Other highlights of the show were displays of 70-year-old Jubilee and Coronation vintage tractors, including a gold tractor, and more than 100 pre-1922 tractors. Also on display were eight Victorian engines and 100-year-old stationary engines.

UK registrations

For the second month in a row, United Kingdom agricultural tractor registrations (over 50hp) were comfortably above last year's level in May.

At 1,283 machines, the monthly figure was 16 per cent higher than in May 2021 and, indeed, was the highest May total since 2012.

The return to growth comes despite ongoing supply chain disruption, dating back to last summer, which has led to extended lead times, a situation which has not been helped by the war in Ukraine. Nevertheless, the underlying strength of the market means that registrations for the year to date are now slightly above their level in the opening five months of 2021, at 5,482 machines.

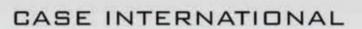

Peter Love visits Chris Wells to admire the results of a sympathetic restoration.

t was a pleasure to receive a call from Chris Wells of Rushlake Green, East Sussex, and to hear that his 1973 Ford 4000 was finished and ready for the road! This is the latest of several restorations that he has undertaken and I was keen to see the results of his efforts.

Chris' father was the publican at the White Horse Inn, Bodle Street Green, but he purchased Durrants Farm, Cowbeech, and was due to take up residence early in 1963 but because of the horrendous snow and freezing conditions the move was delayed by some weeks.

The farm would eventually become Chris' concern after his father suffered a heart attack when Chris was just 14 years old. He took control, under the guidance of his parents, and would go on to rent the farm from them until their passing. There was a lot of growing up to do and life was not all plan sailing for Chris, but it all ended happily.

In those early days the farm featured a Guernsey dairy herd, but after the restrictions were placed on full fat Channel Island milk he moved over to a Friesian herd. Chris explained that he needed more land than he had to make them a real success, so he moved onto other types of farming and engineering to make a living.

He went on to create AGMAC with Rob Leaves, which they operated together for a good number of years before an amicable parting of ways. This led to Chris taking on the tyre side of the former business and creating RLG Tyres, which has been going for around 30 years now.

Chris runs the business alongside his



tractors, as well as rubber to suit four-wheel drive vehicles. RLG Tyres also offers a mobile fitting service in the area too.

Back to the farm and over the years two Massey Ferguson 35s were used, as well as Ford 4000 and 5000 models and the ubiquitous Fordson E1A Major – which was used for timber work. Chris still has this tractor, but predominantly uses a very clean International 955XL.

IN A FIELD

As for the subject of this feature, Chris was offered it a few years ago now. It was fitted with a loader and power steering by Shaws of Cowbeech and

had been sold at Hugh Parks'
disposal sale before ending
up at Moieties Farm,
Cowbeech.



THE STAGES OF THE PROJECT



This is the tractor as purchased, with the loader ready for removal.



The tractor ran for five minutes and stopped!



The engine was coated in grease and grime after decades of neglect.



After taking the cab off it was time to pull the tractor out of the workshop and power wash it.



The cab frame was good, but needed sanding down and cleaning up. The mudguards were replaced by better examples.



Progress is being made with the cab now in primer.



A genuine replacement genuine cab roof was acquired and prepared for top coats of paint.



On goes the high-build primer.

The tractor had been standing in a field for some time as, unfortunately, it had a fuel problem and would start for five minutes and suddenly stop. Chris did not know this until he was informed by others! A deal was eventually done and it came back to Durrants Farm.

Thanks to Rob Leaves, the fuel problem was diagnosed as the fuel tank filter, which had been replaced but was becoming blocked by particles in the tank after five minutes of running. With this removed the tractor ran superbly, but in the restoration process the tank was power washed a number of times to cure the problem for good.

Chris decided that this was not going to be a half measures job and the 4000 was fully stripped. He didn't want the loader and power steering and so these were sold off for further use.

After power washing a number of times, the tractor was stripped where necessary. Luckily, the engine was basically good, but all the oil seals were replaced and the cooling system was treated to a new water pump and radiator overhaul.

The clutch was replaced, along with the steering joints and all of the oils, and the brakes were overhauled. A new wiring loom was required and this basically left the cosmetic side of the project to sort out – which wasn't without its complexities.

The off-side cab door was missing, but Chris was able to obtain a second-hand example, along with glass for the sides and rear of the cab. The original windscreen was retained and the nearside door was straightened and reused. Sadly, the roof was past its best, but a deal was done with Tottingworth Farms at Broadoak and a genuine 4000 cab roof came Chris' way. Various other cab parts were obtained from Tractor Cab Specialists in Northern Ireland, which fitted perfectly. Two mudguards were also obtained to complete the list of parts needed to be replaced.

ORIGINAL

Chris is a strong believer in original parts and, where possible, he will use them. Experience has led him to discover that some aftermarket parts do not fit very well. He would like to thank Robin Curd of Haynes, the local New Holland dealer, for all of his help – particularly when it came to sourcing quality, correct parts.

As with all these things, it takes time doing the job, but the result would be worth the wait. Naturally, the wheels got the works before a new set of tyres went on and it was in this area that Chris was originally planning to fit two pairs of CEAT tyres, but he ended up putting on a pair of Alliance 12.4/11-36 on the rear.

The tractor would usually have been fitted with Goodyear tyres at Basildon, but Chris considered Indian brand CEAT as it is one that he sells a lot of. CEAT's European subsidiary is based in the Netherlands and in recent years it is a brand name that has become more popular in agriculture.

When it comes to the age-old debate of whether to shot blast or not, Chris is certainly not an advocate of this process. He appreciates the finish achieved by blasting, but finds that blast material always gets where it shouldn't and causes problems. As a result, Chris opted to sand the tractor down himself in readiness for applying paint.

Other preparation included filling and sanding the bonnet panels, which are mostly original, before employee Lewis Tripp got to work with the spray gun. He used synthetic paint supplied by Trade Paints Ltd. of Hailsham and I have to say that the results are very good.

On Sunday 15 May the tractor was finally ready to take part in the first Cowbeech charity road run, when 36 tractors and a number of military vehicles came together to take part in a 13-mile road run around the area. The sky darkened, but Chris and the others got round without getting wet, just in time for a burger back at Cowbeech.

He says that the Ford 4000 went well, but he will adjust the tappets shortly and the tractor will be ready to rally. Hopefully, Chris will make a speedy recovery from a back problem and I look forward to seeing him at events as the year progresses

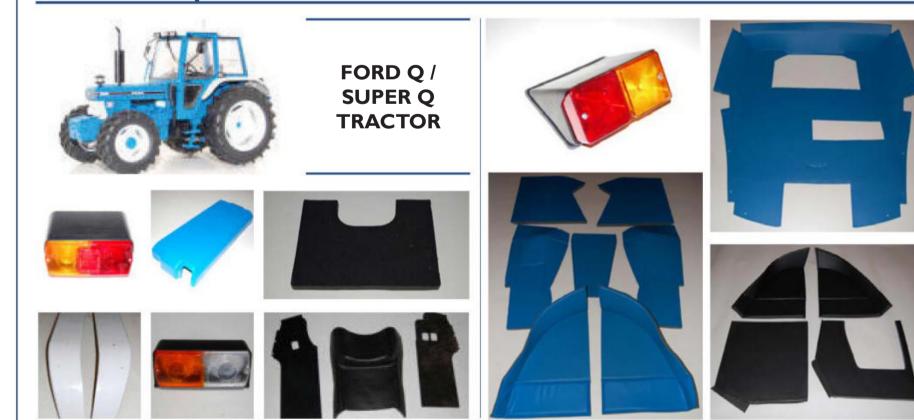

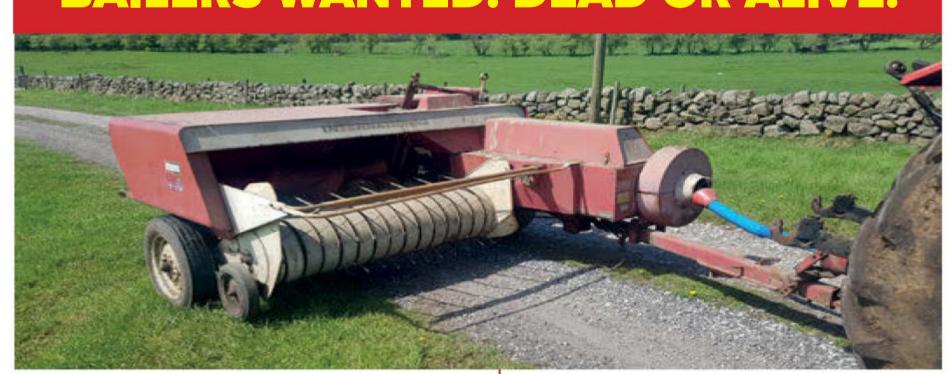

n a relaxed and friendly atmosphere, Kelsey Media staged the rescheduled Tractor World Spring show at the Three Counties Showground, Malvern, Worcestershire, on 21-22 May, writes Peter Love.

The second recipients were Steve and Annette Thornell for their 1983 David Brown 1690 Turbo, which was debuting at the show. As regulars to such events will appreciate, the Thornell family has done a great deal to champion the David Brown cause in recent years and has raised the bar when it comes to the quality of classic tractor restorations.

There was bated breath and genuine shock from the winner when the award for Show Champion was announced at the prize-giving ceremony early on the Sunday afternoon. Matthew Lloyd and his father picked up the award for their 1983 Deutz-Fahr Intrac 2004, which was in a poor state when they started the project. They had got it to a commendable standard and it looked great with its front-mounted Niemeyer mower.

It was a great show, where enthusiasts were happy to be out. Congratulations to all that took part, as it was well worth the effort. As for next year's show, plans are for it to be staged in early March, but this will be confirmed on the website in due course: tractorworldshows.co.uk

Sekura showdown

Two tractors of a similar power output, with the same cab - one turbocharged four and one naturally-aspirated six - which would you choose?

t is natural for comparisons to be drawn between tractors of the same age and size, but take a turbocharged four-cylinder machine and a naturally-aspirated straight six, both with the same cab, but with only the latter available in both two-and four-wheel drive configuration, and it makes a comparison slightly more difficult – but this was a dilemma facing some buyers in the mid-1980s.

The 90-100hp sector was becoming increasingly popular at the time and the Case 1594 and Marshall 904XL would have a hard time up against the Ford 7610, IH 956XL, John Deere 3040 and MF 698T and 699. It was imperative that the Case and Marshall had appeal, as well as ability, in order to take a good market share, as their contemporaries boasted impressive specs. But which of them would you choose if you were taking on the opposition?

It's interesting to note that Marshall decided to produce the 904XL solely as a four-wheel drive machine, but perhaps the company decided that with 92hp available anyone using the tractor was going to maximise its potential and,

therefore, have no need for a two-wheel drive version.

Case on the other hand decided that it needed to offer two- and four-wheel drive. After all, additional traction was not always necessary alongside power – when driving a trailed forage harvester, for example.

Here we make a brief comparison of the two to see what each offered purchasers.

ENGINE

Over the years both engines have come in for praise, but the Marshall's turbocharged four-cylinder motor has an army of fans! Leyland was subjected to much abuse over the years, for various reasons, but when it designed the 4/98 engine it got it right!

With a bore of 3.86in (98mm), a stroke of 4.92in (125mm) and a capacity of 230cu in (3.77 litres), the 4/98 featured direct injection, a cross-flow cylinder head and developed an impressive 92hp (DIN) and 322Nm of torque at 1,600rpm 92hp (DIN). This was not far off the 1594's 329Nm @1,425rpm and proved what was possible from turbocharging a decent, four-cylinder engine.

The AD6/55 direct-injection unit, designed by David Brown, had a bore of

3.94in (100mm) and a stroke of 4.5in (114.3mm), with a capacity of 329cu in (5,394cc). It produced 95hp (DIN) and the grunt and smoothness that you'd expect from a straight six – which is what many wanted from a tractor of this power output – but for those that didn't mind, there was the 904XL!

TRANSMISSION

The Marshall featured a derivative of Leyland's nine-speed synchromesh transmission, providing 15 forward speeds and five reverse. This was the crux of the 'XL' range of tractors – featuring an additional six forward and two reverse creep gears over the standard tractors, with forward speeds from 0.3-20mph.

These creep speeds, all below the bottom gear on nine-speed tractors, made the 'XL' suitable for specialist applications where low ground speeds were required.

The 1594 could not compete in terms of creep speeds, in Synchromesh or Hydra-Shift form, but had the option of a clutch-less gear change via its semi-powershift transmission option. Hydra-Shift permitted three on-the-move changes without needing to use the

clutch pedal and could be fitted to both two- and four-wheel drive tractors – unlike the DB 90 Series. No special oil was required, the tractor could be tow started and engine braking was not affected. It had proved itself to be a reliable system, if not abused, and was carried over into the Case IH era.

Both Case and Marshall chose to use a Carraro front axle on their tractors, but with a shorter wheelbase the 904XL had a tighter turning circle.

HYDRAULICS

In terms of the hydraulic system, the two tractors had a similar operating pressure, but the flow rates differed according to specification. Combining the 904XL's flow from the twin-chamber pump, using the diverter valve, increased output to 12.1gpm (54 litres per minute) – which was more than the 1594's single 8.7gpm (39.7 litres per minute), but not as much as the tandem's 16.7gpm (75.9 litres per minute).

The six-cylinder tractor also had a greater lift capacity and, arguably, a better draft control system too. The Marshall system was adequate, but the Case Selectamatic system had been honed over the years by David Brown and the 1594 also had lower link sensing – which was invaluable when operating semi-mounted implements.

CAB & STYLING

Using what is essentially the same cab, albeit with some subtle differences, choosing your favourite comes down to

colour preference – namely your taste when it comes to interiors!

Case switched the austere black interior from the DB 90 Series to a nicer grey for the 94 Series, and Marshall plumped for a 'tan' look throughout. The latter perhaps disguised the mud better, but looked a little dated in comparison to the contemporary grey of the 1594 et al.

Irrespective of colours and controls, with rear-hinged doors, tinted windows, a flat floor and roof hatch, there is little doubt that the Sekura-built cab was a nice place to spend the working day.

Case had learned the hard way from using Power Red to paint the skid units of the 90 Series, with every little oil leak visible, so a change to black for the 94 Series was welcomed! With a Semi-Gloss Black on the 904XL too, it comes down to the beauty seen by the beholder.

The Marshall bonnet design was dated, but it seemed to complement the Sekura cab, while the sharp lines of the 1594 were so fresh that they were continued well into the Case IH era. There's something appealing about the Marshall livery, but ask yourself if the 904XL has the same presence as any tractor in the 94 Series and the answer is probably 'no'!

STAR LETTER

Hedge-cutting shenanigans

Dear T&M,

Sadly, it takes a while for your magazine to reach newsagents in Melbourne, Australia! I have just found the November 2021 issue of T&M and, on page 77, found the enquiry about the possibility of fitting a hedge cutter to a Ferguson TE-F 20 tractor.

The answer to the question is, basically - yes. The letter brought back memories of my apprenticeship days at College Motors, Ashton Gate, Bristol. In about early 1957 we had part-exchanged a TE-F 20 on a new FE 35, and the TE-F 20 came to us with a Bomford & Evershed hedge cutter that was mounted just forward of the steering wheel.

I cannot remember all of the details, but the main frame mounted at the foot rest mounts and, maybe, at the front axle housing to cylinder block bolts. The frame had a vertical pivot pin towards the left-hand side of the frame, upon which a long boom was mounted. The boom had a cutter bar and control handle at one end, and a Petter engine of about 500cc, counter-balancing the assembly at the other end.

My memory is a bit hazy, but there was a transport latch to hold the boom in the fore and aft position for on-the-road use. No flashing lights or warning triangles in those days!

Being the young apprentice, I was asked to attach my 'L' plates and the General Use Trade Plate to the TE-F 20 and take it to a farm on the Bristol to Portishead Road.

I was to drive the tractor in a demonstration, and our salesman, Francis Brasnett, was to guide the cutter bar.

I was instructed to use first gear with just sufficient engine revs to keep it going comfortably. The farmer looked on with keen interest. We set the Petter engine going lustily and the long 'V' belt bounced around a fair bit. We set off and all worked well, and under load the drive belt settled down somewhat.

As we were cruising along, Francis tripped over a blackberry runner and fell - what I saw was the Petter engine shooting upwards at an alarming angle and the cutter bar close to the ground. I immediately braked, but could not reach the Petter engine to switch it off. We soon recovered our sensibilities and the boom returned to its normal attitude.

The farmer had watched all of this keenly and his only comment (in his Somerset accent) was, "Ahhhhrr! Mr Brasnett, if I had've wanted a gateway there, I would 'ave informed thee!"

Never forgotten, and we did make the sale! It may yet still be there!

It all seemed difficult at the time, but looking back things did seem simpler.

I get great enjoyment reading your magazine, but am a bit devastated at the amount of rust that British enthusiasts have to contend with!

MF 70 mower

My guess is alpha is year of manufacture and the numeric is the count of mowers being produced. I wonder if the alpha is taken as the letter of vehicle registration for that year – for example, N-reg being 1974, and so on.

I will be grateful of any assistance given.

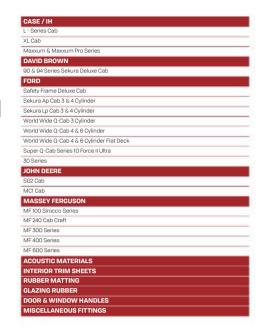

The intricacies of the IH 523 and my thoughts on it have been covered in past issues, but our feature on my family's collection and subsequent conversations with readers about the model have led me to the point where I'd like to set the record straight on a few things. Not only that, but fellow owners would like to provide an opinion too!

make no bones about the fact that International Harvester is my marque of choice, but I am also quite honest about the fact that no tractor is perfect – especially red and off-white models from the 1960s!

They are not easy to get on and off, particularly if you're tall and/or have big feet, and they are definitely not the best starters, but we all have a cross to bear!

As you will appreciate, though, if you have a brand of tractors that you love, you put up with their foibles and retaliate with an insult if one is thrown at your tractor(s)! I, as I'm sure is the case for many of you, have endured this banter for decades – and I'm happy to accept criticism if there's a foundation

for the claim, but this is not always the case with the 523.

It's a tractor that only a select few seem to understand in any detail and most of these are either owners, former owners/ operators or IH-trained dealer personnel. Like any machine, the easiest way to get to grips with it is to operate it for a substantial length of time and, preferably, to delve inside it!

When it comes to the latter, I will hold my hands up and say that I've never ventured into the transmission of our tractor, but have tinkered with most other elements of it – including undertaking an engine rebuild with father and little brother. It's generally best to leave things alone if there's nothing wrong with them and that's the case with the Agriomatic-S transmission in this instance.

So, helping me in my quest to discuss frankly and educate, I have asked a group of fellow 523 owners for their thoughts on this ground-breaking Continental tractor, but before we get to the nitty gritty of its character it is worth remembering how the model came to be.

In Germany, International Harvester had been producing its popular D-Line tractors from 1956, with models featuring two-, three- and four-cylinder engines to suit all types of agricultural operation. As good as they were, tractors like the D-326 (three-cylinder, 26hp) did not have the power to suit the needs of

European farmers throughout the latter half of the '60s and beyond, and so a new range was needed to meet the demands of modern agricultural practices.

At the heart of these new tractors would be a range of new engines to replace the 1,088-2,434cc units that had powered the D-Line models. The first two introduced, in 1965, were the three-cylinder D-179 and four-cylinder D-206 and these are probably best known to British farmers for their place under the bonnets of the IH 454 and 474 respectively.

The latter was a short-stroke motor that did not win over everyone that encountered it, but the D-179 found itself an army of fans worldwide and it is this engine that was used to power the 523 – one of just two new models to launch the so-called Common Market Line, in 1965.

It would be another two years before the 523 made it to the UK, slotting into the International Harvester Company of Great Britain's line-up between the 43hp 434 and 62.5hp B-614 (replaced by the 634 in 1968). At 52hp it bridged the gap nicely and was in direct competition with the likes of the David Brown 990 Selectamatic and Ford 4000 (6X) at 55bhp, but also had to contend with the 45.5hp Massey Ferguson 135 and 62hp MF 165, as well as the 45bhp Nuffield 3/45 and 65bhp Nuffield 4/65. This, as you can appreciate, was no easy task.

Performance aside, the price of a tractor is always a major sticking point and at £1,104-0-0 (June 1967) in basic Agriomatic-S guise, the IH 523 wasn't cheap. Given that you could pick up a DB 990 or MF 165, both with more power than the IH, for £131 and £24 less respectively – it was never going to be an easy task for a dealer's sales representative.

Luckily for the rep, the 523 had some tricks up its sleeve and plenty of standard features to keep the other manufacturers on their toes. It was these that convinced my brother and I to consider adding one to the collection in the first place.

Our father had started working for IH dealer E. Hildred & Son Ltd. of Ramsey, Huntingdonshire, soon after leaving

school – but Hildred's was taken over by Rustons – a company that would eventually end up selling International Harvester machinery and other equipment from branches across Cambridgeshire and Lincolnshire.

In those early years the Bradford-built models, B-614 and 634, as well as the BTD-6, were the bread and butter of his time in the workshop, but he recognised that the 523 was a great tractor despite very few being sold in the area and we decided that it was this model that we should focus our search on when looking for something larger than our Ferguson TE-D 20 to double the size of the 'collection'.

Although a glance from afar may not reveal it, those that know will tell you that the 523's a tractor that was way ahead of its time. To be truthful, it was fortunate that it was – otherwise even less would have been sold! There are no accurate records of how many 523s were sold by dealers under the IHGB umbrella, although it is a purported 1,370, and to the surprise of many there are more around than first imagined.

Despite its innovative features, the 523 was a hard sell. It was very different to the other models on dealer forecourts, and it was German! This did not bother everyone, but it was off-putting for some and in a bid to combat this, IHGB issued dealer sales personnel with various pieces of literature to help them and their customers understand what the International 523 was all about.

The two that reps may remember are the *Sales Letter* and *Fact Finder* – both instrumental in illustrating the features and benefits of the new tractor. Issued in July 1967, they broke the tractor down into its various sub-assemblies and explained how each would benefit the farmer if he chose to purchase a 523.

The *Fact Finder* also featured a confidential price comparison, dated 29 June 1967, which made for interesting reading. Even those with very little knowledge of tractors could appreciate that the 523 had a lot to offer, but a high price was prohibitive.

Dealers also took it upon themselves to come up with ways to emphasis the 523's appeal and at the East of England Show, Johnson Bros (Bourne) Ltd. organised a driver-less demonstration of the tractor with help from staff at the company's Spalding branch.

In this instance the 523 had bumpers at the front and back, to protect it if something were to go wrong, and ran between two stops. The Agriomatic-S control lever had ropes attached to it going in either direction, so when the tractor drove forward the rear rope went tight, pulling the lever backwards and thus changing the direction of the tractor.

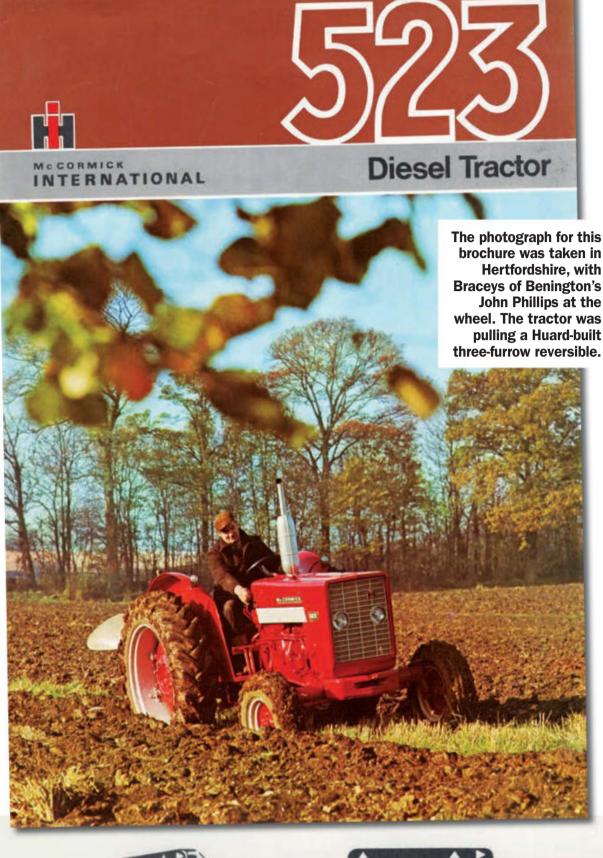
Once it had reversed so that the bumper was almost touching the stop at the end of the run, the front rope went tight, pulling the lever forwards.

According to those there at the time, the tractor did this all day long on tick-over!

Moving on and the aim here is to discuss the good and bad points of the 523 and to draw comparisons with the David Brown 990 Selectamatic, Ford 4000 and Massey Ferguson 165 – providing an honest appraisal of whether the 523 deserves to take the spoils in the three main sectors (engine, transmission, hydraulics & PTO) as IH suggested it did.

ENGINE

As discussed, International Harvester started producing the direct-injection D-179 engine at Neuss, Germany, in 1965 – and one of its most notable features is its 5.06in stroke and subsequent ability to 'hang on'. Of its three main competitors,



the 523 has the longest stroke and over the years has gained a formidable reputation for draft work.

Unlike its Bradford- and Doncaster-built siblings, it's a great starter too – with a 135Ah battery, 4.5hp starter motor and an excess fuel system teaming up to provide reliable starting in all weathers. The competitors were fitted with either a 96Ah or 128Ah battery as standard, and although none are particularly bad at starting, the 523's cranking power is enviable.

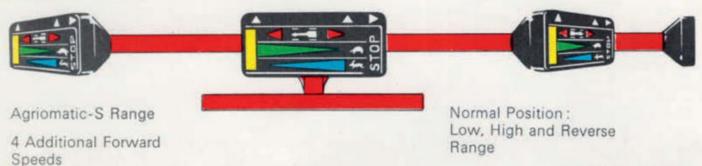
The Bosch distributor-type fuel injection pump can cause confusion should the operator need to engage the excess fuel setting to aid winter starting, as the fuel cut-off knob needs to be pulled half-way out before pulling a knob to engage the starter motor.

There is also the small matter of the hand throttle being 'backwards' to what you might expect – push it forward to increase revs and pull back to reduce. Does this have the ability to catch you out? Yes! Thankfully, a foot throttle was included in the specification as standard, operating in the 'normal' manner.

There are few, if any, three-cylinder engines that you can describe as smooth, but the D-179 is about as smooth as you'll get – especially from that era. The hydraulic governor is nice too – responsive and precise – but whether it's any better than the competition is difficult to measure.

If I'm uber-critical, the engine can be noisy depending on what silencer your tractor is fitted with. Early examples have

Fast Stop Position



The clutch packs operate independently of the engine clutch via the Agriomatic lever (opposite page, top). This is connected to a hydraulic valve that directs oil from a gear pump to the appropriate clutch pack. a rotund unit that evidently has better sound-deadening capability, as the assault on the ears is much less than a 523 fitted with the later, '956-style' silencer. This is particularly raucous and can leave you pretty fed up at the end of the day.

I have not spent as much time on a DB 990 or Ford 4000 as the other two, but I would still say that I favour the IH and Perkins units. The D-179 is powerful and frugal to boot, but the Perkins A4.212 has the edge in terms of fuel consumption from the information available. This is particularly relevant at the current time.

TRANSMISSION

Those that are familiar with the IH 523 will realise that the transmission is the main reason it impressed in the late '60s and early '70s, as well as blessing it with a cult following today. For those without the need for anything too flash, the basic eight-by-four gearbox is more than adequate.

Said to give "driving ease equal to a modern car", it features two speed ranges and a reverse range, with four gears in each. It is familiar in its shift pattern, but has the added benefit of synchromesh – a feature that would not be prominent on IH's British-built tractors for several years.

The 12-by-four Agriomatic-S system is significantly more advanced. It offers synchromesh, just like the basic transmission, but has two other strings to its bow. The first of these is a clutchless shift, with the ability to change on the move easily. No big deal, granted,

given that the MF 165 Multi-Power can do just that and the Ford 4000 has the option of Select-O-Speed to provide numerous clutch-less changes, but the 523 has something else up its sleeve.

The transmission uses three levers: range and gears between the operator's legs and the Agriomatic lever to the right, beside the hand throttle (see right). It works by providing two speeds for each gear in both low and high ranges, which are selected hydraulically – without declutching – using the Agriomatic lever. This, as explained, is essentially a 'splitter' when the range lever is in high or low, but the Agriomatic lever has a second purpose when the operator selects reverse range – a clutch-less shuttle.

No less than 13 years on and this still catches me out, as I don't feel that it's intuitive to select reverse range when you want to go forward! Once reverse range and the desired gear have been selected by depressing the clutch, motion is controlled solely by the Agriomatic lever. Push it forward to go forward and pull it back to reverse – without the clutch!

Like all good shuttles, the reverse speeds are around 30 per cent higher than the respective forward speeds. For example, when third gear is selected, a forward speed of 3.7mph is achieved, while 4.9mph can be reached by flicking the Agriomatic lever into reverse.

Select-O-Speed is the only rival transmission that comes anywhere near this and if you drive the 523 regularly it can be an extremely rewarding and

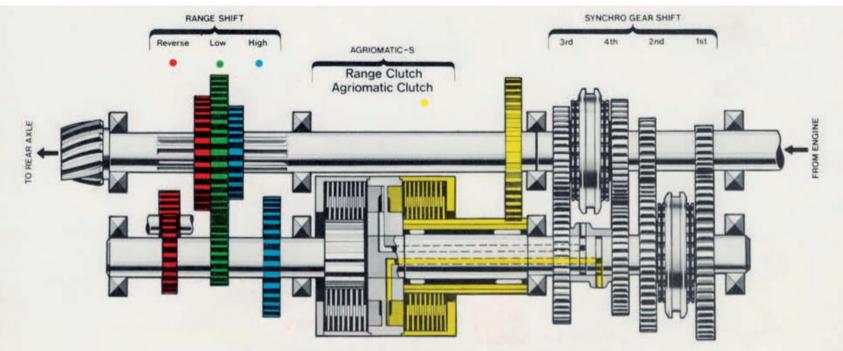


useful transmission to operate. Drive it now and again and you have to think about what you're doing! With this said, it's still by far the most versatile transmission of the bunch.

HYDRAULICS&PTO

Whereas IH's British-built models incorporated the 'Vary Touch' hydraulic system, the 523 utilised the 'Exact' system with position and draft control. This had been around since the days of the D-326 et al and was a top-link, hydraulically-sensed system that automatically compensated for changing field conditions and maintained traction by adjusting the draft of the implement.

As you'll find on the other IH tractors of the period, the 523 used an engine-driven hydraulic pump (with an output of 6.3gpm) and had a separate oil reservoir – but it was much better in terms of operating remote cylinders, of which three could be fitted. Unlike Vary Touch, where additional spool valves were rarely specified, it is not difficult to

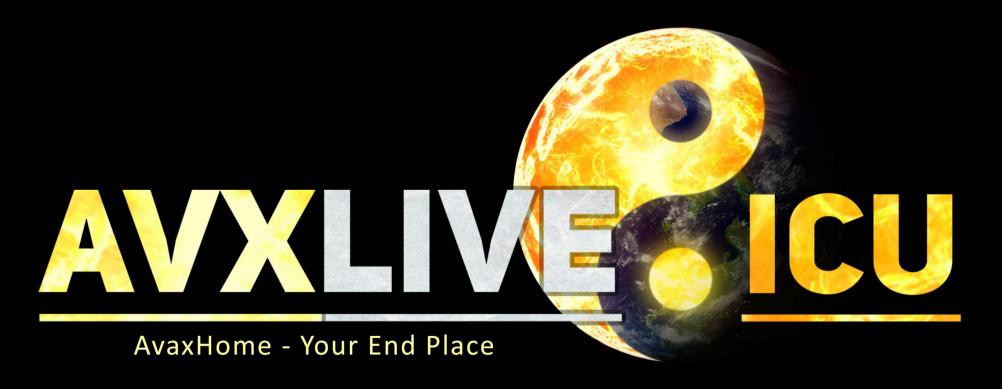

find a 523 with plenty of capacity in this department – plus, you can pick up both single- and double-acting valves to fit relatively easily, should you wish to increase versatility.

The three-point linkage is also capable of lifting 1,700kg – 112kg more than the MF 165 MkII and a full half-tonne more than the popular 434. It also has a nice drop-valve facility, positioned by the operator's left leg, which means that when operating a heavy implement the speed of lowering can be governed to prevent a rapid drop rate.

The lower links incorporate a handy feature, in that they did not need to be reversed to switch between category I or II – unlike the Bradford-built models. The ball ends feature a quick-release system in which a category I collar can be easily inserted into the ball and fixed in place with a pin.

As for the power take-off, the engineers at Neuss designed it with a 540rpm shaft as standard, with the option of a 1,000rpm shaft positioned alongside – able to be fitted on the farm should it be needed after the tractor was ordered.

The Standard features an independent PTO, controlled by a lever on the left of the dash that permits the tractor to be stopped whilst the PTO remains in operation. Agriomatic-S versions do not have this luxury. The PTO is engaged by

depressing the clutch pedal and moving the engagement lever on the side of the transmission. Once engaged, the motion of the tractor can be halted by moving the Agriomatic lever to the 'Stop' position, without affecting the PTO.

At 48hp at the shaft, the 523 suffered from minimal losses and offered more power than the David Brown and Ford, as well as having the option of 1,000rpm. With its decent lift capacity, it impressed in this respect too

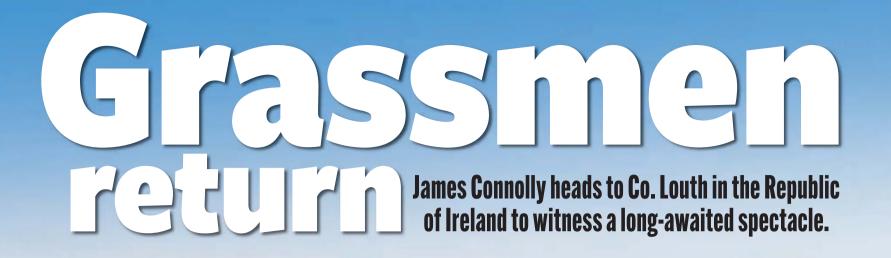
they were on show for everyone to see and enjoy – in original condition too.

Lifting grass

A look back at some of the tractor-driven technology used to cut silage over the decades.

oday, the selfpropelled forage
harvester is king. The
go-to piece of
equipment for the
largest of farms and
agricultural contractors, a selfpropelled forager is a must for
productivity and efficiency.

Once, such machines were in the minority – eclipsed by the number of mounted and trailed foragers driven by a tractor's PTO. These were the mainstay of the silage season across many parts of the world and although they still have a place in agriculture – with smallholders, those with awkward fields and others looking to save on the cost of a contractor – their widespread use is a thing of the past.

We look back at some examples from the 1960s, '70s, '80s and '90s.

Left: At the time of the Taifun heavy-duty forage harvester, products produced by Fella-Werke GmbH, part of the Sachs Group, were marketed in the UK by Melotte Farm & Dairy Equipment Ltd. of Grantham, but later saw distribution by RECO. The Taifun was a precision-chop machine with a minimum power requirement of 65hp and a working width of 5ft 6in. Six knives were fitted as standard, with a further three available, and to further control chopping requirements, a three-speed (plus reverse) gearbox was fitted – controlled from the tractor seat. All images from promotional literature.



Above: The Wild Silage Harvester, manufactured in Nechells, Birmingham, by M B Wild & Co. Ltd., was said to have a loading speed of 8-10 tons per hour with two basic sub-assemblies (pick-up and fan) combining to produce what the company called "the most economical machine yet produced." Mounted on the tractor's lower links, the weight of the machine was shared with two, rear-mounted castor wheels.



Hailing from the United States was the Mathews Company 60 G-1 – a 60 GS-1 chopper with the additional chute assembly. Made in Illinois, the 60 G-1 was said to be a three-season machine, able to perform a multitude of tasks from chopping grass to shredding corn stalks. The manufacturer did not state the power requirement for the machine, but suggested that it was best suited to a two- or three-plow tractor.

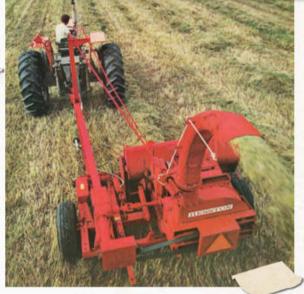
Above: International Harvester's Gloster-badged forage harvesters were ideally matched to the tractors available at the time – predominantly sub-40hp machines like the B-275. Marketed with one-man operation in mind, the B20-1 (inline) and B20-2 (offset) models had what the NIAE described as a 6½ hp 'no load' power requirement, meaning a little tractor was capable of running them.



Above: Marketed by Massey Ferguson as the 71, this little offset forage harvester could be powered by tractors of 25-60hp, with output said to be 15-20 tons per hour. It was trailed behind in transport, with just two attachment points to set it into work mode. A combined gearbox/trailer hitch enabled drive to be taken through 90 degrees from the PTO shaft to the forager, while permitting a trailer to be towed directly behind the tractor. Two rows of seven, hook-on flails were used to chop the grass.

The Sila-Master, by John Wilder Ltd., was available in three configurations – 40in and 52in inline and 52in offset. Even the smallest could mow direct at 4mph, covering more than one acre per hour, while collecting wilted swaths allowed the tractor to run at $4\frac{1}{2}$ mph and harvest more than 20 tons per hour. Moving the rotor shield enabled the chute to be bypassed, ejecting the cut material onto the floor – particularly useful for scrub clearance and straw chopping.



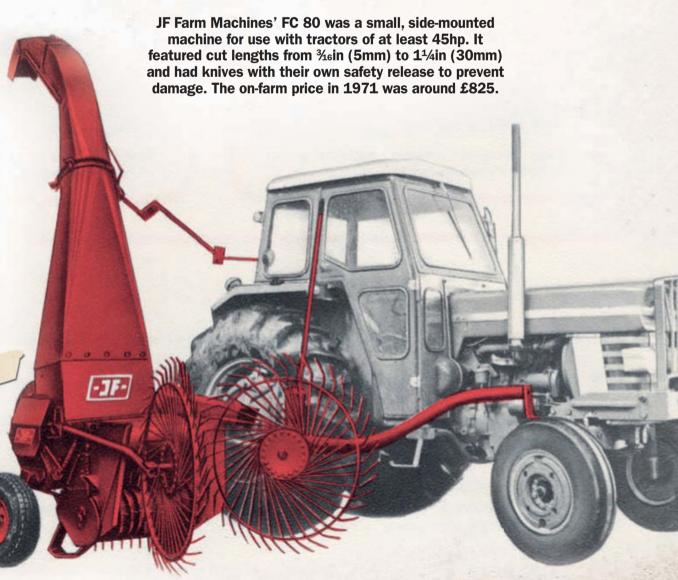

23in-long knives were standard.



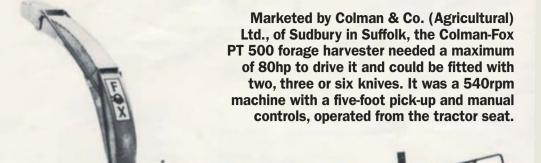
New for 1973, the Claas Jaguar 40 was a compact machine said to be "the ideal forage harvester for the modern farm." It had a folding, 1,620mm (5ft 4in)-wide pick-up and a transport width of just 2,160mm (7ft 1in). The drum could be fitted with two, four or eight knives and the power required was a minimum of 45hp.

Output in wet silage was said to be 35 tons per hour.





Above: At the 1975 Smithfield Show, the basic Full-Chop had a list price of £2,848 – with Archie Kidd Ltd. charging an additional £137.92 for a hydraulic trailer hitch and £38 for a chute extension to permit side delivery. Six knives were fitted as standard, with length of chop between ³4in and 1½in – although three blades could be removed to provide a chop length of 3in. Tractors of less than 75hp could run the Full-Chop via a 540rpm or 1,000rpm shaft, but only the latter could be used for tractors of more than 75hp.



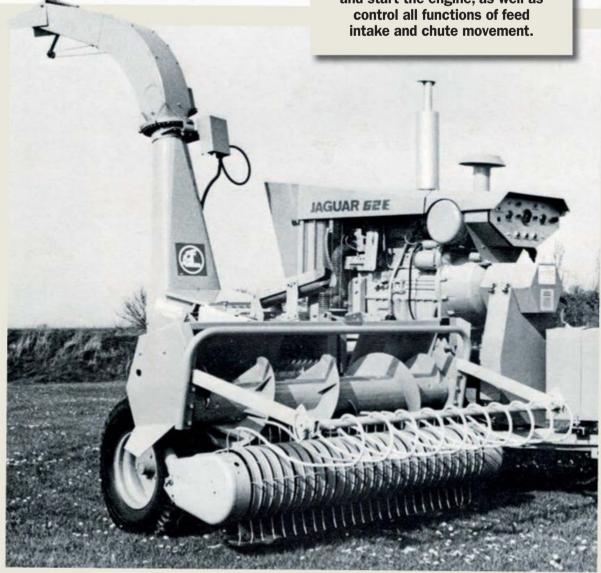
The Taarup 605 was available with three styles of attachment – a maize header, pick-up header and disc cutting system, as shown here. A 12-knife cylinder was fitted as standard to the basic machine, but three, four or six knives could be used for longer chop lengths. At least 90hp and a 1,000rpm PTO were required, but considering the disc cutting head had a working width of 2,400mm and the pick-up header 1,800mm, enabling a decent throughput, the

power consumption was reasonable.

Below: Claas' 62E had the features of the 62, but did not require a substantial tractor to drive it. Power was supplied by a side-mounted Perkins 6.354.4 six-cylinder engine rated at 110hp, with a centrifugal clutch and belt drive. An in-cab console enabled the operator to stop and start the engine, as well as control all functions of feed intake and chute movement.



The Jaguar 60 and 62 models were part of Claas' offering for the early '80s. Both could be fitted with four or eight knives, but the larger machine had a choice of more features, including electric remote controls and the option of a metal detection system. The 60 had a power requirement of 60-80hp in 540rpm form and 80-110hp as a 1,000rpm machine, while the 1,000rpm 62 model needed a tractor of 80-130hp to run it.

Across 'The Pond', Ford's 670 and 672 models were serious machines requiring tractors producing up to 130hp and 170hp at the PTO respectively. Fitted with either six or 12 bolt-on tungsten carbide knives, the foragers had a six-foot pick-up width and electric controls to start, stop and reverse the feed, as well as rotate the spout and alter the deflector angle.



The JF Warrior 160 was a larger and more productive side-mounted forage harvester for the mid 1980s. With an output of 20-50 tons per hour, the 160 required a tractor from 75-102hp and could be run at 540rpm or 1,000rpm. Features included a floating, 1.5m-wide pick-up, new rotor design to make better use of the tractor's power, new feed flow system, new 'L' frame for easier hitching/unhitching and a new in-cab control system.



Mengele's SH 25 N was a compact flywheel forager designed for the medium-size farm. A proven design and decent build quality ensured an output of 70 tons per hour with a tractor of at least 65hp (125hp max.). Chop lengths of 4, 6, 8, 12 and 17mm were possible, while other features included a 1,400mm-wide pick-up, 1,000rpm drive, electro-hydraulic in-cab controls for pick-up, reverse drive, chute and spout, and 10 knives.



Wilder Engineering's Meter Flail Forage Harvester was basically an updated version of the Sila-Master, able to cut direct or chop to near precision standards from a mown swath. Two models were available – 1.2-metre and 1.5-metre working width (FH 120 and FH 150), with hydraulic trailer hitch, electric chute controls and hydraulic lift as standard. Power requirements were 65-80hp and 75-100hp respectively.



Deere claimed that despite its size and output, only tractors of 69-120hp (DIN) were needed to power to the 3765. This was thanks to the 'Dura Drum' – a closed-centre component that prevented material from entering the cylinder and enabling each of the 24 knives to throw exactly what it had cut. With the cutterhead acting like a paddle, there was no need for a blower fan, therefore meaning the power requirement was less.



New Holland's popular 525 was around at the time of Ford's Series 10 Super Q cab tractors and was commonly seen in action with models from this range. Either 15 or 30 J-shaped knives were employed, with tractors of 75-135hp required – depending on the PTO speed. Other features included a heavy-duty gearbox with reverse (7), optional metal detector (1), combined slip and overrun clutch (5) and remote-controlled pivoting spout (11) with optional extension (10).

The Farm Equipment Division of the New Idea Corporation, based in Ohio, produced several forage harvesters during the 1990s, on what is believed to be an IH design. Two of which were the 660 and 680, with the smaller of the two driven by a 540rpm or 1,000rpm shaft, by a tractor of up to 95 PTO hp/140 PTO hp, and the larger at 1,000rpm only and requiring up to 190 PTO hp. An 18in-diameter cutterhead featured 12 knives of 20½in and 24½in respectively.

load the beet into the cleaner-loader and on to the waiting lorry. There's so much going on that it keeps you mesmerised

for some time!

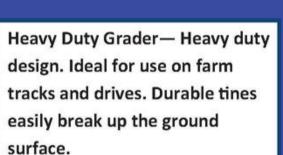

Stuck years of MF600 MF6

Jonathan Whitlam acknowledges the Massey Ferguson 600 Series as it celebrates its ruby anniversary.

espite being successful, both mechanically and in terms of sales, the Massey Ferguson 600 Series that first began to appear on farms 40 years ago, in 1982, did not have enough distinctiveness to gain legendary status and, although not forgotten, is a range often overlooked by history.

Sandwiched between the 500 Series, that was the first MF range to feature an integrated quiet cab, and the revolutionary 3000 Series with its electronic wizardry, the poor 600 Series range could not compete in terms of features and memorability. Perhaps one of the reasons for this is the fact that the range was basically a 'MkIII' 500 Series!

PREDECESSORS

The Massey Ferguson 500 Series itself had a lot of living up to do following on from the fantastic 100 Series tractors. It managed to do so, but not without a few missteps!

Unusually, the first in the range to appear was the largest. The 88hp (DIN) 595 model was a French-built machine that replaced the rather temperamental 1080 model in 1974, two years before the rest of the 500 Series models were launched.

As the 595 made use of the same Perkins A4.318 engine as the 1080, which was largely responsible for that model's downfall, it was perhaps not surprising that the 595 continued to have issues in that department. It did, however, spearhead the way for the rest of the range – with its new styling and the cab that was fully integrated into the design of the tractor, rather than being an afterthought, as had been the norm previously.

The rest of the 500 Series duly arrived in 1976, just in time for the new quiet cab legislation that came into effect in Britain in that year. Built in both Coventry and Beauvais, the 500 Series looked completely new with its 'hard nose' design, tinwork and striking, single-door cab, despite the fact that mechanically speaking it was quite similar to the older 100 Series models that were being replaced.

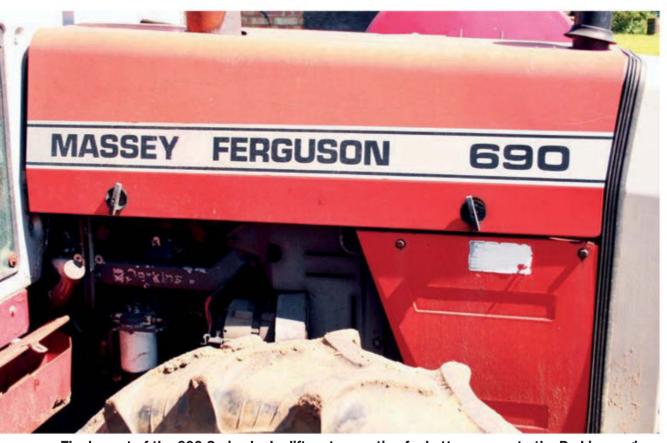
The 565, 575 and 590 were all four-cylinder tractors, while the little 550 was a three-cylinder machine. All were powered by Perkins powerplants.

As the 1980s dawned, revisions were made to the 500 Series to address issues and criticisms levelled at the range, including a two-door cab. Several other small items were updated as time passed and the livery changed to a predominantly red cab, although many were still not completely happy with the series as a whole.

The answer would be to produce a new range and hopefully upgrade the tractors enough to overcome any remaining niggling issues and please loyal customers and prosepctive purchasers.

The 675 was the smallest of the Massey Ferguson 600 Series line-up, with just 66hp (DIN) on tap. A new feature on this range was the painting of the skid unit in 'charcoal', rather than the familiar

grey of the 500 Series.

600 SERIES

It was 1982 when the 500 Series finally ceased production and the new replacement, although technically a 'MkIII' version of the 500 Series, was first seen on farms. Sufficiently different to be graced with its own number range, the new models were, fittingly enough, dubbed the 600 Series, keeping a continuity with the old order.

Unlike the earlier range, the 600 Series would be built solely in Beauvais in France, and although a few 675s and 690s were built during 1981, production proper got underway the following year.

This was at a time when MF was already planning for the future and the next few years would see much investment in developing a whole new range of models using electronics to control may functions automatically.

The 600 Series did not play a part in this and was a purely mechanical range and, as such, could perhaps be considered as a stopgap measure to tide things over until the new machines came online. This would be a bit disingenuous to the 600 Series though, as it was certainly improved compared to the 500 Series and offered a reliable and up-to-date alternative to competitive marques in the early 1980s.

Hindsight can make quite a difference when looking back at the introduction of new tractor ranges when you know what came next, and in this case it makes the 600 Series look much less important than it actually was at the time of its introduction.

In 1979 Massey Ferguson introduced the new 200 Series tractors that offered a variety of options and features in an affordable package. These were sold alongside the 600 Series tractors which, taken at face value, looked very different to the 500 Series it replaced, predominantly because of a new cab sourced from Italy.

This unit was used by Landini, an Italian-based tractor manufacturer of Massey Ferguson. This acquisition also

The 600 Series cab was an improvement on the old 500 Series cab, featuring larger amounts of glass for better visibility, a flat floor and better isolation from the skid unit to reduce noise and vibration. Another bonus was the fitting of openable side windows that provided much more controllable ventilation, but not everyone liked the front-hinged doors. The bonnet featured new styling with a liftable top section to gain access for routine maintenance, while the silencer and air intake above the bonnet line remained much as before.

Four-wheel drive had begun to become a factory-fitted option on some models in the 500 Series and with the launch of the new 600 range this feature became an option on the whole line-up and somehow seemed to be an integral part of the design, rather than an add-on, as it had with the outgoing tractor range.

MODELS

The three models that introduced the 600 Series to the farming public were the 66hp (DIN) 675, 75hp (DIN) 690 and the 88hp (DIN) 698. This equated to the 675 replacing both the 60hp (DIN) 565 and 66hp (DIN) 575, the 690 replacing the 75hp (DIN) 590 and the 698 the 88hp (DIN) 595.

Specification wise, the Perkins four-cylinder engines drove through a 12-speed synchromesh transmission as standard, while a 12-speed Multi-Power option was also available. The hydraulic system was classed as an 'Advanced Ferguson System' design and consisted of a three-point linkage, two spool valves, drawbar and Auto Hitch as standard. An independent power take-off offered high power, producing more than 59hp on the MF 675, 67hp on the MF 690 and 81hp on the MF 698.

In comparison with other Massey Ferguson tractor ranges, the presence of only three models was quite unusual. The 600 Series was designed to bridge the gap between the larger members of the 200 Series family and the big, six-cylinder 2000 Series models.

The 60hp (DIN) 265 was the reason that the 675 replaced the two older 565 and 575 models and used the same Perkins four-cylinder power plant as the 675 in the shape of the A4.236 unit, while the larger 75hp (DIN) 290 offered an alternative to the 690 and was the largest 200 Series model at that time – fitted with the same Perkins A4.248 engine as the 690.

The smallest of the 2000 Series was the 93hp (DIN) 2620 which thus offered a slightly more powerful six-cylinder alternative to the 698.

Launched in 1981, the new 600 Series took its place between the 200 and 2000 Series machines as they began to roll out onto farms during 1982 and must have seemed a big leap forward over the old 500 Series tractors when it arrived – the new look and features being instantly appealing, while the tried-and-tested mechanical units were reassuring to many exiting 500 Series customers.

One issue that remained though was the relatively low power outputs of these models, a criticism that had also been

levelled at their predecessors. The answer for many customers being the fitting of aftermarket turbocharging kits, such as those supplied by Opico, that boosted power significantly from the Perkins four-cylinder engines. This practice carried over to the 600 Series and many tractors, especially the 690 and 698, were fitted with turbochargers. Indeed, many Massey Ferguson dealers would fit these at the request of the purchaser.

It took until 1984 before this issue was addressed by Massey Ferguson more comprehensively, when the 698 was replaced by the 698T. The successor dispensed with the Perkins A4.3182 and used the turbocharged AT4.236, producing 90hp (DIN). Despite the small increase in output, the 698T was a very successful model and sold well, especially in Britain where farmers had begun to embrace the idea of a tractor of around 100hp with four cylinders and a turbocharger – a trend started by Ford with the 7000 in 1971.

Another new 600 Series tractor appeared in 1984 in the shape of a new flagship model. The 699 was a 95hp (DIN) tractor was powered by a sixcylinder A6.3544 engine and replaced the larger MF 2620, which was deleted from the 2000 Series line-up at the same time. This was a timely move, as many farmers, especially in continental Europe,

were moving away from the four-cylinder turbocharged format in favour of a lightweight six-cylinder tractor. The 2620 certainly did not fit in the lightweight category being based on the same heavy build as the largest 2720 model, and so MF's designers came up with putting the six-cylinder Perkins engine in the 698 chassis and ended up producing a real winner.

The 699 sold extremely well, because if you wanted a straight six, 100hp tractor with plenty of power in a light, compact package, then the 699 was the one for you.

The 698T and the 699 thus became the best-selling models in the 600 Series line-up and also took Massey Ferguson in directions it had not hitherto explored when it came to tractor models that were gaining in popularity at that time. In many ways it was ahead of the game with the lighter, six-cylinder 699.

It proved a successful formula, but one that would only last a further two years, as by 1986 a new range was ready to be introduced by Massey Ferguson that would do nothing short of revolutionise the tractor industry forever!

SUCCESSORS

The big news of 1986 was the launch of the Massey Ferguson 3000 Series. These were new from the ground up and owed extremely little to the outgoing 600 Series, breaking the mould as the first new Massey Ferguson models in this power bracket since the company had been formed. They would also prove to be the beginning of a whole new era of tractor design and use.

Out went the 66-95hp (DIN) 600 Series and in came a five-model range from 71-107hp (DIN) with new styling, a brand-new cab and the new Autotronic electronic control features, as well as the Datatronic option with on-board computer system. The 675 was ousted by the new 3050, the 690 the 3060, the 698T the 3070 and the 699 the 3080, while the new flagship 3090 was a higher-powered entry. Most were four-cylinder tractors with the two largest models featuring a naturally-aspirated, Perkins six-cylinder engine.

The 3000 Series would grow and develop as the 1980s gave way to the 1990s and was in many ways the first modern range of tractors that featured the use of electronics from the very beginning of the design process. The concept and execution of the new range made the 600 Series look very dated overnight, and so began the decline of the 600 Series in the minds of farmers – the range now no longer looking as new and fresh as it once did and much more like the last of the old order – which in many ways it was.

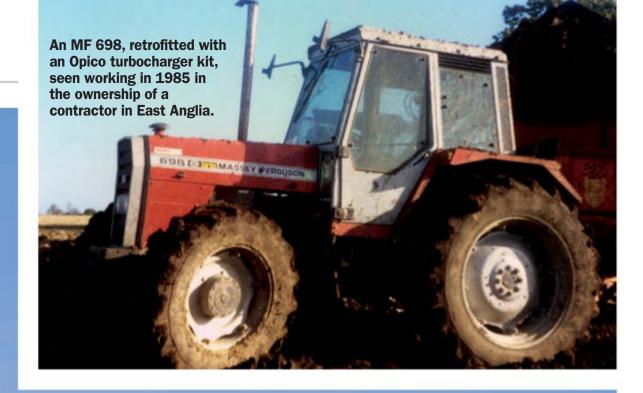
Ironically, the 3000 Series tractors had been the result of a long-ranging and comprehensive canvasing of farming customers by Massey Ferguson to produce the tractors that were wanted by the farming community, and the first advertising campaigns making use of this fact were actually produced featuring the likes of the Massey Ferguson 699, back in the mid-1980s.

LEGACY

With such a milestone following hot on its heels, the 600 Series quickly faded from the minds of most people – except those that still ran examples on their farms. In fact, the memory of this range would even be edited out of some promotional films later produced by Massey Ferguson that showed most of the tractor ranges of the past. This was perhaps not surprising given the seismic effect on the industry of its successor.

The fact was that there were also problems with the 600 Series, although most of the mechanical issues that were part of the earlier 500 Series had been ironed out. The big issue was the cab.

It had seemed a good choice at the time of the 600 Series development to go with the Italian-sourced cab, but the structure soon proved to be far too prone to corrosion. Rusting doors and



pillars were an all-to-common sight with the 600 Series tractors and one that signalled the early demise of many examples, either being cut up for parts or having the whole cab removed and then exported to third world countries that did not need, or want, a fully-enclosed cab.

Although most 600 Series machines suffered the ill effects of the dreaded tin worm, many examples have survived and some are in fine condition, provided they were given lots of loving care by their former and current owners. Indeed, some examples can even still be found at work, as well as in the hands of collectors.

The numbers of survivors are not huge when compared to, say, the 500

Series, but many do remain to remind us of a range of tractors that was designed as a stopgap measure, but proved to be not only an excellent final version of the old 500 Series, but also a trendsetter, in particular with regard to the later 699 model which was one of the first really successful lightweight six-cylinder tractors.

So, perhaps it is about time that this, long-time unheralded tractor range was given a bit more respect when it comes to tractor history. After all, it did very well keeping Massey Ferguson at the forefront of the best-selling end of the tractor market from 1982 to 1986.

It may have had its faults, but it was still a successful product in so many ways. ■

Carrington Carrington

ack on the agenda, for the first time in three years, the 61st Carrington Rally Steam & Heritage Show, near Boston in Lincolnshire, was an event of the highest quality – supported by excellent clubs and friends, says Peter Love.

Staged on the Crawford family's farm for many years, the rally has totally transformed itself – with the committee pulling together to put on an excellent event, led by chairman Alex Bell.

It was good to see a wonderful stationary engine section and the largest commercial/car section seen since I first attended the show in 1962. These were bolstered by excellent food, courtesy of the WI, and other great attractions – but,

sadly, two stalwarts of the event were missing. We have lost both Robert Crawford and Herbert Epton in recent times – well-known enthusiasts and collectors in their own right.

To this end, at least 35 Marshalls were present, in memory of Robert, including the 1910 Marshall Colonial E that was brought back from Australia by Major Henry Marshall, and a 1931 Marshall E 15-30 that R H Crawford bought new at £315.

My two highlights in the Marshall display were Bob Shaw's 1938 Marshall 12-20 contractor, which still has its original block and features hydraulic brakes, a winch and sprag. It's one of six produced with hydraulic brakes and suggested to be the only survivor. The

Babbings family were next door with their 12-20 example, and were helpful to everyone, as always.

Also seen for the first time at the rally was a 1938 Marshall M (no. 852) from the Stow collection in Cranleigh, Surrey. This very original condition tractor is a stunner and was exciting to see.

The tribute to Herbert was just as impressive, with a line of around 25 John Deeres led by his stepson Alan with Herbert's rare, Mannheim-made 3120. L Parker was proudly exhibiting a 1953 John Deere 40S that he has just restored, along with a lovely 290 corn planter that was a winner at Newark last November.

A total of 9,473 40S models were made between 9 January 1953 and 17 October

1955. All told, some 54,000 JD 40 variants are said to have been made, featuring a 25bhp engine.

As for the Massey-Harris display celebrating 175 years of the marque, Malcom Robinson had assembled a wonderful array of machines and types from various people, with Gordon Carson showing a 1922 Wallis OK, MH 12-20, ex-Hunday late GP 15-22 and an unstyled Challenger, along with more delights representing the anniversary well. The adjoining Ferguson and MF display was excellent too.

Congratulations to everyone involved. The show had plenty going on in all sections and was a great tribute to those who are sadly no longer with us

Spring run

ith Spring well and truly in the air, Saturday 5
March saw a dry, sunny day with a cool, keen wind for the running of the reorganised, renamed Coombes' Spring Charity
Tractor Road Run, writes Anne Bates.

Starting from Chadwell Grange,
Newport, by kind permission of Mr &
Mrs Richard Maddocks, 81 tractors and
six four-wheel drive vehicles descended
on the potato farm for the run, which
had been delayed from its usual
Christmas week date due to the Covid-19
restrictions. It was, once again,
supporting the fundraising efforts of the
Gnosall & Newport Lions Club – which
was raising funds for Prostate Cancer
testing and awareness.

Roger Perry led the way in his David Brown 1390, turning left out of the farm and along the lane towards the junction at Chadwell Mill. The tractors turned left, following the lane to join with the A41. Here, after a short stretch of main road, the run turned right onto the B4379 towards Heath Hill. It was at this point that the tractors picked up their first off-road section, along a farm track and fields to meet Pitchcroft Lane. Here, after the drivers had parked up, they settled down to their fish or pie dinner and pudding before the drawing of the raffle.

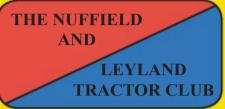

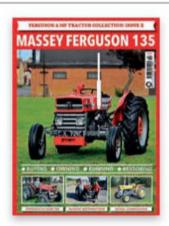

780 rescue part 17

DIFFICULTY RATING

With the work on the tractor well advanced, Andrew Hall turns his attention to rebuilding the seat, which has been more involved than first envisaged.



hen the tractor first arrived, back in 2019, the controls were

either seized or very rusty, due to it having languished in brambles for around 20 years.

As part of the original equipment, the tractor features a Rest 'O' Ride seat, which has two bonded rubber adjustable springs to enable the seat to be adjusted according to the weight of the tractor driver. The condition of the seat was no exception to the rest of the tractor, as the seat pan was rusty, and the whole mechanism beneath was seized up.

I could, perhaps, have taken the easy route and replaced the seat assembly as a complete unit, but in the interests of originality I chose to retain the original seat and strip and completely renovate it.

BROKEN SPRING

Heat was required to free off man of the adjustment components and the two springs, which are retained by roll pins and soon yielded to a hammer and suitably-sized punch. Unfortunately, one of the springs was broken due to the bonding between the steel and the rubber separating, and I knew that it couldn't be repaired, so set about ordering a pair of new springs.

The considerable investment has meant I have been committed to repairing the seat, despite at times

feeling I should have replaced it with a more modern sprung seat from one of the aftermarket suppliers.

BRONZE BUSHES

During dismantling it was noted that there are six bronze bushes that take the load on the swivelling arms of the seat. Two of these were cracked and broken, and had lost their flanges, so I considered making some fresh bushes. The problem was that I couldn't obtain any bronze of suitable dimensions to make them efficiently in the lathe.

A call to my local agricultural engineer and friend Tony Davies soon had some bushes coming in my direction. They did, however, require some modification, as they were %in bore and needed to be bored out to a ¾in clearance to match the swivel arms.

BORING TOOL

To increase the bore diameter I used the lathe with a boring tool, as I could proceed with a series of fine cuts rather than using a drill and a reamer to finish the hole size. The wall thickness wasn't going to be very thick after the machining, so too much force could possibly damage the bushes, and also I needed a ¾in clearance and didn't have a suitable reamer to achieve it.

Each bush was turned to size and then assembled on the swivel arms, after

The Rest 'O' Ride seat, which is the topic of this issue, was very rusty and the spring mechanism seized solid.



New rubber springs

When dismantled, one of the springs had become un-bonded, so a new pair was sought, and the bronze bushes were too far gone to re-use too!



Laid out

The new springs and replacement bushes were laid out in order, along with the rest of the support frame and seat pan, ready for preparing for fresh paint.



Boring job

The centre bores of the bushes needed to be bored out from 5/8in to 3/4in clearance, to fit over the swivel arms.

removing the corrosion on them and cleaning up the contact areas. The flanges on the new bushes needed to be machined to reduce their thickness, as they were thicker than the originals to allow the seat support to be reassembled. A small spacer was made to facilitate assembly and smooth movement of the swivel arms.

REASSEMBLY

At this point all the prepared parts were primed in red oxide and allowed to dry before reassembly took place. With all the components ready, they were laid out in

sequence, together with the new rubber springs.

To get the position of the rubber springs correct I took a look at one of the early photographs, as it showed their correct positions with the diagonal braces in place. I had two braces, but the spigots on which the braces locate weren't long enough to accommodate the two braces together, so I had no option other than to use just one of them, but it shouldn't make any difference.

THREADED ADJUSTER

A threaded adjuster screw attaches to the back of the

springs and had a right-hand thread one end and a left-hand thread the other, with a ¾in gap unthreaded in the centre. This is screwed to tighten or slacken the tension on the springs.

During assembly I had to determine the correct orientation of the swivel arms, as they are cross-drilled to accommodate roll pins where they attach to the base plate of the seat assembly. They are handed left/right and won't operate correctly if transposed!

FIDDLY JOB

The swivel arms were placed onto the base plate and the

nylon bushes they ride in were aligned with the base plate and the holes in the swivel arms, whilst fresh roll pins were inserted. This procedure was rather fiddly and took two or three attempts to get it right, after which the two rubber springs were placed in position at the front end of the frame and their roll pins also fitted.

The assembled seat frame was temporarily bolted to the tractor to hold it secure for the fitting of the threaded adjuster, which proved to be rather a headache. I lifted the swivel arms to bring the holes where the adjuster fits

WORKSHOP



Measuring up

Some measuring up was done to ensure the bushes were opened up to the correct diameter. The swivel arms were to be polished up during the seat restoration.



Boring tool

A boring tool was used in preference to a drill and reamer to obtain an accurate clearance size for the bushes, which allowed a series of shallow cuts.



Part way there

An initial pass set at zero was done, followed by five more passes to get the desired diameter. The bushes are 'Oilite' and have been soaked in oil.



Temporarily assembled

With the bushes successfully machined, the springs were temporarily assembled to check for a correct fit.



Ready for cleaning up

Satisfied with the progress, the support frame components were now ready for some pre-painting preparation.

together as much as possible before attaching it to them, but the seat pan support wouldn't sit straight and looked crooked. No amount of adjustment/ removal and refitting would bring any improvement, as one swivel arm sat lower than the other.

I studied the distance each nut was located along each of the adjuster threads and after trial and error I was able to position them to bring the pan support level and adjust the tension to suit driver weight.

SEAT PAN

Next was the cleaning and preparation of the steel seat

pan for painting. It was rather pitted with rust, so was treated to a thorough rotary wire brushing and finishing off with a flap wheel to smooth the surface.

Any pitting still present was then filled with filler and sanded back to provide a smooth substrate, followed by the usual prime in red oxide. The seat pan will be finished in DB Orchid White, whilst the seat support frame is to be finished in DB Chocolate Brown.

REAR AXLE & PTO HOUSING

The next task on the agenda was to clean, prepare and

prime the rear axle and PTO unit. David Brown tractors feature many nooks and crannies on their skid units, which makes cleaning rather a chore, but to paint over dirt and hardened grease isn't an option.

The effort with a rotary wire brush and scraper was well worth it, and enabled a coat of red oxide to be brushed on, providing a good substrate for the subsequent coats. The pick-up hitch parts were painted separately, and then mounted on the tractor after it had been primed.

Also, the front weight frame was primed and fitted

to the tractor, along with the steering drag link and track rod, which benefitted from some new rubber gaiters.

A coat of red oxide will be sprayed over the whole of the tractor before applying the David Brown Chocolate Brown

Cleaned up

Some vigorous rotary wire brushing was required on most of the parts, seen here with the task partly completed.



All primed

Each part was brush painted with red oxide before the reassembly took place. A further coat will be applied to the frame by spraying when the whole skid unit is painted.



Seat pan

The seat pan was welded where it had rusted into holes, followed by wire brushing and smoothing with a flap wheel, and filling any pitting with filler paste prior to priming.



Seat support frame

The reassembled seat frame was bolted into place on the tractor skid unit ready for the aforementioned further priming and top coat application.



Rear axle & PTO unit

Much effort was required to access the various nooks and crannies before applying the first coat of primer by brush.



Pick-up hitch

The components of the pick-up hitch were assembled onto the back end of the tractor to be sprayed along with the rest of the chassis.



Thread cleaning

The 5/8 UNC threads of the front casting were cleaned with a suitable tap to enable the fitting of the front weight frame.



New gaiters

Four new rubber gaiters were obtained before fitting the steering drag link and track rod.



Weight frame

The weight frame is now in place, whilst the steering drag link and track rod still await fitting.

Experts' advice

These pages are here to help readers solve their technical problems. Our pictures are only for illustration, unless indicated otherwise, and are not the tractors being written about.



Oliver 500

I have a 1962 David Brown 850 diesel tractor converted to an Oliver 500. I have had the injector pump recalibrated (a DPA), plus, all injectors reset and cleaned professionally.

My problem is bad starting. The engine whines and whines before firing, giving out loads of smoke. A cold start has been fitted to retard the pump, but makes no difference. Even when the tractor is running it still discharges lots of smoke. Any advice on the problem would be useful.

Dick Coupland, via e-mail

With a recalibrated injection pump and reconditioned fuel injectors all should be well. However, you don't say whether you have had the engine rebuilt or not. To have the injection pump serviced it would have been removed from the engine, and this is a possible clue to your problem.

When installing the reconditioned pump, was it set up as it was before removal? It could be that the pump has been mis-timed when fitted and this is causing the symptoms

you describe. Before removing the pump to rectify the issue it would be a good idea to spill time the engine statically. The static spill point for your engine is 11 degrees before top dead centre (TDC). To check the spill timing, follow these instructions:

When number one piston is on compression stroke and the indentation in the flywheel coincides with the peg aperture marked 'SP' on the left-hand side of the clutch housing, the line marked 'C' on the injection pump rotor should be exactly in line with the line through the eye of the body circlip (to access the pump rotor you need to remove the side cover of the injection pump).

To make an adjustment, if necessary, slacken the three mounting nuts of the pump flange and rotate as necessary until the pump rotor aligns as previously stated, then re-tighten the mounting bolts and refit the pump side cover.

If, however, you cannot obtain the desired alignment, it indicates that the pump may have been fitted too far out of time and further investigation should be carried out by inspecting the alignment of the timing gears in the engine.

Fordson Major E27N

I have a question relating to the fuel to use in my 1947 Fordson Major E27N tractor.
Until recently I have been using E5 to start my tractor, but since the arrival of E10 fuel I was wondering if this can be used satisfactorily.

When hot, I run my tractor on a mixture of heating oil and petrol in a ratio of four units of oil to one petrol, and this has always worked well. The higher price of E5 has put me off using it in the Major and nobody I've spoken to can give me a definite answer regarding E10, so if *T&M* can advise me it would be most welcome. *Michael Sanders*, *via* e-*mail*

It is still rather early days regarding the use of E10 petrol in our vehicles. The extra Ethanol is purported to absorb moisture, which in turn can cause corrosion to vulnerable metal components of the fuel systems, and may attack older rubber fuel pipes, causing them to leak.

If your E27N has its original metal piping from the tank to the carburettor it'll be less vulnerable than if rubber is present. I would recommend lining your fuel tank with one of the proprietary tank linings such as 'Slosh' or similar, which is Ethanol proof. This would reduce the vulnerability of the fuel tank.

Another tip is not to over-fill your starting tank and drain it down after use, and also to drain the carburettor bowl of fuel before leaving the tractor idle.

Fordson Major Diesel

We run a work-worn
Fordson Major Diesel
tractor and recently
bought a brand-new topping
mower to run on it. When
we attempted to fit the PTO
shaft of the mower to the
tractor it was observed that
the splines of the tractor PTO
shaft are nearly worn out and

we felt they are too far gone to put a nice new PTO fitting onto them.

We have held off with any mowing until such time as we can either replace or repair the worn PTO shaft on the tractor. Our question is, how difficult is it to remove and replace the shaft, and would

it be more economical to repair the shaft rather than replace it? Any advice would be most welcome.

W & J Smith, via e-mail

If your shaft is badly worn you are wise not to fit a new yoke to it, as the slop in the worn shaft will

cause premature wear and tear to the new item.

Removal and replacement of the Fordson PTO isn't a difficult task. You will need to drain the rear transmission oil, of which there is around 10 gallons (45 litres). The bearing housing around the PTO shaft is retained by four bolts. After removal, the shaft can be withdrawn complete with the bearing and the hydraulic pump drive gear.

A good, second-hand shaft can be fitted, but in the absence of a fresh shaft the splines can be built-up using hard-facing welding rods and ground back to the original profile of the splines.

If you choose the latter option it is still a good idea to remove the shaft and the bearing housing/oil seal from the shaft before doing any welding, as the heat may damage the oil seal. However, it is always a good policy to replace seals if you are dismantling and rebuilding anything mechanical!

Massey Ferguson 590

My old Massey
Ferguson 590 has
a problem with its
PTO shaft, as it appears
not to turn off, and remains
turning even though
the operating lever is in
neutral. I think the PTO
is independent, as I don't
have to depress the clutch
to engage/disengage it.

Why would the shaft refuse to stop when disengaged, and is it an easy job to repair it myself? Alan Carter, South Yorkshire

You have an independent PTO on your 590, which

is operated by a hydraulic clutch pack supplied from the auxiliary hydraulic pump. When the clutch is disengaged, oil is diverted to a small brake pad on the outside of the clutch pack, which holds the shaft stationary whilst disengaged. It sounds as if the pad on the brake unit has worn to the degree that it won't hold the shaft, and could do with replacing.

Reaching the brake unit is quite involved, and requires the removal of the hydraulic pumps and the PTO shaft to access the brake. If you have the means to dismantle the tractor and appropriate mechanical knowledge to do the job yourself, it can be done.



However, I would recommend you obtain an official workshop manual for the tractor before embarking on the work and study it well!

The alternative is to seek a technician with experience of the MF 590 model to do the work, as this is often easier with tractors of this period!

E27N revisited

Andrew Hall makes more progress with his 1947 Fordson Major E27N, with the cleaning, painting and refitting of the radiator.





t last, after nearly seven years of working on my Fordson E27N, I have made some progress!

After rebuilding the gearbox and fitting new bearings, and replacing the rear axle oil seals, further work was carried out on the brakes, which were relined and treated to some new operating cables. New retaining springs were also fitted to the clutch thrust bearing carrier, and the two halves of the tractor were then mated together!

WATER PUMP REBUILD

Turning my attention to the front end of the tractor, I stripped and rebuilt the engine water pump using a new seal gland. The engine itself wasn't in need of any serious attention, as it is a reconditioned unit, which I had fitted a few years ago from an old Lincoln welder.

The cylinders are 0.020in (20-thou) oversize and have no wear whatsoever. I did, replace the valve springs, as the originals were a little tired. All the aforementioned work was covered in *Ford & Fordson Tractors* magazine, and more recently in *T&M*.

PAINTWORK

I started to refinish the tractor in primer, undercoat and top coat in E27N blue, and had worked from the rear forward and progress was looking good. This is where it all stopped, and for the last five-plus years nothing has been done at all until very recently, when the project was resurrected!

RADIATOR

Much of the new paintwork had suffered from peeling, and has been revisited, the results of which I am very pleased with. This has spurred me on to finish the tractor and enjoy it once again.

The radiator was removed from the tractor with the intention of re-coring it, which would have been an interesting feature in itself. Reality kicked in and the cost of a new core alone is now prohibitive and as the radiator didn't leak at all I feel it would have been an unnecessary expense.

In the meantime the radiator has languished up against the workshop wall and had a nice crop of nettles growing around it.

As anyone with experience of Fordson tractors will know,

The radiator is nearly ready to receive some paint. To reduce the amount of moving around, all accessible surfaces were painted first, then turned over for the remainder.

the radiators are extremely heavy to handle. When I removed mine I used an engine crane to lift and lower it safely to the ground.

Way back in 1986, when I first purchased the tractor, it had been standing in a wood where it had previously powered a saw bench, and had stood without the radiator cap fitted. The result of this was a nicely built mouse nest in the header tank.

Filled with enthusiasm and less than half my current age I unbolted and lifted it down to clean out the debris by inverting the radiator. I found

it heavy at the time, but now I have no hope of lifting the radiator single-handed.

The current radiator came with the reconditioned engine and was used because it was cleaner than the original.

PREPARATION

The engine crane was used once again to extract the radiator from its resting place and enable me to set about cleaning it up in preparation for some fresh paint.

A close inspection of the core showed no damage caused during its period against the workshop wall,

but of course the true condition won't be known until I refill the cooling system with water when it is refitted.

Taking care not to damage the core it was dusted down and freed of cobwebs, and the outside of the header tank casting, side panels and bottom tank were all attacked with a rotary wire brush to remove all the green covering and dead paint etc.

Taking advantage of the warm sunny weather, the prepared radiator was dusted down again and brake cleaner used to wash the surfaces due to be primed. As the radiator

is heavy I decided not to move it around more than necessary and prime all accessible surfaces twice, before then applying two coats of E27N blue top coat.

This was done in a short succession to facilitate keying of the various coats and hopefully not see a repeat of the problem I have encountered.

The unit was then carefully turned to one side to treat the remaining surfaces. It was then allowed to dry overnight before any further movement.

In the meantime I prepared the engine block, which ▶

The cause of the peeling appears to be a faulty tin of paint used earlier on in the project.

had been primed way back in the project. This was cleaned of dirt, dust and any other debris before roughing up to key the top coat, and treated to two coats of top coat as per the radiator.

Once dry, new gaskets were used for the header tank and the bottom tank, and the radiator lifted into place. Unfortunately the engine crane couldn't attain the desired height, so it was lifted into place manually with two people and now looks good once again.

Further work on the mudguards and engine air filter is to come, bringing the project, all being well, to a close very soon!

Problems with the MF 51 disc mower mean the FE-79 mid-mounted mower has to be pressed into action this year. Andrew Hall demonstrates the sequence of mounting it onto the MF 35 tractor.



ack in 2020 I
benefitted by the
return of my
Massey Ferguson
51 disc mower,
which I'd
swapped for a disastrous SIP
185 drum mower, which had
lasted only two seasons before
breaking up terminally.

The MF 51 completed the 2020 season with no hitches, but halfway through the 2021 haymaking I caught the concrete surround of a drain, which caused some damage to the outer rotor. A strip down of the mower brought the bad news that the bearing housing of the rotor was worn

badly and beyond easy repair, as the bearings were running loose in the housing, allowing the rotor to rock dangerously!

With no parts to hand to repair it, I've had no option but to revert to using the FE-79 mid-mounted mower this year.

NICE TO USE

The mower was renovated about eight years ago and saw some service prior to the return of the disc mower. It is a nice mower to use, as one has a clear view of the cutter bar without having to look over the right shoulder, and ending up with a stiff neck as a result!

Being a knife mower, however, it is a little slower than a disc mower and requires a bit more routine maintenance than a disc mower, but when set up correctly does an excellent job of cutting.

BRACKETS

I have two sets of mounting brackets with the mower, one for a TE-20 and the other for my 35, which is approximately one inch longer between the footplate brackets and the rear face of the PTO housing, where the rear casting bolts onto the tractor.

The brackets bolt between the footrest and the clutch housing and have been left on the 35, knowing they'd be needed at some stage.

FITTING THE MOWER

Firstly, all the mower components were laid out and checked over before bolting the front casting to the mounting brackets under the centre of the tractor. There are two 1½ in AF setscrews that secure the casting, and these were tightened well to prevent them loosening in service. There are two rubber pads located under the mounting brackets to cushion the side thrust of the mower knife.

With the front casting in place, I then turned to the rear of the tractor and removed the linkage check chains and brackets, and fitted the rear casting to the four studs around the PTO shaft. There are four special nuts that replace the check chain >

WORKSHOP



Laid out

The front and rear castings, together with the main frame, were laid out ready for fitting to the tractor.



Cutter bar

This was stored separately and will be fitted after the main frame has been fitted to the tractor. Note the safety guard and wooden swath board.



Front casting

The front casting is bolted to the two brackets attached to the gearbox sides. There are two rubber pads present to cushion the side thrust of the mower knife during use.



Rear casting

Check chain brackets were removed from the tractor and replaced with the rear casting bolted to the four studs. The drive pulley is also provisionally in place here.



Main frame attached

The tractor was rolled backwards over the frame and then it was lifted and clamped to the front and rear castings.



Mounting spigot

The cutter bar attaches to this spigot, which requires cleaning to remove old grease and abrasive debris accumulated during storage.

nuts that locate the rear casting, and extra leverage was used with care to ensure they don't loosen due to vibration.

The two castings support the main frame of the mower, which was positioned behind and in line with the tractor, which was then rolled backwards over the frame until it lined up with the castings. It's too heavy to lift into place, so rolling the tractor over it is easier!

The frame was then lifted up and clamped into place. At this point the lift/lower bracket was placed over the right-hand lower link and clamped in place. This lifts and lowers the mower in and out of work using position control.

CUTTER BAR

Next was the fitting of the cutter bar to the frame. It sits on a spigot, which was cleaned up to remove any abrasive debris and coated in fresh grease to lubricate it before aligning the cutter bar with the spigot and sliding it on. Two 11/16 in AF setscrews then hold the cutter bar in place and have a locking tab to keep them tight.

DRIVE PULLEY

The drive pulley and matched belts were then fitted over the

PTO shaft and tensioned by revolving the eccentric collar behind the smaller pulley, followed by fitting the belt guard, which prevents grass wrapping round the shaft when in use.

SHARP KNIFE

A sharp knife was then fitted to the cutter bar. This was fed from the left-hand side under the tractor and slid into place along the bar. It was then secured to the connecting rod and cranked over by hand to check for correct operation with neither any tight spots, nor being too loose in the bar. The knife should run with

each section close to the fingers for crisp cutting action, and the wear plates adjusted to allow minimal, but free movement of the knife. Knife register was also checked, as it should run between the centres of each finger to give a clean, full cut!

SAFETY DEVICE

The mower incorporates a safety break back if it hits an obstruction and features a cable attached to the clutch pedal that pulls the pedal down, thus stopping the forward motion. This was set up, leaving the mower ready for use – subject to greasing.



Cutter bar lined up

Cutter bar was lined up with the main frame ready to be fitted, after swivelling it into the working position.



Lift/lower bracket

This is attached to the right-hand lower link arm, and lifts the mower in and out of work via the chain.

The check chains have been stowed on the lower links out of the way.



Cleaned & greased

The spigot mentioned in image six has now been prepared to accept the cutter bar. The engine was started and the height set to line up with the cutter bar.



Sharp knife

A sharp knife has been inserted from the left-hand side of the tractor and checked for free movement and correct adjustment to provide a clean cut.



Safety device

This cable attaches to the clutch pedal and pulls it down to stop forward motion if the mower breaks back due to overloading or an obstruction.



Cable clamp

The cable is clamped to the front casting and routed as straight as possible to prevent any kinks forming in it.



Belt tension

Drive belts are tensioned by revolving an eccentric collar behind the small pulley, and clamping it to the rear casting.



Ready for work

The mower is now ready for work, subject to lubricating all the necessary grease points and filling the drive shaft casing with oil to lubricate the bearings.

Massey Ferguson 135 sells for £25,000

At least 1,300 lots made up the Tractor World Spring sale on Saturday 21 May, held in warm weather at the Three Counties Showground. This auction usually takes place in the depths of winter, with numerous layers of clothing, but it was certainly not necessary in late May.

There were some good lots entered in this sale, particularly in the first half when an original, locally-supplied and used 1966 Ford 3000 went on to sell for £7,600. A new record was set for a well-restored Ford-Ferguson 9N, when some £7,000 was paid for it, but the Ford-Sherman plough behind it did not sell.

A restored, 1966 Ford Force 4000 Select-O-Speed, in grade 4 condition, changed hands at £5,000, but the big one was a Massey Ferguson 135 with Sekura cab that has apparently had two owners from new. It was a tractor that people certainly wanted to own, particularly as it only had 415 hours on the clock, and the hammer came down at £25,000. It is now part of a Scottish collection.

There was a well-sprayed David Brown 25 Cropmaster diesel in the sale, but it really needed more repairs to the panels, before the lovely coats of paint went on. It sold for £4,600. Two very well-restored International 8-16 Juniors were brought back from North America last year. The

better one was sold in April and this example changed hands at £11,000.

As for a fine, 1982 John Deere 3140, which suffered some door damage as it was unloaded, it sold for £9,500 and is to be used as a winter road run tractor.

A restored Ferguson-Brown A, no. 1109, on steel wheels (grade 4) sold for £22,000 and a 1969 Massey Ferguson 135, HEC 548G, with V5C (grade 5) was knocked down at a good £11,400.

A late entry from East Sussex was a 1978 MF 590, TAS 974S, in restored condition. It was let go at £7,900 and is to be put back to work on a smallholding.

The sale went very well, when all's said and done.

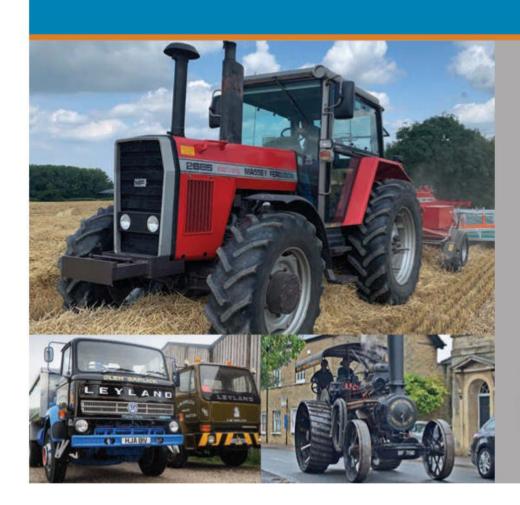

SALES REVIEWS

New MF records at Bancroft sale

We knew it was going to be big and it certainly lived up to its expectations! The second of Alan Bancroft's dispersal saw original and clean MF tractors go under the hammer, with record prices along the way.

Held near Skipton, North Yorkshire, on 7 May, a large crowd was present as well as numerous online bidders. Everything sold, and although all but two tractors were subject to VAT, bidders were not put off – with impressive prices achieved throughout the sale.

The traditional auction bell rang at 10am, with Bill King and Oliver Godfrey of Cheffins taking it in turns to sell the various items. One of the first items to cause a stir was a Ferguson mounted

two-furrow plough with slatted mouldboards, discs and skimmers. This implement was in very good condition and the bidding reflected that fact when it reached a selling price of £3,500!

There were numerous other ploughs on offer too, many of which went on to break auction records. Starting with a Massey Ferguson 150 two-furrow mounted conventional plough with discs and skimmers. That sold for £1,600, while an MF 797 two-furrow reversible plough made £2,100. Then came an MF 24 chisel plough that made £500 and MF 412 three-furrow conventional plough that sold for £900.

Continuing to set new records were three ploughs – an MF 46 two-furrow reversible and a three-furrow reversible that sold for £800 and £1,200 respectively, while best of all was a Massey Ferguson 86 five-furrow semi-mounted model at £2,600 – another record.

As would be expected, there were numerous items related to cultivators and planters in the sale, most bearing the Ferguson name. Starting things off, a couple of potato planters caught the eye and achieved record prices. The first was an MF 718 that sold for £1,400, while a 728 with bell did somewhat better when it made £2,400. Also doing well was an MF

32 five-row precision drill with seed units that was in original condition and sold for £1,500, while an MF 721 mounted grader blade and depth wheel went for £2,100.

To round things off, a Massey-Harris 561 mounted tipping buckrake, that had been on the farm from new, sold for £1,300. An MF 30 disc coulter drill with Reekie end-tow kit made £1,100.

They were followed by a rare, Massey Ferguson 711 single-row potato harvester with elevator that sold for £3,000, while an MF 37 PTO-driven crimper made a record price of £3,600. The most expensive implement though turned out to be a Massey Ferguson 39 folding spring-tine cultivator that had been supplied by A Burrell & Son of Haxey. Retaining its original condition, it sold for a record price of £5,900.

Records also fell among the selection of disc harrows in the sale – notably an MF 28 mounted set that sold for £1,700, while a 12ft trailed set that had been supplied by Peacock & Binnington made £1,800.

Among a fine selection of original-looking balers, the MF 20 was sold for £1,400, while a 128 sold for £4,000. Coming out on top though was a Massey Ferguson 124 baler in original condition that went for £4,300.

In great condition, following restoration, this Ferguson 30cwt trailer did well when it made £3,200.

The tractors went on to set record many records for the condition they were in. Doing well was a 1986 Massey Ferguson 675 that was fitted with extended mudguards and was showing 3,050 hours on the clock.

It sold for a record £20,000 – a type that doesn't normally get many fans. This tractor was in very good condition, but still retained its originality, as did a 1986 Massey Ferguson 698T Multi-Power with 4,298 hours behind it that did even better when it sold for £25,500.

In a similar vein, the final section of tractors on offer all achieved new records. The first was a 1988 Massey Ferguson 3050E with 1,615 working hours behind it. Getting a lot of attention, it sold for £22,500, while a 1996 MF 6120 Dynashift that was showing 1,280 hours made £27,800. With 3,284

hours on the clock and in similar condition was a 6150 from 1997 that sold for £18,000, while an 8110S Dynashift from 1996 went on to make £18,500.

The tractor that everybody wanted to see being sold was Alan's 1982 Massey Ferguson 1250 that had got 2,245 hours on the clock. Bidding certainly created a tense atmosphere with the price rising quickly, then slowing down before creeping up to the amazing selling price of £70,000, with a well-deserved round of applause following.

It was certainly a fitting highlight to an extremely interesting sale. It is rare for an incredible line-up of Massey Ferguson tractors and implements like this to go under the hammer, with so many quality machines on offer and records being broken continuously.

Tim Price does good work with his restorations and this is yet another one. This tractor came in a very sorry state but, amazingly, the rotten radiator still held water! This was just one item on a long list of parts that had to be replaced to make this fine Massey Ferguson 135 a machine to be proud of once again.

Having now been completely restored to a very high standard, both mechanically and cosmetically, it is available to purchase by anyone that cherishes this highly sought-after model.

On careful inspection, the engine had recently been overhauled, and the clutch replaced, but a significant amount of mechanical work had to be done. The hydraulics were not working, the diff lock and hand brake lever were both seized, leaking fuel lines had been patched up with rubber hose and the wheel rims were rotten.

A new hydraulic pump, draft control spring kit and quadrant have been fitted and the hydraulics are now perfectly adjusted. There is no play in the steering or the rear linkage. All suspect fuel lines have been replaced together with a new lift pump and filters.

Electrical work includes a replacement starter, dynamo, regulator, switches, instruments, lights, wiring and battery. New lower link arms, knuckle joints and clevis pins have been fitted because so much was completely seized. There are new wheels and tyres all round and the brakes have been replaced and are working well.

Most of the tin work is new and shiny, and the tractor has a V5C and registration plates. This tractor is now in excellent all-round condition.

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't on think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

Band 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been re-sprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

Band 6

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

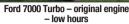

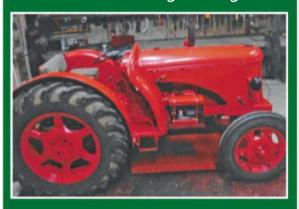

The most iconic David Brown tractor has to be the post-war Cropmaster; there are plenty of petrol/paraffin examples, but not the more desirable diesel example, as seen here.



Owner Brian Fotheringham purchased the tractor in 2012 from a farm near Stansted Airport in a poor dilapidated state. It's the 360th off the line and went to Bellington, Macclesfield, Cheshire originally.

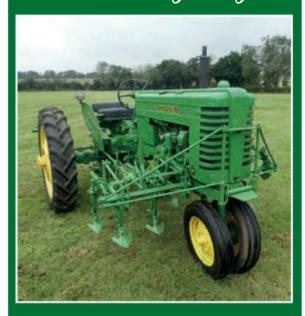
Brian gave the diesel engine a total rebuild, remembering it has a good solid block to start with, but a new crankshaft went in and so much more, plus a new cutch was fitted. The transmission had new bearings, as did the final drive, new brakes went on and the drums were skimmed at the same

All the tyres were renewed, new loom, along with lights and a battery the dynamo and starter were overhauled. The panels are still all the original, which were rubbed down and fully repainted in the correct shade of Hunting Pink.

"You don't find them this good," said Brian, who has spent £1,000s on the spares to rebuild the tractor. It has been used to plough and on road runs and has never let him down and certainly comes highly recommended.

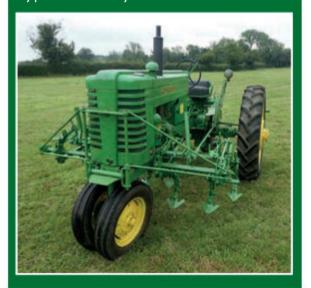

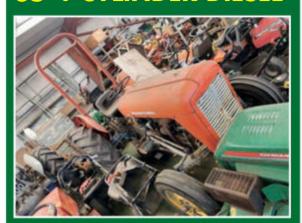

The tractor was purchased by its first owner in the Brecon area in 1971 and has remained in the local area ever since. The weather was not good on the Sunday, but on the Monday it changed and was dry. A sale was staged on the Monday that looks as though it has the potential to take off.

It was great to see the five JCB excavators taking part in the Platinum Jubilee pageant in London commemorating Her Majesty the Queen's 70-year reign, with the 1953 Fordson E1A Major Loader leading them all! They paraded down The Mall towards Buckingham Palace, past tens of thousands of cheering spectators that were lining the route.

This is when he joined the vintage tractor scene and was an early member of the Cornish Tractor Club. He created a vintage tractor registration business, working for clients all over the UK and for organisations like the Ford & Fordson Association in its early years.

He liked to make sure classic tractors featured safety cabs where they should, complying with legal regulations, and he also had a great passion to see tractors preserved authentically, including having age-related registrations.

As many of you may know, Thomas could accurately quote the history of many different tractors, just from there registration numbers.

Both Thomas and his wife, Liz, were privileged to have visited the DVLA a number of times and had travelled the length and breadth of the UK mainland with their Land Rover and caravan and in pursuit of rallies and vintage fairs. Thomas was also passionate about ploughing and served many years on various committees, which also took him around the country.

Thomas and Liz made many friends, and he was the man to go to in his area for tractor workshop manuals. On occasions he would commentate at various shows, including the Royal Cornwall Show. Through his efforts he welcomed the National Vintage Tractor Road Run to Cornwall, which was a very successful event.

He was a keen Ford man and will be very much missed by everyone in the preservation movement. We send our condolences to Liz and their family at this sad time.

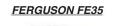
