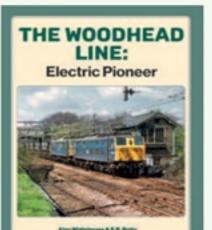


BRITISH INDUSTRIAL STEAM IN THE 1960s

The collected industrial colour photography of Terence Dorrity

As a schoolboy trainspotter, Terence Dorrity spent many an hour by the ex-Great Western Railway line at Stratford-upon-Avon but then subsequently discovered the parallel world of industrial railways in the late 1950s on a car journey from his home town to Banbury. Wisps of steam rising from the fields near Wroxton turned out to be coming from locomotives on the Oxfordshire Ironstone Railway with its fleet of tank engines which worked in the quarries and along the double track 'main line' to exchange sidings with British Railways. Acquisition of a copy of the Birmingham Locomotive Club Industrial Locomotives of the West Midlands Pocket Book, and subsequent membership of the club, led to further visits to industrial systems in and around nearby Birmingham. Next came the South Wales valleys with, at first, the aim of visiting the numerous BR sheds to be found there but the sight of NCB locomotives at coal mines, and the gradual demise of BR steam, soon tipped the balance and priority was given to industrial sites. There were many collieries much closer to home as well. The NCB Warwickshire Area pits used some very interesting locomotives, including an unusual Beyer-Garratt 0-4-4-0, and Staffordshire collieries and quarry lines in Northamptonshire were also within easy day trip range. Casting the net wider, Terence took advantage of visits to an aunt and uncle in London to investigate some sites in the capital, such as Beckton Gas Works, and the nearby south-east including the Bowater's 2ft 6ins gauge system at Sittingbourne. There were several excursions to Scotland to explore the extensive NCB Waterside system in Ayrshire, other collieries, steel works, gas works, power stations and even a distillery as far north as Aberdeen and Morayshire. There was a lot more and fortunately Terence was able to capture much of it in colour before everything disappeared forever, long lost scenes which are now presented within these pages.

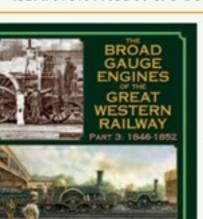

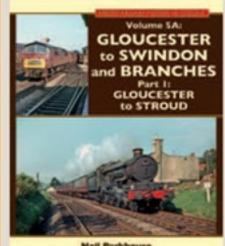

THE REVEREND CANON BRIAN ARMAN

In 1843 Swindon Works opened. Equipped with the most modern machine tools and with a workforce drawn from every corner of the kingdom, the seeds were being sown for one of the world's great locomotive, carriage and waggon manufactories. By 1845, the works were sufficiently developed to allow the construction of locomotives to commence. Take a tour around this rail-served brewery system

Master modeller and past RM Cup winner **PETER GOSS** is well known for his large layouts with detailed architectural studies and exquisite hand-painted figures. However, he has downsized slightly for his latest OO gauge project, which depicts the brewing industry of Burton-on-Trent set in the Edwardian era.

lexander Copper and James Wort were merchant brewers in Burton-on-Trent before 1835, but within 15 years, both the partners had passed away. Their descendants formed a public limited liability company in the late 1880s, Copper, Wort & Co. Ltd. The company was later bought out and amalgamated in 1910 with a larger brewery.

Our period, the early 1900s, represents the high point of the brewing industry in Burton-on-Trent, when Copper, Wort & Co. Ltd. was still an independent company. The town was extremely busy as the bigger breweries started

to establish their real potential with the Midland Railway's network, and all the smaller breweries muscling in between them.

The layout depicts, essentially, the whole brewing process together with a small section of High Street and a level crossing. The track plan is loosely based on Worthington's brewery track arrangement at Burton at the turn of the 20th century, and the model buildings have been created using the larger brewery building designs found elsewhere in the town; predominantly Bass, Ind Coope, and Truman's. Some of these buildings

are still in existence today, even though the railways have long gone. Assistance and advice were gleaned from various people, principally my friend Joe Stamper from Burton, and included numerous visits to remaining brewery building sites and to the National Brewing Centre in Burton.

The layout design

The layout is built to 4mm scale using OO gauge Peco Streamline trackwork, laid on a hexagon shaped sixboard arrangement (4' length per hex outside edge) and is about a third of the size of my previous two layouts (Rowland's Castle – see RM November 2008 and The Worlds End – see RM October 2015). When erected on its clothes horse type trestles it covers an area of about 8' x 8'. Three long diagonal braces tighten up the layout's stability. At exhibition venues I, together with my wife Julie and our team of helpers, use a hexagon shaped interlocking foam floor mat marked out with the trestle numbers to set out the footprint, so nothing else needs to be measured when setting the layout up.

The track plan is a continuous run with plenty of sidings available for shunting. Four of the boards contain the complete brewery process, whilst the fifth contains the High Street crossing with shops and houses with a single track running between and behind the town buildings. The sixth board is a fiddle yard which includes a small maintenance area.

Point tiebar control is by piano wire running in plastic tube, which is set into the cork surface and connected to the points which have had their springs removed. At the operator end a DPDT (Double-Pole-Double-Throw) sliding switch changes the polarity of the live frogs and alternates the red and green LED route indicators. A couple of 'juicers' are included for the diamond crossing in front of the Ale Stores, which automatically change track polarity for those sections each side of the crossing.



The maltings and the brewing process

The maltings is where cereal grain is delivered in covered wagons brought down from the main line exchange

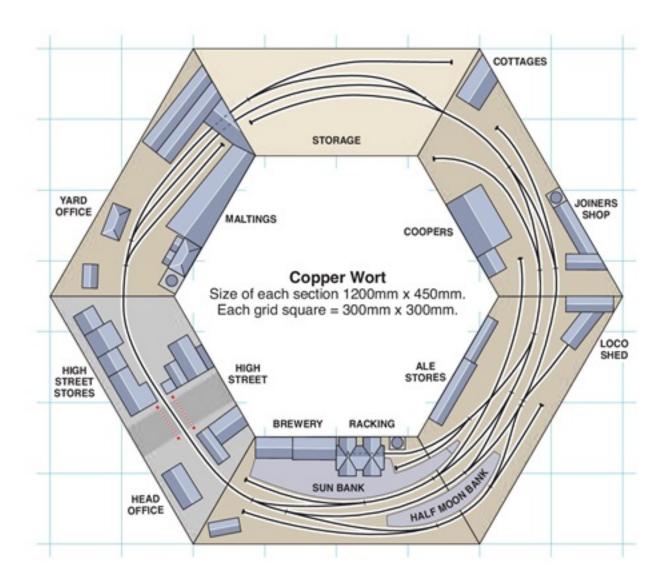
sidings at Burton station. The grain is dried in a process known as malting. The grain is made to germinate by soaking in water and is then halted from germinating further by drying with hot air. This is the malt.

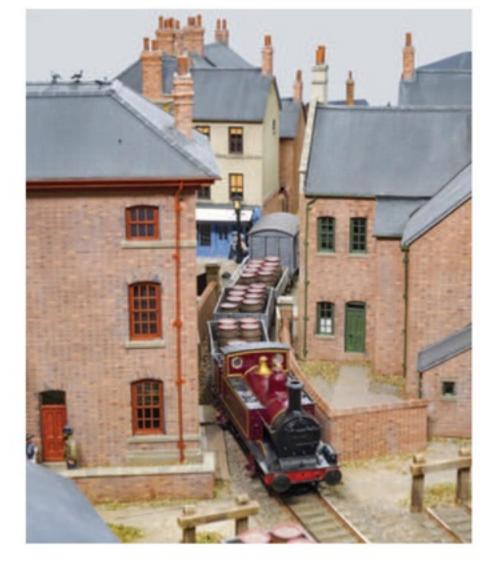
Malting buildings were not originally included in brewery rail system plans as the process was considered specialist and was provided by other companies. Eventually, however, the breweries started to include maltings within their site designs but there was little

physical room left within the very confined areas of Burton-on-Trent. The maltings were therefore often located on separate pieces of land well away from the breweries they served. To suggest this, I have deliberately located the High Street scene between the maltings and brewery boards (see plan above).

The brewing process begins with the liquor (water) being pumped from a well below the brewery up to the cold liquor tank which is right at the very top of the tower. The prepared malt is transferred from the maltings to the brew house in covered wagons where it is crushed in the grist mill after which it travels to the masher and then on to the mash tuns. The mash tuns are just visible inside the brew house on the model. The brewing process then continues through the brew house until the product reaches the union and racking building to the right of the brew house, at which stage the beer is run into empty casks.

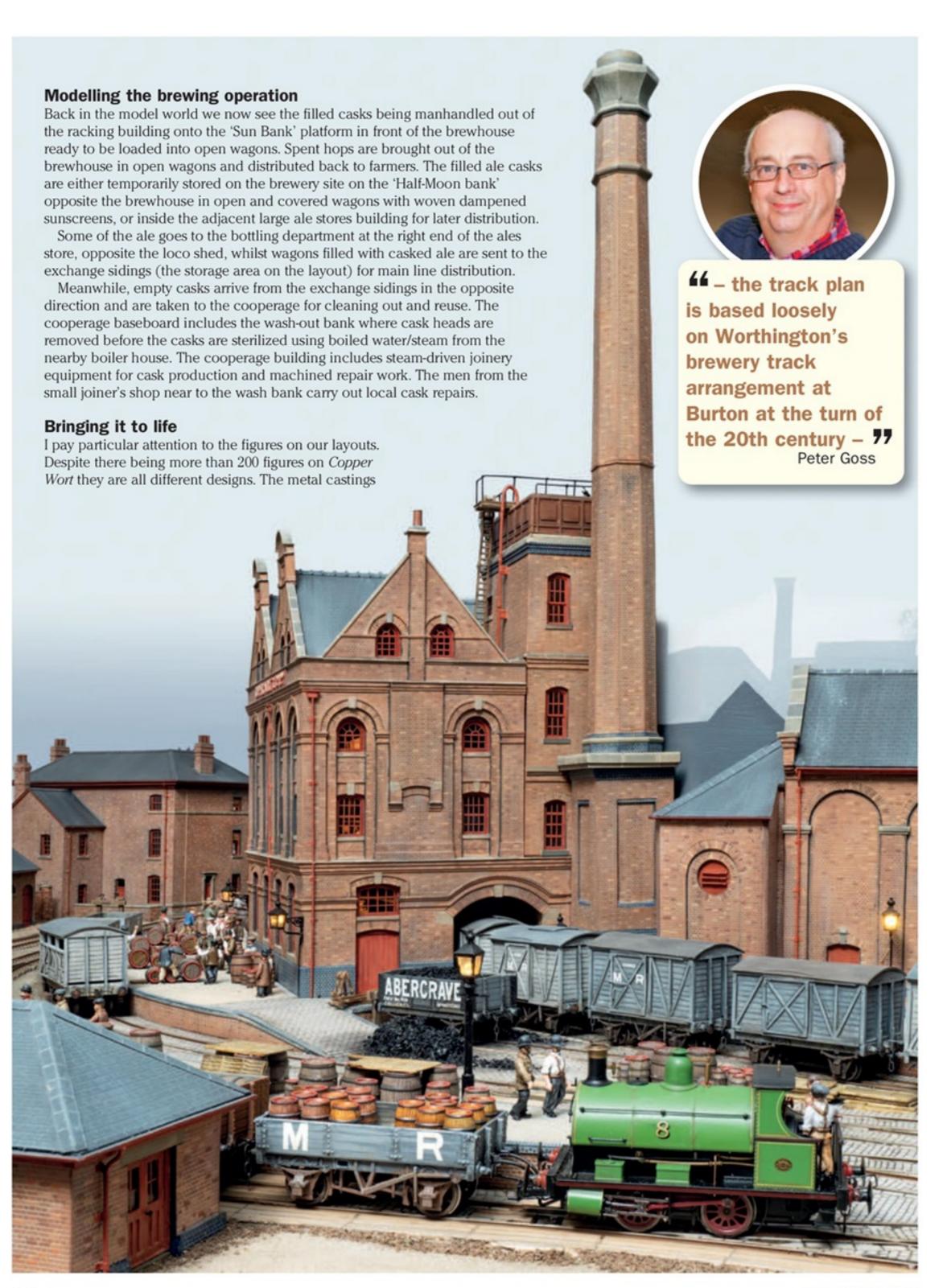

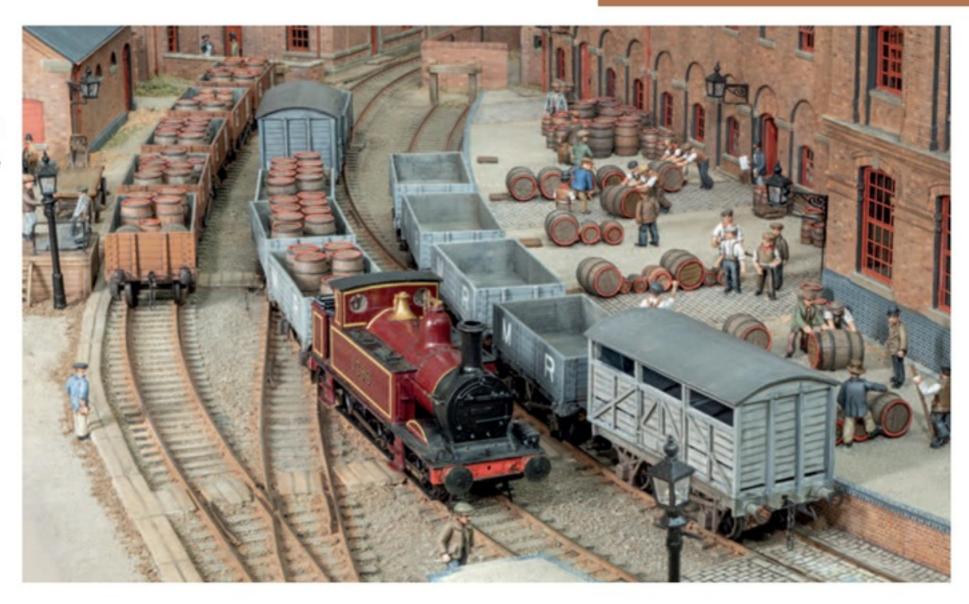

have been taken from both our own Pete Goss Figures and Andrew Stadden's Edwardian ranges. Some figures have had their hats changed or hats added, heads turned, tools added, arms moved, or more drastically, have been sliced in half at the waist and carved to make them bend over to push casks before re-assembling.

To paint the figures, first a short section of 0.5mm brass wire is inserted into the underside of one foot of each figure, these pegs then enabling multiple figures to be lined up on a block of wood, which first had corresponding holes drilled into it. The figures are then batch-sprayed with white etch undercoat before painting the individual figures using acrylics. Finally, they are matt varnished before being fixed to the layout, slotting the pegs in pre-drilled holes in the layout scenery. Glued

in place, first with impact adhesive and then with a small drop of superglue, the figures remain robustly located.

Other buildings

A small engine shed serves the brewery but is undersized as the brewery locomotive fleet has grown considerably over the years. A coal loading bank and water crane are available nearby to keep the locomotives running during the working day. Mess rooms adjoin at the end of the engine shed and there is another mess building and toilet block opposite the 'Half-Moon bank'.

There are several boiler houses, coal stores and chimneys dotted around the site. The three octagonal shaped chimneys are a scale 100' high (400mm) and are removable from the model for transport purposes.

Locomotive fleet

To add some substance to what is essentially a little-known small brewery company I have given Copper Wort a few of its own 0-4-0ST locomotives to support the larger Midland Railway locomotives running through the town. The fleet currently stands at seven: six Hornby Peckett 0-4-0STs and one Bachmann Class 1F 0-6-0T. The Pecketts (four blue and two green liveried) have been re-numbered 1, 2, 4, 5, 7 and 8. All have had their cab upper rear panels removed for all-round crew visibility as Bass Brewery did, and the green ones have had their roofs halved to represent an earlier half-cab design that the Copper Wort brewery employed. 24" buffers have been added to the locomotives and very light weathering applied. Crews have been added using figures from our own range with various additions and enhancements.

The Bachmann half-cab 0-6-0T has had its LMS square shaped Belpaire firebox replaced with a plasticard round-topped version, together with replacement boiler

fittings to suit. It has also received a complete re-paint from LMS black to the earlier Midland Railway lined crimson livery and was re-numbered to 1396.

To maximise electrical reliability when running at slow speeds, I created eight-wheel pick-ups on all the four-coupled Pecketts by having a match wagon permanently coupled to the locomotive using an articulating brass wire connector. The insulated steel wagon wheel axles are electrically connected to the locomotive using 0.5mm brass wire lengths which touch the wagon wheels, soldered to copper-clad acetate strips under the wagons with flexible wires soldered to the nearest two locomotive pick-up wheel wipes. The flexible wires pass through holes drilled in the modified Hornby locomotive coupling plate to hold them in place whilst allowing full articulation. The hook was removed, and the hole filled in with plasticard.

Wagons

The accompanying wagon stock is entirely kit-built, or scratch-built on a kit chassis. This consists of 40 or so Midland Railway and Great Northern open wagons with a few outside-framed Midland Railway vans. There are no brake vans on the layout as they were generally kept at the main station exchange sidings. All the wagon stock is kept out on the scenic boards either in sidings or constantly being moved around the layout. Aside from the open cask wagons, other trains running through our

brewery include coal deliveries from South Wales, internal train movements using a couple of Copper Wort three-plank company wagons, the directors' saloon (see p229) and a Midland-liveried shunter's wagon (right) acquired for company railway worker and equipment movements.

The many hundreds of casks are resin or cast metal proprietary items in three sizes. Some of the casks have had their heads drilled out and separate lids laid in at an angle to represent the washing out and sterilising processes.

Electrics

DCC is included for locomotive drive only. This includes inertia starting and stopping. With the available eightwheel pick up, the little 0-4-0STs run extremely well at slow speeds. A separate 12V dc circuit powers all the LED gas lamps (with suitable resistors) and the red and green LEDs on the back panels of each board showing main line routing.

Operation

The operational design started out with good intentions comprising a complex multi-move schedule sequence. Unfortunately, however, this proved too complicated for use at exhibitions and so it was refined to a simple 10-move train sequence with trains taking turns to run round the layout before being shunted back to the same, or a different siding. A variety of locomotives can be used during a running session with perhaps no more than two being in steam at any one time.

The wagons generally run as fixed rakes of five or six vehicles coupled together, with a piece of bent 0.6mm brass wire permanently located on one wagon and slotting into a short plastic tube on the end of the next wagon. This rigid articulation provides absolutely no slop in movement so the wagons can be propelled or pulled around the very tight curves with no risk of buffer

locking. Couplings on the wagon rake ends are short length Sprat & Winkle couplings with a single hook on the wagon end and an empty hoop on the locomotive. The wagons face the same way round so that hook and hoops or brass wire and tube receivers remain constant. Small magnets are pre-laid in the track at a dozen strategic locations and the

S&W hooks are slightly bent to the curvature of the main line to ease coupling and uncoupling. Some wagon rakes are made up of single wagons with S&W couplings but with a hook only at one end and a hoop only on the next wagon.

Looking forward

We hope to attend a number of shows in the near future once the uncertainty of recent times has passed, details of which I hope will published amongst these pages in due course. It will be wonderful to get out and about and meet all our friends again on the show circuit.

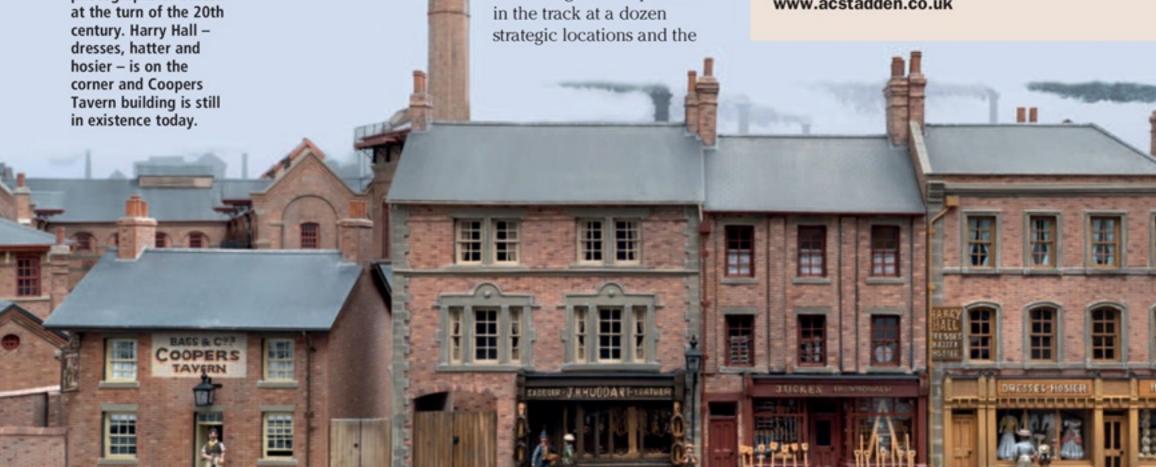

Unusual wagons for Dentdale – 2

IAN NUTTALL presents a further selection of oddities and novelties from the extensive wagon fleet that is operated on his outstanding 4mm scale Settle & Carlisle layout.

hen I was considering which of my wagons to present here for this second selection, I realised I was looking at a cross-section of my model railway history, individual cameos of what I had created over the course of more than 50 years of commitment to this fascinating and compelling hobby of ours. The first was built in my early days as a member of the Grimsby & District MRS, whilst the most recent rolled off the Kingswear Wagon Works production line only a couple of months ago.

Also apparent is the broad range of construction materials used including plastic injection mouldings, whitemetal, etched brass and plasticard sheet for the scratch-built examples. No card models from the likes of Kenline or ERG are featured here, and although I do have a few in my collection, it is a struggle for their level of detail to match modern offerings.

Ready-to-run models are very much in the minority on my layout and those I do possess have all had work done to impart my individual stamp on them. I have nothing against off-the-shelf wagons, particularly as the standard nowadays is so high, although I do not like to see wagons together carrying the same number. Furthermore, I do happen to like building wagons as opposed to merely opening a box!

And so, to the wagons forming this second batch (the first instalment appeared in RAILWAY MODELLER March 2021). Should my offerings encourage you to broaden the range of goods wagons on your layout by either kit- or scratch-building then I would be delighted (or the 'hands on' approach could become a dying art) and in many ways, that is what true railway modelling is all about.

Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway Diagram 3 van

The Lancashire & Yorkshire Railway was particularly keen on providing maximum ease of access to its rolling stock so included 'roof doors' to help. This feature was commonplace on L&Y vans but is rarely seen on model railways. The reason for this is obvious; you cannot buy one off-the-shelf, so must resort to kit- or scratch-building if you want one on your layout. Mine is the David Geen kit built to Diagram 3 which dates from around 1880 onwards. I stocked up with around a dozen of David's whitemetal kits at Railwells a while back.

To replicate the tarpaulin cover, which only covers half of the roof width, I used a sheet of tissue whilst strips of 20 x 40thou plasticard represented the slats attached to the tarpaulin, which provided stability in real life. Fine brass wire and twisted five-amp fuse made a decent job of fixing the lower edge and reasonably to scale. Many L&Y brake levers extended beyond the headstock so I am assuming the LMS replaced the original.



LMS 20T coke hopper

This is no longer quite so rare on layouts as Hornby has introduced a version relatively recently. And I do have one, still boxed to date, as I was interested to compare the latest offering with the ones already in



my possession. Those of a certain vintage will recall 3H Wagon Kits; top quality models and brought to us via Doug Hewson and Roy Jackson. The LMS coke hopper followed their LNER six-plank open and 12T goods van,

both very common, run-of-the-mill vehicles; the coke hopper was not, and remains a gem. I bought three when they first appeared over 45 years ago and I also benefited as bags of failed mouldings would be deposited at our Grimsby MRS club room either by Doug or Roy as they lived in the area. From various sprues it was possible to gain a full kit of parts at no cost; hence I built another four.

The LMS built a total of 200, in two Lots of 100, in 1930 and 1935 and, with their 20T capacity and 12' wheelbase they were the state of the art in their day. Because of its open chassis the kit is slightly more fiddly to construct than the average, yet it was well designed, the mouldings were fine and detailed, and the result was a wagon of class and character. They also seem to have been very adept at avoiding the photographer's lens, so I can't confirm whether they only travelled in rakes. I'm plumping for 'not' to avoid having to buy another dozen. Though having rummaged through my mountain of unmade wagon kits I have found two more. Maybe I will require a rake!

GWR Beetle C Special Cattle Van

A truly 'posh' cattle van; you certainly don't see many of these around, but thanks to Parkside (Peco) we can all parade this smart, well-appointed GWR Special Cattle Van. Whether you needed to be a 'special cow' to travel in it I can't say, but I'm sure the tariff was higher than for using the more common versions. The vans were designed to be marshalled in passenger trains if necessary, so were part of the GWR's 'Brown Vehicles' stock which was part of the coach diagrams. The GWR also code named all of its vehicles: this was Beetle C to Diagram W7 from a batch turned out in 1928.

As expected, the basic dimensions of the kit are spot on with crisp detail. To raise the bar further, full brake gear was added, as were steam heating and vacuum brake pipes (ABS and 51L). Before painting the body, I repeated my ruse of painting all louvred areas black then dry brushing with GWR chocolate to enhance the illusion that the louvres are see-through.

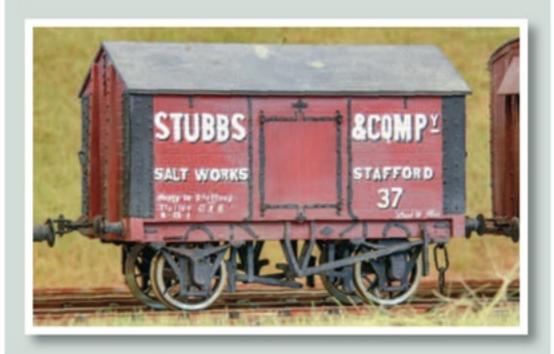
Weathering is via an overall wash of 'thinned grot' followed by drybrushing (Humbrol 26, 33, 34, 70) to achieve the 'in service' appearance I was after. How encouraging that the stock sales in Dentdale attract farmers from throughout the land; they must be doing something right.



Stubbs & Co. salt wagon

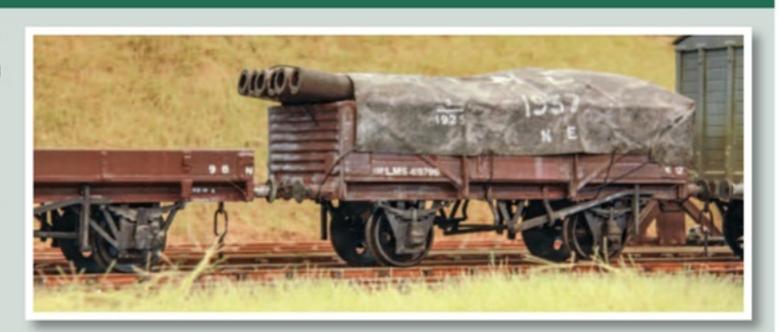
A Slater's (now Cooper Craft) kit. This is the firm's peak-roofed salt wagon, although it comes without transfers. I searched through Bill Hudson's pioneering series of Private Owner wagon books, to which Keith Turton has also added his considerable knowledge via his own volumes. Both authors have aided serious modellers on a huge scale. In Bill Hudson's third volume (OPC 1984) I came across Stubbs & Co., which proved an exact match for the kit. When built in the early years of the 20th century it only had brakes on one side. I have presumed it would have gained a second set by my era (1937-47), although perhaps I should have considered fitting more modern axleboxes.

For the lettering I used Woodhead transfer sheets, which are of the Pressfix type. I have had them in stock for at least 25 years, yet they still work. If a letter seems to have lost its tack when being fitted, a smidge of varnish soon sorts things out. Each letter is put on individually; even the 'Empty To Stafford station'. My eyesight was pin sharp in those days! Nowadays you can achieve this so much more easily as Powsides offers the full transfer set for Stubbs & Co. (ref.0164).



LMS five-plank wagon

This corrugated end five-plank LMS wagon is one of the earlier releases from Parkside, hence it didn't boast internal strapping detail to match more recent releases. Rather than add it all, I opted to fit a pipe load from plasticard tube protected with a wagon sheet, which has done remarkably well to survive the 12 years from its issue date to the start of my LMS period. In case the purists suggest the load is projecting too far over the wagon end I have marshalled a barrier wagon to provide immediate protection. The 16 ropes to the sheet are present, although I'm not sure I am allowed to use the buffer shank as an anchor point; no doubt someone will advise.



LMS 20T loco coal wagon



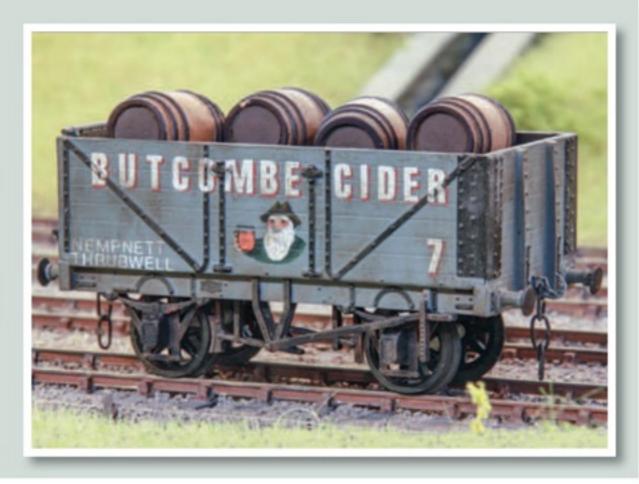
This is my one example of an LMS 20T loco coal wagon, built to D1974 in 1936/7. At some stage some were given extra plating for protection over the side T-sections and the corners (see LMS Wagons Vol.1 pp163-4 by R J Essery, OPC 1981) as they suffered rough treatment. I have modelled mine in original condition as they were almost new at the start of my chosen period. Whilst many were built (1000 up to 1945) they are far from common on model layouts because, as far as I am aware, there is neither a ready-to-run wagon nor kit available. I scratch-built mine and can recall that it was during a two-week Thames boating holiday in August 1971. However, I did take the basic body and solebars with me and, whilst cruising sedately between watering holes, added all the bracing, solebar strengthening brackets and just over 700 individual rivets. All lettering was by hand using a mapping pen. The rather chunky three-links give away its age, yet it still performs well as it approaches its 51st birthday.

Charles Roberts seven-plank private owner wagon

This evokes happy memories indeed of my halcyon days with the Butcombe Junction Group. We revelled in each other's company, and we were all competent modellers in different ways. Hence, more than average layouts resulted, or at least I like to think so, but then I am biased. This wagon is one of six made, one for each of our group, as Christmas presents; a tradition which I started in the late 1970s and still continues with one of the original group to this very day. I regret the wagons were never seen together as a rake; I like to think they would have looked the part. The 'Cider Drinker' artwork on the side is courtesy of my wife Sally, who has a natural gift. I do wonder what became of the other five wagons, for only one of our original group is still modelling.

The wagon itself is the Slater's Charles Roberts seven-plank PO end door wagon; I can't recall the source of the barrels, but they are effective. The transfers are from Letraset. I befriended a rep who gave me many a sheet; she couldn't understand why I only wanted white. I applied the red shading with a mapping pen, which seems to have worked as it gives the desired effect. Because of the cider connection, we used to take a gallon of Farmhouse Scrumpy with us to exhibitions to allow the paying public to sample the true nectar of the Mendips; it seemed to be appreciated! After one exhibition we realised we had spilt a bit as it had taken the varnish off the wooden floor!



LNER 12T sleeper wagon



I must be getting old; I was convinced good friend Roger Ellis and I had found this ex-LNER 12T sleeper wagon at Parkend in the Forest of Dean in the very early 1970s when it was still used by BR. However, my photos show the buildings of Grimsby Docks poking up behind the wagon. Hence the location must be East Marsh Sidings, not a million miles from where we measured the ex-LNER grain van (RAILWAY MODELLER January 2020). As with the grain van we created a scale drawing and took photos which were published in *Model Railway Constructor* in the mid-1970s. This information allowed me to build the 4mm scale model pictured using plasticard as a basis, with 10thou cube bolt heads to the fore. This was one of my first wagons to feature the finer scale three-link couplings which were then

Apart from the 'NE', all the lettering and numbering is by hand as PC Transfers, now HMRS, were not available for wagons at that time. My end handrail seems to have taken a bit of a battering, but then they did in reality, so I will leave it in its 'used' state. This wagon would make an ideal first scratch-building project as a drawing and photographs are available in *LNER Wagons Vol.4Aa* by Peter Tatlow (published by Wild Swan, 2011), and it is not available ready-to-run; you could be the envy of your friends!

Cliviger Coal Company 10-ton wagon

Trying to expand my knowledge of railways and modelling options I bought a job lot of *Model Railway News* in the late 1960s. I came across this particular wagon amongst a series of wagon drawings published in the early 1940s issues, and was attracted to it because my family roots are in the Burnley area. I found out only last year that I have family connections allied to this very wagon. My sister has recently researched my mother's side of the family tree and discovered that our great-great-grandfather, one Barnard Wood, lived in a miner's cottage at Copy Pit between Burnley and Todmorden, right next to Cliviger, and worked at the mine. What a coincidence that I chose to build this, of the huge range of wagons available.

Construction is from plasticard with Romford wheels and the same firm's chunky three-link couplings, whilst metal fittings are all Kenline. With a build date of either 1968 or '69 this represents one of my earliest scratch-built wagons, and I think the very first to feature cubes of plasticard to represent the bolt heads. The lettering is by hand using a mapping pen and Pelikan Plaka white ink which had excellent opacity. However, I have made a veritable howler as I have spelt Cliviger incorrectly. The wagon has just celebrated its half century.



LMS 20T cement wagon

Just a few months ago I stumbled on four Jidenco etched brass examples which I had completely forgotten I owned. I must have picked them up from a second-hand exhibition stall somewhere. All four were far from common types and perhaps that was the appeal. This is the Dia.1806 LMS 20T cement wagon which saw the light of day in 1932. A drawing, plus the only known photo, is in LMS Wagons Vol.1 (by R J Essery, published by OPC 1981).

There were certain aspects of construction I found beyond me. It proved impossible to fold the solebar into a neat channel, so I substituted 3 x 1mm milled brass, overlaying the channel part with 5thou plasticard to allow me to add all the detail from 10thou plasticard cubes. I had to resort to plasticard to model the end stanchions accurately and was able to represent the missing rivets round the top of each end. The roof was



1.5mm too short so I formed a replacement from 10thou brass sheet, then added hinge detail to the roof hatches.

The view of the underside shows several upgrades. As supplied, the Jidenco brakegear lined up with the axleguards, so I moved it to be in line with the wheel treads instead and added a second layer of brake rodding from Masokits parts, plus plasticard brake blocks, and more accurate brake levers from Ambis Engineering. The left-hand axle pivots so the wagon benefits from three-point suspension. My build date of February 2019 is apparent.

LMS Calf Van

Another uncommon wagon courtesy of the Jidenco stable, or maybe that should be byre, as this is an LMS Calf Van, 10 of which were built at Derby to Dia.1819 in 1929. They also feature, albeit briefly, in LMS Wagons Vol.1; the Midland origins are obvious. The body for this kit was far more user friendly to assemble than the cement wagon, although one or two louvres weren't etched through fully. A channel solebar was provided but the real vehicle actually had a wooden one, so I used the Slater's MR cattle wagon chassis instead; all its dimensions and details matched the Calf Van, and I had a spare one lurking about. To some degree the layout of the wagon lettering (HMRS Sheet No.6) is guesswork as there doesn't appear to be a photo of one in LMS livery, but I am hoping my portrayal is acceptable as I have based it on similar vehicles.



LNWR one-plank wagon



This is my second wagon loaded with a container, which is an ex-LNWR one-plank offering from the David Geen range of whitemetal kits. Many of these wagons were converted for use with container traffic; the kit provides the etched lugs fitted along each side for securing either ropes or shackles. I have opted for the latter which are from an Ambis Engineering etch. Very fine brass wire rings are fitted to each corner of the container for attaching the shackles, whilst more etched shackles replaced the moulded ones on the roof. Brackets are fitted on the opening end, and I had made an angle piece to fit between these to secure the door whilst in transit. However, this appears to have gone AWOL so I must make a replacement. The container is an old Mainline one; I would have liked to change the number, but this was built as the prototype, a batch of one, so K1 it will remain.

Little Aire

RICHARD PRATT owned OO gauge models of Class 308 and 321 Electric Multiple Units but had nowhere to run them. This led him to design this West Yorkshire inspired layout, complete with overhead catenary, which was developed in conjunction with the members of Harrogate Model Railway Club.

run my models of Class 308 and Class 321 electric multiple units. This pair of models had already been built, but at the time did not fit with anything else that I owned. This new layout also in fact facilitated several firsts for the Harrogate club – namely the employing of Digital Command Control, adding lights and sound, and the installation of (non-working) overhead catenary.

Traditional baseboards

The layout measures 2' wide and is just short of 20' in length which is split over four boards; the two end boards are 6' x 2' whilst the two inner boards are 4'x 2'. The baseboards were made by the club using MDF top surfaces with the frame and leg units constructed from 50 x 25mm softwood.

Control

Little Aire is actually two layouts in one with the station and passenger lines at the rear being completely separate operationally from the depot and wagon works on the front. This allows us to operate the passenger lines on regular 12V dc analogue power using a Gaugemaster hand-held controller at the rear of the layout and shuttling the passenger services up and down between the eightroad fiddle yards. The depot, wagon works and fuel unloading point at the front of the layout are under DCC power. I use an NCE Powercab with a master controller at the depot side and a slave controller at the wagon works end. Both these controllers operate from the front so there is no hiding from the public at exhibitions!

All the trackwork is from the Peco code 75 Streamline range, with the point tiebars operated using Peco twin-solenoid motors – controlled using traditional switches.

Operation

The layout requires a minimum of three operators, but extra hands are invited in for additional support at exhibitions, which usually ensures something is always moving on the layout. Generally speaking we do not stick to a fixed timetable or sequence, but there are eight hidden roads in the fiddle yards to hold passenger units and we usually







Locomotives and rolling stock

Models of locomotives and DMUs are appropriate for the time period modelled, including the Class 308 from DC Kits and the Class 321 from Bratchell Models. With regards to locomotives, I have a particular preference for Heljan Class 58s and Hornby

Class 60s, and I try to ensure that all locos have working lights and DCC sound. All have also been subtly weathered.

We use the American Kadee magnetic coupling system for rolling stock at the wagon works, which enables hands-free shunting. For additional operational interest I

have been gradually building up a collection of departmental and engineering wagons for the layout, including a structure gauging train. For the most part these have been converted from ready-to-run items.

Scenery

I have used a variety of 'ready-to-plant' buildings, largely from the Hornby and Bachmann ranges, along with some appropriate Peco kits (such as the office building).

Quite a bit of time was spent detailing the layout, which included the installation of the non-working catenary fitted to the passenger routes. These assemblies took some time to engineer and comprise a mixture of Hornby International items for the single masts, while the gantries were made by modifying Dapol masts with metal strip. Whilst the finished result may not be entirely accurate, the catenary has proven to be sufficiently robust to withstand the rigours of transporting the layout to exhibitions.

Reflections

Once the layout had been completed I naturally started to evaluate aspects that, in my mind, could be improved upon. For the length of roads in the fiddle yard as only

example, I wish I had paid more attention to one is of sufficient length to accommodate a A Class 37 is employed on civil engineering duties with a structure gauging train, whilst in the background multiple units pass in the station.

The layout is profusely populated with appropriate figures. Here the track gang removes some time expired permanent way material with the lookout keeping a watchful eye on the passing trains.

four-car EMU. To get around this (and to allow flexibility when operating at exhibitions) we have had to add a small extension to one end so that all roads are capable of holding any of the passenger units. I also wish that more planning time had been given to constructing a frame for transporting the layout between home and exhibitions.

In terms of operating the layout, I am now considering changing the point control so that the tiebar operation can be controlled digitally from either end; currently the controls are split such that points can only be operated from one end of the layout. This would mean that run-rounds would be much easier and could be completed without having to walk the whole length of the layout. Certainly there are many things to ponder upon for the next project...

A motorised coach for 009

PAUL BASON required a means of auxiliary propulsion for his collection of small 4mm scale narrow gauge locomotives and experimented by adapting a Peco bogie coach for this purpose.

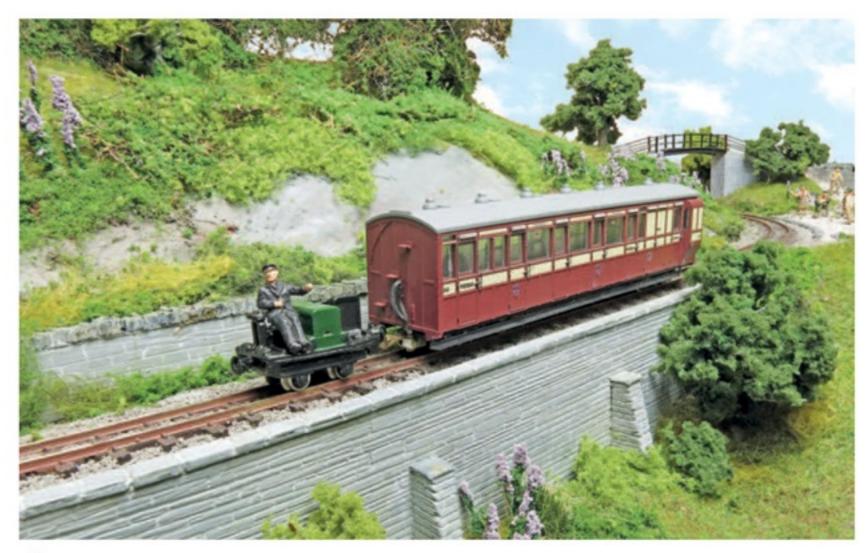
ecently I embarked upon an extensive programme of refurbishment on my 1980s built Vale of Maentwrog OO9 layout. During the course of this work I obtained a number of models of unusual and small locomotives to add further interest around the evolving project. Although some intrepid modellers find ingenious ways of incorporating tiny mechanisms into such models, I will admit to having reservations about their reliability and performance under exhibition conditions.

Thinking that the models would simply become static features in the yard on my layout, to start with I had no plans to use them in anger. However, following the gift from my friends Doug and Jenny Thompson of a redundant Graham Farish N gauge Class 158 DMU, I had an idea to fit the mechanism from this into a ready-to-run OO9 carriage. This could be used to propel these small locos and assist with pulling longer trains around the layout.

With the seed of a project in mind I decided that a special Ffestiniog Railway liveried version of the Peco Lynton & Barnstaple brake coach (see photo I) would fit in rather nicely with the echoes of Ffestiniog theme of my layout. The only problem with this idea was that the Class 158 model had a much longer overall wheelbase than that of the Peco coach.

Disassembly and assessment

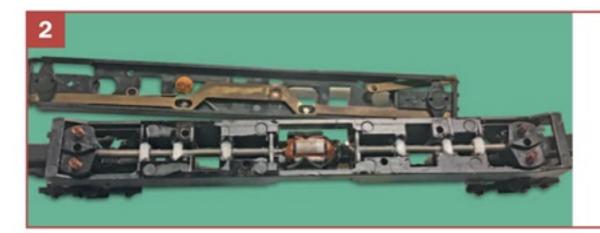
Having removed the body of the donor Class 158, I started to strip the chassis down to its essential parts (photo 2) taking several photographs at each stage to act as an aide-memoire to assist reassembly if needed. To reduce the length of the wheelbase I decided to shorten the chassis by removing a section from the centre part of the casting.

Before commencing with this, however, I drew a sketch of the chassis in plan view to provide a check for how it would fit into the body – thereby avoiding any mistakes with my modifications to either the Graham Farish chassis or Peco coach. gauge Graham Farish Class 158

Shortening the chassis

Next, using a small engineer's square, I marked out the section of the chassis block that needed

to be removed before using a junior hacksaw to make a couple of precise cuts (photo 3). After a little cleaning up it was a case of so far so good. The next job was to reassemble the remaining parts.

From past experience I was aware that the alloy used in the manufacture of the chassis block wouldn't be suitable for soldering and that there would not be a large enough joining area for an adhesive to be used for bonding the parts together unsupported.

Therefore I decided to make up some brass channel sections from 10thou sheet that could be fixed in place either side of the shortened chassis block using Araldite Rapid epoxy adhesive (photo 4). Whilst the resultant assembly was left to harden, the drive spring was removed and then reduced in length (on one side at the motor fixing end) to match the reduction made to the chassis length. Once the spring had been refitted, the rest of the chassis parts were reassembled ready for testing and fitting to the coach body.

A new support bracket

To accommodate the motorised chassis inside the Peco coach, it was necessary to remove the seating and then cut away the floor part of the bodyshell moulding (photo 5). I next had to work out the best way of joining the body and chassis.

My solution was to make a supporting bracket from 20thou brass sheet that runs the entire length of the vehicle, with vertical end pieces that could be glued to the insides of the ends of the plastic body. Two screws were also soldered in place such that the chassis could be clamped firmly between them using a purpose made brass retaining strip and a couple of nuts.

To try and disguise the bracket on the finished model, it was given a couple of coats of car spray primer and satin black prior to final assembly (photo 6).

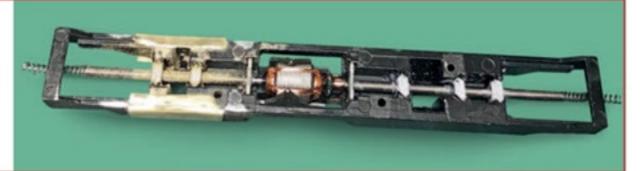
Trial run

With the chassis and coach body assembled (photos 7 and 8), the model was deployed on a test run around the layout which was successful.

I am pleased with how this somewhat unorthodox project has turned out. In due course I intend to cut some painted passenger figures in half and fix these in the seating positions to The modified DMU chassis block showing the short section that has been removed to reduce the overall length so that it could fit inside the bodyshell of the Peco coach. A junior hacksaw was used to make the cuts. Visible in the top part of the photo are the Farish bogies.

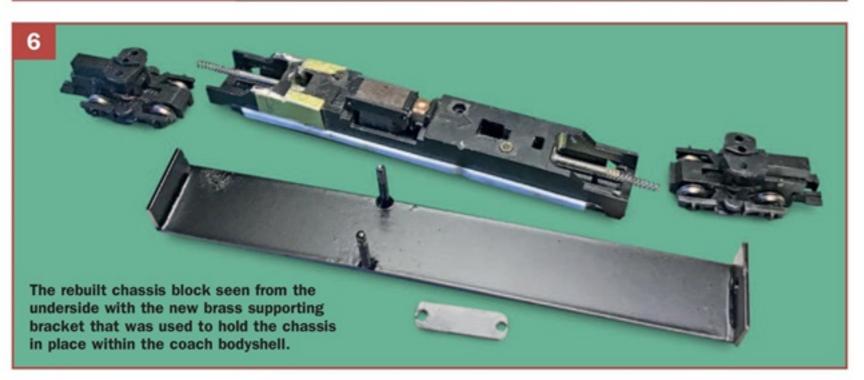


A view of the top of the rebuilt chassis block showing the purpose made brass angle framework that was used to join the remaining parts of the donor Farish chassis together.

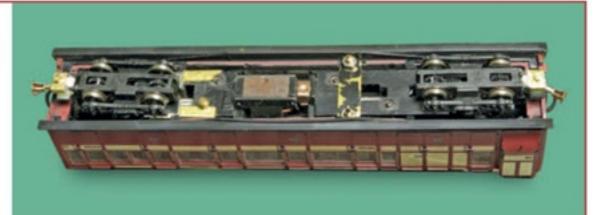


To accommodate the motorised chassis, the seating from the Peco OO9 coach was discarded and a large amount of the floor area was removed from the body moulding, as can be seen here.

The pair of Peco bogies that were left over have even found alternative uses, these being repurposed for use with 3D printed bodyshells for OO9 Simplex diesel locos; these have made for useful additions to the stock box, particularly with a bit of lead added to help keep them on the track.

Preserving the ball clay tramways of Dorset in 4mm and full size

Purbeck Mining Museum

PETER HOLLINS uncovers the background to this fascinating heritage centre at Norden which now includes RON DYSON's exquisite depiction of the Pike Brothers' transhipment sidings and workshops at nearby Furzebrook.

n Roman times, to produce pottery in this part of Southern England, extensive use was made of the local clay extracted from around Poole Harbour. Fragments of Roman pottery have been found at Newton and other locations throughout Dorset. A Roman kiln was unearthed in lower Hamworthy in 1926, and a working replica kiln has recently been demonstrated at the Romano-British farm in the grounds of Upton House much further north.

Ball clay, which is rare and only found in a very few places in the world, has been dug in Devon and south Dorset since the 16th century, much for the production of clay tobacco pipes, but by the mid 18th century, new firing methods developed by potters such as Josiah Wedgwood, increased the demand for all types of pottery and the fine

ball clays of these areas were now being used to mass produce white bodied tableware that was exported all over the world. In 1669 ball clay was being shipped by a Mr Fellows from Russell Point, Arne, to a merchant called Cornell.

Thomas Hyde worked the Dorset clay from 1731 to 1795, and established a quay in this area in 1768 to ship the mineral from the lands of John Calcraft of Rempstone and William Moreton Pitt of Encombe.

In 1771 Hyde was contracted to supply Wedgwood with 1400 tons of ball clay per year, but by 1793 Hyde was declared bankrupt and the key landowners, Calcraft and Moreton Pitt formed a consortium to continue the extraction of ball clay and appointed Mr Barker Chiffney, a Liverpool merchant, as their agent in 1798.

By October 1803 Chiffney was also bankrupt and Benjamin Fayle & Co., a London merchant and shipping insurer, purchased the Dorset clay pits and signed a contract with Wedgwood to supply 7,000 tons of ball clay.

First 'railway' in Dorset

In 1805 Fayle commissioned a plateway to be built from his clay pits at Norden to Middlebere Quay on the Ame peninsular within Poole Harbour. This was constructed by John Hodgkinson, and when completed in August 1806, became the first 'rail' transport in Dorset, and also one of the first systems of its kind in the South West.

In about 1760 the Pike family moved from Devon to prospect for clay in the Purbeck area and by the 1830s they had opened up a clay pit at Furzebrook.

In 1840 they built a tramway to connect the pit to an inlet of the Wareham Channel at Ridge. From Ridge Wharf a steam tug towed a string of flat bottom barges to Poole Quay, where the clay was trans-shipped into sea going vessels for shipment to London, Staffordshire via Liverpool, and many other potteries around the world.

Pike and Calcraft were instrumental in bringing the Southampton & Dorchester Railway to Wareham, and W J Pike went on to promote the first Swanage Railway scheme with Thomas Phippard Junior in 1847.

In 1866 the horse drawn tramway was rebuilt to take a steam locomotive called *Primus*, built by Bellis & Seekings, which was joined by another from the same maker in 1874 called *Secundus*. This locomotive is now preserved, and is currently on display at the museum in Corfe Castle goods shed.

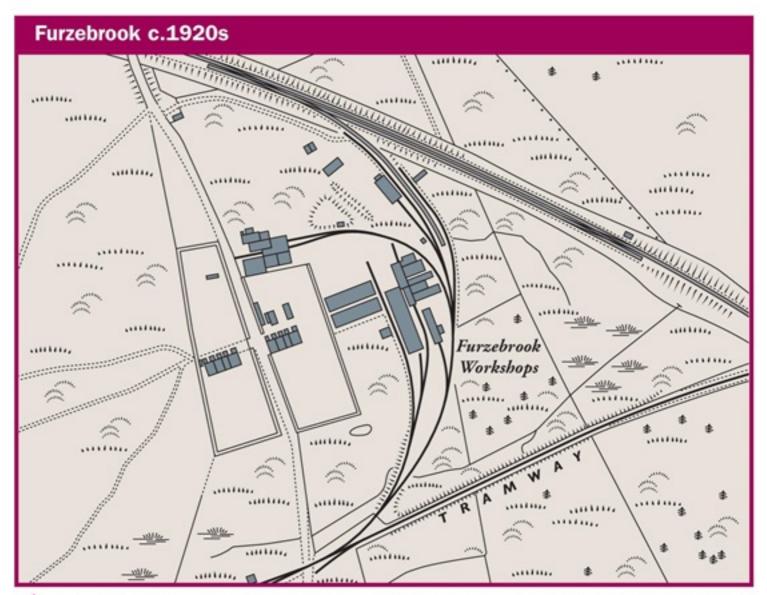
During the 19th and early 20th century the network of tramways expanded as new mines were opened up, and the production of ball clay increased to 100,000 tons a year.

Ball clay was the main traffic of Pike's tramway; inbound supplies were also shipped, such as pit props, coal and machinery, but no regular passenger services were run.

After the Second World War there was a decline in the clay industry, and road vehicle transportation saw the closure of the

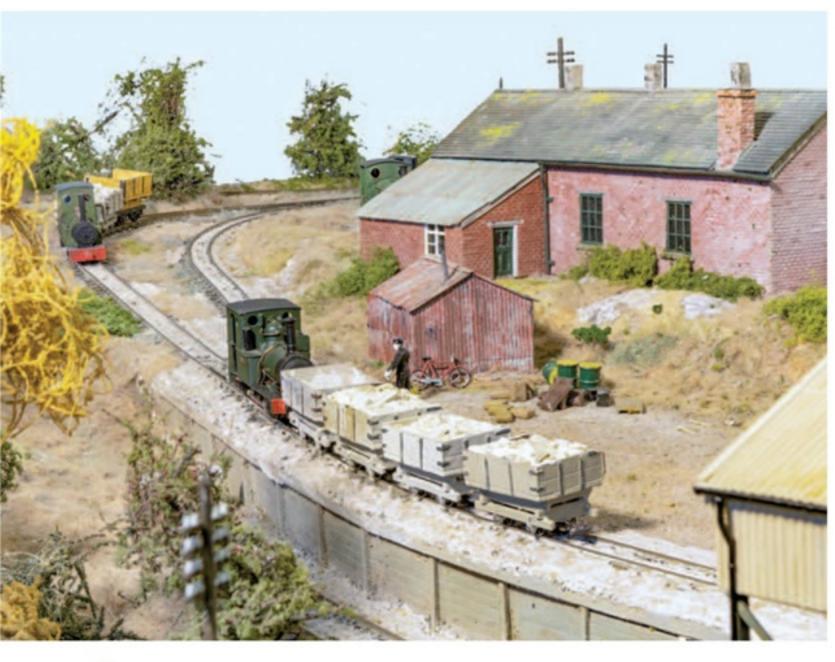

In 1949 Pike Brothers and B Fayle & Co amalgamated, and were taken over by English China Clay in 1967.

New uses for ball clay, such as fillers in plastics, have increased the demand for clay, and open cast mines in the Purbeck area



operated by Imerys Minerals continue to supply industry today.

The Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum Group is formed

Around 2003 Imerys Minerals approached the Swanage Railway Trust to see if they could make use of the firm's redundant Norden No.7 mine transhipment shed. The Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum Group (PMMMG) was thus formed to consider establishing a permanent mining museum at Norden and to exhibit artefacts primarily connected with the mining of ball clay in Dorset. Subsequently the mine transhipment shed was dismantled and has been re-erected at the Purbeck Park adjacent to Norden station on the Swanage Railway.

It is now operated as a volunteer-led museum and aims to open to the public in the summer season from April to October, although actual opening is totally dependent on there being sufficient volunteers in attendance – see the panel at the end of the article for further details.

The Pike Brothers Furzebrook scene

The layout was inspired by Ron Dyson's late father – Peter Dyson. As a child, Peter lived in Wareham where his father was the Wareham Station Master and his mother, the Booking Clerk. Peter used the branch line to travel to school in Swanage and could recall many tales from his commute – not least during the War. He also had fond memories of the old clay lines and would regularly cycle out to the workings and chat with some of the 'real' Dorset characters working on the narrow gauge railway.

Ron found such stories fascinating and on returning to his home county in the early 1990s, he decided to resurrect his former childhood interest in modelmaking and create a layout that would bring the area around the Furzebrook interchange siding and transhipment sheds back to life.

At its peak, Pike Bros' narrow gauge railway comprised no less than 25 miles of track for transporting very high-quality ball clay from mines around Creech Grange to the weathering beds, the processing works at Furzebrook, and the Frome estuary. The interchange siding, connected to the adjacent Wareham-Swanage branch line, was provided in the early 20th century.

As well as the interchange siding, Furzebrook also housed a weighbridge, processing works and transhipment sheds and was essentially the centre of railway operations, with two engine sheds, a wagon repair shop and other facilities such as a coaling stage.

Between 1866 and 1958, eight different locomotives featured on the network and there were approximately 120 wagons in use – most of which featured elm bodies on oak frames and were built in the workshops at Furzebrook, by J Newbury of Wareham and the Cambrian Wagon Co...

The 4mm scale model illustrated provides an indication of what the railway system

would have been like at Furzebrook in the 1950s when steam locomotives provided the main form of transport for the clay.

Because of the unusual design of side-tip and flat-bed wagons used on the tramway, Ron was particularly grateful for kits provided by Golden Arrow Productions.

Pike's locomotives were named *Primus* through to *Septimus*, so my OO9 model locomotive was named *Octavius* as it was slightly different to the seven original locos.

"In some respects," admitted Ron, "I knew the model would never be fully finished, since gaps in my early knowledge of the site were filled as more photographs appeared on the internet."

An unexpected house move some years ago required the full, but incomplete layout to be dismantled.

"The only part of the model that could be salvaged was the main transhipment area at Furzebrook," he added. "For the next two years this section of the model was left leaning against a wall, gathering dust from building work, cement mixing and plastering!"

Once Ron's house renovation was complete, he opted to give the layout some TLC. "I reinstated the buildings and restored and finished some of the landscaping. I then offered the model for display as a static exhibit at the former Blue Pool visitor attraction." This was a place most closely associated with the Pike Bros' tramway and was around 2006: a time when the Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum was just a twinkle in the eyes.

Peter added, "Credit must go to the team at Blue Pool for looking after the model and creating a display case complete with painted backdrop."

Following the passing of the owner in 2020, this popular attraction closed and its future became uncertain.

"Consequently, I arranged for the model to be transferred permanently to the Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum."

For those who can remember the clay lines, Peter hopes the model in its new home will engender something similar to the happy memories to those of his late father.

"Along with the full size artefacts at the museum I hope the layout will help to give an impression of what life must have been like during that period. A time that, quite literally, helped to shape this lovely part of Dorset known as the Isle of Purbeck."

Some vertical mine shafts did exist on the Pike Bros' site, though remote from Furzebrook. Ron included this one on the model to show the alternative means of clay extraction, in difference to the drift mine and adit as depicted full size at the museum (see below).

The Purbeck Mineral & Mining Museum

This unique and exciting visitor attraction is centred around a reconstruction of a typical Dorset ball clay drift mine as it would have appeared in the 1960s. It includes a short operational narrow gauge line for demonstration purposes which uses industrial diesel locos (including one that originally worked at this location) and a set of prototypical skip wagons, along with a variety of mining rolling stock and permanent way material.

The ex-Pike Bros' Bellis & Seeking 2' 8" gauge locomotive Secundus (mentioned above) is on loan to the PMMMG and is currently on display in the goods shed at Corfe Castle station. The intention is that it will eventually be transferred to the Norden Museum site when suitable accommodation can be provided. Also on display at the Norden Museum is the sledge brake clay wagon, which Secundus hauled across the Dorset heathland over 100 years ago.

Details of the museum opening times in 2022 will be published on the museum website and Facebook page in due course.

Turbot makeover

bought this OO gauge Dapol Turbot bogie ballast wagon as a Christmas gift for a friend. The problem was that it looked too clean!

y friend Colin Whalley and I always exchange railway modelling-related gifts at Christmas. The latest such present that I gave to him was one of the Dapol Dutch liveried Turbot bogie ballast wagons in OO, this model fitting in with his 1980/90s era layout. These ready-to-run models look superb, but they are not representative of how I remember the real versions looking back in the 1990s – they were definitely not in pristine ex-works condition!

I decided that a weathered version of the wagon would make a better present than the out-of-the-box model. It was time to get to work!

The Turbot

Turbot bogie ballast wagons were converted in the 1980s from bogie Bolster E wagons, a BR design dating from the early 1960s which proved largely unsuccessful as it was too short for most steel traffic. Even the Turbots were on borrowed time as they were vacuum braked,

and most were withdrawn by the late 1990s. Most photos showed them in their earlier life when they were still quite presentable, though my own photographic collection gave three 1990s The completed wagon, in service on the author's new micro layout Chequer Lane which will feature in a future issue of RAILWAY MODELLER.

This Turbot was photographed in 1991 in the sidings just outside St Helens Central station. The number is hard to read but appears to be DB978551. Modellers worried about overloading their wagons can treat this as a prototype for everything – it was possibly the reason for it being left on its own.

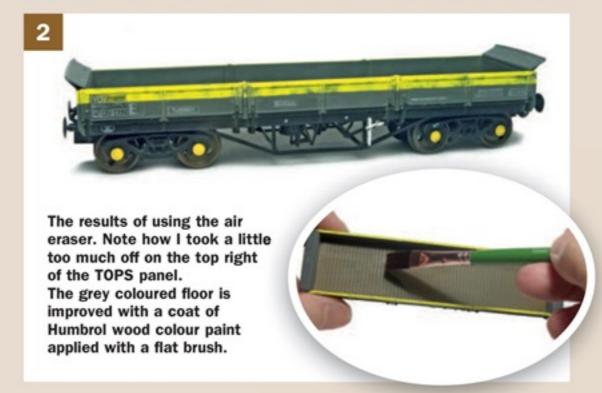

Assessing the work

Straight from the box, the Dapol model really captures the look of the Turbot. The Dutch yellow band, notoriously hard to apply to models, is good and Dapol has sensibly chosen to model the body in rail grey coloured plastic which then only needs the yellow band and lettering to complete. The inside is the same colour as

the outside which I am sure would not have been the case for long, and I doubt that the planked floor would have received a coat of paint. The photos show that the ends stayed in reasonably good condition with just a slight fading of the paintwork. The dropdown sides did not fare so well, however, with damaged paint and rust being very evident.

Therefore, my work on the model would include painting the interior, toning down the bright yellow band, introducing rust patches, and generally weathering the whole model so that it looks like it's had a hard life exposed to the elements.

An air eraser

All the work can be undertaken without the need for any disassembly. The only thing I did was to remove the couplings which simply pull out of their NEM pockets.

The first job was to tone down the yellow band. Weathering would tone it down, but I took a different approach. I used what's often called an air eraser. This is a miniature shot blaster which fires a very fine abrasive sand. It connects to a compressor just like an airbrush and works in a very similar way, using abrasive powder, not paint. It can be used for etching materials or cleaning the hard-to-reach parts on metal models before priming. The air eraser can be difficult at first but it's a handy weathering tool once you have mastered it. The trick is to understand how thick the paint is that you're attacking.

The lettering on the Turbot is just printed on so it needs only a light touch to begin erasing it, thus making it look faded and damaged. The yellow paint is quite thickly applied relative to the printed lettering, so it needs quite a heavy touch with the air eraser. In places this succeeded in taking the paint back to the plastic while overall it took most of the shine off the paint finish. Finally, the model was given a good brush to remove any of the abrasive lodged on.

also achieve the same effect.

Not everyone has an airbrush let alone an air eraser so what are the alternatives? For many years I achieved the same effect by using a glass-fibre burnishing brush to remove paint and take off the shine. These handy little tools cost just a few pounds. Both do the job, but the air-eraser can be more subtle on the lettering and is better able to get into nooks and crannies. The next job was the wooden floor and I used Humbrol wood colour paint and a flat brush to paint the planks. A perfect finish was not required as the later weathering would tone it down.

Base weathering

The weathering was commenced with an airbrush, using a tone of grey that was slightly lighter than the rail grey base colour, suggesting that the ends had faded slightly from the original colour. I did this with an airbrush, but that's not to say that you can't achieve the same effect with a paintbrush by thinning the paint until it is a wash and then applying several thin coats.

Now it was time for the rust, for which I used Citadel Typhus Corrosion. There is a fine powder in the paint which, when dry, adds a very convincing texture to the rust patches as if the steel is bubbling up and peeling off. I daubed several patches on the sides and a few lighter strokes with the brush to imitate scratches.

Final weathering

To complete the weathering, I used an airbrush with Humbrol matt black to tone down and darken all the yellow and grey colours both inside and outside the wagon body.

For the chassis and bogies, I swapped over to Precision Paints Frame Dirt as well as also giving the superstructure a waft of this second colour. I'm certainly no expert with an airbrush, and I'm still in the early stages of learning how to use it, but I would not now be without it.

The weathering certainly lifts the out-of-the-box model and makes it look much closer to how I remember Turbot wagons in reality. Furthermore, the work described here only took a short amount of time to complete, so it would be quite a quick process to replicate on a whole rake of Turbot models.

The only task that remained to do with this example was to pop it back in the box, wrap it up and pass it over to Santa for delivery to Colin!

MICRO MARVELS

THE SMALL LAYOUT GALLERY

Foxbury

BOB BROWN revived the name of a previous layout for his latest 3mm project, which was designed as a small and lightweight setup for taking to exhibitions. A commercial baseboard kit and an ingenious 'half station' design – inspired by Rodney Hall's Llanastr – formed the basis.

Western Railway and BR (Western Region) interest me, it is the branch and secondary routes that really hold my attention. However, my fascination is not with the locomotives and trains, but the whole scene; the architecture and overall ambience

of the archetypal GWR country station.

Looking back to my youth, I was forever doodling plans for potential layouts. These would almost always be for branch line termini and composed of the obligatory platform road, bay, loco shed, goods shed, cattle dock and dairy. Such was the erroneous perception at the time as to what a branch line terminus should consist of. It just seemed to be that one would have to model the entire terminus, often crammed into the confines of the baseboard with little or no scope for any of the surrounding scenery beyond the railway fence.

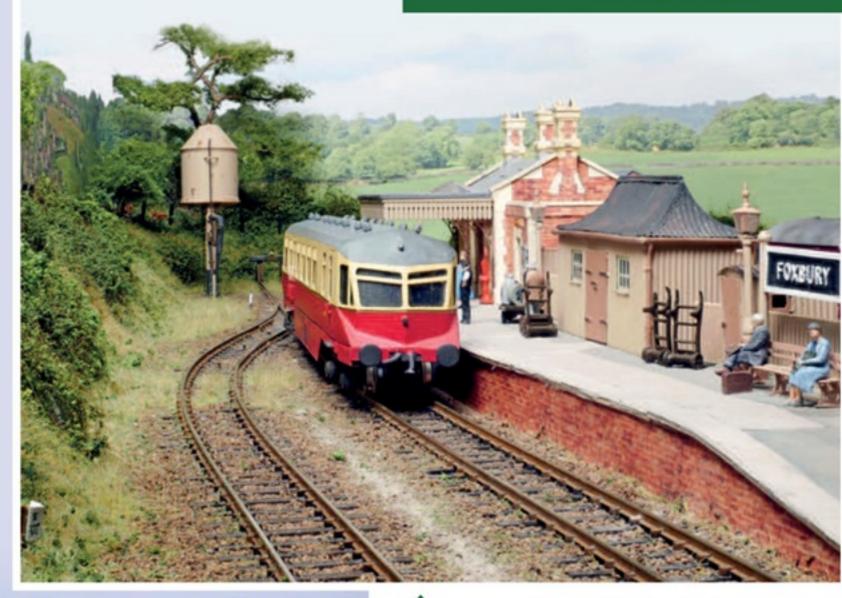


Thankfully things change and the one layout that struck a chord with me in particular as one of the catalysts for change in layout design was Rodney Hall's *Llanastr* (published in *Model Railway Journal* No.4). When it appeared it was revolutionary in concept; why model the entire station when you can model part of it?

Planning a 'bitsa' station

Although I appreciate any size of layout, I prefer something small and manageable. My previous layout, *Chipping Compton* (RM December 2016) was the largest one yet and after two exhibitions I decided to sell it to a fellow 3mm Society member. I set about planning the next layout and my thoughts instantly went back to *Llanastr*.

I wanted to use various aspects of certain GWR stations and finally came up with a design which met my criteria reusing the name of my first 3mm exhibition layout Foxbury. Like its predecessor, it is set in my native Gloucestershire, although its exact location is undecided. As it only portrays half the station, being bisected by a convenient

road bridge, the unseen half of the station could contain whatever I liked. It allows for freight stock to enter the station and be taken to the imaginary siding at the other end of the run-round loop. On *Foxbury* this is imagined to include a cattle dock and a private siding serving the small gas works.

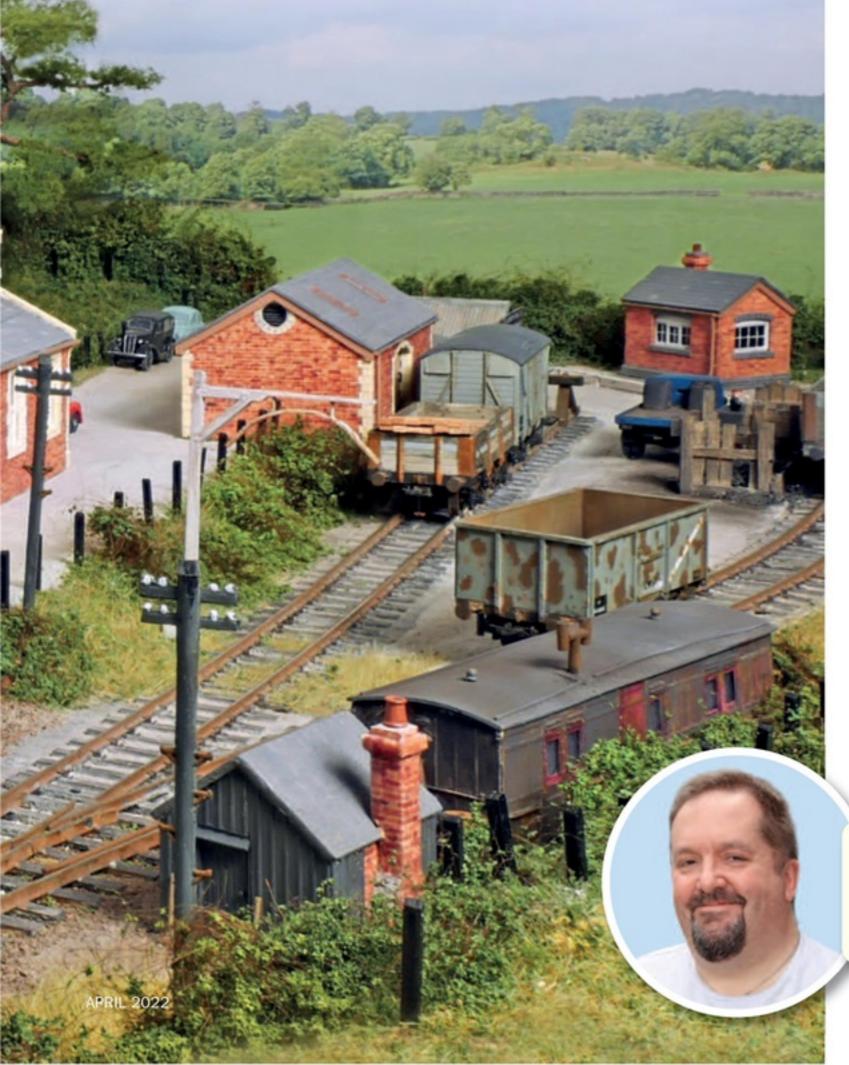
I would describe myself as a builder rather than an operator and layouts seldom get used between exhibitions. Time at home is spent building structures that take my fancy or a new item of stock. This influenced the design of the layout in that it is operated from the front. With *Foxbury* I can stand to the side in front of the fiddle yard to operate and answer any questions.

Laser-cut baseboards

On my previous layouts I used plywood baseboards supported by girders formed from strips of ply with blocks of softwood fixed between them at regular intervals. Whilst strong, it was rather over-engineered for the light loads they were designed to bear. With this latest incarnation of *Foxbury* I wanted something lighter but not at the expense of rigidity and strength.

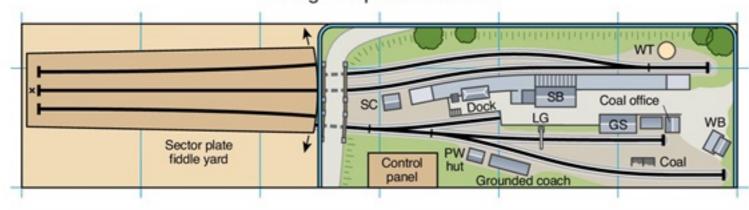


A visit to the Stafford Model Railway exhibition in 2020 resulted in me discovering Grainge & Hodder from Birmingham, the supplier of laser-cut ply baseboard kits. Construction of one of these was simplicity itself, suitably augmented by a ply fascia and

backscene. An afternoon's work gave me two baseboards which lined up perfectly; the layout measuring 6' x 16½", 3'6" of which is scenic, with the remainder forming a three-road sector plate hidden behind the scenic break of the road bridge.

The competition is starting to make its presence known. Private car ownership was on the up in the 1960s and did as much to drive a nail into the coffin of rural branches as any government diktat. The driver of No.5805 wonders how long it can last.

Scratch-building

My preference is to build everything, either from kits or from scratch and I don't usually run anything that I haven't made myself. I try to keep developing my skill levels and not stand still and I would certainly encourage others not to be afraid to step out of their comfort zone. For years I resisted the urge to use an airbrush to paint or weather locos and rolling stock, preferring to brush paint everything, but I invested in an airbrush back in 2012 and I can't imagine being without it now. I had similar worries about low-melt soldering until recent years, having previously used epoxy to build whitemetal loco bodies; the ones I'd glued were fine but soldering makes them so much stronger. It's simply a matter of getting some decent tools, some advice and above all, plenty of practice.

Whilst I am happy with my soldering skills, I have so far shied away from track construction, instead preferring to commission Hugh Martin to build the points for me. These are worked by wire in tube using components from Wizard Models. Plain track is from the 3mm Society stores.

I used 2mm scale ballast from Woodland Scenics on the main running line and some very lifelike ash powder. In steam days railways would have used ash as ballast in sidings and even on the running lines of branches. The rails were painted with suitable track colour from Precision Paints.

Like Chipping Compton, much use has been made of static grass, on the cutting sides particularly but also on the track to give a weed-strewn effect.

Card buildings

One of my main modelling interests is buildings and my preferred material for making them is good quality card. Using plenty of layers combined with internal bracing creates a good, sturdy box structure with no tendency to bow or warp. The techniques I learned from George Illiffe-Stokes and my late friend and modelling mentor, Peter Gentle.

A journey in 3mm scale modelling

Growing up in the 1970s, my brother and I had a 00 gauge layout that our father built for us, and it was a terrific introduction to the hobby. This was a double track Tri-ang 'Super 4' system with numerous sidings and loops, and to us it was sheer heaven.

It was later on that my attention was drawn to 3mm scale and, after joining my local group of the 3mm Society, I never looked back. I was able to learn from experienced modellers first-hand, something which only active membership of a club can really offer.

I began building kits in 1977, initially loco body kits in whitemetal from the likes of GEM and BEC which could be

mounted on proprietary Tri-ang chassis (although long since out of production, these were available second hand through the 3mm Society). Eventually I progressed to making etched brass loco bodies from kits.

I have never regretted my decision to adopt 3mm scale for my modelling, and I continue to enjoy the challenge of having to make everything myself. Furthermore, one advantage of modelling in a 'minority scale' is that you don't have to worry that the loco you've just spent months building will suddenly appear as a ready-to-run item!

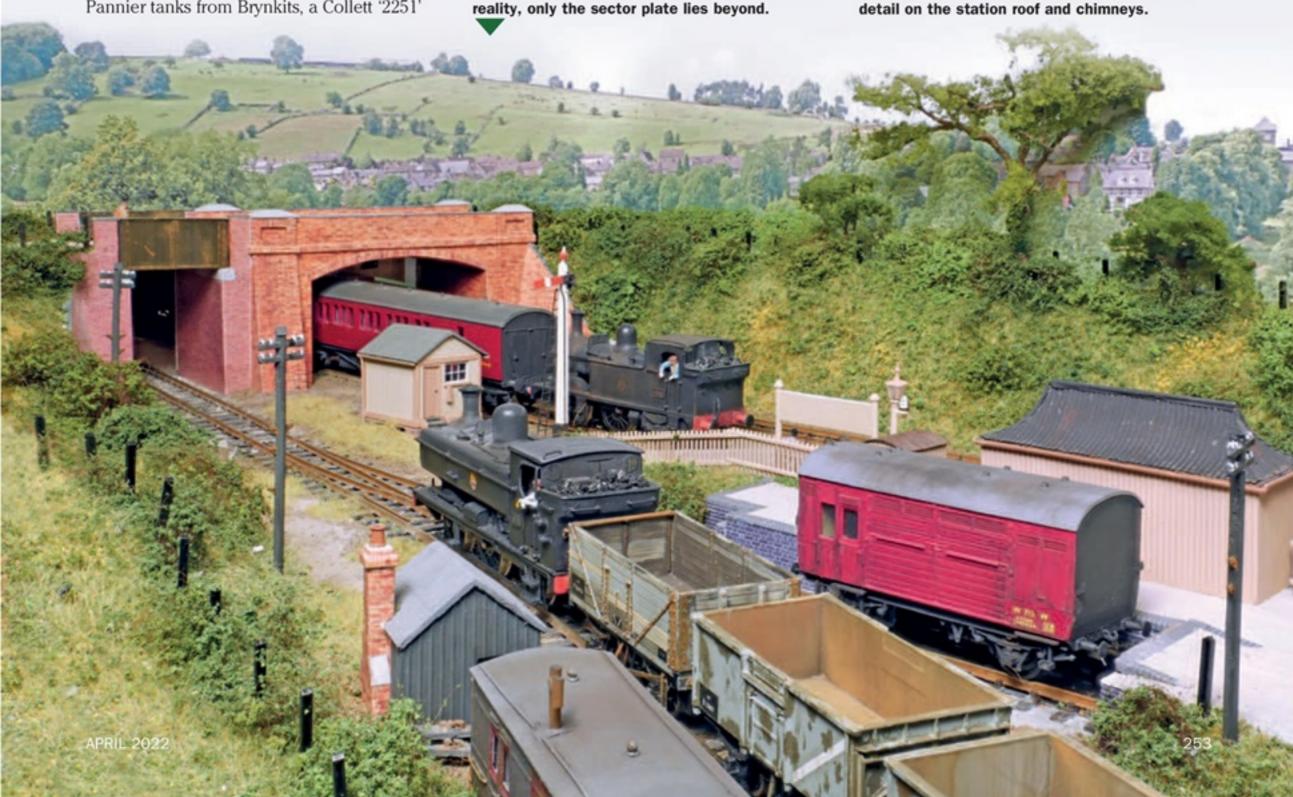
The station building is one of the distinctive types designed by William Clarke and is the second one of the type that I have built, the previous example being for *Chipping Compton*. The matching goods shed is also based on a William Clarke design, whilst the diminutive signal box is based on the one at Watlington.

Locomotives and stock

All the locomotives seen on the layout are built from kits, the exception being the '7400' 0-6-0PT, the basis of which is a heavily modified GEM '5700' 0-6-0PT kit with scratchbuilt tanks and boiler. There are two '5700' Pannier tanks from Brynkits, a Collett '2251' A view across the yard shows Collett '5700' 0-6-0PT No.8717 positioning an ex GWR Mink at the doors to the goods shed. The coal office and dry storage are a very individual touch and show the benefits of working in a scale where not everything is provided by the trade.

A Pannier tank constructs a rake of empty coal wagons for the midday goods departure. The wagon weathering is particularly notable. In theory the bridges bisect the station site, but in reality only the sector plate lies beyond

The new kid on the block is this AC Cars railbus. This uses a 3D printed body from Lenny Seeney and is powered by a Halling tram chassis. The view also shows the attention to detail on the station roof and chimneys.





is superb and was well worth the time spent creating an interior and individually flush glazing the windows.

Waybill operation

The wagons are all plastic kits from the likes of Parkside and Cambrian, commissioned by the 3mm Society or Finney & Smith.

I use B&B couplings on all the stock and employ electro-magnets to uncouple them. As they are delayed-action units this only means having an uncoupler at the neck of several sidings; once uncoupled the wagon is then propelled to wherever it is needed. The couplings can be susceptible to

knocks when handling so to ensure they continue to be set correctly I have made a simple set of

gauges to check the height of the hooks.

I employ a
basic system of
waybills to decide
on traffic flows. Each
wagon is represented by
a card, these being shuffled
along with a quantity of blanks,

thus altering the train length when dealing out the required six cards. This adds an extra dimension to operating and adds an element of unpredictability to running goods trains.

What's next?

With Foxbury complete, thoughts have now turned to developing a fixed layout at home portraying several stations on a branch. I envisage something along the lines of Jas Milham's Yaxbury or H W Burchell's Broad Aston (RM November 1974). This would certainly result in much more

operating interest, especially if I was to employ a similar waybill system for the goods train operation.

For anybody looking to try 3mm scale modelling (see panel) I would thoroughly recommend starting by joining the 3mm Society. Not only is the organisation a supplier of kits and components for members, but also has a network of area groups that meet regularly, together with regional meetings.

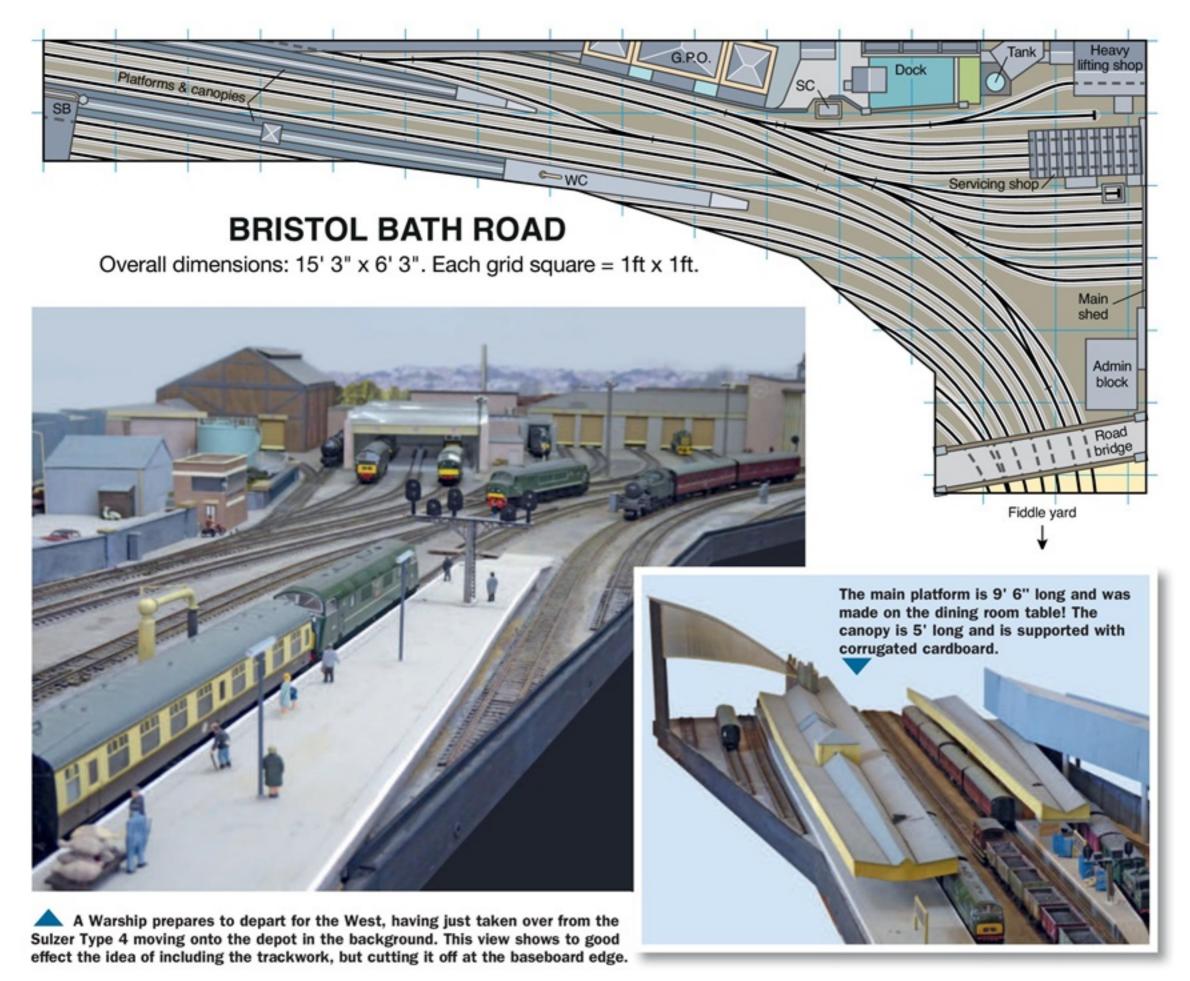

Bristol Bath Road

ALISTAIR BOLT rekindled memories of his teenage years standing at the western end of Bristol Temple Meads station with this OO gauge scheme, which accents the adjacent locomotive depot and demonstrates how an expansive prototype can be recreated in a modest space.





connected to the rest of the model; some of these sections of track are in fact cut through at angles where they meet baseboard edges.

The scenic area occupies 15' 3" x 6' 3" in a curving L-shape (see plan). The fiddle yard is accessed under the model of Bath Road bridge and is actually through a hole in the wall!

Baseboards and trackwork

The baseboards are formed of a 50 x 25mm softwood frame with a fibreboard top. As the

shape of the layout was configured to follow the curved departure lines out of the station, an irregular, bespoke framework was developed.

The electrics for the operational parts are 12V dc analogue with two feeds and the layout divided into two. All the track and points are from the Peco range, which was pinned in place and then ballasted with 2mm scale grey granules, subsequently dulled down with beiges and browns.

Hydraulic operation

The front part of the layout represents the far western end of the station platforms, which allows me to set up trains to then depart around the curve and under Bath Road bridge. Parcels and freight stock can be stabled in the middle road. The back half of the layout is the depot, which provides ample scope to run locos on and off shed.

My memories of Bath Road are from the transition era when green diesels prevailed,



History of Bristol Bath Road depot

Bristol Bath Road depot was built on the site of the original Bristol and Exeter Railway shed and was rebuilt in 1934 by the GWR. The site served as the major repair and maintenance point for the Bristol divisional area and featured a straight eight-road running shed with northlight roof. The site had a standard GWR twin-ramp coal stage and two 65' turntables, one to the rear of the shed, and one close to the repair shop which was located to the north of the depot's site adjacent to the River Avon.

While Bath Road handled passenger traffic locomotives, St Philip's Marsh depot (situated a short distance away to the east – see map) handled freight types. After Nationalisation both Bath Road (now code BR) and St Philip's Marsh gained allocations following the closure of the local Midland Region sheds. By 1950 Bath Road had a collection of 93 locomotives, mostly 4-6-0s and a fleet of 2-6-2Ts for running local traffic.

Closed to steam locomotives from September 1960, Bath Road was rebuilt as a diesel depot and became home to a large contingent of the Western Region's hydraulic stud. The depot ceased operation in 1995 when all operations were transferred to St Philip's Marsh.

virtually all of which were hydraulic classes. This is reflected on the layout and, other than a few kit-built wagons, all the stock has been purchased ready-to-run.

Structures and scenic details

The structures are mainly made of card, using a combination of corrugated cardboard and mounting board. The main

platform, which is 9' 6" in length, features a bevelled canopy and proved to be an interesting challenge to make on the dining room table!

The signals are representations of the early GWR electric system which was installed in 1935 and replaced in 1970; these were constructed from oddments of card, signal gantry components and ballpoint pen parts.

The model includes the western corner of the station's magnificent train shed, complete with a castellation, which made for a satisfactory end-piece to the scenic section. The glazing was created from acetate with paint rubbed into scribed bars.

The GPO sorting office, where my late father worked, not only supplied vast amounts of traffic to the railway but was a feature of the scene and was made from mounting card. The numerous windows are computer printed infills. The building had a sunken bay for the loading of vans, and I included some of the (much later) mail conveyor as part of the background.

The River Avon flows underneath the station throat at this point, and I morphed this into part of the nearby Bristol dockland

with a reproduction of a prototype corrugated iron shed that was used for unloading tobacco.

At the far end of the layout is the model of Bath Road bridge, which is both on a skew and a rising grade. I built it in sections, largely from cardboard.

Bath Road depot

The depot site consisted of a varied group of structures. The brick-built heavy lifting shop was modernised from the GWR steam shed. On the model it is essentially just a cardboard box, but the skylight helps to bring it to life.

The servicing shed, which is similar to that at Landore, is a classic example of 1960s architecture with steel, concrete and glass panels. It is a long structure and was quite a challenge to build using acetate and plastic display board material. I think the model evokes the open feel of the original.

The main shed is low-relief, but the administration block includes the period eggshell blue window panels that were used all over the site. The oil tank has a spiral staircase fabricated from plastic fencing parts.

Dreaming

So imagine if you will, a morning in 1964. Station platforms are occupied by lengthy rakes of passenger stock, forming services to and from the Midlands, South West and London. An express that has arrived from the Midlands has its Sulzer Type 4 locomotive

detached, to be replaced for its onward journey by a Warship diesel-hydraulic that is waiting under Bath Road bridge in readiness to couple up. In the centre road a fitted freight has been parked most of the morning, whilst beyond it parcels are being loaded into a motley array of vans.

Elsewhere there is the sound of nondescript steam locomotives occupied on pilot and suburban work, whilst from Bath Road shed comes the subdued rumble of

multiple diesel engines idling or warming up. Hymeks and Westerns emerge and retire, whilst Type 2s wander off to do local turns. Eventually the Warship departs with its express, easing its way under Bath Road bridge and accelerating away to the West...



Talking Points

Topical issues from the world of model railways

Have the manufacturers abandoned heritage DMUs?

In the midst of ever more amazing model releases and announcements from the mainstream firms, Steve Flint asks a pertinent question, motivated by some potent '70s and '80s nostalgia.

've long been a fan of first generation – or heritage – diesel multiple units, and to a lesser degree, their electric counterparts. They were the staple passenger service vehicles during my formative years, when train travel was a thoroughly compelling pursuit.

Although regarded as second best to locomotive haulage, if your rail-roving was away from the key main lines, a DMU would be your usual mode of conveyance. Yes, the toplights rattled and a whiff of

diesel could hang around in the saloon, but they were ideal transport for youthful, eager railway enthusiasts discovering the network.

If you were lucky you might get a seat behind the driver's cab with a full view of the line ahead. Failing that, the door droplights were always inviting portholes through which you could – with due caution – stick your head out for a better view.

We had our favourites; the Metro-Cammells were considered the bee's knees, whilst a ride in a Birmingham unit was thought of as least desirable. Others had a touch more luxury and form the subject of this discourse, as you will have guessed, no doubt, from the accompanying photographs.

Model scarcity

So ubiquitous were DMU vehicles on all BR regions, except for much of the Southern and the remoter parts of the Scottish – and over a 30-year span from the 1950s to the 1980s – that modellers of the time were mystified

by the concomitant paucity of ready-to-run DMU models.

Sparse it was. We had make do with the old Triang-Hornby R157 'shortie' version of the Metro-Cammell 101s, or slice up Lima Class 117s and attach etched brass Craftsman sides in order to gather together the barest of a fleet.

Then, ironically, by the late 1980s as most of the real units were reaching the end of their working lives and being withdrawn, 4mm scale modellers were steadily seduced by a growing range of heritage DMU models.

This was manifest firstly in the guise of Charlie Petty's quite extensive DC Kits range of Black Beetle-powered self-assembly models; an array that kept heritage DMU devotees on track during the 1990s.

Then, biting the bullet after the turn of the century, came Bachmann and Hornby, seemingly with release after release of many of the classic DMU and EMU types. Bachmann deserves a pat on the back, with matching releases for N gauge enthusiasts as well.

It looked like a golden age for aspiring DMU layout builders had finally arrived, and although further excellent models depicting second generation units, and even the Pressed Steel 117s, have more recently appeared, the momentum has slowed to a trickle, with high hopes for further heritage unit models currently only hanging on Heljan's promise of Birmingham RC&W Co. 150hp sets (Class 104).

High hopes

Speaking of high hopes, mine have long been pinned on seeing off-theshelf models of the Swindon-built long-bodied Inter-City sets of which several designs (planned for selected routes and services) emerged from the former GWR Works between 1956 and 1963.

Most survived long enough to be designated under TOPS as Classes 120, 123, 124 and 126 but the entire series seems to have been

> completely overlooked by the mainstream model manufacturers. To my mind, that's a big hole in the market that can currently only be plugged by some significant conversion work on suitable existing R-T-R vehicles. In this area Silver Fox Models is a key supplier of suitable conversion packs (the firm also offers ready-to-run versions available to order).

> Of the series, my first preference would be for the Trans-Peninne (124) sets, closely followed by the Inter-City (123) units, the reasons for which will become obvious a little later.

Introduced in 1960, the Trans-Pennines were originally six-car sets outshopped in lined BR green livery. The blue/grey with full yellow cab fronts appeared in the late 1960s. Been here before

Readers with long memories will no doubt recall that we have been here before. Back in 1966 Trix (British) introduced a model of the Trans-Pennine sets which, for the time, was to a high standard, albeit to a hybrid HO-OO scale of 3.8mm/ft! The model was still available under the Lilliput (UK) branding until 1988, but examples were rarely, if ever, seen running at exhibitions or indeed on layouts featured in magazines.

Insufficient scope

Quite why Trix saw it fit to produce such a model in the 1960s remains a mystery, especially as today's established manufacturers have long since proclaimed that such trains had a limited area of operation, and thus the production of a model as complex as a six-car set would not be commercially viable.

Well, possibly? All the original six cars would each need to be tooled up separately to meet today's exacting standards and expectations of course, but, insufficient scope? Surely not?

Constructed and introduced in 1960 for the main Liverpool-Leeds-Hull services, the Class 124 sets held sway for the best part of 20 years, but did work to numerous other destinations either side of the main route across England's backbone, both on 'filling-in' turns as well as scheduled services and weekend specials.

Blackpool, in particular, played host with a regular overnight stop; a weekend special was recorded at Blaenau Ffestiniog in 1968; and one filling-in turn that operated between Hull and Beverley included the buffet car – though whether it sold any refreshments on the 10-minute journey is unclear!

Numerous other routes were also traversed from time to time and following the transfer of Swindon's later Inter-City sets from the Western Region in 1977, the reach of these trains spread to the tracks

on the South bank of the Humber, Sheffield and the Hope Valley route.

As modellers we are past masters at justifying why such-and-such a train, locomotive, or wagon might feature on our layouts, so it's legitimate to suggest that any model railway setting in the North of England, post 1960, would be fair game to include an example or two of the Swindon sets.

Mixing and matching

The original six-car 124 sets lost their buffet vehicles steadily during the early 1970s as customer demand fell and by the middle of that decade, five-car sets were the norm, but for a short period only.

When the Inter-City sets, noted above, arrived in Yorkshire in 1977 a mix and match exercise occurred and hybrid four-car sets became commonplace on the Trans-Pennine traffic: often with a 124 cab at one end and a 123 cab at the other, though not always.

During this period, these venerable trains could also be spotted much further afield than just the Hull-Liverpool corridor, again as noted above.

The combined sets retained this formation until withdrawal in May 1984, displaced by Class 31s and Mk.I stock as an interim measure until sufficient second generation DMUs became available.

Any takers?

The current gamut of major model manufacturers in the UK operate at all points of the market compass. Some are searching to provide the ultimate all-singing, all-dancing superlative model locomotives – if only to improve on earlier incarnations of the same class. Another is tackling a cavalcade of unsung industrial engines, or is turning out amazing one-off pioneers like the APT or the Gresley W1. Celebrity film engines and early Victorian rolling stock items are on the cards, whilst in complete contrast, we should soon see 4mm scale examples of state-of-the-art Flirt hybrid-power sets; and even a promise of the modern-day Nova 3 TransPennine Expresses in both N and OO.

Don't get me wrong: all of the above is really fantastic stuff, but for now, I've only been enticed sufficiently to head off on a couple of essay-sized modelling projects, both a very long way from those much cherished rail explorations of my youth.

If any manufacturer is reading and listening; take note that back then hundreds of 'gricers' just like me were out and about on the network, revelling in British Rail's finest hours. And, just like me, many will wish to recapture those jaunty days of freedom and discovery through the medium of scale modelling – please don't forget us.

Crediton

CHRIS HEGGADON revives the workings of Meldon Quarry in Devon with this modern N gauge recreation of a key passing station on the Tarka Line.

erhaps in difference to the majority of those in the hobby, I have no childhood memories of watching trains or even having a model railway when I was young. It wasn't until my early 20s that I started to become interested in the hobby; this was following a visit to Pecorama with my fatherin-law, which inspired me to build a small L-shaped OO gauge GWR branch line terminus.

Two house moves followed, which saw subsequent grandiose layout schemes attempted in the loft spaces, none of which were completed. What I did learn during this time, however, was that I enjoyed the construction and detailing aspects of modelling much more than running trains.

The Exeter & Crediton Railway

The route between Exeter and Crediton was engineered by Robert Dymond and would have opened in 1847 but for a dispute over the track gauge, which delayed its opening until 12 May 1851. An extension to Barnstaple was opened in 1854.

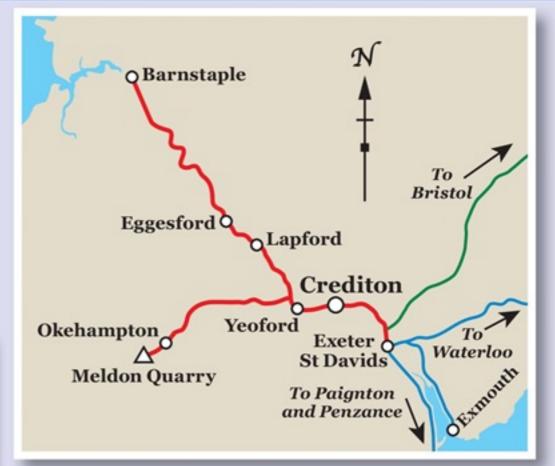
Crediton is sited approximately halfway between Exeter and Yeoford Junction, from where further lines were opened to Okehampton and North Cornwall, and by 1877 on to Plymouth. Originally operated by the Bristol & Exeter Railway, the lines were subsequently taken over by the London & South Western Railway (later the Southern Railway) with the line from Exeter to Crediton forming part of the route for 'Atlantic Coast Express' services from Waterloo, bound for the coastal resorts of Devon and Cornwall.

In the mid-1960s the lines beyond Okehampton were closed, leaving access on this section of line from Yeoford Junction only

as far as Meldon Quarry. However, Crediton continues to serve as one of two passing places on what is known as the Tarka Line, with DMUs running a regular service between Exeter and Barnstaple.

In recent years the Dartmoor Railway was based at Meldon, and operated heritage passenger services along the short section between Okehampton station and Meldon. However, in November 2017 the Government included the reopening of the line from Exeter to Okehampton as part of its plans to expand the national network. This has seen the reintroduction of passenger services on this route by Great Western Railway.

A change to N gauge

In 2010 I decided to embark upon the construction of a much more achievable scheme and I discovered a plan for an N gauge interchange facility (moderN micro by Paul Lunn, RM February 2008) which would only require a small amount of space. I had no experience of N gauge and was not at all convinced that I wanted to work in this smaller scale, but I bought a few items of modern image stock and some track and had a go. After a year or so I had something that I was pleased with and decided to expand what I had created into a bigger layout.

By now I was sold on modern image and, given that I wanted to create a realistic station scene, what could be better than modelling my local station of Crediton? I made a site visit, took lots of photos and measurements and drew up the plan.

Built for a house move

The scenic baseboards are two 5' long boards made from 2"x1" timber topped with 6mm MDF. I was conscious of the fact that we would be downsizing our house at some time in the next few years, so I had to be able to dismantle and re-assemble the layout, so the tracks in the station were laid straight across the join but with the intention to cut through them when the move came.

The main running line forms a circuit via a seven-track traverser with a branch to the railhead. The track is all Peco code 55 with Electrofrog points, controlled by Seep point motors which are operated by a probe and studs.

Control is 12V dc using a Gaugemaster Model D twin-track controller. The layout is split into seven sections, each of which can be switched to either controller circuit, or isolated by using DPDT switches on the control panel. A Gaugemaster HF-2 electronic track cleaner is also employed to keep the rails clean.

Ballast was laid using a mix of granite chippings and builder's red sand.

Buildings

The buildings come from a mix of sources. The station building is a much modified Metcalfe card station kit, which gives a good impression of the actual building although it is a little small. The shelters are scratch-built using card and plasticard over wooden blocks.

The footbridge – which is a crucial element of the station – uses steps from a Faller footbridge with a scratch-built deck and supports. However, no sooner had I completed this in the green colour it wore in 2015, than the bridge was refurbished and repainted in LSWR colours! The signal box is from an ABM Railcraft Kit with altered steps.

The signals were made by CR Signals including the custom built down platform signal with route indicator.

The signage around the station is created from photos which were cropped, resized, and printed on photo paper.

The High Street is made up from Metcalfe

The footbridge at the western end of the station uses steps from a Faller item with a scratch-built deck and supports. Soon after the model had been completed in the green colour worn by the prototype, the full-size version was refurbished and repainted into LSWR colours!





kits, whilst the farm and industrial units are a mix of ready-to-plant buildings and scratch-built.

Scenic modules

Many of the scenic areas were built away from the layout as stand-alone modules so that they could be removed safely when the move came. The cutting by the signal box was made using lightweight packaging material mounted on a piece of cardboard; this made for a very light structure with

bumps and hollows, which I then coated in plaster bandage and dressed with scenic materials.

Other modules were created in a similar way, including the signal box area, the church grounds, the gardens, and the platforms which were built from Metcalfe kits.

Up-to-date rolling stock

The two main items of rolling stock that I have for the layout comprise a pair of First Great Western Class 150 DMUs, which

operate the regular journeys from Exeter to Barnstaple. These are sometimes supplemented by a dummy Class 153 which is a Central Railways model with vinyl sides.

I couldn't resist a Dapol seven-coach HST in GWR colours as there have been a number of HST specials through the station over the past years. I have fitted the set with Hunt Magnetic couplings and corridor connectors which have really improved the look.

In addition there is a Colas Class 66 that is used to haul a train of JNA ballast wagons to and from the yard at Crediton.

To uncouple stock I have employed Dapol Easi-Shunt couplings, placing magnets on the layout where needed.

Operating the layout

Operating trains is not my main interest, so I run an ad hoc timetable of trains when it suits me. A typical sequence consists of setting the Up line to come from the left-hand control and the Down line from the right-hand control. A DMU can then be sent from the traverser towards Exeter on the Up line and another DMU comes the other way on the Down line to Barnstaple. The Exeter-bound train stops at the signal box to drop

off the token and pulls into the station. The Down train just pulls into the station. When the signal clears the points are set, the sections are switched to the other controller channel and the Up train moves on towards the traverser. Meanwhile, the Down train stops at the signal box to collect the token and then moves onwards to the traverser. They both then remain stabled on the traverser ready to make their return journeys.

Other trains can come from either direction stopping at signals and the signal box as appropriate. The ballast train comes from Exeter and shunts the wagons into the yard. The wagons are emptied by using a

magnet to remove the loads and the locomotive shunts them out onto the Down platform before running round and taking the empty wagons back to Exeter for onwards movement from there.

What's next?

The layout is all but complete, although there are still some scenic elements to finish on the boards that link the main station section with the traverser fiddle yard.

I have also started on my next layout project, which depicts a simple country halt built inside a gun case and is small enough to take to exhibitions.



Duns engine shed

JIM HAY presents drawings for this two-road steam locomotive shed situated on a former through station on the Berwickshire branch. Although this structure is to a North British Railway design, it has modelling potential for a wide range of other applications.

he North British Railway opened what was then called the Berwickshire Railway from Reston (on what is now the East Coast Main Line) in 1849. Confidence for the scheme was so great that the branch was built as a double track line, though like so many of the routes constructed during the period, the reality of the scheme failed to live up to expectations. Consequently, by the late 1860s one of the lines had been lifted.

Duns was originally the terminus for the route, which was subsequently extended to Earlston in 1863. This was not to be the end of its chequered history, however, as during 1948 the central section was subject to extensive flooding and the poor traffic flows deemed that the portion between Duns and Greenlaw (including Marchmont station) should be abandoned, thereby making Duns the terminus once again.

Of course, this didn't improve the line's fortune, with the passenger service considered uneconomic and, with the exception of the occasional special, this was curtailed in 1951. The freight service continued until the branch cuts of the mid 1960s.



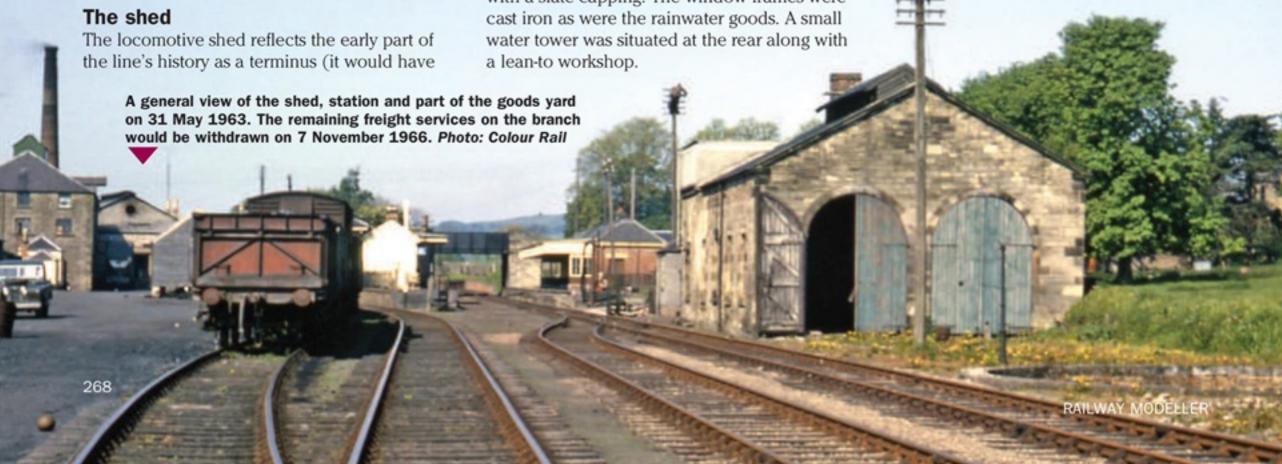
An undated view of the characterful locomotive shed at Duns – in many ways a typical branch line terminus structure, except for the provision of two roads.

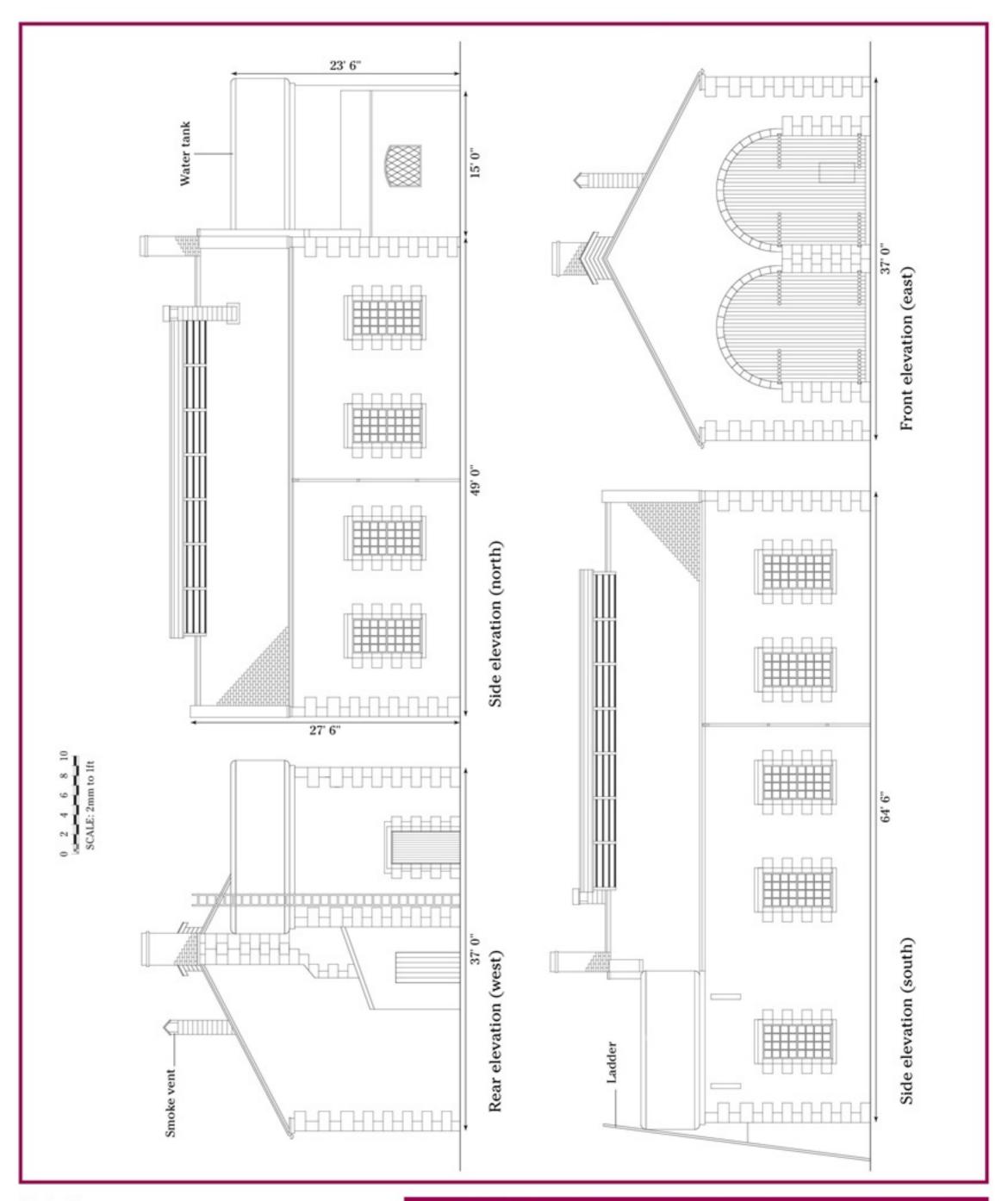

been unusual to site locomotive facilities on a branch through station) and given the eventual traffic flow, making the structure capable of accommodating two locomotives perhaps demonstrates the initial over ambitious plans for the line.

The building was situated at the north side of the line with a turntable at its eastern end and was substantially built from faced rubble walls under a slate roof with the quoins projecting ½" from the face. The gable ends were capped with a single layer of stone projecting above the slate line. The two internal roads were accessed via a pair of arch top openings with wooden doors. The shed features a long clerestory style smoke vent made from timber with a slate capping. The window frames were cast iron as were the rainwater goods. A small water tower was situated at the rear along with a lean-to workshop.







Modelling

A representation of the shed can be modelled in 4mm scale using Wills Coarse Stone material sheet (ref.SSMP200) which could have the surface sanded almost flat using a sanding block. Suitable windows could be adapted from the Wills round top mouldings (ref.SS71), with the quoins from thin plastic sheet or the Wills cornerstone pack (ref.SS76).

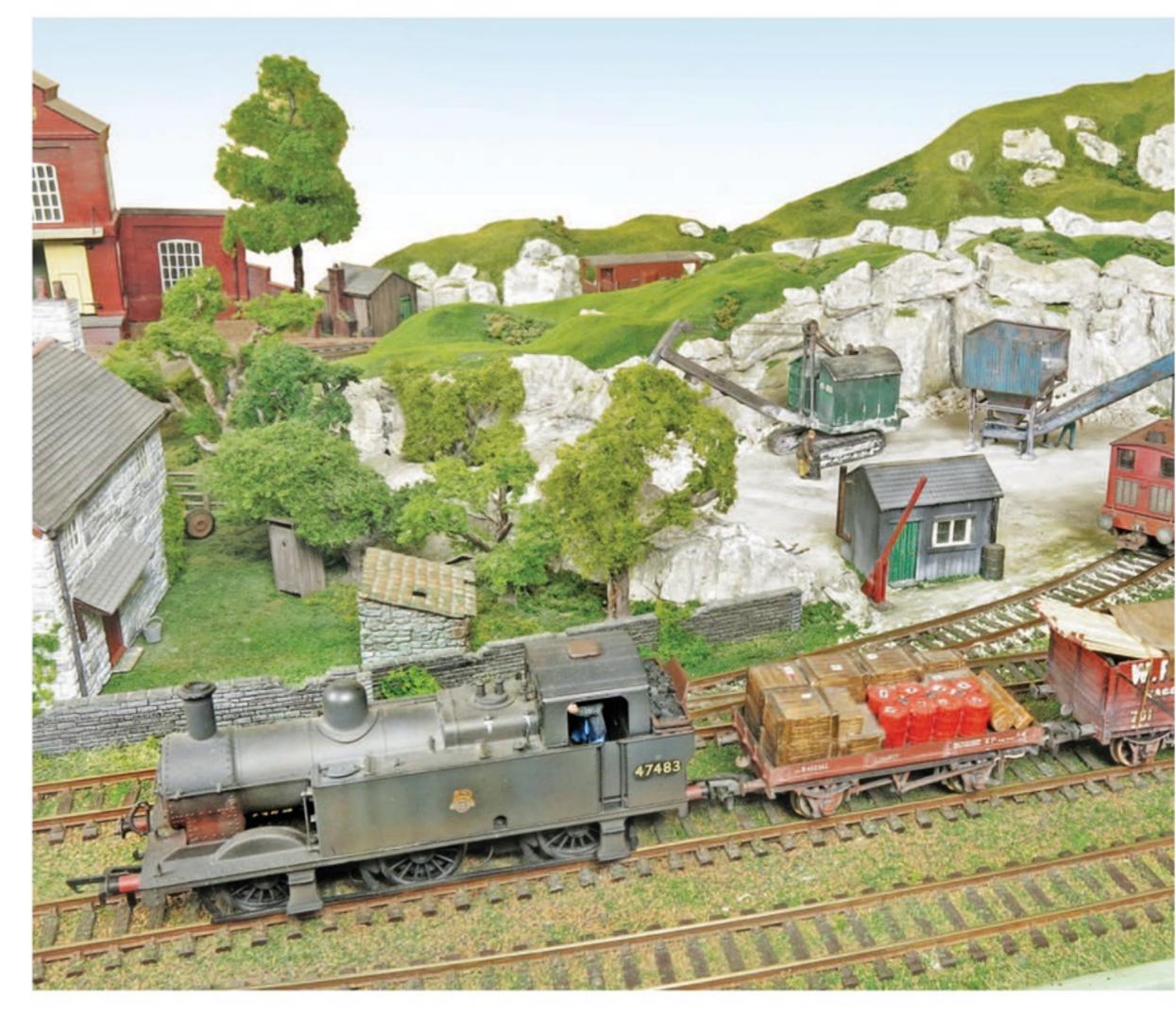
The tale of two Jinties



The Tri-ang 'Jinty' 0-6-0T, which was originally reviewed in the August 1953 edition of RAILWAY MODELLER.

GREG BADDOCK'S childhood introduction to model railways didn't go well, with the temperamental running of his first train set leaving him feeling disillusioned with the hobby. However, this all changed more than half a century later following his re-acquaintance with an old friend...

hen I was young I owned a Tri-ang train set which consisted of a small oval of track with two sidings. A plastic Tri-ang engine shed sat on one siding and a cardboard goods loading dock on the other. The loco was a Fowler 3F 'Jinty' 0-6-0T locomotive together with half a dozen various wagons.

I remember that I was particularly interested in the transportation of goods on the railway, never passenger traffic, so I used to search in the garden for twigs to make up timber loads. I had some small – but not to scale – Watneys Red Barrel casks and I even asked my mum to make some sacks for me, which she duly did, each complete with 'FLOUR' lettering written neatly on each one. The fact that each sack was almost as big as the wagon itself didn't bother me at all – what bothered me was something far more fundamental...

The dark times

There was little room in the house for a layout on a permanent baseboard, so the whole lot lived in a cardboard box under the stairs. I would set it up on the living room carpet, clipping the track together carefully, then plugging in the transformer and then the control box. Then the train was placed on the track, the control knob turned and away it went. Except that it didn't. The locomotive and its train often ran only a short distance before stopping, requiring a wiggling of the joiners to get it moving again.

There were barrels, timber and sacks for the first Tri-ang 3F 'Jinty' 0-6-0T but it never collected them. However, this Bachmann model does... every single time!

A BR Sulzer Type 2 (later Class 24) stands with a very short passenger train. The station building is built from the venerable Airfix HO scale booking hall kit.

Sometimes the loco needed a push and a prod, and occasionally carpet fibres needed removing from the pick-ups too.

It was this unreliable state of affairs which bothered me the most. All I wanted was to drive that train like a real one, slowly and smoothly down to the loading dock, fill the wagons with barrels and sacks and then slowly pull away.

Each time I set up the layout, I harboured a renewed hope that it would all work perfectly, but on every occasion I ended up disappointed.

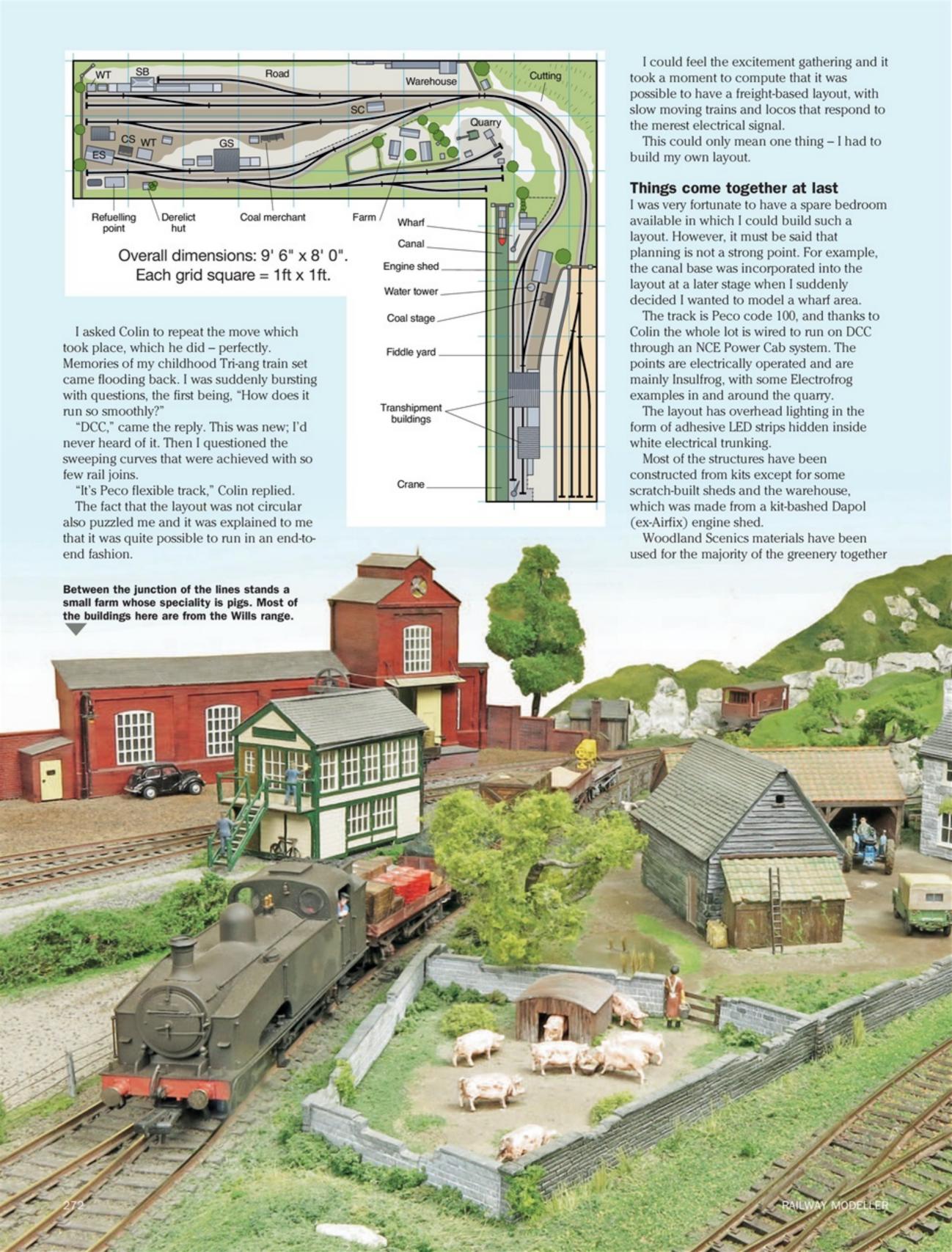
One day I put the entire set back in the box and vowed that I would never play with it again. As far as I was concerned my interest in model railways was finished.

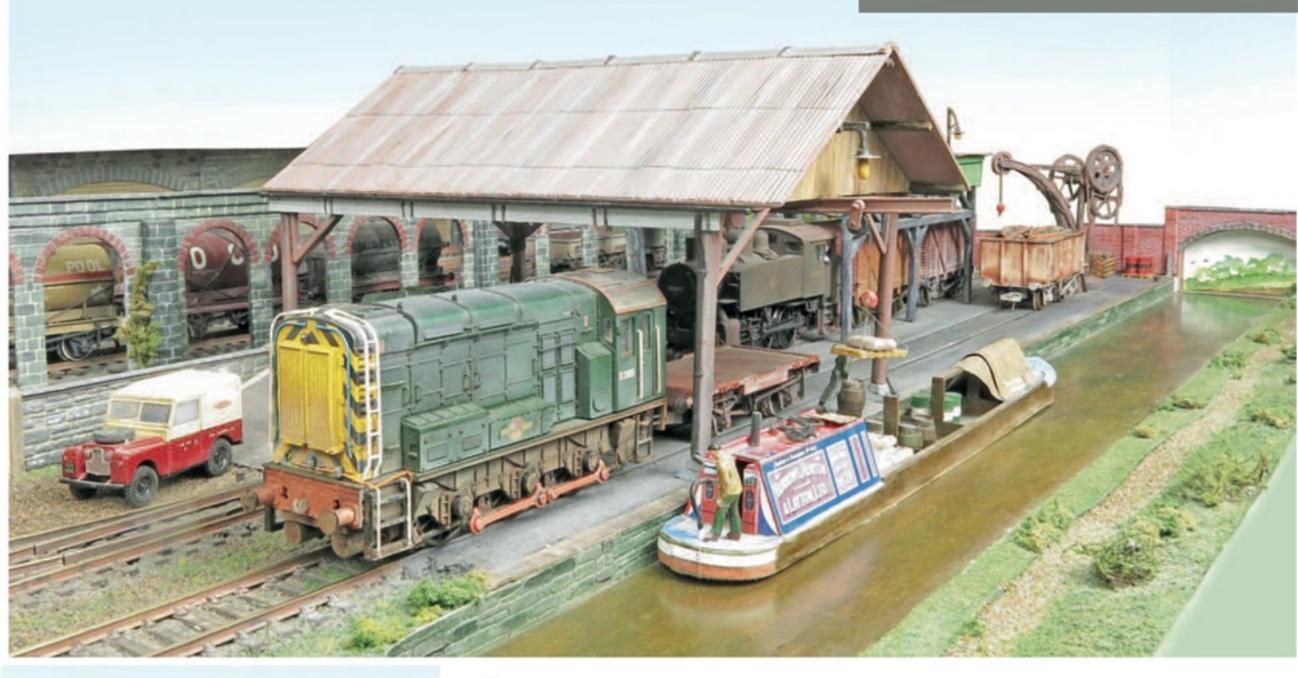
Into the light

That was then, but fast forward 50 years to my retirement, and I decided to look up my old friend Colin Batterham whom I hadn't seen for ages. "He's in the model room," said his wife Sue.

On further investigation I found Colin with a superb, compact, L-shaped modern image layout, the operation of which centred on a cement works.

As I watched, a Class 66 with a rake of 10 Presflo wagons eased effortlessly out of the works, rounded the bend, and disappeared into the fiddle yard. Seconds later a Class 47 emerged with a string of empty wagons and, at a snail's pace, shunted them into a siding. I was transfixed.

with the same firm's rock mould kit for the quarry and the cutting. The tarmac area at the wharf was made using Polyfilla™, which was then painted with grey acrylic. I waited for the filler to be partially set before pushing a wagon slowly along the rails to create the running grooves.

Most of the scenery and stock is weathered to some degree as I love using an airbrush to

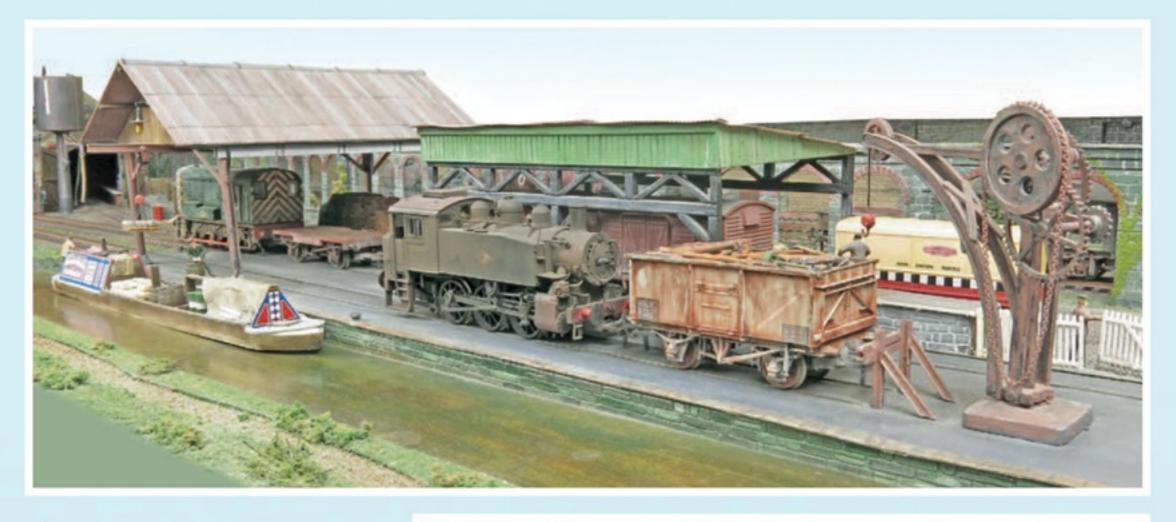
try and create that dusty, rusty look of the steam to diesel transition era, but as yet I don't have the skill and confidence to attempt detailed work like limescale streaks on steam engines.

Locomotives and stock

I run models that appeal to me – rather than maintaining strict historical authenticity – and I am quite content with this relaxed arrangement. Therefore on my layout you might see, for example, a USA 0-6-0T dock tank alongside a Gresley J50 0-6-0T.

Most of the locomotives and rolling stock items are from either Bachmann or Hornby, together with a Dapol Sentinel. All of the locos are superb slow runners and, although the layout is now five years old, I still get a huge kick out of shunting at realistic speeds.





Looking in the other direction at the wharf, as the Southern Railway USA 0-6-0T shunts a wagon underneath the crane for its load to be transferred onto a narrowboat.

However, my favourite locomotive has to be my Bachmann Fowler 3F 'Jinty' 0-6-0T, finished as No.47483. Remember the Tri-ang 'Jinty' from my childhood? I cried at that one half a century ago, but this modern equivalent brings a smile to my face.

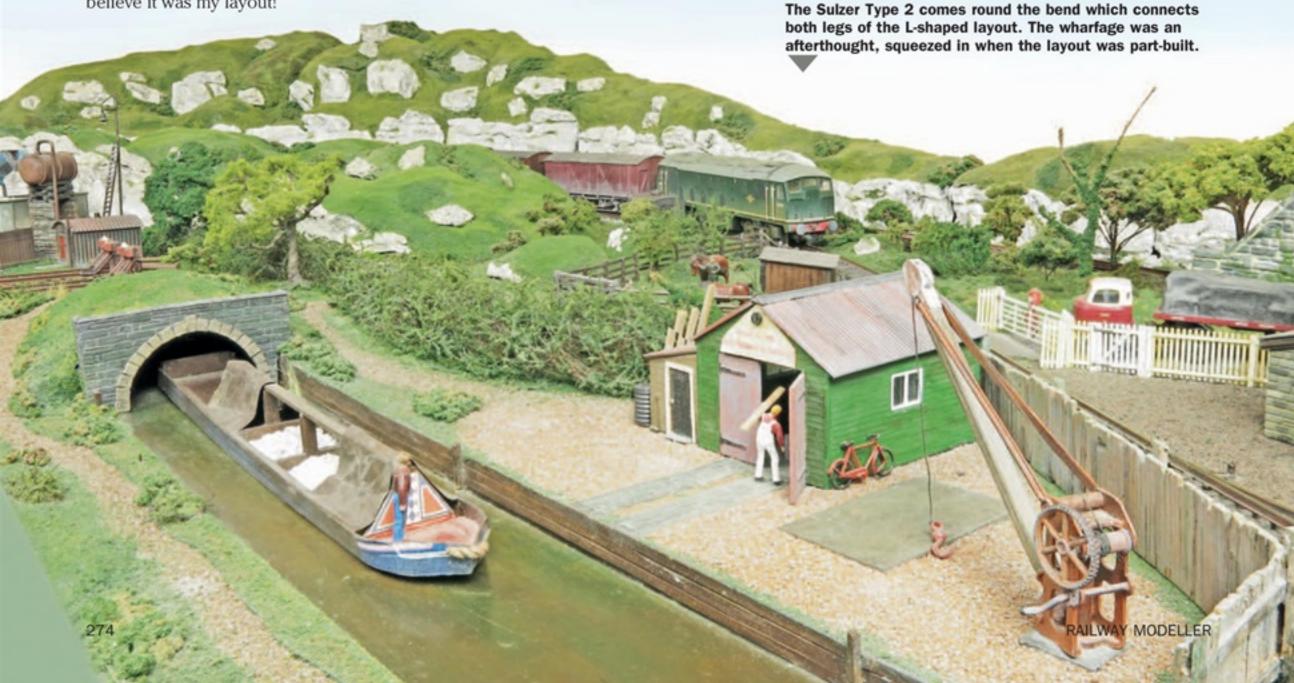
Conclusion

I don't consider myself to be a seasoned modeller – this essentially being my first layout. As such, I hope this article may encourage those who themselves are considering embarking on a layout project for the first time.

Brooking Vale to Lyallcombe

JASON PIERCE imagined a heritage diesel operation for this compact L-shaped N gauge system, which was created using clip-together Kato Unitrak components.

fter many years of producing small, portable N gauge layouts, I recently found myself with the opportunity to create something more permanent and with increased operational scope. However, despite having an entire room at my disposal in which to house my new model railway project, I concluded that it would need to take the form of an L-shaped shelf layout

running along two of the walls, one end of which would be above my workbench.

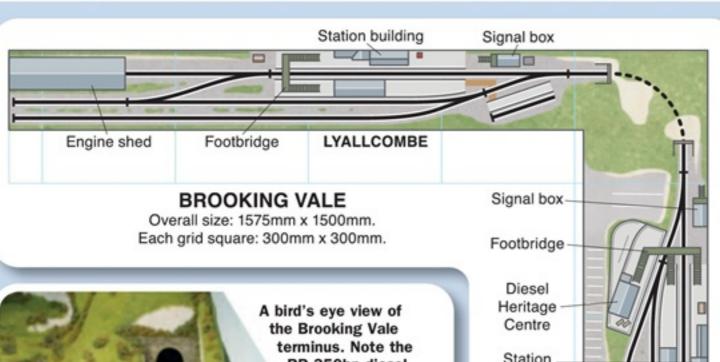
I worked out that the layout could measure around 1.5m on each side, giving me a total end-to-end layout length of around 3m.

There was a restriction in depth that I had to allow for; the side above my bench could be no deeper than 180mm, whilst the other side

could be anything up to 280mm deep. Suitable baseboards were fabricated, these being largely of plywood construction.

made to look very convincing if the edges of the plastic trackbed are 'feathered' into the layout using modelling clay or Milliput. The appearance can be enhanced further with additional weathering.

Magnetic uncoupling

I decided to incorporate a magnetic uncoupling arrangement on the run-rounds that I'd used on previous layouts: this involved placing a small, rare-earth magnet under the trackbed at the required location and then fitting Peco uncoupling lifting arms (ref.NR-103) to the knuckle couplings on the coaching stock. With the careful installation of these arms, the magnets cause the couplers to lift when the stock passes over them at very slow speed. It's a system that I have found to work very effectively on my layouts.

The two ends of the layout are joined in the corner by a curve of minimum (9") radius, which even my model of a Peak – with its gigantic eight-wheel bogies – can negotiate.

Using Kato Unitrack

I settled on a track plan that was almost symmetrical – in that each side of the L was virtually the same, with each incorporating a run-round loop and sidings.

For the trackwork I chose to use Kato's Unitrak system together with the 'plug and play' points and switches from this range, together with a controller by the same manufacturer. Kato Unitrak items (which are intended primarily for Japanese N scale) feature an integral moulded ballast base and can be simply clipped together. The ballast base makes this track system particularly suited to modellers who are perhaps slightly wary of undertaking their own ballasting with loose granules, which for some could be the difference between starting a layout build and just dreaming about it!

I have found that Unitrack items can be

A heritage railway scene

With the track plan and construction basics established, I needed to decide what I wanted this layout to depict. As a self-confessed diesel enthusiast, and due to the compact nature of this layout, I thought that it would be best suited to running locomotives only, with very little rolling stock. This in turn meant that I was looking at some kind of motive power depot or perhaps a heritage line. As my diesel loco collection liveries span most of the eras, a scene

depicting a heritage line seemed to me to be the logical choice.

Low-relief stations

I decided that both ends of the layout would incorporate a station and at least two platforms. The station buildings needed to be very low-relief, so I purchased a Kestrel Station Master's house and small station, cutting these in half to create the low-relief, then grafting them together to create two good sized models of station buildings for the price of one!

I also converted some Kestrel footbridge kits to provide passenger access to all the platforms. I wanted a decent sized engine shed at each end of the layout as well, but I couldn't find a kit which was the correct type or size, so I scratch-built these structures using embossed plasticard. I also built a couple of cut-down Kestrel signal boxes and

scratch-built a few other lineside items including a refuelling station.

Developing the heritage theme

At this point the whole backstory for the layout was becoming defined, with the site assuming the guise of The Diesel Heritage Centre. Accordingly, one of the platforms

incorporates the main entrance and visitor centre which takes the form of a brand-new building, once again created using a modified Kestrel commercial building kit.

I imagined that a consortium of diesel enthusiasts had recommissioned an out of use branch line, laying new track but restoring the old original station buildings at each end of the line. I wanted the whole scene to look fairly new and not run down in any way, hence the very minimal track weathering.

The car park features a BR 350hp diesel shunter mounted outside the entrance to the visitor centre – giving a hint of what was to be enjoyed once inside!

West Ham score!

At this point I felt that the layout was worthy of a name. As a lifelong fan of West Ham United FC, it was an easy decision to make this layout a tribute to my heroes, and so the Brooking Vale to Lyallcombe Line was born. The theme didn't end there though; next came the Devonshire Arms, a very pleasant drinking establishment down by the canal where one can watch the comings and goings of the three canal boats 'Paolo', 'Carlos' and 'Bonzo'. Elsewhere on the layout members of the Upton Classic Car Club have met up to show off their highly polished prized possessions whilst enjoying a nice cup of tea from the urn under the gazebo!

A plan early on in the project to detach one side of the layout for exhibition use was ultimately shelved, but I have managed to exhibit other examples of my modelling; these include Brooking Vale Brewery – a 7mm narrow gauge layout that was featured in the December 2021 edition of RAILWAY MODELLER. There is also Lyallcombe Quay – an N gauge 'Inglenook' style shunting layout, but this has yet to have an outing.

Building a brass locomotive body kit in 009

CALLUM WILLCOX explains how he assembled an etched kit for this four-wheeled narrow gauge locomotive in 4mm scale – without using a soldering iron!

n recent years the specialist narrow gauge supplier Narrow Planet has introduced a number of locomotive kits consisting of a mixture of etched nickel silver, whitemetal and 3D printed components, which are designed to fit various types of ready-to-run chassis. One example from this range is a kit that covers the Baguley McEwan Pratt '677' 10hp Class 0-4-0PM (ref.NPL-016). These locomotives were originally constructed for the War Department during WWI but examples subsequently also saw employment in industrial service.

The kit consists of a combination of etched nickel silver and whitemetal components, which are designed to fit a Tsugawa TGW
TU-DB 158 chassis with some slight
modification. (At the time of writing, this kit is
available to purchase complete with a
modified version of the chassis, fitted with a
Tramfabriek 0615 coreless motor – refer to the
supplier's website for further details.)

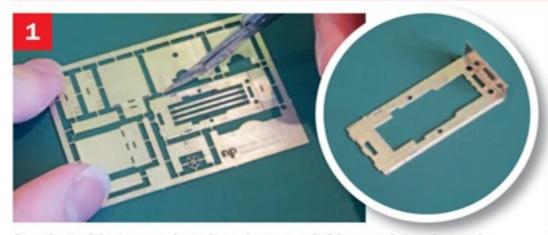
Only a basic set of modelling tools is required for assembly, together with paints and transfers to suit. Soldering is recommended; however, the instructions mention that contact adhesives can also be used to achieve similar results, as demonstrated here.

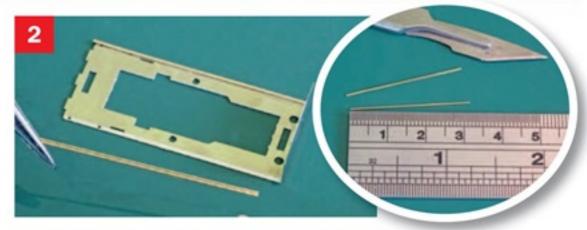
Assembling the body kit



Starting with the running plate, I removed this part from the etch before filing the edges smooth (this process is repeated on all components). The front buffer beam was then formed by folding this part to 90° following the fold line (inset).

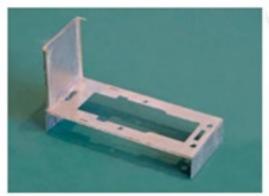
The rear of the cab is the next item to be tackled. This section is made from two components which are joined by butting the edges up against each other; I found that filing the joining edges made for a stronger assembly. Using a similar technique to the previous step, I then attached two over-length pieces of the 0.5mm angle to the recesses on either side of the cab interior (this time with the inner section of the L shape facing inwards). Once in position the excess was trimmed, before the two supports for the grab rails were then folded around at a 90° angle (inset).

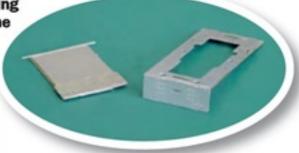




The valances of the running plate are created by cutting two 31.5mm lengths from the 0.5mm angle sections supplied (inset). These are then each fitted to the recess on the underside of the running plate with the inner section of the L facing outwards. Once secured in position the four marker holes for the cab grab rails are drilled out using a 0.3mm bit.

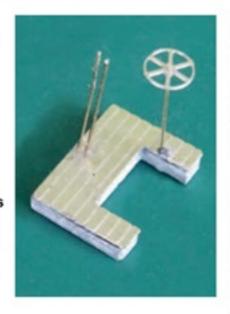
Before the cab rear and running plate were joined together, the outer layers for the bufferbeams were first attached,





ensuring that the slots for the couplings remained clear (inset). A flat surface (such as a piece of glass) is useful to ensure that a right-angle is formed between the cab and running plate when joined together.

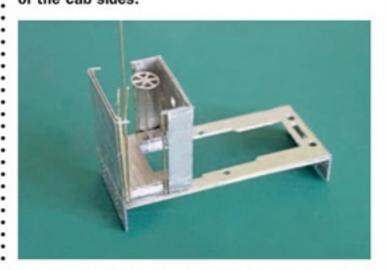
Next the etched cab floor is attached to its whitemetal subbase, with care taken to ensure the two parts are in correct alignment. A 0.3mm drill bit was then used to open up the three holes to accept the brake column and gearbox controls. Using the 0.3mm



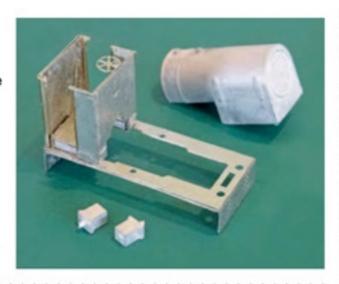
wire provided, the column for the brake wheel is then formed; this is cut such that the brake wheel itself sits about 1mm below the line of the top of the cab. The same wire is also used to create the gear levers, which are also cut to a similar height.

The front of the cab consists of five parts. First, the two cab sides are formed by bending the sides of the main cab part into right-angles. Then separate overlays for the cab front and sides are added - making sure that they are each aligned precisely and flush around the edges. The cab front can then be attached to the running plate using the alignment holes provided: I found that adding the cab floor first made for an easier fit, whilst also helping to set the cab front exactly vertical.

With the complete cab in place the grab rails were then added. These were created from four lengths of the supplied 0.3mm wire and then inserted into four corresponding holes in the running plate. The grab rails were then attached to the supports at the top, with the excess wire then trimmed such that the rails were set flush with the top of the cab sides.



The engine bonnet consists of a single whitemetal casting, which needed minor cleaning up before fitting. The base and rear of the barrel were filed gently to remove traces of excess material, thereby enabling the part to sit flush against the running plate and cab front; the locating pips also required a small amount of fettling to slot into the corresponding holes on the running plate. The pair of sandboxes are also formed of whitemetal castings, which fit into holes located on either side of the running plate.

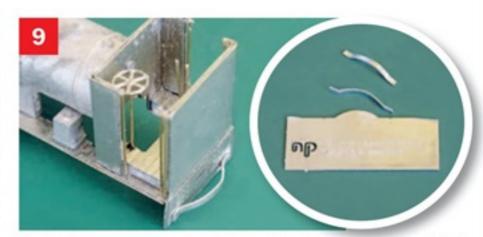

Greenwich couplings are recommended for use with the kit, although these need to be sourced separately. The couplings were assembled in accordance with the instructions, minus the loops, and then trimmed to the desired length Once in position on the model, excess sections of the coupling shanks protruding through the bufferbeams were then removed, thereby ensuring that the fitting of the chassis was not impeded.



With the body complete it was now ready for painting. After priming with a light grey primer, the body received an all over coat of Humbrol Acrylic Spray No.155 Olive Drab. The cab floor was then picked out using Humbrol Matt Enamel No.110 Natural Wood. The livery was finished off with the addition of some W^D waterslide transfers from Railtec Transfers, these being applied to the upper portion of the bonnet. Finally the body was sealed with a quick mist of Humbrol Acrylic Matt Varnish No.49.



The bufferbeam irons were the next to be tackled. A profiling jig for these is provided as part of the etch (inset) with the bars formed to shape by pressing them around the edge of the jig. The bars were then trimmed to length using the measuring marks on the jig as a guide. The completed bars could then be attached to the front and rear buffer beams.

Citadel Nuln Oil wash was brushed onto the paintwork using downward strokes. The wash instantly transformed the look of the paintwork, giving it an oily appearance. Further coats of the wash were added around



the front grille and bufferbeams, as these areas would be likely to receive a build-up of dirt. AK Interactive Dust & Dirts Deposits Wash was also added to the lower portions of the frames to represent track dirt. Once happy with the desired effect, the model was sealed with another quick mist of Humbrol Matt Varnish.

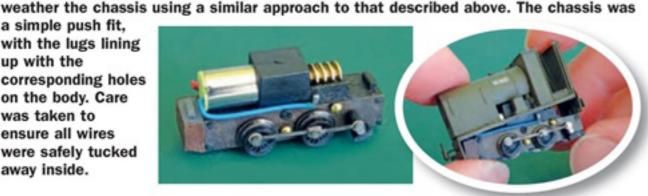
A view of the finished model in situ on Argonne Forest, the author's WWI micro layout. The driver figure is from the Modelu range.



The Tsugawa TGW TU-DB 158 chassis was supplied pre-fitted with a 3D printed extension piece attached to the front end so that the length matches that of the locomotive body. Before attaching the body, the opportunity was taken to

a simple push fit, with the lugs lining

up with the corresponding holes on the body. Care was taken to ensure all wires were safely tucked away inside.

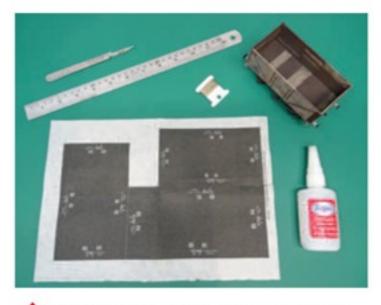
Fitting a wagon cover

CALLUM WILLCOX shows how he fitted a Parkside Models tarpaulin sheet to a seven-plank open wagon model in O gauge.

arkside Models by Peco recently released a range of tarpaulin wagon cover packs in 4mm and 7mm scales. There are five different packs available, representing each of the four pre-Nationalisation railway companies, together with British Railways. The covers are produced from a material that seeks to replicate the texture and look of canvas tarpaulins, as were once commonly used on open wagons to protect the contents underneath.

For this project I have used the ref.PS90 BR tarpaulin set to cover a Dapol BR seven-plank open wagon in O gauge. This pack contains three covers of various sizes (eight are supplied in the 4mm packs), together with a quantity of cord to represent the tie-ropes, used to attach the cover securely to the wagon.

Additional items required include a sharp knife (for cutting the cover from the sheet), steel ruler, pin vice, tweezers, cutting mat and contact adhesive.

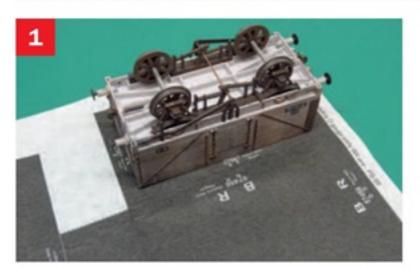


The 7mm pack contains three tarpaulins.

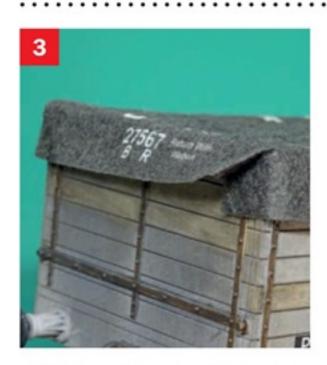
Fitting the tarpaulin cover



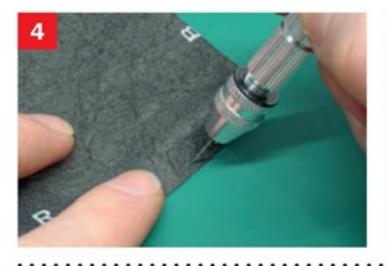
By placing the wagon upside down on the sheet, I was able to determine which tarpaulin was the most suitable size. The cover was then cut from the sheet using a sharp knife and steel ruler.



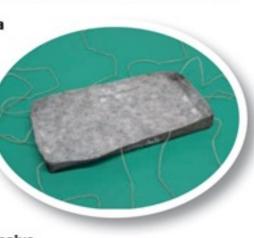
To replicate the creases and folds that are characteristic of real tarpaulins, the cover was scrunched up into a tight ball by hand. Be careful not to tear the material.



With the cover placed centrally on the top of the wagon, I then folded the sides of the cover over the upper edges of the body; I found that after folding the material it was able to retain its shape quite well. The ends of the cover were folded down next, adding small additional folds into the corners as illustrated; these folds were each reinforced on the inside using a small drop of contact adhesive, dispensed with a cocktail stick.



Taking inspiration from a prototype image, locating holes for the tie-ropes were opened carefully with a 0.5mm bit in a pin vice, through which lengths of the provided cord were threaded and tied. The knots were reinforced with small amounts of contact adhesive.



Each tie-rope was then fixed to a suitable mounting point on the wagon chassis, ensuring that all ropes were pulled tight (inset). Once everything was in place, any excess cord was removed. The finished tarpaulin pictured here was

not subject to any additional weathering, but such treatment using paints or powders could be undertaken if desired.

In the right order

have often pondered on the notion that, whilst the majority of the methods and techniques associated with modelmaking require a certain proficiency, there are other skills beyond these practical aspects that can prove hugely beneficial to have in your armoury.

Take the analogy of building a house. This can be broken down into the individual practical tasks of digging a hole, mixing cement in the correct proportions, laying bricks, measuring, cutting wood, hammering in nails, fixing screws, joining pipes, painting, decorating and so on - all of which can be mastered with sufficient practice. In addition, there is also an undoubted expertise involved with the coordinating of these multiple and various tasks, such that a logical order or sequence is followed to suit the particular project and its objectives.

So it is with our model making, with layout projects comprising a similarly wide array of operations (though we rarely need to dig holes, as I may be doing in writing this!). For instance, we measure, drill, cut, use pins and screws, and apply adhesives, solder and paint to our models. However, over and above these varied hands-on aspects, there is an additional mastery that lies in the ability to optimise the order in which they are tackled.

This approach first came home to me when I built Cleckhuddersfax (RM August 2013). I knew I wanted to build a model

railway in an urban setting. This was because I only had a limited space at my disposal, and I wanted a model that would keep me going for several years before I ran out of room. At first, I had only vague ideas of the track layout, so my first objective was to construct the required buildings. These were mainly card kits, which were subject to increasing amounts of modification and enhancement as my skills improved and developed. After fabricating a low-relief hotel from two Metcalfe main line station kits I wondered whether scratch-building may be

the more straightforward solution, so I 'graduated' into doing just that.

Eventually I built the baseboards and laid the track. I could do this whilst placing buildings temporarily in position to evaluate how everything looked. Almost by accident I had hit upon a sequence that enabled me to

juggle around with the overall appearance of the scene I was modelling as track was being laid, and so make minor adjustments as work proceeded.

Another advantage of the 'buildings first' approach was that I didn't have to abandon the layout, with track and electrics completed, and revert to creating the buildings, which would have imposed a frustrating pause in the overall layout build.

Ultimately the layout was sold, and I embarked on Langdon Beck (RM April 2018) a rural layout, which was built in a similar sequence despite having far fewer buildings. The scratch-built station took three months and was the first project-within-the-mainproject to be completed; long before the actual layout build was started.

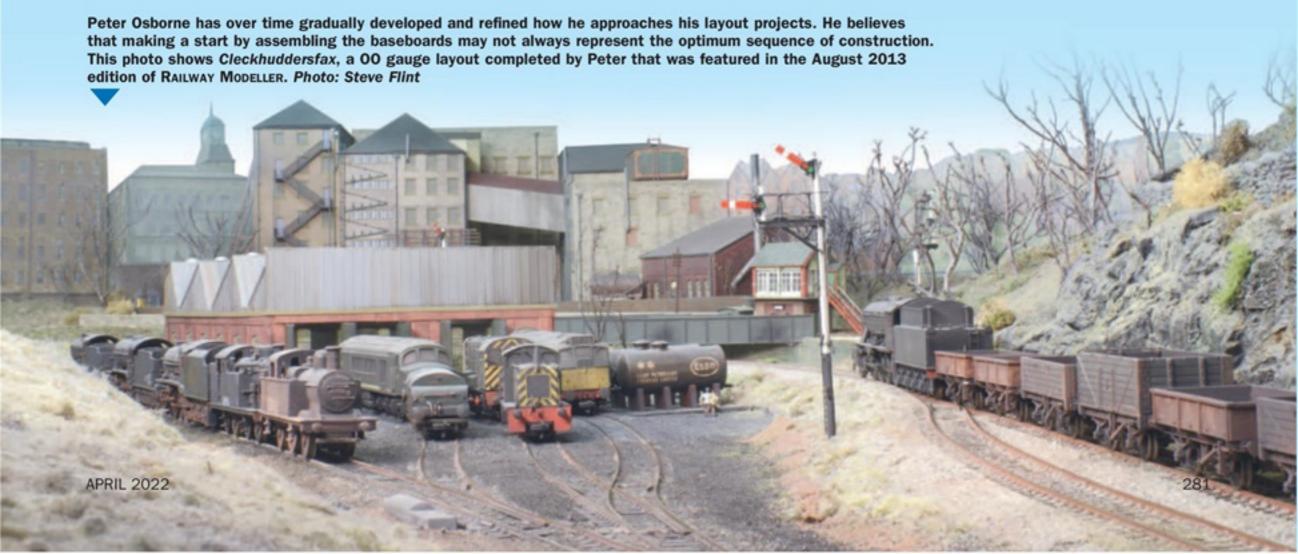
I recently embarked on a minimum space O gauge scenario suitable for exhibition use (A. Bodge Engineers Ltd. RM February 2021). This includes several working features: a fully working overhead crane, a wagon turntable, doors that open and close, and even some dual-gauge track. Working to my evolved sequence I built the various features first as stand-alone modules; the locos were completed next, then two or three wagons, a narrow gauge electric trolley, the wagon turntable, the overhead crane, the motorised door opening mechanisms, and so on.

> The individual features were set up temporarily to see how it all looked and mock-ups of the buildings were made in card. Only then was the minimum size of the baseboard, together with the overall design and presentation, fully established.

I believe that, to have applied convention and constructed the baseboards

first would have been very restrictive, and would have limited the options of what I could or could not have included on the finished model. The sequencing of the project needed careful forethought and choosing to start with the rolling stock and buildings allowed time for the overall design of the layout to evolve whilst changes could still be made. Crucially this approach significantly reduces the likelihood of encountering the all-too-common 'I wish I had done such-and-such first' scenario something I am sure many fellow modellers have experienced at least once during the course of their endeavours...

Micro Marvels – last words

I was interested to read the comments in the January RAILWAY MODELLER about the layout Penmaenbach.

One of the most important aspects of this diverse hobby is that everyone who participates should enjoy what they do and get pleasure and fulfilment from it. Hobbies and pastimes are for enjoyment, are they not?

We all have different levels of skill and experience, and many have that uncanny ability to create outstanding model scenes, as with Chris Hopper and his small layouts.

I regard myself as an average modeller and like so many, I do not have huge amounts of space available to create a large permanent layout. I have a British layout, an around-the-wall one depicting South Australian Railways, and a small New South Wales layout called Yanga (See CONTINENTAL MODELLER July 2020).

As the term 'micro' layout does not seem to find favour with some of the modelling fraternity, I have adopted the term 'compact' for small layouts. The layout I use the most is the compact NSW layout Yanga and most days I will go into the garage and run some trains.

It is operated to a sequence and I use train cards which detail the train consist entering the station; i.e. the wagons to pick up to form the departing train (see my article Planning an operating sequence in the August 2020 issue of RM). That is about as close to the prototype operation as I get, and as it's a compact railway scene, I am very confident that, if and when we have to downsize to a smaller home, I will still have a layout that I can enjoy operating.

British modellers do seem to excel in possessing the skills and observation necessary to produce quality compact layouts. From initial thought, planning and design, to execution to finish, the end results are a credit to the builders.

Soldering jig for joining layout wires

I hope this little soldering jig I have made from wooden clothes pegs will be of interest to fellow readers.

On the left is the 'bench' version which allows wires to be held rigidly whilst leaving hands free to hold the solder and soldering iron. I aim to use the idea to extend the wires on DCC

decoders with open-wire harnesses, so as to fit more easily into DMU bodies.

The partly dis-assembled version on the right is the one I use when repairing wires under the layout. The pegs are held in-line by the short wooden stub, being fixed via the 20mm screws.

Using downloadable self-print kits as scratch-aids

I much enjoyed reading James Smith's article in the March 2022 issue in which he described how he modified Scalescenes kits (right) during their physical construction. This was particularly timely for me as, having recently returned to modelling after many years, I decided that I would start with some Scalescenes kits.

The kits as designed weren't quite right for their intended locations on my nascent layout, but I found that the sheets, once downloaded, could be easily modified prior to printing.

The Scalesenes PDFs, once purchased and downloaded, were modified using a PDF editing programme, a free version of which is available for non commercial uses from: www.pdfsam.org The app is available for Windows, Mac and Linux and it enables the PDFs to be split into their individual pages. The pages containing the items I want to modify are then imported into a free vector drawing app called Inkscape (this is another freely available open source programme: www.inkscape.org).

The objects as imported are grouped together so need to be ungrouped, often numerous times, until the element which I want to alter becomes editable.

I then modify the elements to suit my requirements and when complete use the 'Save as Copy' in PDF format command to produce a new file.

I am however a novice in Inkscape and find printing the files somewhat challenging, so as yet I have only used this method for simple edits of the Scalescenes designs. With practice I see no reason why the Scalescenes designs cannot be adapted as 'scratch-aids' to prepare bespoke designs for your own layout, in much the same way as we often modify plastic and etched brass kits to suit our specific layout requirements.

Bovington Camp - a railway connection

With reference to the February 2022 edition of the RAILWAY MODELLER, one particular article that I found very interesting was that which featured the layout Bovington Junction described by Rob Hopegood, especially as it had some military activities included.

It brought to mind, in a big way, memories of the large camp of the same name in Dorset – Bovington Camp – which is the home of the British Armoured Corps. Also, about two or three miles from the camp the nearby Lulworth Gunnery School was situated on the Dorset coast.

What is possibly less well known is that in the early 20th century Bovington Camp had a rail connection from the station at Wool, on the Weymouth to London main line.

The rail connection was eventually lifted sometime after WWI, but the line and the camp sidings are shown on maps of the period and there is still evidence of where it ran if you know where to look.

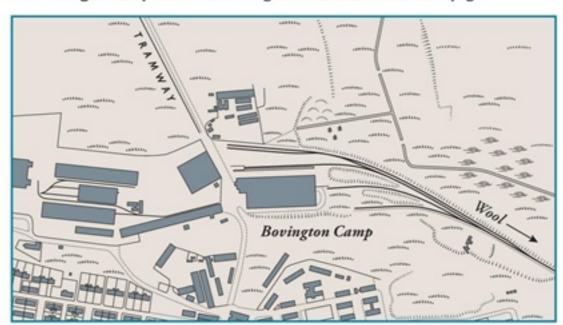
For instance, where the route crossed a small river, the bridge footings were still to be seen for many years afterwards. Also there is a small hotel on a nearby road where evidence of a road/rail crossing can possibly still be detected: some rail ends stick out from beneath the tarmac at the side of the road.

As an ex-soldier I find it interesting to see layouts in RAILWAY MODELLER which feature models of Army barracks, airfields or docks that are rail served

British Rail Class 370 APT-P

Brand new from Hornby in 00

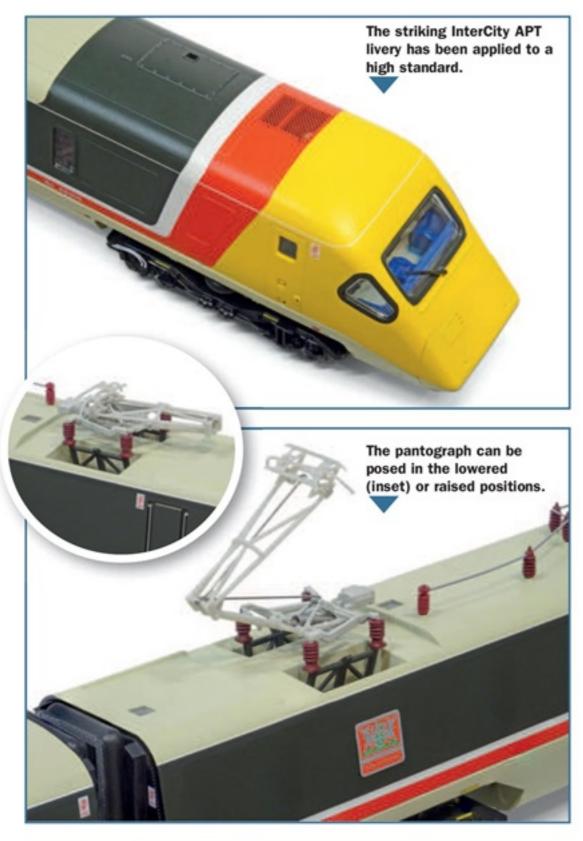
Hornby celebrated its centenary year in 2020. It was a major milestone that coincided not only with the 40th anniversary of British Rail's Class 370 Advanced Passenger Train commencing its short period of service, but also the release of the original Hornby model of this prototype in OO (see Reviews, RM October 1980). Therefore it came as no surprise that, as part of its 100th anniversary celebrations, Hornby announced that this ground-breaking train was to be made available once again in OO from all-new tooling.

This brand new model of the APT-P has been released as two separate train packs – a five-car or seven-car set – together with several additional coach packs, and stand-alone NDM (Non-Driving Motor) to build up a full 2+12 formation. The suite of tooling for the different vehicles comprises a DTS (Driving Trailer Second); TS (Trailer Second); TRBS (Trailer Restaurant Buffet Second); TU (Trailer Unclassed); TF (Trailer First); TBF (Trailer Brake First); and NDM (Non-Driving Motor). Additionally, Hornby has also catered for the unique APT-U Test Vehicle, Sc48204/977527, which was developed from a TS (Trailer Second) and ultimately led to the development of BR Mk.IV stock.

For review we received a sample of the five-car set (ref.3873), comprising DTS No.48103 & No.48104; TBF No.48603 & No.48604; and NDM







which are supplied in the usual clear plastic 'ice cube' style packaging.

An instruction manual is included with the train packs, which feature diagrams for the five-, seven-, and 14-car formations – although the arrangement of the individual vehicle numbers in each case is not specified.

Our sample in detail

The five-car set depicts half sets (see panel) 370 003 and 370 004 in the original InterCity APT livery scheme with clean breaks between colours, although a slight difference in shade was noted between the cream of the main body and the lower nose section on the DTS models. A fine white cantrail stripe runs the full length of the set. Renditions of the various vehicle lettering and InterCity branding are crisp and clear, and all are legible under a glass.

Passenger window frames are neatly picked out in aluminium, and the cab windscreens in black. Etched City of



with plain yellow fronts. The livery application has been completed to a very high standard throughout, with the main cream body colour offset by the striking red/white/dark grey and yellow colour scheme: all lines are straight

Derby nameplates for the NDM are supplied for the modeller to fit over the printed versions if desired.

The construction of the vehicles comprises plastic mouldings for the most part, with the exception being the VINTAGE VIEW British Rail Class 370 APT-P

Prototype information

Authorised for assembly in 1974, three APT-P train sets were constructed at Derby for operation on the West Coast Main Line between London and Glasgow. Each full 2+12 consist was formed of two half sets, comprising a driving trailer, five intermediate trailers and a non-driving motor. These half sets were marshalled back-to-back with the NDMs located in the centre of the train. With a combined total output of 8,000 horsepower (6,000kW), the APT-P was the most powerful domestic train to have operated in Britain, a title which it still holds today.

The APT-P was officially unveiled to the public on 7 June 1978, although it was not until 1979 that powered main line testing began, with passenger testing commencing during April 1980.

However, following more than a decade of development, BR management found itself under increasing pressure (including from the press) and consequently the prototype trains were put into service despite continuing technical problems.

On 7 December 1981 representatives of the media were invited aboard the first official run from Glasgow to London. However, despite the train setting a new record time on the outward run, the event ultimately proved to be a public relations disaster for BR, with the press reporting on the sickness experienced by some passengers as a result of the tilt system.

The train continued to operate sporadically until the mid-1980s, when the prototype fleet was withdrawn from public service. Despite the troubled history of the APT, the design was highly influential, directly leading to the development of other high speed trains including the British Rail Class 91 and Mk.IV stock, together with the Class 390 Pendolino, the latter operating on the WCML to this day.

The majority of the APT-P vehicles were hastily cut up following their withdrawal. However, one set formed of six cars (comprising DTSs Nos.48103 & 48106; TRSB No.48404; TBFs No.48602 & 48603; and NDM No.49002) has been preserved at Crewe Heritage Centre, with a second NDM No.49006 also preserved on site.

grilles atop the driving trailer cabs and NDM, which are formed from etched metal. The windscreen wipers are separately fitted and are also formed from plastic.

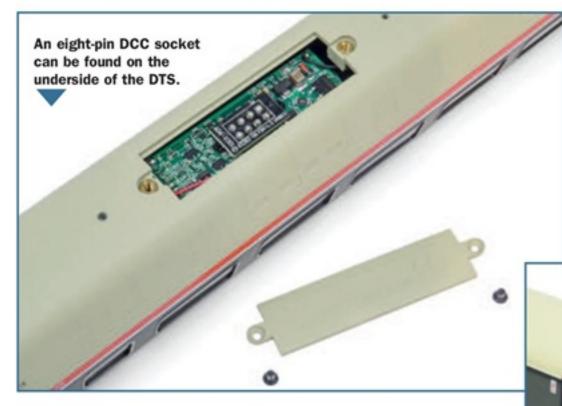
Glazing is flush with smoke tint, with the exception of the windscreens which are clear. However, it was observed that some mounting pillars for the body retaining screws are visible through some windows (as are capacitors in the passenger compartments of some vehicles).

The NDM is furnished with various 25kV overhead equipment, including insulators – which are separately fitted – and high-voltage bus-bar which is formed from fine metal wire. As per the prototype, the pantograph assembly is attached directly to the bogie (through the body) allowing it to remain level while the body tilts on curves. Mainly of plastic construction, the pantograph can be posed either stowed in the down position, or deployed in the up position.

Two coupling systems have been utilised on the model; the first is a ball and socket arrangement for use between the vehicles equipped with intermediate trailer bogies – this is a simple rest fit, allowing free movement for the tilting function. The second type is a clip-fit drawbar used between the TBFs and NDMs. Two packs of spare drawbars are also provided; however it







is worth noting that these are made up of two different lengths – the shorter of which are intended for fitting to the NDM models.

Lighting

The model is equipped with directional and interior lighting (with the exception of the NDM). Each car is equipped with wiper pick-ups that collect current directly from the rails, powering roof-mounted LED strips; these illuminate when power is applied to the track under 12V dc operation or constantly

when using digital control. (There is no option to switch these on/off on DCC.)

An eight-pin DCC socket is provided in each DTS for digital control of the directional marker and tail lights; this is accessed via a panel on the underside of the model which is held in place by two screws.

Mechanism and performance

As per the prototype, drive is provided solely by the NDM vehicles. Weighing end of the chassis. There are also six retaining clips present where the upper and lower bodyside sections join together; some resistance was experienced when separating these parts.

The full 2+12 set certainly made for an impressive sight on the Pecorama exhibition layout Peckwick Rye. The model proved to be a smooth and quiet runner through the speed ranges, and capable of handling the 1:48 gradients

The interiors reflect the colours of the prototype, with the seating in the First class carriages in blue (pictured) and the Standard class vehicles in red. The upholstery in the real thing was a tartan pattern.

with ease – no doubt due to the power provided by the pair of NDMs – while the 3' radius curves provided an excellent demonstration of the tilting function, which is the signature feature of the prototype.

Conclusion

Despite at the time being regarded as something of a white elephant, the APT-P for many has become a celebrated symbol of the 1980s railway scene – and the same was true of the original OO model released by the manufacturer in 1980. This latest incarnation truly captures the essence of these ground breaking machines, one which is sure to see wider application than the full-size counterparts.

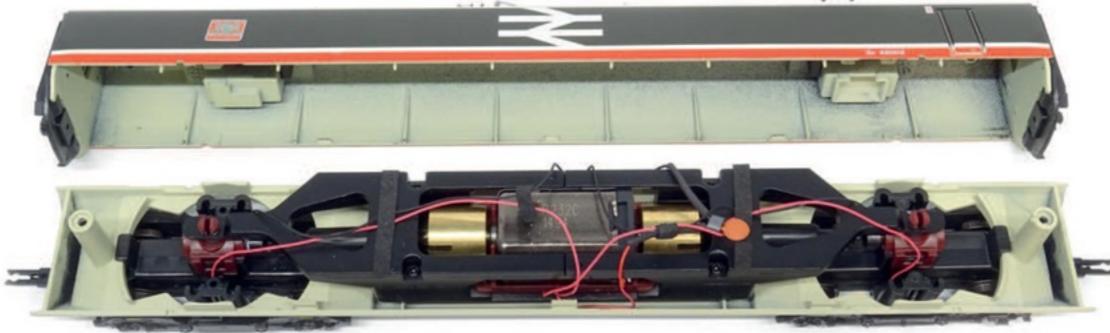

Hornby rebuilt W1 Class 'Hush Hush' 4-6-4

Hornby has received stocks of its Gresley W1 Class 'Hush-Hush' 4-6-4 in its post-1937 rebuilt form. This follows our review of the model in the loco's original high-pressure form in the February 2022 issue. The Margate manufacturer developed both versions in tandem, with plans for both being first outlined in the news pages of our February 2020 edition.

Once it was deemed that no more progress could be made with the application of the high-pressure water-tube boiler, plans were drawn up for No.10000 to be rebuilt with a conventional boiler. The last movement of the locomotive in its original form took place on 13 October 1936 when it ran from Darlington to Doncaster Works.

Emerging in November 1937, the rebuilt machine retained as many components from the original locomotive as possible - including the frames (though shortened by 18") and 4-6-4 wheel arrangement - with the addition of three 20" cylinders, outside Walschaerts valve gear and inside conjugated valve gear, and diagram 111 boiler (similar to that fitted to P2 Class No.2006 Wolf of Badenoch) encased in A4-style streamlining. The cab, while similar to that of the A4 class, was considerably longer due to the 4-6-4 wheel arrangement; its spacious layout and the engine's smooth ride proved popular with drivers, though less so with firemen due to the extra distance between the tender shovel plate and firebox.

In 1948 the engine passed into British Railways ownership. Now numbered 60700 the locomotive continued to work King's Cross services, venturing to Leeds, Cambridge and occasional 'lodging' turns to Newcastle. Following its allocation to Doncaster on 25 October 1953, No.60700 became a more frequent visitor to Leeds and also worked turns to Sheffield, as well as hauling Doncaster to Peterborough passenger services and various fitted goods trains.

On 1 September 1955 No.60700 became derailed shortly after departing Peterborough owing to a failure of the front bogie frame; however it was repaired and returned to service.

Officially withdrawn on 1 June 1959, the locomotive was broken up at Doncaster Works later the same year.

For review we received a sample of No.60700 without side-valances in BR lined green with early emblems (ref.R3844) – one of two versions announced as part of the Hornby 2020 range; the second (ref.3843) is presented as No.10000 in LNER Garter blue with side-valances.

Three further versions were added as part of the Hornby 2021 catalogue



and recently announced 2022 listings (see News, February 2022), to be presented as (ref.R3978) No.10000 in LNER works grey with valances (a livery that the loco wore but is not believed to have run in), together with (ref.30125) No.60700 in BR Garter blue with 'BRITISH RAILWAYS' lettering and (ref.3980) No.60700 in BR lined green with late crests and without valances.

The construction of the model takes the form of cast metal for the fitted here for photography, are cylinder draincocks, front and rear vacuum pipes, locomotive brake rigging and flanged rear Cartazzi truck and pony wheelsets. A front NEM tension-lock coupling is also provided.

On the whole, the livery application is crisp, with neat representations of the numbers and emblems – although a slight fuzziness was noted to the orange and black lining around the sweeping curves of the smokebox. The BR Brunswick green has a pleasing smooth satin finish, with the black



metallic appearance. Cab backhead detail is well represented with fittings picked out in appropriate colours – this extends to the printed dials and gauge glasses.

Mechanically, the model shares the same set up as the 'as-built' W1, comprising a five-pole motor fitted with a substantial brass flywheel providing drive to the centre coupled axle, with current collected from all driving and tender wheels. Overall weight is 461g, just 2g lighter than its 'high-pressure' counterpart.

There is an eight-pin decoder socket located in the tender, which is electrically connected to the locomotive via an adjustable drawbar. However it was found the drawbar could not be adjusted for close coupling as intended, due to the drawbar being obstructed by the location of the electrical socket on the tender. This could be rectified by trimming the excess length from the drawbar or creating a new one from scratch.

Body removal mirrors that of the original version, the undoing of three screws being required; one accessed through the rear of the front bogie frame and the other two situated under the footplate. Additionally, the rear lubricator assembly needs to be detached from the right-hand trailing driving wheelset (for which a R913 Con rod nut spanner is recommended).

It was noted on our sample that the tender body was not sitting flush with the frames at the front.

On test the model handled a load of 11 Pullman cars with ease around the Pecorama loft layout, with its 1:48 gradients and 3' radius curves. This was on a par with the original condition W1, although this latest release was able to achieve this without coming into contact with the layout scenery.

Despite a few niggles highlighted here, the model is an excellent sequel to that of the locomotive in its original form. It will doubtless prove to be a popular addition to many BR Eastern Region layouts where, just like the prototype, its close resemblance to an A4 will be sure to fool many onlookers at first glance!

Heljan Class 86/4 from brand new tooling

Heljan revealed at the 2018 Warley National Model Railway Exhibition that it was to develop a 00 gauge Class 86 from brand new tooling (see News, RM January 2019) thereby supplanting the previous version released by the manufacturer (see Reviews, RM June 2010). Heljan subsequently expanded its plans for the new-tooling Class 86 to cater for the mixed traffic Class 86/4 and freight-only 86/6 sub-classes seen from the mid-1980s onwards – see News, RM January 2020. The fruits of these projects have recently arrived with retailers.

The last of the 1960s-built fleet of 25kv locomotives, the Class 86 (classified AL6 on introduction) officially entered service in August 1965, with the entire 100-strong fleet (constructed between English Electric at Vulcan Foundry, Newton-le-Willows and British Rail at Doncaster Works) completed within a period of 24 months.

Upon introduction, the locomotives were noted to be notorious rough riders at speed, often resulting in track damage due to their axle-hung traction motors. This was cured with Flexicoil springs, which were eventually rolled out across the whole fleet.

Over the years the class – which was sub-divided to reflect various modifications – proved its worth on both passenger and freight duties. The electrification of further routes also enabled examples of the class to venture away from their main stamping

ground of the West Coast Main Line.

Today members of the class are still going strong, both on railtours (such as with Locomotive Services Limited) and with open access operators, as well as Freightliner; a number have even found a new lease of life overseas exported to countries including Bulgaria and Hungary.

produced, all of which are supplied DCC ready; these comprise 86 404 in BR InterCity Executive livery (ref.8640), 86 634 University of London in Railfreight Distribution grey (ref.8641), 86 416 in Rail Express Systems red & grey (ref.8642) as per our sample, 86 426/E3195 in BR 'retro' blue (ref.8643), 86 622 in Railfreight Distribution European grey (ref.8644), 86 401

The construction of the model takes the form of diecast metal for the chassis, with a moulded plastic bodyshell. All bufferbeam details are factory-fitted, including the pipework and screw-link couplings. The sprung pantograph is supplied in the clipped down position for transportation. Constructed from a combination of metal and plastic, the design (which has no electrical connection to the chassis) is sturdy enough for operation on a layout with catenary, such as the items in the Peco range.

Buffers are plastic and sprung. Two NEM slimline tension-lock couplings are supplied in an accessory pack, along with what appears to be a pair of yellow lamp irons, although there seems to be no indication of where these should be fitted.

Bodywork detail is moulded for the most part, including the jumper cables which have been picked out in orange and black. Handrails (with the exception of the long horizontal rail

New livery Cargowaggon IGA bogie flat from Heljan

Heljan has received stocks of its latest run of Cargowaggon IGA bogie flat wagons in OO, plans for which we outlined in our February 2021 issue. Eight versions have been produced with a selection of new running numbers – as well as pristine/weathered finishes – that cover examples in Corus Rail or Cargowaggon blue liveries, with or without wood/pipe loads. A RailAdventure grey barrier wagon twin-pack with concrete panel load has also joined the range.

Our sample (ref.5114) is presented in Cargowaggon blue with weathered finish. Lettering and data panels are crisp and fully legible, while the weathered effect gives the model





below the windscreens) are metal and separately fitted, as are the windscreen wipers. The high-voltage rodding is also represented in wire. The Flexicoil suspension springs are body-mounted; this affords ample movement for the bogies, while not detracting from the overall look of the model.

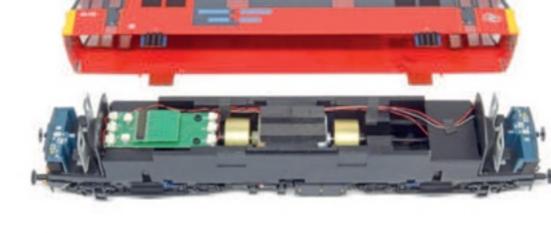
The Rail Express Systems red & grey colour scheme has been well captured, with clean breaks between the main body colours. The livery includes the fine orange cantrail stripe around the roof line of the body. The silver cabside BR 'double arrow' symbols have been applied crisply and data panels are legible under a glass.

The model has a large five-pole motor with two brass flywheels amidship, driving all eight wheels via shafts and gear towers. Provision for DCC is via a PCB with 21-pin decoder interface located atop the chassis; access is gained by removing the bodyshell which is held in place by four clips (located behind each bogie).

There is no specific allowance for DCC sound; however, there is sufficient space within the body for a speaker of choice. The model is equipped with headcode and marker lights; these can be switched on/off independently under DCC operation; 12V dc users are restricted to just directional head and tail lights in analogue mode.

Tipping the scales at 466g, on test the model performed smoothly and quietly. (The manufacturer recommends curves of no less than second radius.)

The re-tool of these 25kv loco-



motives, which for many years were synonymous with electrified services out of Euston and further afield, is most welcome. It means that another chapter of the BR AC electric locomotive story is represented amongst the latest generation of OO gauge ready-to-run models, the Class 86 joining the recent Class 87 releases from Hornby.

a convincing 'in service' appearance. Construction takes the form of injection moulded plastic, with metal wheels giving the models an overall weight of 103g each (without load). NEM slimline tension-lock couplings are fitted as standard, which are mounted in spring-loaded brackets attached to the

underside of the floor (independent from the bogies).

The vertical stakes are posable with hooked ends formed from fine metal wire. These can be pivoted down to lie horizontally at the solebar level when not required. The four end stakes are fixed. Air brake pipes are pre-fitted, while buffer heads are plastic and not sprung. Grabrails are fine metal wire. The model is complemented with a selection of timber loads formed from plastic mouldings, with real wood utilised for the wooden dunnage.

New tooling Brush Type 4 from Heljan

It was announced in our March 2018 issue that Heljan was to produce models of a Brush Type 4/British Rail Class 47 Co-Co in 0 gauge from all-new tooling. The project covers both 'as-built' and later condition versions of the class, with examples of 47/0s (depicting c.1960s/70s era machines with glazed headcode panels and steam heating boilers) together with examples of 47/4s (representing c.1980s/90s examples of the class fitted with high intensity headlights, Electric Train Heating equipment and with boiler tanks removed).

In total 11 liveries/variants have been produced for the initial set of releases, which comprise three versions of the 47/0 finished in BR two-tone green with small yellow panels, BR two-tone green with full yellow ends and BR blue with full yellow ends; and eight versions of the 47/4 comprising BR blue with full yellow ends, BR large logo blue, Railfreight 'Red Stripe' grey, Railfreight sector three-tone grey, BR engineers grey/yellow, BR Parcels Sector red/ grey, InterCity Executive and Network SouthEast colour schemes, Each model comes unnumbered/unnamed.

For review we received a sample of the 47/0 (ref.4851) finished in BR twotone green with full yellow ends. Upon receipt of our sample, one of the bogie sideframes had to be reattached, this part having become separated from the model in transit.

The model consists of a cast metal chassis, with plastic moulded bodyshell that is detailed with numerous separately fitted components, including metal wire grabrails. Particularly worthy of note are the fine etched cab steps and brake actuators which incorporate real springs.

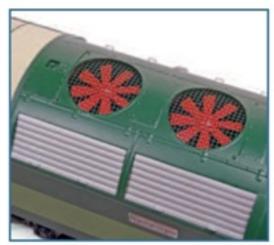
Photos of the real machines suggest that the appearance of the cab fronts is not entirely convincing, although it is hard to establish where exactly the shape of the model deviates from that of the prototype. We suspect that it is, at least



in part, caused by the ledge that runs underneath the cab windows, which on the model does seem to be too pronounced and flat.

The etched roof grille affords a clear view of the red engine fan inside, which rotates when the model is under power (above a certain voltage on 12V dc), via its own separate motor. Cab detail is also impressive, with fine representations of the desk controls, including crew hot plate. The locomotive is supplied with detail parts factory fitted (including functional screw-link couplings), with further parts included in an accessory bag; these include two pairs of buffer steps and snowploughs (with mounting screws).

The overall weight of the model is an impressive 2759g. Transmission is via two horizontally mounted fitted motors – each equipped with a hefty brass flywheel – which drive the outer axles on each bogie. The directional headcodes/marker and cab lights all illuminate in the direction of travel under 12V dc – these can be controlled via three on/off switches located on





the underside of the chassis to the rear of the No.2 end bogie.

Provision for the installation of Digital Command Control takes the form of a screw terminal fitted to the Printed Circuit Board (PCB) on the chassis; the manufacturer advises that decoders such as the ESU LokSound V5 XL or similar are suitable. A mounting point for a DCC sound speaker has been provided in the No.2 end, with an opening for sound catered for, appropriately, by the exhaust.

The livery has been applied to a high standard throughout, with clean breaks between the green shades of the two-tone colour scheme. The full yellow ends border neatly the cab windows and roof line. The British Railways late crests have been crisply applied, along with clear renditions of the overhead warning flashes on the bodyside and nose-ends.

Bufferbeam and underframe pipework has been picked out in the appropriate colours; however the unpainted wheels would certainly benefit from a coating of black paint.

The return of the Class 47 in 7mm is certainly a welcome one, with these releases joining the ever-growing stud of BR diesel locomotives that are available ready-to-run in the larger scale. The sight of this O gauge Class 47 also whets the appetite for the allnew OO gauge version of these prototypes being developed by Heljan, which we look forward to reviewing a sample of in due course.

Bachmann VEA 12T covered goods van

Bachmann has received stocks of its latest ready-to-run OO gauge wagon type, the BR VEA 12T goods van, plans for which were first announced in our March 2017 issue.

Four versions have been announced covering a selection of BR Railfreight liveries, including bauxite, red & grey and Distribution Sector grey & yellow.

A total of 550 VEA vans were converted from BR Vanwides between 1978 and 1983 at Ashford, Horwich and Shildon. The refurbished vehicles were designed to offer an air-braked wagon for MoD munitions and supplies that could negotiate the tight curves that existed at some Army bases. As well as running in short block trains on their own, the vehicles could also be found marshalled as part of mixed BR Speedlink consists. The VEAs were in widespread use until the mid 1990s, subsequently continuing in service at MoD sidings and depots.



For review we received a sample of ref.38-880 finished in BR Railfreight bauxite livery. The model consists of a plastic injection-moulded body and chassis, with various detail fittings fabricated from a combination of plastic and metal. Body detail includes separately fitted lamp irons, lower/ upper door guide rails and fine metal door grabrails. Door latches are also formed from metal wire. Wheelsets are metal and chemically blackened.

Overall weight is 41g. Slimline tension-lock couplings are fitted as standard, mounted in NEM pockets.

The model features a remarkably detailed underframe, including fine representations of the air-braking apparatus, including reservoir, pipework (much of which is formed from metal wire), brake pull rods, and brake shoes which are positioned in line with the wheel treads. An additional detailing pack is also provided for the user to fit if desired, which includes brake yokes, safety loops (also metal) and air pipes – all of which have been fitted here for photography.

Livery application is to a high standard, with a pleasing richness to the BR bauxite. Railfreight markings and data panels are crisp and clear, while details such as the brake handles and lamp irons are neatly picked out in white.

Black Five from Ellis Clark takes shape in O

Ellis Clark Trains has received the first engineering prototype of its ready-to-run LMS Class 5MT 4-6-0 in 0 gauge.

First announced in the November 2019
RAILWAY MODELLER, it depicts the batch
of 227 long-firebox engines, Nos.52255451, constructed by Armstrong
Whitworth in 1936/7 – the largest single
locomotive order ever placed with an
outside contractor by a British railway
company.

18 versions are planned in LMS and BR black liveries, including the 1936 LMS guise with sans-serif lettering in which the engines were delivered new. The BR models will carry lined black with early emblems or late crests, and the plain black applied after 1963.

As well as un-numbered versions, five running numbers will be offered, including three preserved examples – No.45337 (currently under overhaul at the East Lancashire Railway) in plain or lined BR black with late crest, No.45379 (owned

by the Mid-Hants Railway Preservation Society and currently displayed at the former Hornby factory in Margate) in late BR lined black, and No.5428/45428 Eric Treacy (in service at the North Yorkshire Moors Railway) in LMS or early BR lined black. The others are No.5241 in LMS lined black with 1936 insignia, and No.45430 in early BR lined black.

The previously advertised option of sound and smoke has now been replaced with DCC sound only. Ellis Clark explained: "The reason is that the smoke function will delay the project by around six months due to availability of parts, which in turn would have a knock-on effect on the testing and tooling stages."

The model is expected to be available in the third or fourth quarter of this year, with recommended retail prices of £949.00 for DC/DCC ready versions and £1,175.00 for sound-fitted locomotives. A further £50.00 should be added to

these prices for limited edition model ref.E1003Y (No.45428 in early BR lined black) as a signed print is included.

Heljan unveils North British prototype 10800 in 00

Danish model railway manufacturer Heljan has unveiled plans to produce the unique British Railways No.10800 Bo-Bo in OO.

Built in Glasgow by the North British Locomotive Company in the early-1950s, No.10800 was originally ordered by the LMS as part of its pioneering investigations into main line diesel traction. It was envisaged as the equivalent of 3MT tank locomotives for lighter passenger and freight work and fitted with an 827hp Paxman diesel engine. Eventually delivered to BR in 1952 it was tested on the London Midland, Southern and (briefly) Eastern Regions. After withdrawal by BR in 1959 it was sold to Brush and used as a testbed for new traction equipment before eventually being scrapped in 1976.

Following in the footsteps of the firm's previous OO gauge prototype diesels – such as BRCW Lion, Brush Kestrel and DP2 – models of No.10800 will be produced in limited quantities across four versions depicting the NBL machine in post-1954 SR/LMR and final BR condition with later external modifications, each priced £234.95 DCC ready.

The specification is set to include fine etched metal parts, working marker and cab lights, 21-pin DCC interface, provision for DCC sound, sprung buffers and all-wheel drive/pick-up.

CAD work has been completed and tooling is currently underway, with delivery expected during 2023.

Inverness Class 26 for 00

Heljan has also revealed plans to introduce an all-new version of the BRCW Type 2/Class 26 in 00; the announcement follows the development of the firm's 0 gauge model which was first outlined in our January 2021 issue.

The initial release will comprise two models depicting Highland machines, featuring the early style circular radio pods and twin headlights: 26 039 in BR blue (1970s condition); together with 26 032 in BR blue with twin headlights and Highland stag motifs (mid-1980s). Heljan has also confirmed plans for an upgraded version of the Class 26/0 with further details to be announced later this year.

The specification is set to include directional lighting (with switchable cab, tail and engine room lights), easy-access 21-pin DCC interface and 'plug-and-play' DCC sound capability.

Revolution Trains announces 175 and 180 units in 00 and N

Revolution Trains will model two 'missing links' in ready-to-run DMUs, in the form of Class 175 'Coradia' and 180 'Adelante' units in OO and N gauge.

Built by Alstom in Birmingham between 1999 and 2001, the 100mph Class 175s initially entered service with First North Western, later working for Wales & Borders and Arriva. The 11 two-car and 16 three-car units are now operated by Transport for Wales, running throughout Wales and into the Midlands and North West England.

The 125mph Class 180s are similar to the 175s, except with aerodynamic cab ends, closely based on the streamlined LNER Coronation 'Beavertail' observation cars of the 1930s. Originally built for First Great Western, the 'Adelantes' did not prove a success with that company, and were later transferred to Grand Central (operating from London to Bradford and Sunderland) and Hull Trains. More recently they have also started running on the Midland Main Line with East Midlands Railway.

"For lots of people modelling the last 20 years these units are the 'missing link'," said Ben Ando of Revolution Trains. "The 175 has been a stalwart in the West Midlands, North West or Wales since the late 1990s, whereas the 180 - despite its inauspicious start - has proved to be a successful and stylish train in Grand Central's unmistakeable black and orange colours, and has seen operation on three of our busiest lines."

The Revolution models will feature directional lighting; couplings that can transfer power and DCC control signals between vehicles; a coreless motor and pin-point axles; and full interiors with saloon lighting.

Liveries have not yet been finalised, but are expected to include First North Western, Arriva and Transport for Wales on the Class 175s, and First Great Western, Hull Trains 'dynamic lines', Grand Central and East Midlands Railway on the Class 180s.

Computer Aided Design work is almost complete for the N gauge version, which is expected to arrive first, and the design will then be upscaled for the OO model, which will follow a few months later. The order book is expected to open shortly after this issue goes on sale.

Going nuclear

Revolution is also to produce the new FNA-D nuclear flask carrier, again in both OO and N scale.

Built by WH Davis from 2014, these wagons displaced the older vehicles built in the 1970s, and are used to transport spent nuclear fuel in hardened flasks from power stations to Sellafield reprocessing plant in Cumbria.

Operated by Direct Rail Services, the wagons usually run singly or in small numbers, hauled by Class 66 or 68 diesels or Class 88 electro-diesels Computer Aided Design for the Revolution Trains Class 175 'Coradia' DMU in N gauge.

in pairs – meaning, in the words of Revolution's Ben Ando, "they can be used by those with layouts large or small."

Consisting of plastic mouldings produced from original works drawings, the models will feature separately fitted wire, plastic and etched metal parts, and kinematic couplings in NEM sockets. They will be finished in the prototype's green livery with a white flask cover, and several different running numbers will be offered.

The order book is expected to open shortly with delivery anticipated in early 2023.

Bachmann Europe Plc has released details of new models that are planned for delivery during Spring 2022 as part of the manufacturer's latest set of quarterly announcements, which cover the Branchline (00), Narrow Gauge (009), Graham Farish (N), Scenecraft and EFE Rail ranges.

Set to join the Graham Farish N gauge stable, and heading the listing on this occasion, are models of a Class 769 Flex four-Car Bi-mode Multiple Unit (photo 1).

The Class 769 units have been developed from Class 319 Electric Multiple Units and are being converted by Brush Traction for service with operators including Transport for Wales, Northern Rail and Great Western Railway. Like the real units, the model shares many similarities with the firm's forthcoming Class 319 EMU, with features including a coreless motor and flywheel, electrical pick-up from all axles, an unobstructed interior (including seating and table detail), functional multiple unit couplings at the outer ends, directional and internal lighting, and Next18 DCC decoder socket with pre-fitted speaker.

The initial release will comprise 769 008 in Transport for Wales livery scheme – available DCC ready – priced £349.95.

DCC upgrade for Farish Class 08 Another new development for the Graham Farish range will see a DCC upgrade for the firm's British Rail Class 08 diesel shunter model, which follows the DCC upgrades to the Class 03 and Class 04 models that formed part of the manufacturer's Winter 2021/22 announcements (see News, RM January 2022).

The upgraded 08 will now incorporate a Next18 DCC decoder socket with pre-fitted speaker. Seven versions are planned; No.13287 in BR green; 08 818 in BR blue with weathered finish; 08 721 Starlet in BR Red Star Express Parcels livery; 08 953 in BR Engineers grey; 08 919 in Rail Express Systems red & grey; 08 417 in Network Rail yellow; and 08 441 in RSS Railway Support Services scheme (photo 2).

Each version will be available DCC ready priced £144.95, or sound-fitted priced £244.95.

Refurbished BR Mk.IIF DBSO and Vanwide ventilated vans for OO

New tooling has been developed for refurbished BR Mk.IIf Driving Brake Second Open (DBSO) vehicles in OO. Models will feature interior, directional and central door locking lights, with an integral DCC decoder allowing independent control of the lighting features when used on DCC; for 12V dc users this is restricted to just directional and interior lights. BR InterCity Swallow (photo 3), Anglia (photo 4) and Network Rail colour schemes are to be offered – priced £149.95 each.

Also from new tooling is a suite of BR 12T Vanwide ventilated vans (photo 5) which follow the firm's forthcoming

Unlike the Limited Edition models normally available through the Collectors Club, the pair of JPAs are not certificated. The manufacturer advises that there are no plans for further JPA releases in the main Bachmann Branchline range.

Product updates

In conjunction with this latest set of product announcements, Bachmann has released updates on previously announced projects. Currently at the tooling stage are the firm's 009 Baguley-Drewry 70HP Diesel, Ashover coach and RNAD wagons (plans for which were first outlined in our March 2018 and March 2019 issues). Engineering prototypes of the firm's forthcoming BR Class 25/1 and Class 25/2 in OO are also expected to arrive shortly, along with the first livery samples of the OO9 Quarry Hunslet 0-4-OSTs and Bulleid coaching stock in OO (see News, RM March 2018).

York Easter Show postponed until 2023







Scenes such as these from previous events will have to wait for another year to be repeated.

The directors of York Model Railway Show Ltd have announced that the 2022 event, which was due to take place over the Easter holiday at York Racecourse, has been postponed until 2023.

Coming after a two-year interruption due to the Covid pandemic, the organisers had been hoping to host the show again over the holiday weekend 16-18 April, but events beyond the directors' control have led to its last-minute cancellation.

Spokesman Peter Leadley said, "Although lingering Covid hesitancy has been a factor in our decision, the primary reason is to do with the transfer of our

banking arrangements." He added that the problem has affected much of the 'not for profit' sector, including many clubs, societies and preservation organisations whereby certain high street banks were closing the accounts of such groups.

"This situation has been widely covered in the national press and unfortunately we are one of the organisations so affected by these changes."

Peter advised that new arrangements had been sought with an alternative bank but the process of validation was taking an inordinate amount of time. "Regrettably, this has meant that we

cannot guarantee key deposits to secure assets and services, such as hotel accommodation, which have to be paid in advance."

They have been assured by their new banking provider that the account will be up and running soon.

"However," Peter cautioned, "without a firm commitment from the new provider as to the account status and our timeline, we felt that to keep the many local businesses, on which we rely, on indefinite hold would not only be unfair, but irresponsible."

He reaffirmed that a lot of hard work

had gone into organising the show already and expressed sincere thanks to everyone who has continued to offer support, whether as a volunteer, trade support, exhibitor and much more.

In finishing, Peter reassured the Show was otherwise on a firm financial footing and the team were looking enthusiastically to the future. "We expect to return 'full steam ahead' across Easter 2023. The venue is already booked and planning underway. We look forward to sharing our plans with the hobby throughout the remainder of this year."

Exclusive Class 90 in 00 from Kernow Model Rail Centre

Kernow Model Rail Centre has announced the subject of its latest exclusive locomotive in OO - British Rail Class 90 90 129 Frachtverbindungen in DB red livery.

As part of the Freight Connection 92 Exhibition, held in September 1992, three Class 90s were repainted into DB, SNCB and SNCF liveries to draw attention to the seamless European rail network to which the Channel Tunnel would connect BR services. The three locomotives were repainted at Crewe Depot, bearing names in the language of a European partner nation and painted in the country's state railway colours; with 90 129 outshopped as Frachtverbindungen in Deutsche Bahn AG German Railways' red colour scheme, with white and yellow cab fronts and BR double arrows.

Produced exclusively for KMRC by Bachmann, the model shares the same specification as the standard release (see review, RM July 2019), with features including a die-cast chassis block with a five-pole motor, posable/DCC-operated metal pantograph and an easy-access DCC interface.

Models are available to purchase via the retailer's website priced at £229.95 for DCC ready and £329.95 for DCC sound fitted versions, each supplied with etched nameplates and a numbered certificate of authenticity.

Dapol announces GWR Toplight coaches in OO

Dapol is to fill a major gap in the ranks of ready-to-run Great Western Railway rolling stock with Churchward Toplight coaches in OO gauge.

Both corridor and non-corridor variants are to be produced, with the former currently being designed, while the noncorridor Main Line & City type will be the first to be released.

Designed for suburban commuter traffic from the Thames Valley area into the City of London, these vehicles were ordered in 1913 but cancelled in 1915 because of the First World War, and the six sets of six coaches were eventually constructed in 1920/21. In order to run directly to Liverpool Street via Metropolitan Railway metals, they were seven inches lower than other carriages of the time, to fit the restricted loading gauge of the underground network.

The stock survived into BR days, being withdrawn in 1956/57, although three examples continued in use on miners' trains in South Wales until the early 1960s. One was scrapped in 1962, but the last two examples – Brake Thirds Nos.3755 and 3756 – were withdrawn in 1964 and preserved. Both are at Didcot Railway Centre, with No.3755 operational and No.3756 stored awaiting restoration.

Dapol's models will replicate all three designs (Third, Composite and Brake Third) with details including frosted Toplight windows, separately fitted metal door handles and handrails, and different numbers of roof ventilators – the only major change made to the coaches in their lifetime being the removal of one ventilator from each compartment.

The prototypes were close-coupled with short buffers on all but the ends

of the brake vehicles, and the models will reflect this with kinematic couplings and NEM pockets, including a special close-coupling bar – but will be capable of negotiating second radius curves.

The models will also feature sprung metal buffers, interior lighting (with DCC option) and a directional tail lamp on the brake coach

Liveries will cover the entire history of the carriages, from the original lined crimson, through GWR chocolate & cream, shirtbutton and all-over brown, to the final guise of BR maroon. Six running numbers will be offered on each livery, giving two of each carriage type, to allow a prototypical sixcoach rake to be assembled.

Engineering samples and livery artwork are currently being reviewed, with production to take place in two phases. The first three batches (in lined crimson, chocolate & cream, and BR maroon) are expected to be delivered in the third quarter of 2022, with the other three sets (chocolate & cream, shirtbutton and all-over brown) due to follow by the end of the year. The recommended retail price will be £60.00 each.

Class 59 engineering prototypes

Dapol has also received functioning engineering prototypes for its forthcoming Class 59 project in N – plans for which were revived in our September 2021 issue.

Tooling will cater for all three sub-classes, with the models incorporating a five-pole motor with all wheel pickups, diecast

chassis, NEM couplings, operating front/rear lights (independent operation for DCC, switched for 12V dc use), and switchable cab lighting. A Next18 decoder interface will be accessible via the removable exhaust system. Etched nameplates and bufferbeam details will also be provided in a detailing pack.

Seven liveries/identities are planned for the first batch of releases; 59 005 Kenneth J Painter

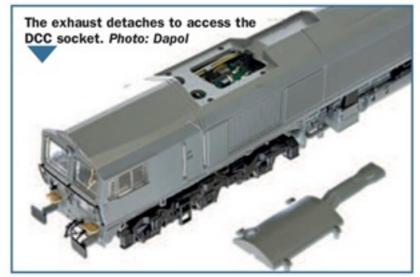

Accurascale announces new Brush Type 2 in 00



Accurascale has announced what it claims will be "the definitive model" of the Brush Type 2 diesel (BR Class 30/31) in 00 gauge.

Already fully tooled up with working samples being tested, the model will feature nearly all the detail variations of this large and long-lived class, including the original locomotives with the Mirrlees JVS12T engine (TOPS Class 30).

The entire class was rebuilt with the English Electric 12SVT power unit, becoming TOPS Classes 31/0 and 31/1, following metal fatigue problems with the Mirrlees engine in the early 1960s. Later subclasses, 31/4 (with electric train heating) and 31/5 (departmental locomotives with ETH removed) will be included in the Accurascale range.

Modular tooling will allow the company to offer detail variations such as different exhaust ports, boiler ports, roof and bodyside panels and radiator grilles, bufferbeam fittings and snowploughs, and even such small items as London Underground trip-cock gear, and Whitaker-style tablet catchers fitted for working the High Dyke iron ore branch in Lincolnshire.

The specification will include working radiator fans, separately switched tail lights, and an ESU Loksound 5 decoder with a bespoke DCC sound package, including a wheel flange sensor to automatically play flange squeal on curved track.

Numbers and liveries to be offered in the first production run are: Mirrlees-engined D5549 in BR green as delivered; Class 31/1s No.5544 in BR blue; No.5803 in BR green with full yellow ends and double arrow logo; 31 110 in Railfreight livery with white cantrail stripe; 31 128 in BR blue (Privatisation era); Class 31/4s 31 409 in BR blue with white stripe; 31 420 in InterCity Mainline; 31 421 in Regional Railways; 31 432 in BR blue with cantrail stripe; and Class 31/5 31 514 in 'Dutch' civil engineers' livery.

The prices will be £169.99 for DC/DCC ready locomotives and £259.99 for DCC sound-fitted models,

Limited to 350 pieces, this model will retail at €44.95.

Maunsell D1 Class in 00 – latest exclusive from Rails of Sheffield

Chirk-based model railway manufacturer Dapol has, in conjunction with retailer Rails of Sheffield, revealed that the Maunsell D1 Class 4-4-0 will be the subject of its next exclusive OO ready-to-run model – the announcement follows the release of the D Class 4-4-0 (see review, RM August 2021).

After Richard Maunsell took the reins from Harry Wainwright in 1913 he worked on a series of new locomotives which were intended for a long service life. This involved the conversion and upgrade of 11 E class locomotives, resulting in the E1 class. This proved very successful and led directly to the conversion of 21 D class members to form the D1 class between 1921 and 1927. Though arguably not as elegant as the D class, equipped with a larger boiler, a Belpaire firebox and longer travel cylinders, the D1 displayed a considerable haulage and power increase over its predecessors.

Initially allocated to Ashford shed, this class was to be found all over the South Eastern Division from London to the south. 20 remained in traffic upon



Nationalisation, with the last examples withdrawn during 1961. None survived into preservation.

There will be six versions produced that will be exclusive to Rails of Sheffield; No.735 in SE&CR grey, No.1749 in Southern lined Maunsell olive green, No.1741 (with top feed) in Southern lined Maunsell olive green, No.31487 in BR plain black with 'sunshine' lettering, No.31741 in BR lined black with early emblems and No.31246 in BR lined black with late crests – priced £199.95 DCC ready and £324.95 DCC sound fitted.

The tooling will cover a number of different detail variations between the prototypes, including: two frame types; two cab styles; two chimney options; two smokeboxes; and Ross pop and Ramsbottom safety valves.

The model's specification is set to include a diecast chassis, sprung buffers, removable coal load, firebox glow and five-pole motor with electrical pick-ups from the tender and driving wheels. As with previous releases from Dapol, models will incorporate a 'pull-out' PCB with Next18 interface for 'tool free' DCC decoder and speaker fitting.

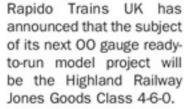

Highland Railway Jones Goods class for OO from Rapido Trains UK

15 locomotives were built by Sharp, Stewart and Company for the Highland Railway company, numbered No.103-117. These machines were the first 4-6-0s in the British Isles, and at the time of

delivery between September and November 1894, the most powerful main line locomotives in the country. Originally intended principally as freight engines, they were often called upon for passenger duties during the wide fluctuations of traffic which occurred on the Highland Railway, particularly during the summer season.

All the locomotives passed into LMS ownership at the Grouping in 1923, gaining the numbers No.17916-17930 and 4F power classification. Withdrawals began in 1929, with the last in 1940, but the first class member – No.103 (LMS No.17916) – was set aside for preservation by the LMS in 1934. The locomotive was later restored to working order by British Railways in 1959 and spent several years hauling enthusiast specials, as well as appearing in the 1965 film Those Magnificent Men in their Flying Machines. No.103 was retired in 1966 and is currently on static display in the Riverside Museum, Glasgow.

He loved to get layouts 'first time out' for the Shipley exhibition and often booked exhibits without even seeing them, knowing that the modellers who built them would produce layouts of the highest quality.

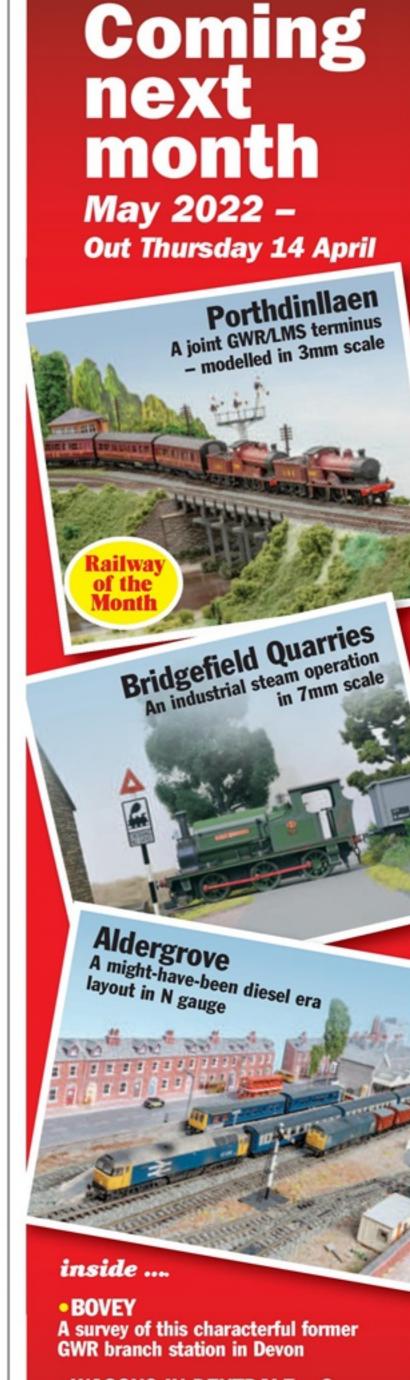
