## You've seen it all on TV, – now visit the national show

his is truly a bumper issue this month. Here's an example of an ideal starter layout in 00 gauge which does not require a lot of space in the home, and includes interchangeable scenic modules to keep the layout fresh and fun.

Another plan for making a start, this time, in N gauge appears on page 990. Based on a layout by Terry Tasker, it offers the potential to depict

main line trains with large engines and long rakes of carriages or wagons.

Next up, it's the turn of readers to scrutinise Channel 5's The Great Model Railway Challenge which certainly generated lots of bouquets and brickbats. Did you watch it or avoid it? Check out readers' views on page 1010 and don't forget there are two of the winning layouts from the TV

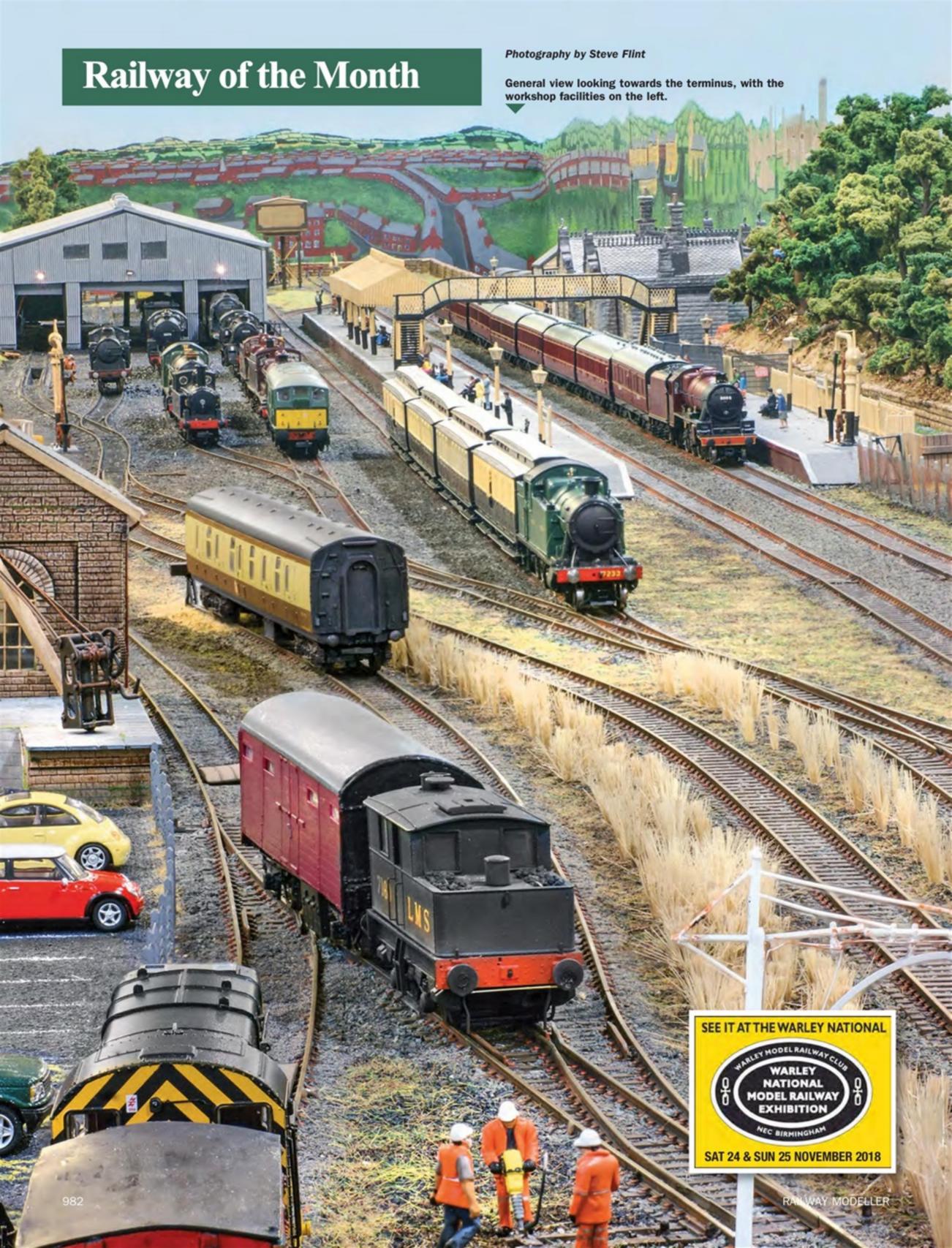

## Northbridge

#### A terminus on the Dalton Valley Railway

**DUNCAN PETFORD** describes this heritage railway portrayal in OO gauge, devised and constructed by a group of Warley Model Railway Club members, and making its inaugural appearance at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition at the NEC.

So, what do the members of the Warley Model Railway Club do when they are not busy organising and running the club's national model railway extravaganza at the NEC? Well, we gather together several like-minded individuals, form a group and build layouts – just like other model railway club members do the length and breadth of the country.

Our little group of seven got together in late summer 2015. The like-mindedness of the group members in this case was that we wanted to create what would be for each of us, our first exhibition layout. We all owned quantities of 4mm OO gauge rolling stock, but that was about as far as it went, for we each came to the group with a very wide range of diverse model railway interests.

So the first question was how would we

build a layout that could cover everything from pre-Grouping Highland Railway, Big Four GWR, British Railways steam, and diesel types from the 1970s to the 2010s? The answer is of course: build a heritage railway layout. The Severn Valley Railway is fairly local to us in the West Midlands and seemed like a suitable prototype, but it was problematical for two main reasons.

Firstly, we are all aware of the rivet-counters out there in the wider domain of the hobby and there is nothing less certain than they would gather like moths to a flame if we attempted to do an exact copy of one of the SVR stations.

Secondly, as it was to be an exhibition layout, it had to have entertainment value for the viewers and we reckoned that a layout faithful to the SVR would not provide enough interest. So we compromised and decided to use the station at Bridgnorth as the basis, but with several twists to catch the eye and to be more visually entertaining.

Thus, Northbridge was born, and when the kindly aforementioned rivet counters point out that Bridgnorth is "...not like that!" we can agree and point out politely that it is in fact Northbridge. In the event, apart from the station building faithfully recreated by Jim Smith, whose work has previously featured in this magazine, very little else resembles the Bridgnorth site.

We upgraded the line to double track and added a branch line, all to give more options for train movements. The turntable has been added and sits to the left of the engine shed. We also added a turntable and a goods yard to allow some shunting, both by group





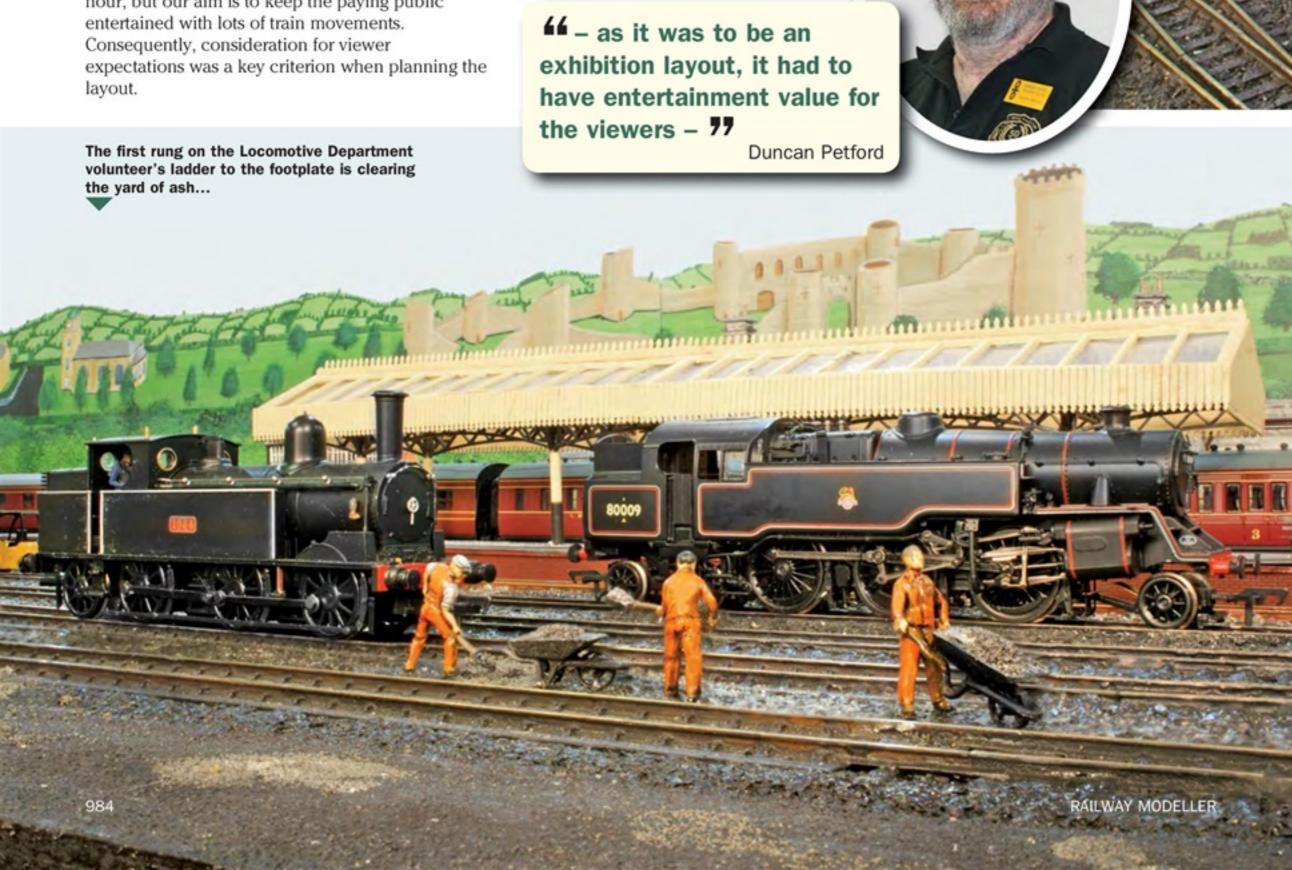
▲ A three-car Class 108 copes with the off-peak traffic as a Jubilee is prepared for duty. The turntable is a modified Peco/Airfix combination.

members and by the public at shows.

Hopefully with all these options there will always be something moving. Of course there are those out there who appreciate finescale models of sleepy little branch lines operating to authentic timetables which might see one train movement an hour, but our aim is to keep the paying public entertained with lots of train movements. Consequently, consideration for viewer expectations was a key criterion when planning the layout.

#### Materials and parts used

The layout consists of six 4' x 2' scenic boards made out of 6mm plywood with 2" x 1" softwood bracing, six 4' x 6" scenic extensions, and an 8' long fold-up fiddle yard with eight sidings, all fully rotatable. As older rolling stock is being used we opted for Peco code 100 track and points. We began with SEEP point motors wired traditionally, but as

we are using a DCC system for train control – a Gaugemaster Prodigy – we changed to Cobalt IP digital point motors which have been fine.

We also initially started with adjustable feet on each supporting leg, but difficulties with setting up and levelling a layout as long as this one lead us to abandon that idea and we came up with a support trestle that allows for adjustment at waist level, eliminating any need for crawling around on the floor.

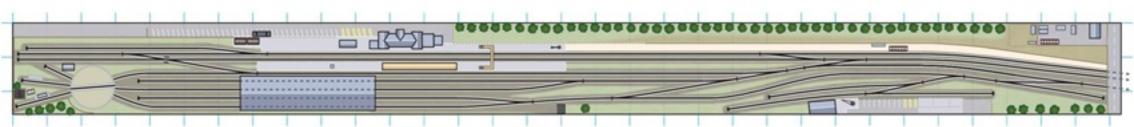
All scenic work started with 'pink' insulation foam boards being sculpted to

shape and covered with a layer of PVA soaked kitchen roll or, where appropriate, flexible DIY filler. This was painted an earth colour and flock type materials glued down as needed to reflect the different areas, from the soupy, oil polluted, engine shed apron through to the undergrowth of the lush woodland that forms the backdrop to the track for much of its length. The woodland was definitely a labour of love and dedication by two members of our group who produced dozens of trees. Smaller buildings are mostly off-the-shelf examples from Peco, Wills, Lcut, Severn Models and Skytrex, some of them were adapted as required.

The main station building and the engine shed were both scratchbuilt and based on originals at Bridgnorth. We struck lucky with both, as the SVR had applied for planning permission to alter the two of them and scale plans were readily accessible at the local council planning office.

To make the metal siding (cladding) on the engine shed, an accurate master was first made using a 3D printer. A mould was then made from the master which was then used to cast all the other sections using car body filler.

The turntable started life as a Peco LK-55 kit onto which parts from an Airfix turntable were grafted to give it a more GWR appearance. Staffordshire blue brick walls from plasticard were also added and it was motorised with a Locomotech motor and gearbox.

#### Operation

We do try to keep it within reasonable bounds, but trains that were never preserved, such as the Blue Pullman are allowed to visit Northbridge. We can certainly call on a stock list that would make any manager of a present-day British heritage railway green with envy, particularly as ours don't require major fund raising efforts and regular boiler rebuilds!

The stock you will see running comprises many R-T-R items, as well as kitbuilt ones and some scratchbuilt examples. Trains are run in and out of the station primarily where locos are exchanged before running out. The branch line provides extra movements, and many of the shunting manoeuvres that one would associate with a full-size heritage railway are replicated on the model.

#### Cameos

There are several cameo set-pieces on the layout to give additional visual interest. The idea was that we would display small

sections of the layout year after year to show how the layout was progressing. By 2015 we had little to show beyond the basic trackwork, so a foamboard outline of the proposed engine shed was made to give some idea of what the finished area would look like. Although it was a 'dummy' shed, it was quite a good model in its own right. Anyway, part way through the exhibition it disappeared. One of our group's members, called Mick, aided and abetted by our club

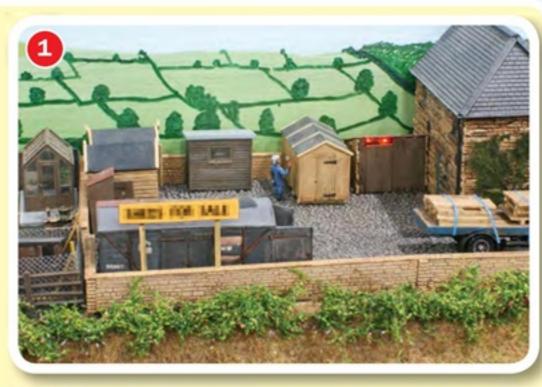

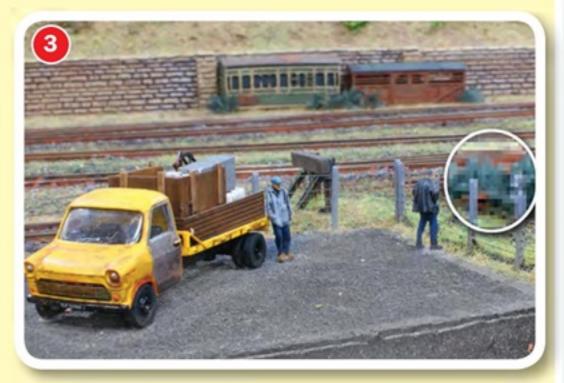

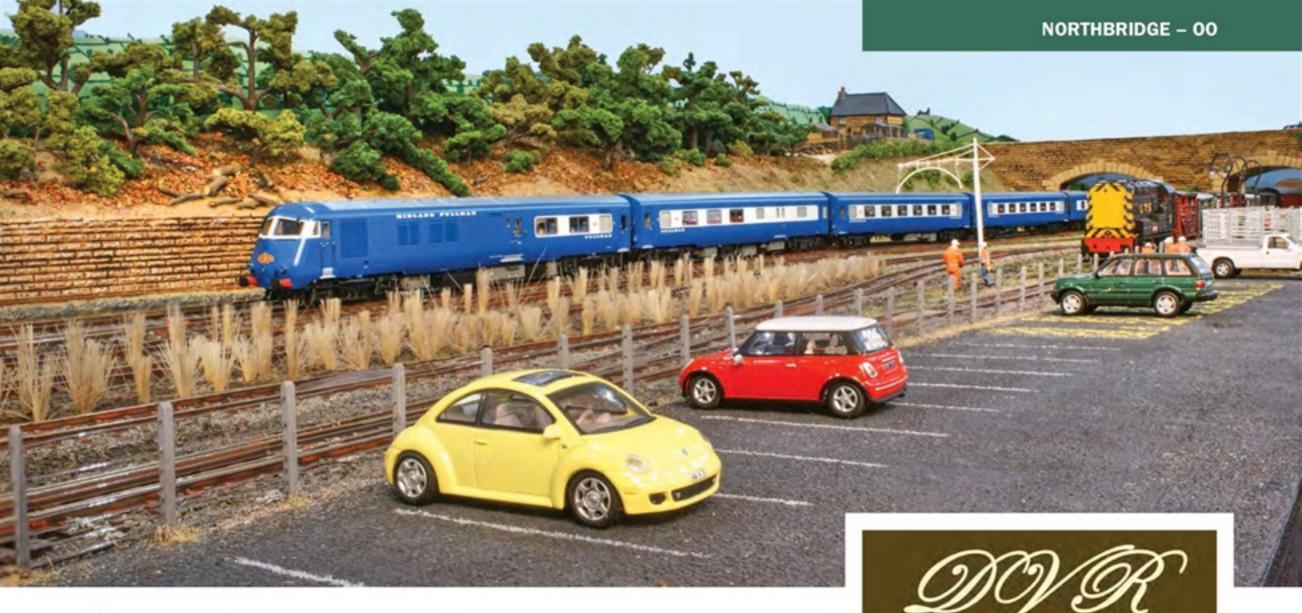

search online found the excellent little figures (which are from Modelu) and a beaver-tailed AA transit van (Oxford Diecast) which we altered and filled the back with parts from Scale Model Scenery. Incidentally this firm also produced most of the fencing including the security type that protects the camping coaches and the holidaymakers at the centre back of the layout.

#### Further work

Whilst no model railway is ever 'finished' there were a few items not ready in time for the photoshoot: we hope to have finished by the time of the NEC show. So come along and see if you can spot the additions. The more observant amongst you will notice that we have yet to install any signals. This is

partly due to the usual debate as to what the correct signalling should be, and partly due to time constraints. A proper rake of camping coaches is also in the pipeline, but until they are ready, a rake of Southern stock coaches will have to stand in. We also intend to create more cameo scenes based on the exploits of group members

If you do get along to the NEC show, please come along to see the layout, we'd love to see you, and of course, there's the little spotting competition in conjunction with Peco Publications as detailed in the panel opposite.

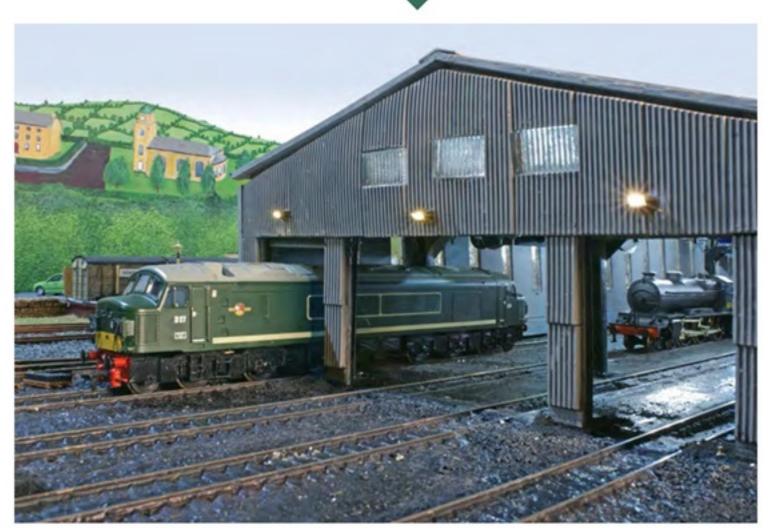

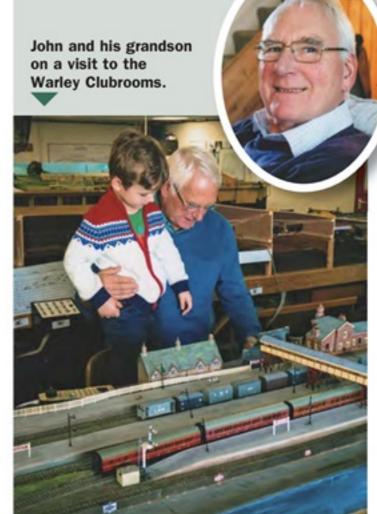

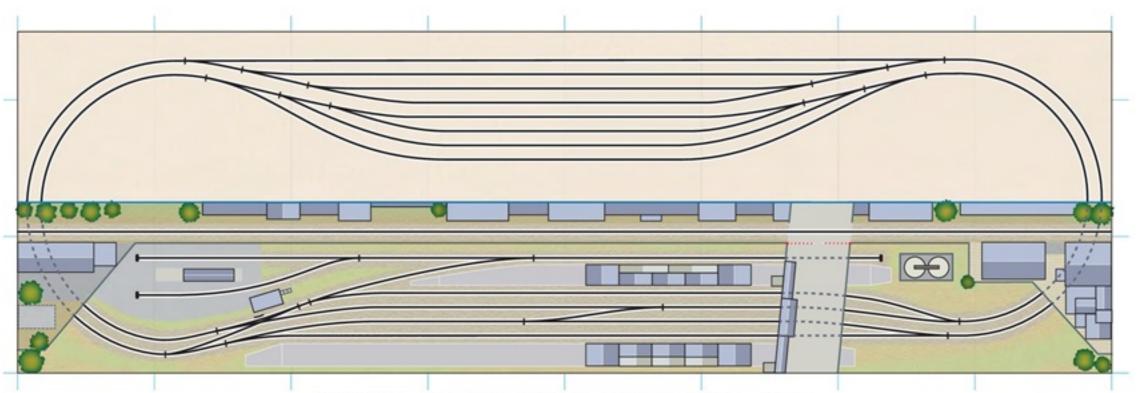




## Dunnlakin

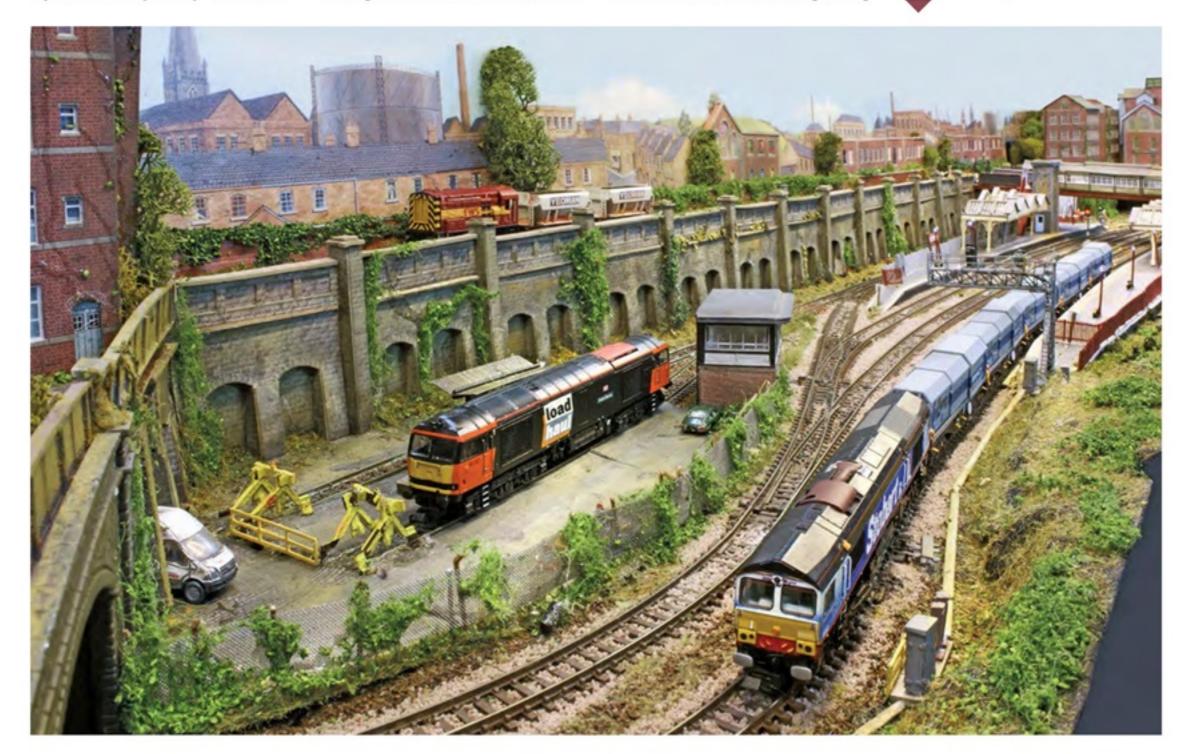
Dunnlakin Overall size 8' x 2' 6". Each grid square = 1' x 1'.

gauge has the distinct advantage that main line railways can be modelled in a comparatively small space. This month's plan is a case in point.

Dunnlakin is based closely on a layout built by Terry Tasker of Southport which he has taken to exhibitions in the north-west and Scotland. It features a double track oval, half of which is the fiddle yard.

The scenic section portrays a through station with two fast lines and two platform roads for stopping passenger trains.

A third platform face, the bay platform on the inside, could be utilised for passenger trains, although Terry, in his design, intended it to be a stabling siding Terry's layout in operation. The top freight line could be replaced with a tram or car system. On the main layout, the installation of a single slip and curved point (beneath the Class 66) would enable trains to enter and exit the bay platform, as shown on the plan.

for locomotives, hence the small refuelling area at the right-hand end of the layout.

By making a minor modification to Terry's design – fitting a single slip and curved point in the top right hand corner of the plan – passenger trains can then run in and out of the bay platform without having to run 'wrong line'.

The station building is arranged on the road overbridge with stairways leading to each platform. both of which are fitted with a canopy. This is a very common arrangement and was used at sites all over the UK, so any region could be readily portrayed without compromising realism.

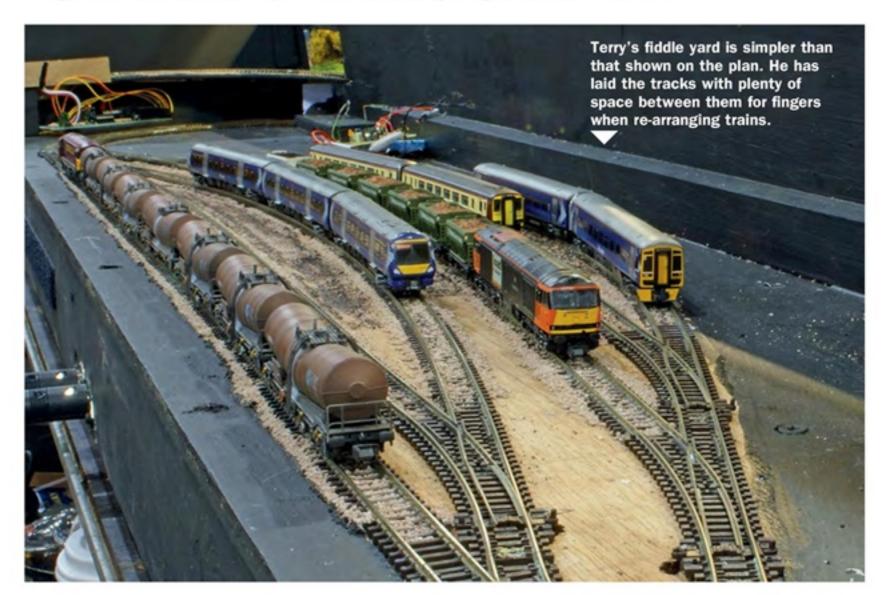
Indeed, although the photos show the layout in the privatisation diesel era, the format lends itself to virtually any period in railway development.

The hidden sidings are capable of storing reasonable length trains on both up and down lines. So operationally the layout can be run with a procession of trains in both directions. As it stands there is little potential for shunting goods trains, so the plan is very much a 'watching trains' visualisation, although with plenty of potential for town scene development along the back of the scenic section

Digital control would be very

useful, as several short trains could be readily stored on one fiddle yard track without the need for individual isolating sections, further increasing the variety of trains that can be used.

Making the scenic elements – station buildings, signal boxes etc – interchangeable would allow the same layout to depict a station with different regional architecture. So, overall an ideal scheme for those modellers who prefer to collect ready-to-run models and need somewhere to run them.



Whatever happened to...

## Little Burton



Previous versions of Little Burton are now long gone, but the concept lingered on until **CLIVE BAKER** built this third impression, depicting a Midland and North Staffordshire Railway Joint line.

Burton upon Trent, once nationally accepted as the centre of the brewing industry, hosted four pre-Grouping railway companies – principally Midland (MR), with London & North Western (LNW), North Staffordshire (NS) and Great Northern (GN) all working into the town. Although the title *Little Burton* may suggest a small layout, it is actually a name of an area of the town, close to the main railway line to the north of the main Midland station.

Opened with the coming of the railway in 1839, the station and goods facilities soon proved inadequate for the huge amount of traffic generated by the breweries; to satisfy demand, the Midland Railway quadrupled

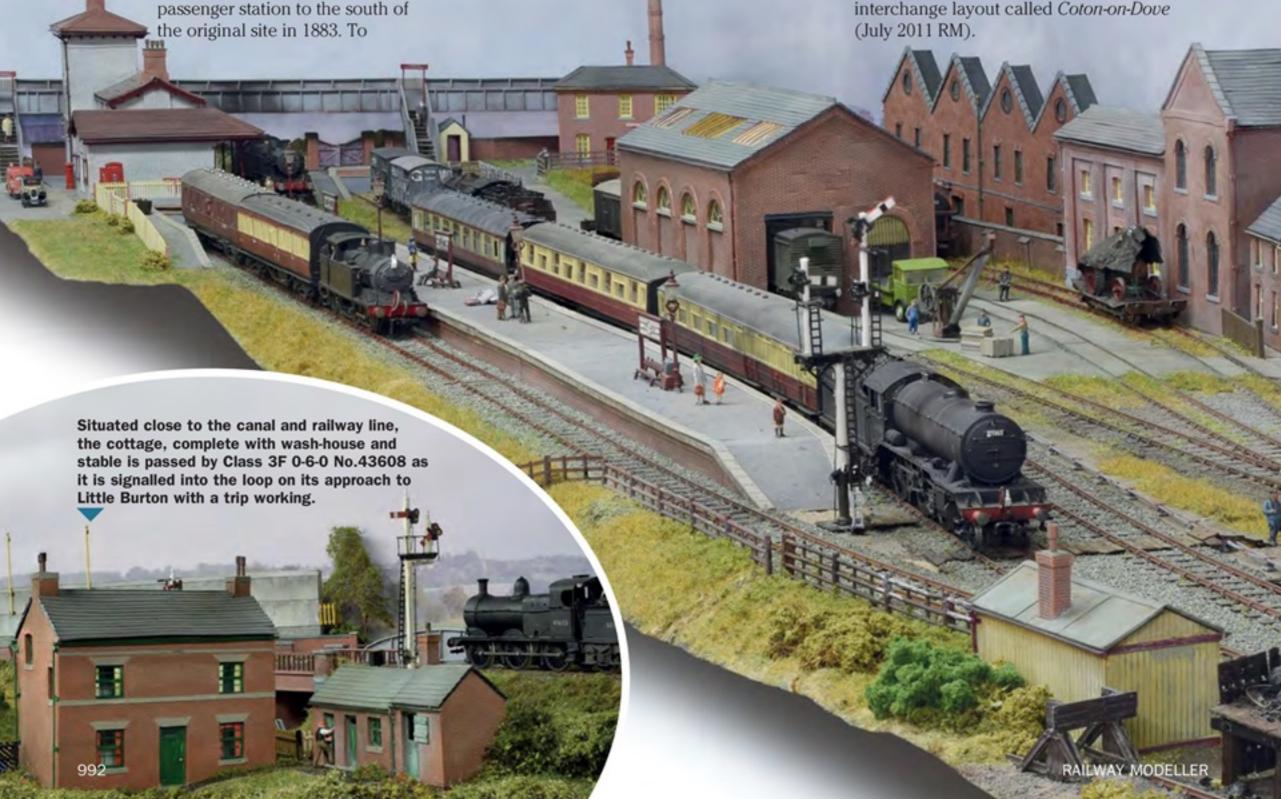
the track and built a new

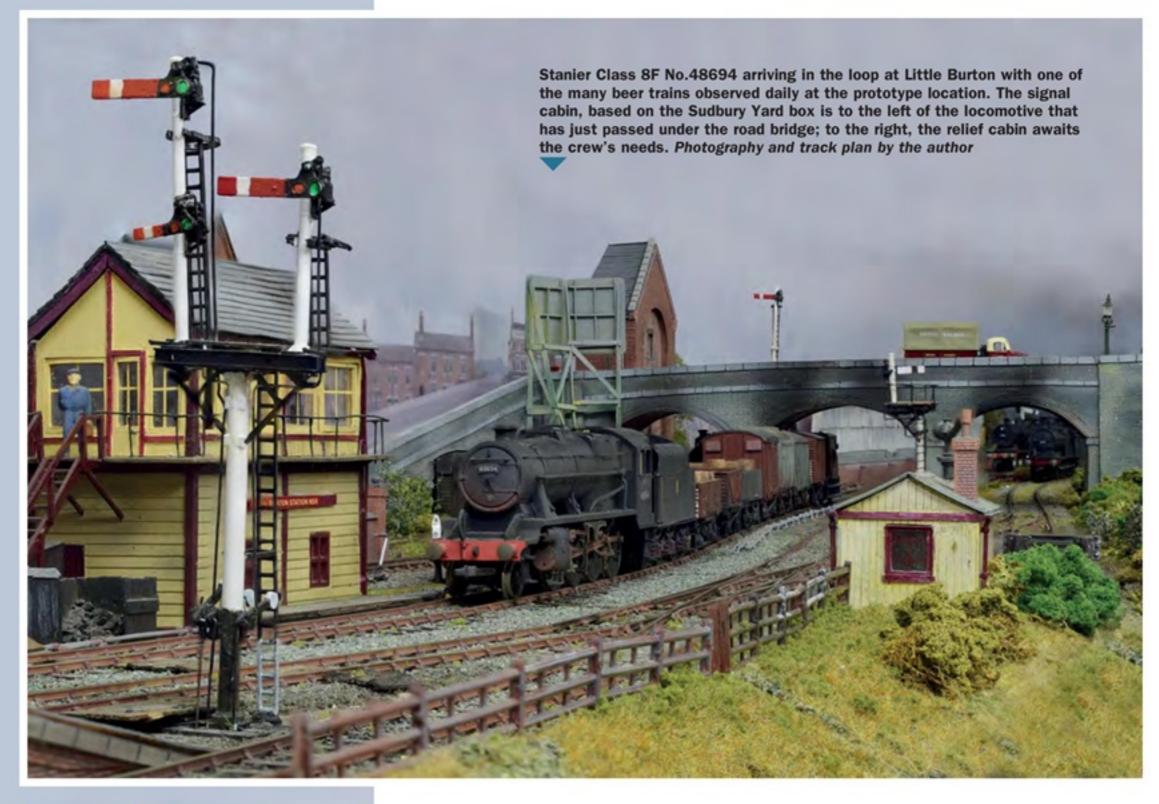
accommodate the burgeoning brewery traffic, the MR laid branches to numerous sites, crossing the town's streets at over 30 level crossings; worked by MR locomotives as well as those owned by the brewers, the town became synonymous with delays to road users.

The new station took the form of an island platform in between the up and down fast lines; two bay platforms situated at north and south ends were for the exclusive use of the LNW (south bay) and NSR/GNR (north bay).

It is the traffic frequenting the north bay that originally inspired the author to create the first version of *Little Burton*, which featured as Railway of the Month in the December 1985 issue. The second version of Little Burton featured as Plan of the Month in the March 2000 issue of RM.

Moving house into a property with inadequate loft space, the second version of *Little Burton* had to fit into the much reduced space. It featured as Plan of the Month in the March 2000 issue and survived intact until the end of 2011. During that intervening period, the author built a portable layout, *Rolleston-on-Dove*. (November 2007 RM) which represented an actual location on the North Staffordshire Railway and left the author with a yearning to delve further into all things NSR. Also in this period he built a small narrow gauge/standard gauge interchange layout called *Coton-on-Dove* 







Although the previous versions of *Little Burton* are now both long gone, the concept lingered on until the author built this, the third version, meaning that his trilogy of *Little Burton* layouts span almost 40 years of modelling.

#### Mark III

Theoretically situated to the north of the main Burton station close to the actual area known (to some local people) as Little Burton, Little Burton station this time is on a supposedly joint MR/NSR branch.

Consequently the main station building is modelled on Trentham, a station deep in NS territory and, coincidentally the selected area was once the site of the NSR engine shed that, following closure, accommodated the exchange sidings for the Eagle Brewery of Truman, Hanbury & Buxton.

#### The plan

As the track diagram indicates, version three is an L-shaped, storage yard to terminus layout running along the two long sides and one end of the garage, a work bench occupies the other end wall.

The five main scenic baseboards, together with two small extensions (indicated) makeup one half of the U, the remaining part of the curve being presently considered offstage. A drawbridge carries the line across the gap for the access door; at that point the line doubles to join one section borrowed from *Rolleston* before entering the cassette storage yard.

Garage floors generally slope so that excess water from a car drains away under the vehicular door. To ensure a level track base, the baseboards are all mounted on brackets constructed from Dexion aligned to the brick courses at a height convenient for the author, thus giving uninhibited space below for the boards of the other two layouts that only emerge for exhibitions.

The main objective when formulating the track plan was to achieve an impression of space whilst broadening operational potential. Apart from the curved viaduct section, the situation is urban, so a greater number of tracks in the available space is permissible.

The run round loop stretches almost the full length of three baseboards allowing access not only to the main goods yard and cattle dock, but also to a cold store and brewery that provide extra reasons for freight traffic and shunting in general.

Another objective, the facility to operate the main line independently from the goods yard, had proved a popular feature with version two during the couple of occasions when that layout appeared at exhibitions.

The overall objective, to re-create the Burton railway scene as remembered during trainspotting sessions in the mid/late 1950s and early 1960s, remains. With the building of some LMS and ex-NS rolling stock, the



clock is occasionally turned back; with the layout lacking post war infrastructure, all looks compatible.

#### Permanent way in EM gauge

When first constructing track to suit EM gauge standards, a formula developed at that time has been applied to all subsequent layouts; for plain track, the now unavailable Ratio plastic sleeper bases support code 75 bullhead rail, and pointwork is assembled, referring to EM Gauge Society templates, from plywood sleepers, the rail soldered to brass rivets representing chairs. Cosmetic chairs would greatly improve the appearance and this addition may happen in the future [Ed. – see also the announcement on page 1062 in the news.]

A healthy stock of the Ratio sleeper bases has been accrued over time, often from bring-&-buy stalls at exhibitions; always satisfied with this product, the author became some what perturbed when, at a recent exhibition whilst operating Rolleston-on-Dove, a well-meaning punter

informed him that the chairs represent GWR equipment, the NSR/LMS items having an extra bolt. One reason for adhering to the Ratio product came about because Romford driving wheels of an earlier vintage, fitted to the original kitbuilt locomotives, had a tendency to foul when passing over another manufacturer's chairs.

Most track items have been recycled from earlier layouts, the pointwork being carefully lifted by soaking the ballast whilst applying a palette knife underneath. Once removed, some repairs proved necessary and the opportunity was taken to test the tolerances of crossing points and checkrails before relaying.

Underlay (1/16" cork), cut to the ballast profile, formed a base for granite chippings in the case of main lines, and fine granules with added greenery for sidings and lesser-used locations.

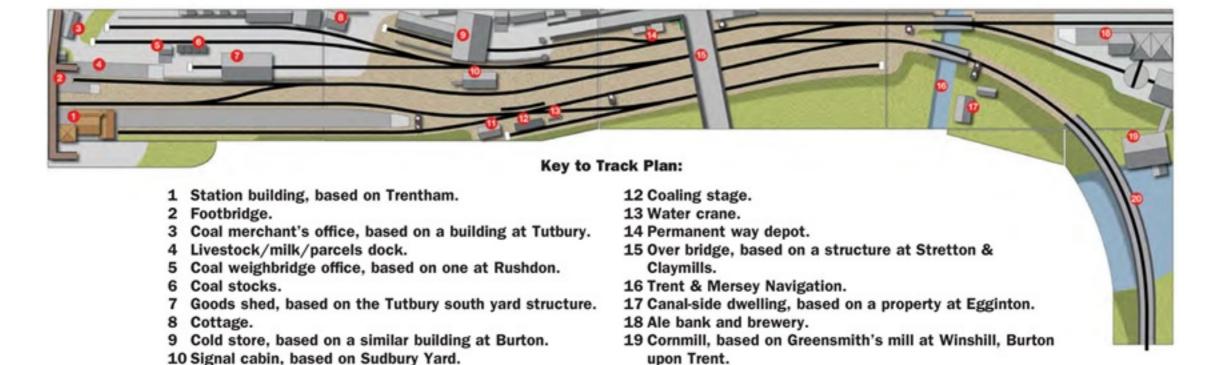
An assembly of Peco point motor, coupled to locking base and polarity switch is linked to each pair of blades. It is vital that each blade seats tightly against the relevant stock ▲ Standard Class 2 2-6-2T No.84007 awaits departure with the Tutbury Jinny whilst the porter attempts to light the gas lamp. To the rear is the goods shed, emulating the structure at Tutbury, the Jinny's destination.

rail as the very fine wheel flanges have a tendency to stray into any slight gap.

The main single line curves through 180° in a space of 8'; one portion of this curve, being as tight as 3'6" radius, has created a few problems for certain locomotives.

Modifications to the tightest curved track by replacing every third plastic sleeper with one comprising plywood and rivets soldered to the rail to maintain or slightly spread the track gauge proved the most effective.

As no fishplates are used, true alignment at rail joints is vital. As the track for each baseboard became functional, thorough testing began; first with the locomotives and rolling stock most likely to offend before the old faithfuls took to the rails. Generally if the eight-coupled Stanier 8F remained on the track, the others would also.

#### Simple electrics

Keep it simple! The author has only basic electrical skills; there is no DCC, just isolating sections at strategic locations. Made up of five baseboard sections, cross-board wiring is minimised by installing a control panel for points, signals and isolating sections on each of the four baseboards. When at home these control panels are front-mounted, but for the exhibition situation, can be moved to the rear.

Points and signals are controlled through centre-off/three position slide switches.

#### Station structures

Many NS structures are architectural gems often featuring half-timber construction with herringbone pattern brickwork, pantile roofing and ornate bargeboards. Apart from the pantiles on Trentham station the author chose to avoid the ornate complexity.

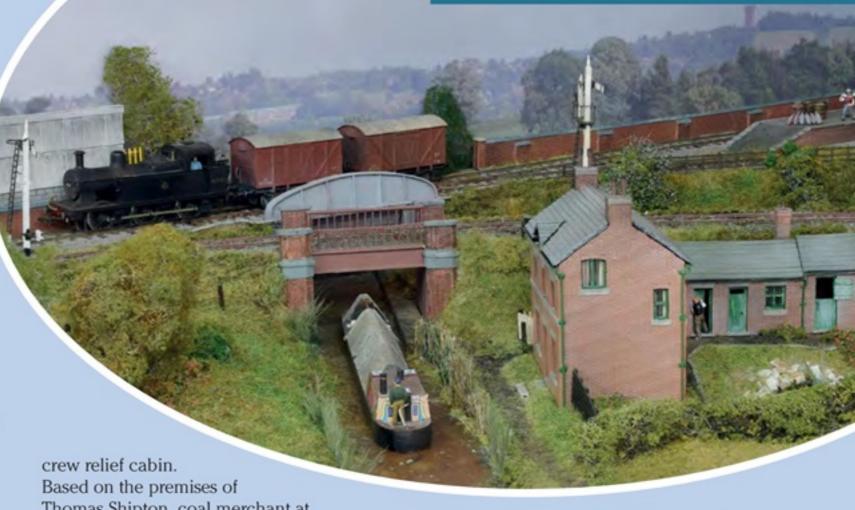
During the LMS and BR periods, little change occurred to secondary station structures, but a number of NSR signal cabins such as Tutbury North Yard and Stretton Junction in the area of Burton were replaced.

The converted Airfix cabin that was used on the previous versions as a replica of the Burton Station South box, received a new superstructure with gabled roof and lever frame rotated to face the rear and placed between the loop and sidings, and linked by a barrow crossing for token exchanges.

Serving as a builder's merchant store at the location of Tutbury South Yard, the old goods shed provided a prototype for the model. Some shortening proved necessary, and roof lighting was added to break up a large area of tiled roof.

Other structures adjacent to the station include a two-storey coal office, footbridge, weighbridge office, watchman's hut and loco

Little Burton station building is based on that at Trentham; the footbridge provides the scenic break at this end of the layout.



Based on the premises of
Thomas Shipton, coal merchant at
Tutbury, its building survived until recently
so research was made easy; having a narrow
footprint, this prototype proved to be an
ideal subject to be sited across the corner
created where the backdrop turns through a
right-angle. Although the footbridge spans
the entire baseboard width, positioned
against the end backdrop, it only passes over
the main line. Based on a similar bridge at
Wetmore to the north of Burton station, its
purpose is to disguise the end of the line that
occurs too close to the baseboard edge.

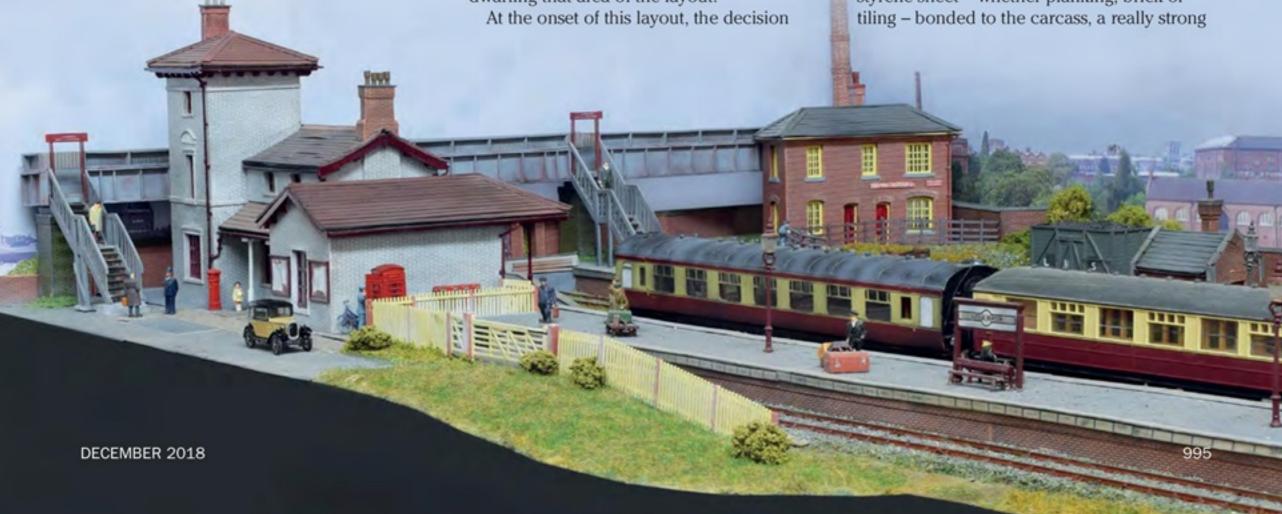
The weighbridge office is based on that along the Churnet Valley line at Rushton, whilst the two remaining huts/cabins are both freelance.

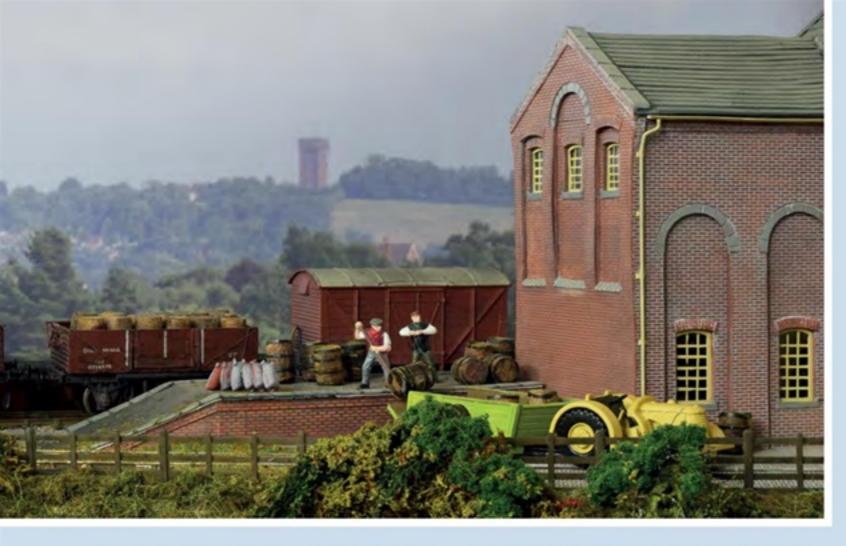
There has never been a *Little Burton* layout without a canal; to make more of a feature of the railway's predecessor, for this third version it was decided to place a waterways-style dwelling together with stable and wash-house block alongside the towpath. The ideal property presented itself to the north of Burton, alongside the Trent & Mersey Navigation. When preparing the elevations it was realised that some reduction in the dimensions would be required to avoid this imposing structure dwarfing that area of the layout.

This bird's eye view shows the Trent & Mersey Navigation wending its way beneath the main line and the brewery/corn-mill sidings. The canal-side cottage, right foreground has been loosely based on a similar building at Egginton.

that low-relief buildings would be banned was made. Practicality intervened, but with the proviso that roof gables should not be at right-angles to the panorama and the roof apex must be forward of the backcloth, not merging with it. The Trent Cold Storage building with convex end wall to accommodate the curve of the loop is a new build, based on an actual structure sited to the north of Burton station, close to where Little Burton is said to be. Having its own siding to increase freight potential, the neighbouring yard area comprises two buildings that date back to version one. The row of offices are low-relief but angled to the backcloth and the weighbridge office is modelled on all sides; they act as a reminder that the area remains predominantly MR.

With a healthy stock of triplex card, previously used for mounting pictures, the construction of new structures began by assembling a box shape with windows and door apertures already cut. With embossed styrene sheet – whether planking, brick or tiling – bonded to the carcass, a really strong





basis resulted on which to add the detail, for example window frames cut from 2thou styrene with mullions drawn on to the glazing with a bow pen and guttering, downpipes and other furniture fashioned from styrene, wire and other odds and ends.

#### Signalling

I've always considered working semaphores to be an essential part of a layout; an early OO layout I built in the 1970s was equipped with Hornby Dublo products 'improved' with ladders and other details passing for LMS square-post, upper quadrant units.

The McKenzie & Holland lower quadrant signals, used to control traffic on the Burton branch of the NSR since its opening, were replaced in 1951 with BR upper quadrant

units. I therefore assumed that the decision was made to bring forward the replacement programme into the pre-WW2 era when

signalling the station area and made use of Ratio LMS round-post upper quadrant kits. Away from the station area, earlier MR style lower quadrant types, originally constructed using Model Signal Engineering kits, remain in service.

Having considerable experience in the construction of kits by the above suppliers, a number of hybrids have emerged. Signals are very susceptible to errant elbows when track cleaning or maintenance is underway, so the use of metal for items such as signal posts became desirable. The repeater standing adjacent to the road bridge is one example made using Ratio plastic parts with a taller than average post fabricated from brass tube of two different diameters, the wider diameter at the bottom end supporting the levers. The ladder, constructed from MSE components, made a very sturdy structure once attached to the post.

In most locations, each arm has a lead weight suspended from its control wire Brewery labourers load barrels from ale bank to 'floater'; a low-to-the-ground road trailer, this type made a familiar sight in Burton, hauled by David Brown tractors. The soft focus backscene helps to create the illusion of depth.

beneath the baseboard, and is activated via a Peco point motor. The staton starter, having three arms, is presently controlled by wire-and-tube from the front of the layout; a situation which will be made difficult should the layout be exhibited.

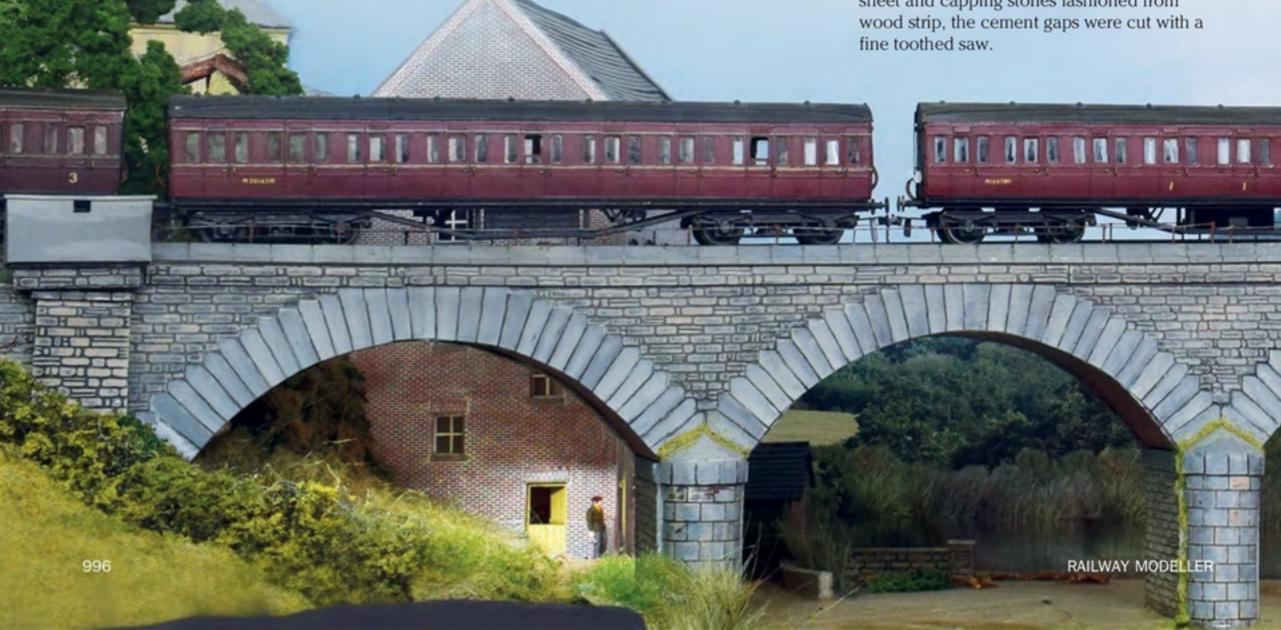
#### **Bridges**

The route into *Little Burton* passes over two separate stretches of water; firstly the River Trent, via a five-arch viaduct, and secondly the Trent & Mersey Navigation by a single span. Inspiration for the viaduct came from the MR structure that carries the Burton to Leicester line over the River Trent at Branston. Built on a curve, the model's plywood construction forms a major part of the baseboard's rigidity. In line with its prototype, pillboxes have been added at each end and semi-circular abutments only occur on the side facing the river's current.

Crossing the canal is a far less imposing experience; the very narrow 'cut' is part of a baseboard recycled from version two, but with a new water effect. The actual NS line crossed the navigation close to Stretton Junction, soon after leaving Burton, so a shorter version of that bridge presented itself as a suitable prototype. Consisting simply of I-section cross-members and cast balustrade, all were fashioned from styrene sheet and given a weathered, rusty appearance.

Before entry into the station, a road passes over four tracks by a three-arched bridge. Of blue brick construction, an ideal NSR bridge on which to base the model once stood adjacent to Stretton & Claymills station.

Once more, plywood formed a base carcass with flexible card within the arches, before covering with brick embossed styrene sheet and capping stones fashioned from wood strip, the cement gaps were cut with a fine toothed saw.



#### **Panorama**

Photographic backdrops can be very overpowering so images require some digital manipulation to achieve that far-away effect. Lightening each image is a good starting point, followed by reducing the saturation to deaden the colour strength before applying the blur tool enough to remove the sharpness of detail – all creating an impression of distance and recession. When selecting suitable scenes, a vista of middle distance to horizon is preferable as vanishing parallels will be less severe; structures closer to the eye, giving a very angular impression, are not compatible with the actual models.

When preparing the latest panorama, some half-relief buildings were positioned to breakup the scene, thus generating individual views within the whole and disguising the transition between three and two dimensions. Soft landscaping in the guise of trees and bushes also aids this illusion.

With the digital manipulation complete, an online printer prepared a full-size vinyl poster that could be cut and mounted to the rear of the layout; almost 5m in length, only one subtly disguised joint is evident.

#### **Traffic**

Mixed goods trains are common and ideal for the modeller who enjoys building a variety of wagons rather than a batch of identical vehicles. A few mineral wagons coupled to cattle and general merchandise vans, with flats carrying farm machinery from the Uttoxeter-based factory of Bamford, and the odd grain hopper were typical elements of freight workings seen during the 1950s.

It is not uncommon for such a rake to be hauled into the loop by a Stanier 8F, only to be returned along the same track by a waiting Fowler 4F. Lengthy coal trains made their way through Burton daily, with motive power ranging from Stanier/Austerity 8F 2-8-0s, Standard 9F 2-10-0s to (prior to 1957) ex-LMS Beyer-Garratt 2-6-0+0-6-2s: this type of

freight train needed to be replicated, so with a large slice of modeller's licence, a recently completed Garratt, assembled from a K's kit, occasionally plods along the single line branch into *Little Burton*.

The private brewery siding at Little Burton also sees traffic shunted by either an ex-L&Y loco or ex-Caledonian Pug (their prototypes both rostered at Burton at different times). The destination is York and B1 Class locos are occasionally rostered, such as No.61066, frequently spotted in the East Midlands.

Apart from replicating the pull-push passenger service between Burton and Tutbury – known to the locals as the Tutbury Jinny – some other regular turns needed to be invented. To this end the author ignored the closures in 1939 of the ex-GNR routes between Uttoxeter and Stafford and Derby Friargate, Nottingham and Grantham and assumed that summer excursion traffic from these routes featured regularly on the NS route. Trains of ageing stock replicate those seen by the author as they made their way to destinations such as Alton Towers, Trentham Gardens, Blackpool, North Wales and, to the east, the Lincolnshire seaside.

Although *Little Burton* station served the NSR and GNR routes, occasional trains from the MR line can also make appearances.

#### Rolling stock

With many models dating from as early as the 1960s, some locomotives do not perform as well as today's ready-to-run models. However, having spent many hours fine-tuning them to achieve the best possible performance, they are not for replacement.

The latest addition to the motive power depot is BR Standard Class 2 2-6-2T No.84007 the prototypes of which were designed at Derby and delivered new to Burton in 1953, replacing the Johnson 0-4-4Ts on the Tutbury Jinny service. A K's product acquired in part-completed condition, the project proved quite a challenge, but with Romford wheels

and a Mashima motor, it replicates another era in the long life of the Jinny – Burton's favourite passenger train.

The Burton brewery branches abounded in tight curves and all the privately-owned locomotives had, out of necessity, 0-4-0 wheel arrangements. Burton MPD maintained a number of short wheelbase shunters, and one such example, L&Y Pug No.51217, can be seen. It dates back to version one days, and is formed from an improved Kitmaster body mounted on a West Coast Kit Centre chassis. In more recent years this has been joined by ex-Caledonian Pug No.56020 – an Anchorage kit.

Little evidence of ex-NSR rolling stock prevailed on the 1950s Burton scene; one or two non-gangwayed carriages were recorded, parked in sidings, but licence is occasionally granted to allow a scratchbuilt B Class 2-4-0T sporting LMS crimson livery with matching stock to pay a nostalgic visit.

#### Conclusion

The existing fleet is more than ample to give variety of operation, so more time has been allotted to add detail which should be evident in the accompanying photographs.

Whilst exhibiting recently and admiring the LED lighting effect of a layout across the hall whilst chatting to its owner – who delighted in demonstrating his method of control via an iPad from a distance of some 10 metres – the author realised that his 20-odd locomotives ageing from 10 years to 40 would not be suitable for conversion to more modern and effective means of control.

The lighting issue is in hand, but recalling a situation at a previous show, whilst the author ran his Stanier 8F – a Homby body mounted on a Comet chassis with Mashima motor driving through a two-stage gearbox – at the slowest speed possible, a member of a well-respected model railway club commented "That's running nice and slowly, it is obviously DCC." I'll

## LNER Class J6 0-6-0

The former Nu-Cast range of locomotive kits is being gradually revamped thanks to the joint talents of South Eastern Finecast and Branchlines. **TONY WRIGHT** constructed the most recent one to be thus treated, for the long-lived ex-Great Northern standard goods engine.

South Eastern Finecast and Branchlines have acquired the old Nu-Cast range of loco kits and are steadily improving and reintroducing certain types as time allows. The most recent

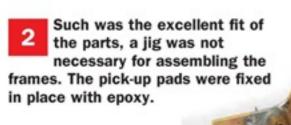
one is the J6, the subject of this review. At this time there appears to be no ready-to-run one on the horizon, but who knows?

The Class was very long-lived and popular. The first 15 were introduced by Ivatt on the GNR in 1911, and were known as the 521 Series. Gresley took over in 1912 and had a further 95 built between that date and 1922, known as the 536 Series. There

were detail differences between the series, most notably the larger cab and further-forward boiler on the 521 Series and sandboxes above the leading splashers on the 536 Series. There were also

#### **Building the LNER Class J6 0-6-0**

The original Nu-Cast loco kits had a whitemetal lump for a chassis, but this one has an accurate etched one. The holes for taking the bearings were opened out with an appropriate taper broach. Fixing it in a tap-wrench saved the fingers!



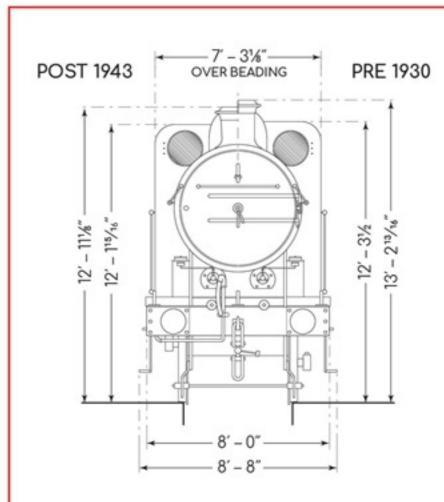


I fitted the recommended SE Finecast motor/gear mount to drive off the centre axle. No brake hangers/shoes were supplied, but I just used a fret from my spares box. A suitable fret can also be obtained from Wizard Models (they might well be supplied in the kit).

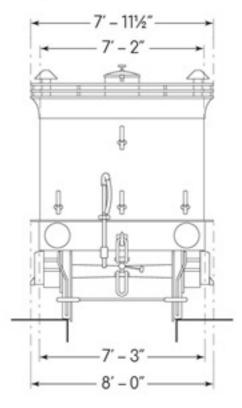
The chassis/body-fitting hole in the front footplate did not line up with the front frame spacer. I elongated it to suit using a dental burr in a mini drill.

The difference in elongation can be seen here, with the assembled footplate on top of the frames. The 8BA nuts were fixed securely with solder. Splasher clearances were a bit tight (see later).

many different tender variations. Little alterations were made to the locos in their lives, the most noticeable being a slight reduction in the cab height and chimney to clear the LNER loading gauge, the substitution of Rosspop safety valves, replacing the Ramsbottom type, the shortening of the handrails at the front of the smokebox and the postwar removal of the water pick-up gear from the tenders. The class could be seen on all manner of freight and local passenger work, even hauling summer season excursions to the coast, made up of many carriages. The final survivors lasted until 1962; a life of 50 years! For most of their lives, they were just plain black, making it easy for painters at least.

Before starting, I scrutinised

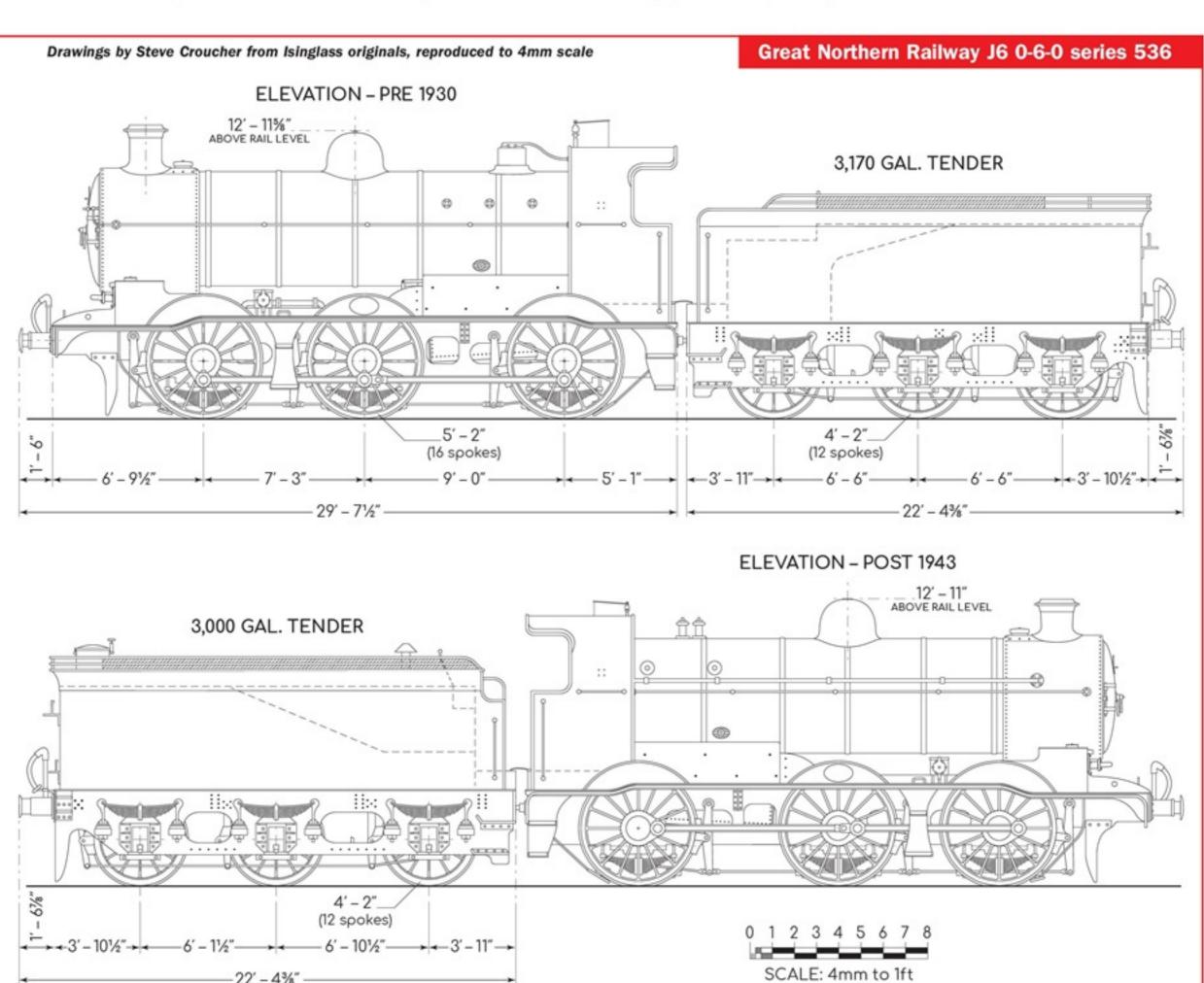

the works of the RCTS (Part 5 of the green series), Yeadon's Register (Volume 37, Part B) and as many photographs in my collection as I could find. I also used the appropriate Isinglass drawings. To complete the parts, I acquired a recommended SE Finecast motor/gear mount, six 20mm Markits drivers, axles and crankpins and a set of 14mm spoked tender wheels.

The kit more-accurately makesup into one of the later (and far more numerous) 536 Series locos. Different parts are supplied for those experienced modellers who'd like to make a 521 Series loco, but a fair bit of modification is required to do that. I chose to build a 536 Series example. The following pictures show how I got on.

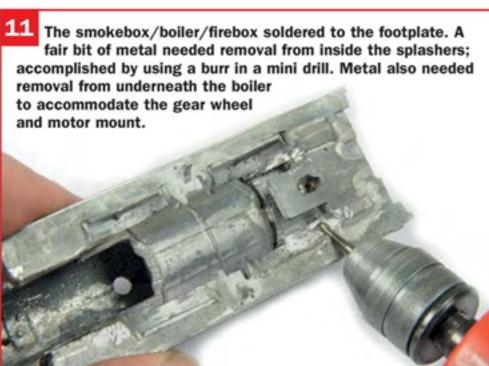








Though most soldering should be done from the inside, soldering the firebox to the spectacle plate had to be done carefully from the OUTSIDE. Excess solder was first removed with a curved blade, to be followed by cleaning up with a glass fibre pencil.



Even with metal removed, I still had to pad up the body with Peco 1/8" diameter fibre washers, to prevent interference fully and shorting problems.



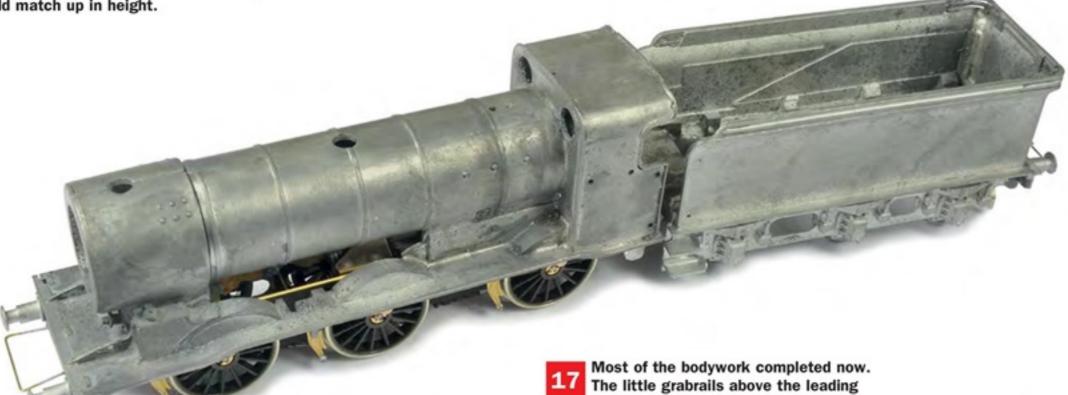


Some solder-filling was also needed where the central cab roof section met the cabsides.

I always build the tenders at the same time as I build the locos, and this was no exception. A new tender chassis was provided, replacing the whitemetal original. Though 16mm tender wheels would be the correct size for a GNR tender, 14mm wheels made the tender ride at the right height (a Nu-Cast legacy). I fitted plastic-centred wheels to begin with, but these wobbled too much and were subsequently replaced with Romford/Markits all-metal types.



The (correct) relative ride-heights of the loco and tender are evident in this view. The loco footplate and tender soleplate should match up in height.



footsteps were soldered in place before

the steps themselves were fixed.

The completed tender. Though it wasn't universal, as these tenders lost their water pick-up gear post-war, the filler dome and breather cones were removed; as shown here.



The neatness of the etched tender chassis is evident here.
My coupling system suits Sprat & Winkle semi-auto
couplings, hence the brass goalposts front and rear. The
screw shackle is a Bachmann product, available as spares.



Everything was soldered in place except the chimney and smokebox door, which were fixed with quick-setting epoxy. Refer to prototype photographs for getting the positions of the crossrail and top lamp brackets correct. They varied throughout the locos' lives. I substituted a Markits turned brass whistle. Whitemetal ones on cab roofs never last long!





Complete and ready for service, after painting. Odd extras such as sandpipes, vacuum brake pipe and injectors were made up from bits of brass and fusewire, soldered in place. An extra handrail was fitted to the left-hand side of the tender, towards the rear post-War. Refer to the recommended sources for coupling the asymmetrical wheelbase tender to the appropriate locos. Most, including all the 521 Series, has a symmetrical wheelbase tender, not catered for in this kit.

This is an original Nu-Cast J6, by way of a comparison. It was part-built by Ian Wilson and completed and painted by me.

## Automating a level crossing

**PETER DAWSON** explains how he mechanised his four-gate level crossing. Although Peter used an Arduino micro-controller and servo motor as a drive system, the assembly could be manually operated via a conventional wire-in-tube arrangement if this electronic option is not for you.

n my article in the June 2018 issue of RAILWAY MODELLER I described how I made a four-gate level crossing to fit on a curved section of my layout. I ended the article by stating that I wasn't sure of the best way to operate the gates automatically, so for a while I opened and closed them manually.

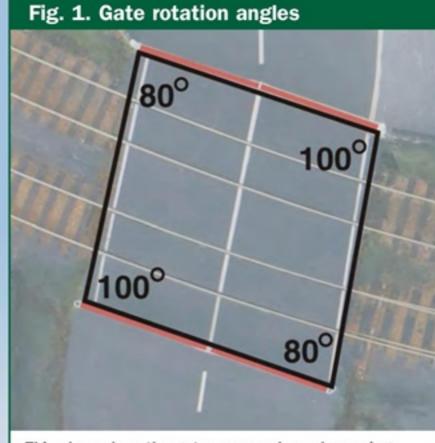
Although I used my own cast resin crossing gates, this method is suitable for use with commercially moulded gates such as the LK-55 set from Peco.

The level crossing with GWR Castle Class 4-6-0 No.5011 *Tintagel Castle* passing through. Some further lineside fencing has yet to be installed to complete the scene.

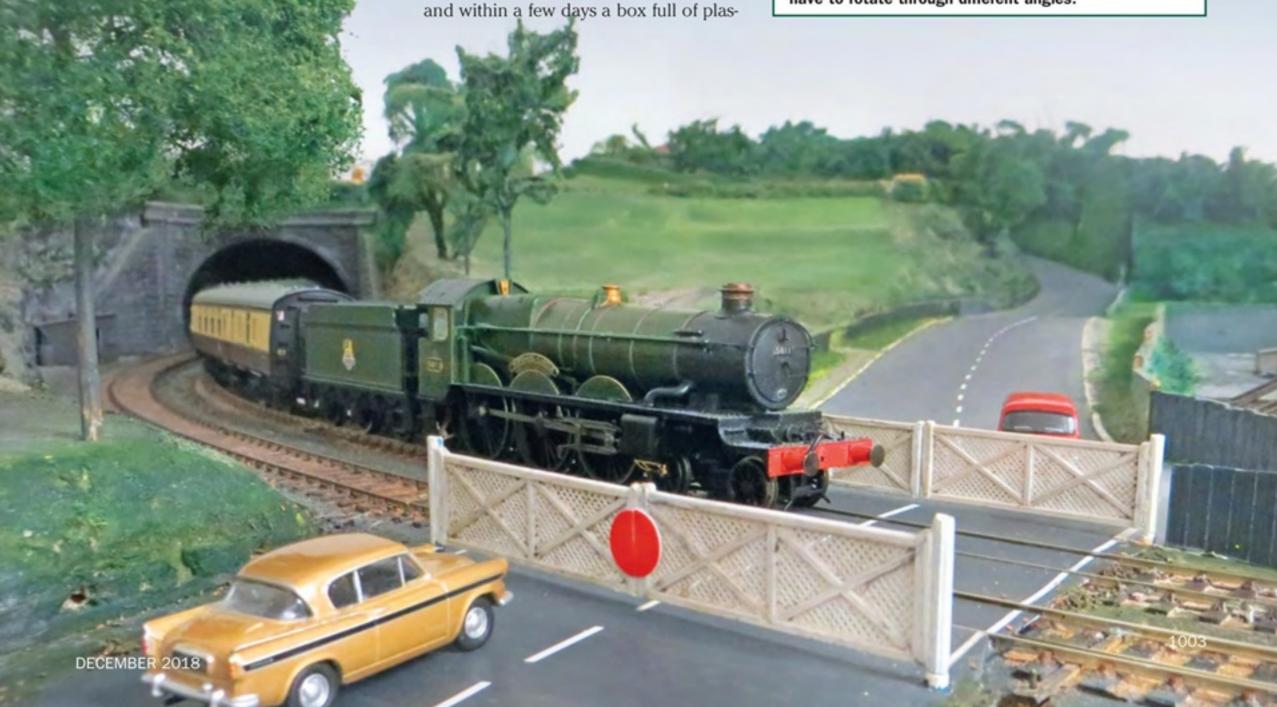
My first idea had been to use pulleys and string. I had plenty of pulleys, and string is easily obtainable. However it just didn't work out quite right. Other ideas had involved gear wheels and even speedometer cables, but again without any success.

Having the road crossing the track at an angle was another problem. It meant that two of the gates on the same diagonal needed to turn further than the other two gates; 100° at the obtuse angles and 80° at the acute angles as shown in Fig. 1. Had the crossing been 90° to the track, all gates would have moved equal distances. Finding a simple solution to the dilemma stumped me for quite a while.

Enter my son's comments. He'd recently built a 3-D printer and offered to motorise the crossing for me. As he is an airline captain who also builds his own light aircraft, I felt I didn't need to argue, and within a few days a box full of plas-

crossing together with a full set of 3-D printed horns and bearings. Brass and/or plasticard can also be used to make these items.

tic components, some servos, and an Arduino microcontroller arrived in the post together with a mock up model, all as seen in Fig. 2. It was a prototype mechanism.

The four gates were all produced on his 3-D printer and looked very good, but unfortunately not Western Region 1950s era! His mechanism was slightly oversize but when assembled it worked perfectly with the Arduino and a micro servo motor. All four gates moved together, in spite of the difference in rotation angles. At last I had a workable design.

At first glance, it does appear rather complicated, but the servo, wires, and plastic ends are basic model aircraft components available at any aero model shop. The blue plastic mouldings, known as 'horns' in aero modelling, are available too, but these were all created by my son on his 3-D printer, and they vary slightly in length. The longer the horn, the longer the arc it will pass through for a given angle of rotation, resulting in more movement being applied to the 'push rod'. He calculated the lengths for each horn to achieve the correct amount of movement necessary at the individual gates, which saved me a lot of working out.

The push rods are simply lengths of metal rod which fit into adjustable sockets, called clevis fasteners, attached to the horns as seen in Figs. 3 & 4. To accommodate the mechanics my original crossing baseplate was removed and used as a template for a new slightly larger base. It was a start, and a few days later we'd condensed the mechanics to fit within the confines of the

new base plate. Two 'worms' eye views Figs. 3 & 4 show how the system works. The red dotted lines illustrate the position of the four gates up above ground, Fig. 3 with the road closed and Fig. 4 with the road open.

The upgrade to an automatic gate meant relocating the solenoid motor on the adjacent cross over point, but all in all the change was worthwhile.

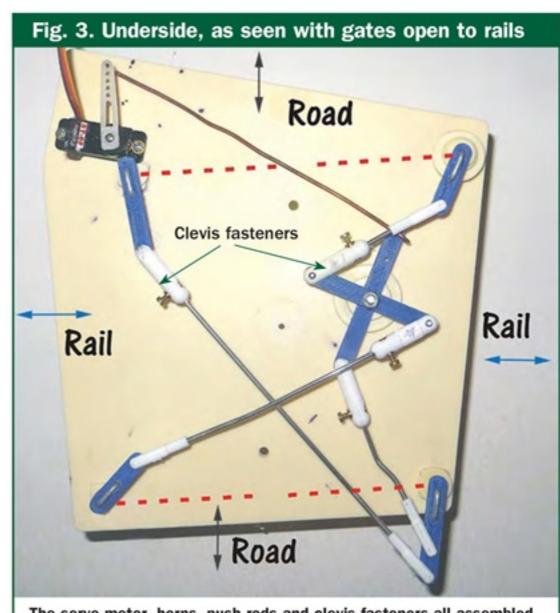
#### How it works

Initial movement starts at the servo and motion is transferred via the copper wire to the central 'hub' beneath the module. The copper wire was a temporary easy-to-bend template later replaced with some steel rod. From there, two rods supply just enough push to rotate two of the gate horns through 80°, the other two rods simultaneously push the adjacent gates through 100°. Needless to say, reversing the servo returns the gates to the original closed to the road position.

#### Servo controller

Servo motors require an input signal to move them from one position to another. The magnitude of this signal dictates the start and stop positions of the motor and thus the operating arm. There are several electronic devices which can be used to set the start and stop position, usually called a servo controller board. In my case I utilised the tiny Arduino microcontroller board supplied by my son along with the 'prototype' crossing mechanism.

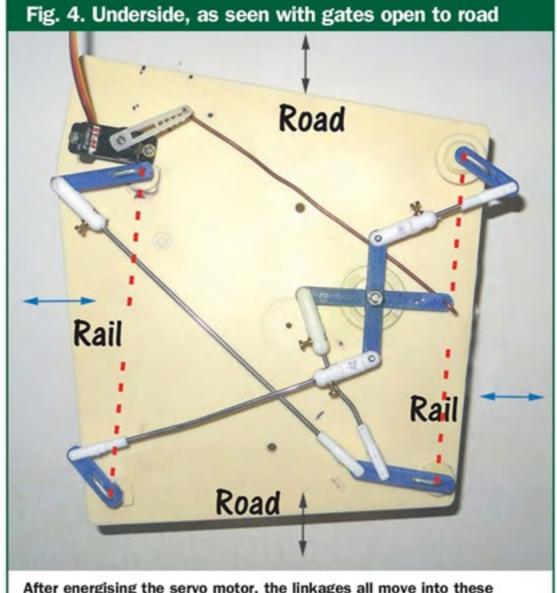
The servo connections to the Arduino board are shown in Fig. 5. Note that the Arduino requires an auxiliary power supply of between 5V and 12V dc. A simple



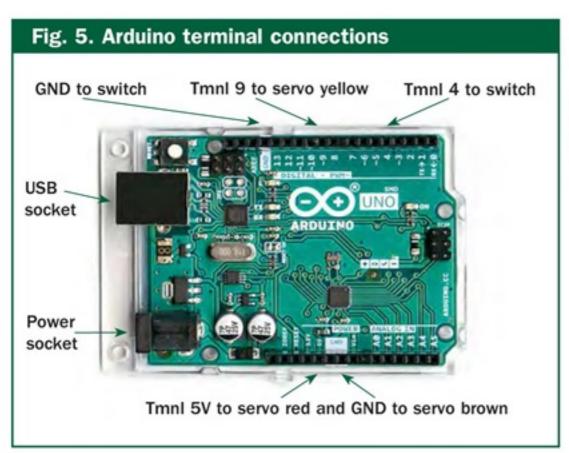
The servo motor, horns, push rods and clevis fasteners all assembled into the linkage mechanism, as set to open for the railway tracks.

on/off switch connected to terminal 4 and the GND terminal on the Arduino board, initiates the sequence either to open and close the gates.

To programme the Arduino, a free app can be downloaded onto a PC from the Arduino website. The app opens up a template on screen into which the lines of code can be written and saved as a 'sketch' (which is the term used for the mini-program). The lines of code follow an established format and full instructions, and a list and explanation of the various functions, can be found on the Arduino website. Once the 'sketch' has been written and saved, it is uploaded to the

Arduino board's memory via a USB socket on the board.

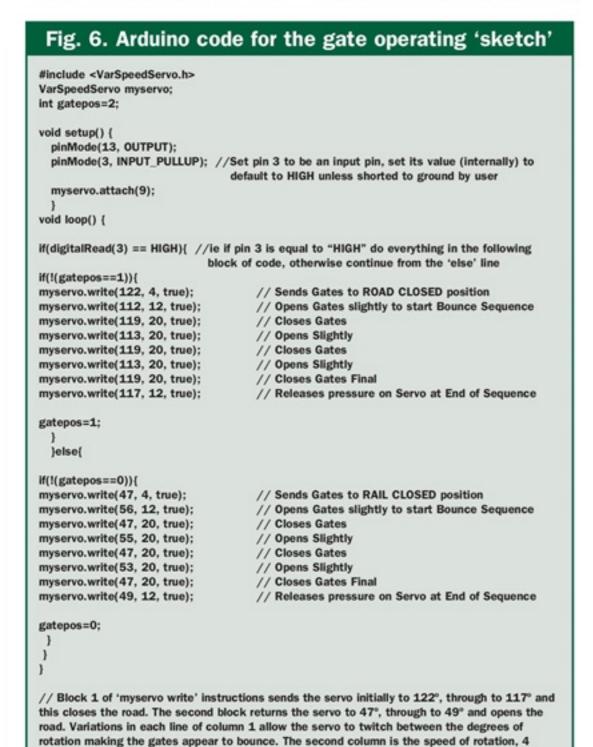
It is best to connect up the servo and Arduino board on the bench to test the setup first. This helps should any fine tuning to the start and stop positions via the sketch software be required (note that some physical adjustments to push rod lengths via the small clevises can be performed once the crossing module has been installed on the layout).

Alas my son thought they

looked like 'toy' gates, without character, but he knew how to add momentum and bounce. Slowing down the servo created a heavier-looking gate and adding extra lines of code to the programme sketch made the servo retreat a few degrees at a faster pace after full travel, return to full travel, then repeating the actions twice through even fewer degrees gives the impression of a heavy gate bouncing when it hits the stop block. [Ed. the Peco



being slow and 20 being fast for the gates' closing bounce and clatter



SmartSwitch servo kit PLS-100 can also be used as a drive system, the advantage of which is that setting the start and stop positions of the servo can be achieved without a computer/software combination.]

For anyone who understands the Arduino principles, they will be aware that there are numerous ways in which they can be used to programme and drive servos. In the adjacent panel I include the actual code I used, written in the Arduino app template on the PC, saved as a 'sketch' and uploaded to the Arduino unit via the USB connection. Adjustment of the rotation angles and amount of bounce is undertaken by tweaking the angular values in the code and overwriting the previously stored code in the Arduino memory.

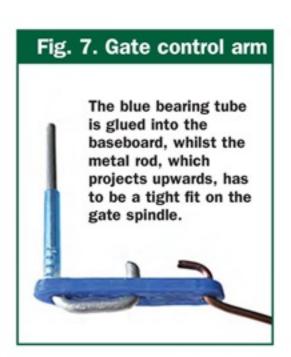

My crossing is effectively on a skew, because of the curve. However a simpler crossing can be constructed by locating it on a straight track with a road crossing at 90°. The hub and homs could all be cut out from 2mm styrene sheet. Shape isn't critical but the distance between the two holes in the horn and the two holes in the arms of the hub should be identical for all gates to move the same amount.

A close up of an underboard gate operating arm – one for each gate – is shown in Fig. 7.

Bend the 2mm diameter wire rod as shown. Dimensions are dependent upon individual circumstances, such as the length of gates, track centres etc.

The blue 'cotton bud bearing tube' should be a sliding fit on the wire and should be glued into the baseboard first, its length determined by the baseboard thickness. Then the metal rod



can be pushed upwards through the tube leaving the projecting pin long enough for the gate height. My gates have a plastic tube glued to their outer edge and this tube is pressed down onto the projecting pin. Gates from any kit would do but need to be a tight fit on the wire rod.

#### Fine adjustment

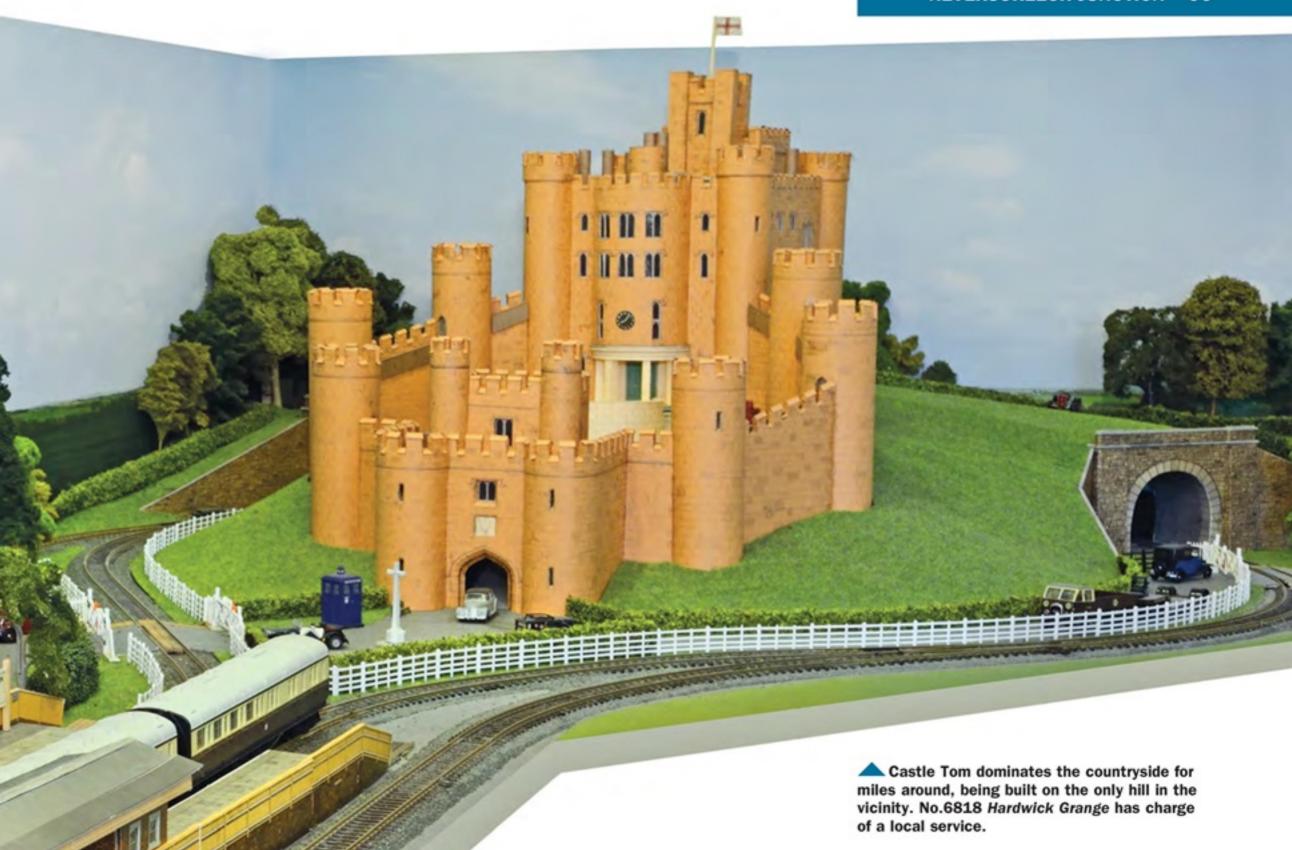
The nylon clevises on my model allow for fine adjustments to the lengths of the push rods. The type of rod I used from the servo horn to the hub is a simple 2mm piece of wire bent as shown in Fig. 5. Every push rod could have been made that way for a few pence.

#### Remote manual option

Electronic controllers such as this set up are not to everyone's liking. The servo motor could be omitted entirely and the push-pull motion activated with a basic wire in tube arrangement connected to the hub and run to the baseboard edge or central control panel. Of the two options described I would recommend the second to begin with unless you are conversant with computer programming. Mechanically speaking, adding a servo drive in the future would be easy.

The buildings to the rear of
Neverscreech Junction station were
assembled from the Superquick range;
terraced houses, market house and wooden
barn. Likewise the station was built from
these venerable card kits, although a modern
Ratio plastic moulded footbridge links the
platforms. The signal box was built from a
Metcalfe kit, as was the viaduct at the lefthand end of the layout, on which a short

train is posed to represent the Great Western main line. Trees and hedgerows came from a variety of suppliers.

Dominating the layout itself is of course Castle Tom, which is a 'one off'. The keep was built around a cardboard box, and was

This is the view of the elaborate double staircase and underground car park that would be seen by Fg Off Timothy Tom from his Spit'.

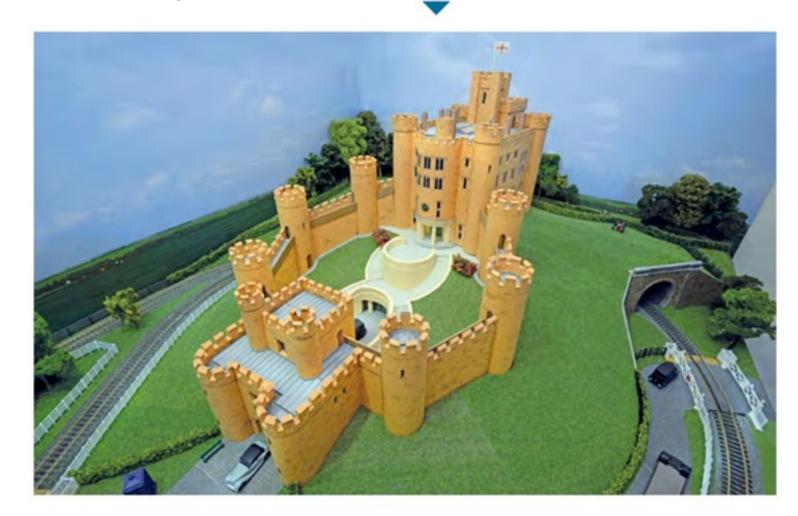
hence Neverscreech Junction – a take on the now closed real Evercreech Junction..

Apart from the hillock on which the castle stands (a mini Glastonbury Tor) the baseboards are flat – the construction of them and the installation of the track was by B&R Model Railways based in Chesham. Control is via a Hornby Select DCC controller.

All rolling stock is GWR, generally produced by Homby and Bachmann: the layout is placed timewise after the war and before nationalisation.

#### Structures and scenery

Although the foundation of the layout was acquired, the structures are all my own work.





Carnival atmosphere in Neverscreech!

It was just like a carnival in Neverscreech last Tuesday, as this small market town witnessed the grand opening of the long-awaited railway extension to link it to the Great Western Railway main line four miles away at Evercreech Junction. Crowds flocked to the station, flags were waved, children had the day off school, and the Town's Mayor and Town Crier were in attendance.

Light refreshments and sherry for guests were prepared and distributed by the very hard working Mrs Christine Ainsworth and her volunteer team of helpers. The apricot cake was particularly enjoyed by this reporter! The sun shone as if to recognise the importance of this day in the town's history.

The cheering throng of people saw the first steam train enter the station at 11.00am, possibly encouraged by the invitation of the GWR Board to travel free on the first day only! One free return ticket to Evercreech Junction was given to everyone who had requested one, but due to the popularity of the event, many residents had to wait until late in the afternoon to enjoy their free trip.

At 11.30am, Michael Hartley Esq. was invited by the Town Mayor to say a few words and to open the new extension formally. He welcomed the commitment of the GWR Board and, in particular, Mr John Ainsworth, the Board's Secretary, who was the guiding light and driving force behind the project, and also the designer of the route; he mentioned the hard work

of Mr Ron Nettleton, who was responsible for the final survey of the route and the construction work, to finish the job within the time allowed prior to the opening. He thanked all those responsible for the new railway, and for the day's festivities, and wished the new extension all the best for the future.

At 12.00 noon precisely, the first passenger train left the station, to the sound of three cheers from the crowd, and much flag waving.

Unfortunately, there were a few teething problems during trial runs on the day before and during the opening celebrations, but no-one felt these were serious and they did not dampen the enthusiasm of everyone present. Comments by residents given to this reporter indicated that this day would long be remembered by everyone present and in the annals of the town. Neverscreech is now, at last, on the railway map of Great Britain!

#### A Journey Down the Line

This reporter was fortunate to be invited on to the first train to leave Neverscreech. The highly polished GWR tank engine, proudly displaying a special commemorative plaque on its smokebox, with two crowded carriages full of excited children and parents, moved slowly off, with arms waving out of windows and many tens of people standing on the platforms waving flags or their arms in celebration.

With the coming of the railway extension, the town was already

experiencing the construction of some new buildings, promised by Lord Tom. He had indicated that some further houses would be built, together with a new hotel to serve the increasing number of tourists expected to travel by train to see the famous landmark, Castle Tom, situated on its lofty hill overlooking the town. These new houses can be seen from the train, as can the imposing castle.

The train picked up speed on the single track level gradient, round the base of Castle Hill, and we travelled through glorious lush countryside on our way to Evercreech Junction. Views are breathtaking, with attractive landscape in all directions. At one point the line goes past extensive goods sidings and then disappears under a viaduct of the Great Western Railway main line linking Bristol with London. It is soon after this crossing under the main line that the extension drifts into Evercreech Junction station.

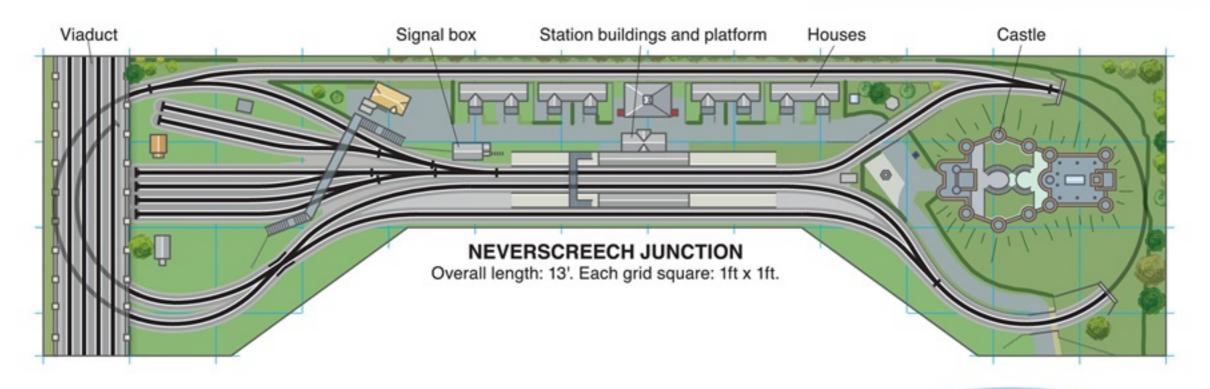
The overall journey time is only 12 minutes, but it is a memorable journey. After a brief stop, although no-one was able to descend at the end of this special journey, the train shunted round to the back of the carriages and we travelled back to Neverscreech, where we were again met by loud cheers from the still waiting assembled crowds.

Certainly a train journey to remember, and a route which is bound to be popular with regular users and tourists alike. A trip on the railway will become a 'must do' adventure for many years ahead!

The townscape was built up mainly from Superquick kits, as was the station itself (minus the Ratio moulded plastic footbridge). A Metcalfe signal box controls operations.

inspired by Powis Castle in mid Wales. Its windows are by courtesy of Metcalfe's parish church models (I needed, I think, three).

There is a history of the place and layout of course, beginning with the oldest element; the family ownership goes back to one of the knights who came over with William the Conqueror! First constructed by the Normans as a motte and bailey castle (probably just in timber) it was remodelled and rebuilt through the Middle Ages until towards the end of the 16th century the keep took its present shape. Much restoration work was carried out 100 years ago and the father of the present owner, Sir Thomas Tom, employed the architect Sir Edwin Lutyens in the 1930s to alter the courtyard,



providing impressive steps up to the keep, with garaging underneath – Sir Thomas collected London taxis! Flying Officer Timothy Tom can be seen passing over the castle from time to time in his Spitfire... unfortunately not seen in the photos! I have neither the time nor space to elaborate further, but I do think that embedding a layout and its features in history can be a fascinating add-on to the hobby.

I should point out that the left-hand part of the layout especially remains incomplete; also there are no signals! My late wife's poor Evidence of the recent wartime years is seen by the pillbox, looming out of the wooded area that helps to mask the loop to the rear of the layout.

## Talking Points

Topical issues from the world of model railways

#### The Great Model Railway Challenge – readers' feedback

Steve Flint reviews the aftermath of the bold and original Channel 5 TV series, which culminates with the grand final this very week!

es, it sure is a bit of bad-timing. The very day after we publish this December 2018 issue, the 'Grand Final' of The Great Model Railway Challenge takes place, and the winners of the trophy and the title of Britain's Best Railway Modellers is revealed.

All five heats however have been broadcast, and what a wonderful mix of comments and opinions we've received from all walks of life. But before we divulge the good, the bad, and the ugly ones, let us remind ourselves of the nature and aims of the programme which all the major UK model railway manufacturers supported unreservedly.

Railway modelling and layout building is a very popular hobby that has been around for well over 100 years. Despite that pedigree, very little about it is understood outside its usual circles. Our magazines, forums and exhibitions are nearly always 'preaching to the converted' and finding a way to reach people and prospective modellers outside our natural boundaries has always been a real challenge.

#### On board

When the TV production company approached us with its nub of an idea, we were quick to embrace it, knowing full well that it would be for mainstream TV audience viewing, and not a masterclass in the finer elements, methods and techniques of modelmaking - all that will have to wait for another time. Besides, there are already lots of informative video programmes about aspects of railway modelling on YouTube, Indeed my co-judge for the series, Kathy Millatt, runs her own YouTube channel on which she presents a vast array of 'how to' videos: visit www.youtube.com/c/kathymillatt.

The first week of transmission raised an audience of 1.3 million. Now that might not match the viewing records of the 1970s and 1980s when popular programmes of the day got 18 million plus, but put it into the context of the some of the biggest model railway shows in the UK which only see visitors to the tune of 18,000 over a weekend.

Even by the standards of RAILWAY MODELLER's best ever record circulation figures - 103,000 in 1981 - it's a tenfold increase.

Clearly The Great Model Railway Challenge has reached out to the parts of the country that other means cannot reach!

#### There's no such thing as bad publicity

Or so the old adage goes, but there are those who argue that the true nature of our skilful hobby has not been upheld.

I ask though; what is the true nature of the hobby? I've been around a long time to know that the hobby means so many different things to so many different people: it's fun, it's creative, it's relaxing, visionary, scholarly, authoritative, challenging, and so on.

Some of these attributes are of course paradoxical, can you be visionary and have fun, and still be scholarly and authoritative?

That is what makes for a great debate. I personally think it's been really great publicity for the hobby, more so than we could have ever hoped for just through the pages of Britain's best selling model railway magazine.

#### Here is a selection of brickbats...

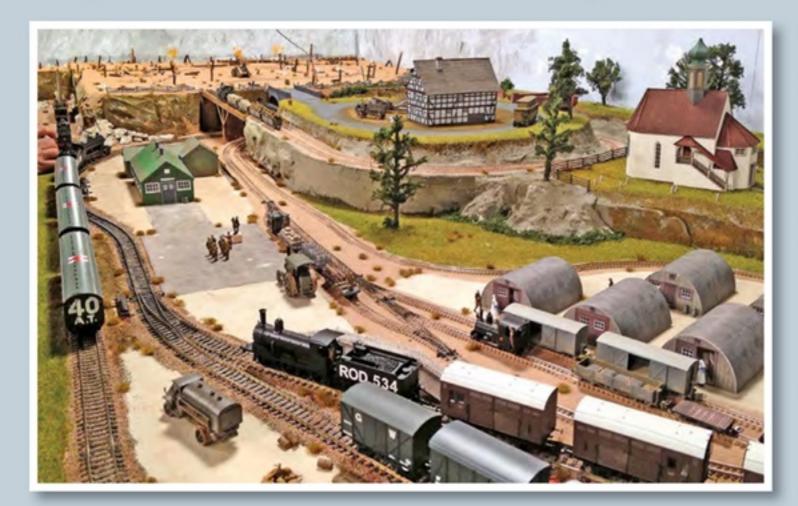

"Our theme was 'Fire and Ice', unusual for a model railway, but any theme can be tackled given enough forethought, ours was the most literal interpretation, I think."

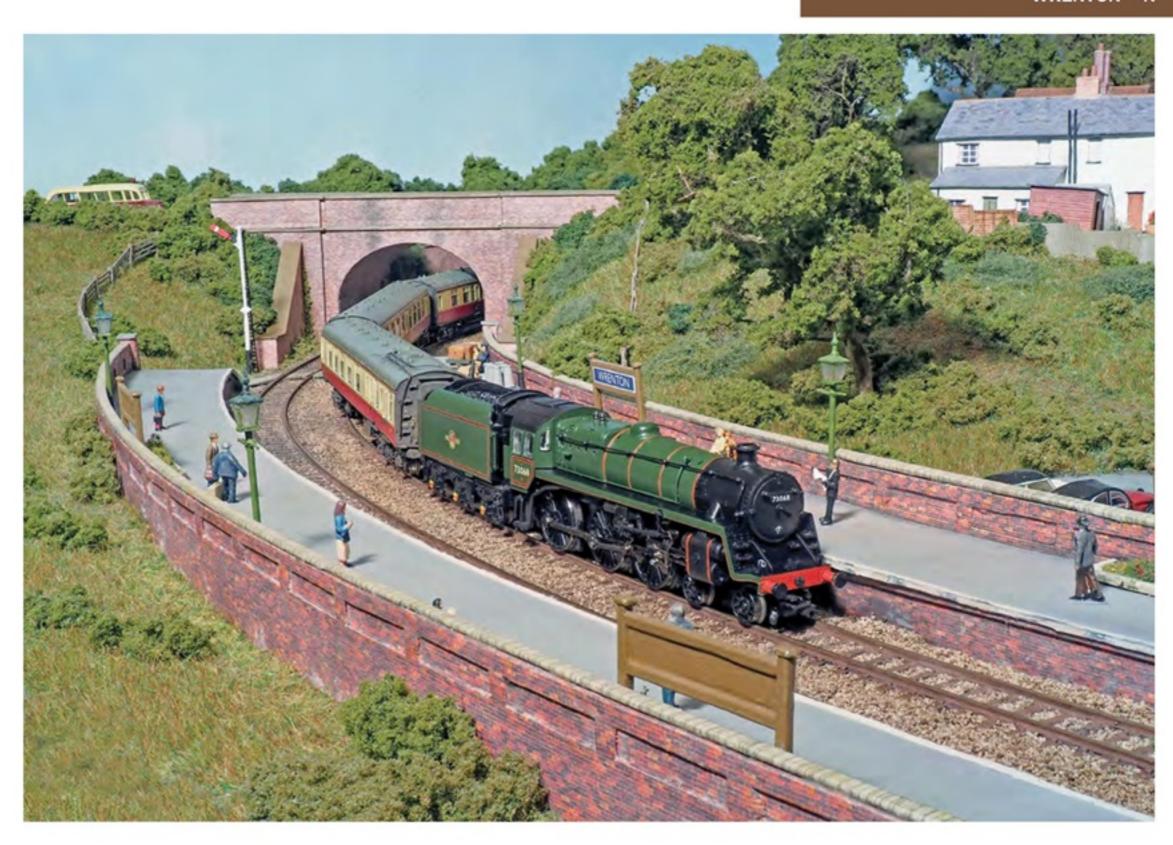

any model railways are inspired by real locations, sometimes places which were never served by real railways.

Wrenton is one such and its non-railway buildings are all impressions of prototypes which can be found in and around Finchingfield, a pretty village in the north of Essex. It was here that one of my grandfathers was born and though I have never lived nearby I have always had a soft spot for the place.

I started by making some buildings, thinking of perhaps making a diorama of part of the village. After a few months' work I had some cottages, a pub and a tiny shop and it was time to make a decision – and naturally it was to build a layout, not a diorama!

I decided that if I was going to build a railway then Rule One would apply – it's my project and I'll run what I like. I admire people who can make an accurate model of a particular location and run the trains that would have been seen in that area. But that's not for me; my layout is pure fantasy. Although the buildings tie the layout to East Anglia I'm happy to run trains from other regions and to mix eras.

#### Locomotives and rolling stock

My choice of motive power and rolling stock has been pretty random and includes locos and stock that would never have been seen in East Anglia in an assortment of liveries. There are locos from the Eastern and London Midland regions with some BR Standards and there's even a 64xx 0-6-0PT hiding in the fiddle yard awaiting an occasional run.

Although I haven't risked weathering a loco myself – my recent purchases have come nicely weathered from TMC – I have worked on most of the rolling stock. I started with some Peco wagon kits which had been sitting in a cupboard, unassembled, for several years and moved on to more expensive models when I felt more confident

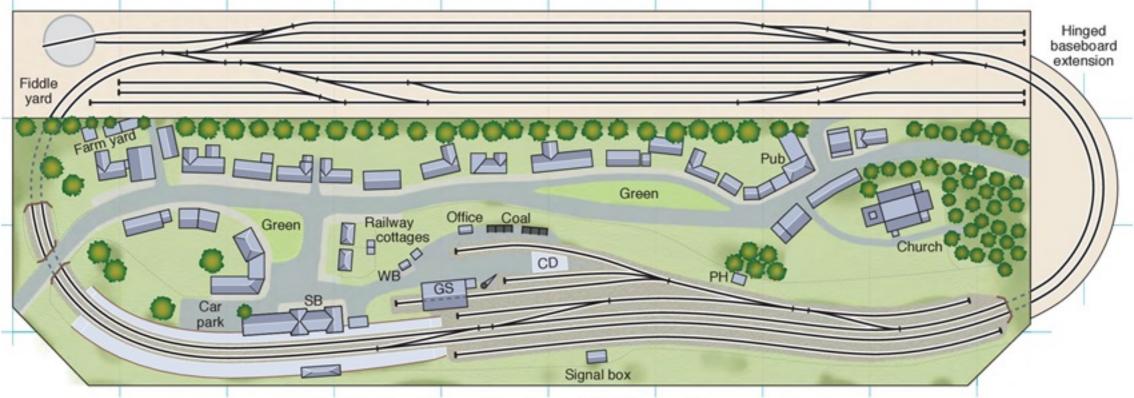
about the job. I used Lifecolor paints from the Rust and Dust, Weathered Wood and Rail Weathering sets.

#### **Buildings**

I live a long way from my prototypes in Finchingfield. In the pre-computer days this might have been a problem but today

A view down the main street. Sparse provision of road vehicles, and careful positioning of figures, evoke the period perfectly.



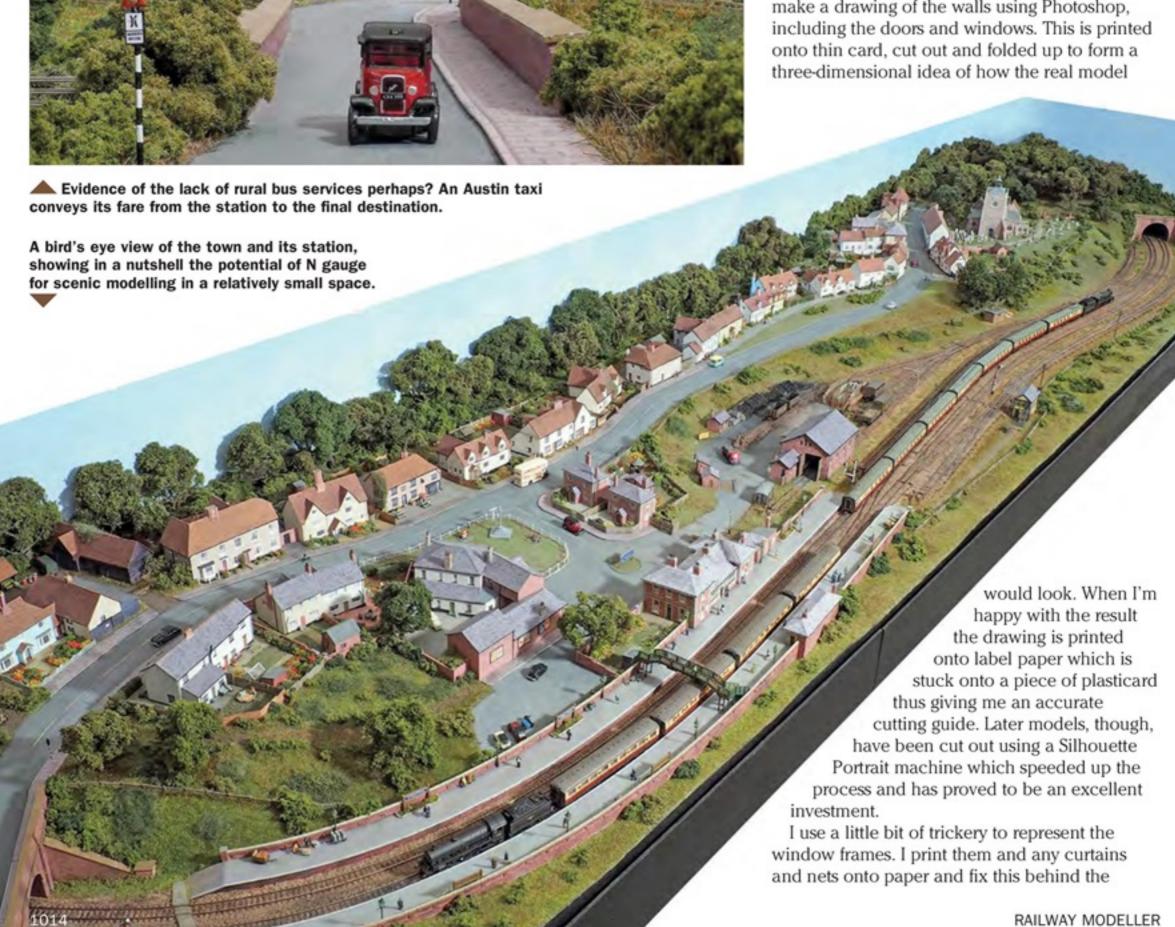


Wrenton Overall layout size 9' 6" x 3' 6". Each grid square = 1' x 1'.



Google Maps can come to the rescue. Zoom in close in map view and it's possible to measure the size of a building with a fair degree of accuracy. Viewing at different angles in Street View gives the arrangement of doors and windows and lots of other details. All I wanted was to create an impression of the fronts of most of the buildings; the backs are largely imagined.

Before starting construction of a building I make a drawing of the walls using Photoshop, onto thin card, cut out and folded up to form a





#### Layout technical details

#### Baseboard

The railway lives in a spare bedroom and one requirement that I set myself was to build it in such a way that a bed could be stored lengthways beneath it. There are three baseboards each 3'2" long and 3'6" wide and rather than have lots of legs or trestles supporting them I sat them on a subframe which is 8' long, has just four legs and is bolted together making it possible to dismantle it. The subframe and the tops and framing of the baseboards were all made from 9mm birch plywood.

#### Track

The village was always my main interest so I chose a track plan that provided just enough operational interest without taking up too much of the baseboard. A small through station on a double track line, a lay-by siding on one side and a goods yard

on the other are fed from a 10-road fiddle vard.

All the track is Peco code 55 laid on cork underlay and fixed with PVA. Every piece, no matter how small, had droppers soldered to the undersides of the rails before installation for connection to the DCC bus.

Points are electrofrog and are powered by Cobalt motors. As the over-centre springs aren't needed I removed them and cut away their housings and all the other redundant plastic around the tiebar area. I think the improvement in appearance is well worth the extra trouble.

After giving the track a spray of brown and painting the rail sides a rusty colour I added a mix of buff and brown fine grade Woodland Scenics ballast fixed down with WS Scenic Cement. The track and ballast were weathered with a coat of diluted

artists' acrylic raw umber followed by Payne's grey.

#### Control

Control is DCC using a Gaugemaster Prodigy Advance 2. I use the firm's WiFi module which enables me to control the locos and points from an iPad using WiThrottle [Reviews, RM August p694].

In the fiddle yard I included short isolated sections at the ends of each of the sidings, feeding power to them through the auxiliary switches of all the Cobalt point motors that have to be set to allow access to the main lines. This prevents accidentally starting a train for which the route isn't set and also makes a useful emergency stop when a train returns to the fiddle yard. The power to the isolated sections is also fed to LEDs which indicate which routes are set.

glazing material. At normal viewing distances the trick is virtually invisible and it gives finer and neater looking frames than I could cut from any material. It's probably not a technique that would work as well in larger scales, though.

I dislike seeing gaps under buildings so I learnt from Pendon and made almost all of the buildings with 'foundations' which were buried in the scenic treatment.

The roof is the part of a building that is most visible in a model and in order to capture the character of the village buildings I use tile paper which I developed from photos of roofs of some of the real buildings.

The church is based on Finchingfield's. It took seven weeks of hard work to make it, but I'd already spent many hours making paper cut-out versions. I shortened both the nave and chancel by one window and also reduced the size overall by about 10%. The station buildings are based on the larger versions of the 1865 GER design but the goods shed is a work of pure fiction. [Ed. – Roger will be expanding on his construction methods in a step-by-step article in the April 2019 issue.]

#### Scenery

Rather than develop the scenic areas directly onto the baseboard they were made as stand-alone modules which were only fixed into their final positions when they were virtually complete. The modules were built up with layers of foamboard, carefully cutting each to give the correct ground levels for the many buildings which sit on slopes.

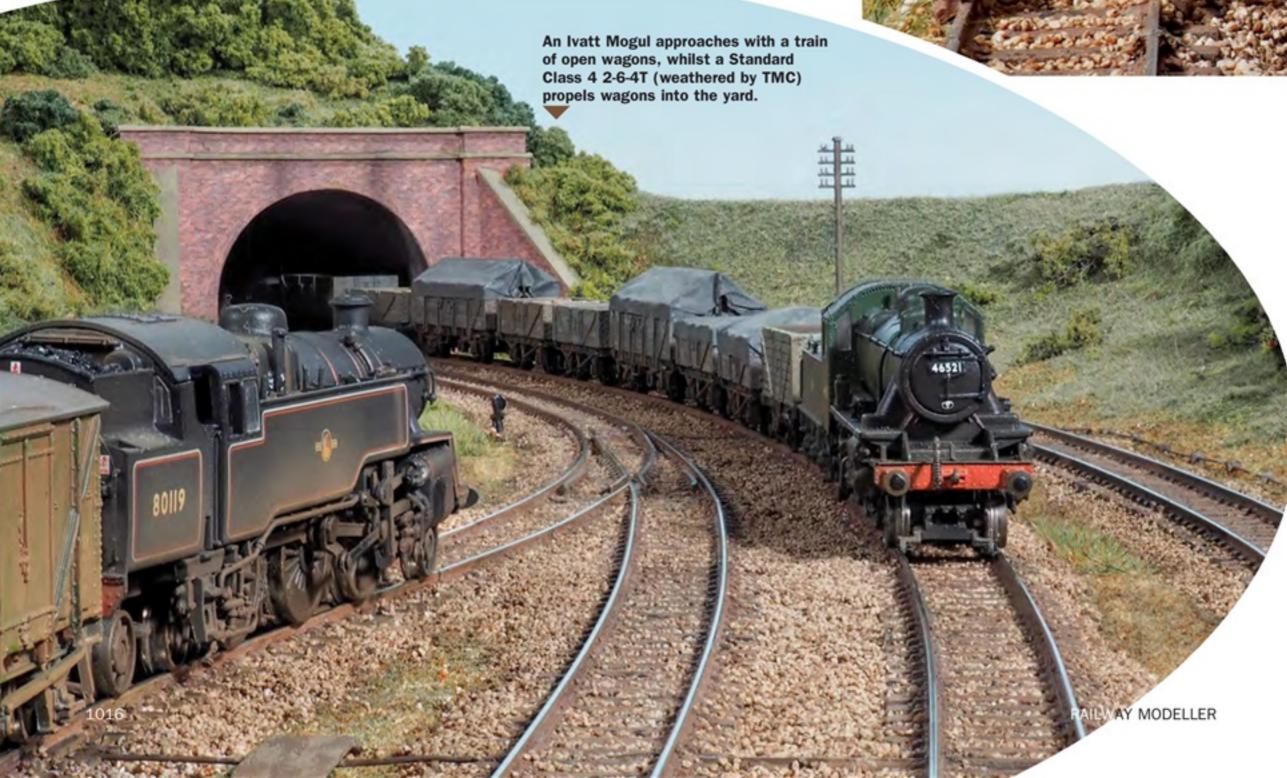
After applying a layer of plaster the buildings were installed and work began on the scenery. Trees were made from twisted wire coated with a plaster/PVA/brown acrylic paint mix. Small pads of the material used to stuff teddy bears and the like were added to the branches, spray painted and scatter added, fixed with hairspray. Fences are a mix of bought and home-made as are the clumps of flowers. War World Scenics static grass and various Woodland Scenics products were used for the greenery. Paths vary from garden to garden - some simply painted to represent concrete, some printed surfaces for paving and even fine sand to suggest gravel. The roads are simply painted plaster but I varied the tones slightly - not many roads are a uniform colour.

#### Conclusion

After about five years' work *Wrenton* is nearly complete. It was my first serious attempt at building a layout – the last try was a very small and crude OO9 affair made 50 years ago. I can see many things that I could have done differently and better – one of the attractions of the hobby is that there is always scope to improve one's modelling and there are always new things to learn. But I hope I've created a reasonably plausible village and something of the atmosphere of a railway passing through it.

Why did it take me until my late 60s to get back into modelling? The usual excuses of lack of space, time and spare cash don't tell the whole story. Browsing magazines and seeing the superb layouts that appear every 4F No.43924 trundles through the station with a coal train. The bracket signal was mostly scratchbuilt with a few Ratio parts.







The modelled buildings are mostly arranged as they are in real life, but some have been repositioned for aesthetic reasons.

month can make the hobby seem quite intimidating, as can the depth of knowledge of many of the contributors. It's easy to say "I couldn't do that" and continue to be an armchair modeller. So I suggest to anyone who falls into that category that you try to make something, however small and simple, and thus start to acquire the necessary skills. Maybe one day you'll make it to the pages of RAILWAY MODELLER!

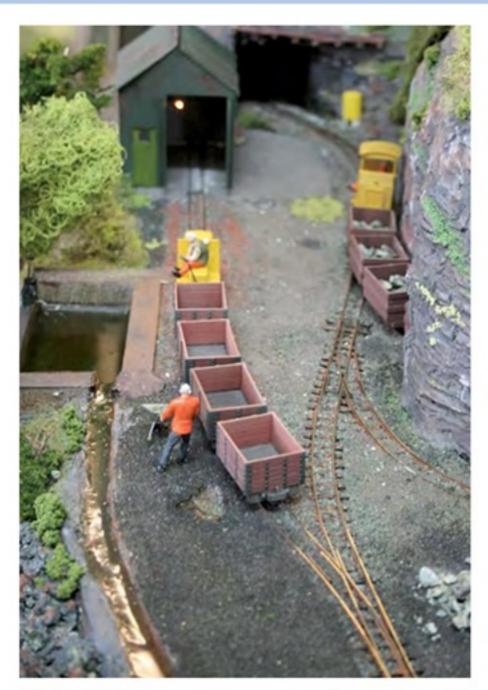

Model Railway Club over 25 years ago. It is making its farewell appearance this year.

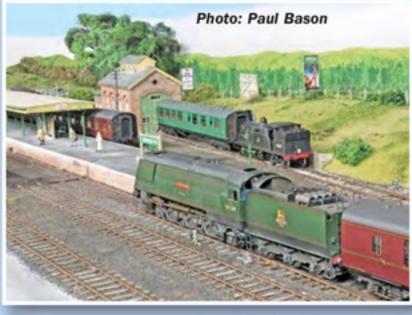

## Out with the old... farewell to New Bryford

s well as Broom Junction bowing out of the exhibition circuit (as highlighted on the previous page) another memorable layout which has travelled far and wide since its inception is Bryford Road, an OO gauge diesel era layout which has had a life rather like that of an ageing rock band with several different line-ups down the years.

The anchorman throughout however is Mick Bryan, from Langho, being its founder back in the 1990s, though its heritage goes back even further. In 1985 Mick started the construction of his previous layout *Bryford Road* using code 100 Peco track.

The layout appeared in the May and June 1987 issues of RAILWAY MODELLER and spent several years on the exhibition circuit.

Mick had hoped to extend it but the introduction of the finer Peco Code 75 track at about that time forced his hand and he started afresh – New Bryford was born in the early 1990s.

The first incarnation included a cement





depot which had been 'borrowed' temporarily from his friend and fellow operator Steve Moore, who had built it for his own layout *Moore*.

Later the cement terminal was removed and a new Leisure Centre building was constructed.

The layout appeared in the model press

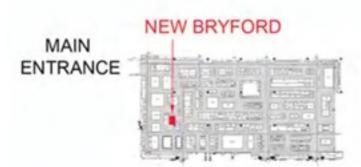
in 1994, then later in the October 1990 edition of RAILWAY MODELLER. Shortly after that Mick sold the layout to a private buyer.

That, he thought, was the end of the line for New Bryford, and began to draw up plans for a new scheme. But New Bryford appeared on the market again in 2009. Intrigued, Mick and another friend and fellow operator, Pete 'Spike' Taylor bought it back again!

A full refurbishment took place, with new scenery and buildings – Spike's forte – and conversion to digital locomotive control was undertaken.

This third and final version, as seen above, took to the circuit once more, and that is how it can be seen at Warley this November, over 25 years since it first appeared.

Mick meanwhile, is back to contemplating seriously what to do next.

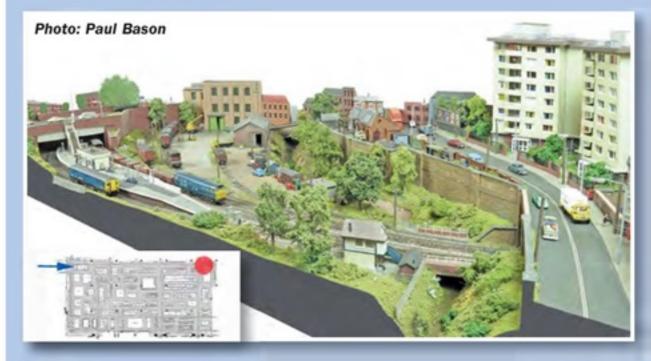


## **Editor's choice** D&E era layouts



For the purposes of selecting my choice of diesel and electric era layouts, I've assumed the cutoff to be 1968, when main line steam traction was banished by the then British Rail Board.

First port of call is Steve Farmer's delightful little N gauge study of 1970s British Rail in Staffordshire, all of which he managed to squeeze into a footprint of only 4' x 2'. *Lymebrook Yard* proves that anyone has room for a superb layout which is oozing with 70s atmosphere – you can almost hear Queen's *Bohemian Rhapsody* issuing from the open door of the workshop at the end of the goods sidings.



Another favourite of mine is Ian Blackall's *Tidworth* terminus in OO gauge. This really takes me on a trip down memory Iane into Network SouthEast territory, and the tail end of the Railfreight Speedlink era. A china clay



terminal and freight forwarding depot (left) provide lots of operating potential on this end-to-end layout of manageable size.

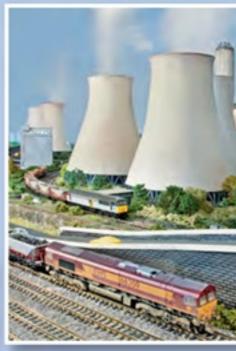


For sheer theatre and amazement, don't miss Didcot A Power Station in N Gauge. It's a great depiction of the former coal fired generating station that used to be situated alongside the London to Bristol main line in Oxfordshire.

The cooling towers really do pour out real steam, thanks to an electric disco 'smoke' machine concealed beneath the baseboard, no dry ice. As well as the MGR coal trains to and from the power station

sidings, there's plenty of passenger train action too.





## For younger, and very young, visitors to the NEC show

hilst this hobby is often perceived as being for adults only – there are special displays within the exhibition put on for youngsters that will surely change a few minds - be they young minds or old ones.

Firstly for the very young is the Warley Club's Thomas the Tank Engine OO layout, Awdry St Nicolas. Every year the information desk at the show fields questions from adults accompanied by children.

"Is there a Thomas layout here and where is it?"

Awdry St Nicolas is the club's third Thomas layout. The previous two had served their purpose, and the format pleased the children. Designed with children in mind, it is exhibited lower than most exhibition layouts, although it gave most of us backache whilst we built it. Nevertheless, it is the right sort of height for the younger operator.

Something simple in design was the order of the day, and thus Awdry St Nicolas is a basic four track circuit, the sole purpose of which is to let as many children as possible experience the excitement of 'driving' a train.

Why Awdry St Nicolas?

Well obviously 'Awdry' in memory of the man – The Reverend Wilbert Awdry – who wrote all the stories, and 'St Nicolas' as being the name of the parish church in King's Norton where he was based at the time.

We are indebted to Hornby Railways for making the Thomas range of trains available. Could enjoying Thomas be the first rung on the long ladder of this hobby which has many so many facets? Who knows? Visit the stand with your youngsters and you may well find the answer!

#### Worsted and Watney

For the not quite so young is the Warley Model Railway Club Junior section layout, the Watney and Worsted line.

It was actually started back in 2006 but with juniors coming and going on a frequent basis, it took quite some time to complete, but was designed and built by the junior group members themselves, with some help, advice and guidance from dedicated helpers and parents.

The layout comprises three independent ovals on eight boards (12' x 8'). There is both digital and analogue controls. The running lines are fed by a 10-track fiddle yard from the rear of the layout.

There is no period set for the layout, so one can see Virgin, EWS, steam and many other train operating companies – and even possibly Harry Potter.

During construction, the juniors learned track laying, wiring, soldering, building scenery, adding lights, trees and team building. A new layout was started in February 2018, which will be seen at the Warley show in a couple of years.

#### Junior Modellers' Workshop

The have a go yourself feature for young persons run by Maggie Gravett and her team is again operating over the duration of the show. Some previous students return to show Maggie the results of their own modelling exploits too – so a worthwhile stop-over.

#### **Getting to the National Exhibition Centre**

he National Exhibition Centre is located almost in the geographical centre of England and surrounded by motorways, railways and even an airport. So it should be easy to get there – but sometimes, it just doesn't seem like that. Then there's the parking. Yes there are a lot of car parks at the NEC and they all seem a little pricey...

So, here is the RAILWAY MODELLER guide to getting to the NEC and enjoying yourself.

#### Let the train take the strain

With Birmingham International station immediately adjacent to the NEC – a five minute walk in fact – travelling by train is a really good option. Virgin Trains, Cross Country, West Midlands Trains and London Northwestern Railway all serve the station direct with connections via other operators from major towns and cities.

Ticket prices vary of course, but booking in advance can save you money. It's not so cheap if a group of you are travelling together, but at least there's no car parking to pay for at the destination, and it's only a short walk from the trains to the show entrance. Letting the train take the strain can be a relaxing way to visit the show.

#### Can you get a a flight?

Birmingham International Airport is right on the NEC doorstep – but that's the problem, it's an *International* airport and most flights are to and from overseas



destinations, with only limited domestic services. Unless you live in Scotland, Northern Ireland, or on one of the islands, flying to the NEC is not an option.

#### Travel by car

The vast majority of visitors to the event come in by car, sharing fuel costs and car parking fees between the passengers.

With access straight off the M42 and A45, providing there's no traffic congestion on the main routes, getting into the NEC site is relatively straightforward, though it can be a bit troublesome at the end of the day when all the exhibitions are shutting simultaneously and an evening show at the NEC's Genting Arena is bringing people in at the same time.

#### Car parking – buy in advance via the NEC website and save money

Parking at the NEC is often a cause of disgruntlement, mostly in view of the price which will be raised to \$16.00 for all tickets purchased upon arrival from this autumn. However, if you purchase your ticket in advance via the NEC website you will get it for \$12.00.

It is possible to book your parking up to three months prior to your visit, which both saves a few pounds and gives you a little peace of mind knowing that it is all taken care of before you travel.

#### Disabled car parking

Drivers who are blue badge holders may also pre-book a standard ticket but on arrival they should follow direction signs for disabled parking (usually near to the Piazza entrance/Hall 5) and present both the ticket and the blue badge to the attendant. Disabled parking is on a first-come first-served basis so drivers may be directed elsewhere if no spaces are available.

#### Free parking at selected stations

Whilst most stations charge for parking, certain stations within the West Midlands transport area offer free parking. So another option is to travel to one of these, park up, then continue your journey by train straight to Birmingham International.

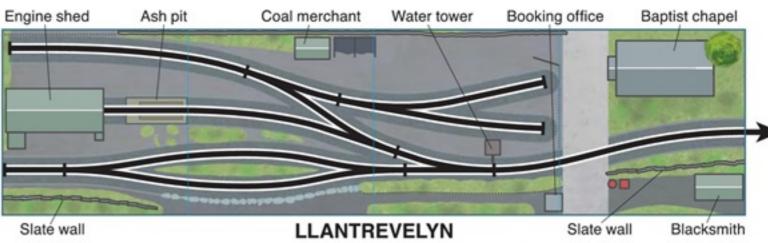

## Llantrevelyn

we began to research various aspects of layouts, settling on a classic small rural terminus.

After little to no planning at all a track plan was laid out utilising a spare kitchen cabinet shelf as a baseboard. Next we had to give the railway a purpose. Initially freelance, we soon decided we wanted to choose an actual railway as a prototype, settling on the Welsh Highland Railway.

Once we had settled on the track plan and the railway's purpose the next task was choosing a location. After a lot of head scratching and book reading we decided to plant Llantrevelyn in the mountains of Snowdonia about five miles north-east of the village of Beddgelert. This decision stemmed from a plan we discovered for a potential line to Betws-y-coed.

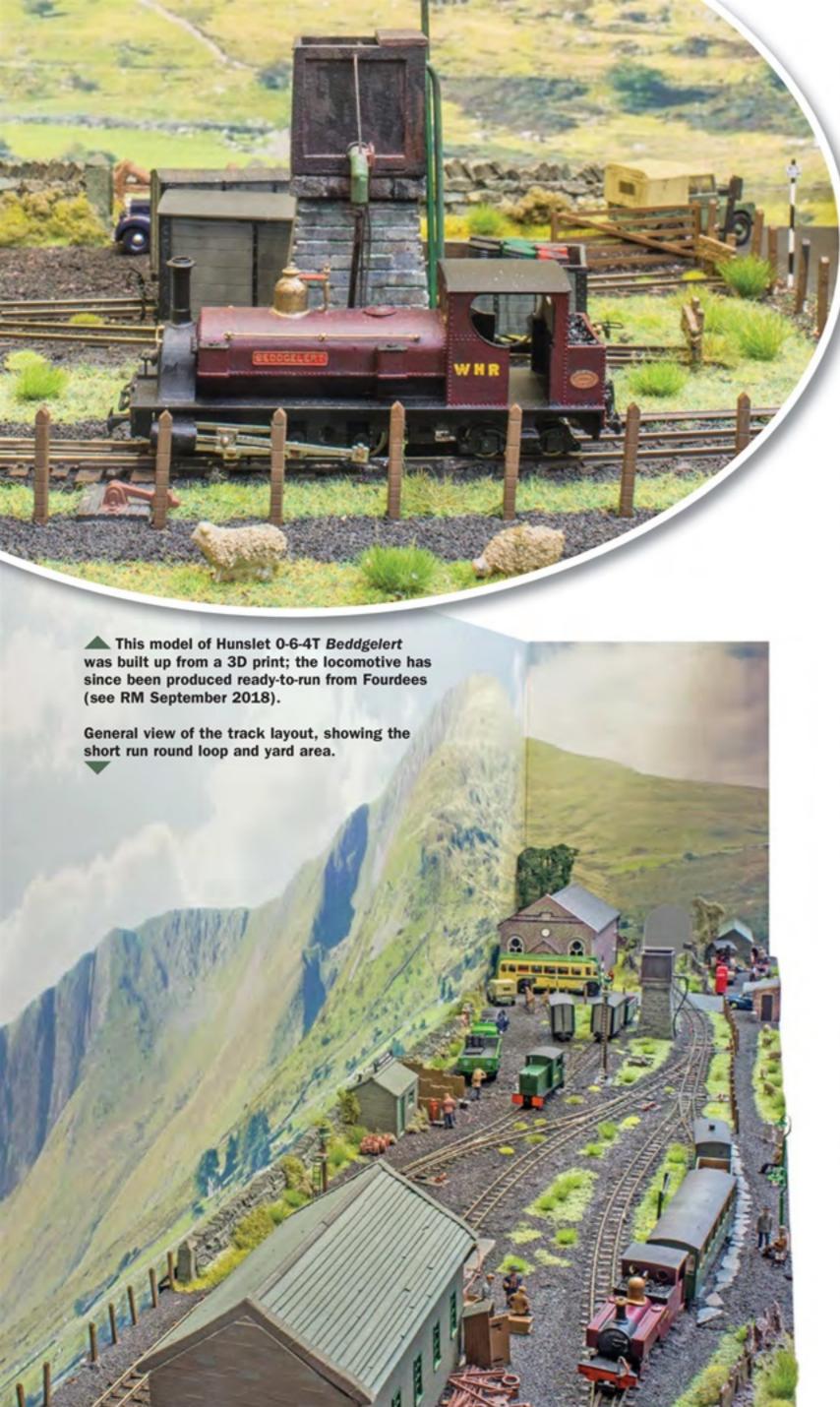
#### Construction

With this being our first attempt at an exhibition layout, it was decided to keep baseboard construction simple. For the main scenic board we chose to use a chipboard shelf, meaning the required framework was of a light construction, so a lot of the work could be carried out in our front bedroom/ workshop at home. Inspiration for the leg design was taken from a club layout being built at the same time; we adapted the design so that the layout neatly slots onto the top using triangular cutouts to help secure it in place.

The fiddle yard took some more thinking; initial plans incorporated a ladder style but we wanted to save on length, so the next step was to build a traverser, something we hadn't attempted before. Help was sought on the best way to get power from the main line to each storage road, the simplest option being two pins which slide into brass tubes mounted on PCB board, which has served us well. The runners were obtained from stationroadbaseboards.co.uk and have proved to be robust in their operation.

We decided to include the lighting rig into the layout's nameboard to help save on space and materials. Lighting is provided by LED strips fed from the mains via a

transformer mounted under the board which supplies 12V dc; these were fitted following a failed attempt at using spotlights.

The nameboard itself represents a large-size version of the running-in board on the platform.

#### **Buildings and scenery**

The majority of the scenics were produced using Woodland Scenics scatter, we used a mix of fine and coarse cinders for the track bed and ground cover in the yard. For the grass area we decided to experiment with static fibres dispensed by the Noch puffer bottle system; we were really happy with the results. The slate style fencing used are sections of Javis cast resin with the ends trimmed to length.

One feature of scenery that gets mentioned a lot is our photographic backscene; this was produced by ID Backscenes and features an image of the Llanberis Pass in North Wales. It is 15" tall, so adds a great sense of depth to the layout and many people have commented on it.

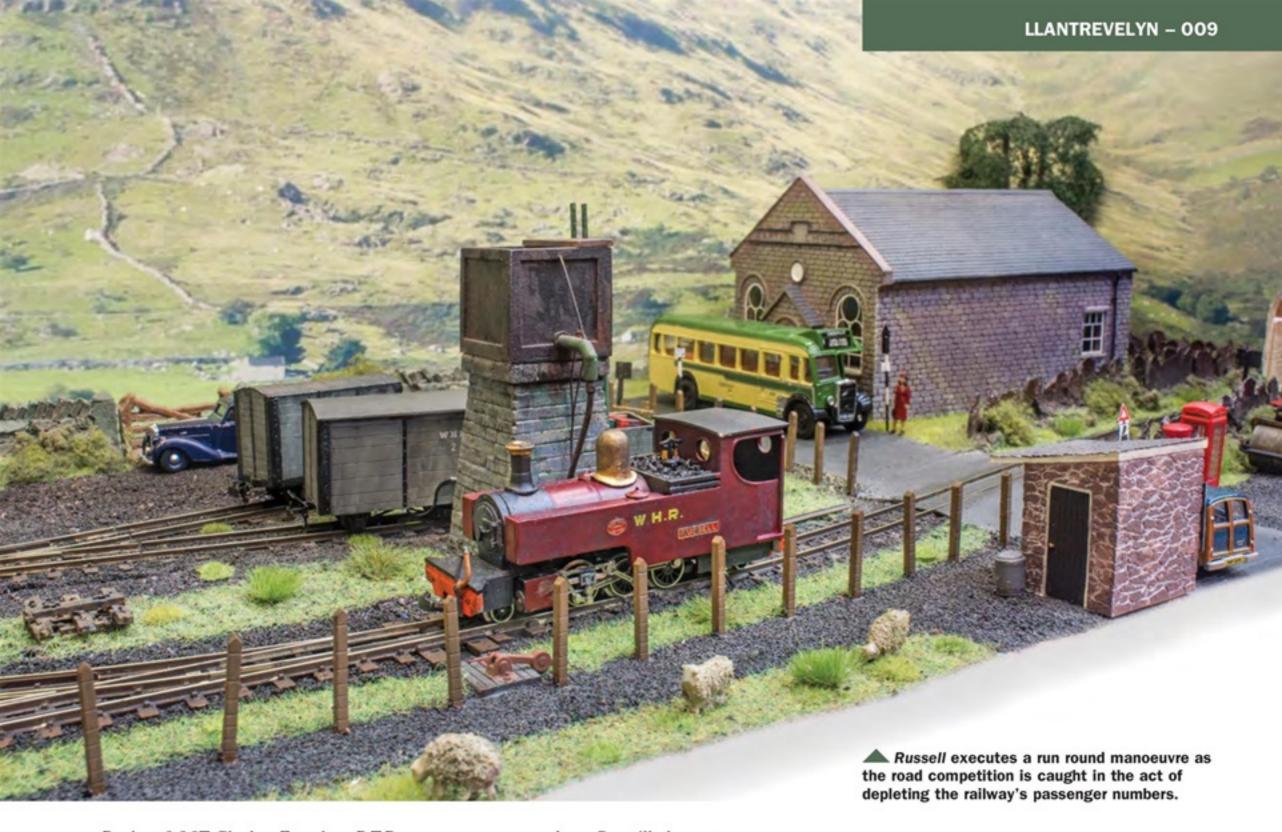
The buildings are a varied mix of scratchbuilt, ready-to-plant and kits. The impressive single road engine shed (complete with ash pit) was scratchbuilt from plasticard and features a fully fitted out workshop and shed lighting. The water tower was also scratchbuilt in plasticard, being loosely based on the tower found at Dolgoch on the Talyllyn. The station booking office building is a slightly modified Bachmann Scenecraft model of Campbell's Halt on the Ffestiniog Railway. The Baptist chapel is a Hornby Skaledale item, slightly weathered.

Throughout we also have included cameo scenes to add a sense of realism, ranging from the local schoolboys visiting the engine shed, a shepherd rounding up his sheep and the local smith at work in his shop. The local wildlife hasn't been forgotten either, including squirrels in the trees and stoats running about the yard. The layout also features a couple of trees depicting the species found in the area which we obtained from The Model Tree Shop.

#### Rolling stock

The rolling stock used is a mix of kit/ scratchbuilt and ready-to-run with the majority being of either WHR (Welsh Highland Railway) or FR (Ffestiniog Railway) provenance, plus a few 'what ifs' for good measure. Some locos are of particular note:

- Vulcan Foundry 0-6-4Ts Snowdon Ranger and Moel Tryfan, both Chivers/Five79 kits on Arnold 0-6-0 chassis.
- Hunslet 0-6-4T Beddgelert, Robex 3D print on a Graham Farish Class 08 chassis with RT Models motion.
- Bruce Peebles PBSSR (Portmadoc, Beddgelert & South Snowdon Railway) boxcab electric loco, scratchbuilt on a Kato tram chassis.
- Hunslet 0-6-4T Gowrie, Mountaineer Models 3D print on a Bachmann 0-6-0 switcher chassis.
- Baldwin 4-6-0T No.590, Bachmann R-T-R.



- Peckett 0-6-0T Glaslyn, Fourdees R-T-R.
- Peckett 0-6-0ST Volunteer, RT Models kit on a Graham Farish 08 chassis.

We have also been lucky to have the odd visitor to the layout at exhibitions, ranging from a dinky Joe Works Bagnall *Huw* to a Paul Windle Mallet kindly provided by fellow OO9 modellers. A regular performer on the layout is our railcar built from Dundas Models Welsh Highland Bro Madog coach and a Kato 105 chassis.

The passenger and freight stock is a mix of Dundas, Worsley Works and Mercian Models kits, all suitably weathered and fitted with the unobtrusive Greenwich automatic coupling system which works by placing static permanent magnets at locations on the layout such as sidings, headshunts and run round loops. The most interesting vehicle in our freight stock is the large six-wheel Cleminson coal wagon kindly built for us by our friend David Burleigh, unique in the fact that the WHR only had one vehicle of this design and also that only two models currently exist.

#### Road vehicles

Even though Llantrevelyn is a remote village in the Welsh Mountains, believe it or not there is road access. The vehicles we tend to

use range from Crosville buses to a steamroller: the vehicles are a mix of Base Toys, EFE (Exclusive First Editions), Corgi and Oxford Diecast. The majority have been suitably weathered to take away that 'fresh out of the box' look.

#### Thank you

This was my and Thomas's first venture into an exhibition quality layout and also my first OO9 layout; without the help of a few close friends providing advice and support we would still be staring at the drawing board. So thanks to the members of the Tyne Tees OO9 group; our friend Tom who scratchbuilt the engine shed, pit and water tower; and also thanks to members of Perth

#### Welsh Highland Heritage Railway

One of the aims of exhibiting Llantrevelyn is to promote The Welsh Highland Heritage Railway in Porthmadog. Thomas and I would highly recommend a visit to anyone wanting to learn more about the varied history of the Welsh Highland Railway, its predecessors and successors and take a trip behind the only surviving locomotive Russell. ## Derwent Road



BILL FLUDE was inspired by the Leighton Buzzard Light Railway to build this compact layout in O9; although the scale/gauge combination results in a narrower gauge (18" instead of 2'), the way modern housing has enveloped the railway replicates a typical LBLR characteristic.

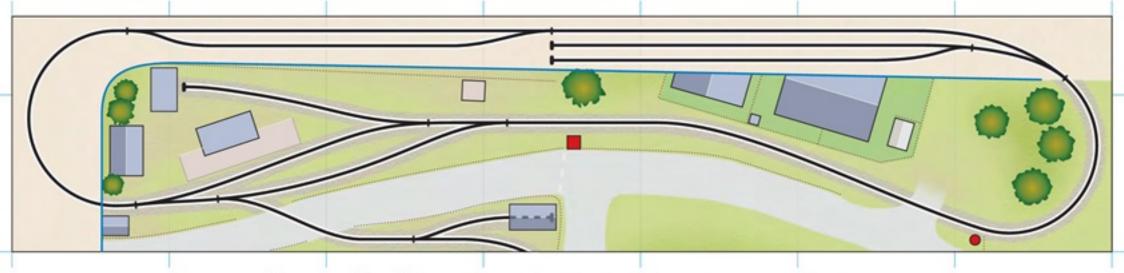
Bedfordshire. If you go to Derwent Road you won't find a narrow gauge railway sneaking down the side of the road, however a short distance to the east you will find the 2' gauge Leighton Buzzard Light Railway, the inspiration for my model. This unique railway runs through a housing estate: the railway was built to carry sand just after the First World War, and ran through open fields from the many sand pits to an interchange with the standard gauge. As Leighton Buzzard expanded, the housing estates were built around the railway.

I have modelled a line with a gauge of 18" set in the mid-1980s where sand trains still run the full length of the line; the preservation society only operates its trains as far as the loop at Derwent Road.

I decided to use O9 (9mm track with a scale of 7mm/ft) again, as I already had stock from my *Buttermere Mining Company* layout [see RM March 2016 – Ed.] that I could also use on the new project. I hoped to be invited

to exhibitions so the layout had to fit into my small car; the two boards could only be 42" long and 18" wide. I decided that the layout should be easy to set up and must be operational within 30 minutes of getting to the venue.

#### Baseboards and backscene

I used 9mm ply to build Buttermere but decided to use 6mm for this layout as the two boards have the backscene and proscenium arch built-in, to give a rigid structure. I gave my local timber merchant a cutting list and within an hour I had a large number of very accurately cut bits of high quality ply. A couple of boxes of screws and copious amounts of PVA glue turned the ply pieces into two light but very rigid baseboards.

The layout is supported on the same adjustable metal trestles I use for *Buttermere* but because *Derwent Road* has two baseboards, two aluminium girders rest on the trestles and the boards sit on them.

Lights, DCC system and an MP3 player with speakers are built into the baseboards. Trains can be running in around 10 minutes and the layout can be fully ready for display within 30 minutes.

The built-in lights are the 'LEDs on a roll' type. After some experiments I have used four strips running the length of the scenic part of the layout; three of them are warm white, the other cool white, which gives a good balance of colour and brightness. A single strip of the cool white ones lights the fiddle yard.

I wanted to try a photographic backscene. I had visited the real Leighton Buzzard line a few times and taken hundreds of photos of the railway, its surroundings including buildings, and realised that Thornbury – the town that I was working in – had houses that were to the same design as ones in Leighton Buzzard. On a nice sunny day I took the photos for the backscene in Thornbury!

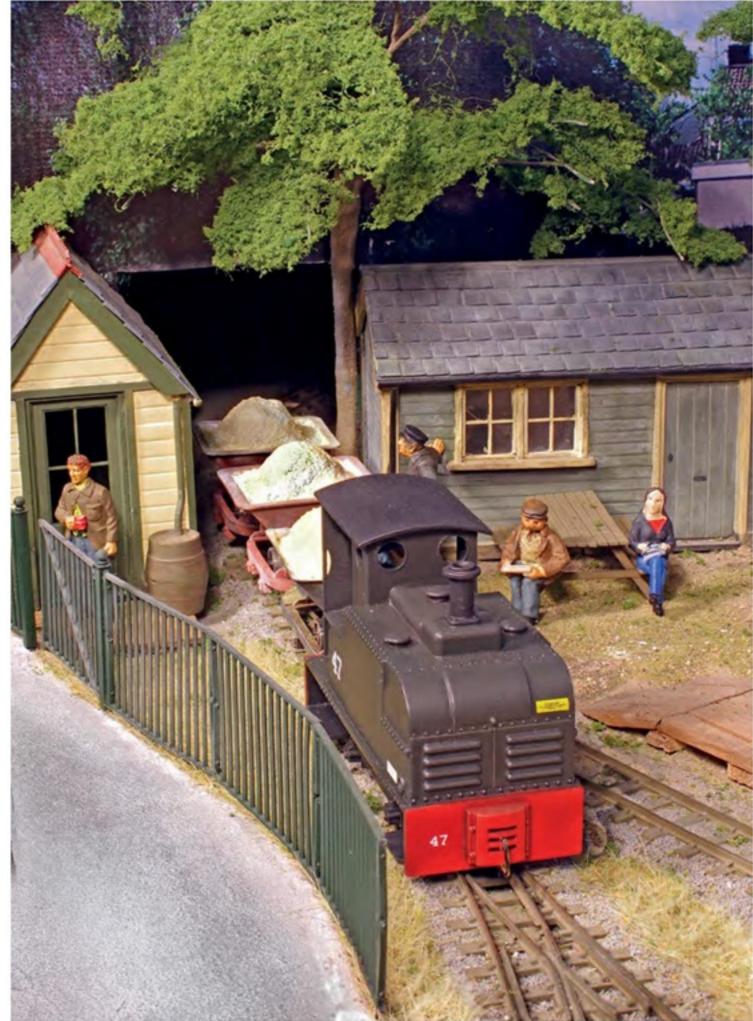
The backscene was produced from a set of six photos taken with my digital SLR, the images stitched together in Photoshop and then the completed file was taken to a local graphics firm which printed it onto vinyl material which was trimmed to fit and glued to the ply backscene.

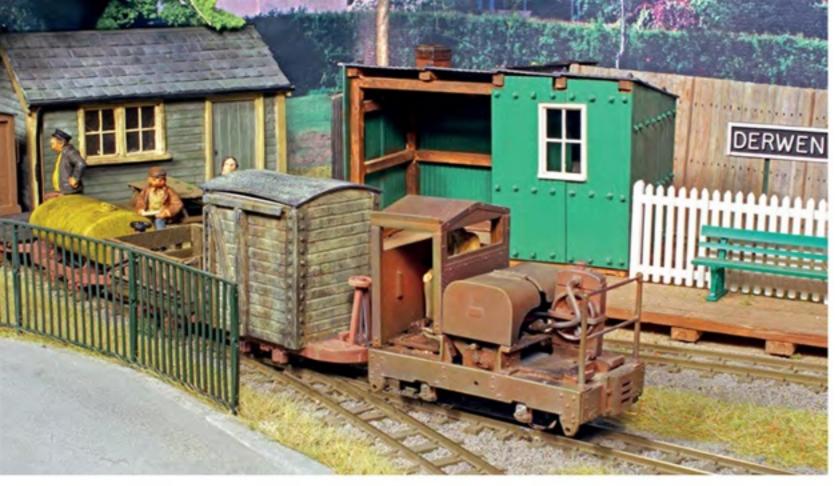
#### **Buildings and scenery**

The buildings were mainly scratchbuilt from styrene sheet and sections, but a couple of the sheds were picked up on eBay. DAS clay and blue foam was used to shape the ground contours and then static grass was applied using my bargain-basement \$4 applicator followed by ground foam. The roads were made from mounting board with styrene

Three loaded skips emerge onto the scenic part of the layout; the curve to the fiddle yard is masked by a couple of huts.





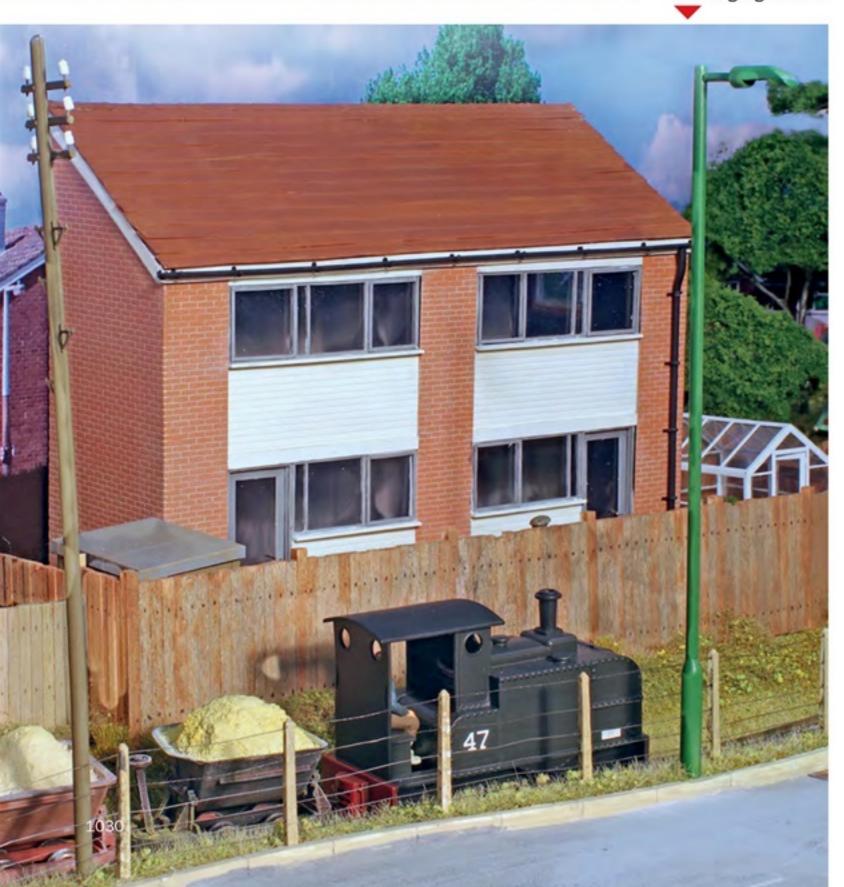


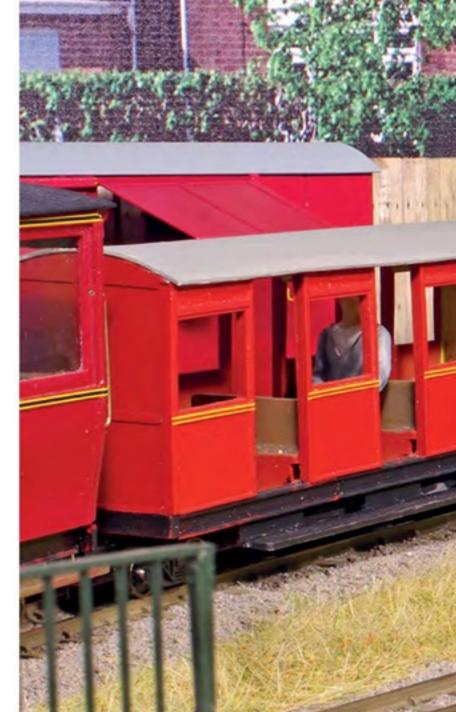

kerb stones; drains and manhole covers 'by Giles' (bygiles.com); metal fences from Peco; wooden ones from stripwood cut using the basic NWSL chopper, the bits glued together and weathered with acrylic paint with ink/ alcohol washes. Brass tube was used to make the two street lights.

The point rodding is the 4mm Wills product; although underscale it looks convincing with the small gauge. Peco OO9 track was laid on Woodland Scenics N gauge foam underlay with N gauge ballast.

#### DCC and other electrics

Motive power has DCC decoders fitted and in some, if space permits, sound. A Digitrax DCC system with a mixture of wireless and tethered throttles is used to drive trains and control points. The points operate using Cobalt IP DCC motors; a series of routes has been programmed, allowing several points to be set by pressing a couple of buttons. The 'Tea Van', inspired by the ones that used to run on the Talyllyn and Fairbourne railways, has a DCC-controlled serving hatch.

The built-in sound system plays a random suburban sound track with bird song, road vehicles and some train sounds. I used a program called Atmosphere to produce an hour-long track that plays on a loop.

#### Stock and operation

Locos, coaches and wagons stock are a mix of scratchbuilt, kitbuilt and 3D printed items; a few have been completed as their designers intended but most have been modified. Greenwich couplers with tiny neodymium magnets allow hands-off uncoupling.

Operation is fairly simple: empty sand



Empties and fulls for the sand company circle the layout whilst the preservation society's workings shuttle to and fro.

The wealth of small details available for 7mm scale means that distinctive wagons can be created simply and inexpensively.

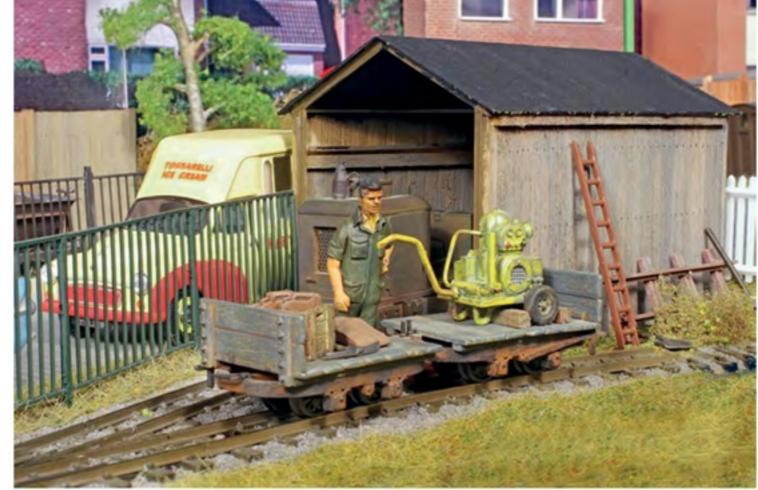
trains run clockwise, full ones anti-clockwise, preservation society trains run from the fiddle yard as far as Derwent Road, run round and go back again. For a bit of variety we can run engineering trains and light locos, whilst the 'Tea Van' has to be delivered at the start and collected at the end of each day. It was clear after a few exhibitions that trains spent a long time running through the fiddle yard; also when operating from the front of the layout, trains in the fiddle yard cannot be seen, so a couple of car reversing cameras and screens were installed. The fiddle yard has also been modified to allow a more frequent train service to be maintained to entertain the watching hordes.

#### An enjoyable challenge

When I started to design the layout in 2016 I did some sketches, and *Derwent Road* has turned out pretty much as I envisaged it. It has been an enjoyable challenge to model the suburban scene.

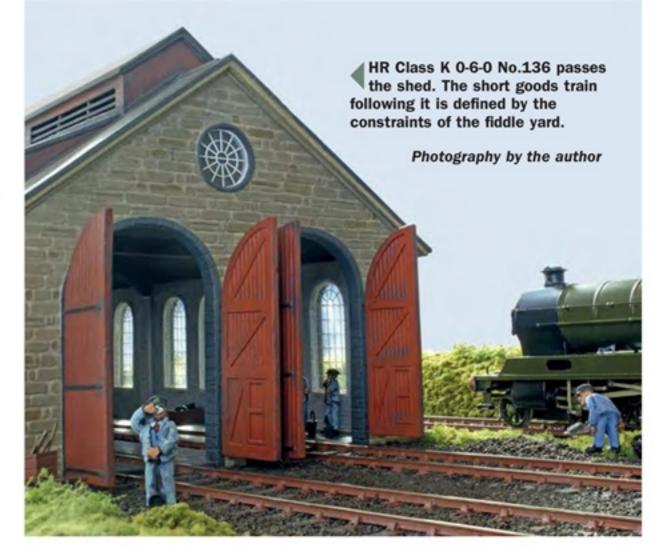
My thanks go to the members of the NGRM-Online forum for the encouragement and support, my good friends who operate the layout at shows, and to Elaine for putting up with the layout and general modelling clutter all around the house.

The gradual expansion of suburbia means that in places there is barely enough room for the trains to pass modern installations.





# Creating Criochpart 2



**PETER FLETCHER** continues his description of how to build a small fold-away layout in 4mm scale. This month – the structures and trackwork.

his layout, *Crioch*, portrays a small engine shed on the Highland Railway in Edwardian times. There is a through main line on one side of the scenic board, but the principal structure is the model of Tain engine shed. The majority of the shed's construction was carried out before the track was laid to ensure that clearances were adequate all round.

The scratchbuilt shed was made as a 'kit of parts' using 3mm plywood as the structural shell covered with plain and stone-embossed plasticard, as seen in Fig. 1.

The semi-circular arched windows were a challenging feature for this average modeller to tackle, especially as the plywood I used, from the local superstore, tends to splinter at the mere sight of a craft knife.

#### Walls and windows

To start, some window glazing etches in brass were obtained from Lochgorm Kits. These are made to the dimensions of those in the ex-Highland shed at Aviemore and as such were suitable for my model.

A small wooden template was made as a guide for cutting out the side window apertures. Fortunately the etches for the rose windows in each gable end of the shed matched the diameter of an American 1c coin – so that was used as the template!

Windows and door shapes were drawn in pencil on the plywood at the correct positions. To form the circular arches a series of small holes were drilled within the pencil lines and the bulk of wood for each opening was removed. Thereafter, each window shape was gradually filed out to fit the template. Stoneembossed plasticard was then glued to each side of the plywood in turn and the windows and arches recut and filed once again to shape. The embossed card on the outer edges was left slightly longer than the length of each section to allow corner stonework to be formed once the structure was assembled.

To get the window etches to locate, a rebate of plastic microstrip was worked around the inside of each window opening. You can see these in Fig. 1. The brass etches then were sprayed with a matt white paint and set aside until all the walls were painted. Painting first enabled me to get some variation in stone colours, add some light weathering, and create an impression of mortar. Stonework was painted principally with Humbrol No.187

dark stone, but with some use of No.84 matt mid-stone and No.121 matt pale stone, all washed with a very thin coat of dirty black paint. The darker stone around the windows and door arches is Humbrol matt black No.33 and weathered. The painting tasks were completed before window frets were added, and only then were the two shed sides and two gable ends glued together.

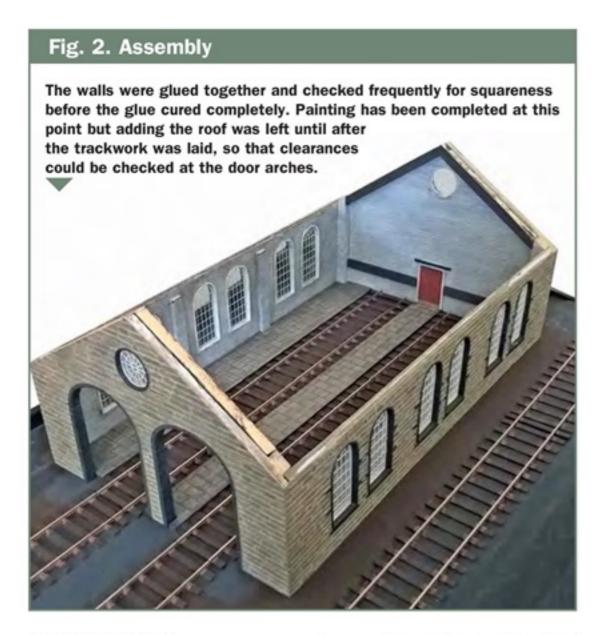
During assembly and before the glue cured, the alignment was checked frequently with a small engineer's square. After trimming the over-length embossed card at the ends of the side walls, I filed the stone courses lightly around the corners of the building and touched up the paintwork as required. The shed at this stage can be seen in Fig. 2 and was retained without the roof until the tracks were laid.

Experience has taught that model buildings are always prone to warping with changes in temperature. Bowed walls and sagging roofs can dent the confidence of the modeller quickly and potentially destroy hours of hard work. To try to mitigate such effects, Crioch shed sits around a 3mm plywood shell which was covered with simulated walling via embossed card. This means that the walls should retain their shape at all levels. Moreover, two sturdy wooden A-frames were made to keep the tops of the side walls at the prescribed distance and to provide extra points to which the roof could be fixed later. The left-hand photo shows the outer sides of the walls, whilst the right-hand photo shows the inner sides.







#### Roof and doors

The roof was formed from two pieces of better quality plywood sourced from a local model shop, glued to each gable and the prefabricated A-frames. Slateembossed plasticard was added. The distinctive smoke vents of Tain shed were then modelled with the aid of photographs using small plywood formers and microstrip, a task that required time rather than skill and ingenuity. This part completed roof detail is seen in Fig. 3.

The final touch was provided by Lochgorm Kits etches of Highland shed doors, again based on those at Aviemore shed which still survives today as part of the Strathspey Railway.

The thin brass door etches have been glued to 1mm plywood to give a more prototypical thickness and enable three very fine holes to be drilled to take Peco track pins that act as hinges.

Matching holes were drilled in the stone arches to take the pins with the result that each door was simply pushed into place without any need for glue. The resultant slight gap between door and stone reveals three simulated hinges per door. Shed door clearances are tight but quite adequate for the largest locomotives, as indeed they were on the original.

The Highland Railway appears to have used copious quantities of sienna-brown paint for its wooden structures. The exact shade of this colour is shrouded

in mystery and so Humbrol No.100 matt red-brown was chosen for the shed doors. See Fig. 4.

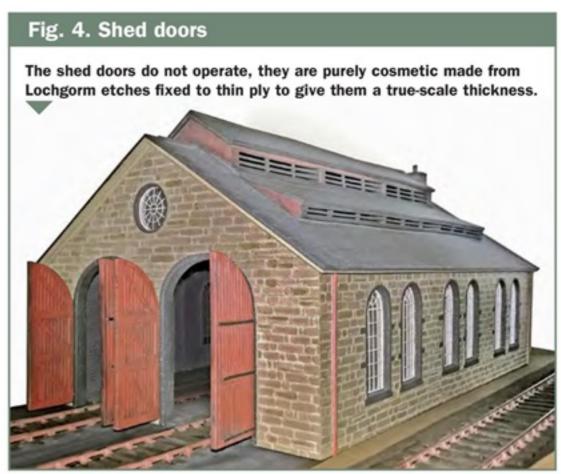
#### Trackwork

Work on the shed took some time, but once the shed door arches had been made I could position it on the baseboard and align the track accordingly. The track is from SMP, suitably painted and ballasted with a cinder product purchased many years ago from W&T [Ed. - this item is now available from Scale Link; see www.scalelink.co.uk]

The one point was handbuilt using the copper-clad sleeper construction method. The tiebar is moved by a small sprung pin soldered at right angles to a brass spigot fixed under the baseboard. A threaded rod turning in a brass nut also under the baseboard, acts as a screw mechanism that pushes against the spigot to change the point. Turning the screw back the other way takes the tension off the spigot spring and changes the point back. The rod movement also activates a microswitch that changes the polarity of the live frog. This simple mechanical method ensures that the point blades move relatively slowly and avoids any sharp movement that might damage the point blades or the tiebar. Although I've used EM gauge trackwork, OO alternatives are equally suitable.

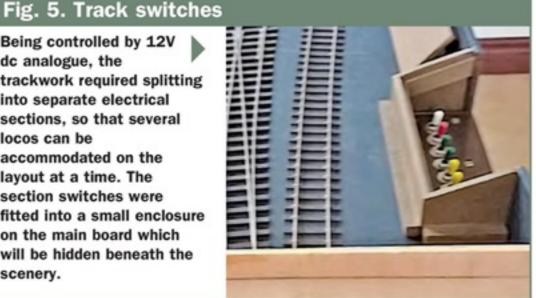
Utilising 12V dc control means

Being controlled by 12V dc analogue, the trackwork required splitting into separate electrical sections, so that several locos can be accommodated on the layout at a time. The section switches were fitted into a small enclosure on the main board which will be hidden beneath the

scenery.

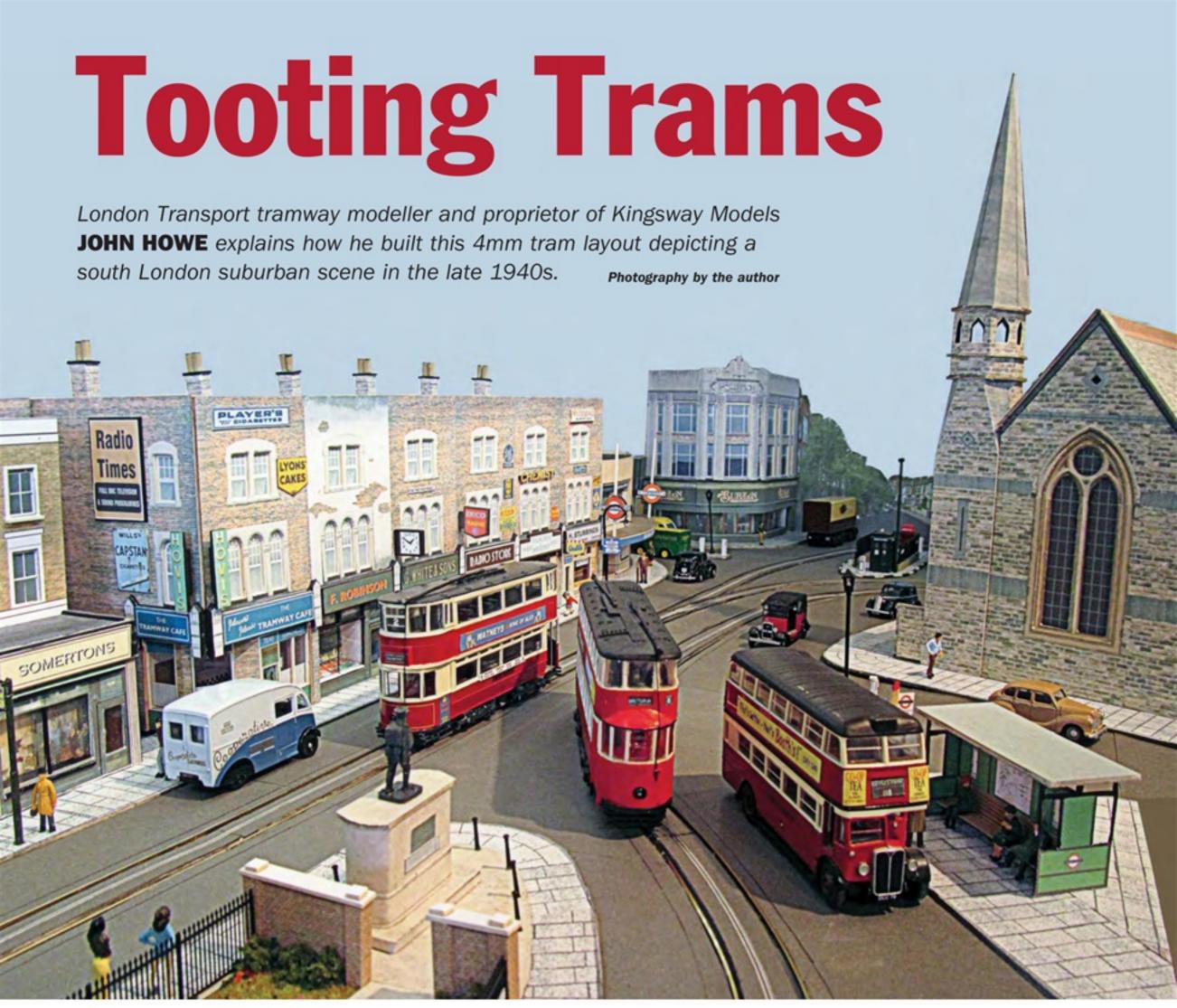


isolating sections are required if more than one loco is to be deployed on the layout. The switches for the sections were fitted onto a small panel at one side of the baseboard. A wooden case, as shown in Fig. 5, around the switches was made with a removable lid so that scenery could cover the switch panel at a later date but allow easy access for maintenance.

y two previous London tram layouts were based upon real locations with unusual features; *Kingsway Subway* (RM February 2006) had trams running in a subsurface tunnel and along a reserved track on the Embankment, and *Dog Kennel Hill* (RM September 2008) comprised a quadruple track running up a 1:10 hill.

They were exhibited for a time until, in 2013, my wife Jenny and I moved from Essex to Buxton, Derbyshire where I gave much contemplation to what I might build next.

I yearned for a more typical London tramway than those depicted in the previous layouts. This time I wanted double track street running in a location no more specific than urban postwar south London.

#### Knowing my limitations

Tramway modelling remains an odd corner of the hobby that has many very talented individuals who can create marvels of miniature engineering. Unfortunately I am not among them!

Firstly I avoided having to install and maintain overhead wires for the trams, as the layout is based on that large part of the London network that used the conduit system of current collection.

Secondly, although the passenger tramcar fleet in postwar London was wholly of the twin bogie variety, previous experience with such tramcar mechanisms had left me despairing, so I chose to use four-wheel mechanisms hidden behind the dummy twin bogie sides hung from the body.

Trackwise, I use standard Peco code 100 items with small radius live frog points, the live frogs overcoming stalling problems which can occur with small wheelbase bogies running across dead frog points.

For the double track junction, Y points have usefully saved some length, although as the crossing is unavailable as live frog, the An aerial view of the war memorial in Trinity Square showing St Jude's church. layout does reproduce the real danger of tram cars being 'stuck on the dead'. The prototypical practice of a small burst of acceleration helps to maintain progress.

Accepting these limitations may not suit others, but it gives reliable operation and allows me to concentrate on the aspect of modelling that I enjoy most: creating an environment which includes suitable buildings, vehicles and advertising posters which reflect the supposed period and location.

London's trams ran for the last time on the

night of 5 July 1952. With such a definite cut-off, one has to be very careful to avoid anachronisms.

#### Finding the space

This layout is housed permanently in my workroom on a 'ladder rack' shelf system. The room is L shaped and the layout has now reached the largest possible extent, being bounded by the window in one direction and the door, in the other.

For the first section around the U shape I built simple baseboards 18" wide, using softwood frames topped with 6mm plywood. Coach bolts and wingnuts hold the boards together and the surface is about 46" above the floor.

I would have liked to have had a typical 'stub end' terminus arrangement, but I find that the prospect of running a car 'backwards' with a driver at the trailing end would upset me almost as much as running it alongside a Routemaster bus! For this reason I use hidden return loops.

A great advantage with trams is that the loops can be of considerably tighter radius than on a railway layout, especially with my four-wheel mechanisms. I find that curves of less than 4" radius are quite possible. I have a circular card template with quadrants cut to radii of 3½", 4", 5" and 6" that I use when laying track. A good quality code 100 flexible track such as Peco can be coaxed into such

tight turns. My practice is to glue the track down with Bostik All Purpose adhesive using drawing pins to hold the track in place whilst setting.

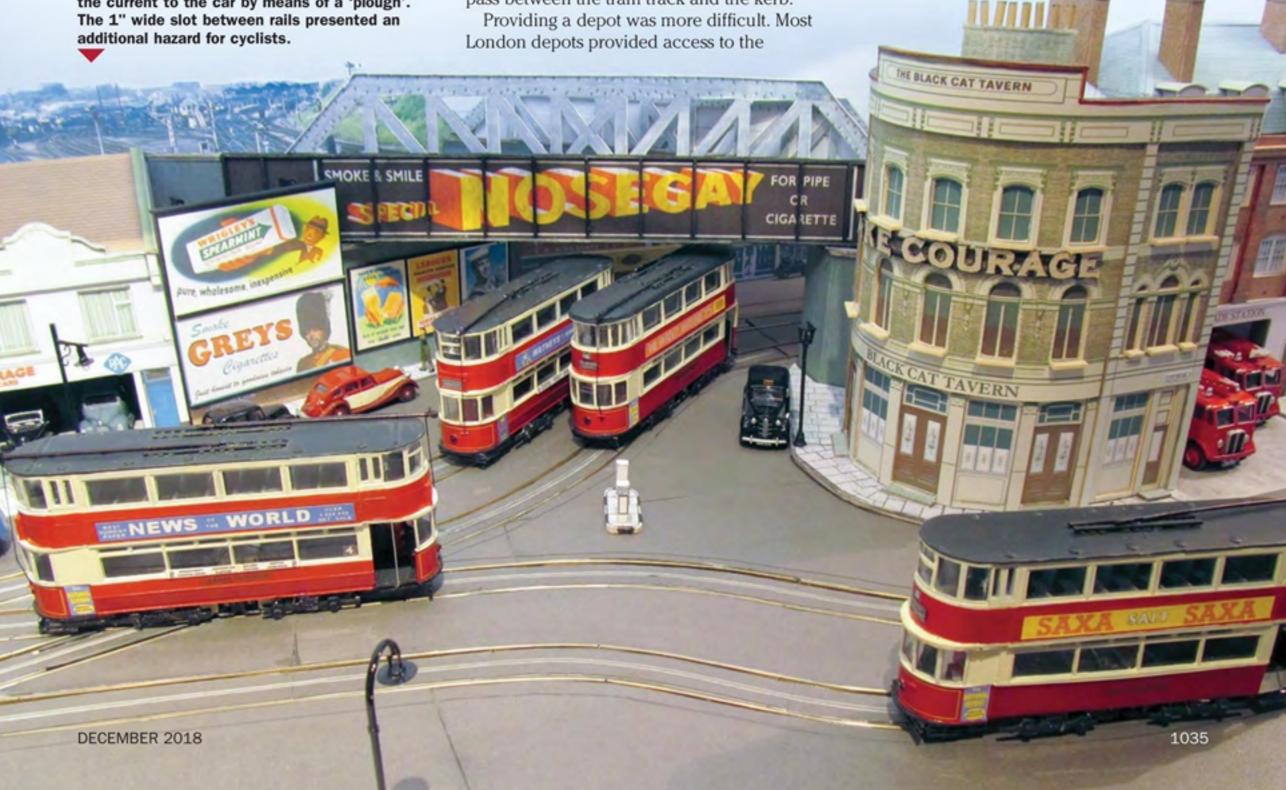
#### Layout design

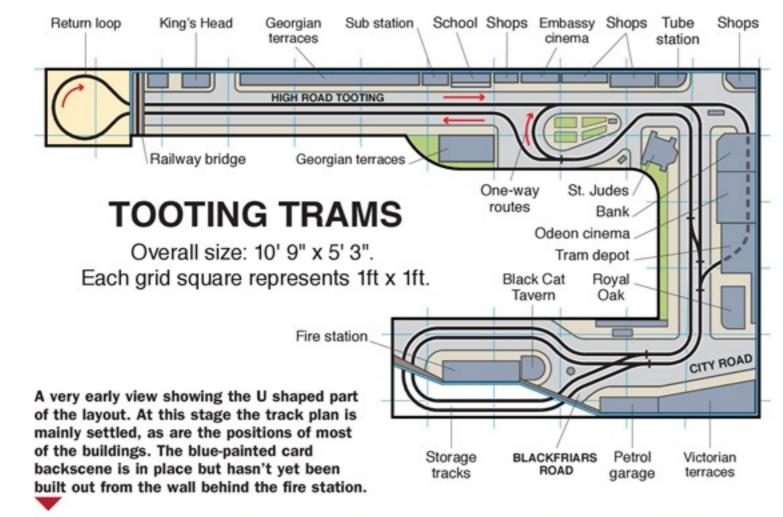
In order to illustrate the 'typical tramways' of London, I wanted to incorporate a double track junction, and a depot, and wanted some degree of choice of route for the cars. All this needed to be achieved with as much standard double track as possible. With these requirements the layout pretty much designed itself.

Because the trams ran in streets alongside other traffic, roads need to be wider than than those often seen on model railway layouts. Most of the London system allowed space for at least one lane of other traffic to pass between the tram track and the kerb.

adjacent running lines in both directions.
Using standard railway points, this was impossible. I decided that a visually acceptable alternative was to install a crossover outside the depot in order to allow cars to be reversed in order to gain the required track. There is also a rear entrance (a not unknown arrangement).







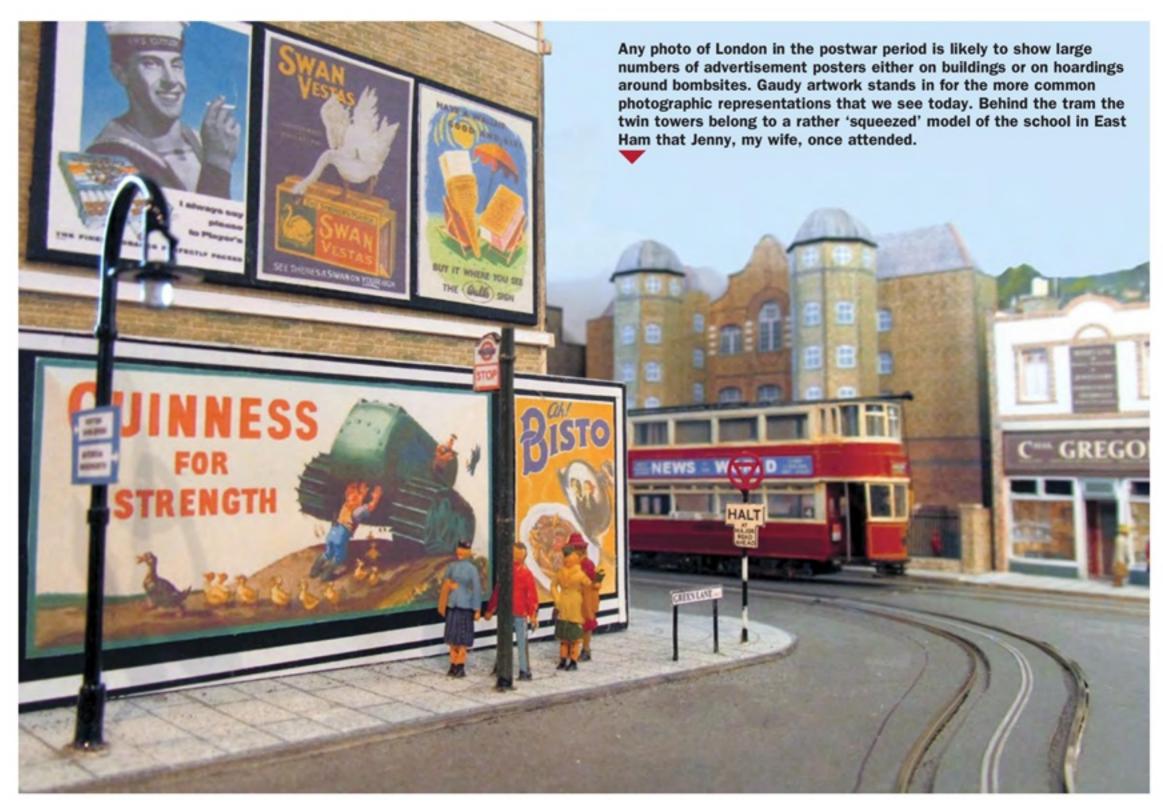
For the other side of the U shape, I considered an arrangement where separate lines ran in parallel streets. Sketching it fullsize, it appeared too squashed on an 18" board so instead I adopted the Trinity Square 'one way system' – a nod to those at Vauxhall and Westminster, albeit on a smaller scale. This provides the means to turn a car short, enabling it to take the rear entrance to the depot, where there are isolated sections for five cars.

As I laid the tracks around the first section of the layout, I thought about an extension. A further 6' of straight wall lay beyond. Here the boards would have to pass above my desk. I decided to raise the tracks at a 1:10 gradient as on *Dog Kennel Hill*, but for just 30". This gave increased clearance over the desk, with straight double track climbing to a hidden loop beyond another bridge.

With the required features in place, I now had to visualise the scenery suitable for this London tramscape – quite different from the previous layouts where I worked from actual places.

#### Searching old maps

Wishing to use names that gave the right atmosphere, I searched some old maps and chose Tooting. I wanted an Underground station, and the Charles Holden designed Tooting Broadway building has always been a favourite. In order to avoid being too specific, I called it Tooting Common.

The tram depot building is based on one of the entrances to Camberwell depot.

Many of the south London tram routes that didn't venture through the Kingsway Subway to north London used a large double track loop crossing Blackfriars and Westminster bridges to the Embankment. The similarity to my smaller loops suggested that this might be the City end of the layout. Similar games named the roads around the layout.

#### Scenery

Buildings in the 1950s would have been mainly Victorian and Edwardian and, due to the recent war and air pollution, would look rather rundown but with the gaudy and prolific advertising posters of the period. Railway overbridges also carried large painted adverts on their spans.

The buildings are mainly from my own range of card building kits (Kingsway Models) in either standard or modified form.

The viewable length of the layout is about 16', so a large number of buildings were required. There are three pubs, 14 shops, two cinemas, 18 private houses, a fire station, school, bank, Underground station and church. A classic-style substation complements the LCCT depot.

#### Backscene

The card backscene is about 12" high, and was painted sky blue using emulsion matchpots from a DIY store. To this were glued printed pictures to give depth. At the City end, the backscene follows the railway overbridges. Similar backscenes can be seen

underneath the bridges, providing continuity as the layout is viewed from the front.

#### Lighting

Around the U shaped section, an LED 'warm white' illuminated strip under the shelf above gives excellent light for operation, and photography. Along the High Road the layout nears the window which provides natural light. LED lampposts throughout the layout are from the excellent range available from Layouts4U (www.layouts4u.net). The two cinemas and Underground station are lit internally.

#### Controls

The up and down lines are separately wired through DPDT switches to the twin outputs of a Morley Vector controller and have multiple switched sections. Each of the City loops holds three tramcars. The loop at the top of the hill can hold four, and the depot five. Wire pushrods control the points.

#### Tramcars

In the postwar period, most London passenger tramcars looked very similar. Tower Models plastic kits produce the London E1 Class and the Feltham [Ed. – now available from Bec-kits: www.bec-kits.co.uk]. With reference to photographs the E1 kit can be bashed into different variations. The Feltham kit enables the cars to be built and

run with the trailing doors open, as per prototype. The front doors were only used prewar. Note that the centre entrance *Cissie* prototype (also from Tower) never received a plough carrier, and so was unable to run on conduit track.

For Els I use the small four-wheel mechanisms from the erstwhile Bachmann Underground Emie track inspection trolley. The wheelbase matches the inner axles of the two bogies. I glue a dummy 'wheel' inside the bogie frames where the outer axles should be. For the Felthams, I use a longer Tenshodo SPUD unit in similar fashion.

#### Conclusion

I'm very happy with the way the layout has come together. Although the location is fictional, the ingredients are drawn from fact. A few ongoing scenic changes have been made, but the design has proved satisfactory.

#### **Kingsway Models**

## Lower Exbury Photography by Steve Flint

Having acquired a small 4mm scale quayside layout from a fellow exhibitor on the show circuit, ALISON BARKER of the Southampton MRS decided it needed a small splash of colour to set off the muted 1950s tones. So with the serendipitous assistance of Modelu at a recent South Hants MRS show, a period version of herself 76 times smaller was created by scanning and 3D printing!

first saw Lower Exbury at the Wells exhibition in August seven years ago. The 4mm scale creation was constructed by Jo Palmer in response to Chris Challis's Scalefour Southwest P4 Layout Challenge, set in 2009 to build a layout to show at Railwells in 2011. With only two years to design and complete it to the standard expected Jo, who freely confessed to little model making experience, took the advice, mentoring and assistance offered by more knowledgeable friends and family, keeping both the track plan and construction methods as simple as possible.

My husband David and I saw it in Wells, were taken by the charms of Lower Exbury and, being involved with the organisation of the Southampton Model Railway Exhibition, immediately asked Jo to bring it over from Teignmouth to the SMRS show in Eastleigh the following year, where it turned out to be a strong contender to win the Best Layout award.

Fast-forward a few years to September 2015; we visited Scaleforum at the Stoke Mandeville Stadium in Buckinghamshire and imagine my surprise when I saw a sign indicating that Lower Exbury was for sale! Having bought David a privately-owned OO gauge engine shed layout for one of his big-number birthdays the previous year, a few (less than subtle) hints were dropped. Contact was made with Jo in the hope that Dave could buy me a suitably retaliatory gift for an upcoming big birthday too! She explained that with the continuing growth of

her picture-framing business in Devon and her expanding involvement in the industry trade body, she was regrettably unable to commit ahead to the weekends her exhibition layout's bookings deserved. A favourable deal was negotiated within days and delivery arranged a couple of months later, enabling me to take over officially as custodian of Lower Exbury from the end of December 2015.

#### Around the layout

Set at the end of July 1952 and inspired by the New Forest village of Exbury (just over the Southampton Water from my home town), it is a terminus of the fictitious and declining South Hampshire Light Railway, but had been reinvigorated by its military







importance to the D-Day preparations. We decided that the Light Railway had been nationalised in 1948 and would now be part of British Railways Southern Region. However due to being fairly remote from authority, the locomotives and stock may have changed but working practices remained much as before.

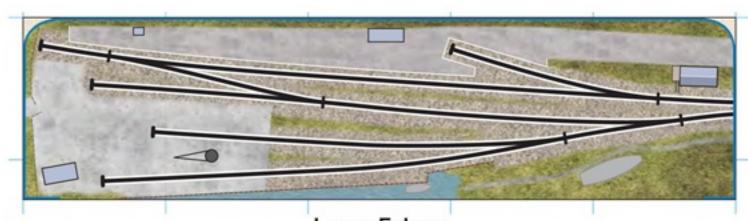
I enjoyed the decaying remnants of World War II, the muted colourations and associated atmosphere of a backwater branch line. However, I could see the potential of adding splashes of colour to draw the viewer's eye across the narrow baseboard, making the perceived depth look greater. I didn't think it was necessary to make any major physical alterations to the diorama - other than little details to help place the period being depicted.

For example, the classic Oxford Diecast model of Ivo Peters' 1951 Bentley MkVI in midnight blue (complete with the correct registration number NHY 581) is adding

more weathered colour, parked at the back of the layout. This is on the understanding that the great railway photographer bought the specific vehicle earlier than is known he did and had driven it out of his beloved Somerset to this quiet corner of England to take some pictures or ciné film.

The South Hants MRC (organisers of the Portsmouth Exhibition) had already expressed great interest in the layout and invited me to take it to their one-day show in November 2016. I then decided to make a real impact for my first outing as the new owner and a thought came into my head perhaps with the placement of another figure on Lower Exbury's platform, prominently standing outside the waiting shelter?



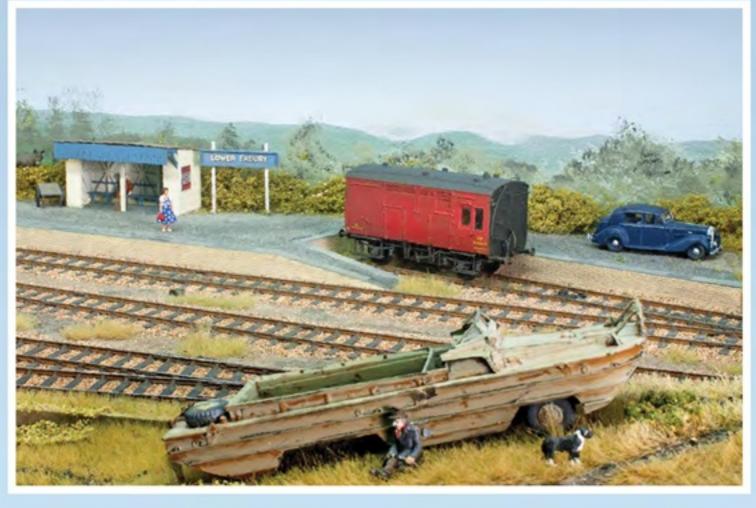

#### **Exaggerated wavy hairdo**

Having been impressed by the 3D body scanning and scale printing work done by Modelu at various exhibitions, I was delighted to discover the South Hants boys had also booked the (then Welsh-based) company. After arranging to meet with proprietor Alan Buttler again, my idea began to become a distinct possibility!

I visited a local fancy dress and costume shop to explain the reason and (much to the owner's amusement) arranged to hire an ideal 1950s-style polka-dotted, halterneck frock for the few days either side of Saturday 19 November 2016. It came with a bolero jacket plus underskirts and belt, enabling me to arrive the following morning dressed in



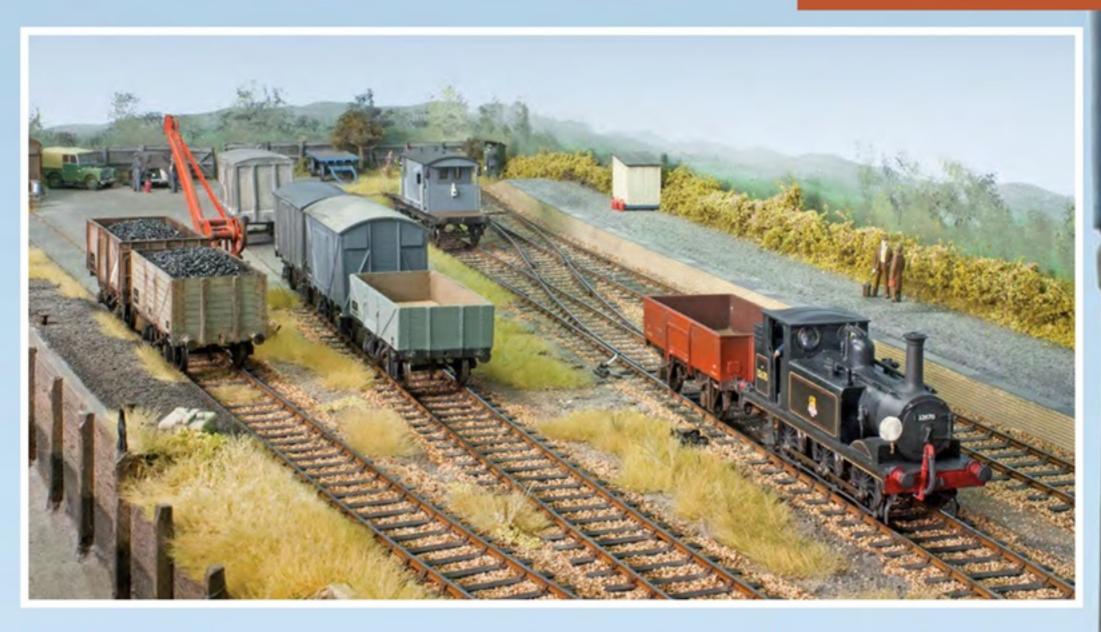
Having been scanned by Modelu before the show opened, Alison poses with the layout at the Portsmouth show, 17 November 2016. Photograph: David Barker

the full outfit, as *Lower Exbury* had been set up in the Portsmouth exhibition venue on the Friday night. I only needed the addition of a period handbag temporarily borrowed from a friend of mine, as I already owned a suitable pair of white stiletto shoes. The 3D scan was completed before the public arrived, and I then operated my layout in full costume!

For the original scanning of the 'Fifties Female', I had also arranged for an exaggerated wavy hairdo to make painting of the model figure as easy as possible in ▲ Highlighting the post D-Day relics that survive in the area, a US Army DUKW has been abandoned just above the high-tide line. A local tramp and his dog take a rest...

whichever scales were printed. This was a good thing, as David even took up the challenge of finishing a 4mm version of his wife (as photographed at the time of scanning – complete with polka dots on the dress...) to stand on the platform, waiting for a train. He is also threatening to acquire more 4mm scale models and to paint me as a blonde waiting at a bus stop on his own layout, if not another (redhead?) on the street corner! However, he does admit that those dots are unfortunately not to P4 standards!





#### **Tramps and DUKWs**

A different form of personalisation came about while exhibiting *Lower Exbury* at the Liverpool show in April 2018. Wanting to reduce the number of operating assistants travelling from southern England, I invited my friend Perry to join the team, as he is a Merseyside resident. He was a fireman during my volunteering days on the Talyllyn Railway when I was a guard in the 1980s. He mentioned that his

Crwydryn meaning 'one who wanders' – then reversed back into English as 'Tramp'! So, given the presence of a certain dishevelled and unnamed character leaning against the dead DUKW (1942 designed, utility/amphibious all-six-wheel-drive landing craft with two powered rear axles, or 'duck') – well, I'll leave the rest to you...

The daily goods at Lower Exbury is shunted by Class A1X 0-6-0T (Terrier)
No.32670, a detailed and modified Hornby body on a Branchlines chassis, with Alan Gibson wheels, a Mashima motor and High Level gearbox. Most of the wagons are compensated or sprung, but a few have rigid chassis.

#### Parallel future

After deciding to operate some suitable Great Western motive power and stock occasionally, there is another angle of *Lower Exbury* that I am pursuing for a parallel future. When looking carefully at an Ordnance Survey map, we found the wonderful name of Splatt Bridge over the Gloucester & Sharpness Canal – which is far too good to ignore! So I invented Splatt Quay, situated just to the west of Splatt Bridge alongside the River Severn and a history of what might

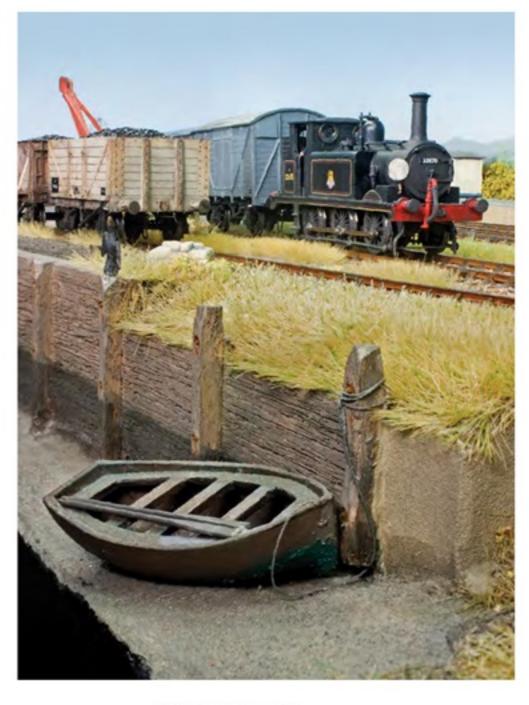

#### 'Fifties Fella'?

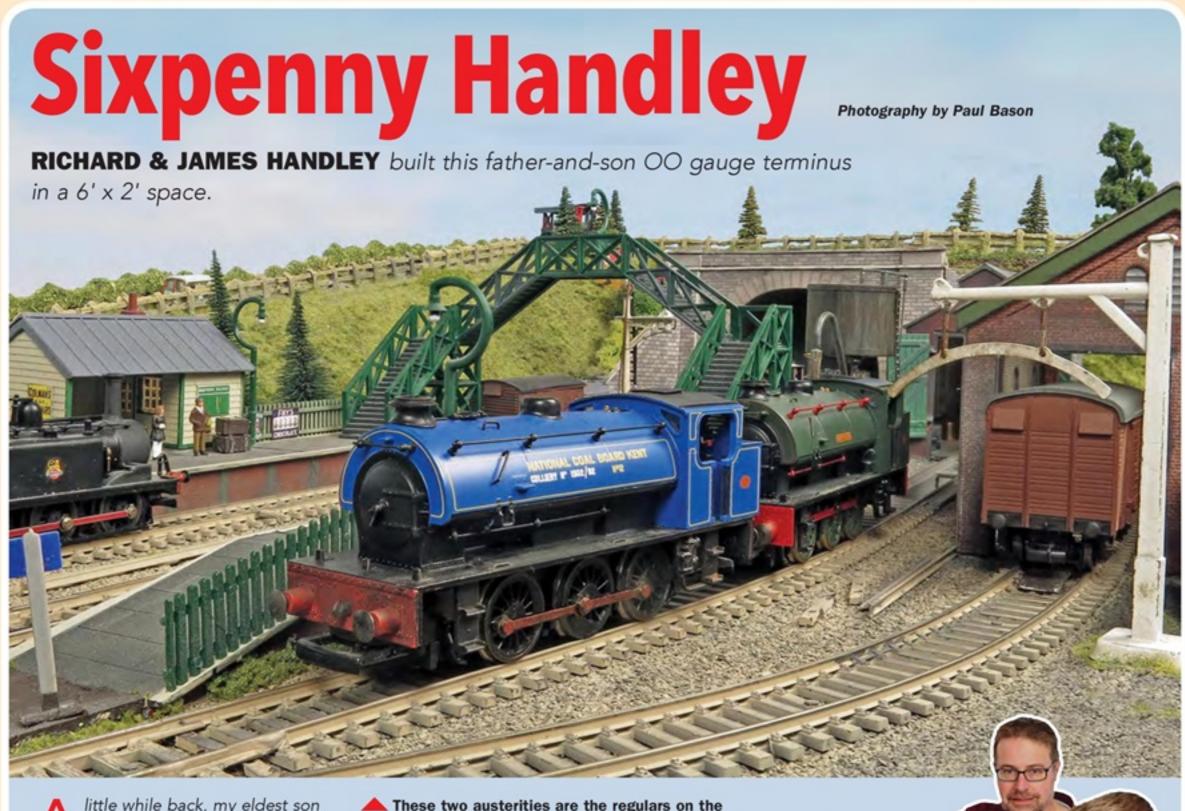

little while back, my eldest son and I decided to have a go at building a small layout, something that might fit in his bedroom. We're a family of six – Richard (me), modelling enthusiast; Claire, my very patient wife and Finance Director; eldest son James; daughter Nerissa; and twin sons Silas and

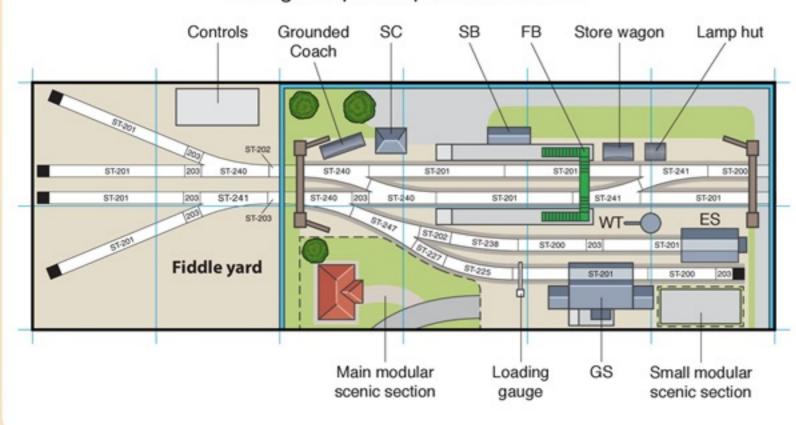
Nathanael. Family life is busy so it's a bit of a treat to be able to steal away and work on a modelling project, and also something with the kids that's away from the inevitable TV/Xbox/mobile phone!

We named our layout Sixpenny Handley, and thus began our journey of creating a small layout for exhibitions. Sixpenny Handley is a village in north-east Dorset; it seemed a very apt name for our little layout –

Handley being our surname and Sixpenny as the budget was very small.

#### CONSTRUCTION

The inspiration for what would become Sixpenny Handley was a layout we saw at a visit with the kids to the Kettering MRC show in 2016. James was very impressed with Two Sisters Farm by Peter Marshall (RM April 2009) and really wanted to build something

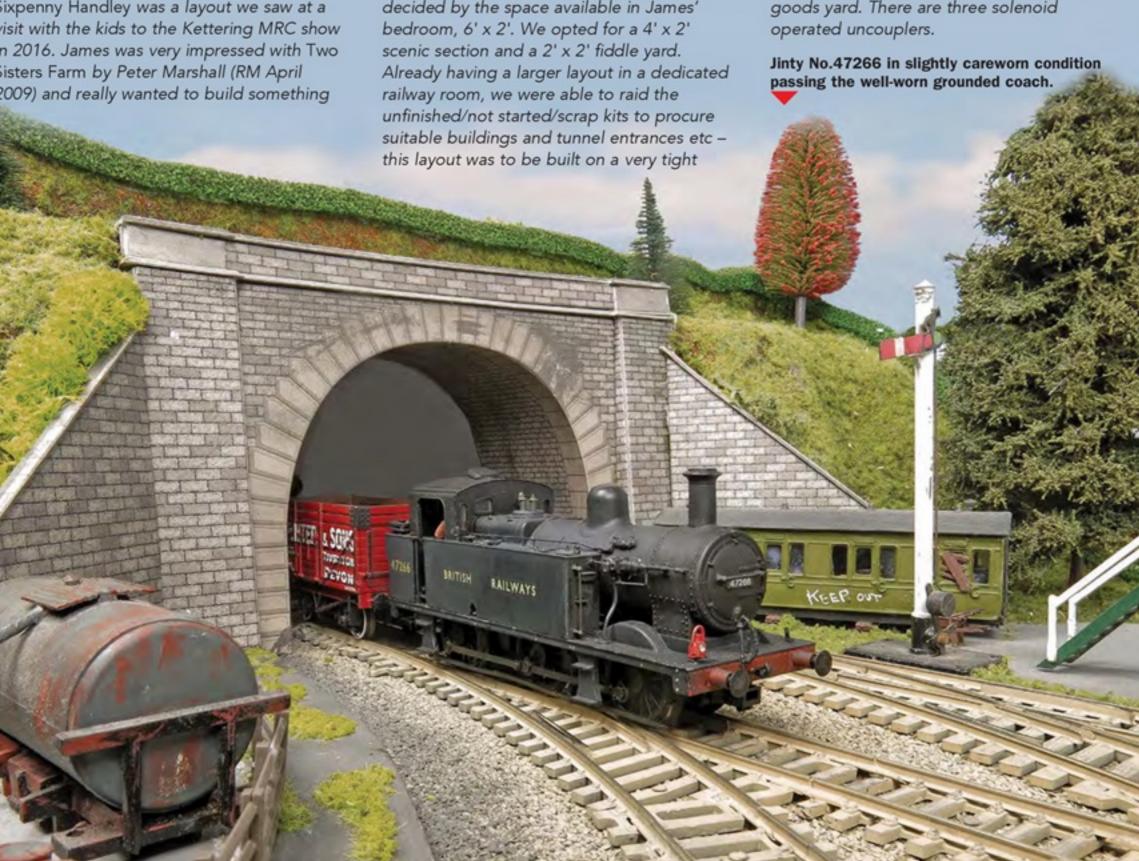
he could exhibit himself. Having mused on it for a while, and having fortuitously picked up a selection of second-hand points from my local model shop, we decided to make a start. The overall size of the layout was decided by the space available in James' bedroom, 6' x 2'. We opted for a 4' x 2' scenic section and a 2' x 2' fiddle yard. Already having a larger layout in a dedicated railway room, we were able to raid the unfinished/not started/scrap kits to procure suitable buildings and tunnel entrances etc this layout was to be built on a very tight

budget agreed in advance with our Finance Director and would use as much recycled stuff as possible.

Firstly we built the standard type of baseboards and set up three basic 'Workmate type' legs, then we were able to use paper templates to figure out a track plan that would fit and work. Now you might think this modus operandi was a backward way of working but actually being able to see the layout ideas full size was such a help in making the final decision. James spent a good amount of time playing trains to figure out what did and didn't work.

Once the idea for the look of the layout was settled we laid the track on ballast mat and sprayed it to weather it down. We opted not to ballast the track and overall I think this was a good decision given the crumbly nature of ballast. Sixpenny Handley is often in storage and has travelled around a lot already so the less that can fall off the better!

Point control was copied from Two Sisters Farm and is operated by metal rods - simple but cheap and effective on a small layout. Control is analogue. DCC is good but already having a couple of controllers in stock meant no extra cost. Simply wired up, one controller operates the station line and the other the goods yard. There are three solenoid



#### ROLLING STOCK

We have a stable of small 0-6-0 tank engines; the size of the layout and the sharp radius points on the run-round loop mean large engines don't fit in well. We have three Bachmann Jinty engines, SDJR Nos.23 and 24 and British Railways No.47266. Two Dapol Terriers, Boxhill and 32650, have been rewheeled and run very well considering their age. Three Hornby austerities work the goods yard - not exactly prototypically correct but they add some colour to proceedings. The most used loco on the main line is the GNSR-livery pannier tank (a model of the real thing used in The Railway Children), really popular with exhibition audiences and a super reliable engine. We also have Thomas, Percy and Stepney, characters from the Thomas the Tank Engine books. Coaches are Ratio four-wheel kits painted in SDJR and Southern Railway colours using Pressfix transfers to detail. We have also used this same technique on a Dapol non-gangwayed coach. As lovely as the new range of Southern coaches from the R-T-R suppliers are, they are still way out of our budget. We make do and mend! Various trucks are used with appropriate loads for the changeable scenery. SR cattle wagons are still on the wish list.

At exhibitions we try and stick to a scheduled running order. The exception to this is when younger visitors are watching, when Thomas, Percy and Stepney may make a surprise appearance.

#### INTERCHANGEABLE SECTIONS

At exhibitions many people comment favourably on our transposable scenic sections. The idea for these came about quite by chance. James had developed a list of scenes/buildings he really wanted to have on the layout, but actually bringing these ideas into reality was like trying to get a quart into a pint pot. We had an odd-shaped area at the front of the layout that we couldn't decide what to do with, and we were also becoming a slightly obsessed and unsociable!

We had some of the ply left over from the backscene, which meant we were able to cut a board to fit the space. Making a scene on the smaller board was much easier, and it also brought us back to the kitchen table to work in the throng of family life, which was a refreshing change of scene. James soon had an excellent eureka moment. He suggested we could make several small boards to fit in the odd shape and swap them around. Thus the 'house', 'farm' and 'garage' boards were built. After Sixpenny Handley's first show at Rushden 2017, the layout and its interchangeable scenes were so well received we built a further three smaller versions for the other end of the layout over the winter -'crane yard', 'cattle dock' and 'provender store'. See the panel on page 1046 for full details of these.

Storage of the units takes up some extra space but being able to remove them from

the layout for transportation makes damage less likely. We also added lights using the Gaugemaster plug and go system. Careful siting of the lamp under the main scenic sections means the buildings are lit up through a hole in the underside of the boards.

#### OTHER BUILDINGS

A lot of enjoyment came from the detailing of the inside of the buildings – a pet hate of mine is looking at a model building on a layout and finding it has nothing on the inside, much like running engines with no crews. The goods sheds and offices are no exception – we had to add a door between the office and shed as it really bothered Silas that the door was on one side of the wall but not the other! It just wasn't logical! The signal box was built from the old Airfix kit and is also fully detailed inside with levers etc. I'm pleased to say Silas is happy with the detail we've put in.

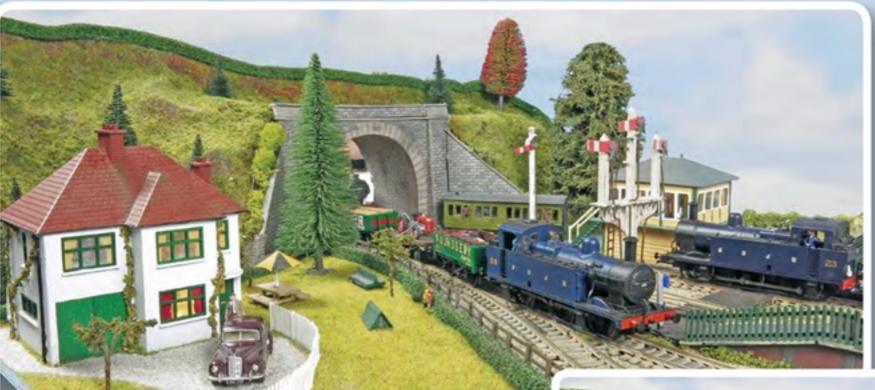
#### **FUTURE PLANS AND THANKS**

We are considering extending Sixpenny
Handley by adding a new second section on
the road bridge end. Our youngest,
Nathanael would really love this extension to
be a quarry spur off of the main line; we're in
the early planning stages, watch this space...

#### The house

The house is an Airfix kit from the 1960s. The scenery came from various suppliers and second-hand bins at our local model shops. We've had some (probably reasonable) comments that the house wouldn't be so close to the line, but we're granting ourselves a bit of cheeky licence for the sake of aesthetics!

#### The farm

The main barn structure on the farm came from a scrap box, we covered the damaged areas in grey paint, greenery and strategically-placed clutter. The bus is a Dinky toy; apart from adding corrugated iron to the windows it is pretty much exactly as I found it in the toyshop. Thomas the Tank Engine fans may recognise this scene is a little homage to Bulgy the Bus who, in the Thomas stories, hit a bridge and was turned into a chicken coop. The hay cart was adapted from a free market stall kit given away in RM. This is my (Richard's) favourite part of the layout.

#### Garage and yard

The garage is a Metcalfe kit slightly modified and weathered. The oil container out the back came from a Tri-ang milk truck. The coal area is made of card, cut and scored to look like planks and filled with coal loads.

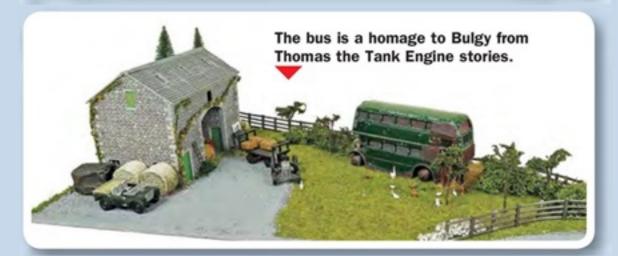
#### Crane yard

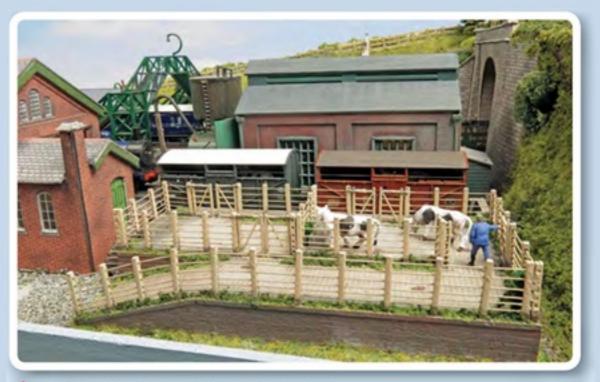
The crane yard platform is a cobbled together long station platform kit from the leftovers box, suitably weathered and overgrown. The



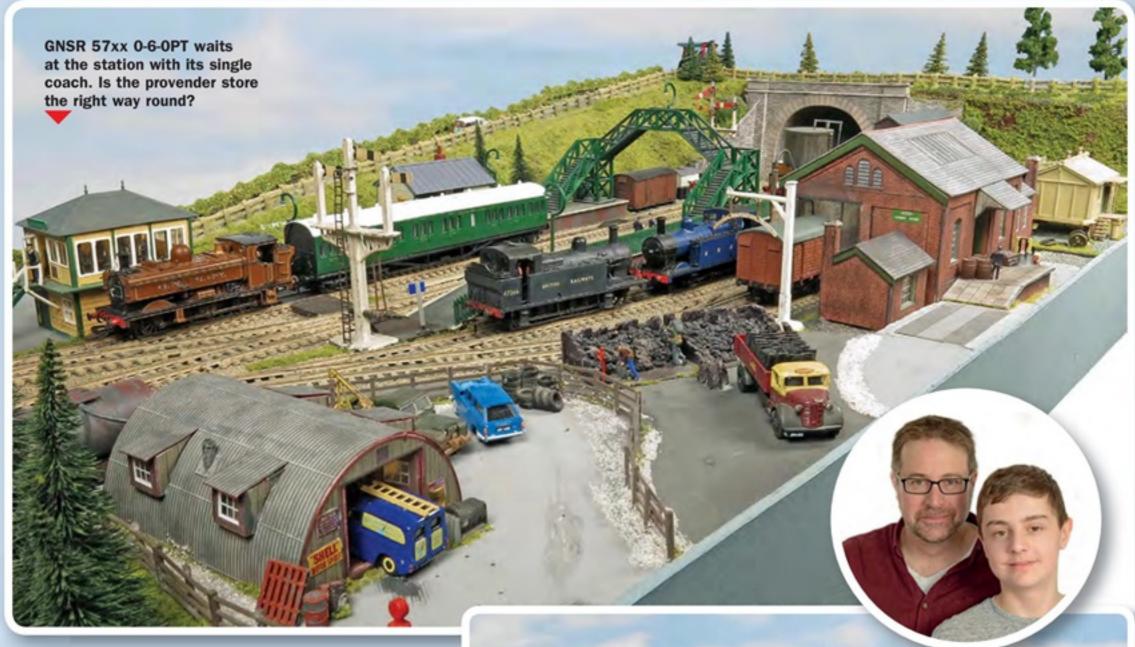

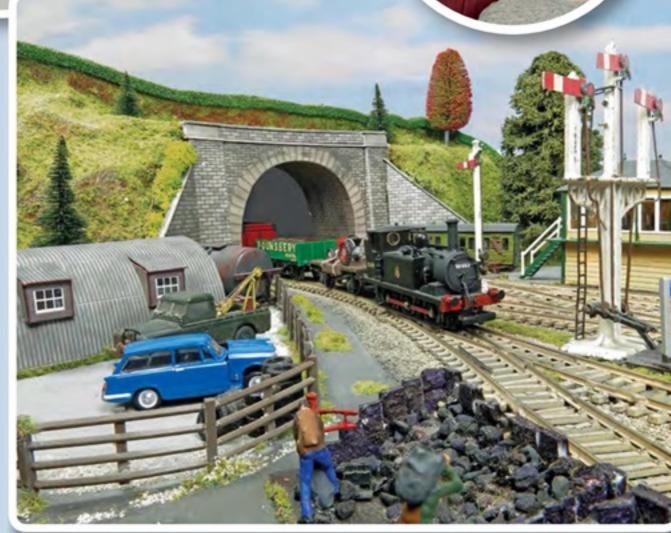
crane was originally posable but after the entire section was inadvertently whipped off the layout and smashed by an enthusiastic cardigan sleeve it is now fixed in place!

#### Cattle dock

One of the few new items bought for the layout and built last winter – and it was a very fiddly job! Bases for the smaller interchangeable sections were made from much thinner plastic, as we found the plywood just didn't look right and raised the structures too high up for the cattle trucks to unload.

#### Provender store

This also came to us ready-built but in need of major repairs. The store was originally fixed in the location the small scenic sections now fit in, but fell off after storing the layout on its side for some time; it then unfortunately became reattached to the backscene. The eagle-eyed may see that the board has been put into position the wrong way round in the photo (top right) – the only disadvantage of movable sections.

## How to build your free kit

Ratio Plastic Models. **CRAIG TILEY** demonstrates how to build and paint your grounded van body, which is ideal for anyone wanting to try their hand at plastic kit construction for the first time.

our free grounded van body kit utilises mouldings from the Ratio GWR 12Ton Ventilated Van
kit, the prototypes of which were built in their
thousands between 1933 and 1945. Many of these
vehicles ended up as grounded van bodies in farmers' fields and yards around the country, examples of
which can still be found today – if you know where
to look!

The completed model can make for an interesting scenic addition on almost any layout – from the late steam era through to the present day. It could be used in an agricultural setting to provide shelter for livestock, or as a means of covered storage in a scrapyard or railway goods yard. [We welcome pictures from readers showing imaginative or unusual applications of their free kit – Ed.]

The model also presents a straightforward project for a first attempt at plastic kit construction. Assembly requires a liquid polystyrene cement (such as Plastic Weld), together with just a few basic modelling tools; knife, file, metal rule and fine brush (to apply the solvent). A suitable work surface (such as a cutting mat) is also recommended. If you don't already own these items, then they are worth investing in because they are useful to have for a whole host of modelling projects.

With almost none of its wooden planking remaining, the shell of this BR 12T van (a different prototype to that represented with the kit) still survives in a field in Somerset. All photography by the author





#### How to build your kit





Exclusive to readers of

The kit only has five parts, so it makes sense to cut them all off the sprue in one go before starting assembly. To achieve each cut, rock the blade whilst applying gentle, even pressure – don't use lots of downward force to try and cut through in one go.



Some flash (waste plastic) will remain on the parts from where they were attached to the sprue. To remove this, use a flat file as illustrated. Don't be too over-exuberant as this risks damaging the parts; work slowly and check the part frequently. Fine grade sandpaper is also useful for cleaning the edges of parts.



Start assembly by joining one of the ends to one of the sides. Hold the two pieces together and then run a small amount of solvent along the inside of the join, as illustrated; capillary action will draw it into the join. Hold the parts for a further 20 seconds to give the solvent chance to harden sufficiently.



The other side and end are then attached to complete the basic van body structure. If you don't have an engineer's square, then the grid on a cutting mat is useful for visually checking that the body has been assembled square (as pictured).



To attach the roof, this part is placed upside down on the work surface. The body is then placed on top, judging by eye an equal overhang on all four sides. Hold the body in position against the roof and then run solvent around the inside edges.



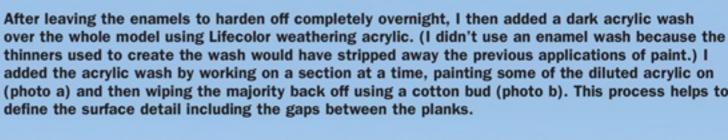
To represent the solebars, two lengths of 1mm styrene are cut (measuring 67mm x 3mm) and fixed against the rebates that run along the lower inside edges of the sides. These are optional additions; the gap beneath the body could instead be disguised behind grass/foliage.

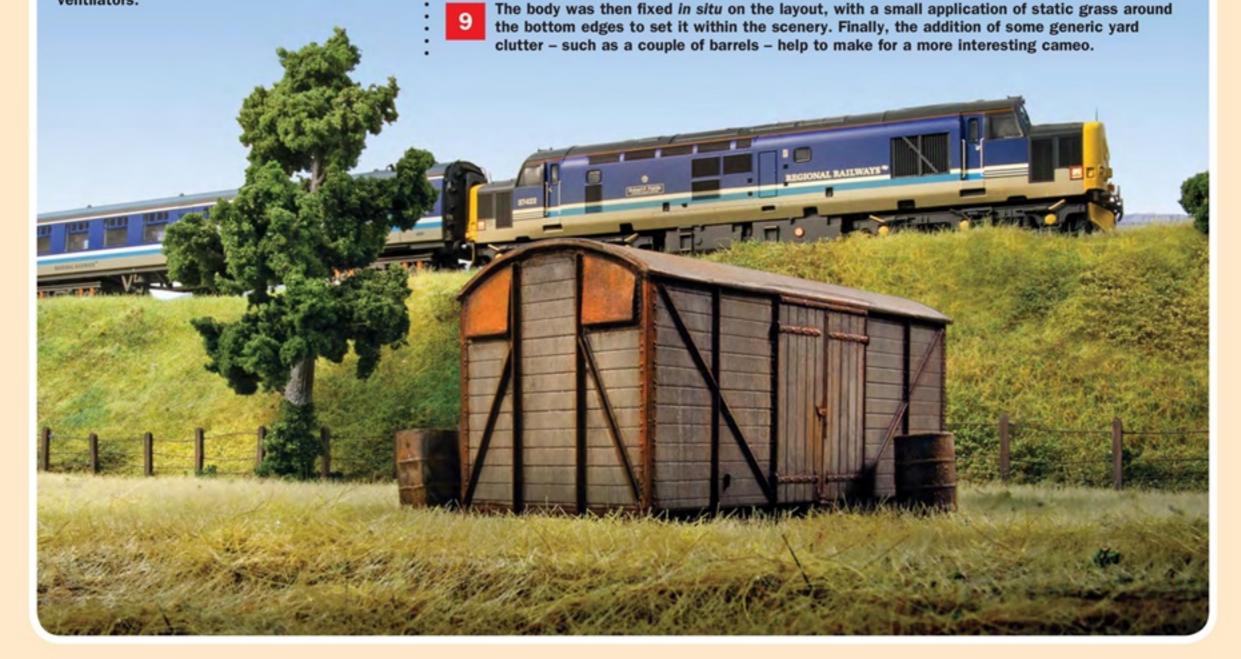


I chose to replicate an example that had been subject to the ravages of the British weather and had completely lost its railway livery. Firstly I mixed a light grey colour using Humbrol enamels to simulate the bare wood of the planking on the sides and ends. Then a rust colour was mixed to pick out the metal strapping, headstocks, solebars, and end ventilators.

# Custom transfers for a TV star!

**CRAIG TILEY** enlisted the services of a specialist transfer supplier to prepare a Homby Class 800 for its starring role in the grand final of The Great Model Railway Challenge.

Riday evenings to watch The Great Model Railway Challenge on Channel 5, may have caught glimpses of a Hornby Class 800 sporting TGMRC branding that features in the introduction sequence of each episode. The model will, in fact, feature prominently in the grand final of the series – scheduled for transmission on Friday 9 November, the day after this issue officially goes on sale.

RAILWAY MODELLER was asked earlier in the year to prepare a 'star train' for the final as part of the magazine's support for the TV show. Following discussions with the production company, the recently-released Hornby bi-mode Hitachi Class 800 IEP was chosen to reflect the latest rail traction that can be seen on Britain's rail network.

Rather than simply run the Hornby model 'as supplied' it was decided to reinforce its starring role in the final by applying transfers of the TV show logo. There are several suppliers who can supply custom decals, including Railtec Transfers. See the website for more details about this firm's custom transfer service:

#### Preparing the model



I was able to supply Steve Bell at Railtec with a high resolution version of the logo, requesting that it be reproduced on the transfers without the black edge around the outside. The transfers needed to be exactly 24mm wide to fit the intended locations on the model and a set of 12 was required in total; the logos being applied to all vehicles in the five-car unit.



The waterslide transfers were easy to apply; after soaking in water for a minute or so, the transfer was coaxed away from its backing sheet with a fine brush (as pictured). The blunted point of a cocktail stick was then used to make minor corrections to the positioning before using tissue to dab away any excess water around the transfer.



With all of the transfers applied, each was treated to a light pass of clear varnish from an aerosol to secure them in place and protect them from disturbance as a result of the models being handled. (The glazing was masked off when the varnish was being applied.)

# The Warley Show story

or many years the Warley Model Railway
Club held an annual exhibition at the Harry Mitchell Recreation Centre in Smethwick, in the Birmingham suburbs. It was well respected, well attended and made a useful contribution to club funds; in other words we were doing quite nicely. I was the trade officer for this show.

#### Why move?

The decision to move our show to the NEC was a very big one. The main reason for a move to the NEC related to the state of the hobby in the early 1990s. There were no really big shows around then, and it felt as if the hobby was on the wane. Paul Jones, our exhibition manager, wanted to put on a grand event as a showcase for the whole hobby and demonstrate that it was still very much alive and well. The exhibition committee were right behind Paul once they had recovered from the initial shock!

Looking back from where the Warley NEC exhibition is today, it is hard to understand what a big risk that first show was. In order to protect the club, the Warley NEC exhibition has always been operated by a limited company, wholly owned by the club. It has no employees and all profits are donated to Warley Model Railway Club funds.

#### It could not have happened without the full support of traders

The club had been prudent in order to ensure it had as much cash in the bank as possible but this was nowhere near enough to fund the cost of hiring a hall at the NEC. The solution was found from two sources. First of all Peco, Bachmann and Midland Counties Publications kindly agreed to

sponsor the show. Secondly we agreed that we would have to ask trade exhibitors for full payment for space in advance, so that we could make payment to the NEC for the hall in advance too.

Nearly all the traders who took space at the Harry Mitchell Centre show were happy to move with us to the NEC but that was well below the number needed for even the smallest hall at the NEC.

We drafted an invitation letter explaining what we were doing and sent it to all the relevant advertisers in RM and received sufficient positive responses for us to

proceed. Warley MRC is most grateful for the traders' support at this first show. It could not have happened without them.

#### The first NEC show

After much work by everyone we finally got to setting up the first NEC show. We knew how

many visitors we needed to break even but we had no way of knowing whether enough would come. This would be our first and only show at the NEC if we didn't get sufficient people through the door. The event was of course a great success and so we decided to do it all again the following year. The club view was that if it all went well, we might do up to 10 annual shows at the NEC.

#### The years that followed

It was only after the third show, I think, that it dawned on the club that the NEC show was likely to be a long-term success and that it would have a big effect on our club.

That we were able to purchase our own club rooms was only possible due to the overall success of the show.

It must be emphasised that the show is only financially viable because of the huge voluntary efforts (around 4,000 man hours) put in by so many people. The exhibitors who bring their layouts, the demonstrators, wives and partners of club members, members of other local clubs and many of

our friends all play an essential role; the show couldn't happen without them.

#### Managing the trade exhibitors

Something we had not anticipated was that our show would become a very important source of income for many of the trade proprietors. Word got around that sales were good, and in the years following the first show we had a very long waiting list of businesses wishing to join us.

Because the ethos was to put on a good balanced show, the proportion of trade to layouts, demos and societies has always

> been kept about the same. We could easily have had more traders and fewer layouts but that is not what the exhibition is about.

Most potential trade exhibitors were very patient and understood that we could not accommodate

them in those early years. We had a waiting list and tried to invite model railway businesses fairly from the waiting list. We also tried to keep the balance of types of trade exhibitor right; we like to have specialist suppliers as well as the bigger shops represented.

#### Show treasurer

After managing the trade in the early years, I looked after layout exhibitors' hotel bookings for a while, then took a break from the organising committee. I now act as treasurer for the show which is a never-ending all-year round job that takes up several hours each week. I do get a bit weary at times with the continuous flow of work but I am very happy to have been a part of the Warley NEC show right from the beginning. Moreover, it's thanks to all the visitors over the last 26 years that have helped make it a truly great event.

There is clearly an economic influence in the decisions for the leading R-T-R manufacturers to concentrate their marketing on the more affluent southern end of the country.

It seems that any obscure loco for southern buyers is fair game as long as it was seen somewhere in the Home Counties or in the great GWR rural terminus territory.

Southern Region suburban electrics have been given a fair run of late but in contrast, two of the absolute mainstays of later steam in the north and Midlands are treated with some contempt. I refer of course to the momentous work and reliability of the Black Fives and Black Eights.

We have seen the Midland Pullman and the Brighton Belle brought to modellers' tracks as landmark and historic services, but both running into London!

However, in the same era, a northern DMU fleet has been ignored but would be just as significant as

obscure GWR tank locos.

## The Art of Compromise

I've been interested in model railways (and the real thing) since my school days in the 1950s. Now in my 70s I still haven't built my dream branch line layout, preferring instead to pipedream.

I was greatly inspired by the Roy Link classic layout The Art of Compromise. Determined one day to build my version of it, I filed the page from the October 1978 RM.

It's a good thing I never did attempt to build it with the design flaws explained by Chis Ford in the October 2018 RM under the title Celebrating a Roy Link classic.

However, one of my favourite inspirational layouts over the years was Haven Road by T J B Pellow and published in the December 1984 RM under the sub-title Ludus 1 - the limits of compromise. A delightful, bucolic simplified version of the Isle of Wight Steam Railway's station at Haven Street, although an SE&CR P Class loco seems slightly out of place even in Southern livery, and the Hornby island Terriers, although more appropriate for this line, didn't have the extended bunker so unique to the IoW Railway.

Dapol\* has a 'correct' island Terrier but in O gauge, however, teaming up with Rails of Sheffield\* the firm hopes to produce all the Terrier variations including the loW version - in OO gauge (\*usual disclaimer).

# Scottish rearward-folding doors

In your review of the Class H2 Atlantic in the October issue you remarked on the style of 'suicide' tender doors folded back on the outside of the tender. This I believe was the standard method on most if not all cab doors on Caledonian locomotives.

#### STEVE PARSONS

There were well over 400 locomotives in the UK that had this style of doors, many of which survived to become British Railways property in 1948. Admittedly the vast majority of them were Scottish locos; however, the others were ex-LBSCR locos.

Apart from the H2 class, the five H1 Class 4-4-2s also had these doors, three of which survived until 1951.

At least one of the 25 B2x Class 4-4-0s had them, No.207, and there may have been others. All 33 B4 Class 4-4-0s had them according to the Brighton Works drawings. The 17 K Class 2-6-0s were fitted with outwardopening doors.

The Scottish locos were the Glasgow & South Western Railway Whitelegg

rebuilds of Hugh Smellie's 119 Class 4-4-0s; Drummond Class 131 and the rebuilds - Class 137 4-4-0s; Drummond Class 279 0-6-0s and his Class 16 2-6-0s.

Most Highland Railway tender engines had cab doors that opened outward: the Strath, Skye Bogie, Bruce, Loch, Big Ben and Small Ben 4-4-0s; Drummond's Castle I, II and III Class 4-6-0s and his Barney Class 0-6-0s; and the Jones Goods 4-6-0s.

The 'Caley' had a huge number of tender-engines with outward opening doors: the 4-2-2 Singles; the Oban Bogie 4-4-0s; Drummond 80 Class and Drummond/Lambie Class 66 4-4-0s; the Dunalastair 4-4-0s; the McIntosh Class 55, 908, 49 and 903 Cardean 4-6-0s, his Class 600 0-8-0s and Class 812 and 30 Class 0-6-0s. Finally we have the Drummond/Lambie/McIntosh 'Caley Jumbo' 0-6-0s of which over 200 became British Railways stock in 1948, and by the end of 1961 there were just over 100 still in service.

Not to mention the tanks so fitted...

# Products from long-gone firms

During my trawl through the odds boxes at shows and the stalls at swapmeets I have come across items from long-gone manufacturers, and wondered if any reader could shed any light on their products?

I have a couple of OO working yard cranes, manufactured by S&B Productions, London SE25. Both have been put to good use on my layout.

At a recent swapmeet I found a kit for a GWR 45T 'Crocodile H' Trolley Wagon. The kit consisted of a pair of very finely cast whitemetal sides and buffer beams with cast on buffers. The kit had been started and the floor etc was of thin plywood. There were no bogies but as I had a pair of K's GWR freight bogies in hand the £4 asked seemed worth it as it appeared to offer a reasonable wagon. It had been marketed by ARCO Supplies of Chipstead, Coulsdon, Surrey.

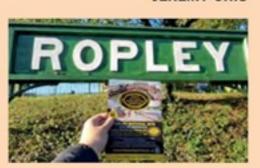

**GWR 61xx large Prairie** 

New for O gauge from Heljan

Heljan has delivered stocks of its first British outline O gauge steam locomotive model, which is based on the Great Western Railway '5101' Class of large Prairie 2-6-2Ts; a design first introduced in the early years of the 20th century by then-Chief Mechanical Engineer George Jackson Churchward but updated by Charles Collett in 1929. Our sample represents No.6144, of the uprated 61xx fleet of 70 locomotives introduced between 1931 and 1935 chiefly for suburban passenger work in the London area. They performed these duties admirably for nearly 30 years for most; the class was rendered extinct by the end of 1965 with the sole exception of No.6106, preserved at Didcot in the care of the Great Western Society.

First announced in our November 2015 issue, these models were originally forecast for a late 2016 release. However, delivery was ultimately a little over two years later than planned. Factory decorated samples were in fact displayed at the 2016 Warley show, but shortly after this Heljan chose to re-visit the tooling and undertake a number of revisions, including new coupled wheels with a reduced tyre depth. Pulling development of the model back contributed significantly to this resultant delay, but the finished model is definitely the better for it and certainly worth the longer wait.

The overall proportions of the real locomotives have been superbly captured by the manufacturer. Detailing is excellent throughout including fine representations of the bars on the rear cab windows, cylinder draincock

assemblies, lamp brackets and brake rigging. Also worthy of note are the grab handrails on the boiler top and conduit pipe that runs along the underside of the footplate valance on the driver's side (that carries the ATC electrics)

However, whilst the 'face' looks convincing, the BR smokebox numberplate (with printed numerals) is not set absolutely vertical on the door, which does detract ever so slightly. Another very minor observation concerns the wheel guards, which look distinctly undernourished in comparison to those on the prototype.

The austere plain black livery (which is painted on – the parts are moulded in green plastic) is offset with neat applications of the large early BR emblems and blue route/tractive effort discs. Cabside plates have raised beading with printed numerals. Incidentally, our sample (presented as No.6144) has inadvertently been fitted with a No.6132 cabside plate on the fireman's side. However, we are advised that this is likely to be an error specific to our sample.

All buffers and coupling hooks are sprung, whilst the screw-links are fully-working replicas. Cab detailing is excellent, with a plethora of separate detail fittings, all picked out in suitable colours. There is even a subtle firebox flicker effect (on permanently in 12V analogue, switchable on/off with DCC).

The model is powered by a large fivepole flywheel-fitted motor driving the rear driving axle, with pick-ups from all driving wheels. Construction of the superstructure is plastic for the mostpart (including the running plate), hence the large casting inside the tanks that provides additional weight over the coupled wheels to increase traction. Weighing in at just over 1.5kg, the model has more than enough 'grunt' to haul the lengths of trains that most modellers will expect from it. The manufacturer advises that the model has been tested on Peco Setrack curves (radius 1028mm).

On the prototypes the rear pony wheelset is actually a radial truck, but Heljan has represented this on the model with a conventional pivoted pony truck arrangement, presumably to enable the model's use around tighter curves. Viewed with the model on the track, this arrangement is disguised by a convincing representation of the rear mainframe sections. Both the front and rear pony trucks are sprung (both laterally and vertically) and are supplied unattached in the box to be fitted to the model by the purchaser.

Separate accessories supplied with the model include vacuum pipes, steam heat pipes, fire irons and cylinder inserts. Usefully, spares are provided for each of the pipes, to allow for loss or breakage. We fitted some items for photography, although it is advised that the cylinder inserts should only be fitted if the model is being operated on curves with large radii; they are liable to interfere with the movement of the front pony truck on tight curves.

The model is supplied ready for 12V dc analogue operation. However, there is provision for DCC sound installation with the factory-fitted ESU pin-connector adapter (ref.51959) located inside the smokebox/boiler moulding; the attached analogue PCB can be exchanged for an ESU Loksound L4.0





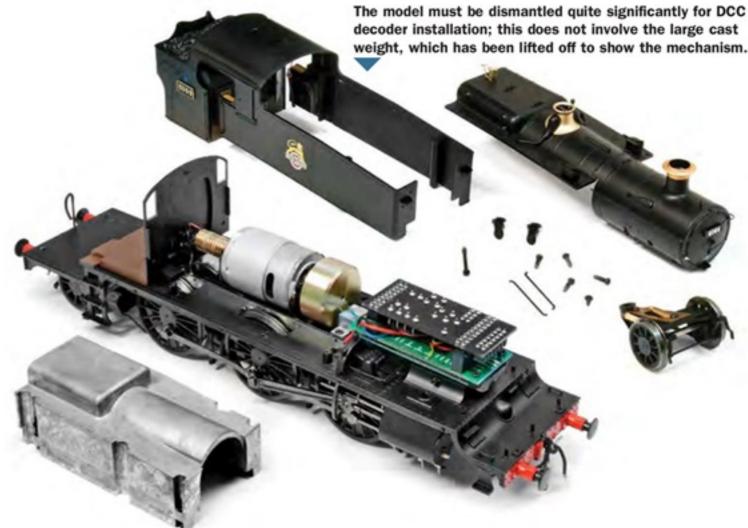

decoder (which needs to be obtained separately by the purchaser). To facilitate the sound installation, a chamber has been engineered into the underside of the chassis to accommodate a speaker; removal of the cover plate reveals a 24mm diameter cavity (approximately 10mm deep) with wiring ready for connecting to a suitable speaker.

If an alternative DCC decoder (such as a non-sound item) is to be used, then the manufacturer advises that this will have to be hard-wired to the pin-connector adapter. However, it is understood that a non-sound decoder is being developed by ESU to fit the factory-fitted pin-connector.

Whilst this provision for DCC sound is commendable, installation is far from straightforward, requiring significant dismantling of the model to access the pin-connector adapter. Firstly there are four screws holding the bunker/cab/tank assembly that need to be removed, followed by a fifth screw that retains the front pony truck, and then a bolt that is subsequently revealed that holds the smokebox to the chassis. Next, the handrails on either side of the boiler need easing away from the tank fronts to enable the bunker/cab/tank assembly to be released. The smokebox/boiler/firebox

assembly then needs to be removed, after first unclipping the two smokebox steam pipes and pair of stays that run between the smokebox and front footplate section. Sliding the smokebox/boiler/firebox assembly forwards off the model, the pin-connector adapter is finally revealed.

Reassembly is effectively the above sequence in reverse, but extreme care is needed to ensure details are not damaged when handling the model, and parts do not become distorted by over tightening the retaining screws. It was found that the steam pipes are best refitted by engaging the lugs on the footplate ends of the parts first.

Likewise, the stays are best reattached by locating the footplate ends first.

It cannot be understated that this procedure requires a level of care and dexterity if performed by the purchaser of this locomotive. Alternatively, decoder installation could be outsourced to a firm or individual that offers such services professionally.

Notwithstanding the above, this is a very worthy first steam outline model from this Danish manufacturer.

# LNER Toad E brake van amongst new releases from Hornby



'Fifteen Guinea Special' train pack

On the Grouping in 1923 the LNER inherited a wide variety of goods brake vans, and almost immediately set about replacing life-expired examples with new builds. Over the next decade well over 1500 20T vans, 19' in length over body and on a 10'6" wheelbase, were built by company workshops and private builders alike. Initially with wooden duckets (and given the telegraphic code TOAD B), those built from 1930 onwards had steel duckets, and the code TOAD E. Hornby has delivered on its promise to model both in OO; the latter is pictured, in unfitted BR grey livery. It's spot-on compared to published drawings and dimensions, and features very fine rivet work. The works plate is legible under magnification, which marks the model as representing one of the batch of 162 built in 1934 by Shildon (as per our sample) and Faverdale. The underside features full chassis ribbing, and brake shoes in line with the 00 wheelsets. Slimline tension-lock couplers are clipped into NEM pockets on mountings able to self-centre thanks to 'tails' made from springy engineering plastic. In short, an excellent new release for the LNER/BR Eastern Region modeller.

Hornby has commemorated the end of main line steam on BR half a century ago this last August with the release of a 'Fifteen Guinea Special' train pack. The collection consists of BR Class 7 Britannia Pacific No.70013 Oliver Cromwell, a maroon BSO and two blue & grey TSOs. The coaches are numbered to reflect the real participants and have BR1 or Commonwealth bogies as appropriate - but they do not represent the first (or last) three coaches in the formation, as two full kitchen cars were third in line both ways. (Interestingly, both end coaches were maroon BSOs.) The inclusion of the Pacific means the pack represents 1T57 on its northbound run, specifically from Manchester Victoria to Carlisle. The set is an attractive representation of a momentous 11 August 1968.

Other recent releases from Hornby include ex-LMS rebuilt Patriot 4-6-0 No.45534 E Tootal Broadhurst in early BR finish, with 8A Liverpool Edge Hill plate, reflecting the locomotive's nine-year stay in the city from November 1951. It was the third machine to carry the name of the former LNWR director (after Claughton No.856 and sister Patriot 5525); withdrawal came in May 1964. The model is identical to its stablemate of a decade ago (see Reviews, September 2008), with ample fine detail fitted and supplied in the parts bag. The 8-pin socket and blank-

ing plug for DCC use is to be found in the tender, where there is also space for a speaker if desired. Some of the fine detail will be specific to layout curvature – cylinder drain cocks for example – for which the minimum quoted radius is 25". The tender drawbar can be brought closer to the rear of the engine, and the 'plug-in' wiring loom is factory-inserted to the underside of the tender.

Also making a welcome return to the range is the Devon Belle Pullman observation car, last seen in the June 2011 RM. The latest version adds warm yellow internal lighting; given that the USP of Homby Pullman cars is the fine lighting, the omission of it from this model was odd – especially if the car was being run in a train after dark.

The Railroad range of budget-priced models from long-established tooling sees the return of the Great Western 14xx as No.1424 with late crest. The open-frame motor and traction tyres may be 'old school', but the model will delight many nevertheless. No provision for DCC (other than wiring one in yourself) is present.

Finally, there is a triple pack of the

long-standing LMS 57' gangwayed coaches, smartly lined out once more in the striped livery of the LMS's crack express – The Coronation Scot – just in time for the Christmas present-buying season. Two corridor firsts and a corridor brake third make up the set.

# Former exclusives join mainstream Bachmann range

A couple of items that were commissioned by retailers as exclusive items have now joined the mainstream Bachmann range in new identities, along with a brand new tooling container.

The Great Northern 4-4-2 was released as National Collection preserved machine No.251 as a commission for Locomotionmodels.com (see Reviews, June 2015). Now it is available as classmate No.272, the second one built, in GN finish as outshopped in 1904; it lasted in traffic until August 1947, thus escaping being nationalised. The livery, whilst attractive, boxes it into something of a corner when it comes to ready-to-run coaching stock to pull, something that does not befall its stablemate available in LNER apple green (ref.31-762).

The locomotive is fully up to the standards of its predecessor; it is a smooth runner, and has a 21-pin socket and blanking plug in the tender. A can-type motor drives the leading coupled axle via a gear train.

Detail parts supplied for the purchaser to install – layout curvature permitting – include brake pull rods, buffer beam pipes, guard irons, cylin-



der drain cocks, cab doors and more.

We last saw the BR Mk.I horse boxes – commissioned by TMC – in October 2014. Versions are now available from Bachmann including SR green, with the branding NOT TO WORK BETWEEN TONBRIDGE AND BATTLE – a reference to the Hastings route that barred all but Restriction O rolling stock due to the tight clearances.

Finally, Bachmann has gone back in time from its Freightliner flats and containers (see last month) to the designs' immediate predecessors, the type BA containers of 1961. Intended for the Speedfreight services, the alloy containers featured sliding side doors and vents along both sides (two towards the door end, singles towards the fixed end both sides). They were secured to the container flats by Freightliner-style pins and sockets, not the chains and shackles of traditional containers. The model is finely moulded with much detail, and the lettering is first class.

# **Revolution Trains releases IZA twin-unit Cargowaggons**

N

Revolution Trains has delivered on its latest wagon project, the Cargowaggon twin wagons announced last year (see news, September 2017).

The real things date from the mid-1980s, and are used to carry goods including bagged cement and mineral water. All the nearly-200 vehicles remain in traffic, and have carried the original and later Cargowaggon schemes, plus branded for customers such as Perrier.

The models are supplied with standard N gauge couplings on the outer ends, and drawbars on the inner. Both halves are so equipped, so one of the drawbars must be removed (with extreme care) before the combination can be coupled together. Each wagon weighs 18g for optimum trackholding, but the long fixed wheelbases might cause drag on curvature sharper than 12": the weights can be unscrewed if necessary, the bodies being easily removed to allow this.

Liveries are excellently applied: examples we have seen represent the original and revised (pictured) Cargowaggon scheme. Versions are available with flashing rear lights factory-fitted, activated by a switch on the underside of the vehicle. (Batteries are ready-fitted too.)

Detail parts – brake pipes – for the purchaser to fit are included in the smart plastic packaging with card sleeve to hold the halves together.

Although Revolution Trains has sold out of the models, stocks may still be available at the firm's retailers such as Cheltemham Model Centre, C&M Models of Carlisle, Osborns Models in Bideford and Kernow Model Rail Centre amongst others.

# PB&SSR/NWNGR/WHR Russell 2-6-2T new from Fourdees



Fourdees has closely followed Welshpool & Llanfair Light Railway No.14 (Sierra Leone No.85), reviewed in our November issue, with the release of another attractive Hunslet 2-6-2T Russell, built as works No.901 in 1906 for the Portmadoc, Beddgelert & South Snowdon Railway, a nominally independent concern but in effect a subsidiary to extend the North Wales Narrow Gauge Railways, where the loco



was delivered and worked until the missing link from South Snowdon (Rhyd Ddu) to Croesor Junction was eventually completed as the Welsh Highland Railway in 1922, connecting with the Festiniog Railway in Portmadoc.

To enable through running on the FR, in 1924 Russell was severely cut down (chimney, dome, and cab) but the drastic surgery was to no avail as it was still too wide over the cylinders.

Following closure of the WHR in 1937, Russell was requisitioned in 1942 for war service, working on an ironstone line in Oxfordshire; it was sold to a clay railway in Purbeck in 1946, running as an 0-6-2T, and was set aside damaged in 1953. Remarkably it survived, and was eventually restored in 1987 for what is now the Welsh Highland Heritage Railway.

The model represents the original – and indeed present – condition of the locomotive, which has been restored with the full height cab, dome, and chimney.

The models are hand-assembled in Britain from 3D-printed parts made on advanced additive manufacturing machines; the highly detailed body employs etched metal panels and many separately fitted details.

As usual, a high level of detail has been achieved – the cab interior is fully equipped and painted, and there is flush glazing in all spectacles. The cab roof can be removed, to appreciate the detail and fit a crew; it is a simple push fit

The model is initially offered only in the 1906 maroon livery (as the loco is in preservation).

The base colour is sprayed with good coverage and a satin finish, with the black (satin and matt) areas and details (buffer beams, flycranks, brasswork, pipework, etc.) hand painted. Colours are specified (Humbrol references) in the instructions to aid matching, if necessary. The etched brass plates are by Narrow Planet.

The complete body is ingeniously held onto the chassis by four small clips, completely concealed but easily accessible from below if separation is required for maintenance.



The model is built on an N gauge Graham Farish Class 08 diesel outside framed chassis, with custom-etched metal motion parts added.

It runs nicely; a running-in period of half-an-hour in each direction is recommended, with lubrication after every eight hours use.

Minimum recommended radius is 225mm (9").

Weights in the tanks ensure reasonable tractive effort but more weight could be useful both for adhesion and electrical contact.

The couplings are standard Peco GR-102s, mounted in NEM pockets. The height matches Peco stock perfectly. The couplings are flexibly mounted on the pony trucks.

The model comes smartly packaged in the usual collector's stout dark green card box with a protective sponge insert. The included glossy booklet has information on the history of Hunslet and the background to this and other designs, illustrated with archive pictures. A separate leaflet provides operating instructions.

We understand that the first batch has already sold out but orders are being taken for future production.

Fourdees is also considering offering the model to order in kit form; the price would be in the region of £132.50.

Lifecolor has released a set of five washes which is intended for use with its ref.CS13 flesh sextet of paints: the quick flesh shadowing pigments are in the following shades: ochre, light red, red umber, green shadow and grey shadow, plus a remover fluid. Each wash is supplied in a 22ml plastic pot; shake them well before use.

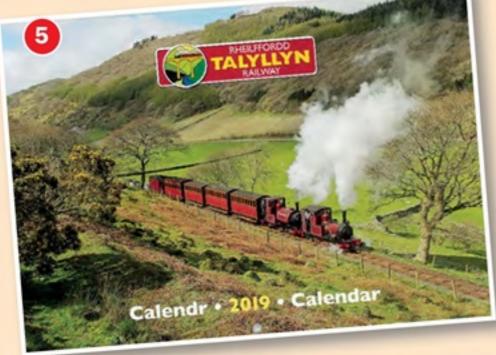

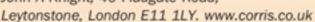


scene at Wharf station in Tywyn, with a Christmas Carol train's guard in appropriate headgear (7). Bilingual greetings adorn covers and insides.

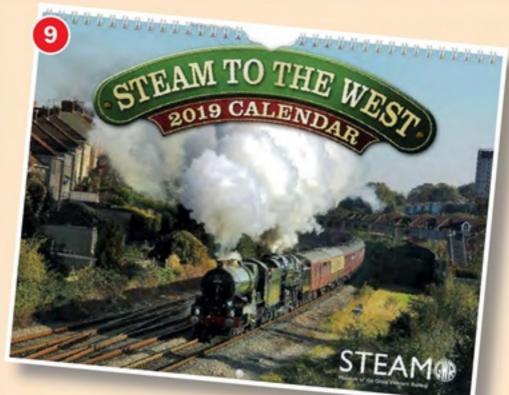

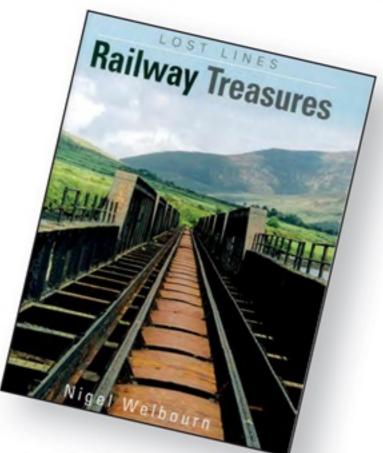

### **Book Reviews**



#### Lost Lines, **Railway Treasures**

Nigel Welbourn

Having authored 15 specific regional titles in the Lost Lines series, this time the author takes an overall view of what has been lost on our railways, over a period of almost 200 years of railway history in the British Isles. As well as the lines themselves, it is the railway infrastructure and architecture, and the landscape which is studied, although it does show that much has survived if you are prepared to look for it. So, as well as mourning the losses there is something of a celebration of what has made it through to the present day. Specific case studies highlight the latter, with a look at some of the heritage railways and museums that have become sanctuaries for many remnants of the past. A review of 10 main lines that have been closed and lost reminds the reader of what could have been.

This is a book that seems to be aimed at the general reader and enthusiast, but nevertheless gives a good account and may make the reader pause to reflect on what they have missed. Fully illustrated with over 400 photographs.

#### Southern Style – After Nationalisation 1948 - 1964

John Harvey

This is the latest in the highly detailed HMRS definitive guides to colours used by the Southern, either its constituent companies or the Region the Railway became. This volume looks in forensic detail at the changes, especially during the early years, as individual works sought to apply the BR painting edicts to specifically Southern locos and coaches. (Wagons, being easier to paint to specifications, are omitted from this work.)

Using accepted colour definitions, the author has drawn together detailed observations and record by a number of enthusiasts, to the extent that it is possible to track even minor changes to a specific locomotive's livery over time. There were, for example, many variations (naturally, being hand-painted) of the adapted 'sunshine' lettering used to spell out BRITISH RAILWAYS, and the later emblem and crests ('right' and 'wrong' versions of the latter) are covered in great depth.

The volume includes colour samples, and the book is replete with references giving the nearest available Humbrol identity. The Southern Region modeller will be well served by this volume, which comes warmly recommended. It is available from most book shops, or direct from the society at its Derbyshire HQ.

#### The Book of the Southern Moguls part one: N, N1 Classes

Ian Sixmith & Richard Derry

The 'Book of...' rubric has, it is noted early on, encountered a slight problem with the Maunsell N and N1s: it is the practice to present each volume's subjects in BR number order, so the scattering of renumberings in Southern days means some early-built batches are chronologically out of sequence due to their 3xxxx identity. For clarity's sake, the three-cylinder N1s are listed and pictured on grey-tinted paper, the Ns on plain white ground.

Frequently thought of as South Eastern & Chatham-designed locos which spread west, in fact quite a few were allocated new to the Western Section in the 1920s; some even made Devon their home for their entire life.

Following an introduction the Moguls are catalogued in the usual way, after a chapter on detail changes (chimneys, deflector handholds etc), many more of which will become apparent in the well-reproduced photograph. There was even no commonality of the hook used to hang the front coupling link on; some were to the nearside buffer, others to the right-hand edge. In several cases details of the train behind the tender are given, which is very handy for those wishing to replicate accurate train formations.

Unlike some recent 'Book of...' subjects, the Ns and N1s were kept clean, by and large, into the 1960s, so 'BR grime' is less prevalent. This allows one to gauge whether such items as cabside lining is a simple oblong or follows the lines of the cab side itself - another pitfall!

Books such as these are becoming ever-more valuable as the ranks of those who saw such engines first hand inevitably thin...

# The Syston & Peterborough Railway second edition

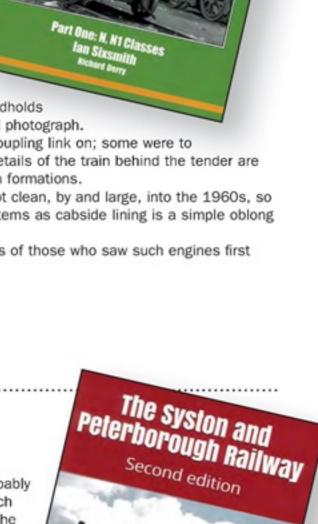
This new work builds on the author's first self-published volume of 2014 on this stretch of Midland Railway main line, most probably made famous by the venerable Airfix signal box kit inspired by the structure at Oakham. It includes many more photographs which have come to light since then, and highly detailed scale drawings of the structures en route. Maps and track plans accompany the mainly pictorial journey eastwards to the east coast main line. A bibliography is included for those who wish to delve deeper into this stretch of line - although a publisher name is confused with that of the well-known East Anglian doctor/photographer.

The drawings are clear even at the small scales necessary to be included in the page size (the author is also the proprietor of Kirtley Model Buildings), and scale bars are included for those wishing to enlarge them. Refreshingly, the author is happy for readers/intending modellers to contact him by email to discover more of the extensive collection of material on the route which he has amassed over the years.

Photographs are a mix of colour and black-and-white, some less than sharp but included for historical reasons or because of rarity of subject matter. The book is a wealth of information for the Midland Railway enthusiast. It is available from the Amazon website, or from the Kirtley Model Buildings stand at selected exhibitions.

revealed in the final episode - to be broadcast on 9 November 2018.

Taking place at the NEC in Birmingham on 24 & 25 November, and billed as the UK's largest model railway event, the weekend promises to bring together in excess of 90 model railways and over 150 specialist trade stands. The layouts will cover all the popular scales and gauges, representing British and overseas prototypes.

In keeping with the narrow gauge and miniature railway theme of this year's event, the prototype display will include locomotives and items of rolling stock from the Romney Hythe & Dymchurch Railway in Kent. Amongst the items it plans to bring is Pacific locomotive Northern Chief, which was designed by Henry Greenly and built by Davey Paxman & Co. in 1925.

# EM Gauge Society commissions 'ready-to-lay' trackwork from Peco

We can reveal that the EM Gauge Society, which was formed in 1955 to promote modelling in 4mm scale with a track gauge of 18.2mm, has commissioned Peco to manufacture items of 'ready-to-lay' bullhead wooden-sleepered trackwork.

With design work already at an advanced stage (undertaken to the Society's own specifications), there will be left- and right-hand two-way points (to B6 geometry), together with plain track.

The points are set to feature solid metal blades and parallel sleepering (perpendicular to the straight route) - with sleeper length and spacing as per the prototype. To be supplied as Electrofrog only, with closure rails bonded to the frog rails and blades bonded to adjacent stock rails. The manufacturer's existing code 75 bullhead rail will be used, whilst the existing Peco bullhead rail joiners will also be suitable for use with the EM gauge items.

Plain track will be supplied in 914mm lengths, but with the sleeper base split into scale 60' lengths; the sleeper spacing will be reduced on sleepers positioned at the ends of adjoining panels, as per prototype practice.

CAD renders of this new trackwork range are reproduced here. It is planned to have 3D-printed samples on display at this year's Warley National Model Railway exhibition (see separate story).

# Accurascale and Realtrack team up to produce PCA cement wagons in **00** and **N**

Accurascale has announced the subject of its next 4mm scale ready-to-run wagon project - the CFMF PCA bulk cement wagon. A 2mm version is also to be released in collaboration with Realtrack Models.

Built by CFMF of France for wagon leasing company STS, the 50 PCA bulk cement wagons of the PC017B design diagram started entering service in 1982. A number were hired to Rugby Cement, with other examples leased to Blue Circle for use on a number of workings.

A further batch of 15 wagons was manufactured in 1985 by another French firm, Fauvet-Girel. Assigned design diagram PC017C, these vehicles received Rugby Cement livery and replaced the wagons previously leased to that company.

All wagons were re-liveried in 1996 when they were leased by Castle Cement for use on workings to London - initially to Kings Cross freight depot and then to the freight facility at Saint Pancras from 2003. Since 2013, a number of these wagons have also been used on workings between Clitheroe and Avonmouth.

Realtrack Models previously announced a model of this distinctive wagon, but approached Accurascale in spring 2018 with a view to forwarding the project, whilst also developing a 2mm variant; the resultant arrangement will see Accurascale release the 4mm models under its own brand, with Realtrack releasing the 2mm version under its banner (see the firm's website: www.realtrackmodels.co.uk).

Accurascale's 4mm version will be presented in STS dark grey, Rugby Cement and Castle Cement branding, featuring multiple running numbers in packs of three. The 4mm packs are priced at £69.95 for three wagons, with discounts available across all three liveries for rake bundle deals.

Each wagon is set to feature over 100 separate parts. Ease of conversion to EM and P4 is also incorporated. A factory sample has been received in both scales (4mm sample illustrated) and a number of tweaks and corrections are currently being made before production commences. Realtrack will release the wagons in the same three liveries as Accurascale, although prices are still to be confirmed.

The project is said to be well advanced with delivery of the 4mm models planned for January 2019; the Realtrack 2mm version (illustrated here with a CAD render) is due during the first quarter of 2019. Preorders of the 4mm wagon are available now exclusively via the Accurascale website (see below).

Accurascale has also unveiled that it is to release Rawie buffer stop packs in 4mm scale.

Several variants of this distinctive buffer stop can be found across the rail network, from terminus stations, to locomotive stabling points, to motive power depots and freight yards

The variant that has been modelled by Accurascale first appeared in the early 1990s. Three different options will be available; a basic buffer stop with traditional buffer pads; a buffer stop with Scharfenberg coupling box attachment (both types supplied in packs of two priced £5.95); and a buffer stop with a Scharfenberg attachment with lighting pole and functioning lighting (with electrical pick-up from the track, supplied individually and priced £6.95).

Tooling for the models is complete (a sample is pictured here). Tweaks to the design are currently being undertaken by Accurascale's factory in China. Friction pads will be provided in each pack to be placed on the rails behind each buffer stop as per the prototype - suitable for both Code 100 and 75 00 gauge track.

Delivery is expected by the end of 2018 and orders

can be placed directly via the Accurascale website once stocks are received.

#### First look at Cemflo/PCV wagon in 4mm

Accurascale has received the first production sample of its forthcoming Cemflo/PCV wagon in 4mm (as first announced in our August 2018 issue).

The Cemflo project has been subject to a slight delay (caused indirectly as a result of a factory closure in China), but is on course for a revised delivery date of April 2019. The delay has allowed Accurascale to negotiate reduced production costs, which it has passed onto its customers as compensation for the delay. Details of the lower purchase prices for new customers can be found on the website.

Accurascale has also stated that it plans to offer the Oleo buffers and the cosmetic screw link couplings used on the Cemflo/PCV in seperate accessory packs. Full details on pricing of these items will be confirmed in due course.

(In addition, an N gauge version of the Cemflo/PCV is being produced in collaboration with Revolution Trains - see News, RM November 2018.)

#### TOPS and NCB 24.5T HUOs

The TOPS and NCB internal user packs of the HUO 24.5 Ton coal hopper wagons (see Reviews, RM August 2018) were due in stock by the time this issue went on sale, with almost 50% of the production run sold out on pre-order. A limited number of all versions released to date are still available direct from Accurascale's website and from the firm's stand at the forthcoming Warley show - where it also plans to make its next model announcement.

# Realtrack Class 142 and second run of Class 156s take shape in 00



Illustrated here are hand-finished painted samples of the next batch of OO gauge Class 156 DMU models that are being manufactured for Realtrack Models by Rapido Trains.

This second run of Class 156 models (which follows the first versions released last year – see Reviews, RM October 2017) will include the colourful East Midlands Trains livery and the classic Provincial delivery scheme, with both original 'Sprinter' and later 'SuperSprinter' branding.

Realtrack Models has commissioned nine different versions in total; four EMT and five Provincial. There are printing differences between all nine sets, which will also have unique destinations at each end.

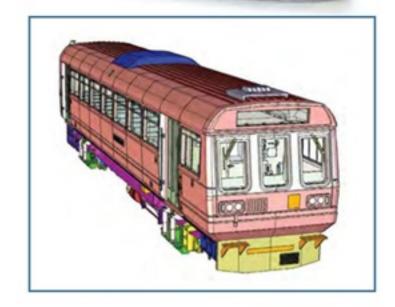
Also reproduced here are early CAD images for the forthcoming Class 142 DMU, which was first

announced in our January 2017 issue and is also being manufactured for Realtrack Models by Rapido Trains.

The models are set to feature a plethora of different body variations and alternative parts to represent differences between prototypes as they appeared 'as built' and in later years. The detail differences include; four-leaf (original) and two-leaf doors, roofs with three or ten strengthening ribs, two styles of roof pod, two styles of destination panel, and numerous other minor underframe and cab front parts. The first run of models will also feature the original bus-style seating.

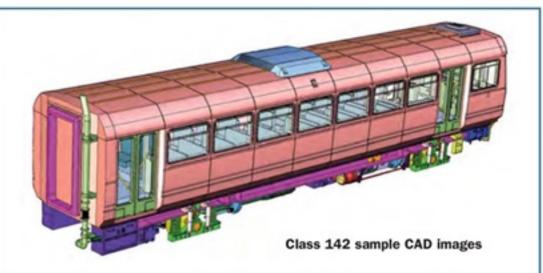

# Second run of Heljan L&B 2-6-2Ts in 009 near production

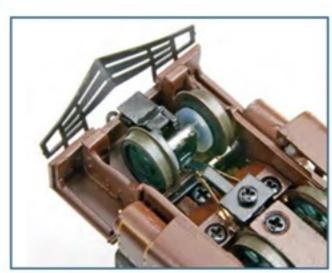
We recently had the opportunity to inspect a number of decorated samples that Heljan has received for the second tranche of releases for its L&B 2-6-2T model in 009. This follows the first stocks of these models that were delivered last year (see Reviews, RM April 2017).

This second run has been manufactured at a different Chinese facility and the opportunity has been taken to revise slightly the springing arrangement of the front and rear pony trucks (pictured *inset*).

There are 11 livery versions planned for release (see News, RM July 2018), of which four are illustrated here (from left to right); ref.9950 Yeo in L&B dark green, ref.9955 Exe in L&B dark green, ref.9956 Taw in L&B dark green and ref.9953 No.E760 Exe in c.1927-29 'intermediate' SR green.

It should be noted that on all the samples illustrated the nameplates are set too low on the tank sides; this has been corrected for the production versions, the manufacturing of which is currently underway. A projected delivery date is still to be confirmed.

#### Great Sutton - 2

Last month we presented part two of Giles Barnabe's account of his 1860s era layout, Great Sutton. Unfortunately, as a result of some rogue 'cutting and pasting' of text at the magazine design stage, which went unnoticed, a spurious paragraph was placed inadvertently at the start of the article. We wish to apologise to Giles, and to any readers who were somewhat baffled why a layout set deep in rural Shropshire should be described as having a "north eastern ambience"!

### **Allan Downes**

Allan Downes, who died in August aged 83, will be known by many established readers of RAILWAY MODELLER as a skilled architectural modeller with an inimitable writing style who contributed to these pages from the 1970s onwards.

Born in 1935, Allan was evacuated to Yorkshire during WW2, and it is from this and schooling in Oxfordshire that germinated his love of rural buildings. He was a talented sketch artist, many of his modelling articles being accompanied by line drawings of his subjects.

In those early days his chief modelling medium was card, often covered in computer chads for bricks, Pyruma fire cement for rendering, and many varieties of Colron wood dye if a wooden structure was being modelled. Card was an ideal medium which absorbed the dye without any deformation in a manner that plasticard most certainly didn't.

Allan's principal influence was John Ahern, whose Miniature Building Construction was as much of an encouragement to him as he was to RM readers in his own articles.

His first article was published in the October 1973 edition of RAILWAY MODELLER, and by 1976 he became practically a monthly fixture, penning pieces on modelling thatched roofs, cobbled farmyards, water mills and suchlike.

The first layout, *Pipers Mead*, appeared in 1975, to be followed by *Candleford Mill* in 1979, which was resident here at Pecorama during in the 1980s. By 1979 he had had three books of plans published by Peco, again with the emphasis on rural structures such as windmills and churches.

Although country buildings were his forte, he could turn his hand to urban structures, most memorably in 1981 with his cityscape which appeared under the title Civic Splendour in that year's December issue.

Allan's last feature for RM was in 1994, but he made frequent appearances elsewhere in the model press thereafter. He also developed some very speedy modelling techniques involving rapid bonding of plastics with superglues and an unusual aerosol spray technique for roofs and stonework in which he could paint and weather the surfaces to a very realistic finish in seconds.

In more recent times he was a frequent contributor to a well known model railway forum, and was active and still encouraging others in their modelling up until his death.

From the appreciative comments that have been posted over the past few weeks, it is clear that he will be greatly missed, but his legacy will live on in the countless numbers of model structures he built for himself and his many clients.

# **Brian Gardner**

We were saddened to learn of the passing on 7 October 2018 of Brian Gardner, one of our friends and associates who produced many of the Peco CD and DVD compilations over a 20-year period.

Born in 1951, Brian worked for 13 years at HMSO before leaving to start his own video production business. He was a skilled film maker and became very well known to many within the model railway fraternity.

Brian began working with Peco in 1990 when he produced the Creating a Model Railway video. This was followed by two videos titled Creating Classic Layouts featuring both British and continental layouts and the Steaming the Beer Heights video.

In 2000 Brian began producing the RAILWAY MODELLER Annual on CD. These were produced for the next 10 years and gave RAILWAY MODELLER and CONTINENTAL MODELLER readers the opportunity to see many great layouts in action.

He was known for his patience in coaxing a great performance from the most nervous of modellers. Every summer he looked forward to visiting and filming the modellers and their layouts for each year's production.

Brian had always loved model railways from a very young age and tried to attend as many model railway shows and exhibitions as possible. He made several starts at building his own layout but these were always thwarted by lack of time during his working life.

When he scaled down his work after retirement, he was never happier than being in his railway room working on his layout. Brian is survived by his wife Geraldine, their two children Suzy and Tom, and six grandchildren.

# Temporary reduction in Bachmann production capacity

At its annual Press Day held on 31 August 2018 (see News, RM October 2018), Bachmann Europe Plc outlined the plans by its parent company, Kader, to open a new model railway production facility in Gaobu to supplement the existing facilities at Shenzen and Dongguan.

Although the Kader site in Dongguan was earmarked for redevelopment, it was expected that production would continue in the medium-term whilst the new sites came onstream. However, the manufacturer has since been asked to vacate the site sooner than previously indicated and to facilitate this, staff from other locations have been engaged in the transfer of machinery, tooling and materials to the new

Gaobu site. This has led to a temporary reduction in production capacity whilst reorganisation takes place.

Once the reorganisation is complete the manufacturer will benefit from an increased production capacity, which will assist with the delivery of models that are still outstanding, along with others that are currently in development.

The following items are expected to be released during the remainder of 2018: 00 – Class H1, H2 & C1 Atlantics, Class 37 'EuroPhoenix', BR Mk.I POT coaches, BR Mk.IIf coaches (all types), FFA/FGA Freightliner flats and BR Mk.I horse boxes. 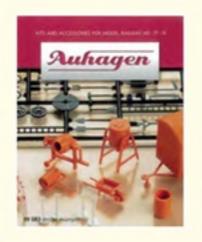

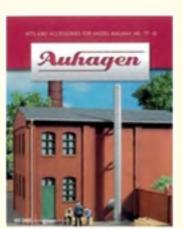

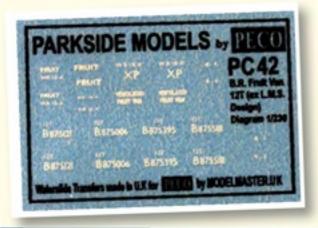

# **Sutton's Locomotive Works confirms Highland 'baby Sulzers' in 4mm**

Phil Sutton has confirmed production for three further versions of his ready-to-run 4mm scale Class 24 model (see Reviews, RM July 2016), manufactured under his Sutton's Locomotive Workshop label.

The latest trio of models confirmed for production will all represent headcode box-equipped Class 24/1 prototypes allocated to Inverness in the Highlands of Scotland.

Inverness was the first depot north of the border to be allocated with BR Sulzer Type 2s. They were utilised, along with BRCW types from 1960, to supersede steam traction in the Highlands. This tranche of 19 Derby-built machines (D5114-D5132) from the Class 24/1 sub-class featured new roof-mounted headcode boxes (for four-digit train identification) and removal of the hinged headcode discs and their illumination lamps. Cab-side recesses for tablet-catching equipment were provided and miniature snowploughs were soon fitted.

Whilst standard machines were relatively common visitors to the West Highland Line, the 'Highland Baby Sulzers' tended to stick solidly to local diagrams, principally the remote branches of Kyle of Lochalsh, Wick and Thurso, along with heavier main line outings (often double-headed) south to Perth and Edinburgh. They also featured on the Aberfeldy branch and later made appearances on the Waverley route before closure.

The three confirmed versions will be presented in; BR green with small yellow ends, pre-TOPS blue and TOPS blue. Running numbers are to be confirmed.

SLW is now accepting pre-orders for these models,

which can be placed via its website. A wide range of options are being offered, including DCC sound, high-capacity 'stay-alive', together with factory-fitted EM and P4 gauge wheelset options. Prices start from £185.00 and delivery is estimated for late 2019.

# New 4mm kit for LNER B3 4-6-0 released

Modellers Graham Nicholas and Graeme King have joined forces to produce a mixed-media kit for the GCR/LNER 9P/B3 4-6-0 type in 4mm scale under the G\_Train Locomotive Works name.

The prototypes formed a class of just six locomotives that did not survive into the BR steam era; however, one of these, LNER No.6165 Valour was chosen as the GCR (and later LNER) war memorial loco and throughout the 1920s and 1930s was regularly involved in the memorial services on armistice day that took place at Sheffield Victoria station. The launch of this new kit is therefore very timely, coinciding closely with the 100th anniversary of the 1918 armistice on 11 November 2018.

The kit comprises a set of nickel silver etches (designed for G\_Train by Nick Easton) for the locomotive chassis, footplating and cab, together with a collection of resin items for the boiler and other detail parts such as front cylinder covers and sandboxes. Two chimney and three dome types are available; a chimney and dome will be provided to suit the builder's need.

Wheels, motor and gears are for the builder to supply, as are the various detail parts to complete such as buffers, handrail knobs, etc. Although primarily designed for OO gauge, suitable additional parts are available on the etch to allow the model to be constructed for P4/EM use.

For the more adventurous builder, a set of parts is also included for simplified working inside valve gear to impart a visible rocking motion to the outside valves.

No tender is provided – the prototypes towed the Great Central Standard 4000 gallon type at various times in their careers, several options for which are available to the 4mm scale modeller.

Both Graham and Graeme will be present at the Warley National Model Railway Exhibition on 24 & 25 November (see separate story) and a made-up example of the kit will be available for viewing as part of Graeme's resin casting demonstration stand.

The anticipated selling price for the kit is £105.00 plus p&p. Both the nickel silver etches and resin parts can be made available separately if required.

The resin boiler has been designed by Graeme to fit a range of GCR 4-6-0 types, including the GCR 9Q/LNER B7, for which a kit is planned for release in the future. For further details, contact Graham Nicholas:
