Ever since their introduction in 1961, windscreen wipers on Westerns were a constant source of problems. Swindon experimented with different motors and blades before turning to George Kents Limited and their design for a Clear View Screen. D1039 emerged from the works in March 1964 with this first style of Clear View Screen. Tests were carried out and initial observations were that the wiper would slow down if the loco was

aveling at high speeds. odifications were made and improvements noted but the drivers were still unhappy with the wiper obscuring their view.

D1000, while painted in this livery, had some modifications to its front valances to have some ventilation grilles added. These are represented on our model. The vents were plated over when the loco was painted into BR Blue in June 1967.

The number & nameplates fitted to D1000 were larger than the ones fitted to the other members of the class and D1000 was the only Western to carry a cast aluminium BR crest under the second man's window at both ends.

The non-standard name & number plates were carried until scrapped, but the BR crest was removed when the loco was repainted into BR Blue.

As with the first incarnation problems were discovered and rectified 'on the job' and this included Kent's redesigning the screen. The updated versions were fitted in July 1966 and this is the version that our model will carry.

The main benefit of the Mk.II was the removal of four support rods that had impaired the drivers view but even with these rods removed, after fifteen months the Screens were removed

Overall the Clear View Screens performed well in heavy rain

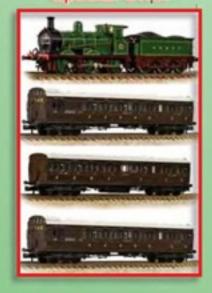
but, even with the support rods
on the Mk.II removed, the
screen obstructed the drivers
view considerably more than the
standard wipers. They also cost
more to fit and it was therefore
decided the scrap the Clear View Screen as a reliable alternative

D1006 was running again in March 1967 with the standard windscreen wipers reinstated.

Semley

The highest point on the Salisbury & Yeovil Railway, meticulously recreated in P4

It's Tuesday 2 July 1912 – less than three months since RMS Titanic set off on its ill-fated trans-Atlantic voyage, the outbreak of the First World War is looming, and the reigning monarch is King George V.

MARTIN FINNEY is our host as he winds the clock back more than a century and takes us on a tour of this Wiltshire station, modelled in 1:76.2 scale.

emley Station in Wiltshire opened on 2 May 1859 to serve the nearby Dorset town of Shaftesbury (2½ miles to the south), and was situated on the London & South Western Railway main line to the south-west of England. The facilities saw rapid expansion and with the opening of a dairy in 1875, Semley became the first station in the country to have a wholesale milk depot to serve the London market.

Researching the prototype

The project to build this model started in May 1998. Research is still ongoing and – apart from all the help received from the folk who now work and live around Semley station – two particular events come to mind: I contacted the Plans Arch at Waterloo and spoke to a helpful gentleman who promised to look in the Semley folder. A day later he called to tell me that there were four photographs and 21 drawings! I agreed to buy the lot and when they arrived was amazed to find the four photographs were full plate prints of 'offical' pictures taken on 10 March 1904.

I have subsequently located four further views taken at the same time, the best published in the July 1904 edition of *Railway Magazine* and without the information they contain a convincing model would have proved impossible.

The drawings included a 1954-dated 40':1" plan and drawings of the bridges, but the majority comprised a complete set for the replacement signal box that was built in 1961.

Eric Smart started work at Semley station in 1936 as a shunt horse lad and, before his death, I was privileged to meet him to discuss his experiences. Semley was an awkward track plan with all the sidings bar one on the up side; short shunting necks and the whole layout on a gradient falling towards Gillingham. His recollections of the

Behind the scenes - layout control and operation

The signal box frame is a 1:12 scale model of the Stevens frame in Semley box utilising castings from Scale Signal Supply. The frame is fully interlocked by scratchbuilt locking designed by Peter Squibb. On a shelf attached above the frame sit models of the Preece block instruments and bells which (for reasons of practicality and the tone of the bells) are built to one third scale.

As the beginnings of this project go back nearly 30 years to when the first locos were built it is very much pre-DCC. All track power is applied through a system of relays and CMOS logic chips. The input to this system comes from reed switches sensing the position of the under-board point and signal operating rods and the position of the signal box block instruments. This means that the operator's 'control panel' is simply the model of Semley box lever frame and instruments, with no individual on/off switches for track power required, giving the signalman the same role as 100 years ago.

To communicate with Semley box the next boxes up and down the line at Tisbury and Gillingham are also required; these only have the half which communicates with Semley modelled and are ideal for less experienced signalmen to begin their training!

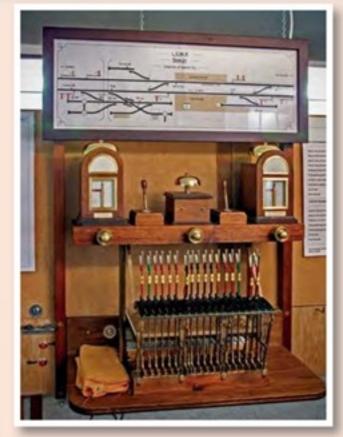
Train driving is a separate job, the up and down drivers being situated at the front of the model. To complete the operating roster requires a shunter at Semley and ideally two people in the fiddle yards. Train control uses PICtrollers from Malcolm Smith.

castings from Scale Signal Supply. The frame is fully interlocked by the locking frame under the Perspex cover. On the shelf attached above the frame are models of the Preece block instruments and bells. The Hornby Dublo point levers operate points in the yard and the red buttons control the Alex Jackson uncoupling magnets.

working of traffic, particularly goods trains, have been invaluable in attempting to represent the movement of trains accurately.

Planning the layout

Planning the model started by scanning the 1954 plan. I then imported the scans into my usual CAD package. It was then backdated using a small copy of an LSWR 40':1" plan c.1915, obtained from the National Railway Museum. This file was used to design the whole model including the baseboards, track, point and signal mechanisms – and later the room in which to house *Semley*.

The model was to be of the approximately half-mile of railway between the occupation bridge No.296 at the eastern end and the three-arch viaduct, No.298, carrying the main Shaftesbury to Warminster road over the line at the western end. This meant the scenic part of the model would be some 37' long and the overall layout would need a space of 40' x 10'.

Permanent way

Having completed the first six baseboards, which contain the majority of the scenic part

of Semley, construction of the track could start.

long rail and flexible switches. The sidings
were laid using the earlier 1891 design using
30' panels and heeled switches.

Track construction was very conventional using the Brook-Smith method of plywood sleepers with brass rivets and steel rail on templates drawn using information obtained from the South Western Circle and Alan Blackburn. Alan was particularly helpful in resolving the geometry of the unusual double slip which has staggered switches. The cosmetic detailing of the track – chairs, ballasting, fishplates, stretcher bars and point rodding took many hours. The chairs are whitemetal castings, each chair in two halves fixed in place with superglue: in excess of 10,000 pieces!

The points and signals are mechanically operated using a system of rods and cranks under the baseboard. The benefit of having built the model with separate baseboards became apparent as much of the time was spent working with the boards upside down!

Buildings and structures

Among the information I acquired from the Waterloo Plans Arch were drawings of bridges 296 and 298. Unfortunately there was no drawing of bridge 297 in the Semley folder so an enjoyable Sunday morning was spent measuring and photographing the structure. I was then able to make drawings of all three bridges and build the models.

Most of the other buildings and structures were built by Mike Jolly, who sadly passed away in December 2007. He was a supremely gifted modeller and was my guru for all things relating to buildings and scenery. Mike

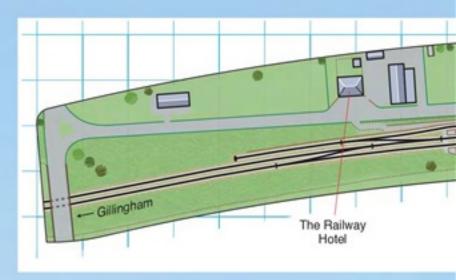
and I spent many sessions at Semley surveying and photographing the buildings for me to produce drawings and Mike to work his magic and produce his stunning models.

Using Computer Aided Design methods

Many of the details on the model have used photo etching and, as a retired designer and producer of locomotive kits, this is a technology I am very familiar with, using 2D

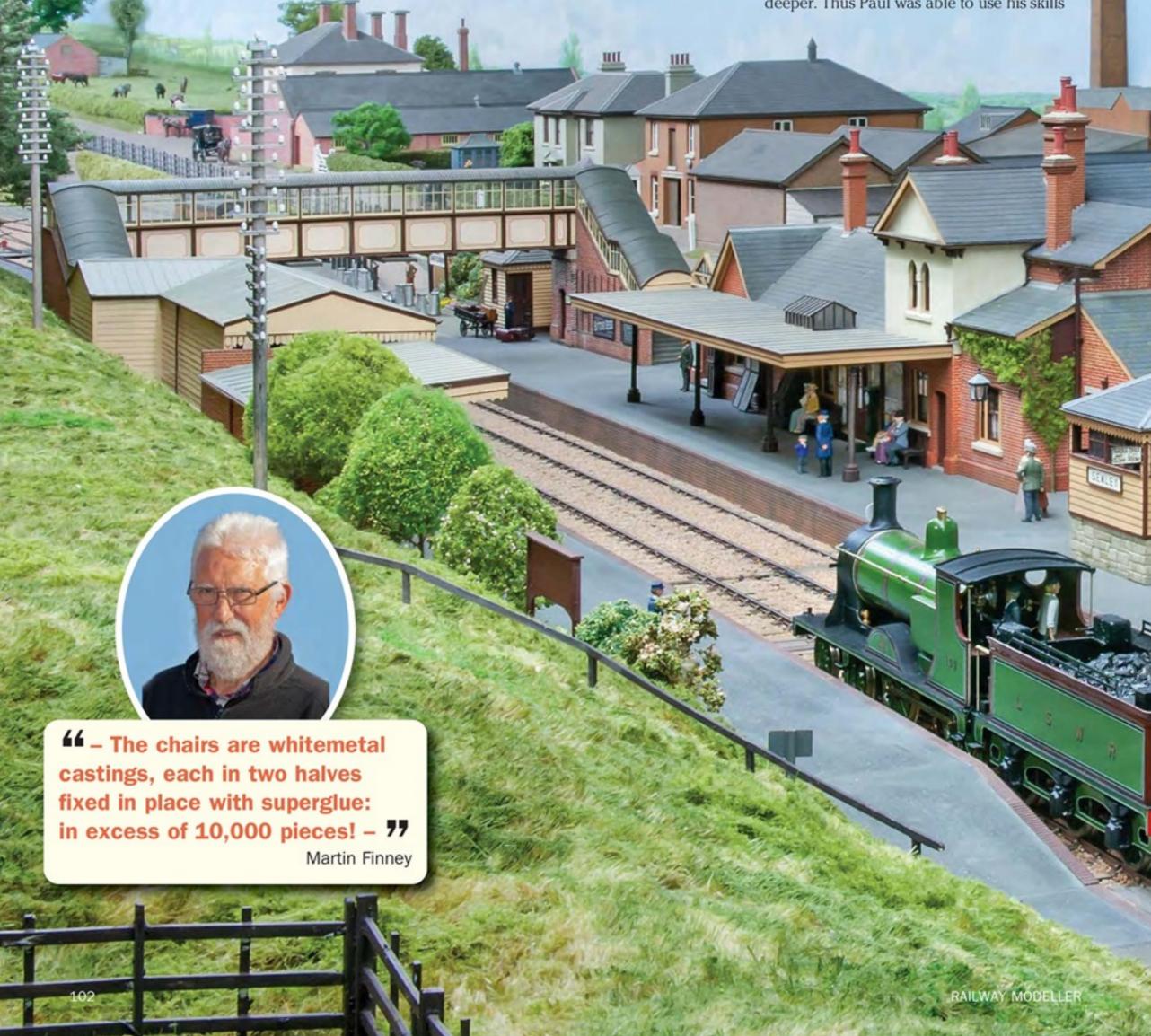

The list of etches I have produced specially for Semley is long and includes: bridge plates, canopy brackets, gradient posts, signals and ground signals, point rodding, window frames, running-in boards, signs, wagon underframes, carriages and the footbridge. However etching, as a technology, does not produce solid three dimensional parts easily and these can now be produced by 3D printing. Unfortunately 3D parts must be designed using 3D CAD and my skillset is stuck very firmly in 2D!

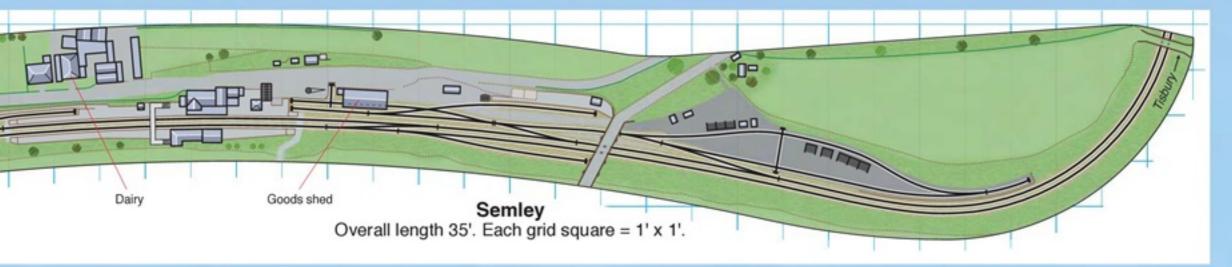
Before his untimely passing, my younger brother, David Finney, had begun to develop his own range of 3D printed products and he was able to turn my 2D drawings into the 3D designs required for printing. He produced for *Semley*: canopy pillars, platform trolleys, telegraph poles, signal wire posts, chimney pots and carriage parts.



Backscene, figures and details

I first met Paul Brambrick some four years ago. Paul had built a considerable reputation as an expert in designing and executing model railway backscenes and he agreed to take on a new backscene for *Semley*. I made the new backscene boards higher and the baseboards at the eastern end of the model deeper. Thus Paul was able to use his skills





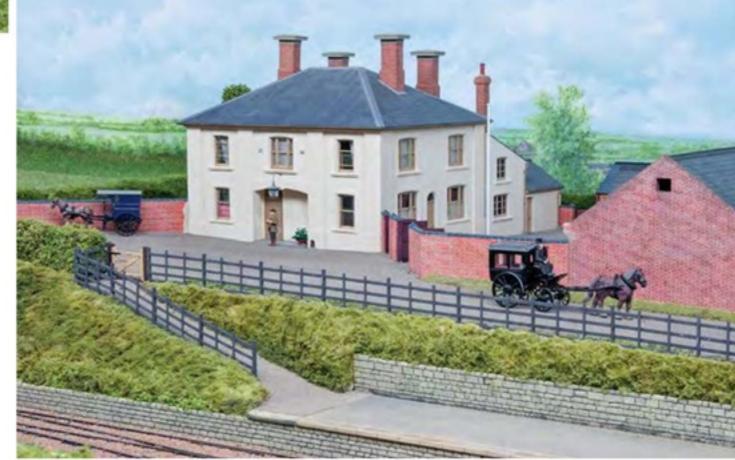

in particular make wonderfully challenging and attractive models and are a mixture of kitbuilt and scratchbuilt with Drummond M7, 700 goods, T9, L11, L12, D15 and T14, and Adams A12, X2 and T3 completed. By 1912 traffic on the LSWR route to the west was booming with many of the heavy through corridor expresses in the hands of Drummond's much-maligned 4-6-0s, so the F13, G14 and P14 Class 4-6-0s are still on the to do list!

Another corridor train has been started and is a top priority. For light relief I work on more wagons, either from my stash of wagon kits or by scratchbuilding; I am currently progressing LSWR cattle vans, S&D road vans, together with two Bradford & Sons of Yeovil PO wagons.

Edwardian operation

Operating days involve a sequence of 31 trains, which is a little under half of those that ran through Semley on the chosen date of Tuesday 2 July 1912. This date was picked to be near midsummer to take advantage of the longer daylight to run some of the overnight goods trains and cattle wagons to the Tuesday Salisbury market. Several of these trains call at Semley to drop off or collect wagons and vans. Time is also needed for the up and down pick-up goods trains to shunt the yard. All this activity means that the sequence can be completed in around four hours.

I organise operating days about every two months through the year when Colin, Mike, Simon, Steve, Tom, Tony and guests can have an enjoyable day pretending to be either Edwardian railwaymen or Edwardian railway enthusiasts! Finally I wish to thank the many friends who have helped and continue to help me in completing my 'last great project'. In alphabetical order and with apologies for anyone I omit they are:

Modelling Barnsley's railways-3



ALAN WHITEHOUSE concludes his series of layout suggestions based on south Yorkshire locations around Barnsley, this time with a look at run-down lines serving collieries that have now disappeared.

e can only imagine the sense of excitement in the mid-19th century as new railways began spreading their tentacles across the country: single tracks at first, tapping into and creating new industries before expanding in a seemingly endless way – two tracks, perhaps four, sidings loops and so on.

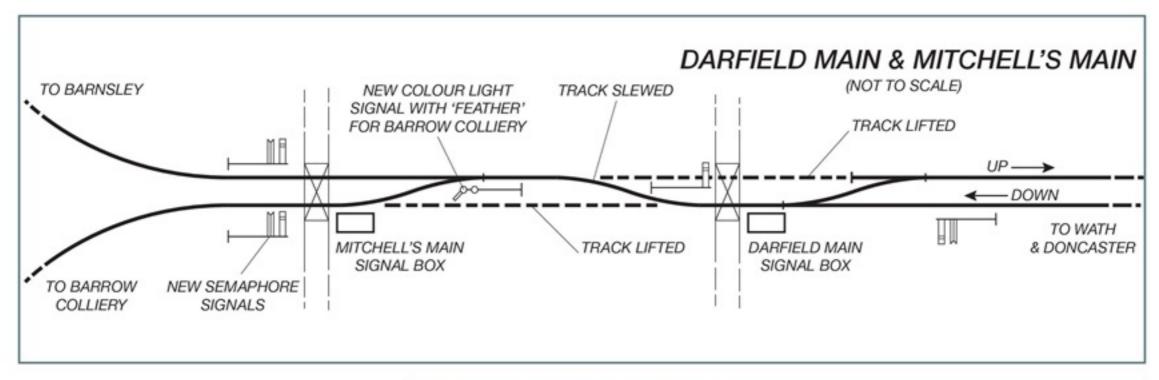
It is a stark contrast to the rapidly contracting railway of the 1980s, particularly in coal mining areas as collieries closed; remaining production was concentrated on a few outlets and the railway gave up certain traffic flows as simply not worth the cost or trouble.

And so, in the third and final part of this short series on modelling Barnsley's railways, let's look at what a railway in steep decline looks like as those multiple tracks are ripped out leaving behind a very basic railway, probably looking rather similar to those early days.

This plan looks at a section of the South Yorkshire Railway's route from Doncaster to Barnsley. The line was built in stages, tapping newly-sunk collieries along the way, throwing off branches to serve yet more coal mines. But in the 1980s all had gone into sharp reverse. Closure of the Woodhead route, of which this stretch formed a small part, had robbed it of most traffic. What remained was essentially a colliery branch.

But, because there was little modernisation during the 20th century, 'left-over lines' were often expensive to operate, with many

manual signalboxes, and the S&T engineers were skilful in coming up with ways of cutting costs, usually in the knowledge that the railway was working out its final years.

Setting the scene

This was the case between Barnsley and the mining town of Wombwell. By then only three collieries were being served and, unfortunately, two of them were on separate branches, requiring a signal box at Aldam Junction – featured in RAILWAY MODELLER January 2010 – to be staffed whenever either route was open.

The next two boxes along the line were Mitchell's Main and Darfield Main. Both controlled level crossings, so had to be open whenever the line was. Both had trailing crossovers in a double track line which served perhaps half a dozen trains per day. How to cut the running costs?

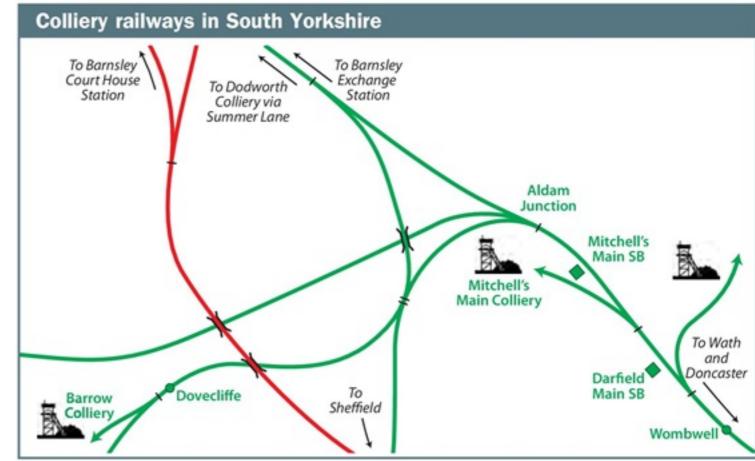
The track plan shows an ingenious solution. After Darfield Main box the line became single track and was slewed over from the down trackbed to the up so that, when it reached Mitchell's Main, about a quarter of a mile away, the crossover was a facing one.

This transformed the two trailing crossovers into a junction, one line heading to Barnsley itself to take coal traffic from Dodworth Colliery, the other running to Dovecliffe on the former South Yorkshire Railway route to Sheffield, where it served Barrow Colliery. With the addition of some (mostly second-hand) signalling, it allowed the closure of Aldam Junction.

Industrial dereliction

This scheme would suit anyone wanting to model industrial dereliction and little else: devotees of express passenger trains should look elsewhere because this was a railway about slow-moving coal trains often using life-expired wagons moving through a landscape of redundant infrastructure – including the railway equipment – patched up for a few more years.

As such it could be extremely atmospheric, evoking a time and a place now long gone.



Modelling it well would not be easy: it is always simpler to create a pristine scene than it is to model, say, a ruined building with broken-down walls and scattered bricks, or a signal box with windows boarded up or covered with wire mesh to try to thwart the vandals. It is almost pointless to suggest a layout as such because this scheme is almost infinitely adaptable, from a simple cassettes-at-each-end system to an oval with each of the two single line branches meeting in a fiddle yard. The choice would be entirely yours.

Similarly, scenic treatment can be of your own devising. The real thing ran through mostly level ground with a large and overgrown colliery spoil heap along one boundary fence. The remaining land was that





The Barnsley coalfield definition of 'Main'

A small historical note: the term 'Main' denotes a colliery that tapped the main Barnsley Bed of coal which is why so many mines in south Yorkshire had it in their title. Others tapped the Silkstone seam and included this in their name instead. Hence, Mitchell's Main and Darfield Main signal boxes. Both these boxes were Saxby & Farmer designs installed for the Great Central when the tracks along this section were quadrupled early in the 20th century, only to be turned into a pair of single tracks after closure of Aldam Junction box in 1983.

on the edge of Barnsley.

Locomotives were usually Tinsley Class 31s and 37s, though Class 47s and 56s did put in appearances as did Class 45s - a comedown from their glory days on the Midland Main Line! The odd engineering train, sometimes hauled by a Class 08, and DMUs working a couple of enthusiast specials completes the lineup. There are pictures of a Cravens Class 105 DMU on one of these workings.

Universal location

It is worth adding that this sort of quirky scheme does not have to be set anywhere near south Yorkshire. It would work equally well in almost any setting intended to showcase industrial decline. I could see a West Midlands or north-east version being just as effective, and not necessarily with coal traffic.

And this completes a brief survey of the modelling opportunities. I have deliberately steered away from the Woodhead Route itself as this is really a modelling subject in its own right, and nor have we looked at Barnsley's slightly extraordinary Exchange station with its single platform and adjacent loco shed. More possibilities!

I hope it has sparked some interest and maybe set a few of you thinking about your next project.

Diesels in the Valleys

The purchase of a new loft ladder with a surplus surround section gave **LES NEHRLICH** an idea: create it into the base for a layout on which to run a growing collection of contemporary N gauge diesels.

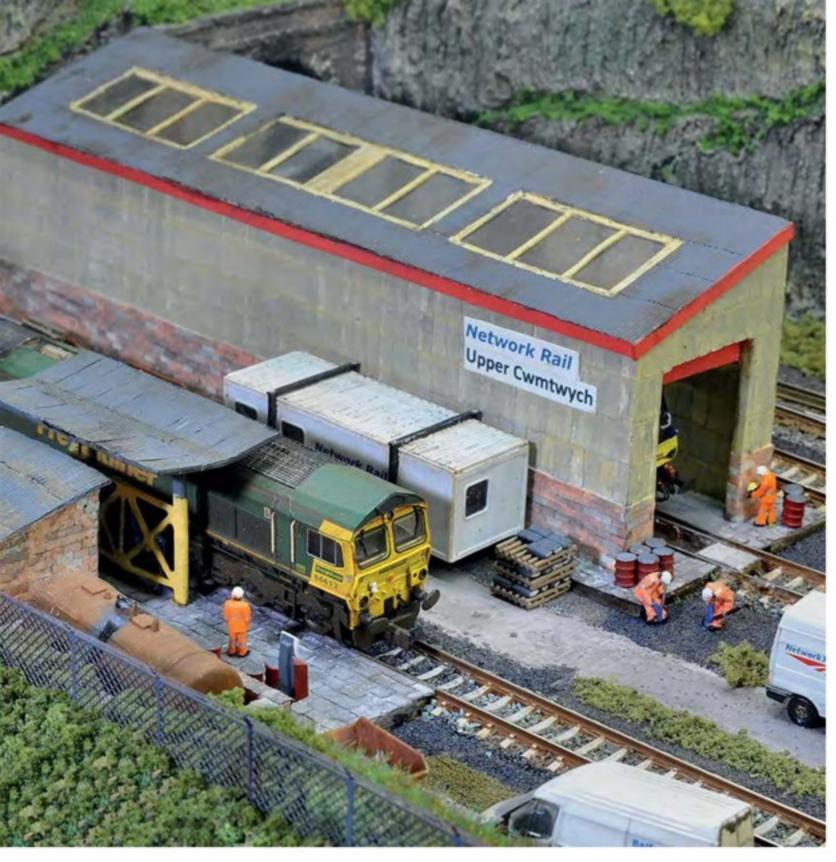

pper Cwm-twrch is a place in the valleys north of Swansea in South Wales. The Midland Railway's line to Brynamman used to run past the settlement but there hasn't been a railway since 1950. It does, however, have a very good pub which I have stayed at on a number of occasions.

The layout is titled *Upper Cwmtwych* because I mis-remembered the name of the village. It came about because I needed a new loft ladder: because my layout storage and workshop are in the loft, the old aluminium one was falling to bits as it was not designed for the excessive use it was therefore receiving.

The new ladder was supplied with a surround which locates with the hole in the ceiling. As I only needed the ladder it seemed a shame to throw out the redundant surround as it looked like it could be a good base for a layout. It measures 44" x 21", so it fits in my Ford Fiesta for transportation to exhibitions; this is an advantage as these

days I am too old to hire vans.

I had started collecting diesel locos that I liked the look of, so a layout to show them off was contemplated.

Design considerations

A few years ago I operated Ian Futers' layout Lochty Lane (see RM April 2016) which has a rear fiddle yard with sector plate feeding storage lines and a line running through a tunnel into a small loco stabling point. I checked with Ian that I could copy his idea, and he agreed.

Although the fiddle yard arrangement is similar, the viewing side was more complicated than Ian's simple layout.

Once I had decided on a track plan to make loco movements interesting it was time to try a few firsts for me: Peco Streamline code 55 concrete sleepered track; electrofrog three-way points; and Circuitron Tortoise point motors. All is still 12V dc.

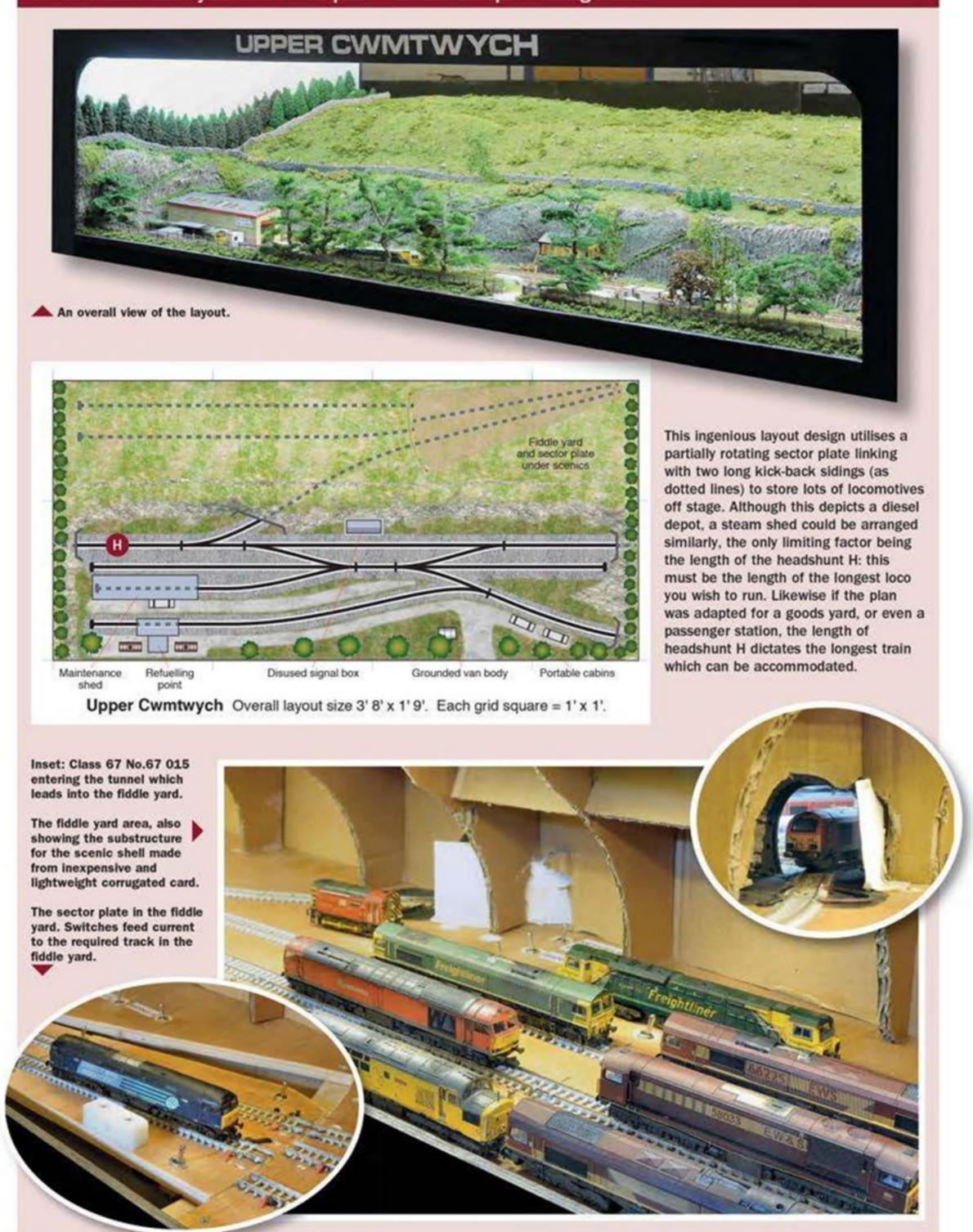
I was able to buy the point motors second-hand from Preston MRS. They had been used on its *Bee Lane* layout. We agreed a price and they have now been recycled thanks to Carl Bowden who helped me wire up the points and motors.

Whilst running a demonstration stand at the Workington exhibition I took the

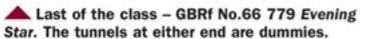
Network Rail-liveried Class 37 No.37 354 John Tiley passing the disused signal box.

opportunity to test the track and electrics thoroughly over the two days before adding any scenery. No problems were found. The layout was now made into a box with an open front. The roof of the box is hinged so that in transit it is flat but when exhibited it is raised 30° using two folded wings.

Lighting takes the form of LEDs over the scenic area, and beneath the scenery above the fiddle yard.

Scenery

Scenery was shaped using corrugated card formers followed by woven strips of thin card. This is then covered by three layers of industrial towels dipped in wallpaper paste.

Once all was dry, for the rock faces old bandages were tack-glued to the scenery to give a key for the the plaster that formed the rock face itself.

The hardwall plaster was applied with a spatula and shaped into rock surfaces using an old knife and fork. When dry it was coloured with poster paints.

On the front part of the layout I used static grass - another first for me - but the rest of

Scenics scatters.

The large trees were made from twisted wire, covered in plaster mixed with poster paint and finished with Woodland Scenics foliage mat. The fir trees were produced thanks to obtaining a bargain bag of plastic trees which were transformed by dipping in dilute PVA and covering all over in dark green scatter.

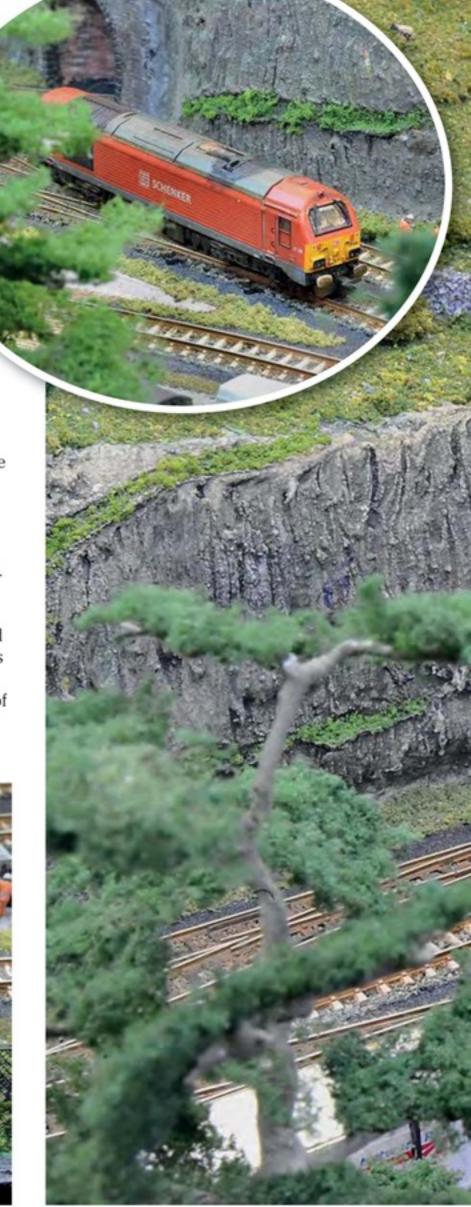
The dry stone walls were described in detail in my article on Llwyn Grug - see RAILWAY MODELLER May 2018.

The security fencing was created using the etched stainless steel fret from A1 Models.

Tunnel mouths began life as the Merit mouldings, but by adding individual computer chads and book binding punchings they were made to look different.

The refuelling point is a mixture of scratch- and kitbuilt. The base, bund and control office were made from card covered in computer chads. The corrugated roof was produced by rolling tinfoil between two coffee jar lids. This was also used on the roof of the refuelling rig, which was part of a Knightwing kit. Storage tanks were made





from two Peco tank wagon kits.

The loco maintenance shed was again scratchbuilt from card and finished with chads, punchings and corrugated foil. What can't be easily seen is the inspection pit in the shed.

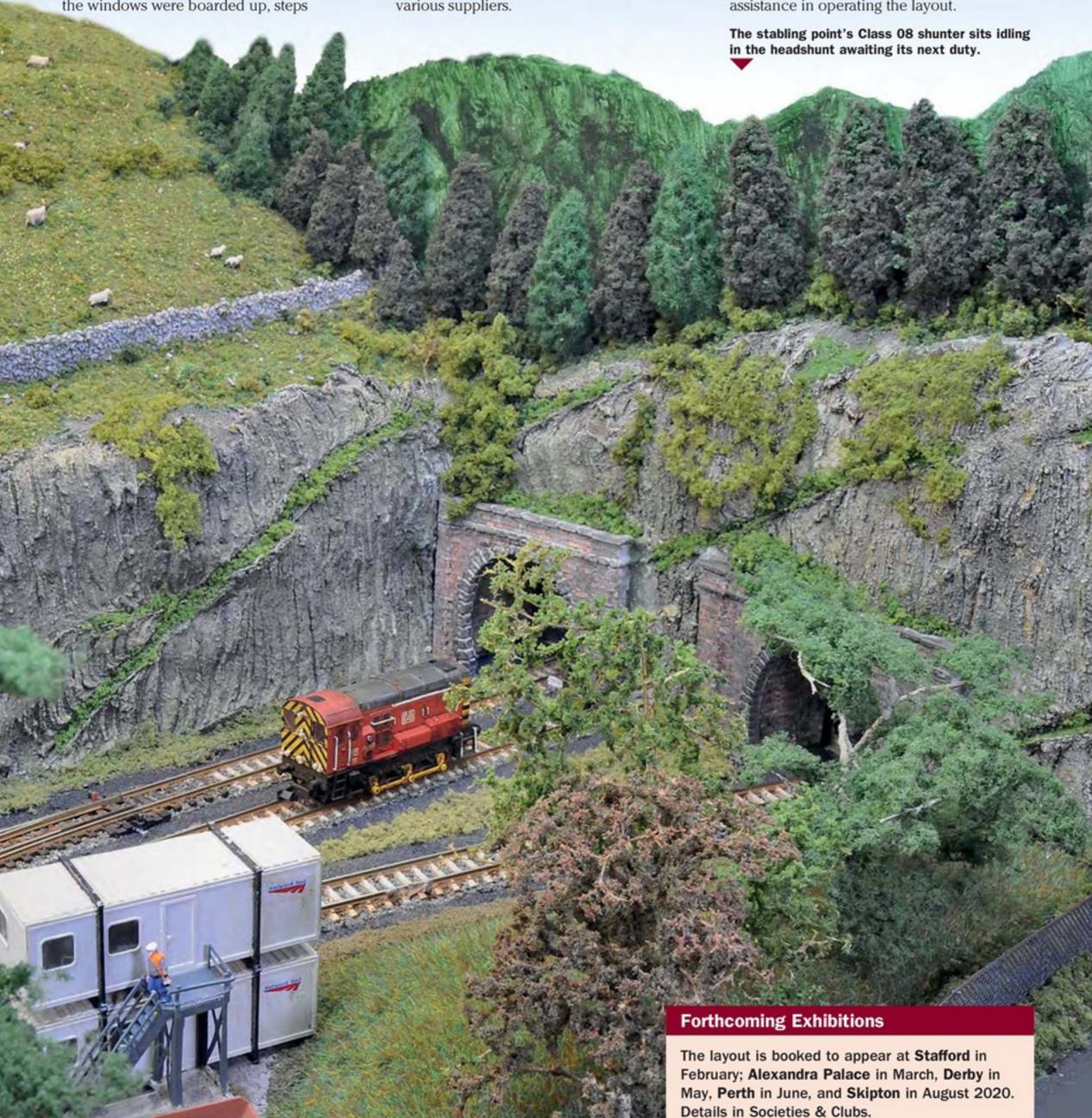
The disused signal box was salvaged from Llwyn Grug when the layout was refurbished, but as it was old I couldn't throw it away. So the windows were boarded up, steps distressed and graffiti added which includes the names of Bill and Gwyn who had helped me test the layout at Workington. The Network Rail staff are in the process of dismantling the box.

The workmen are from Graham Farish; vehicles are all by Oxford Diecast; portable cabins are Knightwing items; and oil drums, sacks, pallets and skips were obtained from various suppliers.

Best in show at first attempt

On its first invitation at the Southport exhibition it was a real surprise to have Upper Cwmtwytch voted as the best layout in the show!

Thanks must go to my friend and fellow modeller Tony Wright for undertaking the photography and to members of Preston & District Model Railway Society for their assistance in operating the layout.

Talking Points

Topical issues from the world of model railways

Railway Modelling - why are we so dedicated to the hobby?

Evan Williams contemplates the reasons why we spend so much time, energy and money on our model railways.

Photography as credited

It's a question I'm often asked by the non-modellers of this world. A question that I've asked myself many times. A question I ask when the grand plan just isn't working out, or when I've come away from a model railway show having seen such amazing exhibits I fear I'll never be able to emulate.

It's also a question I mull over whenever I'm stimulated to build another model railway. Inspiration for the next layout is sparked into life from all sorts of sources. It then grows arms and legs as I doodle plans and track formations on the back of an envelope. The trouble is, before I've thought the whole thing through properly, I'm already beginning to imagine my dream layout winning an award at a major exhibition, or appearing in the hallowed pages of RAILWAY MODELLER.

Hang on a minute: who am I aiming to please? What sort of satisfaction am I hoping to gain from the finished project? Is my latest layout just a means to an end, a quest for fame and glory?

Surely people are motivated by much more down-to-earth reasons for embarking on their model railway layouts at the outset. Aren't they? There could be a 101 reasons behind every modellers' dedication to the hobby. Here are just a few possibilities.

Recreating memories from the past

Many of us still recall where and when our love affair with railways began; others regret the time they spent on other interests and wish they hadn't let the trains pass by without properly observing them. Rose-tinted spectacles are especially useful here.

With this reason, the aim is to recreate in miniature the locomotives

and trains of a specific era, along with the environment in which they ran and the way in which the railway operated. For many older enthusiasts this can only mean steam trains and semaphore signals and, beyond the railway fence, road vehicles, street furniture and a way of life that reflects the chosen historical era.

Fascination with the present rail scene

A reason for many other, perhaps younger, modellers. The ideal here might be a contemporary railway model with all the bells and whistles that DCC control can provide. Rolling stock has the latest Train Operating Company liveries. There's state-of-the-art multiple-aspect signalling at the trackside and 21st century architecture for stations and nearby buildings. Making a model of what they know from first-hand experience.



Development of practical skills

Modellers seeking a means of gaining new skills embark on a project that can help them with achieving this objective. Sadly, and this is my opinion, I feel that the UK education system has short-changed young people in recent times by providing them with very little in the way of practical and technical education. For some reason, our schools have had no desire to turn out future Brunels, Telfords, or Stephensons. To construct a model railway, enthusiasts need to develop some of those practical and creative skills that they missed out on earlier in life. By that I mean, of course, woodworking, technical drawing, metalwork, electronics, art and design and so on. As well as achieving the aim of gaining new skills, it can also lead to a desire to acquire deeper knowledge and understanding of a specific aspect of the hobby. Taking up electronic control projects, perhaps with the help and support of organisations such as the Model Electronic Railway Group (MERG) and like-minded fellow-modellers.

Realistic railway operating

The days when a signalman would invite you up into his signal cabin for a chat, and perhaps an opportunity to pull a lever or two, are long since gone. Out of bounds too, is the Sunday shed-bash because of the need for increased security in railway installations.

Now, we could go off and set up our layout to be controlled with a smartphone or tablet... and that may indeed be how

the real modern railway can be operated, but for me I feel the best way to get up close to a working steam railway is to use traditional means of control, like a lever frame to change the points and signals, and also to run the trains as they used to be operated. Do you remember empty coaching stock brought from the sidings by the station pilot, the train loco with full tender, backing up from the the shed, and the express departing in a flurry of activity?

Shared experiences

Modelling can be a shared activity, whether in small groups with a common interest, or under the umbrella of a model railway society. Clubs and groups provide a social aspect to the hobby that can be especially desirable for those living alone.

Working together replicates the Victorian railways' concept of the 'Mutual Improvement Class'. This sharing of information embraces everything from historical and operational aspects of the real railway to the knowledge and skills needed to build a model. In fact everything you need to build a convincing layout, and of course it's not only experience that's shared, but also the cost of materials and the accommodation for the layout.

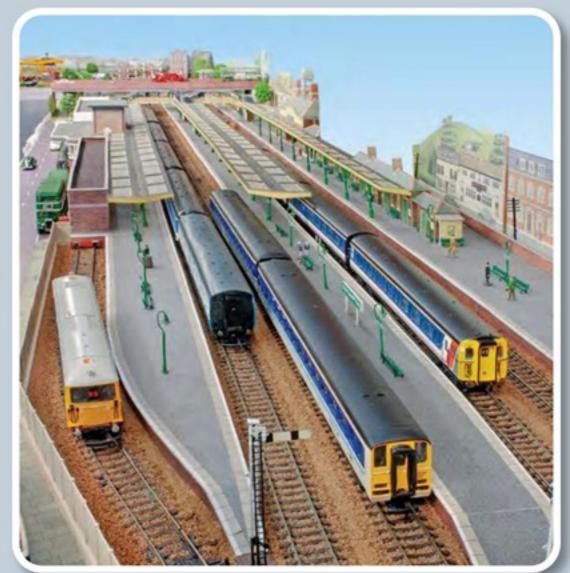

This reason is easy to comprehend. People who build such layouts find simply running trains to be very relaxing, and thanks

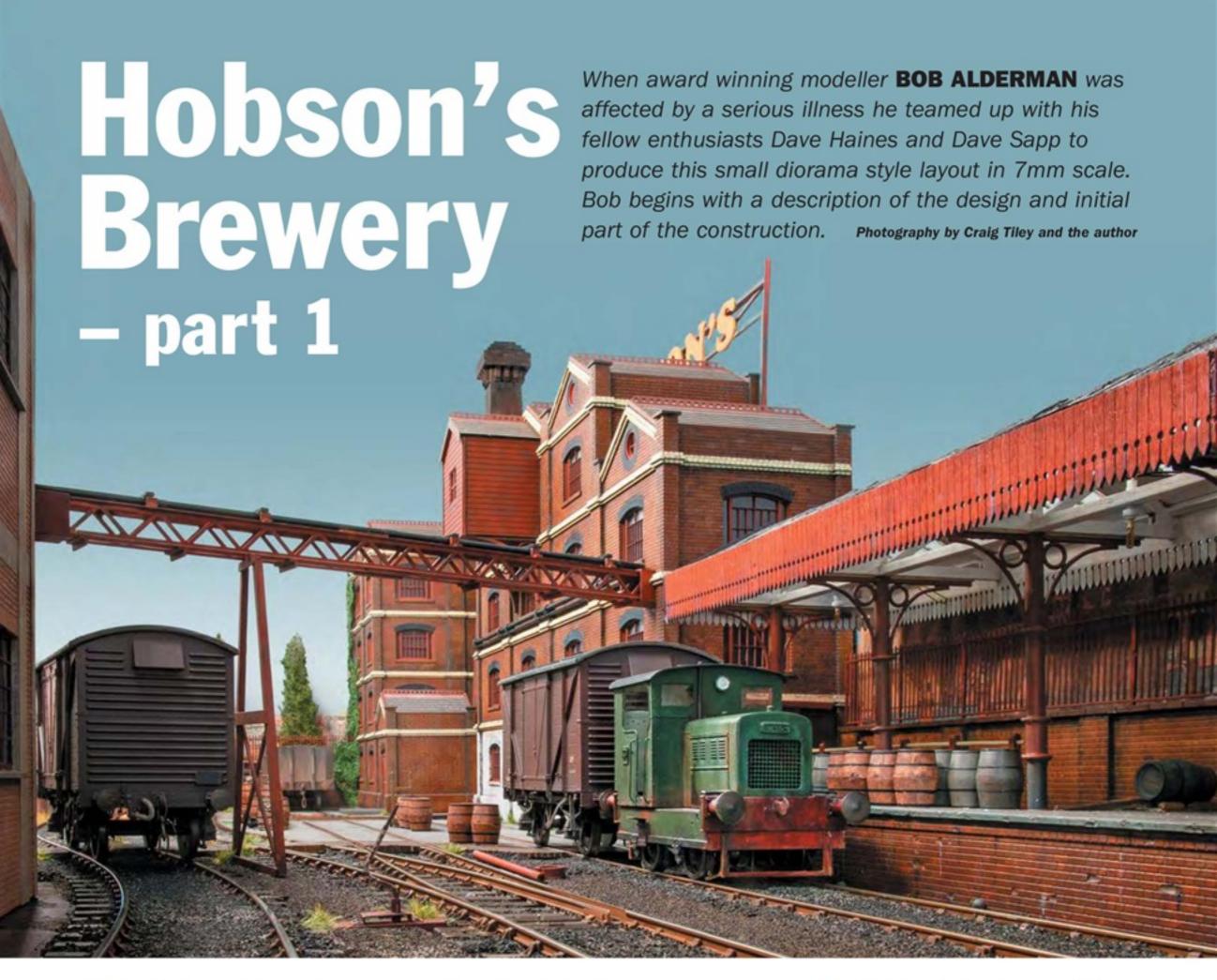
to the amazing range of ready-to-use and plug-and-play models from today's manufacturers, building such a layout can be stress free too!

obson's Brewery – the layout, came about because my modelling activities were steadily coming to an end. This situation had transpired because I was diagnosed recently with motor neurone disease, a progressively debilitating illness in which I would lose movement in my limbs and eventually much more.

So, this was to be my final layout, by way of defiance against my misfortune. It has however turned into a collaborative effort as my abilities waned; ending up with me supplying the ideas and others implementing them. My brain, their hands.

I'm not sure where the inspiration for the scene came from, apart for a fondness for real ale. I think a number of thoughts coalesced. Certainly the name came before I discovered there was a real Hobson's Brewery. I chose the name based on play and 1954 film *Hobson's Choice*, meaning that there is no real choice, but in this case it's IPA or stout!

Another factor was the choice of buildings. I am no longer able to scratchbuild as I used to, so a commercial item was needed and I figured I would be able to assemble a laser cut kit. I had noticed parts from the Intentio range (www.intentio.co.uk) for a modular factory frontage based on warehousing on Ipswich Cliff Quay (now in reality converted to trendy apartments). The style and period attracted me, so I drew up an outline based on a number of the modules. A further encouragement was that the factory frontage kit could be adapted from an essentially 2D backscene model to one with 3D depth. This followed a conversation with Phil the proprietor at Intentio, which found him more than willing to create the additional modules to add the depth. Moreover he added floors, roof parts and a back to make a structure; best of all Phil combined the many modules into single units. In addition he undertook to make the large chimney to my design.

One detail I didn't order was the lucam – the gable cantilevered out of the wall, housing a hoist. Phil at Intentio thought the structure needed it; a common feature of mills and breweries for hoisting grain.

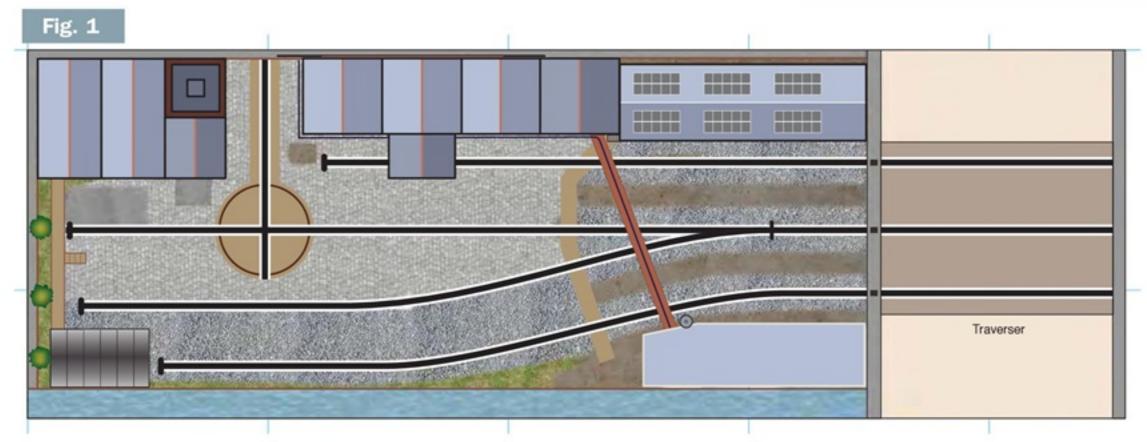
Similarly a friend Steve, at Yeovil MRG, undertook to make the building at the front. I Looking down the layout from the fiddle yard/traverser end. It's hard to believe that this is only 1050mm long in 7mm scale.

outlined it and he did the details. He has developed a surprising aptitude to design for laser cut objects. He built and painted it too.

Layout design

I did all the layout design on DeltaCAD, a CAD system I was using (but it could have been any other) whilst I was still able to manipulate a mouse. I was looking to create something that would have some operating potential whilst also creating an interesting picture. The layout was to be small. I had thoughts it could be transported alongside me in my wheelchair accessible vehicle. The diorama format lent itself to this.

Unlike earlier layouts, my long-held rule of thumb on design – that fewer than five points does not give interesting operation – had to be ignored, there really wasn't the room for more. In fact I could manage just one, but it had to be to a tight radius. I have never used commercial points before, preferring to make

my own, but now I had little choice. As it turned out, the Peco Setrack point would be ideal with some modifications. Similarly making plain track was not possible so once again Peco track was deployed.

Having set my 'rules' I started a preliminary sketch; somewhat more precise in CAD but a sketch nevertheless. Several iterations later a plan emerged. Even though plans are nearly always two dimensional flat drawings, I have always been able to imagine in my mind's eye how 3D renderings would look when complete. In this case, the historic brewery was to be along the back, with a more modern building at the front hiding the exit to the fiddle yard, further obscured by a pipe bridge. The final plan of the layout is illustrated in Fig. 1.

The fiddle yard was kept simple, a sliding table. I originally thought this would be within my limited abilities to use, but no. In the end it has been motorised.

I had built the whole layout in my head as a means of putting myself to sleep at nights: I knew it down to the last blade of grass!

I had been describing the evolution of the

layout on the Gauge O Guild website forum. This brought about some unanticipated results, several members of the Guild offered their help; Rob Pulham volunteered to make some ale wagons and Keith Newton to put an indexing drive on the fiddle yard. There have even been gifts of the real Hobson's ale!

To add to the operational interest there was to be a wagon turntable (see photo 1) in the guise of a suitable motorised laser-cut kit from Kitwood Hill Models (www.kitwoodhillmodels.com).

The layout was to be 'hands free' for all operations. Fiddling with three link couplings would be impossible, besides, they have always been anathema to me, so it would be my favoured Alex Jackson (AJ) couplings: they maintain the magic; no interloping hands, but, the big question – how to move wagons on and off the turntable?

Push-me - pull-you

I had experimented with this form of moving things in the past. That time it was for a proposed inclined plane on a 7mm model of part of Penrhyn Slate Quarry. My trials were successful, but the model was never built. So, based on those early assessments and a further simple test, it proved obvious that hauling a standard gauge wagon on the level with a magnet would be easy.

I designed what has become known as the 'push-me – pull-you'; as the mechanism for hauling wagons on and off the turntable. A toothed belt carrying a rare earth magnet is the basis of the drive belt (photo 2).

The turntable drive is a 12V motor with a 148:1 gearhead and a universal joint connection to allow less-precise alignment of the motor and mechanism to give more freedom of mounting.

The turntable's well was laser-cut by Intentio; one advantage of using the same supplier for the baseboard/enclosure fabrication was that the location and magnet clearance could be cut with all the other holes required in the baseboard such as uncoupling magnet positions. In my past career, I recall the problems of liaison between two different suppliers, so one supplier to do the lot is often easier. The design was near-perfect, but when it came to

the installation, Dave Haines had to do some further modifications to get it to perform effectively.

In the meantime the turntable kit arrived. There were many more parts than I anticipated but amongst them some slip-ring arrangements to keep the track live. This was useful as I could now run a loco across it. Construction was simple, speeded up by the use of superglue. It turned out, however, to be one of the last models I was able to make. When it was ready for installation it was dropped in place with packing pieces to set the level, then secured. This was completed with precision such that as a wagon passes across the gap between turntable and the adjacent fixed track there is barely so much as an audible 'click'.

Platform and canopy

In the corner at the right hand end of the brewery and beside the exit to the fiddle yard there is a covered platform (photo 3). The canopy is from Poppy's Woodtech. This I was able to assemble, though final details were left to Dave Haines. I just managed to cover the roof with tissue to represent elderly tarred felt. This has been mounted on a platform with barrel handling rails and a very well detailed surface which regrettably is largely out of sight!

Behind the canopy there is the boundary wall and a town scene beyond (photo 4). The wall is scratchbuilt in plasticard topped with Peco spear point fencing. On reflection I think the horizon is too low, putting the brewery on a hill.

The far end of the layout is similarly finished off in this way, but with some trees and shrubs added in to help break up the straight lines (photo 5). I even managed to sketch out what I wanted using CAD – Who says you can't sketch on CAD! (see Fig. 2)

The Brewery building

The kit of parts was the next to be tackled. Again there was much more to it than I had anticipated. Apart from the major panels there were many detail parts; string course overlays, window frames and glazing, buttresses and plinths.

My first job was to have Dave H spray all the brickwork with Halford's grey primer to give a good surface to paint over, rather than working with bare mdf. I was able to paint the majority of the brickwork on the brewery building as a slightly wobbly hand was not an issue (photo 6).

I use the Citadel acrylic paint for this sort of work. It covers well and has good colour



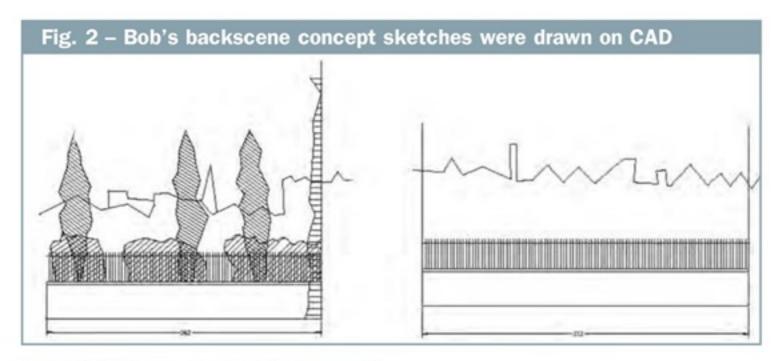




Photo 6. Bob busy painting the walls of the brewery building. At this time he still had the use of both hands.

density. There are three colours to create the brick tone; red, yellow ochre and a brown. A selection is picked up on the brush and mixed on the surface creating a patch of colour. This continues until the patches are joined together, resulting in a subtle variation in shades across the model (photo 7).

The mortar courses have not been accentuated, as in the era of the construction

of this building, mortar courses were narrow and black, being made with an ash content.

After the bulk of the painting had been done I handed over to Dave Haines to add the details and assemble the structure. The strips of string courses cut from white paper were too fine for me to handle. When they had been applied the contrast against the brickwork was a feature we thought could give character to the structure. They have been painted a yellowy cream.

The house colour of the brewery company is red oxide. Accordingly all windows, doors and other structures which would be made of wood are in this colour; all from a tin of Halford's primer.

The white wall is a safety feature. The wagons pass close to the wall so this is intended to improve visibility. Painting it badly removed the need to give it any weathering (photo 8)!

The roofs and ridges have been finished with slates and ridge tiles from York Modelmaking. They make a crisp job.

Once I had done my bit of painting that was the end of my physical input. It was down to Dave Haines to do the rest of the assembly and construction based on my drawings and CAD sketches. As construction progressed it prompted some ideas which I would then email to Dave. These he would implement, or open a discussion. For instance, when he was installing the small double doors, we discussed hinges. I jokingly

suggested Gothic with curlicues and that is what I got (photo 9)!

We only argued once, and that was when Dave proposed putting a 'Built in Swindon' plate on the water tank!

The tank of course is by Dapol, ex-Airfix. Though intended for 4mm it fits into a 7mm scene if some details are changed. The supporting structure needs to be more substantial and the safety rail around the inspection hatch requires resizing. Dave added a float contents gauge and he also gave it a magnificent paint job – two colours separated by gold line, though all this was lost under weathering.

Trackwork

When it came to track laying, the turntable was the first thing to be fitted. It is key to

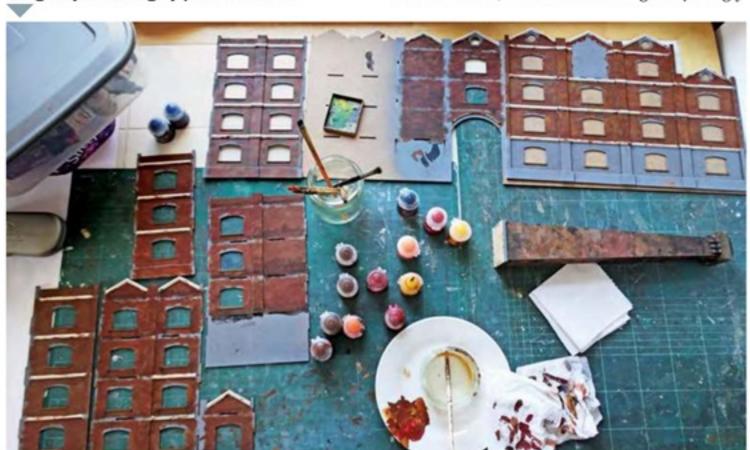

three tracks. Dave Sapp fettled it so that it revolved smoothly and Dave Haines fitted it. This was the datum point and working outwards from this the other tracks were steadily put in place. The single point required some surgery as most of the curved turnout section had to be removed to enable a proper reverse curve made that would connect to the adjoining parallel track (photo 10).

The track was pinned and glued directly to the ply as, for such a small layout, I felt underlay to be unnecessary. Train movements are short with lightweight stock, so there would be little noise to insulate against (photo 11).

You will notice a series of holes in the board under the track. These are the positions of the uncouplers.

Auto uncoupling

On previous layouts I have always used electromagnets for uncoupling the Alex Jackson hooks. The reason for this is that the magnetism is generated when needed, unlike a permanent magnet, which can induce unnecessary uncoupling. That is until I had a conversation with Dave Fenton who runs Megapoints. He told me of a layout that used permanent magnets lifted into uncoupling position by servos. As I had already decided to switch the point with a servo it seemed an obvious solution.

There are nine uncoupling positions.
Unusually I have provided more than would
be anticipated on a layout of this size, but
the micro-sized dimensions limit running to
just to and fro.

Anyway, initially I devised a lifting arm to which a small rare earth magnet would be fixed. That in turn would be linked to the servo arm which would swing up into position and unlatch the hook. However Dave Haines decided to do it differently. The magnet is now constrained by a brass tube in which it moves vertically up or down rather than in an arc (photo 12).

I had thought I would be able to select the magnets individually, but the selection process would require different inputs from me, and could end up being prolonged. So we decided that a single command up or down would operate all the magnets simultaneously. It should have no effect other than on the vehicle in question.

Track detailing

I originally envisioned all but the track at the front to be embedded in granite setts. Dave went his own way here, reducing the amount of embedded track and increasing the amount of ash ballasted track. I wonder if he didn't relish fitting so much plastic sheet? I

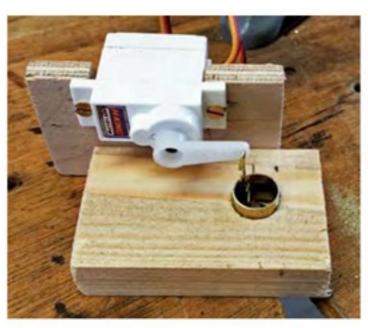

must confess I had not worked out a way to fix it, leaving its installation until after the track was in place.

In spite of this I agree with what has been done. The larger area of setts would have looked bleak. Similarly the wooden walkway was not in my vision but is a good addition that takes the eye through the scene to the somewhat hidden loading platform.

Some hidden detail is inside the building at the right hand end, obscuring the fiddle yard exit. Another friend Graham, one of my regular operators on *St Martins Wharf [Ed. – see RM June 2018]* wanted to do something for the layout. All we could think of was that we had something to fill the obviously empty building. He came up with a vat of some kind that looks

like an item of production equipment found in a brewery (photo 13).

Another deviation from the initial design is the finish of the front edge of



the yard. On my plan this was labelled 'stream'. I had even done a drawing of the wall; red brick to the left, blue brick replacement for the foundations of the building and random drain pipes emerging from it. Dave stuck largely to this notion, but turned the stream into a silted canal spur and added timbers to the wall (photo 14).

The pipe bridge

The basics of the pipe bridge were drawn before construction of the layout was started. It uses a Plastruct truss. The drawing defined the joints between sections and the joints across the two trusses. On the plan I could have taken the overall length BUT I could not allow for the position of either building being exactly where they were on the plan. So the drawing allowed the bridge to be made overlong and trimmed on installation.

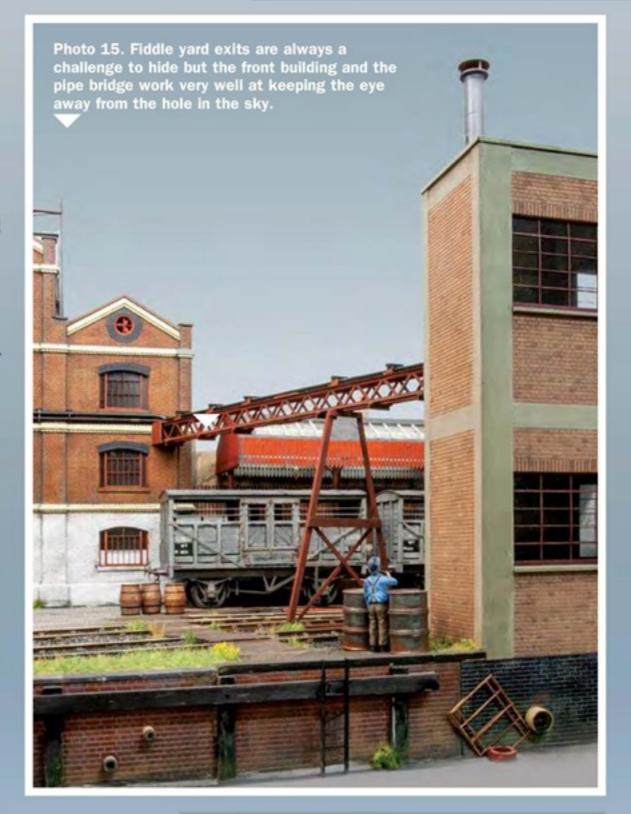
Dave Haines undertook the construction and installation. Copper tube was used for the pipes. This was used as it could be bent to the curves for direction changes; something not possible with plastic as they were tight bends. I was unable to find a suitable product for ready-made bends. I did wonder if the A frame support was necessary but it has gone in. Its position helps as another view blocker to the fiddle yard exit (photo 15).

Layout lighting

The layout is illuminated with a lighting fitment intended for use under kitchen top cupboards. LED lighting strips were used briefly, but the self-adhesive backing failed and they fell off!

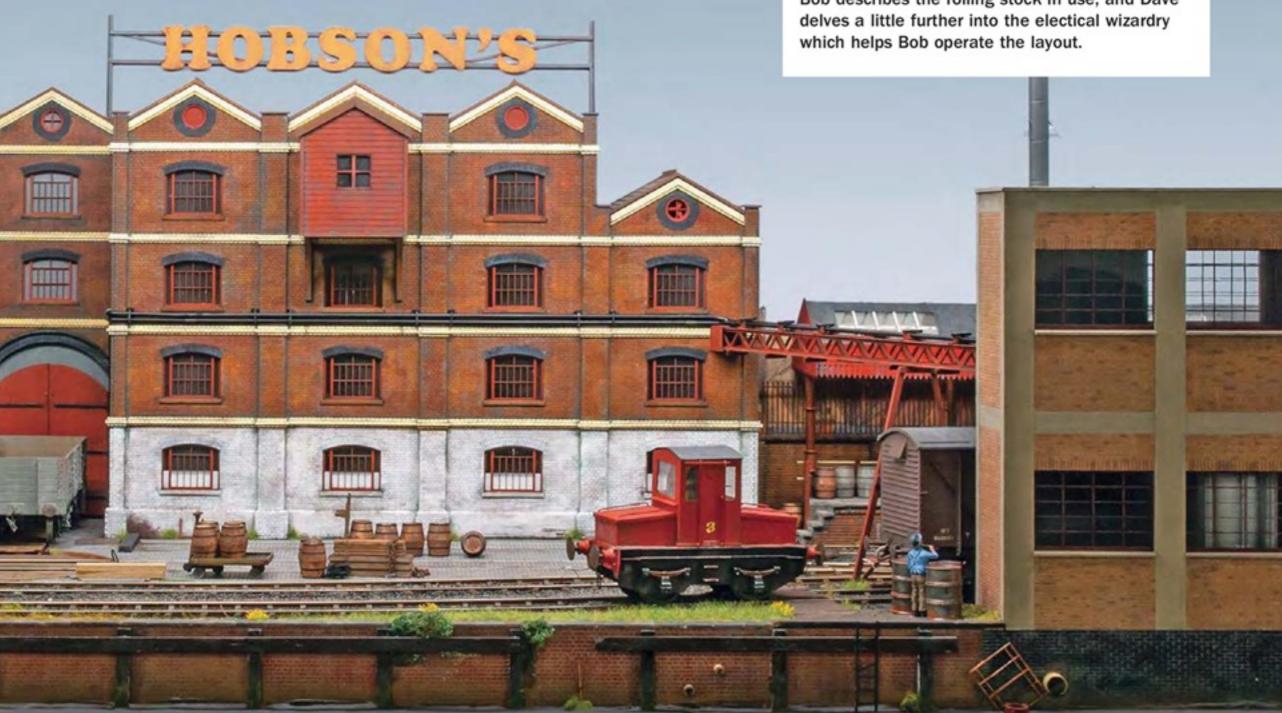
The buildings are lit too. My choice is to use grain of wheat bulbs. Run at 9V they last indefinitely and, I feel their radiant glow is more in keeping with the period. LEDs are too harsh, lacking the warmth of an incandescent bulb. To fit the bulbs inside the brewery, straws were secured inside inserted through the back wall. They end about halfway across the building. Grain of wheat bulbs are pushed down them until they just reach the end. They are connected together in parallel to run on 9 – 12V dc.

Stanley

JOHN FARLINE recounts how 'Project 60' - a layout to mark the diamond jubilee of the Wakefield Railway Modellers Society - came to fruition; it is a 4mm scale model of the former station on the Methley Joint Line in west Yorkshire. Layout photography by Derek Shore

n 2018 the Wakefield RMS celebrated the 60th anniversary of its founding. Two years earlier the Society's committee had decided that the occasion should be commemorated in some way and that a layout, based upon a Wakefield area station, should be constructed and be ready for the 2018 show.

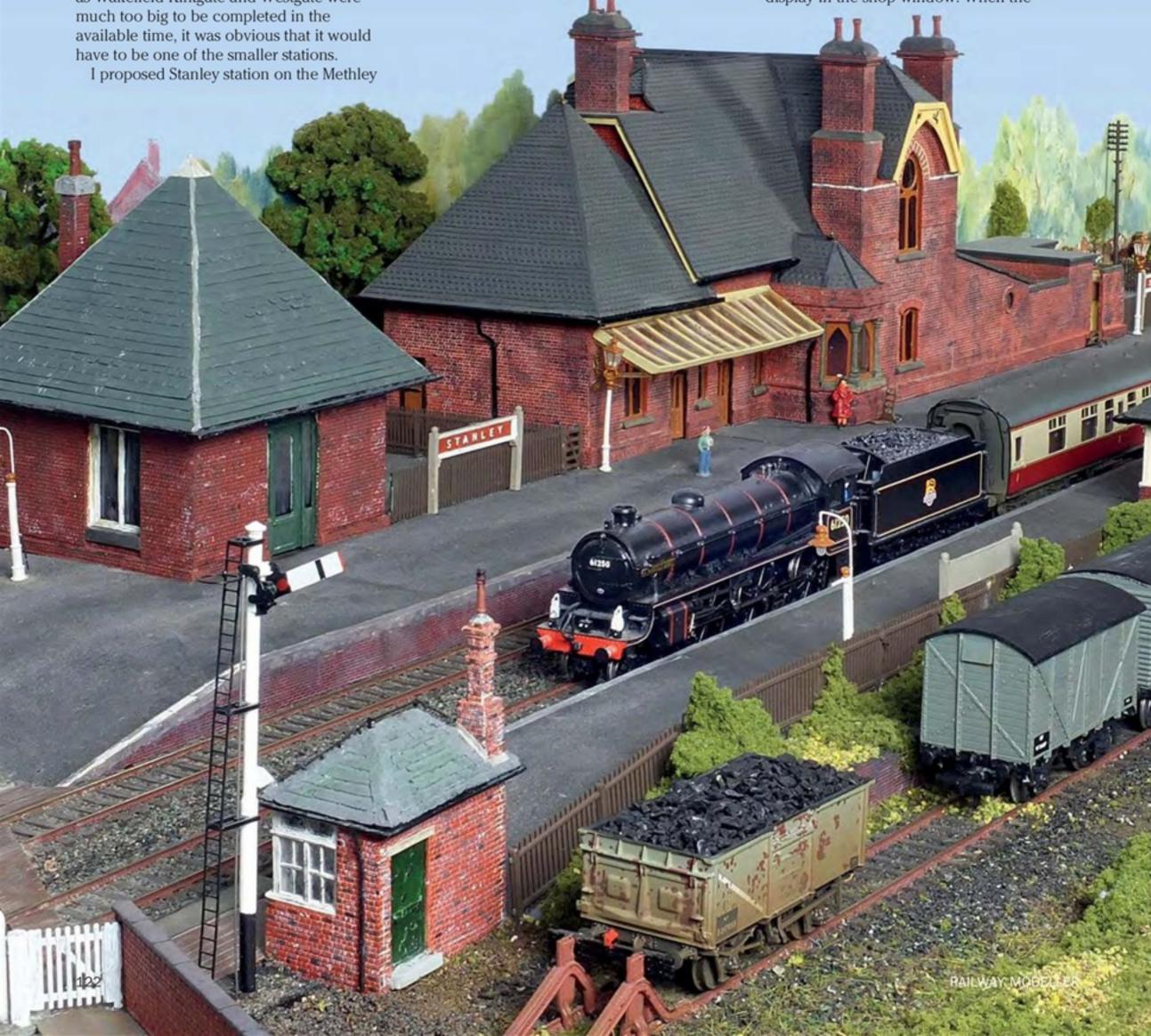
Members were asked for suggestions and, as Wakefield Kirkgate and Westgate were

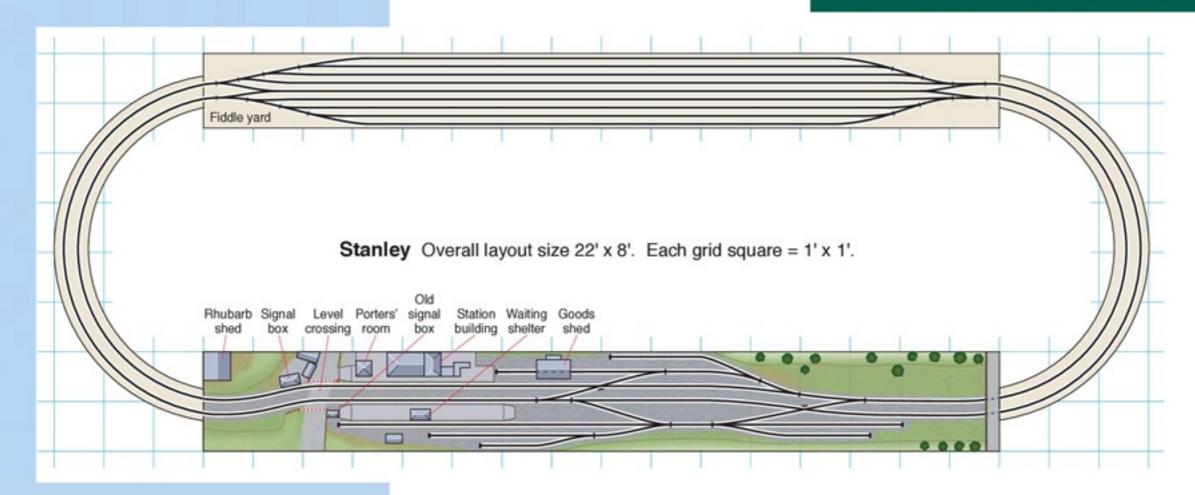
Joint line. It is no longer standing, but I have a considerable number of photographs and information about it (see February 2011 edition of RAILWAY MODELLER).

After much discussion my proposal was accepted and a team of volunteers organised: an OO gauge portrayal of Stanley was underway.

Structures

After the publication of my article on Stanley I was contacted by Alan Oakey, who told me that he'd built a 4mm scale model of Stanley station based on the information in the article. He sent me photographs of his models which were very impressive. I later met Alan at our local model shop, Going Loco, where his Stanley diorama was on display in the shop window. When the







go-ahead had been given for the team to commence construction of the layout, I asked Alan how he had made his buildings and whether he would be prepared to loan them to our project until we had constructed our own versions. He said that he had sold the diorama to a couple of members of the Society, Clive and Richard Whitehouse!

They agreed that we could borrow the models for the proposed layout. Footprints of the buildings were drawn and, eventually, these were used to position the buildings on

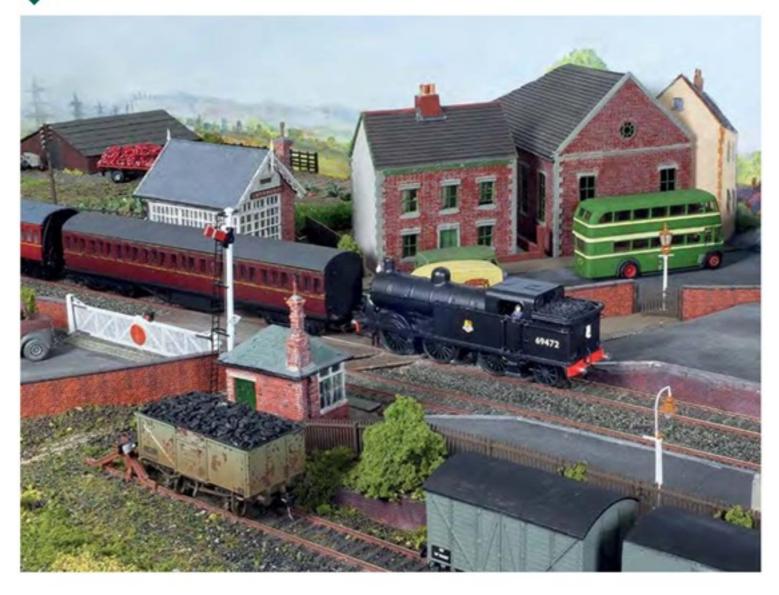

the baseboards. The signal box was deemed to be unsuitable as Alan Oakey had used a modified Hornby model. However, our then chairman, Mike Watson, said that he had a model of a GNR 'box that was fairly close to what we required. Another building had not been modelled; what we believe to be the original signal box, which was located diagonally opposite the main 'box on the other side of the level crossing.

Design

Several basic parameters had to be decided before construction could commence. The main ones were: the layout to be as accurate as possible for the year 1958; operation to be by DCC; and pointwork to be operated by servos connected to the DCC system. The latter two items were made the responsibility of Neale Burrows, our resident DCC expert, who also tackled the baseboards. Trackwork – Peco Streamline code 75 – was to be done

by Mel Price and David Stockdale. The layout supports are adjustable metal trestles purchased from a DIY store.

Construction

Firstly a copy of the OS map of the station area was printed for us to 4mm scale, which allowed us to determine the overall size of the baseboards, in particular for the station area at the viewing side of the layout. The overall size of the layout is 22' x 8'.

Previously, some baseboards had been donated to the Society and we were lucky to find that they were perfect for the scenic section. This meant that Neale only had to construct the end radius boards and those for the fiddle yard. Cork sheet was glued down on the donated boards and, using the OS plan as a guide, the track plan was drawn onto the cork. Track laying and wiring could then commence.

Steve Sampson painted the backscene; as a resident of Stanley at the time of the period being modelled, he was able to create a very accurate scene, one which is very familiar to local residents who see the layout.

Buildings

I produced drawings for the two signal boxes, but this was not easy as we didn't have good photographs of either building. As we had no original drawings I had to count bricks and relate items such as windows to drawings of GNR signal boxes which we found in a couple of publications in the Society's library. We'd decided that the 'box offered to us by our chairman was not accurate enough to depict the one at Stanley so Mel Price offered to construct it whilst I built the model of the original one. Both were made from polystyrene sheet and Wills brick sheets. Amazingly (or was it pure luck?) the two completed buildings matched the footprints shown on the OS plan.

As the other buildings were on loan we would have to construct replacements. Drawings thus had to be made so, once again, I got busy counting bricks! I produced drawings for the porters' room, the waiting shelter and the goods shed, all as seen in photographs taken around the period that we were modelling. David Woodward offered to build the goods shed and I decided that I would build the porters' room.

Ian Clasper, one of our overseas members offered to make a kit of parts for the station building as practice in the use of his 3D printing machine. Our one and only Australian member Tony Weber volunteered to build the waiting shelter.

Unfortunately, neither of these buildings was ready for the photo shoot so the station building and shelter are the originals built by Alan Oakey; the tiles on the porter's room are larger than those on the station building because Alan used Wills tile sheets whereas I used strips of styrene sheet. The goods shed seen in the photographs is the replacement one built by David Woodward.

Electrics and control

Neale Burrows was in charge of the electrical work, which included the DCC power to the tracks, signals and, eventually, the operating level crossing gates.

There is a twin cable bus running underneath the baseboards around the entire layout with wire droppers from the rails at regular intervals. Control is split into up and down line buses to ensure that, in the event of a derailment on either of the lines, any subsequent electrical short will not shut down power to the other line, or the entire layout. Each bus is protected by a 21W bulb.

The turnouts are operated by servo motors mounted underneath the baseboards and are driven by a Megapoints servo controller linked to a multi-panel system that can, effectively, control 192 outputs and includes

a mimic panel at each end of the layout. Indication is given on the panels by LEDs to show the selected point position.

Also connected to the multi-panel is a DCC interface which has the ability to connect the two main systems of XpressNet and LocoNet handsets and has a wi-fi server built in for use with Android devices such as mobile phones, tablets, etc, or proprietary wi-fi handsets such as wi-fi Multimaus. The system also allows USB and network LAN connections for PC control software to be used. The system is obviously very versatile and can be used to run the operator's preferred control method.

Scenery

There's not a lot of scenery beyond the boundary fence since the layout is concentrated on the station area. At the western end of the station the land increased in height to form a shallow cutting crossed by a girder bridge. Our present chairman, Chris Burnage, created this landscape by shaping two lengths of polyurethane foam (much better than polystyrene) to form the gradually increasing cutting. These were then covered in the usual ground cover products from various suppliers. There are a couple of landscape cameos which are the work of our exhibition manager, Stephen Foster, which depict the local rhubarb industry. Stanley is situated in what is known as the 'rhubarb triangle' and Stephen has captured the local features of the rhubarb fields and the distinctive buildings of the rhubarb forcing sheds very well.

The layout is illuminated by strips of LEDs under the upper fascia boards.

Locomotives and rolling stock

We are very much reliant on members to provide the motive power and stock. However, only items depicting subjects which would have run through Stanley are allowed on the layout at shows. This does give us a wide variety of locomotive classes although the numbers on the models are probably incorrect for the area that we are modelling.

As mentioned earlier, the layout is set in the Society's founding year of 1958 and, to make things more interesting, it is summer and the high season timetable is in operation. This means that there are a lot more trains than usual, including holiday excursions to east coast resorts such as Bridlington and Cleethorpes which would be hauled by Black Fives, B1s or the occasional Jubilee. Local services tended to use tank engines such as G5s, C12s and N1s. The majority of the locomotives and rolling stock were supplied by Ray Clasper and Dennis Cannon. Ray built the C12 and G5 especially for the layout. The N1 came from his son Ian and has a 3D printed superstructure; but not one created by lan. Ray also modified several of the Peco grounded vans, as supplied free with RAILWAY MODELLER, so that they can now run on the layout.

Dennis's models are from Hornby and Bachmann with some modified and weathered by TMC.

One service which must be mentioned was the rhubarb specials which ran during the night, probably hauled by an Ardsley shed V2. The train was assembled at Ardsley and ran non-stop to London with its load of fruit vans containing rhubarb for Covent Garden market. Some of these vans would have been loaded at Stanley goods shed.

cream or maroon liveries. You'll notice that I didn't state carmine & cream. I've always been puzzled by that description of the main line gangwayed coach livery in model and prototype railway magazines as, in my copy of the July 1949 supplement to Railway Pictorial and Locomotive Review, it quite clearly states that the colour was crimson lake. The material in the supplement was reproduced by courtesy of the Railway Executive and included details of all liveries and even dimensions for the various types of lining so I presume that it is correct. It's an invaluable reference for modellers.

We have a great variety of wagons and, of course, with the layout set in the West Riding of Yorkshire we have to have coal trains. As mentioned above, fruit vans are also a necessity.

Conclusion

As our team, which took part in Series 1 of The Great Model Railway Challenge, know very well, trying to build a layout to a deadline is not a good idea. Our committee told us that Stanley had to appear at the Society's annual show in mid-November 2018 which, at one time, appeared to be very unlikely. However, thanks to some frantic work during the two weeks before the exhibition, and the very welcome assistance of other members, we achieved our goal.

The layout didn't have all the details that we would like to have seen and there is more work to do on it. This includes electric operation of the signals and crossing gates. Point rodding is something else that we would like to have and, also, we will need transportation cradles. The layout will be going to the Pontefract show in January 2020.

Finally, probably the most satisfying aspect of showing the layout in November 2018, was how well it was received by the people who saw it and, in particular, by those who lived in the Stanley area who could remember the station when it was still open.



Scale Drawings

The buildings at Stanley station, except for the signal box, appear to be unique to that location. From the enormous roof on the porters' room to the fancy tiles and brickwork on the station building, I can't think of anywhere else with this style of architecture, although there were some similarities at some of the stations between Wakefield and Doncaster. However, none were as architecturally elaborate as Stanley. Even the timber and brick waiting shelter doesn't seem to have been quite the same as others on the Great Northern Railway

system. Although the line was a joint venture between the Great Northern, North Eastern and Lancashire & Yorkshire railways, it was the GNR which had responsibility for the infrastructure, including the signalling. Perhaps the architect was allowed to design whatever he fancied.

The big problem I had was that the only things that I could work from were photographs because, as far as I know, the original drawings don't exist and the station was razed to the ground in the 1960s. Unfortunately, several of the photographs in

my collection were not very clear so that when I got round to counting bricks some assumptions had to be made.

My drawing of the station building was published in the February 2011 issue of RAILWAY MODELLER, so I won't repeat it here. The latest drawings are for the porters' room, the goods shed, the waiting shelter, the signal box and what I believe is the original signal box; a considerably smaller building.

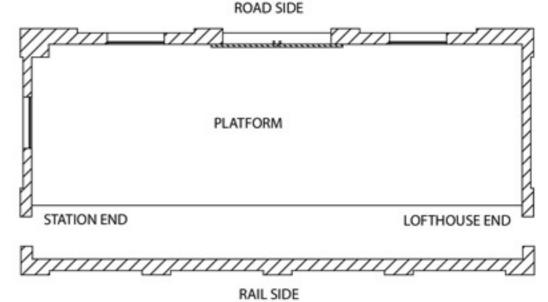
The buildings are drawn, as far as I can ascertain, as they appeared around 1958.

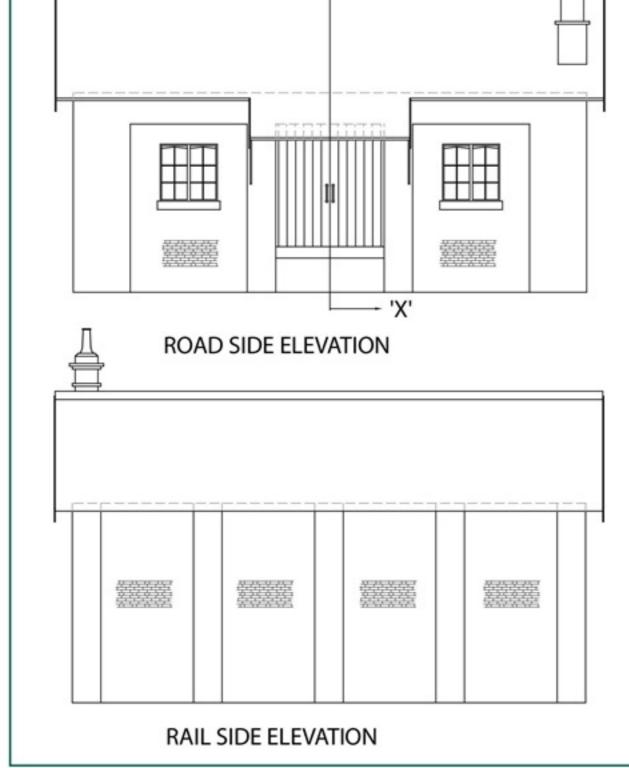
The goods shed

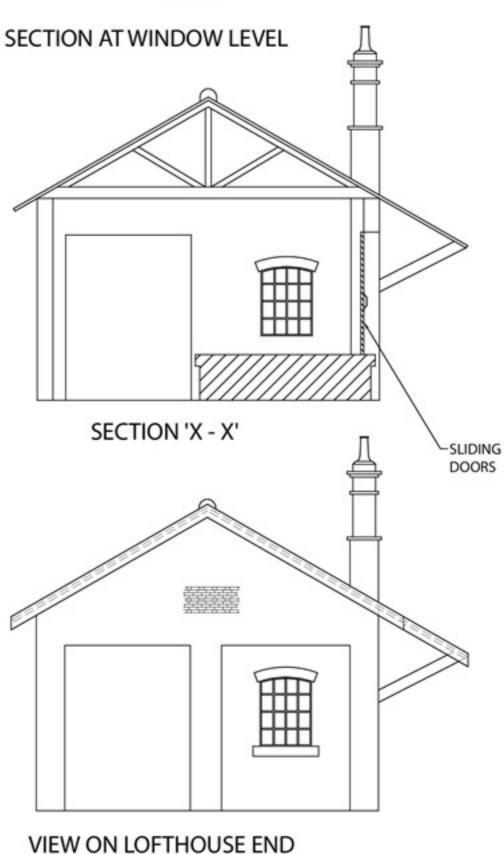
As the only photographs I have of this building are fairly obscure, I have had to use the footprint shown on the OS map as the only fairly accurate dimensions that I can work out. On one of the photographs it is just possible to see how many brick pillars there were along the rail side of the building. The road side has been drawn as a typical GNR shed with a short sloping roof over the vehicle loading platform. The end openings originally had slatted timber sliding doors but these had disappeared by 1958.

This has been drawn from measurements obtained by counting bricks on the base section and then using proportions for the timber upper part of the building. Luckily I have several good photographs of this building.

Whether or not it was the original 'box, I don't know, but with its position adjacent to the level crossing it would seem to be a fair assumption. Once again I had to count bricks and compare proportions which was not easy as the photographs are not particularly clear. However, the building's footprint does match that on the OS map.

RAILSIDE VIEW

One feature which has baffled me is what appear to be metal rods mounted on the roof. I've included these on the drawing but I'm not sure if they would have still been *in situ* in 1958. I've shown the entrance door at the rear of the building but this is pure conjecture as I have no views of that side.

The signal box

This is a standard GNR type with the entrance door, steps and other details as seen on photographs of that at Stanley. The biggest problem I had was in determining the window arrangement, which varied depending on which photograph I was looking at. Eventually I decided that the arrangement shown on the drawing was probably correct for the period around 1958.

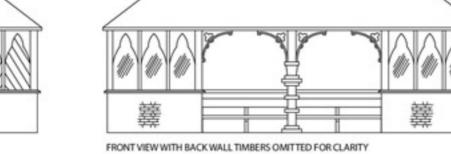
The waiting shelter

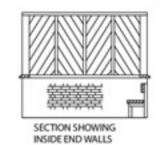

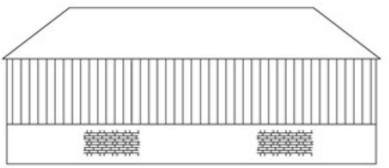
The shelter was on the eastbound side of the station, served by trains heading towards Castleford. The Great Northern built many such structures across its system.















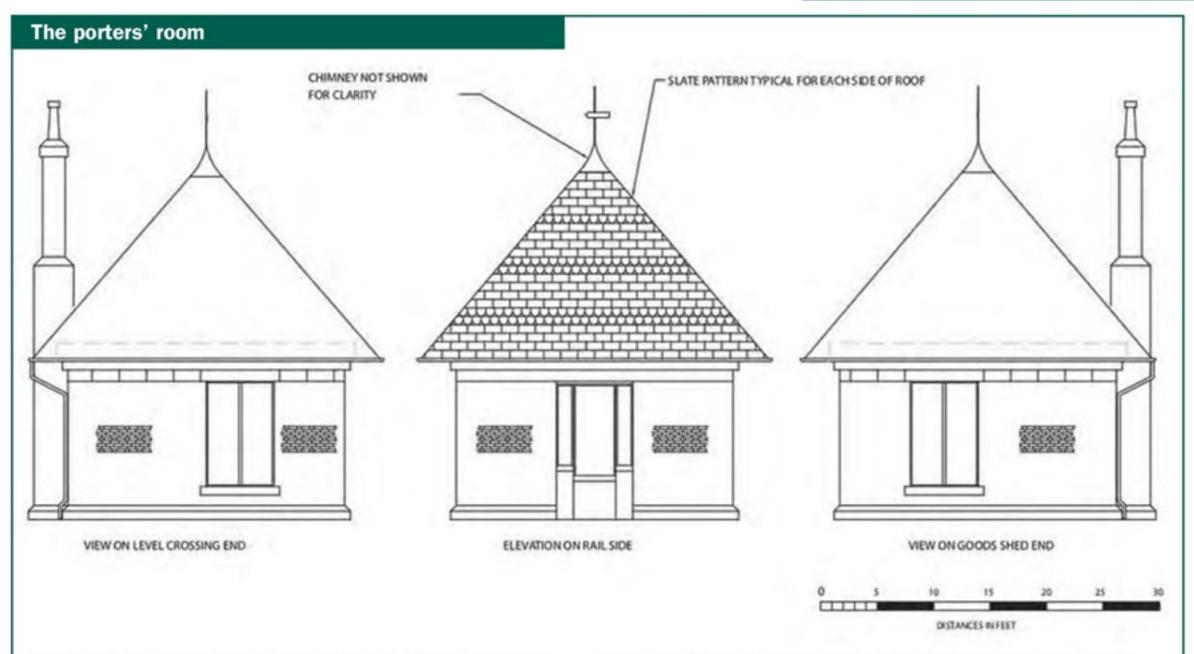
SECTIONAL PLAN VIEW ON BRICK WALLS

I've given it this name as that is what it was in 1958. However, it may well have been used for another purpose when it was built. The outstanding feature is the enormous pyramid-shaped roof. This has a similar pattern of tiles as seen on the main station building. In earlier years there was what appears to have been a weather vane fixed to

the apex of the roof. Another interesting feature is the door into the building as this appears to have been about 10' to 12' high. The building, like the station building, was set about 18" below the 1958 platform level.

ooking at photographs of model railways, however realistic, the human figures are usually the most obvious item that reveals one is looking at a model and not the real thing. As in any art form, the human figure always presents the most difficult challenge. So, when starting my first foray into O gauge, and having built the excellent Alphagraphix etched brass kit of the Irish Timoleague & Corkmacsherry Light Railway 0-4-2 locomotive St Molaga, I decided the figures within would have to be just right - or as right as I could make them. My attempt is described below.

Bodywork adjustments

I started by selecting two of Hardy's Hobbies 3D printed figures, scanned from actual people. This would be a good start.

My completed model of the T&CLR locomotive St Molaga, built from an Alphagraphix kit, and ready for service.



The 3D printed figures from Hardy's Hobbies arrive with the support framework which has to be removed and smoothed with care.

The figures were a driver and fireman; the driver was leaning on one elbow on the cab side, but would his elbow be at the right height? I contacted Hardy's Hobbies and the firm willingly stretched the driver's legs and shortened his torso so he would fit the cab side ledge and not bang his head on the cab side opening!

Preparation

The figures duly arrived through the post. Each was connected to a frame which is part of the 3D printing process, and needs removing and cleaning up very carefully; the material is quite brittle (photo 1). Indeed, I later clumsily dropped the fireman onto a hard floor and his foot came off, a trace of cyano adhesive did the repair.

The driver also needed minor surgery to his hip and foot to fit him into the narrow space available in the cab. Careful use of a flat needle file did the job.

Primer

Halfords grey primer. The cleaned-up photos 2 and 3, fireman and driver respectively.

Brushes

I use a Pro-Arte 2/0 white nylon brush for large areas (say the overalls) and a 10/0 Pro-Arte Miniature Painting brush for detail (photo 4). I have plenty of light and and use an Optivisor magnifying binocular for close work.

Patience

An artist's palette or an old plate can be used for mixing paint; it can be quite badly mixed! Handling the figures should be minimised as this can impart an unwanted sheen. The best sequence is to spend only a few minutes at a time actually painting and then leaving 24 hours to dry before continuing.

Applying the colours

I started with the flesh, mixing Flesh 61 with Light Grey 64 and using my own arm for colour reference. Flesh 61 alone is too bright; drivers and firemen are rarely cherubic after a day on the footplate!

Next came the hair; Light grey 64; Dark grey 32 and Brick Red 70 not mixed and applied, but built up steadily by dry brushing. Eyebrows as hair. I left the eyes as being just too small; shading (later) was sufficient.

Lips are Flesh 61, a touch of Light grey 64 plus very little Scarlet 60. This is where the patience comes in useful – best to let the flesh dry thoroughly overnight before painting the lips.

The shirts were Aircraft blue 65 for the driver and Mid green 101 for the fireman, colours I happened to have in stock, but appropriate to the job in hand. I painted smaller clothing details first and finished on the overalls.

The fireman is wiping his neck with a rag; to accentuate this I painted it Scarlet 60. His tie (small wonder he is too hot!) is Trainer yellow 24 as is the lining of his cap. The outside of his cap is Dark Grey 32/Brick red 70 mixed.

The driver's tie is Ochre 83. Boots are Brick red 70. The sole edges are Railmatch Weathered black as this is later used to darken the shiny glue holding them down to the footplate.

Lastly, the main colour for the overalls, a mixture of Blue 25 and Light grey 64.

Once thoroughly dry the figures, now looking far too smart (photos 5 and 6), need 'weathering' if that's the right term!

I put a dab of Dark grey 32 next to a drop of thinners onto a palette. Allow the two to blend but don't mix them. A fine brush can be used to pick up varying quantities of thinner and colour depending on where it is to be placed.

Lie the figures down and drop a very small quantity of the mix onto the model, face and all. This should be allowed to run into the creases to form shadows, general dirt and even represent the eyes.

Do not overwork and do not use so much that the mix runs all over the place and under the figure; just sufficient to run into the creases. Once dry turn them over and repeat for the other side of the figures.

Installing

Add them to the loco cab with buckets of real coal, oil cans (also available from Hardy's Hobbies) and any other detail.

I fixed my figures in place with Roket Card glue and disguised the shiny adhesive with Railmatch Weathered black. I also added representations of gauges and pipework, regulator, etc. from the scrap box.

Whilst not perfect, especially in cruel close-up in the photographs, at normal viewing distances I feel these figures look reasonably convincing. A very satisfying mini-project.

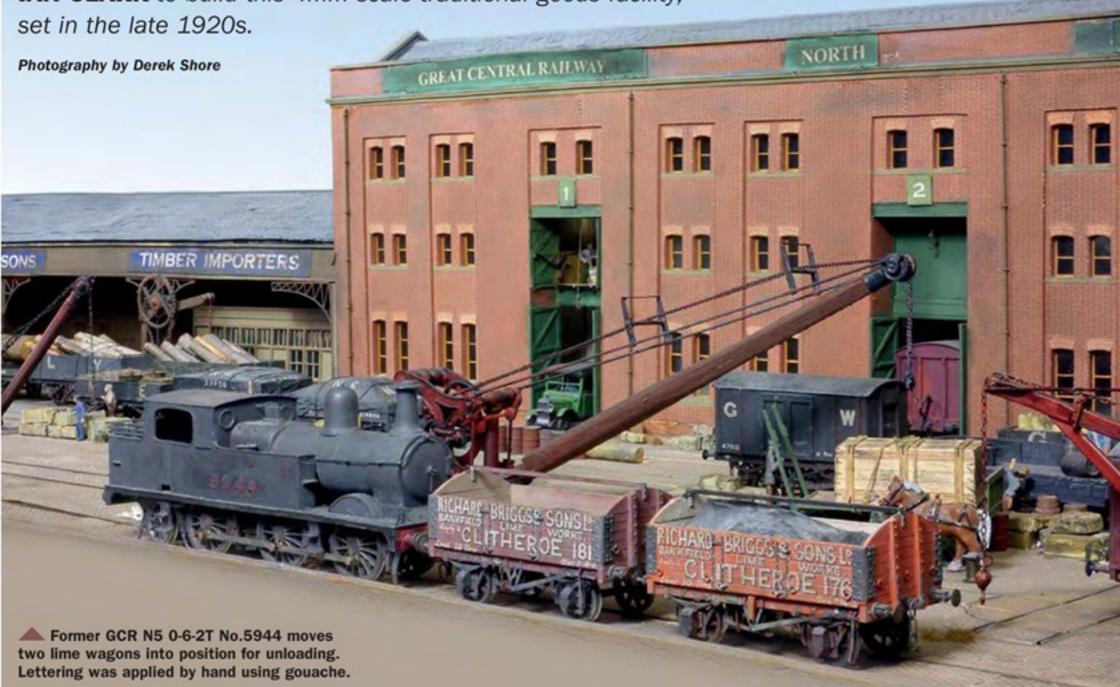

An urban goods yard

Memories of a former Midland Railway site in the city of Sheffield prompted

IAN CLARK to build this 4mm scale traditional goods facility,



n the early 1960s I travelled quite regularly between Rotherham and Sheffield on the No.69 bus. On the northbound journey I always tried to occupy a nearside seat on the upper deck. As the bus traversed Savile

Street in Sheffield this enabled me to peer over the very high wall - 27 courses of bricks plus a stone capping - and into the former Midland Railway Wicker goods yard. Of course the main purpose of this exercise was to try and spot the numbers of the shunting engines, but I became fascinated by the

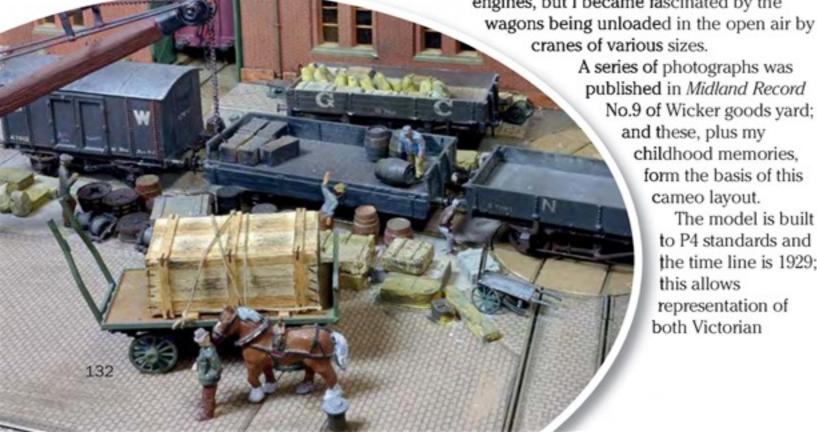
locomotives and rolling stock through to the standard types introduced by the Big Four in the mid-1920s.

The setting is north Lincolnshire, just south of the Humber estuary. The facility was originally built by the Manchester, Sheffield & Lincolnshire Railway (MS&LR), which became the Great Central Railway (GCR) in 1897 and the LNER at the beginning of 1923.

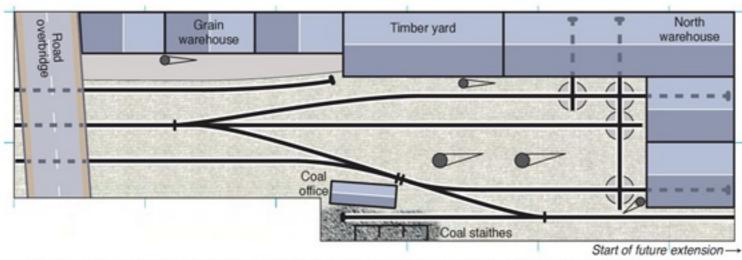
General description

The left-hand side of the layout is dominated by a large road overbridge which spans several tracks that lead to the various warehouses. The first of these is the grain warehouse, which has a large number of sacks waiting to be loaded into vans or

moved inside. In the centre are the premises of timber importer Martyn Frobisher & Sons, which has taken out a 999 year lease on the site. At the right-hand end stands the large north warehouse, where general merchandise is dealt with.

At the front of the model are the coal staithes and the offices of A. Lacey & Co Ltd. Lacey's was a coal merchant in Kingston-upon-Hull, but I decided the firm would have had a business on the south bank of the Humber as well.

The buildings

Most of the model buildings I have made in the past have represented stone-built structures. In the area modelled here there are few stone buildings and ways had to be found to represent brickwork. The real problem was that I have never been able to get on with brickpaper.

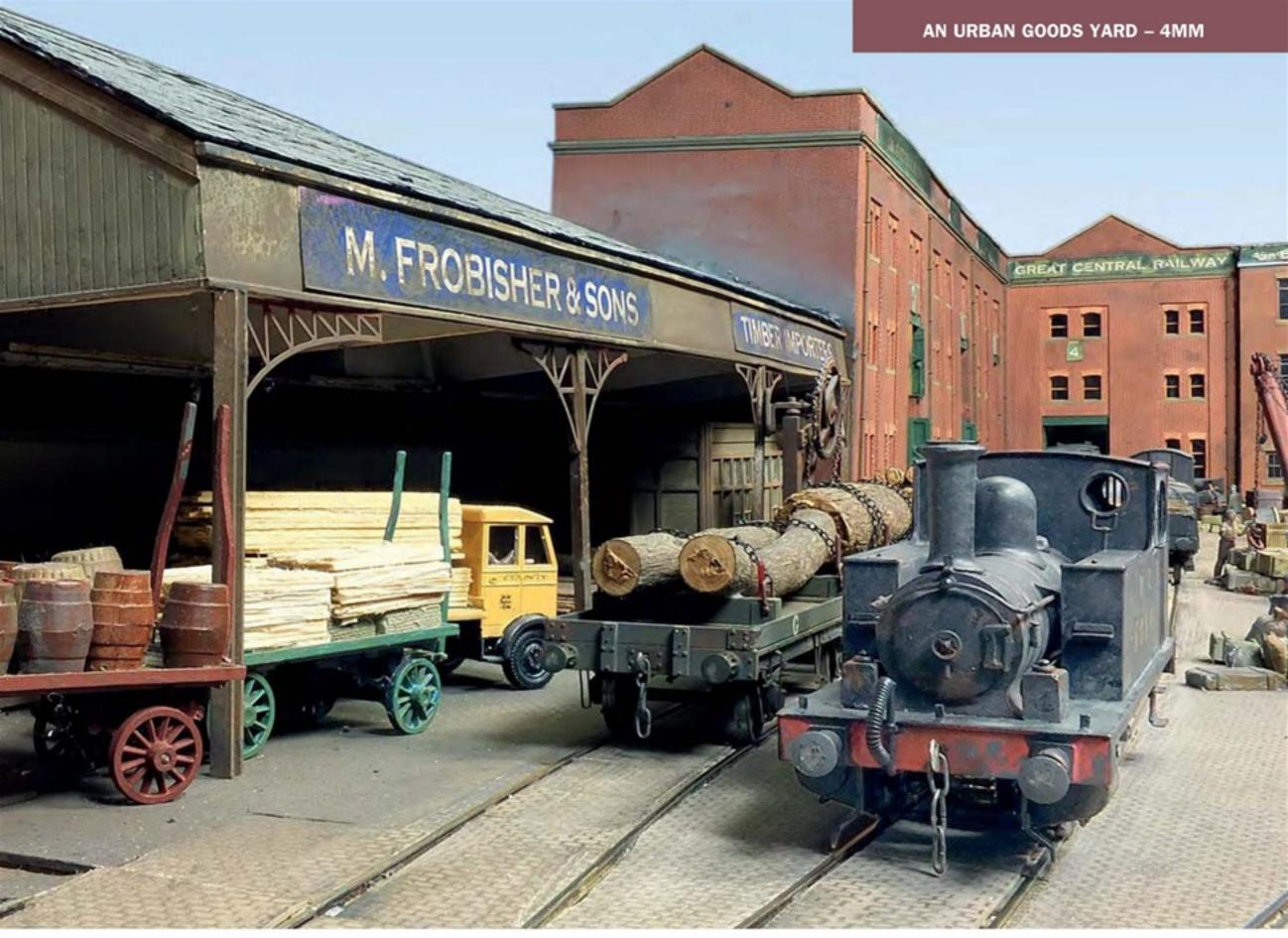
All of the buildings modelled had cardboard carcasses with roofs consisting of a Slater's Plastikard sub-roof and slates cut from 5thou Evergreen sheet, glued into place using D,L-Limonene. The representation of the brickwork varies however. The north warehouse has been covered with Ultrascale 'plastic' brickpaper. Unlike its paper relative, this material has some depth, and, in addition, it readily takes thin washes of the paint used to weather it.

The grain warehouse and coal offices were covered with computer chads, held in place with PVA glue. When everything had dried

the chads were suitably coloured; the PVA does not accept colour easily so formed the mortar course.

The Frobisher building contains little visible brickwork, but, a number of moulded plastic sections were used in its construction; the spandrels were originally intended for North Eastern Railway signals, and are brass etchings from the D&S range.

Yard cranes

There are five of these scattered across the yard, ranging from the heavy duty one in the centre of the modelled area to the simple hoists in the wood yard and at the right-hand side of the scene. All of these were fabricated from whitemetal kits in the Mike's Models range except for one of the hoists, which is a Langley product.

Barrels, boxes, sacks and carts

A large percentage of the time spent on creating this cameo has been in producing these items, generally dismissed as goods yard clutter. The majority of these items were made by first producing a master which was used to make a silicone rubber mould. The final items were then moulded using casting resin or Milliput epoxy putty. These were supplemented with items from the Merit range, acquired from boxes under stalls at exhibitions over a period of many years.

The majority of the hand carts were produced using parts cut from etched-brass frets, mainly from Springside products. I have to confess that these do not always end up producing the item the kit designer intended!

Road vehicles

With the exception of two petrol-driven lorries, most of the road vehicles on display are of the horse-drawn variety. Much use has been made of the Slater's Midland Railway dray, with a variety of modifications. However, I have never been convinced that the horse supplied with this kit is able to be deployed as a cart horse, so they have been replaced with whitemetal equines more suited to the task; these have mainly come from the Langley Models range.

Inlaid track

Virtually all the trackwork in the goods yard is inlaid; this allowed the mainly horse-drawn road vehicles to traverse the tracks without any problems keeping their loads in place.

The 'sleepers' (there are far fewer than in the construction of conventional track) were made from PCB strip glued to the baseboard, and one rail was then soldered in place. The other rail, held at the correct distance using a track gauge, was then soldered to the PCB.

After the track had been wired and tested a thin layer of card was glued throughout. When all this had dried a layer of embossed Slater's Plastikard was added to represent the setts themselves.

Locomotives

The yard is generally shunted by one of two former GCR tank engines. J63 0-6-0T No.5089, which spent its entire working life in north Lincolnshire allocated either to Immingham or New Holland sheds, is ably assisted by N5 0-6-2T No.5944.

The J63 was constructed from a Judith Edge kit with Alan Gibson wheels, a High Level Models gearbox and a tiny Mashima motor. The model was built for me by Jeremy Suter. Soon after the loco's delivery and testing, every available orifice was filled with lead prior to painting and weathering. This locomotive runs beautifully and is capable of hauling a 20-wagon train, which, I am fairly sure, is more than the prototype could ever manage!

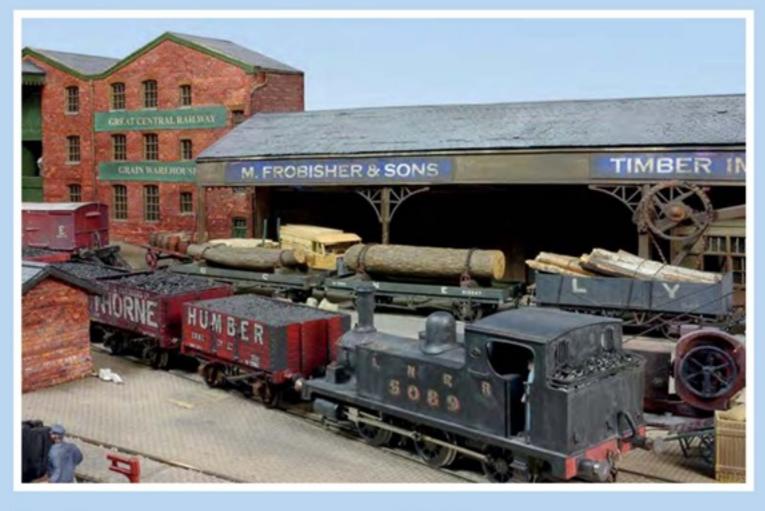
The N5 body is based on a Millholme whitemetal kit, with numerous modifications and a scratchbuilt chassis. It is powered by a large Portescap motor/gearbox combination. With that amount of power in the firebox a very gentle touch on the controller is required when shunting.

Rolling stock

Over 100 wagons and vans are available for use on this layout; OK, I know that this is somewhat excessive for such a small cameo, but, they have been built over a period of several decades. The vast majority of these were assembled from kits (or modified kits) but there are a few scratchbuilt items to extend the range. They are mainly from D&S Models and Slater's, but other manufacturers' products have been utilised.

A fair proportion of these wagons are private owners. Some have pre-printed sides; some have been lettered using transfers whilst others were finished by hand using designers' gouache and a mapping pen as described by David Goodwin in RAILWAY MODELLER March 1983.

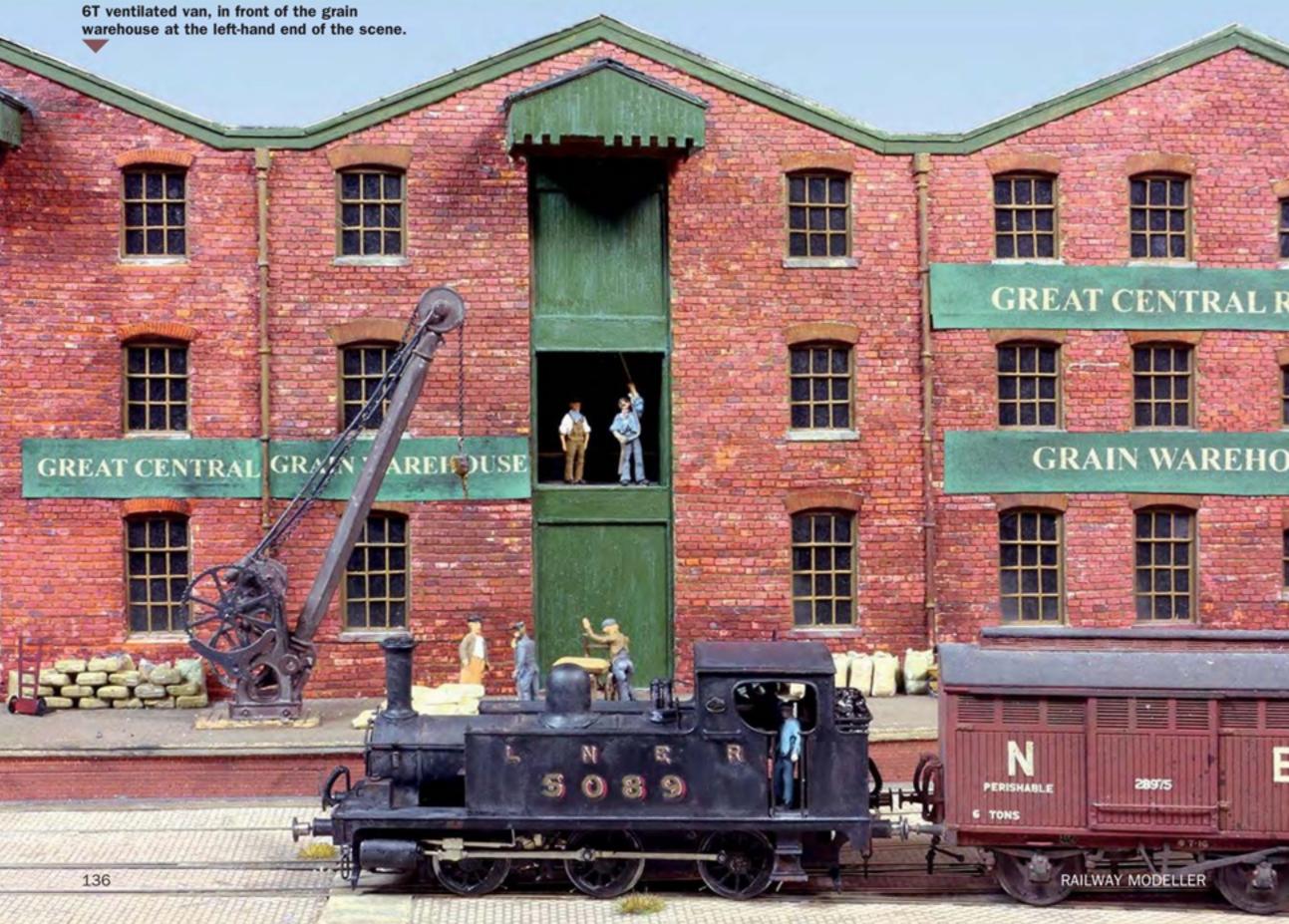


Operation

All points are operated by the wire-in-tube method; the tiebars are physically connected to the switches which change the polarity of the crossing vees. All stock is fitted with either scale three-link or screw-link couplings; of course this means operating from the front.

The future

Amongst the wagons available are a number of LNER constituent company cattle wagons and it seems a shame that they should stay boxed. To this end the layout will be extended as shown on the track plan in order to include, amongst other items, a set of GCR pattern cattle pens.



Low Wharf

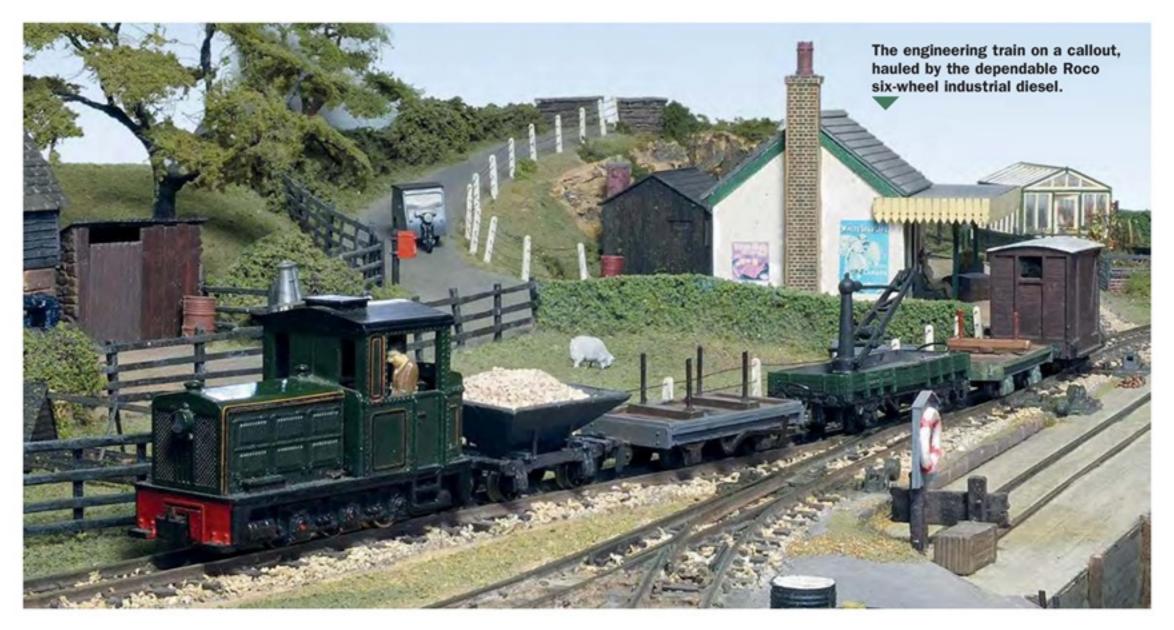

ow Wharf started its life 31 years ago, when my 12 year-old son was given a bare 3'6" x 2' baseboard, a length of Peco OO9 track and a point as a thank-you for helping a friend operate his OO9 layouts at various model railway exhibitions.

At the outset we decided that the layout should be up to exhibition standard, that the railway should blend into the scenery and have 'atmosphere'. It should also be interesting in its operation, both for the operator and public. This would be achieved by hands-free shunting and an automatic branch line service. After a bit of head

scratching and a few false starts, a track plan that would fit onto this small baseboard was designed and agreed. The plan enabled quite a lot of shunting movements to take

place which satisfied our requirement for interest.

Trackwork

There is no straight track at all on the scenic section, instead the track curves and meanders to give the effect of distance and depth. The wharf siding is on a slight slope which allows gravity shunting with certain stock. This together with the low level of the water, adds to the overall scene.

Point operation is effected by brazing rods which are threaded through the timber baseboard framework. A right-angle bend is formed at the point end of the rod and this is then passed through an elongated hole and locates into the point tiebar. A simple bracket stops the rod dropping out. The other end of the rod goes to the outside rear of the layout. Here a bead is attached to the rod end for easy point operation: inexpensive, simple and quiet.

Uncouplers are homemade. A square brass tube is fitted through the baseboard in the centre of the track where an uncoupler is required. A square brass rod (which is just a sliding fit) is connected to a plasticard crank, again using a brazing rod to operate it. When the rod is pulled, the crank lifts an oblong plasticard shoe in the track to uncouple the wagon.

Once the track and isolated sections had been wired up and fully tested, rail sides were painted a rust colour to disguise the rail height. The main line was then carefully ballasted with cork ballast and then plaster was used to infill the sleepers in the yard sidings. Slater's paving was used on the wharf, packed up to bring the surface flush with the rail level. Care was taken when fitting the paving between the rails to leave enough clearance for wheel flanges. One paving flag doubles as a uncoupling shoe and is invisible when not in use.

Landscaping

Thoughts then turned to scenery and how to hide the entrance to the fiddle yard. At one side a shallow tree-lined cutting was employed. This disguises the hole in the backscene and hides the tight radius of the track. The station approach road bridge helps at the other side.

Land contours were formed from blue Styrofoam insulation sheet as used in the building trade. It is a lot denser than polystyrene, easier to cut with a saw or knife

and creates little mess. This was stuck down with PVA glue and contoured, then covered with plaster bandage. Cork bark forms the rock cutting, leading to the bridge. Thick card was used for the lane surface, which was pinned and glued to the required elevation before being painted with dark grey undercoat and a very fine sand scattered on whilst still wet, to give a texture to the road surface.

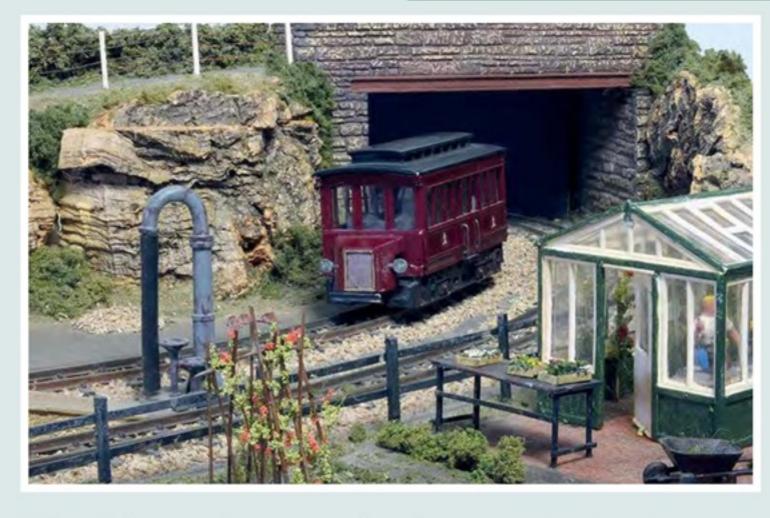
Much thought was given to the location of the buildings, so that they fitted into the overall scene. The buildings are mainly chopped and adapted kits along with a few scratchbuilt structures. All buildings were painted in mute colours and suitably weathered. The farm cottage started life as an Airfix church kit. This has a smoke unit fitted to it which is adjusted so that only a whisper of smoke rises from the chimney when switched on.

Once happy with the location of the buildings, they were bedded into the surface. The bare DIY filler surface was then painted before applying a mix of scatter materials. Different types of fencing and hedging helped break up the overall scene. This together with all the small details and figures hopefully give a realistic look.

Stock is a mixture of plastic and whitemetal kits with some ready-to-run items that were on the market in the 1980s, all painted and weathered so everything blends together, and nothing stands out.

Shows, storage and revival

Low Wharf has its own lighting pelmet and first made its debut at the Shipley Model Railway Exhibition in September 1988. It then went on the exhibition circuit



dried up. The layout was then put away until 30 years later, when I needed a small OO9 layout to fill a space at the Shipley Exhibition. My eldest grandson offered to operate it with a friend.

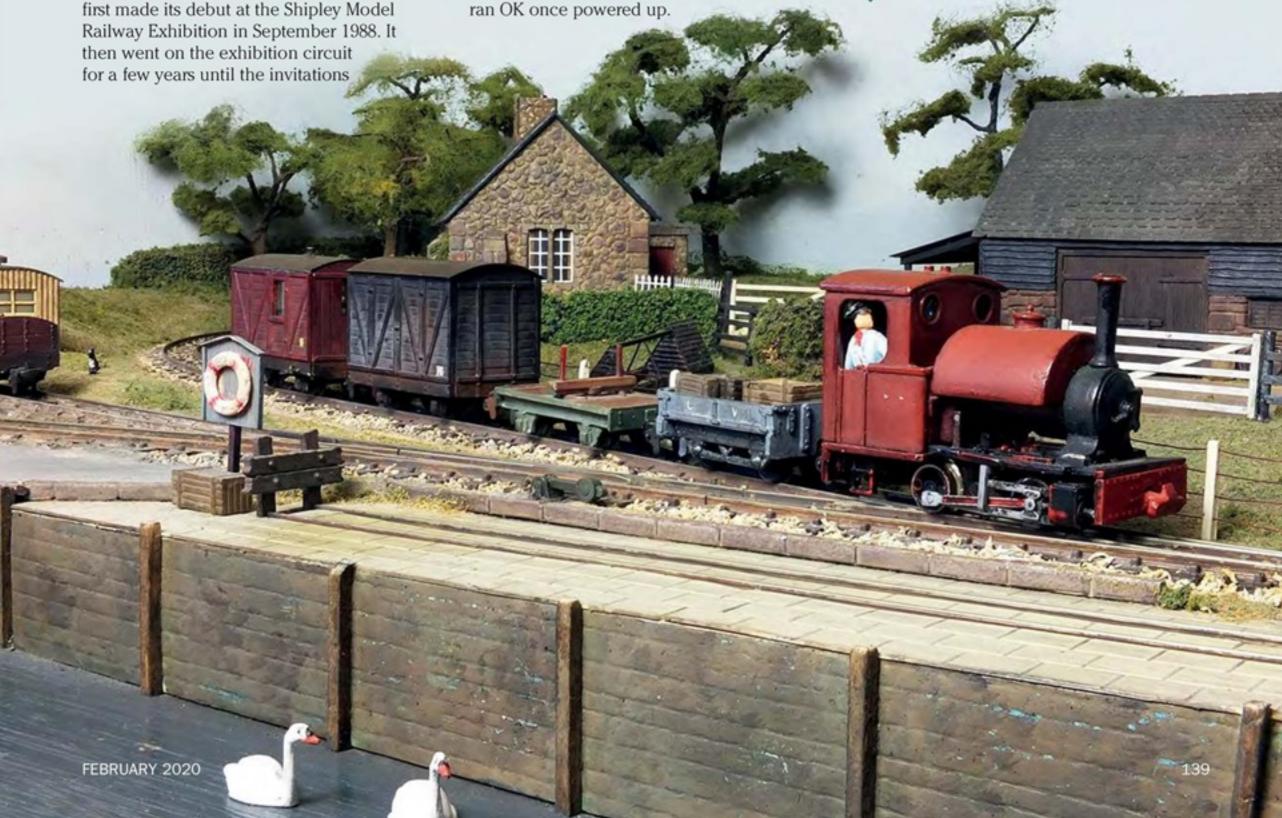
I was surprised to find that when the covers came off the only thing that needed replacing was the glazing in the greenhouse as it had gone a smoky yellow colour! After a good track clean and a vacuum, the landscape was given a blast-over with hairspray to bring the colours back to life, making sure that it was kept away from the track. All stock was cleaned and oiled and it

Looking back on the 30 years since Low Wharf was built, I think that it still holds its own alongside today's projects. The only thing that I would have done differently would have been to add microswitches to change the polarity on the points.

My grandson now wants Low Wharf left to him in my will!

The Haggis tippler

Our choice of Scottish delicacy was the haggis and in our imaginative version of reality, haggises are harvested somewhere in the highlands. They are transported in tippler wagons on a high level industrial track to be tipped down a chute into other waiting wagons. We made use of a second-hand Fleischmann tippler wagon (ref.5501) and its matching unloading station (ref.6481). These were repainted in bauxite. The 'haggises' were beads recovered from an old bracelet and to ensure the load tipped efficiently we added a simple card chute to the unloading station.

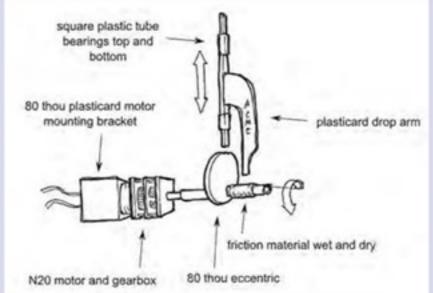


Cornish pasty conveyor

This animation depicted pasties moving down a conveyor belt located inside a factory. The factory building was constructed from card and brick paper and the conveyor was built using some black

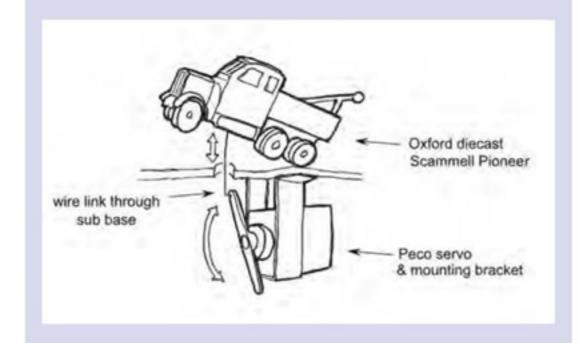
ribbon which was driven by a roller covered in fine emery paper. The roller was connected to a single 3V N20 geared electric motor (See RM April 2018) attached to a battery supply. Also fixed to the drive shaft was an eccentric which lifted the ACME business end of the press up and down. The joint in the ribbon was diagonally tapered to avoid a hard ridge that

joint than either superglue or PVA would. The final touch was to paint pasties on the surface of the conveyor belt.





A giant Yorkshire Pudding appeared in our food fair scene. The pudding itself was hand-crafted from ready-coloured modelling clay and, appropriately, baked in the oven to set. The animation depicts a butch-looking Scammell Pioneer crane attempting to lift the heavyweight delicacy – but failing! The model was the 1:76 scale example from the Oxford Diecast range and a servo (from the Peco SmartSwitch set) was fitted under the board. This drove a simple push-rod which caused the Scammell to rear up as it struggled and failed to lift the giant pudding. The final touch was the placing of men in high-vis vests supervising the abortive attempt.



The big screen

Another feature in the food fair scene was a cookery demonstration being shown on a big screen. Our celebrity chef was positioned behind his workstation with a camera crew, all in front of the big screen.

Our team captain Patrick's wife was filmed demonstrating the art of fine cuisine at a long table draped with a white cloth, matching that of the model and loaded onto a smartphone – in this case an old Blackberry but any smartphone will do. A simple screen surround was constructed for the phone which concealed the working parts but left the screen visible. The five minute video clip was simply played back when required.



pioneer of both automatic operation and animations.

The overall theme of the layout we were given to work to by the production company was 'Best of British' and we chose to interpret this by depicting local food delicacies being brought in by rail from the regions to our busy metropolis. Our prior builds were to feature these food delicacies in some way, each with their own animated features and we chose a whimsical representation, as after all, this was for a mainstream TV audience! Here's how we did them!

Conclusion

If nothing else, we learned that the usual skills deployed in building model railways are readily transferable into the construction of animated elements. We enjoyed the challenge and we could see the value of having animations for a layout aimed at the general public on TV or at shows. For a home-based railway built by a modeller who





Planet XVI – a laser-cut layout

SIMON & SUE DAY run a laser-cutting service called Blotz. When Simon joined the Railway Sleepers team in series 2 of The Great Model Railway Challenge, plans were made to exploit the technology to construct as much as was permissible under the competition's pre-build rules. The result was this space-age city on a colonised planet far, far away, but still operating earth-like trains, as Simon relates.

lotz primarily makes laser-cut buildings and accessories for the wargame hobby, so when our team came up with the idea for the competition layout, it made sense to try and prefabricate as many of the underlying structures as we could. This was acceptable under the rules as we were effectively bringing along our own kits - as opposed to say Metcalfe Models or Peco kits. The plan was to build our kits in the

modelling room whilst James, Martin and Mike got on with laying the track, and Paul painted the backscene as early as possible on Day 1 of the challenge.

We also designed a laser-cut structure to create the shelf along the rear of the layout for the city scene. This was basically a series of identical interlocking platforms each supported on a pair of laser-cut arched braces. This opened up the underside of the

As the competition drew to a close, final testing of the interstellar spaceship on the finished layout was done by Warren Gleeson.

shelf to act as one long tunnel and permit easy access to the track and fiddle yard that was to be hidden under it.

The various gradients and upper loop trackbed were also prefabricated in this way, with the track bed being held up by a series



of simple two-piece pillars with wide feet and heads ensuring they would not topple before the glue attaching them to the baseboard had set. Each piece of the upper loop automatically 'clipped' to the pieces on either side making it one complete, self-supporting structure.

The landscape begins to take shape with the inclusion of the girder bridge. Road sections for the moving cars have been fitted and painted.

As mentioned above, all the buildings were were pre-cut and brought along to the Fawley Hill TV location as flat-pack kits ready for assembly and painting. I designed these specifically for the layout and all were dry-fitted at home to ensure everything went together as expected when we got onto the site. We carefully dismantled everything, and labelled absolutely every part, ready for what was to be in effect a huge kitbuilding exercise under the lights and cameras.

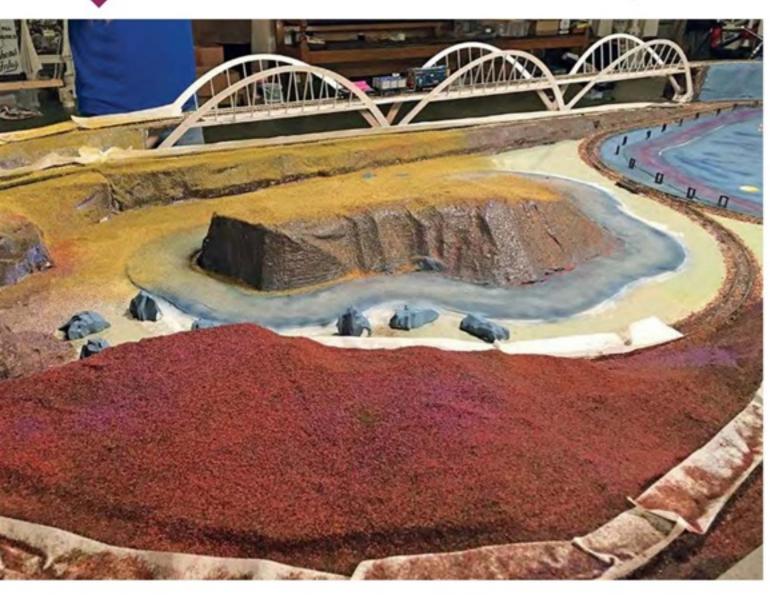
For the city colour scheme we opted for a clean blue and white - not due at all to the fact that James is a very keen Sheffield Wednesday supporter, honest!

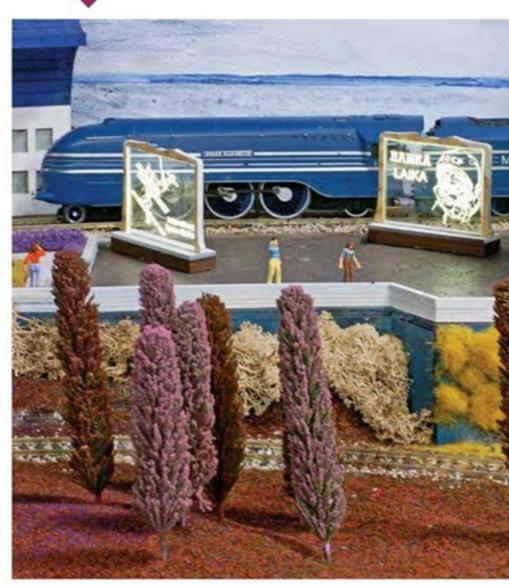
We were to have two main animations on the layout; a space alien chasing a miner, and a pop-up alien, the mechanisms of which were also prefabricated as kit parts out of MDF. Details of these are included in the panel overleaf.

The three-arch bridge at the front of the layout was also designed specifically for the layout and laser-cut from 3mm MDF, making it very quick and easy to assemble - once again enabling the lads to get the track laid across it in record time and tested.

Even the two roads which sported working Faller vehicles on them were also pre-cut.

The designs on these small display screens were etched with the laser and are lit below by LEDs to create the illuminated effect.

Planet XVI – the animations

Since no-one in the Railway Sleepers team is gifted with electronics – basic or otherwise – we opted to go for an old-school approach, and make our animations operate mechanically. Although they were to function with retro-mechanisms, 21st century laser-cutting technology was still deployed to make all the parts.

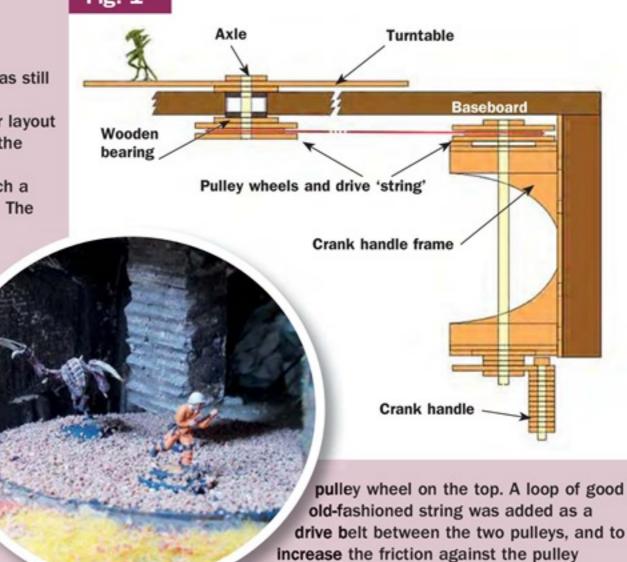
The two simple animations we had come up with for our layout depicted indigenous life of Planet XVI appearing amongst the human colonists.

The first animation was a simple rotating disc upon which a hapless human miner was to be chased by a hungry alien. The other animation was a 'pop-up' alien emerging from an underground burrow in the manner of an earth-bound prairie dog.

To create the chase scene we needed to make what was effectively a turntable with its axle passing through the baseboard and attached to a pulley wheel. The pulley was made from a number of 2mm MDF discs which were stacked and glued together: the turntable was produced in similar manner. The top and bottom assemblies were push fitted onto a wooden dowel axle and two MDF 'bearings' were glued to each side of the baseboard to enable the whole assembly to spin freely.

At this point we could have used a geared electric motor to drive the turntable, but we chose not to.

Instead more laser-cutting technology was employed to make the vertical crank handle assembly, with an equal sized



centre of each one: see Fig. 1.

The second animation featuring an alien popping up in the restricted zone near the spaceship was achieved by affixing the creature on the top of a reciprocating piston rig, again all cut from trusty MDF. The lower crank axle was attached to a long shaft – in this case a length of PVC pipe – which ran to the back of our layout where a second crank handle was located (in this case a horizontal one) see Fig. 2.

wheels we added a small elastic band to the

The modern electronic method would be to use a servo to drive the piston shaft up and down. I'm sure it would be simpler, but we enjoyed the challenge of making it with laser-cut wood.

We created them as a series of 2mm MDF pieces with jigsaw connector-shaped ends. The groove to hold the steel vehicle guide wire was part-cut into the sections at the same time.

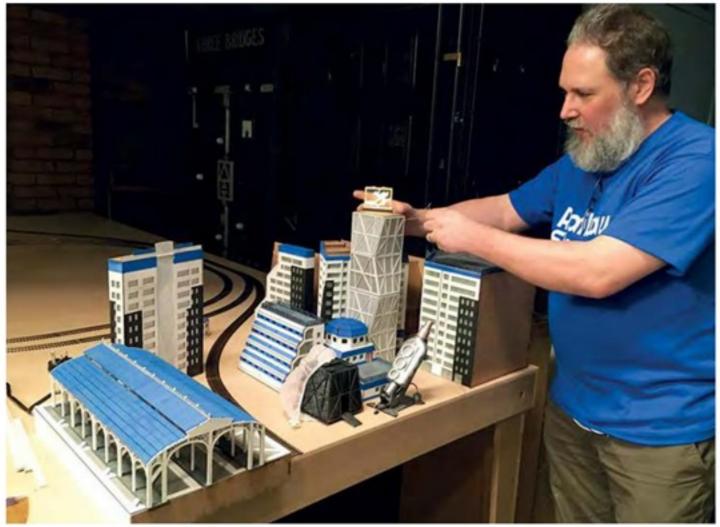
Each piece was numbered and a plan prepared so that on set, Mike could quickly re-assemble them in the right order, glue them down, and inset the steel guide wire.

Laser-cutting equipment

We used our two large industrial laser-cutters in our business premises and all the design work for the items to be laser-cut was carried out on Corel Draw, a computer drawing application. A simple 2D drawing is required, with the colour of each line directing the laser-cutter to perform a particular type of cut; – ie draw a surface mark, cut right

through, cut wide, engrave half depth, ignore, etc. The Corel Draw files interface directly with the software that controls the laser-cutters.

While the machines we have for our business are rather expensive, much cheaper home workshop laser-cutters are available from a variety of online sources with prices starting at around \$200 for a very basic

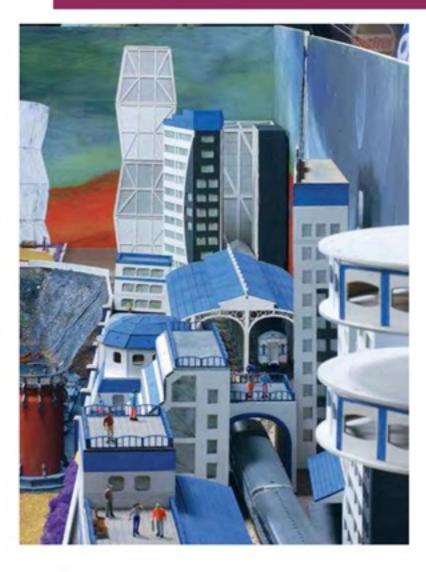

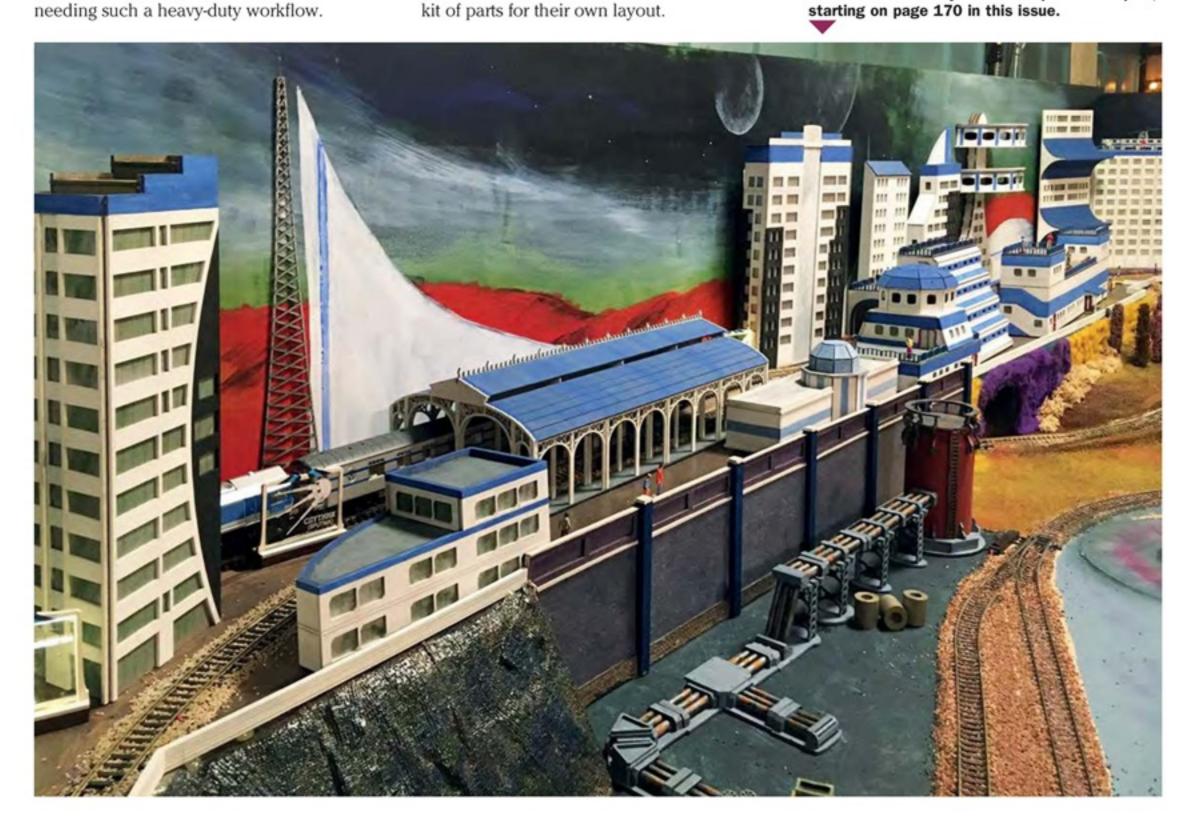

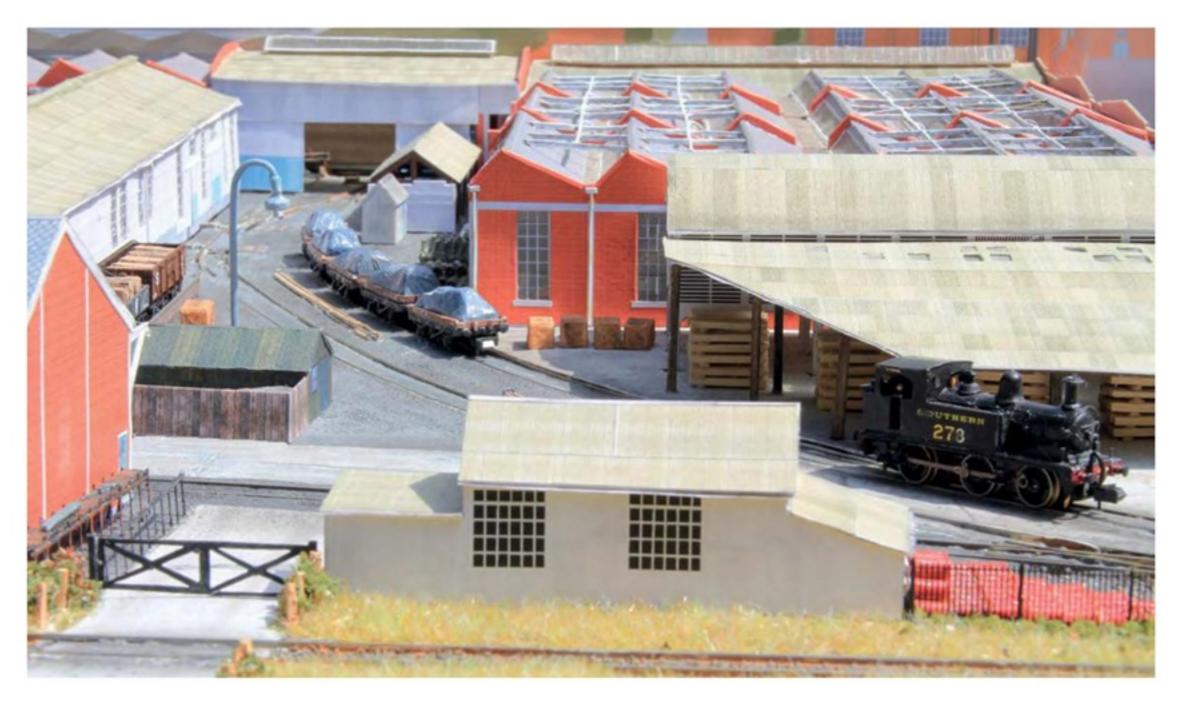

Thornycroft Sidings

Pather and son modelling duo

hornycroft Sidings served the factory of world-renowned commercial and military vehicle manufacturer

J I Thornycroft Ltd, which was located in the town of Basingstoke, Hampshire until 1972.

The rail connection with the town's main station used a short surviving remnant of the Basingstoke & Alton Light Railway, the route of which closed to traffic in 1936. The factory

site was levelled in the early 1990s to make way for a supermarket.

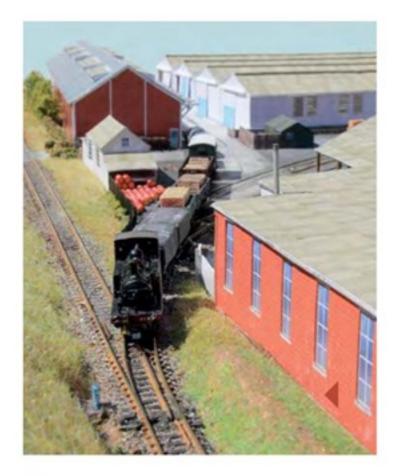
Our decision to 'rebuild the Thornycroft factory' only came about due to the launch of the Britain From Above website, which is an archive of aerial photographs of UK locations taken in the 1920s and 1930s. It was whilst searching there for pictures of Cliddesden station (our previous project, see

RM March 2016) that I came across a perfect view of the factory and its sidings that just cried out to be modelled.

Discussing it with my son Edward, he agreed to join the project and we set the era

to be during Southern Railway days – as per the date of the Britain From Above photograph.

Researching Thornycroft

As with all model railways based on actual locations, a fair amount of research was required. It is this aspect of seeking out historical details that I find particularly interesting since it increases ones knowledge and gives credibility to the model created.

Edward set about drawing up a scale plan from old maps to see what would fit our baseboard 'standard' of 1200mm x 800mm. We found that about a third of the factory could be accommodated if we reduced the width of the main goods yard a little. Worting Road with its bridge over the railway would be the scenic break on one side and the B&ALR would run along the front edge.

I knew from the start that much of the modelling was going to be involved with constructing buildings for the factory complex, with little in the way of landscaping requirements. Edward's plan gave the floor area of each building but what of the heights and architecture style? Thornycroft was prolific in photographing its vehicles and even owned its own photographic studio.

Some photographs show vehicles in front of the factory buildings, which helped our understanding of architectural styles. One photograph in particular included a view of the railway buffer stop alongside the Wood Store. The Wood Store height was scaled from the height of the buffer stop and this became a reference point to calculate all other building heights.

There are many Thornycroft photographs published online and in books, but we also arranged to view the archive held by Hampshire Museum Service. The museum had photographed the buildings for posterity



just prior to their demolition. These were most useful and in full colour!

A chance encounter

This research provided us with sufficient reference to model the buildings, but what good is that without knowing their purpose? I needed to find someone associated with the factory that might know.

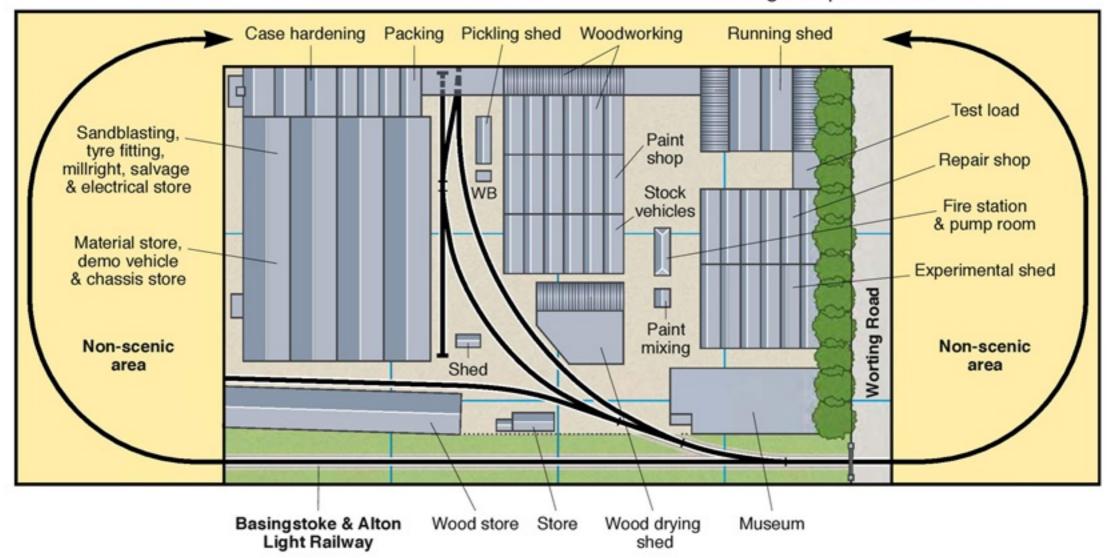
Remarkably, a chance encounter with a former Thornycroft employee gave the answer. His time at the factory was after our model period (when some rebuilding had taken place) but he was able to pass on to us A wet day inside the yard sees solid-tyred lorries (probably destined for military service) on Lowmacs ready for despatch.

a floor plan from the 1930s that identified the purpose of every building. We could now proceed, not only with evidence to hand, but with authority as well.

I intended to share the building design and construction with Edward but soon realised the task was going to be complex and time consuming, probably too demanding on his time. He agreed that I should make all the buildings first and then he would come on

board for layout construction. In all 14 buildings were created from scratch over a five month period (comprising a few hours per week). The smallest building is thumb-size, whilst the largest measures nearly half a metre square – massive for N gauge!

Buildings - design and construction

Buildings were designed in a graphic editing software application. I loaded up one or more photographs of the real building (or parts thereof) and scaled them to N gauge (1:148). Decorative layers were overlaid using photos of real building materials or artwork creations; each side of the building and roof being drawn independently. The larger buildings included a plinth that could be buried in recessed ground works.

The designs were printed (using a home inkjet printer) onto self-adhesive A4 label sheets and the parts cut out to stick onto

board for assembly. I use Epson Durabrite Ultra ink as I find that it has excellent colour retention properties over time and resists water damage.

Where internal lighting wasn't being fitted, windows were printed opaque. However, for the three buildings where internal lighting was being fitted (using Livarno LED striplights), the windows were printed opaque and then stuck to transparent film, with the panes peeled off to leave just the window bars.

Model vehicles

Being a factory manufacturing commercial vehicles, it was essential to have some examples of these placed in the yards. I believe there is only one class of Thornycroft vehicle in N gauge available from the trade, clearly insufficient to show the variety of vehicles in manufacture over the modelled period. This left me with no option but to make my own.

More research was undertaken to identify vehicles from the late 1920s/early 1930s and three types were chosen for which dimensioned chassis drawings existed on the web; the A1 van, A3 van, PB van and XC bus. To these I added the earlier J class lorries and No.1 Van as these were held in the firm's onsite museum at the time.

The No.1 Van was the first vehicle made by the firm and was steam driven. This model was designed and made in a similar fashion as the buildings, except for the wheels and boiler, which were fabricated in FIMO clay (a craft material that is oven-hardened).

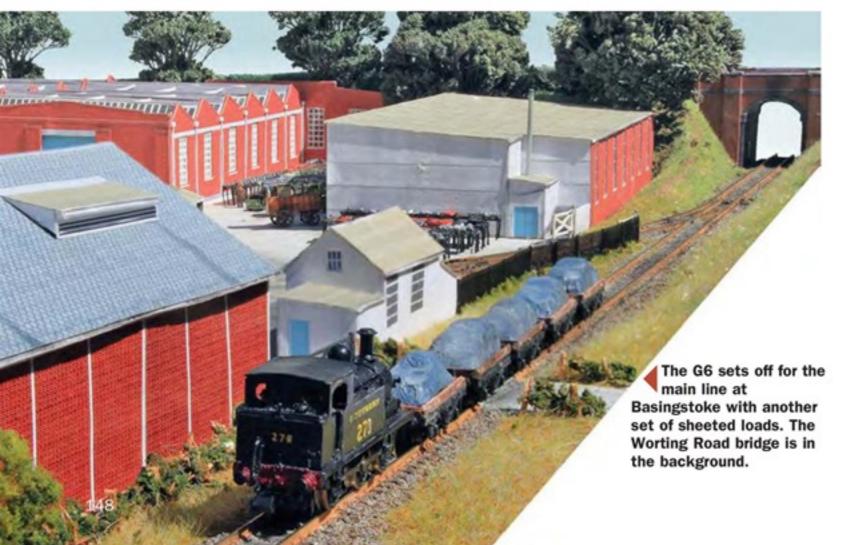
The others were designed and printed as kits of parts on our own 3D printer. In my experience, using 3D printing to create detailed N gauge models is pushing the boundaries of printers that use the extruded plastic filament method; quite a bit of fettling is needed on the printed parts, rather like flash removal on conventional plastic kits. I have found that the finish is not as good as injection-moulded technology, but there may be more I need to learn about the process in order to improve quality.

Layout construction

The construction of the layout is traditional in most respects and was undertaken over a period of two years, including the numerous structures for the factory complex.

We built the baseboards from MDF and softwood frame; Edward laid the factory road surfaces using DAS clay to raise the height to rail level. Cobbles, tarmac and concrete were modelled this way.

I created Worting Road and its embankments from polystyrene packing foam blocks and Edward did his masterful static grass laying. Trees are made from sprigs of dead Sedum flower heads and the manicured hedge is made from green kitchen scourer covered with short static grass.





Track is Peco code 80 with points controlled by SEEP motors. Trains are 12V dc powered from homemade electronics.

Creating the backscene using CAD

The backscene was quite a project in itself. The problem we faced was the model buildings on the layout had to be shown continuing seamlessly into the backscene. Edward decided to 3D model the remaining two thirds of the factory in CAD and, using camera positions within the CAD, we were able to choose a view that was convincing if viewed from a certain position.

The wire frame CAD model was then exported into a graphic editing application where surface detailing for the structures was added; the completed image was then softended tonally so that it wouldn't dominate the foreground buildings. It was then professionally printed and stuck to MDF board, which slots into the baseboard behind the buildings.

The backscene blends in the three-dimensional modelling with the two-dimensional imagery, whilst maintaining perspective.

Operation and stock

A Dapol M7 locomotive trundles between Basingstoke and Alton past the factory with its passenger coach or freight wagons, whilst a Class G6 0-6-0T shunts the yard.

The G6 is an etched brass kit from N Brass Locos, mounted on a Graham Farish 57xx 0-6-0PT chassis. Given the number 278, it is a model of an actual G6 that served the factory in the 1930s.

The passenger coach was scratchbuilt in card on a scratchbuilt chassis with proprietary bogies. Among the proprietary wagons can be seen scratchbuilt one-plank wagons (card on Peco chassis) and LOWMACS (card on parts cut from two Graham Farish Mk.I coach bogies).

Figures and cameos

Figures were made in FIMO clay on wire armatures. Nearly all have flat caps, common for the period. The scene of a van being photographed by the official photographer is fictitious but entirely credible for reasons stated earlier. I am particularly pleased with the model of the photographer, which is

based on a photograph of the 1930s American aircraft photographer Rudy Arnold.

Other set scenes on the layout have been recreated from photographs including an A3 flatbed lorry unloading straw into the Wood Store; a driver of an A1 van being directed by the Foreman outside the Repair Shop; goods yard clutter comprising vehicle parts and racks of materials.

At the north end of the layout is a J Class anti-aircraft gun-carrying lorry. This depicts the vehicle that was donated back to the factory by the War Department after the First World War. It was housed in the onsite museum but hauled out to sit beside the Chassis Store during the Second World War as a threat to enemy aircraft! There it languished, deteriorating until the 1960s when it was given to an enthusiast, later to be obtained by the Imperial War Museum which restored it. It is now display it at Duxford Museum.

Have you ever wanted to extend your layout? PETER FURNESS did, and now relates the experience of relocating and rebuilding his model railway into an annex in his home in South Africa.

Furness Rail extended

n May 2013, RAILWAY MODELLER published a feature about the first model railway I had built since I was an 11 year old boy - a long time ago now!

Furness Rail, as the 2013 layout was called, was located in a small bedroom in my house and measured approximately 1.8m by 1.2m. It depicted a railway in the UK, specifically the Lincoln area around 1960, and consisted of two inner tracks, with five station sidings off the inner tracks, a main line station with a loop to provide three tracks to the station. There were also two elevated tracks.

Unfortunately, 'model railway disease' is highly contagious, with adult males being particularly susceptible, the symptoms include continuous attention to building layouts, wandering around railway model shops and attending shows. It must be mentioned, that I am equally 'compulsive' to both the operating of the model trains and the landscaping, therefore, my layout was densely packed with both the rail system and associated urban sprawl.

Phase two

Having completed stage one, as featured in the original article, it became obvious the layout did not provide enough operating potential. I constructed phase two as an L-shaped extension of 1.2m by 1.2m and amended the elevated tracks to go around the total L-shape and extensions to the original internal ovals.

Again, I endeavoured to pack in as many sidings and buildings as possible, based on the red brick industrial areas of Stamp End in Lincoln where I spent much of my misspent

youth. These included the Ruston & Hornsby workshops, the Lincoln Co-op grain silos, and The Poachers Brewery, to name a few.

At this stage, I had almost filled the

bedroom. There was only just enough room for the door to swing open and one person to stand in the small area not occupied by any of the layout.

The local terminus station is relatively unchanged but the main line station has had its overall roof and footbridge transferred to the new part on the far side.

Relocation

I needed to re-think: I could not physically reach the entire track and Murphy's Law proved that all train or track problems occurred in these unreachable areas. So the decision was taken to move the layout.

I cut the layout into two main sections, and with the help of five professional movers to do the physical work, we moved the separate sections through the door, down the corridor, into the garden to its final resting place in an annex. The sections were then positioned on specially made steel stands, which gave the potentinal for yet another extension, and so phase three began!

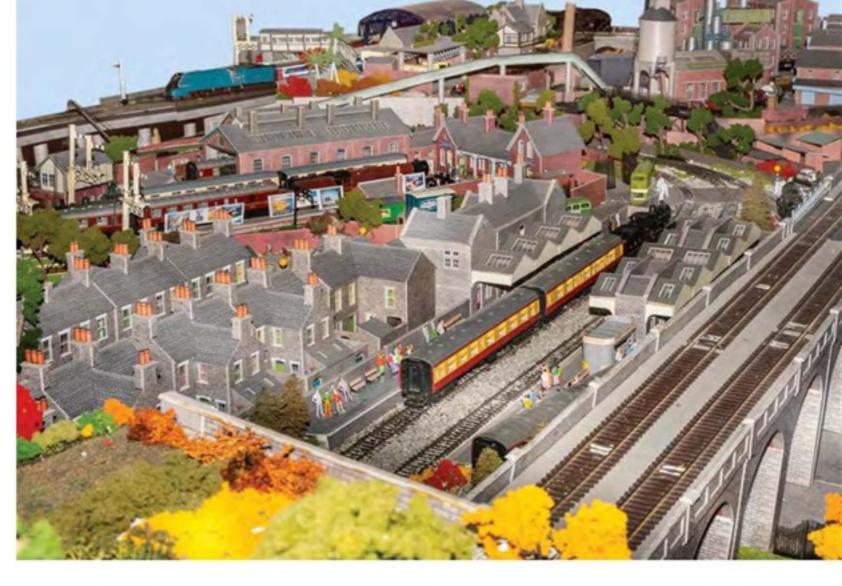
Phase three

Work on rebuilding started in earnest, commencing with the reconnection and amendment of all tracks, and reinstating the 'bits' that had fallen off. Once all the original trackwork was connected, I started at the front of the layout, with the repositioning and extension of the elevated tracks over a new elevated viaduct, which spanned a new canal complete with long boats delivering coal to a conveyor, feeding the existing coal hopper.

I constructed a new main line station, which also incorporated an underground station that runs below the elevated lines, next to the canal. The local station line feeds from the underground track, which curves through the central link between the original parts of the layout, to feed the industrial area.

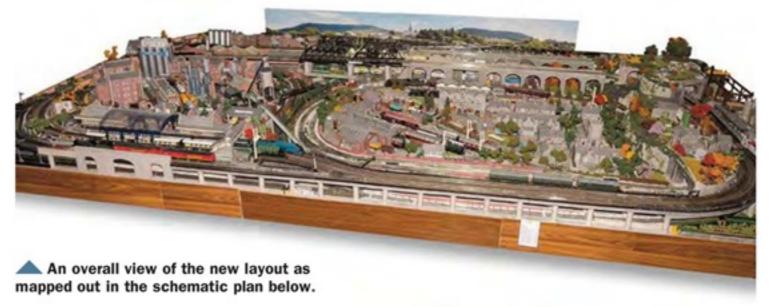
The farm was also extended with storage sheds, cottages, cattle and sheep pens, plus a lumberyard and coal mine.

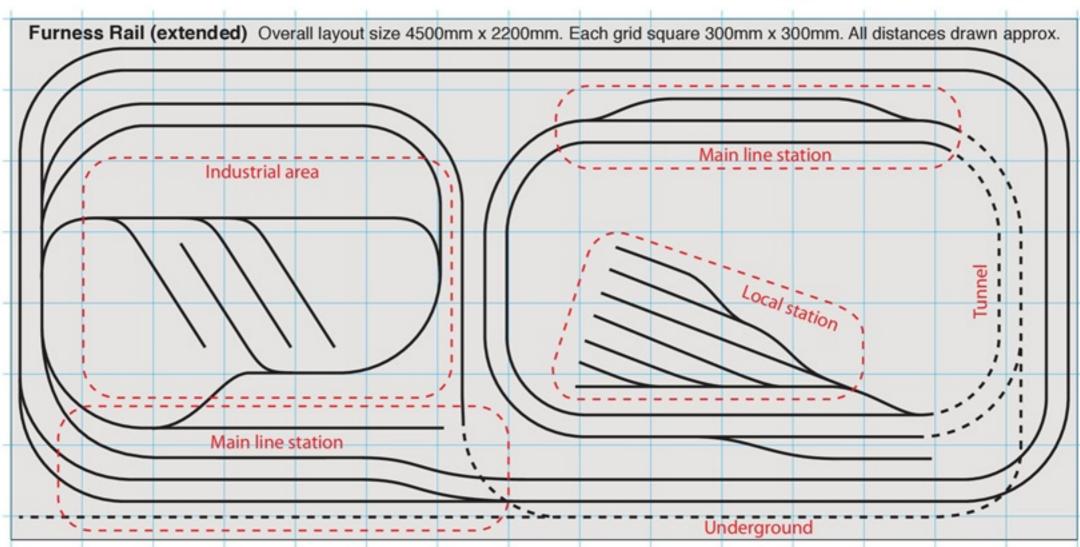
A new high street was created along the full length of the layout with cinemas, shops,



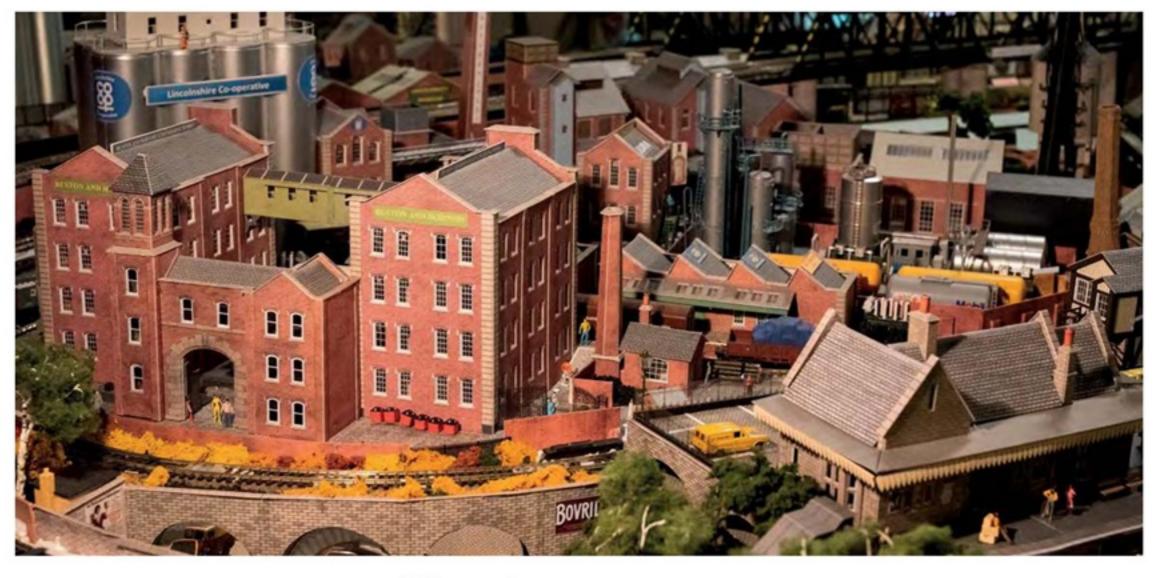
banks etc. I am a firm believer that every detail, model and scene featured should tell a story.

With all these new additions, I was therefore faced with a problem of getting goods to and from the industrial area by road, since the central area was covered with tracks and buildings. After some deliberation, I decided to excavate, through the base polystyrene, to provide an appearance of underground access for deliveries, collection and staff parking.

Refinements

I spent the following year fine-tuning the rail system, correcting faults and ensuring the trains ran smoothly. Here, the technical knowledge of my friend Terry Cookson and the people at Model Train Exchange, who service my engines, offered advice and of course accepted my money to feed my model railway needs.

There's a but

Well, there was a lot more operating potential on the rebuilt layout, but...

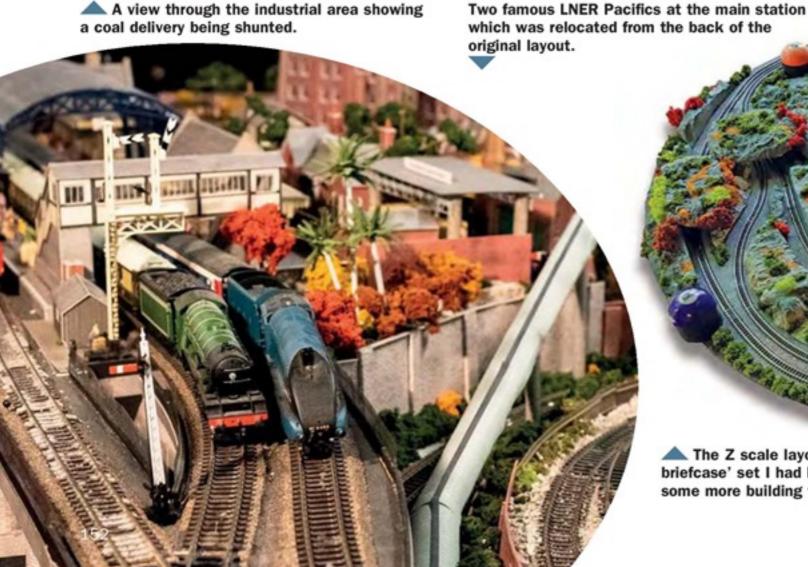
At the end of 2018 there was no room left for any more building work, and as I said earlier, I am a compulsive builder as well as an inveterate operator.

Another move was out of the question since, there was no more space available in my house. Furthermore, the layout was now too big to exit through the door it came in!

Phase two included scenic elements from my youth spent in Lincolnshire. Here we see a depiction of the Ruston & Hornsby and Lincolnshire Co-operative factories. Many of the buildings will be recognised as those from the Metcalfe Models range, with the silos and vertical tanks from firms such as Walthers.

Then I remembered something I had been given previously; a 'train in a briefcase' built to Z scale. I was off again. As no Z scale models were available in South Africa, I had to build all scenery myself. This included paper buildings, landscape, roads and mountains. I found modelling in this new, much smaller scale, had its drawbacks, and I soon realised that my fingers were more used to modelling with OO gauge models. However it's now finished and sits below a glass coffee table in the snooker room.

Now what is next? A G scale model calls, so wish me luck!



The Z scale layout built from parts I recovered from a 'train in a briefcase' set I had been given some time ago. It provided a chance to do some more building work now that Furness Rail was finished.

THIS MONTH • Deeply Vale • Using the new Peco TwistLock point motor

Deeply Vale

WILLIAM BARNFIELD built an OO layout set in Lancashire using inexpensive locomotives and stock. Photography by Derek Shore

t the dawn of the Industrial Revolution the real Deeply Vale, just north of Bury, had 15 mills with about 2000 workers, but with the coming of steam they all closed down and the valley returned to nature. It was briefly famous again for its pop concerts in the 1970s.

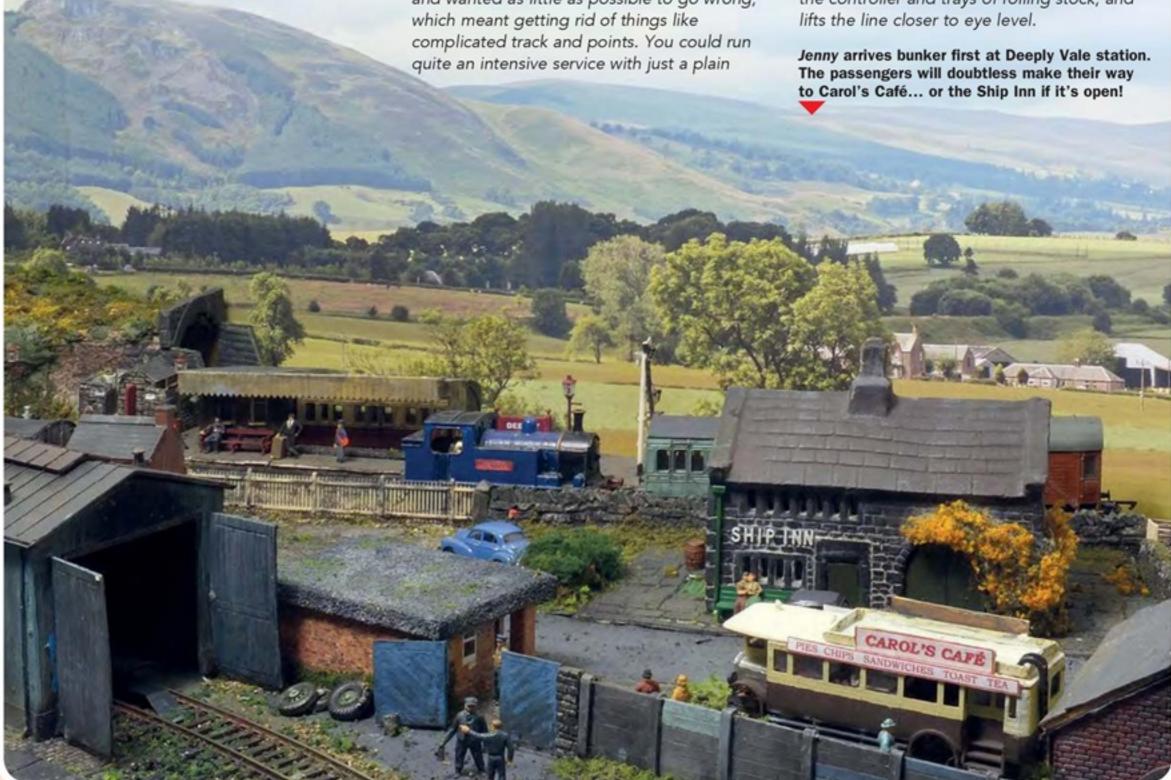
In my rewrite, one firm - the mighty Sproutwind & Trott - has kept on going and has its own railway system. There's also a branch up into the hills at Cheesden, where there's a mill which supplies Sprouts, and a quarry.

THE LINE

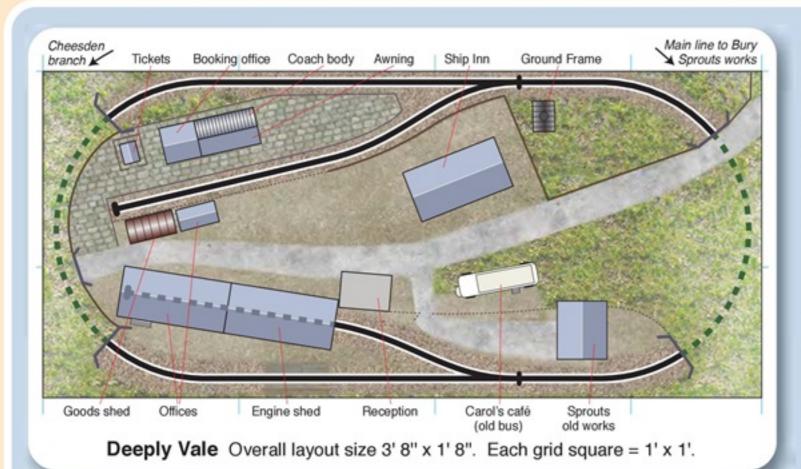
I started with a board measuring 45" x 20" and wanted as little as possible to go wrong, which meant getting rid of things like complicated track and points. You could run quite an intensive service with just a plain

oval but it would tend to be a procession, so I went mad and added a bay platform to the station, allowing for exchange of traffic, and a siding at the bottom. The fiddle yard, all 18" of it, is the back of the oval.

It might sound a bit Terry Pratchett but the board has a column of '£1-shop' plastic plant pots under each comer. This made room for the controller and trays of rolling stock, and

THE TRAYS

These are quite important. There's one each for the main line, the works and the branch. What goes in which depends on where the train originates, so full quarry wagons are always in the branch tray and empties in the main one. I originally thought I'd move stock between trays to reflect progress but you end up with one tray nearly empty and another overflowing.

SCENERY

Trains like to derail in tunnels, so apart from a small block of wood at each comer I've kept the track accessible. At each end I spanned the blocks with a double thickness of old track and onto these laid some crude card formers, so it looked like two primitive cantilever stands.

On the right-hand side I built up a traditional hillside, stretching strips of newspaper dunked in green-tinted dilute PVA over balls of rolled-up paper and across the card formers. I then added more PVA/paint, put scatter straight on and fizzed it with inexpensive hair spray so the finished hill rose from the bare earth in about 10 minutes.

On the other side I got into an awful mess. I wanted the station as compact as possible but this created a bottleneck between the sharp curve and the end of the bay siding. Clearances were down to millimetres and the siding got shorter and shorter! I solved the problem by running the platform into a sheer cliff of biodegradable plant pot material which is quite a nice poor-man's rock. On top there's a narrow plateau of shrubs and scatter.

I then felt that this horseshoe cliff was a bit claustrophobic, but I found a small piece of narrow tunnelling that had been lying around for years, and made a single track road through. I still haven't worked out what to put in front of the fiddle yard. More cliffs?

BUILDINGS

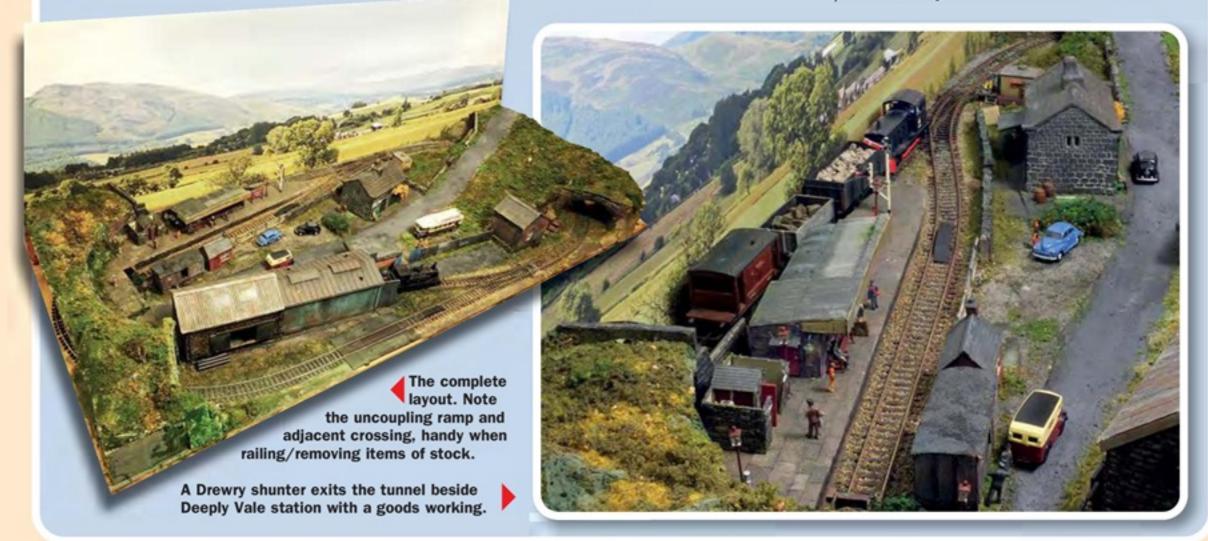
I started with the platform which was just a few layers of soft cardboard topped with one of my favourite materials – old lino. Distressed lino perhaps, the underside scored into old stone flags so it almost fell apart.

I always liked the idea of an old carriage as the station building, and I downgraded a ubiquitous Hornby four-wheeler body from proud Great Western to weather-beaten London Midland maroon & cream, but I was disappointed with the end result, stuck there in the middle of the platform, like a pea on a drum as we say round here. I added a stone blockhouse as a booking office and decided that to make up for its earlier austerity the company had authorised an awning. It was quite fun marrying the three types of roofing together; the carriage, the awning and the corrugated blockhouse roof. After much debate I put a sleeper base under the carriage.

On the platform there's also a toilet which is bodged, freelance and far too grand.

I still had no idea what to do with the fiddle yard side, until a good friend gave me some quality scrap card and I put a big shed over the siding, disguised as two buildings – a corrugated engine shed backing onto a stone office. The corrugated stuff comes from one of those things you hang over a doorway in summer; strips of soft plastic letting air in but keeping flies out, so for about £3.00 you get miles of it! I could now fiddle in secret but the other side of the 'office' is an improbably large loading bay so I can get at the carriage if it derails.

The original landlord was a bit of a rebel and not keen on railways, so the pub is the Ship Inn. I got the building from Roger's brilliant model shop on Bury East Lancs station; it's a single piece of pottery so I think it was meant as an ornament. I gave it a back porch for easy access from the station for



thirsty passengers and railwaymen.

Ages ago I bought an old bus body from somebody's scrap box, which I'd had vague thoughts of turning into a railbus, but Carol took it over for her catering empire. I meant to put her behind a hatch selling takeaway pies but was in too much of a rush to get the cafe 'planted'.

The only building with any prototypical origins is Sprouts old works. The real one is on the canal at Skipton.

ROLLING STOCK

Apart from an L&Y pug, engines are geographically random and dictated by what goes round sharp curves and runs smoothly.

The Terrier is a classic for light railways and the J94 could be found almost anywhere. If anyone asked how a particular engine got here I'd blame the war!

I've acquired three Hornby 'Smokey Joes', and the oldest – bought new for £7.00, now with cut-down cab and stovepipe chimney (an old golf tee) due to much dropping – is in its prime. It runs with a looseness and freedom the others haven't yet grown into.

Jenny my wife bought Jenny the engine for £1.50 at a jumble sale. She (the engine!) was then the standard bright red. I managed to get the body a bit lower so it looks less leggy, and give the straight chimney more shape by wrapping it in a loop of fine sandpaper and twizzing it round like a football rattle. Sophistication, that's what this hobby needs...

Goods stock is fairly unremarkable, all weathered with varying success. The works is very fond of its Jouef French guards van, which makes regular trips into the station.

The only bogie coach is an old Hornby clerestory which had been given an elliptical roof. Others are all four-wheelers: various bashed-up Hornby ones, an ancient Piko coach which RM readers kindly identified for me a while ago, and a 'Davy Crockett' type open-ended coach which I picked up somewhere for almost £1.00 but I've never been able to find another.

ELECTRICS

There is just one connection to a single controller which, after 20 years' use,

Gaugemaster kindly repaired under its lifetime guarantee.

RUNNING

Despite my rock-bottom standards of workmanship I love building, but there comes a point where you've got to start running trains. Would this uneasy transition be painless?

The biggest piece of modellers' licence is using the oval as an offstage run-around but you get used to it and it seems quite normal. The next biggest cheat is stabling the main line coach in Sprouts' building but it saves messing with bogies every time. By its nature there's a lot of plonking stock on and off the track but apart from the coach it's all easy stuff.

I've never been keen on 'terminus to fiddle yard' layouts and I feel that an oval creates a 'sense of journey'. In the imagination the hidden ends can be any length.

There's an element of diorama. At heart I'm a trainspotter rather than an operator and I like to sit back and watch trains. On leaving the station trains enter a tunnel in either direction and I run them round into the next tunnel, so the fiddle yard briefly becomes a through line. I then bring them back to take them off the track.

To be truly efficient more trains would go straight up to Cheesden and Deeply Vale would be a through station, but it's a very twisty branch and needs its own dedicated stud of engines. The works line had its own industrial stud, with occasional powers to propel trains into the station.

Goods is plentiful, with coal coming up from Bury to both Cheesden and the works; stone from Cheesden to Bury; goods from the branch to the works; and empties in both directions. There's also general goods in both directions made up randomly.

Operation is fiddly but fairly entertaining. Here are a couple of examples:

The morning coal train: the J94 brings three coal wagons into the station, runs round the train and shunts the guards van and rear

wagon into the bay, leaving the other two in the main platform. The branch engine arrives with a guards van, runs round and attaches it to the back of the wagons. It then runs round again and sets off up the branch.

It returns with the empties, runs round and goes back up the branch with just the guards van. Meanwhile the J94, aroused from its slumbers, picks up the empties, couples them onto the guardsvan and heads for home.

Finally a works shunter comes along light engine and takes the remaining wagon to the works.

Rush Hour: Jenny runs the single four-wheeler into the bay, bringing the night shift home. The Terrier arrives from Bury in the main platform. Jenny propels her empty coach offstage and waits.

The Terrier then runs round and shunts the carriage into the bay, making room for the branch passenger to arrive in the main platform. The branch engine, usually a Caley pug, runs round its train then sets off home.

The Terrier leaves for Bury and Jenny reappears to collect the morning shift.



What next ...?

part from tinkering this line is all but finished. I might spend some time refining running routines, as there always seems to be one more variation.

On a good day I almost achieve my ambitions of trouble-free operation, but then you get other days! I don't know how anyone has the courage, and stamina, to run a layout in public.

I might model the hillbilly terminus at Cheesden and give it a

connection to the Scout Moor Tramway, which was a local quarry

At the other end there could be a little back street terminus in Bury. I've always had armchair dreams of modelling a Temperance Billiard Hall, and there's a lovely green-tiled example near Bury Bolton Street. However those who know me would say that I wasn't a temperance sort of chap!

Using the new Peco 'TwistLock' point motor

Designed for quick and easy installation, **CRAIG TILEY** demonstrates how this new type of Peco solenoid motor can be used to operate points remotely – **THIS MONTH OO GAUGE POINTS**

ew to the Peco Lectrics range of layout accessories is the 'TwistLock' solenoid motor (PL-1000 series), which has been designed with quick and easy installation in mind. This new motor provides modellers with even more choice when considering options for switching point blades remotely on a layout. The new TwistLock motor joins



The motor is available on its own (ref.PL-1000), whilst the microswitch is available either supplied with it (ref.PL-1001, pictured) or separately (ref.PL-1005). Additional parts are also supplied with the motor to enable the unit to be surface-mounted.

the established range of Peco Lectrics electronic accessories that includes the faithful PL-10 twin-solenoid series, and the more recent SmartSwitch servo system.

The 16V ac TwistLock motor is rated at 3 amps and is compatible with all Peco pointwork items up to O gauge. (It can also be used with other manufacturers' points, although the mounting may be different to that described here.)

The unit comes with wires pre-attached, and the innovative 'TwistLock' feature enables it to be removed and re-fitted, several times whilst maintaining perfect alignment.

A new twin-microswitch attachment has also been developed for use with the TwistLock motor, which itself 'twist-locks' to the motor housing (hence the two projecting spigots). The twin-microswitch can be used for frog polarity switching on Electrofrog and Unifrog points and/or route setting indication on a mimic track diagram.

The accompanying step-by-step sequences show how the TwistLock motor can be installed both above, and below, a baseboard to operate the blades of a two-way OO gauge point. Finally, we show how a



twin-microswitch can be attached for auxiliary switching of the frog polarity.

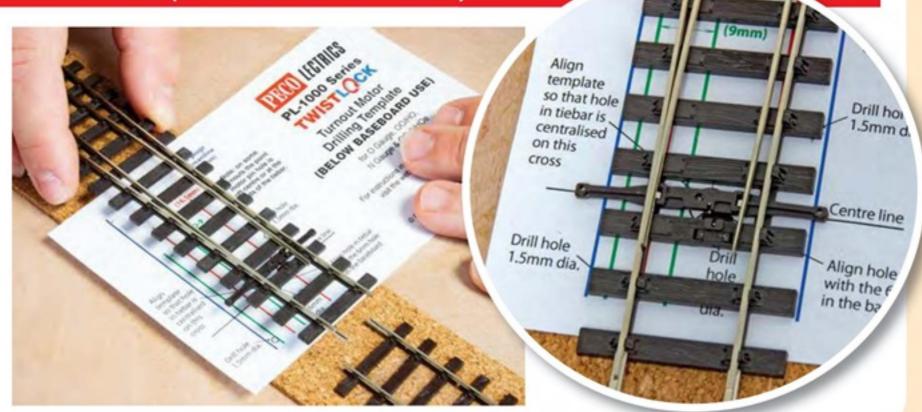

Fitting a Peco TwistLock solenoid motor (below baseboard installation)

There are two drilling templates supplied with the TwistLock motor; one for when the motor is to be mounted beneath the baseboard, and the other when the motor is to be surface-mounted on top of the baseboard. Installation should be undertaken during the track laying stage of a model railway project (as retro-fitting may require existing pointwork to be lifted). Firstly, position the drilling template underneath the point with the template's centre line in-line with the tiebar and the relevant guidelines - in this case the red lines for 00 gauge in line with the rails (see inset and note that the red lines are hidden by the rails).



With the template temporarily fixed in position with masking tape, drill three 1.5mm diameter pilot holes all the way through the baseboard in the positions marked on the template. Then open out the centre hole (for the drive pin) using a 6mm diameter drill (inset). It is important to ensure all three drilled holes are precisely perpendicular to the baseboard surface and parallel to each other, otherwise the unit may not fit or function properly.



With the track now fixed in position (photo a), the two mounting stud assemblies (b) can then be screwed into the underside of the baseboard using the 1.5mm pilot holes as guides (c).



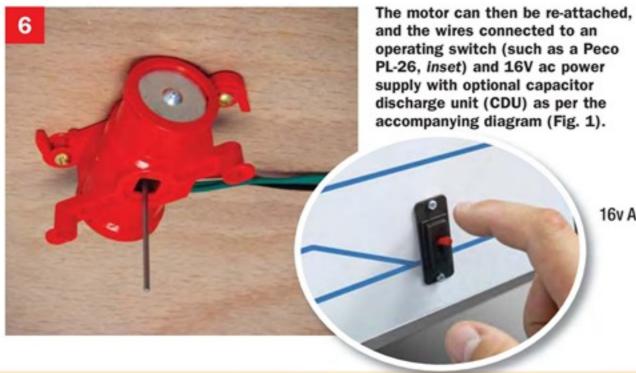






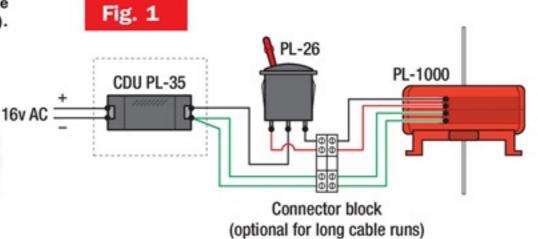
Now trial-fit the motor by first threading the drive pin through the hole in the tiebar from beneath the baseboard. Then hold the point motor up to the baseboard and rotate it clockwise until both clips engage fully with the studs (inset).





The motor drive pin is supplied over-length to cater for different depths of baseboard. The excess can be marked with a permanent ink pen (inset) and then - with the motor detached from the layout - the pin can be trimmed using a large pair of side cutters or a cutting disc (as pictured). Take great care when doing this and wear eye protection.

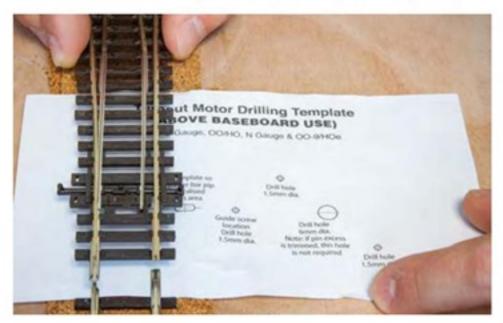

Fitting a Peco TwistLock solenoid motor (above baseboard installation)

Position the drilling template for surface mounted motors underneath the point, with the centreline on the template in line with the point tiebar. (Note that the motor can be positioned on either side of the point by rotating the template accordingly through 180°.) Align the red guide lines for 00 gauge with the rails and then tape the template in place temporarily.



With the track fixed in position, the two mounting studs can then be screwed into the pilot holes, not forgetting to add the additional plastic spacers beneath each of the studs. (The spacers are included in the package).



Drill four 1.5mm diameter pilot holes all the way through the baseboard in the positions marked on the template. The fourth hole is for the connector bar guide screw (see steps 3 and 4). Then open out the drive pin hole using a 6mm diameter drill bit(inset).



Next attach the connector bar (supplied with the TwistLock motor) to the drive pin on the motor. Then clip the point motor onto the studs whilst also locating the hole at the end of the connecting bar onto the spigot on the point tiebar. Then add the connecting bar guide screw as shown. The wires from the motor can then be connected in the same way as described for the beneath baseboard installation (Fig. 1), with both ends of the driving pin trimmed off.



Adding an auxiliary switch to change frog polarity

The TwistLock

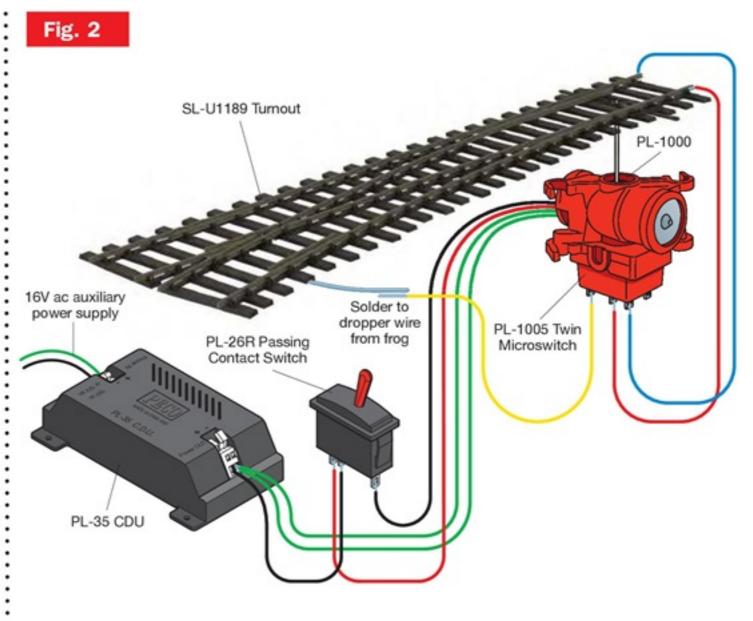


whilst the other could be used to control lights for route setting indication on a mimic diagram. The microswitch 'twist-locks' to the motor housing as pictured, with the drive pin first threaded through the rocker inside the switch.

Connecting wires can then be attached to the electrical tags on the microswitch (including the wire that connects to the frog), using

Peco PL-31 spade terminals, or by soldering them in place if preferred. Fig.2 shows a wiring arrangement for using the microswitch to change frog polarity.

Why accuracy matters to me

was rather surprised when the editor invited me to write a comment piece with this title. Although I always aim for accuracy in my modelling, I have never thought of myself as a 'rivet counter'.

It is true that from the earliest day I have wanted my models to look like the real thing.

It probably began at the age of four in the mid-1950s. My 'big' Christmas present was a Hornby Dublo Tank Goods set (the EDG17). The three-rail track did not seem to worry me too much, but the unfamiliar ex-LNER N2 tank did. I was hoping for a tank engine like the ones shunting in the yard at the end of our road. They were pannier tanks, and I was disappointed to find that no such models were available at the local toy shop (how times have changed!).

When he raised the subject with me, Steve Flint had just photographed Bevois Park and St Denys, the N gauge layout which is a joint project with my son Simon. The model is a depiction of the ex-LSWR main line between Southampton and Eastleigh in much more modern times. Clearly the trouble taken to create an accurate model of this part of the former Southern Region had made a favourable impression on him.

It was quite a long time ago when we had the original idea to model St Denys. Having

got to grips with the task of researching such an interesting location it seemed only right to make the best job we could of the modelling. Fundamental to this would be the fact that the railway scene would not be subject to any selective compression in any way, as originally it had not been envisaged that the layout would later be extended to include Bevois Park.

However plans change, and with this addition the scenic section is now over 6m long (well over a scale half mile in N gauge). Fortunately by proceeding in two stages the enormity of the task ahead did not fully hit home. Although the trackwork was to be N gauge code 55 rather than 2mm finescale,

there was the matter of the third rail to be modelled. All the structures of course had to be scratchbuilt (after drawings had first been prepared) including the lattice girder bridges.

Fortunately, the quality of off the shelf N gauge rolling stock has greatly improved in recent years but most of the items that we run on the layout have needed to be detailed and repainted to suit our chosen period (1991). In this scale there are, at the moment, no suitable ready-to-run third rail electric multiple units available so they have had to be kitbuilt.

This approach, together with scratchbuilding, has also been necessary with items such as road vehicles, platform furniture, street lights, etc, all of which need to reflect the prototype period and locality that we have chosen to model.

A dictionary definition of 'accuracy' is being 'correct and precise'. In the field of

railway modelling, this can be achieved by giving attention to detail on individual elements such as locomotives, rolling stock, buildings, signals, etc, but also putting together the overall scene needs care in order to convey the right impression.

Aiming to achieve this in a consistent way will pay dividends when operators and the public view the finished results.

Also not to be forgotten is the way in which a layout is operated. Realistic running is vital if a model is going to look like a real railway.

I do appreciate that modelling an actual location without compromising the overall size is not going to be practical for everyone.

> In fact Bevois Park and St Denys is too big to erect at home in its entirety (we can only put up one or two baseboards to work on at a time) but it was always

intended to be an exhibition layout.

Accuracy matters because I believe that it is the only way I can produce a model that is satisfying to me and, I hope, other people.

Of course some will feel that early 1990s BR is not their particular area of interest so will pass quickly by to the next exhibit, but on many occasions visitors looking at the layout recognise the location and point out particular features which makes all the trouble taken so worthwhile.

More favourite issues of RM

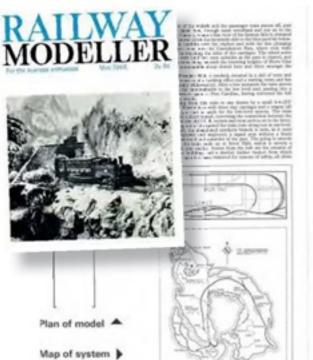

Craig & Mertonford coach body rediscovered





A Craig & Mertonford Railway coach body about which little was known and which only ever appeared in one photograph in the March 1975 RAILWAY MODELLER (right) has been found right under the noses of the members of the Edinburgh & Lothians MRC!

The chance discovery of the coach happened one Tuesday evening in September 2019 in the E&LMRC clubroom when a member, Richard, was looking through the March 1975 RM for the Eyemouth station building plans. Now in the same RM is an article by P D Hancock on the C&M which includes the only known photograph of a four-wheel compartment coach, or 'one ancient coach' as he describes it.

Another member, Linny, on taking a look at the CMR article recognised the coach in the photograph on p68 as the one being used on a temporary basis as a grounded coach body in the goods yard of the new club OO layout and which was due to be replaced by a NBR coach body being built by him! The former C&MR body was immediately reassigned to the club's P D Hancock Collection.

It appears the coach body was gifted



by P D to Lee Marsh. Back in the 1990s Lee was a member of the E&LMRC team building the club's large Rheilffordd Cwm Edwyn 009 layout (RM August 2000). The coach body somehow found itself being used as the station facilities at Kidstons Platform (above right) and there it sat until the layout was broken up about five years ago. However in the past year it had found itself being used as the temporary scenic accessory.

The body probably dates from the early 1960s and is a cut and shut job of whitemetal coach sides which come from a GEM Isle of Man Railway coach kit. However the coach ends are from a K's four-wheel Stroudley coach kit with a bit trimmed off both sides. P D used similar kits to build a rake of four-wheel NBR coaches; two unused sides, a

roof and an end panel were found in the P D 'spares drawers'.

The coach in the March 1975 RM photograph does not have any roof detail but Lee Marsh has confirmed that it did when P D gifted the coach to him. Also there is no 'Craig and Mertonford Light Railway' brass nameplate above the doors but, as will be seen in the photograph of the coach (above left) one was clearly fitted at some time after the 1975 photograph was taken. The C&MR nameplate from that coach was also in the spares drawers. The light tan livery is a mystery as no mention of it is made by P D and there is no indication this coach has ever been painted in any of the recorded C&MR liveries.

I have had some difficulty explaining to Lord Craig why, over the past 25 years, the coach has been sitting on club layouts: I never recognised it as a former CMR coach, so at his suggestion I have been to the optician...

That said, P D saw Rheilffordd Cwm Edwyn at exhibitions himself on a number of occasions but never commented on the coach!

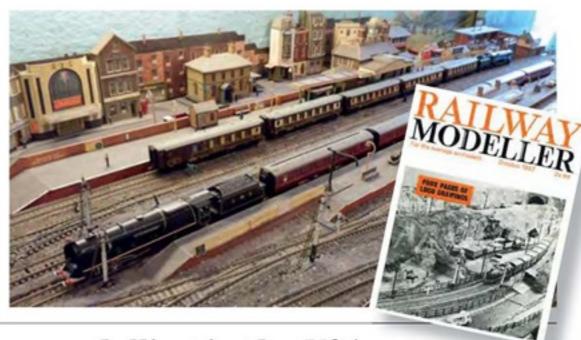

NEW PRODUCT REVIEWS

FROM RAILWAY MODELLER BY OUR EDITORIAL STAFF AND CONTRIBUTING MODELLERS



Following the success of its industrial locomotives and the charming little SECR P Class 0-6-0T, Hatton's has pushed the boat out big-time for its first modern OO project: the Class 66.

We illustrate two examples of the final pre-production models to have been received by the Widnes-based firm from its Chinese manufacturing facility; some details do not reflect the actual locomotives to be delivered to customers, such as the rotating axle caps (a first we understand on a UK outline model), which are press-fits on these two models but will be secured in place on paid-for items.

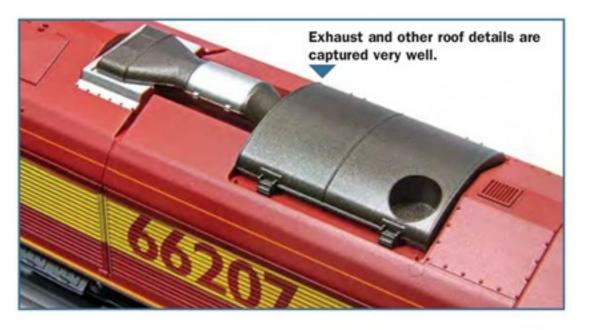
Ample weight for traction

Releasing the locomotives from their packaging, the first aspect to note is the weight: 739g, thanks to its diecast chassis block, which allied to all-wheel drive and powerful five-pole motor with two flywheels mechanism makes for prodigious haulage ability. On test on Peckwick Rye, the Pecorama loft layout, all 26 Hornby Pullman cars in our test fleet were handled without the machine breaking into a sweat. (This amounts to a trailing load of 4.2kg. First class work, chaps!)

There is much factory-fresh fine detail to these locomotives, such as chassis pipework; full cab interiors (including bulkhead signage); metal grab rails; etched grilles for the radiator, bodyside and horns; and etched nameplates attached as appropriate. The cab front at the radiator end of each locomotive is fully-detailed with scale couplers and brake pipes installed; at the other end is a slimline tension-lock in an NEM pocket on a sprung self-centring mount. Duplicates

of both are in the detail parts bag, along with brake pipes. Hatton's is reflecting the many variations as seen with such a plentiful array of proto-

types: these include the later five-door low-emission bodyshell arrangement; three headlight designs; two sizes of fuel tank; cabside window styles and

presence/absence of rear view mirrors; snowploughs as appropriate; type of sandboxes; and much more. Nonfunctioning auto couplings are included on some of the models.

When running under DCC there are three separate lighting functions for head, tail and cab lighting: switches inside the locomotive allow for day or night running configurations – day at one end and night the other if desired – plus there are switches to extinguish the tail lights at the end next to a train. DCC users can fit the recommended DCR-21Pin-DirectV2 decoder which is installed on all factory-fitted DCC locomotives. For sound, an ESU LokSound 5 decoder with bespoke audio file is specified, as installed on all models which leave the factory so equipped.

Of the over 50 liveries carried by members of the class over the years (some as one-offs), Hatton's is releasing locomotives in no fewer than 37 finishes, some as individual members of an operator's fleet (eg Freightliner), others as singletons such as the Biffa Flying Dustman and the magenta example As One We Can, a model of the one named after the shipping container conglomerate Ocean Network Express.

Prototype background

Developed from the initial Class 59s constructed for quarry operator Foster Yeoman in the mid-1980s, the real Class 66s are truly widespread, both in the UK and overseas. Almost 500 have been delivered, from the groundbreaking No.66 001 of 1998 to the final one, GBRf No.66 779 Evening Star of 2016. Truly the Black Five of modern times, albeit in a far greater range of colours!

In an acknowledgement of tighter emissions rules, from 2004 the builders, Electro-Motive Division of General Motors, modified the design to accept a cleaner-burning engine. This necessitated the provision of a fifth bodyside door to maintain access to the interior of the locomotive, and a reduction in fuel tank capacity from 1440 gallons to 1133 – note the two types of tank on the samples; the larger one on the EWS machine and the smaller on the DRS example.

Chiefly found on all manner of freight duties, from heavy haul load-lugging to intermodal flows, the Class 66s can also be found on the occasional charter.

Just three 66s have been written off as a result of accident damage, including No.66 734 which derailed in an inaccessible location on the West Highland line, its components eventually being recovered for re-use (its engine is now inside Evening Star).

Into continental Europe

The success of the type in the UK led to them being used as open-access freight operators on mainland Europe, with subsidiaries of UK operators such as Euro Cargo Rail (an off-shoot of EWS) and Freightliner Poland, with others run as self-contained fleets for a multitude of private operators.

Hatton's can congratulate itself on a job very well done: just like the designers and manufacturers of the real Class 66s in fact. Ubique – in 1:1 and 1:76 scales alike.

the Class 50 is shipped screwed to a thick wooden plinth, which would suit the locomotive if it is to be displayed.

The model is a hefty 2.37kg in weight, thanks to its cast chassis and twin motor drive, each with a

its cast chassis and twin motor drive, each with a turned brass flywheel. The manufacturer recommends controllers that can supply at least 5A, and the minimum radius is 6'. Because of the high outputs required, Heljan suggests that an ESU LokPilot (or LokSound) V5 XL decoder be used if the model is to run under DCC; the decoder can be attached to the printed circuit board via the screw terminals provided.

Directional head and tail lighting is fitted: switches on the underside of the model allow these to be turned off if required.

Sprung buffers and sprung drawhooks are features, and the roof fan (in eye-catching yellow finish As always, check your chosen loco and period, as several wore the NSE West of England sub-sector motifs – but not all.

Prototype fidelity

From the side the Heljan model is every inch a 43rd scale Class 50. The hunkered-down stance of these big locomotives has been captured very well indeed. The handbrake chains on the bogies are an especially neat touch on all four corners of the model.

There is a slight issue with the cab fronts, which may or may not be a deal-breaker: on the real things there is a supremely subtle vertical curve to the 'ledge' below the cab windows, which themselves are not parallelograms. This curve is betrayed by the horizontal handrails below the 'ledge', there being slightly more cab front above the inner ends

Prototype background

The 50 locomotives that made up the class were built at the English Electric Vulcan Foundry plant at Newton-le-Willows, Lancashire, and were taken on strength by BR between October 1967 and December 1968. Initially the locomotives were leased to BR, and they carried small bodyside plaques to that effect. (BR acquired the locomotives outright in 1974.) The Type 4s were not fault-free, problems being traced to a number of factors including filtration, engine issues and more, which were not cured fully until the locomotives were refurbished. The slow-speed equipment with which they were fitted in order to work Merry-Go-Round trains was not fully used until 1974, by which time several examples had been transferred to the Western Region from their native London Midland haunts.

Their most notable workings were in pairs on the accelerated services on the WCML between 1970 and 1974, when the electrification to Glasgow was completed.

Transferred en masse to the Western Region to replace the hydraulics, the 50s broke further new ground, this time on the Southern Region, as from the May 1980 timetable.

Refurbishment in the late 1970s/early 1980s solved most of the ills, such as the dynamic braking filter issues, but the gradual introduction of Sprinters saw the class in decline. After a final hurrah on the West of England route they were withdrawn by the end of 1994. Several have been preserved, with some main line certified, but 32 have gone to Hoover Heaven...

than the outer ends of these handrails. Heljan has rendered the 'ledge' as a near-flat plane, which has affected the shape of the cab windows. To most this will not mar an otherwise superb model.

Livery application is very good, with the NSE striping running across the louvres and cab door handrail recesses very well. The printing is fine, and the data panels are pefectly legible.

Enthusiasts wishing to recreate the glory days of these handsome machines will have their own views on the cab fronts; suffice it to say that the memories of following these locos up and down the London end of the former LSWR main line in the 1980s came flooding back to your reviewer – especially the Southampton diversions caused by work at Andover – bonus! Newest R&H 48DS from Hornby

Readers inspired by the Whisky Galore plan of last year (August) will find the latest model of the charming Ruston & Hornsby 48DS industrial loco – see Reviews, December 2019 – an ideal fit, as it is a smooth-rolling advertisement for Queen Anne Whisky, as originally blended by Hill Thompson & Co of Edinburgh in 1884. The whisky was a staple of the Glenlivet Distillery, and combined output from its own, plus Grant and Longmorn distilleries, to produce the elixir.

R&H works No.265618 left the company's Boultham plant in Lincoln for the highlands in October 1948, and worked over the last remaining segments of distillery railway at Glenlossie,







on the GNos route south of Elgin, where it met the Highland Railway. When the distillery closed in 1979, the loco and a selection of stock was donated to the Strathspey Railway, further down the GNoS at Boat of Garten. It remains part of the collection today, and is currently under restoration at Aviemore. (The brand itself, once very popular, has according to the website scotchwhisky.com, all but vanished from sale.)

The model is, as expected, beautifully finished, with all lettering down to the smallest slogans legible under magnification. The 'cream-walled' tyres are a neat touch, as are the buffers and drawhook, coloured to match. The ex-Airfix conflat is numbered as a regular revenue wagon as opposed to the internal user of the previous release; the body can be unclipped and replaced with a Dapol body of the modeller's choice if desired.

Note too that the 48DS exhibits the early style of semi-open cab, inside which is the basic interior.

Another hugely popular release of these attractive locos from the famous Margate enterprise. Tim Rayner

Rawie buffer stops from Accurascale

Accurascale has delivered on its promise to manufacture the modern friction-type buffer stops which are a widespread feature of railways here and overseas. Built by the German manufacturer Rawie, they offer a wide

range of impact protection, some even using rails in the 'four-foot' to achieve maximum retardation.

Accurascale has chosen a typical arrangement whereby the stop is accompanied by 16 additional friction



blocks, installed eight to each rail; a spacer is included to align them accordingly. (We set our blocks further from the back of the stop for photographic purposes; in reality they would be spaced off the rear of the stop.)

Accurascale is releasing two-packs with and without the recess which in reality accommodates Scarfenburgtype auto couplers; and its sister company Irish Railway Models has produced the variety seen across the Irish Sea (to the 16.5mm gauge most Irish outline modellers work to, despite 21mm being the correct scale width).

Also available is an illuminated version: current is collected through the track via stiff springs – perhaps too stiff – and for 12V dc layouts the stop should be installed on an isolated section of track and fed from the uncontrolled supply to maintain brightness irrespective of controller settings.

KQA pocket wagon for tall containers from C-Rail

With a wealth of containers in its range - both in kit form and ready-finished -C-Rail Intermodal has released its first compatible wagon, a KQA pocket wagon in Tiphook blue livery with a container lettered for the Hong Kongbased shipping and logistics firm OOCL on board.

The real things were built in Finland in 1997 to 1998, initially only numbering 35 examples. They were built to allow containers that are 9'6" high to be transported within the restricted UK loading gauge. Upon delivery a repeat order was placed for a further 40 wagons. Delivered in Tiphook Rail blue, they have tended to run in very weathered condition. Once the firm had been taken over by GE Rail services, the





Freightliner's capabilities today.

The C-Rail models represent the vehicles as built, with original UIC number prefixes. The wagon is finely moulded in plastic - which makes them seem light at only 13g unladen, 21g with the box in place - with air brake and reservoir detail, handbrake wheels and access loop grabs being worthy of note. The regular N gauge couplers are clipped into the neatly moulded Y25C bogies, allowing the substitution of other types if desired. Metal wheelsets are fitted.

Painting and finishing on both the wagon and the container are first class, right down to the small lettering, brandings such as CAUTION 9'6" HIGH ON the container doors and Channel Tunnel-compatible logo on the sides of the wagon.

There are several other liveries available of these 40' high-cube containers in the manufacturer's range. Highly recommended to all with an eye to today's freight operations.

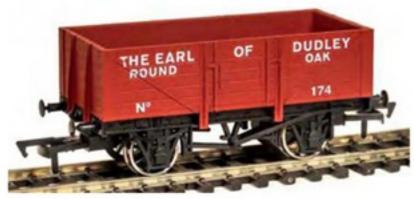

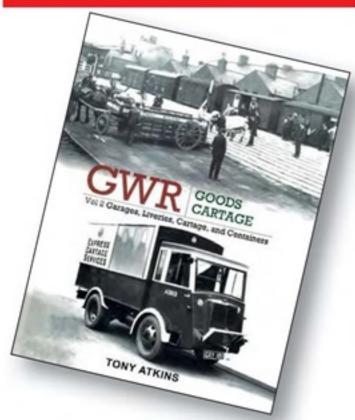

Book Reviews



GWR goods cartage vol 2 – garages, liveries, cartage and containers

Tony Atkins

This book completes the late author's detailed coverage of the GWR road freight equipment, organisation and personnel, and will be required reading for anyone interested in how the non-rail operations were carried out. Chapters look at the repair and maintenance of the fleet; numbering; cartage agents; C&D operations; cattle markets, horse fairs and agricultural shows; special cartage – one of the photos shows a huge cable drum being loaded onto a specially-built trailer – containers and much more. Economical considerations are also detailed. Appendices look at a complete fleet list, traffic regulations, accidents involving GWR road vehicles and more.

Pictures and diagrams show much of the fleet types, often in official views. Snapshots of horse van drivers retraining for the diesel- and petrol-powered replacements, including the road traffic rules of the day, will be of wider interest to transport enthusiasts. Advertisements add vintage flavour.

Modellers after a different cameo scene form the roadway – a container being loaded outside a family's old house for example – will find much inspiration here. In conjuction with Mr Atkins' other work on the GWR freight operations, this book will be a fine memorial, and a well-thumbed work of reference for many years to come.

The Hayling Island branch – the Hayling Billy

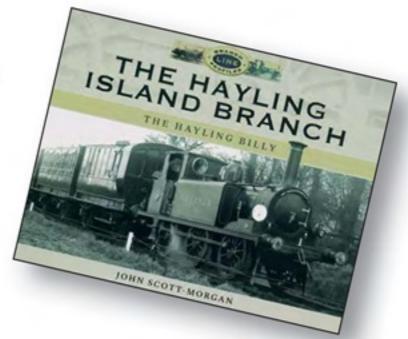

Few branch lines have maintained a captivation like the Hayling Island branch – the LBSCR line which crossed to the Hampshire resort on a wooden trestle bridge, and which was, due to said bridge's weight restrictions, an exclusive haunt of the Terriers from their displacement from south London suburbia right up to closure in November 1963.

Following a short history of the line, the photographs are arranged roughly chronologically, beginning with LBSCR days, through the Southern to the well-remembered rakes of ex-SR and BR non-gangwayed stock – including the experimental one built from GRP – during the last 15 years of the line's existence.

The full length of the short (4½ miles) branch between Havant, on the main line, and Hayling Island is travelled, with the wayside halts and Langston Bridge itself fully covered. Track plans form an appendix, and are sure to get the planning thoughts in motion. Well-written captions bring modellers' attention to changes over time − the canopy at the terminus was shortened, to the detriment of its appearance, in the 1950s − and aspects such as signalling and the locomotives' depot at Fratton are included. A colour section will kindle memories, or wistful thoughts of what was missed.

Finally, and not to be outdone, the short-lived ferry to the Isle of Wight, which will be recognised in



model form by those who have seen the East of Scotland group's P4 layout Burntisland 1883, appears for completeness in this fine album.

LMS Locomotive Profiles No 15 - the Royal Scots

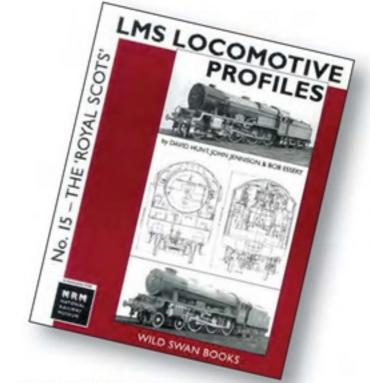

When the authors began their mammoth and highly detailed series of monographs on the LMS locomotive fleet – with the rebuilt Royal Scots (see Books, RM February 2001) – it was always their intention to backtrack to the Scots in their as-built parallel-boiler format. In the intervening two decades or so not only has further information come to light but the standard of presentation has improved, so much so that the authors have decided to revisit the 4-6-0s in original and rebuilt guise in one volume.

In common with the rest of the series, there are general arrangement drawings – including no fewer than 12 fold-outs – plus meticulously captioned photographs of great clarity, including the preparation of No.6100 (in reality No.6152) for its North American trip in 1933. Details, modifications and alterations are also covered in depth.

Tenders receive a chapter to themselves, as do the footnotes to the main text. Two appendices provide a summary of the differences between the Scots which were built at North British, and those constructed 'in-house' at Derby – a boon for modellers – and an explanation of how it was deemed more cost-effective to build the second batch despite the 'headline' price for each locomotive being greater than the NBL one.

The authors intend that a pictorial supplement to this remarkable work of reference will be published in due course. Highly recommended.

Twilight of the goods

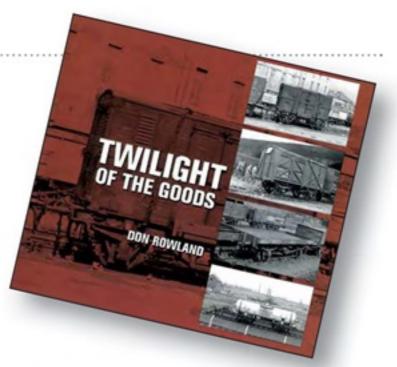

The author will be well-known as a freight vehicle authority of long standing, and in this volume he presents a selection of his extensive library of photographs, cleanly reproduced and full-page size (thus a boon for modellers), with extensive captions. Former Big Four and BR designs are featured, plus ex-Private Owner examples. Modellers will find this collection of views particularly welcome, especially as the days of the traditional two-axle goods carriers recede ever-further into history.

Gresley's V2s

It is one of the great iniquities of preservation – a 'postcode lottery' if you will – that there transpired to be (a) only one V2 that was saved from the scrapmen, and (b) it is currently unoperational. This is a pictorial tribute to the 184 of these superbly capable LNER Prairies from start to finish: the first 17 photographs document the construction of No.4782 at Darlington. Vintage colour views are included, especially the garlanded No.4843 on the occasion of its naming as King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry on 20 May 1939.

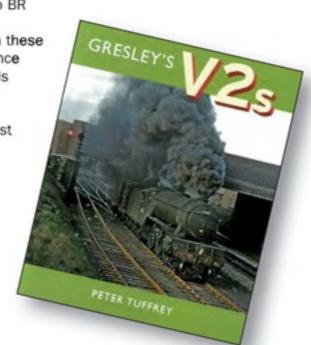
Shots of the machines on shed and in action are accompanied by detailed captions, spread geographically across the system. The photographs are arranged roughly in number order; the higher the number the later in life the V2 is pictured. Thus we run from pristine LNER finish to BR unkempt.

Modellers will find much of interest in these views, not least the construction sequence mentioned above, which will show details largely hidden with complete locos.

In short, a welcome collection of photographs of one of Gresley's very best locomotive designs.

Great Western Pannier Tank Classes

David Maidment

This impressive tome is, in effect, a tribute to the aphorism "if it ain't broke, don't fix it". The GWR pannier tank became a tool of such usefulness that, when the Company was nationalised, of the 3858 locomotives taken onto BR's books, 1269 were six-coupled tank engines – around a third of the total. Not all were pannier tanks of course: the author has spread the net widely in this survey to include saddle tank classes that saw some/all rebuilt with panniers, and allowed some that remained saddle tanks until withdrawal space herein for completeness. Not all are six-coupled machines: the first GWR pannier tank, No.1490 of 1899, was a 4-4-0T, but not one of Dean's finest...

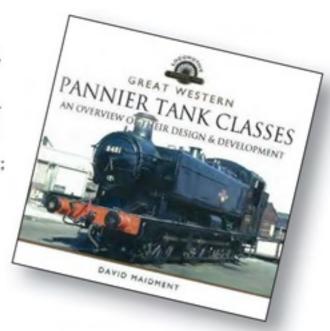
The huge fleet is dealt with in chronological order, starting with the early types such as the Buffalos, then covering the absorbed tanks, followed by the Collett 57xx family.

Remarkably, the production run began in 1860 and continued

right up until the emergence from Swindon of 16xx No.1669, destined to have a working life of just over a decade.

Preserved examples are noted in the relevant chapters, and all are listed with weight diagrams, build dates, life after main line service where appropriate (such as NCB use), and technical specifications. A fine selection of photographs (including a colour section) accompanies the well-written text; the author was a career railwayman with knowledge of the breed in the 1950s and 1960s, and some of his performance logs are also presented in this fine volume.

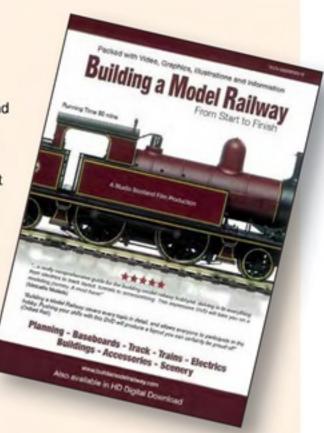
Building a Model Railway – From Start to Finish

Building your first true model railway layout, venturing beyond the train set, can be a daunting task to the uninitiated. There are so many things to consider, and if not properly planned, mistakes, some costly and certainly inconvenient, can be made.

Starting with an empty room, this brand-new production sets out to help the novice modeller take the right path from the very beginning, with planning considerations discussed first, leading on to baseboard construction, track laying and wiring. This follows on to scenery skills, including kit building, with proprietary card kits being the focus of attention. Techniques for creating the scenery are covered in depth, using many traditional methods and some new ones too, thanks to the many new products now available. The programme follows the construction of an LMS-themed end-to-end layout, constructed for DC operation, and concludes with numerous scenes of train operation, showcasing the progress made throughout the process. The build quality of the subject layout is very high, perhaps higher than some modellers might choose to adopt, but there is nothing wrong with encouraging a clean and tidy work ethic!

This is a very professional production, with a helpful and easy-going style of presentation, although quite briskly paced, structured with a series of chapters. By necessity, the treatment of the journey from start to finish is quite generic, but for the first-time modeller this is probably just about right, and hints and tips on how to learn more are given on the way. There is a tendency to direct the viewer to resources online, although we are bound to say that there are plenty of helpful guides and resources available in printed form too, not least from the publishers of this magazine, but in the end the constant reminder about planning and thinking ahead was reinforced over and over, which is no bad thing. As was the reminder that this is a hobby and should be enjoyed at every step of the way, something on which we can all agree. All in all, a very slick production with high production values, and one that will certainly help and encourage someone to embark on their first layout build.

Hornby's plans for 2020

Report and pictures from the official Hornby presentation by Steve Flint and Craig Tiley.

Monumentous and very ambitious, that's how we might describe Hornby Hobbies' plans for 2020, the year in which the world famous Hornby brand celebrates its

Yes, Hornby trains have been around for 100 years, and in so doing have played a significant role in creating a worldwide hobby popular with millions.

In fact, as Hornby Marketing Manager Simon Kohler said in his annual presentation at the manufacturer's long-time HQ in Margate; "It's more than just a hobby it's a lifetime journey."

Taking to the presentation lectern, he began by reassuring everyone that the firm was in excellent shape and that the supply chain issues that have dogged the company in recent years were improving significantly. Outstanding models promised last year would be coming through very soon, including the Large Prairie (January), the Mk.III coaches (March) and the Merchant Navy (June). The latter being stalled, along with the Pecketts and the Azumas, by a sudden factory closure in China.

It was then onto the real heart of Simon's presenta-

tion, beginning with an exciting new development under the Bassett-Lowke brand - Steampunk. "What's that?" I hear you ask. Sci-Fi and Fantasy hobbies have long held the public's imagination through gaming

and movies, and such themes were frequently applied to layout building in Channel 5's The Great Model Railway Challenge TV show. Sensing a demand for combined Sci-Fi and Fantasy activities with model railways led to Hornby partnering with Steampunk enthusiast Laurie Calvert (of Cato Pass) to create a new range of out-of-this-world railway models and accesso-

"We had to be imaginative and fantastical, think right outside the box and come up with something that could be entertaining and fun for the countless thousands of youngsters and adults who are captivated by the genre."

Simon then turned his attention to the range of centenary limited edition models, 10 categories in all, with each one marking a decade of the firm's history. The new models - all reproductions - would depict a typical product from its corresponding decade: for instance an O gauge tinplate model archetypal of the 1920s, and so on, though possibly the most exciting one for hobbyists of a certain age will be the Stephenson's Rocket

model commemorating the original 1960s version. Full details of each centenary model appear later in this report.

trated the design office as on the list are three newly tooled examples of LNER express locomotives including the legendary Hush-Hush W1 Class 4-6-4 both in original form and rebuilt form. The limited edition Rocket set from the centenary limited edition range will also be available in 'ordinary' packaging in the

2020 range.

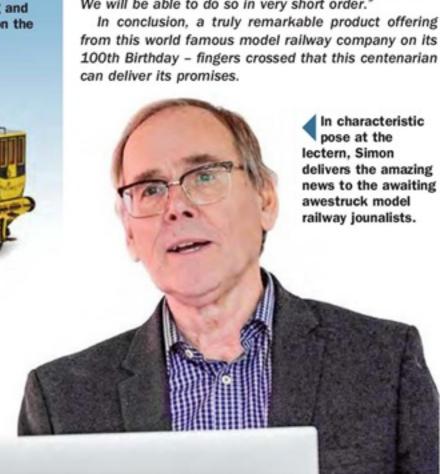
Newly re-tooled, due to popular demand, is the prototype APT-P Class 370 model, first introduced in 1980 by Hornby and long since absent from the range. The new version will include supplementary models of all the carriage types found in the formations.

The 2020 range also includes a huge tranche of re-liveries on both locos and stock as detailed later.

With three distinct divisions of new releases in the bag, it was with astonishment that we listened to the details of yet another initiative born within the walls of the Margate grand edifice.

A new app to use on a mobile phone or tablet - the HM6000 - for the control of 12V dc analogue trains. The system, which you can find more information on later in this report, will be complete with all the associated accessories and power transformers.

With traditional analogue and DCC digital control systems entrenched in the hobby, we wondered where in the market this might fit. Simon replied that it would primarily be a control solution within the brand. "You can do just about everything on your phone these days," he emphasised, "so why can I not control trains? We will be able to do so in very short order."

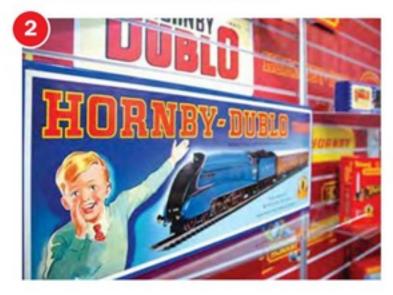
Hornby Centenary range of limited edition models



Hornby will be celebrating its centenary with a range of limited edition products, each one marking a different decade of the company's history and carrying a '100 years' logo mark. The launch of each product will be spread throughout 2020:

1920s – Hornby has returned to its O gauge roots for the first of these centenary releases, commissioning the tinplate specialist ETS to produce a new three-rail 0-4-0 steam locomotive based on a 1920s Hornby clockwork model (photo 1). Supplied in period-style packaging with certificates, there will be four liveries produced (inspired by London & North Western Railway black, Midland Railway red, Caledonian Railway blue and Great Northern Railway green).

1930s – This decade be marked with a train set that evokes an original Hornby Dublo release; the set will comprise Gresley A4 No.4468 Sir Nigel Gresley in LNER garter blue livery with two Gresley teak carriages, oval of track and controller (photo 2).



1940s – The latest tooling version of the Stanier Coronation Pacific will be presented as No.6231 Duchess of Atholl in LMS crimson livery without smoke deflectors (photo 3); a homage to the original 1948 Hornby Dublo version. The model (which will mirror the construction of the Dublo original with diecast locomotive body and plastic tender body) will be presented in period 'candy stripe' blue packaging.

1950s – Stepping away from trains briefly, these years will be marked with a fleet of six 'Dublo Diecast' vehicles – including a Scammell Mechanical Horse and VW T2 van – in colour schemes inspired by the original Dinky Dublo models of 1957.

1960s – This will be marked with a train pack (presented in Triang Railways style packaging) comprising models of Stephenson's Rocket and accompanying trio of carriages – all from the brand new tooling (photo 4).

1970s - A model of No.92220 Evening Star will take centre-stage, this symbolising the last locomotive produced by Triang Railways. The 9F model will be



complete with a commemorative makers plate (cast in resin) based on that affixed to the real locomotive.

1980s – The humble 'Smokey Joe' 0-4-0ST will be produced as a limited edition; this model, which incredibly has never been out of the Hornby range since 1983, will receive extra details (including separate handrails) and be presented in c.1980s 'blue belt' packaging (photo 5).

1990s – The latest tooling Stroudley Terrier 0-6-0T will be presented as LB&SCR-liveried No.45 Merton, this name chiming with that of the original Triang Railways factory.

2000s – The first decade of the 21st century will see an 18ct gold plated version of No.35028 Clan Line – the model that the firm attributes to a resurgence of the Hornby brand.

2010s – Finally, a Peckett 0-4-0ST will be released in works grey livery as No.614, presented with a replica brass effect maker's plate.



There will be a further release, which will celebrate 100 years of the Hornby train set and also recall the first train set produced by Rovex; this limited edition set (photo 6) will utilise the forthcoming all-new tooling Stanier Princess Royal tooling, presented as No.46201 Princess Elizabeth in BR plain black livery with early emblems (as per the 1950s release) with a pair of LMS coaches, oval of track and controller.

Retro wagons

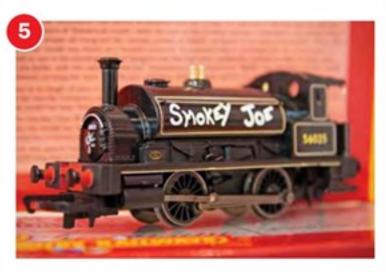
Also in keeping with the centenary theme, there will be six wagon releases in 'retro' liveries that evoke colour-

ful livery schemes from the tinplate era, such as the United Dairies, Colman's Mustard and Crawford's Biscuits examples illustrated here (photo 7).

Golden Tickets

Hornby will be running a 'Golden Ticket' campaign as part of the promotion for the centenary range, with a single ticket hidden in a box for each of the centenary products listed above. These tickets take the form of vouchers for values ranging from £100 up to £500, which will be redeemable via the Hornby website. The top prize is tickets for two to travel on board the Belmond British Pullman.

Steam locomotives

New tooling for steam traction is a veritable parade of LNER express locomotive types. Topping the bill is Gresley's experimental W1 4-6-4 No.10000 'Hush Hush' (photo 8). Completed in late 1929, this locomotive was constructed with an experimental marine type watertube boiler operating at 450psi. It was subsequently re-built with a conventional type of boiler and A4-style streamlining, emerging from Doncaster in this condition in November 1937 (photo 9). It was finally withdrawn in June 1959.

The Hornby model (photo 10) will be released in five versions, the first three will cater for No.10000 in original form; LNER grey, LNER grey with optional British Enterprise nameplates (as allocated, but never affixed to the real locomotive) and an interpretation of lined LNER apple green livery (that the

locomotive could conceivably have appeared in). The fourth and fifth versions will depict the locomotive in rebuilt form; as No.1000 in LNER blue with valances, and finally in BR green without valances as No.60700.

Continuing the LNER express locomotive theme will be examples of the Thompson A2/2 and A2/3 Pacifics. The former, ex-P2s (photo 11), will be presented as No.60501 Cock O' The North in BR lined green livery with early emblems, and No.60505 Thane of Fife

New HM6000 layout controller

The brand new HM6000 is a control system which uses smart phone app technology to control a 12V dc analogue powered model railway.

The system can operate up to eight channels (circuits) or functions on a layout. These can be, primarily,

loco speed, inertia and braking control, and/or the switching of accessories such as electrically operated points and signals.

The app can be installed on Apple or Android smart phones and tablets and uses in-built Bluetooth technology to communicate with base station control modules. Each base unit controls two channels or circuits (eg two separate tracks each running a loco) and each has its own mains/transformer power unit. Up to four modules can be added to the system to operate eight circuits. When used to control points one circuit can switch two points (such as a crossover) simultaneously.

The app also includes on-screen track

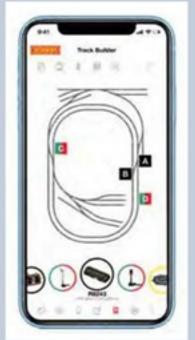
planning software. As well as enabling the user to draw a track diagram on the phone, it also allows the allocation of points and signals on the layout to the corresponding contol glyphs on the screen.

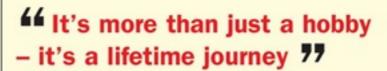

ranks of BR Standard locomotive classes is set to be filled with models of the 78xxx 2MT 2-6-0 (photos 14 and 15), which will be available as Nos.78000 in BR plain green with late crests, 78010 in BR lined black with early emblems and 78047 in BR lined black with late crests.

The final new tooling announcement will see Stephenson's Rocket produced from all-new tooling, supplied with a trio of Liverpool & Manchester Railway fourwheel carriages. In conjunction with the limited edition train pack that forms part of the aforementioned centenary range, these models will also be available in the main Hornby range.

Aside from new tooling, there are humerous re-introductions, including a quartet of Terriers, and pairs of four- and six-wheel Pecketts; highlights include a Terrier as No.13 Carisbrooke in lined Malachite green livery with BRITISH RAILWAYS in 'sunshine' lettering on the tanksides (photo 16), and B2 class Peckett No.1426 in c.1960s NCB green livery with red coupling rods (photo 17).

Green is the colour for new versions of the firm's Stanier Pacific models, with Princess Royal No.46211 Queen Maud and Coronation Pacific No.46257 City of Salford (photo 18), which will both be decked out in BR lined green livery with late crests.

The latest addition to the 1:1 Collection will be 9F 2-10-0 No.92212 in BR plain black livery with late crests, whilst Railway Museum-branded models of locomotives in the National Collection will include Drummond T9 4-4-0 No.120 in LSWR lined green, Churchward No.4003 Lode Star in GWR lined green livery with 'shirtbutton' roundels, and BR Standard Class 7 Pacific No.70013 Oliver Cromwell in lined BR green livery with early emblems.

Diesels and electrics

The headline act from all of the new tooling announcements for 2020 is undoubtedly the Class 370 (photo 19) 25kV ac overhead electric Advanced Passenger Train (APT), which is being designed and manufactured by Hornby from scratch (the original 1980s-era tooling no longer being in existence). There will be train packs in five- and seven-car formations, together with supplementary releases for a Non-Driving Motor (NDM) vehicle and twin-packs of TS, TRBS, TU and TF trailer cars, which will enable various formations up to a full 13-car set to be assembled. And yes, the model will tilt!

Also to benefit from all-new tooling will be models of the Class 91 Bo-Bo 25kV ac electric locomotive (photos 20 and 21). Four versions will be available

initially; 91 002 Durham Cathedral in InterCity 'Swallow' livery, 91 117 Cancer Research UK in GNER livery, 91 111 For the Fallen in VTEC 'remembrance' livery and 91 118 The Fusiliers in LNER red livery. There are no plans for accompanying MkIV coaching stock – yet...

Amongst the notable new liveries on exiting tooling is a Class 390 Pendolino four-car train pack in the brand new Avanti West Coast colour scheme (photo 22). This pack will be augmented with five trailer cars in the same scheme, available individually to enable up to a nine-car rake to be assembled.

There will also be Class 373 Eurostar models adorned in an interpretation of the 'Yellow Submarine' scheme (photo 23) that was bestowed upon a full 18-car set in 1999, which was undertaken as part of the marketing campaign for

the digitally-enhanced re-release of the 1968 film by The Beatles. Both a train set and train pack will be available, each comprising a motorised driving trailer,

passenger saloons.
Other new liveries include a five-car LNER Azuma (Hitachi Class 800/1) train pack with 800 104 in 'Celebrating Scotland' scheme (photo 24), whilst also of note is a trio of new 48DS models in DVLR (photo 25), Express Dairy and GrantRail Ltd schemes, together

Steampunk from Bassett-Lowke

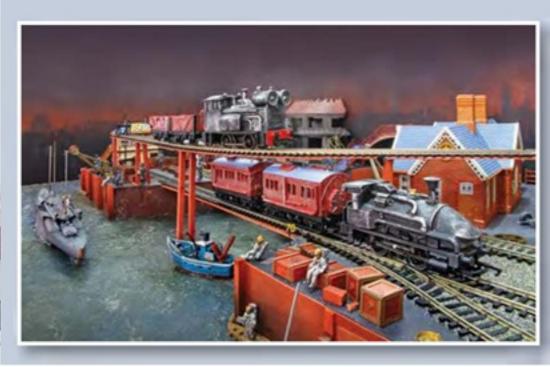
Children love stories of fantasy, Sci-Fi and interstellar warfare, so what better way to introduce model railway building and operation to youngsters than through a very popular form of adult escapism – Steampunk.

Imagine, for a moment, that steam is used to power the world, past, present and future; dinosaurs have become domesticated, and interplanetary travel is commonplace; that's a world which Steampunk embraces.

The radical and inventive train set pack and accessories under the Bassett-Lowke brand has been designed in conjunction with Laurie Calvert who lent some of his locomotive and rolling stock designs to the project. All items use established mod-

els from the main Hornby range, modified with resin additions and repainted in appropriate colours. The range will also include 8" figurines and a set of acrylic paints to complement the railway set which builds into an end-to-end format layout only 105cm (42") x 50cm (20") in size: ideal in fact for a spare bedroom or shed.







Resin additions and repaints to existing Hornby models will make up the locomotive range.

The set is a simple end to end layout which fits nicely in the average sized room.

There is to be a range of collectable figurines 8" high, to go with the railway.

This year's Model Rail Scotland event will take place on Friday 21, Saturday 22 and Sunday 23 February 2020 in Hall 3 of the Scottish Event Campus in Glasgow (postcode G3 8YW).

The three-day exhibition - which is being supported by Peco Publications Ltd, Hornby Hobbies Ltd, Bachmann Europe Plc and Squires Tools - will bring together in excess of 50 layouts in a variety of scales and gauges, representing British and continental prototypes, together with 150 exhibitor stands including specialist trade support, societies and modelling demonstrations.

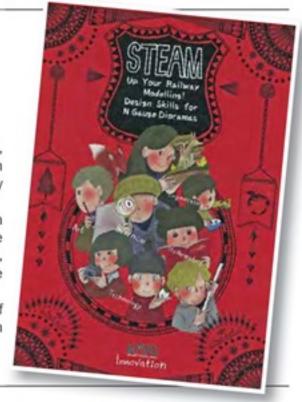
'Steam up' your railway modelling with Kato

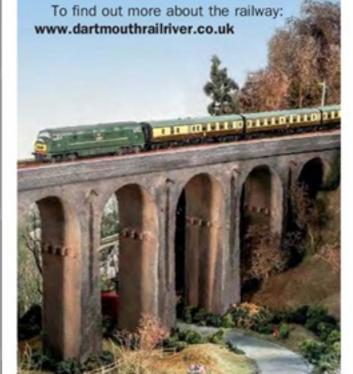

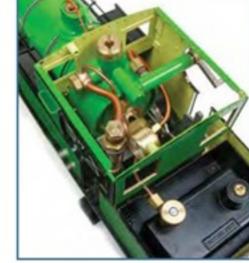

Peter Halliday Dowd

We regret to announce that Peter Dowd, the last surviving founder member of Wakefield Railway Modellers' Society, passed away on 18 November 2019. He was 92 years old and had been President of the society for some years.

As an active member he visited the clubrooms most weeks, in more recent times modelling figures for his 16mm narrow gauge garden line, The Mogok Ruby Mines Railway (which featured in the May 1999 issue of CONTINENTAL Modeller). This project commemorated his time in Burma with the Royal Army Service Corps in the late 1940s.

He subsequently worked for 29 years in the fire service, after which he spent 10 years prior to his retirement as a workshop technician at Outwood Grange school where he thoroughly enjoyed being able to pass on his extensive knowledge to children.

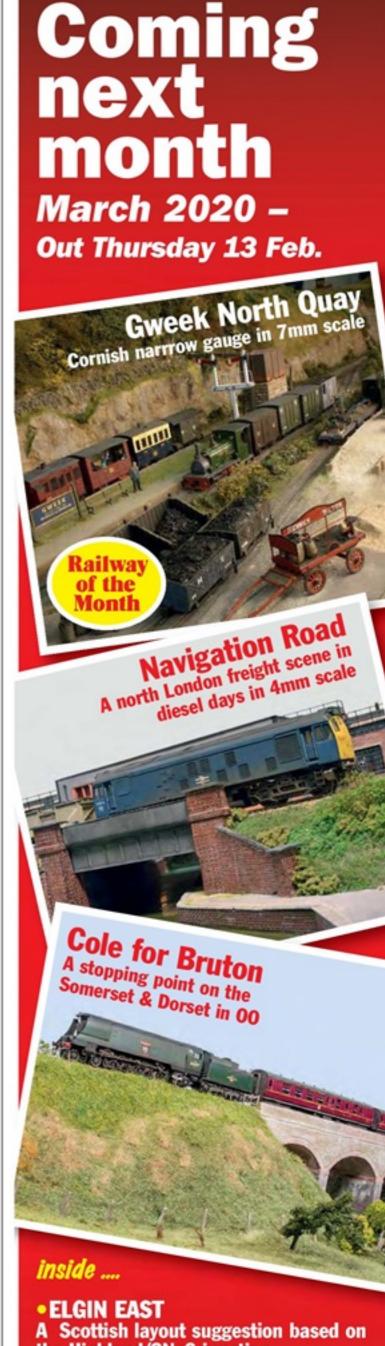
Peter had a love of the Midland Railway, modelling this for many years in 4mm scale as an early exponent of EM standards and member of the EM Gauge Society. He built a large

layout in his attic (Wakefield Northgate), which was based on a hypothetical terminus at the end of a branch from the Midland main line near Normanton. One of the locos on the layout was a Hornby Dublo A4 painted in Midland red and named Cuckoo - a great example of his subtle sense of humour!

Peter was also an early and active member of the 16mm Association and was involved in the construction of the 16mm system at the Midland Railway Centre at Butterley, which enabled him to satisfy both of his interests. The Yorkshire Area of the 16mm Association maintain a demonstration layout named 'Mount Dowd' in recognition of his contributions.

He will be sorely missed. Our condolences to Peter's family, friends and fellow society members.
