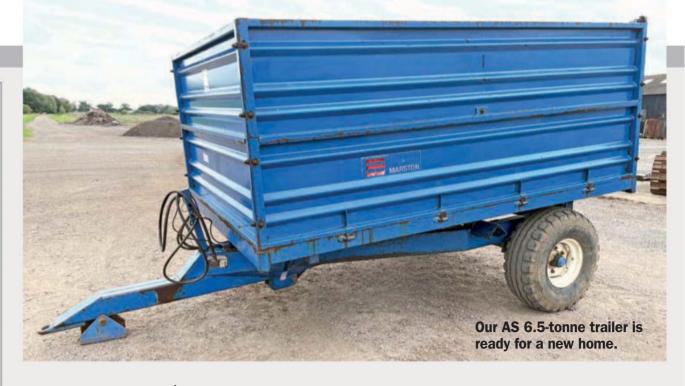

#### ORGANISERS OF THE MENTAL

health fundraiser, Run1000, are looking to set a new record in January 2022, when the initiative will return for the battle of the nations across the UK and, for the first time, New Zealand.

Launched in 2021 by founder Sheena Horner, who started running again in lockdown for the first time in 20 years, the campaign was joined by more than 1,200 participants that walked or ran during the month of January. Each step counted towards their country's collective miles, raising £51,545 for charity.

With teams this year from Scotland, England, Wales, Ireland and New Zealand, the team captains are not only competing to be crowned winners, but also to raise more money for their chosen charities – RSABI, DPJ Foundation, Embrace Farm, YANA, Farmstrong New Zealand, Farming Community Network, The Gamekeepers Welfare Trust and Vetlife.

Sheena explains why Run1000 is so important: "Rural mental health affects us all but we don't always realise it, nor appreciate that we are not alone. In rural areas many of us are working in isolation or live in remote areas that can result in little contact with the outside world. I wanted to create a community that could support each other, regardless of where they are based, whilst having a little fun and raising money for charity.

"With the pandemic impacting so many charities and their ability to organise events or fundraisers, we are hoping to get more people involved than ever this year and give something back to the organisations that support so many in their time of need."

The competition is open to all, whether or not you have been affected by mental health and costs just £20 to participate, with the money divided equally between the charities.

Individuals can take part by registering via the fundraising platform Enthuse, kindly donated by RSABI, and selecting the team they would like to join. All activity is recorded via Strava, ensuring every step is counted.

# Hydrogen injection

CB is investing £100 million on a project to produce super-efficient hydrogen engines, the company has announced. A team of 100 engineers is already working on the exciting development with the recruitment of up to 50 more engineers underway, as JCB targets the end of 2022 for the first machines to be available for sale to customers.

The wraps have already come off a prototype hydrogen-powered JCB backhoe loader and a second JCB machine – a Loadall telescopic handler – was unveiled at a central London event attended by Prime Minister Boris Johnson. JCB is world market leader for both backhoe loaders and telescopic handlers.

JCB's hydrogen technology was also on show in the Green Zone at COP26 in Glasgow, as world leaders debated measures to drastically reduce greenhouse emissions. JCB's emergence as a leader in zero-emission hydrogen technology comes as governments around the world unveil strategies to develop the infrastructure needed to support the use of hydrogen to drive down CO<sub>2</sub> emissions.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson said: "Great British manufacturers like JCB are developing innovative solutions to slash greenhouse emissions and advance the UK's green industrial revolution. It was fantastic to see JCB's super-efficient hydrogen engines, which could overhaul UK manufacturing, help us to rapidly reach our climate targets and ramp up the UK's hydrogen economy – an exciting area that will be essential to tackling climate change, creating new jobs and attracting investment."

JCB Chairman Lord Bamford said: "Our sort of machinery will need to be powered by something other than fossil fuels. We make machines which are powered by diesel so we have to find a solution and we are doing something about it now. We are investing in hydrogen as we don't see electric being the all-round solution, particularly not for our industry because it can only be used to power smaller machines.

"It does mean we will carry on making engines, but they will be super-efficient, affordable, high-tech hydrogen motors with zero CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, which can be brought to market quickly using our existing supply base. These will be our industry's first hydrogen engines, developed in Great Britain by British engineers. Hydrogen motors have the potential to help the UK reach CO<sub>2</sub> emissions targets more quickly."

JCB has manufactured engines since 2004, and this year it will celebrate a major milestone: the production of its 750,000th engine.

# Heritage on show

# Jonathan Whitlam travels to Devon to admire some classic machinery.

t is not often that I travel nearly 400 miles to a ploughing match.
Sometimes, though, it just has to be done and that was most certainly the case on 11 September when the Bradworthy & District Ploughing
Association held its annual ploughing match and working day at Coombe, near Monkleigh, in Devon.

The land for the show was kindly loaned by the Beer family and the three main fields used were all on a steep bank, which certainly provided the

ploughmen with a challenge – the hard ground conditions only recently moistened by a spell of light rain that added to the fun of the occasion.

This event has become well known in recent years for its themed tractor section, which has produced some superb line-ups of various tractor manufacturers' products and this occasion was no different, as the exhibitors did not disappoint when it came to the display of SAME Deutz-Fahr family tractors, the large turnout of which took prime position on top of the steep hillside that overlooked the working plots.

This Italian-owned tractor brand is usually abbreviated these days to SDF,

but the history of these machines actually belongs to no less than five famous tractor marques and much of that history was on show that day.

SAME, Lamborghini and Hürlimann tractors of various vintages line up across the top of the ploughing field.

#### **DEUTZ-FAHR**

The marque with the longest heritage when it comes to tractor production is Deutz of Germany, which can trace its first tractor to 1894 – although this was produced by an affiliate company in North America. The company's first German-produced tractor was in 1907, so it was still the earliest of those that would later come under the SDF umbrella.

Deutz started life as an engine builder and soon began producing complete ➤

vehicles, especially farm tractors, using its unique form of air-cooled, diesel-powered engines. The firm merged to become part of a larger enterprise known as KHD in 1938, the initials standing for the participating firms of Klöckner, Humboldt and Deutz.

In 1927, the 14hp Deutz MTH 222 tractor was the first diesel-powered example produced by the firm and this now became the fuel of choice. Aircooled diesel engines arrived in 1942, in the shape of the Deutz F11.514 tractor.

By the early 1950s a range of tractors was being produced, including the 60hp F4L 515, which was fitted with a seven-speed gearbox and was represented at this event by Paul Stanbury's restored example. This tractor looks more like a six-cylinder model than a four-pot machine, due to its elegant and impressive styling.

The smaller D-30, which was another tractor exhibited at Monkleigh by Paul Stanbury, was a 28hp machine with eight-speed transmission and was one of the models offered for sale in Britain from 1961.

KHD then became part owner of fellow German tractor and farm implement builder Fahr, in 1968. Fahr built its first tractor back in 1939, and eventually the two agricultural specialists were merged in 1970 with the Deutz-Fahr name appearing on tractors, combines and other machinery from 1981.

Deutz-Fahr was actually one of the first European tractor manufacturers to

become what the Americans called a 'full-liner', offering both tractors, combines and implements – in this case predominantly hay and silage equipment.

Watveare Overseas became the UK distributor of the green tractors in 1974, which coincided with the introduction of the new Deutz 06 tractors which were a big success for the company in Britain, including both two- and four-wheel drive models with both four- and six-cylinder engines. A nice example of this range, a two-wheel drive D 6206, was towing a trailer around the site for visitors to utilise.

Deutz had been producing tool carriers for some time when it introduced a new concept called the Intrac 2003, in 1972. Later, the Intrac 2004 was introduced and Paul Stanbury had one of these at the event, too. The tractor is powered by an air-cooled 70hp Deutz diesel, driving through a 12-speed transmission.

Deutz had great success with its new DX range from 1979 and several examples of this type, both the original and later models, were part of the display in Devon. These tractors had a very angular design and new, more spacious cabs, plus new Deutz four-, five-, six- and later eight-cylinder, air-cooled diesel engines.

From 1981 these tractors were badged as Deutz-Fahr and continued to be produced in updated forms. An early addition, seen at the show in the form of a Deutz DX140, was the Powermatic change-on-the-move transmission.

KHD had an interesting sojourn into the USA in 1985 when it bought the Allis-Chalmers company and began producing air-cooled, Deutz-powered tractors for the North American market under the Deutz-Allis brand name and with a mixture of American and German styling. This came to an end in 1990 when AGCO bought the firm from KHD.

The DX Commander series was a major update introduced in 1989 and was soon followed by the new AgroStar DX4 and DX6 ranges in 1990 that featured a new, flat-floor cab with more glass area, as well as 48-speed transmissions.

Deutz-Fahr was also a pioneer of the sloping bonnet design, with the derivatives of the AgroStar and new AgroXtra ranges launched in 1991 featuring increased visibility thanks to the steeply sloping bonnet design. A trio of these tractors were at the show, including one still carrying its front- and rear-mounted spraying kit.

In 1995, Italian tractor maker SAME purchased Deutz-Fahr from KHD, eventually forming the new SDF company and the following year the first all-new Deutz tractors for some time arrived in the shape of the Agrotron range: a very futuristic, sloping bonnet design with an all-new cab. This would set the style for the brand in the future, with models up to 260hp, and also saw the changeover to liquid-cooled engines, rather than air-cooled units.

Several Agrotron tractors, as well as the later and newest members of the



Deutz-Fahr range, were at the show, including the distinctive, black-painted Warrior models.

#### SAME

SAME qualifies for the place of second oldest in this family, as the first Cassani tractor appeared in 1927, although SAME itself was not formed until 1942 and the first SAME-badged tractor appeared in 1948 – setting new standards in terms of design and features, such as four-wheel drive.

The company was started by Francesco Cassani, who had built those earlier tractors, with the acronym signifying Società Accomandita Motori Endotermici.

The 1952 DA25DT was not only a four-wheel drive machine, but also the first SAME with an air-cooled diesel engine. Both two- and four-wheel drive models followed and the subsequent machines became larger and more sophisticated. It took until 1964 before British farmers got to try out a SAME and by this time the Leone and Centauro models were the most popular.

More models arrived from 1969 onwards, when Bamlett of Thirsk became the sole importer, and by the mid-1970s tractors ranged from the 56hp Minitauro 60 up to the 126hp Buffalo. The styling of these tractors, particularly the cabs, was shared with both Lamborghini and then Hürlimann, as these two firms were taken over by SAME.

The six-cylinder Laser models were launched in 1983 with new cabs and features and soon became popular, as did the Explorer range, later becoming the



With its front-mounted cab, the Deutz-Fahr Intrac concept was all about forward visibility with front-mounted implements and the ability to carry loads behind the cab, as well as on the rear linkage. These unusual-looking machines were made in both two- and four-wheel drive formats, with Paul Stanbury's being of the latter type. The 1979, 70hp Intrac 2004 was used in Somerset for harvesting willow, but had been laid up for some time before Paul bought it and restored it in 2020.

improved Explorer II in 1988, several examples of which were seen in Devon.

Examples of the Silver range were also present, these tractors first appearing in 1994 and being amongst the most popular SAME types here in the UK. The larger SAME tractors, such as the Rubin of 1998, took many features from the Deutz-Fahr range following SAME buying the German manufacturer. Most evident was the use of the same cab across the different marques, which was derived from that used on the Agrotron.

An example of the current SAME range, a Virtus 140, was displayed on the

#### HÜRLIMANN

Hürlimann, based

near Zurich,

Another member of the SDF family, Hürlimann, was actually based in Switzerland and produced its first tractor in 1929, just two years after the Cassani. Hürlimann was another brand that soon favoured diesel power and the resultant tractors were very distinctive and powerful looking. They soon garnered a reputation throughout Europe for build quality and performance. Founded by Hans

time to include a whole range of models, the D Series being introduced in 1946, and a rare example of this range was exhibited at the show by Nigel Jenkinson.

The high-quality machines being produced by the firm led to financial difficulties and in 1975 SAME purchased Hürlimann and eventually moved production out of Switzerland and over to Italy. Despite the acquisition, Hürlimann remains as a separate brand to this day within the fold of SDF.

A new light green colour was used for the first brand-new Hürlimann tractors to be launched following the takeover by SAME, and stretched from the H-480 up to the mighty H-6160, followed by further models over the years. Most Hürlimann tractors continued to be powered by Swiss-built Hürlimann engines during this time and in 1980 the brand began to be sold in Britain for the first time.

1985 saw a redesign of the range and it became more closely related to the other SAME and Lamborghini models, although always as a more premium product.

Following a change to silver paintwork, the distribution of this brand became rather sporadic in the UK after 1998 and more recently the brand has reverted back to green.

#### LAMBORGHINI

The last of this family of tractor builders to start production was Lamborghini, which produced its first tractor in 1948. Diesel was again the favoured source of

power and from small beginnings the Lamborghini tractor began to become more well known throughout Europe.

Ferruccio Lamborghini was the driving force behind the tractors that bore his name and soon he was producing small crawlers as well as wheeled tractors. Usually painted orange, a white colour scheme had been adopted by the time the business was sold to SAME in 1972, due to its owner concentrating more on high-performance sports cars.

The brand now flourished alongside the SAME line, sharing many components, such as cabs, but retaining its unique style and individuality.

The mid-1970s saw the introduction of the Lamborghini 'Blue Line' models to British farmers, initially with tractors

from 38-105hp imported by Maulden Engineering of Bedfordshire.

Two 754 tractors of this period were at Monkleigh, still being used on local farms to this day.

In 1979, following the 1975 purchase of Hürlimann, the SLH company was founded as the trade name for the new group, the letters denoting the three constituent members, and from then on all three would share numerous components.

Larger Lamborghini models followed from 1980, including the imposing 135hp 1356DT and 155hp 1556DT, plus five-cylinder models such as the 92hp 955DT. Most were four-wheel drive, but two-wheel drive was also an option on the smaller tractors. Most had air-cooled engines up to this point, but the two large new models introduced water cooling.

Crawlers were still an important feature of the Lamborghini range and an excellent example was at the show on the Blakewell Services Ltd. stand, which also proudly displayed a brand-new Lamborghini Strike model.

Lamborghini tractors continued to mirror the SAME and Hürlimann models and this was also the case when the Racing 190 arrived in 1992, bringing a high level of electronic control to the range, including an electronically-controlled, full powershift transmission. Jim Hedges was working his 190 on the ploughing plots and was getting a great deal of attention from visitors. This tractor was also produced as the SAME Titan 190 and the Hürlimann Master H-6190.

The colour changed to silver for a time in the late 1990s and into the 2000s but has recently returned to the familiar white livery. Lamborghini tractors are not sold in large numbers in the UK today and even Jeremy Clarkson had to import his R8 model from Germany!

#### **DEVON DEALERS**

Although the SAME and Deutz-Fahr brands have always been well supported by dealers in Britain, the Lamborghini and Hürlimann ranges have been rather patchy in coverage. Nevertheless, this part of Devon was once well served by several dealers specialising in one or more of these brands.

Easterbrook & Tanton were based at nearby Barnstaple and sold the three SLH products of SAME, Lamborghini and Hürlimann tractors for many years,

while Bernard Hancock was a dealer for Lamborghini tractors, also near Barnstaple.

F W Yelland, from Northlew near Okehampton, was a Deutz dealer until the mid-1980s, with dealer G K Alford taking over the Deutz-Fahr flag from its base at Hatherleigh. During its time with the brand, the dealer acquired a small vintage Deutz F1L514 single-cylinder tractor and used it to promote the new tractors on its stand at shows and events around the area.

When the business ceased trading in the early 1990s, a local farmer bought the little Deutz, keeping it in the area, and it actually made a reappearance at the ploughing match, once again standing next to its much newer descendants on the stand of current Deutz-Fahr dealer MSW Engineering.

The Deutz-Fahr brand was still represented from Hatherleigh after the G K Alford era thanks to Devtrac and this was followed by current SLH specialist Blakewell Services Ltd. from 2007 which, as well as selling new Deutz-Fahr tractors, also looks after many SLH products still at work in the locality.

MSW Engineering is the newest Deutz-Fahr dealer in the region and with the two firms keen to sell the green tractors, the brand seems to have an assured future here in north-west Devon.

#### **SELLING THE BRAND**

Themed event organiser James Poole had talked to Richard Tanton about his 40 years of SDF before the event. Richard started his career with Berry's, a David Brown dealer, and then spent 12 months selling Universal tractors with Bernard

Hancock before setting up on his own with business partner Dave Easterbrook, to form Easterbrook & Tanton, taking on the Hürlimann franchise in 1980.

The Hürlimann company had recently been acquired by SAME, although at this point was still quite independent and the tractors were imported into the UK by a separate company from its new parent: I Bridgeman of Newbury.

Easterbrook & Tanton demonstrated these tractors and soon made a success of them. Richard says: "They were a very well-made tractor with an excellent four-wheel drive axle. They used a centre drive axle, which gave a much better turning circle than the rather more cumbersome side-drive units that were then commonplace."

At the ploughing match, Blakewell Services Ltd. had a Hürlimann H-360 on its stand, which was actually sold new by Richard to a Mr J Martin from Exbourne, who bought it at the Devon County Show in 1981 and still owns it today, with 5,400 hours on the clock.

As time passed, the distribution network for Hürlimann was taken over by SAME and this saw a gradual move to sell more of the red tractors. By this time the two tractor brands shared much more in common anyway and so the dealership started to sell many more SAME tractors, resulting in the last Hürlimann being sold in 1986.

Although it may be in poor condition today, after a lifetime of hard work, the last new Hürlimann sold by the dealership, once again an H-480, was in the main theme tractor line-up and belongs to Roger Easterbrook. In the five years that the company sold >

Hürlimann tractors, it sold around 30 units, while in later years the peak for SAME tractor sales hit 25 units a year.

"With the new Explorer tractors, introduced in 1984," says Richard, "SAME had a true four-wheel drive braking system with wet brakes fitted inside the front hubs that, in my opinion, hasn't been bettered to this day."

SAME tractors were certainly well endowed when it came to features and the launch of the Explorer II tractors saw the transmission become a 60 forward and 60 reverse unit, plus it was one of the first manufacturers to have a 40kph top speed. Although, to be fair, the same features were also rolled out on the Lamborghini and Hürlimann models too - they were simply not as well represented as the SAME product. Farmers bought the SAME tractors and contractors did too. A popular option was the reverse drive feature, often used to run a Reco Mengele SH40 reversedrive forage harvester.

In 1989, in a move that was to foreshadow future events, Easterbrook & Tanton took on the Deutz-Fahr franchise alongside SAME, running with both brands into the 1990s. Richard left the firm and started his own business in 2001, trading as Blakewell Services Ltd., which acquired the SDF franchise in 2006 and once again Richard found himself as a SAME Deutz-Fahr dealer, but now with the two brands under the same ownership!

Today Richard is supported by his son, two daughters and son-in-law across two depots and in the process has become the area's largest SDF dealer.

#### **BEST TRACTORS**

Prizes were awarded in the early afternoon for the best themed tractor entry, as well as six runners up, the judging being done by an SDF area representative plus the CEO of SDF UK, Graham Barnwell.

This saw Paul Stanbury win several prizes, including the top spot for his superbly restored Deutz F4L514. Obviously a Deutz fan, he also won three runners-up prizes for his little D30 and a stunning DX85, as well as his unique Intrac 2004 – all restored to a very high standard.

The other three runners up were Nigel Jenkinson with his 1940s' Hürlimann in lovely original condition, which had developed a fault just before the show and so spent the day on a trailer, this not distracting from its typical Swiss styling one bit.

Colin Martin also won a prize for his fine example of a SAME Explorer 90 and Jim Hedges also won for his Lamborghini Racing 190, which he used with a plough, the distinctive growl of its liquid-cooled, six-cylinder motor being heard all around the site as he powered up the steep field.

Of course, the whole event was based on the ploughing match, which saw many local competitors in several classes featuring Fordson, Ferguson, David Brown and International Harvester tractors and ploughs. The best ploughing award for the themed tractors was won by Bernard Allin with his SAME Explorer and four-furrow conventional plough.

Perhaps the most memorable sight of the day had to be all those SDF family tractors lined up together, making a very unusual sight in this country. It was great that so many of these tractors are still being used locally, many on the same farms to which they were bought new, and they are a real tribute to the quality of these German-, Swiss- and Italian-built machines, even if the tin worm had got to a few of them, most being used on livestock farms in this part of the world!

For me though, the highlight had to be Jim Hedges powering his Lamborghini Racing 190 up the furrow. That sight, and particularly the sound, will remain with me for some time to come!

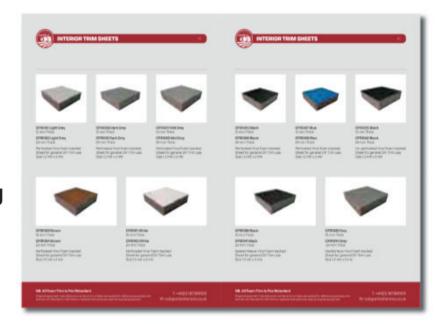

# Firestone tyres

PART ONE

# In the first of a two-part series, Bernard Holloway looks at the early history of Harvey S Firestone and the introduction of the pneumatic tractor tyre.

s the railroad punched its way across 19th century
America, it proved be the catalyst to transform albeit a vast, but predominately parochial, country into a modern, cosmopolitan society. It opened up the country, creating new markets, providing the means to swiftly transport goods, raw materials and people across its many states, which hitherto had relied upon the motive power of the horse.

Towards the latter part of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century, the country underwent another transport revolution – the development of the internal combustion engine.

Technological change takes time and does not occur overnight, and whilst the train still rolled on it would take 50 years or so for the tractor, automobile, and commercial truck to gain acceptance and replace the horse and wagon – the principle prime movers on farms and within cities. As it did so, it provided the population with unprecedented levels of

flexibility, freedom and speed, breaking down the barriers between city dwelling and country life.

Into this exciting era Harvey Samuel Firestone took his first breath on a 640-acre family farm, 'The Homestead' near Columbiana, Ohio, in 1868. It would remain a constant in his life and in later years became a haven where he was able to insulate himself from the pressures of business, to think and recuperate.

As a young man he laboured on the farm and this work instilled in him the value of hard work and long hours, which he adopted the whole of his working life. Taking these principles with him he graduated in advanced business studies and this qualification provided a good grounding for his, as then unknown, future in the world of commerce. Here he would excel as a businessman, with the gift for knowing what the public wanted and the marketing ability to sell it to them.

Variously employed as a bookkeeper, salesperson of medicines and extracts,

his most auspicious move was whilst working for the 'Columbus Buggy Works' in Detroit, selling buggies and tyres.

In the 1890s, horse and buggy racing was a popular pastime; the young Firestone was caught up in the sport and when teamed with the right horse was one of the men to beat. During this period, he saw his first rubber-tyred racing buggy, made in England, and realised the advantages that this tyre had over the standard solid type.

The desire for speed stayed with him his whole life and was instrumental in his company supplying tyres for many forms of motorsport, including the Indianapolis 500, which was won more than 50 times between 1900 and 2000 on Firestone tyres.

#### **INFLUENTIAL FRIENDS**

But this was the future and relevant in the early days of his business life was a chance meeting in 1895 with Henry Ford, who purchased from him a set of pneumatic buggy tyres. These were not for racing but for 'The Quadricycle',

Ford's first car, that he was building in his spare time whilst working for the 'Edison Illuminating Company' based in Detroit. Little did Firestone realise then that he, Ford and Edison, three of the most influential businessmen of their time, were destined to become great friends.

They would become famous for their camping trips, undertaken in style with a retinue of helpers, including a chef and drivers. A specially-adapted car, a Ford of course, supplied the fuel for the stove; the back dropping down to provide a large table, useful for family and guests – amongst whom were John Burroughs, the environmentalist, and Presidents Coolidge and Harding.

Back tracking a few years, and before he moved in such exalted circles, Firestone, astute as always, quickly realised the automobile and air-filled rubber tyres were the future and moved after a brief time in Chicago to Akron, Ohio, 'The rubber capital of the world' the centre of rubber and elastic manufacturing in the USA. BF Goodrich, credited with making the first pneumatic automobile tyre, had opened its rubber manufacturing plant there in 1870, with the Goodyear company following about 28 years later.

After two years of selling other manufacturers' tyres at a loss, Firestone

realised that manufacturing his own tyre was the only way to profitability. By 1902 he opened his first factory in a dilapidated building equipped with second-hand plant. By 1903 the first pneumatic, detachable, mechanically-fixed, straight-sided car tyres, which could easily be changed with a spanner, were rolling off the Firestone production line.

These provided a more supple ride over the difficult-to-fit and harder riding 'clincher' type and the solid rubber side wire tyre, with wires strengthening and stiffening the carcass to ensure maximum tread contact, that the company had been selling.

Life is full of opportunities – some self-made and others coincidental. That chance meeting with Henry Ford and the success of Ford automobiles was going to pay dividends. Firestone had built a reputation for a meticulous approach to business and manufacturing tyres of high quality, and 1906 was destined to be a milestone year for the company. Firestone approached The Ford Motor Company for business, and it responded by placing an order for 2,000 sets of tyres.



That order, the largest placed with a supplier, helped the company reach a turnover in the region of \$1million – an impressive achievement for a company in only its sixth year of trading, and four years later that figure represented its profit.

If you think that was good going, by 1925 recorded sales figures were \$125,597,998 – remarkable because a few years prior the company was in debt and had gone through the depression of 1920-1921, but astute cost cutting to increase sales and a tight rein on wages pulled the company back into the black. The company certainly was motoring!

Firestone continued to supply The Ford Motor Company with a good percentage of its tyres, so upon reflection the success of the company is not particularly surprising as the 'Model T' coming on stream in 1908 had total production figures in the region of 15 million, until production ceased in 1927. It must also be remembered that there was income from the replacement market, other clients, and commercial vehicles.

#### **NOT JUST CARS**

Firestone was also in the forefront of promoting the use of commercial vehicles, championing the 'Ship by Truck' movement to distribute goods, using the network of new highways that had been constructed, and by 1935, despite another depression in the early 1930s, sales were still at a healthy \$121 million.

Under Firestone's guidance the company researched and developed significant improvements in tyre

technology for all types of vehicles. For example, the first commercial demountable rim and in 1908 the non-skid tread – the 'Firestone non-skid' providing superior traction to the usual smooth surfaced tyre.

At that time it was not unusual for manufacturers to add metal rivets and leather to the compound, or use a dimpled tread to assist traction. This new tyre had an angled tread pattern and formed the basis of the tyres we have today. Written diagonally across the tyre was the maker's name, 'Firestone'.

Incremental steps to improve tyre technology followed. Company chemists devised a method to incorporate into the carcass fabric ply in lieu of square woven cloths, adding strength, flexibility, improved reliability, and tyre life.

By 1931, BF Goodrich had developed a 'Zero Pressure' tyre – a design neither solid nor pneumatic. Consisting of a series of solid rubber webs inside the carcass, the deformation of the tyre provided grip, but the company reverted to a more conventional design soon after.

The first real breakthrough came when Firestone and Allis-Chalmers collaborated in 1930, with the intention of developing a pneumatic tractor tyre, They initially experimented with aircraft tyres fitted to commercial vehicle wheels at the 'The Homestead', which soon became the company's testing facility. Firestone's first-hand experience of working all types of farm machinery made him

conversant with their pitfalls and as a well-known exponent of pneumatic rubber tyres, he was determined to bring their benefits to the farmer.

In 1932 the practicality of a lowpressure tractor tyre was proven when a pair of Firestone's 48 x12 aircraft tyres were fitted to an Allis-Chalmers U. Trials proved successful and reaffirmed during their first public test on Labor Day in Dodge City, Kansas.

Firestone developed the tractor tyre using the principles of the balloon tyre incorporating a chevron tread design and named the first practical pneumatic low-pressure tractor tyre the 'Ground Grip.'

That year Firestone began his campaign to 'Put the Farm on Rubber'. A-C offered a specially-designed tyre manufactured by Firestone as standard equipment on the model U, although steel wheels were an option.

Acceptance was slow. Farmers were reluctant to accept the revolutionary rubber tyre. The effects of the Depression were not conducive to spending hard-earned dollars, as money was tight, and survival was uppermost in their minds – let alone taking the risk of purchasing a new and expensive rubber tyre that did nothing to ease their deep-rooted scepticisms that it was advantageous over steel rims and solid tyres.

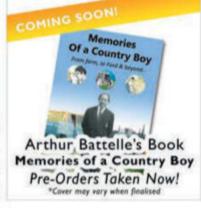




























# Triple triangle value

Choosing a tractor can be a minefield, especially when there are so many to pick from. We offer opinion on which Massey Ferguson models offer the best value, with the help of an expert.

Massey Ferguson model is considered to be a safe bet when it comes to buying a tractor for work and/or play. A blend of Perkins engines and Massey Ferguson sub-assemblies has proved to be a worthy combination, with many of the company's ranges gaining critical acclaim over the years.

Today, the company's tractors built during the 1960s, '70s and '80s, in particular, have a reputation for productivity and reliability, but with so many to choose from, which should you buy?

A tractor is capable of any job if it is matched with the appropriate implement, but to make your choice more straightforward we have split the tractors into four categories – sub-50hp, 51-75hp, 76-100hp and 101-125hp.

We have also enlisted the help of Chris Clack, who held several positions at Massey Ferguson during the period we

are focussing on, including Product Manager for the 600 Series tractors, based at MF's Central Marketing Group in Stoneleigh. Chris has a wealth of experience with all ranges, from the 100 Series to the 3000 Series, and is well versed in their manufacture and operation.

Experience has shown that these models have a great deal to offer, but their popularity is often reflected in their price tag. Our aim is to highlight the model that we consider to offer good value for money to those looking to purchase a Massey Ferguson tractor for work and/or 'play', according to power output.

You may not agree with our choices, but they will certainly provide food for thought. The prices included are based on tractors sold recently at auction, on the Internet and privately.

It is also worth mentioning that when contemplating 'value for money', we are considering these tractors as a purchase to use, rather than to make money – although it has to be said that classic machinery appears to represent a good investment at the current time.

As for condition, rough examples consume both time and money, so it is advisable to buy the best that you can afford – unless a project is your aim. Cabs can be problematic if corrosion has taken a significant hold, so pay particular attention to their structural integrity, as well as their appearance.

With time, money and know-how, problems can be overcome – but choose wisely and don't let your heart rule your head!

Turn the page to see what we've chosen as our best-value models from one of the best-loved machinery manufacturers of the last six decades. Please note: all power figures are quoted in the DIN standard, unless stated. DIN power is approximately 1.05 times lower than the BS rating. ➤

## SUB-50hp

his is a prevalent category and covers models that are particularly popular due to their size. They can be easily transported and fit into small buildings with relative ease. Suitable for those entering the world of classic tractors, they are highly prized and often command premium prices, so do your homework before you part with your hard-earned money.

The obvious contender in this sector is the 45hp MF 135. Recognisable to millions, this little tractor took the farming world by storm when it replaced the 35X and has become the obvious choice for many when it comes to buying their first tractor.

It's the epitome of reliability, starts well, performs brilliantly and virtually every part is available should problems arise, but should you buy one? It is expensive for what it is, but it does offer good value when you compare it to the other models of similar power output. A rough, off-farm example will set you back around £2,500 – proving that this is a model with a 'premium' price tag, despite the fact that more than 250,000 were built in Coventry alone.

Chris Clack suggests that the MF 152 MkIII should be considered as a contender in this category. It used the Perkins-built AD3.152S, producing 47hp, and was coupled to an eight forward, two reverse transmission, with three-



plate, oil-cooled disc brakes too.

"Somewhat later, the MF 154S fruit tractor, from the Landini stable, is also worth considering if you can find one," Chris suggested. "At 47hp and with a 12-speed synchromesh gearbox, both it and the 152 MkIII are pretty reliable and will probably have low hours. They

would certainly be a talking point at shows etc."

The lack of 152 MkIII and 154S examples means that they are not obvious contenders as alternatives to the 135, although do give them careful consideration should you find one, so our attention turns to the 200 Series models.

As a successor to the 135, the 240 is an attractive proposition, although the cab can let it down. The 230 commands a similar price to the 135, but with 7hp less, it doesn't really make sense in terms of value, so is ruled out in this respect.

If you want a tractor with a cab, the 47hp MF 350 is certainly in the running. It may be slightly more expensive than a 135, but because of the Sankey-built cab and general specification, it offers good value.

In conclusion, the Massey Ferguson 135 can seem expensive compared to tractors like the David Brown 880 Selectamatic and IH 434, but if you are desperate to a purchase a sub-50hp Massey Ferguson it's probably the right one for you.

**OUR CHOICE: MF 135** 

## **51-75hp**

t 58.3hp (BS) and 62hp
(BS) the MF 165, in MkI
and MkII form respectively,
is a prime candidate for
our choice, but it is
expensive for what it offers
– given that you can pick up a 75hp (BS)
MF 185 for not much more money.

"More than 40,000 MF 185s were made and some are still working on farms," Chris Clack explained. "Parts are readily available, including parts for the Scirocco safety cab with flexible cladding. They turn up at farm retirement/dispersal sales, although many have been exported over the years. In the same vein, an early MF 290 is similar, provided the cab is reasonably intact."

At 75hp, the A4.248-powered MF 290 can be found with a Duncan cab or a GKN Sankey unit, as well as a choice of three transmissions – the eight-speed 'box, Synchro 12 or Multi-Power.

A really nice original example can be found for around £10,000, which is less than the equivalent MF 135, but there are other models to consider.

"The later introduced MF 275 and 375 are good tractors and a real find would be a two-wheel drive MF 3050 in good condition – all having that great Perkins A4.236 powerplant, albeit the 3050 selling in small numbers," Chris told T&M. "As in the aforementioned category, the MF 158 MkIII and red Landinis – the four-wheel drive MF 184S/184F models, at 56hp and 68hp respectively, have presence on individuality."



Our choice may command more money than others in this category, but what it offers in terms of specification makes up for the additional expenditure. With the brilliant, naturally-aspirated A4.236 under the bonnet and the great, if a little small, Sankey-built LoProfile+cab, there's so much to like about the 362.

Initially producing 60hp, later examples are rated at 62hp and have the option of the 12-speed manual shuttle with single-lever side shift transmission, which is great for loader work. There was also the option of the 18 Speedshift gearbox, with gear lever-mounted 'splitter' button, as well as a consolemounted button to use if desired.

Controls were simple and well laid out, with the only electronics being the Speedshift (if fitted) and chunky rocker switches for lights, four-wheel drive and differential lock engagement.

Available in two- and four-wheel drive forms, a good, early 362 with standard eight forward, two reverse synchromesh transmission, will set you back around £10,000, while four-wheel drive 12/12 models tend to command around £15,000.

With a decent engine, generating 243Nm (191lb/ft) of torque at 1,400rpm, renowned hydraulic system and a choice of transmissions to suit your requirements, the Massey Ferguson 362 is the ideal blend of proven and 'modern' components to meet your needs.

**76-100hp** 

iven that the MF 699, at 95hp, is commanding top prices, perhaps the most desirable would be a

four-wheel drive MF 3070," Chris suggested. "The MF 698T, known as a 'pocket rocket', with that glorious wastegate turbo on the Perkins AT4.236, also has a place, as many can now reasonably fix a poor cab on these models.

"There's been no mention by me so far on the MF 500 Series models, but an 88hp MF 595 MkII is not out of the question, as the last incarnation of the Perkins A4.3182 engine was well sorted by then. Many Multi-Power versions of these were sold which, if well looked after, cause no transmission problems.

"The MF 298 is possibly underrated, as it too used the refined A4.3182 engine. The Duncan cab was okay, as it was fitted by Duncan at its Coventry facility. The three-lever Synchro 12 manual gearbox was one of the best MF ever introduced."

Much has been written about the 600 Series before and although the underpinnings were rather good, it was let down by the cab. If you can find a good one, the 698T and 699 are powerful performers and represent a good investment, but we're inclined to agree with Chris on this one.

The Massey Ferguson 298 is an underrated model. There are so many horror stories about the A4.318 that



anything with that engine tends to be tainted, but after some rectification by Perkins, the A4.3182 has a lot going for it.

Rated at 88hp and producing 344Nm (254lb/ft) of torque at 1,300rpm, the 5.2-litre engine's long stroke and direct injection mean bags of pull and decent starting. Add the optional centre-drive

front axle into the mix, with mechanical engagement and Auto Lock differential, and you've got a very capable tractor.

Standard specification includes two-speed iPTO, linkage pump and auxiliary pump with Mk3A Selector Valve, oil-cooled disc brakes, two spool valves and 16.9/14-34 rear tyres. Two-wheel drive examples are fitted with 10-16 fronts, while four-wheel drive models utilise 13.6/12-24 rubber.

With oil flow from the linkage pump at 28 litres per minute (6.16gpm) and the auxiliary pump emitting 36 litres per minute (7.92gpm), combined flow is 64 litres per minute (14.08gpm) – making the 298 great for flow-hungry applications.

At less than £5,000 for a reasonable example, the 298 is around £1,500 cheaper than the equivalent 290 – which although a great tractor is giving away 13hp in the power stakes. Even a top-notch, original example can be had for less than a 135 in the same condition, so it's hard to find another Massey Ferguson model that offers such good value for money.

**OUR CHOICE: MF 298** 

## **101-125hp**

f you're looking for a 'big' tractor, the 2000 Series offers something different, but most would consider the Massey Ferguson 3000 Series as the most viable contender for a model in this sector.

"The 2640 is not all bad if an early model was subjected to a factory upgrade programme done by dealers, namely changes to the concentric clutch slave cylinder and the like, but an MF 2645 Electronic would be well sorted by then," Chris explained. "A bit iconic is a two-wheel drive MF 2620. Not many were sold, but it was good at PTO work – on a power harrow or forage harvester – with its Speedshift transmission and tight turning circle.

"Of the 3000 Series, it would be the 107hp MF 3090 and 3095 models that get my vote. Even a Coventry-made MF 4270, introduced in 1997, is now in contention – an early model being nearly 25 years old!"

It has to be said that the 3090 offers plenty of 'bang for your buck'. It was bought with productivity in mind and many will have amassed high hours, but the A6.354.4 is renowned for its reliability and parts are plentiful should you need to overhaul it. A good one, with around 9,000 hours on the clock, can be bought for around £12,000, but it's possible to find a reasonable one for under £10,000 without too much difficulty.

Standard specification includes a naturally-aspirated, 5.8-litre, six-cylinder



engine generating 375Nm (294lb/ft) of torque at 1,400rpm, a 16-speed synchromesh transmission with shuttle, oil-immersed disc brakes, independent 540/1,000rpm PTO with electrohydraulic engagement, electronic linkage control and Autotronic.

The latter is particularly useful if you

want a tractor to put to work, as it takes the drudgery out of field operations. Automatic functions include disengagement of the diff lock when the linkage is lifted and re-engagement when it is lowered, engagement of four-wheel drive when the brakes are applied, disengagement of four-wheel drive over 9mph, four-wheel drive engagement when the diff lock is selected, engagement of four-wheel drive when parked, engagement of the PTO clutch and disengagement if an implement blocks.

With so much technology, the 3000 Series was a trend-setting range and although some were sceptical about the electronics, the 3090 and its siblings have proved themselves to be reliable. Electronic linkage control has become the norm and data monitors have made for increased productivity.

The cab, with its chunky 'B' pillar and doors complete with 'pockets', was reminiscent of Case IH's XL in many ways and this was no bad thing. Comfortable, quiet and with good visibility, it's still a nice place to spend the working day.

## CONCLUSION

s is the case with most tractor manufacturers, there are alternatives from each range that will suit your requirements, but we have chosen those that we feel best represent best value.

The popularity of the brand means that MF products tend to command a premium compared to some other marques, and the fact is that if the badge on the bonnet is not important you will be able to find something cheaper in the same power bracket.

It is, however, not always about purchase price. No machine can be guaranteed not to break down, but MF models from the period we have focussed on have garnered a reputation for rock solid reliability and it is this that adds to their price tag. Plus, the re-sale value of the majority of Massey Ferguson tractors tends to remain high, which is good if you are considering your purchase as an investment as well as a necessity.

Buy right and you will not be disappointed, but should you need or wish to improve your purchase, there is a vast array of dealerships and specialists offering genuine and replacement parts to suit virtually all MF models, some of which are listed here.

RIGHT: It is possible to pick up a later, four-wheel drive model, with a decent cab and better spec, for less than an earlier two-wheel drive tractor. A 47hp MF 250, with driven front axle and Sankey 'Q' cab, will set you back around £10,500 (in original condition), while an MF 148 can command as much as £14,000.

BELOW: Although extremely collectible, the 105hp MF 1200 is expensive and not particularly good value. With nice, original examples fetching in excess of £18,000, there are numerous other MF models of similar power output that can be purchased, such as the 2640- at around half the price.

#### **Farming memories**

Dear T&M,

The letter from Steeve Hewlett, in the October edition of Tractor & Machinery, stirred further memories of farming in the post-war years. In the early 1950s, when the new Fordson Major, as it was known, was first introduced, the first farmers to buy one in this area (mid Surrey) were, I believe, Frank and Bill Royle, from Jury Farm.

I used to visit them on my motorbike to persuade Bill to come and bale our hay and I have to admit that I cast very envious eyes over their new tractor, knowing I had to go back to our E27N, with bald tyres and one foot brake (the left side completely shot due to being used to try to stop wheel slippage when ploughing, as there was no diff lock in those days!).

Many years later I remember buying four redundant Majors and selling the best one to Steeve, who it transpires sold it to the Ryde Farm Estate - which comprised Holride Farm, Ryde Farm and Jury Farm. I find It fascinating that 30 years later they bought another one, which it seems gave excellent service.

It's kind of Steve to ask how I'm keeping and I'm pleased to say that I'm surviving,

although not doing much farming! I hope he is okay too.

Going back to the Royle brothers, they had an eight-foot cut, self-propelled Massey combine on small front drive wheels – probably 16-inch, whereas all the rest were usually 28-inch. I just wondered if any readers know what the model number was, as despite looking carefully at combine pictures and articles, I have never seen another one!

**SL:** Some of Massey Ferguson's combines had 24-inch front wheels, such as the 31 model, but I suspect that you are referring to a model from the Massey-Harris era. One of our knowledgeable readers is sure to know the answer and, as always, I pass the baton over!



## **Hedge trimmer**

Dear T&M,

I read your answer to the problem of using a TE-20 with a reciprocating hedge cutter with interest, as I used to cut my hedges with my Ferguson and a McConnel hedge cutter.

I used what I consider the best solution - an epicyclic gearbox fitted to the tractor. That gives two great advantages. You now have a lower set of forward speed gears and, in effect, a live clutch.

When approaching a thick part of the hedge you can travel slowly and stop if necessary, whilst leaving the cutters running at normal

speed. That is attained by simply using the hand lever fitted to the epicyclic gearbox.

Unfortunately, these gearboxes are not easy to find, but if you need to use your Ferguson for this purpose I feel that it is an ideal solution.

SL: Sound advice, Michael. As you rightly say, a hard-to-find component though!

#### Dear T&M,

I've just read the piece about a chap wanting to fit a hedge trimmer to a Ferguson TE-20. I know a chap that's got a few hedges to do and he uses a

McConnel trimmer with a petrol engine mounted next to the big drive pulley. It has a belt tensioner that's reached from the seat to stop the drive and is separated from the tractor PTO, meaning the tractor can be driven at very low revs to accommodate thick hedge growth.

This might be an easy option for other makes of trimmer, like a Twose midmounted model for instance - that takes the drive from the back end via a tube inside the wing.

Nuffield 4/65. Gearbox hump is too high, so makes it hard to mount and dismount the tractor. A smaller hump would make it easier to get on and off the tractor. Gear sticks to the side, like the Leyland synchromesh transmission, would also make it easier to change gears.

Draft control is just not adequate enough, so if position control were to be added the use of three-point implements that work above ground would be much easier.

I have added a foot throttle from a Leyland 270 to mine and it is much better than the hand throttle, for road work and travelling around.

Finally the thing all 4/65 owners want is better brakes! The dry disc type are horrible and you are better slowing down with the gears than the brakes. If a wet type, similar to that used on MF 165s etc., was used, or even the band type used on the 135, braking would be much better!

# Raising the stakes

The International Harvester Company of Great Britain Ltd. enjoyed tremendous success with its Bradford-built models, but the Hi-Clear variants are not particularly common. We take a look at them.

hen the
International
Harvester
Company of Great
Britain Ltd. (IHGB)
introduced the
B-250, it was the start of big things for a
successive line of small tractors. First
produced in 1956, the B-250, known as
the Little Giant, was revolutionary in
that it had disc brakes and a differential
lock as standard.

With its 30hp, four-cylinder engine, five-speed transmission, live hydraulics

and reversible category I/II three-point linkage, the B-250 was always going to be popular, but it's hard to believe that anyone envisaged that nearly 30,000 examples would be produced before production ended in 1961.

At the heart of the B-250 was the IH BD-144 engine – with wet, replaceable sleeves, a 3%in (85.7mm) bore and 4in (101.6mm) stroke. Rated speed was a lowly 1,750rpm.

Channelling the power to the transmission was a 10-inch (254mm), single-plate clutch, with five forward

speeds and a single reverse speed available to the operator.

Largely found at the rear was a live hydraulic system with three-point linkage and in-built weigh transfer, as well as a power take-off, although these were not standard equipment and joined a long list of options, including a self-sealing hydraulic coupling, automatic pick-up hitch, swinging drawbar, downswept exhaust, wheel weights and larger tyres.

The B-250 had everything that farmers of the day could want from a

'conventional' tractor, but for those looking for more the B-275 was the answer. The newer model, introduced in 1958, had the BD-144's rated speed increased to 1,875rpm and the fuel injection system altered to produce an additional 5hp. An eight forward, two reverse transmission was a standard fitment, too.

Over time, further enhancements were added and by the end of production, in 1968, the B-275 could be specified with a 10-inch single clutch, an 11-inch (279mm) dual clutch – with 9in (229mm) PTO clutch, single- or dual-speed PTO (with a choice of speeds) and Vary-Touch hydraulics.

Just as Ferguson had produced narrow versions of the ubiquitous TE-20 for specialist applications, International realised that there was a gap in the market for those that needed a tractor to suit tall-growing crops.

By their very nature, the B-250 and B-275 were small tractors – with a ground clearance of 15%in (397mm) – and using such a machine in crops of significant height could result in damage to the plants, so the solution was to produce Hi-Clear versions of the models to aid growers. These were introduced on 8 April 1959.

The Regular B-250, for example, was fitted with 4.00x19 fronts and 10x28 rear tyres and this was the major difference between it and its Hi-Clear sibling. The taller tractor utilised 10x38 rear tyres as standard, with longer kingpins to keep the front level with the rear.

This arrangement provided 26½in (673mm) of ground clearance under the front axle and increased clearance under the rear frame by 5%in (143mm).

#### MID-MOUNTED EQUIPMENT

Increased clearance made these tractors ideal for use with sprayers and fertiliser spreaders, but it also permitted the use of mid-mounted equipment, such as hoes and ridgers. As well as those produced by implement manufacturers and specialists, IH marketed its own system for use with its tractors. The B2-1 Gloster Mid-Power Hoe could be used in conjunction with a rear-mounted B2-2 Gloster Linkage Toolbar for a complete weed control system.

Some of the options that were introduced for the B-275 throughout its production period were largely due to the introduction of the B-414 in 1961. This was a more powerful, slightly restyled version of the B-250 and B-275, using a bored out version of the earlier tractors' engine, designated the BD-154.

This was a handsome-looking machine, with off-white taking the place of silver and, in some areas, red, but it was still very much a more powerful B-250. Looks aside, the most obvious difference between the B-414 and the B-250/275 was the adoption of a heavy-duty, box construction front axle

– a departure from the tubular type used on the earlier tractors.

Getting on and off a Regular B-414 was already a hindrance, thanks to the square-cut dash panel, and this was exacerbated by the step up to the Hi-Clear derivative. More power and a new front axle were welcome additions to the Bradford design, but it was in desperate need of freshening up. Cue the

Such was the popularity of the B-275 that it remained in production for around two years after the introduction of the 434, in 1966. At 35hp it had a power output that still suited many and it made sense for IHGB to continue to offer it as an alternative to the 43hp newcomer. Production of its eventual replacement, the 37½hp 276, began in 1968.

The 276 and 434, as well as their Hi-Clear derivatives, were very much cut from the same cloth. The skid unit was the tried-and-tested four-cylinder engine married to the eight-speed transmission, with new bonnet styling that involved greater use of off-white. Gone were the wide bars of the B-275 and the fine ➤



mesh of the B-414, replaced by a simple, removeable outer grille and fine mesh inner grille to prevent chaff and the like reaching the radiator.

Vary-Touch hydraulics were now standard equipment, with two-speed flow and an isolating valve, but a single-plate clutch was also fitted unless a tick was put in the box for the dual clutch option.

On the tyre front, 5.50-16s and 11-38s were fitted, with the option of 4.00-19, 5.50-16 six-ply and 6.00-16 four- and six-ply fronts. Interestingly, the ground clearance was marginally less on the 434 Hi-Clear than its predecessors – 22¾in (578mm) under the front axle and 21½in (546mm) under the rear frame.

#### **NEED FOR SPEED**

Aside from the increased clearance that 11-38 rear tyres afforded, the other advantage was an increase in road speed. In top gear, 18.33mph was achievable with a 434 Hi-Clear – 3.3mph faster than the Regular model, but not as swift as a 434 Regular with Speed Amplifier – capable of around 21mph in 'overdrive'.

The 276 Hi-Clear was not as fast, at 17.18mph, and had fractionally less

clearance than its more powerful sibling, but it looked very similar to the 434 – with the exception of the tubular front axle.

International Harvester was keen to stress that despite the Hi-Clear configuration being ideal for work in tall-growing crops, it was equally at home undertaking 'normal' linkage and drawbar work. The driving position aided visibility and other than its height there was little to separate the Hi-Clear from the Regular.

Production of the 434 ended in 1971, following the introduction of the World Wide Series, but the 276 soldiered on until 1974. It was a popular tractor in its own right, but had also become a useful skid unit for other manufacturers – such as Braud et Faucheux (Manitou) and Whitlock.

Serial number records do not separate Hi-Clear variants from the Regular version of each of the respective models and as a result there are varying accounts of how many were produced. They are not particularly common on today's market, but you can find them for sale and they do not always command higher prices than the Regular equivalent.

Some tractors were converted to Hi-Clear configuration in later life with addition of longer kingpins and larger rear wheels, but paying attention to the tractormeter can be a good indication of whether the tractor you're look at is a genuine Hi-Clear model. The rear tyre size should be indicated, along with 'HI-CLEAR'. The serial number plate will not indicate whether it is a Hi-Clear variant.

IH collectors are particularly fond of Hi-Clear tractors, but they are a good all-round machine for work and play and a great talking point at events. ■

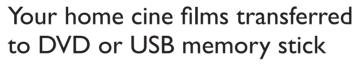

# Dropside trailers

The glory days of the dropside trailer may be confined to the history books, but thousands are still in use. We take a look at some of the popular, UK-built models.

ropside trailers were an integral part of the agricultural industry for many years and although still built today, monocoque designs account for the vast majority of sales.

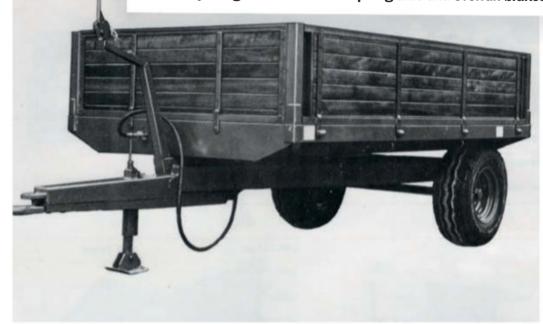
Perhaps the most famous of all the early dropside trailers is the Ferguson three-ton tipper, but examples existed long before Harry Ferguson's marketing team got to work letting the world know about the new trailer that was an integral part of the Ferguson System. In fact, the JCB story began when Joseph Cyril Bamford started his business by building a dropside trailer using surplus WW2 parts.

It's fair to say that Ferguson trailers had a profound impact on farming, with the rearward axle design allowing for significant weight transference and increased traction for additional safety, but Ferguson did not have it all his own way.

A plethora of new designs from existing and new manufacturers would follow and it's here that we look at some of the manufacturers of single-axle models that were produced during the heyday of the dropside trailer.



A S Trailers, based at Marston – near Grantham, Lincolnshire, produced a wide range of trailers in the company's traditional blue livery. This 3.5-tonne, three-way tipper was from its 'Local Authority Range' and featured a sprung axle and overrun brakes.



Foster (Farm Equipment) Ltd. produced many trailer models over the years at its facility in Beverley, North Humberside, including the Load-Master range. This was the 4.25-tonne model, with a body that tapered by four inches to allow material to flow freely out of the tailgate. The steel was finished in red, while the floor and sides were made from Keruing, finished in linseed oil.



Aberdeenshire-based Fraser Agricultural (Rothienorman) Ltd.'s single-axle dropside models in the style shown spanned four to seven-and-a-half tonnes and could be specified with floor and sides made from hardwood or steel. The F68 shown was a 4.5-tonne model with an unladen weight of 860kg.

By the 1970s, the Tye **Trailer Co. Ltd. was** among the top six trailer manufacturers in the UK. It had a reputation for quality, rather than mass production, with the company's design work undertaken by **Bill Berry. Tye** attended one major show each month. from April to September, in its heyday and would expect to take at least 20 orders for new trailers at each event. Photo: **Courtesy of Peter** Squires.

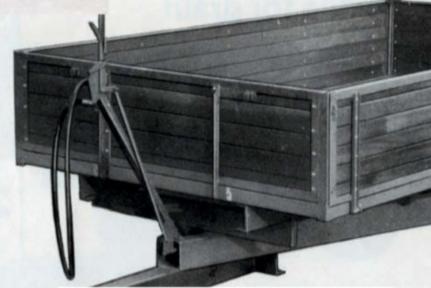




The Super Standard was a popular model for Lincolnshire-based Pettit, which by this stage was a division of the Geest Industrial Group Ltd. Tipping versions of this trailer were available in 3.75-ton and 4.5-ton guises, with five-stud axles and five axle positions. Extension sides of 18 inches (shown) and a silage kit were available to increase load capacity and versatility. Pettit also produced trailers for IHGB and Ransomes Sims & Jefferies Ltd. (above right).



T&F Equipment Ltd. had a slogan that claimed 'trailers of distinction' and it's fair to say that its 21135 and 21140 models certainly cut a dash. With striking orange steel frames and Malayan hardwood secured with galvanised nuts and bolts, these 3.5-ton and 4-ton trailers looked the business. The company was based in Sutterton, Lincolnshire.



The 5.5-tonne Wheatley Regent 'T', pictured, had a basic list price of £1,231 in November 1977, with extras such as overrun brakes and lighting costing £73 and £77 respectively. Based in Peterborough, by this time the company was known as Hestair Wheatley Ltd.

Weeks of Hull was famed for its light blue trailers with yellow wheels, but it also produced numerous models for Massey Ferguson, such as this MF 21 3.5-ton model in standard trim with the optional lighting board at the rear. In July 1970, the cheapest version of this trailer had a list price of £196-0-0.

# Feeling the Force Ford's Series 10 celebrates its 40th anniversary this year. In the second part of the series, Jonathan Whitlam looks at Force II.

**PART** 



hen Ford updated its 1000 Series tractors in 1968, the company called it the Ford Force – and for good reason, as the considerable updates it represented over the original machines certainly made it a force to be reckoned with. It went on to sell very well over the next seven years. Fast forward to 1985 and a similar

situation now existed for Ford to update Series 10. In production from 1981, as we saw in part one of this series, the original Series 10 encompassed several models,

from the little 2910 up to the 8210 and had sold very well.

However, by 1985, the quiet cabs they were fitted with had been in production since 1976 with very little, if any improvements. The Synchroshift synchromesh transmission introduced with the Series 10 tractors had suffered from a bad design of selection system and it was obvious that the range was in need of a refresh.

The result would be, perhaps, the best-looking of all Ford tractors and British farmers got to see them for the very first time at the 1985 Royal Smithfield Show.

#### **NEW FORCE**

The main thrust of the Force II upgrade to Series 10 was in the area of an improved operators' cabin, but it actually went a lot further, in that the whole Ford tractor range became part of Force II, not only the three-, four- and six-cylinder Series 10 machines, but also the big three Series TW tractors too, meaning that it encompassed tractors from the 3910 up to the mighty 195hp TW-35.

This was logical because the new Super-Q cab was included as standard on the TW tractors, as well as the 7710, 7910 and 8210 machines in the Series 10 line-up.

44 TRACTOR & MACHINERY December 2021 www.tractormagazine.co.uk A small Roman numeral 'II' was placed on either side of the bonnet on all the Force II tractors to signify the update, along with a new set of decals that brightened the models up a great deal compared to the original examples, and also lasted longer. The first Series 10 decals tended to fade pretty quickly and can look rather tatty today.

The range was rationalised somewhat when it came to the three-cylinder models offered in the UK, with the 3910 being the smallest in the price lists, although a 2910 was still offered in other markets, such as the USA. The 4110 was also not sold in the UK to begin with after the Force II upgrades were introduced, although it was later to make a comeback.

This meant that the 3910 and 4610 were the sole representatives of these smaller tractors in Force II and the 3910 was only available with the Sekurasourced LP cab while the 4610 came as standard with the slightly higher and better specification AP cab.

The four-cylinder models changed most, thanks to the top-specification option of the new Super-Q cab, although the 5610 was not offered with it to begin with. There was also a 5110 model which was not sold in Britain, as it was designed specifically for Holland and France and was based on the 5610, but fuelled to produce just 70hp.

The 6610 and 7610 could be had with either the AP or the Super-Q cab, while the 6710 was dropped completely, with the 7710 carrying on in Force II guise with the Super-Q cab as standard fitment

in the UK, despite its former uniqueness now being reduced thanks to the Super-Q cab upgrades, which meant that all the tractors so fitted now had a flat floor and gear levers mounted to the right-hand side of the driver's seat.

This resulted in the 7610 and 7710 being even more similar than before, although the 7610 had a much more compact bonnet than the higher-build 7710, making routine maintenance much easier on the latter model.

Six-cylinder wise, the 7910 and 8210 now gained the new Super-Q cab, as well as the new-look bonnet decals. The Super-Q cab suited the longer-bonneted six-cylinder tractors just as well as the smaller four-pot machines and also looked just as good on Series TW models.

#### **SUPER SUPER-Q**

The Super-Q cab, built to Ford designs by GKN Sankey – which had also supplied the earlier 'Q' cab, was more than just aesthetically pleasing though, as it consisted of a large number of improvements, including more sound-deadening material to reduce the noise level at the driver's ear.

With a flat floor and pendant-type pedals, not only was noise reduced, the driver was also more cosseted. No less than four halogen work lamps were positioned at the front of the cab roof, increasing night-time visibility enormously, and two further lamps mounted on the back of the roof gave excellent rearward lighting.

Heater and air conditioning systems were available inside the cab, which also featured a roof hatch as standard, while the cab air filters were positioned on both sides above the side windows – giving external access and reducing the risk of dust and dirt getting in the cab itself during routine cleaning. A de-luxe seat, sourced from Bostrom, was fitted and re-designed steps gave improved access to the cab.

The new design of the Super-Q cab, allowing for even the four-cylinder tractors to have two floor-mounted gear levers to the right-hand side to operate the synchromesh transmission, was a huge improvement over the original Series 10 models in almost every respect. The deletion of the awkward columnmounted gear levers of the original Series 10 went a long way to persuading back customers who had not liked the earlier machines because of this. ▶



The 64hp 4610 continued to be a popular machine after Force II was introduced. This three-cylinder, 64hp tractor was never available with the Super-Q cab and was fitted as standard with the Sekura-built AP cab.



The 5610 was originally only offered with AP or LP cabs. The smallest of the four-cylinder models to be offered in the UK, the 5610 was a 75hp machine and not many would have been fitted with a front linkage like this one.

Dual Power was also still a feature of these tractors, giving 16 forward speeds with a high or low selectable now by a foot pedal, instead of a hand-operated switch.

The Super-Q cab really was a great addition to these tractors and modernised the design a great deal, making the tractor look, as well as feel, fresh and modern. The many improvements to the tractors were therefore very well received by the farming public and a protracted advertising campaign by Ford got the

message about the new machines across well.

As the Super-Q-cab-equipped 5610, 6610 and 7610 tractors were top-specification versions, this allowed the AP cab alternative option to also include the older-style, centrally-mounted gear selectors and these tractors were certainly 'no frills' versions, allowing them to be sold at a much cheaper overall cost than the Super-Q cab machines.

The AP cab was particularly popular with livestock farmers, just as much as

the LP was in this area of usage. There was no need for all the bells and whistles when it came to a livestock machine and so the lower-priced AP option was often chosen.

With a front-opening windscreen, as well as openable rear and side windows, the AP cab was not a bad place to spend the working day, and also suited the lines of the Series 10 tractors, despite being adapted from a design Sekura also used on John Deere, David Brown, International Harvester and a few other manufacturers' tractors.



The bonnet retained the excellent access points as had been established on the original Series 10 models of 1981. Note the Roman numeral 'II' on the lower panel which, along with the new style decals, denoted the new range.

For many purchasers, the cheaper AP cab option was very attractive, as was the lower overall height. This 6610 was used for many years on a livestock farm.

The AP cab even included a roof hatch as on the Super-Q, although in reality this was actually an escape hatch and was a requirement of certain Scandinavian countries, where legislation took into account the possibility of a tractor submerging itself in a frozen lake with no other exit point other than through the roof!

The AP option was also often chosen by arable farmers too, especially on the 7610 model, as it was seen as a good enough tractor for everyday tasks around the farm.

During 1986, Ford bought farm machinery company Sperry New Holland to form Ford New Holland Inc., therefore bringing a range of forage and hay equipment, plus combine harvesters, into the Ford range for the first time. From the beginning of 1987 the Force II tractors were being produced by Ford New Holland after a reorganisation of the company structure.

#### **FINAL FORCE**

By 1987 the Series 10 Force II range was selling very well for Ford New Holland, but, towards the end of that year the first all-new model, since the Force II upgrade in 1985, arrived and it would prove to be a major turning point in the history of the Series 10 range.

This was the 7810 model, designed to fill the gap between the turbocharged,

four-cylinder 7610 and 7710 and the six-cylinder 7910, just as its model number inferred.

The 7810 was, in fact, powered by the same six-cylinder engine as the 7910, squeezed into the same-sized frame as the 7610 to provide a compact, six-cylinder, 100hp tractor.

Farmers had wanted such a tractor since the days of the original Force range of 1968, but Ford launched the 7000 in 1971 and did not want to harm sales of its turbocharged four-pot 'pocket-rocket' model by offering a six-cylinder ➤

machine of about the same power output.

This status quo continued into the era of the 7600 and then the 7610, the only other option being the taller 7700 and then the 7710, still featuring a turbocharged four-cylinder engine.

Other manufacturers were enjoying much success with compact six-cylinder machines of around 100hp when the Force II range was introduced in 1985, but still Ford did not relent on its protectionist policy.

In the end, the 7810 only appeared thanks to South Essex Motors, a

company that put a lot of time and effort into engineering and developing prototypes of the concept which, eventually Ford bought the rights to.

Thus the 7810 was launched at the Royal Smithfield Show in December 1987 and attracted a huge amount of interest from the very beginning. Production soon ramped up at Basildon and the model became the best-seller in the whole range by the end of 1988.

The 7810 was a huge success, although it proved to be the swansong of the Force II range. Progress was being made in the use of electronics in farm tractors, with

Massey Ferguson being a particular pioneer in this area, especially with the 3000 Series launched in 1986, only a year after the purely mechanical Force II range.

So, with new tweaks to the performance, as well as electronics appearing, the need to add more features to Ford's range of tractors led to Force II being replaced, in 1989, by the last incarnation of the formidable Series 10 line

Next time we will take a look at the machines that, appropriately enough, Ford dubbed Generation III. ■

## A zest for tractors

Henry Shannon has spent much of his life immersed in the world of vintage tractors. He has worked with them, restored them, preserved them and played an important part in his local vintage club. One particular tractor stands out among Henry's collection, as Willie Carson discovered.

enry Shannon's father,
William, bought his first
tractor in 1947. Enticed by
the latest technology of
the day, he invested in the
Ferguson System and
purchased a TE-20, powered by a
Continental Z120 petrol engine.

The versatile new workhorse was used for ploughing and tillage operations in the farm's cereal and potato enterprises and, with a Featherstone mid-mounted mower, mowed hay for the herd of 20 suckler cows on the slopes of the Antrim hills.

The TE-20 made way for a Standard petrol-engined TE-A 20 and soon after that a second-hand Ford 2N (Ford-Ferguson) joined the workforce. As Tractor Vaporising Oil replaced petrol as the fuel of choice for cost-conscious farmers, the Ford-Ferguson was upgraded to a TE-A 20 that had been converted to

With 20 years' experience of Ferguson tractors, it was only natural that the next move would be to a TE-D 20, registration RZ 894, built in 1954 with modern 12V electrics. A Ferguson 'bell' planter eased the backache of planting the seven or eight acres of potatoes by hand and contractors took care of the cereal harvest, carrying out the binding, threshing and baling operations.

Later on the ubiquitous 'Grey Ferguson' fleet was upgraded to Massey Ferguson 35 and 135 models, which were much more capable when paired with the implements of the '60s and '70s.

Henry went to work at Logans of Cloughmills, fitting tyres and servicing commercial vehicles, tractors and family cars. During the next 42 years he met many members of the local community in an era when there was always time for a bit of a chat with customers.

Between work at Logans and helping his father on the farm, Henry was able to observe the progress of mechanised farming and in November 1968 he acquired a tractor for himself and began to experience that development at first hand. "I used to milk cows and drive tractors on a part-time basis for a neighbouring dairy farmer called Mr. Francis Stewart. He worked with David Browns so I knew the model range well. Over that period he owned a 900, a red 770, a white 880 and a 995. They were all good, sound tractors.

"My first tractor was a 1941 David Brown VAK1 (reg DZ 7595) which had belonged to Mr. Stewart. I didn't have a proper David Brown PU1 plough with the depth wheel, so it wasn't used for much cultivation work; I used it mostly for carting hay and bringing peats home from the moss. It had done a lot of work on Mr. Stewart's farm and the engine

was well worn, so I reconditioned it with new pistons and bearings and then fitted a new clutch. Eventually I was able to swap a Ford-Ferguson plough for a David Brown PU1 plough."

In 1971 Henry added to his collection when he purchased a 1943 Ford 2N and shortly afterwards a petrol-engined 1939 Ford 9N with its distinctive, early rear wheel hubs, appeared in his shed. It needed a rebuild and was running well but, during some particularly frosty weather, disaster struck when a crack appeared in the block.

#### **TRANSPLANT**

Seeing opportunity in adversity, Henry, his brother-in-law, William Anderson and local Perkins engine expert, John Fleming, decided to convert the tractor to diesel power by fitting a Perkins P3 engine.

A P3 that had previously powered an air compressor was acquired and, with the flywheel from another, well-worn P3 from a previous tractor conversion, the unit was installed in Henry's tractor.

This common conversion was usually characterised by a high bonnet line, which is not to everyone's taste, so William Anderson put his considerable fabrication skills to good use, recessing the base of the fuel tank such that it straddled the rocker cover and allowed the tractor to retain its original, compact proportions.

Growing up with post-war tractors, meeting the farmers who used them during the expansion of agriculture in that period and collecting a few examples of the more significant models in the development of the tractor, Henry had seen mechanised farming from different viewpoints.

In 1981 fellow enthusiasts in the locality formed the Cloughmills Vintage

Club with Henry and his father among the founding members and soon their annual rally became a popular fixture on the Northern Ireland event calendar.

Working displays at the event included a threshing mill, a barn thresher, barn fans to winnow the seed and a demonstration of straw battling, a technique used before the advent of the baler whereby an armful of straw was gathered from the back of the thresher and deftly twisted into a knot for storage and handling during the winter.

The club also hosts an autumn ploughing day, usually held on harvested potato fields. The popularity of the event was such that they even arranged for a chip van to do the catering at lunch time. These re-enactments of old farming practices showed that the club was interested in putting its vintage machinery to work, so the members soon caught the attention of professional video producer, John Thompson.

John was planning an hour-long film, entitled *A Taste of Farming Life*, in which

he would show the techniques used to grow potatoes in the pre-war, post-war and modern times. That exciting period of development in agricultural mechanisation during the 1950s was re-enacted by the members of the club with Henry's David Brown VAK1, his Ford-Ferguson and his father's TE-D 20 all playing their part for the camera, tilling the ground and spinning out the crop of spuds.

The result is a permanent record of our farming heritage; available for the education of younger generations and the Cloughmills Vintage Club can be proud of the part it played in its production.

Various other tractors passed through Henry's hands, including two Fordson E27N Majors, a Power Major and a Nuffield 460 into which he transplanted a six-cylinder BMC diesel engine from a council gritter lorry.

He was keeping his eye out for a Ford 5000 when a customer called Gordon Stewart called in at the tyre depot. ➤

During conversation he happened to mention that he had a Nuffield 4/65 that might be for sale. Henry went to see it, agreed a price and the deal was done.

Introduced at the 1948 Smithfield Show, the Nuffield M4 tractor was a new venture into the agricultural market for Morris Motors. Powered by a side-valve engine, taken from the company's commercial vehicle division and converted to run on TVO, the tractor was rated at 38hp and with five forward gears, it made an impressive alternative to the Ferguson TE-A 20 or the Fordson E27N.

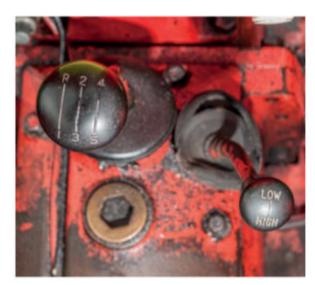
Dressed in handsome Poppy Orange tinwork, the Nuffield M4 certainly caught the attention of the forward-thinking farmer. By the early 1950s diesel was accepted as the tractor fuel of the future and the DM4 appeared, initially powered by a Perkins four-cylinder engine which was superseded by a BMC diesel engine of 3.4-litre capacity.

#### **UPGRADES**

In 1961 the engine's cylinder bore was increased, taking the swept volume up to 3.77 litres and pushing power output up to 57.5hp. This new model, the 4/60, was offered in 'Standard' and 'Deluxe' forms, with the latter featuring independent power take-off (iPTO) and a new hydraulic system incorporating draft control.

In 1964 Nuffield continued to offer a realistic alternative to the recognised market leaders from Massey Ferguson, Fordson and David Brown when it introduced the 10/60 model. By adding a high/low option in each gear, the new tractor boasted 10 forward and two reverse gears and 57.5hp.

This same year both MF and Ford showed their development capabilities



**10** forward gears and two reverse were available to the operator.



The business end of the 4/65 differed from its predecessor, thanks to a change of hydraulic pump from Dowty to Plessey and an increase in lift capacity to 3,350lb.

when they launched their new and comprehensive model ranges, the 'Red Giants' and the '6X' Series respectively, offering the latest features wrapped up in a modern, stylish package with a tractor for every customer's needs. Nuffield had to respond.

At the Smithfield Show in 1967, the new 4/65 indicated Nuffield's intention to compete for its share of the market. Engine development had increased power output to 65hp, enough to keep up with the likes of the pre-Force Ford 5000.

Further upgrades included optional power steering and a new dual-chamber hydraulic system, which increased pressure to 2,600psi and lift capacity to 3,350lb. The revamp allowed the designers to move the fuel tank and the battery to the front of the engine, creating a cleaner bonnet line and vastly improving access to the driver's seat.

Modern styling replaced the ageing tinwork, which had maintained the family resemblance since it first appeared on the M4 at the end of the 1940s, but it was to be the last generation to bear the famous name.

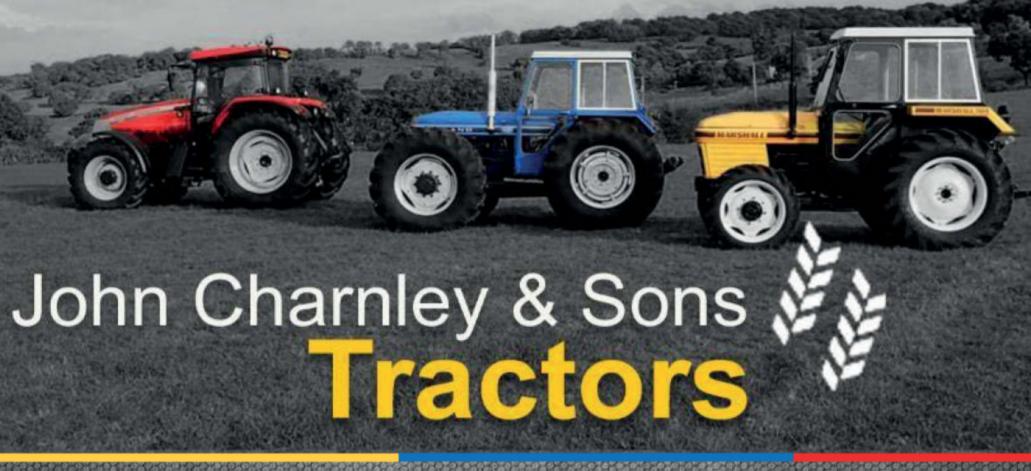
In 1968, British Leyland was formed, bringing some of Britain's largest vehicle manufacturers together in what was supposed to be a rationalisation process. For Nuffield, the most visible consequences of this merger were a restyle, a new colour scheme in blue and silver and a new name; 'Leyland'. The 4/65 was to herald the end of an era.

Henry brought his Nuffield 4/65 home complete with a loader and cab, both of which he removed, revealing a very well maintained example of this historically important model. Changing the water pump and replacing the brake friction plates brought the tractor back to proper working order.

Henry keeps the tinwork clean and coats it occasionally with light oil to preserve that original patina. Not content to stand back and admire his purchase from a distance, Henry regularly climbs up behind the steering wheel and puts the Nuffield to work when it is time to make hay. The grass is cut with a Claas drum mower and tedded several times before the International B-46 baler completes the field operations, all of which are well within the tractor's capabilities.

He has also used it at the club's ploughing day, pulling a David Brown three-furrow plough. Since he enjoys taking part in the various charity tractor road runs in the locality, Henry has unbolted the standard tyres (11-36 rears and 6.00-16 fronts) and purchased a second-hand set of Ford rims from the early 1990s, shod with 420/85 R34 rears and wider 7.50in front tyres.

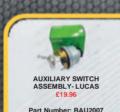
Henry has played his part in keeping the interest in our agricultural heritage alive. He has worked in the background to make sure that the tractors are the main focus of attention, ensuring that history will live on for the next generation.

### Ivel stars

t the Shuttleworth Trust's
Vintage Weekend, held on
4-5 September near
Bedford, a low-key event for
vintage enthusiasts took
place on the Saturday to be
followed by the annual flying show on the
Sunday, says Peter Love.

At one of its first appearances since its October 2019 sale, as the highest-priced veteran tractor sold in Europe, was the 1903 Ivel, no. 131. The pioneering tractor was coupled to a rare Clayton & Shuttleworth saw bench, which it ran during the show.

The 'Power Farmer Tractor Collection', the earliest known veteran tractor collection, was kept at Old Warden (Shuttleworth College) in the mid 1950s. The Shuttleworth family legacy lives on and all that pioneer Richard Shuttleworth



did for vehicle (tractor, steam and cars) and aeronautical preservation should never be forgotten.

He was also a very successful Bugatti and Alfa Romeo racing driver at Brooklands and the winner of the prestigious 1935 Donington Park Grand Prix. In 1936 he had a bad racing accident in South Africa and was made to retire by his mother, but not from flying. It was here that his pioneering veteran planes were the stars at various flying shows in the 1930s.

In the early hours of 2 August 1940 he took off in an RAF Fairey Battle light bomber for a cross-country training exercise, but it crashed into a hill at nearby Ewelme and he was killed. His mother, Dorothy, who lost her husband early in their marriage, never got over Richard's death, but made sure their legacy would live on. ■

### Tractor Day at Bredgar

he Bredgar & Wormshill

'Tractor Day' on Sunday 5

largest ever crowd on the

The railway is open from the first Sunday in May to October and features different themes each month. 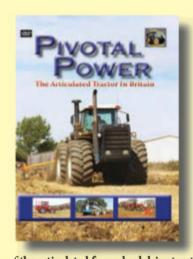

# Suffolk working day



fter being unable to hold a working event last year, due to reasons that we are all very familiar with, I decided, with support from Blue Force member James Forrest once again, that Blue Force should hold another working day in 2021, writes Pete Earl.

This would be promoted as a public event on the understanding that it may need to be cancelled at short notice if Government restrictions came into force regarding Covid-19. So, the date and charities were decided at the beginning of July and the land earmarked. Planning and promotion of the Ford event of the year was once again underway at one of the busiest times of the year.

A lot of interest was initially generated with enquiries for exhibitors coming in

from as far afield as Devon, Hampshire and Warwickshire, along with the 'regulars' that faithfully support the event each year.

As also seen at the 2019 event, there appears to be a growing trend where we see less and less of the vintage exhibits with small conventional ploughs, and more of the classics with four-, five- or six-furrow ploughs on the working scene. Luckily, this year we had approximately 100 acres of stubble at our disposal, should we need it on the day.

Ernest Doe & Sons was also keen to help and supported me with the arrangements and publicity for the event. The company brought along a hospitality trailer and several tractors, both new and classic, including a T6 in the heritage colours, T7.315 HD Blue

Power and a standard T6, along with a Doe 130 and a very nice Ford 9700.

The company also generously supplied a gas BBQ as a raffle prize to accompany various tractor models and additional prizes kindly donated by New Holland Agriculture, Blue Force, K&M Tyres and Shelbourne Reynolds, which came along for the day to show off the new 7060 hedge trimmer and FBO2800 frontmounted flail mower. K&M tyres were on hand during the day in case of any punctures – which was lucky as we needed to call upon their services on three occasions – we've never had any punctures on previous working days we have held!

Once again, we were blessed with fine, dry weather on the Sunday and wall-to-wall sunshine – the exceptional temperatures for the time of year making for a great day out. The only downside that this was probably one of the best days in at least the past four weeks, which meant that several of the working exhibits had to withdraw to carry on with a late harvest and also to make the most of the weather to get next year's crops planted.

There were still around 40 tractors on the day – a combination of both working and static exhibits. We had a few different working exhibits making an appearance this year, including two Roadless 90s, a Northrop and the unique 'Mini D' (see *T&M* July 2021) which was built and is owned by Michael Moore.

It was also great to see the return of an FW-30 to the field, pulling a Dowdeswell nine-furrow, semi-mounted plough – it was great to hear the bark of the

Cummins V8 engine as the tractor worked in what turned out to be some hard ground conditions.

Stalwarts of the Fordson tractor range included a selection of Majors, whilst conversions were well represented by Northrop, Roadless and County. We also saw a Ransomes MG crawler at work and a restored Ford Transit Mk2 dropside in the line-up with static tractors. Blue Force is not just about tractors, but also encompasses Ford's commercial vehicles.

The day would not have been the success it was without the support and generosity of both what seemed like the endless stream of public that turned up to watch and support the event, and of course the exhibitors that brought their tractors along, some of whom had travelled a great distance at considerable personal expense to join in with the day, especially Ben who trailered his impressive 8730 and plough all the way down from Warwickshire - now that's dedication!

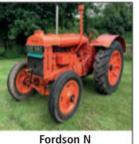

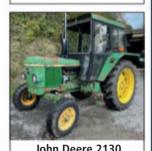

## 70 years of success

he 70th British National Ploughing Championships, at Mindrum Mill, Northumberland, on 9-10 October, was a great success - according to the organisers, the Society of Ploughmen.

The site covered almost 300 acres in 14 different fields and was kindly loaned by D Harvey and Son. Visitors and competitors travelled from all over the country, as the event had been postponed for a year due to Covid-19 and was one of the few shows to be held in the area this year.

With the two previous Championships ending in a good few inches of mud, the same fear came to mind earlier in the week when torrential rain stopped all organisation on the site for a day. It did, however, dry well and everything then

went to plan and with mostly good weather over the weekend, it had made the hard land a little better to plough for the competitors.

First-time plougher in the British Championships, Brian Baxter, from Forfar, Angus, was the winner of the Reversible Final with 300 points, ploughing with a Massey Ferguson tractor and Kverneland plough. He beat Peter Alderslade from Gateshead, Tyne & Wear, by eight points – a good win, as Peter has won the title eight times before. Alan Critchlow from Scropton, Derbyshire came third with 277 points.

Ashley Boyles, from Market Rasen in Lincolnshire, won the Conventional Final for the fifth time, also ploughing with a Massey Ferguson tractor and Kverneland plough. Ashley won by a whisker as he had amassed the same points as Stuart

Vickers from Sarn, near Malpas in Cheshire.

They both had 258 points, but rather than a tied place there is a 'countback' system in place where the aspects are worked back in a certain order to find the winner. Ashley won by having higher points in the general appearance of his ploughing.

In third place, 12 points behind, was Evan Watkin from Newtown, Powys, who was unable to keep hold of the title he had won in 2019.

The Vintage Trailing Plough-Off Final was won by another Lincolnshire man, John Crowder, who lives at Sturton by Stow, near Lincoln, ploughing with a Fordson N tractor and Ransomes RSLD Major plough. With 251 points, he had a 10-point lead from past British, European and World Vintage Ploughing Champion,

As well as the sight of some of Britain's best ploughmen and women in action, visitors were treated to the spectacle of steam ploughing.

John Milnes, from Penistone, South Yorkshire, who in turn was 10 points ahead of Trevor Johnstone from Wigton in Cumbria.

In the Vintage Hydraulic Final, Charlie Nicklin from Congleton, Cheshire, used his Massey Ferguson 35 and Ransome TS54 with great effect to gain 258 points, three points ahead of Richard Ingram from Atherstone, Warwickshire, who had been the reigning champion. In third place was John Sivewright from Blairgowrie, Perthshire, with 238 points.

David Thomlinson from Escrick, North Yorkshire, retained his title when he won the Classic Final for the second time. David was driving a Ford 3000 (Force) tractor pulling a Ransomes TS86 conventional plough and he received 248 points, giving him a four-point lead from Mac Simpson of Garstang, Lancashire. In

third place was David Hankey from Wrexham.

The scores over the two days are aggregated to find the champions for the Horse Ploughing and the High Cut Tractor Ploughing. The High Cut Tractor ploughing champion was Ray Alderson from Darlington, County Durham, ploughing with a Ford 3000 and a Ransomes RSLD No. 9 plough. Second place went to John Saunders from Carlisle, Cumbria.

The plots of the winners of the five Plough-Off Finals, the High Cut tractor champion and the Horse ploughing champion are then judged to find the Supreme Champion and this award was given to Ashley Boyles, who won the title in 2017.

Commenting afterwards, Sue Frith, Chief Executive of the Society of

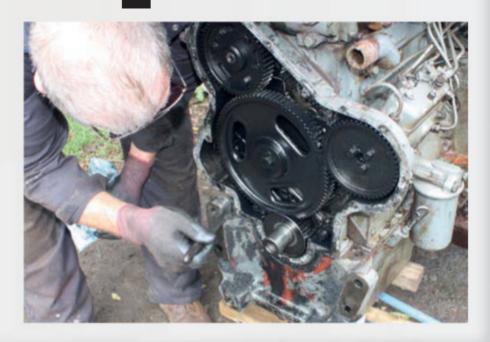

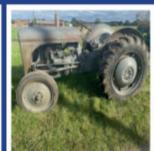

### **MF 35X**

Andrew Hall and Barrie Everson change a leaking crankshaft oil seal on a neighbour's MF 35X and equip the tractor with a brand-new, cutter-bar hedge trimmer.



y neighbours
have a Massey
Ferguson 35X
that they use
with a six-foot
Votex topping mower in their
field, and until recently they
have been maintaining their
hedges with the use of a

hedge cutter.

As their hedges have matured, this has become a difficult task to cope with, and they were looking for a suitable hedge cutter, of the reciprocating knife variety, to mount on their tractor.

There are various makes and models of hedge cutters to suit smaller tractors on the market, and the chosen machine was an Italian-built Frontoni Fly, which mounts on the three-point linkage and features its own PTOdriven hydraulic pump and oil reservoir.

Having acquired the cutter they approached me to set the machine up on their 35X, but before doing so we decided to give the tractor a complete service, as it hadn't been done for many moons! This included the usual engine and transmission oil and necessary filter changes, and also, as autumn is upon us, the anti-freeze too.

Before undertaking any servicing the tractor was given a thorough power wash to remove the build-up of grime that had accumulated, as the engine in particular was covered in a thick coating of black greasy grime, the reason becoming apparent once the service had been carried out.

#### **CRANKSHAFT OIL SEAL**

Once complete, the tractor was run up to check for any leaks, which may have been created when replacing the engine oil and fuel filters. We hadn't created any leaks ourselves, but oil was running at quite a rate from the front crankshaft oil seal, beneath the crankshaft pulley. Such was the amount we decided that the seal should be replaced immediately.

Fortunately, the leaking seal was noticed before we had mixed and replaced the coolant, so after removing the bonnet to gain access to the engine, the cooling system was drained down, and the strength of the anti-freeze looked poor, so it was well overdue for some fresh.

After the coolant had been drained, the radiator was removed by slackening and removing the two nuts and washers from their studs on the base of the unit, together with the top and bottom hose clips and stay bar at the top, which attaches to the engine to keep the radiator in place. The hoses were retained for further use.

#### **Draining coolant**

After removing the bonnet, the first task was to drain down the old coolant, which was rather dirty and overdue a change!



#### Off with the axle

The axle needed to be removed to gain access to the front of the engine. This involved removing the front casting bolts, steering drag links and foot rests to free the radius arms.



#### **Jacked & supported**

Blocks and an axle stand were used to safely support the tractor whilst the water pump and timing cover were removed as one unit to save disturbing the pump gasket.



#### **Crankshaft pulley**

The bolt was removed and the pulley extracted using a pair of pry bars to lever it away from the crankshaft.

#### **FRONT AXLE**

The next task was to remove the front axle to gain access to the front of the engine and the timing cover. The tractor was safely supported, using suitable axle stands and blocks under the engine, whilst the bolts of the front centre casting, the rear steering ball joints and the foot rests were all removed.

A ball joint splitter can be used to separate the ball joints, but a blow from a pair of hammers opposite sides of each joint soon had them free, after which the whole axle was wheeled forward away from the tractor.

#### **WATER PUMP**

On the Perkins A3.152 engine, the water pump is attached to the timing cover and can be removed to separate it from the cover, but we decided to leave it in place, which meant we only had to slacken the hose clips of the bypass and transfer hoses, which then came away with the pump and timing cover as one unit. This saved disturbing the water pump gasket!

#### **CRANKSHAFT PULLEY**

Next was the crankshaft pulley. The tractor was put into gear and the brakes applied whilst a suitable socket was applied to the bolt, which in our case wasn't very tight! A pair of pry bars was then used to extract the pulley from the crankshaft. The timing cover bolts were removed, along with the top left water pump bolt, which secures through to the rear timing cover, which then allowed the cover to be carefully levered away without stressing the aluminium.

#### **AXLE BUSHES**

We noticed that at some point the single axle bush had been replaced with two, which is a good thing, but in this case both were loose in the axle, so this was dealt with before the axle was refitted to the tractor.

#### **CLEANED UP**

With the cover removed, the gasket face and the inside of the timing case was cleaned up, along with the cover. The pulley seal face was also cleaned up using emery cloth to ensure it was smooth for the new seal.

A very slight groove was detected, so the new seal was tapped into the timing cover in a different position to allow for this. The tractor >

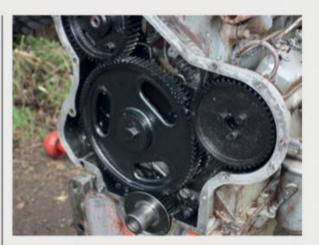

was then reassembled in the reverse order of dismantling, using a fresh gasket on the timing cover.

#### **HEDGE CUTTER**

The hedge cutter arrived screwed to a pallet, so the tractor was reversed up to it and the machine attached to the three-point linkage, and then detached from the pallet. It was then raised on the linkage to a suitable height using position control and the PTO pump attached to the PTO shaft and secured with the chain supplied.

Stay bars to control lateral sway were necessary, and as the tractor didn't have any brackets, these were purchased and fitted. To support the cutter at the desired height it was also necessary to use a pair of Ferguson drawbar stays attached either side of the top link bracket, using a drawbar pin for extra length.

Doing this allowed the position lever to be lowered and the hedge cutter supported on the linkage, rather than the hydraulic system. The extra rigidity was necessary to ensure accurate control of the hedge cutter whilst in work.

A bracket was made and fitted to the left-hand mudguard to support the

hedge cutter's bank of control levers.

The cutting mechanism is powered by a hydraulic motor, which requires more oil flow than the tractor could supply (38 litres/minute), so this is why the Fly model was chosen, as it features its own oil supply and pump.

The whole assembly sits neatly on the back of the tractor and the cutter bar clears the rear wheel when it is lowered, so no contact with the wheel is possible. The cutter has a good reach to cope with high hedges and with the control levers mounted on the left-hand mudguard they are

convenient for the operator to use.

To operate the hydraulic motor at the correct speed for blade operation, the PTO needs to be run at 540rpm, which is developed at 1,500erpm on the MF 35X, and first gear in low ratio used for cutting.

First trials with the cutter are promising, meaning that all the hard work of using a hand-held hedge cutter will be a thing of the past. The only downside of reciprocating cutters is the clearing up necessary when compared with a flail unit, but the finish of the hedges should be neat!

Now back together, the engine was run up and no signs of any leaks were apparent, so another successful job completed.



#### **Hedge cutter fitted**

The new Frontoni hedge cutter is now fitted and ready to go, parked alongside one of the hedges it'll be used to maintain.



#### **Neatly folding**

The cutter folds very neatly onto the rear of the 35X and the cutter bar clears the rear wheel safely when in the folded position.



#### **Self-contained**

The machine is self-contained and features its own oil supply and PTO-driven oil pump to provide for manoeuvring the arms and powering the cutter bar.



#### Stay bars

Note the use of Ferguson drawbar stays to support the cutter at a suitable height and enable the hydraulic system to be lowered.

The PTO pump was attached and prevented from rotating by using a chain and 'D' shackle secured to the tractor.



#### Low height

A low folded height enables the hedge cutter to pass under relatively low clearances and is extremely compact!

# MF 17 trailer rebuild part 6

Andrew Hall continues with the repair to the trailer hand brake lever using metal that was lying around.



ou may recall me dismantling the seized hand brake lever in the last issue. Although it would seem a straightforward task to undertake its repair, it has taken a while to complete.

The problem was that the plastic button had seized in the tube of the handle, and when dismantled I discovered that the push rod had corroded badly and when provoked the button broke off, leaving the rod floating unattached at the top of the tube.

#### **NEW ROD**

I measured the diameter of the broken rod and then took a search around for a suitable piece of steel rod to replace it, and came upon a piece of similar-diameter steel in the form of an old rod left over from my Fordson Elite plough project, which was completed last year.

The hand brake rod has a 90-degree bend at its end, where it passes through the ratchet pawl lever that locates inside the lever body. I replicated this by heating the end of the rod whilst held in a vice and gently tapped it into shape with a ball-pein hammer.

#### **SUBTLE BENDS**

There were very subtle bends in the original rod, to allow it to clear the pawl inside the lever body, so the fresh steel was marked in the appropriate positions and the bends formed in the vice before comparing and cutting the fresh rod to the desired length.

#### **BUTTON**

The original button was made of black plastic and had split, so reusing this wasn't an option. I measured the diameter, which was ½-inch and found an old bolt of the same diameter from which to make a new button. The thread was cut off the bolt shank and the head placed in the lathe and faced off with a standard lathe tool, followed

by the use of a centre drill to mark for drilling out the centre hole, which was to be threaded M5 to enable it to be screwed onto the new rod.

A look in my Zeus workshop data book showed the tapping drill diameter to be 4.2mm, so the tapping hole was drilled to about 8mm deep to give plenty of thread for the rod to screw into.

To ensure that the thread was tapped straight, I placed an M5 tap into the lathe tailstock and started the thread, which was then completed by holding the button in the vice, taking care not to wreak the tap as I progressed!

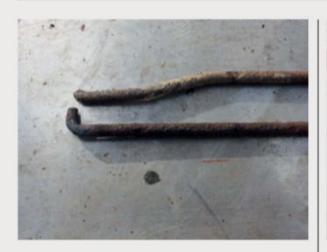
#### **Fresh rod**

A fresh operating rod will be made from one left over from my Fordson Elite plough project last year.



#### **Heating the rod**

In order to bend it close to its end, the steel rod was heated with the oxy-acetylene torch and tapped to form a 90-degree bend.



#### **Subtle bends**

There are some subtle bends in the original rod to replicate on the new piece of rod, to allow it to clear the ratchet pawl.



#### In shape

After marking the new rod it was slightly bent to match the original, before cutting it to the desired length.



#### **Plastic button**

The button had been seized in the lever tube and is split, so won't be reused. A steel button will be made to suit.

The next stage was to cut off the bolt head and form the opposite end of the button to create a radius.

#### THREADING THE ROD

The top end of the rod was then threaded to match the button thread using an M5 die and diestock. With this complete I then tried fitting the newly-made rod and button into the lever tube.

Although the new button measured the same ½-inch as the original plastic button it seemed too tight to fit into the tube, so I placed it back in the lathe and skimmed a small amount off the outer

diameter, allowing it to slide in and out nicely.

The ratchet pawl was inserted with the new rod in place and the pivot hole lined up with the lever body and a clevis pin fitted using a washer and fresh split pin. The button was attached and the movement checked.

#### MISSING SPRING?

I seems apparent that the lever assembly is missing a compression spring that returns the button to its outer position. When dismantled there was no evidence of a spring, so no attempt was made to fit one. However, a

spring is necessary to act between the base of the button and the tubular lever body, but there's nothing inside the tube for the spring to bear against.

I will have to obtain a suitable length of compression spring and fit it, and to retain the spring at its lower end I'll have to drill a small hole and insert a small domed-headed rivet for the spring to press against. Meanwhile I have trial fitted the repaired lever and it will work well once the spring has been fitted and enable the parking brakes to work once again.

#### **FURTHER WORK**

Further work on the trailer will involve repainting the chassis in the earlier Massey Ferguson red and the wheels in yellow, which will require suitable weather. Once this is complete the trailer floor needs to be replaced, preferably in a similar hardwood to that used when it was built.

The price and availability may dictate the rate of progress of the project, but I'd like to finish the trailer as originally as I can, and not skimp on materials, so this may be the last feature covering the project for a while!



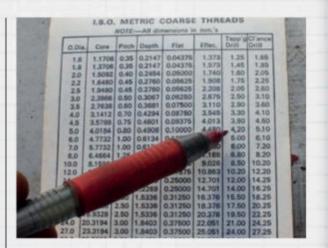
#### **Old bolt**

An old bolt, of the same diameter as the button, was found sitting around, so will be used to provide the steel for the button.



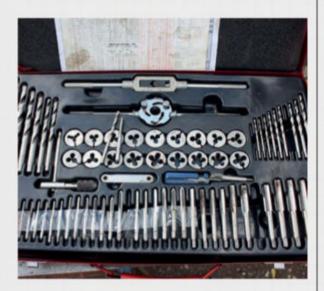
#### Lathe

After cutting off the thread, the bolt shank was placed in the lathe, faced off and centre drilled ready for a tapping drill.



#### M5 tapping drill

The correct tapping drill for an M5xo.8 pitch is 4.2mm diameter, as shown here in my Zeus workshop data book.



### Tap & die set

A tap and die set, such as this, is invaluable in the workshop. Many of the threads I deal with are imperial, such as BSF/BSW and UNF/UNC.



### **Tapping the thread**

After lining the tap up in the lathe, the thread was hand-tapped using an M5 tap and tap wrench.



### Threading the rod

An M5xo.8mm die in a diestock was used to create a thread on the replacement rod after it was cut to length.



#### **Nearly there**

The new button and rod are screwed together to check their fit before attempting to insert them into the lever housing.



#### Reassembly

The operating rod has to be inserted through the bottom of the housing before screwing the button into place.



### **Trial fitting**

It was then fitted as a trial and will work well once a return spring is fitted inside the handle tube (see text).

# Experts' advice

# **Massey Ferguson 203**

I am in the throes of building my own house and being a tractor enthusiast I have bought an old Massey Ferguson 203 digger/loader to dig out the footings and use as a general workhorse throughout the building project.

Owning this machine has sparked extra interest in them and Massey Ferguson construction equipment in general. I have been made aware of other similar industrial Massey Ferguson tractors, such as the 702 and 205 models, which to the casual eye look very similar.

Can you explain the differences (if any) between the varying models, and any other information on the loaders and diggers? I am keen to know!

The introduction of the industrial digger/loader tractors dates back to the late 1950s, when MF introduced the Davis backactors and front-mounted

loaders. These were designed to be fitted to the 35 and 65 tractor skid units and could be retrospectively fitted to existing tractors.

However, MF saw a market for complete machines and many digger/loaders were sold as a complete package, based on either the 35 or 65 power units and finished in MF industrial yellow. The early Massey Ferguson 35 tractors featured the Standard 23C diesel engine and industrial tractors thus fitted were known as the 702.

In 1959 MF bought Perkins engines and thereafter the Perkins A3.152 engine was offered and the Perkins-powered machines were re-designated 203. An alternative transmission from the standard six-speed gearboxes was also introduced in the form of the torque converter transmission (or instant reverse) giving four forward and four reverse speeds, and this was offered as the 205 model.

The larger 65 tractor was offered in industrial guise as the 65R or 65S model, the former having the instant reverse transmission, whilst the 65S retained the six-speed standard transmission.



## **Nuffield Universal**

We've had a Nuffield 4DM tractor for many years, using it as a stationary power unit on a saw bench. In recent months we have moved it and started using it on the road for bringing in timber from the woods.

The tractor has a good road speed, but unfortunately the brakes don't match the pulling efficiency! We removed one of the brake covers and a brake drum, only to find the brake contaminated in gear oil. Is it an easy task to strip the brake units and replace the oil seals behind the brakes? We intend to keep the tractor, as it is in otherwise good working order.

Access to the oil seals is easy once you have stripped the brake units from the tractor. As the drum brakes serve as parking brakes too, you'll need to chock the rear wheels to prevent the tractor rolling and causing an accident whilst you are working on it.

Once the brake back plates are removed, the oil seals can be seen in the centre recess. These can be removed using a suitable pry bar and the area around cleaned up and degreased before fitting the new seals. Make sure the new seals are tapped in squarely to ensure an oil-tight seal.

As your brakes have been contaminated by oil, you'll need to replace the brake linings on your brake shoes and degrease the brake drums before refitting them.



## **Ford 2000**

I have recently acquired an early Ford 2000 tractor and my intention is to restore it to its original condition.
Until now I have had little to do with Ford tractors, my previous experience

being with Massey Ferguson machines, and as such my knowledge of them is limited and I am still learning as I go.

One question I have relates to the colour of the mudguards, as since my ownership I have been observing examples of Ford tractors displayed at the limited number of tractor shows around this year, and I've seen tractors with both blue and light grey mudguards, my question being, which is the correct colour?

This also seems to apply to the larger and more common 3000 models too. I have been working on my tractor, which dates from 1966, during the lockdown period and it is nearly ready for its new paintwork, so an answer to this would be most welcome. Many thanks.

From the year of your tractor it appears to be a pre-Force (6X) model,

which predates the 1968 update when the Ford range became known as the Ford Force (6Y) range, hence the pre-Force name applied in retrospect to the earlier models!

Although the colour scheme of the 6X and 6Y tractors was commonly blue with grey mudguards and wheels, strangely, both the 2000 and 3000 tractors appeared with blue mudguards, whilst the 2000 also had a blue wraparound grille, presumably to differentiate between the 2000 and 3000 models.

Your tractor therefore should have blue mudguards and a blue grille too. The 2000 is a less common model than the 3000 and a very desirable tractor to have in a collection!

### **International 574**

The hand brake of my International 574 has packed up working after many years of regular use. It has been adjusted on a few occasions, but now it has reached it limit. The operating cable goes into the rear transmission housing on the left-hand side, and I suspect the actual brake mechanism is inside.

My question is how difficult a task is it to strip, inspect and replace anything that requires new parts? Is it a job I can accomplish at home, or should I employ somebody with experience of these tractors?

International 574
tractors have a
contracting band hand
brake, which is located on the



output shaft of the gearbox, forward of the differential unit. The output shaft carries a brake drum, which is splined to the shaft and has the contracting band, located around the outside. This is anchored one end and connects to the operating cable the other end. The cable passes through the housing and up to the hand brake lever.

It isn't a difficult task to do

the job, but easier accomplished by removing the hydraulic top cover of the tractor, as merely removing the sidemounted inspection cover doesn't provide much room to manoeuvre inside the housing.

To do this you'll need to remove the tractor seat and any metalwork in the form of covers over the top of the hydraulic cover, together with any relevant plumbing and

linkages. Once the cover is clear the layout of the hand brake will be clear to see and the task of changing the worn band not difficult.

I would, however, recommend a workshop manual to assist you. An official IH manual covering the 574 model would be ideal, but an alternative manual is an I&T IH-203, which will also be helpful.

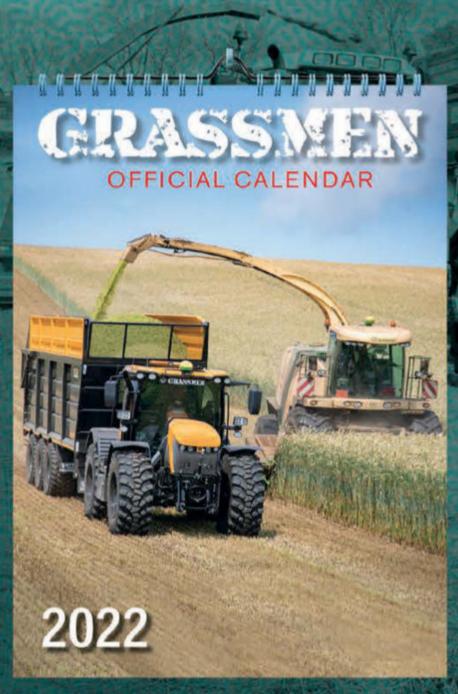

# 780 rescue part 15

Just when Andrew Hall thought he was ready to get some paint on, a decision was made to undertake some further preparation, which brought some problems!



rogress was looking good in the previous issue of *Tractor & Machinery*, when I began preparing the rear wheel rims for their fresh coats of paint.

As always, the weather plays a significant part in the progress of our projects, and I was hoping to get the paint applied before it turns too damp and wet.

Hopefully, this will still be the case, but one other task has sprung up, with the suggestion that the front axle should be stripped and dismantled to allow any future adjustments to the track width to be made easily and without damaging the fresh paintwork.

#### **VERY RUSTY**

Looking at the axle externally it didn't look too bad condition wise, so we set about slackening the axle bolts that secure each outer axle section to the centre beam. What should have been a relatively easy operation turned into a bit of a nightmare.

The outer sections are a snug fit in the centre section at best, and the right-hand side came out without too much effort required, with both bolts (or setscrews) unscrewing with no difficulty. The outer section only required a bit of tapping from a soft mallet to free it off. However, the left-hand side was a completely different story.

#### **SHEARED BOLTS**

Barrie applied reasonable pressure to the first setscrew, which promptly sheared off flush with the centre section of the axle casing. Any time a bolt or setscrew shears brings with it some misery and the thoughts that the job is going to be hard to accomplish, and my heart immediately sunk at the thoughts of have to remove the sheared shank of the screw.

It was, however going to be a double whammy for us, as I then attempted to slacken the remaining setscrew, only to shear this one myself! Looking at the broken setscrews I think the reason they sheared relatively easily was due to the thread being cut right up to the screw heads, leaving the shanks weak.

If they had been bolts (only threaded partly along the shank) they would have been stronger and less likely to break.

#### **AXLE REMOVAL**

With the prospect of having to drill out the broken setscrews, with a drill held horizontally being rather difficult, we thought we'd set about removing the whole axle to enable us to drill vertically and more comfortably than with it in situ.

To remove the axle on the 780, the core plug at the front of the pivot pin needs ➤

#### The easy part

Off to an easy start, as the right-hand outer axle section comes out with no difficulty, but that's as far as 'easy' went!



#### **Internal rust**

Although the axle looked clean on the outside, there is evidence of plenty of rust between the axle sections to deal with.



#### **Heat applied**

The left-hand setscrews were tight, so some heat was used to attempt to free them off, but then...



#### **Disaster strikes!**

... whilst attempting to remove the left-hand side, both setscrews were sheared off, as they must have been weak under their heads, due to a full thread.



### **Core plug**

We attempted to remove the whole axle to facilitate drilling the broken screws out vertically rather than horizontally, as it's easier, so out came the core plug!

to be removed. This was achieved by drilling a hole in its centre and screwing in a self-tapping screw, and using it as a puller with a nail bar to pull it out.

This was the easy part, as the pivot pin is then supposed to be withdrawn through the front. A 1/16 UNC thread is cut into the forward end of the pivot pin to facilitate removal, but it wouldn't budge. No amount of levering on a suitable bolt inserted into the pin would bring it out.

A desperate move then was to make up a slide hammer. using the aforementioned bolt. and attempt to use the extra effort this would provide, but still to no avail! It was getting late in the day, so we left the job until we could approach it with more enthusiasm.

The only other course of action was to use some heat from the oxy-acetylene torch, as we suspected the pin was fused to the axle centre section with rust. There was no measurable wear in the outer bush, so we assumed the tolerance was tight between the axle and the pin.

After further unsuccessful attempts at removing the pin, we decided to abandon removal and try and drill out

the broken setscrews horizontally.

Each screw was centrally punched to enable us to pilot drill through the shanks and open up with successive larger drills until the desired size was achieved. The outer setscrew needed to be drilled from both ends – one being the threaded portion, which was slightly exposed.

After a successful drilling session we had both broken setscrews out of the axle. The inner one had to be cut through with a hacksaw to liberate the outer axle section, but in the end we'd succeeded.

A clean of the % UNC threads in the axle should enable some new bolts to be screwed in easily once I've obtained some. Meanwhile, the outer axle sections can be cleaned and prepared for some red oxide and the top coats of paint!

#### Threaded pivot pin

A 7/16 UNC thread is cut into the end of the pivot pin to enable a bolt to be inserted to grip the pin, or in our case...



#### **Slide hammer**

... a slide hammer, as the pin wouldn't budge – even with our slide hammer, possibly due to rust between the axle and the pin.



#### **Drilled out**

We gave up on the idea of removing the whole axle, so the outer setscrew was drilled out successfully in stages and after...



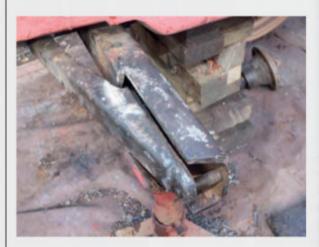
### **Centre punching**

... centre punching accurately, the inner bolt was drilled out as far as we could, before...



### **Hacksawing**

... sawing through the shank with a hacksaw to liberate the left-hand axle outer section.



#### **Screw inserted**

One of the right-hand setscrews was inserted whilst we cleaned the thread of the inner setscrew hole in the centre section.



#### **Success at last**

After some effort, both axle sections are out and will be cleaned and painted completely to prevent any further rust taking hold.



#### **Tapping out the threads**

All of the threads were cleaned out using a 5/8 UNC tap to ensure the new setscrews will screw in nicely when we get them.

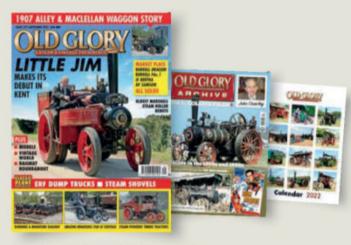

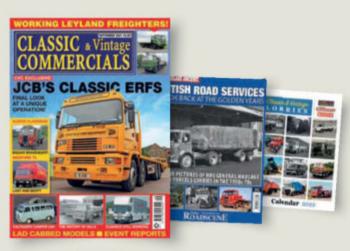

he sales season has not yet come to a close, with lots going on from the likes of Cheffins, H J Pugh and others, right into December.

One thing for sure is that bringing classic and vintage machinery over from other countries, particularly the USA, is off the agenda at the moment - with container companies charging £16,000 per container, with up to five tractors able to squeeze inside.

Before March 2021, the cost per container was £3,000 and things were reasonably okay until the 2021 Suez Canal incident when a container ship got stuck, causing mayhem. There is also a shortage of containers in China I am led to believe, but I am not convinced that we are being told the whole story.

One feels that operators may be trying to make a fast buck to reclaim loses from the

Covid-19 and Suez situations, but how long it will last? We will have to wait and see, but it's a worldwide problem, that's for sure.

Despite this, a UK resident bought two of the three restored International Junior 8-16 tractors from the excellent Aumann Auctions Jimmy Wilson sale at Piedmont, South Carolina, held on 9 October in poor weather conditions.

None of the restored, European veteran tractors made mega bucks at this sale. The early 'flat manifold' IH 8-16 sold for £9,187 and the other two, with the later manifolds, sold for £7,980 each. They are well-restored tractors and I look forward to seeing them over here next year with any luck. They were certainly not expensive and perhaps show the sign of the times price wise. Time will tell.

Still on the subject of veteran tractors, the British Wallis that was sold after the Ward September sale, having not reached its reserve, has gone to Cheshire. The 1918 Fordson MoM, no. 2556, is now in Cork, Republic of Ireland.

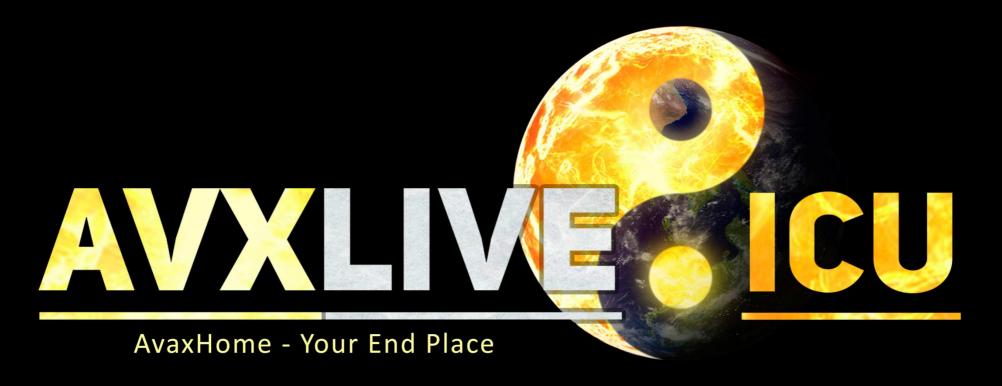

# **Plenty of stock**



The best of the DBs in the sale was this 1983 1290 fitted with a Grays Lynkon 420 power loader. With 1,944 hours behind it, the tractor sold for £8,000.

There was certainly a good crowd at Fackley Farm, Teversal, near Mansfield, on Tuesday 7 October for the auction of more than 50 tractors in this 1,000-lot sale.

Conducted by Bagshaws Auctioneers, the sale started at 10.30am and had no Internet bidding and no buyer's premium.

A strong selection of MF tractors, looking to be pretty original, included an MF 35 with turf tyres that sold for £3,500. That was followed by a 1979 MF 590 showing 6,717 hours on the clock. That sold for £4,150, while an MF 20 with 2,849 hours behind it and partly restored loader made £4,500. Then a 690, from 1982, with 6,759 hours on the clock, sold for £7,600.

Moving up the price range, a 1979 MF 240 with loader and fork, as well as a Duncan cab, went for £5,750, while a 1982 MF 690 and 6,759 hours behind it sold for £7,600. Doing even better was a 398 that made £9,000, while having a much more modern feel, and being more expensive as it turned out, was a 2004 MF 5465 with 3,905 hours on the clock. It made £19,900.

There were a number of Ford and Fordsons on offer too. Getting a fair amount of attention was a rare, French-built Super Major, with bidding reaching £3,800. There was also a batch of 1000 Series models in the sale. Prices varied due to condition, but an Irish-registered pre-Force 2000 made £3,400, while a 3000 made £4,000. The best of the 4000s dated from 1970 and sold for £2,400, while a 7000 that was definitely in working condition made £8,000.

The best among the line-up of David Brown tractors was a 1290 from 1983 that

# **Fords dominate at Cheffins**

Cheffins offered approximately 180 tractors at its last Vintage Collective of the year, which took place on Saturday 23 October, at Sutton, Cambridgeshire. The weather was dry and reasonably warm. The commercials and steamers did well, but when it came to the tractors it was a matter of quantity rather than quality, but many of them sold well for what they were.

The Fords dominated with a 'custom-style' grade 5.5 1963 Roadless 6/4, no. 6026933 (with a 1968 registration, TBL 374G) making top money at a record price of £40,000.

The second highest price went to the late Ted Goldup's single-speed 1915 Overtime R, no. 2929, which Ted found behind a shed and tree and had to clear everything out to remove the tractor. It was last

shown before Ted died at The Great Dorset Steam Fair in the 2019 Kelsey Media Tractor tent.

It went on to sell for £38,500 and although in grade 4 condition, is an excellent runner. Ted gave the tractor a 'Mk2' restoration in 2001 and then took part in the largest ever gathering of veteran tractors ever assembled in the UK at the 2001 GDSF.

In the implement section, a rare Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies RTYPL ride-on plough of this era sold for £20,000, some £3,000 above my estimate, and has gone to a collector of these early tractors and ride-on ploughs.

In the online implement sale, the first production Ransomes-Ford Learnington Spa factory-made 1016 two-furrow reversible plough, classed as a lightweight and designed for the 'new' Fordson Dexta range, went

on to sell for £4,100. It was last used at the 2008 National Ploughing Championships near Maidstone, Kent. There were other good prices in this section, which you will see in the results.

Ford Series 10 models did very well and a 1991 MF 365 with MF 80 loader, in very original condition, sold for a record £20,200 +VAT. Although a number of tractors were not sold, this was mostly down to high reserves, particularly if the condition of the tractors was not up to the price required for them.

All told a good sale for Cheffins. A summery on the individual marques follows.

restored U. It sold for £2,600 in grade 4.4 condition.
Auctioneer Oliver Godfrey stated there was an option to buy a starter motor and ring gear to convert the U to electric start.

#### **DAVID BROWN**

The stock was not that glamorous and the ex-Canada restored 50D did not make it and it was left to an original-style 1954 David Brown 30D with DB two-furrow plough to make best money at £4,500, but it needs further work.

#### **CATERPILLAR**

Doing well was a 1943 Caterpillar D4 7J which had been with the same owner since 1956. The restored tractor had been used in preservation, but was in good order and sold for a fair £4,200.

#### **COUNTY**

All the County stock did well, with two of the lots imported. The County 4600-Four didn't quite excite as it did in the catalogue and didn't have a cab or roll bar as it should officially and this reflected in its price.

#### **FERGUSON**

There was nothing very special about the stock and the Ford-Ferguson 2N that was listed in the programme as a 9N was a good piece of kit and sold for £3,800. The best was a genuine 1953 Ferguson a TE-L 20 orchard model that was going rather rusty in places and sold for £3,550.

#### **FORD**

This year has been all about 'blue' and it carried on here with Series 10 particularly shining at Sutton. A number of 8830s were offered but none sold this time, with owners wanting too much for what they were. One even came from Barcelona, Spain. The nicest was a rare-to-see 1984 Ford 2910 with LP cab. It had been supplied by Curtis & Horn and thanks to its originality it sold for £9,000 +VAT.

The best price went to a two-wheel drive, 1986 Ford 6610 Force II with only 991 hours on the clock. I feel some parts of the tractor had possibly been resprayed at some stage, but the tractor sold for a thumping £22,500 +VAT.



With the commission, the successful bidder paid £8,000-plus for this well-restored Zetor 6748.

#### **FORDSON**

The one the bidders loved at Sutton was a Duncan-cabbed 1955 Fordson Diesel Major in original-style condition. It was sold to the Manchester area for £6,600 and is to stay as it is. Driven away with lots of blue smoke from the Perkins P6 exhaust was a 1949 Fordson E27N Major, OVW 436, in original style, that sold for £7,500.

A fine Lambourn-cabbed E27N with Perkins P6 and Ransomes Robin plough and high top gear got to £8,000, but was not sold. It was a similar story with an original, petrol/TVO E1A Major DKN that got to £5,000 but was not let go.

#### IH

There was not much to report about International Harvester. The TD-9 is a hard type to find for crawler fans, and as this example needed heavy work. It was moved on for just £850.

### **JOHN DEERE**

The John Deere collection was eclectic and a fine 2850 sold for a good £20,000 and a similar, but not so good, example sold for £12,000 +VAT. Ted Goldup's Overtime/Waterloo Boy become part on John Deere on 1 January 1918.

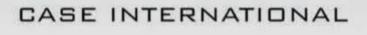

but the French objected to this on the grounds of the famous battle and so Overtime was used instead. I am told that some late European examples were called Waterloo Boys in the end, but not in the UK.

#### MF

As always the Massey Ferguson prices, for what was offered, were high. The 35 prices are rising and it's similar for the 135 and the 1200.

The late Ted Goldup's 1967 Morris Minor, that was new to Ben Turner and something Ted drove when new, was very much as it worked for this company. It sold for £8,500 on the day.

The highlight though was a two-wheel drive, 1991 MF 365 with MF 80 loader, H463 KAD, grade 9.7 at £20,200 +VAT.

#### MARSHALL

Too much was expected for the original 1950 Field-Marshall 3 contractor with winch, but no lights. The tractor features a donkey engine, which makes it so much easier to start, but loses its authentic looks and it faded out at just under £20,000.

There was great interest in the original-style Marshall 804XL and it went on to sell for a very good £17,000 – anew world record.

#### **MUIR-HILL**

Only one Muir-Hill was offered - a 1975 121 and not the greatest example really, but not the worst by any means. The vendor made money on his purchase, having kept it some years. It went on to sell for £8,500 +VAT, in 2/4 condition.

#### **NUFFIELD/LEYLAND**

Not many of these tractors were present this time, but both examples did well and the great improvement in Leyland prices was shown again with a 1977 Leyland 272, a very clean and original 3/10 example, selling for £4,100.

#### **ROADLESS**

The star of the show was a 1963 Roadless 6/4, TBL 374G, that was new to J G Phillips of Wiltshire and used on forestry work from 18 January 1964. The restoration was obviously fastidious and perhaps over the top for some, with bright injection pipes and CAV pump. The Oakes-supplied tractor reached a stunning £40,000, which had been predicted.

Others in this line did very well for what they were.

#### **ZETOR**

This marque has lost value over the last few years, which is such a pity as it has been so well respected. The 8011 was a delightful example of the early series and sold for £4,800 +VAT. As for a well-restored 1977 Zetor 6748 in grade 5 order, it changed hands at £7,900.

#### **OTHERS**

Perhaps the bargain of the sale was a running Frenchbuilt Austin 15-25 that sold at £6,200. It needed work, but irrespective of this the interest in early tractors appears to be fading, which is such a pity.

Sadly, it looks as though the East Anglia-based 1938 Lanz 25hp, in grade 2/4 'dusty' condition, is to be yet another Lanz to leave our shores at £10,500.

The underrated 1955 Cockshutt 40, 6B230331253, in original 2/3 style, was yours for £2,400.

Just five industrial machines were sold in this section. There is a following starting to be seen for MF industrial machines and a 205 fitted the bill well at Sutton.

# PRICE GUIDE

### PART Z-B

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can.
Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to

look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't on think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

All the prices quoted are what we call hammer prices and don't include UK VAT, commission or value added tax in the USA. If you cannot find your make or model for any reason, or need any advice, you are welcome to call our compiler, tel: 01323 833125.

# WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

#### Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

#### Band 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

#### Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been resprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

#### Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

#### Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

#### Band 6

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

This project to create a representation of hay making in the 1960s and '70s began 10 years ago.

The tractor was purchased by its first owner in the Brecon area in 1971 and has remained in the local area ever since. Having purchased it, the present owner set about overhauling the engine and the clutch, as well as improving the hydraulic system. Working for and with Peter Williams of David Brown Parts Ltd. has enabled the owner to source original parts, which have enhanced the finish of both the tractor and implements.

The first implement to be restored was the hydraulically-driven, mid-mounted mower, and this was followed by the New Holland crimper. The restoration of this involved sourcing parts from the USA, including the authentic tyres, which are not available in the UK.

The DB L7 loader was eventually found and both it and the Perry bale grab have been restored with the correct decals. To complete the project, David Brown rear wheel weights were fitted.

This well-restored collection is now being offered for sale together with instruction and parts manuals, in the hope that an enthusiast will appreciate the rarity of the implements attached to the tractor and the story behind the acquisition of the whole collection from an iconic era.

# The last word

# In each issue our Editor-at-large, Peter Love, takes a look at what has been going on in the world concerned with heritage preservation.

was very pleased to receive a phone call on Sunday 24 October from Howard Edwards, the joint owner (with Brian Bean) of the 1967 Lely Fisher-Humphries combine that featured in this section in the last issue. The combine, powered by a Perkins 6.354, is a prototype that the pair purchased at the late Fred Rolls' 2016 sale at Little Hall Farm, Upton Snodsbury, near Worcester.

Fred was a keen collector for decades. There were two Victory combines in the sale with the revolutionary folding headers. They realised £1,750 and £1,350 respectively. It's great that Howard had it going, working like it did this season near Shrewsbury, and I look forward to calling in when in the area – thanks to his invitation.

My good friend, keen ploughman and captain of the Allard Owners Club, Dave Loveys, saw the Lely item in *Tractor & Machinery* and remembers seeing one at work in 1967. He says: "The Lely combine reminded me of my time working in Wiltshire, during 1967-69. I was tractor driver, and did some milking, on a 400-acre farm near Marlborough. The family also ran a 100-cow dairy farm at Wooton Bassett. I used to do a fair bit of tractor work there; silage, hay, and we used to combine about 20 acres of barley.

"Lely had a large manufacturing facility at Wooton Bassett, (now an industrial estate,) where I believe this combine came from. They also either owned or rented land next door to my boss' family's dairy farm on which they planted wheat, and possibly barley. I could only see for sure wheat in the fields next to us.

"They combined this with a Lely combine which could be the one pictured. I remember the major feature



that the header folded up for easier movement along the roads. This was advertised as an exclusive feature. I suspect they used more than one single machine and it seemed to be very effective, and for a year or two after I left the farm's employment, their combines could be seen at work in those fields for some years later."

Perhaps you have some Lely Fisher-Humphries combine memories? Please get in touch if you do.

Anne Bates has recently been in touch to tell me the tragic news of Mervyn Prosser's passing.

She said: "The Breconshire and Welsh vintage tractor scene has lost a larger-than-life character in the shape of Mervyn Prosser. Mervyn, who was 73 years old, passed away suddenly in hospital on 2 October and his funeral service and burial took place on Saturday 23 October. The small hamlet of Llandeilo 'r Fan was brought to a standstill as family, friends and neighbours congregated to pay their respects to 'Pross'."

Farmer's son Mervyn was the chairman of Defynnog Vintage Society for 15 years until retiring from the position in 2019. He was influential in the organising of 2002 National Vintage Tractor Road Run and was the route leader for the inaugural Welsh National Tractor Road Run in 2012.

He took part in many tractor runs all over Britain and Northern Ireland. He was no stranger to travelling, as he drove lorries all over the country to markets and abattoirs, as well as hauling hay and straw.

Anne also reminded me that Mervyn organised the 2012 Breconshire county display at the Royal Welsh Agricultural Show, which traced the history of farming from horse to modern day machines. This was also re-enacted in 2015 to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Defynnog Agricultural Society.

Mervyn was a Fergie man through and through, which saw him been carried to St. Teilo's Church, Llandeilo 'r Fan, on a Ferguson trailer behind his beloved 1956 Ferguson TE-F 20, behind a procession of Defynnog Vintage Club members and friends driving tractors, many of which were Fergusons.

After the service he was carried away from the church to meet up with the hearse, which followed the parade of tractors the five miles to Brychgoed Chapel, Heol Senni, where he was laid to rest in the chapel yard.

Mervyn is survived by his wife Liz, of nearly 50 years, and his two daughters, Eleanor and Delyth. We send our thoughts to his friends and family at this time.

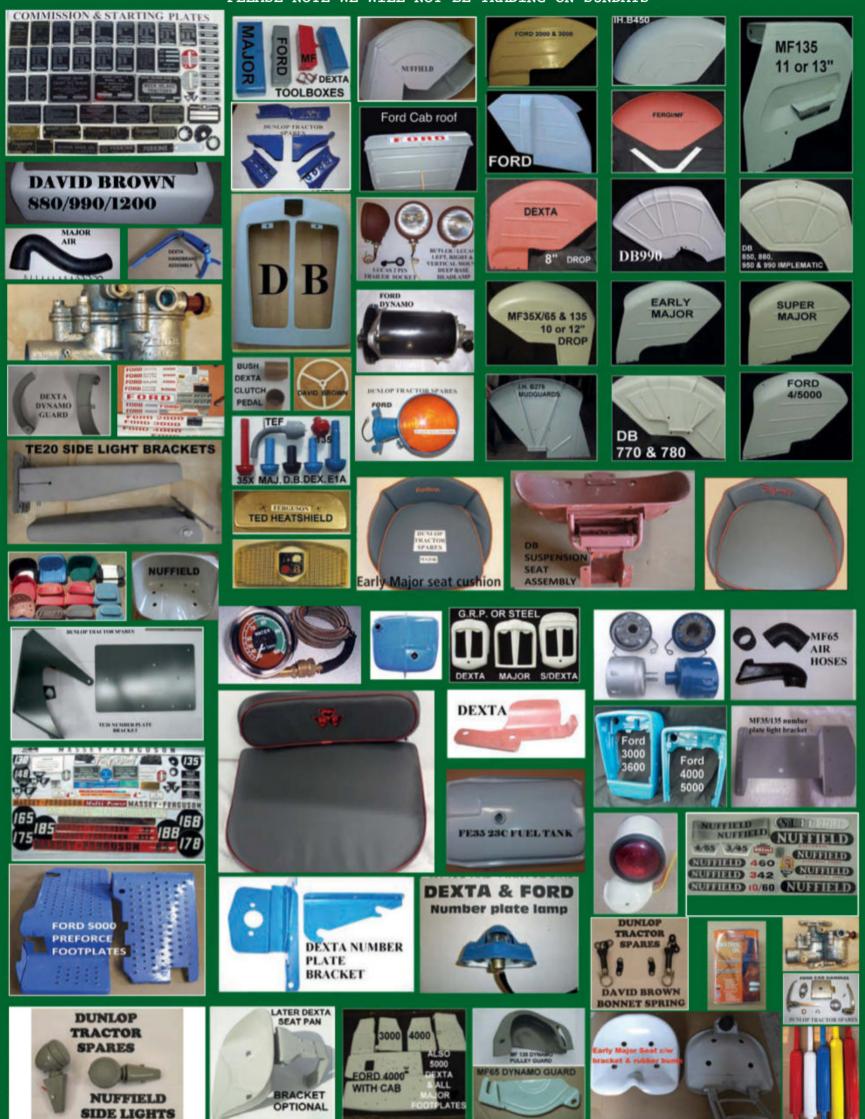

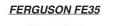
