Tyre-flipping record

A tyre-flipping contest in Newcastle has achieved a new Guinness world record. The event, which took place on 14-15 August, was sponsored by Continental agricultural tyres and featured a Tractor70 tyre weighing 100kg for the men and a 70kg CompactWaster AG telehandler tyre for women.

A new world record was recorded for the men's 100kg 12-hour tyre flip with a distance of 10.725km becoming the new benchmark.

"This was a brilliant event organised by Philip Pugh in aid of the Tiny Lives charity, which helps support the Royal Victoria Infirmary Neonatal unit, and Grace House, a children's hospice," said Continental agricultural specialist Richard Hutchins.

The Continental tyres were supplied by dealer New Bridgegate Tyres, with eight tyres being used across seven different tyre-flipping events.

TE-20's 75 years

he Friends of Ferguson
Heritage is planning a 75th
anniversary tribute to the
TE-20 at the Newark
Vintage Tractor & Heritage
Show on 13-14 November.

The club is hoping to display as many very early tractors as possible, from the first days and weeks of production in 1946, according to FoFH chairman Rob Sowden.

Among them will be number 33, from Colin Taylor in Northern Ireland, which has been restored using almost all parts from its year of manufacture. Mr Taylor says that the only parts that don't date back to 1946 are the fuel, oil and battery.

Also crossing the Irish Sea will be Raymond Browne's newly-restored number six, which rolled off the line in the first week of production. The vehicle was found in 2019, buried under brambles, and its visit to England will be its first since restoration was completed just months ago.

"It is a fantastic and rare opportunity for visitors to see two of the oldest Ferguson tractors which have been restored close to original production line spec," Mr Sowden says.

Club secretary Peter Mitchell says the vehicles offer an insight into a war-torn Britain dogged by fractured supply lines and material shortages. For example, both TE-20s on show have 20hp Continental engines because the planned Standard version was not available in time to meet the production schedule.

Facts like these – and others about the achievements of founder Henry

George (Harry) Ferguson – will be displayed alongside the vehicles.

Aside from the very old machinery, there will be examples from every decade from the Ferguson stable. "We hope to have more than 100 exhibits on the stand in the John Eastwood buildings, grouped in order of model and year of manufacture," says Mr Mitchell. "Along with the early greys, we know of 35s, 135s and 165s which are planning to make the journey to the show."

The club is still finalising entries and would like to see vehicles like the iconic 1200 from the 1970s. Many people have a soft spot for this articulated tractor, despite its unconventional hydrostatic steering system, pivoting between the two axles. "It was a modern design for the UK market which took its styling cues from the big American tractors of the era, so it stood out," says Mr Mitchell.

Finally, to bring the whole exhibit range up to date, the club is in discussion with local MF dealers to bring a large current tractor to the show.

Yara moves to ensure UK fertilizer supply

100 YEARS

ara CEO Svein Tore Holsether has confirmed that Yara is bringing ammonia to Europe from production facilities in Trinidad, the USA and Australia to support fertilizer capacity, after the surge in European wholesale gas prices caused factories within Europe to stop or curtail production.

"Faced with record high gas prices, we actually have the flexibility in our system to switch off ammonia production: so rather than using European natural gas, we're importing from our other facilities that are running at full blast," he said. "We are bringing that ammonia into Europe so that we can maintain our fertilizer production at close to full capacity."

Mark Tucker, Head of Agronomy at Yara UK, has confirmed that the UK will have supplies: "It's a relief for farmers that product is still available, but please do talk to your usual supplier as early as possible to discuss your requirements." "I would also encourage all farmers and their advisors to view this announcement as an opportunity to look again at your season 2021/22 cropping and nitrogen management plans. Are there opportunities to manage risk by considering spring cropping and adopt new technology to further improve nitrogen use efficiency? This will ensure that you make every kilogram of purchased nitrogen work harder for your business and optimise the return on investment."

Yara confirmed it was impossible to say how long the high gas prices would last in Europe, but that it was able to supply all its customers with contracted volumes.

Concluding on the current situation Mr Holsether said: "Longer term, what we need in place is policy to make development of renewable energy more resilient and we need a more value-chain approach to the food system, which is currently so fragmented."

lue Force is throwing an open invitation to all exhibits that cover the club's remit for this year's Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show. Fordson, Ford and New Holland tractors and conversions, as well as Ford trucks, will all be welcome, says club spokesman and magazine editor Jonathan Whitlam.

Normally the club has at least a couple of big themes on its large stand at the show, but following the coronavirus pandemic and the lack of shows for well over a year, it has decided not to specify a particular theme in a bid to encourage as many people as possible to take part.

"Last year's cancelled show would have seen the Fordson E27N Major celebrate its 75th year," says Mr Whitlam. "This time around marks the 70th anniversary of its replacement, the E1A or 'New Major' which was introduced back in 1951."

The tractor was a radically new type of Fordson that for the first time completely

redesigned the concept and was virtually new from the ground up. Its brand-new sleek and, back then, very modern styling concealed a superb new type of engine which was available in either petrol, TVO or diesel variants.

The E1A design was a huge success and was gradually improved on over the years with the Diesel Major, Power Major and Super Major versions before finally bowing out in 1964, says Mr Whitlam.

Other notable celebrations include 50 years since the Ford 7000 model was introduced in 1971 as the first successful, mass-produced turbocharged tractor to be built in Britain.

40 years ago, Ford launched the Series 10 range from the 44hp 2610 up to the 103hp 7610 and 7710. These were the first Ford tractors to be equipped with a synchromesh gearbox.

Then, 30 years ago in 1991, Series 40 was launched to replace the four- and six-cylinder Series 10 models; these being the very last tractors to be introduced by the Ford Motor Company following the Ford New Holland division being sold to Fiat the same year.

It is also now 25 years since the first proper New Holland tractors were launched back in

Despite not specifying a theme, there will nevertheless be several of the aforementioned tractor models in the Blue Force display in the John Eastwood building at the Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show on 13-14 November, as well as in the vintage competition classes.

New BKT plant

TRIAL PRODUCTION HAS started at BKT's new state-of the-art site in Waluj, in the Indian state of Maharashtra.

The result of a \$56 million investment, the plant will be manufacturing small- and medium-diameter tires, designed for machinery operating in the agricultural and industrial industries.

At full capacity, around 500 people will be working at the site.

For BKT this new plant is a strategic choice which not only increases its production, but also makes it more efficient. The site, spread over 22 acres, is just 5km

from BKT's existing production facility in Waluj, opened in 1987.

The project focused on the construction of a cutting-edge plant from both a structural and mechanical point of view and on the reorganisation of departments and work flows for maximum efficiency.

With the foundation stone laid in June 2019, this site arose during the pandemic. BKT was determined to ensure the safety of all those working on the project before continuing with its realisation.

The company intends to expand its share of the off-highway market, following a philosophy summarised

by Arvind Poddar, BKT President and CEO: "Growth is our commitment. Looking ahead is our constant goal. A company which cannot look boldly towards its future is like a person who cannot dream".

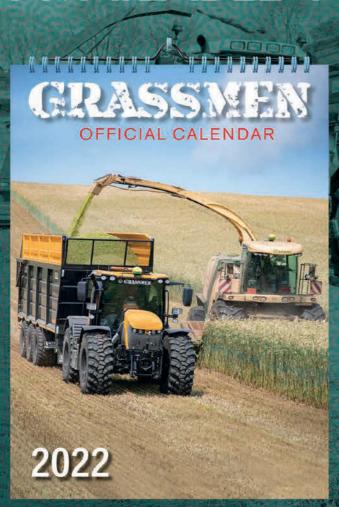

A purchase with purpose

David and Russell McNeill's International Harvester 574 Hydro has been a labour of love, but it's not just for show, as Scott Lambert discovered.



he launch of any new tractor range is important, but International Harvester's World Wide Series had to be particularly good. Not only was it replacing a group of tractors that had built up an enviable reputation, but it was replacing a group of tractors that was somewhat 'long in the tooth' and required features that would demonstrate IH's ingenuity and put the new range well ahead of the competition.

First out of the blocks. in 1970, were the 454 and 574 - the former a threecylinder, 52hp tractor and the latter a four-cylinder, 68hp model. They were accompanied by the Bradford-built 354, but this was not a new design - simply a 37½hp replacement for the IH 276 and 434, with new styling.

Assembled in Doncaster, the 454 and 574 had a lot to offer cash-conscious buyers - including comfort, safety and ease of operation, and at their heart were German-built diesel engines, namely the D.179 and D.239 respectively.

The D.239 was a four-stroke, directinjection, water-cooled engine producing 68hp (63hp DIN). The four-cylinder unit had wet, replaceable liners and a Bosch fuel injection system with hydraulic governor. Later examples used a CAV fuel pump.

Bore size was 98mm (3.88in) and the stroke was a not insignificant 128.5mm (5.06in), with the total piston displacement being 3,915cc (239cu in). Maximum torque of 236Nm (174lb/ft) was generated at 1,500rpm and rated speed was 2,200rpm for tractors with the synchromesh transmission and 2,400rpm for hydrostatic examples.

The tractors had been built with the driver in mind and standard features like

of vital importance a hydrostatic transmission has distinct advantages.

Such transmissions were not new technology, but fitting it as an option on a British-built range was a different concept. Hydrostatic drive was first showcased by International Harvester, in 1960, on the HT-340. This was a gas turbine-driven experimental tractor that was not a success in terms of fuel, but paved the way for hydrostatic transmissions in everyday tractors.

From 1964 onwards, International Harvester fitted hydrostatic transmissions into a range of machines, starting with the 430 combine. Following that, everything from garden tractors to cotton pickers utilised the technology, so the World Wide Series seemed like an ideal platform for IHGB to introduce Hydro as an alternative to synchromesh and the optional Torque Amplifier.

INTERNAL COMPONENTS

The hydrostatic element of the transmission slotted in place of the standard gearbox (a four-speed, two-range unit (with optional TA), while the rest of the rear end was similar to a conventional gear-drive version. The main difference was that the range gearbox did not feature a reverse gear, as the hydrostatic unit provided this. The steering, hydraulic lift, and auxiliary hydraulics were, in essence, the same as a gear-drive model.

A mechanically-driven, low-pressure charge/servo pump provided oil to fill the high-pressure pump and motor, as well provide a supply of oil to the servo rams that controlled the speed and direction of the tractor.

The axial piston pump converted mechanical energy into hydraulic energy and a hydraulic motor converted this hydraulic energy back to mechanical energy to drive the rear wheels. Controlling the amount of oil pumped to the motor, and the direction it was

pumped, was done using a flat, circular plate known as a swashplate.

In the pump, a total of nine pistons forced themselves against the aforementioned swashplate. When the swashplate was angled, it varied the pistons' stroke and it was the alteration of stroke that determined the amount of oil that was pumped.

The pistons were filled with a light resin called Phenolic and met the swashplate at an angle, so as the pump piston rode down the angled plate it pushed it forward and this discharged the fluid. The fluid then forced the motor piston backwards, the piston rode down the angled swashplate and, thus, the barrel assembly was rotated.



A good finish was achieved with the spray gun. Note the Bettinson cage/dual wheel lugs.

Following a complete revolution of the barrel, the piston rode up the opposite side of the swashplate and was forced back into the cylinder and the oil was discharged, returning to the pump and filling the piston in readiness for the next pumping stroke.

The swashplate did not have fixed positions and could be adjusted between the fully open and fully closed positions via the Speed Ratio Control Lever (SRCL) on the dash panel – allowing the operator to choose any speed between zero and the tractor's top speed of 20mph.

A crown wheel:pinion ratio of 14:51 permitted the high top speed on hydrostatic tractors, but a 15mph top >

speed was the norm for tractors destined for the export market.

Switching between forward and reverse was also done via the control lever. Selecting reverse altered the angle of the swashplate to the opposite of its forward position, reversing the flow of oil and rotating the motor in the opposite direction.

Aside from regular servicing, with particular attention paid to filter changes, it was imperative to incorporate a large oil cooler into the system. Cool oil has better lubrication characteristics and means longer life for components. In this case, the 574 had the capacity to cool 14 gallons of oil per minute.

The oil cooler was situated in front of the radiator, where the air was cooler and cleaner and, following removal of the radiator grille, could be swung out to be cleaned to enable optimum performance. An oil cooler bypass valve enabled cold oil from the cooler to be bypassed – allowing the oil to reach working temperature quickly when the tractor was started during cold weather.

EASE OF OPERATION

The main features of a 574 Hydro were listed as ease of operation, no gears to change, no clutch, independent control of forward speed and engine speed, an infinite range of speeds, instant forward/reverse operation, smooth iPTO engagement, positive engine braking and 'Foot-N-Inch' control.

These equated to lower maintenance costs, less driver fatigue, more output, maximum fuel consumption and optimum efficiency.

Although a Hydro model was capable of performing any tasks that a gear-drive tractor could do, it was best suited to jobs

that made the most of its benefits – such as loader work, baling, hedge cutting, precision planting, hoeing and harvesting.

It is the latter that attracted David and Russell McNeill to an International Harvester tractor with this transmission. "Both David and I are civil/mechanical engineers and we look after Curragh Farm in Aghadowey," Russell explained. "It totals around 25 acres and we grow a few acres of old variety potatoes with my three kids, who love the outdoor work. It brings back memories of my father growing potatoes in hard times when we were growing up.

"We searched for a few years for a Hydro machine, for ease of speed control for potato harvesting and planting."

The 574 Hydro was a very versatile machine and ideal for this sort of work. Aside from the transmission, a dual-

root crops, such as the McNeills' limited acreage

On average land, just 35hp is required to operate the 711 and with four sorters aboard Massey Ferguson claimed that output was around 2-2½ acres per day.

A disc lifted the row of potatoes and soil and a rotor passed the potatoes into the side-mounted drum elevator, with the fine soil falling back to the field. Rubber-covered fingers inside the drum lifted the potatoes onto the sorting table – comprising rubberised canvas to minimise damage to the crop.

From here the team of sorters moved the potatoes into a rubberised conveyor trough and the stones and clods headed towards the deflector, doubling as a scraper to keep the sorting table clean, before falling to the ground off the front of the machine.

Two versions were available – bagger and bulk delivery – but otherwise the features were the same. A chain-driven unit permitted two PTO speeds, suiting numerous tractors, while independent depth control was achieved from the tractor seat via a hydraulic ram on each wheel. A kit was available to make the 711 suitable for harvesting early potatoes, bulbs and carrots

In June 1968, the list price of the bagger model was £770, while the bulk delivery model was £876. The elevator attachment was an additional £116.

speed power take-off was fitted as standard. Unlike the 454, that was fitted with a single-speed PTO as standard, the 574 had dual power take-off shafts – either 614 and 1,004rpm or 555 and 1,004rpm. The system fitted was

D.239 engine. Parasitic losses meant that this was not enough for a tractor with a hydrostatic transmission and power at the PTO, in particular, was insufficient.

IHGB rectified this on later versions of the 574 Hydro by increasing the power

IHGB rectified this on later versions of the 574 Hydro by increasing the power output of the engine to that of the 674 – 78hp.

specified at the time of order, but can be determined today by noting the third suffix letter on the serial number plate – 'Y' for the former and 'Z' for the latter.

Initially, the 574 Hydro had the same power rating as its synchromesh sibling, with an output of 68hp produced by the

output of the engine to that of the 674 – 78hp. This meant that the power at the PTO, 58hp, was now the same on synchromesh and hydrostatic versions of the 574.

The three-point linkage was a reversible category I and II affair, with a

lifting force of 1,790kg (3,950lb) at the link ends. Power came from a transmission-mounted, live hydraulic pump with an output of 45 litres per minute (10gpm) and a work pressure of 172bar (2,500psi). Position, draft, response and drop rate were all conveniently controlled by levers at hip level, to the operator's right.

JUST THE JOB

The 574 had the features that would prove attractive to more than 29,000 buyers between 1970 and 1977 and these, plus the fact that a hydrostatic transmission added another dimension, proved irresistible to Russell.

He went on to say: "We bought this machine from a local fella who had found it in Scotland. It had only had two owners when we bought it – one that owned from new, until recently, and ▶

it had been standing in a shed for decades.

"It was showing an original 4,500 hours and 9,000 miles on the speedometer. It was saved from being a loader tractor and although one was on it, it was never plumbed in!

"The bonnet, side panels, doors and front were unmarked, with not even a dent, and the original decals were still present. The downside was the tops of the mudguards – they were rotten!

"We made the decision to blast of the panels and left this in the capable hands of C Boyd Tractor, Machinery & Lorry Resprays in Ballymoney. While this was being done we CNC cut and folded the mudguards in house quite easily."

Although, at first glance, the cab on the McNeill's tractor looks the same as any other tractor from the World Wide Series, look closely and you will see that it is the later, ISO-mounted cab that was introduced to comply with new noise regulations introduced in June 1976.

As well as keeping the noise level at the driver's ear below 90 decibels, the rubber mounts helped cushion the ride. Tinted glass was also included to cut out 60 per cent of the sun's heat and reduce glare. Inside, heavily-padded, soundabsorbent trim reduced the noise level further.

"Any parts we needed were found without too much bother. The majority came from Farmcare NI, while others came from SPS Parts.

"Other than the shot blasting and glazing, everything else was done in-house," Russell explained. "Re-wiring, painting mixing, painting, the interior and any mechanical work – including servicing of the transmission. JS Windscreens of Balnamore glazed and re-gasketed the entire machine."

The finishing touch, as with most restorations of this nature, was the application of the decals. Kits for World Wide Series tractors are widely available, but the missing element was the 'Hydro' decal for the upper portion of the bonnet. David and Russell enlisted a local company to produce some to match the originals.

The 574 Hydro has proved to be a hit and exactly what the McNeills needed for planting and harvesting potatoes. The tractor, as can be seen in the

photograph on page 14, was used in conjunction with a Massey Ferguson 711 potato harvester this year and Russell was very complimentary about its performance.

"For our job, we can't fault it. The ground speed control is revolutionary and the only drawback I see is power loss in the transmission. For its era, it's no noisier than say a Massey Ferguson 265. I'd say the main drawback is improper use and understanding that it's not really suited to heavy, low-rpm draft work.

"The only other drawback which I foresee is the servicing cost – a set of filters being £60 and oil being around £170. I suspect that most were not serviced correctly, hence the early demise of some and now the rarity of parts. An interesting fact is that if you drain the transmission oil you must refill the transmission below the floor with five gallons in addition to what you put in the filler plug, or you will destroy the transmission."

The McNeills' IH 574 Hydro looks set to be a useful addition to the farm and with enthusiastic youngsters waiting in the wings, its future appears to be assured. Hydro may not have had the impact that International Harvester would have liked, but it proved popular with those that needed the benefits it could offer, whilst paving the way for other continuously-variable transmission systems.

Kevin's back!

Carters Steam Fair pulled into Pinkneys Green, near Maidenhead, for its 40th occasion over the August bank holiday and Peter Love was pleased to become acquainted with Kevin the County - a tractor that has thousands of young followers on social media.



arters Steam Fair is a traditional, travelling fun fair, with rides dating from the 1890s to the 1960s. Boss Joby Carter said: "We are a unique piece of living history. Over the past 44 years we have been rescuing and restoring vintage fairground rides and attractions, taking them on tour around London and the South East for everyone to enjoy."

One of the features that makes Carters Steam Fair unique is the decoration of its rides and transport, with consistently superb signwriting, lining and traditional fairground decoration, created by Joby and his team. Joby is a leading expert on the traditional craft of signwriting and fairground art and hosts training courses at Carters Yard,

particularly during the colder, winter months.

In 1977, show promoters John and Anna Carter bought the rare 1895 Robert Tidman & Sons Jubilee Steam Gallopers that were in a terrible state and restored them magnificently in a short time. The ride is still in operation with Joby to this day.

Carters took the Jubilee Steam Gallopers to steam rallies and fairs and as their passion for vintage fairgrounds grew, they added more rides to their collection. They soon became known as a specialist in vintage fairground rides and restoration and the artistic talents of Anna Carter were put to good use restoring rides back to their former glory.

In 1999 they found a new yard to house the fair during the winter months,

but they were shocked when John Carter was diagnosed with Hodgkin lymphoma and sadly died the following year – it was a huge shock to his family and the preservation world.

John's enthusiasm and vision had been a guiding force, and his children had inherited a love for the fair and for what it stood for. After a difficult few months, it was decided to get the fair back out on the road and continue what John had started.

The fair has since gone from strength to strength, with Joby, Anna, Seth and Rosie Carter and their families all personally involved, and with many friends and supporters working hard to keep it on the road.

Joby and his wife Georgina took over the managing of the fair from Anna some years ago now, and are heavily involved in the travelling, maintenance and restoration of the rides.

The collection of rides and side stalls makes Carters the largest travelling vintage fun fair in the world and it is an incredible collection of beautiful vintage rides and attractions that would otherwise would have been lost. The highly-skilled restoration team have helped other people save items of British heritage. "We are certain that John would be very proud of what we have achieved," Anna Carter says.

AUCTION LOT

No. 17 in the fleet is a 1966 County 954/1124 that was bought in 2012 from an online auction site and was named in jest after Kevin, who was the winning bidder on behalf of Joby.

County introduced the Super-6 954 in the middle of 1966, powered by the Ford 2703E six-cylinder 95bhp power unit, but looking at this example it has been uprated with a heavy-duty rear axle from a 1004 model and the larger 113bhp 2704E that went in the County 1124, that was first shown at the 1967 Royal Show at Stoneleigh. 'Kevin' also features the later-style Ford Force panels.

Joby had wanted one ever since he was a teenager and his family had borrowed an example from friend and circus owner the late Gerry Cottle, and it turned out to be a great success.

The tractor arrived looking a bit worse for wear, but in working order, painted blue – but was changed to Carters' maroon livery.

'Kevin' is used to move vehicles around on wet ground, and because of its light weight and low gearing it's able to shunt things around without causing too much damage to the ground.

The tractor had been out of use for some years, but Joby instructed fellow showmen the Hyman family to rebuild the tractor. They did a great job and 'Kevin' is now back out on the show field, doing what it was bought to do.

I caught up with the County at Pinkney's Green on 'build up day', Thursday 26 August, and it was great to see it in action. How often do you see a County tractor genuinely earning its keep in a commercial setting?

As County values are going up every month at the moment, most examples are now just being cosseted on the rally field or in a shed and to see one at work in different circumstances was a fantastic experience.

Joby was full of enthusiasm for the tractor and I would like to thank him for taking time out from his very busy schedule to talk to me and for his encouragement for me to write something about 'Kevin' in *Tractor* & *Machinery*.

The first generation

Ford's Series 10 celebrates its 40th anniversary this year. Jonathan Whitlam looks back.

PART ONE

t was 40 years ago this year, in 1981,
that the Ford Motor Company
updated all of its three- and fourcylinder models, placing them all
within a single series. These new
tractors were a major upgrade on what
had gone before, marking the introduction

The 64hp Ford 4610 was the best-selling
three-cylinder tractor in the range and
also the largest of the initial four models,
making it ideal to show off the main
features of the new Series 10 tractors,
which used the same 'Q' cab as the
previous 600 Series.

The models were also the beginning of 10 years of evolution of a series of tractors that would expand in scope as the years went by and would also take the Ford tractor from a purely mechanical machine into the beginning of the era of electronics.

of several new features to the Ford line.

Although new, the Series 10 models that appeared in 1981 were firmly based on earlier incarnations of Ford tractors. In fact, the basis for the Series 10 range can be traced right back to the 1000 Series tractors, launched in 1964. This range of four models replaced the Fordson tractors that, in one form or another, had been such an iconic part of British farming since 1917, although now the same range of tractors would be built, not only in the USA and in Belgium, but also at a brand-new factory built for the purpose at Basildon in Essex.

Early teething troubles with the all-new line-up saw the improved Force models arrive in 1968, with these modified machines cementing the success of the new range and selling extremely well.

The Force tractors were the first to be fitted with Ford's own safety cab from 1970. The existing range of 2000, 3000, 4000 and 5000 models, plus the American 8000 and 9000 six-cylinder machines, was joined in 1971 by the 94hp, turbocharged, four-cylinder 7000, followed by the 8600 and 9600 replacing the American six-cylinder tractors in 1972 – these latter two tractors being the precursors to the new 600 Series range.

It would be 1975 when the Force range finally gave way to the new 600 Series

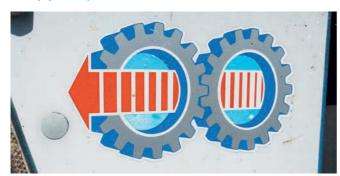
proper and it then took until 1976 before a new quiet cab was included to meet the sound level guidelines then being implemented by the powers that be! The new Ford cab helped make the new-look 600 Series, and the 700 Series four-cylinder variants, really look the part as the latest in tractor design and thus set the scene for what would come in the '80s.

NEW GENERATION

The first sign of change actually came in 1980 when the four-cylinder tractors in the 600 and 700 Series received new engines with more power. These were called the PowerPlus models and a small

decal of a piston was included on both sides of the bonnet to denote the new feature. The engines were, in fact, the first fruits of a programme that had been initiated to produce the next generation of Ford tractor that would soon become Series 10.

And so, 1981 saw the introduction of the new Series 10 tractor range, thus replacing all the Ford tractor models previously in existence, from the little 2600 up to the turbocharged, luxury 7700. This was the entire range of three- and four-cylinder models and the 8700 and 9700 that evolved from the 8600 and 9600 in 1976 had already

been replaced by the new TW range in 1979, so Series 10 saw the updating of the Ford tractor range across the board.

There was an anachronism though, in the shape of the 8200 model. This tractor had been based on the earlier 8100 and was built in relatively small numbers for Ford by County Commercial Cars. Despite the arrival of Series 10, the 8200 would soldier on next to the new range and did not change at all until it finally bowed out in 1982.

SYNCHROSHIFT

The Series 10 range was actually first seen at a dealer show in Switzerland in September 1981. At first glance the new range looked pretty similar to the outgoing machines, but a closer look revealed a brand-new design of decals on the bonnet and also a re-designed front cowl above the radiator grille that was liftable to gain access to the dry air element filter underneath. On either side of this, on both sides of the bonnet, a new logo of meshed gears was included on what was now a white painted panel, the new decal signifying the biggest change brought in with the Series 10 the Synchroshift transmission.

Synchromesh gears were a first for the Ford tractor, despite the likes of Deutz and IH already having gone over to this type of easier-to-use gearbox. Ever since the innovative Select-O-Speed transmission had quietly disappeared, about 10 years prior to Series 10, all Ford tractors had been equipped with a basic constant-mesh, eight-speed transmission, soon uprated by the optional Dual Power gear splitter in the early 1970s, which provided 16 speeds in all and gave a high and low speed in each of the main gears – operated by a switch and without the need to depress the clutch.

Now a synchromesh transmission had been added to the mix, giving eight forward speeds and four in reverse – the

same number as before, but with better spacing of the ratios. The Dual Power option was also still available to double the number of gears. With Synchroshift in the new 1981 Series 10, Ford now had a truly synchromesh box that made changing through the gears on the move much easier – or at least it would have done if Ford had not decided to fit a column change unit with a difficult-tomaster shift pattern to control the gear selection!

Synchroshift was a very good and useful addition to the Ford tractor but, in shades of what had happened earlier with Select-O-Speed, operators struggled to get to grips with the illogical change pattern, especially on the four-cylinder models. The three-cylinder tractors also had a column change, but it was easier to operate – due to a different layout that used the range lever on the left and the speed lever on the right. This was much less complicated than the four-cylinder models with both levers positioned on the right.

Unhappy users soon dubbed the new gearbox the 'Rubik's Cube', after the popular puzzle game invented in the '70s, and, eventually, Ford responded by altering the way the levers operated into a more logical and easier-to-use form, although still with a column-mounted set of levers.

This was where the larger, ex-700 Series tractors came into their own, as they were not affected by the column change issues, their Synchroshift transmission being controlled by conventional floor-mounted gear levers to the right-hand side of the driving seat. This often made the 6710 and 7710 a better proposition than the smaller, column-change 6610 and 7610 variants, although the 6710 and 7710 were heavier, larger and more expensive to purchase.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS

Another innovation was the expansion of the availability of factory-fitted four-wheel drive on Ford's Series 10. Previously, Ford had been more than happy to simply produce two-wheel drive tractors and let the conversion specialists, such as County and Roadless, produce four-wheel drive versions, these then being sold through Ford dealerships alongside the standard machines.

Times were changing though and, after the 8700 and 9700 arrived in the late 1970s with the option of four-wheel drive and then their replacement, Series

TW, also having the option, it was the beginning of the end for the four-wheel drive conversions. The three-cylinder 600 Series models were offered with factory-fitted four-wheel drive in 1980, using a Carraro axle, and with Series 10 the option extended to the 5610, 6610, 6710, 7610 and 7710 models - really hitting the four-wheel drive specialists hard. In fact, most had gone into receivership by 1983.

The Carraro axle was retained for the three-cylinder Series 10 models, but on the four-cylinder tractors a centre-drive ZP axle was used.

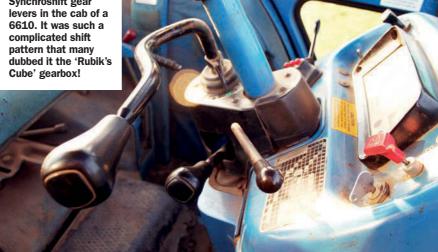
Series 10 also benefited from a more powerful hydraulic system, giving a faster flow rate and the ability for both the external services and rear linkage to be operated at the same time. The new hydraulic system gave faster operation and was a real improvement on what had gone before.

The three-cylinder Series 10 models, which had now received the engine improvements that had originally been seen in the four-cylinder PowerPlus 600 Series, were initially made up of the 2610, 3610, 4110 and 4610, mirroring the earlier 2600, 3600, 4100 and 4600 machines.

The four-cylinder tractors replacing the 5600, 6600 and 7600 were the 5610, 6610 and 7610, making it easy to keep some sort of commonality with the familiar numbering system of the older

The 6710 and 7710 had a higher floor and joined the aforementioned models to give a comprehensive offering of tractors from 44hp to 103hp, thus keeping Ford at the forefront of tractor sales in many countries, including the United Kingdom.

NEW MODELS & CABS

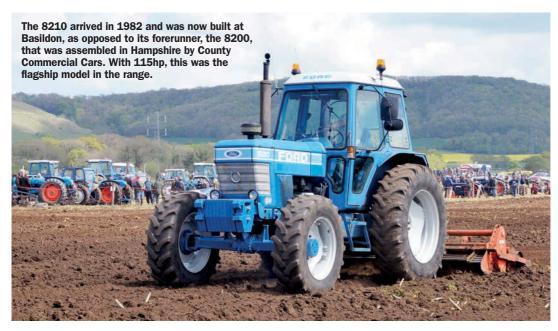
1982 saw the introduction of the first new model to appear in the Series 10 line-up since its introduction. This tractor was also the first six-cylinder tractor to become part of Series 10 and was dubbed the 8210. This was a 116hp tractor that was the replacement for the 8200 and was now built at Basildon as an integral part of the Series 10 line-up. The 'Q' cab and Synchroshift floor-mounted gear levers were standard fitments and four-wheel drive was an option.

The 'Q' cab was used across the range, much as it had been on the earlier tractors, including the smaller machines, often looking rather top heavy on the small 2610, 3610 and 4110, which was not surprising really, as the cab was the same size if it was fitted to the little 2610 or the 188hp TW-30!

Lambourn had provided a low-profile cab option for the three-cylinder models

in the 600 Series and for Series 10 Ford sourced a cab from Sekura from 1982, dubbed the LP – denoting low-profile. This cab provided a much more utilitarian workplace than the 'Q' cab, with flat glass and panels, but it was very useful for working in buildings with low clearances and was also often chosen by cost-conscious farmers, because it was cheaper. The four-cylinder 5610 was also offered with this cab, but the 'Q' cab remained the only option on the 6610 and 7610.

The 2610 and 3610 received a major upgrade in 1983, becoming the 2910 and 3910 respectively, and with beefed-up rear axles to make them stronger. Other improvements were made to make them more similar to the larger 4110 and 4610. Ford was also listening to customers complaints about the gear shift pattern of the Series 10 tractors and it was also in 1983 that a new 'H' ➤

pattern gear shift replaced the original version, making operation much easier and more logical. The gear levers were still positioned under the steering column, but at least it could no longer be called the Rubik's Cube!

By 1983 a serious problem had reared its head in the shape of perforated engine blocks, something that would become a problem synonymous with Ford tractors and one that was exacerbated by the ever more powerful and heavier tractors being produced. The fourcylinder engines were the most prone to perforation, due to additional vibration.

Ford addressed the problem by fitting ribbed engine blocks, which were stronger and helped to prevent these issues, but it took the use of a chemical product in the cooling system to finally sort these problems for good.

1984 saw the introduction of another new model – the 7910. This was basically a de-rated version of the 8210, with the same six-cylinder engine being fuelled to produce 103hp. This was to meet a demand from French farmers in particular, who preferred a straight six-cylinder engine over a turbocharged four pot in this power class. The 7910 also found sales elsewhere, including in the UK, but it was always rather overshadowed by the more powerful 8210.

It was also in 1984 that the four-wheel drive systems used on the Series 10 were upgraded, with an improved ZF unit on the four-cylinder machines and a centre- drive design now used on three-cylinder models. Also, in 1984, a new LP2 cab replaced the original and a

new AP, or All-Purpose, higher version was also produced, the latter version being available on the 4610, 5610, 6610 and the 7610.

Once again, these cabs were built by Sekura for Ford. The two larger models fitted with the AP cab also reverted back to the constant-mesh Dual Power transmission, keeping the price of these machines at a very affordable level compared with the standard tractors.

South Essex Motors, which had already been responsible for several altered Ford tractors, began producing a narrow version of the 4610, as well as a turbocharged variant, the 4610T, with 77hp under the bonnet. Both were produced from 1984.

The original Series 10 had been very successful for Ford, even despite the unpopularity of the Synchroshift column change. By 1985 the range had been on the market for around four years and it was then that it was given a full makeover to take it through to the 1990s. This would include a new Super-Q cab option and styling tweaks that made the new Series 10 Force II quite possibly the best-looking Ford tractors of all time.

MACHINERY MILESTONES

Marshall 100 Series

The landmark events in agricultural machinery production that proved successful for manufacturers and features that set the standard for others to follow.



nitially, Marshall's 100 Series comprised just two models – the 100 and 115 – but the 125 was latterly available as the range-topping model. As with many other 'new' ranges, the 100 Series was a blend of proven and new technology.

At its heart was the Leyland 6/98 engine – with the 103.5hp Marshall 100 using the engine in naturally-aspirated form and the two larger models using a turbocharged version of the 6/98. Maximum torque was delivered at low revs, particularly in naturally-aspirated form, and other features included a viscous fan and stainless steel exhaust.

Coupled to the engine, via a 13-inch (330mm), single-plate clutch, was a ZF transmission with 20 forward and nine reverse gears – of which eight forward and four reverse gears were creep speeds. This gearbox is essentially the same as that fitted to the IH 1255XL and 1455XL, as well as some Fendt Favorit models.

Speeds ranged from 0.3mph (0.5kph) to around 20mph (32kph), with an electronically-engaged differential lock and a power-assisted hand clutch providing control of a two-speed power take-off. Four-wheel drive models used a side-drive front axle with limited-slip differential and electronic engagement of drive, permitted on the move.

For added ease of control and safety, hydrostatic steering, automatic four-wheel braking and hydraulic trailer braking were standard fitments.

At the rear, things got rather interesting. Like some of its competitors, lower link sensing was part of the package – providing accurate draft control with all types of implements – but the 100 Series scored heavily in the fact that it utilised electronic linkage control. Not only was it accurate, but it

provided the facility to mix position and draft control, the ability to reset an implement at a pre-set depth after turning at the headland, and a variable response for lifting and lowering the linkage.

Mudguard-mounted controls made hitching implements easier and a hydraulic drop arm took the drudgery out of linkage levelling. Lift capacity was 10,000lb (4,536kg) and the three double-acting spools were colour coded for simplicity.

The Sekura-built Explorer cab was common across the Marshall range, but it looked particularly good on the 100 Series. Two doors, a flat deck, an adjustable steering wheel, a suspension seat with swivel function and ergonomic controls made for a nice working environment.

When the Leyland tractor business was sold in 1982 to Charles Nickerson, the owner of Marshall Tractors, it was hoped that the legacy of the Leyland tractor line would enjoy a prosperous future, but it soon became clear that this would not be the case.

In the early days of Marshall building the former Leyland models at Gainsborough, it was envisaged that around 2,000 tractors per year would leave the factory, but around three years into the venture and Marshall had only assembled around 1,000 tractors – 97 of which were purported to be 100 Series models. The company had run out of money and the receivers were called in.

Production was transferred to Scunthorpe under the leadership of Theakstons of Driffield, for a short time, before Bentall-Simplex bought the business. This marked the end of the 100 Series, as in 1989 Marshall Daimler Ltd. began a badge-engineering exercise with Steyr tractors and the six-cylinder machines were confined to the history books.

Over the years, much of the negativity surrounding the 1690 has diminished, especially amongst David Brown fanatics, and it has become a popular model for classic tractor enthusiasts. Robert, as an aficionado of the marque, realised its potential as both an appreciating asset and a reliable workhorse and knew that a 1690 was just what he was looking for - irrespective of

"On first inspection, I did not know whether to laugh or cry," Robert exclaimed. "It was really rough and needed a lot of work, but on the up side it had a really sweet-sounding engine with minimal blowback. I purchased the tractor and a transporter brought it to my workshop in Co. Down.

"I started by removing what panels were still on the tractor, to give me access to the engine. Next was a full service, with all oils and filters renewed. Then the work really started!"

The cab, a Sekura-built unit that has received a great deal of praise over the years from both David Brown and Leyland/Marshall fans, was in a poor ➤

eing brought up on a farm that ran David Brown tractors, it was inevitable that Robert McCormick would develop a soft spot for them. "We started with a David Brown Cropmaster, followed by a 990 Implematic - which I still have," he told T&M.

"I bought my first tractor in 1980, a David Brown 996, and have had a number of David Browns since - but I always wanted a 1690. They are really quite rare, so when I saw one advertised on Done Deal, I really had to go and see it."

David Brown Tractors, based at Meltham Mills in Yorkshire, had been building tractors for 40 years when it introduced the new 90 Series. The company had been acquired by Tenneco and merged with J I Case in 1972, and this resulted in the Case name appearing on David Brown's tractors, albeit in a

small font, and the new range was the last where the David Brown name would appear prominently on the bonnet.

Underneath the new tinwork the skid units were very familiar, but the new cab, styling and numbering system meant that the 90 Series appeared extremely fresh. Five new models were offered, with

in terms of specification, while the 1490 was the largest of the four-cylinder models, with 83hp available. The flagship of the range was the 103hp, six-cylinder 1690 which, like the 1490, could be purchased in two-wheel drive form with the award-winning Hydra-Shift transmission, instead of the synchromesh unit. Unfortunately, teething troubles were experienced with the new range and the 1690, in particular, needed issues

state – inside and out. "The doors had been held closed with a rope tied from one to the other," said Robert. "New inner and outer door handles at least gave me easy access to the cab, but once inside there was also plenty to do. The floor was wet and slippery, but a new clutch master cylinder rectified that.

"Next was the electrical system – there was not even an ignition light. Local auto electrician Stephen Wilson, from Truck & Plant Elex, was called in and he transformed the tractor with LED headlights, work lamps and, of course, flashing beacons.

"One frustrating problem that I came across was that finding the gears proved difficult," Robert explained. "The 1690 had the early gear change, so I have upgraded the gear stick and selector to a 1594 type, which is much better.

"What changes the tractor most, but takes the least time, is the panels. I purchased a new front panel and nose cone and after getting the bonnet and all of the panels rubbed down, I gave them a coat of primer followed by the top coats. I also took advantage of having the panels off the tractor and gave the chassis and engine a nice bright coat of David Brown/ Case Power Red to brighten it up."

The 90 Series was not only the last range to feature the David Brown name on the bonnet, but it was also the last to

feature a Power Red skid unit. Following the introduction of the 94 Series, Power Red was only used on the wheels, with the skid unit finished in black – with the livery often referred to as the 'Magpie' colour scheme.

ASSET

Robert's intention was to add to his fleet of dependable classics with a tractor that is mechanically sound and will perform the tasks that are asked of it. The purists may not like the LED headlights and additional work lights, but they make the tractor more usable and provide him with a machine that will undertake the heavier jobs on the farm, as well as being a great tractor for road runs.

"I have to say, I am delighted with the result," Robert told *Tractor & Machinery.* "I am sure that the 1690 will be a great asset on our farm."

Come 1984 and the introduction of the 94 Series, more power was on offer throughout the range – with the exception of the 1194 and 1494. The output of the 1294 was now 61hp, while the 1394 was a 72hp tractor – thanks to the addition of a turbocharger.

The top-of-the-range 1694 now boasted 108hp from its turbocharged six-cylinder engine, while there was a newcomer that filled the original gap. The 95hp 1594 used a naturally-aspirated six-cylinder

engine and became a popular choice with many buyers.

A creeper transmission was now an option on the 1394 and 1494, while the Hydra-Shift transmission was finally available as an option on four-wheel drive tractors – resulting in an advanced package that was ahead of much of the competition at the time.

The 94 Series improved the original design and addressed the bulk of the earlier issues. The loss of the David Brown name did not seem to have a detrimental effect on sales – which is surprising given the high regard in which the David Brown name was held in agricultural circles.

Of course, beneath the Case decals and the new livery, the 94 Series was still a David Brown product – a range of Yorkshire-built tractors with British engineering at its heart.

The 1690 may have given way to the 1694, but as the first David Brown six-cylinder tractor for many years it will always have a special place in enthusiasts' hearts and worth saving whenever the opportunity arises. ■

Regarding the letter about the colour of Pettit trailers, the models that I have seen have all been painted in red, as shown in the 'three-way tipper' picture.

Keruing was the preferred species of timber used by most trailer manufacturers of that era, with its very fine grain, lack of knots and rot resistance. Keruing does have its downside though – splinters will go septic (and painful) overnight, so be careful when handling it. I would advise wearing gloves, but I can never work comfortably with thick gloves on.

Keruing also contains a lot of resin, which comes to the surface in spherical globules, especially in hot weather. This is a good reason not to varnish the boards, as the resin will push the varnish off the surface of the timber. I recommend treating the timber with Danish Oil, as this soaks in but does not leave an impermeable surface coating.

Also, once varnish starts to deteriorate it is difficult to smarten it up without major work, whereas Danish Oil can be given a wipe over by brush or cloth and it will be good as new again. There are many different 'recipes' under the banner of Danish Oil, the important thing seems to be the percentage of Tung Oil it contains. I

have found the product from Rye Oil to be particularly good.

I have included a picture of a recent restoration where the boards are treated with Danish Oil. Just another word regarding varnish. If you do decide to use varnish, then bear in mind that there are many very different products that go under the name 'varnish'. Going for 'Yacht varnish' sounds rather better, but even that is not foolproof as yacht varnish from one well-known High Street supplier is not recommended for external use!

The key thing is to use Yacht varnish from a manufacturer that expects it to be applied to boats, so buy from a chandlery and you should be okay.

My other point relates to Andrew Hall's MF trailer restoration. It's an enjoyable read and honest too, outlining the problems in dismantling the hydraulic ram on these 'five-stud' trailers. Andrew had new seals made specially, but I can advise that these are 'off the shelf' items from Fergie Trailer Shop, which should be a cheaper option.

SL: Valuable insight – thank you Phil. I have to say that the timber originally used on my Pettit trailer has proved extremely durable. For an implement built well over 50 years ago, the current condition of the boards on the sides of the trailer is remarkable!



High-hour fleet

Dear T&M.

I enjoyed your article on the Linssens' MF fleet. It shows what can be achieved by regular servicing and careful operating, but it seems to highlight a huge difference in the economics of farming in the Netherlands as opposed to the UK.

Running a profitable small mixed farm in the UK without a direct marketing operation is pretty much impossible. And four tractors, all racking up high hours, on a 100-acre dairy, beef and arable operation? What on Earth are they all doing?

SL: I too questioned the number of hours that the tractors were racking up, but when you break it down it's not unimaginable.

The MF 135, for example, has clocked around 17,500 hours over 45 years. That's approximately 389 hours per year, or 7.5 hours per week. The MF 3060 has amassed more than 21,500 hours over 31 years – which equates to approximately 694 hours per year, or 13 hours per week.

As for the economics of farming and the differences between the Netherlands and the UK, that's something I am not able to comment on. Perhaps a reader with knowledge of the subject will be able to enlighten us all.



Matbro Mastiff loader

Dear T&M,

I have just come across the request for help regarding a Matbro Mastiff loader and I hope that I can add to your correspondent's dilemma.

From the photograph, this loader is a Matbro Mastiff Series II, which would tie in with 1963 taxation date. The Matbro Mastiff Minor had the driver positioned on the rear chassis, whereas the photo clearly shows the operator's cab on the front chassis. The cab has been modified from factory specification, as the original had a folding canvas top to facilitate driver entry.

Mastiff Series II models did indeed have Ford Super Major axles (six studs on the axle ends), compared with the eight-stud arrangement on the Ford 5000 axles with the Series III model, which was introduced circa 1966.

All Mastiff Series II, and indeed Series III models, used Ford six-cylinder engines, so this machine must have been re-engined at a later date. The Series II model used a Brockhouse ITT transmission with separate transfer box, whereas the Series III used the Brockhouse TTT three-speed forward and reverse transmission with integral drop box. Small Red Giant

The Massey Ferguson 130 was the smallest of the Red Giants, and survivors are thin on the ground. Norman Mitchinson from the Scottish Borders owns a fine example, writes Bob Weir.

orman Mitchinson lives in Selkirk, which was formerly the county town of Selkirkshire. The Royal Burgh is one of the oldest towns in the Scottish Borders and was prominent in the Scottish wool industry. These days the town is best known for its Selkirk Common Riding, which is held in the month of June. The ceremony features hundreds of riders and is one of the largest cavalcades of horses in Europe.

Norman comes from a farming background and has lived in the Borders area all his life.

"My father worked freelance and was involved in farm, dyke and drainage work," he said. "Back in those days you had to turn your hand to most jobs, as and when they became available.

Although he started off working with horses, he was a tractor man for many years. He would have driven various makes, including grey Fergies, Case and Fordson."

Norman also went into farming after he left school and worked in the local farm dairy. "I worked in the dairy for three years, but the hours were long, even by the standards of the day," he recalls. "I was only allowed one weekend off a month and had to get up at 4am every morning to milk the cows. It all got too much in the end, so I packed it in and became a lorry driver instead. I worked for the Co-operative Galashiels creamery, until they made the workforce redundant in the mid-1990s."

Norman is now in his late 70s and can remember the days when the farms were still transporting their milk using traditional churns. "You did the rounds of all the local farms collecting milk, and the job would take most of the morning," he recalls. "The roads could get quite treacherous during the winter months, and you had to keep your wits

about you. A lot of dairy farmers packed it in when they switched to bulk tankers, because they couldn't afford the investment. Times certainly changed, but I suppose it's for the best."

Apart from collecting tractors, Norman has another interesting hobby and has been a radio ham for many years. "I got interested in amateur radio and decided to have a go," he explained. "I have been involved in this hobby for many years and passed my amateur radio license. I am currently involved with the radio repeater site at Lindean Loch, just outside the town. Radio repeaters, or base stations, are used in two-way radio communication to enhance the radio signal over a wide area. The mast is also the main television broadcasting station in the Borders area and was one of the first stations in the UK to be upgraded as part of the digital switchover."

PASSION

Once he left the Co-op, Norman decided to run his own shop, specialising in electrical goods and repairs. "I thought I would put my radio expertise to good use," he explained. "I ran the shop for several years, until I retired. Although I enjoyed the work, I wanted to spend more time restoring my tractors."

Norman has been collecting old tractors for many years and is a member of the Borders Vintage Agricultural Association (BVAA). "I've always liked looking after tractors, which is probably

a throwback to my childhood," he said. "I don't have particular favourites and tend to buy whatever takes my fancy. Some of the tractors have needed some work, but fortunately I am quite handy with tools. That's one of the benefits of having been brought up on a farm."

He can remember that he acquired his first tractor when he still owned his electrical repairs shop. "I got a call out from a farmer to repair an aerial on his premises," he explained. "I could not run the cable through the window, so decided to go round to his shed to see if I could find a piece of wire. Much to my surprise I found this International B-414, standing next to a pile of pallets. The tractor did not appear to have been used in years but looked in good condition."

After he had finished installing the aerial, Norman decided to have a word with the owner. "Turned out the

International had belonged to the previous farm owner and had been left behind as part of the fixtures and fittings," he recalls. "I asked him if he would be interested in selling, and he said he was happy to exchange the tractor for a new fax machine.
Fortunately, I had one in stock, and was able to come to an arrangement. Once





I had set up his fax, I drove the tractor back home, and it has been with me ever since. I've since added a couple of accessories, including a loader and Ransome plough, and the tractor is stored a few miles away in Kelso."

In addition to the International, Norman also owns an early petrol/TVO Fordson E27N, a grey Fergie paired with a contemporary plough, a Massey Ferguson 135 and an E27N crawler.

"The crawler is interesting because it was originally new to the farm I was brought up on when I was a boy all those years ago," he explained. "I can still remember the Major turning up one day, and it certainly looked an impressive machine.

RECENT ACQUISITION

"The tractor stayed with the holding for several years, until it was sold on as part of a farm sale. It then did the rounds and in one of those coincidences finally ended up with a good friend of mine, George Riddell. It took me many years to persuade George to sell the crawler, and because of a lack of space the tractor is still stored in his shed."

Norman also acquired his most recent tractor, the Massey Ferguson 130, as part of a disposal sale.

"The Massey Ferguson previously belonged to the late Bill Shiel, and I bought the tractor in 2018," he recalls. "I don't know a lot about the Massey's history, except it was new in 1967 and is wearing a Newcastle-upon-Tyne registration."

Massey Ferguson faced a lot of competition in the early 1960s from the likes of David Brown, Ford, International Harvester and Nuffield. The earlier 35 and 65 models had been a success, and the Massey Ferguson Corporate Coordinating Committee was set up in 1962 to consolidate the company's position in the tractor market.

The aim was to develop a new line of tractors and emphasis was put on designing similar types of tractor for different markets, to take advantage of

economies of scale. The first four tractors in what was the new 100 Series, the 'DX' line, were introduced at the 1964 Smithfield Show in London. Of the MF 130, 135, 165 and 175, the larger three tractors were built at Banner Lane in Coventry, featuring Perkins engines and a six forward, two reverse transmission as standard.

The MF 130 was the baby of the 100 Series and was built in France. The tractor was aimed predominantly at the wine and fruit-growing industries. The machine was powered by a 1,753cc Perkins A4.107 four-cylinder diesel engine, delivering 30hp at 2,250rpm and 75ft/lb ft of torque at 1,200rpm.

A vineyard variant was also produced, but it was a choice between Economy and De Luxe versions of the basic model that most buyers had to make a decision on. Visually, integral headlamps showed if an MF 130 was a De Luxe version, but other differences were less obvious.

Mechanically, the predominant difference concerned the clutch. An



11-inch, single-plate clutch was fitted to the Economy model, while a dual-plate (11-inch transmission, nine-inch PTO) clutch was fitted to De Luxe tractors.

The dual clutch obviously meant that De Luxe MF 130s had a live PTO, but they also had ground-speed power take-off too, with one rotation of the shaft achieved with 19 inches of travel. Economy versions of the 130 solely had a power take-off proportional to engine speed, with 24hp available at the shaft for both versions.

Other differences between Economy and De Luxe were road lights and a tractormeter – which were standard on De Luxe only, 4.00-19 front tyres for Economy and 5.50-16 for De Luxe, and a difference in top link – screw-type adjustable for De Luxe and two-piece adjustable for Economy.

INVESTMENT

Compared to other small tractors, Massey Ferguson's 135 included, the 130 was a little different in that it had dry disc brakes and synchromesh on the top two gears in each range. These were nice features to have on any tractor – yet alone a 30hp model.

Lift capacity of the category I linkage was 1,825lb (828kg), with two-way draft control, response control and position control all part of the package. A gear-type pump delivered two gallons per minute at full revs, with oil lines available for delivery and return. An automatic hitch was an optional extra.

The tractor weighed in at 2,600lb (1,179kg), but front and rear wheel weights were optional accessories, as was a weight frame and up to eight 60lb (27kg) weights.

In December 1967, the list price of an Economy MF 130 was £675, while a De Luxe version would have set you back £710.

Norman's MF 130 is an Economy model, but it's had a few additions to make it more suitable for occasional use. "As I recall, Bill had acquired the Massey Ferguson from an enthusiast in Berwick-upon-Tweed," Norman recalled. "He was the one who fitted a different front to the tractor.

Massey Ferguson's Industrial & Construction Machinery distributors had a 'Highway' version of the 130 to sell, but it did not prove as popular as the 'yellow version' of the 135 - the 2135. They were pitched particularly at local authorities, but the 2130 was said to meet the requirements of airports, highways, hospitals, public parks and gardens, sports grounds and golf courses.

Like the 130, the 2130 was available in two guises – 'Economy' and, confusingly, 'Highway' – with the latter being the 'bells and whistles' option. For the most part, the Highway was a yellow De Luxe tractor, with the main mechanical difference being the addition of drum brakes for parking.

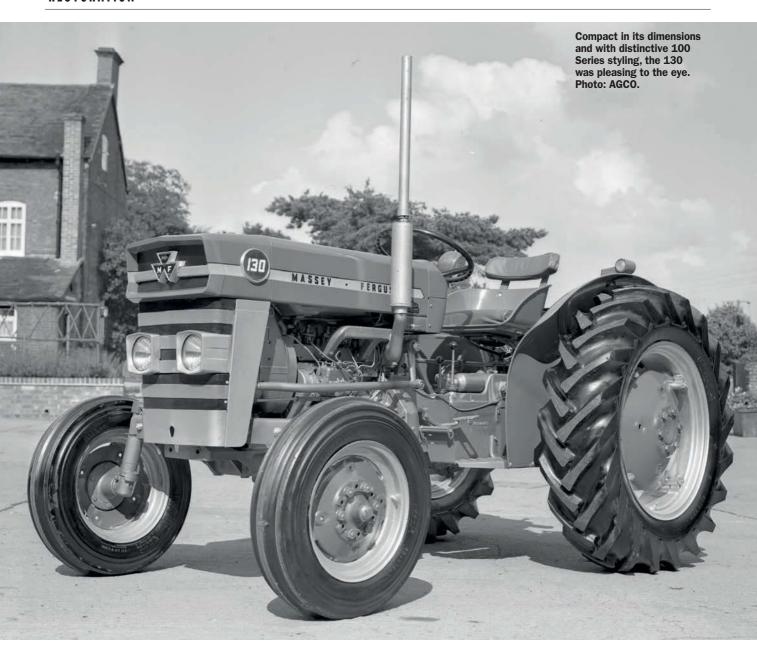
Aside from the full complement of lighting, a speedometer, horn and mirror were also standard fittings on Highway versions of the 2130. A foot throttle was standard equipment on both versions.

The 2130 was a rare tractor, with just 221 brought into the UK from France in 1965, according to a Machinery Serviced by Central Parts Operation document dated 23 January 1970. It was marketed alongside the 2135 tractor and promoted as part of a package of implements to suit the 'Industrial' market, including the 35 loader, 17 trailer, 723 post hole digger, 721 multi-purpose blade and 727 cable layer.

"I've carried out my fair share of restorations over the years, but this time around I was looking for a tractor in good condition to take on club road runs," he said. "I also think some old tractors are a reasonable investment at the moment, bearing in mind the very low interest rates. If you can turn a profit looking after an old tractor, that's a bonus."

Norman spent a few weeks tidying up the MF 130 and touching up the paintwork. "I also relined the brakes, and added the pair of headlamps," he explained. "ABB 52E was a basic model and would not have come supplied with front lights. These were integrated into the front of the tractor on the De Luxe model, but I did not want to risk spoiling

the metalwork. The Perkins badge is just a bit of fun."

Norman says the tractor is fun to drive, and the steering is light and straightforward. Although parts of the Scottish borders can be quite hilly, he also says the Massey can keep up with the traffic when it is taking part in road runs.

"These have all been cancelled of late, because of the Covid pandemic, although they'll hopefully be starting up again in the near future," he said. "It would be nice to see some of my BVAA friends again, because that's what collecting tractors is all about."

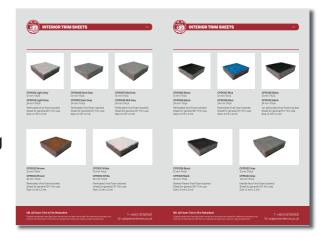

Czech mate!

Joseph Lewis discovers a Zetor 14145 working on a farm in Devon.



recent classic tractor finds is this 1988 Zetor 14145, owned by Giles Bamberger. We have seen many models from the 1960s and '70s from one of the pioneers of four-wheel drive, but this 150hp, six-cylinder model from the 1980s reflects later developments from the innovative Czech company and is a key part of Giles' fleet of tractors.

ne of my favourite

"I have been connected with farming all my life with my father, milking cows," explained Giles. "The first tractors I can remember would have been Fordson Majors and Super Majors, then a Ford 5000 Select-O-Speed. By about 1978 we started our Zetor connection, with a 6748.

"From this firm farming foundation, I developed a liking for Ford tractors and built on this experience with a new role in south-east England. As a 16-year old I went to work in Essex on an arable farm at harvest time, for A W Squire & Sons.

"They were Massey Ferguson people, which didn't sit well as I was a Ford fan. Luckily, Ernest Doe's Rochford depot was literally at the end of their drive. They had Ford TW tractors in the yard and County as well. I now own a TW-35 and two Countys, as well as a Marshall 904.

"Today, we farm dairy and suckler cows, beef and followers. I carried out contracting until 2018, running a Krone big X700 with 12-row maize header and whole crop header, two Fusions and conventional round balers, three big square balers, a McHale 998 wrapper, mowers, ploughs, drills, tankers and dung spreaders. I also had three excavators, a skid-steer loader and tracked dumper, dump trailer etc., which, due to ill health, I decided to sell."

At present Giles' working fleet features a Takeuchi TB290 with tree shear, grab, breaker and post knocker and a Case CX135 13-ton excavator with blade, with



two low-loaders, a 20-ton dump trailer, tracked dumper and skid-steer loader.

On the farm side, the scraper tractor is an IH 574, while the rest is Ford/New Holland – with 7610, 7810, 8340, 8360 and T7.210 models, as well as a Claas Scorpion 7035 telehandler.

BACK TO ZETOR

"The Zetor connection came around again in the early 1990s, when we bought a Zetor 10145 for contracting," continued Giles. "It had typical Zetor brakes, but the rest of it was bulletproof and it sounded nice when working. Probably from then onwards I wanted a Zetor 14145.

The chance came in 2015, when I saw this one advertised and after a bit of haggling, a deal was done over the telephone. I had only seen pictures of it until it was delivered from Wales, but I was not disappointed.

"Apart from the Zetor brakes, one of which didn't work at all, everything else was fine. I am not sure what it had been doing before I got it, but it has McConnel brackets on it and does not appear to have had a hard life. When I got it I had the brakes renewed and a trailer braking valve fitted.

"On the plant side, I have a New Holland T7.260 for the heavy work, but the Zetor does haul the TB290 around the farm. Some of the ground is four miles away and I would haul nearly all of the big square bale hay with it and the two low-loaders with bale wedges.

"Last year we did about 600 big bales and 500 round bales, including straw. The 14145 also goes on the slurry pump and pulls the 6.3m Twose ballast rollers on drilled ground."

Coming full circle, the Zetor 14145 has proven to be a good choice and one of those occasions when a dream becomes reality.

"I didn't buy it for any other reason than it is a very useful 150hp tractor that can do any job – it was the right money at the time and I always wanted one," concluded Giles. "I hope it will hold its value well and spares are cheap and easy to source. Interestingly, for the older, mechanical technology, it does out pull the T7.210 up hill on the road with bales on!

"The gearbox is not synchromesh and takes some getting used to, but is fine when mastered. It has two forward ranges and one reverse, with four gears in each with a splitter lever. It also has three-speed PTO − 540rpm, 1,000rpm and ground speed. The 14145 fits in well for farming and moving around plant when required, and does about 100 hours a year − enough for an old girl I think!" ■

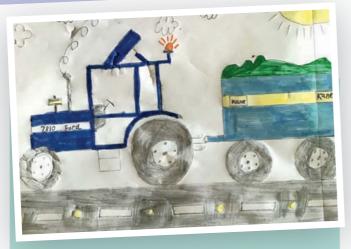

Spreading the love

The McKee family recently took on the restoration of an IH B-200 manure spreader. Jeff McKee told Scott Lambert what was involved.

ike many enthusiasts, Jeff
McKee's interest in agricultural
machinery goes back to his
early years. His grandfather
was a contractor and
continued exposure to tractors
meant that Jeff was soon bitten by the
bug.

An International Harvester B-414 played in important role in his grandfather's business and when he passed away Jeff vowed to restore it to its former glory. His father, Robert, and uncle, Graham, had grown up around machinery from this era and for them the implements are as important as the tractors.

Over the years, the trio have taken great interest in finding and restoring implements to complement their tractors and have built up quite a collection. A few years ago they decided to hold a 'theme' day at their home in Kilkeel, Co. Down, and it was at this point that they decided a piece of equipment was missing from their array of IH machinery.

They, naturally, had the tractors and ploughs that form the backbone of many collections, as well as a B-47 baler, but they concluded that the one thing that was missing was a manure spreader.

Jeff scoured the *Tractor Mart* pages of *Tractor & Machinery* and the Internet for some time, but the right machine ➤

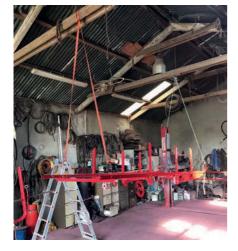

eventually came along via local enthusiast Andrew Annett, who had bought the spreader at auction and was willing to sell it on.

The machine was an IH B-200 – a ground-drive model capable of holding 1.5-ton loads. It was just what they were looking for, but the downside was that it had several parts missing. This resulted in Jeff, Robert and Graham buying a second spreader, in the hope of making one good one from the two. An auction, conducted by H J Pugh & Co., yielded exactly what they wanted and it was bought through online bidding.

With the second B-200 home, work began on the restoration and the trio was of the opinion that it would be one of their easier projects. This turned out not to be the case.

"When we started the restoration, it seemed like quite an easy project," said Jeff. "We were wrong! There are so many moving parts in that spreader, it's unbelievable!"

The B-200 was pitched at farms with an average herd size or larger and, like other spreaders of the period, was designed as a low machine to facilitate easy loading. Being ground driven, there was no PTO shaft and sharper turns at the headland were possible. It was robust and well suited to most operations.

SIMPLE DESIGN

The hitch and frame were simply constructed, with hitches available to suit both drawbars and pick-up hitches. Unlike some rival spreaders, with the box made extensively from wood, the B-200 had steel sides and a wooden floor. Much like a trailer, the box was tapered slightly to enable material to flow easily to the rear.

At the front, high above the drawbar and within easy reach of the tractor seat, two levers permitted easy operation of the B-200. The first put the 'apron' into gear, while the second controlled the spreading rate – with five settings to choose from.

The slowest speed setting enabled just five loads to be spread to the acre, with an additional five loads for each speed selected, up to 25 loads per acre on setting five. A steady flow of material was said to be assured, thanks to a ratchet and pawl apron feed.

At the rear, the upper shredding cylinder levelled off the moving load to a constant depth, while the larger, second cylinder ensured that the material



heading towards the spiral was well shredded to permit even distribution.

"We started by stripping everything down," Jeff explained. "The chains were separated, cogs taken off the shafts, and the beaters were unbolted too. We took every panel we could save and cut the rotten bits out and welded in new bits. The sides couldn't be saved, so we got some new metal for that. We also made the arch at the back from scratch, as the old one was badly twisted out of shape and beaten down by some careless loader action in the past.

"The handles for engaging the floor, and the beaters, were straightened up and the old rotten floor cut out. We

sanded everything down individually and hung it on a ladder attached to the roof of the shed, ready for painting!

"I understand that two-pack paint isn't necessarily for the ultimate vintage enthusiast, but I find it easier to get a colour matched, as well as easier to use and a better, longer-lasting finish. I used a shade of red from Auto Paint in Newry, matched from some I had, along with 'Mercedes 1408' off-white for the wheels.

"We got some new carriage bolts and started the rebuild! It seemed daunting at first, but with some help from a manual I salvaged from a neighbour, we soon got things into perspective.

"New tyres were also needed, but our local tyre man Eddie Doran, trading as E D Tyres, helped out with those," Jeff continued. Some of IH's marketing material shows the B-200 fitted with Firestone 7.50-20 tyres, but Eddie supplied Jeff, Robert and Graham with a pair of BKT Implement-AS504 7.50-20s – which set the spreader off nicely.

PERIOD LOOK

The finishing touch, the all-important decals, were supplied by Machinery Decals. "Titch Sanders is very easy-going and really helpful," Jeff told *T&M*. "With the older stuff being faded, and in some cases non-existent, he can usually get the decals as near to what I want with some explaining over the phone!"

With the B-200 restored, Jeff was keen to hitch it to his B-414 and complete the period look. A second B-414, fitted with a B-901 loader, fittingly provided manureshifting capability and rounded off the International Harvester quartet.

Two versions of the B-901 were available, initially to suit B-250 and B-275 tractors. The 'Standard' model was for use in confined spaces and where lift height was not particularly important, whereas the 'Extended' model enabled extra reach and a greater discharge height.

Both models had two positions for mounting the lift cylinders on the frame – the lower point for optimised tearaway force and the upper for increased lift height. The frame itself was a one-piece welded element, bolted to the front ▶

axle bolster and a crossbar across the transmission housing – under the fuel tank.

Pre-formed steel pipes connected the loader frame to the tractor's hydraulic system, so only two flexible pipes were required – connecting the rams to the loader frame. This made for a neat arrangement, and the inclusion of an isolating valve in front of the gear lever meant that switching between loader operation and the three-point linkage was straightforward.

At the front, a tubular steel guard protected the bonnet and radiator and it could be unlatched to swing forward for easy access to the engine.

A parking stand enabled the loader to be taken off the tractor, following the removal of four quick-release pins, and left in a position that made reattachment easier than if it was left on the ground or balanced precariously.

The B-901 loader is an implement that adds another dimension to the McKees' collection of machinery, but given their penchant for International Harvester equipment of this era, more will surely

follow. Jeff has an IH 120 disc harrow and a B-13 plough ready for restoration, but he would like to add a B-614 tractor to the collection too.

Aside from his fondness for International Harvester machinery, Jeff has designs on a John Deere 2130. "My grandfather bought one brand-new," he explained. It'd have to be the new-style 2130 with a Duncan cab and oversize tyres would be a must!"

Whatever the colour, we're looking forward to seeing the next addition to the McKee collection. ■

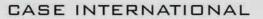

Significant sale

With the help of owner Tom Scott and auctioneer Mathewsons, James Connolly looks at a County 1474 that is due to be sold at auction soon.

pproximately 15 years ago, Tom Scott, from Crumlin in Co. Antrim, saw this County 1474 TW advertised for sale near Dover, Kent. It was sold new by Ford tractor dealer Haynes of Maidstone, Kent, and Tom decided to purchase it and have it transported to Northern Ireland.

The serial number plate shows that the tractor was built on 24 July 1981, and although the original 1474 was based on the Ford 9700, by the time this tractor was built, County was using the Ford TW-20 skid unit to produce this model.

When Tom bought the tractor it was in off-farm condition, and after being checked by a local Ford/New Holland-

trained mechanic, any issues were sorted out and the decision was taken to respray the tractor. This was undertaken in a spray booth that Tom used in his truck repair business. The tractor also had four new Goodyear 18.4 R34 tyres fitted.

Whilst in Tom's ownership the tractor has never been put to work, but has attended many local event and one of its last outings was at the Ford 100 event in 2017, held near Nutts Corner in Co. Antrim.

Tom is planning to retire and take things easier and has made the decision to sell the tractor. Given that the current market for 1474s is very strong, Tom has commissioned Mathewsons in Pickering, North Yorkshire, to sell the tractor at the company's auction on 12-13 November*.

Tom has a good working relationship with Mathewsons, having bought and sold classic commercial vehicles from the company in the past, as well as recently selling a County 1184 TW through the company.

Having seen quite a few 1474s, both at working events and at shows with static displays, it's fair to say that this tractor is a nice example of the model.

Tractors in good original condition tend to fetch the highest prices, but well-restored examples are also popular with enthusiasts. Some like to purchase an unrestored tractor, whilst others prefer tractors that have been restored and painted. Either way, the 1474 is very popular with fans of the County marque.

AESTHETICALLY PLEASING

The overall condition of the 1474 is very pleasing to the eye and the four Goodyear 18.4 R34 tyres really set it off. The tractor has the 12 County front weights, along with the large front weight block, and inside the cab there's very tidy trim and the Bostrom seat is in first-class order – it looks like new.

A Clarion push-button, medium- and long-wave radio is installed, which is fitting for the period and age of the tractor. The cab floor mat is also in good condition.

With 4,094 engine hours recorded on the clock, this tractor has not worked hard. The interior reflects this when considering the condition of the clutch pedal, brake pedals and the floormounted Dual Power pedal. All the lights on the tractor are correct and in good order.

The engine starts up easily and the oil pressure gauge rises instantly. The fuel gauge and temperature gauge work perfectly as the tractor idles and warms up. When you blip the throttle on the turbocharged Ford engine, it sounds healthy and responsive. One thing to check on any tractor is the engine oil and in this County it was on the mark and was a good colour.

This particular County 1474 has a 540rpm power take-off shaft fitted, along with twin assistor rams, drawbar and spool valves. Although I did not drive the 1474, Tom assures me that the tractor drives perfectly and that the brakes are good.

As to the value of this tractor, it is anyone's guess! Bearing in mind that the last County 1474 offered for sale at auction made an incredible £196,000, albeit in nice, original condition, and the unpredictability of the current market, it is difficult to estimate a sale price. Mathewsons will be setting an estimate once the tractor is prepared for the auction.

The tractor is being pencilled in for the November Mathewsons sale and it will be interesting to see what the outcome of the sale will be.

IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN



Oxdale Products have been making the standard grader for many years which have been primarily used for levelling, grading, backfilling or spreading materials like gravel or soil. With the increasing size of transport using farm tracks and roadways, the amount of uneven and pot-holed lanes have also increased.

Although the standard graders can do this job, we found that they were a little light for the larger tractors. This led us to develop a heavy duty model suitable for tractors of 50hp to 150hp+, in sizes of 6ft, 8ft and 10ft.

It comes with two rows of tines (8) which are designed to scrape the lane surface as the grader travels along the track collecting debris inside and then depositing where the ground is lower. The rear blades level and grade the ground surface.

Astle Park

he Astle Park Traction Engine Rally is a traditional family event, held this year on 14-15 August. The show is mainly steam orientated, but more than 100 tractors were present this year, with nearly all of them braving the rain showers to parade in front of the large crowd, says David Reed.

To be fair, despite there being a number of marques represented at Astle Park, the tractor section was dominated by the Fordson name and those that came under the Ferguson banner.

Andrew Dobson was at the event with his 1951 Ferguson TE-D 20 that he received as an early 14th birthday present, back in 2005, after the tractor had stood unused for a number of years. It has been restored by Andrew with the help of his grandfather using secondhand parts and is now used for general farm work, while Michael McElchare's 1952 Ferguson TE-F 20 was spotted languishing in a hedge in North Yorkshire seven years ago when he was making a delivery to the farm. After Michael bought the tractor he fully restored it over an 18-month period.

Among the many MF 35s on view, Peter Newton was seen with his fourcylinder example, while George Newton was driving his three-cylinder model. Both had made the trip down from Millom in Cumbria, while it was a somewhat shorter trip from Nantwich for Paul Reeve with his 1961 MF 65.



This 1969 County 1124 Super-Six was found on a farm at Poynton, where it had stood for eight years without being used. It was pulling a Morewear Goose 10-ton dumper that was found in a poor state.

Seen in working condition was a 1965 MF 175 that was entered by B Cragg, while Phil Booth's 1974 MF 1080 was bought in the 1980s and worked on the farm until being fully restored in 2018.

Tony Walker said of his 1968 Nuffield 4/25, that he bought in 2009: "It belonged to a lady who had a smallholding. It is as original now as it was then. The only thing that I have done to it is fit new tyres."

In similar condition was a 1969 Nuffield 4/25 that had been entered by J Whittington, while a 1965 BMC Mini and 1972 Leyland 154 in excellent condition were also seen braving a sudden rain shower to parade around the ring.

The David Brown brand was also well-represented with L Goodier's 1951 Cropmaster braving the wet conditions. Seen in the later Chocolate Brown and Orchid White livery were a couple of models owned by the Nixon family.

The first was a 780 that dated from 1968 and the second was a 770 from a year earlier, both being in excellent condition, while having a work-worn look was D Foden's 1957 David Brown 2D. No history is known about this tractor, but it has been with the present owner for 25 years and is still in original condition, apart from having two new rear tyres fitted.

There was a good selection of tractors bearing the International Harvester symbol too, including the 1968 IH 523 Agriomatic-S that had been entered by G Dale. D Tomkinson's 434, which was also from 1968, and to round things off was a 454 dating from 1972, entered by M Hall.

All in all, the Astle Park event was an excellent show in all classes, with the tractors being an integral part of proceedings. There was a lot to see, proving that this Cheshire event is well worth a visit.

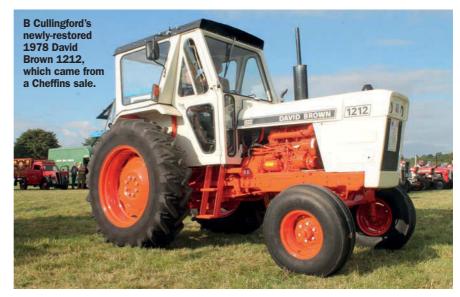

Weald of Kent

he late summer weather did not disappoint and a lovely warm sunny day attracted a massive crowd to this year's Weald of Kent Ploughing Match at Honey Farm, near Pluckley, writes Gary Hawkins.

Along with the large crowd, a good number of ploughs turned out to contest this year's match, on a reasonably flat venue of stubble with a medium soil providing a fairly good ploughing canvas for all. It was noticeable that some areas had more straw and longer stubble, which proved hard to bury with the older classic and vintage ploughs. This was not the case for the modern commercial ploughs, however, with a deeper furrow dealing well with the trash that was presented.

The ploughing was backed up by some excellent trade stands and family entertainment, including steam ploughing, horse ploughing, terrier racing and dog handling. Archery and clay pigeon shooting and some great displays of wild birds were topped off in the air by a WW2 Spitfire from Biggin

The match never fails to deliver and it was great to see everything back with excellence, after last years' forced cancellation.

MF 500 Series

Due to lack of use, the external services lever of Andrew Hall's Massey Ferguson 550 snapped off when he tried to move it. This feature shows the steps taken to remedy the problem.

t's a well-known fact that machinery doesn't like standing around unused, and my '77 Massey Ferguson 550 is no exception. Up to last year the tractor was in reasonably regular use for topping duties, hay turning and baling, as well as the occasional ploughing match. During the winter it is also used on a hydraulic log splitter too.

At the start of the first lockdown I prepared a large stock of firewood, which saw us through the 2020/21 winter and I didn't need to use the tractor on the splitter, giving me a rest period regarding logs. This meant the tractor had little use until I turned and rowed up a field of hay for a friend in the summer of 2020.

On the return from this job I noticed the hydraulic pump seemed to be rattling rather loudly as I reached home with the Haybob attached. Concerned about this I checked the transmission oil level, which was completely off the dipstick. I immediately refilled the system, which silenced the pump thankfully, but then noticed oil dripping from the left-hand lower link pin.

A closer inspection showed the pin to have slackened and allowed it to drift outwards and oil to leak from the area. At this stage I stopped using the tractor, which stood around unused for many months, until I recently needed to use the front-end loader to do some lifting.

In an attempt to temporarily stop the leak I used a soft mallet on the end After a long period standing idle, the external services lever had seized up and snapped off when an attempt was made to move it.

of the lower link pin to drive it back into place, but will need to remove and replace the pin as soon as possible.

SEIZED SELECTOR LEVER

The loader had been on the tractor whilst it was idle and the external selector lever was in the loader position during this time. I had noticed that it

was stiff the last time I moved it, but this time it wouldn't move and succumbed to some excessive pressure and snapped off completely. This meant I could use the loader, but not the rear linkage. A close look at the broken lever showed it had been repaired before, so I had no option but to repair it once again!

CABFLOOR

To access the bracket that supports the external selector lever I needed to remove the cab floor, together with the seat. The lever works the external valve that is located on the right-hand side of the hydraulic top cover and is connected to it by means of a steel rod.



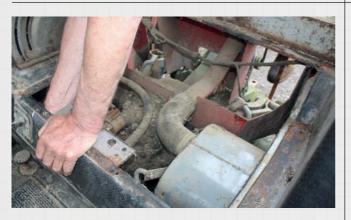
Snapped off

The spindle was seized and the lever snapped off at a weak spot as I tried to turn it from the loader position to the rear linkage.



Seat removed

Removal of the seat allowed the cab floor to be removed to access the rear of the lever. Despite vacuuming, there was still some hay loose in the cab.



Detaching the control rod

The control rod crosses the tractor to the selector valve and is being detached at the valve end.



Access

The two setscrews that attach the lever support have nuts behind the panel that can be seen in this view.

The cab was full of debris from the previous haymaking and other jobs, so the first task was to vacuum the whole inside of the cab out to make access easier to the floor mounting bolts.

The seat needed to be removed before the floor, and this is well worn and really past its best. I slid it back to access the front bolts, and then fully forward to release the rear bolts. It is a heavy unit to handle, but was easily passed through the wide door, leaving a clear floor area.

The bolts were then released that secure the floor to the tractor cab, allowing

the floor panel to follow the seat out of the cab. This gave a full view of the lever support bracket and linkage rod.

The rod was removed from the lever, after removing the split pin from the back of the lever assembly, and allowed to rest to one side whilst the two fixing screws of the lever were removed. The lever guide plate comes away at the front, whilst the lever itself passes through the vertical cab panel.

WELDING UP

The easiest repair method was to weld the broken lever up.

Currently our MIG welder is out of order and needs a new coil fitted, and arc welding wouldn't be satisfactory on a lever of this small dimension, so we chose to use oxyacetylene with a number five nozzle, which would give a more controlled heat to the lever.

When welding rods or round shafts together, I always prepare them by either cutting or grinding the two parts to be mated to a chisel-shape, which are then butted together. This enables the weld to penetrate fully by beginning at the centre and welding the edges of the two

pieces, and working outwardly to build up the repair to the required shape and dimensions.

Oxy-acetylene welding, although considered 'old hat' by some people, is still very useful to have around the workshop, even these days! The problem with welding small components with arc welding is the 'locking' of slag in the weld, which should float to the surface of the weld and curl off the workpiece when conditions are right, but when it locks into the weld it weakens the repair, which often breaks inconveniently! ➤

WORKSHOP



Split pin

A split pin locates the control rod on the lever end and is being removed to allow the lever to separate from the rod.



Seized up

The spindle is seized up where it passes through the sleeve on the support bracket, and was soaked in penetrating oil to free it off.



Prepared to weld

Each of the two pieces was filed to a chisel point to allow a full weld penetration when using the oxyacetylene method.



Lined up

Before committing to weld, the two halves needed to be lined up accurately to get the lever in the correct position.



Almost there

The welding is part finished, as there is more metal to add to build up the original profile of the spindle.

LUBRICATION

After fettling the weld to make it tidy, the lever assembly was then given a liberal coating of oil to lubricate the spindle and to help prevent any further seizure occurring before refitting it to the cab using a fresh split pin on the operating rod. Movement of the lever is now much easier, so hopefully the problem won't reoccur.

CLEANING HOUSING

Inevitably, dirt and debris builds up around the rear transmission housing under the cab, and my tractor was no exception. I took the opportunity to scrape way and vacuum around the rear end whilst the cab floor was removed and access was easy. This also gave the opportunity to check the rear end of the tractor for any unwanted oil leaks at the same time.

LOWER LINK PIN

I have a replacement lower link pin, as I believe that the original may be distorted and may not seal if it is reused. To access the pin, the left-hand rear axle trumpet housing will have to be removed, which will involve draining the transmission oil and also supporting the cab whilst the axle housing is removed. This is a similar job to that undertaken by me on the Massey Ferguson 35 earlier this year, when I discovered the broken casting. Hopefully when I get around to doing the job I won't find anything wrong with the 550 in the same manner.

NEGLECTED

Unfortunately, I feel I've neglected the 550 somewhat, and it deserves some attention, particularly to the cab, before it is too late.

Mechanically the tractor is

generally in good order, as it hasn't many hours behind it, but sitting about as much as it has hasn't done it any favours.

Ideally, the cab could do with re-trimming inside, which would include new rubber matting and a new, more comfortable seat too. The rear tyres are the originals from 1977 and are badly cracked and in need of replacement, but hopefully, in the fullness of time I will be able to bring it back to a tidy condition once more, as it is a comfortable tractor to drive and easy to get in and out of too!



Replacement

After the repair was complete, the lever is passed back through the cab panel, ready to be bolted back into place.



Floor replaced

The rear transmission was vacuumed off before replacing the cab floor, as this isn't accessible once the floor is fitted.



Free movement

With a bit of lubrication and the repair complete, the lever now has some free movement, as intended.



Tatty seat

The driver's seat is rather tatty these days and could do with replacing with a more comfortable one!



Rubber matting

The rubber floor mat isn't too bad for the age of the tractor, but could do with replacing, as it is beginning to crack up a bit.



Clean dashboard

Whilst working in the cab I cleaned the dashboard, making the instruments easier to see, as it was coated in fine dust from haymaking in the past.



Loose lower link pin

The left-hand pin (mentioned in the text) has loosened off, and will required tightening. I have a replacement pin to fit.



Trumpet housing

To access the pin the axle trumpet housing needs to come off, after draining the oil. Plus,...



Cab support

... the cab will need supporting whilst the axle housing is off the tractor – a job for another occasion.

With the tipping ram seals now oil tight, Andrew Hall surveys the ironwork for the sides and tailboard and sets about freeing off the seized handbrake lever.

and sets about freeing off the seized



t is nice to be able to tip a tipping trailer without oil leaking from the tipping ram, and with that hurdle now crossed I have turned my attention to the bodywork of the trailer. It's been a while since the sides and tailboard were fitted to the trailer, as one of its last tasks was bale carting, which was a few years ago now.

The trailer had been re-bodied many moons ago with softwood, and this has rotted to nothing over the years. The sides and tailboard were stacked up to store and in the fullness of time the wood had completely disintegrated, leaving the ironwork loose and at risk of being lost!

I pulled the sides and tailboard from their resting place and placed them onto the trailer in their respective positions to check that everything was still present, which thankfully it was. There was enough of the timber present to be able to piece the sides together and connect them to the rear corner posts by means of the loops and lynch pins, and the tailboard was still intact enough to do the same.

TIMBER REQUIREMENTS

One of the next tasks is to measure up and assess the amount and type of timber needed for the refurbishment. As previously mentioned, the trailer had been renovated in

the past using softwood, but this isn't really an option for me, as I'd like to re-body it in the hardwood as it was originally.

This isn't going to be a cheap option for me, and with timber being in short supply and the price increasing dramatically I may have to reluctantly consider a compromise! In the meantime I've got some counting to do regarding the number and length of coach bolts required to bolt all the timber together.

Around the top edge there is a length of batten, which requires longer bolts, but I may simply buy the longer lengths required and cut the bolts down for the rest of the timber where they need to be shorter. The existing bolts are rusted up and the easiest course of action will be to cut them off with the mini grinder.

IRONWORK

Once the bolts are out of the way I can then set about cleaning the ironwork up and preparing it for some fresh paint. The colour scheme of the 17 trailer is red with yellow wheel rims, whilst the timber should be a light brown colour.

The preparation will take the usual form of wire brushing with the rotary wire brush, followed by a couple of coats of red oxide and some Massey Ferguson Dark Red, ➤

WORKSHOP



Sides & tailboard

Remnants of the sides and tailboard were fitted to the chassis in order to assess the ironwork, and to check it was all present!



Rear corner posts

These slot into the trailer frame and secure the sides and tailboard using lynch pins and hoops.



Rotten timber

There is just enough of the timber on the tailboard and sides to work out what goes where. Note the angle iron and wood batten along the top edges.



Front corners

The front corner irons should be fixed to the headboard and carry the brackets to secure the sides.

as the trailer pre-dates the Super Red of later MF equipment. The wheel rims will be similarly prepared and finished in Massey Ferguson industrial yellow.

TYRES

The original tyres fitted to the trailer were 7.50-16 multi-rib cross-ply, but these have been replaced with a road-type tyre on one side and a Land Rover-style tyre the other side. Currently I am happy to keep the tyres that are present, as they are both in good condition, so will not worry until one or the other needs replacing.

HANDBRAKE LEVER

I serviced the parking brakes early on in the refurbishment, but the handbrake lever was found to be seized up and the button stuck in the lever tube, so it won't hold in the 'on' position until it has been freed off.

To do this easily the whole lever had to be removed from the support, which took more doing than I first thought it would, due to the pivot pin being riveted into place rather than having a split pin to retain it.

A closer inspection of the assembly showed a washer to be in place with the pivot pin

peened over to retain the washer in place.

The easiest way to deal with it was to grind the pin off and knock it through the support to release the brake lever. With the excess metal ground off the pin still wouldn't move, despite some stiff hammering of the end of the pin, using a punch to drive it out.

With no success I resorted to centre punching and drilling the centre of the pin in stages, until the diameter of the pin was almost reached, at which point it could be driven out. A fresh pin will need to be made

from a suitable bolt on reassembly.

The clevis pins were then removed from the lever, which was dismantled and inspected. The button at the top is plastic and had seized into the lever tube, whilst the push rod was removed, along with the pawl that engages with the ratchet.

Rust had eaten through the rod below the button, so a fresh rod will be needed, and I may make a steel button to replace the original, split plastic one.

I'll bring you more on my progress in the December issue. ■



The pivot pin is riveted in place and peened over a washer to

retain it. The manufacturer didn't intend it to be removed!



Ground off

The peened over protrusion of the pin was ground off to allow the washer to come away and the pin to come out through the other side.



Drilling out

No amount of hammering would release the pin, so I resorted to drilling it out in stages until the diameter was reached and the pin could be tapped out of place.



Free at last!

The pin yielded to some final tapping and came away, allowing the lever to release from the support. A new pin will need to be made.



Rusty rod

Further stripping of the lever revealed a rotten operating rod just below the plastic button, so a fresh one will be made to replace it.



Plastic button

This is jammed into the lever tube and is cracked, so a steel one may be made as a replacement and threaded into the operating rod.



Beyond repair

The rusty operating rod and the plastic button can be seen in this view, but both are beyond any further use, but easily replaced.



Measuring up

A vernier caliper was used to measure the rotten rod, which looks to be ³/₁₆in-diameter, just short of 5mm.



Primed up

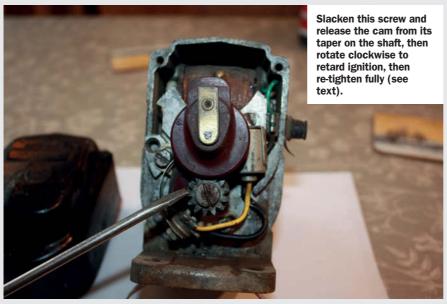
Meanwhile the lever tube was cleaned up and primed ready to receive further paint once it's back on the trailer.

NEXT MONTH: There is further progress with the handbrake assembly and the ironwork comes under closer scrutiny.

Experts' advice

Fordson Major E27N

l've had magneto trouble on my 1947 Fordson E27N. Until now it has had a Lucas RF4 magneto fitted, which I believe is the original style for this tractor, but sadly mine now has no spark. I've looked into the cost of having it rebuilt by a magneto specialist, but currently the cost is somewhat prohibitive.

As a result I trawled a well-known online auction site and came across a Lucas SR4 magneto, which I was informed would replace the original RF4 model. The SR4 has a good powerful spark, so I set about fitting it to the tractor, which involved changing the distributor cap, so I was careful not to mix up the plug leads.

I then attempted to start the tractor, which fired up very rapidly compared

with the old magneto, but the engine seems to run with a knocking and sounds generally very rattly. I'm not happy with this and suspect the ignition timing is too far advanced, but there isn't any timing adjustment on the SR4 unit, unlike the RF4, so what can I do to rectify this?

I have seen other E27Ns running on SR4 magnetos quite sweetly, so have I done something wrong when I fitted it? Any help would be useful.

The Lucas SR4 magneto was sold as a replacement for the original RF4 models, but unlike the RF4 it hasn't any readily adjustable timing. The knocking does sound like advanced timing, particularly as it coincided with the fitting of the SR4 unit. The RF4 can be adjusted to suit differing fuels and workloads on the tractor, but the SR4 doesn't have this facility.

You can improve matters and stop your knocking by using the following procedure. Remove your distributor cap and slacken the large slot-headed screw that secures the rotor arm drive gear to the main shaft. Note the position of the rotor arm and ensure it doesn't move whilst you slacken the screw. The insert a screwdriver under the back of the cam that opens the contact breaker points and twist it to release the cam from the taper that it sits on.

Carefully rotate the drive gear (not the rotor arm) clockwise (against the direction of travel) slightly and re-tighten the screw. Re-start your engine to check for an improvement. If any knocking still persists repeat the operation until the knocking is eliminated. I must stress that you must rotate the gear and cam clockwise to retard the timing, and only a very small amount in one go.

If you rotate it anti-clockwise it will advance the timing more, which may cause the engine to kick back when you hand crank it. Always keep your thumb and fingers the same side of the starting handle whilst cranking, to minimise the risk of injury if the engine does kick back.



Ferguson TE-F 20

I wondered if it is possible to fit a 'finger bar hedge cutter' to a diesel Ferguson TE-20 that does not have hydraulics. Also, would a Teagle or Fullers hedge cutter work on a belt or a pulley system, or would they have

to be used by hydraulics? I'm hoping it's not too expensive a cost!

When you say "does not have hydraulics", do you mean the tractor or the hedge cutter? Early hedge cutters, such as the Bomford Hedgemaker, were capable of being mounted on a Ferguson TE-20 tractor, as they had their

own engine to power them, but needed a second operative to guide the cutting head along the hedge.

The Blanch T2 was a trailed machine operating on the same principle as the Bomford and could be towed by a TE-20.

Machines of this type would

be the most suitable for your tractor, but are rare and hard to come by these days!

The Ferguson TE-20 range has its limitations regarding the power take-off and hydraulics, as it only has a single-plate clutch and not a live drive system. This means if your cutting mechanism is PTO powered it will stop when you de-clutch, which is unsuitable for hedge cutting at low speeds.

Teagle made the DynaCut hedge cutter, which is belt-driven but would be too heavy and unsuitable for your TE-20, and also the 'Golden Bullet', which is a finger bar trimmer, whilst the Fuller Tractordraulic hedge cutter was mid-mounted and powered by a hydraulic

motor, so also a non-starter and as rare as hens' teeth!

If you'd like to use your
Ferguson TE-20 for hedge
cutting, the most suitable
hedge cutter would be the
Marples air-operated AU-E-60
or AU-E-61, which was supplied
as part of the Ferguson range
of implements. It uses a tractormounted air compressor and
has a hand-held cutter with a
60-foot long hose. Again, they
are rare and could take some
seeking out.

If it's a finger bar hedge cutter you want, it may be better to trade up to an MF 35 tractor with live drive and look out for a McConnell power arm with hydraulic angling, which will make a good combination.

Lely Hedgehopper

We have a Lely Hedgehopper with a flail head on it, and it has been eating belts at a fast rate on the flail head unit. I have noticed that the pulleys are out of alignment, which is likely to be the cause of the belt eating.

We've taken a look at the pulley on the flail shaft to see if we can re-align it, but are not sure how to set about freeing off the pulley, as it has a centre boss with Allen-head screws in it, which don't free the pulley off when they are removed. Any advice on the procedure would be most welcome, as hedge cutting time is fast approaching. **Ken Smith, via e-mail**

The flail shaft pulley on the Hedgehopper is secured by a Taperlok bush. This is keyed to the shaft on its inner diameter and tapered to match the hole in the pulley on its outer diameter.

To remove or slacken your pulley you need to completely remove the two Allen-headed grub screws from the pulley and bush, and insert one of them into the third hole and screw it in tightly. This should free the bush from the pulley and allow you to remove or slide it along to re-align your belts.

If the bush refuses to move you can insert a chisel or screwdriver into the slot and tap it in to expand the bush, thus freeing it off. Use a straight edge to align your pulleys and tighten the two grub screws back in their original holes to retighten the bush and pulley.

ABOVE RIGHT:

Remove both grub screws seen at six and nine o'clock and...

RIGHT:

... insert one of them onto the hole at six o'clock and screw in tight to separate the bush from the pulley.

780 rescue part 14

Due to languishing under brambles for many years, there has been much rust to deal with during the restoration of the DB 780. Now it's the turn of the wheels to be painted. Andrew Hall has the story.

The repairs to the bonnet have been well documented in previous issues of *T&M* and the mudguards are being replaced, leaving the wheels to be cleaned up and prepared.

WHEEL CENTRES

The rear tyres were removed in part 13 and took a lot of effort, as they had age hardened and were well rusted to the rims, one being badly corroded and too far gone to repair, as the extent of the pitting along the edge of the rim bead was excessive. Fortunately, I had recently acquired a pair of rims from a burned out Ferguson TE-20, and one of these has been selected to use as a replacement on the 780.

Meanwhile Barrie Everson and I set about separating the wheel centres from the rims to facilitate cleaning and paint preparation.

The rim-to-dish bolts on the 780 differ from those used on Ferguson tractors inasmuch as they are coach bolts with square shanks under their heads, which locate more positively than the bolts with the 'pip' that locate in the pear-shaped holes of the Ferguson wheel centres.

Barrie applied a bit of heat from the oxy-acetylene torch to each of the rusty nuts before removing each one, all of which came off with little effort, allowing us to re-use the bolts.

PREPARATION

With the wheel centres out of the rims I set about cleaning them up with a rotary wire brush, to remove the dead paint and loose rust. Fortunately, there is very little pitting on the centres, so little if any filler will be required to smooth the surface.

Satisfied with each centre I then hand painted them in red oxide, which dried very rapidly in the bright autumn sunshine. Attention then turned to the Ferguson rim, which although it had been

in a fire is still in relatively clean condition, with only light rust that has appeared since the loss of the paint.

The centre was removed from this, as the original DB centre will be used on reassembly. A heavy session with the wire brush soon had all traces of surface rust cleaned off the rim, which was treated to a similar coat of red oxide to the centres.

PAINI

Initially, I have three litres of David Brown Orchid White and two litres of Chocolate Brown for the skid unit, and have been using red oxide as a substrate on the skid unit and other parts as they've been prepared.

I am aware that the Orchid White may require ➤

Wheel centres

Although the paint was lost in the fire, the rim remains undamaged with only surface rust, which has formed since the fire.



Centre preparation

The centres were prepared using a rotary wire brush to remove any dead paint and loose rust. Pitting is limited, so little filler is required to give a smooth surface.

something lighter in shade as an undercoat, as the red oxide may be too dark, so I may use some grey undercoat too, before spraying the white. I have some beige primer supplied by David Brown Parts Ltd., which may also be suitable.

SKID UNIT

As mentioned in previous issues, the skid unit has been painted in primer as each area has been cleaned and we have been progressing.

The intention is to spray the complete skid unit in primer and undercoat once the whole area has been thoroughly cleaned and prepared.

The area beneath the radiator on these tractors tends to harbour rubbish and the webbing of the casting takes some patience to clean and prepare. I used a small rotary brush, which was nimble enough to get into the corners of the webs and immediately primed the area to prevent any further rusting.

DRAG LINK & TRACK ROD

Barrie removed the steering drag link and the track rod, as they need replacement rubber gaiters on the ball joints, and also the track rod will be dismantled to ensure it is free to adjust if necessary. The front axle will also be split for the same reason before any paint is applied too!

DASHBOARD

The next target was the dashboard panel. The stop control cable proved to be stubborn to remove, as the locknut was jammed on the thread, so I made two small incisions in the bracket to allow it to come free without damaging the cable.

The dashboard was then cleaned ready to paint, but has some small rust holes that

need dealing with before we progress. The engine 'stop' decal was heated with a hot air gun to facilitate removal before wire brushing the area.

With any luck, and weather permitting, more progress will be made in the next issue.

Primed

Each centre was given an initial coat of red oxide and lightly rubbed down to offer a key to the next coat. Note the holes for wheel weight attachment in the centres.



Cleaned up

A thorough wire brushing soon brought the loose surface rust off the rim, which came up like new metal. Much better condition than the discarded rim!



More priming

The same procedure was applied to the rim, which received two coats of primer with a light rubbing down in between each coat.



Steering linkages

To ensure the steering drag link and the track rod are free to adjust they were removed using this ball joint splitter. New rubber gaiters are required whilst there're off!



Track rod

This was also removed using the splitter and will be dismantled, cleaned and reassembled to ensure it can be adjusted if necessary at a later date.



Fuel tank

This has also been cleaned and prepared for some primer. The fuel gauge sender has been removed to protect it from any damage whilst moving the tank around.



Dashboard

All instruments and switches have been removed to allow the dashboard to be prepared for painting too.



Decal removal

Heat was used to soften the adhesive of the stop control decal. It worked to a degree, but the adhesive remained on the surface, requiring further removal!



Rust holes

There are a few rust holes requiring attention and the top edge is rather jagged and will need some welding to sort it out before any paint is applied!

NEXT MONTH: The finishing line gets closer, as more progress is made preparing for the final coats of paint.

ncredibly, September saw almost 30 sales take place in the UK that had some vintage and classic machinery element in them, and we look at just some of them here.

If you want to get the best out of any sale these days, it really has to be online as well as on site, and I feel that one or two sales fell short price wise because they were not online. It can, however, go the other way - as a couple of timed auctions did not do so well with some of the smaller lots and if the auction had been on site they might have sold better, but who knows for sure?

One thing that is certain is that advertising a sale online at short notice and not in printed media does not give the vendor the best chance to see his stock sell well.

Anyhow, the weather was very kind all through September and it certainly brought out the crowds. Interestingly, much of the sales action has been in the West Country and Midlands and prices for the right things have held up very well, especially for MF products and classic John Deeres at a couple of sales too.

Interestingly, JCB's ERF lorry fleet attracted much attention at the company's sale on Tuesday 29 September. These trucks were worth approximately £7,000 each, but went on to sell from between £9,900 to £16,600 plus commission and VAT. They had been well maintained, but the prices were exceptional.

The sale season is not over yet, with a number of good sales coming up in November to keep us all on our toes and we preview a few auctions here that we are aware of.



Kivells sells 83 Fords!

A tremendous day was had at Middlecott Farm in Beaworthy, Devon, on Saturday 4 September, where Kivells' machinery team dispersed of Phillip Warren's collection of 83 Ford tractors.

It was said to be one of the largest Ford 1000 Series private collections, or if not the largest, to come to market for decades.

Phillip Warren (77), an avid Ford collector, restorer and 'tinkerer',

started buying and retaining tractors in 1989 and confessed to having "an extreme hobby gone out of control." His first purchase was a Ford 5000 Select-O-Speed from a Kivells auction.

The sun shone on a huge crowd of around 1,200 buyers from all over the United Kingdom, with many travelling down to Devon from far and wide. As anticipated during the three-month build-up

and preparation of this unique sale, huge media attention was achieved, resulting in countrywide sale participation - with buyers not only present at the sale from all parts, but also online with the MartEye app.

Interestingly, 31 lots were sold to online bidders and approximately 4,000 people watched the sale live online, from Ashwater to Australia. Trade was very strong, with the top price going to a four-wheel drive Ford 7810 at £25,000. The final lot of the day was a Ford 7000 with Schindler driven front axle, selling for £21.000.

Prior to that, a clean, 1982 Ford 655 excavator sold at £12,500. Other prices on the day for Ford 3000, 4000 and 5000 models ranged from £2,000 to £5,100.

Record money for 4020



There were some wellrestored tractors at H J Pugh & Co.'s Willow Barn Farm sale, at Chandlers Green, Mattingly, Hampshire, on Wednesday 22 September.

The owner spent his early farm life in Kent before moving to this area of Hampshire in 1966. He built up this excellent collection of mainly MF tractors more than 16 years ago, but he has concluded that you can only drive one of them at a time and after his handyman had retired there was no one else to help lift things, so he decided it was time to sell up.

The 173-lot sale was held in lovely weather conditions and the main interest was his genuine 1964 John Deere 4020 with Syncro-Range

transmission, which was supplied by Lundell of Edenbridge, Kent, the main UK/Ireland JD importer at the time. This tractor also starred at John Deere UK's 50th anniversary celebrations in September 2016 celebrations and ploughed both days with a JD F145H plough.

The tractor had been well restored and went on to make a record £18,600. The plough sold for £2,100.

The highlight in the MF section was a 178 Multi-Power that saw the hammer fall at £13,200. As for the one I would like to have taken home, well that would have to be the American-made Super 90 at £5,600. All the vendor's tractors were up and running and a credit to him.

JCB's ERF truck fleet

Pieces of JCB history went under the hammer on Tuesday 28 September when the company's Rocester-based fleet of ERF trucks was retired and sold off, after travelling the equivalent of almost 500 times around the world. It all happened at Wardlow Quarry, near Cauldon Lowe, Staffordshire.

The distinctive JCB-liveried lorries have been a familiar sight on the roads for the past 15 years, transporting parts between JCB factories and taking JCB machines to UK events. In that time

the 17 ERF EC-11 models have notched up a combined 15 million miles.

JCB Transport and Global Auctions manager Phil Pepper said: "When we bought them, they were between six to eight years old and they have been maintained to the very highest standards, so while they may be retiring from JCB, there is plenty of life left in them."

The articulated tractor units went on to be sold for prices ranging from £9,900 to an impressive £16,600 +VAT, but the company generously gave

a 10 per cent discount to all winning bidders of the immaculate fleet, as there was no buyer's premium.

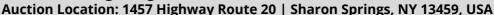

Euro Auctions



This MF 54 tracked loader looked to have been well used during its life, but still looked to be in pretty solid condition. It sold for £4,500.

There was a lot of talk at the latest Euro Auctions sale, on 15 September, about the company's recent acquisition by Ritchie Brothers. As it was though, it was more or less business as usual, with the various lots making their way onto the selling ramp, and bids coming in thick and fast. It has to be said that the number of lots that were being offered for sale had decreased in all areas, including the tractors.

This included the Ford and Fordson tractors, with only a handful coming under the hammer. The best of the Fords, price wise, was a 1993 Ford 8340 Powerstar SLE that was in good overall working condition.

That sold for £7,750, while there was slightly more rust evident on a 1992 Ford 8240 Powerstar SLE that, otherwise, was also in good shape. It sold for £7,000.

The cheapest tractor in the whole sale though, was a Fordson E1A Major that had certainly seen better days. This tractor looked to be in original condition and was showing a fair amount of rust. It did not look like a lost cause though, and hopefully with restoration in mind, it sold for £1,500.

As for MF tractors, the top lot was a 2004 MF 7495 – selling for £16,000. A tidy MF 6150 made £9,000 after some competitive bidding. That was followed by a 1995 MF 6180 that also looked to be in good shape, selling for £7,250, while at the lower end of the market an MF 550 that ran well but had a rough cab saw the hammer fall at £2,750. A Ferguson TE-F 20 was yours for £1,750.

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet. privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to

look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't on think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

All the prices quoted are what we call hammer prices and don't include UK VAT, commission or value added tax in the USA. If you cannot find your make or model for any reason, or need any advice, you are welcome to call our compiler, tel: 01323 833125.

WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

Band 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been resprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

Band 6

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.
