Welcome!

ello and welcome to the
September issue of *Tractor* & *Machinery*. I hope you enjoy
reading about the Linssen
brothers' Massey Ferguson
fleet as much as I did. I find it
fascinating that their tractors have clocked
so many hours with minimal problems.

It is testament to their fastidious approach to servicing and maintenance and it makes me wonder whether the tractors in the Lambert 'collection' will enjoy such longevity, without major issues arising.

Our IH 523 has already fallen at the first hurdle, given that it had only clocked around 5,000 hours before needing an engine rebuild. This is hardly surprising, given that one of its former owners used it like a car for many years, travelling to and from the local shop at low revs, and not giving it any hard work.

This was its downfall and a rather undignified episode in the tractor's history, given that these Neuss-built engines have a reputation for longevity.

The other tractors in the collection have clocked anywhere between 3,000 and 7,000 hours, so hardly earth-shattering totals, and

unlikely to increase massively due to the fact that each racks up less than 50 hours per year.

A diesel engine benefits from good, hard work and although the tractors don't do a great deal, we try to give them a significant workout whenever possible, to improve their chances of a long life.

By the time you are reading this we will have given two of them a run out to a local classic vehicle event, and although this is no substitute for a day's ploughing, it will have provided some exercise and presented an opportunity to give them a good clean!

If I'm completely honest, attending the event is as much for me as it is to display the tractors for others to enjoy. It will have been almost two years since I took a tractor to an event and it will be great to meet up with like-minded people, as well as see some familiar faces. I am really looking forward to it!

he British National
Ploughing Championships
& Country Festival will be
celebrating 70 years when
the event is held on 9-10
October 2021 at Mindrum Mill,
Northumberland, by kind permission
of D Harvey & Son.

Entries are coming in from all sides for the event. Space for trade stands, shopping stalls and agricultural machinery demonstrations is being snapped up after many shows have been cancelled. The key to longevity

John Meijers visits Jac and Peet Linssen and their high-hour Massey Ferguson fleet.

rothers Jac, 56, and Peet
Linssen, 59, appreciate
Massey Ferguson tractors
and their Perkins engines,
having used them on their
mixed farm for many years.

In the south of the Netherlands, in the
province of Limburg, on the edge of a
town called Horn by the River Maas, the
brothers' farm consists of dairy and beef
cattle, as well as potatoes, sugar beet,
barley and maize.

They also grow around 10 acres of leeks for the fresh market, which keeps them busy during the winter months, and the type of soil varies from heavy river clay to sandy loam. There is a long history of successful farming in this region.

In this part of Limburg there was a Massey Ferguson dealership that played a major role in the transition from horse to

tractor. It was a successful dealership with many clients in a 30-mile radius.

Jac and Peet's grandfather bought the 100-acre farm in 1936. Their father, who sadly passed away in January 2020, was three years old at the time. The first tractor on the farm, in 1953, was a Ferguson TE-D 20 and in 1965 it was joined by a MF 135 that would become the main workhorse – a role it held for 11 years.

This 135 was traded in for one of the last 135s produced, in 1976. It is still on the farm and still has several roles, such as rolling with dual wheels, sowing sugar beet with a Kleine six-row drill, tedding hay and pulling a six-ton trailer. In the summer, there are numerous little chores for it.

At the moment it has 17,596 hours on it. It has been repaired, due to parts that have become worn out – like the power

take-off shaft. The splines become worn over the years and the tractor is now on its third shaft. The three-point linkage has also received some replacement parts.

During its working life the Perkins engine has only been touched once, for something other than routine maintenance. Last year, the head gasket started to leak and so this needed to be addressed. When the head was taken off, the honing lines were still visible on the liners. They looked like they had just been installed at the factory. After inspection, it was deemed unnecessary to skim the cylinder head, too.

Although it has been mechanically reliable, the brothers decided that it needed a cosmetic refresh around 15 years ago and so the tractor was resprayed.



HUGE HOURS

In 1979 they bought a new, two-wheel drive MF 265 to become the main workhorse. Sadly, they traded in the Ferguson TE-D 20.

Interestingly, after 300 to 400 hours, the MF 265's A4.236 engine was worn out because of a factory fault in the air inlet. The engine was rebuilt with new liners and pistons. It proved to be a very

good tractor, but it had a few annoying little problems. The battery was big, but still not big enough to start the tractor easily during frosty weather.

It racked up an impressive 23,000 hours in its time on the farm, with no further problems, and was traded in for a four-wheel drive MF 3060 in 1990. This tractor became the main workhorse on the brothers' expanding farm.

At the moment it has 17,596 hours on it. It has been repaired, due to parts that have become worn out - like the power take-off shaft. The splines become so worn over the years and the tractor is now on its third shaft

The hour meter has been round once already. How many more revolutions will it do?

At first they were a little sceptical about the electronics employed in the tractor's design, but during its time on the farm the Massey Ferguson 3060 has proved to be very reliable. In its heyday the tractor was used for all of the

major jobs and performed faultlessly. It is now displaying more than 21,500 hours!

Jac has been involved in match ploughing since the age of 18. He enjoyed great success with the 3060 and became National Ploughing Champion in the reversible and conventional classes several times over, thus representing the Netherlands at the World Ploughing Championships.

Due to increasing acreages and more intensive work for the 3060, the brothers decided to purchase a new tractor in 1996. The new model was a four-wheel drive Massey Ferguson 6110 – the

smallest model in the 6100 Series, powered by the brilliant A4.236 engine.

The model was short-lived, possibly due to the fact that a tractor of around 70hp was deemed small by this stage, and the Linssens' example was not without its faults either.

On the whole it has proved to be a good tractor, with the exception of power loss through the transmission and issues with non-hardened selector forks. They wore very quickly and were replaced under warranty, but the issue re-occurred once the warranty period had expired.

Another strange thing is that the hour meter seems to be counting the hours slowly. The brothers estimate that it has at least a few thousand hours more on it than the clock shows.

Jac and Peet are extremely complimentary about the tractor's engine. The Perkins-built A4.236 first saw use in the Massey Ferguson 175 tractor, introduced in the 1960s, and was also latterly used by Massey Ferguson to power the 187 combine – a model for smaller acreages available with a choice of cutter bars from 8ft 3in (2.5m) to 10ft (3m).

In its heyday the tractor was used for all of the major jobs and performed faultlessly. It is now displaying more than 21,500 hours!

KEY TO SUCCESS

Its five-inch stroke provided good torque (258Nm at 1,200rpm in the MF 175 and 275Nm at 1,400rpm in the MF 6110), but its days were numbered and it would be the 1004-4 and 1006-6 engines that were the mainstay of the 6100 Series.

The brothers' 6110 is predominantly used for drilling, spraying, some ploughing and with a Grimme two-row potato harvester. It now has more than 11,000 hours on the clock.

In 2004, an MF 5455 joined the ranks. The tractor features a Perkins 1104D-E44TA engine, producing 105 rated horsepower, but boosted to 125hp for transport applications in third and fourth gears. It became the prime mover on the farm, undertaking the ploughing, power harrowing, sub-soiling and pulled a 12-ton trailer. It has never let them down in the 10,000 hours that it has racked up and has proved to be a very effective piece of machinery.

With increasing hours on all of the tractors' engines, Jac and Peet's latest acquisition is a used MF 5712S Dyna-4, that they bought with only 500 hours on the clock. This is the first Massey

Ferguson tractor that they have owned that is not powered by a Perkins engine – with power coming from a 120hp SISU unit.

It handles everything with ease and the brothers only hire a contractor for harvesting sugar beet and chopping maize for silage. ➤

With such outstanding performance and longevity, the MF brand looks set to be an essential part of the Linssens' business for many years to come, but what is the key to their tractors' success?

Jac and Peet put it down to two things. The first of these is maintenance, servicing and repairs. They do everything themselves in the farm's comprehensive workshop and ensure that service intervals are strictly adhered to, with good-quality parts and correct-specification oils used.

Secondly, they believe that knowing how to operate a tractor, without abusing it, is essential if it is to provide years of trouble-free service. This particularly applies when the engine is cold. Driving at low revs just above the engine's maximum torque gives lower fuel consumption and a longer-lasting life. The most striking point was when Jac informed me that the 3060's rev counter has never been above 2,000rpm!

This fastidious approach to maintenance and operation has served the brothers well and I look forward to a return visit to see how their tractors are faring in a few years' time. ■

A dream come true

Peter Love went to meet Nick Horsburgh and his wife, Beryl, and their David Brown Thresherman.

ick Horsburgh always
wanted a David Brown
Thresherman. He and his
brother, Malcolm,
witnessed J J Armfield &
Co. Ltd.'s example driving
by their house regularly in the early
1950s, and the seed was sown.

Although this type of tractors is always called the 'Thresherman', it was officially known as the David Brown Heavy Duty Tractor (Threshing Model) and designated the VTK1. Just 185 were made between 1946-47 and this one is a late example – first licensed on 16 August 1947 and one of just six made that year.

In the paperwork that Nick obtained with the tractor, it was listed at £748. Compare that with a Perkins P6-powered Fordson E27N Major, that was about to

enter the market at £535, and I know what I would be buying. The 'blue' tractor would be running on cheaper diesel fuel, with more power, and probably would be more reliable.

This type of David Brown tractor goes back to the 1941 VIG1/100 that was built to the Air Ministry's specifications for towing heavy bombers around war-time airfields and came with a heavy winch and vacuum braking for trolleys and the like.

During 1942 the VIG1/462 was developed. This featured a Brockhouse torque converter in place of the regular clutch and proved to be very successful for the Royal Air Force. The VIG1/100 and VIG1/462 were well liked and did what was expected of them, particularly in the hands of the RAF.

After WW2, David Brown saw a gap in the market for an agricultural contractors' tractor, with its main purpose being to shift the threshing drum, trusser, and associated tackle from farm to farm. The company tested prototypes of the VIG1/100 for forestry and threshing applications and the tractor proved itself to be more than capable for the latter.

The new model went into production as the VTK1 and was based on the VIG1/100, with a TVO engine, winch, heavy-duty rear towing hitch, front hitch and front-mounted belt pulley. The price, a heady £750, proved to be its downfall – as it was twice the price of a regular tractor.

As well as the price, the David Brown VTK1 was held back because of a lack of

raw materials and the fact that you needed to be in the possession of a War Agricultural Executive Committee permit to buy one.

CONTRACTING

One of the lucky ones to have a permit was J J Armfield & Co. Ltd., of Stuckton, near Fordingbridge in Hampshire. The company undertook agricultural contracting and engineering, as well as forestry, hence why a VTK1 was ideal for the type of work. The tractor purchased was registered GAA 5.

Nick Horsburgh's grandfather used to work with the gang when needed, whether it be in timber extraction or helping threshing the crops, and seeing the outfit drive by the house at Blisford left an everlasting impression on Nick.

Over the years Nick kept tabs on the VTK1, which has three of J J Armfield & Co. Ltd.'s addresses listed in the original buff log book – the last being Stockton Iron Works, near Fordingbridge.

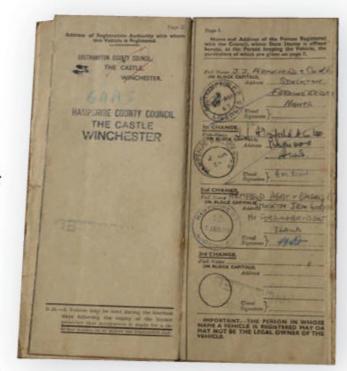
The tractor ended up in a rundown wood shed and Nick and his brother asked the company if they could buy it. They were told that the matter would be

considered, but did not hear anything else. Time went by and when the owner died the next thing Nick and Malcolm knew the tractor had been sold to Campbell Samson, who had a fine collection called 'Bygone Days' at North Gorley.

The new owner took the VTK1 to Peter Noble's team at Ringwood, who thoroughly restored the tractor. Upon the tractor's return to the Samson collection it was not used much over the years, but did appear at the Great Dorset Steam Fair.

Upon Campbell's death, his nephew, Christopher, placed the tractor on the market. Nick and his brother spotted it and had to purchase something they had tried to buy more than 40 years earlier. Those fond memories from their early days lingered on and the tractor became theirs in November 2020.

It had not run for some time and after cleaning the ignition and fuel systems and unblocking the tank, it eventually fired. Since then they have changed the oils and made good what's needed and today GAA 5 lives on in its native county of Hampshire. It still features a 1978

licence disc in its holder, that cost £6.65p at the time.

To think that Nick and Malcolm have been able to purchase their beloved tractor is a wonderful feeling. It has so many happy memories attached to it and you could see this from the smile on Nick's face as he drove around the country lanes on the edge of the New Forest, with Beryl by his side. ■

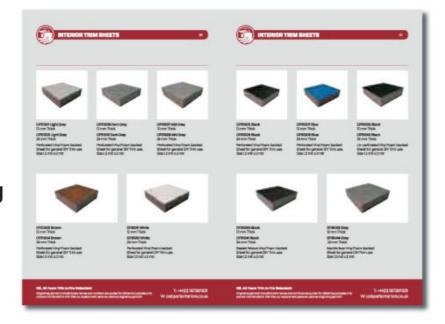

Mannheim magic

We examine the highs and lows of John Deere's four- and six-cylinder 40 Series tractors, built in Europe.



ntroduced in 1979, when it was launched at *The Momentum* dealer meeting in Moline, Illinois, John Deere's 40 Series did not set the world alight, but would late herald the arrival of a huge leap in operator comfort when it became the first range to be fitted with the Sound-Gard 2 (SG2) cab.

In this series profile, we are concentrating on the European-built four- and six-cylinder models available following the launch of the SG2 cab, in 1981, but three-cylinder tractors also catered for those requiring something smaller.

At the launch, all models were fitted with the Operator Protection Unit (OPU), with the four-cylinder tractors being the 62hp (DIN) 1640, 70hp (DIN) 2040 and 82hp (DIN) 2140, while the two sixcylinder offerings were the 92hp (DIN) 3040 and 100hp (DIN) 3140.

The introduction of the SG2 really made potential buyers take notice and it

was at this point that the new cab became a standard fitment on six-cylinder models. The SG2 was, according to former John Deere Ltd. employee Peter Leech, only an option on the four-cylinder tractors as it was considered to be too high – in terms of both cost and height – for tractors with a power output of 90hp or less.

This cab, it's fair to say, divided opinion – but it was clear that it was stylish, comfortable and quiet. Despite almost everyone using a tractor's left-hand door, some moaned that the SG2 only had one door and that it wasn't in the traditional position.

Of those that dared to try the new cab, many were pleasantly surprised. Initial concerns about the unusual method of entry and the fact that the edge of the door created a line near the centre of the windscreen, were pleasantly surprised to find that it was aligned with the exhaust and air pre-cleaner (where fitted) to make forward vision as unimpeded as possible.

The 40 Series was important as it provided offered buyers a host of models to suit their needs, but it soon became apparent to Deere that there wasn't enough choice – in terms of power and specification.

"The 2040S wasn't introduced until one year later, in 1980," Peter explained. "The reason being that the horsepower gap between the 70hp 2040 and the 82hp 2140 was thought to be too big for customers that wanted to trade in the very popular 2130 (75hp) and there was initially some resistance to the turbocharged engine in the 2140 – the first turbo engine in a Mannheim-built tractor.

"So, the 2040S, with 75hp, was introduced quickly to plug that gap and a give a direct replacement for the 2130. The designation S was purely because there were no numbers left between 2040 and 2140."

Deere owners, and those convinced by the salesman's spiel on the benefits of ➤

the SG2, embraced it, but those wanting something less expensive come the end of the Sekura-built OPU on the 40 Series looked to the JD X-E Series. At first glance it was an SG2 with a yellow roof (see the JD 2140 on page 21), but

open the door and you would find central, floor-mounted gear levers akin to the OPU.

It may have addressed the issue of cost, being cheaper than the SG2, but it did not necessarily deal with the issue of height. It was not enough for those negotiating low buildings, such as cattle sheds, and sales were being lost to competitors as a result.

"The engineering team tried hard to develop a lower, cheaper cab based on the Sound-Gard design," Peter explained. "That was how the factory was configured and the best manufacturing possibility would be provided with as much commonality with the standard frame and parts as possible. This wasn't possible and the time it took to find that out frustrated a lot of people within the company."

The result was the MC1, and for further detail on the development of this cab you can read more in the July 2020 issue of *T&M*, but the crux is that a cab was produced to suit livestock farmers and those that wanted something more 'traditional' from a cab.

Built at Deere's Brucshal factory, the MC1 proved to be a great alternative to the OPU, SG2 and X-E – with a cab height as low as 2.43m, depending on tractor model and tyre size (it was available for three- and four-cylinder models up to the 2040S).

POINTS TO NOTE

Front axle

- Two-wheel drive axle can suffer from worn track rods (new spherical inserts and pins are available)
- Steering ram rods are often scored/damaged (replacement rods are available)
- ZF APL 345 axle fitted to four-wheel drive 2140, 3040 & 3140 is strong and reliable
- Lighter APL 325 axle used on four-wheel drive 1640 & 2040 has not lasted as well
- 3640 has APL 350 axle
 heavy-duty version of APL 345
- Early tractors fitted with side-drive axles (APL 1352 on the 1640 & 2040, APL 1552 on the 2140, 3040 & 3140) without caster angle steering

Engine

- If looked after, engines good for 15,000-plus hours
- Balancer shaft bushes can fail on poorlymaintained fourcylinder engines
- Still possible to find good, used six-cylinder engines

Transmission

- New clutches still available
- Flywheels often worn beyond skimming (new replacements available)
- SG2 hydraulic clutchrelease system can require attention to master/slave cylinders
- Synchromesh gets worn on high-hour tractors
- SG2 range gear shift tube often cracks/breaks (replacement requires cab removal)

 PTO clutch can suffer if tractor has been used with equipment that requires a high torque load

Brakes

 Wet brakes have long service life if transmission oil level is maintained and brakes not abused

Hydraulics

- Closed-centre system
- Internal transmission pump wears over time often causing shuddering hydraulic lift
- Internal hydraulic system leaks can be an issue on high-hour tractors
- High-pressure hydraulic pump can suffer loose inlet valve seats that damage pump beyond repair

- Genuine pumps are extremely expensive (good-quality replacements available)
- Load control lower link sensing shaft often leaks (seals easily replaced)

Cab

- Hard to find good, used SG2 cabs
- Six-cylinder cabs have generally lasted better than ones fitted to fourcylinder tractors
- Range of replacement parts and glass available
- Demand for good, used doors – but not easy to find
- Electrics can be problematic and limited range of components available (new or used)
- Tatty interior common (aftermarket trim is available)

- XE & LP version of SG2 cab – gear levers central on floor
- Prior to MC1 cab was Sekura LPU, fitted by Sekura in the UK
- Replacement mudguards available, but parts (new and used) generally limited for all cabs
- MC1 left-hand door frames particularly hard to find

Pick-up hitch

- Often worn out on highhour tractors
- Two types fitted by dealers – ARM (by dealers) and Axla (by factory)
- Good used hitches and parts are difficult to source
- Limited range of new parts available for both types

It came into its own around low buildings where its visibility made it particularly attractive, but it was not without its foibles. There were no pendant-style pedals, side-mounted gear levers or flat floor, but this did not matter to the cash-conscious farmer. It was frustrating given the ergonomic niceties of the SG2, but the MC1 was still pleasant.

Two rear-hinged, fully-glazed doors made entry and exit much more conventional and, once seated, the ergonomics of the MC1 were good. The gear levers sprouted from the floor, adjacent to the dash panel, with the PTO control between the two – reminiscent of the earlier models, the parking brake on the left-hand side of the seat and the hydraulic controls on the right.

The dash panel itself had the familiar, large dial in the centre, with rocker switches either side, as well as hand throttle, engine stop knob and heater and blower controls. Ahead of this, on a sloping section facing the windscreen, and joined by one on each side of the dash binnacle, were two adjustable vents to direct hot cold air where desired.

In common with other 'European market' tractors, the windscreen was

hinged at the top to allow natural ventilation from the front and both side windows were also openable – hinged at the rear to aid the ingress of fresh air.

The cab was mounted on four rubber blocks, but noise levels were higher than

the equivalent SG2-cabbed models, and despite any questions about its quality in comparison to the top-spec cab, the MC1 proved popular. It was a decent alternative for those that liked the 40 Series but wanted something other than the SG2.

John Deere parts specialist Nick Young explained that 40 Series tractors are still useable classics and, mechanically, have generally lasted well. The cabs of all types will often let the tractor down and if you are considering purchasing one, try to find a tractor with a good cab and check that the dashboard works correctly.

Nick said: "Remember that they are around 35 years old and parts, if available, can be expensive!"

Over the next few pages we will take a look at the specifications of the four- and six-cylinder models from the SG2 era, but for an overview please look at the 'Points to note' panel on the opposite page.

As the smallest of Deere's 40 Series models to be fitted with the SG2 cab, the 1640 had to deliver on all fronts. Those that bought an SG2-cabbed model felt that the comfort outweighed the additional expense, or got a good deal from the local sales rep that made it an attractive proposition!

It may not have had masses of power, but the four-cylinder produced maximum torque at just 1,200rpm. With a rated speed of 2,500rpm, this made the direct-injection unit an interesting engine. It performed better than you would expect of a 62hp (DIN) tractor, with plenty of grunt for a model of this size.

JOHN DEERE 2040

You won't find many examples of the John Deere 2040 around today, purely because the 2040S was the one that fitted the bill for farmers looking for a tractor of this size. It was too much of a step down, in terms of power, from a 2130 and the 2140 was a big step up, hence the

introduction of the 2040S a year after the initial launch of the 40 Series.

Like all of the four-cylinder tractors in the range, if well maintained the engine will happily clock 10,000 without major fault, but the balancer shaft bushes can fail if the tractor is not serviced regularly.

JOHN DEERE 2040S

Those that were looking to trade in their JD 2130 for a new model wanted this one. It was introduced later, following demand for a like-for-like replacement of the John Deere 2130, and found favour amongst smallholders and stock farmers.

Pushing out a useful 75hp (DIN), the 2040S can be found with all cab options and makes for a very versatile tractor. It

proved extremely popular in four-wheel drive form and once fitted with the ZF centre-drive front axle with caster angle steering, it became a much more agile machine.

With a narrow track width possible and the two-door MC1 cab fitted, the John Deere 2040S is also ideal for ploughing matches.

JOHN DEERE 2140

Despite the benefits of turbocharging having been evident since the introduction of the Ford 7000 in the early '70s, customers were sceptical about the 2140 and it took a while to find its place in the market.

Once convinced that a turbocharged four-cylinder engine had a place in a Deere,

loyal customers made a leap of faith and others loyal to rival brands made the switch too.

With plenty of power and torque in a compact package, the 2140 proved to be just what was needed at the time – an era when 80-90hp tractors were still at the forefront of many farming operations.

JOHN DEERE 3040

As the smallest of John Deere's sixcylinder models, the 3040 found itself pitted against the International 956XL - one of the best tractors of its generation. It had the advantage of a clutch-less splitter, but the engine did not have the torque of the Neuss-built D-358 or the exhaust note!

At 92hp, the engine was never really under strain and this has proved to be the tractor's trump card - with high-hour reliability reported by many owners. This, coupled with a dependable transmission, has ensured that the 3040 remains a popular choice with those looking for a tractor in this power bracket.

JOHN DEERE 3140

At just shy of 100hp, the 3140 was always destined to be a popular model for progressive farmers. The smooth sixcylinder engine was never under strain and had the torque required for a tractor of this power output.

Like the others in the range, it was restricted somewhat by the ZF side-drive front axle - but was a different animal when fitted with the centre-drive unit and 12-degree caster angle steering, permitting a 50-degree steering angle. Nick Young said: "The ZF APL345 axle fitted to the 3140 is a strong, reliable axle. Used parts for this axle are often available."

Available in two-wheel drive configuration, the 3140 was also a good option for those that needed power and manoeuvrability, rather than traction.

At the rear it may not have had the lift capacity of its bigger brother, but it coped well with a four-furrow reversible plough.

The range-topping John Deere 3640 may not have the draw of its successor, the 3650, but it is still a very competent tractor to this day. It was often seen with a five-furrow reversible plough, but Deere suggested that it was capable of operating a three- and four-furrow push-pull plough combination when equipped with a front linkage.

As the largest model in the range, power delivery was key and putting it down sufficiently meant that the tractor was only available in four-wheel drive configuration.

The 3640 was often the prime mover on large arable farms and estates, and so high hours and subsequent wear are all part of the territory when buying one of these tractors today.

The landmark events in agricultural machinery production that proved successful for manufacturers and features that set the standard for others to follow.



he IH BTD-6 may not have heralded the arrival of a new concept, but it became the benchmark for tracklayers in the UK. With its origins in International Harvester's TracTracTors, the engineers at IHGB could not take full credit for the design of this 'new' machine for the British market, but it's fair to say that the additions and refinements over the years turned it into the crawler to beat.

The likes of Caterpillar, Fowler and Track-Marshall were all enjoying a slice of track-laying action during the 1950s, but IHGB was just getting started and would still be doing well in the crawler market when others had fallen by the wayside.

Things started modestly, with a 40hp version of the BTD-6 introduced in 1953. Powered by the same engine as the BMD tractor, the BD-264, the 4,327cc four-cylinder engine may not have had bags of power, but thanks to a 51/4in stroke it had plenty of torque, at very low revs.

With the Super BMD tractor, introduced in 1953, came an improved version of the 264cu in, indirect-injection engine. Two years later, the BTD-6 would have the same power output, 50bhp, and this is the version that would go on to set the standard for other crawler manufacturers to follow.

The torque output of the revised BTD-6 was 194lb/ft at just 1,100rpm! Rated speed was just 1,450rpm. With this sort of performance, 47.9hp was achievable at the belt and 40.6hp at the drawbar. This equated to drawbar pull of 10,500lb (4,770kg) in first gear at rated engine speed.

A 13-inch (33cm), single-plate clutch, with over-centre engagement, transferred drive to a five-speed transmission – with speeds of 1.5-5.4mph (2.4-8.7kph) possible at rated engine speed. Reverse was a modest 1.7mph (2.7kph), but a high-speed reverse option of 3.5mph (5.6kph) was available in

place of third gear. This was particularly useful when the BTD-6 was used in construction with a bullgrader or Drott equipment fitted.

Whatever the setting, the BTD-6 proved its ability, helped by a range of options that saw it find favour in the hands of thousands of owners. Most common was a four-roller track frame with 14-inch shoes, but 12-, 16-, 18- and 20-inch shoes and a five-roller frame gave the crawler greater versatility.

For those that didn't need the torque of a diesel, or had no desire for it, a distillate-powered version of the crawler was available from 1955-57. The BT-6, as it was designated, produced 42½hp and proved not to be popular. Just 10 were made in the first year, 25 in the second and 13 in the final year.

Come the end of BT-6 production, IHGB introduced an alternative for those not needing all of the BTD-6's 50hp. The BTD-640, first produced in 1957, was essentially a de-rated BTD-6 with less of the 'bells and whistles'. It sold reasonably well and was produced for more than five years.

Sales of the BTD-6 were pretty consistent throughout the late '50s and first half of the '60s, slowing down as the 1970s approached. Just 74 BTD-6s were built in the first year and peak production occurred in 1961, when almost 2,500 were built.

In 1966, a standard-spec BTD-6 (four-roller track frame and 14-inch, clipped-corner tracks) cost £1,919-15-0. A five-roller frame added £90-4-0.

The final build year, 1975, saw 134 leave the line bringing production at Doncaster to a close

It may have been basic, with limited power, but the BTD-6 proved ideal for British agriculture. Perfect for top work, like rolling and drilling, as well as heavy-draft operations, the BTD-6 was the right crawler at the right time and took sales away from all of the other manufacturers producing tracklayers with a similar power output.

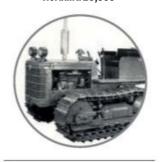

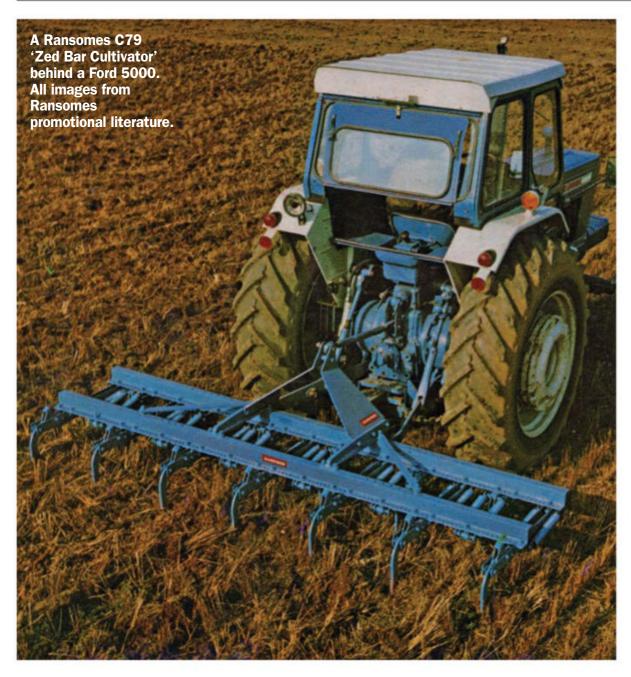

More than ploughs!

Ransomes is a name synonymous with ploughs, but there were many more strings to the company's bow. We take a look at some.

he Ransomes story began in the mid-1700s when Robert Ransome was born, in Norfolk. By his early 20s he had opened an ironmongery store in Norwich and before long he had branched out into the production of cast iron plough shares. These proved to be a successful part of his business and he patented his process of tempering the shares, selling them across East Anglia.

By the end of the 1780s he moved the business to Ipswich in Suffolk, where it

flourished – thanks largely to new ideas relating to the production of plough parts and how standardising them meant they would no longer have to be made by a farmer's local blacksmith.

Ransome registered a patent for the standardisation of plough parts in the early years of the new century and before long numerous outlets were selling the company's plough parts across the east of England.

Robert Ransome's son, James, joined his father's growing business, having established his own foundry, and Ransome & Co. became Ransome & Son. It would later become Ransome & Sons, when Robert's younger son, Robert Jnr., joined the business. The company had changed its name again, by 1825, to J. & R. Ransome – following Robert Snr. relinquishing his role in the company.

The founder died in 1830 and it was at this stage that his grandson, James Allen Ransome, joined the fold, with the company becoming J. R. & A. Ransome, and from then on diversification was one of the firm's biggest strengths.

Lawn mowers, railway components and steam engines were all produced by the company, which by this point had moved to the famous Orwell Works, but agricultural implements remained at its core – with plough production ramping up to the point that the YL model was introduced in the early 1840s. It was also during this period that the company changed its name again, after Charles May became a partner, to Ransomes & May.

EYES OF THE WORLD

Further success was enjoyed following a plethora of Ransomes & May's products being exhibited at the Great Exhibition in 1851, but Charles May left that year and was replaced by James Allen Ransome's nephew, William Sims, leading to an inevitable name change once more – to Ransomes & Sims.

Steam engines were popular in agriculture by this stage, for pulling balance ploughs and powering threshing tackle, and thanks to the expertise of John Head, a former apprentice at the company that had risen through the ranks, these machines became a key part of Ransomes & Sims' portfolio – resulting in Head's promotion and the establishment of Ransomes, Sims & Head in the late 1860s.

William Sims subsequently relinquished his interest in the company and with John Jefferies made a partner in 1880, Ransomes, Head & Jefferies was born. This was short-lived, as the death of John Head saw Sims join the fold once again and Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies (RSJ) was established in 1884, becoming a limited company in 1911.

By now the core elements of RSJ's business were steam engines, threshing machines, ploughs, cultivators, potato diggers and hay rakes. Success continued and at the end of WW2 RSJ joined forces with Ford to build a range of mounted implements for the Fordson E27N − badged as FR. ➤



Thanks to the popularity of the tractor, ploughs quickly became RSJ's 'bread and butter' products, but the company was keen to offer a host of implements that would appeal to farmers not just in Britain, but across the globe.

Come the mid-1950s, RSJ was marketing tillage equipment, threshing machinery, balers, combine harvesters and the MG Cultivator, and in the 1960s the company bought up others to expand its offering, as well as participating in several 'badge engineering' opportunities.

It is at this point that we will set aside the general history of Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies and look at some of the products that it offered during the last 40 years of its existence as an agricultural machinery manufacturer. Not all were built in Britain, but the Ransomes name was prominent and an important part of the company's history.

TILLAGE

Cultivators had been produced by Ransomes since the 1800s, but mechanisation of the farm invariably led to larger machines like the 'Dauntless' trailed model from the 1920s onwards. The introduction of the three-point linkage and additional power meant that tractors could lift and pull more – leading to large, mounted cultivators like the Tillorator.

Heavy-duty cultivators, like the C87 of the 1970s, enabled effective stubble cleaning and pan busting, but for deep cultivations, sub-soiling and mole draining, RSJ offered a range of substantial implements like the C90 toolbar to which various tines and the like could be attached.

The company had also offered disc harrows since the golden age of the horse, but these too evolved into both tractor-drawn and mounted examples. The HR20 was a linkage-mounted disc harrow that could be offset, introduced in the early '50s, while trailed models like the THR 3001 were produced throughout the '60s.

With an increase in power and the popularity of crawlers, RSJ continued to produce larger and wider disc harrows to further increase productivity. These culminated in a working width of more than 15 feet, in the 1980s, with F. W. Pettit of Lincolnshire having a hand in the production of some models.

Badge engineering also came into play with Ransomes range of power harrows. Built in Italy and launched in the mid-1980s, the initial range of three models could be used with 540rpm or 1,000rpm PTO shafts.

The revised range, launched following the sale of RSJ's farm machinery division to the Electrolux Group in 1987, included models with a working width of up to four metres.

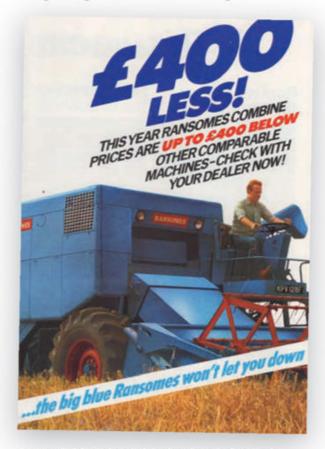
Other badge engineering in the tillage sector included a range of rolls produced by R. Hunt & Co. of Essex, due to Reuben Hunt becoming chairman of RSJ in the early '50s. Available in 'gangs' of three rolls, working width culminated at 24 feet in the late '60s – but rolls ceased to be part of the company's product offering shortly after.

CEREAL HARVEST

From the early days of the company, threshing machines had been an integral product line and although these were phased out in the 1950s, RSJ did not dismiss the concept altogether.

Pull-type combine harvesters were offered from the first half of the 1950s and rather than spend precious time and resources developing its own models, RSJ turned to Swedish firm Bolinder-Munktell for a badge-engineered solution.

The MST 42 had a 42-inch threshing cylinder and required a tractor of at least 25hp to operate it, while its replacement,

the MST 56, took the concept further. A five-foot cut, choice of reels and the option of a tank, rather than a bagger model, made for an altogether more interesting proposition.

By this point it was the late '50s and self-propelled combines like the Claas SF, Claeys MZ and Massey-Harris 27 had established themselves in the field. Not to be outdone, RSJ designed its own combine and it was ready for the harvest of 1958.

The 902 was powered by a four-cylinder diesel, available with a 10ft or 12ft cutter bar and was capable of six tons per hour. The machine proved itself, but not one to rest on its laurels, RSJ set about designing another model.

The result was the 801, with an eight-foot cut, followed a year later, in 1964, by the 902's replacement, the 1001.

These numbered models were replaced by the Crusader and Cavalier respectively – the latter ready in time for the 1967 harvest and the former debuting at the Smithfield Show the same year.

RSJ's final combine, the Super Cavalier, replaced the Cavalier in the mid-1970s – but production was short-lived, as 1976 marked the end of combine harvester production for the company.

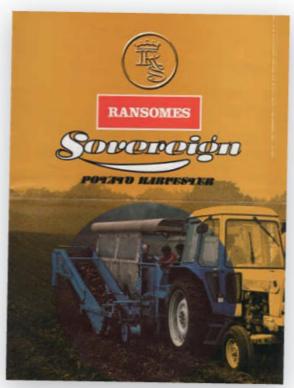
ROOT CROPS

For those growing small amounts of potatoes for bagging, RSJ had been producing potato diggers for many years – in both 'plough' and 'spinner' format from the days of horse-drawn machinery.

FR and later versions catered for those that wanted to harness the power of a tractor, but it was not until RSJ purchased Johnson's (Engineering) Ltd. of March, Cambridgeshire, in the late '60s, that it was able to offer an extensive range of potato equipment that included two-row elevator diggers.

A process of amalgamation ensued, as both Johnson's and RSJ were importing Faun equipment, but this meant that a host of potato-harvesting equipment was now available from RSJ. Perhaps the most famous piece of badge-engineered equipment was the Ransomes Faun potato harvester – captured superbly in 1:32 form by Britains!

This was a single-row machine with a rear sorting platform and was commonly

seen with a side-mounted elevator to dispense the crop into an adjacent trailer, but a bagging-off platform mounted on the front of the tractor was also an option.

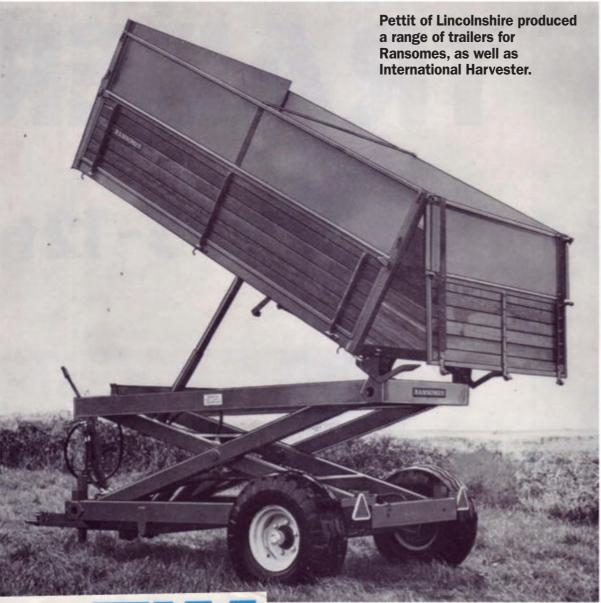
The acquisition of Johnson's (Engineering) Ltd. also spawned a collaboration with RSJ engineers to produce a trailed, single-row potato harvester in the early '70s. The Monarch had a large sorting area and bagging platform, or could be purchased with an elevator. It was replaced by the Sovereign later that decade.

When it came to sugar beet, the story was remarkably similar. RSJ had offered a range of primitive horse-drawn and tractor-mounted beet lifters over the years, but the acquisition of the Catchpole Engineering Co. Ltd. of Stanton, Suffolk, in the late '60s, gave it access to a range of harvesting machinery.

The Catchpole 33 tanker harvester was in production and the design of the self-propelled Powerbeet harvester was being finalised when RSJ took over. The Powerbeet was similar in concept to the Standen self-propelled sugar beet harvesters, in that the idea was for the tractor skid unit to be removed at the end of the season and used as a tractor once more.

RSJ took the self-propelled design up a level with the introduction of the Hunter in the mid-1970s, but the concept did not last long. Badge engineering came to the fore once again when RSJ began to import TIM trailed sugar beet harvesters from Denmark in the early '80s.

DRILLS

The humble seed drill was not an implement that the company had enjoyed particular success with, but its acquisition of Johnson's (Engineering) Ltd. gave it another string to its bow.

Johnson's had purchased Smyth of Suffolk in the years preceding its takeover by RSJ and although this drill technology was now considered outdated, it was yet another line that RSJ could capitalise on in terms of spare parts and the like.

Rather than try to update the Smyth drill, RSJ turned to badge engineering once more – importing Danish-built Nordsten mounted drills from the late '60s. The Lift-o-matic range encompassed models with working widths of up to six metres and proved very popular. More than 10 models appeared with a Ransomes Nordsten decal into the early '80s.

TRAILERS

Lastly on our whistle-stop tour of Ransomes machinery is the humble trailer. This is an implement that RSJ never produced to its own design, instead relying on F. W. Pettit of Lincolnshire to produce trailers on its behalf.

First seen in the 1950s, Ransomes trailers during this period were usually three-ton tipping models, but other versions mimicked the versions available in Pettit livery. Capacities increased significantly in the latter half of the 1960s, with capacities of up to 10 tons available to suit the tractors that were increasing in size.

A 12-ton tipper and high-lift models appeared in the 1970s, bringing the range of single- and twin-axle trailers to a climax.

OTHER EQUIPMENT

Space prevents us from going into further detail and from including information on other implements marketed under the Ransomes banner, but aside from the extensive range of ploughs, the company offered numerous lines of equipment to suit customers' needs.

Sprayers, lawn mowers, turf equipment and Motor Garden Cultivator models were all pivotal to the success of Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies Ltd. before its eventual sale to Textron Inc., of the USA, in 1998.

Today, the Ransomes name still exists in Ipswich, as Ransomes Jacobsen Ltd., a subsidiary of Textron Inc. It supplies high-quality turf equipment under several different brands. ■

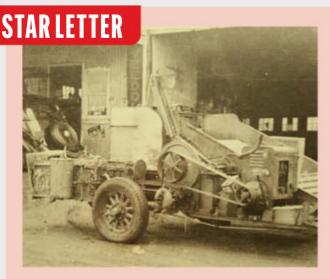

New Holland balers

Dear T&M,

I read with interest Chris Marlow's letter regarding New Holland balers in the August issue. It brought back memories of when I worked for the Glamorgan WAEC, in 1945, at Stormy Down RAF airfield in South Wales.

The airfield runways were grass, so there was a couple of hundred acres of grass to cut. The baler, which was the first of its kind I had ever seen, was, I think, a Massey-Harris with another name added. The foreman at the time was Matt Hughes, who decided it would be used as a stationary baler using a hay sweep fitted to the front of a Standard Fordson – only moving the baler to a new part of the field when needed.

Two men fed the pick-up reel with a couple of hay pikes and my job was looking after the couple of wooden spacers that determined the length of the bale. As Chris mentioned, these blocks had two grooves front and back and the two lads threading the wires through had to make sure the wires went into the correct slots, otherwise the block ended up as part of the bale.

To get the right size of bale you had to watch the outgoing bale pass an upright on the bale chamber, then watch the ram of the baler going on the back stroke, otherwise you could have a smack on the hand, or far worse. In addition, the petrol engine mounted on the top of the drawbar end was going full blast, so communications were mainly carried out by sign language – happy days!

If I remember correctly, the end product was a two-man job to lift the bales, but in fact it was a great improvement on the days of hay sweepers, pitching poles and hayricks. We then ended up with a massive

stack of bales and when the bosses from Cardiff came on sight to view the job, they sent a tarpaulin sheet down from the depot that weighed a ton.

There were no front loaders about at that time, so some thought had to go into how to get the sheet on top of the rick. As the location – Stormy Down – indicated, it was a very windy position and so we thought we could use the wind to help us. So we pegged the sheet down on the windward side of the rick, with four of us holding on to lengths of rope fitted through the appropriate eyelets, and on the count of three flicked the sheet up, which was caught by the wind and took off straight over the rick.

Unfortunately, one of the lads had wrapped his length of rope around his right wrist and was taken airborne over the rick, resulting in a damaged shoulder. He was taken to the RAF sick bay on site and was back in work for the afternoon – these were the days long before Health & Safety was invented!

Another pick-up baler I came across was a bit of a 'Heath Robinson' affair. One of the large estates in the South Wales area came up with the idea of a stationary baler being turned into a wire-tying baler. An engine was fitted to the bale chamber, a metal chute was fitted over the drawbar to deflect the bales out the front end and the normal hay elevator affixed to the rear, as if fitted to the rear of a hay wagon.

A couple of seats were welded to the sides, for those that tied the wires, and normal steel needles were used. I think it was pulled by an International W-9. This again was in the mid-1940s and I recall German prisoners of war working on the machine.

Big, blue & Versatile

Jonathan Whitlam makes a return visit to a farm in Leicestershire. This time it's to see something on a different scale.

t was something I was really looking forward to. I had seen the big blue tractor before when I had visited the farm it lives on in Leicestershire, but it had not been working on that occasion. My mission that day was to see a much smaller Ford tractor of around the same era at work: a Ford 8730 complete with a Ransomes push-pull plough combination.

Having shown an interest in the big, blue leviathan, I was only too pleased to be driving back up the country to catch the beast at full roar, breaking oilseed rape stubble with a large sub-soiler. I was told to drive through the farm and out the back, up a rutted track and then carry on going until I saw, or heard, the tractor at work. I certainly heard it before I saw it!

The thunderous roar from its Cummins six-cylinder engine reverberated throatily around the valley, on the top of which I now found myself. And suddenly, there it was, pounding up the steep incline towards me, the occasional hint of black smoke from the large exhaust, mounted at the front of the bonnet, denoting a particularly hard patch of ground being ripped apart.

As it reached the headland, the implement was raised and the tractor, despite its huge dimensions, turned gracefully within its own length, the pivot steering allowing for a very tight

turning circle, and before I knew it the sub-soiler tines had been dropped back into work and the giant machine was roaring back down the field, after first leaving a trail of black exhaust smoke after each gear change under load as the implement on the back bit into the hard, baked soil.

This beast had been built in Canada nearly three decades before, but it still looked and sounded more than capable of putting in a long, hard day's work! It was the only Versatile articulated four-wheel drive model to be officially imported into the UK by the Ford Motor Company in the late 1980s and early '90s and is, of course, the mighty Ford Versatile 946 – a tractor for which the ground literally shakes!

BACKGROUND

Giant, prairie-busting tractors were not a new phenomenon in the mid-to-late 1980s. They catered for a niche market in North America, where their size and big reserves of power allowed them to become prime movers on many an arable enterprise.

These mighty tractors were mostly of a very similar configuration: large, equal-size wheels mounted to a two-piece frame with the engine, transmission and cab on the front half and the rear linkage or, in most cases in North America, a simple drawbar at the back.

Due to the size of these behemoths, truck components were often used in their construction and most were built by specialised manufacturers. These included the pioneering Wagner and Steiger in the USA and Versatile in Canada. These manufacturers, along with a handful of smaller businesses, had the market virtually to themselves until, that is, the mainline tractor and machinery manufacturers began to take an interest in this section of the marketplace.

Of these, John Deere was probably the most notable, first producing its own rather unsuccessful machine, before getting Wagner to produce its tractors in Deere livery. This arrangement ended abruptly with Deere pulling out and Wagner not able to carry on building tractors in its own right. Deere, having gotten rid of its partner and also one of the competition in one fell swoop, then produced an improved articulated tractor design itself!

Steiger had huge success with not only tractors produced under its own name, but also by producing tractors for the likes of IH and Ford to top off their own tractor ranges. Some of these were not much more than simple 'badge engineering' exercises, as in the case of the Ford FW range for example, while the IH tractors had a great deal of input from International Harvester itself and

were therefore more a true part of the IH line-up, despite using Steiger know-how!

Versatile on the other hand, tended to produce just its own machines, although that changed when it came to opening up the European market for giant-sized tractors. In the late 1970s, Versatile did a deal with Italy-based Fiat, resulting in a four-strong range of articulated four-wheel drive monsters in Fiat colours to sell throughout Europe, including the UK.

And that is where our story begins. It was at the very end of the 1970s that British farmers seemed to wake up to the benefits of the North American pivot-steer monsters that were capable of pulling the larger implements that were also beginning to appear at that time.

Deere had limited success with its two big 30 Series models – the 8430 and 8630 – but the 40 Series replacements found more favour. Ford, meanwhile, had even more success in Britain with the Series FW machines built by Steiger – a condensed offering of the four-model range produced for North American farmers.

It was therefore perfectly natural that Fiat would be interested in getting in on this action and it was also natural that Versatile would be interested in supplying the tractors to gain entry into the European market.

VERSATILE

During its formative years, Versatile was very much a family business. Originally started in 1945 by Peter Pakosh, the first products were grain augers built in a home workshop in Toronto, Canada. In 1947 Pakosh formed the Hydraulic Engineering Company in partnership with Roy Robinson and the business soon produced other farm implements as well as augers, using the name Versatile as a brand.

The business grew and soon moved to larger premises in Winnipeg, with the company being incorporated as Versatile Manufacturing Ltd. in 1963 and finally producing the product it would eventually be most famous for in 1966. The D-100 and G-100 four-wheel drive, articulated tractors, powered by diesel and gasoline engines respectively, proved successful and resulted in a full line of high-horsepower tractors by the mid-1970s, competing with the likes of Steiger for North American tractor sales.

FIAT VERSATILE

The deal between Versatile and Fiat was done in 1979 and by the end of the year four Fiat Versatile models were in production. Based on existing Versatile models, the tractors were built in the Winnipeg factory and fitted out in Fiat colours, with several alterations to meet UK and European market requirements.

Smallest of the Fiat Versatiles was the 44-23, powered by a Cummins six-cylinder engine rated at 230hp, followed by the 280hp 44-28 which also featured a Cummins six-cylinder powerplant. The two larger models in the range, the 330hp 44-33 and 350hp 44-35, were fitted with Cummins V8 engines and all were fitted with a 12-speed transmission.

Versatile was virtually unknown on the UK market when Fiat introduced the 44-33 in early 1980, quickly followed by the smaller 44-28 later that same year. The Fiat name was recognised though and the new four-wheel drive monsters attracted a good deal of attention when introduced and sold, according to articulated tractor sales of the time, pretty well indeed.

The Fiat colour scheme suited the tractors and they certainly looked imposing machines, giving farmers another option to choose from alongside JD's 30 Series and Ford's FW models. These Fiat tractors sold best in Britain, followed by Germany, France and Italy, but production had ceased by 1983 – with the market for such tractors having been almost saturated.



The Ford Versatile was based on a new range of Versatile machines known as Designation 6 and comparing these two models, that are around 10 years apart, shows that the cab is probably the main difference. Note the position of the exhaust at the front of the bonnet – a Versatile trait.

FORD VERSATILE

By the mid-1980s the number of articulated tractors being sold in the UK had waned considerably, leaving John Deere with two models and Ford with the single Steiger-built FW-60 Automatic. Fiat had reduced its range from Versatile accordingly, and in 1983 now offered only the new 470hp Versatile 1150, one of two new models introduced by Versatile in 1982, but interest was very limited and it was never branded as a Fiat Versatile. That was probably for the best in the long run, despite Versatile introducing the new 'Designation 6' models in North America in 1985, because some seismic changes were now afoot in the tractor world in general!

The Ford Motor Company was in a purchasing mood in 1986, buying Sperry New Holland, to form Ford New Holland Inc., and then Versatile in 1987, giving access to the articulated tractors that could then replace the Steiger-based FW-60. This was handy, as Case IH had already bought the Steiger business and the FW therefore needed to be discontinued anyway! Soon the Steiger

name and distinctive lime-green colour scheme would also disappear under the all-conquering red and black of Case IH.

Ford also wasted no time in getting the new Versatile Designation 6 models into Ford branding, although the old red and yellow Versatile colours did remain until 1989 in North America. In fact, a new line of models was introduced in 1988 to replace the original Designation 6 range, although they still held that title and were very similar.

The new range stretched from the 230hp 846 up to the 470hp 1156 – all powered by Cummins engines. The 325hp 946 that was the replacement for the original Versatile 936 and it is this model that most will associate with Ford's iconic livery.

To replace the FW-60 on the British market, Ford brought in the Ford Versatile 946 model, making this the only one of its type to be officially sold this side of The Pond. This made perfect sense, as the 946 was literally the middle-of-the-range machine and it was also a very good match for the FW-60 model, whose shoes it was going to fill.

The 946 got its not inconsiderable power output from a Cummins NTA-855-A325 six-cylinder motor, which was fitted with a turbocharger and aftercooler and produced its rated power at 2,100rpm. Weighing in at around 14.5 tons, this was no lightweight machine but compared favourably with the Ford FW-60's weight of just over 14 tons and output of 335hp.

To get its power down to the ground, the 946, as was the case with the bulk of the range, came with the choice of two transmission options – either the standard 12 forward by four reverse constant-mesh 'box or the more popular, but more expensive, option of a 12 forward and two reverse powershift unit.

Either option was a tried and tested one, as were the Cummins engines that were among the most popular of powerplants for use in large, four-wheel drive tractors. They produced masses of torque, in this case from a six-inch stroke, making them good luggers and therefore giving the tractors high work rates with built-in efficiency and reliability.

The Ford Versatile tractors inherited a lot of respect from previous users of the Versatile tractors, and, by not changing these main features, the new blue giants built on that good reputation.

LEVIATHAN

The Ford Versatile 946 that we see in this article was actually bought to replace an earlier Fiat Versatile 44-28 on an arable enterprise in Leicestershire, thereby keeping the spirit of the Canadian behemoths well and truly alive in this part of the Midlands.

This is truly a beast of a tractor and impressive in many respects. Electronics are fairly limited, although a small

amount are fitted for performance-monitoring purposes. Everything else feels extremely mechanical and the powershift transmission, although smooth, certainly makes you notice it is working as the power comes on quickly after each change. It is, in fact, a very lively performer for its massive size, and certainly finds the large subsoiler an easy proposition, even at a good speed up a steep incline.

The tractor is fitted with Firestone 800/70 R38 'super singles' all-round, this being the modern preference to the traditional dual wheels. The single tyres are massive, but they do not intrude too much beyond the actual width of the machine itself and therefore do not pose the problem that dual wheels do while on the average British road travelling between fields!

The 946 certainly leaves an impression on you and I was only too pleased to be reacquainted with it a few years later while on the same farm visiting a different tractor. I have had the pleasure of seeing it working with two different implements, the other being a McConnel Shakerator hitched to a tool carrier, and on both occasions the tractor simply played with them both. The ease in which it pulled the implements makes me wonder if you could ever stress this leviathan of a tractor.

The 946 became quite a well-known model in Britain before being replaced by a new line of Versatile tractors following the takeover of Ford New Holland by Fiat in 1991. Yes, Fiat eventually managed to get its hands on the Versatile range once again, after originally losing out to Ford!

The new Ford New Holland Versatile 80 Series tractors featured new styling and new features and were a fitting replacement for the 946 and its sisters. These would go on to evolve into the 82 and 84 Series before the great merger of 1999 when Fiat bought Case IH, bringing Steiger tractors into the fold and thus triggering a legal arrangement where the new Case New Holland company had to divest itself of certain tractor factories and tractor ranges. The Versatile plant in Winnipeg, Canada, was one such casualty.

The result was that American company Bühler Industries bought the Versatile plant and its products and produced the existing machines in a new livery, before eventually selling 80 per cent of the company to Russian combine manufacturer Rostselmash. The company now produces a revamped Versatile range in original Versatile colours – the story almost coming full circle, as it were.

As for here in Britain, a few Ford Versatile 946 tractors still survive and often work for their living during the cultivation period after harvest every year, still working with large cultivators or semi-mounted, gang-type reversible

Lockdown mission

Paul Williams has the story of his Nuffield 4DM.

he story of JUX 626E goes back to the early '70s, when we bought it for £100 from T O Brown in Malpas, Cheshire. It's a Nuffield 4DM, a model built from 1957-61, that was registered in 1962 and had been used to cut roadside verges on behalf of Cheshire County Council. It was also fitted with brackets on the front axle for the attachment of a snow plough.

We used it for many years, but with its best days over it sat in a hedge for around 35 years, occasionally running a generator. In 2019 my father gifted it to me and the timing could not have been better.

When the Covid-19 pandemic struck and lockdown was upon us, I decided to grab the bull by the horns and treat the Nuffield to a full cosmetic refresh. Mechanically, it was pretty good, but all that time in the hedge had not done it any favours in terms of the bonnet, mudguards and nose cone.

I drew up a list of what was required and set about acquiring the various parts before sending the tractor for shot blasting and priming by H J Kirk & Co. at Wolverley, near Wem.

The oil and temperature gauges, mudguards, at £400 per pair, and headlights all came from Tyto Agricultural Ltd., via eBay, while I

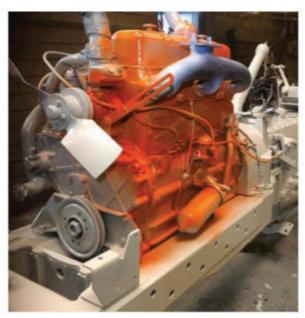

managed to pick up a good, used fuel tank from a Nuffield enthusiast for the princely sum of £50.



With the paint shade matched from the original on the underside of the bonnet, Paul set about spraying the top coats.

A replacement exhaust manifold was needed too and I was lucky that a friend had one that he was willing to sell for £20. A used ignition switch was sourced from a car museum in Llangollen, for £5, and the footplates were made by a friend – who used the originals as a pattern.

This just left tyres and paint. I opted to leave the rears for the time being, which I believe to be the originals, but I have decided to replace these soon. The fronts set me back £120.

I could have bought some paint off the shelf, but the guys at Border Automotive, in Shrewsbury, were very helpful and managed to match the shade of orange from the underside of the bonnet, at a reasonable cost. I applied the paint myself and am pleased with how it turned out.

Hopefully, she will now last for another 60 years! ■

Hydro power

Scott Lambert looks at International Harvester's British-built hydrostatic tractor models of the 1970s and '80s.

gricultural mechanisation has seen a number of advances over the years, in a bid to increase performance and productivity. More powerful engines, the introduction of the three-point linkage and larger implements helped farmers cover more ground in less time, but in recent years the most serious technological innovations have centred on tractor transmissions.

Today, the continuously-variable transmission (CVT) has demonstrated its advantages over standard and powershift transmissions, but in the days before CVT, a gearbox was the mainstay of tractor transmission technology.

In Britain, the 1950s and '60s saw experiments with hydrostatic drive, from the likes of Lucas and others, but it would be the 1970s when hydrostatic tractors became more prevalent – largely due to the option of a 'Hydro' transmission on International Harvester's Doncaster-built World Wide Series, affectionately known as the 74 Series.

Over the years farmers had been gifted additional gears, through the advent of five-speed gearboxes and dual-range transmissions, but particular tasks demanded the right ground speed - not necessarily more gears. If you required an exact speed at particular engine revolutions, a traditional gearbox could not necessarily provide what was needed.

This is where a hydrostatic transmission has advantages. It was not a new invention, and IH itself had been fitting it to tractors in the States since the latter half of the 1960s, but it was a new concept as far as mainstream British tractors were concerned.

In theory it was a simple idea, comprising a variable-displacement, axial piston pump and motor, but the reality was rather more complex. I will



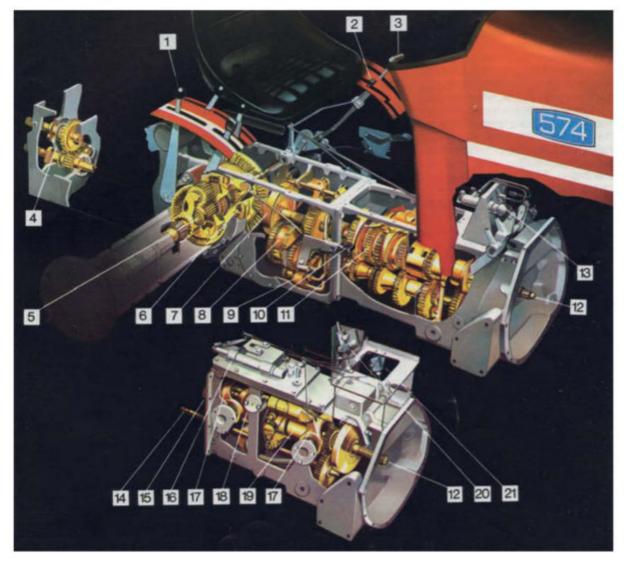
endeavour to explain the inner workings of an IH Hydro tractor in simple terms, but the reality is that it may become more complicated as we go on.

The short explanation is that the engine drives two pumps – a low-pressure charge/servo pump and a high-pressure, variable-displacement pump. This supplies oil, on demand, to a variabledisplacement motor to provide drive.

The hydrostatic section of the transmission fits in place of the standard 'speed' gearbox (a four-speed unit plus Torque Amplifier if specified), while the rest of the rear end is very similar to a conventional gear-drive version. The main difference is that the range gearbox does not require a reverse gear, as the hydro unit provides this. The steering, hydraulic lift and auxiliary hydraulics are virtually identical to a gear-drive model. ➤

The axial piston pump converts mechanical energy into hydraulic energy and a hydraulic motor converts this hydraulic energy back to mechanical energy to drive the rear wheels. Controlling the amount of oil pumped to the motor, and the direction it is pumped, is done using a flat, circular plate known as a swashplate.

In the pump, nine pistons force themselves against the swashplate. When the swashplate is angled it varies the pistons' stroke and it is the alteration of stroke that determines the amount of oil that is pumped.

The pistons are filled with a light resin called Phenolic and meet the swashplate at an angle, so as the pump piston rides down the angled plate it is pushed forward and this discharges the fluid. The discharged fluid forces the motor piston backwards, the piston rides down

the angled swashplate and, thus, the barrel assembly is rotated.

Following a complete revolution of the barrel, the piston rides up the opposite side of the swashplate and is forced back into the cylinder. The oil is returned to the pump and fills the piston in readiness for the next pumping stroke.

The swashplate does not have fixed positions and operates rather like a tap, in that it can be adjusted between the fully open and fully closed positions via the Speed Ratio Control Lever (SRCL) on the dash panel – allowing the operator to choose any speed between standstill and the tractor's top speed of around 20mph, depending on the age of the Hydro model. Earlier versions were higher geared than later examples.

Switching between forward and reverse is also done via the control lever. Selecting reverse alters the angle of the swashplate to the opposite of its forward position, reversing the flow of oil and therefore rotating the motor in the opposite direction.

Between the pump and the motor is a series of components simply referred to as the 'Centre section'. This includes various valves and features faces with extremely fine finishes to seal the pump and motor from oil leakage.

The 'Foot-N-Inch' pedal, positioned where the clutch pedal normally resides,



hydraulically disconnects the pump and motor – providing a true neutral – aside from allowing easy attachment of implements, as the name suggests.

A Deceleration Valve prevents heavy trailers and the like from reversing the Hydro system and overrunning the engine.

BENEFITS

The benefits of such a transmission include independent control of forward speed and engine speed, an infinite range of speeds, and instant forward/reverse operation.

Although a Hydro model is capable of performing any tasks that a gear-drive tractor can do, it is best suited to jobs that make the most of its benefits – such as loader work, baling, hedge cutting, precision planting and hoeing. For arduous work, such as ploughing, and strenuous loader operations, including manure loading, the range lever (to the operator's left) should always be in the 'Low' position.

When using a Hydro for loader work, for example, the benefits of such a transmission are clear. The driver's left hand can be used to operate the SRCL and steering wheel, leaving the right-

hand free to operate the loader control valves (lift and tip). With the right foot operating the foot throttle, the driver can ensure that the engine revolutions are below 1,200rpm when changing direction of travel. Jerkiness when moving from forward to reverse can be avoided by pausing briefly in the neutral sector of the Speed Ratio Control Lever 'quadrant'.

The added benefit of using a Hydro for loader work is the ability to avoid using the brakes while tipping the bucket. By holding the SRCL in the forward or reverse hold position, the tractor will remain stationary – negating the need to depress the brake pedal(s).

On International Harvester 74 Series tractors, an adjustable stop on the forward sector of the SRCL enables the lever to be returned to the same operating position time after time, and a light blue area on the SRCL quadrant indicates the range for best performance. All of this equates to easier and smoother operation, less wear and tear, and less operator fatigue.

IH claimed that conventional gearboxes were a high-expense assembly and providing the option of a hydrostatic transmission eliminated a clutch, bearings, gears and synchronisers – leading to increased reliability, less down time and better productivity.

This did not mean that maintenance was any less important. In fact, on the contrary. Regular maintenance and servicing, particularly oil and filter changes, were imperative to ensure the longevity of the hydrostatic unit.

A filter on the Multiple Control Valve (MCV) was common to all World Wide models from the 454 up and protected the transmission and hydraulic systems, but Hydro models had the additional protection of a second filter on the left-hand side of the transmission housing, under the footplate.

Following the initial filter change intervals stated by IH for new Hydro tractors, these filters needed to be changed every 200 hours and the transmission oil, Hy-Tran, required changing every 800 hours.

Care had to be taken to ensure that the transmission did not run dry on start-up following an oil change, damaging the charge pump. This was done by pouring five gallons of Hy-Tran directly into the Hydro housing before adding the remaining seven gallons through the rear filler plug.

Any tractor is open to operator abuse, but IH did its best to prevent damage to the hydrostatic system via the aforementioned valves and a series of relief valves. It is, however, fair to say that abuse through lack of maintenance and general uncleanliness led to the demise of many Hydro tractors.

Borrowing a neighbour's trailer, with hydraulic rams containing contaminated oil, not cleaning the oil cooler at the front of the tractor, and tow-starting the tractor could all result in damage to the hydrostatic system.

Towing the tractor in order to start it was particularly sinful, as it meant that no lubricating oil was pumped to the centre section by the charge pump – leading to destruction of the motor face.

It was acceptable for the tractor to be towed a short distance with the range lever in the neutral position, but never tow-started.

MODELS

The International Harvester Company of Great Britain kicked off its range of hydrostatic models in 1970 with a Hydro option on the 52hp 454 and 68hp 574, but also offered Hydro as an option on the 62hp 474 when the model was ▶

first produced in 1973. Rated speed was 2,200rpm on synchromesh 454 and 574 tractors and 2,300rpm on the synchro 474, but 2,400rpm on hydrostatic versions of each model.

When the 474 was discontinued in 1974, and replaced by the Perkinsengined 475, the 574 became the sole Hydro offering in the range. It was clear that hydrostatic drive needed additional power to give sufficient performance and so when the 574 was flying the flag for Hydro, IHGB increased power output to 78hp – the same as the range-topping 674.

The synchromesh-equipped 574 remained at 68hp, with both the synchro and the Hydro producing 58hp at the power take-off.

Come the introduction of the Hi-Performers, or 84 Series, a dedicated Hydro model was the sole offering, rather than having a hydrostatic transmission option on several models in the range. The Hydro 84, first produced in 1977, used an 80hp version of the D-246 four-cylinder engine, with a rated speed of 2,400rpm.

When the Sekura-built Super DeLuxe cab (pictured right) was offered as an option for the Hi-Performers, from 1978, this included the Hydro 84. The Super DeLuxe was a full three inches (77mm) taller than the standard cab and offered a flat deck, improved ergonomics, internal control of linkage-levelling rod and pick-up hitch and a roof hatch. It also helped alleviate some of the problems associated with noise and heat that Hydro tractors gained a reputation for.

Production of the Hydro 84 purportedly continued following the introduction of the 85 Series tractors in 1981, with the hydrostatic offering for the new range – the Hydro 85 – built from 1982. Unlike the 585, 685, 785 and 885, that could be specified with a standard (L) cab or the new XL Control Centre, the Hydro 85 did not have the luxury of the latter unit as an option.

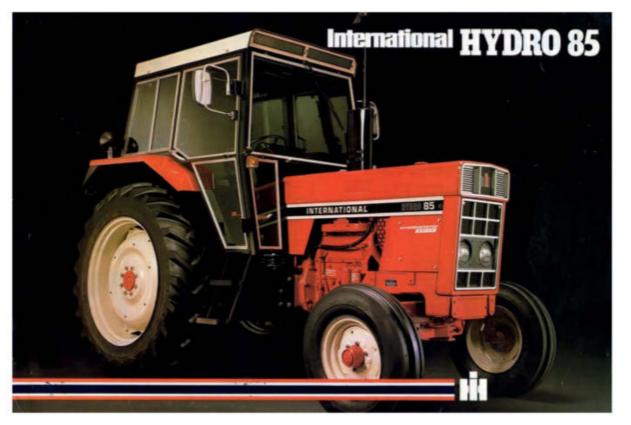
It was initially available with a choice of standard or Super DeLuxe cabs, but the Sekura unit was not available from 1983 – leaving the L cab as the only option on the Hydro 85.

In 1982, anyone wanting to buy an 80hp IH tractor had three basic choices. The 785L had a retail price of £10,319,

while the 785XL cost £12,220. A Torque Amplifier cost an additional £400-500. The Hydro 85 cost a heady £12,845.

Following the merger of International Harvester and J I Case and the subsequent formation of Case IH, in 1985, a hydrostatic tractor was no longer offered – leaving the IH-designed Torque Amplifier and David Brown-designed Hydra-Shift as the transmission options on the 'new' tractors.

Today, there are Hydro models still at work, such as those pictured here on the Brown family's Suffolk farm, while some are in the hands of collectors, but, sadly, many have been consigned to the scrap heap following the end of their working lives. ■

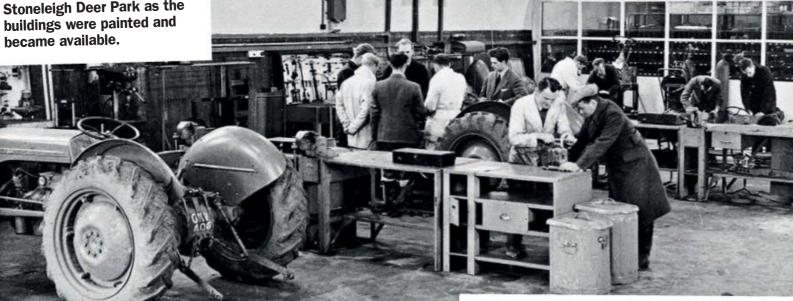

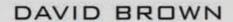

Community spirit

y own definition of 'Community spirit' was pleasantly re-awakened recently, writes Gary Anderson. For the past 15 years, through the Ferguson Club, I have organised the Chiltern Vintage Tractor Charity Run and this year's took place on 4 July.

In the early years, the main driver was to raise funds for our local Thames Valley Air Ambulance. Many people in the area also believed that this was a very good cause and it also seemed to be a choice for many other regional vintage tractor runs.

The support of the event at all different levels, from marshalling and catering through to driving a tractor, was immense. Donations were gratefully received and each year, to our collective amazement, we kept beating the record of monies raised from the previous year. As the years progressed, we realised that the momentum of the event was picking up. So much so that people taking part were looking forward to the following year's event almost before completing the current year. So far the event has raised £57,400.



Then came 2020 and 'Community spirit' took on a whole new meaning – 'protecting the vulnerable, the NHS and each other'. As we moved into 2021 a lot of people asked about the run and whether it would go ahead. We closely tracked Government guidelines to what was possible and 4 July 2021 was approved by the Ferguson Club NFU insurance underwriters. 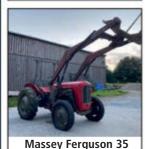

Fabulous Fylde

he 12th Annual Fylde
Vintage, Steam & Farm
Show took place between
Preston and Blackpool over
the weekend of 3-4 July,
says David Reed. It saw a
multitude of entries, with good crowds
in attendance on both days, despite
some uncertainty about the weather.

There was an excellent selection of tractors and the event had a good rural feel to it. The show is a charity event, with the Rosemere Cancer Foundation benefitting from the proceeds of a tractor that was auctioned off, and with other donations, more than £3,500 was raised.

Eddie Worthington's superb 1963 Nuffield 342 was seen parading around the ring. There were some rarities there too, including a 1953 Newman E2 standard with Petter AV2 engine that is one of only a dozen that were known to be built. "It is thought that four are in the UK, mainly in Scotland," owner Ken Pope said, "I bought it from Perth in 2015, after it had been restored by a previous owner in Aberdeen," he added.

Of similar age and from the same area was Bob Wilkinson's 1960 IH BTD-640, that had worked in Perth, "The owner decided to restore it and had it in bits," Bob said, "But he needed the room so he decided to sell it." Bob acquired the International 12 months ago, "It is in the same condition as I bought it," Bob added, "Apart from the hydraulic arms which have been added."

From the Massey Ferguson stable came Rebecca Waterworth, who is the rep for the Ferguson Club in Lancashire, with her 1962 Massey Ferguson 65 MkII. "It was left rotting away at a farm at Chorley with the engine and gearbox full of water," she said.

One tractor on the move was a Darlington-registered Massey Ferguson 35, fitted with a front loader. Owned by rally organiser David Martin, it was in original-looking condition, and was being auctioned off to raise money for the Rosemere Cancer Foundation. It sold for £2,300.

If you have never been to this event before, it is one that you need to put on your calendar for next year, as it was a great success in 2021. The organisers should be congratulated for making it all happen in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Many of the people involved in the heritage section had not seen each other for two years and it was a time to catch up with what had been going on in the world. The section was well placed, mostly on hard standing at the top end of the site, with steam (large and small), commercial vehicles, buses and the many cars and vans.

As for the tractors and stationary engines, they were situated on the grass area further down. The parade ring was rather small, but why was difficult to ascertain. There was certainly room for expansion, with vast tracts of unused green space around.

A parade of old machinery took place in the main ring, as well as the outer road system of the showground. This was all thanks to Bernard and Steve Pike and their section marshals.

Steve was exhibiting a Muir-Hill one-ton dumper based on a Fordson Standard N. He and a team have been rapidly rebuilding the dumper from a heap of rust, following the machine being buried in chalk for more than 40 years. The main frame was badly

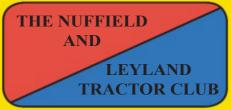

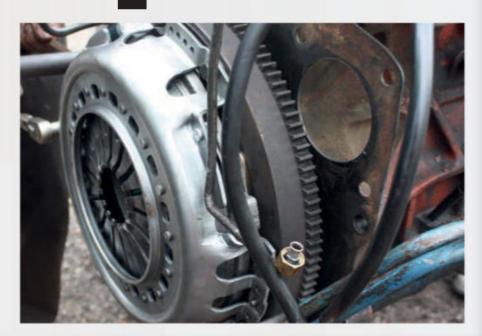

6610 clutch part 2



Andrew Hall and Barrie Everson continue with the task of replacing the clutch on a well-worn Ford 6610.

egular readers will remember the strip down of the tractor in the first part, after the owner had not been able to select any gears. At that stage we had reached the opinion that this was due to the spigot bearing, which supports the gearbox primary motion shaft in the centre of the flywheel.

This appeared to be seized, which would cause the primary shaft to continue rotating and prevent easy engagement of the gears. A new spigot bearing had been ordered and meanwhile preparations were made to reassemble the tractor once the replacement front casting had arrived.

GOOD CLUTCH

An inspection of the original clutch showed no apparent problems with it, and plenty of wear left on the friction plate. The spigot bearing housing is splined on its centre to provide a continuous drive to the hydraulics and independent PTO clutch, and whilst this was removed from the engine flywheel it was placed onto the input shaft to check for any wear.

Once the new spigot bearing had arrived it was fitted, the clutch was then refitted to the engine flywheel and the engine fitted back onto the rear half of the tractor.

NEW CASTING

With the new casting to hand, the original cracked casting was removed from the front axle assembly. Many of the bolts were difficult to move, due to the age of the

tractor, and some rust being present. The steering swivel, which locates in the centre of the casting, was removed and the steering drag link fed through the casting before using the forklift to support the old casting, to allow us to remove the axle pivot pin.

When the replacement casting was first ordered we weren't sure if it would be supplied with the necessary bushes for the steering swivel, but were pleasantly surprised when it did, and the swivel was a nice fit in the bushes when tried!

Using the forklift, we lowered the new casting over

the axle and refitted the pivot pin. The front axle and casting was then manoeuvred into place in front of the engine and bolted up.

SLIGHT VARIATION

After bolting up the casting we then attempted to refit the steering drag link, which had come out of the original casting with no apparent problems, but refitting it with the new casting in place proved to be rather difficult.

After several attempts and a struggle, we made a comparison of the original and new castings and realised that the new casting was

slightly thicker than the original, where the drag link passes through the left-hand side.

The problem was that the drag link couldn't easily be reconnected to the steering arm from the steering box, as the thicker casting wouldn't allow it to swing outwards to enable the ball joint to engage with the steering arm.

Some gentle leverage was employed to 'spring' the drag link outwards whilst aligning it with the hole in the steering arm. Once this was achieved the nut could be tightened and we could move on with the job.

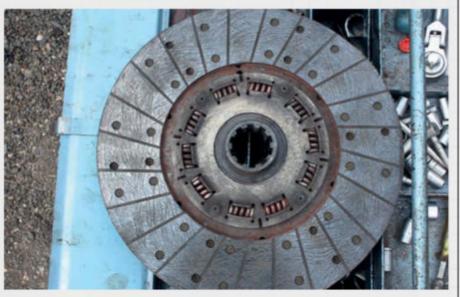
Seized spigot bearing?

An inspection of the centre plate also showed this to be good, along with the rest of the clutch unit.



Check for wear & fit

The centre plate and the spigot bearing housing were tried on the shafts and checked for a good fit and any wear and tear.

RADIATOR

Next was the refitting of the radiator and the adjacent oil cooler pipes. The wiring loom was fed along the right-hand side of the engine and clipped back into place and the fuel feed pipes were reconnected, along with the heater hoses and engine throttle and stop controls.

NO JOY

A bleed of the fuel system and refitting of the battery soon had the engine running and an attempt to try the clutch with the new spigot bearing in place. The linkage between the clutch pedal and the relay lever was adjusted to provide the one inch of pedal free play and with the engine running the clutch pedal was pressed and an attempt made to engage the gears, but with no joy.

Despite the work carried out we still couldn't engage the gears and the original symptoms persisted. The one inch of free play was present and the clutch pedal travelled down to the cab floor.

Try as we may, we still couldn't engage the gears,

even after reducing the clutch pedal free play, leaving us no alternative but to dismantle the tractor once again and inspect the clutch internally.

This was a particularly frustrating time for us, as accessing the clutch on this tractor isn't the easiest of tasks. However, we reconvened on another day and set about splitting the tractor, and as this time though we had the new casting in place we could roll the engine forward with the front axle.

With the tractor re-split, we revisited the clutch, which

appeared to be in sound condition as before. We did, however, simulate disengaging of the clutch and noted that the centre plate linings expanded as the clutch disengaged, leading us to think this may be where the problem existed, so a decision was made to replace the entire clutch unit.

NEW CLUTCH

A new clutch was ordered from Agriline Products Ltd (01527 579111 or agriline products.com) and once this arrived we were ➤

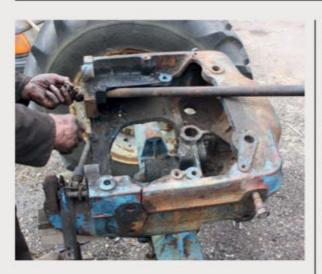

able to fit it, along with a new thrust bearing and reassemble the tractor once again.

Before doing so, copperbased grease was applied to the splines of the primary gearbox shaft and the area where the thrust bearing slides to and fro, taking no chances and hoping to have cured the problem.

As before, the front and rear halves of the tractor were reunited and the clutch pedal free play readjusted. With the engine back in running order we attempted to engage the gears once again, still without any success!

WHERE'S THE PROBLEM?

One would think that with a new clutch in place, full pedal travel and the correct free play everything would work a treat, but this was not the case!

This led to Barrie Everson, the owner and I, all of whom were working on the tractor, scratching our heads and quizzing as to where the root of the problem lie.

After observing the clutch being disengaged and re-engaged numerous times, our first clue showed itself. The owner observed that the relay lever on the bell housing was only moving through a small amount when the pedal was depressed. This was possibly not enough to disengage the clutch, but we could not ascertain why this was.

I then took a look under the cab platform whilst the clutch pedal was being pressed. The pedal swivel is attached to the cab floor and when being pressed the pedal was shying away from the linkage, due to severe corrosion of the cab floor and support for the clutch pedal.

This resulted in limited movement of the withdrawal

mechanism and prevented the smooth engagement of the gears.

NO TIME LOST

After realising this, we lost no time is stripping the cab floor and rebuilding the platform, which resulted in a rigid support for the pedal and allowed full disengagement of the clutch once again.

The subsequent repair to the cab floor is out of the scope of this feature, but there is a moral there regarding being misled, and that is that things aren't always as they seem!

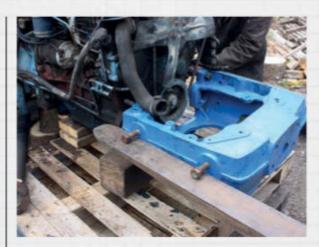
New casting

The steering swivel is being installed into the replacement casting. Fortunately, the bushes were already pressed into the new unit!



Tight fit

The swivel pin was a very tight fit in the new casting and took some persuasion to get it in.



Offered up

The new casting is being offered up to the engine using the forklift truck to take the strain, as the casting is extremely heavy to handle manually.



Using bolt positions

Bolts were screwed into each side of the implement-mounting pads to facilitate lifting the casting, making life much easier.



On with the axle

Next was the axle, which was aligned with the new casting and the pivot pin installed, followed by refitting the track rod inner ball joints.



Ready for the radiator

Back on its wheels, the tractor is now ready to refit the radiator and other ancillary components, which will allow us to start it and try the re-installed clutch.



Ready to run

Now ready to run, the problem was soon found to be still with us, but why?



New clutch

We then chose to replace the whole clutch (see text). This area was well lubricated with copper-based grease.



Tightening clutch cover

This was fitted and the tractor re-started, but the problem persisted. See the text for the reason behind all of the trouble!

MF 17 trailer rebuild part 3

Having worked on the parking brakes in the last issue, Andrew Hall moves on to the leaking tipping ram.



on the brakes largely finished, and only the hand brake lever to service, I have now moved on to the leaking hydraulic tipping ram. Since owning the trailer I have only attempted to tip the trailer once, and this ended up with a jet of oil ejecting from the ram cylinder to such an extent I haven't tried to tip it since!

ith the work

TWO-STAGE RAM

The ram fitted to these trailers is a two-stage unit, which has seals for each stage. The removal of the ram from the trailer chassis was

straightforward enough, as it is secured by two pins, one each end, both of which are held in by split pins.

Before removing the ram, the hydraulic pipe was disconnected, after placing a tub to catch the oil beneath it. No oil spilled out, but the ram was full of water, which ran out of the hose connection and must have completely filled the ram!

After many years of disuse we expected the split pins to be stubborn to remove, but were pleasantly surprised when they came out without any undue effort. I supported the ram whilst my friend Barrie drove out the pins and the ram was then lowered to the floor.

INITIAL CLEANING

The ram was placed on the bench for initial inspection and a clean of the area where the internal parts were to be removed was done using a scraper and some brake cleaner to de-grease the area.

CIRCLIPS

A close inspection showed the ram shafts to be restrained by two internal circlips, one for the smaller section and a second for the larger-diameter section. The ram was fully extended and cleaned, which revealed some pitting and corrosion of the smaller ram shaft, which was disappointing, as we assumed the seals must pass along the ram as it extends and retracts.

Suitable circlip pliers soon had the first circlip out on the inner (smaller) ram shaft, and we assumed the seal was located behind this.

STUBBORN SHAFT

With the circlip out of the way we attempted to pull out the inner ram shaft, but the part we thought was the seal wouldn't pass over the circlip groove, as the edge of the groove was bruised where the ram had continuously reached the end of its stroke.

The ram was awkward to hold, so we secured it to the trailer using some angle iron and a mixture of 'G' cramps and other clamps to hold it steady whilst we attempted to extract it again.

WORKSHOP



Tipping ram

The seals were leaking badly on this ram when it was last tipped, so it's coming off to replace them. No instructions for stripping this though!



Screw coupling

At the front of the trailer, the tipper pipe locates on a screw when it's not in use. This has a Dowty self-sealing screw coupling.



Off with the pipe

A tub was placed to catch the oil before removing the rear end of the tipping pipe, using an openended spanner.



No oil - just water

Not a trace of oil came out, but plenty of water, which presumably entered via the top end of the ram – so not good news!



Safely off

A rope was used to support the ram whilst the pins were extracted, and it was then lowered gently to the ground.

It wouldn't budge so we used a square file to remove the burr on the edge of the circlip groove, after which the ram shaft moved outwards. What we thought was the seal collar was merely a steel collar to support the inner ram shaft and no seal was present at this point.

We then removed the larger circlip to repeat the exercise on the larger section of the ram, which also required the use of the file to de-burr the circlip groove. A pull on the larger shaft soon had the collar out, but neither ram shaft would come out of the casing fully.

Each shaft would come to the end of its stroke and stop dead. Several further attempts were made to remove them unsuccessfully, before taking a break from the job for a while.

SNAP RINGS

After a rest from the task we returned and took a look inside the ram casing, using an inspection lamp to see inside.

I noticed a ring positioned about an inch along the inside casing, which turned out to be a snap ring to restrict the movement of the ram pistons, which are located on the ends of each ram shaft.

Some digging with a screwdriver, and the use of an improvised wire hook, soon had the outer (larger) snap ring out of its groove. This allowed the ram shaft to come out of the casing complete with the inner ram, which is secured in the same manner, albeit with a smaller circlip.

At this stage time was running out for us, so I turned my attention to the piston of the larger ram shaft. The seal is located using another circlip and an expander on the piston, and

consists of a single cup-type seal, which shouldn't be too difficult to obtain. The smaller ram shaft is of a similar build, but as yet I haven't dismantled it.

There are no identification numbers on the seal so I will have to measure the seals and their respective bore diameters before ordering up replacements! It's a case of easier to assemble than to dismantle this type of ram, and there are no workshop manuals for it – meaning that the job has been a steep learning curve for us!

More on the reassembly to come next month. ■



Dirty mess

The end of the ram was a mess and required some scraping and use of some brake cleaner to thoroughly clean the area prior to inspection.



Extended

To clean thoroughly, the ram was extended to reveal the state of each ram shaft – the smaller of which is pitted with corrosion.



Circlips

With the dirt removed we could see two circlips that locate what we thought were the seals of each ram shaft.



Circlip pliers

Some suitable circlip pliers soon had the first (smaller) circlip removed, which restrains a collar, not the seal, apparently!



Stubborn collar

The collar wouldn't pass over the circlip groove, due to a burr on the edge of the groove. A file was used to clean this off.



Outer collar

The ram shaft was pulled outwards and the large collar can be seen part way along the shaft. No seal is present here however!



Collars & circlips

Both the smaller and larger collars and their respective circlips can be seen in the view after removal and cleaning up.



Snap ring

This larger snap ring, located about an inch along the inside of the casing, secures/restrains the larger ram. The smaller shaft is similarly held with a smaller ring.



Cup seal

The seal and expander are secured by a circlip on the ram piston. It's a simple cup-type seal, so shouldn't be difficult or too expensive to obtain.

NEXT MONTH: New seals are obtained and fitted, and the ram is reassembled, ready to take up its rightful position on the trailer.

Experts' advice

Massey Ferguson 35

My brother and I have an MF 35 tractor, which we've owned for a few years now. Since owning the tractor it has been used for mowing and the occasional ploughing match, but recently we have installed a wood-burning stove and have bought a hydraulically-operated log splitter.

It fits on the three-point linkage and has its own control valve, but our tractor hasn't got any external services for operating remote cylinders. How do we connect the splitter to the tractor to get the best performance from it? Any advice would be welcome.

Wesley Smith, via e-mail

You need to isolate your link arms when using a log splitter, which means you'll need to obtain a

diverter valve. As you sit on your tractor you'll see a plate on the top of the transmission housing under your right knee, secured by two setscrews.

This is known as the transfer plate and conveys oil from the pump stack pipe to the internal lift cylinder. If this is removed it can be replaced by a diverter valve, which has the external services pipe attached, supplying oil to the rear of the tractor.

Most log splitters have their own control (spool) valve fitted to them. Oil from the diverter valve, via a snap coupling, feeds the spool, which requires a return feed for the oil. If you can obtain a genuine Massey Ferguson diverter valve it will have a return port built into the body, onto which a return hose can be fitted.

If a genuine Massey Ferguson valve isn't available, an aftermarket valve can be obtained from Agriline Products Ltd. (01527 579111 or agrilineproducts.com). This may

not have the return port, but you can make a pipe up and feed back into the tractor via a port on the left-hand side of the hydraulic top cover, situated under the operator's seat.

You will require a 90-degree elbow to neatly attach the pipe, which can be run to the rear of the tractor, adjacent to the feed snap coupling. The output pipe is likely to be ³/₈in in diameter, but I would recommend using ½in-diameter hose for the return, as this will allow a freer flow of oil back into the transmission housing and is less likely to cause heating of the oil when working the splitter hard!

Another point to note is that when the link arms are isolated they may tend to fall if there is any leakage of oil via the lift cylinder seal. It's a good idea to support your log splitter on an axle stand, or something similar, to hold it at a comfortable height whilst working.



Fordson Major E27N

I have a Fordson
Major E27N with
a TVO engine and
have experienced problems
starting the tractor from
cold. The engine is in
generally good condition, but
has done quite a lot of work
over the years, so there is
some wear and tear of the
internal parts.

The tractor sits around for long periods between running, and although I go through the recognised procedure for starting the engine, it seems to take ages for the fuel to reach the engine and the engine to initially fire. Usually by this point I'm tired of cranking it and feel like giving up.

Do you have any tips for improving this? I'm almost at the point of giving up with this tractor and buying something more easily handled.

Alan Carpenter, Worcestershire

You say it seems ages before the fuel reaches the engine. Make sure

the fuel flows freely from the fuel tank to the carburettor, and that the float chamber is free of any dirt or sediment. The main jet should be two-and-a-half turns open from fully closed and all airways clear of any debris.

Also, make sure there are no air leaks due to faulty gaskets or loose screws leading to a weak fuel/air mixture. If the tractor has the earlier vaporiser, check that the vaporiser plate is flat and not causing any air leaks too. If you have a good spark at the right time, all should be well for a swift start.

There are two flap valves in the inlet manifold that should close when the engine is cranked and running. These are drain valves to drain off excess fuel when on choke. Make sure these are present and working properly.

A well-worn engine can be down on compression a bit, and this will affect its ability to draw fuel/air mix into the cylinders. If all the aforementioned details are fine it may improve matters to remove all the spark plugs and pump a small amount of engine oil from a pump-type oil can into each cylinder and hand cranking the engine to spread the oil around the tops of the pistons before refitting the plugs.

This will improve the suction and assist in drawing the fuel into the engine. Regular running may also improve matters for you, especially some stiff work, which may de-glaze the cylinder bores.

Topping tips

I've just bought a six-foot topping mower with a single blade to run behind my Fordson Major diesel tractor.

There are two areas of concern with this. The first and more important in my mind is that when the mower is running and I declutch at the end of a run the inertia of the mower blade causes my tractor to carry on moving. This is rather dangerous and I wonder if anything can be done to prevent this from occurring.

Secondly, the PTO has to be running to operate the hydraulics, which although is inconvenient, I'm able to put up with this by disconnecting the PTO shaft when not using the blades.

W Pannell, via e-mail

Your experience is due to your Fordson Major only having a single-plate clutch and not being Live-drive. The inertia of the revolving blade tends to push the tractor along and also prevents any gear changing until the blade comes to a halt.

Employing an over-run clutch between the tractor and the PTO shaft can prevent this. Over-run clutches can be incorporated in the PTO shaft itself and allow the blade to revolve without conveying any inertia back through the driveline. A relatively cheap over-run clutch can be bought to fit over the tractor PTO shaft onto which the mower shaft can be attached.

Regarding the need for the power take-off to be running to operate the hydraulics, this was so on all Fordson Majors, early Nuffields and Ferguson TE-20 tractors. A solution for the Major is to obtain a 'raised PTO' unit. This has its own





engagement clutch and allows the power take-off to disengage whilst leaving the hydraulic pump drive running. This, however, is a rare unit and when available is expensive to buy, but they do come up for sale occasionally!

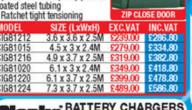

When a friend's Perkins P3-powered Ferguson TE-20 wouldn't crank, Andrew Hall was on hand to help.



friend recently acquired a tidy, P3-powered Ferguson TE-20 that had been standing unused for a couple of years. A fresh battery was fitted, but he couldn't get any life out of the starter motor. With a forthcoming road run approaching and hopes to use the tractor on this, he contacted me for some help.

Over the years I have seen various methods of wiring Perkins P3 conversions on Ferguson tractors and have drawn the conclusion that they varied according to the dealership or workshop that was responsible for the work. This tractor had dispensed with the original bell-housing-mounted starter

switch and features a key-operated starter switch on the dashboard.

NO LIFE

A turn of the key revealed no life from the starter, so the switch was bypassed – resulting in a faint click from the motor, which is a Charles Anthony Vandervell (CAV) axial starter motor – where the whole armature moves along to engage with the flywheel.

This could be due to two reasons. Firstly, the battery could be flat, and, secondly, the switch could be faulty as it didn't operate when the key was turned.

A heavy discharge test was performed on the battery, which proved to be in tip-top condition, as suggested by the owner. All connections were also checked and appeared sound, so the problem seemed to be coming from the starter motor itself.

REMOVAL

The starter is secured by a strap around the body of the motor and once the wires were removed, access was improved and the motor was released from the engine and placed on a bench for inspection.

The CAV starter is a large unit and features a pressed steel cover, which houses the switchgear and commutator. This was removed and revealed the reason for the lack of life from the motor. Due to standing outside,

water had got inside the cover and had started to corrode the internal components of the starter.

At this point we thought there would be no hope for the motor, as everything was water-soaked, and two of the brush springs had rusted to nothing, leaving the brushes stuck fast in their holders.

GOOD CONDITION

On the plus side, the commutator looked to be in good condition and the brushes, although stuck, were also good. A thorough clean of the switchgear and the area of the commutator, followed by gentle freeing of the brushes, soon brought some hope that the motor would work once again.

WORKSHOP



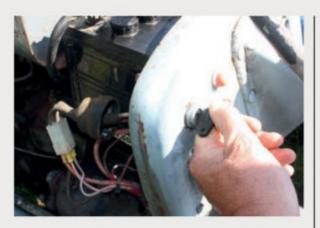
CAV starter motor

The Perkins P3 engine features a CAV axial starter motor, on which the whole armature moves along to engage with the flywheel whilst cranking.



Key start

All original starting equipment had been removed and the tractor wired to start on the key switch, as seen here.



No life

A turn of the key showed no life whatsoever from the starter motor, so some investigation was required to sort it.



Switch bypassed

The switch was bypassed by connecting the terminals on the rear to attempt a start, but only a click from the motor was heard!



Battery check

A check using a heavy discharge tester proved that the battery was in good order and fully charged, so the starter looked likely to be at fault.

BRUSH SPRINGS

The next area of concern was the loss of the two brush springs, due to corrosion. The two remaining springs were clean and in good order, but they are of a different design to those of the Lucas M45 starter motors, fitted to many other tractors of the period, as they feature an extended 'leg' where they press on the brushes.

A call to an electric motor rewind business proved fruitless, so we had to improvise. Lucas M45 springs weren't suitable, but a strip of an old Ford dynamo yielded two springs that looked hopeful.

CLEANING COMMUTATOR

Whilst the switchgear was removed we were able to clean up the commutator segments with some wet and dry abrasive paper, which was also used on the external surfaces of each brush, as they were extremely tight in their holders.

Emery cloth wasn't used for this, as it leaves particles of abrasive on the surface of the commutator segments if not cleaned off thoroughly, which accelerates wear of the brushes!

REASSEMBLY

The dynamo springs were fitted and provided enough pressure on the brushes to run the motor. The seal

around the cover was a little perished, so some silicone sealer was applied to prevent any more water entering the motor when refitting the cover. The starter was then clamped with a strap onto the bench and a battery connected using some jump leads to convey the current.

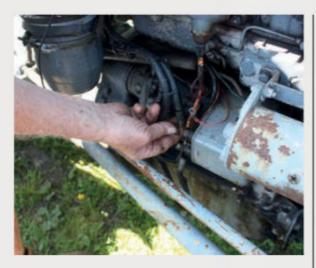
SUCCESS

The motor sprang into action and was run up for a while to re-bed the brushes before refitting it to the tractor. After reconnecting the wiring, the key was turned, but still no life came from the starter. I then bypassed the key switch as before, which brought success, and the engine cranked over.

A replacement switch was ordered and fitted, allowing the tractor to start 'on the key'. I noted that there were two warning lamps on the dashboard, one red and the other green. A check soon confirmed these to be a red charge-warning lamp, whilst the green lamp was to show the cold start heater was working.

OFF TO THE ROAD RUN

Now starting 'on the button', the tractor proved to run very well and was successfully driven on the planned road run, as originally intended! ■



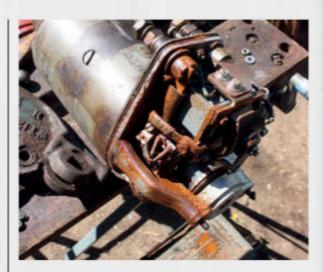
Off with the motor

Wiring was disconnected and the motor was removed for inspection.

Signs of trouble were soon apparent, as rusty water dripped from the cover of the starter motor.



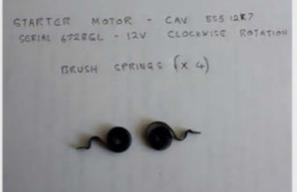
Wet, rusty mess

This is what greeted us once the cover had been removed. At first, little hope of fixing the motor seemed likely.

After a thorough clean up, things didn't look so bad, but two of the brush springs were corroded beyond further use and the brushes were stuck in their holders.



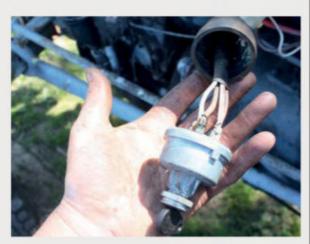
Brush springs

Luck was on our side when we found some dynamo brushes that were suitable and provided enough pressure. The brushes were cleaned, the motor reassembled and refitted.



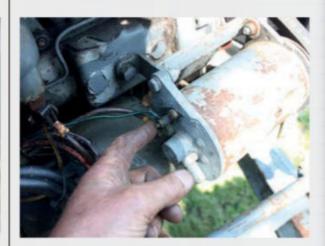
New switch

A new switch was ordered and fitted to replace the faulty one, allowing the tractor to start on the key once again.



Warning lamps

The two warning lamps are for the charging circuit and cold start heater. Red for charging, green for the heater.



Polarised

Whilst finishing off the job, we re-polarised the dynamo, to ensure it charged the battery as intended.

NEXT MONTH: It is hoped that work can continue on the David Brown 780 project, bringing it a step closer to completion.

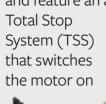

Willetts Farm Sale



The 1988 Case IH 785XL and 1983 IH 956XL made £6,500 each +VAT.

On Saturday 17 July, the machinery contents of the Ashby family's Willetts Farm came under the hammer of South East Marts.

The farm was dedicated to Leyland tractors and featured in *T&M's* sister magazine, *Tractor & Farming Heritage*, nearly 15 years ago now. Most of the relics from that era were present, with the exception of the Leyland 2100, but all looked rather war weary and not in the condition they

were the last time I had seen them.

There were a number of additional lots, including a 1966 Ford pre-Force 4000 selling for a good £4,000 (no VAT). A Case IH 785XL and two-wheel drive 956XL were yours for £6,500 each. Most of the tractors had log books.

Record money for Roadless 118s

On Saturday 24 July, Wellers Auctions of Guildford held the late Gerald Parsons dispersal sale at Honeywood Lane, Oakwood Hill, Surrey.

Cheffins continued its high-profile sales with its mid-term Sutton vintage collective, on Saturday 24 July.

It started with a late-entered 1982 Ford TW-30, EYB 302X, that was a clean tractor to start with. It had 7,325 hours on the clock and had been sprayed well and tided up. Yet another late entry was an original 1993 John Deere 4755 that had worked in Norfolk all its life on one farm. It had been well maintained and had just 4,200 hours on the clock. In no time at all it was sold for £40,500 +VAT.

There were ups and downs, but all things considered, the sale went well.

Humphrey Edwards sale

On Wednesday 21 July, H J Pugh & Co. was at Maesifan, Carmarthen, for the disposal of the late Humphrey Edwards' collection. He was a well-known part of the Welsh tractor preservation scene and was a great Allis-Chalmers and Land Rover fan.

For many years he exhibited at the Great Dorset Steam Fair and took part in the working

area with some of his fleet, especially his A-C B on road bands. Most of the stock had not run for some years, owing to ill health, but the majority had been in the dry and were in original condition.

One to do well was an original 1958 A-C WD-45 standard that sold for a very good £5,000. With 426 lots offered, it was certainly the end of an era.

£53,000 Ferguson-Brown



£10,000 was paid for the 1976 MF 135, while the 165 sold for £11,000.

H J Pugh & Co. held a two-day sale on 16-17 July as a combination of the sales the company would have normally staged at the Much Marcle and Welland rally sites.

There are plenty of tractors to go for at the moment, but occasionally one comes up that two people desperately want and that was the case for a grade 5.5 1938 Ferguson-Brown A (no. 502), registered GNO 521 (with V5C), with original enclosed-pattern rear tyres. The final result was an amazing £53,000! This beat the restored Ferguson-Brown grade 5 record by £28,000!

There has not been an example that looked so good, with so much documentation, for many years. A restored example was making, on average, £18,000 at best in 2019. Neither bidder was going to give in and it has certainly turned the Ferguson-Brown market on its head!

Another to do well was a grade 5 1976 MF 135, PHH 595R, restored by James Cardis of Cumbria. It went on to sell for £10,000, despite not having a cab. A 1970 MF 165 with C&G cab, also restored by James, was registered BAM 512H with a V5C and sold for £11,000.

A 1950 Field-Marshall Series 3 (no. 12962), restored by Robert H Crawford, featured a Hesford winch and had a V5C and instruction book, but was painted orange rather than green, but it still made a record for a Series 3 at £28,000.

A well-restored 1954 Lanz 9506 Bulldog, 408 UXT, sold for a 'thumping' price of £20,500. It made the ex-Australian grade 4 Lanz 48hp Bulldog, sold for £11,900 by Stroud Auctions the week before, look cheap.

Vanstone collection

On Saturday 17 July, the Cheffins team was at Bideford, Devon, for this delayed sale held in brilliant weather. Dave has been a keen enthusiast for many years and has been very much part of the preservation story in Devon for decades. Most of the tractors worked locally.

The first crawler he purchased is one could well be unique in the UK today. I believe it to be a Continental CD70, but I stand to be corrected on that, with an electric-start, 7.24-litre Berliet MDB3R engine.

These crawlers were made at Saint-Cyr, Lyon-Vaise, Rhone, but there was a British 'wing' established at Faggs Lane, Feltham, Middlesex, by 1950. The company started making crawlers in France just before WW2 and continued until 1966.

Only 139 of these crawlers were made and the company created a full range of models for agricultural and plant use, with many of these crawlers featuring a front blade made by Panhard Levassor.

This restored machine looked lovely, but possibly needed some work on the tracks and sprockets in the future. It went on to sell for £3,000.

There were other clean crawlers, but the highlight in this section was the Bristol 20, no. 6269, that was knocked down at a record £4,600.

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can.
Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't on think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

All the prices quoted are what we call hammer prices and don't include UK VAT, commission or value added tax in the USA. If you cannot find your make or model for any reason, or need any advice, you are welcome to call our compiler, tel: 01323 833125.

WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

Band 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been resprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

Band 6

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

There were 39 machines at the event, including John Stephenson's 1930 7nhp traction engine, no. 85620, that he has just put up for sale. Also present was Ducksburys' wonderful 1900 Marshall 10-ton steam roller, no. 34042, called Monica. Paul Ducksbury's late mother bought the engine in 1968, for £640, and it is the oldest in the world.

It eventually ended up at the back of the shed, but in 2016 Paul initiated its revival and thanks to the help of a boiler maker in Cornwall the engine is back together and looking good.

I was saddened to hear that agricultural collector Billy Hammond died five days before his 95th birthday. He was president of the Holt & District Farmers Club for 17 years and very much part of the famous Tunstead Trosh and a keen member of the Starting Handle Club.

Tractor & Machinery sends condolences to his extensive family.

than 1.4 million license applications. The DVLA was also asked to answer MPs' questions on industrial disputes and staff shortages brought about by the pandemic.

The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs has said it would like to lend its support to the hard-working members of staff at the DVLA that have been dealing with a hugely increased workload in the wake of personnel shortages brought about by the pandemic. "We think every workplace can relate to the struggles of the past 18 months," it said recently.

"Through constant dialogue with the DVLA and our close working relationship built up over many years, we have managed to put systems in place whereby our member clubs, their representatives and experts on the ground are able to assist the DVLA through the outsourcing of certain elements of registration processes to the historic vehicle community. These have included in the past the V765 scheme, but also more recently the validation of imports and VHI applications."

It's suggested that, regarding the historic sector, the DVLA is beginning to get back on top of applications. The FBHVC help is to always ensure that historic vehicles that should be on the road are on the road and being enjoyed by their owners and the public as quickly as possible. As a result of those recent discussions on how the FBHVC can assist the DVLA, the FBHVC has now been officially appointed a key stakeholder in the DVLA.

Speaking specifically on the subject of applications for historic vehicles, the DVLA commented: "When applications for historic vehicles cannot be processed using the usual methods, we consider each case individually on its own merits. If required, we also provide guidance to applicants on how best to proceed with their application if further evidence is required.

"Applications that may not have all the expected historic documentary evidence are considered taking into account all the available evidence so as to build a picture of the vehicle's history. Where appropriate, these vehicles are able to retain their history."

This is, at last, some good progress. Lastly, I look forward to seeing some of you on Sunday 3 October in Bodle Street Green, East Sussex BN27 4RA, for our charity road run and vehicle day. All exhibitors will receive a free drinks ticket

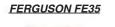
