### **Skills Station**

Choose acrylic paints to match the brick and stone colours as closely as possible - any discrepancy can be disguised by weathering later. The layered reveals on this factory tower look so much better for the painted edges.

Dry weathering pigments offer an effective means of weathering, applied with a soft flat brush. Various dark brown and grey shades are suitable and they will adhere well to the matt card surfaces. Apply a little at a time, as excess pigment is hard

to remove.



Once the roof sections are installed, the building is likely to be surprisingly rigid. Finish the apex of the roof with a strip of folded ridge tiles. The exposed folded edge can be touched in with an appropriate shade of paint.



LifeColor's UA226 Terracotta is a good match for this Metcalfe kit's brickwork, with UAO71 Grey being close to the stone elements. A small brush with long bristles makes it easier to run the paint into the fold lines.



An airbrush is also great for weathering, helping to target the paint strategically in a fine mist. Again, dirty brown and dark grey shades are best. Go steady - the paint will be very difficult to remove if you make a mistake.

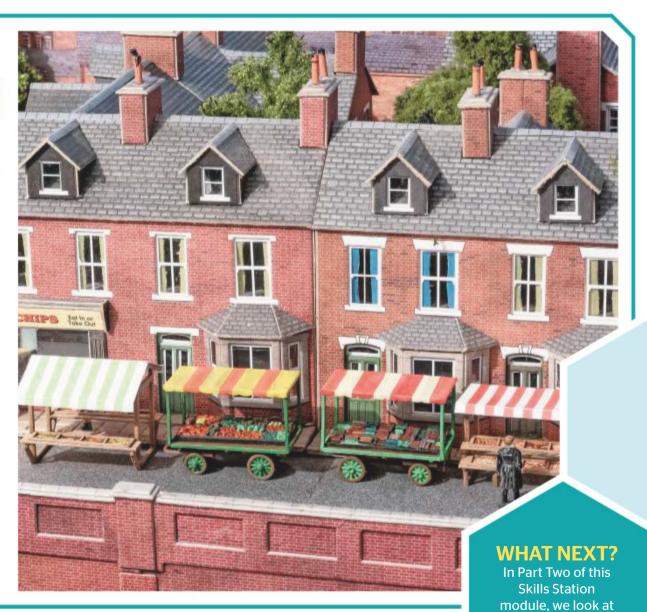


Above: The ease of assembly means that card kits are perfect for building away from the layout, perhaps at the dining room table, without creating mess or nasty smells.

To continue the slightly sombre tone, I also have to report the sad passing of Richard Strange, our historical consultant, on March 8, after a short illness.

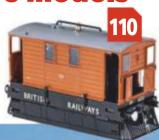

# **UP-TO-DATE 'TRACTORS'**

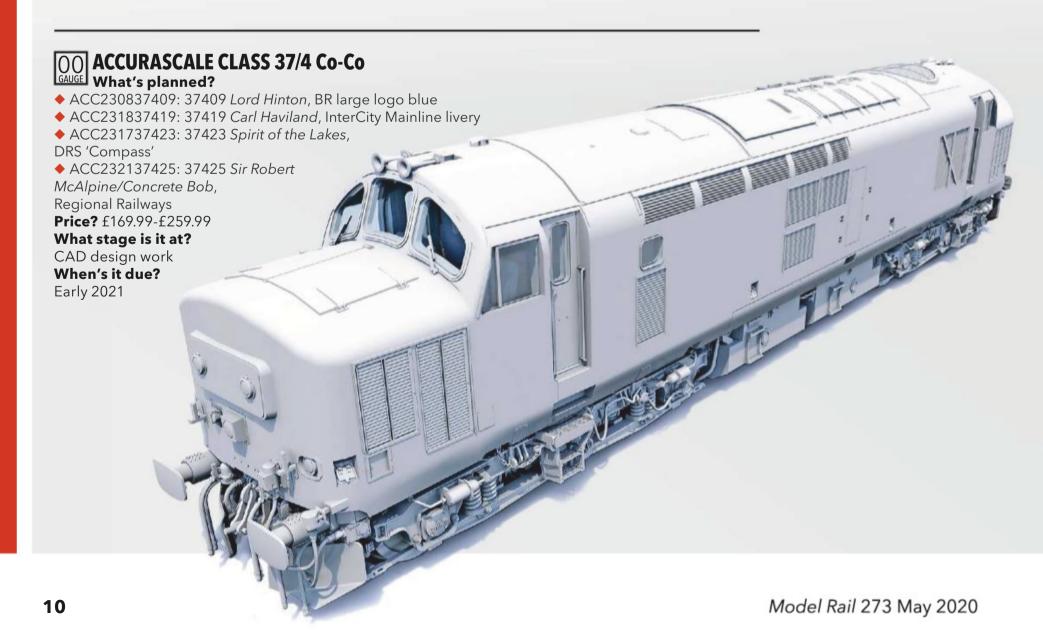
ccurascale has announced another variant to the initial production run of its all-new 'OO' gauge Class 37 (MR269). The ever-popular Class 37/4 will join the previously announced Class 37/0, 37/6 and 97/3 models.

There is a twist, however.

Accurascale is to offer contemporary '37/4s', and not as they first appeared in the mid-1980s.
These '37/4s' are now operated by DRS and the models will feature detail differences between locomotives rebuilt by Harry Needle Railroad Co. and Loram (plated-over side windows, modified tail lights and multiple

working sockets), and 37423, which was overhauled by Brush and sports plated-over headcode panels and Wipac light clusters.

The new '37/4s' will boast the same high specification as its other forthcoming '37s', with full DCC provision, lights, sound and all-wheel drive. Delivery is expected in 2021.

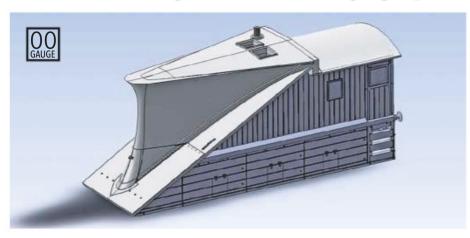




### NIU PUTS A HAND TO THE PLOUGH

### **ANGLO-IRISH MARKET FOR '330'**

OO Works' next ready-to-run locomotive is to combine its staple Southern Railway fare with its recent forays into the Irish market... this is the LSWR '330' 0-6-0ST.

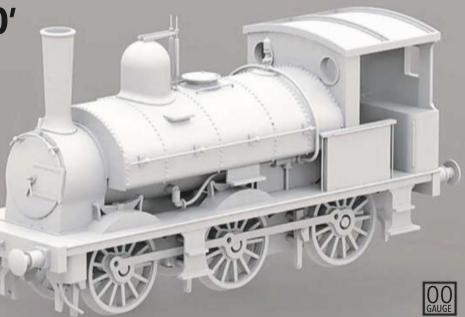
Essentially a Beyer Peacock design but with W.G. Beattie fittings, the Manchester locomotive builder supplied 20 to the LSWR between 1876 and 1882. The last were withdrawn by the Southern Railway in the 1930s, although one was sold to the Kent & East Sussex Railway in 1932 and it lasted long enough to become BR property in 1948 before it was scrapped.

A second was sold to the East Kent Railway, but this was scrapped in 1946.

Beyer Peacock supplied five similar machines to the Cork, Bandon & South Coast Railway in 1881-1894. The last were withdrawn by Great Southern Railways circa 1939/1940.

**OO** Works is to produce four LSWR '330s' in LSWR green, Southern Railway lined black, East Kent and Kent & East Sussex Railway liveries.

Two Irish versions, GSR Nos. 472 and 475, will be produced in late 2020.

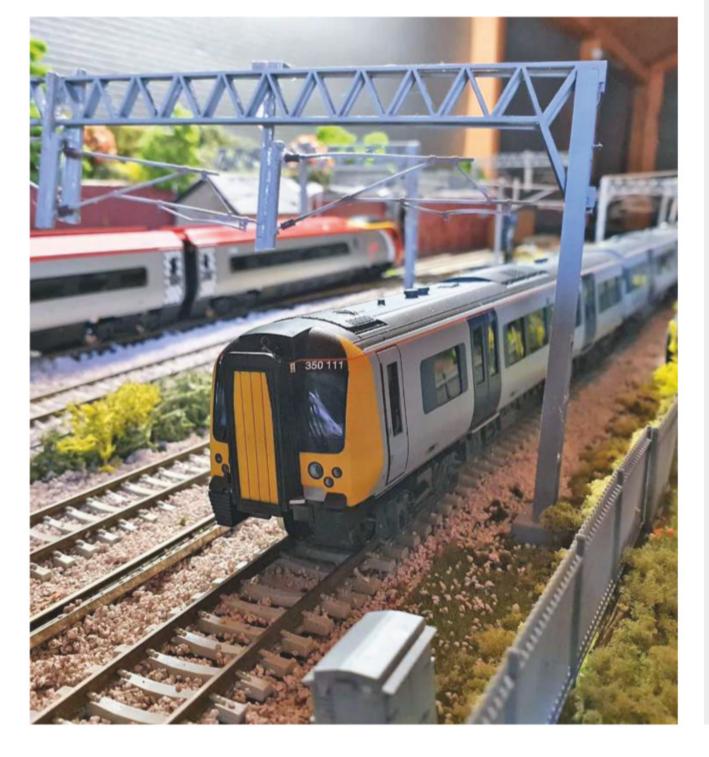

### **Concrete argument**

Can I please ask why it is that there is no sectional track available with concrete sleepers? If one purchases a train set, regardless of era, it always includes track with wooden sleepers. Yet it cannot be beyond manufacturers to produce sectional track with concrete sleepers to include in modern outline sets, and to allow their expansion by the proprietary modeller such as myself. It would simply require the production of straight and curved sections most pointwork nowadays still employs wooden sleepers.

I almost exclusively use sectional track on my projects, as I find it very easy to lay in believable and workable formations and, unlike flexible track, it requires no specialist tools to lay.

So I beg of manufacturers: please give us some sectional track with concrete sleepers.

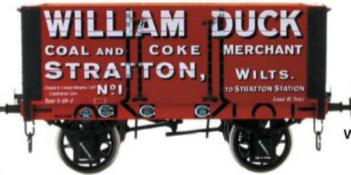

# According to Chris...

...the best laid plans are sometimes best stopped early... fter a lifetime in model railway journalism, I like to present an air of professionalism. That means producing one's written work on time, to the correct length and in house style. This column is easy. I often have several of these pages written up in advance and that was certainly the case this month. It was the first page of this issue to be designed, having been delivered by me on the first day of the production schedule.

I should have realised that I was tempting fate. My text was all about Barnwell village's Railway Children Day and about preparing my layouts for the show on May 23. It was also a preview of the event and an opportunity to publicise it. As a fundraiser for our village church, we needed it. We had a section of medieval retaining wall collapse in the wet weather earlier this year and the repair will be expensive.

In the few weeks between writing it and delivering my column, the prospects for success

changed dramatically and no sooner had my page been designed than it became clear that the Railway Children Day would have to be cancelled. It is one of hundreds – probably thousands – of events, which have fallen, and continue to fall, victim to the Covid-19 virus outbreak. I had been due to exhibit my Cornish harbour layout, 'Polwyddelan', at Egham & Staines Model Railway Society's exhibition on March 21. The society took the decision to postpone the show just a couple of weeks beforehand, at least in part because of the high number of their own club members who are in that 'at risk' over-70 age group.

That cancellation really concentrated my mind. Initially, I was disappointed. 'Polwyddelan' has spent the past two years as a talking point in the *Model Rail* office. In order to check it over and prepare it for exhibition I had enlisted help to get it home and crammed it into the last remaining room in my house that wasn't already crammed with bits of the 'O' gauge 'Railway Children' layout, receiving rather more substantial overhaul ready for May 23. I finished the preparation of 'Polwyddelan' just minutes before I received the news that the Egham show was cancelled. Disappointment soon turned to relief when I gave it some thought. At 73 years old and with a background of childhood asthma, I'm one of those who needs to be careful.

Since then, I know *Model Rail's* editorial assistant Jane Skinner has received requests to cancel several more shows from our Exhibition Diary page. The virus crisis will hit model railway clubs and model railway businesses hard. Many clubs rely on the income from their exhibition to fund their activities. I haven't been on the committee at Egham for the past

quarter-century, since I moved away from the area, but I know we used to cover the clubhouse running expenses from subscriptions and the exhibition income funded the construction of layouts. The layouts earned their keep by being exhibited. I suspect that many clubs operate in a similar fashion. Take out the exhibition and you've knocked over the first domino in the club's finances.

As I write this revised version of my page we are being told to refrain from mixing socially. For the over-70s it is suggested that they stay away from any such gatherings for 12 weeks. I know that clubs are not everyone's cup of tea. Some modellers prefer to work in isolation. The hobby is a broad church with room for all, but clubs and club exhibitions underpin the hobby in a way that the remoteness of social media cannot match. We need our clubs and our club shows and just as the hobby rallied round the Market Deeping club after its 2019 exhibition was trashed by vandals, so we need to rally round our clubs this summer. Once this immediate crisis is over, many may need some financial help and support before they can even think about putting on another show. Let's make sure they get it.

# Undernew management

After his wife Alison became the custodian of 'Lower Exbury' in 2015, **David Barker** explains the history of the layout and the modifications they have since made to the original.

had been bought a layout for a significant birthday, and when Alison was approaching one herself, there were some less-than-subtle hints dropped about that gift idea being copied!"

David and Alison first saw 'Lower Exbury' at RailWells almost a decade ago and were instantly taken by it. Alison loved its simplicity, that despite its small size, it 'looked right'. It was cleverly composed to give an impression of greater depth. As Alison's favourite operating mode is shunting, she saw it would give plenty of scope for this. They were so impressed that they invited its builder, Jo Palmer, to bring it to the Southampton Model Railway Exhibition the following year.

"We spoke to Jo at the exhibition and learned that it had been built following a Scalefour Southwest 'P4' layout challenge in 2009 with the competition concluding at RailWells in 2011," explains David. "Jo freely admitted that she hadn't done much

modelmaking before and took a lot of mentoring and assistance from friends and family throughout the build, keeping the track plan as simple as possible."

A few years later and the pair saw 'Lower Exbury' at another show with a sign on it to say that it was for sale; a few months later, after delivery had been arranged, Alison became its proud owner.

"Since only the layout was bought but none of the stock, it allowed us to slightly alter how the layout was run without making any drastic modifications to the layout itself. After all, since Jo had spent so long creating the 'P4' track with parts from The P4 Track Company and it worked so well, we didn't want to go about changing everything!"

Set in southern Hampshire just outside the small village of Exbury in July 1952, Jo had run 'Lower Exbury' as a light railway, but Alison decided to remodel it as being under BR ownership, as most of the prototype light railways were following nationalisation.

'P4' track uses a track gauge of 18.83mm rather than the 16.5mm of 'OO'.

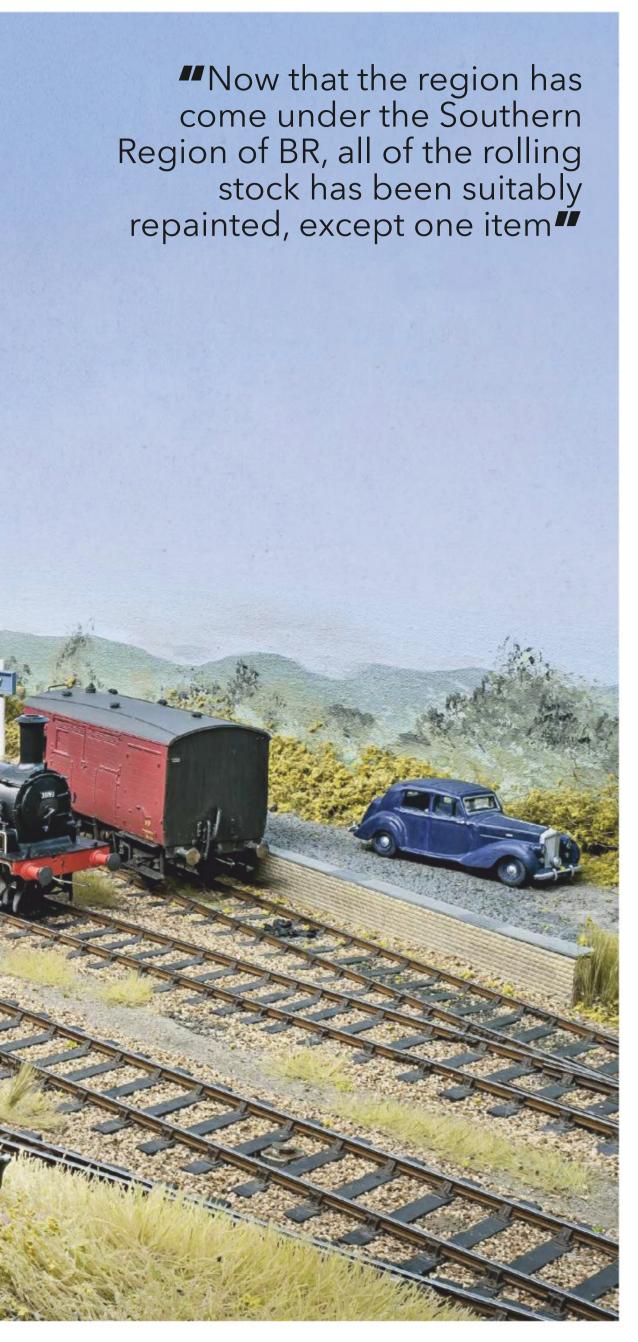
"This worked well for us as it meant we could pick and choose the stock we wanted and, crucially, locomotives which we knew would be easy enough to convert to 'P4' scale with the wider track gauge. All of them have been fitted with wheels from Alan Gibson. A couple use proprietary bodies with replacement chassis and a couple are kit-built, and all of these use Mashima motors."

### NOD TO THE PAST

While the locomotives have all changed, David and Alison have retained a hint of the layout's past with a cheeky wagon, of which head office in London is unaware!

"Now that the region has come under the Southern Region of BR, all of the rolling stock has been suitably repainted, for except one item. A lone Manning Wardle

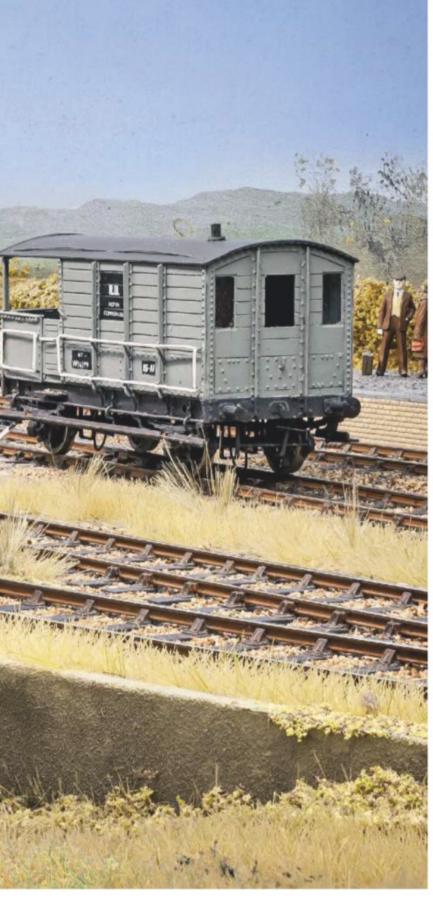
occasionally makes its way to 'Lower Exbury' with a rake of wagons from the local brickworks with a brake van still in the old light railway livery. This is an agreement the brickworks has had with the local office which works for both parties, but it's keeping it a secret from Waterloo for as long as it possibly can!"

"The size of the layout, with a scenic section of just 5ft and a 2ft 6in cassette fiddleyard, meant that building or converting stock to 'P4' would not be too onerous as the amount of stock required would be fairly small. This was our first move into modelling in 'P4'. Previously we had only worked in 'OO' and 'EM'. However, like most projects, we now have more than sufficient locomotives and stock, helped in part by a friend turning up one day with half a dozen or so wagons!

"There are three cassettes in the fiddleyard and each one is capable of holding a locomotive and two coaches, or a locomotive and four or five wagons, depending on its size. This is a very rural line terminus right near the south coast; there is never going to be a large amount of traffic at any one time, which suits us completely."



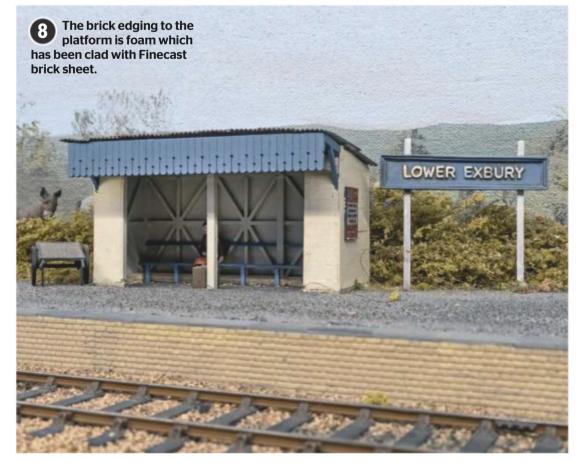

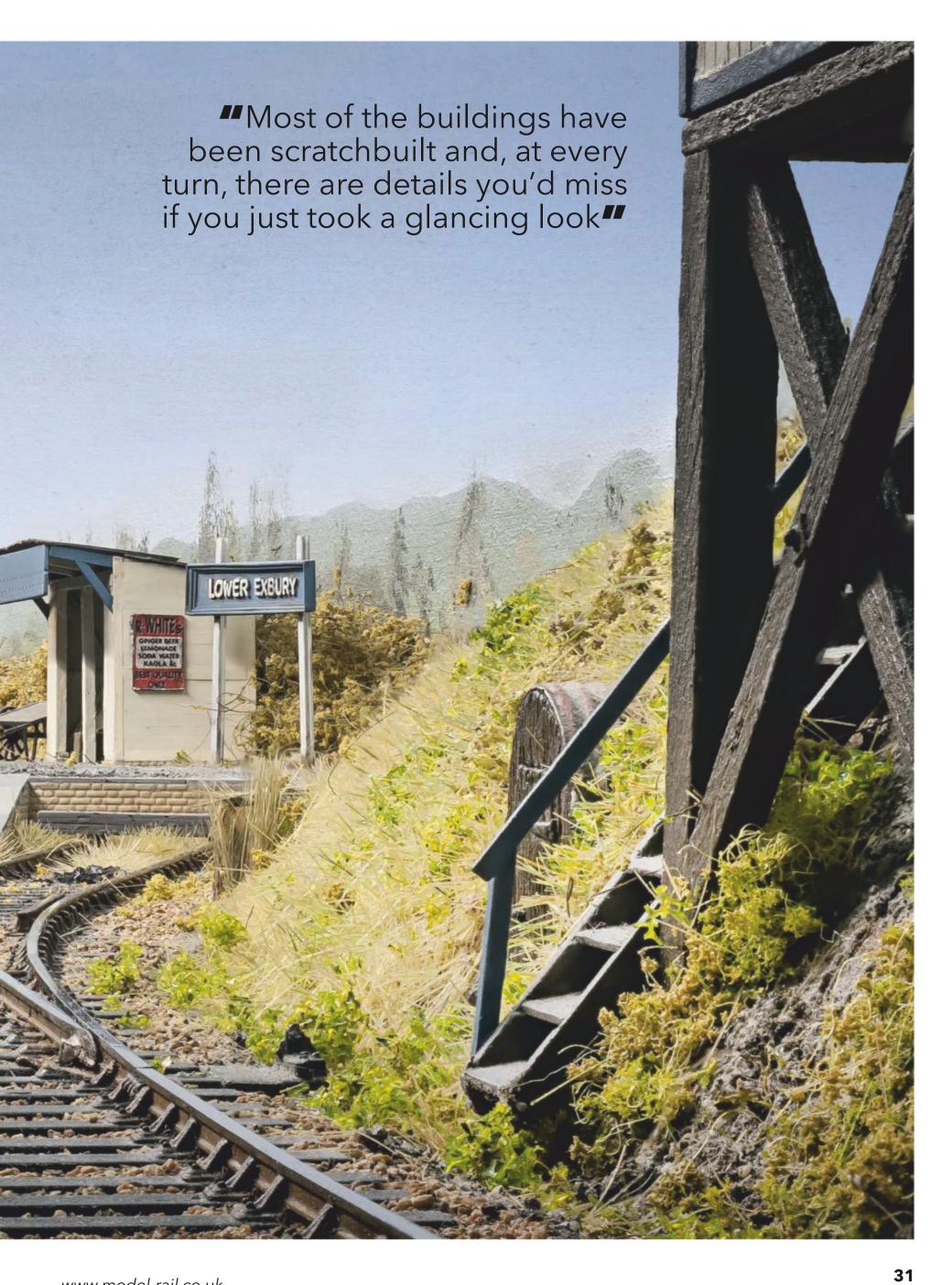

### PAINSTAKING DETAIL

It's not just the hand-built track which makes 'Lower Exbury' such a good layout. Most of the buildings have been scratchbuilt and, at every turn, there are details you'd miss if you just took a glancing look. The cobbles, for example, have been painstakingly hand-scribed into Artec coving adhesive with a scribing tool and a compass. The DUKW, a Second World War amphibious vehicle, abandoned out of the water now that its services are no longer required, is an Italeri kit in 1:72 scale, the backscene is hand-painted, the crane a Wills kit and the grounded body is from Ratio. Everything has been carefully crafted, despite the time constraints that Jo faced in getting the layout completed ahead of the exhibition in 2011, and this has been carried forward into David and Alison's tenure.

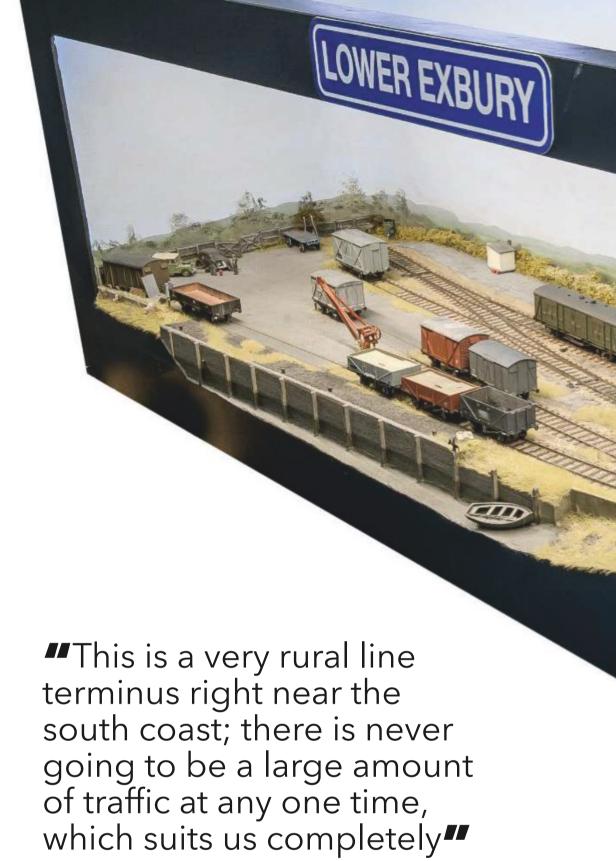

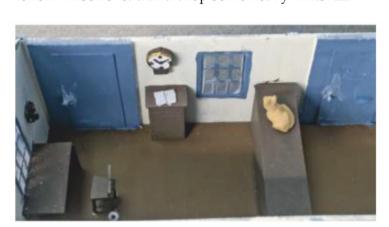

"It needs to look as good as it possibly can, and that means not having a large hand appearing in the sky to uncouple wagons and coaches. We use Alex Jackson couplings and electromagnets between the tracks in significant positions to do the uncoupling. The advantage of these is that we can switch them on and off so that they don't have an effect when we don't want them to, and this helps a lot. The only problem is that there is one permanent magnet which can be a bit of a pain at times, but after so long with the layout we've learned to cope with it until it eventually gets replaced."

David and Alison were fortunate to discover 'Lower Exbury' for sale at an exhibition which set them on the path to owning and exhibiting it themselves. If ever you need an excuse to visit your local exhibition this is surely it; you might find a gem of a layout with a 'For sale' sign on it that needs a new home. And if you want someone to buy it for you, just make sure that you follow Alison's lead and drop some heavy hints!

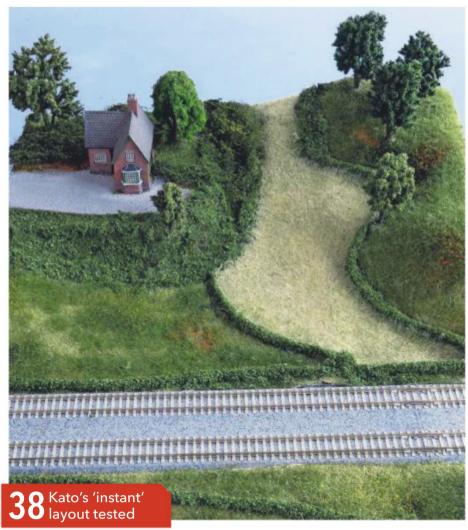

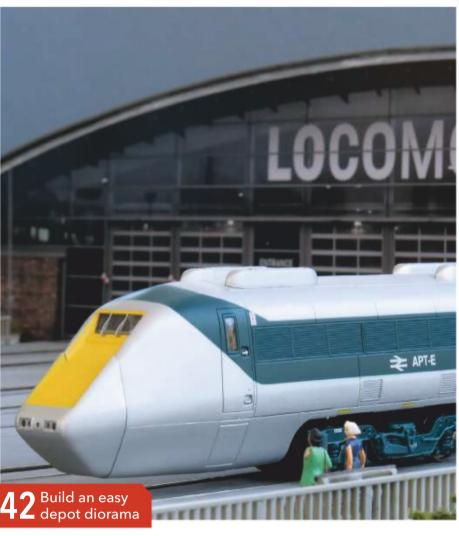

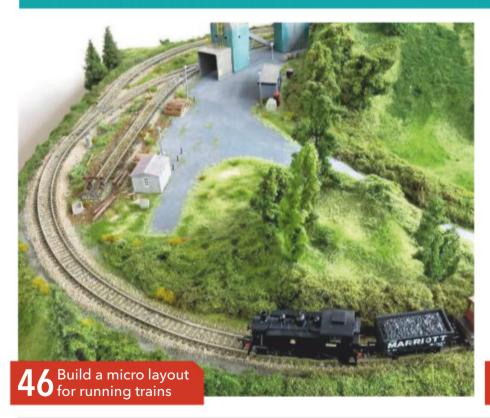

# BUILD A LAYOUT... ON A DINING TABLE!

Peter Marriott tries out a T-Trak module and finds it a very accessible introduction to layout construction.

ou need loads of space for a model railway, yes? Even a modest, Nevardesque job will still require something like a 3ft by 1ft space. But what if you could be given everything you need to build a small diorama in under 40cm? That's right, a space just a little more than the size of an average ruler. And what if you were able to buy everything you need to get this project off the ground for under £50? Say hello to Kato's T-Trak modules.

T-Trak is a modular 'N' gauge modelling 'family' for want of a better word. It originated in Japan and is now popular the world over. You build dioramas on a standard sized baseboard with strict instructions on where to place the track. Other than that, you can decorate your diorama how you wish.

The idea is that you can couple multiple dioramas together to build a complete layout. Such is the popularity of T-Trak that modules from all over the world could, in theory, connect together.

Famed Japanese manufacturer Kato has joined forces with Woodland Scenics to produce T-Trak kits. There are two types straight and corner - and they clip together using Kato's Uni-joiners to make larger layouts.

For just under £50 you get a 300mm by 360mm module that contains baseboard,

track and landscaping materials. All that's needed to complete the scene is your imagination - you decide on how you want the scene to look.

The modules are designed to fit on tables but could just as easily be setup on any flat surface. As the baseboards are so small, they are easy to assemble, dismantle, move and store. Yes, you need to supply your own scenic and detail materials, but these new kits are a brilliant way of getting into building layouts.

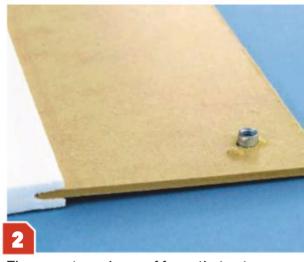

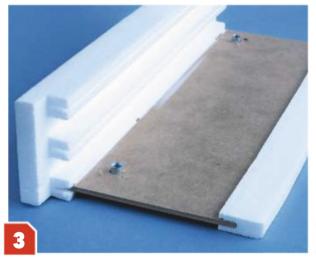

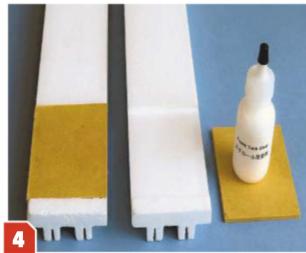
It may be necessary to smooth some of the edges of the hardboard pieces. I found that this was the case and used a sanding board to give the boards the once-over before I started.



There are two pieces of foam that act as bracing for the two pieces of hardboard. Slide them onto the two pieces of hardboard.



Now slide both hardboard pieces into their respective end boards. Use the lower groove and ensure that the protruding ends of the levelling screw threads are upwards, as shown.



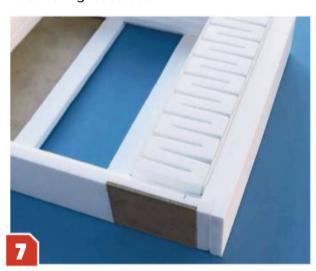
The two small squares of hardboard fit into indents on the two side pieces. Use Foam Tack glue to fix them into their respective indents.



Glue all four corners of the profile boards together, ensuring that the joints are at right angles. Leave it to dry for 24 hours if possible, but overnight at least.



Cut two notches in the ends of the riser piece using a sharp knife. These notches accommodate the levelling bolts that screw into the holes in all four corners.



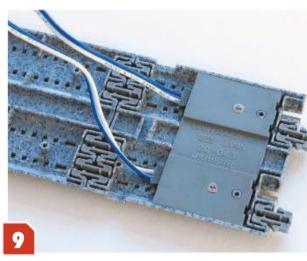
Fit the riser inside the front edge of the baseboard. It needs to be perfectly flush with the edges as any discrepancies will make it harder to connect modules together.



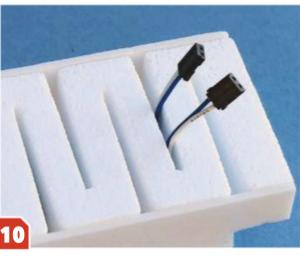
Mark 38mm from the long front edge of the profile board to locate the track. Measure twice to ensure accuracy - misaligned track will cause problems with other modules.

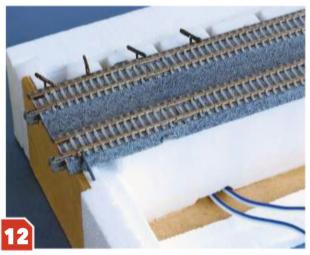
The power feeds connect to the shorter of the two supplied lengths of track, using two clips on the underside of the plastic ballast. Ensure that the clips are on the right way around.



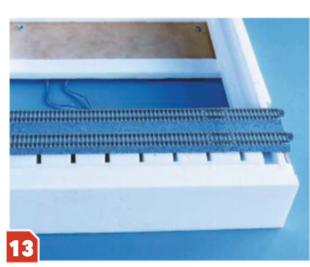
Run the power feeds through the third gap from the end (not the second as shown here). Connect them to the track and fix the other end of the white connector to the baseboard.



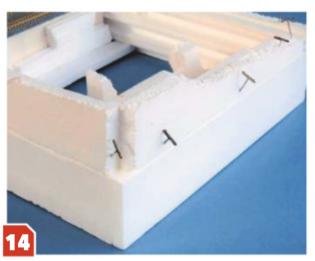
Glue the track in place, ensuring that it fits precisely within the marks made earlier. Also ensure it is fitted centrally on the baseboard. Leave it all to dry until the next day.



Cut a small gap in the base of the foam support for the track to thread the connecting wires from the underside of the track.



This is the completed module. It's a sturdy structure capable of being handled without falling apart. Now you can start on building the scene how you wish.



I found some spare scraps of foam and glued them to the sides and edges of the scene to create some additional height and avoid a 'billiard table' diorama.



I cut away some of the hard foam so that the land in front of the lines was not just flat. To shape the Profile Boards, use either a foam knife or a hot foam cutter.



Cut the Shaper Sheet slightly larger than the area to be modelled. Shape and scrunch the sheet into desired shape, remove any excess and glue it furry side up.



With all the Shaper Sheet in position and dry, cover the track with DIY masking tape before using a houseplant water sprayer to lightly dampen the Shaper Sheet.



Mix 2½ parts plaster to 1 part water, stirring to form a mixture that's smooth and creamylooking. Easy-to-clean mixing pots are supplied in the kit.



Use the supplied spreading tool to apply the plaster. Try to achieve an even layer of plaster, but if there is the odd small bump it doesn't matter. Leave to dry.

In one corner I decided to build up a raised section to accommodate a house and driveway. I made this from a piece of mounting cardboard resting on a piece of hard foam.

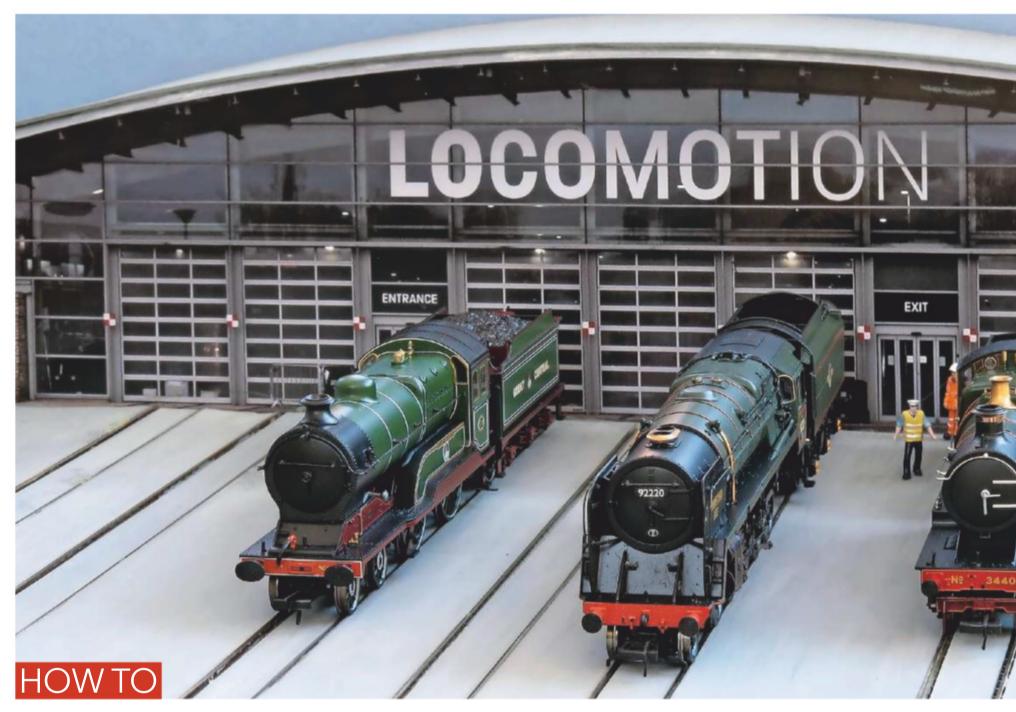


To blend this into the rest of the landscape, I cut pieces of plaster cloth and, having wetted them, stuck them onto the landscape.



When dry, I painted the whole scene with Woodland Scenics Earth Colour green applied with a 2in household paintbrush. Now you're free to add the final scenic details.





# BUILD A DISPLAY LAYOUT

**Peter Marriott** formulates the ideal layout for legitimately displaying all of your model locomotives, regardless of era, mode of traction or origin.

et's face it: whether we're 'N' gauge or 'OO' aficionados, steam or diesel enthusiasts, or fans of the rural branch line or the bustle of the main, the one aspect of railway modelling that unites us all is that we all have more model locomotives than will fit on our layouts.

The usual solution is to build a depot layout. But what if you don't have the money or skill to build such a layout? What if your collection is so broad that you need more than one to show off all your locomotives?

This is the answer: a display diorama that takes up the minimum amount of space, and thanks to the joys of digital photography, can be built over a weekend.

Can it really be 12 years since Bachmann dazzled us with the stupendous prototype *Deltic* it produced for the National Railway



Museum? Since then, any new tooling associated with the NRM has always been something a bit special. Remember Bachmann's *City of Truro*, Midland 'Compound' and *Butler-Henderson*, not to mention Rapido's APT-E and Stirling Single? Even the forthcoming SECR 'D' from Dapol seems to be keeping up with that tradition.

The NRM collection really required a suitable display space to show the locomotives at their best. But the NRM at York has only one track into the museum itself.

Locomotion, the NRM's Shildon outstation, has seven approach tracks, set in a concrete apron, plus a running line behind. This makes

it a much more modellable location.

Due to the limited size of the baseboard – 81cm by 40cm (roughly 2ft 6in by 15in) – I could only model the front of the museum building. This is what makes such a diorama so easy. Rather than go to a lot of effort painstakingly recreating the Locomotion frontage, I used a photograph.

You can, of course, use a photograph of any location you want, from a modern diesel depot to a two-road steam shed. The only difficulty will be getting a square-on, obstruction-free photograph and you'll more than likely need permission to photograph the location of your choice.

Once you have your photograph, it's easy enough to turn it into something you can use on a model. I took my photograph on a memory stick into my local branch of Jessops and

### Factfile: Locomotion, Shildon

Sedgefield Borough Council offered the National Railway Museum a brownfield site with a long railway history and a rail connection, as part of the NRM's plans to put under cover, 70 items of rolling stock which was then in unsuitable storage. Since it opened in 2004, Locomotion has established itself as one of the biggest tourist attractions in the

North East and the most visited museum in County Durham.

Locomotion is now home to 'V2' Green Arrow, the gas turbine APT, Deltic and 'Battle of Britain' No. 34051 Winston Churchill, among others. It's also home to the NRM Conservation Workshop, café and gift shop, as well as Locomotion Models (www.locomotionmodels.com).

had an A2 print made. It cost just £15 and its semi-matt finish worked well on the project.

I toyed with locating the building at one end of the diorama, but that would only allow the central part of the structure to be modelled and, after a little bit of experimentation, I decided it would that it would be better to model the building lengthways, slightly off-centre and at an angle. The two main lines outside the perimeter of the museum could also be included on the baseboard, albeit with only enough room for one locomotive on each line, but that still meant ten models could be displayed at any one time.

The first stage was to remove the sky and the foreground from the photograph. I used a Swann-Morton knife with a new blade and a steel ruler over a self-healing cutting board.



I fixed the backdrop onto a piece of 5mm white foamboard using Woodland Scenics Scenic Glue. I used a flat paintbrush to spread a thin layer of glue on the reverse of the photograph.



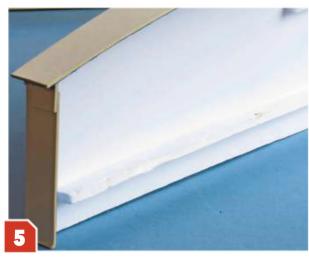


I carefully smoothed the picture down with my hand to ensure there were no air bubbles under the photograph and, when satisfied, left it to dry.

I added a short section of roof made from mounting card and painted it with Woodland Scenics Slate Grey. The roof keeps the photographic frontage nice and flat.



I also added a long strip of foamboard as a support to ensure that the piece remained flat, plus some mount board sides. Then, when dry, I glued the building to the baseboard.



I then glued seven lengths of Code 100 track to the board, running a bead of glue along the underside of the sleepers. When dry, I painted the rails brown to 'weather' them.



The concrete apron was made from layers of mount board, built up to the tops of the sleepers. A final layer filled between the tracks. Leave room for the model's flanges.



Creating the concrete apron required a lot of mounting cardboard and it took quite a bit of adjusting to get it looking right! Use a black felt pen to colour the edges of the card.



With the card fixed in place with Scenic Glue (and dry), I mixed some brown and grey acrylic paints to match Locomotion's concrete. It took a couple of coats to cover the card properly.



Use Deluxe Materials Create and Shape to fill any tiny gaps between rail and apron. Put some on your fingertip and run it along the gap, leaving it to cure for a few hours.



Use Tamiya finishing paper to smooth the top surface. Then apply a second coat of paint (I added a little more grey to the mix).



I used the Swann-Morton knife (with a fresh blade) to cut the track inserts. Make sure you leave an adequate flangeway. Glue in place, allow to dry, and paint.





Once the paint had fully dried, I gently rubbed a piece of Tamiya finishing paper across the apron. This removed a slight sheen and the result was more pleasing to the eye.

I had space to include a representation of the Locomotion running line, plus the Bishop Auckland branch, in the background. Ballast is Woodland Scenics Fine Brown Ballast.



With the ballast tidied, I used a Deluxe Materials' spray bottle to cover it with a mixture of water and a few drops of washing-up liquid.



Use a pipette to apply Woodland Scenics Scenic Cement. Work carefully and allow the glue to slowly penetrate the ballast. Avoid the temptation to squirt the glue into the ballast.



I filled the spaces between the track and other bare patches with various **Woodland Scenics Fine Turf and** ballasts. This was all fixed down with more Scenic Glue.





The diorama required minimal detailing: Wills palisade fencing separates the main line from the Locomotion site (fixed with small holes filled with glue).



A tourist attraction such as Locomotion requires people: I used Woodland Scenics 'HO' and Bachmann 'OO' figures (kept apart), fixed with a blob of Scenic Glue on each foot.



The Bachmann Scenecraft wooden post yard lamp gave the diorama some height. Its chunky base was hidden under Woodland Scenics Fine Turf and Clump Foliage.



The finishing touch was to glue pieces of mounting card to each of the sides of the diorama. I used DIY masking tape to hold the cardboard in position as the glue dried.

# BUILD A MICRO... FOR RUNNING TRAINS

What if you want that quick modelling fix of a compact layout, but then just want to watch your miniature world go by? **Peter Marriott** has the answer.

egular readers will know that we love a good micro layout at *Model Rail*. They're quick to build, easy to store and just big enough to cram full of top-quality scenery - what else could you want?

Well, there's the simple joy of sitting back and watching trains running through a landscape.

Shunting puzzle layouts or scenic dioramas are perfect for those who enjoy building them, but most people get into the hobby because they just want to run trains. This is the crux of the issue - to run a layout with a little interest on it requires space.

This set me thinking: is it possible to build a small layout, with all the plus points of a micro layout, but on which you can simply let the trains run around?

That's what you see here: a 4ft by 3 ½ft layout that's lightweight, easy to move and store, easy to set up and that has lots of play value.

My layout turned out to be a lot of fun to build. It's easy to carry around the house and within five minutes of taking it out of the garage I can be playing trains. Surely that is what the hobby is all about?

Mine is a relatively simple affair - why not see where your imagination will take you?

### 1. The track plan

I started with the simple oval of track that you might get in a basic train set. Then it was a case of deciding what to add. I could have added a small passing loop or various configurations of sidings. I settled on adding two points and two sidings to the basic oval. Essentially, what I've added to the basic oval is Hornby's Track Extension Pack F, which retails for £32.55.

### 2. The layout plan

As Paul Lunn will tell you, it's all very well designing a trackplan but you need to give simultaneous consideration to how the layout will look.
Although my layout only measures 122cm by 105cm, it looks a lot bigger because I've tried to use the landscape to hide the fact that this is a small area.

Therefore, a ridge of high ground divides the layout into two sides. The landscape would fall away under the track base on one side, while a short tunnel in one corner would hide the train from view for a few seconds. The sidings would serve an industry while



some sort of curved bridge would add interest and make better use of the available space.

### 3. Quick baseboards

I didn't fancy messing around cutting and screwing bits of wood together to build a baseboard. Instead, I used Sub Terrain System from Woodland Scenics, which is an extensive range of hard foam (expanded polystyrene) pieces that enable you to build a sturdy yet lightweight base. It took about three hours to build using a low-temperature glue gun and a sharp blade. I built the landscape at the same time, using Woodland Scenics Risers.



### 4. Quick electrics

A simple layout such as this requires a simple controller. If you've used a train set as the starting point for this project, the set's controller will be adequate. If not, a simple analogue controller, such as Gaugemaster's Combi, retails for just £45. I fancied using DCC on this layout as it would enable me to have one train running around the oval and another shunting in the yard. I used this simple Bachmann DCC controller from a train set, and you can buy something very similar for under £135 (www.gauge master retail.com).

There's no need for any elaborate electronics on this layout - just a power feed to the main oval and then a pair of feeds to each of the two sidings.



### 5. Quick tracklaying

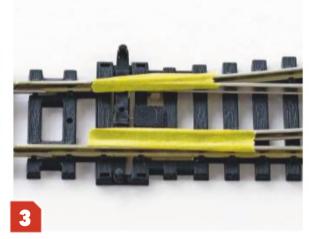
Code 100 track may look a little clunky when compared to finescale, hand-built stuff but it can, with a little work, be made to look perfectly acceptable. It's also easy to lay. Here's how I did it:



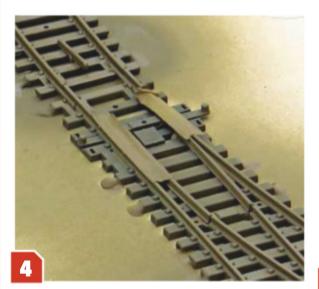
Use Woodland Scenics Foam Nails to secure the track to the foam base. Using the pre-drilled holes in the sleepers works well.



Apply a drop or two of Woodland Scenics Scenic Glue to the outside edge of the sleepers at roughly 10cm intervals.



With the glue dry, mask any moving parts of the points. Tamiya low-tack masking tape is perfect for this job.



Give the track a good coat of Humbrol 29 and the surrounding trackside.



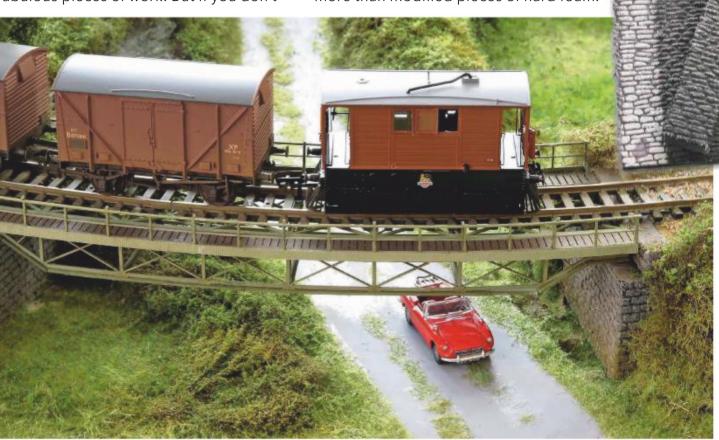
brown aerosol. Ensure you cover the sleepers Less than 15 minutes after spraying the paint, I removed the masking tape and then gave the rail tops a good scrub with a track cleaner. Now you're ready to ballast.

### 6. Easy infrastructure

You can - and many modellers do - spend ages building perfect replicas of key railway infrastructure, such as bridges and tunnels. You only have to scan the layouts in *Model Rail* to see some fabulous pieces of work. But if you don't

feel you have the time and skills to produce something of this quality don't worry - there is a huge range of kits available. The bridge is a Noch laser-cut kit while the tunnel portals are nothing more than modified pieces of hard foam.

### 7. Easy landscapes

This layout leans heavily on Woodland Scenics products. That's because the US manufacturer not only offers a complete landscape building system but it's incredibly simple to use. It features some innovative components such as Shaper Sheet, a strong and pliable sheet that you scrunch to form a landscape, and it holds its shape. Cover this with Shaper Sheet Plaster, which bonds to Shaper Sheet's fibre mesh to create a hard and permanent shell.



I cut sections of Woodland Scenics Shaper sheet to build the landscape between the foam foundations. Scrunch it to shape and then glue in place with Foam Tack glue.



With the glue dry, I covered the Shaper Sheet with Plaster Cloth to give additional strength. This was necessary over the tunnel area to maintain strength but keep the weight down.



The white plaster cloth has been painted using a Humbrol Acrylic Green acrylic aerosol - this cuts down on modelling time! Work in a well-ventilated space.



Woodland Scenics Ready Rocks are perfect for adding some variation to the landscape. They come ready-formed and pre-coloured, so they're very quick to install.



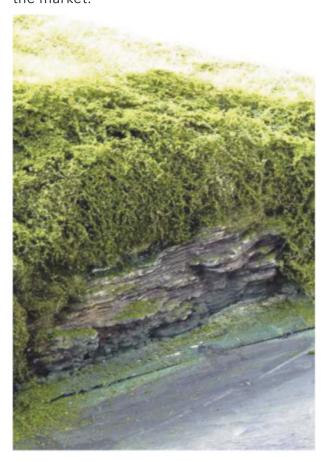
Stick the rocks in place with Woodland Scenics Scenic Glue. Blend them into the landscape with Plaster Cloth. Add a little variation to the colour with Earth Colors paint.

### 8. Easy scenic

Regular readers will know that it doesn't take very long to create basic greenery, thanks to the vast range of products on the market.





Dribble Scenic Glue glue over the landscape and spread with a wide paintbrush.



Then give the Poly Fiber a good spray with some unscented extra-hold hairspray.



Tease out pieces of Poly Fiber with your fingers and press into the wet glue.



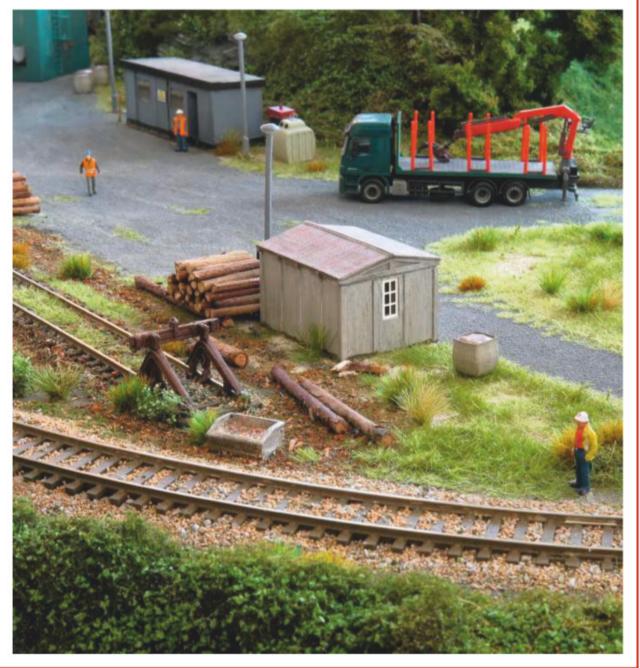
Gently shake Woodland Scenics Blended Turf over the wet sprayed adhesive.

### 9. Easy buildings

Card kits, plastic kits, scratchbuilding... there are many options for model buildings. I'm quite an impatient modeller so I opted for some resin buildings. I could have filled this space with any sort of industry, but I had these Bachmann Scenecraft cement works buildings in stock. I added a further 'industry' - in this case a small timber loading sidings, complete with a scratchbuilt stack of timber.

# BUILD A CHEAP DIORAMA

Peter Marriott up-cycles a piece of old flat-packed furniture into the basis of a diorama.

lat-packed furniture - it's the bane of most of our lives. It's difficult to assemble, isn't very robust and still seems pretty expensive.

Like many people, I had an old Ikea bookcase that had seen better days. I dismantled it with a view to taking it to the local tip... but then I realised that one of the shelves could become the basis of a small, cheap diorama.

It goes to show just how expensive this hobby can be – I spent nearly £100 on four Sommerfeldt catenary masts and wire, Woodland Scenics Risers and Shaper Sheet, Peco track, Noch trees and a station building,





not to mention adhesives, paints and scatters and other assorted scenic items. Obviously, I could have saved money by using as much second-hand material as possible, but sometimes the quality of second-hand scenic items can be a bit questionable and I wanted this to look as good as possible. I also spent a bit more on some detailed specimen trees from MBR, two Noch Profi trees and various station accessory and detailing parts from Bachmann Scenecraft.

I'm really pleased with how my little diorama turned out. I only worked on it sporadically, so it took about a month to complete but, despite not being the cheapest project I could have undertaken, it was fun and has given me a quality little backdrop against which I can take photographs of my collection of rolling stock. Plus, I felt really good about recycling a piece of furniture that otherwise would have ended up in landfill.

If you have a piece of flat-packed furniture that seems destined for the tip, see if you can use it for a diorama - you'll be pleased that you did!

The starting point for this project: a 94cm by 32cm pine shelf from an old lkea bookshelf. It's the perfect starting point for a small diorama... cheap and light but just a bit flat.



I cut the Risers with a Woodland Scenics Foam Knife and fixed them to the shelf with Woodland Scenics Foam Tack Glue.



I used some lengths of 19mm deep Woodland Scenics Sub Terrain Riser to raise the trackbed from the shelf. I then laid a small piece at 90° to form a road.



I laid some riser on its side around the edge of the shelf to support some rising scenery. I used the foam knife to chamfer the sharp edge, to make the 'slope' more realistic.

The gaps in the riser are not suitable for a railway track bed or a road. No bother - cut some mounting card to the shape of both and fix in place with Foam Tack Glue.





Woodland Scenics Shaper Sheet enables most types of landscape to be made quickly and it's also lightweight, which is perfect for a diorama such as this.



Scrunch the Shaper Sheet with your hands and keep working it until you are satisfied with its appearance. Cut off any excess material with scissors and save for later use.



Place the Shaper Sheet where you want it to go. Then lay pieces of wet plaster cloth over the top. Shaper Sheet's mesh bonds with the plaster to create a hard and permanent shell.



It took just five minutes to give the whole scene a blast with some discount store light grey acrylic aerosol. When dry, I painted the road with Woodland Scenics Asphalt paint.

I laid and ballasted the track using the same technique as on p45. I added foliage and undergrowth by teasing out pieces of poly fibre and sticking it into wet white glue.

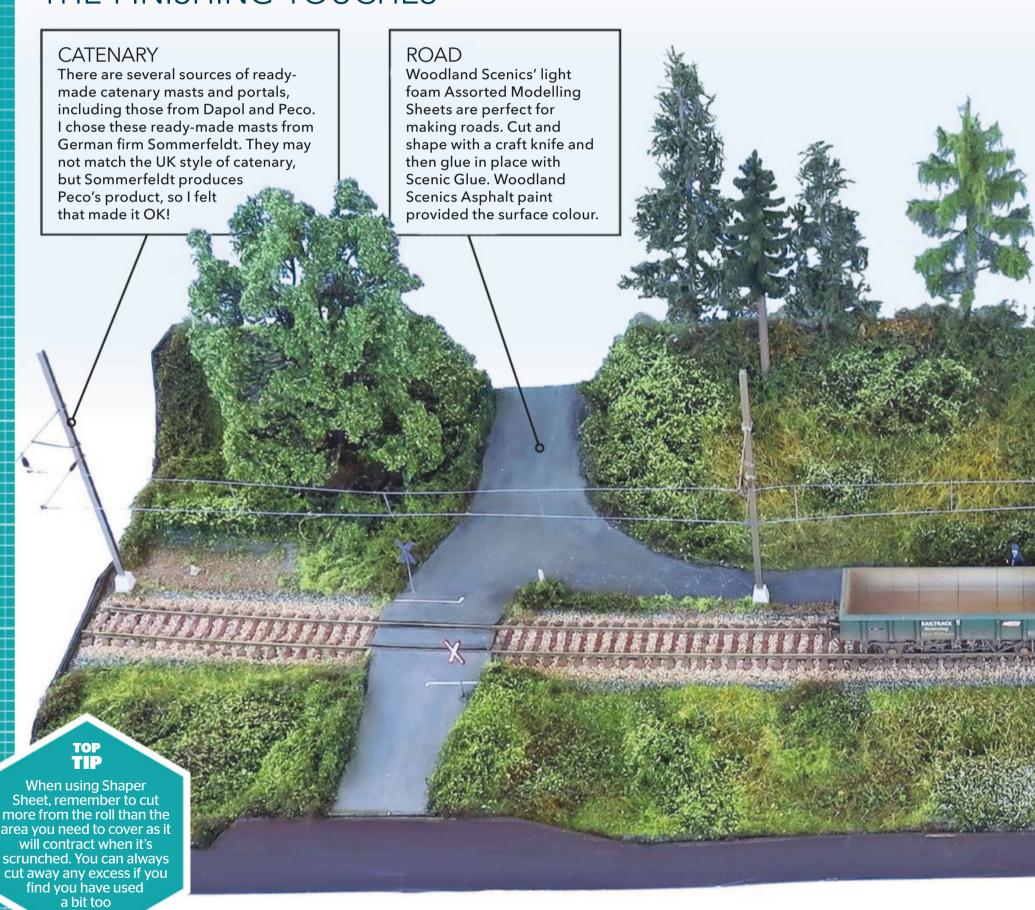


I dotted blobs of Woodland Scenics Foam Clusters to the landscape. This will help make the subsequent layers of static grass more visually interesting.



When dry, I sprayed the poly fibre with strong, unscented hairspray and then sprinkled on Woodland Scenics Blended Green Fine Turf.

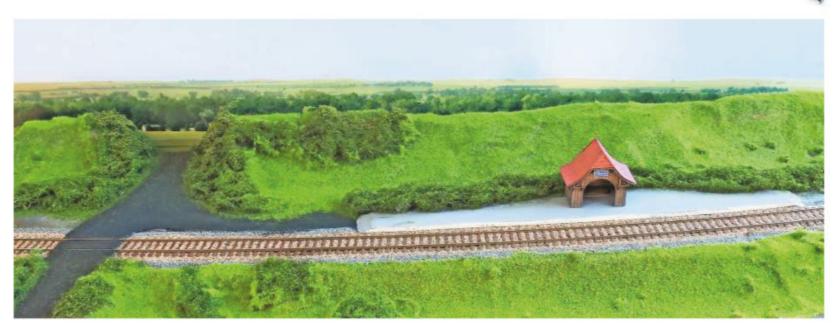

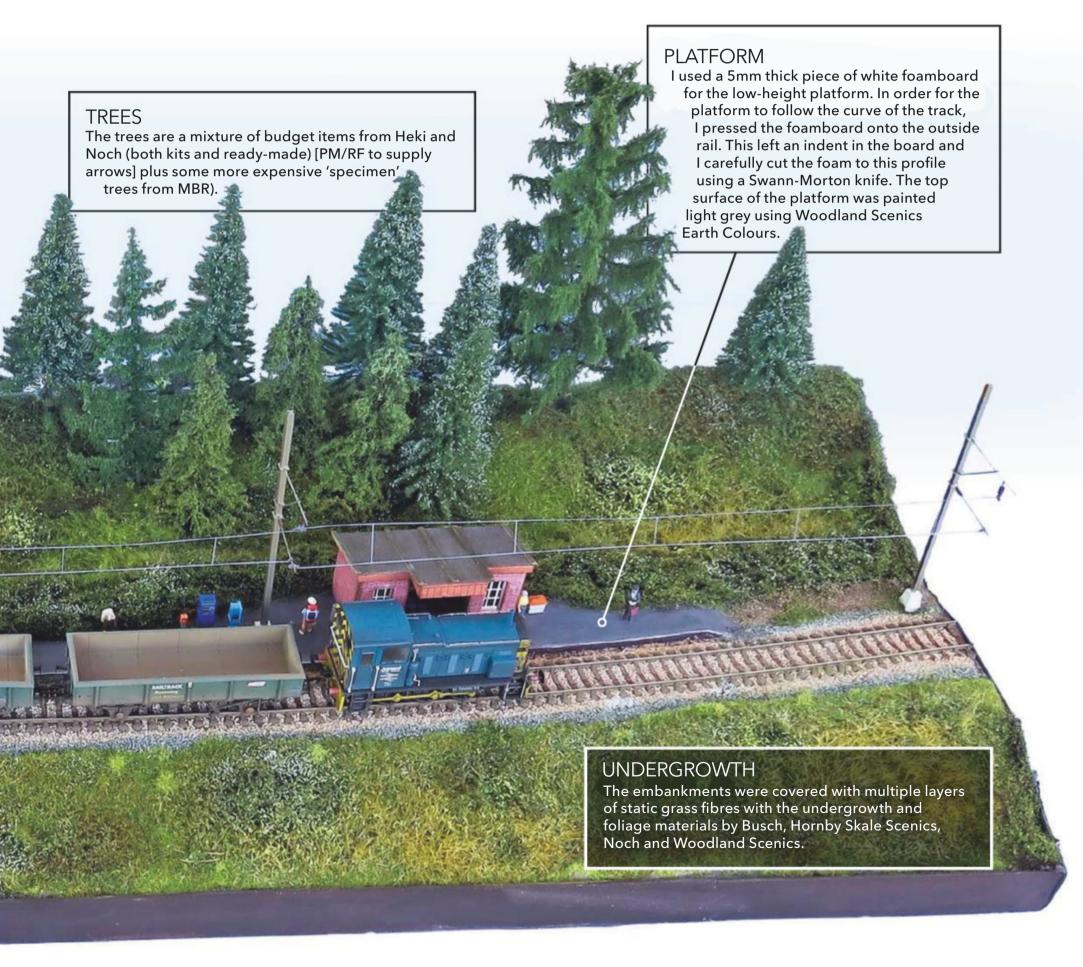

The first layer of 2mm green static grass fibre has been planted on to the landscape using a Noch Gras-master II. A couple of further layers will finish the job.

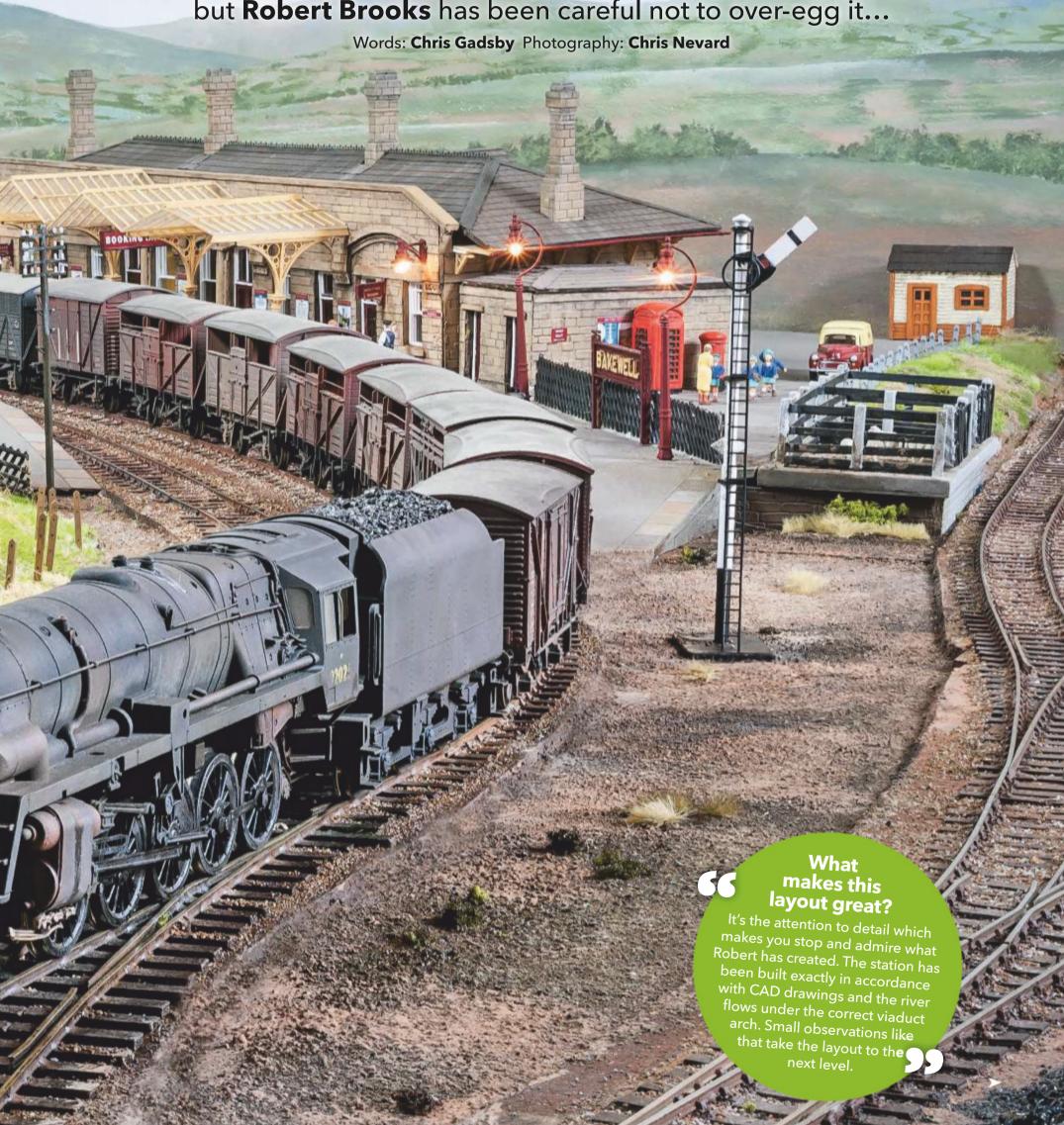








Inspired by a TV programme, 'Bakewell' impresses on every level, but **Robert Brooks** has been careful not to over-egg it...



### 'OO' GAUGE LAYOUT BAKEWELL

akewell. It's a small Derbyshire market town with fewer than 4,000 people that shares a name with a well-known dessert. You'd be forgiven for thinking that the Bakewell tart, or the cherry Bakewell, is the signature pastry that puts the Peak District town on the map, but these are, in fact, variations of the Bakewell pudding, which can trace its origins back over 150 years.

But enough about desserts. The railway that once served the town once was the Midland Railway's main line from London St Pancras to Manchester. This famous through-route closed in 1968 and is much missed by enthusiasts. But inspiration for Robert Brooks didn't come from the countless photographs of the line's classic

locations but rather its proximity to a university.

"My choice of location is a little surprising," explains Robert as he leads the way through the garden to the outbuilding where his creation lives, "as I didn't have a connection to the line, or Bakewell itself, when I was looking for a subject to model.

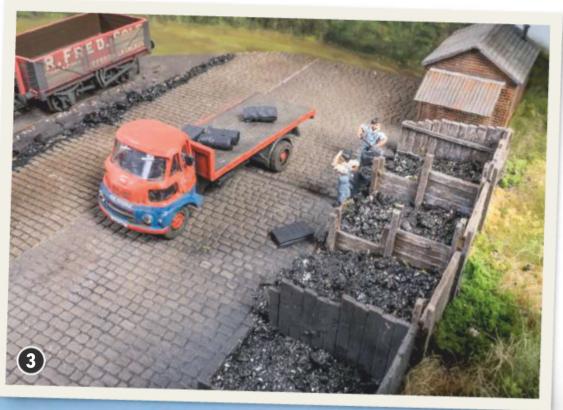
My son started at Sheffield University in 2012 and at that time Julia Bradbury had just discussed the Monsal Trail in her *Railway Walks with Julia Bradbury* TV programme. I did the walk myself and decided that of all the disused stations, Bakewell would be the best fit for the space I had available."

That space is just shy of 15ft by 10ft, and has allowed Robert to produce a reasonably accurate track plan – with a couple of compromises. The goods yard, for example, has had to be flipped >

The 8½ mile foot and cycle path that follows the old trackbed.

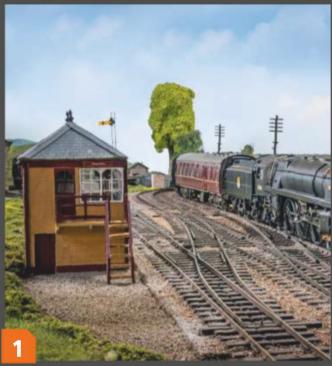

through  $180^{\circ}$  and curved tighter than the prototype.

Explains Robert, "I went through an extended period of planning while I worked out the logistics of fitting in everything I wanted – the station, the goods yard and Headstone Viaduct – but the build began in 2013."

What made things more complicated was that Robert designed the layout to be sectional, so that it could be moved if necessary. He needed to make sure that points didn't foul baseboards joints and had to include extra connections in the layout's power bus wires. This was a blessing in disguise, for the layout moved from its original loft home into his garden railway room.

The station commands Robert's railway room.







Much of the real thing survives and the car park now serves people who want to follow the trail, so Robert wasn't short of photographs and real-world visit opportunities to get his 1:76 scale version just right.

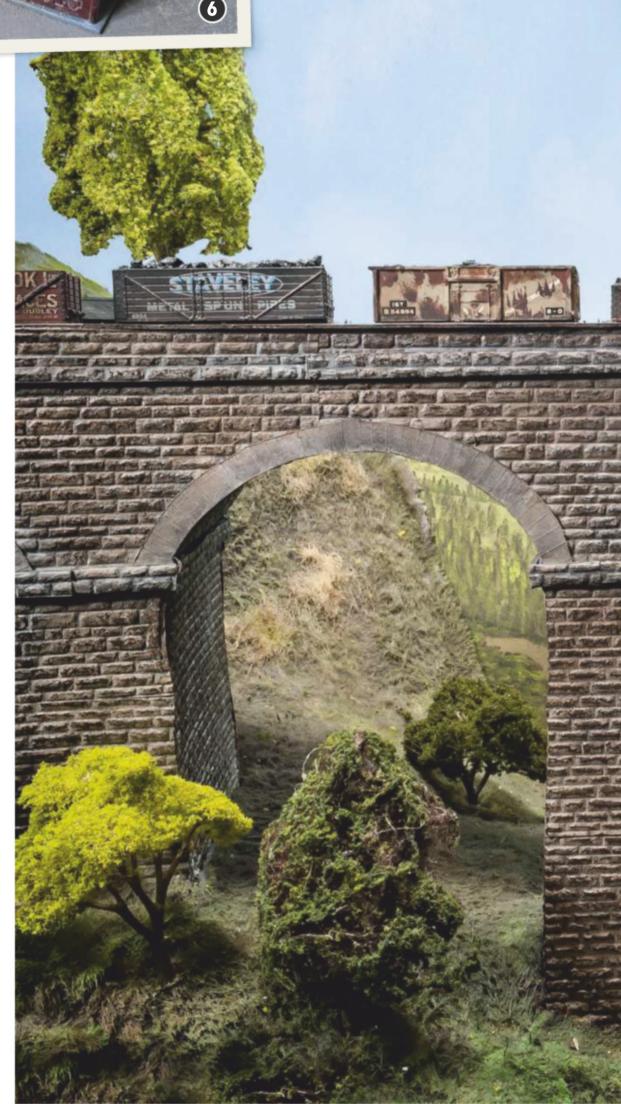
He says: "I've built it with a full interior. Everything I could find about the station has been included, even the toilets! The base structure was produced for me by York Modelmaking and I then finished it with a covering of Slater's Plastikard."

The station is an impressively accurate representation of Bakewell in the 1960s. The canopy on the Matlock-bound platform is missing – intentionally – as it was removed long before the station closed. We often speak about elements of layouts which help to locate them and these are in abundance at 'Bakewell'. Not only does the bright blue Midland Pullman which surges through the station give quite a large clue, but the distinctive Midland Railway lamps and nameboards and Scale Model Scenery kits pinpoint the location even further.

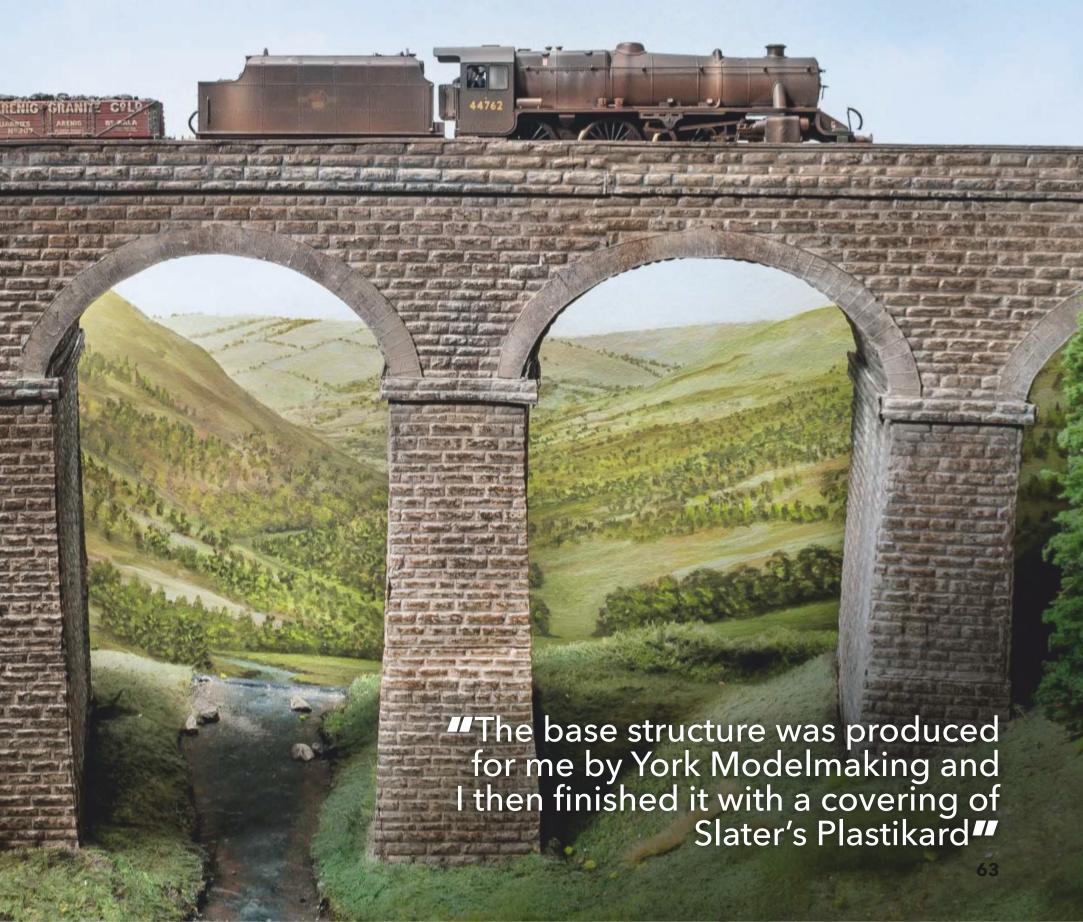
"The Pullman is so distinctive I just had to have one," Robert says. "Many of the classes I have are preserved and I've ridden behind examples of the real ones."

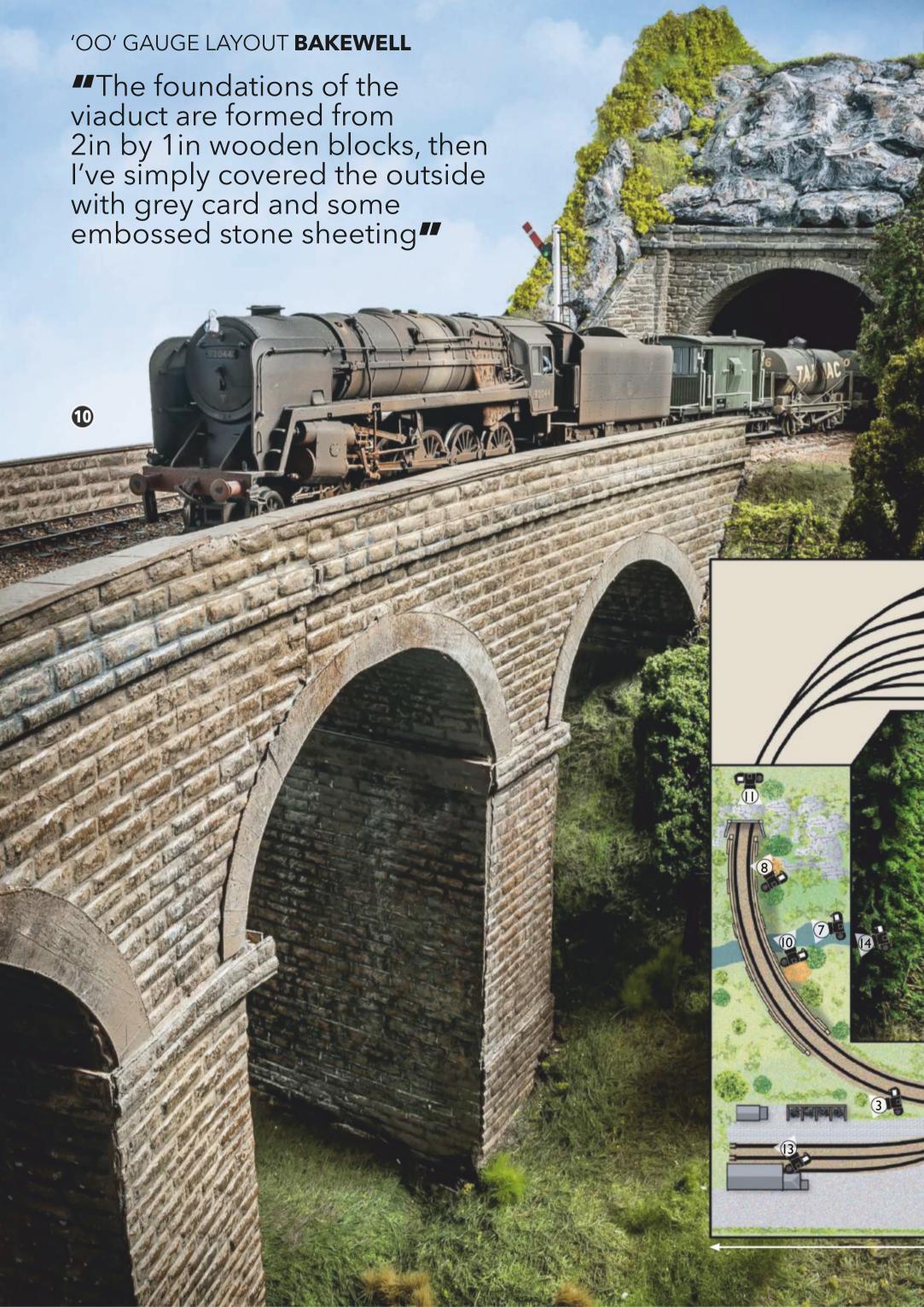
'9Fs', 'Black Fives' and '8Fs' are all suitable for the Matlock-Buxton line in its heyday. But one of Robert's favourite is his re-creation of a 1990s Royal Train. He's replaced the single doors on the Hornby coaches with double doors and used tracing paper in the











windows to depict net curtains. It might be historically out of place but it does look at home crossing Headstone Viaduct at Monsal Dale.

The viaduct and adjacent tunnel portal is one of the most recognisable locations. Robert just had to include it and though the distance to Bakewell has been considerably reduced, you really don't notice. A drop level baseboard was used to give the full effect of the viaduct with the River Wye running underneath, but a crawl underneath the goods yard and into the operating well is required to fully appreciate the quality of modelling Robert has achieved.

"The foundations of the viaduct are formed from 2in by 1in wooden blocks, then I've simply covered the outside with grey card and some embossed stone sheeting. To give the valley a firm base, I carved some polystyrene blocks using a hot wire cutter and laid a grass mat on the top, as the large area was just too much for a solely static grass approach."

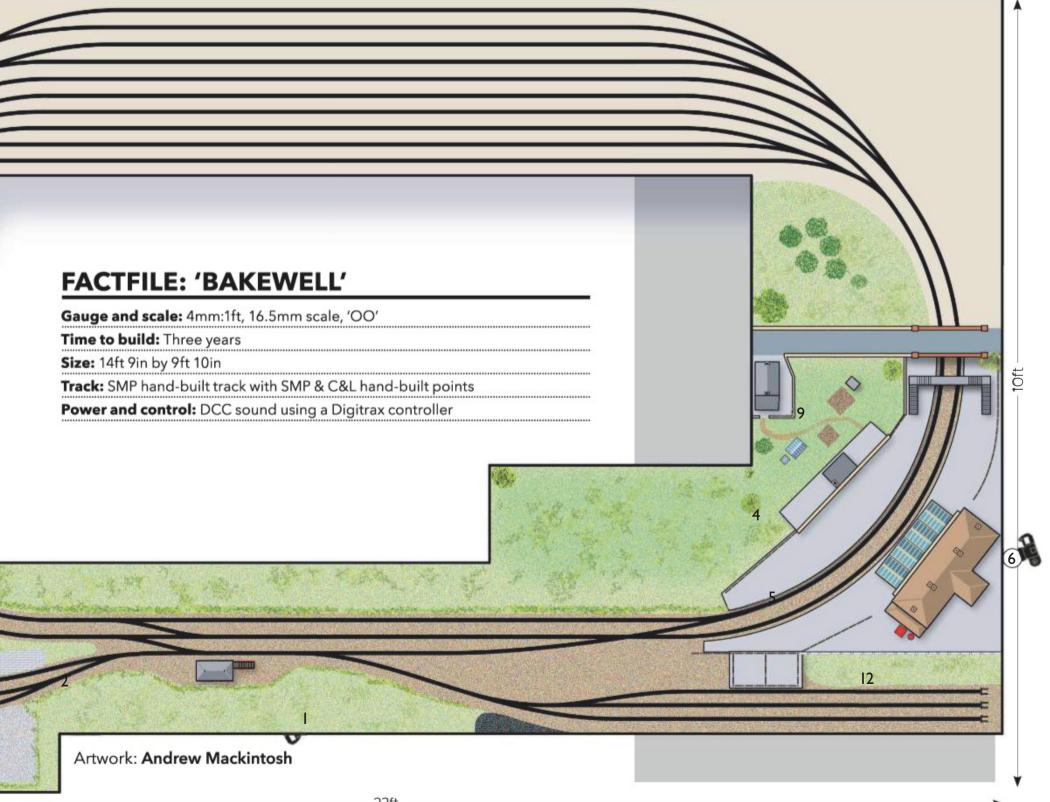
Those are the bigger aspects of the layout, but 'Bakewell' is just as impressive on a smaller scale and, thanks to ModelU, it's even more personal to Robert.

"A miniature version of me is in the goods yard, alongside some other figures from Dart Castings. I've not overly populated the layout, just a few figures here and there to give the impression of a few things going on. As it was a 1960s layout the line was in

decline so I couldn't justify crowded platforms!"

Robert's quest for realism even caused him to look for alternatives to off-the-shelf track. This resulted in him attending a Missenden Abbey Railway Modellers' course (*www.missendenrailwaymodellers. org.uk*) on building track with copper-clad sleepers.

"The C&L and Templot templates are useful for ensuring you get the geometry right so I used them for the points, but for the straights and curves I found it just as easy to use SMP parts. It takes an awful lot longer than slotting together fixed or flexible track, but I do think it looks more realistic."

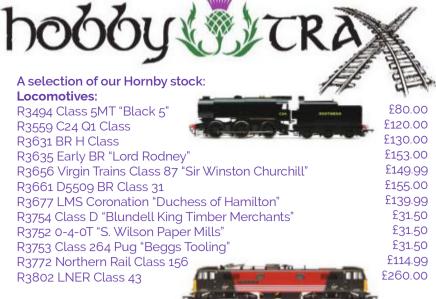
Robert has spent a long time getting everything as accurate as possible, from hand-building track to using CAD images of the station. The ModelU figure of himself? Well, that's just the cherry on top of the Bakewell.

# **ENABLING MODELLING - AGAINST THE ODDS**



My father recently suffered a stroke and has been struggling to continue working on his model railway. Is there any help available for those with impaired physical movement?

Colette Smith, Liverpool.

Mark Davidson says: Many people with disabilities or illnesses assume that they may no longer be able to enjoy building models. However, thanks to various charities, more people can continue to enjoy relaxing hobbies. REMAP is one such charity - it provides bespoke products for those requiring additional help.

A REMAP spokesperson said: "We are a national charity that helps disabled people of all ages to live more independent lives by designing and making customised equipment. We provide solutions to everyday problems when there is nothing commercially available.

"We design and custom-make equipment for individuals because everyone's needs are different.
Our network of skilled volunteers responds to thousands of requests for our help every year and we provide our service free of charge.

"If a disabled person wants a gadget to help them overcome an impairment that stops them from modelling, we can arrange for one of our volunteers to visit and hand-make a piece of equipment, personally for them. This ensures it entirely meets their needs and it's all done for free".

### **SERIOUS ILLNESS**

Rod Fitzpatrick, who has Necrotising Autoimmune Myopathy, says: "I was completely bed-bound but, five months ago, a new experimental treatment worked wonders and now I'm able to look after myself and walk slowly. I've only been to one exhibition - at Peterborough Arena and didn't find any access problems as it was level and flat. I imagine smaller local venues might be awkward, but many adverts give indications of what visitors can expect. Steps are a problem and there is a difference between wheelchairaccessible and wheelchair-friendly, which many able-bodied people don't appreciate. Although I will never recover fully, I'm getting stronger and better. With more mobility and the help of friends I have been able to start a new 'O' gauge layout".

### SIGHT PROBLEMS

Barry Poll, of Glenrothes, has always enjoyed trains and model railways and has been working on his own layout since 2010. "I was diagnosed with macular degeneration in 2009", he said. 'I also have glaucoma. My sight has deteriorated since then and I would now describe my level of sight as a complete blur, although I can see images and colours."

Because of his military background, Barry became eligible for support from the charity Scottish War Blinded. "I've always liked to do locomotive repairs but, with all the little screws, my sight was making this difficult. It also





made reading instructions tricky.
The charity gave me a CCTV reader a specialist magnifier that enlarges
anything onto a larger screen.

"As I've adapted to using it, I'm able to work with my hands and look at the screen instead of what I'm working on. I also have a Synapptic frame which is a portable stand that I can put my tablet into and then use it as a magnifier. It means I can take it out into the garage with me to work on my model railway."

### LACK OF MOBILITY

Colin West suffered a stroke in his 50s and now, 20 years later, says: "Although I was left-handed, I had to use my right hand instead and my eyesight was also affected. I really needed a hobby and I was lucky that my wife, son and friend helped me with my model railway, along with support from the staff at nearby Peco.

"I'm more interested in building scenery because I do not understand



the electrical side of things, so my layout is fairly straightforward. However, as I do have limited vision, I use 'N' gauge to get a perspective of distance and like to make the scenery as realistic as possible.

"I am presently working on a layout loosely based on the Isle of Wight heritage railway. I often visit shows in Exeter and Taunton and find the demonstrators very helpful. When building various models I use standard tweezers, cutters, a magnifying glass with a light and a raised plinth, so everything is at eye level".

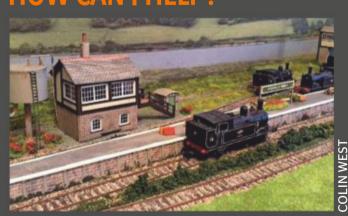
Colin Heath first showed symptoms of essential tremor when he was ten years old. I was a keen modeller in my youth and I had some challenges in painting and soldering. Since then, I have coped with my issues and have built a large number of 'N' gauge wagon kits, along with some coaches.

"I have also managed to build a lot of whitemetal locomotive kits, fitting them to Farish chassis. I built up a reputation in the South West Herts Model Railway Society as being able to adapt other locomotives to produce something unavailable at the time. Producing an ex-GWR '55XX' tank by shortening a Farish '61XX' body and marrying it to a Minitrix Ivatt 2-6-2T chassis, for example.

"My tremor has got progressively worse in the last few years and I have struggled with some of the more intricate tasks, such as wiring. I recently dismantled a layout of Portpatrick Town after it had been on the exhibition circuit for 12 years, and I'm working on plans for another steam/diesel-era Scottish layout. However, I don't intend to finalise the plans or start building anything until I have had neurosurgery, which should correct - or at least considerably improve - my right hand".

Listening to these stories, it seems that 'where there is a will, there is a way', meaning that more of us can enjoy this wonderful hobby.

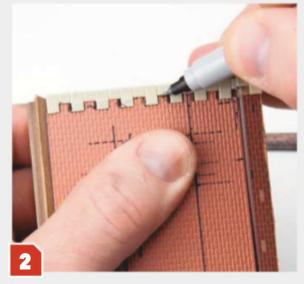
### **HOW TO: IMPROVE A BUDGET WATER TOWER**

GEORGE DENT salvages a basic Hornby structure from a children's train set and transforms it into a realistic model.

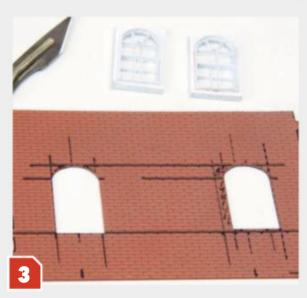




After removing the tank section, Wills corner stone sections were fixed to the edge of each wall, secured with standard liquid poly cement. While the apex of the stone sections sits hard against the corners, the protruding stones stand just proud of the walls.



This tiny gap allows thin embossed plastic sheet (from Slater's) to slot behind the longer stones. Mark out where the brick sheet needs to be trimmed and test for a good, neat fit - but don't glue it in place just yet, as we need to cut the window apertures.



A set of laser-cut plastic arch-top windows was obtained from York Modelmaking (www.yorkmodelrail.com) and, using them as a guide, apertures were cut into the brick sheet. The original openings in the Hornby structure may need enlarging with a file.

In MR271, I described my mania for recycling as much as possible in order to make the practice of my hobby more economical and reduce my impact on the environment. This approach also provides plenty of fun and often generates lots of ideas for new projects.

Indeed, after recently dismantling a train set that I built about 15 years ago for my niece and nephew, a good amount of rolling stock, buildings and scenic items have gone back 'into the pot' for future re-use.

First to see a new lease of life is this humble Hornby water tower. Being a fairly basic plastic structure, it doesn't look much at first glance, but I was sure that it could form the basis for a much more realistic building.

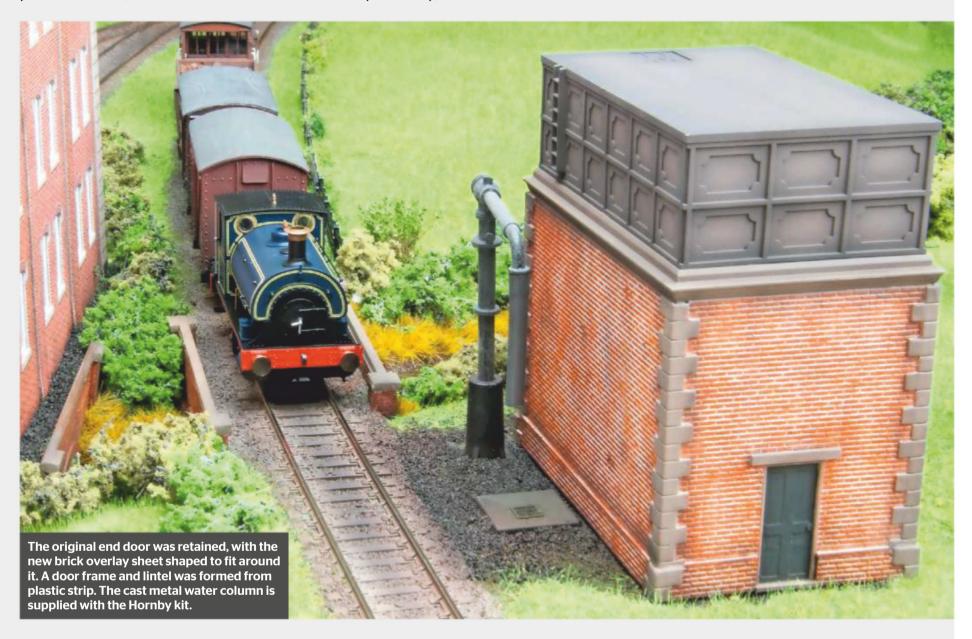
By cladding the base in embossed plastic sheet and moulded corner stones, as well as installing a pair of laser-cut window frames (from York Modelmaking), the model soon came to life. A suitably weathered paint finish then completed the job.

Fitted around other modelling tasks, this project proved an enjoyable way of filling a couple of hours and produced an interesting addition to the 'Hodson's Mill' layout segment, constructed as part of the winning 'Design us a Layout' entry, featured in last month's issue.

### Train set tower

Hornby's R8003 water tower is a simple plastic kit that requires minimal assembly. The water tank section slots into the base and is easy to remove for painting separately.

The base features printed-on brick and stone detail and printed acetate sheets provide the glazing for the window apertures.





When happy that everything fits snugly, the brick sheets can be installed. Again, I used liquid poly cement, applied around the edges and via the original window openings on the inside. Avoid excess, as the solvent may damage the embossed relief.



The lower buttress walls were treated in the same way, with styrene strip added along the top edges. The windows were then installed, with sills and brick arches cut from styrene strip and modified Wills arch overlays respectively.



Allow the glue to cure fully before tidying up the edges with fine needle files and abrasives. If any gaps exist, fill them with a modelling putty and sand smooth when dry. The building can then be cleaned prior to priming and painting.

## INNOVATIVE STORAGE SOLUTION FOR 'N' STOCK



What storage options are there for unboxed 'N' gauge rolling stock?

**George says:** Avocations offers a number of handy storage solutions for models and delicate objects, in the form of adaptable foam packing trays.

The box featured here contains five separate trays that are stacked within a stout, double-wall corrugated card box, complete with a carrying handle. Each foam tray is pre-cut with seven long slots, 320mm long, 25mm deep and 25mm tall, which are perfect for 'N' gauge rolling stock and locomotives.

Within each of these rows are sets of removable foam blocks, which can be repositioned to act as spacers to suit whatever stock you wish to store.

Furthermore, the packing blocks have double-sided tape already applied, so it's simply a case of peeling the backing tape away and fixing them in position.

Each tray can host up to 35 short wheelbase wagons and they're also available separately (£5.99 each) without the card outer box.

Similar trays and boxes are also available to suit other scales, including 'OO'. Once packed, the models are kept secure, with the foam padding offering an impressive amount of protection. An extra foam sheet is provided to cover the top tray before the box is folded closed.

A marker pen can be used to describe the contents of the box, especially if filling more than one, allowing modellers to organise their stock more effectively.

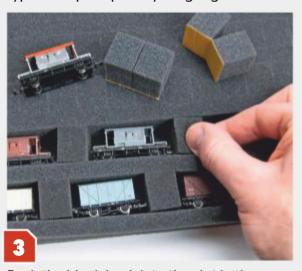

Lay your stock out onto each tray, noting the pre-cut slots in the foam and the removable sections. Arrange by vehicle type to help keep everything organised.



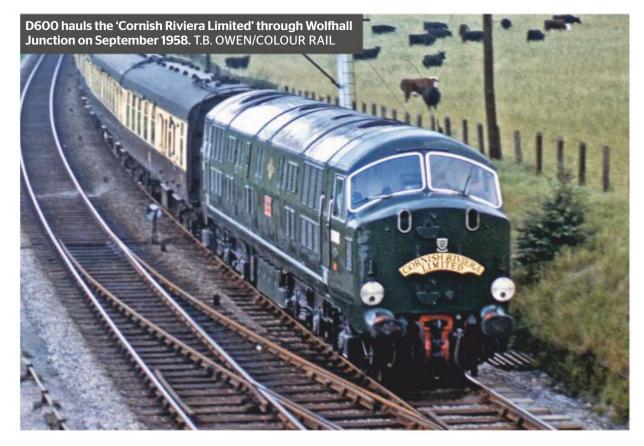
Push the block back into the slot in the desired location, ensuring a snug but not overly tight fit. The stock needs to be held securely, but without risk of damaging the delicate couplings.



Pull the pre-cut packing blocks out of the slots. Work out how many spacers are needed and peel away the backing from the double-sided tape.



Once the tray has been loaded and the packing blocks fixed in position, load it into the cardboard box and fill the next layer in the same way. Orient the trays the right way up, in relation to the box's carry handle.



## 'CORNISH RIVIERA EXPRESS'... OR 'LIMITED'?



I'm really happy with my model of D601, obtained from Kernow Model Centre, in original condition. What

a superb model this is.

In addition to the usual bufferbeam details, KMC has included an excellent set of etched 'Cornish Riviera Express' headboards. In Brian Haresnape's British Rail Fleet Survey 2: Western Region Diesel Hydraulics, there's an image of D601 at Truro in October 1958. However, the headboard shown is the 'Cornish Riviera Limited'.

Can you advise when the 'Limited' changed to 'Express'? Or were these headboards used randomly in the 1950s? Many BR early-crest steam engine photographs show that they carried the 'Limited' headboards.

**George says:** When the GWR launched the Paddington-Penzance express in 1904, the company asked readers of *The Railway* 

Magazine to come up with a suitable name. The winning entry was 'Riviera Express', although the GWR had altered it to 'Riviera Limited' by the time the title was announced in 1906 and it operated under this name until the outbreak of the Second World War.

Relaunched in 1946, BR continued the title following nationalisation, albeit with 'Cornish Riviera' headboards from 1951, then 'Cornish Riviera Express' briefly in 1954. To mark the trains' 50th anniversary, the title changed to the 'Cornish Riviera Limited', which was employed between 1956-58, whereupon it reverted to the 'Express' suffix until the headboards fell out of use in the early 1960s.



## Tool of the month

## Mini battery operated precision screwdriver

I recently picked up this handy little tool from my local branch of Wilko. At just £12.00, it has already proven to be a real bargain. Supplied with six small interchangeable bits (2x crosshead, 2x slotted and 2x Torx) and powered by a pair of AAA batteries, the tool is operated by a two-way trigger for driving or reversing modes. Designed specifically for use

Designed specifically for use on small electrical devices and components, the motor features a soft-starting mechanism, and a top speed of 100rpm means that the tool operates in a gentle manner, which is perfect for precision work.



There is no clutch facility, so it takes a little care to avoid over-tightening screws, but the small, lightweight nature of the tool means that there's a good degree of 'feel', allowing the user to retain control over operation.

Similar tools are available across a range of brands and this example has proven to be a very handy addition to the toolbox, cutting fatigue and speeding up repetitive tasks. (GD)

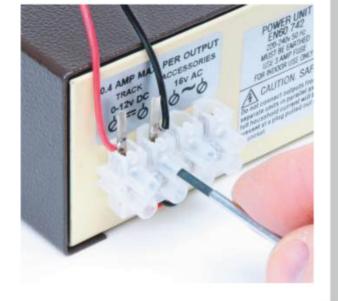


## **TOP TIP: RESILIENT CABLE CONNECTIONS**

**Kevin Russell says:** If, like me, you're likely to be connecting and disconnecting the power feeds to a controller's terminals on a frequent basis, you'll soon find that the exposed cable strands will break apart.

Being compressed within the screw terminals inevitably damages the wire but, by soldering a standard fishplate to the end of the cable, we can create a more resilient contact surface.

Furthermore, the fishplates fit more snugly and securely into the terminals, being less likely to break and ensuring more reliable power flow.



## **READER'S TIP**

I enjoyed your recent review of the Bachmann Ransomes & Rapier breakdown crane (MR269) and I agree, it's a superb model. However, I soon discovered that, since the crane is so realistically reduction-geared, it's very tedious to keep turning the knob to raise/lower the jib and hook. But I found a great solution: a small, battery-powered precision screwdriver (see above). The flat slotted bit fits perfectly (diagonally) into the sockets on the rear of the cabin. The jib and hook still move at a realistically slow speed, but I no longer have to keep rotating the knob with my fingers.

# apyard thing



few years ago, I made a wooden cover to hide some electrical equipment at my old office. It was just under 5ft by 4ft and held together with two sides, making it 12in tall. I moved out of that office recently and it seemed a shame to throw the wooden cover away.

That's when the modelling gear kicked in. I've often fancied modelling a scrapyard and so I challenged myself to build as detailed a diorama as I could in the shortest possible time. But even then, I certainly didn't expect to finish this in just four hours...

### WHY A SCRAPYARD?

Famous locomotive graveyards are few and far between these days, but one such yard is EMR Kingsbury in the West Midlands. I went there in 2010 to help recover some parts for a preservation group. Inside the yard were Class 08s, 37s, 56s, 86s and 87s ready for disposal.

From what I remember, it was a mess. It was located on muddy, slushy ground with bits of locomotive, from engine components to body panels, everywhere. I recall tripping over an air horn which stuck out of

the mud and, after a bit of digging, I had recovered two perfectly good Class 56 air horns, which I bought.

It was just around the time I finished working at Long Marston depot in Warwickshire, where lots of locomotives and rolling stock are stored before being stripped for useful spares, after which their carcasses make their final journeys to yards such as EMR Kingsbury. At the time, it was when the Class 87 fleet had been withdrawn and I remember long lines of '87s' at Long Marston, all waiting to head off by road to Kingsbury for scrap. They were in reasonable external condition and, as an enthusiast, it was sad to see.

Yet there is something strangely mysterious about a railway scrapyard. As a professional photographer, I am quite a creative person and I love to experiment with my work and push my knowledge and camera to the limit. I gladly sank my teeth into modelling the different textures, colours and details of a scrapyard.

I thoroughly enjoyed creating this diorama and I plan to take it to model exhibitions across the country. It just goes to show that you can make something out of nothing in a short space of time, using just a piece of scrap wood.

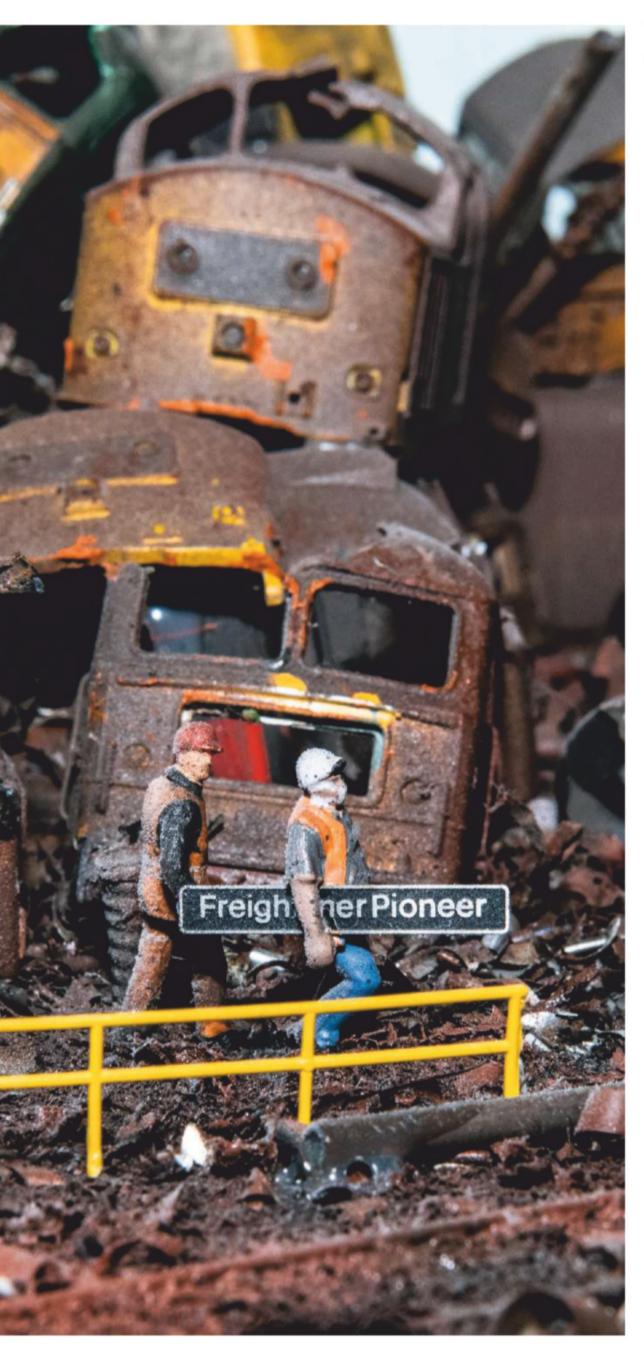




Above: I've built a number of layouts over the years and have amassed quite a collection of bits and pieces. I searched through my scrap box to find material worthy of going on the scrapyard scene.

Left and right: Rail enthusiasts collect pieces of locomotives, most notably flame-cut panels with numbers on. I cut around the numbers on the locomotive bodies and placed them against the wall outside a container. During my visit to EMR Kingsbury, I was allowed to have a look at the flame-cut number panels in one of the containers. There were quite a few in a large pile, particularly Class 37s and 56s. There were also some nameplates lying around, too.





### **CUTTING UP LOCOMOTIVES**



Making a scrapped locomotive look as realistic as possible is important to me. Contemporary models from Bachmann and Hornby models have so much detail on them, and they really look the part. To that end I used as many bodies from recent models as possible, scouring second-hand stalls at shows or model shops.

The main tool I used for cutting them up was a pair of small wire cutters. There's no right or wrong way to actually cut up a model. There's no room for sentiment in a commercial scrapyard, and many locomotives will suffer broken windows, scratches, dents and dings as they're taken apart.

One of my techniques was bending the edges of the body shell to make it look like it had been ripped apart. Older Hornby models are made of brittle plastic and snap quite easily, but the plastic of modern bodyshells is perfect for this.







The starting point: the 54in by 21in wooden cover, now surplus to requirements. Helpfully, even the sides were already painted 'sky blue'.







I removed everything from the board and then gave it a coat of PVA glue. I laid the track directly onto the glue, then sprinkled black powder paint over the whole board to form the foundation of the muddy, claggy ground.



I allowed time for the glue to become tacky and then I applied a layer of metal swarf, which I had obtained from a local engineering firm. With the glue dry, I sprayed the ground with RailMatch 'Sleeper Grime'.



Scrapyards such C.F. Booths in Rotherham and EMR Kingsbury have are an almost endless sea of shipping containers lining the perimeter of the yards. Mine came from Bachmann and I glued them in place.



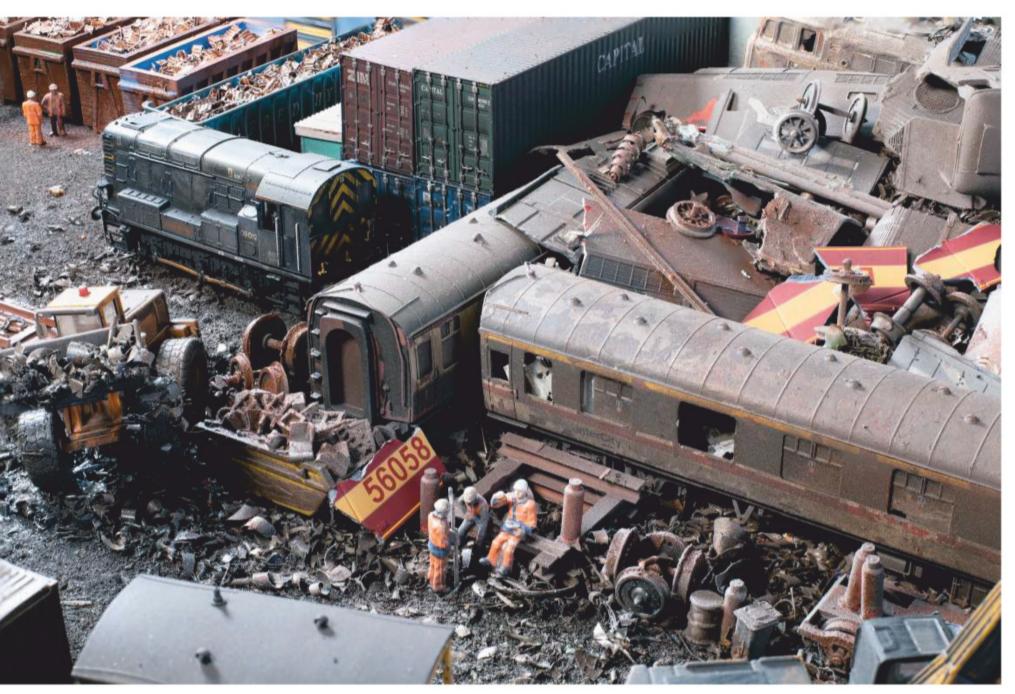


The final touch was the weathering. There's no right or wrong way to weather locomotives destined for the scrapyard so I just used RailMatch Sleeper Grime and Roof Dirt to get a look I was happy with.





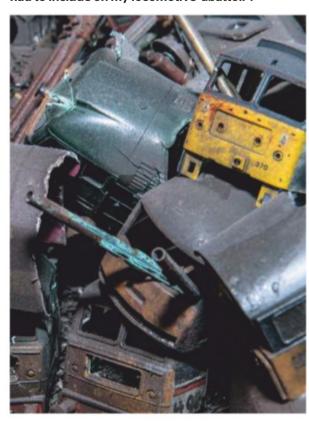
Road vehicles are just as important as railway ones. Most locomotives arrive by road and processed scrap is taken away by lorry. The bulk trailer is an Oxford Diecast model, whereas the skips are 3D-printed models from Goodwood Scenics (www. goodwoodscenics. co.uk).



Above: Scrapyards workers still use oxyacetylene torches to complete the scrapping job, so I dotted some suitable figures around the scene.

Right: Scrapping a locomotive is a brutal process, with hydraulic claws ripping them apart. I found some suitable 'HO' scale claws online. I tailored one scene by bending a Class 37's cab windows to give the impression of claw marks.

Below: Most photographs of scrapyards depict piles of cabs or stacks of body panels ready for the mechanical processor to munch it all down into small particles. These were features that I definitely had to include on my locomotive 'abattoir'.

# EXPECT the unexpected

Earles Sidings in the Hope Valley is a railway timewarp - you never know what trains you'll find there, says **Paul A. Lunn**.

he 3½-mile Totley tunnel is like a kind of magic portal. You enter it from the Sheffield suburbs and you emerge in the scenic beauty of the Hope Valley. As your train rattles westwards, the landscape becomes more rugged, culminating at Edale, which sits in a broad valley overshadowed by dramatic peaks.

Your eyes will naturally be focused on the unfolding landscape but there is one extra treat for the railway enthusiast: Earles Sidings. Unless you've avidly studied the working timetable, you never know what will await you...

Earles Sidings is a railway timewarp. Time it right and the rows of sidings are crammed with wagons, either empties coming in or wagons loaded with cement for onwards distribution. Time it really right and you might see a Class 20 coming off the 1½-mile branch from Hope Cement Works with a heavy train of cement tanks, ready to hand over to one of the Freightliner Class 66s or '70s' sitting ticking over by the fuelling point.

It's an operation that hasn't changed since 1929. Only the trains have changed, with Stanier '8Fs' giving way to first generation diesels and now locomotives owned by private companies. Is there a more exciting location to capture in model form?

In the last issue I described how Hope Cement operated, offered a virtual tour along its connecting branch line and presented two exciting layout ideas. Now it's time to look at the trains that work there!



Above: Steam was replaced at Hope Works by two Sentinel 0-6-ODHs in 1963. Both locomotives were refurbished in the early 1990s by Andrew Barclay and were fitted with a six-cylinder Perkins engine. They were capable of pulling up to eight tank wagons. LES NIXON

Left: Hudswell Clarke O-6-OT No. 1704 was delivered to Hope Works in 1938, Together with Avonside *Winhill*, it was required to haul ten trains of coal or gypsum, weighing 350 tons, from exchange sidings to the works, and to return with up to 21 vans of bagged cement. *Winhill* was scrapped but *Nunlow* was saved by the Bahamas Locomotive Society and is now on display at the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway. On September 7 2008, *Nunlow* returned to Hope for an open day. LES NIXON

### ON THE MAIN LINE

Whatever era you model, Earles Sidings has always provided big locomotives hauling long freight trains. Cement out and coal in were the principal commodities. Once it was '8Fs' with 'Presflos' in tow, now it's Freightliner Class 66s and 70s with big, bogie JPA wagons or DB Class 66s with long trains of coal.

Here's a selection of images to get the creative juices flowing, along with some recollections of exciting trainspotting moments I've had at Earles Sidings. Don't forget passing passenger trains, and you can use first-generation DMUs (Class 101 or Class 108) with Class 158s and '142s' in more recent years.

## AN EXCUSE TO RUN ANYTHING

Avonside supplied 0-6-0ST No. 2007 to G&T Earle's works in 1929, where it was named *Winhill*. It was joined by Hudswell Clarke No. 1704 in 1938, which was dubbed *Nunlow*. Rolls Royce-powered Sentinel diesels took over from 1963.

Today's motive power is provided by Harry Needle Railroad Co. and, according to the Industrial Railway Society's Industrial Locomotives

Handbook 18EL, you'll be able to find 08623, 08714, 08865, 08905 and 09201 on site alongside Class 20s 82, 2 and 3 (formerly 20066, 20168 and 20906) and Andrew Barclay 0-6-0DHs 4 and 5 (Nos. 616/1977 and 613/1977). Also stored on site are Hunslet-Barclay Blue John, rebuilt Sentinel 0-6-0DHs Peveril and Derwent, Thomas

Hill 6wDH V316/1987 and the remains of Barclay 647/1979.

2008 was a particularly interesting year as an open day brought the return of *Nunlow* in full working order. It was joined by West Coast Railway Company's '8F' No. 48151 and 'Hall' No. 5972 *Olton Hall* and Class 14 D9505. Visitors could also see 08892 as well as Class 37 37680, which was rusting away on site pending a sale.

## THE WAGON FLEET

Hope cement, thanks to its connection to the national network, can be distributed from depots as far afield as Carlisle and Birmingham. Nearly 1 million tons of cement is despatched annually and trains can now carry nearly 900 tons.

There are nearly 300 wagons based at Hope, which, in 1978, became the first works to have its own wagon repair shop. The four-wheel PCA tank wagon was commonplace when I got to have a good poke around Hope Works in 1993.

The PCAs came in two distinct body shapes: the BREL style 'v' and the Metalair straight tank. They had the following specification:

- Minimum curve of 50 metres
- Wheelbase 4880mm
- Carrying capacity 32–38.5 tonnes
- Cubic capacity 36 cubic metres (approx.)
- All those on site when I visited had Oleo buffers and Timken bearings

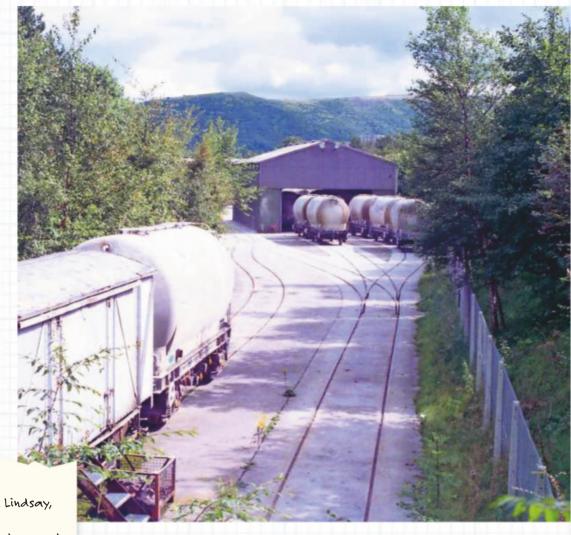
Today, the Feldbinder JPAs, leased from VTG, work the majority of traffic from Hope.

## **Dewsbury Railhead**

Where does the cement from Hope go? One of the key locations is the West Yorkshire town of Dewsbury.

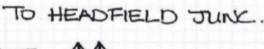
Hope Čement's parent company Breedon's Dewsbury Depot sits inside the former Dewsbury East and West Junction triangle on the old Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway's Calder Valley line. Today, trains leave the Calder Valley line via East Junction, traverse a short section of the old Dewsbury Market Place branch, before setting back into the depot, built on the site of the old Thornhill Carriage & Wagon Works.

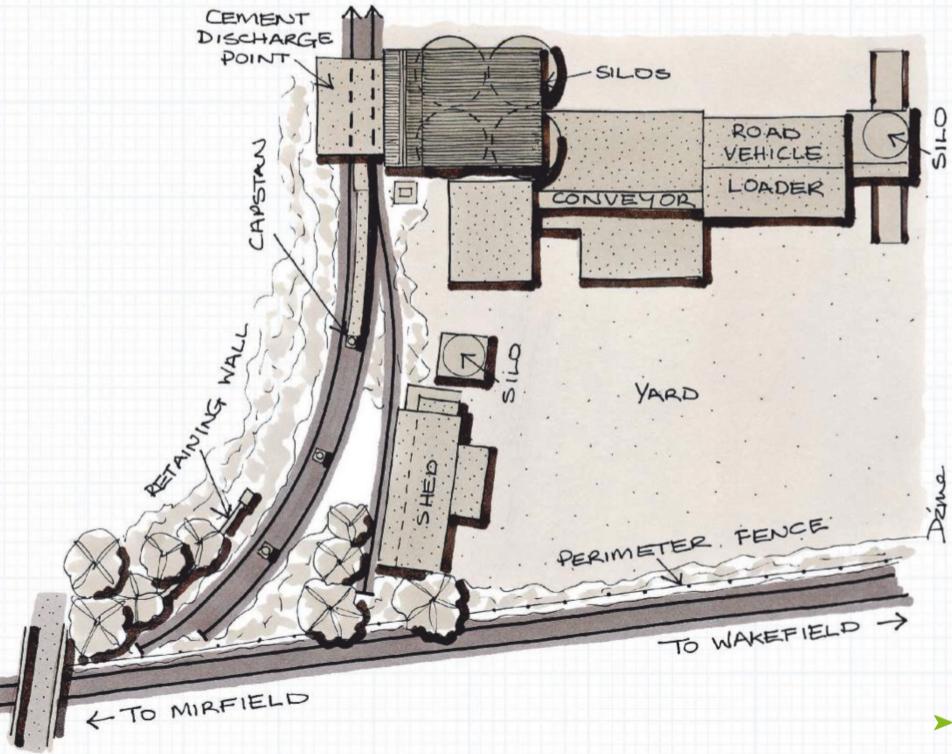
Dewsbury may not have the railway interest of Hope but, with a constant procession of trains during the week and the flow of lorries taking cement products away, there's plenty to make a great layout.

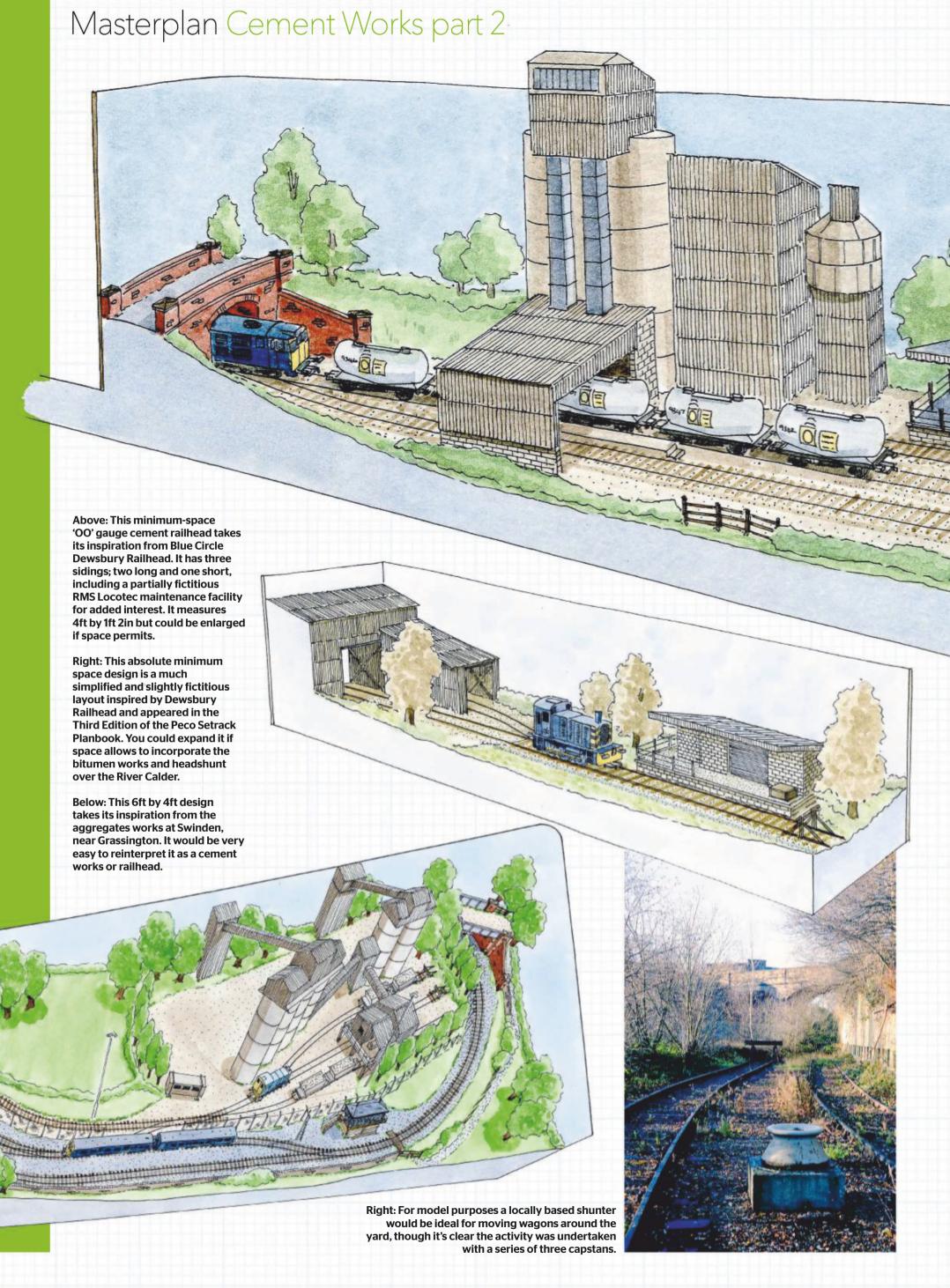

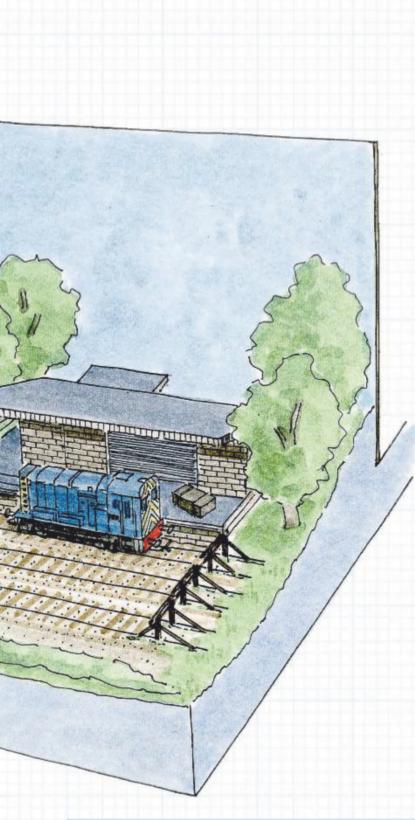

apol announced its intention to recreate the Class 21, as well as the later incarnation - the Class 29 - almost ten years ago, so the eventual arrival of the first models generated quite a lot of excitement in the *Model Rail* office.

The Class 21 Type 2 was not a particularly successful design, highlighting the shortcomings of BR's hurried approach to dieselisation. A whole fleet was put into production before the initial pilot batch had been assessed, with the ensuing chronic reliability issues proving an embarrassment to BR and the North British Locomotive Company. A re-engineering programme soon followed for part of the fleet, thus creating the Class 29, but both classes were

doomed to criminally short working lives.

The combination of a sad-faced aspect and a busy bodyside full of windows, doors and grilles, led to a rather ungainly appearance, but the Class 21 did have a certain character, which the Dapol product has captured extremely well. The front ends, with the drooping windscreens, really look the part and the communicating doors, lamp brackets and marker lights are finely and accurately rendered, although the wipers are a tad overscale.

A set of white and green plastic headcode discs are provided, although they're rather basic and there's no means of attaching them to the model other than by glueing them directly to the marker light fairings, thus removing any means of swapping the 'codes' around in future, unless a temporary adhesive is employed (Glue 'n' Glaze is my recommendation). Furthermore, the lack of locating pins and slots also makes aligning the discs tricky.

The rest of the bodyshell is impressive, especially the large, finely etched grilles on each side, with the radiator elements visible behind. The moulded details, including louvres, grilles, footsteps and tank filling hatches are excellent, while the cab interiors feature moulded consoles and seats.

### **CLEARLY LACKING**

In the past couple of years, I've been struck by the exceptional quality of glazing in

many new 'OO' and 'O' gauge models. Alas, the Class 21's windows aren't quite up to the same standard, with a pronounced prismatic effect around the edges.

The austere green livery has been applied well, but our sample does have patches of overspray around the boiler tank hatches. The diamond NBL worksplates are separately applied etched items, as are the oval shed code plates (the application of which is a little sloppy). The radiator roof fan grille, while finely etched, has also been installed laxly, with the longitudinal walkway being out-of-kilter.

A small bag of bufferbeam details is supplied and their presence greatly improves the look of the locomotive's ends, although no fitting instructions or diagrams are supplied, meaning that the customer has to do a spot of independent research. The dummy drawhooks do not fit into the slots cast into the metal bufferbeams without either trimming the hook's tail or opening out the hole with a drill or reamer.

Below the running plate, the bogie frames look good, with the prototype's clunky brake gear recreated admirably. There's also a run of piping to the brake reservoir tank and the distinctive spoked wheels have been faithfully recreated.

Pivoting NEM coupler pockets are installed, albeit not the sprung

close-coupling type, but a freely pivoting version that provides plenty of lateral movement.
Underneath the chassis is a row of four slide switches, offering independent control of the cab interior lights, plus the head and tail marker lights, which is great for non-DCC users.

## Factfile: Class 21

Under BR's 1955 Modernisation Plan, the North British Locomotive Company was invited to build ten Type 2 Bo-Bo diesel electric locomotives, utilising a 12-cylinder MAN power unit. Before this pilot batch had entered service, however, a further 48 locomotives were ordered.

Built in Glasgow between 1959-60, D6100-37 were initially sent to depots in London and Ipswich, while the rest of the fleet - D6138-57 - remained in Scotland. Designed for light passenger and freight work, they were soon in trouble thanks to chronic reliability problems. Things got so bad that the entire class was consolidated north of the border so that they could be returned to NBL's works for repairs.

Things didn't improve and, in 1963, BR decided to rebuild one example (D6123) with a Paxman Ventura power unit and, such was the improvement, that 19 further Class 21s were re-engineered, creating the Class 29. Other modifications made to the '29s' included remodelled front ends featuring four-character

headcode boxes (although D6123 retained its disc headcodes).

The entire fleet remained based in Scotland for the rest of their short - and expensive - lives. The remaining MAN-engined Class 21s had been eradicated by 1968 and, although the '29s' proved more reliable, they too had all gone by 1971.

#### **PASSENGER STOCK**

Having unclipped the bodyshell, a 21-pin DCC socket looms into view atop the main circuit board, with plenty of space provided for a large speaker. Power collection is via the axle bearings and the central motor is linked to the axles via twin cardan shafts. Operation is commendably smooth and quiet, with plenty of haulage power on tap, allowing the model to cope with any realistic demands placed upon it.

The only performance hiccup noted involved the moulded sanding pipes and brackets at the outer end of each bogie.

While they look prototypical, they also hang just a fraction of a millimetre above the top of the rails. As a result, when encountering a slightly less-than-perfect track joint - or especially a misaligned baseboard joint - the locomotive is prone to stalling or derailing.

### CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR

After such a long wait for a model to appear, it's inevitable that expectations will be high, so the various quality control issues found on our sample couldn't help but create a little disappointment. Maybe it's fitting that a model of such a troubled prototype should also have its flaws? Indeed, even the model's packaging has a problem: the Class 21 is described as a diesel-hydraulic locomotive, rather than a diesel-electric!

Despite the issues outlined here, this is still a very good-looking model, with some impressive detail features and it certainly fills a gap in the Pilot Scheme fleet. It will certainly appeal to modellers of the 1960s Scottish Region, as well as those interested in the Eastern Region of the late 1950s. (GD)

he Class 70s were launched with great fanfare in 2009 as Freightliner joined forces with US builder General Electric to produce locomotives that promised increased power, improved environmental performance and reduced maintenance costs. The resulting Class 70 was designed for use across Freightliner's portfolio of services and, with nearly 3,700hp available, they were expected to be used on everything from Anglo-Scottish intermodal services to the heavy stone trains operating from the Peak District and other quarries.

Unfortunately, their introduc-

tion was marred by disappointing performance – especially at speed – and a series of engine fires. The problem was found to be in the positioning and design of the air intake grille – in motion the streamlining effect of the cabs on the narrow centre section created a void that sucked air away from the intake, causing low engine power and overheating.

GE's solution was to raise the air intake grille away from the bodyside and into the air slipstream and this was implemented with immediate effect for both Freightliner and the ten Class 70s ordered by Colas in 2013.

This revision still caused

problems in tunnels and so the Type B design was brought in from around 2014. This has a distinctive additional box below the intake on one side, housing an air analysis system to govern engine performance characteristics in areas of restricted airflow. This later design has been fitted to all Colas Class 70s and is being progressively introduced through the Freightliner fleet.

Graham Farish originally introduced its Class 70 model in 2013 and then announced the Type B modified version in 2015. It may have taken a while to deliver but the revised Class 70 is now here.

Our review sample depicts

Freightliner's 70015, which received its modified intake in 2017. The most obvious change is the raised intake grille on the body side, but Farish has also captured minor changes, such as one of the tiny porthole windows on the bodyside door moving to the right. Later locomotives lacked a diagonal panel seam on the cabside and this too has been depicted.

Comments about the original model still apply to this version. It certainly captures the looks of the real thing and is correct in all main dimensions. Its panelled sides and sectional roof - designed for ease of maintenance - make for a model

with lots of obvious detail that is in some ways far more appealing than the somewhat ungainly prototype.

The livery has been well applied - with clean paint separation and a smooth, even, silk finish - and lettering and smaller labels sit well over the uneven bodysides. The only obvious livery omission is the Freightliner 'zero injuries' logos which are found immediately behind the cab access platforms at each end.

#### LIGHTTOUCH

The model has an excellent mechanism and, despite being lighter than many other Farish diesels at 81g (due to the narrow centre body), it performs smoothly and strongly, and under test was comfortable with scale-length trains.

It is fitted with a six-pin DCC decoder socket but has a switch on the underside to allow DC users to disable the red tail lamps. The lighting is bright and effective, and comes on at almost full power even when only a small amount of track voltage is applied.

The bogies are neatly moulded, though the secondary dampers above the outer axles lack relief and the large triangular sandboxes on the centre underframe should be considerably deeper and protrude as far as the solebar.

The couplers are in NEM sockets that are mounted on the

> bogies. To avoid fouling them the air dams are too, though on the prototype they are part of the body.

The Class 70 is a useful contemporary locomotive, especially as it now carries the Colas livery too, and the Farish model in its upgraded form continues to look the part and perform well. Who could ask for more? (BA)

'Il make no bones about it: I'm a huge fan of the 36 diesel railcars from Gloucester **RC&W** and Pressed Steel (later Classes 122 and 121 respectively) and I've acquired numerous models ever since Lima introduced its 'OO' take on the subject, some 40 years ago. That Lima model has since joined the Hornby range and has received a modest chassis update. As a big fan of these railcars, it is inevitable that I have several Dapol 'OO' gauge Class 121s and 122s, which are the first railcars produced to 21st-century standards. Given that Dapol was well on with developing its railcars, it was a surprise that Bachmann Branchline announced competing models in the same scale.

Bachmann's railcar arrived in the *Model Rail* office in early March, and I couldn't wait to get my hands on it, particularly to see if it offered any improvement over the Dapol model.

My first impression of Bachmann's model are influenced by my familiarity with the Dapol product. It's well-equipped for the latest in digital technology, lighting and sound, has a raised floor-line to cover the extensive electronics mounted on the chassis. It is heavy and drives on both bogies from a centrally placed motor. Prop-shaft

alignment and lubrication seems to have been an issue, and certainly a re-test of mine after two years' in storage revealed some issues with free running.

Compared to the Dapol model, Bachmann's model is featherweight. Weight and 'substance' has always tended to reflect quality, and in this instance that works against first impressions of the Bachmann model.

It shouldn't. Bachmann's '121' may lack heft but it certainly doesn't lack anything else and the moment I put it on my layout for a test run, I warmed to it.

The review sample represents W55025 in refurbished condition and carrying Rail blue and grey livery with full yellow ends. Despite my extensive photograph collection, this particular vehicle in this livery seems to have eluded me, probably because it was allocated far down in the West Country at this time, working the Cornish branch lines. Indeed, the Bachmann model appropriately carries Newquay and Par on the destination blinds.

Bachmann's motor and drive system is located at the car's brake end but does not intrude much into the 'van' area of the body. Instead, there's a bulge under the floor, which is hidden by the chassis details and the final-drive and gearbox mouldings.

For the first time that I can recall, there is bogie bolster and under-floor frame detail above the bogies. This is an important area on a DMU because the bogie >

## Performance

A small can motor, largely concealed beneath the floor drives the 'van'-end bogie through a short cardan shaft to a gearbox mounted on the bogie. The whole arrangement is below window level in the van area.

The railcar proved beautifully smooth and quiet throughout its test running and never faltered. I progressively increased the load to six bogie coaches, the equivalent of two unpowered three-car units and the Bachmann model handled them with ease. It seems unlikely that the model would be used with such a tail-load and is much more likely to run in multiple with Bachmann's forthcoming three-car unit, so I refrained from pushing what is quite a small mechanism any further.

frames were quite slender and there was a visible gap between the bogies and the floor. Bachmann has got this just right.

There are other goodies on the chassis, too. A full complement of footboards and steps are present, there are guard irons on both bogies and the classic 'cut' buffers with their straight edges are lightly sprung. However, the *pièce de résistance* is surely the very flexible speedometer connection between the leading axlebox and the solebar.

#### **BODY BEAUTIFUL**

Moving above the solebar, the character of the Pressed Steel body has been beautifully captured. The clear glazing allows an unrestricted view into the cab where the driver's seat and main controls are picked out in colour.

It seems almost churlish to point out that the unit is depicted stationary. When the driver left the cab, he would take the two control levers with him as a safety measure. Bachmann has modelled the control desk without the controller handles, but then there's no driver present in the cab so this is quite correct.

The interior detail shows up well, in this case being a one-piece moulding in blue plastic.

Separately fitted details on the body include windscreen wipers, corner steps, lamp irons, exhaust The use of a substantially plastic chassis means that Bachmann has really been able to go to town on the underframe detail.

Numerous separate parts

allow for a real depth and crispness to the detail. I found myself comparing individual underframe components of the Dapol and Bachmann models

and, though Dapol's detail is good, time and again Bachmann's effort is deeper and crisper and there's a lightness of touch and finesse, too.





pipes and the handrails adjacent to the cab and brake van doors. The cut-out beneath the inward-opening guard's door is present, as is the security mesh on one of the 'van' windows.

As one would expect from a Bachmann product, the Rail blue/grey finish is neat and subdued. Correctly positioning the grey is a recurring problem for manufacturers, but Bachmann has got it right this time. The BR logos and limited amount of lettering are neat and legible but the lifting point markings have not been applied to the solebars.

Figuratively, the Bachmann model has all the bells and

whistles you might expect of a modern Class 121 model. Standard tension-lock couplings are fitted in NEM pockets on both bogies and phosphor bronze pick-ups are fitted on both bogies.

True, it does not come with on-board digital sound, but it is equipped for easy sound-fitting. A PluX22 decoder socket and factory-fitted speaker make the installation of top-notch sound easy.

What about lights? A quick test run showed that the model has directional white/red marker lights, interior saloon lighting and cab illumination. As supplied all these are 'on' the moment you apply power using an analogue controller. However, Bachmann has listened to those who don't like running, for instance, with cab lights on because it's normal practice to run with them off.

A row of no fewer than six switches are provided on the underside, just inboard of the trailing bogie. These switches give analogue users maximum possible control over the lighting of the railcar. True, you have to turn it upside down to operate the switches, but if that bothers you, then you really do need to switch to DCC.

What else is there to say? Ultimately, this is a strong contender for Model of the Year 2020. Full marks to Bachmann! (CJL)



## Factfile: Class 121

The Pressed Steel Company produced 16 single-unit railcars for BR Western Region, introduced in 1960. Numbered W55020-35, they were allocated initially to London area suburban and branch line services, where they replaced 20 very similar vehicles built by Gloucester RC&W Co. in 1958. The Gloucester vehicles were then transferred to West Country branch lines and to the Worcester area where they replaced the life-expired GWR diesel railcars.

Classified 121 under TOPS, the Pressed Steel cars seated 65 second class passengers and had a driver's cab at each end and a substantial guard's compartment. They were intended for use individually or with a matching single-ended driving trailer car at peak times and could also be used to replace a defective motor coach in a three-car set.

No fewer than 13 of these useful vehicles passed into preservation.

W55025, as represented by Bachmann, seems to have had a pretty standard existence, livery-wise, carrying lined dark green, then Rail blue with full yellow ends and later (after refurbishment) Rail blue and grey. In 1987/88, it was repainted into Network SouthEast livery and later became a route learner, still carrying NSE livery. It was then acquired by Railtrack/Balfour Beatty and equipped with extensive camera equipment as the network video survey vehicle, in dark blue and lime green livery. It is currently stored, derelict, at the MoD's Long Marston facility.



1: As branch lines closed, the Class 121s were absorbed as supplementary coaches in the suburban fleet, or found other uses as route learning cars and Sandite vehicles in the departmental fleet. Two were converted as a rescue train for the Severn Tunnel. W55020, having been in departmental service, was acquired by Chiltern Trains in 2002 and returned to passenger use, upgraded with its exhaust pipes ducted through the guard's compartment rather than on the cab end. egardless of how good an airbrush may be - or how proficient the user is - the quality of the compressed air source will always play an important role in the painting process. What all airbrushes need is a steady, reliable and controllable air source, free from contaminants like oil and water.

There are some good budget and mid-priced compressors on the market, but many in the under-£300 range are inevitably hindered by limited duty cycles, meaning that the unit requires regular rest periods to cool down. For modellers with a need for more intensive use, be they active hobbyists or professionals, investing in a more powerful and rugged machine is essential.

The new Iwata Power Jet Pro compressor offers the perfect package for more demanding users. Although fairly compact in size (330 by 180 by 300mm) and lightweight in nature (11kg), it's a very powerful unit that's housed in a tough steel case and, thanks to the carry handle, is eminently portable.

Featuring a quiet but powerful, twin-pump 1/6hp induction motor, the Power Jet Pro boasts twin air outlets, each with its own pressure regulation valve, gauge and moisture filter, allowing two airbrushes to be used simultaneously. This means that the compressor can be shared between two users, or permits a quick change between airbrushes (perhaps with different





The oil-less piston motor offers a low maintenance, reliable option and a 2-litre rectangular air tank sits within the steel case. This is an interesting departure from the more traditional cylindrical tank, helping to maximise space and the stored air allows for a very smooth output to the airbrushes. The pressure valves are readily accessible and can be locked to preserve specific settings. The gauges are located in the top of the case, beside the valves, for easy visual reference and the moisture purge valves are also easily accessed, without the need to poke around inside the case.

Iwata's Smart Technology automatically switches the compressor on when the airbrush's trigger is depressed, providing air instantly at the pre-set pressure. As soon as you stop spraying, the compressor will switch off when the pressure within the on-board tank returns to a set level. A pair of 3-metre coiled hoses is provided, with quick-release connectors (no need for a spanner!) and there's even a hole in the outer case to allow for rapid cleaning of the air inlet filter.

The compressor is compatible with any brand of airbrush, with various hose adaptors supplied and a handy pair of airbrush holders are fitted to the top of the unit. Capable of working between O-6Opsi for up to an hour continuously, it's suited to the most demanding of airbrush and miniature spray gun users.

With a full warranty and supreme build quality, it's definitely a worthwhile investment. (GD)

mall shunting locomotives are ideal subjects for large-scale RTR models, with a number of existing 'O' gauge diesel options available from Dapol and Heljan. Bachmann Brassworks offered a Class O3 some years ago but, other than those unpainted brass models, there hasn't been a truly RTR rendition of this popular prototype for 7mm scale until now, thanks to Heljan, which has released the first batch of Class 03s.

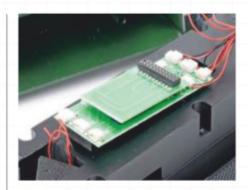
There are ten different versions to choose from (with or without numbers), taking in both the 'flowerpot' and conical pattern exhaust 'chimney' varieties, but all feature the original vacuum-brake-only body style (without the extra cabinets to house air brake equipment). Livery options are spread across BR green, BR blue and a pair of unbranded industrial colour schemes.

#### STYLE AND CHARACTER

With its full-height cab and slender bonnet shape, the Class O3 cuts a stylish figure and the Heljan model admirably catches the prototype's character perfectly. The livery application is top notch, with the yellow and black 'wasp' stripes cleanly separated, while the BR logos, numbers, builder's plates and

other legends are crisply printed. The bodyshell and chassis are awash with fine detail, in the form of moulded rivet and bolt heads, louvres and panel seams, as well as lots of separately applied fittings, such as handrails, lamp brackets and an array of pipework beneath the running plate.

Talking of which, the rendition of the chequerplate walkway around the running plate is lovely and I can imagine how good this would look after a weathering job has been applied. Other attractive features include the etched front grille and protective mesh behind the cab access steps, the bonnet door louvres are finely moulded, as are the air horns and the set of



delicate windscreen wipers. The quality of the glazing is excellent, and the spoked wheels have a fine profile, as do the coupling rods.

After removing the bodyshell, a 21-pin DCC socket is revealed a welcome sight on a Heljan 'O' gauge locomotive. There's ample space for a small, rectangular speaker to sit at the

# Head, tail and cab interior lights

Factfile: Class 03

Forming what became British Railway's 'standard' small shunter, the Class 03 diesel mechanical locomotive fleet boasted 230 examples at its peak. Built between 1957-62 at BR's Swindon and Doncaster Works, the diminutive locomotives could, for a time, be seen across England and Wales. Alas, much of the work for which they were intended began to disappear during the 1960s and 1970s, leading to withdrawals and sales to industrial users.

Powered by the reliable Gardner 8L3 engine, the '03s' boasted a maximum output of 200hp and were ideal for shunting work in goods yards and as station pilots, as well as the odd trip working. Indeed, the class became closely associated with a number of locations, such as Birkenhead Docks, Norwich,

> Newcastle, the Isle of Wight and the Burry Port & Gwendraeth Valley line in South Wales.

Most examples had been



withdrawn by the end of the 1980s, but some of those in use at industrial locations soldiered on into the 1990s. Remarkably, the final Class 03 to work on the national network was 03179 at Hornsey EMU depot in London, which survived until 2003. The class was originally numbered in the D2000-2199 and D2370-99 ranges and many have found their way into preservation.

0.4 amps across the speed range. There's plenty of side-play in the axles, allowing the model to negotiate shallow curves and point radii, but there isn't much in the way of vertical compensation. As a result, the model struggled with some of the (intentionally) poor track joints on our test track, especially those on a curve. However, if your layout features well-laid permanent way, there should be no problem.

Under power, the miniature

red and white lamps glow at each end simultaneously, regardless of direction, as per the real thing. There's also a light within the cab, allowing the lavishly detailed control console to be fully appreciated.

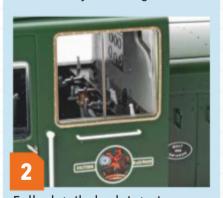




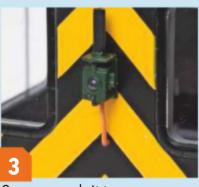

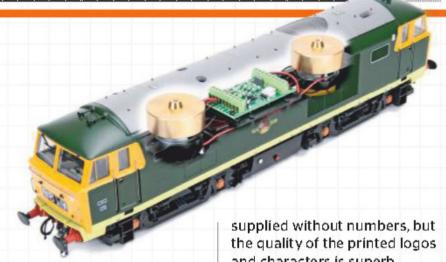


arking the Danish company's entry into the UK RTR 'O' gauge market, Heljan's 'Hymek' was a game-changer when first released in 2006. Offering new levels of realism and superb value for money, the popular Western Region hydraulic was captured with admirable attention to detail.

In the ensuing 14 years, Heljan has produced an impressive array of 7mm scale diesels, with an ever-increasing level of detail. The 'Hymek' still holds its own against more recent products, however, and this slightly revamped version offers a few minor improvements to bring it into line with contemporary releases.

The chassis features a more DCC-friendly layout (but still not DCC ready), with a pair of screw terminals mounted on the main circuit board to facilitate the connection of a digital decoder. It's not quite plug 'n' play, but the arrangement is now in line with the majority of other Heljan 'O' gauge locomotives. There's space for a speaker in the fuel tank (with perforations in the floor for sound to escape) and a full array of LED lighting is present, to illuminate the headcode panels and taillights.

This new model also sports a superior set of wheels and slightly less overall weight than the original version. Four livery



options are on offer, consisting of three versions of BR green (plain green, small warning panels and full yellow ends) and a BR blue version. All are

Overall, this is a wonderful model of a very handsome prototype and the upgraded specification is very welcome. (GD)

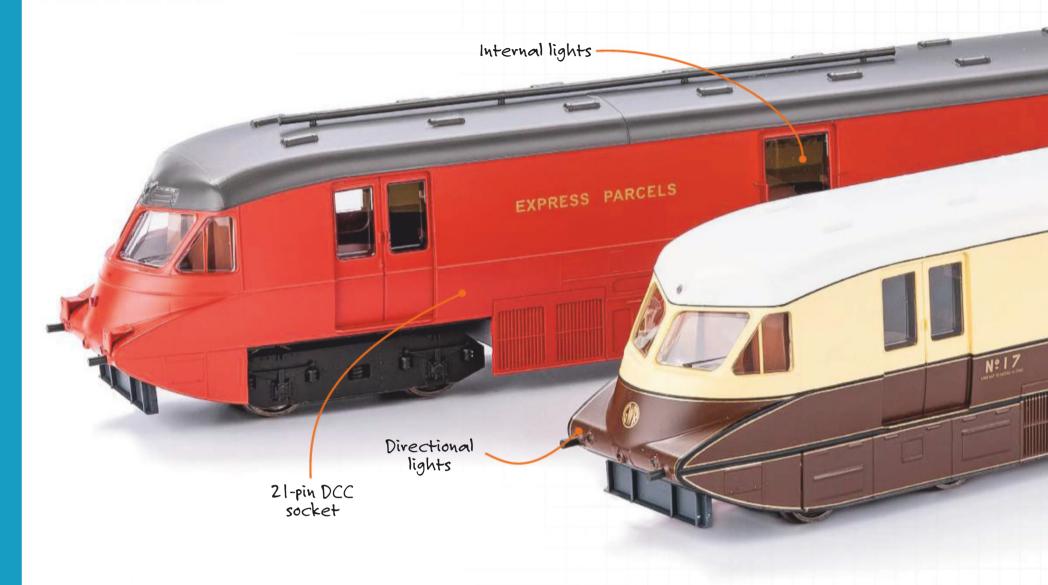

dding the matching parcels railcar to Dapol's GWR streamlined diesel railcar (MR243) fleet seemed, to me, to be an obvious course of action. It uses the same chassis and it has few windows, so the slightly compromised interior of the passenger cars is not an issue. However, it does require a completely new body tool and, happily, Dapol took the view that such expense could be justified. The parcels railcar, 17, or W17W in BR days, is now available and I've had the opportunity to test both GWR and BR versions.

The moulded plastic body captures well the smooth, rounded shape that earned these railcars the 'flying banana' epithet. Each side features the broad, centrally placed guard's

door and two pairs of loading doors. On the real thing all were sliding doors and on the model they are really crisply defined and look almost as if they should slide open but, of course, they don't. The guard's door has separately applied handrails and there's a separately fitted conduit on the roof, but otherwise the smooth body shape does not really demand separate fittings. Glazing is flush and largely avoids the prismatic effect around the edges.

#### **DETAIL ALTERATIONS**

Like the passenger car, Dapol has catered for detail alterations which were made during the life of the cars. On later versions of the model the skirting panels over the bogies were removed, and there's final drive detail on the bogie sideframes. Where

appropriate, there's a detail pack containing the plug and lamp for the central tail lamp which was a later fitting and, on the model, is the only nonworking light. On the fully skirted car the final drive detail is omitted to allow more space for the bogies to turn. The later versions also have steps above the buffers and a centrally placed lamp or bracket. These are supplied separately for fitting by the modeller.

The body is simply attached to the chassis with just two clips, one either side below the saloon doors. A substantial sealed motor, with a brass flywheel, is mounted within the chassis block and drives one bogie through a universal shaft and bogie-mounted gearbox. Lighting is provided by LEDs in the ceiling, and the small

nose-end lights are also illuminated by LEDs, three white lights forward, one red light to the rear.

Access to the 21-pin decoder socket and the space for a digital speaker is gained by removing the interior moulding which is a one-piece moulding in 'caramel' brown plastic. The cabs are provided with seats, rather more substantial-looking than those on the real thing, but there is no other cab interior detail. There is, however, detail of the slatted parcels shelves inside the main body of the car with one side depicted open and the other folded. As on the passenger car there's a large bulge in the floor area where the motor and drive system are mounted on the chassis below. It makes little difference in this car, as the interior is scarcely visible.



The bogies are plastic mouldings. The external drive-shafts and axleboxmounted final drives have been omitted from both bogies on the fully skirted model in order to provide clearance for the bogies to turn. Detail and relief on the bogies is a little flat, doubtless due to the need to allow for bogie swing on the fully-skirted car. Metal disc wheels are fitted with pick-ups on all eight wheels, those on the trailing bogie being simple phosphor-bronze wipers.

For those wishing to fit digital sound, a speaker location is provided in the underside just

inboard of one bogie. Two screws hold the interior and the ceiling circuit board in place and these must be removed to allow access to the speaker location.

#### SMOOTH OPERATOR

On test, the railcar ran smoothly and quietly throughout the speed range, in both directions, and was controllable down to a crawl. Its quietness is impressive, with both samples virtually silent and just the noise of wheels on rails. The lights, though correctly quite small in size, show up well and the cab light does make the lack of a driver rather obvious. I did

not carry out haulage tests as these cars never ran in multiple or hauled a tail-load.

The quality of finishing on both cars is to a high standard. The chocolate and cream is particularly pleasing, set off by a white roof. The GWR roundel and other small lettering is neat and legible in gold colour printing, and the 'Express Parcels' wording is goldcoloured and shaded with black.

For those who model the steam era but are tempted by the odd early diesel, this is the perfect addition to your fleet. (CJL)

## Hornby 'B12/3' 4-6-0

here was a story circulating that when Hornby was moving its manufacturing to China, it sent an old Tri-ang 'B12' 4-6-0 to the new factory and asked the Chinese engineers to copy it. They did... including the 'sandpaper' sound function.

Having what was essentially a piece of sandpaper rubbing against a cam to make a 'chuffing' noise may have been innovative in the 1960s but was laughable in the early

21st century. It got even more ridiculous as the years passed when you consider the development in electronic sound functions.

Hornby delighted modellers of the Great Eastern with the 'J15' O-6-O and then the 'D16/3' 4-4-O. It was only a matter of time before the old Tri-ang 'B12', with its sandpaper sound, was replaced with an all-new model to contemporary standards that would finally do justice to the GER's premier express design.

The 'B12/3' is a bit of a favourite of mine thanks to the work the class did on the former Midland & Great Northern Joint Railway. GER purists will probably disagree, but I really like the combination of Stephen Holden's original inside-cylinder design with the big, bold Gresley boiler and modernised cab. I also think that it's a design which really suits BR lined black better than LNER green.

It was a tad disappointing, therefore, that the new 'B12/3' was

released at a period when Hornby had stopped sending us review samples. Pre-production samples suggested that Hornby's design team had done another sterling job and it remained on my wishlist until funds allowed me to finally get my hands on one.

Happily, that day finally came in mid-March, three years after the model's initial release, when a parcel from Hornby arrived containing 'B12/3' No. 61556 in lined black with British Railways emblazoned on the tender.



I must admit to being a little disappointed with the first impression, thanks to the silver paint on the smokebox. This is based on how the real thing looked circa 1949, but it proved a little distracting to the eye in model form.

But the disappointment didn't last long...

#### **FACE VALUE**

Look beyond that silver paint and you can see what a super job Hornby has done. The face, with the distinctive dished smokebox door and flattened 'chin', is spot on. The lack of outside cylinders makes the 'B12/3' look longer than it really is and Hornby has captured this distinctive appearance with aplomb.

There really is little to criticise about the 'B12/3's' appearance. It matches published photographs and drawings. It looks right from every angle and features a fabulous amount of fine detail - in fact, the 'B12/3' is every inch the top-notch Hornby model.

Some personal highlights are the distinctive chimney with snifting valve behind, the long, slender coupling rods, the sight



screen glasses and that wonderful footplate with all the backplate fixtures and fittings. Correctly, there's a tiny reversing wheel tucked away in front of the splasher.

The tender is the same tooling as appears behind the 'Claud Hamilton' and it's an excellent take on the short wheelbase design that characterised these GER express locomotives. Unlike the 'D16/3', the guard irons on the 'B12's' tender are a customer-fit job.

The fit and finish is up to Hornby's usual high standard.

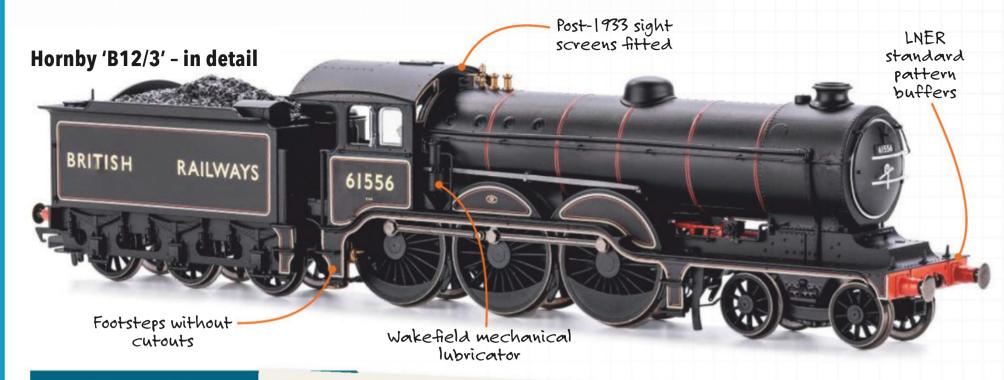
## **Performance**

As East Anglia became an important destination during the Second World War, the 'B12s' were taxed to the limit on trains weighing up to 490 tons. This prodigious pulling power is clearly in the model's DNA, for No. 61556 performed beautifully on our test track.

As with most new models, No. 61556 was smooth and silent straight from the box, the biggest noise being the wheels on the railheads. Now it was time to see

what No. 61556 could pull.
The 4-6-0 handled our
entire fleet of 14 Bachmann
and Hornby bogie
coaches around the level
part of our test track. It
coped well with the section
of tight points and
crossovers and then romped
over the 1-in-30 gradient
with six coaches in tow.
Impressive stuff.

# Factfile: LNER 'B12/3' 4-6-0

The Great Eastern Railway's 'S69' 4-6-0 was Stephen Holden's development of his father James' 'Claud Hamilton' 4-4-0s. They may have looked like a stretched 'Claud' but the new locomotives, five

of which were built in 1911-12, had smaller driving wheels, larger cylinders and a larger boiler, not to mention a larger cab. The locomotives looked big but they still fitted within the tight length and width restrictions imposed by the GER. Stratford works built a further 46 up to 1920.

They became 'B12' under the LNER's classification system. The class also spread their wings under new ownership, with several transferred to Scotland in the 1930s. The LNER also added a further ten to the fleet in 1928, this batch being built by Beyer Peacock.

'B12s' would also appear on former North Eastern, Great Central metals in LNER days, as well as the Midland & Great Northern and East coast Main Line post nationalization.

No. 61556 was built as GER No. 1556 in February 1921 as one of a batch of ten built by Scottish industrial giant William Beardmore for the GER. It had three numbers under LNER ownership: No. 8556 in 1924, 7470 in 1942 and 1556 in 1946. It was one of the 53 'B12s' fitted with ACFI water heater (MR270), which it carried between January 1932 and May 1935.

The locomotive became No. 61556 after nationalisation. It spent most of its BR career at Stratford, going to Colchester in November 1956 before moving to Norwich Thorpe in January 1957. It was withdrawn from 32A in December 1957.

No. 61572 was the only 'B12' to survive. It's in full working order at the North Norfolk Railway.

1: This is roughly how the 'B12s' originally looked, with Belpaire fireboxes, GER-style smokeboxes and the cab sidesheets blended with the splasher. No. 8572, however, was part of the 1928 batch, built new with Lentz valve gear, that became 'B12/2' as opposed to the original 'B12' class. There was also a 'B12/4' subclass, which were Scottish 'B12s' rebuilt with boilers to the original size but fitted with round-top fireboxes. RAIL ARCHIVE STEPHENSON

2: The 'B12/3' was the most famous 'B12' sub-class. Rebuilding was masterminded by Edward Thompson and included fitting a larger, Gresley-designed boiler, round-topped firebox, new smokedoor, long-travel valves and new cabs with steel, rather than wooden, roofs, along with other minor tweaks. Some 54 'B12/3s' were created between 1931 and 1944. No. 61556 was rebuilt in October 1935. RAIL ONLINE

3: No. 8572 is the North Norfolk Railway's flagship. Built in 1928, it was condemned in late 1959. However, Norwich shedmaster and 'B12' enthusiast Bill Harvey discovered that the locomotive was still serviceable and adopted it as a shed pet. It was finally withdrawn in October 1961 and held aside until the M&GNJR Society raised enough money to buy it. It's now in action in full LNER lined green. MEL HOLLEY/SR

## Present your case

If there's a locomotive that you think needs to be offered ready-to-run, here's the place to voice your opinion...

**Item:** GWR 'Toplight' coaches

**Gauge:** '00'

#### Proposed by:

Simon Moppett, Oxfordshire

#### What is it?

Hornby introduced a range of Collett 57ft coaches a couple of years ago. These 1930s vehicles are wonderful and Hornby even manufactured left and right-handed stock to allow sets to be run with the corridor down one side, as per the prototype.

As with many railway companies, the GWR introduced its newest and best coaches to its most prestigious trains, and older vehicles were cascaded down the pecking order. This is what I'm proposing - the vehicles that the 'bow-ended' stock replaced.

The 'Toplights' were introduced in 1907, with almost ornate panelled bodies. The term 'Toplight' comes from the small 'lights' or windows above the main windows. They were built in various types on 57ft and 70ft underframes.

#### What would make it viable?

The 1920s livery was brown and cream with lining around the windows and panels, although from this time the bodies were steel without the panels. The lined livery looks gorgeous, and though difficult to reproduce by hand, with modern manufacturing

techniques they would look amazing in ready-to-run form. They also received plain chocolate and cream and even BR crimson and cream.

These vehicles took on the role as strengtheners for secondary services, and on branch lines services. They are more useful on model railways than the later designs currently available because many of us don't have the luxury of modelling full-length trains on expansive main lines. A 70ft 'Toplight' would make an interesting and different model and a single brake composite is an ideal single coach for a branch line train later in their working life.

A rake of Toplights in 1920s lined livery would look superb behind a Hornby 'Star' or early 'Castle' and could raise the bar again in model coach construction and decoration. There is a trend for more locomotives from the pre-Grouping period and, who knows, a manufacturer may have plans for older GWR locomotives.

#### Can I see a real one?

Some 15 GWR 'Toplights' still survive, although only a handful have been restored to full working order (Severn Valley Railway) whereas you can see unrestored or under-restoration examples at the West Somerset and Swindon & Cricklade Railways.

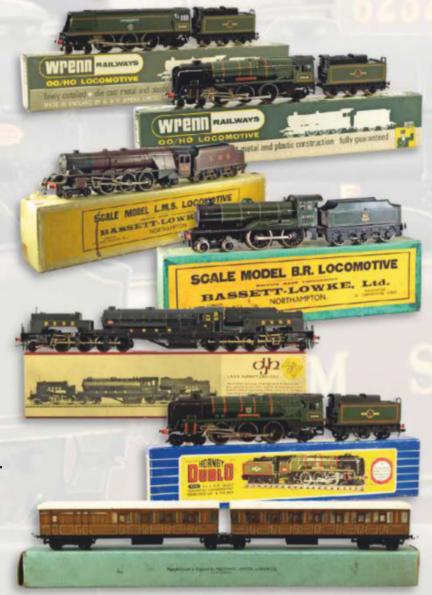

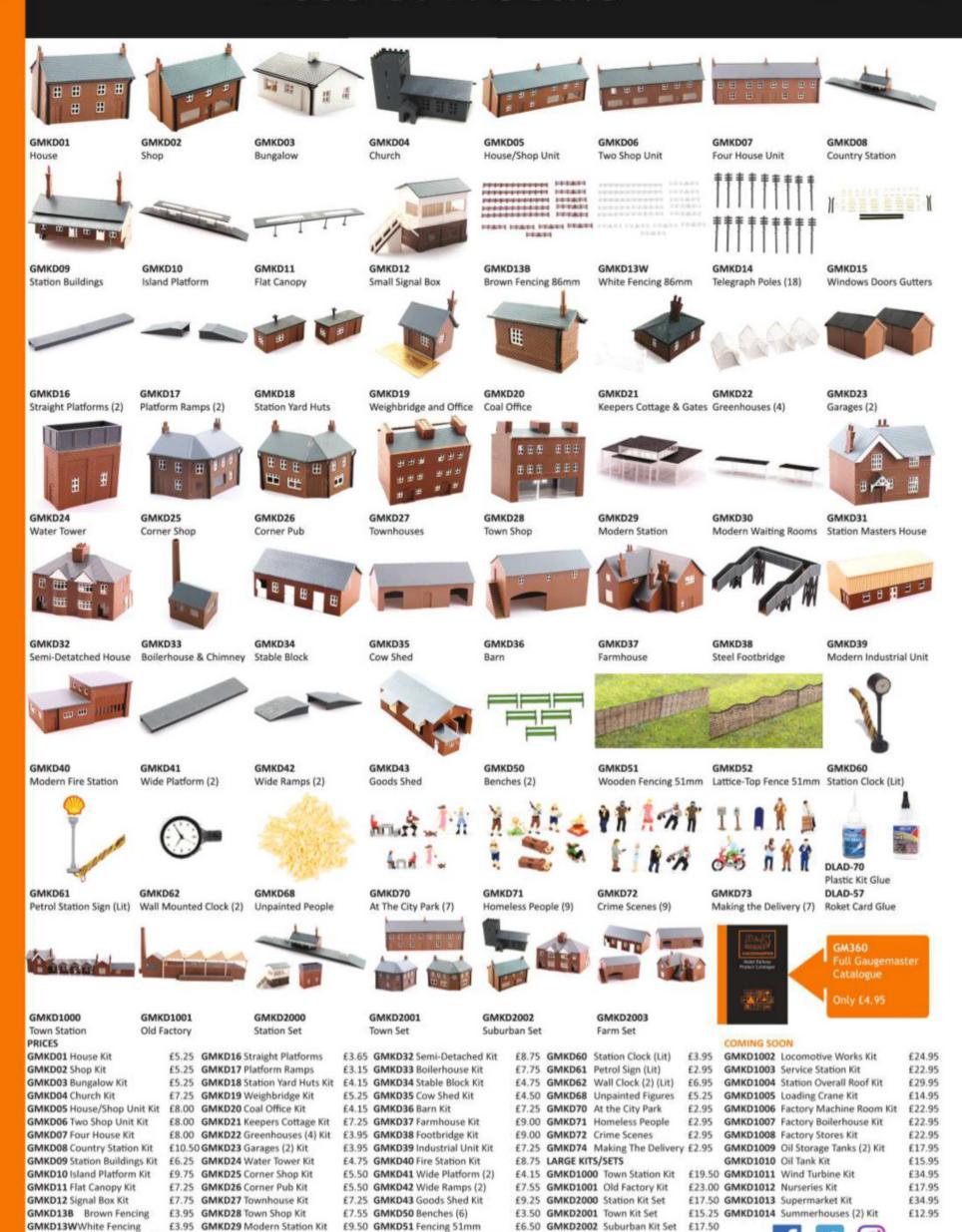

Pt 1: Card kits

Building kits offers potential financial savings, compared to ready-made models, as well as providing a welcome challenge. George Dent begins this new six-part module by explaining how to get the best from card kits.

PLAY YOUR **CARD RIGHT** 

Printed card kits have been around since the early 20th century, offering a relatively cheap and easy means of building a variety of models, including

locomotives and rolling stock. The use of card for replicating trains has waned over the past 50 years, but it's still a popular material for model structures and scenic accessories.

In more recent decades, improvements in printing technology have allowed kit manufacturers to create much more lifelike renditions of brick, stone, concrete and timber, meaning that there's no need for painting the assembled models. Indeed, some kits now also come pre-weathered, with optional graffiti in some instances.

Die-cutting and laser-cutting have also greatly speeded up assembly times, with pre-cut kit parts removing the need for tedious work with a knife and steel rule. Pre-cut parts also remove any margin for error, ensuring that the parts are uniform and the various elements slot together as intended.

A well-designed card kit will build into a surprisingly sturdy - yet lightweight structure and the material is easy to work with, with only a handful of simple tools required. There's very little mess involved and no need for smelly, solvent-based glues. What's more, any waste card can be recycled, so it's an environmentally friendly option too!

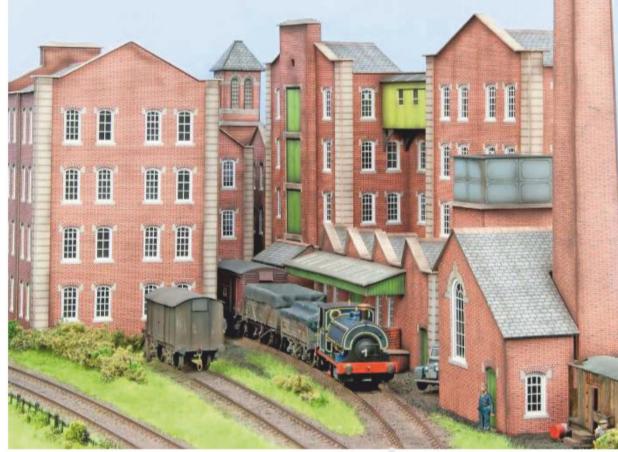
Card is a porous material, so we need to take some precautions when using it. Choice of glue is important (see panel), as anything too watery may cause the card to swell and deform. There's also the risk of the printed surfaces being damaged by excess moisture, so the parts need to be handled carefully and the finished model stored in a relatively dry and stable environment, protected from variations in temperature and humidity.

A modern variation on the traditional card kit is the downloadable version, as offered by Scalescenes, Smart Models and others. The kit components can be printed at home onto paper and laminated onto different grades of card. There's a degree of extra labour involved, as the parts are not pre-cut, but the results can be impressive. An added bonus is the fact that the kits can be printed off as many times as you like.

Card kits are available to suit most scales and they're perfect for modellers of all skill levels.

Left: Card kits are available in various scales, representing railway, industrial and domestic building subjects. Metcalfe and Superquick are probably the best-known ranges.

This extensive mill complex was created from a quartet of Metcalfe card kits. Card kits offer a versatile option, being easy to modify or customise.



**GLUES** 

While many regular **PVA-type** adhesives are suitable for card kit construction, drying times can be relatively long, leading to lengthy waits between assembly stages. **Deluxe Materials offers** a trio of alternatives that speed up the job and help achieve neater, stronger bonds.

Roket Card Glue is a thin, all-purpose, fast-setting glue suitable for most of the assembly work. The 'grab' between parts is virtually instant and just a small amount is needed to affect reliable bonds. Glue 'n' Glaze is slightly more viscous and is ideal for fixing glazing sheets or bonding parts that don't quite marry up perfectly. It takes a little longer to dry but, when it does, the glue turns crystal clear.

Fitting a pinpoint applicator tip to the nozzle makes the bonding process easier, helping to regulate the flow and aiding precision. Keep a needle handy to keep the applicator tip from clogging up.

Speed Bond is a thicker adhesive that is best for bonding larger elements together or for fixing completed structures to the

baseboard. As the name suggests, drying time is fairly rapid, especially compared to 'standard' PVA.

A humble Pritt Stick is also useful, being perfect for applying thin printed overlays, signs and other smaller details. **Availability:** Deluxe Materials glues available are from model shops or Gaugemaster. Tel: 01903 884488 Web: www.gaugemaster.com

Wooden sprung clothes pegs are ideal for clamping parts together.

Right: Lightweight magnetic clamps are designed to fit on either side of a corner joint, holding parts steady while the glue dries. As well as improving accuracy, they speed up assembly. Various shapes and sizes are available from York Modelmaking and Proses.





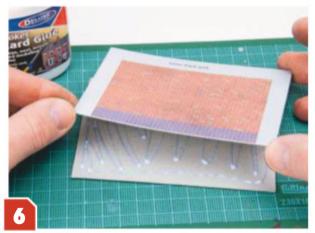




Read the kit's instructions. When you've worked out what parts are needed, use a stout knife with a fresh blade to remove them from the main sheet. Work on a cutting mat, using



To achieve realistic depth, this Metcalfe kit features recessed window frames, with the glazing fitting behind. A thin bead of Glue 'n' Glaze was applied with a pinpoint tip and left to turn tacky before fixing the glazing sheet.



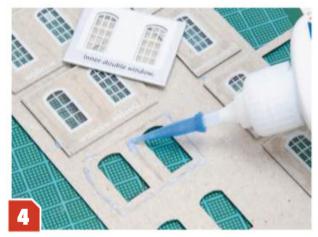
Laminating various layers of card is a common requirement when building card kits. A thin bead of Roket Card Glue is run over one face and, after lining up the layers accurately, they can be pressed together.



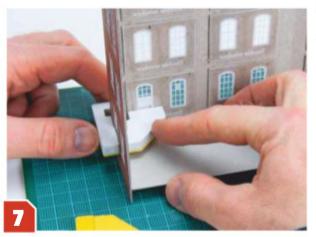
When the glue has set, remove the clamps. If adding all four walls, remember to ensure that the clamps will not be trapped inside! Stone cover strips are being fitted to the corners, tidying up the exposed edges.



Depending on the nature of the kit, glazing may be added at the beginning of the project. Windows are often printed onto clear acetate, which is best cut with a sharp pair of scissors rather than a knife.



Once the glazed window frames are dry, they can be fixed to the inside of the walls. Roket Card Glue, applied via a pinpoint tip, is applied sparingly, well away from the aperture to minimize the risk of glue being squeezed out.



The walls of this factory are designed to fold up around the inner floors, which also act as strengthening ribs. The lower floor is fitted first and a set of magnetic clamps hold the walls at the correct angles while assembly continues.



If any excess glue emerges from a joint while the parts are being pressed together, use a cotton swab dampened with water to wipe it away. Do this straight away to avoid staining or damaging the printed surfaces.

#### Essential tools

- Knives with fresh blades
- Scissors
- Steel rule
- Setsquare
- Cutting mat
- Tweezers
- Cotton swabs and cocktail sticks

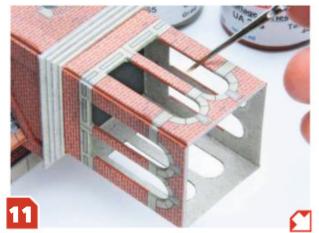




Care is needed to line up the frames accurately within the openings, so that an equal amount of frame is visible around the edges. The use of multiple layers is very effective for creating a lifelike sense of depth to the walls.

With the clamps holding things steady, the remaining floors can be added, along with the spacers. As the glue cures, the structure will become stronger. Double-check with a set square while the parts can still be manipulated.





Exposed strips of blank card can detract from the overall effect, although most of these areas can be treated with paint or coloured pencils after assembly. However, some parts can be touched in before installation.
