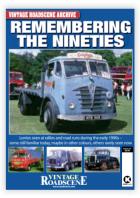

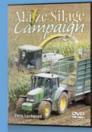

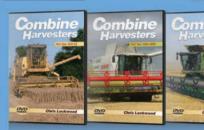

Borras Head Farm

Any farm with more than a dozen tractors that regularly put in a shift is worthy of some attention, so we set out to find out more about the Jones family's sizeable Massey Ferguson fleet.

mongst the picturesque
Welsh countryside, northeast of Wrexham and
just three miles from the
border with England, lies Borras
Head Farm.

A mixed unit, comprising 150 acres of arable land, 60 acres of maize and 270 acres of grass to support the 200-strong herd of Holstein milking cattle and followers, Borras Head has been farmed by the Jones family since 1902 – with fourth generation Andrew currently looking after the operation with the help of father

Neal and teenage sons Harry, 16, and Charlie, 13.

Like so many farms across the world, brand allegiance is an important part of machinery selection – but it is interesting to note that despite 17 tractors from six decades having a role to play, few have been here since they were new.

Besides a JCB Loadall and Ford 8210, the Massey Ferguson brand reigns supreme here – with some of the company's best-loved models gracing the line-up. The first new tractor, a Massey Ferguson 240,

arrived at Borras Head in 1989, but the farm has always relied on MF tractors to get the work done.

The three-cylinder 240, rated at 45hp (DIN) evidently had a profound effect on Neal, as others followed, along with some rare and interesting models that help create a veritable feast for the eyes for any Massey Ferguson fan.

With each having a different role, the sensible way to detail the Jones' fleet is chronologically, and so what follows is a whistle-stop tour of this astonishing triple triangle team.

WORKING CLASSICS: MF



First up is the oldest tractor in the fleet - a 1962 MF 65 MkII, bought in 2000 from J R Tomkinson & Sons Ltd. of Market Drayton. In 1960 the standard MF 65, powered by the AD4.203 engine, had a list price of £792-10-0 when fitted with 32-inch rear tyres and power steering, a

desirable option, added an extra £39-10-0.

"This one had been used on a vegetable farm in Pershore," Andrew told T&M. "The tractor came with a reduction gearbox, which was later removed, and had the job of using a Kongskilde sucker/blower,

for blowing corn, until we started using a bigger machine. At this point it became redundant and so Charlie and I set about restoring it to its original condition and we have since shown the tractor. It's showing 8,359 hours, but has a replacement tractormeter." Up next is a 1964 35X – in many ways the pride of the fleet and one

that certainly clocks the fewest hours. Bought in 2000 in a very poor state, as a skid unit with a few panels, it was restored to the immaculate condition it is in today and is rarely used on the farm, although it is always ready should its services be called upon.

Powered by the Perkins-built A3.152X engine, rated at 44.5hp, the 35X is famed for its dependable starting characteristics and good torque. It followed the three-cylinder 37bhp MF 35 and paved the way for the indefatigable MF 135.

No serious Massey Ferguson collection is complete without a plethora of 100 Series models and

the first to grace the Jones' cattle shed is a 1967 MF 165. Purchased from a friend, in 2006, it plays a pivotal role – used daily for bedding the cattle with a Teagle straw chopper. It's racked up a total of 6,147 hours and has proved to be very reliable.

As a MkI model it features the same Perkins-built AD4.203 engine model used in the 65 MkII, and is rated at 58.3hp. It also has dry disc brakes, whereas the MkII model used a 62hp A4.212 engine, generating 173lb/ft of torque at 1,250rpm, and five-plate, oil-cooled disc brakes.

Pint-sized & prairie power

The most well-known of all Massey Ferguson models, the 135, appears in straight axle guise on the farm. This example was registered on an 'H' plate in 1969/70 and was purchased in 1998 from Oswestry. It was fitted with a cab and used on a potato farm with a McConnel rear-mounted forklift. In standard guise, with six-speed transmission, the tractor would have cost £1,046 when new.

Andrew stripped it down and restored it to its former glory, but today it leads a more sedate life – mainly as the motive force at ploughing matches with a Ransomes TS86. Andrew's son, Harry, has enjoyed considerable success with the combination and set the standard for brother Charlie to emulate! The hourmeter displays '580', but this is a replacement following restoration and the tractor's true hours are unknown.

Arguably the most impressive tractor in the Jones' fleet and a model that won't be familiar to all in the United Kingdom is the most recent addition, dating from the early '70s. Bought by Andrew as 50th birthday treat to himself, in 2019, the big 1150 was imported from North America by Richard Keel and is now used for various jobs on the farm.

Powered by a Perkins V8.510, claimed by Massey Ferguson to generate 135hp at the power take-off, the big 'prairie pounder' has a 12-speed Multi-Power transmission, 20gpm hydraulic system and tips the scales at around 11,000lb (4,989kg). This one has just 2,319 hours on the clock and has been well looked after.

but its appearance is helped by the fact that it evidently worked in a climate that was kind to sheet metal!

The two largest Coventry-built 100 Series models are the next to feature – a 1976 MF 185 and a 1979 MF 188, both of which are used with an MF 80 loader. The former, purchased in 2009, struck a chord with Andrew after it was borrowed from a friend on several occasions to load the farm's Vicon Varispreader and MF 30 drill. It's in good shape considering the hourmeter is displaying '672' and it has already been around the clock!

The 185 used the 75hp A4.248 engine, producing 219lb/ft of torque at 1,300rpm. The standard transmission was an eight forward, two reverse unit, but the 12 forward, four reverse Multi-Power gearbox was available as an option. List price for the standard variant in 1972 was £2,063.

Massey Ferguson's 80 loader sold well over the years and could be fitted to many different models. With the introduction of the 500 Series tractors it was necessary to offer powered control of tipping and ▶

this came in the form of electric remote control or a hydraulic cylinder. Popular attachments included bucket, manure fork and the Power Claw. Complete with hydraulic tip this loader would have cost £674 in 1976.

The Jones' MF 188 joined the fleet in December 2017 and is used during the cereal harvest and sometimes with a rotary tedder. It's clocked a meagre 4,406 hours and is in good order.

Using the same engine as the 185, the 188 was one of Massey Ferguson's Super-Spec range of tractors, available with either a flexible-clad safety cab or a rigid-clad version. Power-assisted steering was standard equipment, as was independent power take-off, category II linkage with Pressure Control and spring-suspension seat.

This particular tractor, built in the last year of production, is a standard-spec model and, as such, is equipped with flexible-clad safety cab, PAVT rear wheels and Multi-Power transmission.

In 1972, the first full year of production, the list price for the Massey Ferguson 188 tractor was £2,382.

Loveable 240

When the 135 handed the proverbial baton to the 240, a devoted army of three-cylinder fans followed and the Jones family was among them. The 240 was billed as combining 'great manoeuvrability with the power of a well-known and reliable three-cylinder Perkins diesel engine.'

This was the first brand-new Massey Ferguson at Borras Head Farm, purchased in 1989, and clearly performed well as a two more would join the ranks later. The oldest of these is a 1981, X-registered tractor that was the mainstay of muck-clearance operations until an unfortunate accident saw it relegated to the back of a shed for many years.

"It had an 'argument' with a girder and snapped the front axle off the tombstone. The clock stopped at 7,065 hours and I don't really know how many hours it has actually done," Andrew explained. "Charlie took it on as a restoration project during the first lockdown period, removing the rotten cab and getting it running again.

"It will be going back in the workshop for a new clutch and to sort the leaks, ready to be resprayed. Not bad for a 13-year old!"

With yard scraping now undertaken by the youngest of the 240 trio, the third example is used in conjunction with a transport box and is classed as the farm runabout – a job it is well suited to, given the stature of the other tractors in the fleet. It was bought from MF dealer Emyr Evans' Denbigh branch in July 2011 and has completed 4,350 hours.

The fourth 200 Series model is a relative rarity and one that deserves particular emphasis. Powered by a Perkins A4.318.2 four-cylinder engine, generating 92.4hp (88hp DIN) and 254lb/ft (344Nm) of torque, the MF 298 was produced in both two-and four-wheel drive configuration.

The Jones' tractor is a 1986 model, purchased in November 2006, and is used on the silage clamp, complete with dual wheels and buckrake. It has racked up 9,358 hours and retains its original Duncan cab, which can be removed. This proves ideal when buckraking, as it enables maize to be piled higher in the covered clamp.

Unlike many of the other MF models, a 12-speed synchromesh transmission was the only option and the remainder of the specification included oil-cooled

disc brakes, two-speed independent power take-off and centre-drive front axle. The maximum linkage lift capacity was 6,130lb (2,781kg) and the tractor tipped the scales at 8,113lb (3,680kg). Standard tyre size was 13.6/12-24 on the front and 16.9/14-34 at the rear.

Equally as unusual is the Jones' Massey Ferguson 2685, purchased used from Massey Ferguson specialist Llansilin Tractors in Oswestry, Shropshire. Powered by a Perkins AT6.3544, rated at 130hp (DIN) and producing 320lb/ft (434Nm) of torque at 1,600rpm, the French-built tractor is more than capable of undertaking the jobs that it does on the farm.

At silage time it is used in conjunction with a trailed mower, but spends the majority of its time powering a Massey Ferguson 1839 inline baler with Ritchie eight-bale accumulator. When winter and spring cereals are going in, the 2685 usually finds itself pulling a JFT triple-gang roll.

In 1986, a time when the Beauvaisbuilt 2000 Series tractors were being sold alongside the new 3000 Series machines, also built in France, the 2685 represented a significant investment at £29,500. By way of comparison, the 77hp (DIN) Massey Ferguson 390 cost £17,550 in fourwheel drive form and the 97hp (DIN) MF 399 cost £20,950.

MASSY-FERGUSON 39D

This MF 390, purchased new in 1990, is regularly used with a Trioliet diet feeder.

Daily drivers

Purchased new in 1990, from Shukers of Oswestry, the MF 390 is used to run a Trioliet feeder wagon throughout the year, but is also used for tedding and rowing up grass.

Powered by the Perkins A4.248, rated at 86hp, the tractor has plenty of power for the jobs it undertakes and is aided by the fact that it is a two-wheel drive model – very manoeuvrable in and around the confines of the cattle shed and ideal for turning on the headland at grass time. The hourmeter stopped at 4,743 hours, but the tractor has done considerably more!

The other 300 Series machine at Borras Head is a 97hp 390T, purchased in 1999. "We bought this tractor second-hand from Pritchards Farm Machinery in Oswestry," said Andrew. "It is fitted with a Chilton loader and is used for stacking round bales, hedge cutting, fertiliser spreading and spraying. It's done the most hours of all our tractors at 10,793, but it still gives good service and is a handy alternative to the JCB.

"The two main tractors on the farm are a 2006 MF 6490 and 2011 MF 6485, both purchased new from Emyr Evans in Denbigh. The 6490's main jobs are pulling the West manure spreader, ploughing with a Kuhn five-furrow reversible, pulling a trailer at silage time, mowing grass and other field work.

"The 6485 is used with the Reco 40 forage harvester, power harrow, Lemken combination drill and round baler."

Aside from the JCB Loadall used for the bulk of the material ➤

handling on the farm, clocking 10,700 hours in the process, there is one other machine that stands out in the sea of red and grey – a 1985 Ford 8210, purchased in 2008. This tractor enabled the MF 65 to take retirement from the blower, but is also used for hedge cutting and buckraking.

"I bought the 8210 with buckraking in mind," said Andrew, "but it has taken on other roles since it arrived. The clock is showing 394, but it's a new one and I don't know how many hours the tractor has actually done."

Looking to the future, the next generation of the Jones family is keen to get involved, which bodes well for Borras Head Farm. "With two teenage sons interested in the farm and machinery, we hope to expand the herd and continue the collection," Andrew explained. "Our eldest son, Harry, is at Reaseheath College, near Nantwich, studying agriculture, and Charlie is very interested in the machinery."

With such an extensive fleet and the vast majority having a role to play, is there a tractor that Andrew prefers above the others? "In terms of the modern tractors, I like the 6485," he said, "but of the ones that are preserved I like the MF 65. Of the older ones that still put in a full shift, it's hard to beat the 2685!

"They've all been pretty reliable – even the modern ones. The 6485 and 6490 have needed cab mounts replacing, handbrake cables and the odd air conditioning problem, but just general wear and tear other than that.

"We're quite happy to undertake the easy repair jobs ourselves, but we'd use one of trusted local specialists if we had a problem that was too big or complicated for us to handle," Andrew said. "Touch wood, we've never had a serious issue. The 6485 has clocked 5,117 hours and the 6490 has done 8,422 hours, so I'm pleased that there has been nothing major."

As for the fleet, what can we expect to see in the future? From an outsider's perspective, it seems that an articulated model would fill an obvious gap in the line-up and it seems that great minds think alike, as when *T&M* asked Andrew which model was on his wish-list he didn't disappoint – although it wasn't the answer we were expecting!

"Given the chance, I'd like to own a four-wheel drive 595, but what would be nice is an 1800 artic!"

Helmut Claas

Helmut Claas, former Managing Director, Chairman of the Supervisory Board and Chairman of the Shareholders' Committee of the CLAAS group, died on 5 January, at the age of 94.

Helmut Claas was born in 1926 in Harsewinkel. His parents, August and Paula Claas, managed a small agricultural machinery firm with a workforce of around 100. He completed an apprenticeship as a machine fitter after graduating from school.

Practical experience followed in metalworking firms, and further practical training in casting. After a complementary study of agriculture in Paris, he took over the planning and establishment of a CLAAS distributor in France, which now operates as CLAAS France SAS. He joined his parents' family firm in Harsewinkel in 1958. Here he applied himself initially to his particular area of expertise, which was engineering.

In 1962 he was made Managing Director. Helmut Claas accepted the position of Personally Liable Partner when the company was reconstituted as a general partnership in 1978. In 1996, as part of the restructuring of the firm into a joint-stock company, he changed from the role of Managing Director to the position of Chairman of both the Supervisory Board and the Shareholders' Committee.

His special focus was always on developing pioneering products and

mass-producing them economically. During his era, following the success of the Dominator combine came the completely-new Lexion model. The Jaguar forage harvester and Xerion tractor were also developed under Helmut Claas.

In 2003 he succeeded in taking an important step towards the company's future: CLAAS took over Renault Agriculture's tractor business in France.

Helmut Claas was first and foremost a farmer. He ran a farm in East Anglia and often stayed there with his wife, Erika. He enjoyed keeping in touch with farmers in the area and took a keen interest in issues concerning agricultural firms. He also had a passion for hunting.

Today, his daughter, Cathrina Claas-Mühlhäuser, manages the decisionmaking and development of the successful group of companies.

Model Tractor, Plant & Construction Show

Open Farm Sunday plans for 2021

In addition to LOFS on-farm events on 13 June 2021, which have seen more than a quarter of a million people visit farms across the UK each year, LEAF will also be hosting a series of 'virtual' farm visits online.

Following last year's success, when LOFS took to our screens for the first time, two 'online' farm open days will take place this spring and autumn, alongside a programme of monthly live broadcasts running throughout the year.

"One of the unexpected positives to emerge from the challenges of 'lockdown' has been the surge in interest in the countryside, nature and buying fresh produce, and we have seen a higher following than ever on our LOFS digital channels," said LOFS Manager Annabel Shackleton. "This is the perfect moment to capture the public's curiosity and build our outreach to benefit the whole industry."

While awaiting clarity on Covid-19 regulations on public gatherings and events, Mrs Shackleton is urging farmers to start thinking about how they can host visitors on-farm in June, which will be the 15th anniversary LEAF Open Farm Sunday.

Chamberlain Tractor Trek

In New Zealand, preparations are ongoing for the major biennial 'Wheels of Wanaka' event held over the Easter Weekend in a stunning area of Otago South Island, writes Mike Gormley. The event involves anything that has wheels or tracks, and even wings.

This year, however, there are some different elements. Chamberlain tractors, that have gained a well-earned reputation as long-distance travellers, will be making a grand entrance to the event.

Long-distance trekking comes from quite early on in their life. The Chamberlain company was started in Perth, Australia, in 1949, aimed at producing a home-bred tractor specifically suited to Australian conditions and requirements. In 1955 one took a limited part in a round-Australia vehicle trial, mostly as a recovery vehicle, and became known as Tail End Charlie.

In the 1957 event, a Chamberlain completed the entire 18,000km circumnavigation.

Moving forward a few years to 2000 and a convoy of 35 suitablyadapted Chamberlains, towing special caravans, trekked right across Australia from Perth to coincide with the Olympic Games on the east coast.

Now in 2021 it is no surprise that a group of these now classic trekkers are to make the journey down New Zealand, across both islands, culminating at the Wheels of Wanaka event. Here they will meet up with another famous long-distance traveller – a Series One Land Rover called 'Oxford' that, in 1955, completed an epic journey from London to Singapore.

The group of Chamberlains includes four 9Gs (the same model as the original 'Tale End Charlie'), one 306, two Countryman models and two Canelanders. They are doing the New Zealand trek, known as the Heartland Tractor Trek, as part of a fund-raising event for Heartkids, so it will have a benefit to vulnerable children as well as a challenge for tractors and crews.

JCB launches recruitment drive

"This means we are now in a position to recruit many more shop floor colleagues and offer permanent JCB contracts to a large number of existing agency employees.

"After a tumultuous 12 months, this really is good news."

Blue to green

Bob Weir went to the town of Hexham, in Northumberland, to meet ex-Ford employee Reg Wilkinson and his John Deere 4020.

exham is an important market town, situated on the banks of the River Tyne. Apart from its
Roman traditions, it also suffered from constant border raids during medieval times. Braveheart William Wallace is even reputed to have burned the settlement in 1297.
Nowadays there is a more peaceful atmosphere, and Hexham was recently named 'England's favourite market town'.

Reg Wilkinson was brought up in the local area and has been involved with tractors and machinery all of his life. "Back in the 1950s my father kept a farm at Warks Burn, up in the high country by the North Tyne," he explained. "We were farming mainly sheep, and I left school at 15 to become a shepherd. Unfortunately, we had two horrendous summers when it never seemed to stop raining, and my father ended up selling the farm in 1959.

"Apart from the livestock, all the farms in the area kept a field of oats for their own use. I remember the thresher coming round, and all the neighbours used to pitch in and help. We then moved to a dairy farm just across the River Tyne from Hexham.

"My father then retired and took a back seat, and I formed a partnership with my elder brother. There wasn't really enough work for both us on the farm, so I decided to do some contracting while he concentrated on running the dairy side of the operation."

Even back in the early 1960s, Reg found the cost of petrol a major drawback. "I did a bit of everything," he recalls. "We had invested in an International Harvester B-64 trailed combine, along with a New Holland baler. Unfortunately, all the farms in the Hexham area were quite small, and I had to spend ages on the road travelling between the various holdings.

"Over time, this affected my income. It was good while it lasted, but my brother was looking to expand the dairy herd. There still wasn't enough work to support two families, so he agreed to buy me out."

By the summer of 1964, Reg was seriously considering moving to Australia. Then he spotted a job advert in the newspaper. He said: "Ford was looking to recruit tractor demonstrators. It was a 12-month contract, and I had to attend an interview at their office in London. Next thing I knew, I was on the train to the Ford Training Centre at Boreham near Chelmsford!

"Following the induction course, our team was moved to the new factory at Basildon so we could become familiar with the new Ford 6X, or 1000 Series as it was more commonly known. We spent most of our time putting the tractors through their paces at a farm near Enfield.

"Once the new machines had been exhibited at that year's Smithfield show, we were sent to different parts of the UK to liaise with the various Ford dealerships."

Head-hunted

Reg spent 14 years with Ford, before being head-hunted by the Norwegian company Kverneland. "The company had been using Bamford for their UK distribution, and now they wanted to go it alone," he recalls. "They had already opened a new HO in Rotherham, and I became a local rep, working mainly from home. When the company expanded into earth-moving equipment, I was also involved in that side of the business. I ended up staying with the firm until 1993."

Reg then got an approach out of the blue from the Swedish company Väderstad. "They offered me a similar job to my early days with Kverneland, covering the northern part of the UK," he recalls. "It was an enjoyable experience, and I stayed with them up to my retirement in 2005. I then remained on the books for a few more months, to show my replacement the ropes."



The 4020 certainly has presence!

No sooner than Reg begun to enjoy a well-earned retirement, he got another phone call out of the blue. "Väderstad's managing director had decided he wanted to move to Australia and set up a similar organisation," said Reg. "He wanted my help, so the next thing I knew I was packing my bags and boarding an aeroplane. As I recall, the Canadian company Seed Hawk was also involved. I was only required during the seeding season, which lasted approximately six weeks. I returned Down Under for the next five years."

It was during this period, working for Väderstad, that Reg acquired his John Deere. He said: "I bought the tractor (serial no: 145344R) on 1 April from the Sanderson brothers over by Bedlington, near Morpeth. It was sitting in a shed, looking a bit down on its luck. I said if you ever

want to sell the machine, give me a call. I suppose I was interested, because it's arguably *the* classic tractor.

"Anyhow I got a phone call one day from one of the brothers, and they said they were thinking of putting the John Deere in a sale. Reading between the lines, I sensed there had been a bit of a disagreement. I was back over to Morpeth in a flash, and we came to an agreement.

Reg's tractor was first registered on 16 October 1968, and was new to Mrs A H & J Stobo of Fishwick by Berwick-upon-Tweed. The rest of the tractor's history is a bit of a grey area.

"Lloyds arranged the delivery back to Hexham, as the tractor was suffering from a few problems with both the starter motor, and the Power Shift transmission." Reg explained. "The tractor was also wearing a Cab Craft cab that wasn't doing it any favours, and the tyres were flat."

Instant hit

The 4020 was arguably one of the greatest tractors of all time. Following the success of its two-cylinder tractors, John Deere decided to introduce the New Generation series in 1960. These featured four-cylinder machines, with the exception of the flagship six-cylinder 4010.

These tractors were a vast improvement on the old 'Johnny Poppers' and were an immediate hit with farmers. They featured some ground-breaking innovations, including detailed instrumentation, ergonomic seating, and a car-like steering column.

John Deere was quick to cash on the success of the new range, and in 1963 the 4020 was tested at ➤

Nebraska. Of particular interest was the new transmission. Controlled from the dashboard, this was the first to offer clutch-less changing under load with the convenience of one-lever operation.

A revised version of the standard synchromesh transmission was on offer to please the penny-pinchers or sceptics of Power Shift, and in America the tractor was also available in row-crop guise. The 4020 dominated the American market in the late 1960s, and was eventually phased out in the early '70s.

Reg said: "Having worked with tools from an early age, restoring a tractor doesn't present many problems. The first thing I did was ditch the cab. I then sorted out the Power Shift. Having worked on Fords equipped with Select-O-Speed I was already aware there could be issues with the Power Shift, because they were designed by the same man.

"In the John Deere's case, if you stall the engine you risk losing control of the tractor. The gearbox freewheels and you lose the use of the brakes, leading to a potentially dangerous situation. The problem turned out to be with the unit's mechanical lock, which had to be replaced. I also ended up renewing all of the electrics. The tractor also required new mudguards, and a fresh set of tyres."

Quite simply, the John Deere 4020 set the standard for others to follow.

with an impressive list of features that other manufacturers could only dream of emulating. It sold in vast quantities in its homeland and although it was deemed too large and too expensive for most farms in 'little ol' England', those that did purchase a 4020 in the UK were rewarded with style and performance that never failed to impress.

It's a tractor that regularly tops polls of 'best', 'most desirable' and 'most influential' classic tractor and is a model that has become increasingly popular with UK collectors in recent years. Those unable to get their hands on an original UK-spec model have resorted to importing tractors to fulfil their desires!

The 50 and 6000 Series may have opened many British farmers' eyes to the potential of John Deere tractors, but it was the 4020 that paved the way for many of the features that we now take for granted when it comes to the tractors of today.

BUYERS' GUIDE: ZETOR CRYSTAL





Crystal clear?

The phrase 'cheap power' seems appropriate when you consider the original Zetor Crystal range, but is that because they are best avoided? We take a look at the tractors that have become increasingly popular in recent years – the 8011/8045 and 12011/12045.

etor's tractors from the '60s and '70s are not always held in the highest esteem, but with all factors taken into account it's easier to appreciate the positives. At the time of their launch they may not have had the 'kerb appeal' that some of their rivals enjoyed, but they offered tremendous value for money – a trait that is still relevant today.

For the purpose of this guide we will be focusing on the 8011/45 and 12011/45 models, due to their popularity, but elements of this guide can be applied to other tractors in the range.

Designed following the realisation that there was a need for a tractor in its line-up producing 80-90hp, Zetor set to work on its new four-cylinder model and it was introduced to the market at the end of the 1960s.

The two-wheel drive 8011 and four-wheel drive 8045 were great examples of numerous factories working together to produce a single product – with the engine produced in Martin, Slovakia, the gearbox built in Prague and the rear axle, hydraulic system and other subassemblies built at the Ursus factory in Poland, which Zetor would swap components with.

Collaborative qualities aside, it transpired that problems would occur regarding modifications. It was a difficult process to get Ursus and other suppliers to agree to changes and so upgrades were not as swift as they might have been had production been under one roof, or in the hands

of one company, and reputation suffered as a result.

Prior to this, the new Crystal was embraced by many dealers and purchasers alike – finding a gap in the market that other manufacturers did not seem to be exploiting. Its success was not only down to an ideal power rating, but the fact that it had the traits that made it hard to beat for the price. These were economy in addition to power, a robust transmission, in-built weight for superior traction and a cab mounted on rubber blocks for reduced vibration and noise transmission.

The six-cylinder 12011/45 would follow later and both they and the 8011/45 would become extremely popular, at home and abroad.

Engine

Zetor's own direct-injection, four-stroke diesels were used to power both the 8011/45 and 12011/45, featuring liquid cooling, wet cylinder liners, a dry air cleaner and 12-volt electrical system. The same bore and stroke characteristics, 110mm and 120mm respectively, were used in both the four- and six-cylinder units.

They were renowned for having bags of torque and performed well against their rivals. The 8011/45 produced 224lb/ft of torque at 1,500rpm and although generally reliable, on the odd occasion they could drop a valve, plus it was not beyond the realms of possibility for the crankshaft's oil gallery plugs ▶

to pop out, causing the engine to seize.

"The injector pump wasn't as reliable as the one fitted to the UR1 either," James Barlow from Zetor specialist Barlows Agri Ltd. explained, "and diesel leaking from the element carriers was eventually cured when Zetor changed the O-ring material. Later models had an oilfed pump with three O-rings per element, which was more reliable. There was a modified engine fitted in later models, which was better.

The cooling system on the 8011/45 was also problematic on early tractors, as the expansion tank could get air locked, so when the header tank was checked for water and found to be OK, it may have been the case that there was no water in the radiator. The bottom of the radiator is also known to crack around the mounting bolts.

Transmission

A 13-inch single-plate clutch transmits power from the engine to the gearbox and this was a weak point on the first Crystals. Once the design was changed to incorporate needle bearings and a better lining was fitted, reliability improved.

From the inception of the design, Zetor was determined that the Crystal would be able to take on the competition in terms of the features it offered – one of which was an optional hydraulic gear splitter, known as the Torque multiplier, as well as two-speed (and ground speed) iPTO, four-speed, constant-mesh main gearbox with high, low and reverse ranges. A clutch shaft brake is employed to aid gear changes.

As well as a clutch-less change, the Torque multiplier has the advantage of engine braking in both positions and the ability to be tow-started, unlike similar systems on the market. With a Torque multiplier fitted, 16 forward speeds are at the operator's disposal – from 2.37-25.5kph – and these are reduced by 34 per cent with the Torque multiplier engaged (tortoise position and lever pulled back).

The gearbox itself shouldn't give any problems. A change to the layshaft during production altered the thrust on the bearings, but you'll be extremely unlucky if you experience a gearbox issue.

Ouality control in the Ursus factory let down what was otherwise a good rear axle design. The main problem was the diff lock engaging teeth could wear if not used properly and, if worn, necessitated the replacement of the diff cage. Later models featured a replaceable insert, which fixed the problem.

Steering & brakes

Although you'll find power-assisted steering on the Crystal models, it was initially a bit of a lottery as to what type of system you'd end up with. "Due to poor Polish production, the effort needed to turn the wheel was different on every tractor," James Barlow explained, "varying from finger light to unbelievably heavy. It was also a nightmare to repair, again down to poor production quality."

If not maintained properly, the bolts on the front axle sliding extension can fall out, but other than that, check for the usual wear in the king pins, wheel bearings and pivot pin. Four-wheel drive models are pretty reliable in the front axle department, but look out for leaking seals. These were modified on later production models when a felt pre-seal was fitted.

Hydraulically-operated disc brakes are fitted to the Crystal models, but don't get too excited! They are of the dry, expanding disc type and although self-equalising, attention needs to be paid to their adjustment, otherwise the slave cylinders can leak.

If air-operated trailer brakes are a must for you, you have the option of buying a 12011/45 (to which they were fitted as standard) or look out for an 8011/45 with the system fitted as an optional extra. This was another of the features that set the Crystal apart from the competition.

Hydraulics & PTO

If there is a weak point in the Crystal's design as far as UK and Irish users are concerned, it's the hydraulic system. A live hydraulic pump with lower-link sensed category II linkage, draft, position, intermix and sensitivity controls and single- or double-acting spools sounded good on paper, but the reality is that the hydraulics are underpowered for the capabilities of the tractor.

The Crystal's ability to pull remains legendary, but it lacks the lift capacity that was required in the UK and Ireland, where reversible ploughs were commonplace. In their homeland, the 8011/45 and 12011/45 were almost certainly destined to

pull semi-mounted conventional ploughs and so there was no need for a large lifting force.

With a poor lift capacity, operators that chose to lift heavy implements put increased strain on the hydraulic pump – which was another component that was let down by the manufacturing process. A better pump was fitted to later models.

"The problem was cured by fitting an assistor ram," said James, "which the factory eventually did to the 8011/8045. It was standard on the 12011/45. The three-point linkage was very little trouble, but changing the pick-up hitch to the drawbar required a lot of work, as you needed to unbolt plates and the like and replace them with different ones.

"The original lift rods on the pick-up hitch were solid, so you had to take them off when using a mounted implement, and backing up to a trailer first time was virtually impossible, as you couldn't see the hook due to the forward seating position and the fact that the hook could swing from side to side!"

Some of these tractors have been retrofitted with other pick-up hitch designs, but pay close attention to this if you intend to switch between numerous towed implements.

Two PTO shafts were fitted to the Crystal as standard – a six-spline

540rpm shaft and a 1,012rpm, 21-spline shaft. Control of the iPTO is via a small lever under the steering wheel, which engages/ disengages a multi-plate hydraulic clutch.

540rpm is achieved at 2,200erpm on the 8011/45 and 1,900erpm on the

12011/45 and 1,012rpm at the shaft sees both the four- and six-cylinder engine turning at 2,200rpm.

The drive shaft from the clutch to the PTO gears was known to be a problem on early tractors, according to Alan and James Barlow, due to it being 'dry' at both ends. "Later ➤

tractors had forced lubrication where it entered the gearbox and this cured that problem, although it could still wear in the clutch unit end, but that was a common problem on most makes with iPTO!" Alan said. "The PTO pack could slip when on a heavy load running at 540rpm, but this was generally cured by fitting an extra pair of plates."

When off, the power take-off shaft is automatically locked for additional safety.

Operator area

Besides the vast array of standard and optional features throughout the Crystal's design, it was the cab that really set it apart from the other tractors on the market. Quiet, comfortable and extremely roomy, it had an adjustable, sprung seat (that could only be moved by unbolting it), passenger seat, two mirrors, heater and two wipers.

When verified in Sweden it was found to be the quietest cab ever tested and set the bar high for other tractor manufacturers. The rubber mountings alleviate much of the usual rattle and din you associate with tractors of this era and although it pales into insignificance compared to the cabs of today, as a feat of engineering it remains extremely impressive.

The main problems are the long reach to the rear window, which can cause problems with manual controls, and the lack of visibility to the pick-up hitch.

The dash panel is simple and easy to understand, but not particularly attractive, and the remainder of the main controls are logically positioned. If there is a criticism of the major controls, it's that the hydraulic quadrant would benefit from being further forward.

Depending on your stature, you may find getting in and out of the cab a chore due to the size and shape of the doors and rake of the windscreen.

Aesthetics

With its square-cut looks it's somewhat utilitarian, but not unattractive! The livery suits the styling and although the Crystal's unlikely to win any beauty contests, there is something appealing about it.

It may not be unique, but it does look somewhat different to most other designs from the era – particularly when it comes to the cab – and that's what gives it charm.

Summary

As no-nonsense tractors go, the 8011/45 and 12011/45 represent great value for money. When this issue went to press (January 2021), it was possible to pick up a rough, sub-7,000-hour 8011 for less than £3,000 and a good 8045 with loader for £6,500.

With the extra power it would seem reasonable that a 12011 or 12045 would command a lot more money, but we found a 12011 for as little as £3,500. Admittedly, it was a little rough around the edges, but we also found a straight example for £5,500.

Naturally, very good examples command a premium and an 8011, 8045 or 12011 in this category will set you back at least £8,000, while a nice 12045 will be more – often at least £10.000.

Compared to tractors with a similar power output built by the likes of Ford and Massey Ferguson, for example, these Zetors offer seemingly better value. The Crystal is the epitome of the old saying 'a lot of bang for your buck' and is seriously worth considering if you're in the market for 'cheap power', something different and an important piece of the history of tractor design.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Dear T&M,

The B-414/35X head-to-head is an inspirational piece, particularly if you were brought up with and still own and operate them, as I do.

It's very interesting to note your findings and compare them to my own, which are a mixture of what I remember from 1964, when both were brand new, and what I can confirm now, after nearly 60 years of service. It's relevant to note that my B-414 is in completely original condition with just over 3,000 genuine hours on the clock and the 35X is what you might describe as an older restoration with close to 9,000 hours.

For me, seeing both these iconic tractors reviewed in *T&M* made me (seriously) go out to the shed and start them both up! Both models are truly remarkable machines that illustrate our tractor heritage in all its glory. Well done *T&M* for bringing it all back and brightening up a hard, dark winter.

SL: Thank you for your kind words, James. The aims of these head-tohead features include provoking debate and rekindling memories, so if we have done that we have achieved what we set out to do!

Dear T&M,

Your head-to-head should have included prices for the standard model when both were available at the same time. Those of us who farm know that starting is nearly

the only show in town – no start, no tractor. However, comments regarding MF's Multi-Power should have priced the option and also its challenges (no tow starting or engine braking), as well as commenting on the tractor's brakes.

You failed to optimise the value of photos when you could have used an angle that showed the dash as well as the gear sticks and the pedal arrangements. Had you used an original-spec tractor it would have shown the IH's additional protection from operator entanglement with the rear wheels (mudguards), which had to be retrofitted on the 35X to comply with HSE requirements.

Also you comment negatively on the mesh grille on the IH, whose small holes (later adopted on the MF 135) impeded the entry of debris into the radiator and subsequent overheating of the engine, in favour of the appearance of the MF's louvres.

Why did you not use a photo of an original 35X (choosing a model with later mudguards and rare PAVT wheels? Bias or ignorance?

SL: I will always listen to what readers have to say and I take your point that it would have been prudent to include further details, but space prevents us from going into vast detail about each tractor – including the 35X's various mudguard assemblies.

North versus South

The latest head-to-head compares and contrasts two popular models from the '60s!

e've featured many interesting comparisons throughout this series - with some closely matched. Others, although seemingly similar on paper, have proved to be quite different emphasising the fact that one tractor was clearly more capable than the other.

When we embarked upon this series one of the main aims was to create a talking point and judging by the correspondence we have received, we have achieved our goal. Thank you to those that have been in contact to express opinion over the past few months and if you would like to suggest a head-to-head, please send an e-mail to tm.ed@kelsev.co.uk

On to the matter in hand and, as many of you will appreciate, the 1960s was an extremely interesting period, given the fact that many new models were released that would go on to become icons of their generation. The two tractors featured here are prime

David Brown's 990 Selectamatic, first produced in 1965, was a classic case of evolution, having been developed from the existing 990 Implematic – introduced in 1961. The Ford 4000 (Major) was decidedly more revolution than evolution – developed from a blank sheet of paper and built in a brand-new factory. This, perhaps unsurprisingly, led to teething problems – but we will aim to dismiss these for the purposes of this feature.

Given the fact that there were two variants of the David Brown 990 Selectamatic in Orchid White and Chocolate Brown and two versions of the Ford 4000, it is important to clarify which ones we're looking at here. To provide a fair comparison we have chosen the 3,045cc David Brown 990, produced from 1965-68, and the Ford 4000 Major (6X) - produced from 1964-68.

Power

With both tractors producing 55hp, it's evidently a fair comparison but, like the IH B-414 and MF 35X, the debate surrounding four cylinders versus three rears its head once again!

The David Brown AD4/47 fourcylinder engine was a direct-injection, four-stroke unit with cross-flow cylinder head, distributor-type fuel pump and oil bath air cleaner.

With a 3% in bore and 4½ in stoke, maximum torque generated was 140lb/ft at 1,400rpm - a 20lb/ft increase on the three-cylinder 880.

Ford's approach was different, with an all-new 'square' engine design for, the company claimed, more power, low fuel consumption and minimum wear. The big bore and short stroke approach followed extensive research in Austria. Great Britain and the United States that showed impressive economy with low emissions.

With a 4.4in bore and 4.4in stroke, the capacity of 201cu in (3.294cc) was greater than that of the DB 990 and it performed rather well. With identical power and similar torque output to the Meltham-built 990, the threecylinder Ford 4000 seemed like a good proposition. Porosity caused some problems throughout the range, but this was largely confined to the fourcylinder 5000, and the 4000 quickly became the best-selling model in the

Both engines have numerous fans, but a poll of T&M's Facebook audience indicated that 66 per cent preferred the Ford engine. We're inclined to agree, as this is a rewarding threecylinder unit that instils confidence.

Transmission & axles

David Brown was famous for being a manufacturer of gears and although the transmissions used in its tractors were not particularly quiet, they were robust and reliable. The 990's was no exception, with a six forward, two reverse unit as standard on the 990.

For those undertaking precision work, a 12-speed gearbox was available to increase the number of useful ratios. This provided six speeds below 1mph, 12 ground speeds with 1,000rpm at the power take-off and 24 ground speeds with 540rpm at the PTO. For specialised applications and tasks like rotavating, the plethora of lower forward speeds proved invaluable.

The Livedrive system incorporated a twin-plate dry clutch, with the second stage providing live hydraulics and power take-off when the motion of the tractor was stopped.

Ford adopted a four-speed transmission as standard on the 4000, doubled by a dual range system. It was reliable and nice to operate, but it had a fundamental flaw – two of the eight forward speeds were essentially the same. Fourth and fifth both had speeds of 4.7mph, leaving a jump to sixth's 7.4mph.

Rather than incorporate a clutchless change in its standard gearbox, as Massey Ferguson had done with Multi-Power, Ford opted to offer a completely clutch-less system as an option for the discerning farmer. Select-O-Speed was billed by Ford as "the biggest advance in tractor transmissions since they first put rubber tyres on the wheels."

The idea was simple – to enable the operator to select the desired gear ratio, via a small lever, through hydraulic power. There was no need to stop, declutch or alter the throttle position.

It was revolutionary, but lacking smoothness and was quickly christened 'Jerk-O-Matic' by those that favoured rival brands. Offering 10 forward speeds from 1.1-17.6mph, Select-O-Speed had the potential to take the market by storm, but it was open to abuse from over-zealous operators and news of breakages, coupled with its 'snappy' nature and an element of suspicion from those that weren't keen on trying new

things, meant that its lifespan was not as Ford had originally intended.

It performed better under load and was ideal for buckraking and loader operations, with high-speed changes possible from forward to reverse, but it wasn't to everyone's taste.

Given its decent spread of speeds and robust, no-nonsense nature, we like the DB transmission.

T&M VERDICT: DB 990

Power take-off

The 990's power take-off system was quite versatile in that it could operate at either 540rpm or 1,000rpm. With the PTO gear range set to 'Low', 540rpm was achieved at 1,800erpm, but with it set to 'High', 1,000rpm was achieved at the shaft at just 1,100erpm – an economy speed in today's terms, perfect for sprayers and other low-demand implements.

A PTO speed of 1,000rpm was obtained with the PTO gear range set to 'High' and the hand throttle at 2,000erpm. These three PTO settings provided outputs at the shaft of 44.4hp, 28hp and 48.5hp respectively.

Ford's independent power take-off was certainly more convenient than the Livedrive system, and with 48hp at the shaft at 1,810erpm there was little choose between it and the DB 990 in terms of performance.

David Brown had the upper hand in terms of PTO speeds though, as a 1,000rpm power take-off could only be specified with a De luxe Select-O-Speed two-speed PTO on the 4000.

If all of your implements were 540rpm, the 4000's iPTO made it a sensible choice, but failing that it was hard to see how the 990's versatility could be bettered in this department.

Our choice may prove controversial, but for its 540, 540 'economy' and 1,000rpm speeds as standard, we like the David Brown.

T&M VERDICT: DB 990

Hydraulics

Some have argued that David Brown's Selectamatic is complicated to operate and at first glance it probably appears that way, but it is actually quite straightforward once accustomed to it. The key to the system was to push the control lever to the 'Select' section of the quadrant before turning the 'dial' to the desired hydraulic service - Depth control, Height control or Traction Control/External Services.

Once 'Depth' had been 'dialled in', the operating depth of an implement was controlled by the control lever - with working depth maintained automatically, regardless of undulations. 'Height' enabled the operator to hold the implement in a set position, irrespective of weight and engine speed, while 'Traction Control' (known as TCU) presented the opportunity to increase the amount of weight transfer by pushing the lever forward.

Operating the lever in the 'External' service enabled a trailer to be tipped or reversible plough to be turned, for example. It pulled against a spring so

that it returned to the 'hold' position when the lever was released. This prevented the system from being left in a state of lift.

Ford had been fitting single-lever hydraulic systems to tractors for seven years when it introduced the 6X range, but it improved it with increased lift capacity, a doubleacting top link (except the basic 2000), a flow control valve and live operation as standard, thanks to a pump with a capacity of 4.4gpm.

On tractors with the standard, eight-speed transmission, a gear-type pump was located in the rear axle centre housing, while Select-O-Speed models had an engine-mounted, piston-type pump.

A small lever adjacent to the quadrant enabled the operator to switch between position and draft control, while independent control of external services was afforded by a small valve on the right-hand side of the rear casting.

Rather like the power take-off, the hydraulic systems are sure to divide opinion, but the Selectamatic system is impressive in our eyes. The Ford 4000 is simplicity itself and is nice to work with, but the DB 990 is equally comfortable with implements with or without a depth wheel and reassuringly accurate.

T&M VERDICT: DB 990

Operator area

With a decent step up making access to the footplate easier, the 4000 scores heavily when it comes to getting on, and off. The David Brown is hampered by the fact that the step is small and the steering arm protrudes rather a long way, hindering access to the footplate.

Once aboard, it is obvious that the 990 had evolved from previous models in that the design appeared rather dated comparison to the Ford - designed on a blank sheet of paper. The 3000's instrumentation and layout of controls appears rather Spartan in comparison to the DB, but ➤

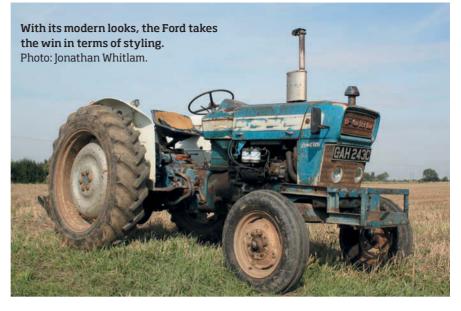

the dash is nicely raked and easy to read, while there is very little 'clutter'.

Visibility is good on both tractors, but the driving position of the Ford feels better and more ergonomic. We are not particularly keen on the 990's left-hand hand throttle either!

The Ford 4000 is simply laid out and straightforward to operate, whether in standard or Select-O-Speed guise and for this reason we're awarding the win in this section to the blue oval.

T&M VERDICT: Ford 4000



Styling

With a similar bonnet profile and round-top fenders, these tractors look similar in terms of styling but the Ford 4000 has a longer wheelbase and a less ground clearance, so their stature (exaggerated by their respective liveries) appears rather different.

Practically the same in terms of height to the steering wheel, and both shod with 11-36 rear tyres, the 990 appears larger thanks to its 6.00-19 front tyres (whereas the 4000 has 6.00-16) and increased ground clearance but there is actually very little to choose between the two.

Although the Chocolate Brown skid unit hides grease and grime pretty well, the Orchid White is not very forgiving and hard to keep looking its best. The 4000 is perhaps not as dynamic in terms of its livery, but pleasing to the eye and modern looking as far as we're concerned.

Fans of the Implematic series may argue that David Brown should have retained the Currant Red and Primrose Yellow colour scheme, but that's an argument for another day!

T&M VERDICT: Ford 4000

Final thoughts

Truth be told, there's very little to choose between these two tractors. They are well matched and if the David Brown can convince wouldbe purchasers that its 12-speed transmission and Selectamatic hydraulic system are not overcomplicated, we feel that more people would consider the 990 as a true adversary of the Ford 4000 and Massey Ferguson 165 (58hp) for that matter

The David Brown 990's ability is legendary amongst those that are loyal to the marque and the company enjoyed tremendous success with the model. Those that were brave enough to try one often stayed with the

brand, which is testament to the 990's competence.

With its radical new appearance, impressive standard features and options, the Ford 4000 was always going to be a hit. With the power output that everyone wanted at the time and a lineage that had won over an army of fans, the three-cylinder Major was destined to take the farming world by storm.

Today, both models retain a strong fan base, but the popularity of the 990 in particular has increased noticeably in recent years. It's well built, reliable and extremely capable and although it tends to command higher prices than many of the other David Brown models produced in the 1960s, it still represents good value compared to the likes of Ford's 6X models and Massey Ferguson's 100 Series.

With classic tractor specialists like Bob Vaughan Tractors, S R Haylock



and Oakfields stocking nice examples of tractors from this era, it's worth getting in touch to see what they have.

So, it's three categories apiece and when this has happened before we've chosen a winner rather than call it a draw. Both have traits that we're not keen on, but looking at it purely from a value-for-money perspective we'd plump for the David Brown 990.

Generally, you can pick one up cheaper than a 4000, but remember that good original examples will always command a premium.

Its abilities are impressive and a reminder of the calibre of machinery that left the factory at Meltham.

Modern machinery

t's a trio of modern kit for you in this issue with another JCB and a couple of tractors for your delectation and delight.

First up is the JCB 1CXT, complete with the features you can find on the real thing - including rubber tracks and telescopic dipper. We liked this one as there's no imitation rust or mud. and it's all the better for it. Despite the intricacy, it feels sturdy enough and at £22.99 it's not bad value.

Next up is the Case IH Maxxum 150. Like all of the other Britains tractors we've reviewed recently, although we like the sturdiness of the three-point linkage, it restricts the turning ability when coupled to a trailed implement. At around £27.99 it's on a par with the bulk of Britains' 1:32 tractors

and a nice addition to the expanding range.

Finally is the one we've wanted to get our hands on for a while - the Claas Xerion 5000. Just like the full-size version there's four-wheel steering and the most impressive feature – a rotating cab!

It's a heavy and wellbuilt model and, unusually, the box features a small selection of parts that you must add yourself to complete the look - including mirrors and flashing beacons. At approximately £34.99 it's good value, particularly when you compare the size of it to a 'standard' 1:32 rigid-frame tractor

Scottish connection

lain Bridges has been a big fan of Nuffield tractors since he was a boy. Bob Weir went to Fife to see his latest acquisition, a 4/65.



ain Bridges' fascination with agricultural machinery, like that of so many others, goes back a long way. "My dad first got me interested in tractors," he explained. "He was raised on a farm, where my grandfather was employed as a horseman.

"The horses were eventually replaced by tractors and after 40 years my grandfather was presented with a long-service medal. My dad went on to have a career as an agricultural engineer, and I've followed in his footsteps."

Iain has lived in Fife all his life. The 4/65 is the third Nuffield in his collection, and the family have owned the other two tractors since before the Millennium. "The M4 was built in 1952, and my dad

acquired it back in the 1990s," Iain explained. "The tractor is believed to have originally been owned by the late John Melloy of Murthly in Perthshire. My dad bought the tractor from a local enthusiast.

"When we first got the M4 it was in a bit of a state. A lot of the parts had been packed away in boxes, and the tractor was missing its tyres. As things turned out the Nuffield was in reasonable condition, and we did all the restoration work ourselves."

The Nuffield 10/60 was bought in 1997. The tractor was originally made in 1966 and is equipped with some factory-fitted extras, including a deluxe seat and full set of lights.

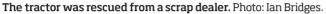
"I believe the tractor was originally fitted with a Winsam cab," said Iain, who is a member of The Nuffield >

and Leyland Tractor Club and Fife Vintage Agricultural Machinery Club. "It's a local tractor and spent many years working in Fife. It led a busy life making hay and when my dad was alive we used to take it to rallies and ploughing matches."

One of the reasons why Iain likes the tractor is because of the Scottish connection. "Like many owners, we have a soft spot for Nuffield because of the factory at Bathgate in West Lothian," he explained. "This was a big deal at the time, because these

were the only tractors being built in Scotland. The machines had a reputation for being well made, and it's a pity the plant closed down after only 25 years."

In 1962. Nuffield tractor production was moved from the company's factory at Ward End in Birmingham, to a new plant at Bathgate in Scotland. The 10/42 and 10/60 models were introduced in 1964. These models featured a high/ low gearbox, with 10 forward and two reverse gears, with the model numbers indicating the number of forward gears and the engine's horsepower rating.

After years of development, the 'Mini' tractor was launched the following year. The tractor only measured 8ft 2¼in in length, and weighed a modest 2,098lb. Despite all the research and planning, the model was introduced at a time when tractors were tending to get larger not smaller, and the Mini was not popular with farmers, although it did find favour with specialised growers and local authorities.

Despite its size, the Mini was technically very advanced and included items like state-of-the-art hydraulics and a two-speed PTO.

BATHGATEFACTORY

Construction of the Bathgate factory began in 1961 under the management of the old British Motor Corporation (BMC). The move was politically motivated and designed to replace the jobs lost by the closure of the West Lothian coal mines. The plant employed thousands of people and ushered in a new age of prosperity to the area.

Along with other modern factories, Bathgate was seen as a fresh beginning for Scottish industry and a breakaway from the old traditions. The new plant was designed to make commercial vehicles, but the following year Nuffield tractor production was also moved up from Birmingham.

It was hoped that local entrepreneurs would set up new

companies to supply Bathgate, but unfortunately this failed to materialise. The majority of components still had to be shipped up from the Midlands, which added significantly to the costs.

During the next few years Bathgate manufactured all its castings, gears, shafts, and engine parts. Things went so well that it became one of the largest machine shops in Europe, but on the downside the plant also suffered from the same labour problems that had plagued British industry since the late 1950s, and strikes were a major issue.

Management had originally intended to build 750 tractors a week, using a 'round the clock' three-shift system. Although these targets were considered by many commentators to be too ambitious, Bathgate confounded the critics by hitting them on a regular basis.

Despite problems with build quality in the lorry section of the factory, the Nuffield/Leyland tractors maintained their solid reputation. Unfortunately, by the early 1980s the world economy had taken a downturn and was in deep recession. The decline in demand took its toll, and it was decided to halt tractor production in 1982. The plant was closed down four years later.

New look

The 4/65 replaced the 10/60 in 1967 and was one of the last Nuffield tractors. There had been some concerns by management that the current models were starting to look a bit dated, and it was decided to give the product range a makeover. The result was a more modernlooking tractor, with new features.

Changes included a re-styled bonnet, wide-top mudguards, and

a repositioned battery. Engine power was increased from 60 to 65 horsepower and other improvements included a dual-chamber hydraulic pump and double-acting top link for improved draft control. The steering was also designed, and the fuel tank was repositioned in front of the radiator.

The 10-speed transmission enabled a higher top speed and the tractor was also equipped with a new instrument panel, a dry elementtype air cleaner, and front weight frame. The deluxe version of the 4/65 featured an independent PTO and could be bought new for £1,044.

In 1969 the tractor was rebranded as the Leyland 384, when Nuffield's bright orange finally gave way to Leyland's two-tone blue.

Iain had been looking for a Nuffield 4/65 since his father passed away and he acquired this example in 2017. "The tractor was built in 1968, and originally sold by agricultural equipment dealer Neil Ross Ltd.," he explained. "The early history is a bit of a grey area, although the

tractor is wearing a Kincardineshire (Aberdeen) registration. Neil Ross Ltd. had a branch in Laurencekirk (Kincardineshire), so it all seems to

"I bought the tractor from a local scrap dealer based at Dunning near Perth. He had acquired the tractor at a Lawrie & Symington auction in Lanark. It looked like the Nuffield's days were numbered, but all's well that ends well."

Ian has a full-time job, so most of the restoration work was done at weekends. The tractor is stored just a few miles from where he lives, so he was also able to put in a shift during the long, summer evenings.

"The Nuffield was on its last legs," he recalls. "The engine had seized, and the tractor had to be delivered by lorry. The tinwork was also in a dire state. I realised the work was going to take some time, so I removed the engine and stripped the bodywork down to the bare bones.

"When I start a restoration project, I usually begin with the engine. I certainly had my work cut out with

the Nuffield's diesel. I don't know how long the unit had been left in this state, but it was obviously going to need a lot of work."

According to Iain, patience is often needed to free off a seized engine and the 4/65's unit was no different. "I ended up having to cut the liners off the pistons to get the gudgeon pins out. It took three nights with the engine turned upside down and soaked in diesel to get the liners to move just a quarter inch. Once I got everything freed off, I sent the crankshaft and cylinder head down to specialists Wm Anderson Engineering Ltd., based in Kirkcaldy. Everything else is brand new from front to back, including the clutch."

Tinwork saved

Compared to the problems he had with the engine, Iain said sorting out the tinwork was fairly straightforward. "I was able to save all the original tinwork, so the body is just like it was when it left the factory at Bathgate in 1968," he said.

RESTORATION: NUFFIELD 4/65



"One of the previous owners had replaced the rear wheels with a set used on the replacement Leyland 384. I managed to get a set of originals from Wheelies Vintage Tractor Spares down at Malton in Yorkshire.

"Power steering was an option on the 4/65 and wasn't fitted to my tractor. I decided to get hold of the right parts from a breaker and fit them myself. The parts would have originally been used on a Leyland 384. As you can imagine, it has certainly improved the tractor's handling."

Fortunately for Iain, he was brought up with tools and was able to do most of the work himself. "I was apprenticed as a fitter to JCB, before I got laid off," he explained. "The rest I learned off my dad. I've found over the years that restoration work on this generation of tractors is fairly straightforward, provided you've got the right parts and are prepared to take your time. The family have also had the use of some storage sheds for many years, so we can keep the tractors indoors and out the weather."

Iain has also followed in his father's footsteps and uses John Charnley & Sons down in Chorley, Lancashire, wherever possible.

"Tracking down Nuffield spares has always been an issue, but Charnleys has always been very helpful," he said. "I even went down to Lancashire with my dad on a couple of occasions to have a look at their facilities."

Iain was also fortunate to find a donor 4/65 to use for spares. "The donor tractor came from a farm sale at Brechin, run by Pentland Livestock Limited based in Kirriemuir," he explained. "The Nuffield was just sitting in the corner of a shed, so I snapped it up. The tractor was in a pretty rough condition, but it had plenty of useful parts. It seemed like too good an opportunity to pass up.

"The whole refurbishment took me two-and-a-half years. I wanted it ready for the 2020 show season, but because of the Covid-19 pandemic, this was obviously cancelled. Hopefully, things will improve in 2021 and I can also take the tractor on a few road runs.

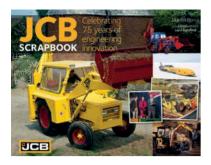

The 75th anniversary of one of JCB was always going to be a milestone worth celebrating and this new book certainly marks the occasion in style.

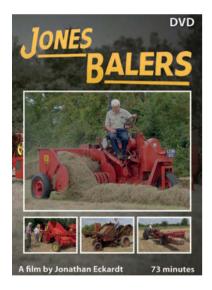

The DVD charts the development of Jones Balers Ltd. with the help of Jones aficionado Mike Lawrence, from Somerset, who has one of the finest collections of such equipment in the UK.

The company's origins lay in the brothers' contracting days in the early part of the 1920s, when equipment was hard to get hold of. They decided to build a machine for themselves and after looking at many other machines available at the time, they successfully built an early baler.

Farmers liked what they saw and asked the Jones brothers to build one for them too. The rest, as they say, is history!

Malcolm Fleet presents the film in a casual, yet informative style, ably aided by Mike Lawrence, who many of you may remember from the Jones Invicta story in the September 2019 issue of T&M.

It may be a niche subject, but we thoroughly enjoyed the DVD and learned a great deal. The number of models produced by the company is astonishing and a tribute to the ingenuity of this once-great manufacturer.

Tractors in the blood

Tim Lynch, from Co. Kerry, tells Peter Love about his newly-restored 1958 Fordson Dexta.



or Tim Lynch, restoring a
Fordson Dexta is second
nature, as he was brought
up with this size of
tractor, along with motor vehicles –
particularly Fords – as his father had
traded them for decades.

His interest in vintage and classic tractors started when his father, Pat, reconditioned, serviced and repaired Massey Ferguson 35s, 135s and 165s, as well as Fordson Dextas and Super Dextas, during the 1970s, '80s and '90s. These tractors are

still used by the small local farms and on the many smallholdings that make up the landscape in this part of Co. Kerry, on the west coast of the Republic of Ireland.

Following that period, Pat Lynch went on to sell light commercials and four-wheel drive vehicles at Ballylongford and Tim went to work at a Toyota dealership in the workshop.

Tim first restored a tractor with Pat in 2002, when they took on a 1950 Ferguson TE-D 20 – a tractor

that he still cherishes today. In fact, Tim has others he has restored, including a number of MF 35s. His Perkins 3.152-engined example was restored eight years ago now and looks just as lovely as the day it left Banner Lane.

As for the Fordson Dexta that Pat owns, it's an early April 1958 example that came to Co. Kerry in 1968, having been imported from the UK. It was used on a neighbouring farm with a rear loader, where it worked until 1997. Pat Lynch was asked to store the tractor for the owner's son. The objective was for the Lynchs to eventually restore it for the owner's family, but that didn't happen.

In 2015 it was purchased by Tim and it came with the original Irish logbook, rear loader and original toolbox. The Lynchs had maintained the tractor in working times and it still ran, but it needed a lot of work to get it up to scratch. It had been many decades since it left the Dagenham production line and time had not been particularly kind to it.

The front axle had taken a lot of punishment and a full overhaul was required. New kingpins and bushes were required, as well as wheel bearings and oil seals. The steering box also had a lot of play in it, so it was decided to remove and replace the worn parts and shim it as required.

Achilles heel

The track rods were replaced and the Dexta's Achilles heel, the top shaft bearing in the steering column, required attention. Here

the wear can be considerable and if you don't pay attention to its state, the bearing can break up completely and lock the steering up, with drastic consequences.

It's not an easy job to replace the bearing, but with safety paramount it's a job that needs to be done. A new steering wheel also went on in this particular case.

Luckily, the engine was in excellent order following an overhaul by Pat in the '80s. The engine oil and filters were replaced, the tappets adjusted and new fuel lift pump fitted too. Luckily, the fuel tank was in good order and didn't need any work after it had been power washed.

A complete overhaul of the cooling system took place, with the radiator, hoses, water pump and temperature gauge replaced. Tim had difficulty sourcing the correct fan guard, as he didn't want an aftermarket fibreglass example, but he managed to source an original, along with other parts, from a breaker in the UK. He has since learned that both types of fan guard are sold by Queensbury Tractor Parts (tel: 01387 811771).

As for the electrics, the original starter and dynamo were reconditioned and used again. A new battery was fitted but, unfortunately, a more authentic black-cased example was not available locally at the time. A new wiring loom was fitted, the >

original voltage regulator was tested and reused, new dash lights for oil pressure and charge were fitted and a new starter solenoid went on. Tim also made up new battery leads incorporating an isolator switch.

The original-type rear lights were sourced in UK and new front lights

were fitted. A new tachometer and drive cable had to be fitted and a registration plate bracket was fitted in the correct location with a period light.

The transmission was cleaned out and inspected and it transpired that new selectors were required. As for the hydraulic system, it did not work as it should and so the lift cover was removed and the valves were found to be stuck. After removal and extensive cleaning, the valves and seats came up well and were fit for further use.

Professional finish

A new power take-off oil seal was fitted and following reassembly with a new filter and oil, the hydraulic system worked well and didn't require any adjustment. New lower links and check chains completed the work on the hydraulics.

The brakes were found to be serviceable and just needed

cleaning and adjusting. The earlystyle handbrake lever was badly seized, but after a session with the oxy-acetylene it freed off well. It operates as it should, but Tim feels that it's best not to park on too many hills!

Unfortunately, the wheel rims were in quite a state and new ones had to be purchased, along with wheel studs, nuts and new tyres – BKT 6.00x16s on the front and 12.4/11-28s on the rear.

The mudguards and footplates were too far gone to repair, so new ones were sourced from Clifford Tractor Parts in Ballymacelligott, near Tralee in Co. Kerry. Tim says that they are excellent quality and fitted perfectly first time. A new seat was obtained and new cushions went on. The nose cone and bonnet needed a lot of fabrication work, which was done flawlessly by a friend of the Lynch family.

Much of the Dexta was rubbed down with a sander and wire wheel, with the exceptions being the front axle and linkage parts, which were sandblasted. A lot of time went into carefully cleaning the tractor down to bare metal, with extra care taken where cast codes and engine numbers are stamped.

Although Tim is very capable with a spray gun, he wanted a professional finish and decided to outsource the work to a friend. Two coats of synthetic primer went on and were rubbed down before two coats of Vapormatic 'Empire Blue' were applied by Tommy Shanahan of Shanahan's Bodyshop.

A flawless, dust-free finish on the Dexta tinwork followed, which really makes the tractor stand out. After assembly, new chrome badges were obtained and hand painted to finish the detailing and the 1958 Dexta was completed with a key coat of wax, not polish, to protect it for the future.

Due to Covid-19, the tractor has not been seen at any shows, but it looks set to be a prize winner when the time is right. Tim's not one to rest on his laurels and his next project is a 1952 Fordson E1A Major.

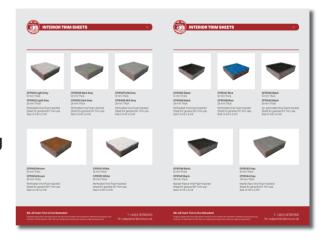

Hi-Performers

Scott Lambert looks back fondly at an often overlooked British-built range of tractors from the late 1970s and early '80s.



nternational Harvester's
Worldwide Series, launched
in 1970, has enjoyed a great
deal of acclaim over the years
– and rightly so. It was a brand-new
range of tractors, launched with
the 454 and 574, that would set
new standards in design, operator
comfort and performance.

This well-liked series of tractors evolved into the Hi-Performers range – better known as the 84 Series – and, ultimately, the Fieldforce range (85 Series) – but question anyone on their favourite IH model from the '70s and '80s and very few will choose a model from the Hi-Performers range. Why is this?

Many, and until recently I would have counted myself among this group, appear to see the 84 Series as a 'warmed over' version of its predecessor – a range of tractors with fresh styling that was essentially the same underneath as the 574 et al, but is this a fair synopsis?

To establish the facts we must look in more detail at the tractors in the range, with the exception of the Bradford-built 384 – as it, like the 354, 444 and 374 before it, was an old design that could trace its roots back to the B-250, and not a true Worldwide Series model.

Come 1977, and the introduction of the Hi-Performers, the D-179-engined 454 was logically replaced by the 484, but for the remaining models things were not quite as straightforward. The defunct 474, powered by the short-stroke D-206 engine and replaced by the Perkinsengined 475, made a 'return' in the form of the 584.

The 574 (68hp) and 674 (78hp) had both used the D-239 engine, as did the new 684, but the 784 and Hydro

84 were powered by the D-246 – an engine introduced in 1974, midway through production of the Worldwide Series. The range-topping 884, which came later, utilised the D-268 engine – a well-liked motor that would go on to power thousands of 844XL tractors.

The beauty of this family of engines was that it was a proven concept of three- and four-cylinder direct-injection units built at IH's Neuss-on-Rhine plant in Germany. The engine range was designed to share many components between the three-cylinder D-155 (533 tractor) and the six-cylinder DT-402 (1455 and, later, 1455XL).

The design incorporated removable wet cylinder liners to ensure efficient cooling and featured plateau honing to reduce oil consumption. The four-cylinder engines, powering the bulk of the 84 Series, used balanced ▶



and hardened, forged steel crankshafts – with two contrarotating weighted gears running at twice the crank speed to dampen any vibration.

The D-268, also a 'new' engine to UK eyes as far as tractors were concerned, was a long-stroke version of the D-246 that IH tweaked to help dissipate the heat produced when generating the additional 5hp.

Transmissions

IH had learned from experience and chose to increase the number of 'pads' used on its 11-inch Dyna-Life clutches – with four used on the smaller models in the range and a six-pad unit fitted to the 784 and 884.

The option of the Torque Amplifier transmission

remained, doubling the number of gears available to the operator and providing a 20 per cent increase in torque when switching out of direct drive.

The 84 Series gearbox retained the four synchronised ratios of its predecessor, selected using what IH called a 'lightning' shift pattern – with first gear at the top of the console to the left of the seat. Moving the lever forwards and down changed up through the gears. Slow and fast versions of the transmission were available – just as they had been previously.

In the range section of the gearbox, high, low or reverse could be selected by the other lever on the left-hand console, before drive

reached the output pinion shaft. As was the case with the speed element of the transmission, varying crown wheel and pinion ratios were available and a small plate on the clutch bell housing indicated, via coding, what ratios the tractor was fitted with.

Unlike the previous range, a sole hydrostatic model was offered. The Hydro 84, rated at 77hp, was the only tractor in the 84 Series with such a transmission as IH had learned that anything with less power was not really up to the job.

The little International 454 had proved that the three-cylinder D-179 was simply not powerful enough to run a hydrostatic transmission, as the system was less efficient and needed a more powerful engine to reach the same rated PTO power as its gear drive counterpart.

To illustrate this, it's worth noting that using the same engine as the 784, rated at 80hp, the Hydro 84 produced a similar amount of power at the power take-off as the 72hp 684.

Hydraulics

There was little change in the rear end as there was no need to radically alter things, despite the design approaching 10 years old. The Worldwide Series was at the cutting edge when it was introduced in 1970 and seven years on, when the 84 Series was launched, it was still an advanced piece of kit.

Using Hy-Tran, an oil suited to both the tractors' hydraulic and transmission systems, a small transfer/lubrication pump in the base of the transaxle maintained the correct oil level in different compartments.

The Multi-Control Valve (MCV) was bolted to the exterior and it was this unusual casting that housed one of the most wonderful box of tricks to ever grace an International Harvester tractor!

Its contents enabled a single main pump, attached to the rear of the MCV, to be used for all of the tractor's hydraulic systems. Inside the MCV was a flow divider to prioritise oil for the steering system and power take-off clutch pack, while the remainder was sent to the linkage and spool valves.

a suction filter, incorporating a bypass valve, a pilot relief valve, PTO pressure regulator, PTO control valve (permitting feathered engagement of the PTO and braking of the shaft when not engaged), steering return check valve and steering safety valve. Like the 74 Series, the Hi-Performers were fitted with two PTO shafts – one with six splines and the other with 21.

The hydraulically-operated, selfadjusting brakes used oil-cooled

Other MCV components included

The hydraulically-operated, self-adjusting brakes used oil-cooled discs for trouble-free stopping power, with an equalising valve to ensure even braking when the pendant pedals were latched together. Unfortunately, IH made no attempt to alter the design of the parking brake, which had already gained notoriety.

The cable-operated contracting band, around a drum on the pinion shaft, was not strong enough to stall the tractor if it was left engaged and so it was possible to drive the tractor with the parking brake 'on'. This could result in the friction material being destroyed and contaminating the oil, resulting in damage to hydraulic components, often at considerable expense.



The most obvious differences between the Hi-Performers and the Worldwide Series were in their appearance. With IH having introduced the US-built 86 Series ➤

in 1976, and incorporating a greater use of black, IHGB styled the 84 Series to match.

Amongst the prominent features were black rear cab pillars with a chrome outline, black stripe decals (with a white outline) on the bonnet and cab doors and a taller bonnet with a nose that leaned forward slightly, rather than sloping back. The round, enamelled silencer of the 74 Series gave way to one of oval profile, which meant the operator's view was less obstructed.

The changes to the cab were rather interesting, as they had to be made in order for the 84 Series to match the 86 Series and European-built models – such as the 955. To enable a wider rear post to be fitted to the cab, a folded steel section was welded to the original ROPS frame – which led to the design of the side

window changing from a sliding type to rear-hinged units.

Plus, despite no obvious changes at first glance, the doors were slightly different – with a larger lower portion and less glass as a result. This enabled the doormounted black stripe to align with the corresponding one on the bonnet!

The standard roof profile was now higher than that of the outgoing 74 Series, but without a heater/blower. It won praise for its increased headroom, but made all the difference when going in and out of low buildings.

The sidelights and indicators were also moved to the front of the cab, rather than the front of the mudguards, in a bid to prevent driver distraction in hours of darkness. This was a simple solution that had the desired effect.

Cabs

Perhaps the most noticeable changes in the cab, for the operator at least, were in the dash panel. The 74 Series started life with a faux wood panel housing four small gauges that displayed the tractor's vital signs, but with improved noise legislation in 1976 came the need to shroud this for sound-deadening purposes.

Rather than keep this chunky rubber insulation, a new, black plastic dash panel was incorporated into the cab on the 84 Series. Gone was the quartet of gauges – replaced by fuel and temperature gauges, with a large tachometer to the left-hand side.

With the oil pressure and ammeter gauges replaced by warning lights, the new, minimal look was arguably smarter, but it was evident that not a great deal of thought had gone



The dash panel was simple and well laid out, but some of the warning lights were difficult to see in bright light.

into it. It worked well in the dark and in the confines of a shed, but in the bright sunlight it was hard to see some of the warning lights – particularly the parking brake 'on' warning. Given that this had been an issue on the 74 Series, it's hard to believe that IH didn't address this from the off.

It was eventually rectified in 1980, when IH announced that a flashing amber warning lamp would be inserted into a hole in the left-hand portion of the dash to indicate when the parking brake was applied.

IH's engineers had improved what started life as a basic, bolt-together ROPS, but more needed to be done if it was to stand a fighting chance against the competition. They had done a good job of converting it to being an ISO-mounted unit for the 1976 'O' cab legislation, but it was still quite basic – a flat floor would improve matters greatly.

IH was developing what became known as the XL, but it wasn't

ready for production and so the obvious solution was to fill the gap with a unit already on the market. Thankfully, IH didn't have to look very far, with Sekura's Barnsley facility less than 20 miles away from IHGB's Doncaster works.

Those of you familiar with the David Brown 1410 and John Deere's OPU will remember the IH flat-floor cab in similar guises, but the Hi-Performers would have the edge thanks to the side-mounted gear levers.

It wasn't all plain sailing, as IH engineers had to re-jig the gear lever assembly to make it function as intended. Using the original 'L' cab lever arrangement proved that problems would occur, with linkages binding/jamming, so the solution was to alter the arrangement to make it better suited to the Sekura cab

In short, it was simplified, but this meant that the speed positions were reversed in the quadrant – with fourth now nearest the rear window. This change occurred after the 'Super Deluxe' cab was introduced.

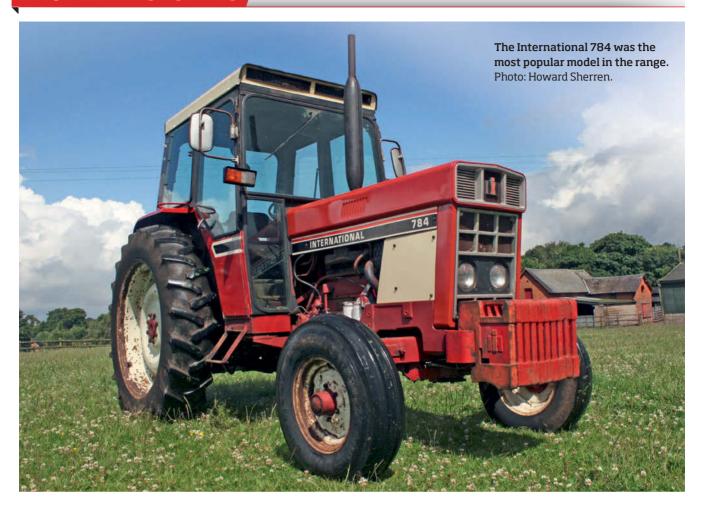
This cab brought numerous benefits, as it insulated the operator more effectively from heat and noise, made adjustment of the right-hand linkage drop rod possible from the seat, provided a decent windscreen washer and enabled a larger fuel tank to be fitted. In addition, creature comforts included a heater/blower unit, sun visor, interior lamp and roof hatch. This, naturally, came at a price, with the Super Deluxe setting the purchaser back an additional £770 over the standard cab.

Other changes

At the front, a new bolster now supported the front axle – with the obvious benefit being the ability to bolt a weight frame directly to it. The larger models also benefited from a heavier bolster and more substantial front axle.

For those that required the benefits that four-wheel drive could offer, all models from the 584 could initially be specified with a driven front axle (until the four-wheel drive 584 was discontinued early in 1978). Like the Worldwide Series, the Hi-Performers utilised a Japanese-built axle from KIMCO – a joint venture between IH and Komatsu. It was an unusual design, with epicyclic reductions each side of the differential and no outboard wheel hub reduction, as well as side drive.

The axle was driven by a twopiece propshaft, with support at the clutch housing, and drive taken from the side PTO opening on the transmission. A gearbox, complete with clutch, bolted on in lieu of the cover plate.

It was not the strongest of systems and IH chose to replace it with a ZF side-drive unit come the introduction of the 85 Series.

The rear of the 84 Series experienced some upgrades too – the most obvious being a new pick-up

hitch with telescopic lift rods and the reversible drawbar clevis/hook, alleviating the need to stow the drawbar when not in use. The other obvious benefit is that the pick-up hitch could be released without opening the rear window.

Summary

We have merely covered the obvious differences between the original Worldwide Series tractors and the 84 Series Hi-Performers, as there were many more subtle changes that space constraints do not allow us to include.

Some addressed flaws in the original design, whereas others improved upon the original or were introduced as components from external sources were changed or superseded.

Many other improvements were made to the 84 Series during its production run too, including upgrades to the four-wheel drive system, but space also precludes us from featuring them. Regardless of their nature, these changes largely improved upon the original design and took the 84 Series forward to a point where it would metamorphosise into the 85 Series Fieldforce tractors – one of IH's best-loved ranges.

Today, the 84 Series models do not command the affection of the predecessors or their successors, which is a shame given their pedigree and obvious ability. Parts are plentiful and good examples can still be found, with a host of specialists on-hand to assist users and would-be owners.

If you own an 84 Series model, parts can be obtained from the likes of Intatrac UK Ltd. of Shropshire and Tractorparts.co.uk Ltd. of Leicestershire, while potential purchasers are advised to contact K G Kingston of Somerset.

Pin replacement

PART

The task of replacing the linkage arm pins took a turn for the worst when a broken differential pinion support casting was discovered.



The original job of replacing the link arms support pins turned into something greater when the broken casting was discovered!

hen I first began the job of changing the worn link arm pins, little did I know what was in store. It must be four or five years since I first began using the tractor, after rebuilding the engine and other items. The rear axle had always sounded a little rough compared with my grey/gold FE 35, but it had never let me down.

For anybody who hasn't read the previous parts of this feature, the problem turned out to be a failed rear pinion bearing in the differential, which had expanded and blown the casting around it, which compromised the support that the main pinion bearings had, hence the noise.

New casting

I wasn't happy to reassemble the tractor as it was, and the only option has been to replace the casting with a fresh one, which is involving a complete strip of the rear end of the tractor.

I found a second-hand casting from an industrial Massey Ferguson 205, which had carried a backhoe and loader. The gearbox and axle trumpets were still attached to it, and the hydraulic pump was also still present, so the vendors placed the whole rear end on a trolley, allowing me to dismantle it in their workshop.

An inspection of the bare casting showed it to be the same as the original 35 one, the only significant difference being the four tapped holes for the drawbar are larger at ¾ UNC, rather than ¼ UNC of the original. This means they are stronger than the originals, so they'll be better!

Extra work

Before I'd realised the extent of the problem I'd already replaced the right-hand axle trumpet after renewing the link arm pin, so this will have to come off once again. An initial cleaning of the casting included running some taps through the threads to clean them out and allowed me to inspect them.

Also, the gasket surfaces of the hydraulic cover and the circular side plates required sanding to remove some light surface rust, as the rear



Failed bearing

The extra work has been caused by this failed pinion support bearing, which fractured the casting – rendering it scrap.



Fresh casting

A complete replacement casting was sought and this one, from an industrial Massey Ferguson 205, was a match for the original – albeit the wrong colour!



How it should look

This is how the bearing surround should look. The two holes are to carry an oil deflector/ end cover for the bearing.



Top cover

The hydraulic top cover will have to be removed, so a bracket is to be made to assist lifting with the engine crane.



Lifting bracket

This bracket, made from some 50x6mm steel will replace the seat...

end had been standing outside unprotected. This was done using emery cloth and WD-40, which brought the faces up nicely.

With all the threads clean and the gasket-mating surfaces clean, all that's left to do is to clean it up thoroughly internally before swapping it over.

Hydraulic top cover

The next task was to remove the top cover. This is heavy and is easier handled with the engine crane. I fabricated a bracket to bolt to the seat mountings to facilitate lifting the cover. This was made from a length of 50x6mm steel, cut and drilled, with an eye welded on for the crane hook to pass through.

Before attempting to unbolt and lift the cover, both circular side covers were removed to allow me to see the hydraulic control levers that operate the roller on the pump control valve. When fitted, the levers are in front of the roller on a 35, so the valve rocker needs to be held back when refitting the cover, but before lifting it I operated the quadrant levers to check the operation of the system.

The crane made light work of the top cover, which was put aside ready for cleaning and refitting at a later date.

Output shaft

Looking into the open casing revealed the gearbox output shaft. This has a splined tube located by a large split pin, which has to come out to allow the tube to telescope to shorten the shaft. Removal is made easier by placing the high-low lever into the high range, which puts the collar forward – making more room. Once out, access to the hydraulic pump is easy.

PTO guard & check chains

Before the hydraulic pump could be removed the PTO shaft had to be withdrawn. The PTO guard and check chains were removed, along with the PTO shaft retaining plate. With the retaining plate removed, a punch was placed in the hole in the PTO shaft and a crowbar used as a fulcrum against the axle housing to extract the shaft, which was also put aside for later on.

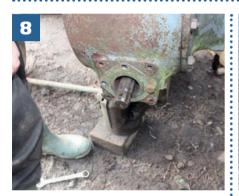
Fitting the bracket

Stud removal

Studs were removed from the scrap casting, as the ones that came with the replacement are too long, as the industrial tractor had different axle trumpets.



PT0 shaft

Next to come off was the PTO shaft, after removal of the PTO guard and check chains with their brackets and the retaining plate.



Bolts out

Top cover bolts were next on the list. The circular side plates were also removed to allow a view inside before lifting the cover.



All clear

The engine crane made a light job of lifting the top cover. It can be lifted manually, but is awkward to handle – especially with the lift arms attached.

Hydraulic pump

The next and final component to be removed before removing the right-hand axle trumpet was the hydraulic pump. This is located by two steel dowels – one each side of the transmission casing. These are each secured by two 5/6 UNF nuts and once these were clear the pump was lifted out of the tractor and placed on top of the housing to allow excess oil to drain from it before storing this away too.

The pump has been removed once before, as I remember when we'd got the engine running after its rebuild the hydraulic lever was raised and the pressure relief valve was stuck. When the draft lever was raised the excess pressure caused the four lift cylinder studs to shear.

We were lucky because I have seen top covers split due to the relief valve being stuck. A new one was obtained at the time and fitted whilst the top cover was off the tractor, and the pump removed, inspected and cleaned too before refitting.

Pinion shaft

All that remained to do at this stage was to remove the pinion shaft, which carries the broken bearing on its rear end. This is secured by six setscrews with ¹³/₁₆ AF heads, and carries a gear wheel that operates the PTO shaft in ground control.

I had removed a very rusty pinion shaft from the replacement casting and managed to get a $^{13}\!/_{16}$ AF openended spanner in to do this, but not so

easily on my MF 35 pinion shaft. The ground speed drive gear is larger in diameter than the later MF 205 gear, with less clearance for the spanner to access the lower setscrews.

A close scrutiny of the shaft showed the gear to be secured by a threaded sleeve locked by a tab washer. The shaft was rotated until the locking tab was showing and a punch used to straighten it up. A chisel was used to 'lock' the gear whilst a second chisel was used to loosen the sleeve, which seemed quite loose and unscrewed very easily.

This allowed the gear, complete with the front tapered roller bearing, to come free and gain access to the three lower setscrews. The shaft was then withdrawn and stored away, ready to

First snag!

All removed

Removing the sleeve enabled the gear and bearing housing to come apart, allowing spanner access. The bearing pre-load will be reset on reassembly!

This inner race will have to be removed using a three-legged puller before replacing with a fresh bearing.



New parts

These are the new gaskets and bearings supplied by Agriline Products. I may have to order some extra gaskets and hydraulic O-rings, as I overlooked them in the first parts order.

remove the inner race of the broken bearing.

Different ratio

Whilst comparing the two pinion shafts it was noted that the differential ratios differ between the Massey Ferguson 35 and the MF 205 – the 205 appearing to be

a higher ratio than the 35, which would figure, as the 205 features epicyclic reduction housing in the axle trumpets, whilst the 35 half shafts are direct, with no reduction.

This won't make any difference to the procedure, as the shafts are interchangeable. New gaskets and bearings for the task have been supplied by Agriline Products (tel: 01527 579111 or visit the website: www.agrilineproducts.com).

In the next issue I intend to cover the reassembly of the tractor and hopefully conclude the task I originally set out to do! Such trials are part of owning old machines.

Mower overhaul

Further progress has been made on the MF 732 mower, with work beginning on the cutter bed and PTO universal joint. Andrew Hall provides an update.



hen I embarked on the project I was looking for one that was not weather dependent, as I lack hard cover for my projects, and the prospects of applying any paint to them during the winter months is extremely slim! However, this has fitted the bill very nicely as some renovation was overdue on it, having languished under a Leylandii hedge for a few years.

Cutter bed

In this issue I have started the work on the cutter bed, as the mower was a donor for a set of fingers when I restored my Massey Ferguson 779 mid-mounted mower. Fortunately, I acquired a spare cutter bed, also from a 779 mower, with a decent set of fingers, so this has allowed a new lease of life for the 732.

At some time in the past somebody had painted the mower in Stoneleigh grey and covered the whole cutter bar. This didn't do anything to improve the cutting performance of the machine, but had certainly preserved the metalwork. When extracted from the hedge, the fingerless cutter bed had survived well, but one or two bolts had been left without nuts on them, so needed some attention.

These secure the bed to the casting and are square countersunk bolts, so not easily obtained. To access these

I had to remove the wear plate from the casting, which had been in place for many moons. The larger bolt at its rear came off with little effort, but the countersunk plough bolt at the front edge spun when a spanner was applied, so no time was wasted and it was ground off with the mini grinder!

This had to come off anyway, as the metal behind it hasn't been protected by any paint, so was quite rusty. The two bolts are ½ UNF threads, and after removing the wear plate they were tapped out, given a vigorous wire brushing and a ½ UNF die run down the threads to clean them up.

The next items to remove were the guides for the inner end of the knife, which include a pack of shims to adjust the play in the knife. These were slightly rusty, but were deemed fit for further use after some cleaning up.

Paint removal

The paint that had been applied to the cutter bed needed to be removed, as my intention is to clean the cutter bar up as much as possible and reset it to cut cleanly. This was done with a flap wheel in the mini grinder, removing all the paint residue and shining up the steel at the same time.

Donor cutter bar

Attention then turned to the donor cutter bar to remove all the fingers, wear plates and knife clips. These are held on by $\%_6$ -diameter square countersunk bolts with $^{11}\!\!/_{\!6}$ AF nuts, all of which came off with no argument with a little WD-40 applied. These were kept in the correct order ready for cleaning and fitting to the mower at a later stage.

PTO shaft

Next on the list was replacement of the universal joint and yoke on the forward end of the PTO shaft. This was because the original yoke was the smaller $1\frac{1}{6}$ in-diameter with an adapter, which was stuck inside. I attempted to remove it without success, so decided to replace the yoke and use a new universal joint spider too.

To fit this, the holes in the shaft yoke were polished up with emery cloth, along with the new one, to allow easy fitting of the spider cups. Starting with the shaft side, the two new cups were pressed into the yoke in the vice and the new spider inserted whilst the cups were pressed fully into the yoke, with the spider overlapping each cup to preserve alignment.

A suitable socket was then used to press each cup fully into the yoke to allow the circlips to be fitted. Care was taken to ensure each cup was lined up squarely before attempting to press them into the yoke, as any discrepancy can damage the cups and yoke.

The same procedure was used for the second part, which involved fitting the new yoke, followed by fitting the new grease nipple into the centre of the spider.

In due course a new PTO guard will be fitted to ensure safe operation of the mower and to prevent any grass wrapping around the PTO shaft when being used.

Setting up

The success of a finger mower relies on the correct setting up of the cutter bar, so I am going to take some time to cover this in future issues of *T&M*, and any thoughts of painting the mower will be on hold until some decent weather returns!



Countersunk bolts

These two countersunk-headed bolts will have to be removed to clean them up, as they have been without any nuts fitted for some time.



Punched out

The two bolts need to be gently punched out without damaging the threads to enable them to be cleaned up for further use.



Further cleaning

Removal of the guide plates and shim packs revealed further rust that needs dealing with before proceeding with the rebuild of the cutter bar.



Cleaning mower bed

This was cleaned up with the grinder and flap wheel to remove the old dead paint and to polish up the steel, prior to reassembling the cutter bar.



Wear plate removed

To gain access to the bolts, the wear plate had to come off after grinding the front plough bolt off, due to it spinning when a spanner was applied. The plate is rusty, so will benefit from paint anyway!



5/8 UNF die

A die was used to run along the threads to clean them up, followed by a vigorous wire brushing to remove all traces of surface rust before refitting them.



Guide & shims

These will also be cleaned up and reused. They adjust the amount of play on the inner end of the reciprocating knife, to provide a clean cut.



Further progress

A liberal coat of WD-40 was applied to prevent any rust forming on the freshly-cleaned metalwork and new nuts found for the two countersunk-headed bolts.

WORKSHOP: WINTER PROJECT



PTO shaft

For a change I then began the replacement of the front universal joint and yoke of the PTO shaft. A new yoke and spider were obtained from Vapormatic for this task.



Polished up

The internal holes of the yokes of both the shaft and replacement yoke were polished up to allow easy fitting of the new joint.



Pressed in

The new cups were pressed in whilst the spider was fitted and overlapped into each cup as pressing progressed to retain alignment.



Socket used

A suitable socket was used to press the cups in fully to allow the new circlips to be fitted before...



Grease nipple

... fitting the new grease nipple into the centre of the spider, with it angled to allow for easy grease gun access.



All done

The finished joint ready for fitting back onto the mower when rebuilding. A new PTO guard will also be fitted for safety.

Rare Ferguson 35



guide for FE 35

odd model. My grandfather
bought the tractor in 1967
from a Yugoslavian agro-

cooperative that had used it for 10 years by then.

It has been painted, so I don't know what the

original paint scheme was and the cab is a farm-built example. The serial no is: SNF 42114.

My question is how can it have a Perkins three-cylinder engine and be built in 1957? Both the Heritage Machines website and Wikipedia state that Perkins engines were fitted from 1959. Thank you, and I hope this interests you.

A It would appear that you have a very interesting and rare example of the FE 35 tractor. A check of your serial number confirms it was built in 1957 and the prefix letters denote that it is Perkins powered. The

prefix SNF stands for – S: Standard-width chassis, N: Perkins engine and F: Single stage clutch (nonlive drive).

A scrutiny of your engine shows it to be an early Perkins P3(TA), as it features the early starter motor and inline fuel injection pump with exposed drive coupling. From this I think that your tractor may have been a prototype to test the Perkins engine to address the starting issues that the Standard 23C diesel engine had, and would have possibly just predated the acquisition of Perkins Engines of Peterborough by Massey Ferguson in 1959.

Ferguson 35

I have a Ferguson 35, featuring the diesel-powered 23C engine. Just like many others it is extremely difficult to start from cold. In fact, mine is reluctant to start at any time, but runs well once started and is a bit smoky and doesn't appear to burn any oil.

I have thought about a way to enable the engine to crank faster than it does currently, and I am thinking of replacing the dynamo with an alternator to put a greater charge into the battery. I'm not sure how to wire it though and any advice would be welcome.

From what you say we don't think replacing the dynamo with an alternator will solve your starting problems, but would recommend you check out the engine first. If, as you say, the

engine runs well once started, this points to a timing issue for both valve timing and fuel injection timing.

It is important that the timing chain is set correctly with the chain taught on the tension side and that the injection pump is also set accurately. Space precludes a full procedure of retiming the engine, so I would recommend you obtain a copy of the official workshop manual to provide the correct timing instructions.

If you'd still like to fit an alternator you won't need to use the original cut-out/regulator (control box). Remove the heavy brown cable that runs from the battery live terminal on the starter solenoid to the ammeter on the dashboard, and also the brown/white cable from the ammeter to the control box.

When the alternator is fitted you need to run a fresh cable from the alternator main terminal via the ammeter to the battery live terminal on the starter solenoid. The original



dynamo wires (D & F) will be redundant and can be taped up to insulate them and the control box can be removed.

I would suggest you upgrade the ammeter to 60-0-60 amps and use a 60-amp cable from the alternator to the starter solenoid via the ammeter. You also need to ensure the tractor is wired for a negative earth for the alternator! If, however, you improve your engine's starting, you probably won't need to fit an alternator and will be able to retain the tractor's originality. A good dynamo will keep your battery charged adequately!



Bean tool frame

I recently acquired a Bean tool frame, as I fancied something different to work on and to display at shows. The machine is virtually complete, but as yet I haven't been able to run it, as the engine needs some recommissioning. It turns over, but lacks compression, due presumably to stuck valves.

After some research I've learned that the engine is a Ford 8hp unit, but I haven't any information regarding its specification. Also, once I strip the engine to undertake the work on it, I know I'm going to need replacement gaskets and other sundries. Unfortunately, I don't have any leads regarding spares for the engine and would appreciate

any advice and information you may be able to provide, as I'd like to complete the work on it over the winter in readiness for the forthcoming rally season.

The Bean is certainly something different, and will definitely generate some conversation when seen on the rally field! As you say, the engine is a Ford Eight unit, which was used in many of Ford's smaller cars from the early 1930s to the early 1960s.

It is a side-valve engine and was very basic in its construction and cheap to mass-produce. Fortunately, the cars in which the engines are fitted are well catered for, and spares for the engines are available from companies such as Small Ford Spares – tel: 01684 219865 or visit: www. smallfordspares.co.uk

Despite the simple nature of these engines, they aren't the easiest of units to work on. The main and big end bearings have white metal direct onto the cylinder block and connecting rods, and don't have separate bearing shells. The valves run in split guides and have flared ends.

When grinding these to re-seat them, the guides have to be in place, or alternatively there is a special tool to support the valves. The valve (tappet) clearances are adjusted by grinding the end of each valve to obtain the correct clearance. Basic specification for the engine is as follows:

Fordson Major Diesel

The oil level in my '54 Major's rear axle was rising and the gearbox level had dropped. A friend said it might be a failed seal on the PTO driveline between the gearbox and rear axle.

I drained the oil in both the axle and gearbox and replaced the 'offending' seal, but to no avail, as it still spills oil from the front to the rear axle. Where do you think the problem lies?

Your oil leak is almost certainly a failed oil seal on the gearbox output shaft. The tractor will need to be split between the gearbox and rear axle to access this. The seal runs on a sleeve, which may be worn at the point of contact with the seal, so it may be a good idea to remove and turn this round to present a new surface for the new seal to contact.



780 rescue

With the winter weather too bad to prepare and apply paint, Andrew Hall finishes the repairs to the bonnet and begins work on the

electrics and dashboard.



ne of the problems of not having any cover to undertake the work on my tractors is that opportunities to complete the work are restricted due to the weather. If conditions had been favourable I would have had the skid unit of the tractor painted by now.

However, as previously mentioned, the bonnet has been the most challenging part of the restoration to repair and, as a result, has taken longer than first envisaged. Most of the repairs have been completed, and the February issue covered repairs to the chin panel.

Support bracket

The last remaining part to refit to the bonnet was the support bracket that is welded into the centre of the chin panel and secures the bonnet to the front casting. I cut the whole thing off when I began the repairs to the chin panel with the intention of welding it back into place when the chin panel was completed.

The bracket sits on a thick reinforcement plate, which was originally spot-welded to the chin panel. After some thought I decided to remove the bracket from this plate and to weld it onto a new piece of steel. The bracket was covered with surface rust and after some initial cleaning up I could just about make out where the spot-welds were, due

to the dimples in the surface of the steel. I then centre punched them – six in total – and drilled them out with a 10mm-diameter drill in the pillar drill. This liberated the bracket from the original rusty reinforcement plate.

A measure of the old plate was made and a new piece of steel cut to size. The bracket was then thoroughly cleaned up before placing it in position and plug welding it to the newly-made plate with the MIG welder using 0.6mm-diameter MIG wire on a setting of three on the one-to-six heat setting.

Chin panel

Attention then turned to the repaired chin panel, which required some cleaning up behind it with a

flap wheel in the mini grinder. After drilling holes for plug welding, the support bracket was centred and set at the correct height, and then welded into position.

The steel of the reinforcement plate is thicker than the chin panel steel, so care was needed not to burn holes into the front surface of the panel. With this complete, the bonnet was put aside for paint preparation at a later date!

Dashboard and wiring

When the tractor was originally dismantled, the wiring loom was removed whilst still attached to the dashboard panel. The instruments are in poor condition and are to be replaced, but my intention is to retain the original loom if possible,

but to do this I needed to mark up the wiring where it attaches to the various instruments and switches.

I used masking tape and wrote on each piece where the wires fit before attempting to remove the scrap instruments. The cut-out/regulator box sits on a bracket behind the dashboard and is stupidly secured by two cross-headed screws and %6AF nuts.

If they had been hexagon-headed setscrews it would have been easier to remove them. The shape of the dashboard precluded using a long screwdriver, but the rusty heads meant I had to use vice grips, which resulted in shearing the screws anyway. I know what I'm going to use when I reassemble it, and it won't be cross-headed screws!

Once the loom and cut-out/ regulator box were clear of the dashboard, the instruments and switches offered little resistance with the use of some WD-40 to assist. The three warning lights – oil pressure, hydraulic filter and charge – are too far gone to retain, so will be replaced.

Stop control

The final part to come off the dashboard is the engine stop control cable. It has a die-cast red knob, which unscrews. This came off with no problems, but a 1/16AF locknut was a different story. The surrounding bracket shrouds the cable and prevents the use of vice grips to grip it, as a spanner is inadequate.

The cable is in good order so I'd like to keep it, so I may have to heat the nut up slightly in order to slacken it to allow removal of the cable. The dashboard can then be cleaned up and primed ready for some of that Orchid White paint that I'm looking forward to applying when the weather allows!

Chin panel

The repaired chin panel requires some cleaning up before re-attaching the support bracket, which locates behind it.



Spot-welds

Some initial cleaning showed up the spot welds, which were drilled out – allowing the bracket to be separated from the reinforcement plate.



Cleaned up

Plug welds were cleaned flush with the metal surface, but some further rust removal and treatment will be undertaken, along with the main bonnet, later on.



Welding finished

The welding of the bonnet is now finished and a thorough de-rusting and priming will take place when the weather allows.



Cut out

I cut the support bracket out of the chin panel before doing the panel repairs, leaving the reinforcement plate to be separated from the bracket and fitted to a fresh plate.



New plate

The bracket was fitted to the new reinforcement plate to be plug welded using the MIG welder, as explained in the text.



In position

The support bracket was placed in position prior to plug welding into place in the back of the chin panel.



Dashboard/electrics

I'd like to retain the original wiring loom if possible – this came away complete with the dashboard when the tractor was dismantled.

Ready for removal

The loom will need to be marked to enable wires to be correctly refitted before any wires are removed from the instruments and switches.



Scrap instruments

All the instruments will be replaced, as they are too far gone to consider renovating.



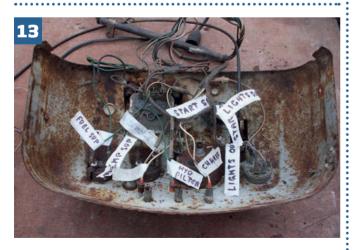
New parts

Warning lights

Unfortunately, the warning lights are also perished beyond further use, so some of the original pattern will be sought.



All marked up

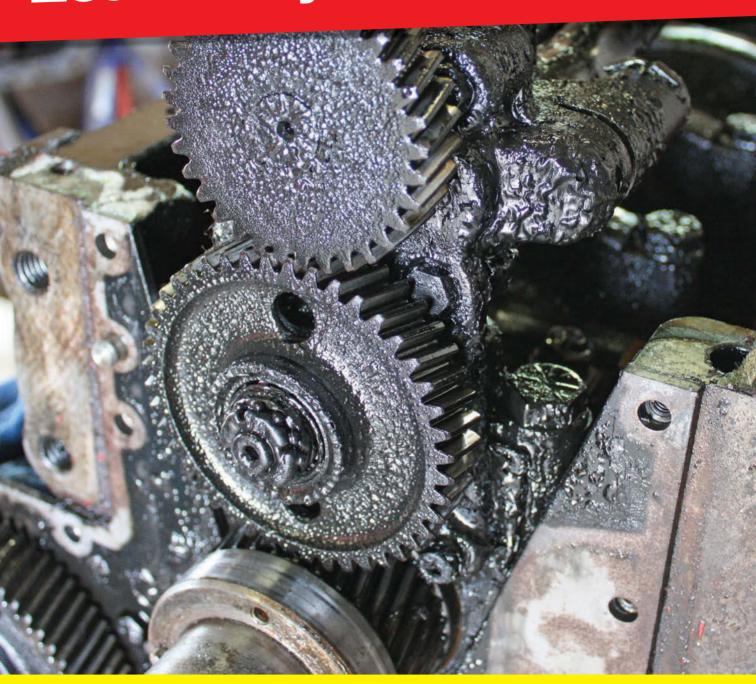
Masking tape was used to mark each wire before removal. 'Fuel sup' – meaning supply, and so on. This will help with reassembly.



Stop control

With the wiring clear of the dashboard, the remaining item to remove is the engine stop cable, which is proving stubborn due to a concealed lock nut.

The company sold more than 4,500 tractors and plant items throughout 2020 at its monthly Cambridge Machinery Auctions, with sales to more than 30 countries worldwide, amounting to an enormous £35m.

"It can be expected that as the Agriculture Bill finally gets ironed out and the future of subsidies becomes clearer that we may well see an increase in dispersal sales, however with Sterling still weak against the Euro, we would expect to see prices remain firm as European markets look to make the most of the quality second-hand machinery available."

VINTAGE & CLASSIC VALUES TO INCREASE?

In 2020, more than 3,200 vintage items were sold under the hammer via both online sales and at the regular Vintage Collective auctions at Cheffins' saleground at Sutton, Cambridgeshire, which took place in late July and October 2020.

The gross sales for classic machinery totalled a vast £3.5m. It saw Cheffins offer 380 classic and vintage tractors, 75 motorcycles, classic commercials and more than 500 automobilia items from the summer to December. There were also nine timed online sales throughout the year.

Highlights of the vintage sales in 2020 included an Irish-

owned short-nosed County 1474, in original condition, which achieved £74,000 at the on-site sale for Malcolm Beaton in Somerset. The Cambridge Vintage Sale in July also saw some spectacular prices, with £70,250 (plus commission and VAT) paid for a 1990 MB-trac 1100 and £53,000 paid for a 1917 Saunderson.

The regular collective sales at Cheffins saw impressive sums paid for vintage and collectors' items. The July auction was the first timed-online vintage sale offered by the firm, which grossed more than £900,000 and in October the sale grossed £1.2m.

William King, Cheffins MD, said: "Whilst the Covid-19 outbreak meant that we couldn't host some live auctions in the first half of the year, the results achieved at the timed on-line collective sale in July is indicative of the demand for good-quality vintage items.

"Our timed on-line sales are also increasing in regularity as both buyers and sellers become increasingly confident with the online format.

"We were pleased to be able to welcome live bidding in the October sale and are hopeful that 2021 will allow us to continue to offer visitors to Sutton, whilst of course following Government guidelines.

"This is a market which has been unaffected by the political or economic landscape, unlike many other asset classes, and vintage items continue to be hugely lucrative with values increasing year-on-year.

"With this in mind, we forecast that vintage prices will increase throughout 2021 as the market continues to gain momentum and we also expect to see a growth in both timed online sales and also on-site auctions as collectors come to appreciate these as one of the best ways to market vintage items."

SUCCESS FOR EURO AUCTIONS

Machines just kept rolling over the ramp and the show carried on through the stop-start 2020 at Leeds-based Euro Auctions. It was an unprecedented and extraordinary year on so many levels for the company in the

Euro Auctions still hosted its full calendar of sales, at its redeveloped flagship Leeds auction site, providing sellers with a financial lifeline, helping to sell equipment and put cash back into their businesses.

For 2020 it was a year of extremes and sadness for many, with Euro Auctions making an early decision to try and find a way to continue to operate at its site just outside Leeds, which is now acknowledged as being Europe's biggest auction site for plant and construction equipment and, to a lesser extent, agricultural machinery.

When Covid-19 struck, more than 5,500 lots of construction and agricultural equipment were on-site at Leeds, that had been committed to the auction. Euro Auctions had three choices: to repatriate machinery 'unsold' back to sellers, leave the lots for sale at the Leeds site for an indefinite period, or to find a way to make the sale work within the new government guidelines for Covid-19.

At that first sale in late March, the gates were locked, the public were not invited, and all equipment in the yard was sold online. The Euro Auctions team from Leeds, plus the local territory managers, created more than 2,500 video clips, of '30-second' duration, of all mobile equipment for sale, which were uploaded to the Euro Auctions online sales platform.

All videos were streamed online at the point of sale, to give bidders the feel of a live

auction, with the sale conducted in 'real time' by a team of 'live' auctioneers operating from the Yoder & Frey HQ in Ohio, USA. It worked, and it worked so well that this new format was repeated and was adopted by the rest of the group, worldwide.

Statistically, the full complement of the eight sales conducted at Leeds during 2020 succeeded on many levels. The hammer total saw an increase of seven per cent over the previous year and 40,717 individual pieces of machinery were sold, in comparison to 35,700 lots in

With all sales in 2020 being conducted via the Internet, with few floor bidders, the number of online transactions rose to 75 per cent, up from 46 per cent in 2019.

Bidder accounts for the year also showed an unprecedented increase from 17,321 in 2019 to 31,259 in 2020, an uplift of 80 per cent on the previous year.

Unsurprisingly, the number of online bidders doubled, but the curious thing was the growth in first-time bidders, with many new entrants to the Euro Auctions arena. Up by 133 per cent, the number of first-time bidders boomed and online registrations tripled throughout the same the period.





£20,000 was paid for this Ford 7000 in December.

During 2020, Euro Auctions continued to present a good complement of agricultural equipment at all sales, which included a regular consignment of tractors. Good late and lowhour examples went over the ramp at all sales in 2020, with no shortage of consignors, as well as regular enthusiastic bidders.



Ford 1910 sold for £4,250.

As Euro Auctions has a strong international client base, from more than 95 counties, with sales conducted online a strong global audience bought well.

With prices strong at all Euro Auction sales, including agricultural machinery, both buyers and sellers were happy with final hammer prices in 2020.

TRACTOR SALES REVIEWS

AMAZING YEAR FOR H J PUGH



The Ferguson Twose road roller made £24,000 at Brent Thomas' sale on 5 September.



£15,000 was paid for this MF 135 at H J Pugh's sale of the late Terry Frances' collection in October. This was the highest price paid for a 135 in 2020.

2020 was an amazing year for H J Pugh, based at Ledbury in Herefordshire, and included three record-breaking tractor and stationary engine sales.

Director Henry Biss said: "In many of our auctions, we have exceeded expectations for tractor and stationary engine prices in our sales, particularly in September and October, even with these being mainly online.

"We had a very strong start to the year on 11 January, when the company sold a County 1164 with blade and rear winch for £18,500 at an on-site sale."

Howard Pugh, Henry Biss and James Pugh moved inside for the sale of items on behalf of Phil Light and Peter Allan on 18 January, where they sold many rare stationary engines and a 1950 Turner Yeoman of England Mk2 (no. 162) for £15,200 (grade 4), the highest price for one of these tractors in some years.

Also sold was a rather 'dusty' 1953 Landini L45 hot bulb singlecylinder tractor that moved on at £7,600.

More than 100 tractors were sold at the Tractor World Spring sale in late February, including some entries from Italy. The organisers were lucky this event went ahead as heavy rain prior to the show meant that the River Severn burst its banks and caused substantial flooding in the area. On the showground, ground conditions were surprisingly good, with more than 11,000 people attending across the weekend.

Even though the monthly Hazle Meadows sales went very well throughout the year, featuring vintage, classic and modern tractors. The delayed late Doug Moule sale saw a Ferguson TE-F 20, made on the final day of production, sell for a record £6,300. This was overshadowed by Ian George's 1947 Field-Marshall Series One Contractor Mk2, no. 3185, that went on to sell for a record price of £16.500.

That was just the start, as the cancelled 2 May Brent Thomas sale was rescheduled for 5 September. It was held over two days with the main sale on the Saturday taking place in excellent weather conditions.

Late in the day the superb Ferguson salesman's demonstrator model made a staggering £10,600. This was £4,000 more than the previous record for one of these clockwork models. It has successfully been shipped across the world to the Robinson family in Western Australia.

The likable Brent Thomas' detailed knowledge of Ferguson machinery made the sale extremely popular, with record prices in every row you looked at. The Ferguson-Brown A. no. 909, was not much better than the example H J Pugh sold for £14,000 at Tractor World Spring in February, but who would have thought Howard Pugh would knock the hammer down at an amazing £31,000?

Other successful lots included a Ferguson beet topper that was sold at a fantastic £10,200, in grade 4 condition, and the Ferguson Twose roller that saw the hammer fall at an amazing £24,000! It's one of only two known with the rear tank and the price was exceptional given that the pre-sale estimate was £12,000-£14,000.

An original 1946 Ferguson TE-20, no. 69, finished things off at £9,000. It was an unforgettable

Henry Biss went on to say: "In October we had two more amazing record-breaking sales. In the middle of the month we had a wonderful collection of vintage and classic tractors

from the estate of the wellknown Terry Francis from Pembrokeshire, which is a very strong agricultural collectors' area. These tractors were varied and colourful and mostly well restored with plenty of money spent on them."

Amazingly, a Massey Ferguson 168 with cab went under the hammer at £20.500. A Frenchbuilt Massey Ferguson 158 fourwheel drive made an outstanding £22,000, vet another record, A French 1938 Le Percheron 25 hot bulb was purchased for an amazing £20,000.

"At the end of October, we held our biggest sale of the year at Osborne Farm, just outside Exeter, Devon, with 240 classic and vintage tractors being sold on behalf of Imbert (Bert) May. It was an important two-day dispersal sale that comprised the whole of his private collection. the line-up of vehicles in the field was incredible and a sight to behold!" said Henry.

Highlights had to be the two that sold for more than £70,000 each, both record-breaking prices! The highest hammer price of the sale was for a Doe 130, selling for £76,000, closely followed by a County 1184 TW military tractor with agricultural specification and a manual gearbox at £71,000. Perhaps the most outstanding price was the £39,000 for an original Massey Ferguson 188 - £22,000 over the estimate.

Our guide reflects the prices that have most recently been paid for veteran, vintage and classic tractors and it takes at least four issues of Tractor Mart for the full A-Z of tractors to appear.

The prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget. If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buving a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was

the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to

PRICE GUIDE KEY

What our coding system means

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1	A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.
Band 2	A tractor that is running and needs some work.
Band 3	The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been re-sprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.
Band 4	This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.
Band 5	A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.
Band 6	The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) - not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails - the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way - it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't on his agenda at all - so really

think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

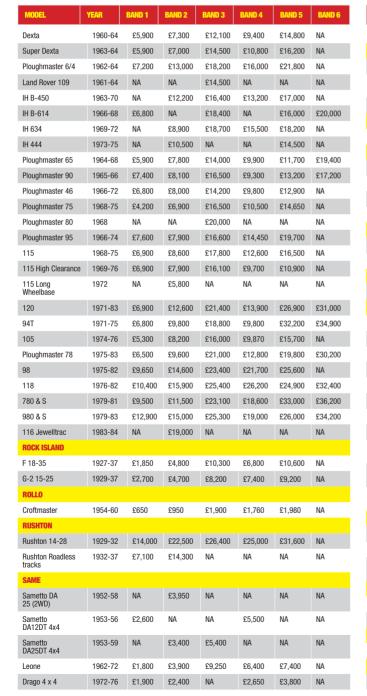
If buying an imported tractor - especially from North America - make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

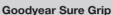

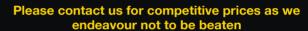

SALE Highlight RARE 1947 NEW HOLLAND 76 BALER



To find an advanced New Holland baler press of this kind and original condition that was imported just after World War Two is very hard to find. Well here is one that has come up for sale in north Somerset.

It was designed by Ed NoIt for New Holland at Intercourse (crossroads), Pennsylvania and the key to his success was that he held the bale under compression using a telescope con-rod that had an automatic latch with this it made the plunger stop were the chamber was full that then missed a stoke while the bale was automatically tied this was unique compared to any other balers of the time.

The baler was better balanced than the Case example that had its pickup at the front end by the drawbar and gave you a rupture if you tried to lift it and needed a three-furrow Case LA to pull it where as a smaller tractor could pull the New Holland far easier. The 73 came along in 1940, in fact the company went on to make 20,000 to that original design. Another fact not realized Nolt used a thicker twine that kept the bail together far better than other manufacturers of the time.

It went on to be imported to the UK after WW2 and sold by companies like TH White, AJ Ward, AT Oliver of Bedfordshire and others

This example has been so well looked after over the years and was one of the first to come to the UK and is fitted with the redoubtable VE4 (V-4) Wisconsin air- cooled engine, petrol with TVO kit. These came to the farm in creates and were assembled on site and is a one owner machine.

It was restored about 20 years ago, back then was fitted with all new belts and canvases, was last used about 10 years ago and has been barn stored since and features excellent tyres never used. In each issue our Editor-atlarge, Peter Love, takes a look at what has been going on in the world concerned with heritage preservation.

i everyone! I should be getting ready to head for Tractor World Spring but, sadly, it's all off. We can only hope things will come right later in the year.

A person who many of you will know is Maurice Houghton and I am sad to announce that he succumbed to Covid-19 in the early hours of Saturday 23 January, aged 83.

Maurice was a great champion of Ferguson, Massey Ferguson and John Deere equipment, having worked for F A Standen for more than 50 years as a mechanic/technician.

In retirement he restored tractors and implements with his son, Gary, also a motor technician and former stock car racer. Together they created some award-winning tractors, including a Ferguson 35. In September 2019 the Houghtons took another first prize at the Haddenham Steam Rally for their 12-stud axle Ferguson F-JE-A30 trailer, which certainly looked the part.

Maurice was always willing to help Ferguson and Massey Ferguson fans and will be sorely missed by all those that knew him. I and the *T&M* team send our sincere condolences to Maurice's widow, Janet, son Gary and the family at this sad time.

On to other matters now and I have been asked by a number of our Irish friends how they stand when exhibiting a tractor post-Brexit, particularly at our Tractor World shows and at the GDSF, as well as when bringing a tractor over to the UK for auction. After investigating, this is what has come to light and would like to thank Cheffins and Bonhams for their help with this matter.

- O. When bringing a vehicle into the UK from the EU for display purposes, or for private entry in a rally (e.g. GDSF, NVT&HS, Tractor World), would you have to pay VAT to come into the UK?
- A. If a vehicle is brought in by the owner then no import tax is due if it is for private use and not for sale etc. If not brought in by the owner, then there are temporary import regimes that can be used, like a carnet for instance.
- O. When importing a car for sale (e.g. Goodwood or Sutton) then 'exporting' it back to the owner in the case that it doesn't sell, is VAT payable?
- A. Any UK VAT liability is removed on export and any EU import VAT should be avoided, providing proof of export is available. The vehicle should be imported and exported by a known, VAT-approved shipper so that the UK VAT need not be paid. Otherwise it is paid and refunded once the export proof has been provided.
- O. There is still the matter of the Phytosanitary (Plant Health) certificate. Is it needed on a historic tractor when it is being exported?

 A. As yet we do not have an answer, but will inform you should this change. I would imagine that this certificate would be needed if the historic tractor has been brought in to attend a show or private event. It would certainly not apply to a 'historic tax class' (30 years old) car, steam engine or commercial vehicle,

but we await clarification from DEFRA on the matter of historic tractors.

Finally, I was looking at a 1948
New Holland 76 self-tying pickup
baler press in Somerset in late July,
which came to the UK in cases from
Pennsylvania, USA, and was used all
of its life on a farm not far from where
I was looking at it.

It would become the market leader by far and the key to its success was that he held the bale under compression using a telescopic conrod that had an automatic latch. This made the plunger stop when the chamber was full, then missed a stoke while the bale was automatically tied. This was unique at the time.

The baler was better balanced than others and used thicker twine that kept the bale together far better than some on the market. It was imported to the UK after WW2 and sold by companies like T H White, A J Ward and A T Oliver of Bedfordshire, as well as others.

This example has been well looked after over the years and was one of the first to come to the UK. It's fitted with a Wisconsin air-cooled engine and even has all of the original literature with it. It was great to see it and I would like to be in the field when it works next – something I can only dream of at moment, given the abundance of snow and ice as I write!

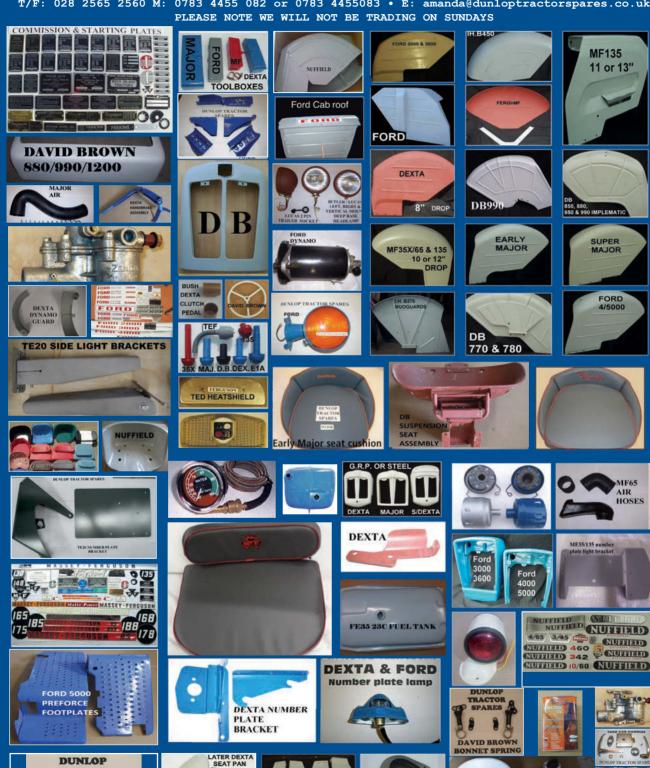
