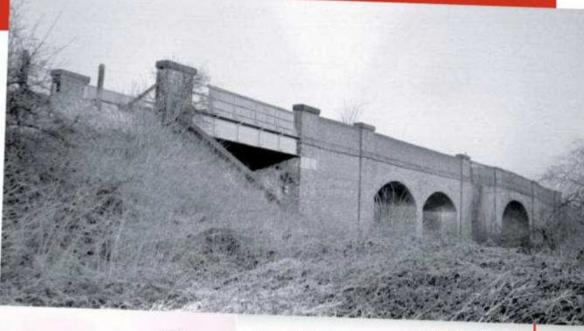
I used static grass scatter placed into PVA glue with a pair of tweezers to represent the growth along the sides of the bridge. I seem to recall a lot of nettles among this growth!

CREATE A BESPOKE COACH

When there's no kit nor ready-to-run option available, what do you do? **Daryl Harris-Saxton** offers some techniques for successful kit-bashing.

urphy Models' Cravens coaching stock proved a big hit with modellers of Irish railways, but there is one essential vehicle that ran with the Cravens that's not currently available - the Generating Steam Van (GSV).

The GSVs were converted from ex-British Rail Mk 1 Corridor Brakes in the early 1970s, specifically to provide steam heating to the Cravens stock. A diesel generator powered the steam heating boiler. They rode on 5ft 3in gauge BR B5-type bogies.

There was only one way to have one on my layout - I was going to have to make my own.

Like the real things, my model also started life as a Bachmann BR Mk 1 Brake Second Corridor, which was fully dismantled, ready for conversion. Modifications were necessary to the underframe, the carriage ends and roof.

Plenty of work was needed on the bodysides too, with one set of double doors being sealed-up on each side, along with the two single-width passenger doors. Indeed, the remodelling of these window and door apertures as well as the installation of a set of ventilation louvres for the diesel generator, were perhaps the biggest challenge of the build.

Replacement buffers and gangways were required for a more authentic appearance and their location had to be altered slightly so that they matched their counterparts on the Cravens stock.

This has been an enjoyable project and I must extend my thanks to the helpful folk on the Irish Railway Modellers forum, for all their assistance.

Fuel tanks, ventilation louvre and roof-mounted exhaust panel, along with a fully appointed interior, make for a convincing conversion.





A Bachmann Mk 1 BSK was employed as a donor model. Unclip the roof and release the sides from the floor and ends to dismantle. Push out the glazing and set aside in a safe place.



All redundant apertures had a piece of plastic card fixed internally, with another layer of sheet styrene plugging the recess. Surplus hinges and handles were carved away.



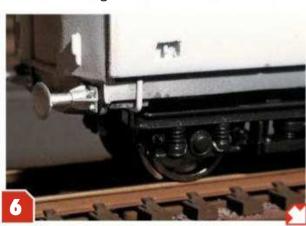
A set of double doors was added to a former window, cutting part of the guard's double door and droplight from the opposite end of the carriage and slotting it into place. The door seams were added with a scriber.



The bodyside grille was created with Evergreen embossed clapboard sheet, cut and shaped to fit snugly within the window aperture. Thin plastic strip created the vertical dividing bar.



The water tank recesses at the ends were marked and drilled with a 0.5mm bit before refining with files. Plastic card backing was added along with wire for the filler pipe.



Plastic rod was shaped around the solebar below the water tank filler recesses. The rod was secured to the frames, cut so as to form a close fit with the lower edges of the bodysides.

Paint it... orange

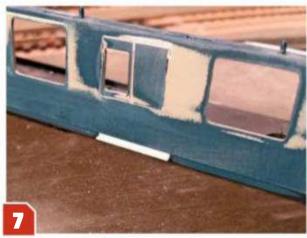
With the conversion work complete, the model was ready for repainting into CIÉ orange and black. The first stage involved coats of Halfords aerosol-based grey primer, which is great for revealing any surface imperfections. Once these had been addressed with filler and sanding, the bodyshell was primed again, but this time with Halfords white primer.

The use of a white base coat is important, as it provides the perfect backing for the twin white stripes, as well as the vibrant orange colour scheme and CIÉ's distinctive fluorescent hazard colour applied to the gangway doors.

For the orange element, after much debating and testing, I settled for RAL 2011, mixed in an aerosol at my local car paint specialist. Humbrol black completed the livery, including the entire underframe.

After the paint had dried, masking was removed ready to be glossed. Lused Phoenix Precision AV62 Gloss varnish, before applying Railtec Transfers. Everything was sealed with varnish again before weathering.





Having marked the redundant footsteps on the solebars, they were cut away with a stout knife and the surfaces tidied with files. New steps were added using plastic strip aligned with the revised doorway locations.



After priming the sides and addressing any imperfections, the door seams were scribed with a fine-tipped scribing tool and a straightedge. Etched door hinges and handles, from Shawplan, were then installed.





The roof panel was formed from 10thou plastic card, with part of the raised ribs removed to provide a flush surface. The vents were created from strips of plastic card and Evergreen round and square tube.



Looking underneath, one battery box needed to be removed. These simply push into place, so they should come out easily. I made a fuel tank out of thick plastic card, detailed with various bits of plastic strip.



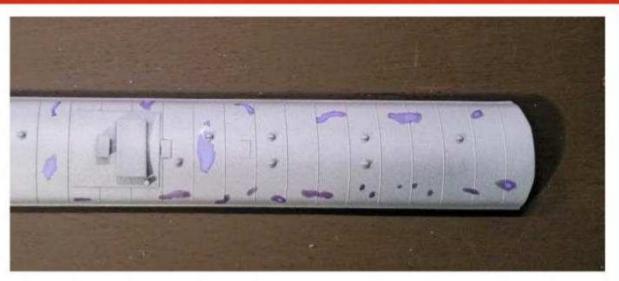
The fuel filler hatch was made by drilling a 1.6mm hole and then opened it up slightly with a 2mm drill bit, before the rod was inserted. Stiff wire was used for the fuel gauge and steps made from styrene 'L' angle and strip.

Weathering tips

The underframe and ends were weathered with RailMatch enamels (402 Frame Dirt and 403 Roof Dirt), plus a little Humbrol Metal Cote (27004). In order to produce a worn appearance to the bodywork, the bodysides were rubbed in light, vertical strokes with fine 1000-grit sanding sticks.

To add a careworn aspect to the roof, I sprayed it initially with a metallic silver to represent bare metal. Using photos as a guide, I covered the roof in 'random' patches of Humbrol Maskol. When this was dry, the roof was sprayed in RailMatch 261 Virgin Grey, which produces a more convincing appearance than pure black.

Once the dark grey coat had dried, I picked off the Maskol to reveal the silver. This created the impression of a peeling

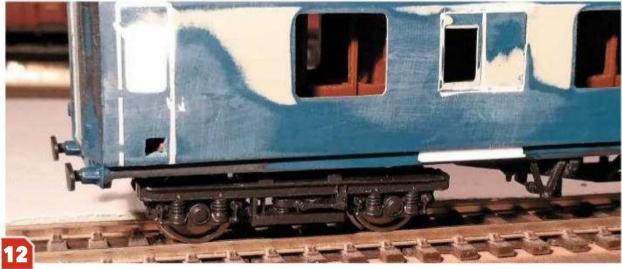


Mk 1 roof. The large roof exhaust panel was weathered with a mix of Humbrol weathering powders (Iron Oxide, Rust and Dark Earth), while the rest of the roof received an overall dusting of Humbrol's Smoke weathering powder, with the odd streak of Rust/Dark Earth creating some tonal variation.





With a suitably care-worn appearance, Daryl's rendition of an ex-BR Mk 1 generator van is impressive.



Replica Railways' B5 bogies were fitted, after re-drilling the bogie pivot holes to 4.8mm diameter. A small amount of plastic had to be cut from the top until the bogie could be clipped into position.



Turning to the ends, the gangways were cut away and all raised details removed, bar the two lamp brackets. The small holes from the water pipes were filled in, along with any other blemishes.



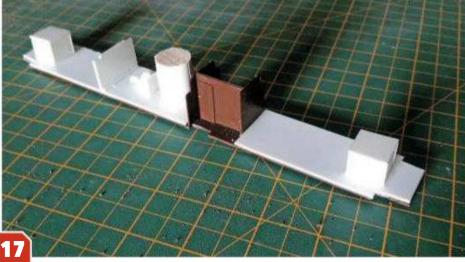
The buffers and moulded coupling hooks were also carved away. After priming and undercoating in white (see panel, page 41), Plastikote Fluorescent Red was applied with an aerosol.



Replacement LMS-pattern gangways were sourced from Comet Models (pack ECM2). These will be primed and painted before installing to the carriage ends with cyano glue.



A set of whitemetal BR Mk1 extended buffers (also from Comet Models, pack C42) were installed. Coupling hooks were added (Cravens stock used screw couplings throughout).



Due to the open nature of the coach, I decided to create a basic interior.
The guard's compartment was retained but everything else was removed.
A new floor was formed from plastic sheet, and two water tanks fabricated.



The boiler is wooden dowel wrapped in thin plastic sheet, while the diesel generator is a 3D print from Shapeways. The interior was primed and painted before being installed in the finished coach.



HOW TO

BUILD A CUSTOM PLATFORM

Peter Marriott shows you how to make a custom platform, for when off-the-shelf or kit ones just won't do.

he station will usually form the centrepiece of a layout, but one of the most problematic areas is the platform. Most kits or plastic and resin sections are modular, which can force you to make compromises on your layout. If you need your layout to be a certain way, then you'll need a custom platform to suit.

Thankfully, making your own platform is really simple. Traditionally, you might have used card and embossed plastic sheet. But Redutex self-adhesive textured sheets make the job even easier!

The heart of a custom platform is Daler Rowney Museum Mountboard, which is 2.2mm thick, comes in a range of colours and is available from many high street arts and crafts stores, such as Hobbycraft.

Making a custom platform is a straightforward and hugely satisfying process. I built mine for a 'OO' gauge layout, but the beauty of the technique is that it can be transferred into any scale.

What you will need

TOOLS NEEDED

- Steel rule
- Sharp pencil
- Sharp craft knife with fresh blades
- Self-healing cutting mat
- Fine-grade sanding sticks, files or sandpaper
- Selection of paintbrushes
- Masking tape

Platform planning essentials

- 1 Make sure you gauge the height of your platform against your coaches. Remember that passengers usually step up a little to get into the carriage but not too much! Most 'OO' gauge platforms are around 12mm high but older stations sometimes have lower platforms.
- 2 Always test clearances with your longest and widest items of rolling stock before you glue your station in place. There is nothing more annoying than watching your trains strike a platform edge every time you run them.



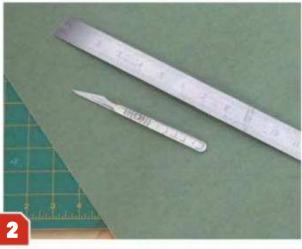
Peter's completed custom platform. Can you tell that he didn't buy it?



Stick paper together to make an area larger than the platform and press it onto the rails where the platform will go. The rails will make indentations, forming your template.



Remember to make the platform surface slightly smaller than the template because a gap is needed between train and edge. Test it thoroughly, cutting away problem areas.



Cut out the template and transfer it to a piece of mounting card. Use a fresh blade to carefully cut the mounting card. Work slowly, making several passes with the blade.



The Rapesco Remover might be designed for removing staples from paper but it also doubles as a useful scribing tool. You can buy them from Amazon for a few pounds.

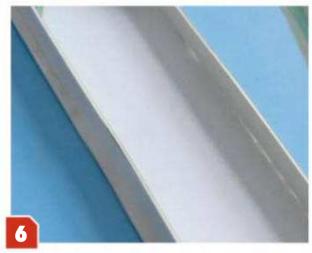

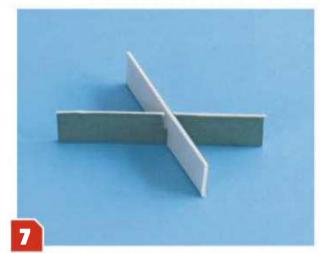

Use the staple remover to form the line of coping or edging stones. Press the remover at consistent spaces to form the individual stones.



Record the height of your platform, taking away 2mm for the thickness of surface. Cut strips of card to that measure to form the platform walls. Glue in place.



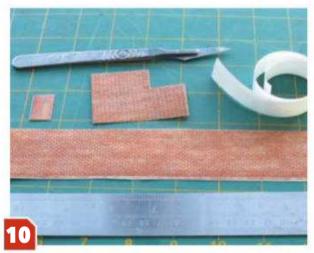
Cut some shorter strips of card to the same thickness. By carefully cutting slots into them, you'll be able to arrange them into a cross shape.



The crosses form the supports for your platform. Use Woodland Scenics Scenic Glue to fix them at regular distances along the underside of the platform surface.



Use Woodland Scenics Earth Colour White to paint the platform edging. When dry, mask them and then paint the main surface. I went for grey to mimic an asphalt surface.



Redutex sheets come in a range of finishes. I chose brick for my platform. Cut the sheets with a sharp blade and steel ruler.



The beauty of Redutex: peel the backing away with the tip of a sharp blade and press it onto the platform wall. Work carefully and in short sections to avoid creases.



Tidy any rough edges with fine grit abrasives, touching up any paint where necessary. When dry, use a thin coat of Humbrol Black Wash to tone down the white paint.



You can now detail your platform. In this view is a whitemetal platform lamp from my spares box, Noch figure and Artitec bicycle. Don't forget station signs, benches, buildings and so forth.

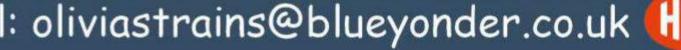

HOW TO

PERSONALISE RESIN BUILDINGS

Dave Lowery is impressed with Bachmann's Scenecraft buildings, but they're not so great if you see them on everyone's layout. Here's how to add a personal touch.

t's been a long time since I had much to do with 'OO' gauge buildings. I think the last time I dabbled with them was when I built some Superquick card kits while on holiday at my gran's.

So, imagine my delight when I received these resin, 'ready-to-plant' buildings from the Bachmann Scenecraft range... wow!
Beautifully detailed, well-painted buildings







that capture the atmosphere of railway structures I was after, and so many to choose from - things have moved on from the days of Superquick!

Take your building from the box and place it on the layout. Job done? Well, the

only problem is that many other people are doing the same thing.

The beauty of these buildings is that they're really easy to modify. Here are a few simple tweaks to bring some individuality to your buildings, to make yours unique to your layout. Not only that, it'll spur you on to do more with buildings. You'll be scratchbuilding before you know it...





Our starting point: a Bachmann Scenecraft Rendered Prefab Building (44-0094) fresh from the box. Here's how to give it some individuality.



Use RailMatch Sleeper Grime to give the roof a light wash of dirt. Mix it with thinners in a pot to create a wash and apply it in patches to the roof.



Using the same thinned wash, work along the sides of the building, about half an inch up from the base. It's a wash of dirt so use it sparingly and make it uneven.



Spread dilute PVA glue around one corner and position some pieces of cotton to represent the stems of a climbing plant. Allow to dry for a few minutes.



Use tweezers to dip small clumps of Woodland Scenics foliage in PVA and place on to the cotton stems. How much will depend on the season you're modelling.



Fix some Woodland Scenics Poly Fiber to another corner with more dilute PVA. Cover the glazing and then spray the Poly Fiber with cheap hairspray.

Tap the pack of foliage material from the Woodland Scenics range to represent a bush. I've gone for light green but there are many colours to choose from.



Think about adding little details. I glued a piece of card over one of the windows to represent a hastily boarded-up window. The result of a break-in perhaps? Shock horror!



HOW TO

TWEAK YOUR LOCOMOTIVES

Chris Gadsby offers some simple tweaks you can make to individualise your fleet.

nly a very fortunate modeller can go through his or her entire life being able to buy everything exactly how they want it off the shelf. For everybody else, some form of modification to the models will be necessary. Understandably, some approach this with trepidation. "I've spent a lot of money on this model - I don't want to risk ruining it" is a common phrase, and I've uttered those

exact words on numerous occasions. But after reassurance from George, and his advice to practise on spare models first, I decided to dive in with a couple of projects that would make two locomotives perfect for my layout.

Project 1 - Renumber a locomotive



Generally speaking, I'm not one to hanker for a particular running number. As long as it's the class I want, in the livery I want, then I'm happy. However, there are a couple of honourable exceptions, particularly Gresley 'B17' No. 61666, named after two-time European champions Nottingham Forest. Sadly, Hornby hasn't yet offered one of its new 'B17s' with that name, choosing instead, No. 61665 *Leicester City*.

Creating my favourite 'B17' is a really easy process thanks to Olivia's Trains re-naming/renumbering packs. Suitably armed, complete with a 'B17' from Rails of Sheffield, I set about turning a 'Footballer' into the team for me.





Disconnect the tender from the locomotive, as you won't need it for this task and it will only get in the way. Put it to one side, making sure that you keep the screw safe. I'll be making further modifications to the tender at a later date.

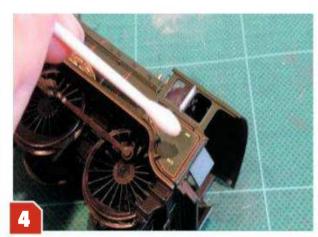

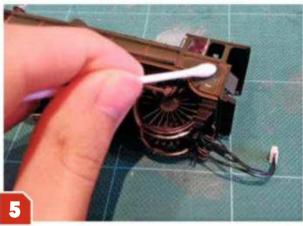
The renaming/renumbering pack from Olivia's Trains contains waterslide decals for the numbers but self-adhesive stickers for the nameplate. These are easy to stick over the top of the existing nameplates, using tweezers.



Dip the cotton bud in the T-Cut. You may want to decant some T-Cut into a dish, but as my bottle was virtually full the cotton bud would reach it from the neck. Don't smother it in T-Cut or you will have more to wipe away.



Rub the cotton bud over the numbers, changing buds regularly. You'll need to apply some force, but be careful - if you use too much you'll start to take the green paint off as well. Removing the numbers takes about five minutes.



When the numbers are gone, use a clean bud to wipe away any excess T-Cut.

Be thorough about this – any excess will cause bubbles and it will continue to dissolve the paint if you leave it.



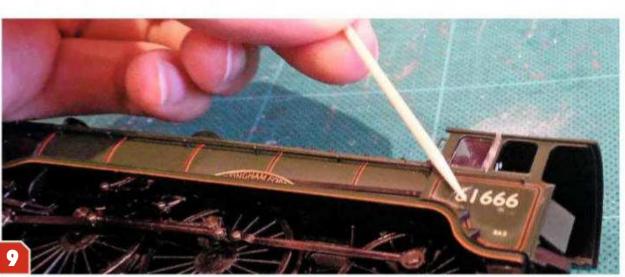
When all the T-Cut has been removed, apply a very thin coat of gloss varnish to the cab side. This will give the decals a better surface to stick to when you apply the new numbers. The area is very small – you'll only need a tiny amount.



Apply tape to the model to act as a straightedged guide for the bottom of the numbers. You could do it by eye, but for a real belt-andbraces approach I used a ruler to ensure there was the same gap to the lining at both ends.



Cut the decal out and place it in tepid water until it begins to come away from the backing. Be careful - it's quicker than you might think and there's no margin for error. Once it begins to come away, remove it quickly.



With tweezers on the backing, use a cocktail stick to slide the decal into place and smooth out any air pockets. Remove the masking tape and, once dry, cover with a matt varnish to seal in the decals.

Project 2 - Adding sound to a Hornby RailRoad model



I wasn't bothered about having DCC sound on my layout until I bought a layout that came with DCC pre-installed and a DCC-fitted model. Now everything has to have it!

New steam locomotive releases are quite easy to convert to DCC sound as there is plenty of space in the tender, but for my Hornby RailRoad locomotive this was going to be more difficult. The decoder is situated in the locomotive body where there is barely enough room for the circuit board, let alone the speaker.

Sound can be expensive but, thankfully, Hornby has introduced its TTS range of decoders. I bought a TTS A1/A3 sound decoder for my RailRoad Flying Scotsman. but it sat in its box for quite a while until I plucked up the courage to install it!

This was actually quite straightforward and not as scary as I thought it might be it only required the extension of two wires.

One area where I came unstuck was making the wires between the locomotive and the tender long enough. Initially I hadn't left enough slack, which meant that the wire would go taut around right-hand bends and would cause derailments. This was also a simple fix after the conversion.

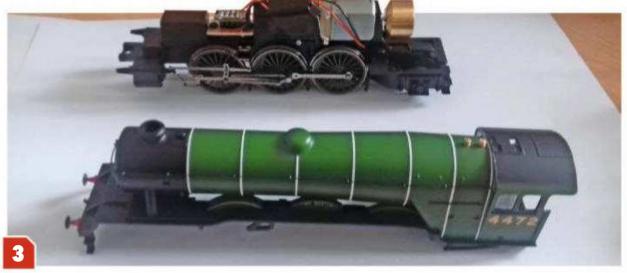




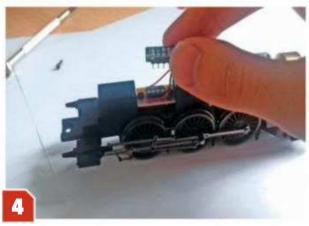
Here's the locomotive before I did anything with it. If all goes to plan, the only difference you'll see when the conversion is finished is two black wires that connect the locomotive to the tender.



Take the body off the locomotive. The front bogie must be detached first and there is only a very small amount of space in which to fit the screwdriver head. Keep the screws safe! Once they're out, lift off the body.



With the body removed, the extent of the problem is clear. The motor housing and wires already sit against the roof of the locomotive, and while there is a little space above the decoder blanking socket, there isn't enough for the PCB and the speaker.



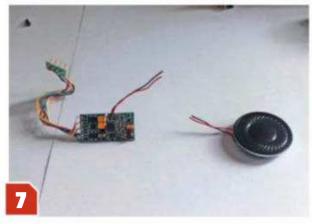
Remove the blanking socket and insert the DCC sound socket to test it, ensuring that the orange wire lines up with Pin 1. There is a small number '1' on the decoder and also one on the housing to help you get it the right way round.



I found it easier to remove all the bodywork first and put it to one side so that it wasn't in my way. The tender only has one screw which can be removed with a long thin screwdriver. The body will then come off to reveal the weights.



The top weight has a sticky pad on it, very similar to double-sided tape. You can add extra adhesive if you want but this will suffice. Leave the weights in the tender, as the extra weight will allow for better running.



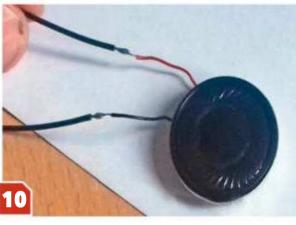
Cut the wires between the PCB and the speaker. Here, I've taken the speaker out of its case to make it easier to work with. Cutting the wires in the middle, rather than unsoldering the joints, will reduce the risk of any damage.



Using wire strippers, take about 5mm off the ends of the wires that you are going to solder. The wire is thin so some of the insulation may melt as you apply the heat from the soldering iron, but don't worry.



You will need extra wire to extend the length between the PCB and the speaker. Make sure you cut extra to ensure you have enough for the gap. You can always put the excess in the space in the tender. Solder the two wires together.



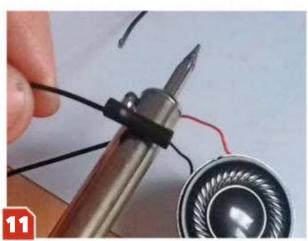
With both wires soldered you will need to insulate them to avoid a short circuit. You can either wrap them in insulation tape or feed heat shrink along from the other end of the wire. Ensure first that your solder joints are sound.

Box conversion

A conversion such as this means that the tender will now be permanently fixed to the locomotive and you won't be able to take them apart again without cutting the wires. This will leave the footplate quite inaccessible, so make sure that you have done everything you want to do with it before you carry out the conversion.

This will also mean that the locomotive and tender will no longer fit in the box snugly, and you will have to cut away some of the polystyrene in order to get the model back into the box. This will leave the tender slightly loose in the box and you may want to use some of the material you previously cut away to pack around it.





With the solder joints in place you can feed heat shrink around the wire and use the side of the soldering iron to heat it, allowing it to shrink around the joint. Do this for both sides and allow it to set.



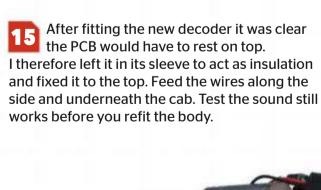
If your heat shrink is too big (as mine was) then bring the two wires together and put another layer over the top of that so it doesn't slip. Ideally you should use the correct size - it will give you more options when fitting the speaker.



It is vital that you feed the wires through the hole in the tender before soldering them to the PCB. If you don't you won't be able to get the speaker inside the tender! Peel off the backing from the pad and fix the speaker in place.



At this point I fixed the body back on the tender. As you can see, there is no difference to the body itself apart from the two wires coming out of the bottom. This goes through the hole that would be filled with the connecting plug on a DCC-fitted model.

Looking at locomotives in detail

'20s' on the Underground

Pip Dunn takes a look at the veteran diesels that have found regular use on London Underground.

he first English Electric
Type 1 Bo-Bos – better known
as Class 20 – were delivered to
British Railways in 1957 and,
by rights, this 60-year-old design really
shouldn't be working regular freight trains
on the national network. But it is.

Most BR classes had their usual territories and it's only after they've been withdrawn from front-line service – or since privatisation – that they've appeared in far-flung places, some way away from their traditional stamping grounds. The Class 20 is no exception.

Enthusiasts will have fond memories of watching pairs of '20s' hard at work on coal trains throughout the Midlands and Yorkshire, or taking trips to the seaside behind them on summer Saturdays. After being replaced in frontline service, nuclear flask and weedkilling duties have led to Class 20s appearing all over the country.

One place where the Class 20 has found favour is on London Underground. This link was sealed on April 29 2018 when 20227, resplendent in London Transport maroon, was named *Sherlock Holmes*, in honour of Metropolitan Railway electric No. 8, by Sir Peter Hendy.

Specials and naming aside, seeing Class 20s on the Underground has been a weekly occurrence since 2009. The reason why is that this seemingly primitive design has some redeeming factors over newer locomotives, and one of those is weight.

There hasn't been a new Bo-Bo on the network with a low axle weight for many years. The new Class 68s and 88s are RA7 whereas the trusty '20' is RA5 (Route Availability 5, axle weight of less than 19 tons). Despite this, there are some routes where lighter locomotives are a must as heavier Class 60s, 66s, 67s and 70s are just that – too heavy.

It's claimed that the order for LU's 191 S-Stock EMUs – worth approximately £1.5bn – was the biggest new train contract ever offered in Britain. It was won by Bombardier and, subsequently, GB Railfreight was contracted to move the new trains from Derby Litchurch Lane works to LUL's Neasden depot, via the Asfordby test track, near Melton Mowbray. The first S-Stock was ready for delivery in 2009.

There's a bridge just outside Neasden with a severe weight restriction. It precludes the use of, say, a Class 66. With nearly 200 new trains to move, GBRf had only one option – to run the trains with Class 20s. GBRf could have run the trains with '66s', swapping to '20s' for the last few miles, but GBRf decided to use '20' power throughout. However it didn't own any, so it hired, on a short-term deal, 20142 and 20189 from locomotive owner Michael Owen, the Class 20 Society's 20227 and Harry Needle Railroad Company's (HNRC) 20901 and 20905.

It's somewhat ironic that Direct Rail Services (DRS) started out using Class 20s,





which it had fully refurbished at Brush Traction in 1995. Twenty-five years on, and DRS is now using ultra-modern Bo-Bos, the Class 68 and Class 88.

GBRf signed a longer term hire deal with DRS to use some of those Brush Class 20/3s – 20301/302/304/305 had major exams and were fitted with trip-cocks, while a fifth, 20308, was retained as a spare.

The S-Stock delivery trains were a sight to behold. The seven or eight-car 'S7' or

topped and tailed by pairs of Class 20s.

These trains occasionally ran with single '20s' on each end. In this case, pairs of Network Rail MLA 'Falcons' bogie wagons were inserted into the train, so the formation became '20', MLA, MLA, KBA, S-Stock, KBA, MLA, MLA, '20'.

The S-Stock is designed for LUL's 'sub-surface' lines but that makes it out-of-gauge for some Network Rail routes. Therefore, the delivery trains run under 'X' headcodes, to advise signallers that diverting the train off its booked route is not advised and could cause issues if done so. They're also limited to 35mph.

The trains were due to run weekly, so set paths were put in the working timetable.

The schedule was the train was due to leave Asfordby at 1142 and arrive at Amersham at 0045, so this was never a fast train!

It quickly became apparent that the new S-Stock needed some major modification, so much so that all 192 trains would have to return to Derby. This made the whole

contract a triangular operation – Derby to Asfordby, Asfordby to Neasden and Neasden back to Derby – which made better use of the resources.

The trains typically ran southbound on Wednesday and returned on a Thursday and, initially, the '20s' would return light



to Peterborough – sometimes without the barrier vehicles which would be left at Asfordby or Derby – for maintenance.

There were some issues with the DRS '20/3s' including periods when availability was particularly poor and so the contract switched to HNRC in 2012.

HNRC prepared eight '20s' – 20096/107/20118/132/20311/314/901/905 – in order to improve availability and reliability of these vintage machines. After all, a round trip is over 400 miles.

That bridge outside Neasden has since been upgraded and Class 66s could work the trains throughout. However, the '20s' have remained for two reasons. Firstly, the hire contract was already signed and, secondly, it would employ two '66s' at a time when GBRf's fleet was stretched.

The relationship between the Class 20 and LUL dates back to 1993 when several were hired for working infrastructure trains on the Metropolitan Line. BR loaned 20007, 20092 and 20169 while D8110 and 20227 were hired from the South Devon Railway and Class 20 Locomotive Society respectively.

This work finished in 1994 but 20227 became a regular visitor to LUL metals as it was hired on an *ad hoc* basic for working the popular 'Steam on the Met' specials, as well as route-learning trips with the LUL's '4-TC'



20142 and 20227 show off their smart London Transport maroon liveries at the Midland Railway - Butterley on April 8 2017. 20142's livery is slightly different: it has Metropolitan Railway crests in place of the LT roundel and number 8. Both use their four-character headcode blinds when hauling S-Stock: 20142 shows '1K73' and 20189 usually displays '0Z20'. ACORN 1/ALAMY

set. This arrangement culminated in 20227 being repainted in Metropolitan Railway maroon in 2000. Although inspired by the old Met electrics, 20227 received a crest on the nose end doors but full yellow ends and a red solebar. It also gained the name *Sir John Betjeman*, after the famous

Metropolitan Railway-loving poet.

London Underground embarked on an extensive series of specials in 2013 to mark the 150th anniversary of the opening of the Metropolitan Railway. Most people's attention was focused on Metropolitan Railway 0-4-4T No. 1's return to the



tunnels under London in January, but the summer's 'Steam on the Met' trips between Amersham and Harrow brought Class 20s back to LUL with a vengeance... and in some rather unusual liveries.

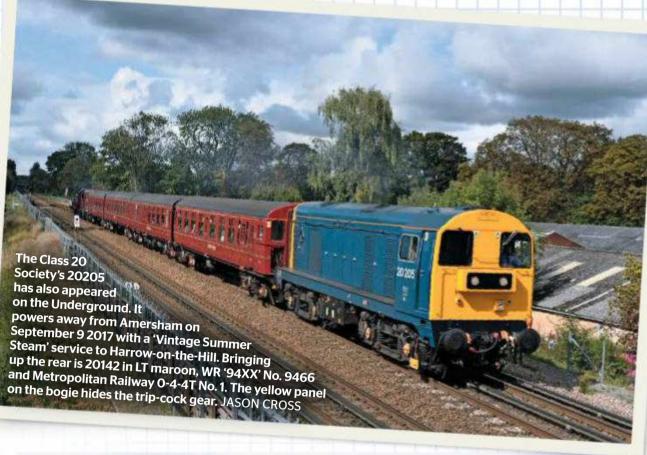
20227's was arguably the most eyecatching. It received a colour scheme based on current LUL practice: white bodysides with red cabs and a blue solebar and small yellow panels.

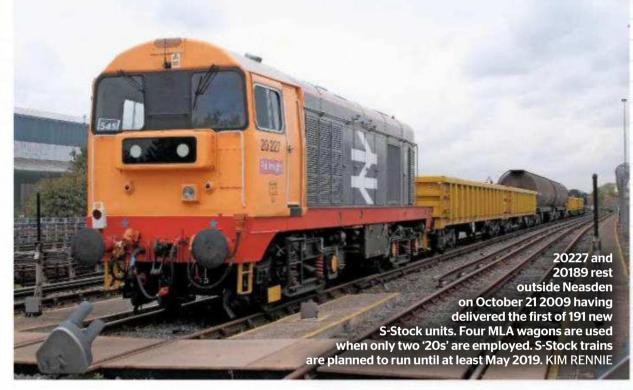
To provide cover for the steam specials, Michael Owen's 20142 and 20189 returned to the Underground. 20189 was repainted into what was meant to be London Transport red, but a communication breakdown meant that it actually appeared in London *bus* red!

Owen's pair were painted into Balfour Beatty blue and white for contract work but, when this was cut short, 20189 reverted to full BR blue in 2016, after running in a temporary scheme – BR blue but with Balfour Beatty grey roofs and solebars.

20142, meanwhile, received full London Transport maroon livery and has since gained the *Sir John Betjeman* name from 20227 because this, of course, gained its new name on April 29.

20227, 20189 and 20142 have made regular appearances on the London Underground in recent years, providing cover as needed for steam specials.





When not on LUL, 20227 calls the Midland Railway – Butterley home, although it's currently on hire to the North Norfolk Railway to work its Sheringham-Cromer dining trains.

Butterley is also home to 20142 and 20189, although at the time of writing both were on hire to the North Yorkshire Moors Railway as steam had been banned due to the exceptionally hot weather. The pair, thanks to their main line registration, have been covering NYMR trains to Whitby as well as working between Pickering and Grosmont.

LUL, meanwhile, has received all 191 S-Stock units, but deliveries of modified units is due to last until May 2019. It's truly remarkable that Class 20s are still in front line use in 2018, but the railway is arguably all the better for it!

What happens to HNRC's Class 20s afterwards remains to be seen. But with more steam specials in the pipeline, the distinctive sound of the '20' looks set to continue on LUL for some time to come.

'20' trip-cocks

London Underground's signalling system includes trip arms by signals. When the signal is at danger, the arm is raised. Should a train pass a signal at danger, the arm strikes its trip-cock, automatically applying the brakes.

All trains that use Underground metals require trip-cocks and the Class 20s are no exception. These are fitted to one side of the front axle of the leading bogie of each locomotive and are easily identified by a rectangular metal plate. This was painted yellow on some locomotives, while the DRS '20s' have just a yellow band painted on them. The plate had a hose and pipe arrangement behind, which led up the side of the bogie.

20096/107/901/905 had to lose their snowploughs in exchange for tripcocks. 20118/132 were reunited with their 'ploughs when were used by GBRf for snow clearing, but lost them again when they returned to S-Stock duties.

make 'Clash at North Ridge' featuring a crashed spacecraft with two aliens rushing to get to the goods on board.

"It wasn't easy to transport though, so the idea for 'Cato Pass' was born – my greatest sci-fi model to date. It has alien factions fighting on the surface, lots of interesting details, and spectators are invited to push buttons and play."

SATELLITE 'PACIFIC'

Locomotives such as *Executor*, *Cyclone*, *Tallern* and *Lion* have many outlandish shapes but look closer and you can start to pick out some familiar shapes. *Cyclone* may look like the offspring of Peppercorn 'A1' *Tornado* and a jet fighter because that's exactly what it is. Laurie has given his locomotives alien shapes using parts from plastic kits (predominantly Airfix fighter jets) or recycling the toys left behind by his now grown-up children.

"I sent a picture of *Cyclone* to the A1 Trust. The trust said it was fun but they had doubts about the loading gauge and will not be doing this anytime soon to the real *Tornado*!"

That rickety-looking high-level railway might make 'Cato Pass' look as though the mine railway from *Indiana Jones & the Temple of Doom* has gatecrashed Blofeld's hollowed-out volcano lair from *You Only Live Twice* but its ¼in balsawood struts are deceptively strong. Laurie has only once had a locomotive leave the track when a child tripped and fell into the layout, causing some disruption. Thankfully, because of the secure 9mm plywood box, constructed by Model Scenery Supplies, the locomotive wasn't damaged.

Despite the sci-fi outline, the technology is somewhat traditional. The layout is controlled from a Gaugemaster D 12V DC controller.

However, as Laurie explains, there is a neat twist:

"The two lines, the base level and the one on the raised bridge within the bunker are wired together but with opposing polarities so that as one locomotive moves one way, the other moves in the opposite direction."

BALLAST OFF

Building sci-fi trains is one thing. But how do you create a believable alien world? By, Laurie explains, thinking outside of the box.

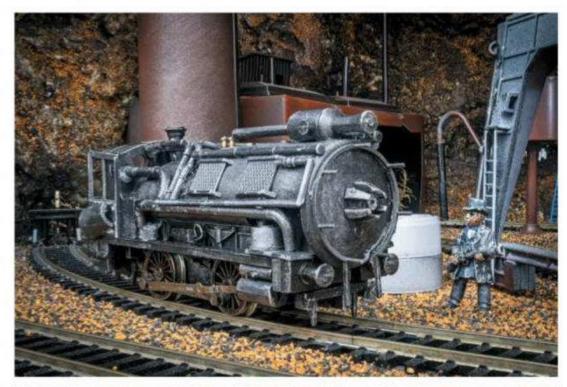
"The multi-coloured ballast was sourced from a reptile shop. Rather than the greys and browns that model shops have on offer, people cover the floors of their vivaria in a variety of different colours and I was able to source the orange gravel easily at the right size to look realistic for ballast. I used a plasma ball executive toy to create the effect of the power generator but for the base part I wanted something rounded. I found a suitable component in the form of a guinea pig home from a pet shop. Some poor guinea pig is homeless now!"

Thankfully, the vast interest in sci-fi/fantasy means that populating 'Cato Pass' has been easy. The invaders are Warhammer figures, helped by a restrained giant lizard (a Therizinosaurus from Schleich), while the defenders are steampunk figures from various sources.

The steampunk base was made from carved insulation foam, which gives a very rock-like finish. The centrepiece has to be, however, the rocket – which could work if Laurie wanted.

"If it was fitted with a black powder motor, it would fly. Not that I can launch it at exhibitions – it can reach 1,000ft and travels at 400mph!

"Getting the smoke effect to function well was difficult. At first this was done with a Seuthe smoke generator but it needed frequent refilling. After about a year I switched to an aroma diffuser, normally used to aerate rooms with smells. This uses water and lasts six hours. It produces a decent amount of steam, but then I have to deal with the problem of condensation, so I did a lot of testing to make sure this is done safely, especially near the electrics. It now runs without any problems."

'Terror Street'

It isn't just sci-fi that gets Laurie rocketing to the nearest model shop for supplies. He also enjoys the dark atmosphere of the night and the idea for 'Terror Street' came to the forefront of his mind while watching an episode of the TV show *Ripper Street*.

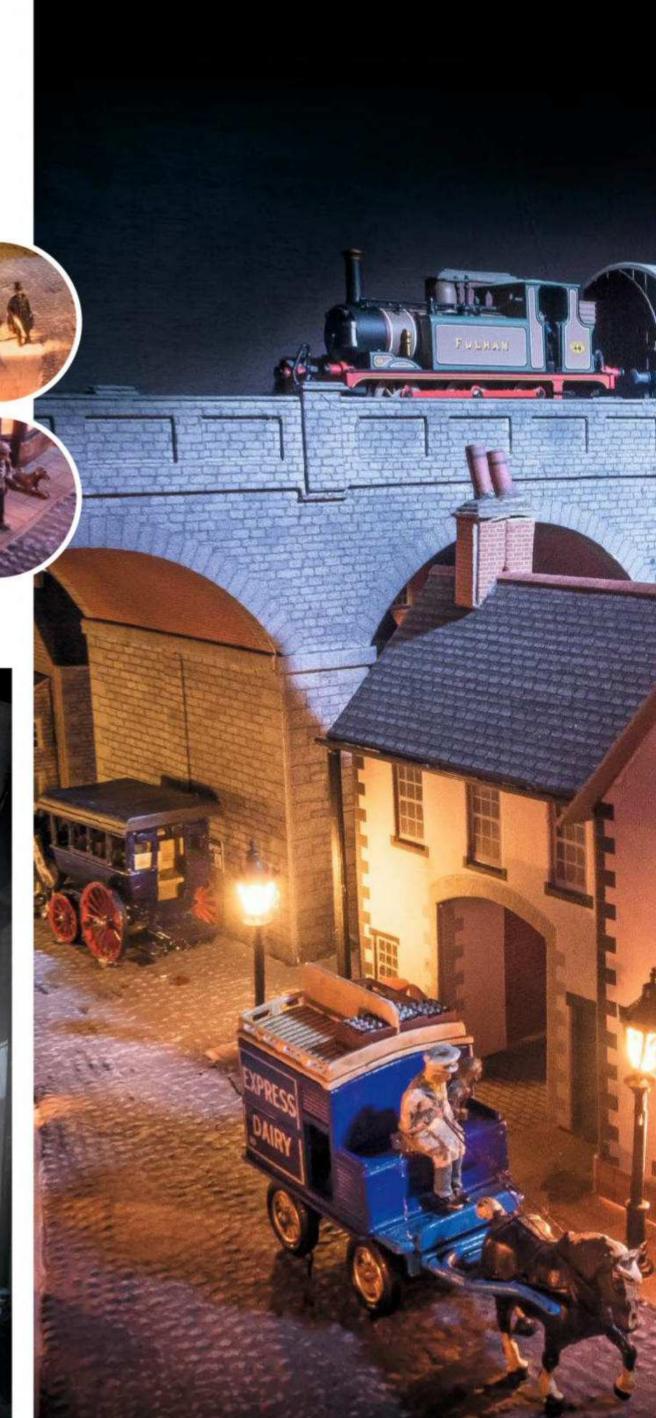
"The first episode of series 3 featured a train crash. I thought this basic theme would be interesting to model but rather than a crash with injured people, I wanted to show the emergency service workers doing their jobs. I also felt the model would have atmosphere, a dark and dingy feel, populated by scary people from fact and fiction. So the layout features a tiny Jack the Ripper, Sweeney Todd, Sherlock Holmes, and even, on occasion, tripods from *War of the Worlds*.

TERROR FIRMA

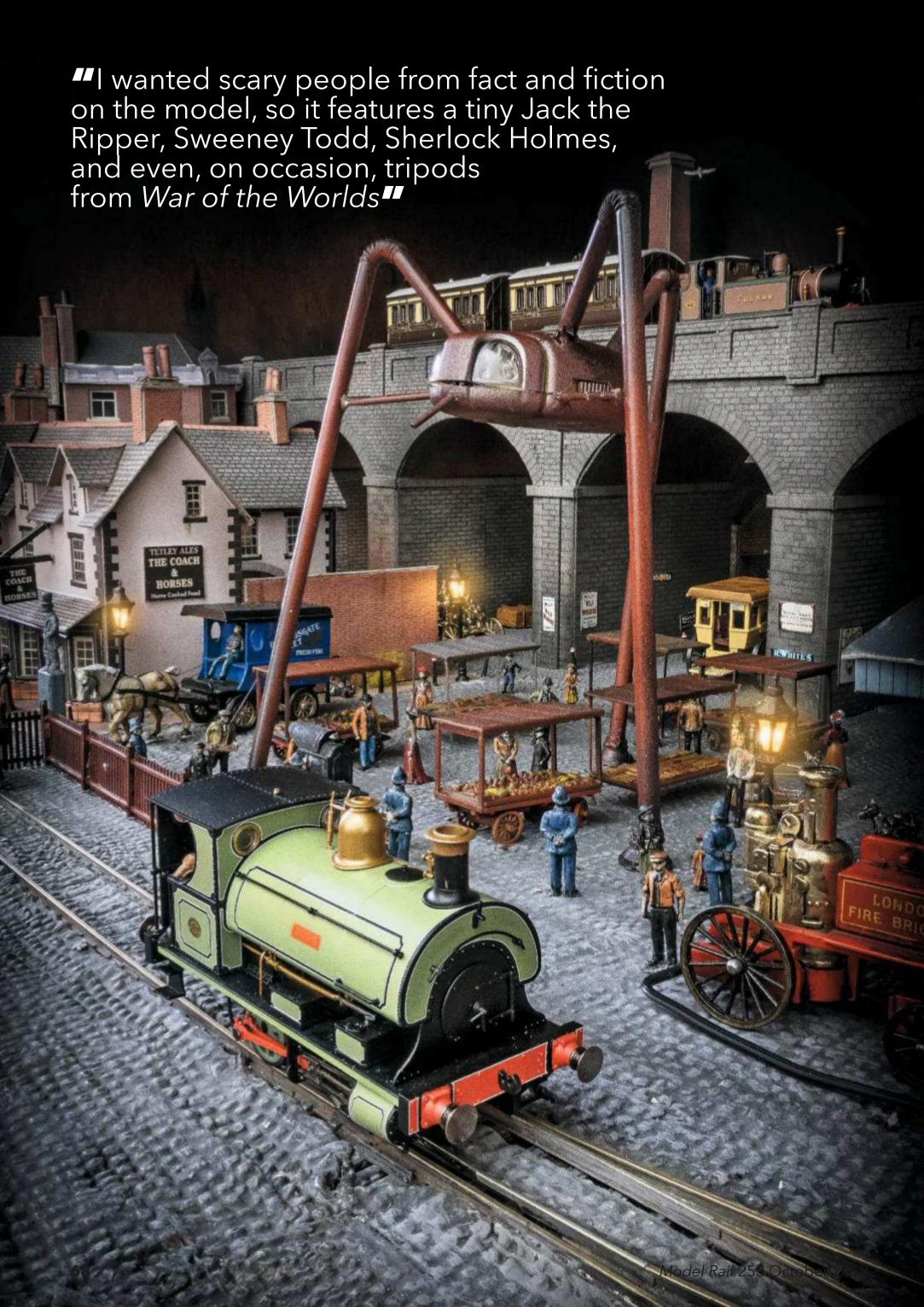
Set in Victorian London between
1888 and 1898, 'Terror Street' was
built slowly over a period of six
months, two nights a week, at
Romford MRS. It's a 5ft by 2ft
'OO' gauge diorama built with
Hornby sectional track and powered by
the trusty Gaugemaster Model D controller.

There are only three working locomotives on 'Terror Street' alongside the crashed Dapol

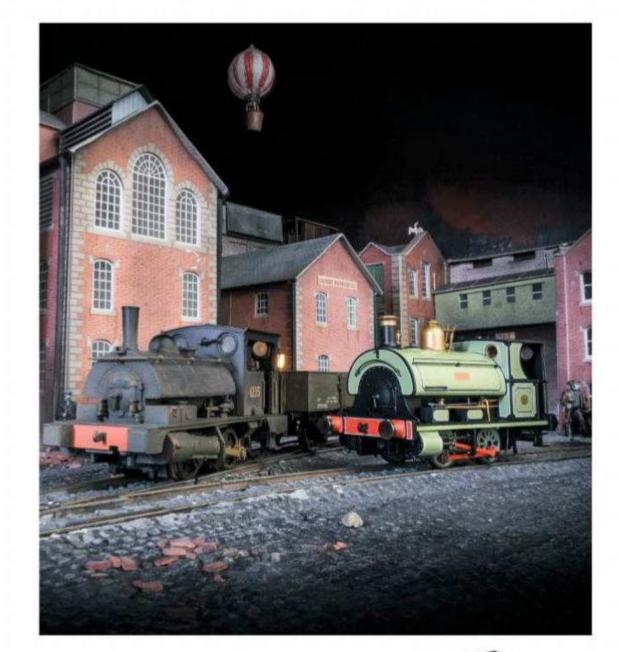
LYR 'Pug' kit. The street level tracks are home to two Hornby 0-4-0STs, an LYR 'Pug' and a new Peckett 'W4'. On the viaduct, a Hornby 'Terrier' shuttles back and forth, again using a Gaugemaster shuttle unit.

"Unlike 'Cato Pass', I made the surrounding box myself from 6mm plywood with an angled roof to allow me to fit all the lights into the diorama. The lack of space made this the most difficult part of the build, but the tedium has proven to be well worth it as it creates so much atmosphere. "I wanted a dark model on which you could almost smell the terror, and a big dramatic puff of smoke in the middle around the train accident in the brewery. This is the focalpoint of the whole diorama. The story is that Mr Hyde was blocking the line and caused the train to derail. I use a disco smoke machine to create the vapours around it, but it gets very hot when in operation.

SINISTER SILHOUETTES

"Classic buildings from the London skyline form the backscene, printed in black and cut out in paper. I then tacked these on to the black sky, and used a can of red primer to give a glow effect, as if the sun is setting. All of the 'evil' goings-on occur at night so this helps add to the atmosphere for the diorama.

"Being a Victorian layout the streets are cobblestone and I needed a fast way to produce them as I had eight square feet to cover. I made an inverse cobble-shaped press out of FIMO clay and pressed this into air-drying DAS clay. The two did not stick to each other, and the DAS dried over a couple of nights. I could then paint it, and dry-brush cobble highlights into them. This worked well for a fast effect and

'Piddlewick Yard' and 'Dunmovin Mine' are more 'conventional' layouts, even though there are one or two classic Laurie cameo scenes. Originally, both layouts were combined with a third to form a modular layout. However, that third member has since been removed, leaving these two scenes to combine into one 6ft by 4ft exhibition layout.

'Dunmovin Mine' is an abandoned Texan gold mine, while 'Piddlewick Yard' is set at an unspecified English location. Since the photographs for this article were taken, Laurie has separated the two layouts as he says they didn't work together.

"I tried to exhibit them once, but unless I set it up jutting into the aisle the audience could only see one side anyway. I used to use the non-showing side as the fiddleyard, but this didn't work very well either so I took the decision to separate them.

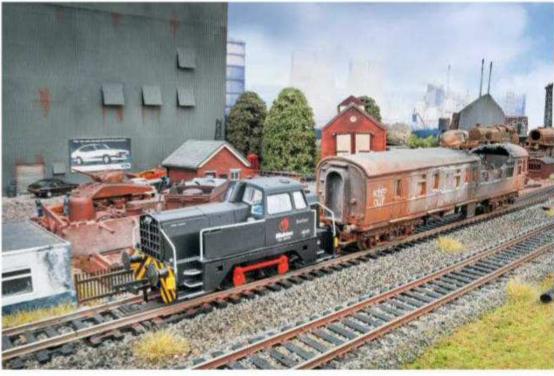
"The layout only took me a week to build. Once the baseboard was built [6mm ply on 2in by 1in frames], the tracklaying was very quick. They layout is quite flat so I didn't have to wait for a lot of scenery to dry before moving on."

SCRAPYARD CHALLENGE

Brian Bassington's model of 'Columbia Wharf' ship breakers yard in Essex inspired Laurie to model a scrapyard. He decided to go with a railway scrapyard as it enabled him to devise inventive ways of depicting decomposing steam locomotives.

"One technique is to apply paint and sprinkle on salt, which partially dissolves, but then also leaves a raised effect as though things are turning rusty," he says. "I also dry-brush on streaks. Sometimes I use weathering powders and then seal them in with matt varnish. Just make sure you cover clear plastic windows or the matt varnish will cloud them over. Also you can cut away for sharp edges, or melt away holes into the models for softer edges, and for that I use an old soldering iron bit. You have to be careful of the

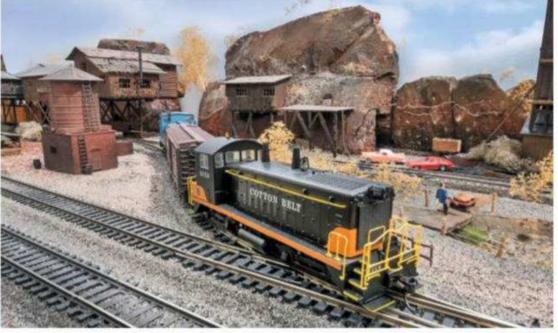

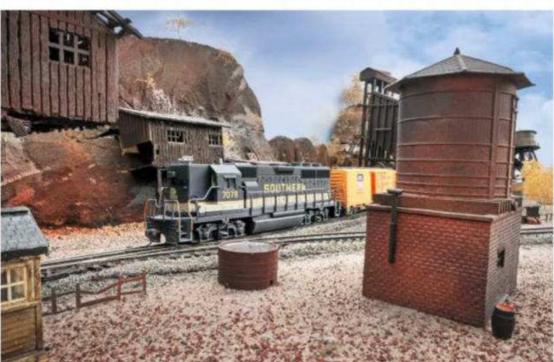
fumes but it is great fun."

WHAT'S THE BEST PAINT FOR FLESH?

What colour do you recommend for the flesh tone on 4mm scale figures? I found a paint aimed at war gamers called 'Barbarian Flesh' but I'm not convinced that this is suitable for footplate crews!

Chris Thomson, by e-mail

George says: When painting the flesh on figures of any scale, my preference is for LifeColor acrylics. The Italian paint brand offers a range of flesh tones in individual jars. However, six of the best shades are collected together into a comprehensive 'Flesh Paint' pack.

Humans come in all different colours and shades, yet this six-pack provides a wide palette of tones to cater for just about all hues. Furthermore, they can be inter-mixed to add lifelike shading and highlights, which is especially useful for 4mm and, particularly, 7mm scale (and larger) figures.

The quality of the paints is high and, being acrylic, cleaning up and thinning is simply achieved with water. They dry quickly too.

For best results, treat the figures to a light but even coat of white primer (preferably from an aerosol). When this is dry, I always start with the areas of skin, applying a neutral base layer. Depending on how pale or dark the figure's skin is intended to be, this base layer can be adjusted either by choosing one of the six paint shades or inter-mixing a few until the required colour is achieved. Two coats may be needed and, once the surface is dry, darker shading can be





added around the nose, eyes, ears and under the chin - anywhere where natural shading will occur.

Finally, using a lighter shade, highlights can be picked out, such as the cheek bones, nose, chin and forehead. With the flesh taken care of, we can then add the hair, eyebrows, beards and then turn our attention to the clothes.

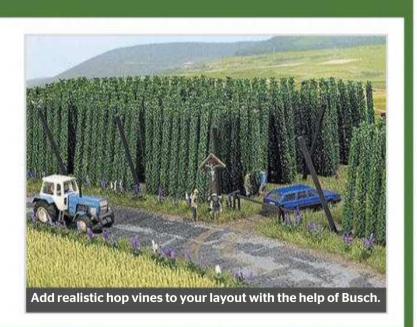


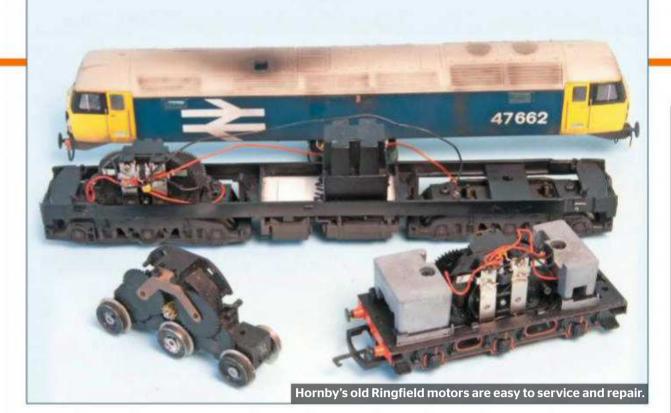

SIMPLE RINGFIELD SERVICING TIPS

I'm a newcomer to model railways and have been buying older, second-hand diesels from Hornby and Lima to get myself

started. Some of the Hornby motors have limited power, while others are getting hot, or squealing. What can I do? Brandon Walker, by e-mail

George says: Like many modellers of a certain age, I grew up with Hornby Ringfield and Lima 'pancake' motors. Indeed, a good deal of my modelling time was spent tinkering with these power units in the vain hope that their performance would improve.

It pays to be discerning when buying older Hornby diesels and electrics. While older mechanisms could be very temperamental, the motors employed by Hornby from the late 1990s were much better, especially those featuring a five-pole motor and power collection from most, or all, of the wheels. These models ran more smoothly, especially at lower speeds and were marginally less prone to stalling on point frogs.

These later Ringfield motors can be found as complete spares and they're easily swapped into older chassis, as the mounting method was exactly the same.

A while back, I replaced all of the mechanisms in my 'heritage' fleet of 1980s-era Hornby Class 47s for later, upgraded motors and trailing bogies (with extra power collection), obtained relatively cheaply from

Hornby spares dealers or at exhibitions.

Despite this costing around £30 per locomotive, I deemed it worthwhile to keep some of my old favourites on the rails.

Most faults with older Ringfield motors, including a loss of power, can be traced to the circular magnet or armature windings, both of which can degrade over time. Replacing the armature is only possible after first removing the drive shaft gear wheel, which is pressed onto its axle by a special tool, thus making DIY repairs difficult.

Dirt and contaminated oil on the gear wheels can cause the motors to run hot, as the extra friction forces the motor to work harder. Cleaning these gears is a simple job, made easier by removing the copper retaining plate. The gears can then be lifted away and cleaned more effectively away from the motor.

A mild alcohol-based degreasing fluid is recommended, as offered by Labelle. Allow them to dry out before refitting, and be sure to lubricate them sparingly but evenly, including the main drive shaft gear. Always use oil that's designed specifically for use with miniature models, such as Labelle 108 (for the plastic gears) and Hob-e-Lube Gear Oil (for the drive shaft).

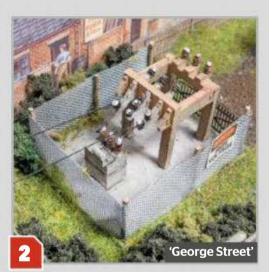
As for the squealing sound, this is also often caused by the gears and their bearings being dirty or covered in life-expired oil. It may also be that the gears have been over-lubricated. Either way, removing the gears, then cleaning and re-oiling them should cure the problem.



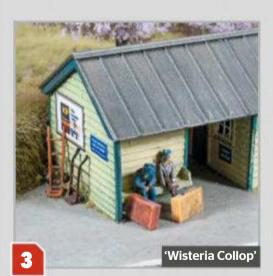
THREE CAMEO IDEAS FOR YOUR LAYOUT...

Technique of the month

Strip paint from plastic models



What's the safest paint stripper for use on delicate plastic models?

J. Piper, by e-mail

George says: The gentlest formula that I'm aware of is Strip Magic, from Deluxe Materials. It's highly effective on acrylic and enamel paints. The action of the stripper can be halted at any time simply by washing the fluid away. In this way, we can tailor how much paint is removed - either just the outer layer or the whole lot. I've had no issues when using it on all sorts of plastics and it doesn't destroy glued bonds like most other paint strippers.



Decant a small amount of the fluid into a pot and, working on one side of the wagon at a time, brush a thick layer of the Strip Magic over the surface, using an old flat brush.



Set aside the model until the paint begins to blister. Stippling the surface with a fresh coat of Strip Magic will loosen the paint. Be sure to wear gloves when using any paint stripping fluids.



Scrub the model with an old toothbrush to remove the loose paint. After treating the other side and ends, the model should be rinsed thoroughly in water.

PROTOTYPE FOCUS

YEOMAN JHA AGGREGATE HOPPER

Foster Yeoman, once one of Britain's largest quarrying companies, spent the 1970s and 1980s searching for improvements in traction and rolling stock performance.

New, privately owned, four-wheel air-braked aggregate hoppers were introduced initially as a means of increasing load capacity and reliability.

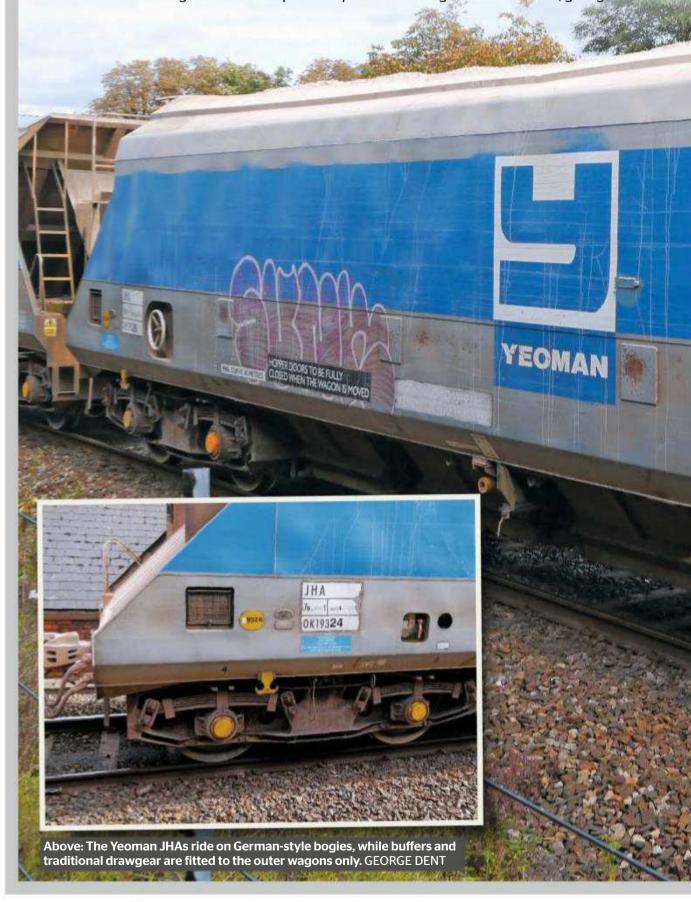
Further developments meant a fleet of former iron ore bogie tipplers being hired in, followed by other, similar box-type open wagons. However, the lack of bottom discharge doors meant that unloading could be a time-consuming business.

Therefore, a fleet of new high-capacity hoppers was eventually sourced, but these aluminium-bodied wagons were not up to

the demands of intensive aggregate flows, lasting only six years in service.

A more rugged design was deemed essential, with Yeoman turning to German wagon builders Orenstein & Koppel for a 100-strong fleet of 102t hoppers. Designated the TOPS code of JHA, the wagons entered traffic between 1989-1990 and were designed primarily for use with Yeoman's new Class 59 locomotives on flows of stone from Merehead and Whatley quarries, in Somerset, to various terminals in the south-east.

Each hopper has a load capacity of 78t, with three bottom discharge doors between the bogies. German-style, plated-front bogies were installed, giving



the wagons a smooth ride with reduced impact on the permanent way. Access ladders and platforms are provided at each end of the hopper and buckeye-type couplings were installed to all but the outer wagons at each end of a semi-fixed rake, these sporting traditional buffers and drawgear.

The Yeoman JHA hoppers have proved highly successful and remain in traffic today. In 2006, Foster Yeoman was acquired by the Swiss Holcim group and is now part of its Aggregates Industries subsidiary.

Although the Yeoman livery is still carried, the wagons are now operated

by Mendip Rail, which is a joint venture with Hanson.

MODEL OPTIONS

For 'N' gauge modellers, a few kits have appeared in the past but they appear to be no longer available. However, a 3D-printed bodyshell is being offered by RAIL 3D Prints, available via Shapeways.

In 'OO', various kits of the JHA hopper have also been available, under the Inter-City Models and S-Kits brands, although these too seem to be out of production. However, Dapol said it will produce a ready-to-run model and this is due for release towards the end of this year.





WEATHERING LOCOMOTIVES WITH OIL PAINTS

l've seen tubes of oil paints employed by military modellers for creating weathering effects. Is it possible to use them on trains?

Oliver Hall, by e-mail

George says: Many types of paint can be harnessed for weathering work, with different formulas offering a variety of benefits. Artists' oil paints provide a variety of suitable earthy tones and good quality versions boast long shelf-lives and slow drying times - which can be both a good and a bad thing!

Slow-drying paints allow for greater flexibility, in terms of manipulation after application, as well as greater ease of removal if the results are not satisfactory. The paints also stay usable for longer, when decanted onto a mixing palette, hence why they've been popular with artists for centuries.

Personally, I prefer using oil paints aimed specifically at modellers as drying times are more appropriate for our needs (hours rather than days).

Furthermore, it's easier to choose appropriate shades, as they're formulated with weathering in mind. Oils from Abteilung and AK Interactive are my favourites.

Choosing the right thinners is important. White spirit or turpentine can be used, but much depends on the quality of these solvents. Instead, I tend to use Abteilung's Fast Dry and Matt Effect thinners (pictured below). Their intended use is self-evident and they dry cleanly, without leaving any unpleasant oily residues. They're also completely safe for use on plastic models and painted finishes.

When using oils, a little paint goes a long way. They can be applied in various ways, either thinning them in a mixing jar and applying like a regular paint or thin weathering wash or, as shown here, in a slightly unorthodox manner. As well as employing the more obvious 'dirty' brown tones, adding light and medium grey shades creates a faded effect, for a more lived-in appearance.

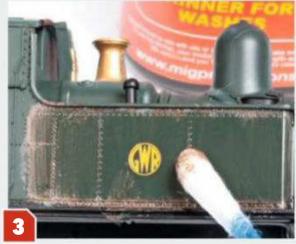




On a small area, place a little of each paint into key areas of the model. Grey shades in the centre of panels will create highlights, while brown and darker colours around the edges will inject shading and trapped dirt.



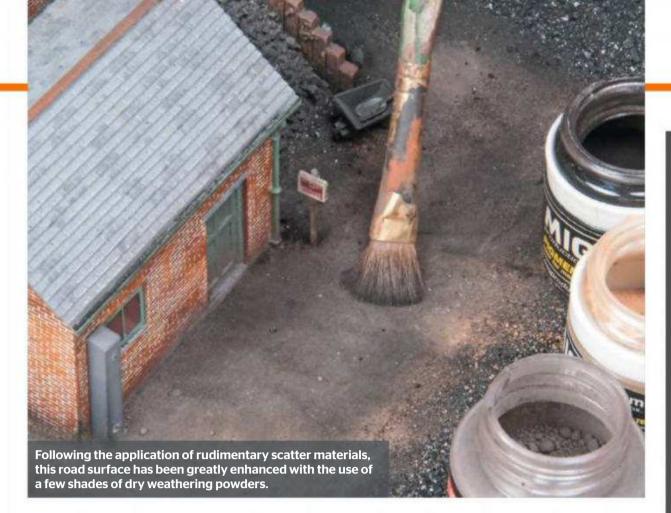
Dip a flat brush into an appropriate thinner and run in vertical strokes over the oil paints. This creates an interesting array of streaking effects. Go easy on the thinners to avoid flooding the surface.



With cotton swabs, wipe away the excess paint and thinners, again using vertical strokes to mimic the actions of gravity. Leave some of the 'dirty' shades around rivet heads and within any recesses.



Allow the surface to dry for a few minutes before deciding whether to remove more of the paints (with a little extra thinners), or to repeat the exercise if the model looks too clean. When happy, move on to the next area.



HOW TO CREATE DUSTY ROAD SURFACES



I want to create a dusty surface on my layout's roads, especially in the freight yard, but am struggling to achieve good

results with scatter materials. Geoff Carling, by e-mail

George says: Many scatter materials sold as suitable for use on road surfaces produce a coarse effect rather than a fine, dusty aspect. Furthermore, unless a few layers are built up, patches of bare adhesive can show through, creating slightly shiny patches here and there.

A simple solution is to apply scatter materials over the road surface, having spread out a thin film of adhesive, such as PVA or, preferably, Scatter Grip from Deluxe Materials, which remains tacky even when dry.

Once the glue has set, remove any loose material before the surface can be treated with a variety of weathering powders. Choose two or three shades to suit your location. For instance, a road through a coal yard is likely

to carry darker staining than one within a cement terminal.

Apply the powders in a number of light layers, using a soft-bristled, dry, flat brush. The powders will adhere readily to the gritty scatter material and darker, more concentrated shades can be worked into certain areas, especially around the base of buildings and structures.

Indeed, a great feature of this method is the ability to blend walls and fences seamlessly into the overall picture, simply by working the powders up against these structures. Any excess powder can be brushed or vacuumed away. If you're unhappy with the results, use a clean, stiff brush to remove most of the powder and try again.

It shouldn't be necessary to seal the powders, unless heavy deposits have been purposely applied for specific effects. In that case, a light misting with matt varnish, from an aerosol or airbrush, will do the trick. Pigment fixatives are also available and these can be airbrushed without need for thinning, or applied by brush, eye-dropper or syringe.



Tool of the month

Handrail wire bending jigs

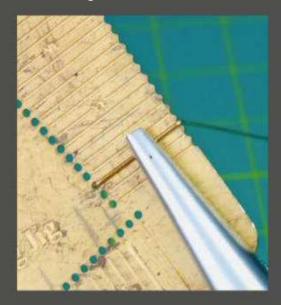
When detailing locomotives and rolling stock, it's often necessary to fashion several wire handrails of identical lengths. The most effective way of ensuring

consistency is to use some form of bending jig, such as these simple little devices

from the Bill Bedford range. Available in two

sizes, for both 4mm and 7mm scales, the etched brass jigs feature a range of small holes, set at incremental lengths from the outer faces. Each hole has a matching, half-etched guide recess as well as a rebate in the edge of the brass to help guide the handrail wire.

Straight brass wire is simply pushed through the desired hole and, with the aid of a pair of miniature pliers, the wire is folded over to form the desired angle.



The wire is then pressed into the recess (as seen above) and the other end is formed over the edge of the jig, using finger pressure or a set of pliers. The result is perfectly shaped and sized wire profiles, the tail ends of which can be trimmed to the required length with a set of sharp snips.

Fabricating handrails and other similar fittings becomes so much easier and far less laborious. A useful tip is to use a fine marker pen to identify the hole currently in use, to ensure that multiple handrails are shaped to the same length.

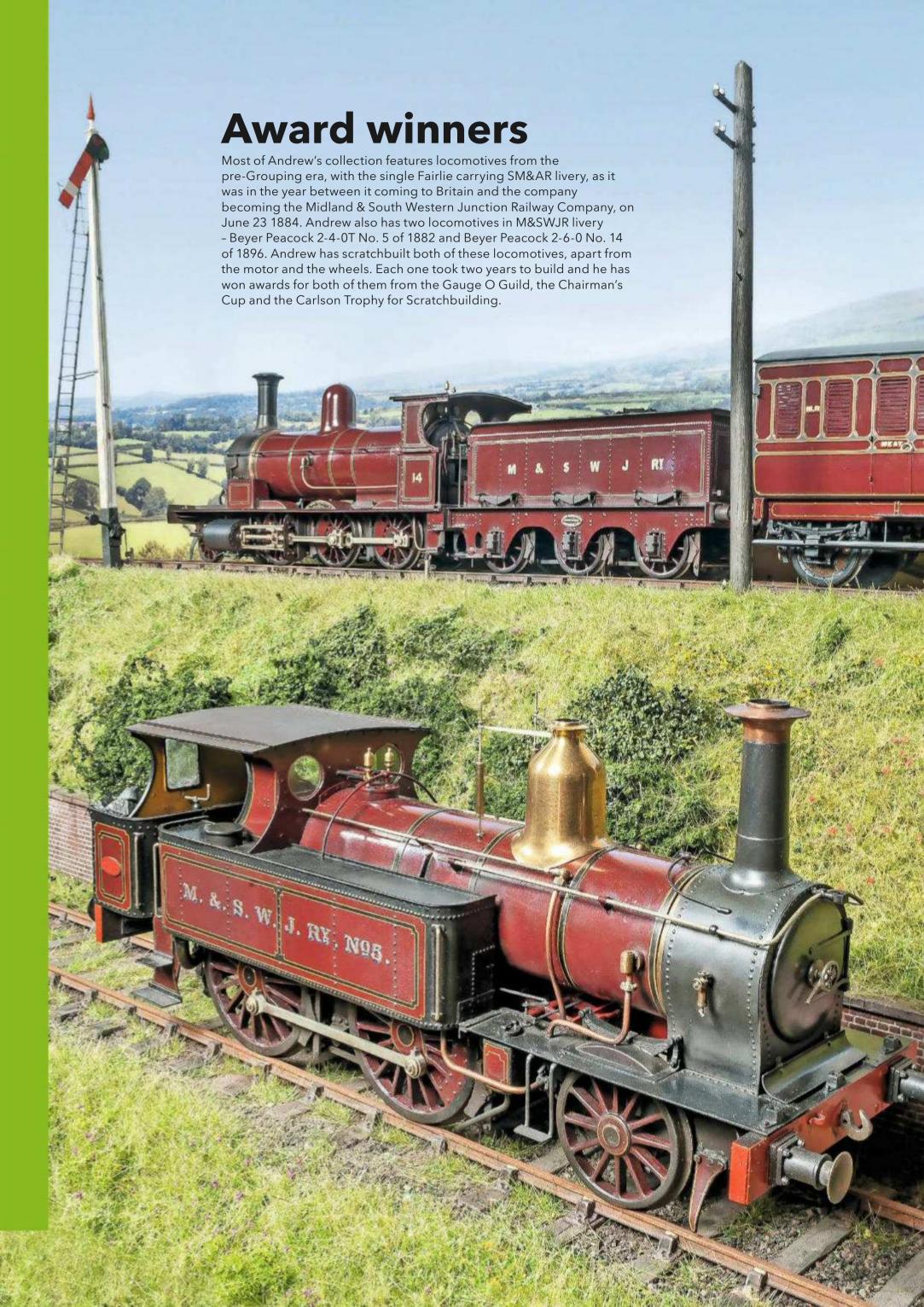

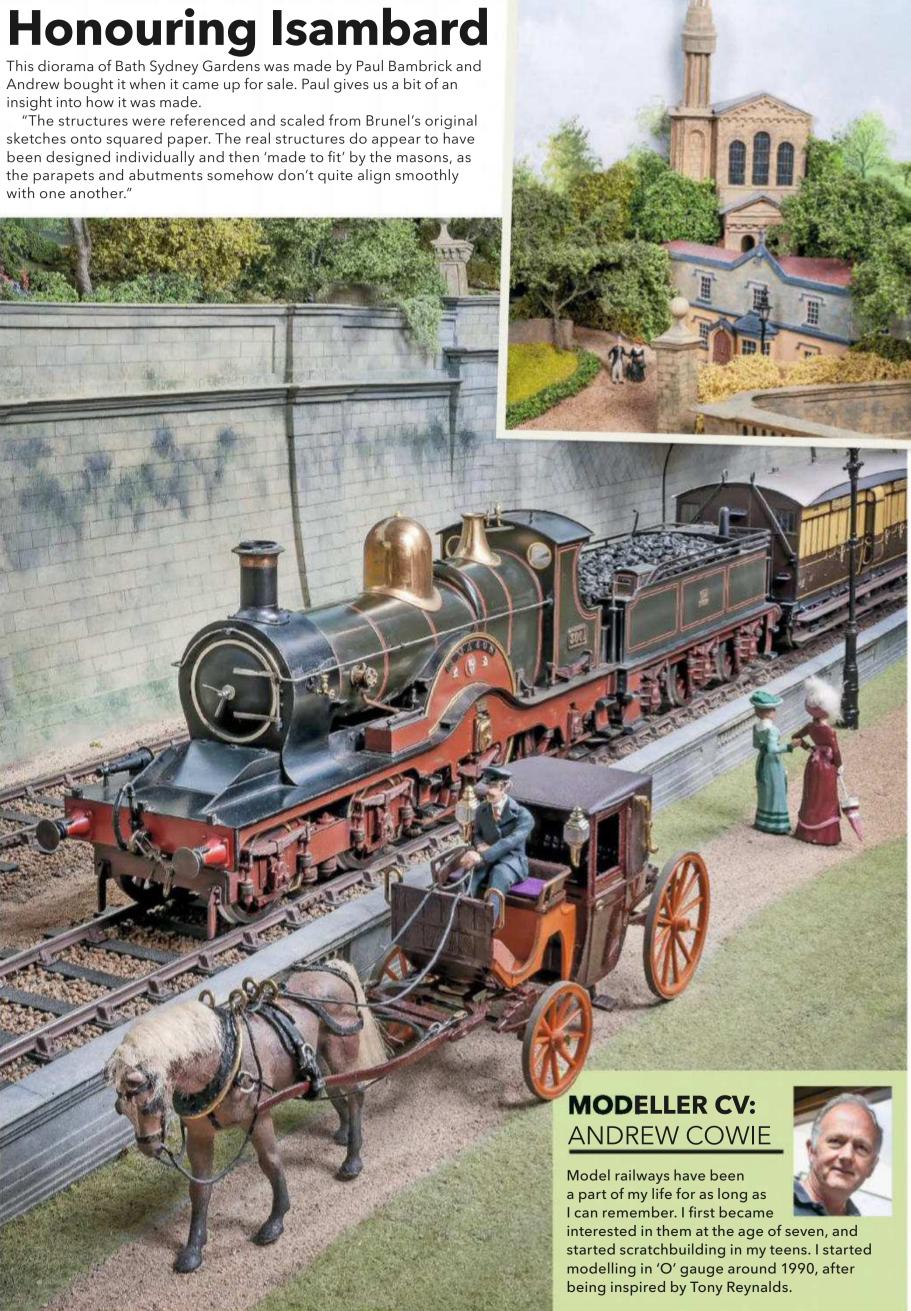

Masterplan Caledonian Sleeper

Track plans to get you thinking in three dimensions

SLEPING beauty

One of the most interesting services on the network, the depots that serve the Caledonian Sleeper are a modeller's dream, says **Paul A. Lunn**.

annoch Moor: is there any finer view to wake up to, with endless miles of rugged heather,

beautiful lochs and the vista of distant mountains? The two shiny rails of the West Highland Railway, floating across the peat bog on a bed of rushes and turf, are the only signs of civilisation.

It's a breathtaking place at the best of times, but to see it at daybreak is something else. That glorious vista starts just the other side of your hotel window, close enough that you feel that you could just reach out and touch it. What's even better is that the view from your hotel window is constantly changing – and that your hotel is being powered by two classic Southern Region electro-diesels!

The Caledonian Sleeper is unique for many reasons. Firstly, unless you fancy camping, it's the only way you can see Rannoch Moor at such a magical time in the morning. Secondly, it's Britain's only dedicated sleeper franchise (the Anglo-Scottish sleeper service was split from previous operator ScotRail in 2015). And lastly, the four sleeper services that ply the West Coast Main Line every night are Britain's longest passenger trains, comprising 16 bogie coaches.

The sleeper services brought some welcome variation to a predominantly multiple unit-worked railway when under ScotRail. But new operator Serco and its traction provider GBRf have combined to make the Caledonian Sleeper arguably the most interesting operation on today's railway.

It's the juxtaposition of old and new that makes studying or modelling the 'Caley Sleeper'

such a mouth-watering proposition. It uses
Britain's newest electric locomotives (Class 92s)
and Britain's newest hauled coaching stock (the
Mk 5s, which are so new that they're still being
tested). But GBRf has also brought classic diesel
and electric traction back into frontline passenger
service. Class 86s and 87s work empty stock in and
out of Euston, and a Class 47 hauls empty stock
from Glasgow Central to Polmadie

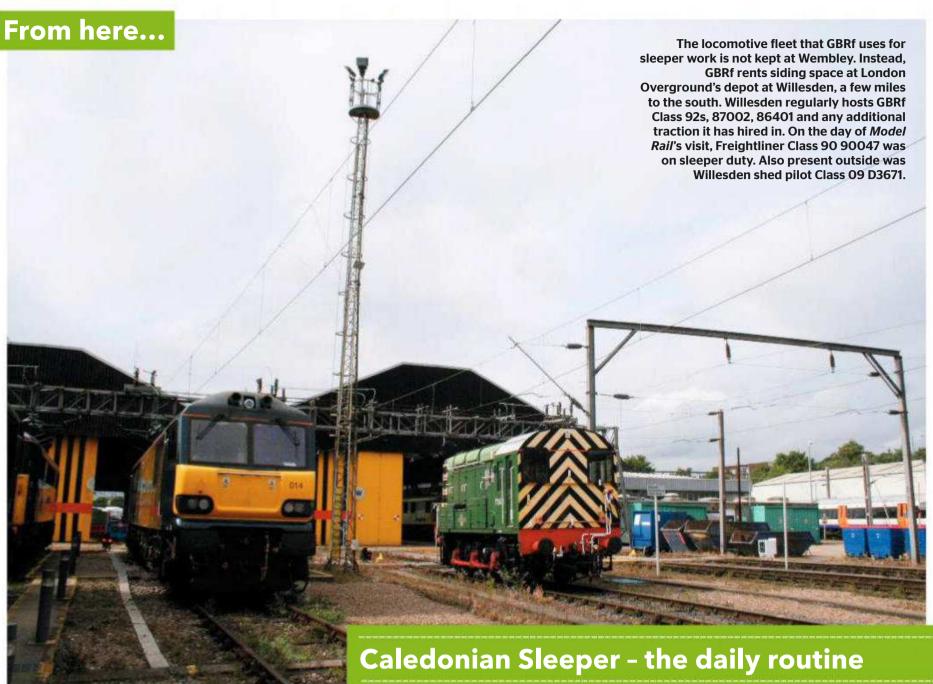
depot. And, to top it all off,
Class 73s – completely
re-engineered, by the way
– are in everyday use in
Scotland, hundreds of miles
away from their former
Southern Region haunts.
The problem for modellers is

that you need a lot of space to do Scottish scenery justice, even if you model in 'N'.
But the sleeper's journey

starts in the West London suburbs, about as far removed from the tranquillity of the Scottish Highlands as it's possible to be.

Alstom's Wembley Traincare facility is the nerve centre for the English end of the Caledonian Sleeper. It's here, in the shadow of Wembley stadium and surrounded by Virgin's 'Pendolinos' and London Underground trains, that the sleeper's Mk 2 and Mk 3

coaches are serviced. The urban background lends itself to building a small layout, but without compromising on the Caledonian Sleeper's fascinating operation.



...to here

It's easier to start our whistlestop tour of the Caledonian Sleeper at London Euston, where, during the week, there are two northbound departures per night. The 'Highlander' leaves Euston at 2000 for Edinburgh. Here, it splits into three portions to serve three destinations (with key stops *en route*): Fort William, Inverness and Aberdeen

The mid-week 'Lowlander' departs Euston at 2200. This train divides at Carstairs Junction; one portion goes to Glasgow (via Motherwell) and the other continues to Edinburgh. Southbound departures work in reverse. That's a lot of trains to keep on top of! Alstom's Wembley depot is the nerve centre at the London end and has to service two sets of sleeper stock per day. Its sister depot, Glasgow Polmadie (also an Alstom facility) services the 'Lowlander set but this effectively becomes two separate trains. The Edinburgh portion runs empty to Polmadie for servicing and then returns empty to Waverley in time for the evening departure.

Inverness and Aberdeen Clayhills depots service their respective portions, while the Fort William portion is serviced in the platforms.

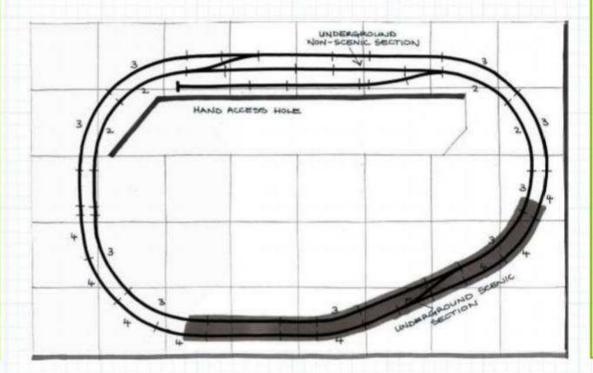


Depot delight

Although the arch of Wembley stadium does catch the eye, it's the view over the London Underground depot that dominates the view from Wembley Traincare depot. This layout design combines both Wembley and Willesden depots, along with a short section of Underground to form a pleasing composite design

in a modest 8ft by 5ft 6in space.

The layout makes good use of my old friend, the Peco Loco Lift. The hidden coaching stock curve in the carriage shed allows for a more prototypical sleeper train length. However, it's worth bearing in mind that there's nowhere to run a scalelength sleeper train at speed.

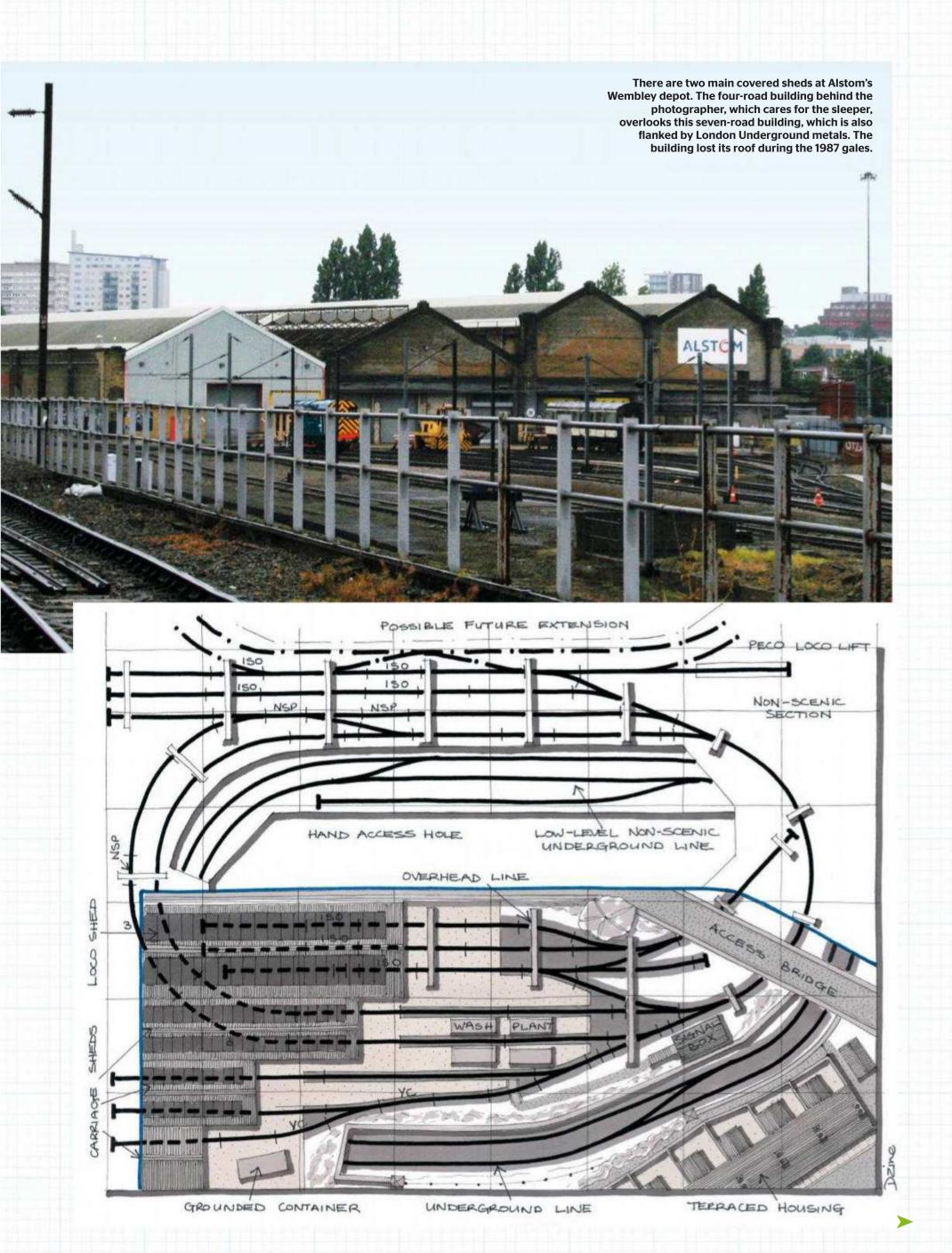

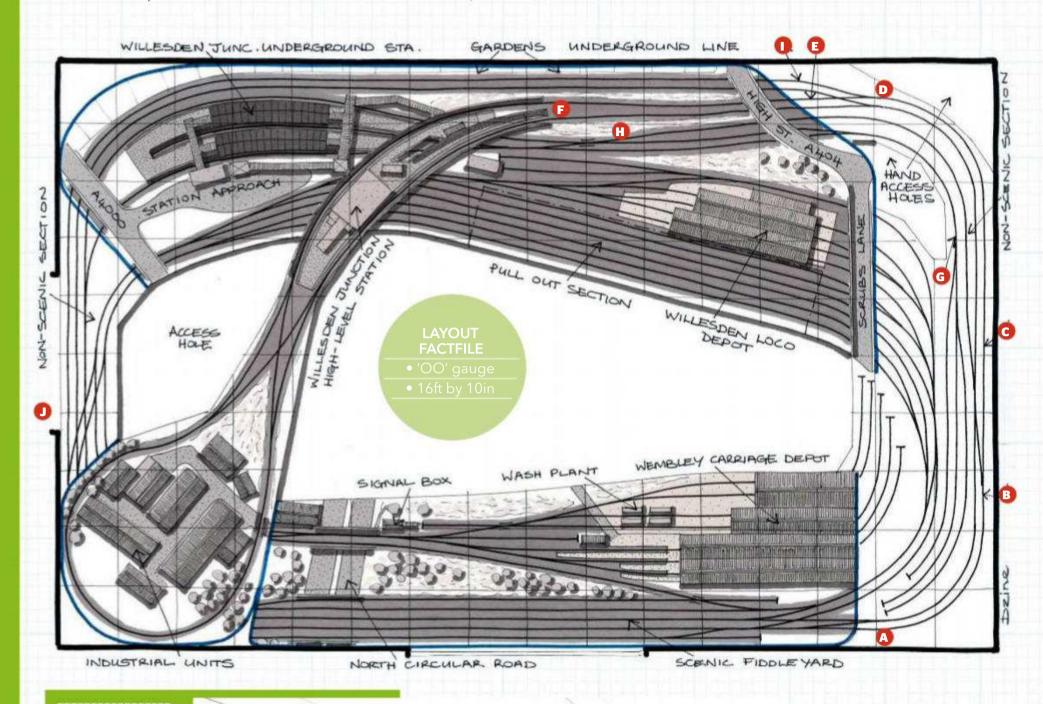

North London

My first plan merged
Wembley and
Willesden depots together but, as any student of the north west
London suburbs will know, there's quite a distance between the two. It's possible to model this distance if you have space for

this 16ft by 10ft 'OO' gauge room-filler.

It includes all key prototype features, including a substantial Underground section and Willesden Junction station, plus the high-level platforms that serve London Overground. As a multi-level layout, it may require DCCconcepts' PowerBase to assist on inclines, depending on train length.

Gradients A to B, C to D and E to F all rise upwards, with G to H and I to J on a falling grade. I suspect that, with the exception of I to J, most grades will be 1-in-40 and I recommend testing clearances when building such arrangements.

This layout can be operated end-to-end or round and round. It includes a visible, scenically treated fiddleyard.

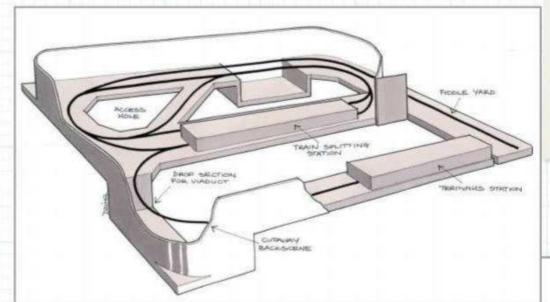

>>> OPERATIONAL DESIGN

In contrast to my usual method of layout design, the following two examples focus primarily on operation. They have been led by route direction and the splitting of Caledonian Sleeper trains for onward travel to more than one location. As such, there's always a chance that realistic scenic appearance might be compromised, particularly near helices, return loops or where two sections of main line run close together.

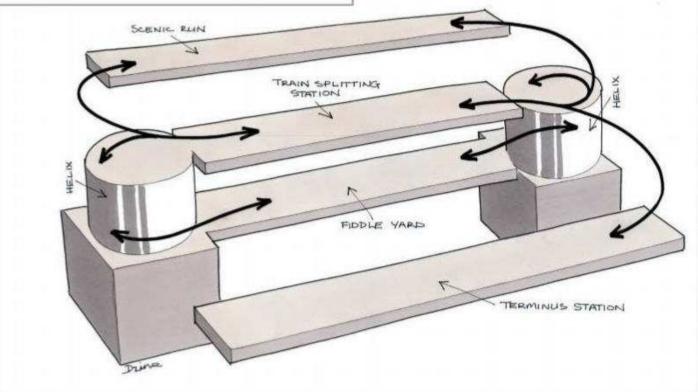




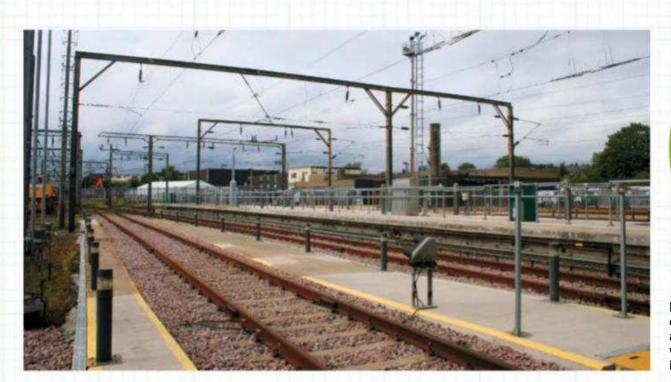
Above: Outside the sleeper depot, looking south. Eagle-eyed readers may be able to spot one of the AC Locomotive Group's two Class 86s, used to haul empty stock between Euston station and Wembley.

Above: This large, dual-level 'OO' gauge layout includes flexible directional travel and has two helices for accessing the low-level fiddleyard at each end. It includes at least two major rural scenic sections in order to model some Scottish scenery.

There are a couple of issues with using helices. There's a possible lack of prototypical appearance, they can take up too much space, and they compromise scenic opportunity. But I think with careful use of physical and scenic arrangements, you could disguise them in order to maximise operational potential.



Above: This large 'OO' gauge is on a single level and offers more potential for modelling Scottish scenery, as I've managed to include a drop section for a viaduct. It's arguably more prototypical than having helices, but it might lack realism in and around the return curve junctions and at the station by-pass lines.

an it really be January when we reviewed Kernow Model Rail Centre's Bulleid diesel 1Co-Co1? Our review praised the model's good looks, attention to detail, performance and finish.

The Southern Region built three diesels to Oliver Bulleid's designs. 10201 and 10202 were built in 1951 and the model that we reviewed in MR243 was based on 10201.

10203 was built at Brighton works in 1954. It looked like the first two but it was three tons lighter and, more importantly, its English Electric engine boasted 2,000hp. There were detail differences between 10203 and its older sisters. They were subtle but required Kernow to tool another body.

10203 has now arrived and, at first glance, it's every bit as good as 10201/202. We received 10203 in BR lined green with

'ferret and dartboard' emblem on the side (now sold out). And yes, 10203 did receive that primrose yellow roof it just didn't stay that colour for very long.

Everything that was good about the initial models has been carried over to the new version. There's lots of fine, separately fitted detail, including the flat section handrails. You can see a representation of the engine through the bodyside windows.

The body shape looks right from every angle. The 'face' looks good too, and one of the key differences is that 10203 was not built with any form of nose gangway door. Moving down the bodyside, 10203 sports full-length side grilles fore and aft of the side window, whereas 10201/202 had half-grilles. 10203, as it wears BR green, has the angled gutter strip over side grilles at the

No. 2 end that all three Bulleid diesels later received.

Close-up photographs of these machines are comparatively rare but photographs in Modern Locomotives Illustrated No. 185 and Brian Haresnape's Bulleid Locomotives suggests that, by the time 10203 received BR green, there was some kind of beading around some of the side grilles and that they had a slightly more curved profile than Kernow's model. Even checking online photographic sources, it's difficult to confirm these possible discrepancies.

There is one minor shape issue that brings 10203's rating below that of 10201. The two roof vents at the No. 2 end sit either side of the horn. Photographic evidence suggests that this arrangement was at the No. 1 end only. At the No. 2 end, one vent is behind the horn.

PERFECT PERFORMANCE

Performance was excellent.
10203 was smooth and quiet straight from the box and romped away with 13 coaches.
10203 has the same 'floating' arrangement as 10201 - the three powered axles are held by an inner bogie within the frames to allow lateral and vertical movement. The leading axle acts as per the prototype.

The long bogies struggled a little with some tight curves and points. However, there was so much power on tap that 10203 tops the haulage charts on our 1-in-30 gradient - it made light work of the climb, hauling 13 Hornby and Bachmann bogie coaches.

The livery is impressively rendered. The green has a pleasing finish and the numbers and '7' power classification look good, especially as they're partially obscured by the handrails.

There are a couple of issues on our sample: the line between primrose and body colour is very fuzzy in places and there are a couple of areas where the primrose lacks full opacity. Our sample also

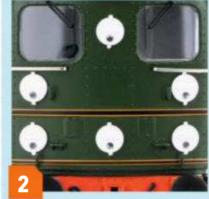
suffered from the lining, well, not lining up in all the corners.
10203 is almost identical to the sample of 10201 reviewed back in January.
Minor niggles aside, it's worth repeating the closing sentence

from that review because it's just as true now as it was earlier in the year: "KMRC should be commended... for producing a model that is a fitting tribute to Bulleid's ground-breaking design". (RF)

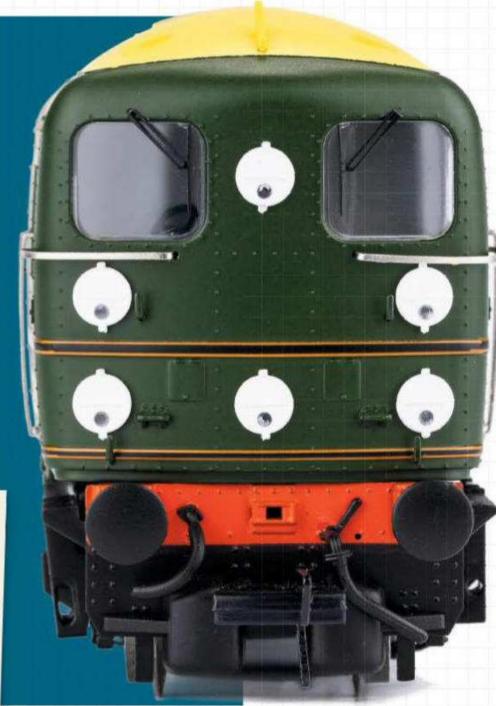
Factfile: 10203

H.A.V. Bulleid's book Bulleid of the Southern is recommended for the full story of how the Southern Railway's chief mechanical engineer arrived at the idea of building three diesel-electrics. What is often forgotten is that they were designed before H.G. Ivatt's Co-Cos for the LMS. However, Bulleid's locomotives were not authorised until afterwards.

10201/202 were built at Ashford in 1950/1951. They were powered by 1,750hp versions of LMS 10000/10001's English Electric 1,600hp engines. 10203, built at Brighton in 1953/54, sported a 2,000hp version of the same engine. 10203 entered service at Nine Elms in July 1954. It spent just over a year on the Southern before it was transferred to Camden, on the London Midland Region, in August 1955. Southern drivers appreciated the riding qualities and the power but, apparently, passengers didn't like the smell.

During the late 1950s, 10203 lost its black and silver livery for BR lined green. Willesden became its new home from November 1959 and, sometime afterwards, its Southern-style whistles were replaced by air horns.

The locomotive was put into store at Derby on October 15 1962 and was finally withdrawn on December 12 1963. It was finally scrapped by Cashmore's in March 1968.

Hornby Kitchen/ Dining First

t is notable that, when
Hornby introduces a fresh
range of coaching stock,
restaurant and sleeping
cars tend to come after the
launch of the ordinary vehicles.
The fabulous and extensive
range of Maunsell coaches
comprised only 'seating'
vehicles - until now. Say hello
to the Maunsell First
Class Kitchen diner.

Mike King's An Illustrated History of Southern Coaches shows 34 Maunsell Dining Firsts in traffic by 1934, usually (though not always) running with a Dining Saloon Third and primarily on the Western Section as the Pullman company had the catering contract for the Eastern and Central sections. Unlike most Southern coaches, the restaurant cars were not permanently allocated to a particular set.

Hornby's model follows the

company's well established practice and matches the existing Maunsell stock in all major respects. If I can highlight a few details, the roof and underframe are particularly pleasing. The roof has separately fitted torpedo vents over the saloon and the full complement of vents and water tank over the kitchen.

The destination board brackets are well defined and the pack containing the alternative close couplings includes four plain body-coloured plastic strips which I assumed are unlettered destination boards. You'll need to find some appropriately coloured lettering decals to complete them.

The coach sides carry panel and beading detail which is a little more prominent than it is in pictures of the real thing but the distinctive square-cornered windows and recessed doors look spot-on. Hornby has

also done a convincing job with the obscured glazing of the kitchen windows.

Internally, the high-backed 2+1 seats and white-topped tables are modelled, and the tables carry Pullman-style brass table lamps though, unlike Hornby's Pullman cars, those in this model are not illuminated. Some modellers have criticised the prominence of the printed curtains. I can't say that this bothered me. The curtains are quite convincing but they do extend further across the windows than is evident in most photographs.

Underneath, the model is really impressive, with battery boxes, brake cylinders, dynamo and the massive gas tanks to serve the kitchen cooking ranges. Interestingly, the weight of these ranges on one side of the car was such that they had to be counterbalanced by lead weights

attached to the solebar on the corridor side of the car. Hornby has these six weights accurately modelled.

The dining car runs on SR 8ft wheelbase 'steam' bogies and these are moulded with some of the deepest detailing that this reviewer has seen. Brake blocks are in line with the 'OO' gauge wheel treads and the model runs on pin-point bearing metal wheelsets. Sprung metal buffers are fitted and the model has tension lock couplers in NEM pockets mounted on a closecoupling cam arrangement. Alternative continental-style close couplers are provided. The corridor connections are fitted with blanking plates which unclip.

The model is offered as
No. 7869 in the austerity unlined
olive green, as depicted in Mike
King's book, and matching
Hornby's 'Return From Dunkirk'
train pack. It is also available as
S7861S in BR Southern Region
'malachite'. Fully lined Southern
livery and BR crimson and
cream will presumably be offered
in future production runs.
A Third Class Dining saloon to
accompany this vehicle would
also be useful.

It is good to see Hornby turning out such high-quality, newly tooled coaches, and filling gaps in its range. (CJL)

Rails LNER dynamometer car

alk about always being the bridesmaid and never the bride... All eyes have focused on Gresley 'A4' No. 4468 Mallard this summer for, 80 years ago in July, the blue 'Pacific' thundered down Stoke Bank snatching the world speed record for steam from Deutsche Reichsbahn 4-6-4 No. 05002.

Today, *Mallard* is positioned so that it's one of the first things you see when you enter the

National Railway Museum's Great Hall. Tucked behind, however, is LNER Dynamometer Car No. 902502, just as it was on June 3 1938. Engineers and technicians on board this vehicle actually captured and recorded the work that driver Joe Duddington and fireman Tommy Bray were doing on the footplate that historic day. The real No. 902502 is likely to remain, quite literally, in *Mallard*'s shadows but, thanks





to a three-way partnership between Rails of Sheffield, Rapido Trains and the National Railway Museum, it should now be able to bask in a bit of glory itself as it's the subject of this stunning new model.

It's been just over a year that the new 'Rails Limited' brand was launched amidst No. 902502's mass of Heath Robinson-like recording equipment. The first view of the new 'OO' gauge LNER dynamometer car was a stereolithography print. It showed much promise - but you had little clue just how good the resulting model would be.

Received for review is what Rails of Sheffield has called 'Version 1'. This depicts the dynamometer car as it was in 1938, with the running number 23591. 'Version 2' features its post-May 1946 running number, the one it still carries to this day.

Rapido Trains' reputation for incredibly fine detail preceded its entry into the British model railway market. The Stirling

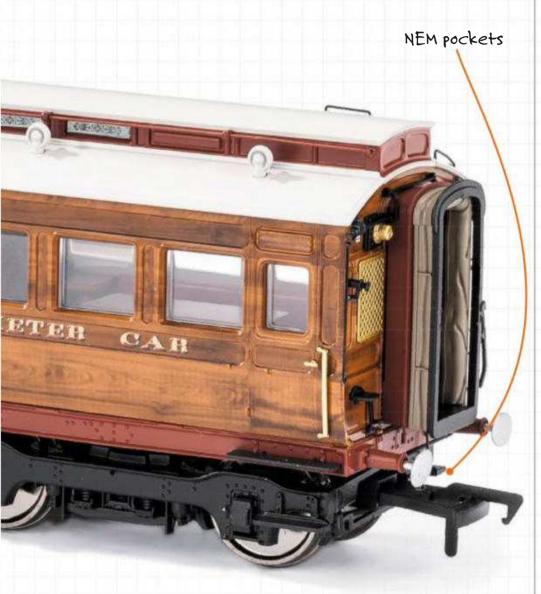




'Single' reviewed in MR251 was a great looking model, but the dynamometer car is in another league and really shows just what Rapido is capable of.

This is simply a jaw-dropping model and it's difficult to know just where to start.
Our eye was caught by the recording wheel and associated underframe fittings. Follow the pipes inside and everything is perfectly aligned.

The shape looks good and compares well to photographs. There's so much very fine



separately fitted detail for your eyes to take in but, though the model requires careful handling, none of it feels as though it'll fall off if you accidentally breathe on it too hard!

If push came to shove, we'd have to say that the patterns on the clerestory windows are our favourite detail. The windows are so small you could have forgiven Rapido for leaving them off but, no, the intricate patterns have been captured beautifully.

Replicating LNER teak 'livery' in 'OO' is always a challenge. Hornby's LNER coaches required 280 tampo print processes to create a particularly lifelike finish. Rapido has gone for

something simpler. It's a dotprinting process that, from normal viewing distances, portrays a realistic woodgrain finish. Get closer to the model though and the individual dots reveal themselves, a bit like when you look at a newspaper photograph close up.

Included is the usual plastic bag of bits containing vacuum pipes and etched end screens which, Rapido suggests, should be applied with a small amount of glue behind the end pipes.

What you won't find included in any other British outline 'OO' gauge coach is the controllable interior lighting system. This is the dynamometer car's party trick and it's so simple that you wonder why it hasn't been used before on a British outline coach.

The key is Rapido's 'magic wand', which is a plastic stick with a magnet on the end of it. Wave the wand over the roof and the magnet activates a switch inside which, if your track is live, should switch the lights on, allowing you to take in all the interior detail. Wave it again and the lights turn off. It's a super system, even if it does make you feel as though you're at Hogwarts while you're doing it! For some added interest, you could fit magnets to your tunnel portals to make the lights work automatically as it enters and leaves the tunnel.

Now, all this beautiful detail and fancy switching does come at a pretty price. We know that the cost of 'OO' gauge coaches is >

Factfile: 902502

The dynamometer car's primary job was to record the performance of a steam locomotive. The locomotive was coupled to what was essentially a large spring, with pencils on the end that would record the drawbar pull on a roll of paper. It would also measure other key statistics, such as speed, boiler and steam chest pressure.

902502 was built by the North Eastern Railway in 1906 as No. 3591. It was absorbed by the LNER in 1923, when it became 23591, and was modified and upgraded to match the increasing

size and performance of locomotives. It was renumbered as 902502 in May 1946.

As well as recording Mallard's recordbreaking run in July 1938, it also played an important role during the 1948 Locomotive Exchanges, recording LMS, GWR and Southern Region express and freight power on the Eastern Region routes. It was withdrawn in 1951 and, given its important place in railway history, was preserved by the British Transport Commission. It's currently on display at the National Railway Museum in York.

a little bit more.

Before you all throw your hands up in horror though, consider this: the only previous 'OO' gauge RTR LNER dynamometer car was Golden Age's exquisite allbrass offering of which, at the time of writing, Hatton's had a pre-owned example for sale for roughly double the cost of the Rails/Rapido model.

When you put it into that context, £125 for what can be considered a museum-quality model is actually good value.

Just put your eye to one of those miniature windows and take in all that wonderful interior detail - it won't be long before you're imagining what it must have been like on that record-breaking run, 80 years ago. (CG)

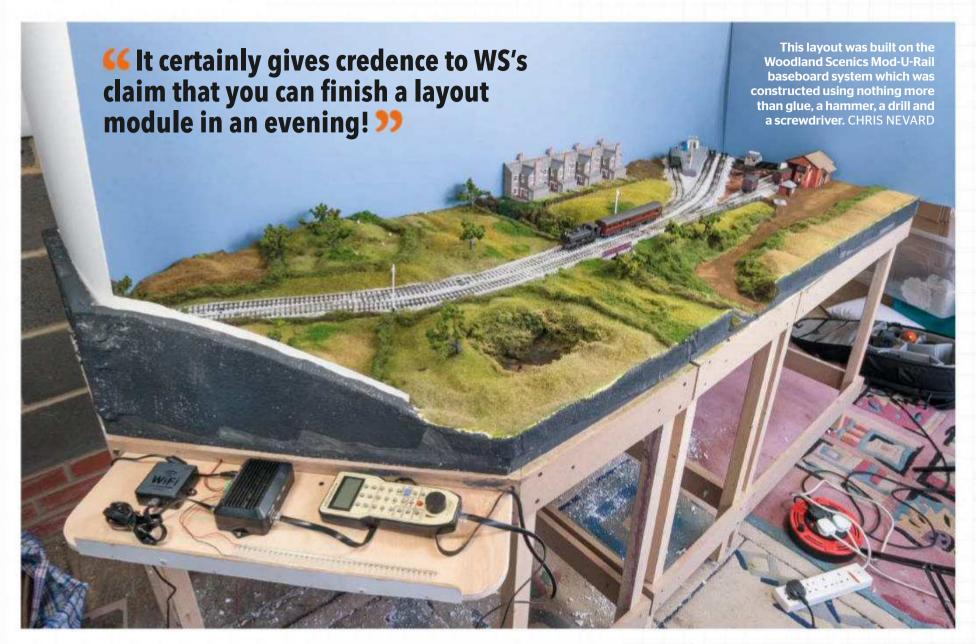

Mod-U-Rail baseboard system

he baseboard - it's arguably the most off-putting part of building a layout. It can be difficult to construct, especially if woodwork isn't your forte, and the pressure to get it right is immense. After all, a wonky or misaligned board can plague your layout forever.

If we told you that there was a baseboard system that was easy to build, with the bare minimum of tools, that would allow you to include mountains or river valleys and that could be used on anything from a micro layout to a huge room filler, you'd probably think it too good to be true.

But it isn't. Say hello to Mod-U-Rail, from Woodland Scenics.

Mod-U-Rail is a modular baseboard system that comes

in two main parts: you get a pine/MDF frame and then a hard foam base. The frames screw together and all you need to affix the foam is glue. Assembly doesn't get much easier than that.

There are two sizes of baseboard kit. There's a 3ft by 18in straight and a 3ft by 3ft unit that can either be built as a square or as an angled corner unit. By combining straight and square/corner units, you can assemble a baseboard to whatever configuration you require. The foam top sections include the flat foam base, foam frames, risers and trackbed, as well as a huge selection of Woodland Scenics glues, scatters and other scenic accessories (see panel). It certainly gives credence to WS's claim that you can finish

a layout module in an evening!

We were able to put Mod-U-Rail to the test, thanks to the generosity of stockist Kernow Model Rail Centre. It worked pretty much as advertised, although we did have to re-drill a few holes because they weren't aligned properly.

You might feel that Mod-U-Rail is an expensive way to build a layout, especially if you're planning a large one. However, factor in the cost of buying all those scenic accessories and it starts to make more financial sense.

It makes even more sense when all you need to provide is track of your choice and you have everything you need to build a fully detailed scene in under a day. Our verdict is that Mod-U-Rail offers a flexible and fun alternative option to layout building. (RF)

REVIEW VERDICT

PROS. Useful and fun alternative to wood baseboards, all you need is track.
CONS. Pricey, some holes need drilling.



The straight modules contain four legs, four 3ft long wooden braces and four 1ft 6in wooden braces, all with a mitre joint. The square and corner modules have all 3ft long pieces, apart from the diagonal corner section.



Don't rely on the mark on the wood being straight. Use a set square to ensure that you have the wood at right angles and that the top of the leg is flush with the top of the cross support to avoid abnormalities in the board.



Again, using a set square to ensure that everything is at right angles, drill one of the screws into place. By only screwing in one at this stage you are still able to move the frame slightly to ensure it is at a perfect right angle.



Place the foam base on top of the stand and glue spare square foam pieces on the base next to the legs underneath, one in each corner. This will form a wedge between the stand and the foam, stopping it from moving.



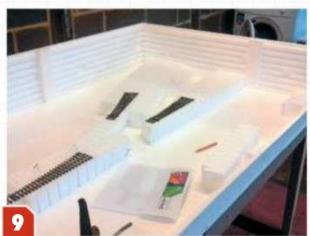
Hammer in the supports for the adjustable feet into the base of the legs, ensuring that they are firmly in place, as we had one of them come out when moving the layout around the room.



We built the two end pieces of the straight module first, which gave us two firm bases for when it came to attaching the longer 3ft braces. It is recommended that you recruit an assistant to hold the wood in place when fixing it.



One of the completed 3ft by 1ft 6in stands, which will form part of the overall baseboard. We have not yet put the feet on the base of the stand so that we could make sure everything was level and at right angles first.



Lay the risers onto the foam base and pin them with the foam nails to check the positioning. The foam borders provide a frame for the scenery and backscene. Shape with a hot wire cutter or a craft knife to the desired shape.

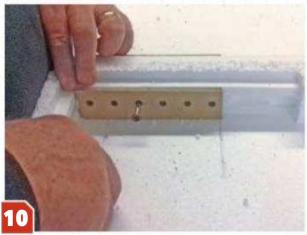

The feet are adjustable on a screw to account for any undulations in the floor. Simply screw them into the holder that you hammered into the base of the legs at the beginning of the build.



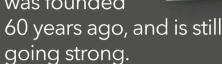
Screws with wingnuts are included with each stand kit to join two kits together and make one solid structure. The holes along the lengths of the braces line up to make fixing two modules together very simple.

he Wakefield Railway Modellers' Society was formed when the model railway section of the Wakefield Society of Model and Experimental Engineers decided to start their own club in 1958. Of the ten members who formed the society, our current president, Peter Dowd, is the sole survivor. Initially rooms were rented above a shop in the city centre, but space was extremely limited and alternative accommodation was sought. This was somewhat larger but only available on a temporary basis so, in 1967, it was decided to lease a plot of land from the council and construction of the new clubrooms commenced. Most of the work was done by the members themselves and the official opening took place in May 1969. By the late 1970s space was once again at a premium, owing to an increase in membership, so a second storey was built. This was opened in February 1983 by our then president, David Jenkinson. An opportunity arose to buy out the lease from the council, so the society now has a permanent home.

The ground floor consists of a meeting room capable of seating 45 people, a layout room and a kitchen. Upstairs is the main layout building room and a library with an extensive collection of modelling magazines,





many going back to the first issue, along with over 500 reference books. The current membership is just below 90 and during the winter months members are entertained every fortnight by talks, demonstrations or films on a variety of topics, both modelling and prototype. Other meeting nights are devoted to the construction of layouts. Currently work is progressing on an Austrian 9mm narrow gauge layout, a scale model of Stanley in 'OO' gauge set in the late 1950s

(due to make its debut at our forthcoming exhibition), an 'O' gauge layout based on Eyemouth in North British days and an American 'O' gauge switching layout. In addition there are completed layouts which are stored between exhibitions. Individual members have their own layouts which appear at exhibitions up and down the country. Our members have a wide range of skills and knowledge, and if anyone has a problem there is usually someone able to help. Meetings are held every Monday and Friday, commencing at 1930. Visitors and potential members are always welcome, whether they're new to the hobby or accomplished modellers. Thank you to David Woodward for preparing this article.

Chester remembers the end, 50 years on

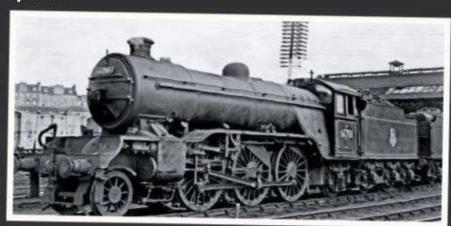

Locomotive: Swindon DMUs

Gauge: '00'/'N'

Proposed by: Mel Harwood and Stuart Moore, by e-mail

What is it?

Swindon Works built four classes of diesel multiple units based on the 64ft Mk 1 coach, rather than the 57ft chassis that formed the foundation for the majority of first-generation DMUs. These four became Class 120, 123, 124 and 126 under TOPS.

Where they were built does not necessarily dictate where they operated. Only the Class 123 was built for the Western Region. The similar Class 124, which shared its distinctive wraparound windscreens but not the end gangways, were built for trans-Pennine services.

The Class 120s were shared between the Western and Scottish Regions. They too had a distinctive nose, with two large windscreens, which was shared by the '126' built for the Scottish Region. The '126s', however, only had this nose at one end - the other had a flat front with two windscreens either side of a gangway.

Whether powered by AEC, Leyland or British United Traction engines, Swindon called its

DMUs 'inter-city' long before those words formed the basis of BR's premium long-distance brand.

What would make it viable?

All four units share the same underframe and a good proportion of their body panels, which would have a positive effect on tooling costs. They were versatile, working across the West of England, Wales and the Midlands, Scotland, and between Liverpool/Manchester and Tyneside. They lasted until the early 1980s so they received green (with speed whiskers or yellow panels) plus blue and blue/grey livery.

Can I see a real one?

One Class 120 car survives at the Great Central Railway, while a complete four-car Class 126 has been fully restored at the Bo'ness & Kinneil Railway.

On a recent trip to Cardiff, I noticed that Arriva Trains Wales (ATW) had already begun removing the logos from its fleet of multiple units, despite the current franchise still having a few months to run. As a regular user of the line from Manchester to South Wales, I won't be sorry to see ATW 'give up the keys', but having recently experienced the run-down of the old Northern Rail franchise, it can be a depressing period for passengers.

The trains have become shabbier and the staff less interested. Coupled with the invisible branding, it suggests that nobody wants to be associated with the enterprise, which isn't ideal. In contrast to the dreadful new 'Northern by Arriva' operation, let's hope that the incoming operator of the Wales franchise (Keolis-Amey) can make some tangible improvements to the passenger experience.
