'16XX': ORDER YOURS NOW


Trains 'OO' gauge '16XX' 0-6-0PT. Design work has been completed and we're now awaiting the first test 3D prints of the CAD files for evaluation before tooling work starts.

The model has been designed to high specifications. The five-pole motor and flywheel, when combined with a heavy die-cast chassis, offer superb pulling power, typical of the real Western Region pannier. It will also have a Next18 decoder socket and factory-fitted sound speaker, along with firebox glow. These features complement NEM coupler pockets and sprung buffers de rigueur for any new 'OO' gauge ready-to-run model.

You can now order the Model Rail/Rapido etch, which has enabled us to expand the scope and choice of prototypes. We've tried to offer models that reflect the wide geographical coverage that the class achieved, from Cornwall to Southall, and South Wales to Stourbridge. This will give modellers the chance to recreate classic branch lines such as the Tanat Valley, Fowey, Tetbury, Burry Port & Gwendraeth, Llanelli & Mynydd Mawr, not to mention the Dornoch branch in Scotland.

We've also tooled the spark arrestor chimney, dubbed the 'Busby', which was fitted to four '16XXs' for working munitions branches (including the Cleobury Mortimer & Ditton Priors), as well as the Lea & Perrins Worcestershire sauce factory.

O-6-OPT was a bit like
Henry Ford's Model T - it
was only ever available
in black! Therefore, we're offering
it in pristine and weathered

We're also lucky that preserved No. 1638 has appeared in non-au-

thentic GWR green, while in its early days in preservation at Buckfastleigh it also carried BR unlined green and green with 'Dart Valley' lettering. Therefore, to inject a little variety into our model, we're offering these liveries too.

We're also going to replicate Nos. 1600 and 1607's NCB careers. No. 1607 was not scrapped until 1969/70. Photographs of this pair in NCB service have proved VERY thin on the ground, so we've chosen a green livery inspired by the colour scheme carried by '57XX' cousin, No. 7754.

HELJAN UNVEILS 'PEAK'

eljan is to mark next year's 60th anniversary of the ever-popular Class 45 by launching an all-new 'OO' gauge model. As an extra special present, Heljan is to include the Class 45/1 sub-class, never before offered as a ready-to-run model.

Heljan will produce the D31-67/D108-137 batch with a pair of central headcode panels (rather than split headcode boxes) as well as those rebuilt with two sealed beam headlights in the nose. Variations will include open or plated boiler steps and roof hatches, bodyside grilles or plated panels (or a combination of both), original or modernised underframe tanks with air tanks, optional inner sandboxes and boiler hatch covers.

The '45/1' sub-class was created in the 1970s when steam-heating equipment on 50 '45s' was replaced with electric train heating for working with new 'air-con' Mk 2s. Heljan's '45/1' will feature the myriad differences of this sub-class and will be available with or without high-intensity headlight.

Other features include a 21-pin DCC socket, NEM coupler pockets integrated into the bufferbeams, fully controllable LED lighting and provision for sound. Production will be limited, so Heljan recommends early ordering to avoid disappointment.



'F3' IN 'O'

Connoisseur Models has unveiled its latest 'O' gauge kit: the LNER 'F3'. The Great Eastern Railway built 50 of these 2-4-2Ts between 1893 and 1902. They were designed by James Holden and were effectively a tank version of the 'E4' 2-4-0. The last was withdrawn in 1953.

Connoisseur's kit contains alternative fittings and cab roof. The pony wheels pivot to enable it to negotiate curves.

IRISH Bo-Bo IS TOOLED UP

GAUGE

Tooling work has started on Murphy Models' 'OO' gauge CIÉ 121 Class Bo-Bo. The General Motors locomotives served CIÉ from 1961 until 2002, although two were retained until 2008. MM is to offer the '121' in at least

four liveries: original CIÉ grey, CIÉ black and orange, 'Supertrain' and the revised orange/ white/black Irish Rail scheme. Prices are still to be confirmed but delivery is expected in late 2019/early 2020.







inerva Model Railways is to produce the Class 14 as its first ready-to-run diesel outline 'O' gauge locomotive. The 0-6-0DH will follow the same specification set by its four previous steam models. It will have an injection-moulded body mounted to a die-cast chassis, with a high-torque motor and flywheel and a 40:1 gearbox.

It will also sport an illuminated cab and headcode panels that light up in the direction of travel.

The Class 14 will be offered in just one livery - two-tone green with 'wasp' stripes and BR roundel - and will be unnumbered. However, running numbers will be supplied on a sheet of waterslide decals and worksplates, and shedplates will be supplied on an etch.

A 22-pin socket will enable a full range of DCC and sound options to be offered. Prices range between £290.00 for a DCC-ready model to £415.00 for the sound-fitted option. Design work is almost complete and Minerva hopes that the model will hit the shelves in spring 2020.

For series ten of *Great British Railway Journeys*, Michael revisits some earlier journeys to see what's changed in the last



According to Chris...

His grandchildren call him 'Granddad Trains' and he's been a dedicated railway modeller since the 1960s but, despite popular legend, Chris Leigh doesn't remember when dinosaurs roamed the Earth!

've yet to meet anyone in the magazine editorial business who actually enjoys compiling the diary page. It's an essential feature of model railway magazines, of course, and has been so since the 1960s, when lots of new clubs were launched in towns across Britain. However, it tends to be a long listing of dates and times for meetings and exhibitions, so it doesn't make for interesting reading. That's why editorial staff don't enjoy compiling it, or proof-reading it two or three times over, but accuracy is key.

It's often one of the first jobs that gets passed to the most junior member of staff and that was certainly true at Model Railway Constructor, when I joined in 1963. Don't think it's an easy job, though. Get a date wrong and the consequences can be dire, so it's an onerous responsibility for a novice.

Luckily for me, many of the announcements related to the formation of new clubs, and in early 1964 I was asked to place an announcement that an exploratory meeting would be held to assess whether a club could be formed in Staines, Middlesex. It was a front-room gathering of interested people, arranged by brothers-in-law Terry Wheelwright and Roger Richens, and it was

the beginning of the Staines Model Railway Society (now the Egham & Staines MRS).

I went along to that first meeting. The club was formed and began meeting on Tuesday evenings in Staines Town Hall. It wasn't long before layouts were being built and an exhibition was planned for late 1966. As part of the publicity, the club's 'Staines West' layout was featured in and on the cover of the November 1966 issue of Model Railway Constructor. I must confess that it wasn't difficult to arrange that publicity as I was both exhibition manager and editorial assistant on the magazine!

After that, I was usually involved in organising the club's biennial exhibition until I moved away from the area in 1992. However, since then, I've only attended shows as a visitor and I'm not a member of any club in

the area where I now live. I am, however, about to organise an exhibition, with only the support of the very active (but small) village community group.

Next year marks the 50th anniversary of the popular Lionel Jeffries movie, The Railway Children, which starred Bernard Cribbins and Jenny Agutter and was filmed on the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway. *Model Rail* readers may remember that I built an 'O' gauge layout based on Oakworth station, featuring characters from the movie. It was exhibited twice at Model Rail Live and once at Butlin's holiday camp in Skegness. Since then it has languished in a shed in my garden.


show in my home village as a fund-raiser for the village church. Our community group has now given its support to the

village hall. The date is May 23 2020. Put it in your diary if you would like to see my 'Railway Children' layout, plus 'Polwyddelan', my Cornish harbour layout, for what could well be their last-ever public appearances. I'm also inviting layouts from my friends at Egham and from *Model Rail* colleagues Dave Lowery, Peter Marriott, Ben Ando and Chris Nevard, though I must stress that the show is not in any way connected with either *Model* Rail or Bauer Media. It is also planned to bring together some 3ft by 1ft Wisbech & Upwell tramway modules.

In the meantime, 'Oakworth' is to undergo renovation. I plan to reduce its height so that the operator can be seated and so that smaller children can see it more easily. There are also lots of jobs to be completed and five years of storage damage to be reversed.

I want it to be a rather different kind of show, a more intimate affair, where visitors can meet and talk to layout operators, and perhaps even try their hand at the controls.





blame Chris Nevard for this layout!"
Or rather, Phil Porter points the finger at a feature *Model Rail*'s photographer and ace modeller wrote about using foamboard to make lightweight baseboards.

Phil also credits the inspiration for this project to two other people.

"Chris' piece about using foamboard really made me think about creating a layout," he explains. "I was forced to go with 'N' gauge because I only had a small room in which to house the layout. So small, in fact, that even though it's only 6ft in length, I couldn't actually put the two halves together until I had moved house. This was my first experience in 'N' gauge and my thanks go to Grahame Hedges for


inspiring me to dabble in it after seeing his amazing 'Stoney Lane Depot' layout."

Chris Nevard's layouts tend to depict the idyllic rolling hills and bucolic harbours of southern England. The rugged, windswept beauty of the Pennines that you see here is down to fellow modeller Gary Atkinson and his 'N' gauge take on the classic and much-missed 'Woodhead Route' that appeared in the May 2004 issue of *Model Rail*.

There are some similarities between Gary's and Phil's work. Both layouts are comparatively narrow, but also deep, in order to show off the majesty of the Pennine landscape. And they both feature impressive tunnels.

The tunnels at Woodhead on the Manchester->

There is one working Dapol signal on the layout, but as the other signal is so close to the canal there was no room for the mechanism and therefore it's non-operational. When planning signal placement it is always important to consider the surrounding landscape.



What makes this layout great? by Richard Foster

I AYOUT **STANDEDGE TUNNEL**



All of the UK's railways have some form of barrier around them. In most places this is fencing, however lengthy dry stone walls are also prototypical. Here, the sections of dry stone wall are vacuum-formed items.

'Standedge' is pronounced 'Stannige' Sheffield-Wath electric railway were some of the most recognisable on the national network. Photographs of the distinctive Class 76 Bo+Bos bursting from the three-mile tunnel, with the redundant portals on the left, and crossing the River Etherow, have starred in numerous books and periodicals.

WET SIDE-STORY

Phil's layout also features a famous tunnel with redundant bores alongside... and water. Standedge Tunnel is an engineering masterpiece that's often overshadowed by its famous neighbour, just over ten miles to the south.

In fact, Standedge Tunnel is better known in waterway circles and is, as co-founder of the Inland Waterways Association Robert Aickman described it, one of the UK waterway network's 'seven wonders'.

Standedge, between Huddersfield and Manchester, is a particularly 'watery' location. The tunnel on the Huddersfield Narrow Canal is nearly 700ft below the ground and is 3.2 miles long.


The arrival of the railway forced an unusual engineering solution: an aqueduct takes the water over the first two railway tracks before turning almost 90° to the left and diving under the railway.

Phil has always liked this corner of the Pennines






I almost took a hammer to it several times as it's a fiendishly complex shape to get right



and the inclusion of a river and canal to complement the railway made it an enticing modelling challenge. But that complex aqueduct arrangement made 'challenge' the operative word...

"I almost took a hammer to it several times as it's a fiendishly complex shape to get right," admits Phil. "I've modelled it in its repaired state after the water broke through the retaining wall in steam days, which is why the corner looks different. I have also modelled the supporting struts behind that section, installed to prevent breakage and a repeat of the flooding."

If that wasn't enough, Phil decided to make life >







even harder for himself by using real water. An electric pump underneath the layout draws the water up to the aqueduct, it flows down and then through a pipe into the water container below. Phil spent quite a while ensuring that it was snug and watertight before adding it to the layout. And, as Phil says, "real water doesn't scale well" and so it took numerous attempts to get it to flow in the way that he wanted.

The River Colne plays an equally important role in shaping the landscape here, but some creative thinking was needed to capture the look Phil wanted.

"It took three or four attempts to get it looking right," he recalls. "To make the ripples, I prodded the ordinary resin with a toothbrush every hour as it was curing and eventually it held its shape.

After a few hours I'd created this lovely ripple effect on the surface of the water."


BACKSCENE BLEND

It's not easy trying to capture the wide openness of the Pennines but Phil has managed it with aplomb by carefully blending the modelled landscape with the backscene.

"I used Ordnance Survey maps to determine the exact elevation change and slope gradient above the mouth of the tunnel and scaled that down to 'N' gauge. Close attention was paid to the soil ridges on this slope, which are lines of PVA glue to give some definition. The slope itself was made from styrofoam covered in filler, then I added the PVA lines and Woodland Scenics scatter material."

There is plywood facing around the foam base, which provides structural support to the lightweight structure for display and transportation. It is a good idea to do this with foam baseboards to prevent pieces of the foam from breaking off.





LAYOUT **STANDEDGE TUNNEL**



The reason that the backscene is so effective is because it's the actual scenery you'd see at the real location. Phil couldn't rely on an off-the-shelf backscene, so he went to Standedge and took over 30 photographs before delicately stitching them together to make an image over ten feet in length, accurate to the real landscape. To give it structural support, both sides of the backscene have been given a satin laminate and it's held upright on wooden supports.

Given the quality of the landscape, you could be forgiven for thinking that Phil was a dyed-in-the wool modeller with decades of experience under his belt and the ability to turn his hand to anything. But that's not the case.

"When I first started I wasn't a confident modeller, so a lot of items on the layout are off-the-shelf. For example, the track is all Peco Code 55 but I had difficulties when it came to the Marsden loop. The

inner line splits to allow trains to bypass the station, taking the line that goes around the back and continuing on uninterrupted. The radius of the Peco point I used is too small to allow a smooth transition, so the tracks here are not aligned particularly well. Accurately to the prototype, the lines are canted and it took me a while to get them back level for the storage area over long enough a distance to avoid derailments."

SING THE BLUES

It's difficult to put your finger on why, but BR's Corporate Blue livery always seemed to work well against the stone structures and landscape of the Pennines. There's nothing like watching a weathered blue Class 47 speed past with a TransPennine service, passing a blue/grey DMU on a local service. It's another reason why Phil's layout works so well. But modelling the rationalised track layout at the

Phil has modelled the Huddersfield narrow canal, which has been populated with two narrow boats, one of which is from the Hornby Lyddle End range.





Factfile: Standedge Tunnels

The four bores that pierce Standedge, between Diggle (Greater Manchester) and Marsden (West Yorkshire), make the location special. The first was built by the Huddersfield Narrow Canal and finally opened in 1811, 17 years after it was authorised. It's Britain's longest canal tunnel and, at over 600ft above sea level, Britain's highest canal tunnel too.

As the canal followed the valley of the River Colne, this area would become attractive to railway builders. The Huddersfield & Manchester Railway bought the canal and used the tunnel during construction of the first railway tunnel in 1848. It became apparent that a second track was needed to avoid bottlenecks so the LNWR, which had acquired the HBR, built a second, single-track bore, which opened in 1871.

Such was the demand on this stretch of railway that the LNWR built a third, twin-track tunnel, which opened in 1894. BR closed both single-track tunnels between 1966 and 1970 but the remaining double-track tunnel is still the fifth longest on the Britain's railway network.

Huddersfield end of the tunnel, with its one turnout, also allowed Phil to keep the under-baseboard wiring simple, which was important given that there's real water on the layout.

"I love big diesels and remember journeys behind them as a child, so modelling the 1980s was a natural choice for me." Phil says. "Standedge Tunnel now looks very different to the way it did in the 1980s, so I had to use plenty of photographs to get an accurate representation. Today you can't see the river as it is so overgrown, so it appears as though the flow from the reservoir goes nowhere, but in fact it flows into the River Colne."

Phil has managed to include a wonder of the UK waterways, the railway and some stunning scenery in a small space, drawing on inspiration from different modellers. Who or what, we wonder, will provide the spark for the next one? MR





Peter Marriott picks five tree kits that guarantee great results without breaking the bank, as **Paul Marshall-Potter** shows you how to make your own.

pring is in the air and trees are bursting into life with varying shades of lush greens and blossoms. So now's the perfect time to show you how to make attractive-looking trees for your layout. There are plenty to choose from, but with such a crowded market it can be difficult

to figure out things such as which trees offer the best quality, or which provide the best value for money. Naturally, each has its own strengths and weaknesses, but here I'll show you how to build four of the most popular tree kits on the market and give you my top tips along the way.

For comparison's sake, I've chosen ease of build, build time, cost and realism. The trees range from those with plastic trunks to those with tree armatures, and they vary in price from less than £1 to around £28 per tree. The build times range from ten minutes to over two hours.

Workbench

THE BEGINNER KIT

Woodland Scenics Trees Learning Kit is the perfect choice for beginners. It's easy to use and the 18 armatures, depicting different tree types, are primarily designed for 'OO' gauge but will work really well if you need tall trees in 'N'. The only thing that slows the process down is that you need to let the Hob-e-Tac go tacky - but set up a production line and you can make a tree in five minutes.

Tools

- Scalpel with fresh blades
- Needle file or sanding sticks



KIT Woodland Scenics WLK 953 Trees | AVAILABILITY

The Tree Learning Kit contains 12 13cm deciduous tree armatures, six 16cm conifer tree armatures, Hob-e-Tac adhesive and two types of foliage: medium green clump foliage and conifer clump foliage.

Now's the time to remove the base. Cut it away with a sharp blade and remove any flash with sanding sticks/needle files. Give your armature a coat of matt brown/green to remove the plastic sheen.



Use your fingers to bend and twist the deciduous tree armatures into realistic, three-dimensional shapes. Real branches bend and twist in all manner of strange ways, so don't worry if your trees do the same.



To shape one of the conifer tree armatures you'll need both hands. Take it slowly so you have more control and avoid snapping the armature in half. Don't worry if you do though – you can then model a felled tree.




Brush Hob-e-Tac adhesive onto the branches of the armatures, but take care not to put adhesive onto the trunk where foliage does not naturally grow. Leave to dry until the adhesive is clear and tacky.





If there are any branches without foliage, brush a little more Hob-e-Tac adhesive onto the branch, wait until it's clear and tacky (usually around 15 minutes), and then push foliage onto the adhesive.



How tall does your tree need to be?

Use the right size of trees for the scale of your layout. It's amazing how often fully grown trees look undersized alongside locomotives and buildings. Trees are taller than we think.

The height of a tree is determined mainly by its age. A silver birch can grow up to 30 metres – roughly six times the height of a locomotive – while beech trees can grow up to 40 metres. It's important to get the height right. To help you, I've formulated a table with an approximate height calculator.

The appearance of the trees can be enhanced further once they are installed in the landscape. Spray the foliage with Scenic Cement and sprinkle on fine turf of a slightly different green. This will add colour variation.

THE FAST KIT


Heki makes both pre-assembled trees and kits suitable for 'OO' gauge. The kits tend to come in packs of ten, which makes them decent value. The trunks come in halves that you join together - but I never do. Firstly, the semi-circle of additional trunk seemed to be a larger width than the size of the main tree trunk. Secondly, the trees were to be planted near each other, so the semi-circular trunk nature of the main trunk would not be too obvious.



This is the Heki tree kit straight out of the packaging. It's a good idea to keep the foliage in the plastic 'bubble' while you're applying it to the branches.



Each tree consists of three parts: a tree armature, a base and a half-circle trunk for the reverse side of the tree. I didn't use the reverse half-circle piece as these trees were destined for the back of my layout.





I used an aerosol of brown acrylic paint to cover the trunk and branches, with the trees supported in a block of hard foam. I never use the bases as I 'plant' my trees in the landscape instead, but if you do like to use them, don't forget to paint them.



Here I've used the plastic packaging to contain the foliage, which I've mixed with some Woodland Scenics fine turf for variation and Deluxe Materials Scatter Grip to make some clumps.



Paint on Woodland Scenics Hob-e-Tac so that the armature will accept the foliage material. Only put the adhesive on the parts of the tree you would see leaves though; they don't grow all the way up the trunk, for example.




Dip the tree armature in the foliage material and rotate it to ensure a good covering. Do small amounts at a time, otherwise the adhesive will go off before you are ready to insert it into the greenery.



Here are several completed spruce trees. Note the slight variations in density and tree shape to provide variety between each one.





This is the box of sea moss as it comes. It's a good idea to sort out the contents into those that look like full trees already, and those that are too small, as you'll find some of them require much less work than others!



Before using any of the pieces, remove all of the seed pods on the dried sea moss. A pair of fine-nosed tweezers is ideal for this, but if you don't have any you can do it with a knife or really carefully with your fingers.



Protect the sea moss by soaking it in Mod Podge or diluted white glue. Attach a clothes peg to the base of the tree so that you can hang it up overnight to dry, like clothes from a washing line.



I've pushed the trees into foam before spraying, but doing this means the bottom of the trunk won't get covered. Spray them with a dark paint to provide definition between the branches and the leaves when they are stuck on.

Using Noch spray adhesive is much faster and less fiddly than a brush-on adhesive. You'll also avoid disturbing the realistic look of the sea moss. Use three different shades of green scatter to add variation.



Different grades of scatter provide extra texture. Using your fingers will give you better control than the dip-and-roll technique shown for the previous trees, but it does take a little more time.

THE REALISTIC KIT

German manufacturer miniNatur's range is not cheap but, in my experience, they are some of the best quality trees that money can buy, whether you go for a kit or an off-the-shelf item. But no matter how realistic something is - there's always room for improvement! I was sure I could better my last miniNatur tree so I chose to build this weathered larch tree with a mixture of live and dead foliage that it calls 'summer'.

Tease the foliage out so that it looks like this. Cut across the mat so that the strands of material will hang down on the branches. You'll need a sharp pair of scissors to cut through the matting.



Here's the adhesive just before a piece of the foliage was pushed into it. I used UHU Holzleim to fix the foliage. Apply a dollop on to the branches and spread with a wooden coffee stirrer.

STEP HIGH-QUALITY LARCH KIT



The tree comes as one flat armature, which is lightweight and easy to bend. It's covered in a bark-effect material and painted in various shades of brown and grey. The base of the tree has a screw thread for fixing to a layout.



Hold the base of the tree armature in one hand and bend the branches in different directions. This is a five-minute job. The branches are easy to bend using your fingers.



Each weathered larch tree kit comes with a tree armature and two foliage mats – one green and the other brown. I found that I needed about 75% of both mats. I've kept the rest of the material for other projects.



I used small scissors to cut the foliage mat into pieces and tweezers to push the foliage mat into the glue on the branches. UHU Holz Leim was one of the adhesives I used for this project.



Here's the finished tree - the result of two hours' work. On some of the lower limbs I used brown foliage to represent dead branches and leaves. The longer lengths were cut off once the glue had set.



MAKING BACKGROUND TREES

Paul Marshall Potter

demonstrates how to make a medium-sized tree.

ou can make a surprisingly convincing 'background tree' in next to no time at all. These tree moulding kits from Phoenix

Precision are priced at only £7.50 and contain enough components to create four 'OO' gauge trees. That works out at about £5 per tree, once you've factored in postiche (synthetic, human or animal hair) and a variety of scatters. This tree kit used to be part of the range of C&L Finescale, but has since passed into the Phoenix Precision catalogue.



Remove any flash or seam lines from your C&L Finescale Tree Mouldings using a sharp blade and needle file. One pack contains enough components to make four trees.



Using a hair dryer, gently heat the plastic until it's pliable enough to bend. The components are fairly flat, so the objective here is to splay the branches in a more realistic fashion.





Use cyanoacrylate or plastic glue and fill any gaps with liquid cyanoacrylate. I like Deluxe Materials Roket Odourless adhesive, which has the perfect consistency for the task.



Prime the tree armatures. I used Halfords Plastic Filler Primer to fill any further gaps, followed by a thin coating of Halfords Grey Primer.



In winter, tree trunks and branches can appear almost black, especially when they're wet. Softly mist branches with black acrylic spray, allowing patches of grey to show through.






Gently tease out a clump of postiche to create a thin veil and drape it over the branches. This will provide an almost invisible frame on which you can affix layers of scatter material.



Spray the postiche frame with hairspray and immediately sprinkle your scatter material over the top. Wherever possible, try not to get scatter on the trunk.



Desaturate the scatter with earthy colours, and keep comparing your tree to your layout or prototype photography.

Scatter materials

Choose a leaf cover that matches what you've used on your layout. Go for colours that are quite muted, mixing autumn and winter colours, and the foliage and grass need to be consistent in their colour tones.

I made my own blend from four different manufacturers. If you want to copy my trees, you'll need:



PLANTING TECHNIQUES

It doesn't matter which kit you choose, the planting technique will be the same. Here's how to do it... and there's not a spade in sight!



Cut away the moulded tree base.






Use a bradawl or screwdriver to press a hole into the scenery...



...drop a small dollop of glue into it and press the trunk into place.





5 Top tree tips

- If you have a limited number of trees to plant, they generally look best in clumps of three, rather than two or four.
- **2** Use your best quality trees at the most prominent locations on your layout. The more basic trees can be used towards the rear of your layout.
- Don't forget the area around the base of the tree trunk. Use foliage and scatter materials to make it look as though the tree grew out of the ground, rather than simply being glued into a hole in the scenery.
- A Before you buy or make any trees, decide upon the season in which your layout is set. There are big differences in leaf colour between spring and autumn.
- **5** Trees need to be of varying heights to reflect different ages and locations. In real life, some single trees standing near stations and chalets are very tall.




Making convincing abandoned vehicles isn't a simple matter of slapping brown paint about. **Phil Coggan** shows you how he achieved this highly detailed scrapyard look.

he saying 'if a job's worth doing, it's worth doing well' certainly applies to railway modelling. Take Pendon's epic 'Vale Scene'. Its magic comes from the simply breathtaking attention to detail. It wouldn't be the same if the houses didn't have full interiors, or the gardens lacked detail, would it?

Sometimes taking a 'Pendon approach' to modelling results in a really rewarding exercise. I wanted to include a few scrap and abandoned cars on my 'Pen y Bryn' layout (MR260) but I didn't want what I've seen on other layouts, on which model cars have simply been painted with rust-coloured paint.

The beauty of Oxford Diecast's 1:76 scale vehicle range is that it combines great looks for ridiculously low prices. So much so that I bought myself a couple on which to experiment.


'Pen y Bryn' depicts a time when you could find pre-war cars in a rather woebegone state. So I bought a Ford Popular 103E and a Morris Eight to see what sort of 'scrappers' I could create...



PART 1 DISMANTLING & CUTTING



Most Oxford Diecast cars screw together. Remove the two screws and lift away the die-cast bodyshell. Inside, you'll find the plastic glazing unit and the plastic 'interior' tray, which forms the dash, door cards, seats and parcel shelf. How much interior you get will depend on the era of the car (older cars were much more spartan than they are today) and the age of the model itself - newer Oxford models are more detailed.





Bumpers used to be little more than bent bits of metal mounted on brackets, unlike their contemporary, sculpted counterparts. And they frequently fell off. Oxford's bumpers are part of the body casting, so cut them away with a coarse blade in a jeweller's piercing saw. Use wet and dry paper to sand and shape the bottom edge of the wings to match the body profile.





Nothing says 'old scrap car' like one with missing wings. Wings were separate panels that were usually bolted to the body and the joint would rust as muck accumulated, especially when neglected. Use a piercing saw to remove the wing, but this time use a fine blade. Use wet & dry paper to create a neat edge to the metal.







To get the best from this project, you really need to open doors, bonnets and boots. The technique is the same: use a 0.6mm drill bit in the corner of the panel gap. Thread a fine (No. 8) piercing saw blade through the hole, re-assemble the saw and cut. Take your time to avoid marking other parts of the body with the blade. I even used this technique to remove the heater vent.

Last but not least... Pull the headlamps from the wings. I drilled out one of the lenses.

PART 2 TIDYING THE PARTS



Some parts may suffer damage during the dismantling process. The bottom edge of the radiator grille will have been tidied with wet & dry paper. Re-scribe the bottom edge of the grille using a scraper, ground and sharpened to have a cutting face of about 1mm.



The top edge of the door that forms the window frame is very fragile (it's obviously not designed to be removed!). It's easier to remove the frame and replace it with copper or brass rod, hammered flat.

STEP PART 3 PREPARING THE INTERIOR



If you've removed a door, you'll also need to remove a corresponding section of the plastic interior moulding. Cut away with sprue cutters and tidy with needle files or abrasive paper. I painted the seats and door cards with a grey colour and then weathered the interior with a rusty brown shade of acrylic paint.



Some miniature steering wheels can be solid, so it's worth taking time to open out the spokes. I used a small drill bit and the tip of a scalpel blade. If your car lacks a gear lever, you can make your own using more flattened copper wire.



You can make a representation of the engine using a block of wood or a scrap of plastic. I added radiator, coil, battery, starter motor and distributor using off-cuts of plastic rod and sheet and such like. I find silver wire is ideal for making pipes and wires.



My model 'Pop' had a pretty plain dash so I found a picture of one on the internet and reduced it in size so that it fitted the model. The steering wheel partially hid a few dials on the photograph, so I made some replacements using Photoshop. I stuck the new dash in place with PVA.

The Morris Eight



car and selected the Morris Eight as the guinea pig. I wanted it to represent a car that's suffered kids jumping on the roof, so I squashed the body in a vice. I cut away the front bumper as per the Ford 103E but glued it back at an angle.

I found the best way to represent dented panels with holes was to grind the inside metal with a ball-shaped burr tool in a small drill. The die-cast metal is nearly 2mm thick in places, so grind it until it's paper thin then push it with a tool to create the dents and creases.

The tyres on two wheels have been removed. To create extra interest, I filed the wheel down to create an impression of the brake drum. Four indents represent the stud holes.





PART 4 THE FINAL DETAILS



Re-assemble the car by screwing the body back in place. Fix the bonnet, door and boot with cyanoacrylate. Now it's time for the fun bit - really making your car look like scrap.



The removed wing will reveal the suspension - or lack of it. I made the damper and top and bottom wishbones from wire. The spring is simply more wire wrapped around another piece of wire.



Scrape away the painted vinyl roof with a blade and the chipped paint will resemble the remnants of glue. Tear and fold some paper and glue it to the roof. The weathered paint was a dirty mix of watercolour paint.



You can use plastic sprue cutters to cut one of the window units and make it look as though the glass has fallen into the door. Scratch another window with the tip of a scalpel to make it look as though it's cracked.



One of the first things to 'fail' on an abandoned car are the tyres. They'll quickly deflate if left unchecked, especially as the rims rust. Cut away the bottom of the tyre with a craft knife and use Araldite to bulge the bottoms of the tyres.



I painted the inside of the door with the same grey I'd used for the interior. I then used more silver wire to create the door handle and window winder.



The final job was to rub the body with a Sandflex fine abrasive rubber block before applying a mix of Red Leather and Flat Brown acrylic paint.

What's Next



These techniques are transferable to all manner of road vehicles. This Pocketbond Austin K2 lorry has undergone quite a transformation!

YOU KNOW?

Want to know how **Peter Marriott** achieves scenic success? It's all down to the tools...

bad workman might blame them, but when it comes to modelling, having the right tools is imperative, just as it is for DIY or working on cars. The beauty of being a railway modeller rather than an amateur mechanic is that the tools you need for this hobby are comparatively inexpensive!

The tools listed here are the ones I use on every project I do for *Model Rail*. If I find that any are broken or are past their best, I buy replacements immediately.

Most model railway scenery is built using plaster cloth, timber, cardboard and, increasingly, hard foam. Here is what you need to put together a basic kit for dealing with these materials, as well as some others that will come in handy for ballasting your track or installing the electrics.

Having the right tools to hand makes modelling easier, quicker and more satisfying. Buy the best you can afford and, as long as you take care of them, they should last a lifetime of layout building.

Model tool makers

Tool suppliers regularly attend the larger model railway exhibitions. These include Squires (www.squirestools.com), Eileen's Emporium and Expo Tools (www. expotools.com). Gaugemaster retails its own range of tools online (www. gaugemaster.com), Hobbycraft stores carry a good range (www.hobbycraft. co.uk) and Deluxe Materials (www. deluxematerials.co.uk) retails its own range online and through designated dealers. Bachmann now has its own range of tools, also available through retailers (www.bachmann.co.uk).

and change them regularly - a dull blade will not cut cleanly and could snag on the material you're cutting.




HAMMERS

Railway modelling is generally a little delicate for the 'Brumamagen screwdriver' but there is one task at which it will excel - knocking in trackpins. Use a crosspein hammer or modelling hammer with a head that's narrower than your track gauge, if possible. A hammer can also be a useful weighty item for holding something down as the glue cures.

FOAM NAILS

These T-shaped metal pins are around 2in long, and they're really useful for holding together scenery while you build it, particularly for holding hard foam pieces together as the adhesive cures. They are also good for supporting trees and other accessories when they're being fixed into the landscape while the glue is drying.

Can also be used for holding track to a foam baseboard as the glue is drying under the track. Holds buildings in situ as the adhesive fixing it to the layout dries.

DRILLS

We need to make holes in all sorts of things, from big holes in baseboards to tiny holes in bufferbeams to accept miniature brake pipes. An electric mini drill is perfect for drilling holes in baseboards to accept wires or bases for miniature catenary or trees. If you're very careful, you can use it to drill small holes in models, or for adding detailing accessories, but most



TOP TIP A mini drill set will usually include cutting discs and sanding strips, making it a particularly useful addition to your tool kit.



GLASS FIBRE BRUSH

These work on the same principle as a propelling pencil and so the fibres can be pushed out as needed. The beauty of

the glass fibre pencil is that you can get an effective abrasive into places that a needle file won't go - or where a needle file is too heavy. You can also use a glass fibre brush to gently distress 'metal' finishes.

Always wear rubber or latex gloves when using - the fibres can get stuck in your skin and cause much irritation.

PAINTBRUSHES

You can never have too many paintbrushes! Because they do wear out after a time, it's always worth having replacements in stock. Flat brushes are good for painting larger areas, while pinpoint brushes are best for finer work. There is no need to buy expensive paintbrushes just to cover large areas, such as the base colour of the scenery, or for painting a road. DIY domestic paintbrushes will do a good job of such tasks. Buy quality brushes for areas that require extra finesse.



It's more a case of where can't you buy paint brushes from. Humbrol is a good starting place and offers four-packs from £4.39 for different applications. Sable-hair artist's brushes are still the best that money can buy.




Don't throw away an old paintbrush. You can use dead ones for applying PVA glue, or even use the handle to stir paint.



PLASTIC SYRINGE AND PIPETTES

Do you end up slopping PVA everywhere? Or getting plastic cement on to areas of pristine paintwork? Then you need a way to apply controlled amounts of glue - or warfluids - and that's where



SCREWDRIVERS


Flat blades, crosshead, Phillips, Pozidriv - there are so many screwdriver types available that it's difficult to know exactly what to buy. We need a selection for model making, from heavy duty affairs for making baseboards to jewellers' screwdrivers for dismantling model locomotives.

SELF-HEALING CUTTING MAT

A cutting mat is vital for protecting your work surface when working with sharp blades. A self-healing mat will, as its name suggests, close over any slices made by a knife. They're available in all sizes, from A6 to A2.

STEEL RULE

A steel rule is always recommended over a plastic or wooden ruler because the blade of a sharp craft knife will not cut into the metal. They're essential when cutting cardboard, plastic and wood.

Go for a 12in rule rather than a 6in one when you need to cut larger pieces.



TWEEZERS

Good for positioning figures and other small details into dabs of adhesive on layouts. They're also useful for pushing signs into place on buildings and putting fence posts into drilled holes in the baseboard.





HOW TO

BUILD YOUR OWN BRIDGES

Need a specific bridge? Arch-modeller **Chris Leigh** spans the knowledge gap with techniques and step-by-step guides for creating bespoke structures.

described how I created a unique bridge for my 'N' gauge re-creation of the Staines West branch in the October 2018 issue (MR253). This was a comparatively simple overbridge and resulted in a proportionally simple build.

But there were two more bridges on the branch: a skew-arch bridge that took the railway over the Wyrardisbury River and another, curving bridge with the main line to Windsor underneath. Both were far trickier affairs, particularly the bridge over the



Windsor branch. The orientation of my shelf baseboard places this bridge on a sharp right-hand curve, not a left-hand one.


Such obstacles would never put off the Victorian railway builder, so don't let them put you off either. You can use the techniques I describe to create bespoke bridges for your layout.

Wyrardisbury river bridge

Having already climbed to cross the LSWR, the branch headed due south with the river on its right. It would have to cross the Wyrardisbury river (pronounced 'Wraysbury') to reach its planned terminus, but the Staines & West Drayton Railway was desperately short of money. We cannot be sure what sort of bridge was built to cross the river but, according to historical accounts, it fell down shortly before the railway opened. In haste, the S&WDR erected a replacement bridge with two yellow brick arches. Unlike other bridges, it was built to carry a single track.

In fact, the Wyrardisbury river bridge was a 'mini-viaduct' constructed in yellow London brick with arches of engineer's blues and was arguably the best-looking structure on the branch. Completed in 1885, it was removed soon after track-lifting in 1981 and it's thought that the resultant rubble was used under the Yeoveney to Poyle section of the M25.







I considered using a carefully scaled photograph as the basis of this model, but it proved too difficult to match the brick colour. The photograph was used to check against the layout to ensure that the bridge would fit.



I did, however, cut the dark brick arches from the actual photograph, but made up the string courses and any other details using thin card faced with Scalescenes' London brick paper.



In order to avoid having exposed white card edges, the string courses were cut from black cartridge paper faced with the Scalescenes London brick paper.




As the trackbed and track was already in place, the bridge had to be assembled around it. Note how I cut the brick paper to allow it to wrap around the arches.



The arch linings were cut over-size. I then cut various card pieces to hold the shape, attaching the front wall, but leaving the back wall until after installation on the layout.



Having set the angles of the various parts correctly, and glued them with Velo-set adhesive, the next job was to trim back the arch linings flush with the wall.



With the main assembly complete, except for the back wall, which remains loose, the central cutwater and the outer piers were cut from balsa sheet and brick-papered.




This assembly was then installed on the layout and glued into place. I painted the brick arches grey to match the top cappings. Two triangular wing walls were added to the front elevation.



At this point I decided that the river needed to be deeper, so I cut out two layers of foamboard and angled the edges to represent the river bank. The central cutwater also needed to be deepened.



The scenery was then blended in around the bridge using plaster bandage and a mix of scenic plaster and Woodland Scenics earth undercoat was applied.

Windsor line bridge

The bridge across the LSWR's Staines to Windsor branch was its biggest civil engineering feature. It negated the need for the Staines & West Drayton Railway to negotiate with the LSWR, a direct competitor, for the provision of a flat crossing.

Accordingly, a man-made incline across Staines Moor raised the branch to a height sufficient to cross the LSWR. The bridge itself was somewhat more substantial than it needed to be, having been built to carry two tracks. Despite such optimism, the branch

was never double track. There was no connection between the two railways until the Second World War, when a spur was put in to enable north-south military traffic to by-pass London.

During construction of the King George V and Queen Mary reservoirs, a Metropolitan Water Board siding branched off the Up Windsor line and passed under the left-hand span before diverging across the edge of the moor.



The short length of track shows the approximate position of the SR lines. I began by cutting away the foamboard supporting the branch track at this point.



Both faces of each girder needed to be detailed. I used pieces of 20thou styrene sheet 150mm by 10mm with Evergreen .020in by .040in strip for the ribs, fixed with liquid poly cement.




For the riveted tops of the girders, I used a Scalelink etched fret that I'd had in stock for many years. However, this is no longer available. Archer AR88025 from DCC Supplies may be a suitable alternative.



The bridge deck is a single piece of 30thou styrene sheet to which all three girders are attached. On the side where they would be visible I added 4mm by 30thou strips, evenly spaced to represent the corrugations.



Next, I test-fitted the bridge in place. As the track is curved and the bridge is straight, precise positioning will be critical. Once I was happy that it all fitted, I sprayed the whole bridge matt black.



The three supporting piers were then made up just as I had done for bridge No. 1 (MR253) using mounting card and ½ in thick balsa, cut to shape and covered with Scalescenes 'N' gauge London brick.



The piers were not yet complete or assembled, but it was time for a test-fit and a trial run before anything was fixed in place. As expected, clearances are tight and it will be necessary to keep checking as the bridge is glued in place.


The size of some 'N' gauge features can be gauged from the platelayer's hut beside this Humbrol paint tin. The hut was folded up from postcard, faced with 1/32in thick balsa and roofed with 20thou styrene sheet.



I had planned to omit the railings as I thought they would be too fiddly, but the bridge did not look complete without them. I bought some packs of very thin Plastruct strip and drew the railing on white paper.



It pays to have your reference photographs on hand before you start installing scenery. I made the slope up to the bridge double track width. It wasn't and I had to strip it out and start again!



I made up the railing on top of the drawing and assembled it with Plastic Magic liquid cement. A craft knife was slipped between the railing and the drawing to separate the two once the glue had dried.



When installing a straight bridge on curved track, it's important to check clearances with the longest items of rolling stock. Water from scenic work has damaged the brickpaper, so this will have to be re-done.



Before fitting the railing in place, I trimmed the vertical posts to the same length against the drawing. It would have been easier to paint it before installation.

AEROSOLS VS AIRBRUSHES

There's a common misconception that airbrushing provides a rapid means of painting models, in a similar manner to aerosol cans. Surely, all you need to do is point the tool at the subject and blow a load of paint at it?

That may be true of industrial spray guns working on large objects, but the typical hobbyist's airbrush is more of a precision instrument. Accordingly, we need to treat it with respect and work to its strengths.

As we'll see, the route to creating a high-quality paint finish with an airbrush involves a patient approach, especially when dealing with complex three-dimensional objects such as steam locomotives.

Targeting and regulating the paint accurately is essential, ensuring that the object is covered consistently, even into the most awkward of areas something that is very difficult to achieve with an aerosol.



It takes time to build up a consistent finish with an airbrush, but the effort is worthwhile. We can preserve fine detail relief - rather than smother it with excess paint - as is often the case when using an aerosol.




HOLD IT **FAST**

Some means of holding the model is important, allowing the airbrush to travel around the object unhindered.

Miniature turntables and clamps are ideal, with various products available. Tamiya's set is particularly useful, consisting of a pair of rotating tables with a variety of secure clamping options.








MISTING IS THE WAY TO GO

control of the painting process and avoid the risk of creating puddles, we need to regulate the flow of paint carefully. During the early phases in particular, keep the paint flow to a gentle mist - this is where the practice work with the trigger, as outlined last month, proves its worth. It's also a time when an airbrush's pre-set handle (if fitted)



really comes into its own, allowing

Always keep a sheet of paper at hand for testing the paint flow, before aiming the airbrush at a model.

Pre-set handles help to regulate the flow of paint from the airbrush. Simply dial the knob at the airbrush's tail to increase or decrease the output.



SCRAP MODELS

Hone your airbrushing skills without fear by practising on scrap or cheap models. Spare bodyshells are particularly useful, while Dapol's range of unpowered plastic locomotive kits (formerly Airfix/ Kitmaster) provide another cheap option.

Ensure that the model is clean and dry. A primed surface is preferable to begin with, rather than bare plastic, although a model's factory finish can act as a suitable undercoat for practice purposes. Aerosol primers offer a convenient option, but beware of applying these over enamel or acrylic finishes, as the underlying paint may blister.

Practice models can be painted over and over again, alternating a coat of neutral grey in between colour coats, which itself provides an opportunity for practising on.

CREATE AN EVEN FINISH



With the model securely mounted and the airbrush loaded with correctly thinned paint (MR260), set the air pressure to 15psi and begin misting the colour into the various recesses. Work about 1-2in from the surface.



Be patient, working your way around the firebox, cab and boiler. Keep the flow of paint to a minimum. Steam locomotive bodyshells are excellent practice subjects, as the intricate profile presents an interesting challenge.



Keep the airbrush moving whenever the paint is flowing, rotating the model to allow the tool to 'attack' the surface from all angles. It may be necessary to approach the model from beneath to reach the lower edges of the boiler.



Having worked your way around the whole bodyshell, repeat the process, again using a fine mist of paint. The colour will begin to increase in opacity, but don't be tempted to rush things - maintain a methodical approach.



Repeat the process until the treated areas appear about 60-70% opaque. Now, we can move the airbrush slightly further away (3-4in) and increase the paint flow a little, moving the airbrush in broad side-to-side sweeps.



Always start and end each stroke away from the model, or deeper patches of paint will appear where the airbrush has dwelt. Intersperse horizontal and vertical strokes and rotate the model to ensure even coverage on all surfaces.



Remember to move the airbrush smoothly while the paint is being sprayed, rotating the model on the turntable and varying the 'angle of attack'. Ideally, we want the paint to build up evenly across the whole model.




As soon as the paint begins to appear 'wet' on the surface, pause for a few moments to allow it to dry before continuing. Matt paints are recommended as it's easier to tell if you can continue when the surface becomes dull.



As the sheen dulls, any areas that lack opacity will be revealed, so we can start with the targeted work again, if necessary, before continuing with the overall coats. Regulate the paint flow carefully to keep full control over the finish.



This is what we're aiming for: a smooth, consistent finish across all areas. At this stage, we can allow the model to dry overnight before studying it under a light to ensure that the finish is acceptable. If not, more coats can be applied.



The same process applies to any 3D object, the initial targeted base layers ensuring that colour is consistent across the whole surface. General sweeps alone will not allow the paint to settle into these recesses without clogging the fine detail.



Some colours will take longer to reach full opacity, especially lighter shades such as blue, yellow and red. Darker colours, such as black, often take much less time and effort, as the pigment has a greater density.

When multiple colour elements are required, ensure that the previous layer of paint is completely dry before applying any form of masking. When several strips of tape are involved, seal the joints with masking fluid.



When applying the next colour, avoid directing the airbrush against the edge of the tape, lest paint be forced under the masking. When dry, remove the tape gently - this reduces the risk of disturbing the finish.



Masking awkward shapes can be time-consuming, but it's not necessary to cover the entire model, just those areas at risk of 'over-spray'. Once again, keep the paint flow to a minimum and build up the colour gradually.



Airbrushing allows the use of simple stencil masks, cut from card and held over the model, either with tape or by hand. Direct the spray from the airbrush carefully to reduce the risk of the paint working under the mask.



Card stencils are useful when a precise demarcation of colours or shades isn't a priority, especially if the model is destined for a weathered finish, which will obscure any minor imperfections.



TROUBLESHOOTING

Don't worry if things don't go to plan, as we learn best from making mistakes. What's important is to identify why something went wrong, so that we can avoid it happening again. If something does go awry, simply let the paint dry fully before rubbing the model down with fine abrasives and starting again.



Without the initial targeted work this often happens, as the paint struggles to settle around raised detail and into the recesses. This may only become apparent once the paint has dried.



If the paint finish dries to an 'orange peel' texture the airbrush was working too far from the surface and the paint dried before it landed. It may also mean that the air pressure was set too high.



Does the paint spatter from the airbrush? If so, the paint may be too thick (see MR260) or the air pressure too low. Alternatively, there may be a small blockage in your airbrush (see MR261).



If the paint puddles or runs off the surface, then it's either too thin or too much is being applied too soon.

Keep the airbrush moving and maintain a fine mist at

all times. Also, try

lowering the air

pressure slightly.

Looking at locomotives in detail

Dock shunters

Richard Foster presents a guide to the myriad hardy little locomotives that kept imports and exports flowing through Britain's ports and fed the heart of an empire.

he docks and harbours of the British Isles have always played a crucial role for trade. That importance grew as the railway network developed, and major ports were transformed during the Victorian and Edwardian era as imports and exports grew.

All dock shunting locomotives shared one key feature: a short-coupled wheelbase to cope with the tight curves of dockside track. Designers also gave their dockside locomotives large outside cylinders to provide plenty of power.

These characteristics might have been inspired by the dockside, but they were eminently suitable for all manner of locations, from marshalling yards to main works. Take Collett's '1366' 0-6-0PTs. They might have been designed for working Weymouth docks, but some class members soon found themselves shunting Swindon Works and, famously, later transferred to the Wenford Bridge branch

where their power and short wheelbase made them ideal replacements for the ageing Beattie 'Well Tanks'.

There's been a glut of miniature dock shunters in recent years. It's with this in mind that *Model Rail* presents a guide to the nation's dock shunters – dock shunter Top Trumps if you will. Plus, we've included some useful tweaks to some of the most recent...





HOW TO

TRANSFORM DOCK TANKS 1: '1366'

George Dent enhances Heljan's GWR '1366' 0-6-0PT.

eljan's diminutive GWR '1366' is a little gem and its outside motion and handsome profile gives it bags of character. The model does have a few shortcomings, however, but this simple upgrade project allowed me to address these cosmetic issues.

The incorrect GWR typeface is the most striking flaw but, after searching through prototype images from the 1950s, I discovered that No. 1370 still carried faint

traces of the GWR livery while working at Weymouth Quay.


Duly inspired, I set about trying to recreate this aspect by partially removing the GWR lettering, before applying a multi-layered weathering job. Another task that I set myself was to improve the look of the outside motion and connecting rods, which were rendered in an opaque black finish. Various shades of metallic paints created a more authentic look, aided further with weathering tones and grease effect paints. Then I added a few cosmetic touches to create a more convincing appearance of a workaday dock shunter.

Heljan's '1366' is a handsome locomotive that runs beautifully. However, this GWR-liveried version sports inaccurate legends, and the opaque black motion and connecting rods would benefit from a metallic finish.



The springs were discarded and the heads mounted into a pin vice to allow them to be dressed with needle files and abrasives - on the front and rear faces - until a superior profile was achieved.



The buffers are also ripe for improvement, being overly long and chunky. Replacement is an option, but I retained the originals after improving the head profile. The retaining lugs must be cut to free the heads from the shanks.



The refined buffers were then secured back into the shanks with a blob of cyano glue, applied with a cocktail stick. Check that the heads are protruding at a uniform distance from the shanks and aligned correctly.



T-Cut automotive finish restorer is the perfect medium for removing factory-printed characters. Shake the bottle vigorously, dipping cotton buds into the fluid deposited within the lid.



T-Cut features tiny abrasive particles that will slowly soften – and eventually remove – the unwanted characters. Work gently with a circular motion to avoid damaging the underlying paintwork.



After an overnight rest to allow solvent residues to evaporate, weathering can begin with a mix of red-brown and dark grey paints, brushed over a small area. Work the paint into and around all of the detail relief.

Once the letters have been distressed sufficiently, the surfaces can be carefully buffed with dry cotton swabs to remove any remaining traces of the T-Cut. This also imparts a pleasing polished effect.



Most of the paint can then be removed with cotton swabs, using vertical strokes wherever possible. Leave as much or as little of the 'dirt' behind as preferred. Repeat the process around the entire locomotive.



The motion and connecting rods were treated with a couple of shades of AK Interactive True Metal paints: Steel and Gunmetal. Decant a small blob of each colour onto a scrap of card and apply sparingly with a small brush.



Heljan's bell had the prominent mould seam filed away before being treated with AK Interactive's True Metal Brass shade. After 24 hours, the metallic paint can be buffed to a realistic sheen.



General weathering followed, via an airbrush, with a variety of browns and dark greys misted strategically. This refines the appearance of the earlier weathering stage as well as toning down the motion's metallic finish.



To restore an element of shine to the dull, dusty nature of the matt weathering paints, clear gloss was airbrushed gently into key areas, especially on the tank and cab sides.



The solid coal load is held simply with double-sided tape, making it easy to remove and replace with real coal chippings. Ballast Bond liquid adhesive penetrates the coal readily and will dry within a few hours.

The footplate crew were inserted into the cab, fixed with small blobs of Gorilla's new formula of contact adhesive. This quickly turns tacky, allowing for positive location of the figures. Leave overnight to harden.



Extra variation, in terms of tone and texture, was added by means of dry pigments. Applied with a soft, flat brush, shades were chosen to suggest deposits of ash, cinders, rust and brake dust.



With the blunted end of a cocktail stick, create small scuffs in the dry pigment deposits and weathering paints to mimic footprints and burnishing from rail staff, especially on the running plates and cab steps.



LifeColor's Grease Effects paints add the finishing touch to the improved motion and connecting rods. A combination of Grease Effect and Dirty Grease shades work to create the look of fresh and grimy oil deposits.



A moulded set of fire irons is supplied with the Heljan model, but I fabricated a set with a finer profile, using brass wire and strip. They were painted and weathered before fixing to the model's brackets.



A shunter's pole can be crafted from a cocktail stick. Start by shaping a length of 0.33mm brass handrail wire with miniature round-nose pliers, before fixing into a hole drilled into the end of the stick.

Whittle the wooden shaft with files and abrasive pads until the desired profile is achieved. As a guide, I kept a 'OO' gauge figure to hand, cutting the pole to a scale 6ft in length.



After adding an array of head and tail lamp lamps, as befits a working shunting locomotive, a few spare tail lights were mounted on the running plate, along with the painted and weathered shunter's pole.

ooking at old photographs of the 'J70s', the cab interiors appeared cramped even when they were empty. However, adding a set of scale figures really brought home how little room there was on the real things.

Hardy's Hobbies has designed a choice of footplate figures specifically to suit the *Model Rail* 'J70' model, sporting a variety of appropriate poses. With leaning postures and outstretched arms, each figure stands nicely within the cab confines, aligning with cab controls and/or peering around the cab pillars.

There's even a fireman crouching uncomfortably with a short-handled shovel to reach into the firebox. Created using 3D



printed scans of real humans, they're scaled accurately and are clad in realistic overalls and caps.

Available in painted or unpainted form, they're a perfect accompaniment to a 'J70' or other similar motive power. And they're available in other scales too!

The 'J70s' were like any other class, and individual locomotives received minor modifications undertaken by shed staff,

rather than a major alteration that was rolled out across the whole fleet during works overhauls.

Towards the end of steam on the Wisbech & Upwell, several photographs show No. 68225 at Wisbech shed and operating on the tramway without its side skirts. This would have been late in its career and presumably its skirts had been damaged, or possibly removed and not replaced during its time at Colchester prior to September 1951. 'J70s' working the various docks lines were not required to have the skirts fitted and it seems that the shedmaster at Wisbech was willing to ignore this aspect of the tramway regulations late in the career of the steam locomotives.









These figures have been designed by Hardy's Hobbies specifically to suit the 'J70'. You can paint them with acrylics or enamels - or buy them ready-painted.



The crew's posture allows them to fit precisely within the confines of the cabs. Drop a tiny amount of cyano on the base and position with tweezers.



The closed door moulding is without the diagonal internal braces. It can be cut down the middle and the two parts fitted in the open position. Trim a tiny rebate from the outer top corners to clear the securing hook detail.



The open doors can be secured in place by running a brush of liquid polystyrene cement down the edge. Cutting the door may have exposed the grey plastic. Humbrol No. 62 is a pretty good match for touching up the bauxite.



I found it easier to work on the ends of the model with the cab fronts removed. They are easy to refit if you insert the two tabs on the lower edge first and then press the top back under the lip of the roof until it engages.



I painted the etched frames white before glazing and fitting them in the way previously described. No. 68222 also retained its GER district allocation plate '5' through to withdrawal - it's easy to fix with a drop of cyano.

No. 68222 was the the last 'J70' to work on the Wisbech & Upwell Tramway and must have been drafted in from Colchester or Ipswich to cover for the failure of both diesel shunters 11101/2 in 1953. It gained notoriety when it ran out of water at Upwell and the crew found that there was no longer a locomotive water supply there. No doubt forewarned about the return of steam, the Reverends Awdry and Boston were on hand. Awdry dashed home to fetch his hosepipe and saved the day! By this time, No. 68222 had received three replacement sliding windows which appear white in photographs as the frames were never painted.

For us modellers, it provides the perfect

excuse to have an unskirted 'J70' with full valve gear on a W&U layout. I could not resist that opportunity and in MR-203, Model Rail provides a 'J70' in just the right state and livery. It also has the coupling safety chains which the prototype retained throughout its career, the only 'J70' to carry them in BR days. There is, however, a little tweak that you can do to the end doors if you plan to model them open. The doors on No. 68225 did not have the diagonal brace which is depicted on the open door mouldings supplied with the model. However, the closed door moulding is without these braces and it would be a simple matter to cut it and adapt it to be in the open position.






Quayside attraction

The theme of this 'everywhere and nowhere' dockside layout was an obvious port of call for retired mariner **Bob Stevens** and his friend **Ian Corps**.

f you look at a plan of any great port around Britain, Europe or the world for that matter, away from the hustle and bustle of the main terminal with its ocean liners and cargo ships, there is still a lot going on.

Take Southampton, for example. The huge ships take centre stage and the smaller ferries to the Isle of Wight and the industrial dock are the bridesmaids, rather than the bride – still important but not the centre of attention. Small wharfs and quays are the homes of the humble coasters and ships of the home trade. This is the scenario in which Ian Corps and Bob Stevens' 'OO' gauge layout 'Bosun's Wharf' has been set. Despite living in Southampton, the modelling duo have eschewed the obvious and created an 'everywhere and nowhere' wharf instead.

"We are members of the Southampton Model Railway Society and we live on the south coast of England, so we decided that our layout should depict that part of the country. However, it has no features that tie it to that location – it could represent any wharf just as well," explains Ian. "Both Bob and I had existing layouts and we were looking for a new challenge. Bob is a retired mariner with a keen interest in shipping and I was keen to build an industrial layout, so when we saw a track plan for a dockside layout we were hooked."

Sourcing the baseboards was easy, as the society had a number of surplus ones that the pair were able to use. This also made deciding on the layout's size easy, as the boards totalled 16ft by 2ft.

"We had the boards and a rough track plan but no other ideas, and then we ran into a problem...

"Bob went to New Zealand! I was left to make a start and drew the track plan onto a roll of wallpaper. Then I had to send a digital version of that, via e-mail, to Bob so he could agree to it. This meant that on his return we could start in earnest."










The cranes are both 'HO' kits, from Faller and Walthers.

What makes this layout great?

We often talk about layouts being effective at showing you where they are located with regional colour schemes and particular models, but 'Bosun's Wharf' is just as believable without a location, as it would look at home at any dock in the UK.

Bob explains how he made modifications to the Scalescenes ship: "The first ship was made as per the instructions. Then I started to think about how I could make them look different. As the hull is made up of a bow and a stern section, what would the hull look like by adding a 4in section in the middle? I made new hull sides and everything looked okay. Add a centre castle with goalpost mast and derricks and you have a different ship.

"As our layout had a tank farm, it needed a tanker, so, as I'd converted a ship by adding a 4in section, I did the same, but this time took a 4in section out, filled in the holds, cut down the sides and added pipework and hand rails. I couldn't resist some modification to the bridge and aft section as well. I find the Scalescenes models are fantastic and lend themselves to being customised."

LIGHT BUILD

Most of the buildings at 'Bosun's Wharf' are Scalescenes kits, which has two advantages. Firstly, they are very light, which makes picking the layout up and transporting it easy. Secondly, once the kit has been downloaded, it can be printed as many times as the owner likes, so any mistakes or alterations can simply be redone at the cost of some ink.

"I'd started making some of the buildings before Bob came back from his travels and we began laying the Peco Code 75 track on his return. Almost immediately we hit problems. Originally our points were operated with SEEP motors that were also going spare at the society, but they were old, and before long became very unreliable. The MERG Servo motor system was the next port of call for a trial. We got on really well with it, as not only does it work as a point motor but you can also adjust the speed at which it moves, making it much kinder on the point blades. Now the points and some of the accessories, including a yard crane, are powered through the system."

SPREAD THE LOAD


There wasn't enough space in the club rooms to erect 'Bosun's Wharf' on a prolonged basis, so Ian and Bob each took two boards home at a time, swapping where >

necessary. The work was split between Ian and Bob, with Ian taking charge of the electrics and Bob dealing with everything maritime.

"The dry dock is an extension on the original baseboard and it was Bob's idea to build it at an angle in order to accommodate a larger ship. Being a former mariner, he was able to tie the ship to the moorings using lines in the correct position, avoiding any potential 'rivet counting' criticisms. The jetty has been constructed from a hardwood which Bob bought back from New Zealand; the weeds are made from a shredded dark green washing-up sponge."

ON A ROLL

Many of the layouts showcased in *Model Rail* recently have featured water, and they have used a variety of techniques. On 'Bosun's Wharf', Bob has used something quite unusual...


"Toilet roll. Well, toilet roll and a lot of glue. First of all, PVA was spread over the baseboard to provide a surface for the roll to stick to, and then the paper was stuck to the top. Naturally, it has creases and bumps in it when you try to lay it flat, so these depict the waves quite nicely. Diluted PVA was then put over the top of the paper to set it hard before murky paint and a couple of coats of varnish provided the finishing touches. I'd love to be able to say that it was an original idea, but we copied it from a video on YouTube!"

In keeping with the theme of lightness, the ships have also been created from cardboard, again from Scalescenes, and they can be removed when the layout needs to be moved. Bob has modified them (see panel, p77) and has added extra features such as a working radar dish powered by a small electric motor underneath the baseboard.

THINK TANK

Aside from the large ships, two huge oil tanks in the centre of the layout provide a focal point. These are

with the correct pipework, thanks to the help of two club members who worked at the local oil refinery.

"They told us that the area around the tanks had to be spotlessly clean to reduce the risk of fire spreading, should it catch alight. We were quite pleased to get this information because, as modellers, the natural thing to do would be to weather everything and make things look dirty. With the information to hand we set about creating the tanks and it was here we encountered another problem. The tanks themselves were fine, but getting the correct size of former for the tanks was more of a challenge. We tried paint tins, cans of food and those rolls of sticky tape you can buy in five-roll bundles,


also from Scalescenes and have been located accurately but then we found a piece of drainpipe which was the correct size and 'looked right'."


> Ian is currently fitting uncouplers in the form of metal plates that are controlled with Bowden cable, a flexible cable which causes very little friction and can be bent around curves.


"It's more commonly used in remote control boats and planes, but I've found it a versatile product when operating the uncouplers. While I'm doing that, Bob is altering the fiddleyard board to include an extension to the quayside and a dredging platform is under construction.

"Hopefully, these will all be in place before the club's open day towards the end of June, when 'Bosun's Wharf' will be importing and exporting at full capacity." M





CONCRETE GROUNDWORK



George's diesel depot layout in MR259 looked great. How did he create the realistic concrete ground surface?
Sam Walker, by e-mail

George says: The depot's concrete hard-standing was created simply with off-cuts of Daler mounting card, which has a pleasant, subtle texture that's prefect for recreating concrete and far more effective than smooth plastic.

It's a time-consuming business to cut and shape the card to fit snugly against - and in between - the tracks. Furthermore, it's important to ensure that the card sits just below the level of the rail heads to facilitate track cleaning.

In reality, large areas of concrete are laid in sections with flexible grout added to any gaps. This compensates

for expansion and contraction or movement of the substrate. To replicate this, panel lines were drawn onto the card with a sharp pencil.

Although they were drawn with the help of a ruler, I purposely made the lines a little wobbly in places, especially where the panels intersect.

An airbrush was then employed to colour the concrete, creating shading around the edges of each panel and highlights towards the centre.

More general weathering then followed, again harnessing the special nature of the airbrush to produce a suitably dusty, grimy finish.



Artists' mounting board is about 2mm thick and is ideal for all sorts of modelling tasks. First, thin strips were laid beside the tracks to act as spacers to gain the correct height for the top layer. Don't glue them yet.



Mark out and cut the top layers of card so that they sit close to the sides of the rails. Lay over the spacer strips and check that the top surface sits just below the level of the rails. If so, the card can be glued with PVA.



When all of the card sections have been glued, clamp with a few piles of books to ensure that everything is flat. Leave overnight, before ruling thin lines with a sharp HB pencil to mimic the joints in the concrete.



Avoid creating a perfect grid pattern. Instead, the sections were irregularly shaped and the lines were purposely drawn a little 'wobbly'. Cracks emanating from the corners and joint lines add some extra visual interest.



An airbrushed mix of Tamiya XF10 Flat Brown and XF24 Dark Grey acrylics created shading, using the pencil lines as a guide, without obliterating them. Move the airbrush further away to create a diffuse mist.

Tamiya XF66 Light Grey was added to the previous paint mix and misted into the centre of each concrete panel to create highlights and to soften the effect of the darker shading.

Tamiya XF10 Flat Brown and XF24 Dark Grey were airbrushed over the track and surrounding groundwork, with a little XF1 Flat Black added for extra shading. This mix was also misted over the concrete pad.

The mix of airbrushed colours can be tailored to suit your needs. This area of concrete is less grimy than that of the diesel fuelling area, with more of the grey and light brown shades visible.

STATE OF THE PARTY OF THE PARTY

TOP TIP

Acrylic paints are less toxic than enamels, making them ideal for use when airbrushing large areas of a layout.

Technique of the month

Easy four-character headcodes



How can I change the headcodes on my old Bachmann Class 37? Rob Berry, by e-mail

The early production Bachmann Class 37s didn't feature backlit headcodes, so they're easy to modify. Gently press the clear headcode panels out of the bodyshell with the tip of a finger, then prise away the black plastic inner panel with the edge of a knife. Plenty of decal options exist from Fox (www.fox-transfers.co.uk), but I used a set of printed paper 'codes, as supplied with a Heljan Class 27. They're just the right size and look really effective. (GD)



After gently prising the panels out of the bodyshell, the existing digits can be overlaid with decals or printed headcodes. The 8T24 is cut from a sheet provided with a Heljan Class 27 and was fixed with double-sided tape.



Push the headcode panel back into position and fix with a glazing adhesive, such as Glue 'n' Glaze, which dries crystal clear. Double-check that the panel is the right way up!



The slightly fuzzy nature of the printed paper headcodes - and the misaligned digits - removes the overly perfect nature of the factory-fitted originals.



CRUELTY-FREE PAINTBRUSHES



I've just found out where sable brush bristles come from. Are there any synthetic alternatives

of a similar quality?

George says: Sable paintbrushes have long been favoured by artists and modellers owing to the superb qualities of the bristles. Sable brushes offer flexibility, longevity and excellent control, especially of oil-based paints.

Alas, sable bristles are derived from animal hair, although not from the sable, whose fur commands very high prices. Instead, Kolinsky sable brushes are made from various breeds of weasel native to parts of Russia and China.

The animals are killed for their fur, so the ethics of their production is questionable. Over the years, many synthetic alternatives have been offered, using nylon or polyester fibres (or a mixture of both), but few have matched the performance of sable.

However, more recent innovations have improved matters and a greater choice of non-animal-derived brushes has emerged. I've tried a few products recently and, so far, one of

my favourites has been the 'Simply... Gold Taklon' range from Daler Rowney. The bristles are 100% synthetic, yet offer a similar feel and performance to sable brushes. An added bonus is that the wood used for the handles comes from sustainable sources.

Daler's 'Simply...' range is affordable (certain synthetic sable brushes can be expensive), with a variety of shapes and sizes that are perfect for a range of modelling tasks. There are even sets offered in protective zip-up bags to help keep them in perfect condition.

They've performed admirably when used with enamels and acrylics and should be available from your local art supply store. This pack of ten brushes retails for £12.30.



THE RIGHT GLUE FOR FOOTPLATE CREW?



What glue should I use to fix a footplate crew into the cab of a steam locomotive?

George says: I'd recommend a slowcuring cyanoacrylate glue, such as Roket Max from Deluxe Materials. This formula allows up to 30 seconds for repositioning and produces a strong, resilient bond that's resistant to vibration and the odd knock. Faster setting cyano glues often create a more brittle joint.

Fast-setting (5min) epoxy is a good alternative, but it's potentially messier. Furthermore, five minutes can feel like a long time when you're holding a small figure in position with a pair of tweezers!



WHAT BUILDINGS ARE AVAILABLE TO GO WITH MY NEW 'J70'?



I've just received my *Model Rail* 'J70' locomotive and am planning a small Wisbech & Upwell-

themed layout. Are there any suitable buildings available?

Peter says: Depot office buildings could be found at various locations on the Wisbech and Upwell Tramway, a surviving example of which can be found at Outwell.

Dating from 1883, the single-storey red brick structure features a hipped slate roof with deep eaves. A central doorway with segmental arch and four-panel door features at one end, with two segmental arch window apertures and stone window sills on one of the longer sides.


A kit of this typical Wisbech and Upwell building is produced by Arch Laser, part of a growing range of 'OO' and 'N' gauge kits and accessories available via Osborn's Models of Bideford.

The depot kit is available in 'N' (£7.95) and 'OO' (£10.95), rendered in micro plywood. Once painted, the building looks very realistic.

PROTOTYPE QUESTION OF THE MONTH

WHY DO WELSH 'PACERS' HAVE TINTED CENTRAL WINDSCREENS?

l've just bought a couple of Dapol
'Pacers' in Arriva Trains Wales
livery. On a recent visit to South
Wales, I noticed that some of the
Class 142s now have the central
windscreens blacked out. Why was this
done and how can I recreate it?
lan Williams, by e-mail

George says: We're not sure as to the exact reason why, but the whole of the South Wales-based Class 142 and Class 143 fleets feature heavily tinted central windscreens. Presumably, it's to reduce glare within the cab, although Northern – the other operator of '142s' – notably hasn't followed suit. Perhaps the sun is brighter in South Wales than northern England!

The work was carried out by Arriva Trains Wales as part of a £500,000 upgrade programme that was completed in early 2018, just months before the end of the franchise. As well as internal and external renovation, the Welsh 'Pacers' were also equipped with free WiFi.

The simplest way of recreating the tinted windscreen is to cut and fix a sheet of black paper to the inside of the central windscreen, using a glazing adhesive, such as Deluxe Materials' Glue 'n' Glaze. Despite the paper being opaque, the discrepancy should not be too apparent in 'N' gauge.

HOW TO: ENHANCE YOUR WAGONS WITH POSTERS

Q

I've been trying to get hold of some of the Hollar Models printed wagon poster packs. Where can I obtain them,

how are they applied and how can I give them a suitably dishevelled look? Gerald Fairclough, by e-mail

George says: The Hollar Models wagon posters are now available from Wizard Models (see below). Available in 'OO' and 'O' gauge, they're printed onto self-adhesive paper and simply require cutting out with a fresh, sharp blade and fixing to the side of your chosen wagons.

There's a wide variety of posters available, for commodities such as cement, carpets, pet food, fertilisers, animal feeds, bananas and biscuits, with a host of household brand names and logos.

These posters were applied to general goods vans from the 1950s up to the 1970s and were a cheap and effective form of advertising. Prone to becoming grubby and torn from exposure to the elements, they didn't stay clean for long.

The Hollar label packs do provide a few faded labels in each set, but some extra distressing and weathering work is definitely worthwhile.

Scrunching, tearing and scraping the posters will take away the pristine appearance, while it's also viable to layer different posters to signify how a wagon has been used for several types of traffic.

The posters look especially convincing when combined with chalked destination markings (www.fox-transfers.co.uk) that relate to the advertised cargo, providing an effective means of adding character to otherwise anonymous freight stock.



If the adhesive has been compromised, add a tiny blob of cyano or PVA glue to the rear. Once in position, further distressing can be effected with the edge of a knife.





Gently scrunch up the poster between your fingers, before flattening it out. Don't worry if the ink flakes away as this adds to the distressed appearance. It's not necessary to get the poster perfectly flat.



Layering posters adds even more interest. Lightly brushing weathering powders over the surface helps them to blend with a grubby wagon.

it bigger. Are all 'OO' gauge track systems compatible or should I stick exclusively to Hornby track?

Track, Kato Unitrack, Märklin, Piko and Tillig. None of these track systems will work well with your Hornby track without some messing around.

If the geometry of the layout does not permit a specific layout, bespoke pieces can be formed by cutting pieces of either sectional or flexible track to fit. To cut track it is necessary to use a sharp, fine-toothed saw or a pair of rail cutters such as those manufactured by DCCconcepts and Xuron.



Tool of the month

Precision drills with thicker shafts

As anyone who has used miniature drill bits will know, there's a constant risk of breakage, especially

when working into awkward areas or tough materials.

Many pin vices also struggle to clamp the smallest drills securely, while use in a power drill is almost impossible.

This pack of ten
HSS twist drills feature
a universal 2.35mm shank,
with the cutting tips tapering
to a variety of diameters (0.5, 0.6, 0.8,
1.0, 1.2, 1.3, 1.5, 1.8, 2.0 and 2.2mm).

Thanks to this larger shaft, the drills can be fitted securely into almost any pin vice or power drill and the thicker material means that the bits are much less likely to break.

Able to drill up to a maximum depth of 10mm, they're an essential part of any modeller's toolbox.






ou've just surveyed your favourite stretch of railway. It's been a fun day out, visiting a much-loved haunt and absorbing the atmosphere. Your inspiration is triggered, and now you want to get cracking with the layout that you've just envisaged...


One of the main reasons for carrying out a survey is to take your research and turn it into a realistic model. But how, exactly, do you do that?

The first part is to interpret your results. Here are my discoveries from surveying Falmouth Docks.

All that remains of the station there is part of the canopy and one platform. There is a series of stanchions/columns supporting the arched corrugated roof. By analysing the space between each pair of columns, it will be easy to locate the various items of railway paraphernalia along its length.

There are 18 bays with 19 columns. These vary from 10ft 7in to 10ft 10in between the inside faces of any pair, except for bay 18, nearest the station





entrance, which is 13ft 2in. For modelling purposes these measurements could easily be rounded up or down to the nearest foot and, depending on space, reduced in number to suit a less-than-prototypical length baseboard.

All columns are wooden, except for the third one, which is concrete. There are modern Falmouth Dock signs on columns 7, 13 and 17, fall pipes on the side of 2, 6, 10, 14 and 18 and fluorescent strip lights centrally placed in all the odd-numbered bays.

From part-way into bay 11, to the end of 18, there is an English Bond brick lean-to with corrugated plastic roof. The platform, which is paved in this area, is 21ft 8in deep with edging slabs (4ft 4in by 2ft 6in) running the full length of the platform. Two seats with cast ends (one BR (W) and one ex-GWR) were provided against the lean-to wall, at the time of survey.

So what do we do with that information? If you know any of the building's dimensions, you can put together a fairly accurate scale drawing to assist your model making. What follows was all put together from my 1988 survey visit.


MEASURING UP TO THE CHALLENGE


Here are scale drawings based on my basic overall measurements, and measurements estimated from elevational photographs. For ease of construction, I recommend a combination of adapted kit parts, sheet material and ready-made detailing packs, as shown on the accompanying 3D illustration.


I've suggested Dapol's canopy end valances, reshaped to a curve, plus their front valance for the long front. Slater's 0436 or South Eastern Finecast FBS409 4mm embossed plastic corrugated iron sheet should bend easily for the corrugated roof and the wood columns and, ideally, cross-members should be made from very fine-grain stripwood. For additional strength it would be wise to 'dowel' the columns into the platform surface.


Perhaps most difficult would be the curved bullhead rail supports. I reckon it would be worth making some sort of template or former to maintain accuracy throughout the large number of components involved; 38 will be required if you're modelling a scale length canopy. Under-roof metal angle can be replicated from the Plastruct range, with guttering and downpipes from Peco Ratio 538. Colour photographs are a boon for accurate finishing, but even they can be deceptive under certain lighting conditions.


So, to clarify, all columns, valances and interior brickwork were painted cream. The corrugated roof is very dark grey, almost black, with extensive rusting, guttering in blue and fall-pipes and bullhead rail supports in black. At the time of my 1988 survey all the colours were heavily aged.





ome people are very lucky. They have the funds and resources to buy their favourite locomotive. But even these people can't have their locomotive inside their own home, where they can gaze at it lovingly any time they wish.

What if you could have your favourite locomotive, with almost all of the functions - save being able to light a fire in the firebox - of the real thing? And it would fit inside your house?

That's what Masterpiece Models produces. These aren't model locomotives; they're scaled-down

replicas of the real thing.

Masterpiece began in 2007 and, in the last 12 years, has brought us superb, museum-quality models of Stanier 'Duchesses', air-smoothed and rebuilt Bulleid 'Pacifics', and BR's 'Britannias' and 'Clans'. But it's Great Western designs that have dominated Masterpiece Models range.

It started with the 'Castle', followed that with the 'King' and has since gone on to produce the 'Grange' and '47XX', along with the '57XX' panniers, 'Small Prairies' and '14XXs'.

What we have here is

Masterpiece's latest, well, masterpiece. This is the post-war 'Castle', the '5098' series introduced in 1946 with three-row superheaters and, from No. 7000 onwards, mechanical lubricators. No. 7008-7037 weren't even Great Western locomotives as they were built by BR.

Henry Royce's famous quote about remembering the quality long after you've forgotten the price rings true here. Yes, they're undeniably more expensive than a mass-produced model from a Chinese factory, but that's not why you buy a model like this. You buy a model like this because you want the very best.

EXQUISITE DETAIL

We were given access to two
Masterpiece 'Castles'. Here you
can bask in the glory of No. 7007
Great Western, with its double
chimney, post-1956
BR emblem and,
given this was the
last 'Castle' built by
the GWR in 1946,
the Great Western's
crest on the splasher. Then
there's No. 7032 Denbigh

Castle, with single chimney and 'cycling lion' emblem.

They both beautifully capture the elegant lines of the original. They look right from every angle and, if there are any flaws, it would take the most expert of 'Castle' aficionados to spot them. The exquisite looks are complemented by the finish. Being made of brass, the paint has real lustre and the lining is very fine.

quality, the 'Castles' come fitted with DCC decoders and sound speakers. There's no need to dismantle one to access the DCC socket for, under the tender tank filler, is a button that enables you to select 'DC' or 'DCC' mode. Could we dare hope that such a feature finds its way



on to mass-produced models? It would certainly make life a lot easier!

Museum-quality 'O' gauge is arguably the pinnacle of model railway manufacturing. So why not just spend a few minutes taking in the majesty of this miniature marvel? (RF)

a look at the underside reveals working inside valve gear. Some poking and prodding reveals just how extraordinary these models are. The smokebox door opens just like the real thing with a miniature dart and locking bar. Inside is the blastpipe, steam pipes and tubeplate.

Turn to the cab and aside from all the fixtures and fittings that have been beautifully replicated, the firehole doors open and the seats can be posed in the up or down position. The tender is just as good as the locomotive and the tool boxes open too. You even get a complementary box of miniature fire irons, lamps and a bucket.

These are truly testament to the skill of the artisans in Masterpiece's South Korean factory.

SUPERB PERFORMANCE

But these models aren't just for mantlepieces - they're designed to work. The motor is what Dave Lowery describes as "the most powerful around". Denbigh Castle performed superbly on

but this is no bad thing - chances are you will need more than one of each.

Network Rail has track plans available online at https://bit.ly/30onrHF if you're prepared to do a bit of searching within the extensive documents (almost 1,000

pages) to find the section of the railway you want. These not only contain accurate track plans, but also provide details of the speed limit on those sections. From this you can determine how many of each sign you need, but also where they should be located.

The only criticism of the kit is that it's not customisable. It could be annoying if you need more of a particular sign and have to spend another £5 on another set just to get it, leaving

you with even more signs and posts that you don't need. While it isn't a perfect substitute, I used a colour photocopy of the original to get the extra signs I wanted. The quality is still high enough for a layout - you'll just need to back the paper onto some thin grey card to support it. (CG)

here's a multitude of track testers on the market and they all work in the broadly the same way: if power is getting through, the tester will light up or buzz. If there's no power, there are no lights.

We reviewed Golden Valley Hobbies' track tester back in the summer of 2017. It was a bit more expensive than other units but it features a neat traffic light system: green for full 12V, amber for 9V and red for 5V and lower. Therefore, this enables you to highlight areas that suffer from

voltage drop. Designed for 9mm, 12mm and 16.5mm track gauges, our review sample didn't sit on 'OO' gauge railheads properly.

GVH swiftly sent through a replacement unit. The contacts protrude below the plastic casing more and the unit worked much better.

I've been using this little unit on my 'Gedney' layout ever since (time really does fly). The unit is designed for both 12V analogue and DCC and will also help find problems with polarity. I've not been able to make use of the traffic lights as all three lights are illuminated under power (perhaps due to having DCC?) but the tester has been worth its weight in gold in helping to find those irritating electrical gremlins that can ruin an operating session. (**RF**)

as dust ever caused you problems? Most modellers will be familiar with the way it gets into locomotive mechanisms, on to track and all over your scenery. So, what if there was an easy way to protect your locomotives other than taking them all off the track and putting them back into their boxes every time you finish a session?

Well, Scale Model Scenery's Loco Dust Cover is one solution. Printed on to thick card, all that's required of the modeller is to cut it out and glue the tabs to create what is, in a sense, a temporary locomotive shed.

Included in the pack are two pages of shed sides and four ends – enough to make two medium-sized sheds that can hold the majority of locomotives. Some larger locomotives with tenders will need the two shed pieces joining together to make a single, larger one. The sheds are available with either a modern or steam-era decor.


Each pack also contains blank nameplates that you can label and attach to the sides, so you'll always know which locomotive each one is protecting.

They can be built in around 15 minutes if a fast-acting glue is used, and only require basic tools. If you aren't blessed with a space large enough to build a locomotive shed on your layout, but don't want to keep packing your models away, this could be the ideal solution. (CG)

Cut out the shed with a sharp knife and a steel rule before scoring along the tabs and the fold lines.



Fix the two ends to the sides, gluing each tab one at a time – ensure that it has completely dried before you start the next one.



Write the name of the locomotive you are planning to protect onto the nameplate, then cut it out. Fix it to the centre of the shed, along with warning signs as desired.

The Acquired Wagons of British Railways, Volume 2: All-steel Mineral Wagons and Loco Coal Wagons, by David Larkin


avid Larkin started this series with pre-BR brake vans (Volume 1) and has now moved on to what was, until the Second World War, a relatively small group of vehicles - steel-bodied mineral wagons.

At first glance, you might consider these to be a fairly standardised group but a complex story of attempts to modernise and improve open wagons for commercial coal traffic and 'Loco Coal' deliveries to depots soon unfolds. Using more than 200 black-and-white photographs, the author covers all the many variations of pre-Grouping and 'Big Four'

steel-bodied mineral wagons inherited by BR in 1948, private owner types and those built for the Ministry of Transport during the Second World War which later passed to BR.

Types covered include early designs from the 1920s, the famous Butterley all-steel design, the Charles Roberts slope-sided type of 1939 adopted for mass production by the Ministry of War Transport and its predecessors, and the LMS and LNER wagons which provided the basis for the standard BR 16t mineral wagon. Larger types include the various 21t private owner types, GER/LNER, GWR and LMS Loco Coal designs and the GWR 20t 'Felix Pole' fleet.

For anyone with an interest in wagons or, more generally, in mid-20th century freight traffic, it provides an excellent work of reference as well as a source of inspiration for added variety to your coal trains As well as a wide range of rare, previously



unpublished and generally high-quality images from both before and after nationalisation, the book provides full details of build dates, batches and wagon numbers.

Based on the first two volumes, this series looks set to build into an essential reference work for modellers and historians. Highly recommended. (BJ)

vo Peters' son Julian has been working towards offering his father's film archive on DVD... and the latest edition is a must for anyone with an interest in narrow gauge railways.

North Wales was one of Ivo's favourite places to film and photograph. This DVD is a 49-minute time capsule in which Ivo visits five locations, circa 1959/60 - two quarries, two preserved lines and a BR branch line! It's easy to forget that

when Ivo
visited the
Talyllyn
Railway, for
example, it was
enjoying its
eighth season
and the
Ffestiniog Railway
had only been
open for four years.

It's fascinating to see these preserved lines as they were in their formative years. But if you want an honest record of what the Vale of Rheidol and Penrhyn and Dinorwic quarries were like at the dawn of the 'Swinging Sixties', look no further.

It's actually the views of the two big slate quarries that are the most poignant as, unlike the VoR, FR and TR, the quarry railways are no more. Ivo's film is a useful resource for gauging colours and textures for modelling. This film has been remastered from the original and the picture quality is, generally speaking, very good. The narration is, on occasion, a little dull and lacks the warm, personal touch that Julian Peters gives the Somerset & Dorset volumes (Vol 1 and Vol 2). That aside, this is another worthy addition to your DVD library. Highly recommended. (RF)



inding accurate, detailed information on coaching stock has always been more difficult than it has for locomotives. More so for pre-nationalisation vehicles - until now...

However, continuing his quest to provide a comprehensive reference library for the BR era, Hugh Longworth has compiled a two-volume study of every pre-BR passenger and non-passenger coaching stock vehicle inherited by the nationalised organisation in 1948. Volume 1 covers GWR and LNER vehicles, while Volume 2 features Southern, LMS and Pullman Car Co. stock.

As you might expect, this is a monumental piece of work, covering tens of thousands of vehicles from Victorian clerestory saloons to modern post-war Thompson, Stanier, Hawksworth and Bulleid designs that influenced BR's Mk 1, as well as mail



vans, milk tanks, horseboxes, sleepers, catering vehicles and ex-LNER 'streamliners'.

For each type, there's a brief technical description, internal and external drawings, BR running numbers and dates for introduction and withdrawal. Details of rebuilding, conversions and further use in the departmental fleet are also included where appropriate. From a modelling point of view, the lists of BR numbers are a huge boon for anyone renumbering RTR vehicles or building kits and wanting to apply the correct numbers. Not only that, but the withdrawal dates give you an accurate picture of what was in service in your region during your chosen period.

For Southern Region modellers, there's also an invaluable table of BR-era coaching stock sets in Volume 2, which gives set-by-set details of the individual vehicles that made them up and how they changed between 1948 and abolition in the mid-1960s. This volume also gives a brief overview of vehicles owned by the Pullman Car Co. and used by BR, including the 1960 Metro-Cammell Mk 1 type.

For the modeller looking to add variety and interest to BR era trains, there's endless inspiration in these two volumes, but they also provide a unique source of information for an often-neglected subject. Get them while you can - these books look likely to become highly sought after. (BJ)

n the morning of Saturday
May 18, members of the Market
Deeping Model Railway Club
arrived at Stamford Welland
Academy expecting to enjoy the day
hosting its annual Stamford Show. They
were met with a scene of utter destruction.

Chairman Peter Davies takes up the story: "To walk into the hall and see baseboards

upturned, locomotives in pieces on the floor and bits of smashed scenery scattered about was heartbreaking. There was debris everywhere. We had to be really careful where we trod and pay close attention to where we were putting our feet - not just to avoid standing on models but because there were drawing pins and shards of broken glass everywhere.

"Breaking the news to the other members of the club was very difficult. Once the crime scene had been reopened by the police, we could only take one person into the hall at a time for safety (and emotional) reasons. One layout in particular took 25 years to build. Many of its buildings, as with other layouts, had been scratchbuilt. You just can't replace that work and time.

"The whole process has been an emotional rollercoaster. The trauma has been so great that some members have had to take time out from their normal day-to-day activities to help them recover from the shock. We are doing all we can to support them.

"However, the club is now looking at how it can move on from this in a positive way.


"Out of such a horrible situation, a positive sense of community from across the world has emerged. That has been truly amazing and incredibly humbling. "We have been completely overwhelmed with the support received since it happened. I've been contacted by people from all over the world with offers of donations of money, materials and stock.

"The crowdfunding website which was set up has completely eclipsed anything we could have hoped for. Initially the target was set at £500 but the total has surpassed £105,000. There have also been offers from manufacturers and across the trade to help and we can't thank everybody enough.

"It will enable us to help others and, perhaps, view the future a little more positively."

The scenes are interchangeable and just lift off when I need to use the space.










Garden variety

Present your case

If there's a locomotive that you think needs to be offered ready-to-run, here's the place to voice your opinion...

Locomotive: Class 313/314/315/507/508 EMUs

Gauge: '00'

Proposed by: Paul Harman

What is it?

A family of three-car (Class 313, 314, 507) and four-car (Class 315, 508) EMUs introduced in the mid-1970s to replace pre-nationalisation units on inner suburban services running on 25kV AC ('314', '315'), 750V DC ('507', '508') or both ('313'). Based on the experimental 'PEP' (Class 445 and 446) design developed in 1972, they were destined to be the future of inner suburban style throughout England and Scotland.

If you visited London in the early 1980s you would have seen these new EMUs in blue and grey operating out of many of London's termini from Holborn Viaduct and Moorgate to Liverpool Street, King's Cross, Euston and Waterloo. North of London, they served destinations to a little beyond the furthest reaches of the Underground, such as Watford Junction, St Albans Abbey, Welwyn Garden City, Shenfield, Southend Victoria and Southminster. They covered an equally wide area south of the Thames too. As well as London, the Class 507 variant was delivered to Merseyside and the Class 314 to Strathclyde for inner suburban services.

BREL built 755 cars in total, so they were far too numerous to be ignored as they spearheaded a smart new look to the electrified commuter railway with their unusual 'tunnel friendly' profile and chamfered corners. Later, they'd serve the North

London line from Richmond to North Woolwich and the South Coast line too.

What would make it viable?

Almost everyone modelling an electrified urban inner suburban prototype will need a train or two from one of these classes. They often run in six-car or eight-car sets so there is plenty of scope for multiple sales. They've had a 40-odd year career and are still in front line service, which makes them an essential part of the current scene. It also means that they've carried a whole host of post-privatisation liveries, as well as BR colour schemes. In fact, 313201 - the first of BR's 'second generation' EMUs to enter service - was repainted in original BR blue/grey in 2017 to mark its place in railway history. The coaches are short, at only 20m long so a three-car set will not take much more space than a modern two-car DMU.

Having to scrabble around to find suitable stock to run on 'Walford' for Channel 5's *Great Model Railway Challenge* really brought home how important a modern inner suburban EMU is and how it's an area sadly lacking in 'OO' gauge RTR. There is none more ubiquitous then the 'PEP'-derived EMUs, so whether you model DC, AC, or both, and whether your layout is big or small, there's a 'PEP'-derived EMU for you.

Can I see a real one?

Musings we couldn't fit into the issue elsewhere, but which seemed very important at the time...

I've had reason to travel to and from Eccles quite a bit recently. Although I must have passed through this location hundreds of times over the years, I'd never alighted at the station before. Despite boasting the historical importance of being one of the earliest stations on Stephenson's 1830 Liverpool & Manchester line, there is now no trace of the fine original station building, which was destroyed by arson in 1971.

However, local community groups have made quite an effort to improve the appearance of the bleak platforms, with well-tended plants and plenty of historical information boards erected.

Of special note is an attractive new sign at street level, consisting of a laser-cut alloy panel mounted to a mock sleeper background. Depicting a range of traction types associated with the line, Stephenson and his Rocket are surmounted by

what looks like an LMS 'Black Five'. I was particularly impressed by the stylish rendition of a Class 40, while a Class 319 stands atop the pile. **Th**ese EMUs are now the staple fare on the hourly stopping services between Piccadilly and Lime Street.

Hemmed in beside a busy motorway, Eccles station can never **be** classed as picturesque, but there are some interesting **fe**atures. The mothballed Weaste freight branch is still extant (looking like something from a Chris Nevard layout), along with a passing loop, and the elderly signal box nearby is still in use.

There are numerous publications available that list the locations of preserved locomotives and multiple units but, in my view, the original is still the best.

I've been after a copy of the Industrial Railway

Society's Industrial Locomotives book for ages, so I was really pleased that the IRS has just published a new version for 2019. It's significant too, for the very first edition was published 50 years ago, in January 1969 - the first full year without standard gauge steam in action on BR.

LOCOMOTIVES

What makes Industrial Locomotives great is that it lists the current location of every locomotive and multiple unit in the British Isles that's not owned by a main line railway company. That includes all industrial locations, military depots, preserved railways, museums, private collections and public spaces, such as parks and gardens. And it's not just locomotives that are included enthusiasts can even track down the location of things like Unimogs and Land Rover ro-rail vehicles.

Did you know that there was an 1893 De Winton 0-4-0VBT at a private location in Newbury, Berkshire? Or that there's a Finnish 2-8-0 at a scrapyard in Newquay? Or that a there's a former London Underground car in London's Great Ormond Street hospital that acts as a radio studio?

Or have you simply always wanted a full list of narrow gauge diesels still operated by Bord Na Móna? Or locomotives still in use by the Ministry of Defence?
