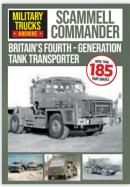

Going green

Many would shy away from a daunting project, but Stephen Crawford from Co. Down evidently likes a challenge. James Connolly admires his recent restoration of a Taarup single-chop forage harvester.

ack in the 1950s and early '60s, hay was the main crop used by European farmers to feed their cattle during the winter months. The art of making good-quality hay was very dependent on the weather. Large-scale silage making was still in its infancy and the process was a relatively new way to make winter fodder for many farmers.

Hay provided reasonable feeding value for cattle. Agricultural research studies indicated that good-quality silage had a higher feed value than hay. Beef cattle feed with silage had improved growth and weight gains. In the dairy sector the improvement was even more significant. Cows fed silage during the winter months, when housed inside, showed a marked improvement in milk production.

Ministry of Agriculture grants in the UK became available to farmers to build silos/clamps and invest in agricultural machinery. More efficient food production was the order of the day in post-war Britain and this encouraged farmers that silage making was the way forward in progressive agriculture.

Silage making in the early years involved grass being cut with fingerbar mowers. Tractors with largetine buckrakes, attached to a frontmounted loader or the three-point linkage, were driven or reversed up the sward of grass until a full load was achieved. This grass was then taken to the clamp or silo on the buckrake.

Another way to lift silage was with a green crop loader. This was ground

driven and picked up the sward of grass using an elevator system of chains and tines to deposit the grass on the trailer.

Farmers were looking for a more efficient method to harvest grass to make silage. This technology became available following development in the United States. Farmers in the US were using PTO-driven harvesters to make their silage.

One progressive Danish company, Maskinfabriken Taarup, from Kerteminde, went to the States to see these machines in action. It was so impressed with what it saw that in 1957 it bought the production rights to a forage harvester, held by John Deere. It then tweaked the design to ensure that it was suitable for the European market.

The first harvesters produced by Taarup were single-chop models. These used a set of rotor flails to cut the grass, which in turn was blown up the spout and into a silage trailer. This was an improvement on using buckrakes and crop loaders, as the cutting of the grass and transporting the crop back to the clamp was much quicker.

Taarup was not the only company to offer single-chop harvesters at this time. Companies such as David Brown, with its Hurricane harvester, Lundell, Wilder and JF (another Danish firm), were pioneers in forage harvester development at the time. The UK distributor for Taarup forage harvesters was Western Machinery & Equipment Ltd., Devon. Cyril Johnston & Co. Ltd. was appointed sole distributor for Northern Ireland with Irish Agricultural Machinery Ltd. appointed the distributor in the Republic of Ireland.

In 1958, Cyril Johnston demonstrated the Taarup 60 off-set harvester at a silage demo at Loughry College, Cookstown. The machine proved to be a hit and demonstrations like this helped convince farmers that these machines were the way forward in silage making. As seen from the

photo above, the harvester was powered by a Nuffield Universal Four.

Taarup made three models in the range, the S 1500 (a 60in off-set machine), the S 1100 (a 43in off-set harvester) and a B 1100 (a 43in inline model).

The success of these machines led Taarup to produce a new version of the side-mounted harvester. These machines went on to be become one of the company's best sellers. A range of flail and disc mowers was also produced at this time.

By the late '60s, another development of the silage harvester was introduced, known as the DC 1500 double-chop harvester. This machine proved to be a great success for Taarup. A range of precision-chop harvesters was also developed and produced at the Kerteminde factory.

In 1993, Taarup was acquired by the Kverneland Group and the deal also included the Kidd factory based in the UK. The company was renamed Kverneland Group Kerteminde AS and made forage equipment, including harvesters, well into the 21st century, during which time the Taarup name was phased out. Today Kverneland continues to make a range of mowers, rakes, tedders and silage wagons.

Project

This brings us to the harvester in this article – a 1960 Taarup S 1500 five-foot off-set machine belonging to Stephen

Crawford of Donaghadee in Co. Down. Stephen is a regular attendee at the popular Border Counties Vintage Grassmen event and had toyed with the idea of restoring a silage harvester, tractor and trailer to take part at this popular silage-based working day.

Red Taarup single-chop machines, especially side-mounted models, were a popular choice for enthusiasts at such events, but Stephen wanted an early production silage harvester that would stand out from the crowd. The dilemma was, which machine would this be? He considered the David Brown Hurricane harvester and other machines made by Lundell, JF and Wilder as possibilities.

Stephen is an agricultural animal feed merchant travelling throughout Northern Ireland and making contact with farmers regularly. After carrying out his business, it is not unusual for Stephen to have a chat with the farmers about his main passion, classic tractors and machinery. It was during one of these chats on the Ward family's farm at Hillsborough, Co. Down, that a green Taarup singlechop harvester was mentioned as a potential restoration project.

Green Taarup harvesters are unusual, and only those of us of a certain age can remember the early colour scheme. Many are surprised that Taarup made machines in colour other than red. It was approximately 1962 when Taarup ceased using the green livery and adopted the familiar red. Stephen decided that this was the harvester he had been looking for to restore, as it fitted the brief of an early machine with something a little different, but from a familiar manufacturer.

David Ward's father, James, had purchased the harvester new in 1960 from Cyril Johnston & Co. Ltd., Belfast. It cost approximately £425. It was first powered by a David Brown 900 tractor and then by a DB 990. Taarup brochures for the harvester stated that the machine required a tractor of 40hp to drive it.

By the mid part of the decade, the Wards had moved on to using a new Ford 6X 5000 to power the harvester. Who was to know that many years later that same combination would be seen in action once again? The Wards used the green harvester for nine years until it was replaced with a new Taarup double-chop model.

In later years the single-chop harvester was used for topping grass, with the chute and spout removed. It was fitted with a rounded top to deflect the grass onto the ground. David advised that somehow the spout and chute had been lost or scrapped and so Stephen purchased the remaining lower half of the harvester.

As can be seen from the photograph opposite, the harvester needed a lot of work to bring it back to working condition. It was taken to Spratt & Co., an engineering and fabrication company in Moneyreagh, Co. Down. Here, a full-scale restoration programme was undertaken, beginning in April 2019. ➤

WORKING CLASSIC: TAARUP S 1500



Stephen purchased a second Taarup harvester as a parts donor from Tom Kirk, a nephew of Cyril Johnston, and he also obtained another top chute and spout from Francis Dickson, whose father and uncle operated a green S 1500 harvester in the late 1950s. Measurements were taken from this machine, along with the salvaged parts, to make a new chute and spout.

When the harvester arrived at Spratt's premises, the first job undertaken was to thoroughly wash the machine and assess what was needed. Jonathan Chambers and Gary Lyttle were the two men appointed by John Spratt with the task of rebuilding the Taarup harvester. They were assisted with any mechanical and hydraulic work during the rebuild by John Stewart.

First, a new chute was made from 2mm plate. At the base it is 60in wide and this then narrows to the point where it meets the top spout. The chute also required a new support 'A' frame, which gives extra strength to

the harvester whilst in operation. It also has a detachable rear inspection plate, that enables the harvester to be cleared of grass if the machine blocks during operation.

Time-consuming

This section was reasonably straightforward to reproduce in comparison to the top spout, which proved to be the most time-consuming and intricate part of the rebuild. At the joint where these parts meet, two 10mm plates were welded to both sections to create a moveable collar. This allows the top spout to swivel on the lower chute section, enabling the operator of the harvester to blow the grass into the trailer where required.

A new linkage control rod and top spring-loaded discharge flap were also built. The flap is operated with a chain within the control rod. The rod sits in a finger-style housing in front of the harvester, which sets the spout position in a fixed setting determined by the operator. Early Taarup S 1500

harvesters were also available with a wire cable linkage to move the chute and top spout, but these were prone to seizing up when the harvester was in winter storage.

The next item to be overhauled was the lower section of the harvester, which houses the rotor and flail assembly. First, the harvester was dismantled into its individual components. This included the main frame, drawbar, parking stand, axle legs, ratchet height adjuster, hubs and wheels.

Every serviceable item was sent away for shot blasting and it is a testament to the way this early Taarup harvester was built and the quality of the steel produced at the time, that after shot blasting very little structural repairs were needed to return these components to working order.

One item that was replaced was the adjustable front stone guard, which after a lifetime of work was too badly bent and worn to repair. This guard

is a very important safety device on the harvester, as it stops stones and debris being catapulted forward from the rotating flails. A new hinge was also fitted, that allows the guard to be adjusted so that the harvester can lift swards of mowed grass or different fodder crops, such as kale.

After being shot blasted and sprayed, the rotor received new securing pins that hold the flails in place. These were made in the Spratt workshop in Moneyreagh. New bushes and flails, from D A Forgie, were also fitted to the rotor, consisting of two rows of eight flails and a further two rows of seven, giving a total of 30.

Two new outer rotor bearings were also fitted, attached to the lower housing. Two adjustable Hardox cutting edges were fitted to the lower flail housing, which determines the chop length and the blow of the harvester.

The gearbox of the harvester was checked and new seals were fitted and new gearbox oil added. Bearing in mind that the gearbox is 60 years old and has done many hours hard work, it was in first-class order. Four new drive belts and a duplex chain and sprockets, along with a new power take-off shaft with over-run facility,

completed the drive train on the harvester.

New drive belt and PTO guards (which had been missing) were also fitted. The freed-up ratchet adjuster, which alters the height at which the harvester cuts, was also re-attached to the main frame. Also refitted was the parking stand that the harvester sits on when not in use.

New bolts for the axle legs, complete with new hub bearings, studs and nuts were fitted and the positioning of the wheel track on the harvester was also set. Both adjustable axle legs were set to a point on the main frame that would give the best possible weight distribution when towing a silage trailer.

A single-acting spool-operated automatic trailer hitch was also fitted to the main frame. This type of arrangement was deemed to be a stronger, safer and easier-to-use unit than the original skid and slide hitch that was fitted to the harvester.

A new set of tubes and tyres from JB Tyres of Tobermore were fitted to the refurbished wheel rims and a wheel scraper bracket was fitted to the outside wheel of the harvester. Two new lower skid plates were attached to the bottom of the harvester too.

Problematic

The two most problematic areas in the restoration were the green colour scheme and the cow's head logo. Both proved difficult to replicate, especially trying to get the exact shade of green produced in the late '50s and early '60s, and the cow's head logo, nicely reproduced by Sign Lines, is different to that used on the red harvesters.

Both were replicated as closely as possible to the originals, with the paint supplied by Coach Finish and the Taarup lettering and other decals reasonably straightforward to replicate for Machinery Decals. A number of brass plates were also reproduced by Vintage Brass Plates and fitted to the harvester. This completed the rebuild of the harvester in late August 2020.

Of significant help during the rebuild was a parts and workshop manual for the harvester, which Stephen obtained via the internet. A further point to note is that Taarup harvesters were very well painted and this rebuilt machine is no different. Three primer and four finishing coats were applied.

The plan was to finish the project in time for this year's Border Counties Vintage Grassmen event. ➤

WORKING CLASSIC: TAARUP S 1500



Unfortunately, this was cancelled due to Covid-19 and it also resulted in a longer time taken to complete the restoration project. As it is the 60th anniversary of this particular harvester, Stephen was keen to get it operational this year.

He organised a shakedown test for the harvester to take place close to Spratt & Co.'s premises on the McDowell's farm, near Castlereagh. The newly-restored Ford 6X 5000 and Taarup forage harvester were taken to the farm to cut grass that is zero grazed for dairy cows. For the first time in more than 50 years, the refurbished harvester cut a load of silage and it performed perfectly.

To test the harvester further, Stephen organised a silage-cutting day in early September on the Bailey's farm in Greyabbey, Co. Down. This was the final cut of silage on their farm for the year and they kindly provided Stephen with the opportunity to really test the harvester out in a full sward of grass.

Two period silage trailers were used on the day to draw away from the harvester, complete with Stephen's 1963 Fordson New Performance Super Major. The harvester performed extremely well and I have no doubt that it operated every bit as good as the day it was built at the Taarup

factory in Denmark. The team at Spratt & Co. had done a first-class job.

I was given the opportunity to cut a load of silage on the day. Back in 1960, this top-of-the-range Taarup harvester was one of the ultimate and most up-to-date machines available at the time. Both the tractor and harvester were a joy to operate and you feel really connected to the whole process when operating it.

The Ford 5000 provided ample power for the machine and the S 1500 shaved the grass off cleanly, with the chop length short for a single-chop machine and great blowing power to fill the silage trailer. At the end of the day, the harvester even lifted a 10ft sward of mowed grass.

I was delighted for Stephen Crawford as he has put a lot of time, money and effort into restoring both the harvester and the Ford 6X 5000 and they performed perfectly. As previously noted, the Ward family (original owners of the harvester) had used a Ford 6X 5000 tractor to power the harvester in the 1960s and it was fitting that history was repeating itself more than 50 years later.

Stephen would like to thank the team at Spratt & Co. for their hard work, especially John Spratt who took a great interest in the restoration project and was invaluable with

advice and supply of parts for the Taarup S 1500.

A big thank you must also go to Stephen's partner Val, who helped select the final colour for the harvester and also helped with the design of the cow's head logo and decals for the harvester. Many people helped Stephen throughout the restoration project and he is grateful to them all.

To complete this silage outfit,
Stephen needs a trailer! An auto-drop
trailer is currently being constructed
at Spratt & Co. and, all being well,
Stephen hopes to take the Ford 5000,
Taarup harvester and auto-drop
silage trailer to the Border Counties
Vintage Grassmen event in 2021 .

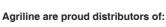

Ted Everett's brand-new podcasts on YouTube

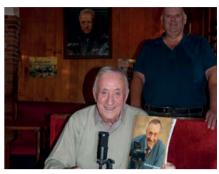

BKT's treatment centre

A contactless Covid-19 treatment centre and E-ICU unit, built by BKT at its plant in Bhuj, India, is already operational. The centre, which joins the secondary medical assistance services that already exist on the site, employs a doctor and eight healthcare operators and will be responsible for treating workers and their families affected by Covid-19.

Built in just three weeks, the unit has the most advanced medical technology, equipped with remote patient monitoring, data analytics on diagnostics and medicine management, high-flow oxygen machines, remote consultations using augmented reality, data availability across the globe for e-consults through Cloud monitoring systems and an AI-enabled X-ray imaging system, providing best-in-class care at the BKT facility.

It is one of the first contactless E-ICU, Covid-19 treatment structures to be built outside of a hospital environment in India, designed by a team of doctors, engineers and IT experts with the specific aim of preventing and minimising the risk of virus spread.

Improving the safety of tractor-trailer braking

The Agricultural Engineers
Association (AEA) published an
updated edition of the Look Behind
You guide to tractor-trailer braking
on Friday 13 November. The guide
is aimed at farmers, tractor drivers,
mechanics and technicians – indeed
anyone using, purchasing or
maintaining tractors and trailers.

It seeks to raise user awareness of what is needed from tractor-trailer braking systems, in order to obtain good performance and also to comply with legal requirements. It will also help users to make informed purchasing decisions and to recognise shortfalls in the braking systems of their current vehicles.

Safety is a perennial issue for farming. That applies as much to the use of farm vehicles on the road as it does on farm. A key concern which comes up time and again is the safety of tractor-trailer or tractor-trailed implement combinations. 10 years ago, prompted by a spate of premature tractor brake failures linked to inadequate trailer brakes, the AEA published the first edition of the *Look Behind You quide*.

Since then, much has changed. Tractors, trailers and trailed implements are bigger, more tractors can now reach 50kph (30mph) and pneumatic (air) trailer braking systems are more common. Certain UK Legislation has changed and new EU Braking Regulations for agricultural vehicles have arrived.

As well as bringing the content up to date, the advance of media technology has allowed new features to be built into the new *Look Behind You*. The online version of the guide includes a number of videos introducing the key topics and animations to help users to get an advanced understanding of some of the most important concepts.

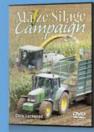

Convention defied

Although ploughing is not as fashionable as it once was, good reversible ploughs are still popular with enthusiasts and those that believe they still have a place in today's farming landscape. We take a brief look at the history of the concept and what you should consider if purchasing one.

t is easy to believe that conventional ploughs paved the way for the reversible counterparts, but a look back through the history books will reveal that it isn't necessarily that straightforward.

Well-known implement maker Ransomes Sims & Jefferies Ltd. (RSJ), for example, was making single-furrow, balance-type ploughs for horses and cable-drawn balance ploughs for steam engines in the 1800s – well before tractors were even thought of.

With the introduction of internal combustion power to mainstream farming, it's fair to say that conventional ploughs still ruled the roost in the early days, but reversible ploughs never went away – adaptations of horse-drawn reversibles were suited to drawbar coupling and the time saved in marking out lands, finishing off and

eliminating ridges and open furrows was an obvious benefit.

The other advantages of reversible ploughs became ever more apparent with the introduction of the threepoint linkage. With the tractor doing the bulk of the work, less muscle was required to turn the plough and less time was taken doing it.

Obvious early examples of mounted reversible are the Ferguson 'butterfly' single-furrow model and David Brown's slightly more elaborate design. The DB model mounted left- and righthanded bodies on the same cross shaft and the mouldboards were

put into work alternately by means of a wire rope running round a pulley mounted on the tractor.

The Ferguson, which made its debut in the early '50s, had a chain-operated reversing mechanism connected to a bracket on the back of the tractor. The mechanism was automatically loaded and operated when the lower links were raised and lowered at the headland.

Neither was perfect and although the Ferguson plough was ahead of the competition, there was an obvious drawback. If it became necessary to raise the implement to clear a blockage, the opposite-handed body was automatically put into its working position as the reversing mechanism was loaded by lifting the plough on the linkage!

RSJ was also prolific with its reversible models at the time – the single-furrow TS 51 with UDM digger bodies being an example. Both this and the two-furrow TS 50 were reversed by a hand lever attached to the tractor's rear axle and, according to sales literature, required little or no effort to operate because the plough was so well balanced that it almost turned under its own weight. Some would beg to differ!



IMPLEMENTS: REVERSIBLE PLOUGHS

Others included the Bonnel single- and two-furrow reversibles. designed in France and built under licence in Norfolk, and the Melotte models - built in Belgium and sold by Melotte Sales Co. Ltd. of Grantham. Lincolnshire.

Assisted turns

Until this point, mechanical trip mechanisms were the bread and butter of reversible plough design, but by the latter half of the 1950s hydraulic turnover was emerging as the best method of reversing such a plough. Depending on the weight of the plough and the mechanism used to turn it, operation could prove 'violent' and affect the tractor, so a smooth transition from right-handed to left-handed ploughing was a welcome addition.

RSJ introduced the single-furrow TS 1015 and two-furrow TS 1016 for the Dexta in 1957, with both incorporating a double-acting ram for turning the plough. Massey Ferguson wasn't far behind with its two-furrow 797 model, once again using doubleacting hydraulics to reverse the bodies.

MF's system was slightly more complex, with the ram operating a toothed rack inside the headstock that meshed with a gear to rotate the plough through 180 degrees. Operation was smooth, but perhaps unnecessarily complicated given that other manufacturers were achieving similar success simply by using an external cylinder.



Come the '60s and an influx of other manufacturers joined the fray, with the likes of French manufacturer Huard, in particular, enjoying success in Britain through a licencing agreement with Salopian-Kenneth Hudson (SKH) and 'badge engineering' arrangements with International Harvester and Massey Ferguson to name but two.

Other European implement builders to gain a foothold on the British market included Lemken, imported by Colchester Tillage, Viaud (marketed

by Bamfords) and the Bonnel models sold by Bomford.

By the 1960s it was clear that reversible ploughs were here to stay, but conventional ploughs would not fall completely out of favour for some time. Those that ran crawlers, which in the main were solely equipped with a drawbar, continued to run trailed, conventional ploughs - but tool carriers were an option for those with larger tracklayers.

There was also an argument that the reversible ploughs on the market did not turn enough furrows to be an economic load for the more powerful wheeled tractors that were being sold in increasing numbers.

With one or two exceptions, reversible ploughs were two- or threefurrow models, but conventional ploughs were being sold by with five furrows in mounted form and with six or more furrows in semi-mounted form. Only the largest, most expensive tractors could lift a reversible plough with more than three-furrows, so why spend so much money when your 66hp IH 634 could pull a five-furrow conventional plough with relative ease?

The conventional right-handed plough was still very much a part of the farming scene, but it was evident

that mounted and semi-mounted reversible ploughs were here to stay by the late 1960s.

Still tripping

Ransomes Sims & Jefferies' conventional ploughs had set the benchmark and not to be outdone in the reversible class, the company continued to introduce new models - complementing the Ford 6X range of tractors nicely. These included the single-furrow TS 80, two-furrow TS 82, lightweight three-furrow TS 83 and the heavier three-furrow TS 84. This last plough, designed with the Ford 5000 in mind, was introduced in 1964 and had large under-beam and point-to-point clearances, and could turn furrows up to 14in wide and 12in

A hand-operated trip mechanism was still prevalent on all of the RSJ models, but the company was not alone in shying away from making hydraulic turnover a standard feature for the '60s. Massey Ferguson's twoand three-furrow 85 model had a chain and coil spring mechanism in the headstock to reverse it at the headland, while the British Demblon reversible ploughs had a mechanical turnover mechanism in the headstock and spring-loaded break-back units attached to the frame.

Another prominent company, a name synonymous with ploughs today, that gained ground in the British reversible market during the 1960s was Kverneland. The

Norwegian manufacturer had a marketing agreement with Bamfords of Uttoxeter from the middle of the decade and the models soon became popular for their design, build quality and options.

Throughout the 1970s the Kverneland name appeared on more and more farms across the UK, but it did not have it all its own way. Other European manufacturers were keen to have a slice of the pie, with the likes of Krone, Rumptstad, Skjold (imported by Falcon Agricultural Machinery Ltd. of Staffordshire) all selling reversibles in Britain throughout the 1970s.

Not to be outdone, Warwickshire farmer Roger Dowdeswell had been hard at work designing a suitable three-point linkage for reversible ploughing with a crawler. The

result, a swinging design for his Track-Marshall, was sold to Turner Engineering and subsequently appeared on other tracklayers, such as the IH BTD-8.

Not content with his efforts. Dowdeswell built a reversible plough for his patented crawler linkage, called the DP1, that took the top prize in the new machinery awards at the 1970 Royal Show. It was fully mounted and offset so that the crawler could run on the land and the swinging linkage kept the implement in line with the crawler without any adverse effects from the slewing action of the steering mechanism.

The depth wheel also served as a transport wheel and remained upright while the double-acting ram reversed the plough. The plough was available as a three-furrow or a four-furrow model that could be converted to five furrows easily and one of the main appeals was the use of Ransomes bodies, discs and skimmers.

Subsequent models were produced, giving the British manufacturer a substantial portion of the reversible market and a fighting chance against the established names from the Continent.

Today's market

As those on the front line of agriculture will appreciate, fashions change and with the adoption of minimum tillage (min-till) and no-till farming methods by many, in a bid to reduce fuel usage, compaction, and improve soil health, ploughing was no longer in vogue unless absolutely necessary for crop establishment.

IMPLEMENTS: REVERSIBLE PLOUGHS



A reluctance by farmers to buy new ploughs in the volumes that the 1970s and '80s had enjoyed means that there is an abundance of models for enthusiasts to choose from today – ideally suited to the classic and modern classic tractors that are currently prized by enthusiasts.

The early, single- and two-furrow ploughs sold by David Brown, Ferguson and Ransomes Sims & Jefferies make the perfect accompaniment for the first tractors equipped with a three-point linkage, while the two- and smaller three-furrow reversibles marketed in the 1960s and '70s by the likes of British Demblon, Huard (including IH and MF) and Ransomes Sims & Jefferies make a good pairing for the DB Selectamatic range, Ford 6X and 6Y ranges, MF 100 and 500 Series and IH World Wide Series, to name but a few.

Those with a penchant for the modern classics of the 1980s, such as the Case IH 85 and 94 Series, John Deere 40 Series, MF 600 Series and even Ford's Series TW tractors have plenty to choose from. This was, perhaps, the golden era of reversible ploughs and there really is something to suit all tractors and budgets.

As well as the private advertisements and *Tractor Mart's* classifieds, the companies selling classic reversible ploughs include S R Haylock of Cambridgeshire, Oakfields of Hertfordshire and specialist Westlake Plough Parts of Cambridgeshire. Those looking for larger reversibles for high-horsepower classic tractors are catered for by J Brock & Sons of Essex.

When looking for a plough to suit your tractor, do your research. It's nice to have an implement that's from the same era as the tractor that's pulling it. Look at literature from the time to see what the common pairings were and don't be tempted to buy a plough that's too big for the tractor –

as it might not pull it and it might not lift it!

As time went on it was common for reversible ploughs to be offered in configurations that could be easily adapted to suit different tractors and different conditions. For example, it is common to see four-furrow reversibles advertised – as this was a popular size, but is it just a four-furrow? Is it a 3+1 or even a 2+1+1? Or can another furrow be added to make it a five-furrow model?

This 'modular' approach was popular and can make one plough suitable for more than one tractor. For example, the Krone Mustang 2+1+1 would suit a 30-50hp tractor in two-furrow form, a 50-70hp model in three-furrow guise and a 70-80hp tractor in full, four-furrow mode.

Purchasing literature can make choosing the make and model of plough a straightforward decision, but also do your homework on spares availability. If the wearing parts are thin, can you buy replacements? If there is a lack of wearing metal available, some ploughs can accept other manufacturers' parts, or be adapted to do so, but it's advisable to check this with a specialist like Westlake Plough Parts.

Common sense will tell you if the plough has been looked after, but be sure to check for bent and/or cracked beams and legs, in addition to poor wearing parts, as well as the integrity of the headstock and any hydraulic components present.

If in doubt, take someone with you when viewing a prospective purchase as this can save a lot of time and money further down the line!

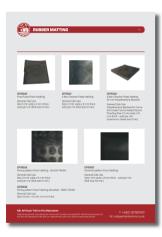

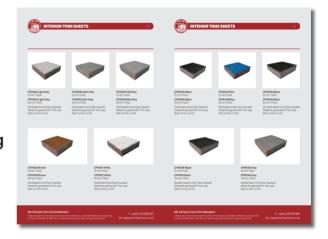

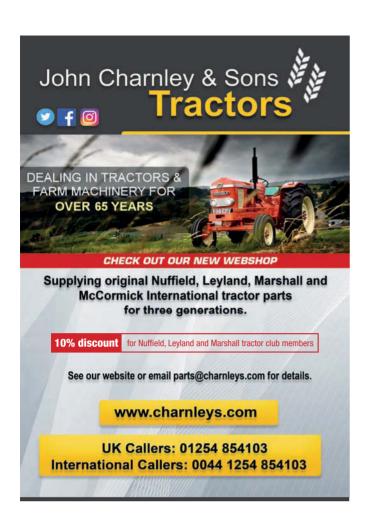

Super Synchro

Leyland tractors do not enjoy the best of reputations, but it's not all bad. The Synchro range, introduced in 1978, was just the boost the company needed and proved a popular choice with farmers.



evland tractors may have been simple in terms of their specification and design, but this reflected in their reliability and, in turn, helped them to enjoy a loyal following. The 1970s, however, saw tractor manufacturers up their game and with increasing competition from cheaper, imported models, Leyland knew it had to pull something out of the bag to stay in contention.

Its designs were dated, but the introduction of the 98 Series engine early in the decade had a positive effect on Leyland's reputation and if it could update the transmission that was a hangover from the Nuffield days then it would have a range that could take the fight to the opposition.

International Harvester had introduced a synchromesh gearbox at the beginning of the 1970s, to great acclaim, and Leyland realised that it would need to follow suit in order to make its tractor range fit for the market. The major problem was an obvious lack of investment and the company's engineers had to work hard to make a synchromesh system work with the parts and tooling available.

The result, given the minimal budget, was nothing short of

astounding and after extensive field trials and further development, the Synchro range was launched at an event in Torquay in March 1978. The 'red stripe Synchro' decals were the most obvious visual difference, but more was to come - with the fourwheel drive 462 and 472 launched a few months later at the Royal Show. Leyland had pulled it out of the bag!

Over the next few pages we'll look at the range in general, with a particular focus on the popular model, and tell you what you can expect if you think one of these tractors will represent a sound investment.

Engine

The Leyland Synchro range boasted impressive engines with great low-down pulling power. The Perkins unit fitted to the 245 needs no introduction as it is the same unit as fitted to the Massey Ferguson 135. With a maximum torque of 128lb/ft generated at 1,300rpm, it's a gutsy three-cylinder motor that won the 245 many fans – for its performance and reliability.

The other models featured here – the 262/462 and 272/472 – both used the Leyland 4/98 engine, with four cylinders and a bore dimension of 98mm. The smaller tractor used a derated version of the 4/98, known as the 'DT', while larger model used the normal 'NT' engine. The later 282/482 models, not featured here, used the turbocharged 'TT' engine.

Rated at 62bhp, the 262/462 produces 165lb/ft of torque, while the 72bhp 272/472 produces 190lb/ft of torque. Both of these Leyland engines push maximum torque out at a lowly 1,200rpm.

Access to the engine is good, with the top of the bonnet hinged and the side grille panels retained by springs, making them easy to remove. As a general rule, don't expect any major problems from either the Perkins or Leyland engines. In terms of the 4/98, don't be put off by an oily appearance, as this can usually be attributed to the rocker cover gasket. The oil feed pipe to the rocker cover can also split, so it's worth checking this too.

In addition, pay attention to the water pump and radiator. Rectifying leaking components, although not particularly costly, can be time consuming.

Transmission

Drive from the engine is transmitted through an independent, dual-plate clutch of 11-inch diameter and you should take particular notice of its operation, as overhauling it is done through the top of the bell housing - not a particularly straightforward process.

The synchromesh gearbox provides nine forward and three reverse gears, which are selected using two sidemounted levers. The range lever, on the left, permits changes between the three constant-mesh ranges, while the right-hand lever has three synchromesh forward gears and reverse. One of the major benefits of the gear layout is that first is opposite reverse, providing the operator with a useful 'shuttle'.

Synchro was a vast improvement over the outgoing 10-speed gearbox and can handle more power than the 4/98 is able to supply, so don't expect any reliability issues. If the gear levers are loose/sloppy, selectors can be changed to improve it.

Top speed on the 245 is around 25kph, while the Leyland-engined models can reach 30kph.

Steering & brakes

The 'A' frame stabiliser-type front axle was rather antiquated in its appearance, but the system works! Be sure to check the ball joints and main pivot pin for wear.

If you're looking for a four-wheel drive tractor, the 462 and 472 won't disappoint. These tractors use a central propellor shaft from a drop box to transmit drive to the spiral bevel crown wheel and pinion differential housed in the Carraro axle. From there, universally-jointed shafts send the power to the hubs, incorporating epicyclic final drive.

The turning radius of both the two- and four-wheel drive models is decent at 12ft (3.66m) and 15ft 2in (4.62m) respectively and the hydrostatic power steering is a far cry from the manual steering of the Nuffields of old!

Effective brakes were not one of Leyland's strong points and this >

is definitely one of the weakest points of the Synchro range. The hydraulically-actuated dry discs provide just enough stopping power and will require adjustment to get them operating at their best. As this area is often neglected by owners, it is advisable to budget for an overhaul. You can expect to pay around £25 for a lining kit and around £75 for an actuator.

One of the quirks of the braking system is a three-pedal arrangement that will probably irritate those of you that are used to a traditional, two-pedal layout. There are two pedals (one for each side) and a third (above) that joins the other two together. It can be flipped up out of the way, but it can be considered a nuisance.

You may view a tractor and find that this third pedal has been shortened or, in some cases, removed altogether.

Hydraulics & PTO

Powered by a gear-type pump located in the transmission, the hydraulic system has a capacity of 6.65gpm (30.2 litres per minute) at 2,250rpm.

The system enables a lift capacity of 3,750lb (1,700kg) on the 245 and 4,000lb (1,814kg) on the Leyland-engined models. By way of comparison, the 63hp Massey Ferguson 565 has a lift capacity of 3,400lb (1,542kg), measured at the end of the lower links.

The category I/II linkage on the 245 and category II heavy-duty linkage on the larger models is controlled by a quadrant with facility for position and draft control and an auxiliary valve. The top linksensed system works well.

An independent, 540rpm power take-off is standard across the range and is operated by a hand/ foot clutch lever, which was dated at the time and feels more so today. The 245 produces 36hp at the PTO at 1,813erpm, the 262/462 emits 48 PTO horsepower and the 272/472 produces 56hp at the PTO.

Operator area

The introduction of Levland's Victor-built, rubber-mounted 'Q' cab was a vast improvement over its predecessor. With the use of cladding and rubber floor mats, as well as the improvements brought about by the use of the synchromesh gearbox, noise levels were reduced to 86dB(A).

Creature comforts include tinted glass, a heater, two-speed wipers, interior light, rear-view mirror and a rear opening window. The ravages of time will mean that you should expect to find signs of corrosion around the doors and glass, as well as possible damage to door latches, hinges and the steps. A slam latch will set you back around £20, while a handle costs around £30.

If it's still fitted, you should expect to find a well-padded KAB suspension seat – but the vinyl is susceptible to cracking and once this has succumbed to the wear and tear of day-to-day life you will find that the foam innards will rapidly disappear.

Although the Synchro range's ergonomics are an improvement over the tractors that came before, you >

will still have to straddle the transmission – there's no flat floor here! The side-mounted gear levers do help, and for a tractor of this age it's an acceptable driving position.

The dash panel provides an array of analogue gauges and these shouldn't cause too many problems.

Aesthetics

A tractor's appearance is always a cause for serious debate, but there is little doubt that the two-tone blue and silver of the Leyland is striking and there's an argument that suggests the dark blue skid unit is also more forgiving when it comes to dirt and grease, too.

The bonnet makes access to the engine easy and there's something 'friendly' and 'reassuring' about the look of it. It may not be as modern as some of its rivals, but the bonnet suits the colour scheme and works well with the cab.

Summary

The Synchro range was one of the best groups of tractors Leyland produced, with the 272 as the best seller. Although the design was further improved with the introduction of the Explorer cab and under the Marshall banner, the original Synchro range represents a reassuring and good value purchase, with few known problems.

Something old, something new

e've managed to get our hands on some of the latest releases from our good friends at Britains, in the popular 1:32 scale, and we're sure you'll like them!

Firstly, it's the John Deere 6120M - in the tried-and-tested formula of construction that we've come to know and love. The finish is good and, at around £25, it's cheaper than some of Britains' other tractors. We're still not keen on the 'three-point' linkage, as

although it's robust it also prevents tight turns with a trailed implement.

Up next it's a 'rusty' JCB 3C MkIII from Britains' 'At Work' series. Like the midi excavator from the same range, that we reviewed a few issues back, we were disappointed with this one as the 'weathered' finish is poor - not very realistic. The build quality is better than the midi excavator, but overall we thought the model could have been finished better. You can expect to pay around £29 for this one.

Finally, a variation on another model that we've reviewed - the Kane tri-axle trailer, but this time in vellow low-loader form, rather than the blue bale trailer. With ramps that are retained by a small pin, it's a little fiddly - but small fingers will find it much easier to operate! Priced at around £25, it's a significant investment for any hobby farm - but a must for realism!

Force field

Gary Hawkins finds out about Ian Linch's latest project.



Supplied by Haynes, a company that had branches at Appledore and Maidstone, Ian Linch's 1973 Ford 3000 was originally fitted with a cab.

an Linch has a great track record as an excellent ploughman, enjoying tremendous success along the way, but besides his passion for turning a furrow he has always managed to find restoration projects to occupy his spare time when it's not match ploughing season.

These are not just show tractors though, as Ian is not afraid to get them dirty – they are part of his match-winning formula. Over the years, Ford models have been his main focus, but there have been other notable examples – including an IH B-414 (see *T&M* September 2015).

Ian's love affair with tractors began in the 1970s, when he worked on farms using Massey Ferguson 35s and 165s, before moving on to a Ford 7600 – now one of his favourite models. He never had the opportunity to drive a Ford 3000, but after several years owning examples of the company's smaller models he had a particular urge to add this one to his collection.

"I came across the tractor on a farm in Chart Sutton, near Maidstone, where I used to do some occasional lorry-driving work," Ian explained. "It usually stood in the corner of the yard, and I would often watch it come and go, but it always looked abandoned and sorry for itself. That's when I suddenly felt the need to do something!

"Tractors like this seem to call out to me, like an abandoned dog! Suddenly I was hooked on this tractor and each time I saw it, it seemed to be calling out to me for help! The tractor was brought new by the farm, so it was still with its original owner before I bought it. It was a mixed farm of fruit, hops and

arable, and the tractor was used for all sorts of jobs. In its latter years the tractor stood in a hop field with a pallet on the roof of its cab, to help workers reach to string the hop gardens!"

A calling

As many of you will appreciate, setting your heart on something can be a risky business and Ian found this to be the case with this 1973 Ford 3000. "Like all the tractors I have restored, I got a sensitive feeling for it," he said. "Plus, I was thinking ahead about what my next project would be.

"I already had a couple of jobs waiting in the pipeline, but every time I saw this tractor it kept calling out to me! Call me mad, or what, but I knew I had to buy it, so I put in an offer to the farmer. Sadly, the farmer declined it, but I never gave up hope!

"Then, one day, the tractor had gone! I was devasted. Little did I know that it wasn't needed any more and it had been abandoned once again in a field somewhere. Then, after about 18 months, it reappeared! I put in my offer to buy it again and this time it was accepted!"

Ian had hinted that the tractor was in a poor state, but was it one of those projects that he wished he had never started and did he encounter any problems along the way?

"I had a fair bit of knowledge of the Ford 3000, in particular the porous block problem, but I wasn't put off," he said. "I was aware that this tractor had a new short engine installed at some point in its life – as the block was still in its original red oxide paint with the cast 'crisscross' pattern on the side. The rest

of the tractor is much the same as the Super Dexta, which I'm more familiar with. Apart from a few overall improvements, different tin work and a more modern dashboard. it is very similar to the Super Dexta.

"The strip down and rebuild was quite straightforward. The cylinder head had to be completely overhauled by Modus Engine Services, because new ones are not available. Like most rebuilds, a lot of the time was taken up with the tin work.

"The nose cone, as always, was very badly damaged and needed a lot of time spent on it. I try and keep most of the original tin work if I can.





The only parts that badly needed replacing were the fenders and the seat."

A point to note is that any imperfections in the tinwork will be emphasised once the paint goes on, so it pays to get it right. Many parts can be filled and sanded before being painted, but areas of excessive rust will need replacing – either by cutting and welding or replacing the item entirely. Ian chose to use Jawel two-pack paint for this project.

"The front axle was overhauled, and all bearings and seals were replaced where needed with items from Simply Bearings and Haynes respectively. Having stripped the engine down, new big end shells and main bearing shells were fitted, along with the thrust washers.



"One thing that stood out to me more than anything was there was that there was very little wear and tear on the engine liners - all they needed was a simple de-glaze and hone. The pistons and rings measured up okay to the specifications and all other tolerances were within the guidelines. The hydraulics were all okay too."

Sound advice

Anyone thinking of buying a tractor for the first time should be cautious in their approach, as it can prove to be a costly affair. If you're considering a purchase with a view to completing a full 'nut and bolt' rebuild, then it's evidently going to be an expensive project, but if >

As a match winner, Ian knows a thing or two about what makes a good ploughing tractor. He says that the Ford Force 3000 has all of the right credentials.

your budget is fixed then there's more to consider. I asked Ian for his advice.

"In the grand scheme of things, I was lucky, and although I had known of the tractor for many years, I let my heart rule my head when deciding to purchase the tractor. My advice would be, when buying one, is to try and find out as much background history on it as possible. Find out what work has already been done to it.

"If this information is not available, then you will need to be careful, because you could end up spending a lot more money on a project than you think! You will need plenty of time on your hands and a decent workspace too!"

Ian is an old hand at projects like this and armed with the parts he required from Agriline Products Ltd. and Southern Counties Tractor Spares, the Ford Force 3000 proved to be a relatively straightforward project.

"What I like about the 3000 is the simplicity of its construction, and having removed its cab it gives you all-round visibility, which is perfect for when I'm competing in ploughing competitions," he told me. "It also

has a minimal amount of nuts, bolts and other connections, which allows for easy and faster splitting. This makes jobs such as replacing the clutch, if need be, a lot easier and quicker.

"The only thing I don't like about the 3000 is the seat that's on this specific model. You just can't seem to get it in the right position to be comfortable. Also, it can be harder work without power steering!"

From his comments I assumed that his New Performance Super Dexta will be retired to make way for the 3000, but I considered it wise to check – on the proviso that if I was lucky one or the other might be for

"Personally, I believe that the 3000 is going to be a good tractor for ploughing competitions because it has great all-round visibility," he explained. "I would definitely recommend the 3000 for ploughing matches with a Ransomes TS 59 or TS 86 two-furrow plough. Ransomes originally designed the two- and three-furrow ploughs to go with the early Fordson and Ford tractors, so they make a good pairing. Another plus for ploughing matches is that the 3000 is also not too big to tow on a trailer.

"Having said that, should the right buyer come along, I would be happy to look at selling her, just as I have done with my other tractor projects. It would be sad to just keep it in storage. It looks as good as it did when it came off the production line, so I would like to see the tractor working again in the field, rather than stuck in storage and not being used. It would be ideal for ploughing, but it would make a great model for road runs too."

Ian has, as always, done a firstclass job with the tractor, with considerable time and budget required to get it looking as good as it would have done when it left the production line at Basildon. Personally, I have always loved the Ford Force models' style, which I believe looks every bit as modern now as it did when it was launched.

Whatever the future holds for this tractor, it's reassuring to know that it will be good to go for another 40 or 50 years!

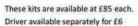

he Massey Ferguson 500
Series, launched in the mid
1970s, was born largely
out of necessity – with
forthcoming legislation dictating
that a new range of tractors was
required to meet the stringent
cab noise level at the driver's ear,
together with enhanced rollover
protection.

Introduced earlier, the Frenchbuilt MF 595 provided clues as to what the rest of the range would look like – with two-tone colour scheme and single-door cab. It was the cab that was the most unfamiliar aspect of these new models, as most other elements could be classed as evolutionary rather than revolutionary.

The 595, powered by the Perkins A4.318, was rated at 88hp (DIN), but with tractors producing as little as

45hp still commonplace on farms across the globe, Massey Ferguson knew that its new range had to be all encompassing. Below the 595 were the 75hp (DIN) A4.248-powered 590, 66hp (DIN) A4.236-powered 575 and 60hp (DIN) 565, and the subject of this feature – the 47hp (DIN) AD3.152S-powered 550 – the sole three-cylinder model in the range.

"The new regulations required a cab that was insulated from engine and transmission noise, such that the operator could no longer be in a 'sit astride' position," Chris Clack explained. "This necessitated a near flat floor cab design. The range also included the now corporate MF 'hard nose' front grille, which would soon be standard across worldwide tractor production and feature as the marketing image on much of the launch and publicity material."

The evolutionary nature of the 500 Series becomes clear when you consider the MF lineage. The company had already enhanced the top-selling 100 Series with the 'Super-Spec' or '8' line tractors as they were known internally.

The MF 148 was the forerunner to the MF 550 and was, in crude terms, a 135 with a six-inch spacer in the transmission to lengthen the wheelbase and give better stability with heavy implements, as well as increased oil capacity.

"The spacer also provided the facility for a centre-drive front axle," Chris continued. "But the 550 model was specified as two-wheel drive only. Improvements also included power steering, longer lower and top links to suit 32-inch rear wheels, together with independent PTO operation. ▶

NEW FOR THE '70s: MF 550



"Engineering design changes had enhanced this tractor range in its reliability stature. For the MF 500 Series, and in particular the MF 550 model, these changes were carried through to the new range. The 550 had just a slight hump in the floor, but with the fuel tank now below the cab, this enabled a lower cab height for an enhanced centre of gravity as well as the ability to be used in traditional, low farm buildings."

The new cab, produced for MF in the UK by GKN Sankey, allowed the incorporation of hydrostatic power steering, with no mechanical linkage from the steering box, integrated hydraulic spool valve options and a fully glazed cab with soft, sound-deadening internal cladding, a heater and filtered air provision from built-in fan motors.

Another boon afforded by the longer wheelbase allowed the operator's seat to be positioned ahead of the rear axle, thus affording a more comfortable ride, and the pendant pedals offered better access and an improved operator environment.

Launch

Chris was heavily involved with preparing the 550 for launch and told *T&M*: "As with the three-cylinder MF 135 tractor, at factory launch in the 1960s, the MF 550 was to be the

last model put into production – a few months after its sister models. To meet all photography, marketing, homologation, service manual and parts book publication deadlines, pre-production tractors are

required many months prior to full manufacture.

"At the same time it is necessary to have a dedicated 'Launch Committee' to oversee all these aspects and monitor critical timing. I was part of that committee and the one key issue was the provision of an MF 550 tractor to enable all of the above criteria. It was decided, at one early meeting, that the factory would have to build a tractor for us, even though it would be the only MF 550 model for the next six months!

"Fortunately, Harry Hebden, the then Managing Director, was an

ex-tank commander in WW2 and a real motivator of a workforce! In his often unannounced forays into the factory, the shop floor production workers worshipped him, as his easy, but frank, demeanour did not convey any animosity towards them.

"Harry and I took it upon ourselves to seek out the factory foreman responsible for assembly of preproduction tractors. It was explained that we needed a 550 built pretty quickly and we asked if he could he do this for us.

"Fortunately, sufficient engineering data existed for the factory to

make a 'hand built', off-line tractor. Forthcoming factory changes required a production line with a newly-excavated, below ground facility to assist cab build etc., and this major, costly construction work was due at the next factory holiday."

The result of Chris and Harry's friendly discussion with the foreman was the Massey Ferguson 550 that was seen in many publicity photographs and company marketing material, as well as the operator's instruction book etc. It was the only one available to meet all of these demands, but was not confined to >

NEW FOR THE '70s: MF 550

"The first 550 was also used, having travelled overland with other models, at the Massey Ferguson UK dealer launch event near Marbella, Spain, in late 1975," said Chris. "When being loaded for its return journey, the driver misjudged the loading ramps and it fell between them. Fortunately, without incurring any real damage, it was manhandled back into a safe position by the MF staff on hand, otherwise much of the next phase of launch material would have been impossible!

"Needless to say, I only found out about this as they all departed for the airport to travel home – my journey back being the long drive north to the ferry at Bilbao in the company Land Rover!"

Following its launch, the 550 appeared in two further guises — with a two-tone, two-door cab and red (with silver roof), two-door cab. Production lasted from 1976 until 1982, by which point less than 6,400 examples had been built at Banner Lane in all forms. This was the smallest amount of the five 500

Series models built in Coventry, with approximately 9,100 MF 565s built, less than 6,700 MF 575s and around 7,300 MF 590s.

Banner Lane also built the MF 560 – a Perkins AD4.203-powered model, rated at 56PS (DIN), with 7.50-16 fronts and either 14.9/13-28 or 16.9/14-28 rears. This was produced for some mainland European markets and it's worth noting that not all 500 Series tractors sold in Britain were produced in Coventry.

The Beauvais plant produced two- and four-wheel drive models and amongst the tractors with a driven front axle that were ordered by UK farmers, some two-wheel drive models also made it across the Channel – largely due to strike action at Banner Lane in 1976 and '77.

Today, the Massey Ferguson 550 does not get the recognition that it perhaps deserves. The drum brakes may have let it down in comparison to the oil-cooled, five-plate discs that its larger siblings were equipped with, but there was a definite need for a sub-50hp tractor at the time and the MF 550 filled that gap admirably.

Stalwarts collide

In this series we compare two popular tractors in a bid to see how they measure up. The models featured in this issue are arguably two of the most well-liked models of their generation - the International 885XL and John Deere 2140.

ooking back, it's not difficult to imagine how the tractors that set the standard in the 1980s have become the models that enthusiasts treasure today. They may have been common, but they were common because they were good - they would not have been bought in vast quantities had they not offered an impressive list of features and work rate at an attractive price.

The first half of the 1980s was, in many ways, a transition period from two- to four-wheel drive and the models that we are comparing here were available in both configurations to suit the needs of buyers throughout

Europe. Both should be considered as evolutionary, rather than revolutionary, but that's no bad thing - much of their technology was tried and tested and this was considered a plus point for many of those that purchased one.

IH's first 885XLs were built in 1981 and could trace their lineage back to the World Wide Series models of 1970. The skid unit and panels were finished in red, with off-white for the wheels and cab roof and a point to note is that it is the XL version of the 885 that we will be comparing here.

Deere introduced the SG2 cab at the same time, so it is fitting that we look at this version of the 2140, which had

been on sale since 1980. The familiar green and yellow livery transitioned nicely from the Sekura-cabbed predecessor to the 'new' tractor and set the tone for what would follow until the early part of the 1990s.

Power

As always, we'll start with the engine. Both use four-cylinder motors, but the IH is naturally aspirated and the Deere is turbocharged.

Built in France, the 4239TL02 is a John Deere-built unit that relies on turbocharging to produce its power output of 82hp (DIN). It is essentially a turbocharged version of the four-pot unit used in the 1640, 2040 and 2040S - with a 106.5mm bore, 110mm stroke and displacement of 3,920cc.

The maximum torque of 270Nm is generated at 1,600rpm, which is the same engine speed that the 885XL generates its torque output of 285Nm

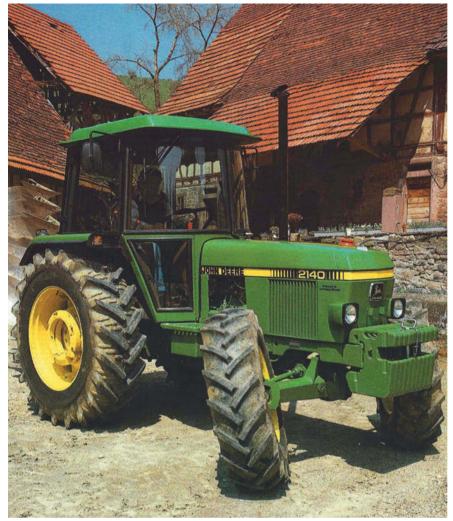
The 885XL uses a German-built IH D-268 engine - a naturallyaspirated unit with a 100mm bore and 140mm stroke - 472cc larger than the 2140's engine. Despite some owners retrofitting turbochargers to the D-268 and later models using a turbocharged version of the engine, like the 985 Turbo Special, 995 and 4240, the D-268 seems to suit natural aspiration.

Both engines are reliable and a pleasure to operate, but we feel that the 885XL has the edge. Although the power output is identical, the D-268 has a better maximum torque and a greater ability to 'hang on' when the revs are pulled down.

T&M VERDICT: IH 885XL

Transmission & axles

As previously stated, both tractors could be purchased in two- and four-wheel drive configuration, but

it's more common to see the 2140 in the latter guise these days. The IH and JD two-wheel drive variants have a turning radius of 3.810mm and 3,800mm respectively (without brakes), while the four-wheel drive tractors require a radius of 4,400mm and 4,200mm respectively (without brakes), so the 2140 is marginally more agile.

The turning radius is an interesting point, as although the four-wheel drive Deere can turn in a slightly smaller space, we were expecting a more noticeable difference – due to the 2140's centre-drive front axle and the 12-degree caster angle, making the wheels lean and achieve a 50-degree steering angle. Evidently the 885XL's side-drive ZF unit is not as restrictive as we first thought!

The gearbox is perhaps the most noticeable difference of the two tractors. Synchromesh was standard on both, but the 2140's consolemounted levers make for a more enjoyable operating experience. Despite the 885XL's logical 'H' pattern shift, we're not huge fans of the lefthand mounted levers.

Both tractors have an eight forward, four reverse transmission as standard, with a 16 forward, eight reverse option (Torque Amplifier on the IH and Power Synchron Hi-Lo on the Deere), but the International system has gained a reputation for being weak, leading to failure. Some tractors may have even been fitted with a TA eliminator kit.

A clutch-less change is a handy option and not to be overlooked, but if transport speed is important to you, it's worth bearing in mind that the two-wheel drive 885XL with TA is the quickest at 20.58mph. The standard two-wheel drive and both four-wheel drive 885XLs top out at 16mph. The

Deere can hit 18.2mph on 16.9-34

For its ergonomic properties, in terms of both clutched and clutch-less change, we like the 2140.

T&M VERDICT: JD 2140

Power take-off

Both tractors feature a two-speed power take-off as standard, but the 885XL uses a dual-shaft system that you can find on the '74 Series' tractors that were launched in the early '70s, rather than an interchangeable stub shaft - as used on the 2140. Power output at the shaft, at rated engine speed, is similar at 74hp for the Deere and 72hp for the IH.

Independent operation of the PTO is standard on the two tractors, with a hydraulic, multi-plate clutch allowing 'feathering' and preventing 'shock loading' of the system.

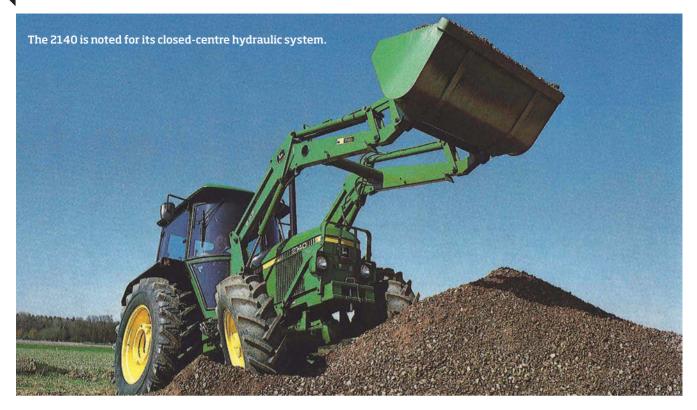
With little to choose between them in terms of performance, the subject of practicality comes into play. Not having to change the power take-off shaft to switch between 540rpm and 1,000rpm operation is an obvious plus point, so we're awarding the win in this section to the International.

T&M VERDICT: IH 885XL

It's top link sensing versus lower link sensing in this category and fans of each marque will argue the point for both systems. Lower link-sensed draft control, John Deere claimed at the time, gains more uniform results from mounted tillage implements, but IH counteracted the claim by suggesting that its torsion bar system was highly sensitive and could send draft changes at rate of up to three per second!

It also claimed that alongside more control was better weight transference and greater reliability in comparison to spring-type sensing devices.

The Deere is famous for its closedcentre hydraulic system with a variable-displacement, multi-piston pump good for 10.3gpm and a working pressure of 2.466psi, while the IH uses a transmission-mounted pump, driven by the iPTO gear, with an output of 11 gallons per minute and working pressure of 2,500psi.

Maximum lift capacity is similar for both the IH and JD at 5,250lb and 5,620lb respectively, but the 885XL uses an assistor ram to achieve this.

Up to three spools could be fitted to both tractors and with output similar, it really is personal preference. Little things like the 885XL's colour-coded

spools and telescoping lower links (an option on TA tractors) make a difference, but we like the closedcentre, lower link-sensed system on the Deere.

T&M VERDICT: JD 2140

Cab

This is where things get really interesting, as there are few cabs that divide opinion as much as the SG2. Designed and built by John Deere, the SG2 was a revolutionary design with a curved windscreen to deflect dust and noise away from the operator,

whilst the panoramic view aided visibility.

With the curve comes a rather unorthodox method of entry and exit and although this isn't to everyone's taste, the SG2 is a nice place to spend the working day once you're seated. It may not be the largest cab on the market, but it's quiet and the controls are well laid out.

The XL, a joint venture between IH and Porsche, is let down by its visibility to the side, thanks to chunky 'B' pillars and the lack of glazing in the lower portion of the doors, but it's still a great cab. It's not as quiet as the SG2, but it's roomier and easier to get in and out of.

Controls are logical on the XL, but the left-hand gear shift is disappointing after using the SG2's console-mounted levers. Pedals, switchgear and levers are all typical of the era in both tractors and reassuring to use, but the Deere's adjustable steering column is a definite bonus.

In terms of ventilation, the XL scores highly for its natural ventilation, but the option of air conditioning on the SG2 is a plus point. Tinted glass is standard on both cabs.

Those that have grown up with John Deere tractors will not see what the fuss is about, but those operating an SG2 after a tractor with a 'conventional' cab will need time to adjust to the Deere.

Despite the fact that many XLs are suffering from serious corrosion, we like the 'Control Centre' – perhaps the only structure of its kind to be designed around the strongest natural shape known to man - the egg!

T&M VERDICT: IH885XL

Styling

As has become customary, let's use our catchphrase to open this section - beauty is in the eye of the beholder! This element of a comparison tends to divide opinion more than any other and as it's square-cut versus curves in this case, the choice is even harder.

Your preference may well depend on your age, but imagine them both in the same livery and it may be easier

to make a decision! The curvaceous looks of the Deere have certainly stood the test of time well and although the IH is still a good-looking machine, it does look rather dated in comparison.

T&M VERDICT: JD 2140

Final thoughts

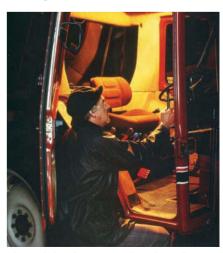
These models proved to be extremely popular for their respective manufacturers and would pave the way for other, equally as successful models - if not more so. The 885XL metamorphosised into the Case IH era and the 95 Series and 4200 Series, while the 2140 essentially found a new life badged as the 2650 - the turbocharged understudy to the magnificent 2850.

The IH World Wide Design was considered by some to be a little long in the tooth by the time it ended up with a right-hand gear change in the 4200 Series, but it was a proven design and one that still has immense popularity today. Parts are plentiful and prices are reasonable - although

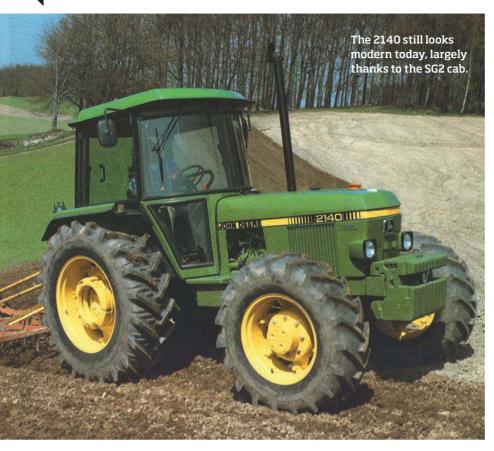
you will have to pay a premium for a smart, original example.

Unfortunately, these are getting harder to find - particularly as corrosion has been the XL's biggest enemy. Find a good one though and it will have the 'kerb appeal' of a prized classic car when you take it to a show!

Equally, good examples of the 2140 are becoming harder to find although time has been kinder to >

it in terms of corrosion. It too is well respected and reliable, and finding parts is not a chore. Buying one won't break the bank either - but it still makes sense to buy the best one you can afford.

With three categories apiece it's come to a stalemate. Choosing one is very difficult and there really is very little in it as far as the T&M team is concerned – but rather than sit on the fence, we're going to plump for the Deere.

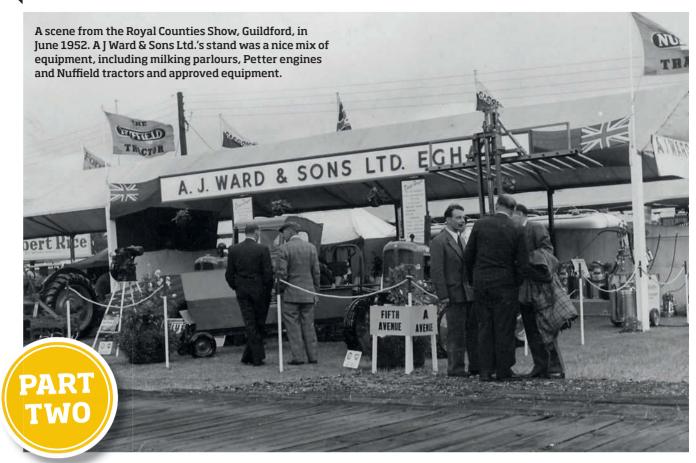

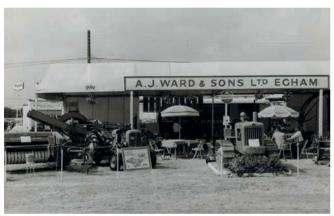

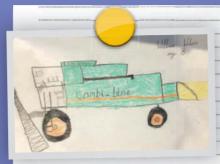

SL: The most obvious point to note is your tractor's serial number, as it dictates that it cannot be a factory-built model. Narrow B-414s run from serial number 501 to 696 and were built in 1965 and '66. I suspect that yours was converted by a dealer or specialist, possibly in France. Production of standard B-414s started in 1961 at serial number 501 and concluded at serial number 53258 in 1966. Yours is a 1962 model.

SEAT CUSHIONS

Dear T&M,

I have just read the article in the November 2020 issue on the Nuffield V8s. I noticed the deluxe seat fitted to the 4/65 appears to have had new cushions fitted. I have the same seat on a 4/65 that I am restoring, but I am struggling to find any new cushions.

Would it be possible for you to find out who supplied the new cushions, please? I really enjoyed the article and the tractor looks superb.

B-23 MOWER

Dear T&M,

I read with great interest the letter from Geoff Hackett regarding the IH B-23 mower and its great abilities. I used this mower extensively during the mid-to-late 1960s and can testify to its strong build qualities and safety features.

Even so, there were occasions when the crop was just too much to cope with and I well remember a totally wind-flattened 11-acre late crop of Italian rye grass that I could only cut by driving into the grass as laid towards the mower and running back blind. The swath board did a good job of throwing the cut grass away from the uncut side, but in doing so created a heavy, deep swath and I used the time running back to flatten it down with the tractor wheels.

Very heavy and high swathes had a tendency to get into the PTO shaft and round the drive pulley. Later models had a steel plate fitted at the mower front that would eliminate this problem. Even so, I was pleased when this work was replaced and undertaken by the newly-purchased Taarup flail machine. It didn't matter which way grass was laid, or thick in the bottom, you could just go!

I am lucky enough to have a fully restored B-23 mower, which I like to rally and play with by cutting along the fen dyke tops by my home.

The November 2020 issue is again a good read. I particularly like the feature on IH cultivator equipment. Well done!

Range-topping Titan

In part one of this feature, Mike Gormley, a former area sales manager with County Commercial Cars Ltd., marked the 40th anniversary of the 1884 with a look at the inception of the iconic model. With the help of owners and former colleagues he concludes with recollections of how the tractor fared overseas.



orty years ago, in December 1980, County Commercial Cars Ltd. introduced the 1884 at the Royal Smithfield Show at Earls Court in London. So short were the timescales to get this 1884 to launch at the show. there was only a simple black and white leaflet using a picture of the 'Texas tractor' (see part one in the December 2020 issue) and there was no mention in the annual

County News publication that was distributed every year at the show.

It took time in those days to have such publications produced. The first colour brochure followed with a picture of the 1884 during early field trials and still on the pressed steel wheels. The 1884 was the largest and most powerful tractor that County had ever produced and, as such, it had pride of place at the apex of the County stand.

The 1884 sat proudly at the pinnacle of a very well-established range of Countys. The top of a very distinguished and incredibly varied family tree that stretched far below it with more different branches than one could imagine. Dating back to 1929, County Commercial Cars Ltd. had developed an extraordinary array of products, from trucks to tanks and then on to tracked and wheeled tractors.

ANNIVERSARY: COUNTY 1884



This sounds relatively simple, but the innovation and variations in the designs of all of these was impressive to say the least. This relatively small British company had designed, developed, and then produced a remarkable line-up of products that was finding its way right across the globe.

So, in December 1980, the first 1884 was launched to take its part in this County heritage. Little did anyone realise that this tractor was to remain the pinnacle of the County marque. It would never be surpassed. This was the end of 1980 and by early 1983 County Commercial Cars Ltd. was to be put into receivership by its bank.

So, the County 1884 had just 27 months under true County ownership. The 1884 was to become an icon of not only the heritage of County tractors but, to a great extent, of tractors in general. It was later to be used as the 'signature' tractor in a book of tractors heading the 'New Technology' section. This was Richard Mason's immaculate example, seemingly the 17th 1884 built by County.

The 1884 looked right, looked powerful and had a stance that made it look like it was leaning into the work it was doing. It did not disappoint. When the 1884 moved out of the lights and glamour of the

1980 Smithfield Show and into the real world and that shiny paintwork became covered in mud and dust, the 1884 showed what it could do. Now, 40 years on, it is still doing it.

Expensive

However, it was not all a bed of roses for the 1884. At its introduction it was deemed to be too expensive.

Notes from the pre-Smithfield sales meeting show that the sales team had reservations about its cost,

which they thought would make it difficult to sell. At launch it was a pricey £29,850.

As it transpired, the 1884's performance justified its significant price tag and those end users that had the need for such an impressive machine started to place orders. This process really gained its momentum at the Doe Show in Essex during February 1981, where the 1884 was put to work in classic County territory.

At this point nobody could imagine that at this very show just two years later, the County employees got the news that the company had been put into administration and were to pack up and go home! The team was, in the end, told to stay to the end of the show, but that was really it for County Commercial Cars Ltd. Records from 1981 show that just two 1884s were built. Probably mostly due to the fact that the cab was only signed off towards the end of September that year.

As all of this was going on in the UK, I was looking after County's interest in Southern Africa, so missed all of the initial excitement of that first Smithfield Show. I had been living in South Africa since the beginning of 1980 and communications were very different then – phone calls, telex and post.

We were also very busy trying to cope with the rapidly escalating demand for County products in Southern Africa, in contrast to most of the rest of the world at that time. So much of the excitement around the 1884 really passed us by.

There was, however, a real interest in the big Countys. We were already busy with the 1464 and eventually we got our first 1884s - one for South Africa and one for Zimbabwe in kit form

The records I have from the time show a study I made of this power class and sales in 1982 for South Africa were 90 over all margues, so in a growing market County should have looked to a reasonable portion of this market

With the rebirth of Zimbabwe gaining momentum, and the groundwork done with the introduction of the 1464, end users both in agriculture and industry were looking for more power. So, the 1884 was causing significant interest.

Strong interest

I still have some of the reports I wrote up following various notable visits during the '80s, both after the launch of the 1884 and during my time based in South Africa. These make for both interesting and somewhat frustrating reading. I was very busy in Zimbabwe in those days and after the launch of the 1464 there was strong interest in something more powerful, namely the 1884.

As far as records show, only one 1884 kit was shipped from County and that was on 16 February 1982. Serial number CFTK 47F 47871 was destined for Zimbabwe, which seems to be the fourth 1884 according to known records. It seems a further six may have been built in this year.

Among the list of County tractors that were on the various shopping lists, a number of 1884s were planned for. Both the major sugar estates, Hippo Valley and Triangle, were very quick onto the 1464 following our initial launch demo and were soon after something more powerful. They had the 1884 firmly in their sights.

There were various private estates showing serious intentions of applying for import licences and funding and Duly, the Ford dealer/ importer, had a demo 1884 on its list. Somehow, I think it would have struggled to keep it for long had it ever got it, such was the need and enthusiasm for this tractor!

From South Africa I went out to visit Ford Australia in October 1982 to discuss the 'relaunch' of County in the country following a lull in their overall market. Top of the list were the 1884 and 1474 with a special plan to reduce costs by shipping component parts in more cost-efficient ways and leaving off items such as tyres and other items that could be sourced locally, also reducing shipping weight and 'cube'. Quite a common way of doing things really, but it required thought.

There were some very clever folk about in those days involved in packing tractor Semi (SK) and Complete Knocked Down (CKD) kits. They were very good at getting a quart into a pint pot! By this time the Ford TW range was coming complete from Antwerp, so already saved a fair amount of the logistic

It was planned for an appropriate skid unit to be sent from Ford Antwerp direct to Fleet and then an SKD 1884 across the world to Australia for final assembly at Ford in Melbourne. Sadly, we never got to implement this. A lot of work wasted, as well as disappointed customers! ➤

ANNIVERSARY: COUNTY 1884



If only those Receivers would have taken the trouble to ask and look at what potential was out there for County, it might/should have been a very different story I would be composing here. For sure a lot more County 1884s (and of course other models) would have been built and would have been used in their many ways to help produce food and work in industry around the globe.

Elite club

Available records, in 2020, tell us that just 26 County 1884s were built and just one kit supplied to Zimbabwe and assembled onto a TW-30 by Duly. This was in 1982, which seems to be the year most were built, with a good number in 1984. Fortunately, a large proportion of these few are still in existence and some in extremely good health – looking great in very good hands and well set to keep the 1884 alive and well for many years to come.

In recent years the '1884 Club' has become quite a select one. Perhaps likened to one of those found in the West End of London! Perhaps a little bit secretive and definitely exclusive. Even the total number built is not a known fact.

Production was, of course, initially by County Commercial Cars Ltd. and then moved on to David Gittins when he bought the company, along with three that were in stock, and then finally to the Benson Heating group of companies, where the final ones were built with Super-Q cabs.

Since then it is believed a number have been made up from kits of

parts and donor TW-30s and this route to the 1884 is still, apparently, open. The majority are still scattered around the UK and Ireland but move around a bit as they occasionally change hands. Some are 'like new' and some still wear their working clothes, but mostly these days are well cared for.

It is believed that a few lurk behind the closed doors of barns, hopefully one day to re-emerge to join the club. A number of course were exported in the true County tradition, typically around 75 per cent of production.

One at least has made it to the other side of the planet and now resides in New Zealand. This is a very hard-worked 1884, but is now on course to a more easy-going life and one where it will be looked after

and given the TLC it deserves by the owner, David Howey.

Some are known to have made it across the English Channel, and some back! One now resides in Belgium with Jimmy Moors and his dad, Jean Moors, and is fitted with some very significant 30.5x32 tyres – which makes it look pretty good!

Ouite a few have made their way across the Irish Sea and are now residing in the Emerald Isle. No less than seven were in a proud line-up, along with a bunch of 1474s and a lot of other Countys spanning the ages, at The Irish County Tractor Club's commemorative exhibition in January 2020. So even in these days of restricted travel, some of the 1884s are quietly moving about.

From those June days in Texas in 1980, through the later quite turbulent times of the County marque, the 1884 has emerged an icon and now 40 years later is revered by both County enthusiasts as well as those with a more general interest in tractors.

Thanks to Jim Fisher (1884 Register), Richard Mason, Andy Taylor, Jean and Jimmy Moors and David Howey (County owners), Bruce 'Gubbs' Giddings (ex-Ford Tractors) and former County employees Chris Burrell, Bruce Keech, Paul Osbourne and Nigel Taylor for their valued help in sorting out some of the finer details.

Pin replacement

PART ONE

In the first part of a short series, Andrew Hall begins stripping his Massey Ferguson 35 to replace the worn linkage mounting pins.



Although much work has been done to my 1960 Massey Ferguson 35, wear on the link arm support pins means the axle housings have to come off to undertake the task.

y 1960 Massey Ferguson 35 is no stranger to *T&M*, and regular readers may recall me replacing the damaged engine block a few years ago. Since that time the tractor has been used for ploughing matches, road runs and plenty of paddock topping and haymaking duties. More recently it featured when we checked the cylinder head torque settings to prevent any head gasket failures.

Worn linkage pins

Despite going through the tractor well when first purchased, including the engine, clutch, hydraulic system and rebuilding the front axle, some jobs have been left alone, one of these being the replacement of the linkage support pins. Two years ago my son was driving to a ploughing match when the right-hand link arm snapped,

leaving him stranded on the road with a plough attached.

At the time we replaced the broken link arm with a good, little-used replacement, but this highlighted the need to change the worn pins either side of the differential housing. This requires the axle housing trumpets to be removed to access the nuts on the inner ends of each pin, so now I have taken the bull by the horns and made a start.

Draining the oil

One of the first tasks was to drain the transmission oil. This had been changed when we first worked on the tractor. One method I use to deal with the large quantity of oil is to attach an open pipe to the external services coupling and feed the pipe into a suitable container, then operate the hydraulics to discharge the oil. This

doesn't fully purge the rear end, but eliminates the need to have a larger, unmanageable container under the tractor.

Wheel removal

With the oil drained, wheel removal was the next target, but for safety I decided to work on one side at a time, starting with the right-hand side. The tractor needed to be supported centrally, as the axle housings were to come off. In addition to an axle stand to secure the outer end of the axle, I employed some stout wooden blocks under the differential housing, as they could be left in place once the axle housing came away, chocks under the front wheels to prevent any unwanted forward movement, and axle wedges to prevent rotational movement.

Access to the rear mudguard fixings was made easier with the wheel



Replacement link arm

A replacement link arm, with very little wear, highlighted the need to replace the well-worn support pins.



New parts

Previously-fitted new parts include the check chains and a replacement top link. The PTO guard is an original Massey Ferguson one.



Out with the oil

An open-ended hydraulic hose was attached to the external services coupling and the tractor run up to remove the old oil.



Further purging

Not all the oil can be pumped out, so the final purging was achieved by draining in the usual manner. Note the watery emulsion, due to condensation!



Mudguard bolts

The mudguard-to-footplate bolts were soaked in WD-40 before attempting to slacken them, as the mudguards have to come off.

off. Some WD-40 was used on the mudguard-to-footplate bolts to ease them free, and the main 5% in-diameter mudguard bolts slackened with no trouble, as they were replaced when we initially worked on the tractor.

Whilst the mudguards are off the tractor I'll do some local welding repairs to them, as the long-term intention is to repaint the whole tractor.

Brake drum

Next was the brake drum. The brake adjuster was backed off by inserting a screwdriver through the back plate and pulling backwards. The drum offered no resistance, the reason becoming obvious when it came free.

The inner oil seal of the axle had failed and allowed oil to contaminate the brake linings, leaving a greasy mess in the brake drum.

This accounted for my son complaining about the low brake efficiency when he drove it on a road run and nearly collided with me when I stopped suddenly! We purchased a new set of brake linings and will take the opportunity to fit them whilst the brake drums are removed from the tractor

As for the failed seals. I have ordered a pair from Agriline Products (tel: 01527 579111, agrilineproducts.com) and at the time of writing await their arrival. The inner seals are easier to fit than the outer bearing seals, as the

outer ones need the bearing and collar to be removed to allow them to be fitted.

Half shafts

Before the axle trumpet housings could be removed, the half shafts needed to come out. It isn't absolutely necessary, but makes life easier by lightening the load when lifting the housing. Early 35s only had six nuts and studs securing the half shafts to the axle housings, but this was increased to twelve on later machines. which is what mine has.

The 11/16-inch AF nuts were removed with four of the twelve studs coming out with them, which is quite common, but on reassembly I will remove ➤

WORKSHOP: MF 35



Main bolts

These are %in-diameter and were replaced when the tractor was worked on a few years ago.



Link arms to remove

Life will be much easier with the link arms and drop arms removed from the tractor and the cross-shaft tied up clear of the rear axle housings.



Wheel removed

Access to the rear mudguard bolts is easier with the rear wheel removed, which has to come off for the task anyway.



Mudguard off

The mudguard is now removed from the tractor and will receive some local welding repairs before being refitted.



Brake drum

After removing the two countersunkheaded screws and backing off the adjustment, the brake drum slid off very easily – due to the presence of oil!

the nuts from the studs and refit the studs before fitting the half shafts. There were five shims fitted between the brake back plate and the axle housing, all of which will be reused.

Trumpet housing

After ensuring all the old oil was drained from the transmission housing, the nuts securing the trumpet housing to the centre housing were removed – making sure that the housing was supported adequately as the last of the nuts came away, to prevent it falling and getting damaged.

With the half shaft removed the housing was light enough to support manually, but if there had been any doubt I would have used my engine

crane to support it. As it came away and was lowered down, the paper gasket inevitably tore, but when I ordered the new pins from Agriline I ordered new gaskets too, as these are quite large and would require a very large sheet of gasket paper from which to make them.

Trumpet housing removal enabled me to inspect the crown wheel and pinion, which is something one cannot do very often. The tractor was very tidy for its age and had been on one farm from new, having led a sedate life amongst sheep. It had carried a loader, which had put some strain on the front axle, which was addressed with our initial work a few years ago.

Apart from a short innings on a

dairy yard scraper until we acquired it, the tractor had always been regularly serviced. It has, however, done more than 8,000 hours, so I was pleasantly surprised to find the components of the rear axle in good order, so no worries here!

Transmission oil

As previously stated, the transmission oil had been changed when we rebuilt the tractor, but when it was drained it was very emulsified, resembling cream. The rear-end oil should be changed annually to reduce the chances of emulsification, but it isn't a cheap option to do this, which results in many tractors having transmission oil of a creamy consistency.



Half shaft

Next was the half shaft, which is released by removing the twelve $1\frac{1}{16}$ AF nuts, allowing the shaft to be withdrawn.



Loose studs

Quite often loose studs will come out with the nuts, as in this case. The nuts will be removed separately and the studs refitted before the nuts go back on.



All good

The condition of the half shaft and bearing is good, so can be refitted without any particular attention.



Shim pack

There are five shims of varying thickness, which are located between the brake back plate and the axle casing. They are also good and will be refitted too!



Failed seal

This is the failed seal, which allowed oil to leak onto the brakes. This will be replaced, along with the opposite side.



Differential unit

Removal of the axle housing revealed the crown wheel and pinion, which on first inspection looks to be good, with no broken teeth.



Wet brakes

Wet brakes, but not for the right reason! The oily linings will have to be replaced with new ones.



Ready to fit

The contaminated shoes and linings will be de-greased and the rivets drilled out to remove the linings, before riveting these new ones in place.

I use a good quality oil of 10W-30 grade in the transmission of my 35s, as this allows the hydraulics to respond well and offers adequate lubrication to the gearbox and rear axle.

Tools used

Despite having to remove the rear axle housing to replace the pins, I didn't

need any special tools to complete the task, and the following tools were more than adequate:

Hydraulic bottle jack
Support blocks
Axle stands
AF socket set
AF spanner set
Larger flat-bladed screwdriver

Combination pliers Copper/Hyde mallet Open-ended hydraulic hose Waste oil container

Part two of this series will cover the linkage pin change, oil seals change and the re-riveting of new brake linings onto the existing shoes.

780 rescue

Progress is made with the most challenging part of this restoration, as Andrew Hall completes most of the work on the bonnet.





ork on the bonnet began in the previous issue, with a repair made to the left-hand side above the area of the side panel, which had rusted completely off. A coat of red oxide was applied to the repair to prevent any fresh rust until the rest of the bonnet could be repaired.

Side panel

The next step was to attack the rust in the side panel, which ran along the top and bottom edges. Availability of bonnet parts seems a little sketchy currently, but as with most of my restorations I like to retain originality as much as possible, so the left-hand panel was marked out to enable it to be cut back to clean metal and let in repair sections.

The rear and lower edges of the panel are folded back on themselves, which I believe is known as a Dutch fold. Fortunately, the rear edge wasn't rusty so I was able to retain the fold all the way down, but the repair section required a fold to be formed along the lower edge. The fold is just over ¼in, so is very close to the edge of the metal. I was able to partly fold in my metal folder and finish off using a suitable sheet metal hammer to obtain a flat finish.

The top edge has a 90-degree fold with a ½in return to match the lower edge of the main bonnet pressing,

which once complete will be spotwelded to the main bonnet. As stated previously, I am using MIG welding throughout the bonnet repairs, as there is minimal distortion of the surface panels, when compared with oxy-acetylene welding!

Using the special clamps between the main panel and the repair sections, each completed section was located ready for tacking in place. The clamps firmly hold the metal together and provide a suitable gap to produce a good butt weld. You can buy them from a number of outlets, including Frost Auto Restoration Techniques Ltd. (01925 648555 or www.frost.co.uk).

The steel being used is 1.6mm (16 SWG) and a setting of number three on the welder was chosen with 0.6mm-diameter welding wire. Once tacked, the welding was completed

and sanded back to provide a smooth surface.

Detail

Each side panel features a support bracket with a rubber plug that rests on the front casting of the tractor. I retained this detail by removing the bracket from the rusty piece removed and transferring it to the repaired panel. A new square support was spot welded in place before reattaching the bracket.

Some further local repairs were carried out to the upper leading edges of the side panel before offering it up to fit to the main bonnet.

Nose cone

Rust had also attacked the leading edges where the side panels meet, and this had to be addressed.

Fortunately, the nose cone isn't dented and repair sections were welded in to replace the lost metal. However, I did note that the nose cone is pressed from a lighter gauge of steel than the rest of the bonnet, and found that the metal required a lower setting on the welder to prevent the metal overheating and retreating when welded! Some care was required, but the result was satisfactory and the repairs were smoothed back to the original contour.

Chin panel

The chin panel was cleaned and prepared to accept the side panel where it joins, and the repaired side panel was lined up and clamped before spot welding it in place. I say 'spot welded', but the ½in fold was drilled at 1½in intervals and 'plug welded', which has provided a strong joint.

Further welding was done at the join between the side panel and chin panel. Some further work is required on the chin panel to finish it, but this only amounts to cutting out the centre, where it is rusty, and replacing the metal where required.

Air filter & exhaust

The tractor features an 'underbonnet' air filter intake and downswept exhaust pipe, both of which will be retained. There are two plastic plugs that seal each hole and moisture has got between the plugs and the steel, causing it to rust.

I marked out the centre lines of each hole for reference before cutting the rust out and replacing the metal. At this point I'm not sure whether I'm going to re-drill the holes and reinstate the plugs, but originality says 'yes', so I may do it before the bonnet is repainted.

Marked out

Both the top and lower edges of the rusty side panel were marked out with a pencil, ready to cut out all the rusted metal.



Clamps

Six clamps were used to secure the repair sections and obtain the correct gap for butt welding with the MIG welder.



Welding complete

After welding the panel was offered into place to ensure a good fit, after which it was ground smooth along each weld.



Base plate

A fresh base plate was made and welded into place to carry the transferred support bracket.



Repair sections

Fresh metal sections were fabricated in 1.6mm (16 SWG) steel and offered into position. Note the folds on each piece!



Tacks

Each piece was tacked in place before removing the clamps. Note that I didn't tack too close to the clamps, so as not to damage them.



Support bracket

A support bracket is attached to the removed rusty section, so it will be transferred to the repair section.



Nose cone

The metal of the nose cone is thinner gauge than the rest of the bonnet and has rusted on its leading edge where it meets the side panels.

Local repair

Both the repaired side panel and the nose cone were repaired where necessary and the original contours reinstated.



Clamped

 \dots clamped into place whilst the welding was carried out. Note the presence of the grill to ensure a consistent gap around its edge.



Air filter and exhaust holes

Both these were plugged with plastic plugs, as the tractor has an under bonnet air intake and downswept exhaust. Rust around the edges means more repairs.



Preparing to fit

The completed side panel is being prepared to fit into place and has been lined up to match the right-hand side, before being...



Nearly there

The repaired side panel has brought back the original strength to the bonnet assembly, and now there's just a couple of areas to focus upon.



New metal

Each hole was cut out and new metal welded into place. Fresh holes need to be drilled to retain originality.

Fordson Major Diesel



I have an issue with the hydraulic lift on my Diesel Major. The lift is very slow to operate when lifting heavy implements and

when the control lever is in the neutral position the link arms drop, and if transporting an implement I have to repeatedly use the lever to bring the lift arms back up again.

I thought the system was self-compensating and if the arms drop they should return to their required position automatically. Can you give me some indication of what the problem may be please? It has become a nuisance.

Link arms dropping with the lever in neutral sounds like a leaking seal on the lift piston, or a worn control valve not sealing sufficiently. It sounds like a strip and overhaul of the system, and some fresh oil is necessary.

The hydraulic system on the pre-Super Major models isn't self-compensating, as it only has a 'hold' position whilst the control lever is in the neutral position, and there is always a tendency for a heavy implement to drop whilst being transported and require the linkage to be raised, even on good systems!

If your system is slow, as you say, it may be due to a worn hydraulic pump. Whilst the top cover is removed to replace the piston seal, access to the pump will be easy, so it could well be worth investigating at the same time!

Ferguson TE-F 20

I recently bought a dieselpowered Ferguson TE-F 20 tractor as a restoration project. I didn't pay much for it, as the engine is in dire need of reconditioning. I am aware that most of the parts required for a rebuild are readily available, but one problem I have is that the cylinder block is cracked due to frost damage. It is damaged on the right-hand side beneath the manifolds, in the vicinity of the core plugs, which I thought were there to allow for expansion and blow out if frozen hard.

My dilemma is whether to have the block repaired and rebuild it, or whether to seek an undamaged replacement. I do want to restore the tractor to a high standard, and show it once the project has been completed!

Arthur Jones, via e-mail

Firstly I'd like to clear a myth about the presence of core plugs, which you mentioned. Although they often blow out, as you say, when frozen hard, the real purpose of their presence is part of the sand casting process when manufactured.

The hollow water jackets that form part of a cylinder block need a core to be made when constructing the mould to form the hollow casting. Cores have to be supported during the casting process, and the rods that do this are secured to the outer part of the mould.

After the casting has been poured and cooled, the core is washed out and the blocks machined and core



plugs are fitted to blank off the block!

As far as your block goes, it depends how badly damaged it is. It may be able to be welded or metal stitched if not too bad, but if you want to restore to a high show standard, a good used block would probably be better.



Broken stud removal

Whilst I was working on my tractor I had the misfortune to shear a couple of studs when removing some parts. The diameter of the studs is 7/16in and they have broken off just below the surface.

Can you provide any tips for the successful removal of the broken pieces, please? I'd like to get them out without causing any damage to the surrounding area.

Breakage of studs or bolts is always a nuisance and can add much time to a task in an attempt to remove them. Although one's heart sinks when it occurs, all is not lost and with a bit of patience, in most cases they can be extracted.

There are several ways to attack the situation! Firstly, if the stud isn't broken too far below the surface you can place an old nut on the surface. Then, carefully, using a MIG welder aimed on the end of the stud through the centre of the nut, it can be built up and fuse the stud to the nut. The

resulting heat will help to ease the stud out, which can be turned using a suitable spanner on the flats of the nut.

If the stud is too deeply sheared, or too small in diameter, then an alternative is to centre punch the end of the stud and drill it out. If you know the thread type and size you can use a drill that matches the tapping size of the thread, but you must be central with your centre punch, or the drill may wander into the surround area!

The other method is to drill and use easy-out extractors, which come in a set of varying sizes and have a left-hand thread on them. One danger with these is that they are hardened and are very brittle, and prone to snapping off if forced too much. This exacerbates the problem inasmuch as the broken easy-out is too hard to be drilled

If the stud or bolt is snapped above the surface then it can be gripped with a suitable stud extractor, but the application of heat to the stud may also assist in successful removal!

Massey Ferguson 35

After many hours of use I decided to treat my Massey Ferguson 35 to a long-overdue service. New fuel filter elements were used and during the fuel bleeding process I managed to snap off one of the fuel bleed nipples on the fuel injection pump, which ended with a leak through the middle of the bleeder.

Firstly, can replacement bleed nipples be obtained without buying a complete service kit for the pump and, secondly, how can I remove the broken piece of nipple from the pump cover? Do I need to remove the cover, or do you think I can achieve it with the cover in place? M Armstrong, via e-mail

Broken bleed nipples aren't uncommon during the bleeding procedure, particularly if they have been over-tightened previously. They are quite hard and often shear where the thread joins the main body. The good news is that they are available as a separate part, and can be replaced without removing the pump cover.

Careful use of an 'easy-out' stud extractor in the centre hole should do the trick, and when ordering new nipples it's a good idea to replace the copper washers too, as unwanted leaks from old, agehardened or distorted washers are a nuisance. To obtain new bleed nipples and sealing washers individually you may need to consult your local Massey Ferguson dealer, or you can try any of the aftermarket parts suppliers.



Mower overhaul

Andrew Hall's winter project takes the form of a Massey Ferguson 732 finger mower. He brings us the details.



ntil the late 1960s, agricultural mowers had changed little since the days of the horsedrawn type. The cutting mechanism followed the same principle of a reciprocating knife using a scissor action against rigid fingers, or guides as Massey Ferguson called them.

Early mowers were trailed machines and the advent of hydraulic lifts and the three-point linkage brought us mounted versions, which were more manoeuvrable and easier to transport. When the advantages of disc and drum mowers were realised, the conventional knife mower soon lost favour, as disc and drum mowers were faster and required less maintenance!

MF 732

One such mounted example was the MF 732, which was available with either a five-foot or six-foot cutting width. I have owned mine for more than 20 years and in that time it has seen little use. I remember using it around nine years ago, when I had my Continental-powered Ferguson TE-20, and since then it became a donor of fingers for my Massey Ferguson 779 mid-mounted mower, as the fingers are of the same design.

Sitting fingerless, it has languished under a hedge since about 2014 and had become covered in brambles.



It has been my intention for some time to extract it and work on it, as I acquired another 779 mower bed, complete with usable fingers, enabling me to bring it back to life.

First task

To handle the mower easily I mounted it onto my Ferguson TE-D 20, where it could be raised and lowered as required, and one of the first tasks has been to free off and reset the break-back mechanism. This is spring-loaded and is designed to allow the mower bed to break back in the event of striking an immoveable object.

It consists of a spring-loaded catch that acts against a roller, and having sat around for many years

I dismantled it and freed off the seized roller.

Heat was required to free the central nut that secures and adjusts the spring tension, and in typical Massey Ferguson fashion it has a long coach bolt through the spring. This had corroded, due to lack of paint when manufactured, so was cleaned up and sprayed with red oxide to prevent any further corrosion, along with the cap that sits over the spring. The catch was also stiff due to lack of movement, but came good with the use of WD-40. It was then cleaned and lightly lubricated.

With this task complete I turned my attention to the driveline, which is a simple design. The PTO shaft

drives a large-diameter pulley, which in turn drives the mower crank via double vee belts.

Bent connecting rod

The crank then drives the connecting rod, which unfortunately got bent when it dropped down whilst the mower was being transported without a knife in. This mower has a steel connecting rod. but many mowers have wooden ones.

All being well I can apply some heat and straighten it to bring it back into line once again. At some time in the past somebody has fitted an adaptor into the front universal joint yoke to enable the mower to be powered by the smaller 11/8 in-diameter PTO shaft of the old TE-20 range.

My Continental-powered TE-20 still had its small PTO shaft when I used it on the mower, so this wasn't an issue at the time, but soon after I converted the tractor to the larger more convenient 1%in-diameter shaft - and then sold the tractor on! My other TE-D 20 has also been converted, so I'm going to have to remove the adaptor, which looks as if it's going to be fun, as whoever did it didn't intend it to be removed!

Balance spring

One item that is missing, and was removed before I owned the mower, is the balance spring and its bracket. It looks as if I'll have to make a bracket and find a suitable spring to replace the missing pieces, but if any readers have a spare spring and bracket I am definitely interested.

In the meantime I have removed the pulley guard and the anti-wrap guard that locates around the PTO shaft forward of the large pulley, and intend to slacken the belt tension to enable the pulleys and crank to be removed to inspect the bearings. The drive belt is tensioned by a push rod and lock nuts. I have been able to shift the lock nut. but the main nut is offering some resistance, so I may need to heat it a bit in order to slacken it.

Once I am happy with the driveline I will remove the fingers from the spare mower bed and prepare them to fit the 732, which will involve making all necessary adjustments to provide a clean-cutting mower.



In the undergrowth

Not having been used since 2011 and stripped of its original fingers, the mower has languished under a hedge and was covered in brambles.



Good bed

The bed is in good order and has been painted at some time many years ago, which has helped to preserve it somewhat.

PTO adaptor

The PTO shaft has a 11/sin adaptor fitted, which will have to be removed to operate on my converted Ferguson TE-D 20 and 35 models!



Instruction book

The instruction book shows the missing parts, which will need to either be made or sought from a scrap mower to complete the restoration.



Break-back mechanism

The first task is to dismantle and free of the safety break-back mechanism, which hasn't operated for many years.

Dismantled

After some heat was applied to the centre nut, the spring was removed and the mechanism moved backwards to confirm it still operates.



Stiff catch

The catch was rather stiff and soon freed off with some movement and WD-40. The surface rust on the ramp was dealt with at the same time.



Seized roller

Heat was required on the roller to free it off before stripping, cleaning and reassembling with some copper-based grease to keep it free.



Reassembled

The serviced break-back mechanism was reassembled and the spring tension reset to a reasonable level, but may require further adjustment when in the field.



PTO shaft removed

This is secured by a roll pin through the shaft and will be freed off, as the two halves are seized together.



Bent connecting rod

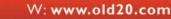

STRONG SALE IN SCOTLAND



The highest-priced lot at the sale was this Sekura-cabbed, four-wheel drive Massey Ferguson 135 at £17,800.

Pentland Livestock has been at it again, with a 994-lot collective sale concluding on Monday 23 November. Included were 28 restored tractors and a number of off-farm examples. The results were very good, but there was some last-minute bidding.

Included was a Massey Ferguson 135 that sold for a superb £11,800 (see News section for further details) and a restored, four-wheel drive 1971 Massey Ferguson 135 with Sekura cab that saw bidding finally conclude at £17,800!

At the finish of the sale, the only main item not sold was an

original-style, four-wheel drive Massey Ferguson 135 (VES 226S), without cab, that reached £8,900 - bang on its value I would have thought.

In the Ford selection the one they were all going for was a 1968 Ford 2000 (RPN 243G with V5C) - a nice tractor with a good turn of speed. It made a record £7.600.

A 1964 Fordson Dexta, with old-style grille and in grade 5 condition, was not knocked down at £3,000. A Ford 3000 (grade 5) had stopped at £5,300 by the end of the sale.

All in all Graham Burke and his team were very pleased with the results, as they should be

One would have thought that it was not the right time to sell a tractor collection and make strong prices, but Imbert May made the decision to do just that and it proved to be a wise move, as his amazing collection went under the hammer on 30-31 October.

It was not until September 2020 that Imbert, known to his friends as Bert, decided to call in H J Pugh to sell his collection of 240 tractors, based at Osborne Farm, Pocombe Bridge, near Exeter.

The only feasible date was the last week in October, as the calendar was full of other sales, and so the team decided that Friday 30 and Saturday 31 October were the days to go for. With that confirmed, all Bert had to do was get the tractors out the shed and cleaned up ready to be photographed.

This was a huge effort and in the end Bert bought a huge batch of batteries, reputed to have cost more than, £10,000, to ensure things went smoothly. Many of the tractors had not run for a while, but the majority were in running order by the time of the sale.

Osborne Farm is undulating land, and so the tractors were laid out down a hill in one large field – with lots to be sold on the Friday from the Ford, Ferguson, Massey Ferguson and David Brown stables.

The following day were the Case, Nuffield, Fowler, Fiat, Leyland, Lister, Porsche, Deutz, Oliver, Minneapolis-Moline, Allis-Chalmers, IH, and John Deere tractors, plus a few others. Bidders were instructed to maintain social distancing at all times by the auctioneers.

Imbert's fascination with tractors began when he was young, when he was brought up on his parents' tenant farm. He learned to drive on a P6-powered Fordson E27N before driving a petrol-TVO Massey Ferguson 35. He left the farm to

drive lorries and ended up with his own bulk feed truck, with a route from Lifton to Plymouth docks. Later on Bert also warehoused the feed for Dalgety.

His next move was to purchase an old papermill at Stoke Canon, that he subsequently turned into industrial units. This turned out to be yet another wise move. He sold up in 2002 and went on to other things, but in 2006 he got the bug to go back to his roots and started buying tractors and exhibiting them at various shows, including The Great Dorset Steam Fair.

The first tractor he purchased was a Massey-Harris 12/20 Pacemaker, but this was followed by a Case SC3, Nuffield M4 and a Massey Ferguson 65. As time went on Bert got really stuck in and ended up with possibly the largest collection of Allis-Chalmers tractors in the UK.

I have had the pleasure of knowing Bert May for many years and he always offered his tractors for various events that I have been involved in, and would do anything he could to help. He said: "I am now 75 and I want to take it easier and not leave all my tractors around my family's heads if anything happens to me. I have met so many interesting, kind people as I have driven around the UK on my search for the various tractors I wanted to add to the collection."

On the Friday of the sale, 11 price records were achieved and by close of play on the Saturday another seven were added to that. Most of the collection was bought at auctions and prices had to be paid, but ultimately Bert didn't lose out.

He recognised a good investment and this was illustrated by the fact that he paid £50,500 for a 1968 Doe 130 (no. D669) at the Rodney Cowle sale, just down the road from him at Winkleigh, on Saturday 4 May 2019. On the Friday of his sale he went on to create a new record for this type of tractor at £76,000!

There were other massive records, like the County 1184TW (no. 48777) with 400 hours on the clock – at £71,000. This was the 'sister' to the example that Malcolm Beaton sold for £54,000 just two weeks before. Bert's was in much better condition in my opinion.

Another thumping record was £21,500 for a 1964 Roadless New Performance Major that I wrote in my programme was in grade 4 condition. It made £21,500! On top of that was the £41,000 paid for a County

Super-4 754 with Select-O-Speed transmission (no. 20392). This is a rare County!

If that wasn't enough, when it came to Massey Fergusons, a 1976 MF 188 Multi-Power (no. 3666606), registered LJL 287P with just 2,708 hours on the clock and with PAVT wheels and cab) sold for £39,000! That was £17,000 more than its pre-sale estimate.

On the David Brown front a Trackmaster 50 with a Blaw-Knox blade and matt paintwork made a good £8,000, but a grade 4.8 DB 50D made just £28,000, whereas the example sold in Northern Ireland the week before raised £36,000. This comes down to the fact that it was in better condition – it makes all the difference.

On the Saturday bidders saw a Fowler VFA (no. 4705463) in good running condition with blade and paperwork create a record at £15,400. An International Super BMD with V5C, which the original owner's family were very keen to buy, sold for a record-breaking £9,500. The following lot was an earlier example, the 94th off the line and registered TSJ 866, that reached just £2,500.

A 1967 IH 706 (no. 4111), registered BLG 786F, went to Worcestershire to be reunited with its sister (no. 4110), registered BLG 785F. The new owners found the tax disc holder under the diesel tank, which had been sprayed over in the past. They took the tax holder cover off and to their amazement two old tax discs were there, proving the registration is BLG 786F.

As expected, other IHs did well – particularly the classics which are certainly up and coming. A restored, and rare in the UK, International Harvester 4166 sold for £30,000 and a 1983 four-wheel drive IH 956XL, registered AFK 332X made £14,200. A 1455XL, LVP 89W, in similar condition changed hands at £18,000.

As for the John Deeres, they did better than they usually do, in my opinion. An original, but not particularly exciting, ex-Canada John Deere R diesel saw the hammer fall at $\mathfrak{L}6,000$ and a grade 2/3 John Deere 5010 made $\mathfrak{L}15,000$. A John Deere 4520 reached $\mathfrak{L}9,000$.

The last lot of the day was a 1951 Pattison tiller-steered roller at just £400. The event was held in a cordial atmosphere and was certainly well organised, as usual, by Howard Pugh's team.

While I was at the sale Bert asked me what the tractors were I would like to take home and it had to be the two Massey

HARVEST FALL SALE

Aumann Auctions held its annual Harvest Fall Sale at Nokomis, Illinois, with the tractors coming up on 28-29 October.

It was not as full as in other years, owing to Covid-19, and was an online sale only – but there were still approximately 350 tractors, besides pedal tractors, signs and literature the following day.

There was an excellent stock of tractors, particularly on 28 October, when a raft of stunning John Deere 30 Series models came up. The highlight was a 1958 John Deere 330 'Southern Special' – a rare, 'semi' rowcrop tractor that worked on a cotton crop. It went on to sell for £23.678.

The other John Deere highlight was a 1958 JD 435 with Detroit engine. This one was perfect and sold for £13,417, but was dwarfed by a 1973 Oliver 2255 FWA, in grade 5.5 condition, that sold for £34,727.



The MF 97 is an M-M GB in MF livery. This example sold for £9,076.

As for the 29 October sale, an imported and restored 1948 DB Cropmaster only made £2,131. An amazing and rare Lamborghini 5C tractor, restored by a father and son team in Italy, sold for \$17,850. A lovely Farmall Super MTA high crop raised £19,950 and an IH 1206 Wheatland made £18,152.

The best on day two was a late 1929 Advance-Rumely Oil Pull 25-40X – a 'regurgitated' Rumely tractor from old stock that hadn't sold and had been updated a little. It was still rather old fashioned by the late '20s, but bidders liked it and it went on to sell for £22.885.

Our guide reflects the prices that have most recently been paid for veteran, vintage and classic tractors and it takes at least four issues of Tractor Mart for the full A-Z of tractors to appear.

The prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget. If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was

the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to

PRICE GUIDE KEY

What our coding system means

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1	A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.
Band 2	A tractor that is running and needs some work.
Band 3	The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been re-sprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.
Band 4	This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.
Band 5	A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.
Band 6	The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

All the prices quoted are what we call hammer prices and don't include UK VAT, commission or value added tax in the USA.

use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) - not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails - the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way - it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't on his agenda at all - so really

think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor - especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

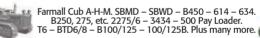

A new fuel tank and sender unit were replaced and new bonnet chrome handles went on after the panels were overhauled.

But that's not all: the engine ran very well indeed but was properly serviced with new diesel injectors and pipes, as was a rocker cover gasket, also with all filters. The fuel pump was also replaced, as were the many other items at no expense spared. New draught control parts were also fitted.

The electrical system featured a new loom, dynamo and starter motor and sundries, including lights. The clutch lever was replaced along with the seat and number place carrier. The wheels were overhauled and new tyres and tubes were fitted. The tachometer was overhauled and all the instruments are now like new and work perfectly, as does the Multi-Power with its gleaming chrome lever. The rear linkage was also given a major overhaul.

In each issue our Editor-atlarge, Peter Love, takes a look at what has been going on in the world concerned with heritage preservation.

i everyone! A new year welcomes us all, however, at this stage, it's one with a degree of trepidation for most of us.

We must be positive about the current world situation and believe we are going the right way to overcome the Covid-19 pandemic, particularly given the vaccines that have been announced in recent weeks. All we can hope is that by late spring we will be able to start holding events and gatherings of one kind or another.

It's with sad news that I report the passing of well-known tractor dealer James Henman, who lost his fight against cancer in November, aged 69. James was also famous for his marquee company and I first knew him when he was based in Oxfordshire - a recognisable character with his bowler hat, shorts and Nuffield tractor. He built up a considerable business through hard work and he will be sorely missed by all. My condolences go to his family at this time.

Some of you will have seen the news from the Government on the ban of petrol and diesel cars on our roads. The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs (FBHVC) talks to the Government on historic transport issues, including tractors and if your club if it is not already, I would suggest that it should be affiliated to the FBHVC. The preservation movement is relying heavily on this organisation to keep us on the road and not ban our historic vehicles - a hobby that generates £7.2 billion each year for the British economy.

The FBHVC recently released a position statement that said: "The move is part of the UK Government's £12 billion strategy for stimulating green industry and quite naturally has caused huge concern within the motor industry. The move suggests that Government policy will still support the use of private vehicles as a mode of daily transport, but not when they are required to be powered by fossil fuels.

"The FBHVC must consider the implications of this policy on the historic vehicle movement from the point of view of our need to focus solely on protecting the freedoms to use heritage transport on the UK's roads, unhindered. The Federation recognises there are already a significant number of electric vehicles represented within the historic vehicle movement."

The Federation urges caution amongst the historic vehicle community not to 'panic' that historic vehicles are in some way about to be made obsolete or unusable as a result of the announcement of these intended UK Government bans.

As the 2020 National Historic Vehicle Survey has revealed, there are more than 1.5 million historic vehicles registered in the UK and therefore they represent a material element of our National Heritage.

Additionally, the historic vehicle sector contributes a huge amount to the UK economy through highlyskilled jobs that will be a vital part of the regeneration of the UK's economy post pandemic and post Brexit."

Despite that huge financial input into the health of our country, the

National Historic Vehicle Survey also shows us that the use of historic vehicles only contributes to 0.2 per cent of the total annual miles driven in the UK. That amount of road use is very small in the overall aim to reduce carbon emissions to levels safe for the health and future of the planet. Nonetheless, the FBHVC recently appointed an environmental director to the board, tasked specifically with monitoring, offsetting and measuring the carbon output of the historic vehicle movement.

The strength in numbers that the historic vehicle community enjoys will help to ensure that it cannot be ignored or hindered without significant financial implications for the country. If we work together as a sector to encourage continued health, growth and skills for the future – the movement stands every chance of survival and the future of historic vehicles powered by internal combustion engines will be secured, regardless of what technology has in store for the future of road transport.
