# **Ben Burgess to acquire J W Doubleday**

LONG-STANDING JOHN DEERE DEALER J W DOUBLEDAY is to be sold to Ben Burgess, in line with the manufacturer's Dealer of Tomorrow strategy.

Doubleday has sold John
Deere's agricultural machinery for
more than 40 years – an
anniversary marked in June 2022
– but an agreement has been
reached with Ben Burgess to
transfer all staff and sites, with a
completion date expected before
the end of October.

The deal will see Ben Burgess, which has been a John Deere dealer since 1964, expand into Lincolnshire for the first time, adding four more sites to its existing seven. It will take over the

sites at Holbeach, Old Leake and Swineshead in Lincolnshire, as well as increasing its footprint in Norfolk with Doubleday's depot at Kings Lynn.

It means that, from November, Ben Burgess will serve farmers and contractors in Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire, Northamptonshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, and Rutland.

lan Doubleday-Collishaw, grandson of the company's founder, commented: "This decision has not been taken lightly, but the Doubleday-Collishaw family is determined to protect the future of its loyal team and the longevity of a reputable John Deere dealer across our

trading area.

"The combination of our joint processes, dedicated teams and the infrastructure already in place at Ben Burgess will deliver the best value to both our team and customers. We are confident the level of service you our customers are accustomed to will continue undisrupted."

# **Lowering input costs**

Farmers are showing interest in machinery and equipment that will help them to farm more sustainably and lower their costs of production.

With soaring costs growers are searching for ways to improve efficiencies and lower their inputs, say business advisers at the Midlands Machinery Show, which takes place on 16-17 November.

"People are interested in machinery that will help them be more efficient and reduce input costs, while still allowing them to continue with the same farming system," says Alex Olivant, farm business consultant at Active Business Partnerships in Nottinghamshire.

Sam Tugwell, a regional advisor at Velcourt, helped a number of clients last winter to access government capital grants, and will be exhibiting at this year's event. "Mostly clients were using the capital grant for reduced input machinery, like direct drills," he says. "It wasn't people who were having a wholesale change to the way they farm, it was those who were upgrading their existing direct drills.

"Farmers are also showing interest in inter-row hoes for cereal crops, and rotary hoes that remove weeds from standing crops," he adds.

# **British National Ploughing**

he Chatsworth Estate will be host to this years' British National Ploughing Championships & Country Festival, when the event is held at Glapwell, Derbyshire, on 8-9 October 2022, by kind permission of the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire.

Ploughing entries are now in and more than 240 ploughmen and women will be travelling from all corners of Great Britain to take part in the Championships, vying for the titles in their respective discipline. The top 10 reversible and conventional ploughers from the first day will compete in a 'Plough-Off' Final on the second day, hoping to win the title and a place to represent England in next year's World or European Championships.

The top 10 competitors in the vintage trailed, hydraulic, classic and classic reversible classes will again win a place in their respective 'Plough-Off' Final again to win the title and hopefully a place to compete in the 2023 European Vintage Ploughing Championships.

There will also be classes for highcut tractor ploughing, crawler tractors, horticultural, Ferguson, Ford & Fordson and David Brown. Finally, on both days there will be the crowd-pulling heavy horses, with 16 pairs entered in the general purpose ploughing class on the Saturday and twelve ploughing in the high cut class on Sunday. Alongside the ploughing competitions, visitors will be able to shop and browse in the trade stand and shopping area and craft marquee, see the latest agricultural machinery for sale being demonstrated in the working area, as well as displays of old vintage tractors and machinery. They can also watch steam ploughing engines, showing how contractors would plough and work the fields in the early part of the 20th century.

The 250-acre site on Elm Tree Farm is looking good, although dry at the moment, and will be very easy to find – only a few minutes from junction 29 on the M1. After a recent site visit, Sue Frith, Chief Executive of event organiser the Society of Ploughmen, said: "We are really looking forward to holding the Championships at Glapwell! We are very grateful that our host and President, the Duke of Devonshire, invited us to Derbyshire as this is the first time in 71 years the event has ever been held in the county – and it couldn't be on a better venue than the Chatsworth Estate."

# Northrop project

County and Roadless tractors may be the most popular when it comes to Ford-based conversions, but Northrop had plenty to offer - as Jonathan Whitlam discovered.

mong the rarest and perhaps most unusual of Ford tractor conversions, the Northrop four- and six-cylinder tractors are both fascinating and perhaps something of a case of a lost opportunity.

For just a few short years in the 1960s, the Northrop name was proudly used on the bonnets of four-wheel drive tractors based on the Ford 5000, yet by the end of the same decade these tractors would head into obscurity. The reasons were both product related and a result of larger company decisions and, in the end, a promising tractor design would be dropped by the wayside as new owners took over the business.

Luckily, several Northrop tractors have survived and today act as a reminder of

not only a then new and unique tractor design, but also of what could have been if the project had been allowed to continue.

# **CHASESIDE**

The Northrop tractor had its origins with a completely different firm called Chaseside. Founded in 1937 in Enfield, Middlesex, but with a history going back to 1925, Chaseside was originally an engineering firm that produced components for tractor and loader manufacturers.

Soon Chaseside began producing its own design of crane and loading shovel based on the Fordson Model N tractor, produced by Ford at Dagenham, and in the

1940s moved its production

increased production of its loaders, cranes, shunting tractors and also dumpers, the latter soon becoming one of the company's main products, next to loading shovels. By the 1950s the firm was looking to expand production and produce larger machines and so, as a means to this end, it merged with a Lancashire firm called British Northrop.

# **BRITISH NORTHROP**

A long-established producer of cotton mill looms, British Northrop was founded in 1902 and was based at a factory in Blackburn from 1907. With plenty of spare factory space, thanks to the downturn in the British textile industry, that would eventually prove to be terminal, the merger with Chaseside was seen as the way forward to return the business to profitability and a secure future.





Following the merger with Chaseside in 1959, most of the heavy manufacturing, previously all undertaken in Hertfordshire, was moved up to the Northrop factory in Blackburn and this included the developments and production of a new range of four-wheel drive loading shovels, based on Fordson skid units, from 1962.



# **FOUR-WHEEL DRIVE 5000**

In 1964 the Ford Motor Company ceased producing the Fordson range of tractors at Dagenham in Essex and moved over to a brand-new facility in Basildon producing the new 6X tractors, which were completely new from the ground up. The four-model range comprised the three-cylinder 2000, 3000 and 4000, plus the four-cylinder, flagship 5000.

Several companies, including Chaseside, had been using Fordson tractors as the skid units for their construction equipment and now serious retooling was necessary to adapt the new tractors for this role. This also meant that companies such as County Commercial Cars and Roadless Traction, which produced four-wheel drive versions of the Fordson Super Major for agricultural and industrial applications, now had to redesign their products to fit the new 5000 model as the new base unit.

For Roadless this was fairly easy, as its smaller front wheel, four-wheel drive axles were easily adapted to the new Ford 5000, while County had only slightly more work to do to make its equal-sized wheel, four-wheel drive conversion complete with twin prop-shaft drive, suitable for use with the new 5000.

The Roadless version, called the Ploughmaster 65, was the least changed of all conversions and the smaller front wheels allowed for a pretty generous turning circle, while the County Super Four 654, was considerably heavier thanks to the massive cast front axle needed to support the equal-sized wheel

design. The benefit of this, with increased traction and hillside 'clinging' ability, was only slightly mitigated by the very large turning circle required on the headlands!

Having prior knowledge of the change to the new tractor range, both Roadless and County were able to get prototype machines up and running and ready for production by the time of the launch of the new tractors at the end of 1964. These would soon be followed by six-cylinder versions of the two tractors, with Roadless producing the Ploughmaster 90 and County the 954 Super Six, both using Ford six-cylinder industrial engines fitted into the 5000 'chassis'.

Back in 1964, while all this was going on, Chaseside took on a new engineer called David J B Brown, who had the idea of producing a four-wheel drive prime mover for agriculture, which was designed in such a way that it could also be used for the more arduous conditions of forestry and sugar cane work.

The idea was obviously seen as a good one because, by the end of 1964, a working prototype had been assembled using the Ford 5000 as a base unit.

For increased ground clearance, equal-sized wheels were used with the front axle mounted under the tractor, making the new machine much higher than the nearest equivalent, the County 654. This also allowed for a single propshaft, positioned centrally and therefore less mechanical complication than the County, as well as less weight.

This also had the increased benefit of a much tighter turning circle than was

ever possible with the 654, although stability was less good, the County always being the best design for working on steep ground.

The design team decided to keep all the Ford components, even retaining the Ford tin work for the bonnet and rear mudguards, something that the Roadless and County tractors also did. The four-cylinder, 65hp Ford diesel engine formed the heart of the machine and drove through a standard eight-speed transmission. It was also intended to offer the Select-O-Speed, change-on-the-move, 10-speed transmission as an option, but it seems that only one of the prototypes was ever so equipped and the further option of a torque converter transmission was never fitted, although it was advertised as available.

If Select-O-Speed had been specified then it would have significantly added to the cost of the new machine, which probably explains why it seems not have been taken up by prospective customers. Following field trials with the prototypes, the new tractor was put into production at Blackburn in the middle of 1965, by which time its instigator, Mr Brown, had departed to join a rival firm known as Muir-Hill. The new tractor was given the title of the Northrop 5004, despite being a Chaseside project.

This was probably done to differentiate it from the Chaseside line of construction machinery that was also using the Ford 5000 as a skid unit, with the powered steering axle on the tractor being shared with the latest loading shovel range.

# **GOING TURBOCHARGED**

By the time the Northrop 5004 appeared on the market in the summer of 1965, both Roadless and County had produced their much more powerful six-cylinder, four-wheel drive conversions of the Ford 5000, which only increased the feeling of the 5004 not being powerful enough, its 65 horses being quite a small figure

for a tractor of such stature. Even when the Ford 5000 engine was tweaked in 1967 to produce 67hp, this was still not enough to make the Northrop 5004 stand out.

The company could have gone down the six-cylinder route, although this would have entailed some major reworking of the design. Instead, it decided to fit a turbocharger, buying in a CAV turbocharger and fitting it to the Ford 5000 engine. This produced a useful 85hp and tractors that were fitted with it from new were called the 5004T. A kit was also produced that could convert earlier tractors easily into a turbocharged version, thereby increasing power enough to make the Northrop into a very useful machine.

There was a problem however.
Turbocharging of diesel engines was still in its infancy in the mid-1960s and there was some scepticism about the idea and its application. Hard as it is to believe nowadays, back then many thought that the turbocharger would shorten the life of the engine and cause all sorts of untold damage! In a sense this was correct, as Northrop did not



uprate the rest of the machine to cope with the increase in power and this did lead to some breakdowns, especially with the power take-off shaft.

Despite all this the Northrop 5004T still struggled to gain any substantial sales orders, although it must also be pointed out that County's 854T and the Roadless Ploughmaster 80, that also used a turbocharger on the Ford four-cylinder 5000 engine, also failed to make a mark, so perhaps it was not the Northrop's overall design that failed to catch on, just the 'new-fangled' turbochargers!

Despite this, Northrop actually marketed the turbocharger kit to be fitted to standard Ford 5000 tractors for a time and in Stuart Gibbard's excellent book, *Ford Tractor Conversions*, he states that an example was tested by the Ford Motor Company and probably led to the later development of the 7000 model.

The Northrop 5004T carried on in production, with just small numbers being produced for mostly the home market, the expected overseas sales never having really materialised, despite a

Belgian company using the 5004 as the basis for a backhoe loader. In the end, less than 150 5004 and 5004T tractors were built, making this one of the more exclusive Ford tractor conversions.

# **SIX-CYLINDER PROTOTYPES**

With hindsight it is easy to see that the Northrop tractor should have used a six-cylinder engine from the beginning, to not only achieve more power, but also useful weight for traction. This can be proven by looking at how County eventually phased out its four-cylinder 654 and 754 models in favour of six-cylinder machines that then went from strength to strength.

Even by 1966, Northrop had already come to the same conclusion and at that year's Royal Smithfield Show a new tractor was exhibited, called the 5004/6. This machine was one of two protoypes that used a Ford 2704E six-cylinder engine of 112hp fitted into the Northrop tractor design by the use of a chassis frame. Earlier lessons had been learned, with the power take-off and the clutch strengthened to take the extra power offered by the six-pot motor.

The new prototypes looked very similar to the original 5004, except for the longer engine and therefore lengthened Ford tinwork and of course, the substantial frame included to support the unstressed engine block.

Extensive field trials with these two machines would lead to the official launch of the six-cylinder Northrop tractor in the following summer of 1967, although it would look very different from the prototypes.

# SIX-CYLINDER 5000

It seems that Northrop had second thoughts of using the more powerful engine and when the production Northrop 5006 tractor arrived in 1967, it used the less powerful 90hp Ford 2703E engine instead of the 112hp unit used in the two prototype machines.

Also gone was all trace of the Ford tinwork, it being replaced by a new bonnet of Northrop's own design and construction that was much more angular and presumably cheaper than adapting the Ford bonnet to fit. This had the effect of making the new tractor look very different to any of the earlier

Northrop tractors, as well as having the added benefit of allowing for a much larger fuel tank to be fitted.

Finally, the Northrop tractor had reached a more advanced stage of development, the six-cylinder 5006 offering more power and weight and making the concept into something that could really be put to good use. However, there was competition, not only from the likes of County and Roadless, but also from a newcomer to the agricultural tractor world.

The Muir-Hill 101 was also based on the Ford 5000 and used a similar, equal-sized wheel set-up and driveline as the Northrop – not surprising really, as it was designed by none other than Mr Brown, who had been the Northrop's instigator!

Launched in 1966, the six-cylinder, 108hp Muir-Hill 101 was already on sale by the time the Northrop 5006 became available in 1967 and therefore had a head start for the limited market for such machines.

With 18 more horsepower available, it would have perhaps been best if Northrop had continued with the 112hp 2704E engine, as this would have made it more competitive with the Muir-Hill – but it didn't!

In the end the Northrop 5006 would not get the chance to prove itself against its cousin, the Muir-Hill 101, because events happening at the top of the Chaseside and Northrop company would overtake the new tractor before full production could even begin.

# WHAT COULD HAVE BEEN

The year 1968 would see JCB acquire the Chaseside business, mainly because the Staffordshire-based firm wanted to get its hands on Chaseside's very successful, seven-model loading shovel range.

This saw a swift end to manufacture of the new Northrop 5006 tractor, with only four being built and one sold, as the whole Northrop project was cancelled. JCB even put the last three off the production line to work on its own farming estate.

The following year saw loading shovel production moved from Blackburn to the JCB heartland of Rocester. Other Chaseside machines were dropped from the range, but the loading shovels went on to be produced until a new range of 400 Series JCB machines was introduced to great acclaim in 1971.

JCB had no plans to enter the agricultural market at the time, and it was only after introducing later products, such as the JCB Loadall telescopic materials handler in the 1970s, that was primarily designed for the construction industry but soon found itself on farms, that the company began to produce equipment specifically for this sector.

This also led to the introduction of the JCB Fastrac in 1991 which, with its revolutionary suspension system design, allowed for fast road travel as well as being capable of primary cultivation roles.

The Fastrac was probably as far removed from the Northrop tractors as





you could get, but the Northrop did have a lasting legacy thanks to the Muir-Hill 101 that had many features in common with it. Muir-Hill hit the market right with the 101 and went on to great success, producing a range of models by

1972, including some of the most powerful British-built models ever constructed up to that time.

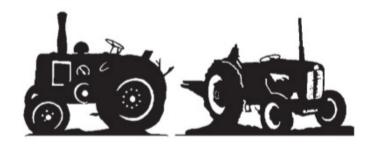
By the end of the 1970s a Series III range, with a modern cab and many other features, was in production and

this showed what could have been for Northrop if circumstances had been different. Sadly, the Muir-Hill tractors ceased to be built in 1983 but they, and the Northrop machines, live on today as part of enthusiasts' collections.

Personally, I can't help but wonder what would have happened if the first Northrop had been fitted with a six-cylinder engine of around 100hp. Would this story have been very different?

Of course we shall never know, but one thing is for sure and that is the fact that the Northrop tractors should be seen as the prototypes for the Muir-Hill tractor range, as they have so much in common with each other. And that, if nothing else, means that the Northrop machines were, at least at some level, a resounding success!

# Big Deere

# Joseph Lewis talks to Andrew Burrows and discovers the story behind what is believed to be the first John Deere 4055 sold in Somerset.

he John Deere 55 Series of tractors built in the USA at the Waterloo Works, Iowa, was introduced in the United Kingdom in 1989. The five-model range featured tractors from 128-228hp, with each using a new, 7.6-litre, turbocharged straight six and a 15-speed mechanical powershift transmission.

At the front, the driven front axle featured a 13-degree castor angle – enabling the wheels to lean into turns and improve the turning circle. A rocker switch enabled the operator to engage the front axle manually or select 'Auto' – which disengaged drive when either brake was applied and then re-engaged it once the pedal was released.

Drive also disengaged automatically over 14kph and engaged when both

brake pedals were depressed, for four-wheel braking.

John Deere was famous for its closed-centre hydraulic system and the 55 Series was no exception. With a 2,530psi (175bar) standby pressure, the system utilised a 3cu in (50cc) radial pump on the three smallest models and a 4cu in (65cc) pump on the 4755 and 4955, driven by the crankshaft, for fast-acting hydraulics with power conservation at its heart.

The SG2 cab, loved by some and loathed by others, was fitted to all five models and included the IntelliTrak monitoring system for the operator. The screen to the left of the steering column showed engine revolutions, PTO rpm, linkage position (up or down), area worked per hour, total area covered, distance travelled and, with the optional

radar fitted, a true reading for the aforementioned functions as well as the percentage of wheel slip.

The right-hand screen displayed fuel level, engine coolant temperature with warning and stop engine alarms, engine speed (in electronic 'dial' form), ground speed and operating hours.

They were impressive tractors, but even the smallest of the range, the 4055, was an unusual sight in the UK and a big tractor in the day for Somerset. Despite this, one farm made the decision to purchase one as a central part of its farming policy and Andrew Burrows was the fortunate driver.

"After leaving school at Wadham in Crewkerne, in 1978, I started to look after the pigs and cattle for Hallett's of Shepton Beauchamp, near South Petherton," explained Andrew. "We

lived at nearby Barrington Court where my dad, John, was a tractor driver as part of a team of five operators. This was at the time when there were 1,200 milking cows and he drove a comparatively large Massey Ferguson 188 supplied by Sparrows of Martock.

"I stayed with the MF theme when I started my tractor driving. This was a 699 four-wheel drive, registration B58 WYB, supplied by South Western Farmers of Crewkerne from well-known salesman Brian Hook."

# **RED TO GREEN**

When JD dealer Milton Mills Engineering (Dorset) Ltd. opened in neighbouring Seavington St. Michael, this was more local for new machines and servicing, plus the start of reducing the number of smaller tractors on the farm into fewer, larger models. The salesman at the time was Bernard Steele.

"One of the first John Deere models I drove was a 3640 on a 1986 'D'

registration," continued Andrew. "This eight-speed model stayed for three years and was primarily used for ploughing and cultivating 500 acres of wheat. Then the 4055 came along in 1989, really to have one, large, main tractor to replace the five existing tractors. Milton Mills had two 4055 tractors at the time and one seen at a Yeovil Ploughing Match is likely the demonstrator.

"The 4055, registration G475 LYA, was certainly one of the biggest John Deere tractors in the area and likely one of the first in Somerset. This was especially true when Massey Ferguson 590 and 690

models were the usual size of the day used on local farms.

"The 4055 also worked hard for around 1,200 hours a year on primary cultivation, using a Dowdeswell six-furrow plough and furrow press, plus a four-metre power harrow and combination drill. The 4055 also worked alongside a John Deere 1075 combine harvester with 14ft header on non-stop summers, harvesting barley, rape and wheat."

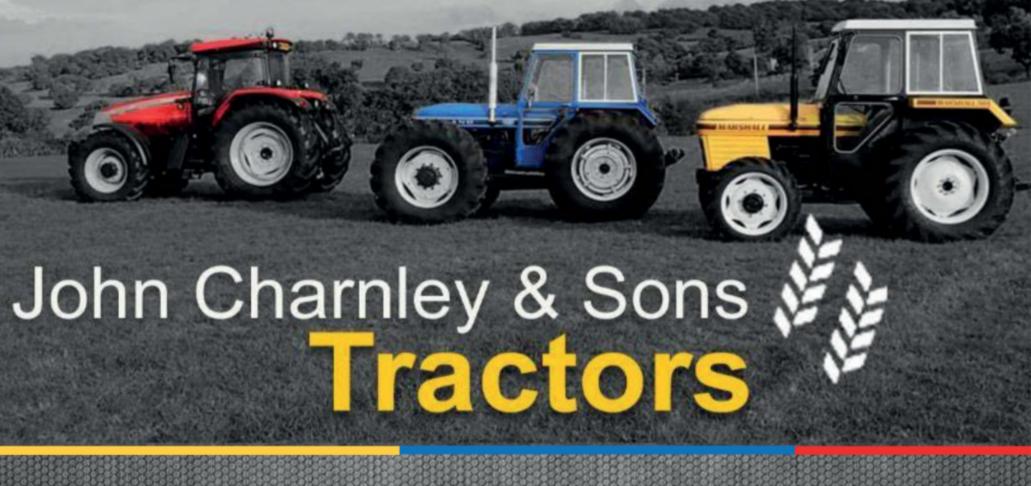
Andrew enjoyed 16 years on the Halletts' farm, building up a good, working relationship with Milton Mills which supplied and serviced the John Deere equipment. He then went on to deliver milk for Cricket St. Thomas Dairies, driving Volvo F10 and FL10 trucks with milk tanker trailers.

"The 4055 was such a smooth tractor to operate, especially with the Power Shift transmission," concluded Andrew. "I also found the electronic information on the digital display useful and the only feature not fitted to our model was the optional radar.

"I really enjoyed my big John Deere 4055 experience, as the tractor really made an impact on our farm. I also understand that our example was traded in to Wool, Dorset, and I would be grateful to know if this significant tractor for our area is still around."

# Magnificent Middleweight

# Robert Chisholm, from Eyemouth in Berwickshire, talks to Scott Lambert about his latest restoration project.

s many tractor
enthusiasts will testify,
it's easy to be 'bitten by
the bug' and Scotland's
Robert Chisholm is no
exception. Already the
proud owner of a Nuffield 342 and
Leyland 245 Synchro, purchased as
non-runners, he was looking for a
four-cylinder model to join the fold
and happened upon a 255 in 2019.

The tractor was purchased from Towlaw in Co. Durham, in July of that year, but several months passed before remedial work commenced.

In a bid to ascertain what state the tractor was in mechanically, Robert fitted new fuel filters and bled the system before attempting to start it. After a jump start, the Leyland 4/98DT engine spluttered into life and it soon became clear that all was not well with the 3.77-litre unit.

It was evident that it was only running on three cylinders and so a thorough investigation was required. "I decided to strip off the cylinder head, where the true extent of the damage was revealed," said Robert. "Number three cylinder had a stuck valve, which had caused a bent push rod.

"The head was stripped and sent for skimming and a new valve seat fitted to number three cylinder, as well as valves and guides. At this point I decided to fit new liners, seals and pistons, as the engine was this far down. Also, when the pistons were out, new standard shells where fitted to the big ends to be safe.

"Exchange injectors were sourced and fitted and the fuel pump was sent off to a diesel specialist to be checked over."

The fuel system comprises a diaphragmtype lift pump, driven off the camshaft, a DPA injection pump with mechanical governor and twin filters, with sediment bowls and drain plugs, for protection.

"After all of the parts were assembled and the engine was timed up and bled, a battery was connected and the engine fired up!" Robert exclaimed. This new engine for the Leyland tractor range, complete with 98mm (3.858in) bore, was designed and built at Bathgate to help overcome the problems associated with the 100mm engine that was a leftover from the days of BMC. Three basic derivatives were used, using the 4/98NT as a base.

'NT' denoted 'Normal rating' and 'Tractor', while 'DT' and 'TT' illustrated that the engine was either 'De-rated' or 'Turbocharged'. The 'TT' would come later, with tractors like the 282 Synchro, while the 6/98DT and 6/98NT were six-cylinder versions used in the 285/485 and 2100/4100 respectively.

Amongst the changes built in to the new 98 Series engines were a new cylinder head with redesigned valves, porting and injector location, as well as a revised liner design that specifically addressed issues with sealing.

With a 125mm (4.921in) stroke, the 4/98 was ideal for agricultural applications, thanks to a high torque output at modest engine speed and good fuel consumption.

At the time the 4/98 received critical acclaim, but would also go on to win an army of fans and transform the likes of the 344 and 384 – which became the 255 and 270 respectively.

The 255 was one of three models in the Middleweight range of tractors, alongside the 245 and 270. The sole Lightweight model was the 154, while the Heavyweight range comprised the six-cylinder 285, 485, 2100 and 4100.

# **WORK BEGINS**

With the arrival of 2020, work began in earnest to check and overhaul the transmission and remainder of the driveline, as the hydraulic system appeared to be in good order and simply required a new filter.

The transmission oil was drained and the right rear axle housing was removed to permit the renewal of the seal. The



brake housings were stripped and cleaned and the discs were re-lined before reassembly. The brake linkage and associated shafts were also disassembled and cleaned before new bushes, springs and grease nipples went on.

The clutch was overhauled with a service exchange unit, including bearings, seals and clutch plates, before attention turned to the front axle.

"The front axle assembly had been subject to some amazing fixes!" Robert told *T&M*. "A previous owner seems to have been a great welder, as the king pins had been welded up – rendering the axle useless. A used axle was sourced and overhauled with new bushes and wheel bearings, as well as a full set of steering rods fitted."

In April 2020, with the Covid-19 pandemic providing Robert with an opportunity to lavish more time on the

Leyland than he had previously hoped, work shifted to the panels, seat and cab. All parts were shotblasted and rust treated to preserve them until they could be repaired and primed.

The inner mudguards required sections to be welded in before they could be filled and primed. New outer mudguards where sourced, along with a used right-hand door, as the one fitted to the tractor was originally from a 'Q' cab. The roof was then repaired and primed before it, along with the other panels, received their top coats of paint.

Those that have experience of the suspension seat fitted to Leyland tractors will appreciate that the mechanism, if not cared for, will seize and not function as intended. Robert stripped and repaired the unit on the 255, before fitting new bushes and a damper. The original type of seat pan is no longer

available, but a new one was located that made for a good substitute.

By this point both the spring and summer months had passed, but the skid unit had received both primer and top coats and it was time to start reassembly. The original glass went back in the cab along with new rubbers, a roll-up rear window and roof lining.

The lights and wiring loom also went on at this stage, as well as the tyres. The front wheels received a pair of BKT TF 9090 6.00-16 three-rib tyres, whilst the rear wheels stayed as they were. They were badly damaged and too far gone to do anything with, so Robert kept his eyes peeled for some suitable replacements.

A pair turned up in early 2022 and these were stripped, prepared and painted in readiness for a pair of Goodyear Sure Grip All Service 12.4/11-32 tyres to be fitted.







During one of the Covid-19 lockdowns, an online farm sale nearby turned up a set of front weights that had been listed as John Deere but where in fact orange – from a Nuffield 4/65, the predecessor to the Leyland range. These, along with an age-related registration number provided the finishing touches and the tractor was ready for its first outing.

The BVAA Rally, in May, saw the 255 go up against some stiff competition, but such was the quality of the restoration that it received the prize for best Leyland tractor in show. A fitting outcome given the lengths that Robert has gone to to give the tractor a new lease of life.

# **PRODUCTION**

Anyone looking for a no-nonsense tractor in the early 1990s may have had one of Case IH's budget-spec tractors on their radar, and today these still represent good valve if high levels of sophistication are not high on your agenda.

Derived from the 95 Series, which could trace its roots back to the World Wide models of the early '70s, the 'Stockman Special' models initially came in two forms in the autumn of 1991 – two-wheel drive 695 and four-wheel drive 895. Four-wheel drive 695 and two-wheel drive 895 models were introduced around 18 months later.

Many were fitted with loaders and found their way onto livestock units, where their basic configuration and low cab height were just what was needed in the confines of a stock yard.

# **CLUTCH, TRANSMISSION & BRAKES**

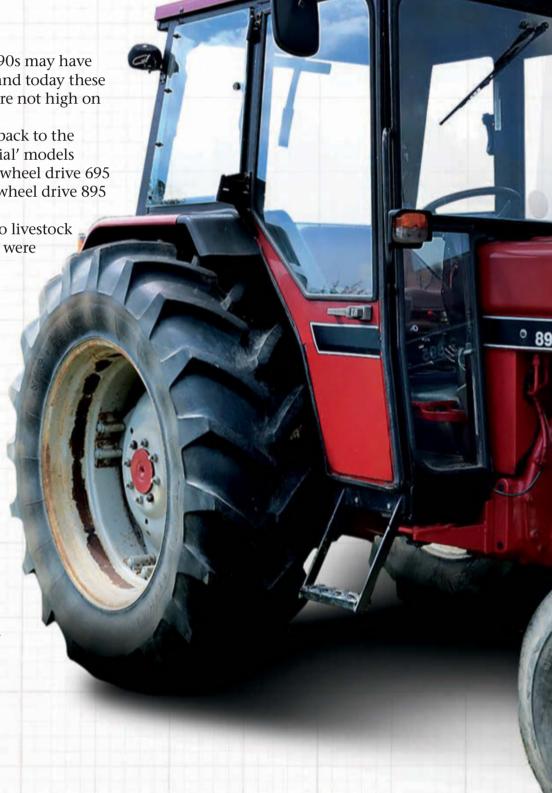
A 12-inch (304mm) clutch was standard across the Stockman Special range, but the transmissions varied according to model. The 695 was fitted with an eight forward, four reverse synchromesh gearbox, while the 895 used the 16 forward, eight reverse synchromesh 'box – with an electro-hydraulic powershift doubling the number of gears of the smaller tractor.

Those wanting a shuttle, particularly useful for loader work, appear to have not been formerly offered this as an option, but several examples featuring a shuttle have been offered for sale in recent years. It is unclear how their specification originated, particularly as Case IH stated that no options were available.

On four-wheel drive models the front axle was engaged electro-hydraulically by a dash-mounted rocker switch. The system would default to four-wheel drive should hydraulic pressure fail. As well as a centre driveline, a limited-slip differential was part of the package.

Despite the budget nature of these tractors, wet disc brakes were included as part of the spec – self-equalising and self-adjusting.

Front tyre sizes were 7.50-16 on two-wheel drive models and 11.2 R24 and 12.4 R24 respectively for four-wheel drive versions, while the 695 was equipped with 13.6 R36 rear tyres and 16.9 R34s graced the 895.



# **ENGINE**

The 695 used the 3,917cc D-239 engine, generating 69hp and 211Nm of torque at 1,600rpm, while the 895 was powered by the 4,392cc D-268 motor – producing 82.3hp and 284Nm of torque at 1,400rpm.

Both were tried and tested four-cylinder units developed by IH in the 1960s and '70s respectively. The smaller of the two had a 98.4mm bore

and 128.5mm stroke, while the larger had a 100mm bore and 140mm stroke, giving it additional lugging power. Rated speed was 2,300rpm and 2,400rpm respectively.

The D-268, in particular, was a great performer – also powering the 844XL to critical acclaim, while the D-239 was used in turbocharged form (DT-239) in the 856XL – another tractor renowned for its performance and it was not uncommon for D-239-equipped tractors, like the 695, to be retro-fitted with a turbo.

Parts are plentiful, but reliability is one of the hallmarks of this range of German-built engines.

# **HYDRAULICS&PTO**

In a bid to save money and offer a competitive package for those looking for a no-frills tractor, Case IH had to reduce the specification of the standard 695 and 895 and some of this came in the area of the hydraulic system.

Maximum working pressure and flow rates remained unchanged at 2,500psi across the board and 10.7gpm (48.5 litres per minute)/11.2gpm (50.8 litres per minute) respectively, but lift capacity took a hit on the 895 – ending up the same as the 695.

The standard ag-spec 895 had a lift capacity of 2,380kg, but it utilised a single assistor ram in order to reach this figure. The Stockman Special tractors had a lift capacity of just 2,000kg, which is the same as the standard-spec 695 without an assistor. Up to two assistors could be fitted to the standard 895 (two on the four-wheel drive only), boosting lift capacity to 2,830kg and some Stockman Special tractors received this upgrade on farm, as it was not a factory or dealer fit option.

The other main difference in this area between standard tractors and the Stockman Special limited edition was the power take-off. A 540rpm-only system was fitted, rather than the 540/1,000rpm of the standard 695 and 895, with 59.3hp and 67.8hp available at the shaft respectively.

Just one auxiliary valve was fitted to these tractors, as well as a pick-up hitch.

# CAB

If you required an XL cab, or even a flat floor, the Stockman Special was not for you. What you got was Case IH's 'L' cab – predominantly the same as that fitted to many other IH and Case IH models that had come before, albeit with rear-hinged doors – as was the case with 95 Series tractors.

It was an economy cab, like that fitted to the standard 695 and 895, but without the luxuries – not even a heater! Many argued

that a tractor destined for a stock farm did not need such creature comforts, as the operator was on and off the seat opening gates and such like, so Case IH made cuts to save money.

The low roof height was naturally welcomed, for easy manoeuvring in and around low buildings, and visibility was decent thanks to glass in all but the lower portions of the doors. It had an overall height of 92in (233cm).

The right-hand console was straight out of the 74 Series, while the left was similar with the exception that 'H' pattern gear levers were employed rather than the 'Lightning flash' gate that emerged in the early '70s.

Instrumentation was analogue and chunky rocker switches were fitted for control of the lights and the like – it really was back to basics!

Official prices for the launch models were £9,999 (cash price) for the 695 and £13,250 for the 895. Case IH made it quite clear that there were no discounts available!

# **Britannia**

Dear T&M,

I have to say that it was a very interesting article in the August 2022 issue of T&M. I am a friend of Robbie Thorpe, though no relation, and it just so happens that I have been researching another Britannia crawler in West Norfolk.

As Jonathan Whitlam eluded, Britannia was Track Marshall's big white elephant. The idea was for it to be ideal for top work, with a 70hp Perkins engine. In essence, the tractor was too heavy for top work, but not heavy enough for major ploughing. Production of the tractor began in 1983 and ceased in 1987, with as few as 30 being built - as four-wheel drive tractors were becoming more popular and offered by most of the leading manufacturers.

Tracking down these crawlers is proving difficult, but I have searched many archives and have come up with one supplied to Arnold Compton Farms, Bedfordshire, that was later exported to the West Indies to work on a sugar cane plantation.

Gerald M Neave, from Market Rasen, had one (serial number 1510028) in 1993, and this appeared at the Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show in 2008.

Private collections include one at Robert Crawford's, Peter Gaskins has one and Andrew Beaulah has one that was used at an open day in 2012. Robbie Thorpe of Holbeach, Lincolnshire, has one that he uses at various working days that he arranges.

This brought the figure to six, but I have just been to see



Britannia serial number 1510018. This tractor was supplied by J W Doubleday, of Holbeach St. John, to a farm at Holbeach St. Marks in 1983/84. The farm sold up in 1986, which is when the present owner, Graham Read, bought the crawler for his farm at Middle Drove Marshland. The crawler is fitted with PTO and three point-linkage, which was a big advantage - as with a Ransomes offset, three-furrow reversible he could plough out of the furrow and with a PTO he could attach a power harrow which was ideal when trying to farm the difficult, heavy land of Marshland Fen.

The tractor, in the main, is still original apart from a couple of clutch renewals. The track pins and bushes have never been touched and look as good as new. Sone weathering is visible, as expected after almost 40 years, and the future for the tractor is for it to go to Robert Crawford's to have the steering clutches serviced and a general check over.

As Graham has retired through ill health, the tractor now resides at his brother's farm near Downham Market, where it's handy for a bit of mole ploughing.

# **'Trinketry'**

# PROJECT 20: PART FOUR

# The final DVD in a special series dedicated to modern classics.

e've reviewed the other DVDs in this series in past issues and have been looking forward to getting our hands on the final instalment, as they have been both entertaining and factual.

The series focuses on farming and contracting, beginning in 2019, using an eclectic mix of tractors from the modern classic era – with most built prior to the year 2000 – and *Part Four* is no different, bringing to a close a story that *T&M* has enjoyed following since Anglian Agri Media started the project around three years ago.

This DVD sees the action begin in early 2021, with a variety of machines and processes depicted, with one of the

highlights being six tractors in action in one field. It's a veritable who's who of iconic classics, with power harrows, rolls and a drill in use, but there are so many other notable tractors that it's hard to pick a favourite chapter from *Part Four*!

If rubber-tracked crawlers are your thing, there's action containing both Caterpillar and Claas Challengers, plus fans of articulated machines are not forgotten either – with a Ford Versatile 946 and a brace of Deeres in action too. For those with different tastes, there's classic Fendt and Lamborghini scenes and a self-propelled sprayer adapted from a 50 Series Deere, too!

As always, there's good commentary throughout, from Neil Williams, but you also get the sweet sound of distinctive engines in full flow. What's not to like?

Thanks to Tractor & Machinery's readers and social media followers we have a varied selection to share with you, which we will do over the next few pages.

# CLAAS SENATOR 70,

"Here is a 1975 Class Senator 70, owned and operated by agricultural contractor Leslie Houston, harvesting in the Braid Valley, Broughshane, Co. Antrim," writes Darren Houston. "The tractor is a 1978 Ford 6600 with KP trailer, operated by farmer Robert Irvine."

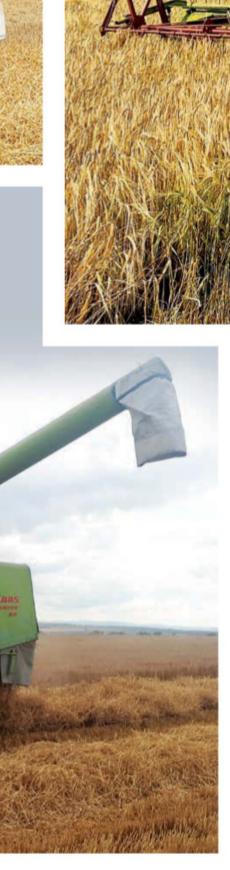
"My dad, Leslie, has owned and driven the combine from the early 1980s, when he sold his Claas Mercator. The Senator 70 has been very reliable over the years and it has always been stored inside. This year it received new drum speed belts and a variable speed belt. The local Claas dealer actually had the drum speed belts in stock!

"The annual workload is typically now only 10-15 acres. The header cuts 10 feet, but with a total transport width over 11 feet, the header has to be sounds fantastic too."









CLAAS SENATOR 80, ABERDEENSHIRE

"This is Barry and Richard Clark with their 1975 Claas

Senator 80, cutting 25 acres of barley at Maud in Aberdeenshire," says



# **CLAAS SENATOR 85, EAST YORKSHIRE**

"This classic Senator 85 was manufactured in approximately 1968," writes Alan Nicholson. "We saw this machine advertised for sale in Trimden, Co. Durham, and it was bought by Nick King of Little Driffield, East Yorkshire, who farms various pieces of land in the area.

"On starting to check it over, we realised that it had been stood for several years, but it had been kept under cover. We changed several belts and a reel speed cable, but couldn't find much more wrong until we put it into action. The engine got a full service and the machine a full grease up.

"Once we started combining we struggled cutting some winter barley as we realised the knife was in a poor state, so once we'd cut the first eight acres we re-sectioned the knife and the combine went reasonably well, cutting approximately 50 acres of both winter and spring barley in the 2021 season.

"In 2022, on checking the machine over, we replaced the cutter-bar fingers and a chain and sprockets for the grain elevator, because the sprockets were badly worn.

"On beginning the harvest we had to replace a variable drum speed cylinder, as it was leaking oil. There have been a few problems this harvest, but it is an old machine so that is to be expected.

"Unfortunately, the grain elevator sheared a roll pin and blocked the elevator. The slip clutch wasn't working and this wore the sprockets, but all is now rectified. In this season we have combined approximately 15 acres of winter barley and 45 acres of spring barley.

"I drive and maintain the combine, along with Nick, and we would like to thank John Marsh of Bempton for his help with parts and advice, JMT Engineering for second-hand parts, and Simon Ullyott, of Garton Field Farm, for the use of his workshop and storage of the combine over winter."





# **CLAAS SF, ABERDEENSHIRE**

Bradley Joss writes: "This combine was brought home by my grandfather in 1976 and has been with us ever since. It probably would have been cutting around 40 acres a year back in its heyday, but it got less and less after a Senator 60 was brought home in 2001. It was eventually retired around 2004 or so and sat in its shed from then until 2018, when I decided I wanted to make a go of it as a repair project.

"It required extensive work to get it back up to working order – the grain pan was full of holes, there was a big hole behind the drum and grain was flying out straight on top of the straw walkers, and the table had rotted through. The steering axle was nearly seized, so making a turn was incredibly difficult with how stiff things were.

"With help from my grandfather, we managed to get some sheet metal and lay it over the top of the rotten parts to get that sorted, filled in the holes in the pan with Isopon, and put a plate into the back of the drum to stop that and swapped the back axle with a spare combine that was kept to butcher spares from.

"The first year that we put it to work again it managed about 10ft before the wobble box broke, so it actually missed a few days waiting for a replacement and



then on the last park we had I managed just under an acre with it, but there were issues with the blade stoke and it just wasn't cutting right, so it had to be abandoned. You can do all of the work in the world to fix things, but you never know if it's going to work right until it's out on the field, when you only get a narrow window to try.

"One thing that's always impressed me is that the engine has never needed any work. It always starts on the button, never chortles on a cold morning – it always just roars into life, no bother.

"Over the winter I did some more work on it, as there were more holes in the grain elevators and the trunk. There was some adjustment needed to the reel depth and a few other mechanical improvements. I also did a lot of work on the blade, replacing a large amount of sections, fingers and all the wear plates for it.

"We have around 120 acres of spring barley a year to cut for winter feed. As

previously mentioned, we have a Claas Senator 60 that did all of the cutting after the SF's retirement, but more recently a new Holland TX34 joined the fleet.

So it's not our primary machine by any stretch – just a toy for me, more than anything!

"I'm 22 now and work in IT for a day job, so the work that gets done to it is either late evening or over weekends/holidays."

# NEW HOLLAND TX32, NORTH YORKSHIRE

"We have a 200-acre family farm, run by my father and I," says Stuart Wilson. "We grow wheat, barley and beans at the moment, but we have cut oilseed rape and peas in the past.

"We have owned the combine since 2007 – she is a 1989 TX32 with 15-foot header. We fitted it with wider wheels due to having some wet land. Over the years the combine has had many new parts and bearings, so we hope it will last a few more years before it will need to be upgraded!"

# Scotland's finest

Both Coventry and Manchester were instrumental in the dominance of Massey Ferguson, but Kilmarnock is often overlooked. We celebrate its success.

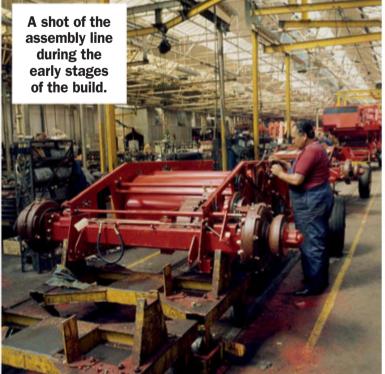


roduction began at Massey-Harris' factory in Kilmarnock in 1951 and it soon established itself as one of Scotland's engineering giants, employing a skilled and dedicated workforce that was passionate about the machinery it was building. Although tractors were produced at the factory in the early days, Kilmarnock became synonymous with combine

harvesters – and it was models like the 780 and 780 Special that would change the farming landscape forever more.

Latterly, models like the 400, 510, 525 would all play their part in enabling Massey Ferguson to retain a healthy share of the combine harvester market, but all good things must come to an end and in 1980 the company's Kilmarnock plant closed its doors for good.

# Countdown is on!

# The Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show takes place at Newark Showground, Nottinghamshire NG24 2NY, on 5-6 November.

here are only a few weeks to go until the Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show, with enthusiasts gearing up for one of the highlights in their calendar. So what can visitors expect on 5-6 November?

Welcoming more than 1,000 vintage tractors, implements and commercial vehicles from across the centuries, there promises to be plenty of competition for the coveted trophies. And visitors will also be treated to the usual live auction of vintage equipment on the Saturday of the show, as well as the autojumble and the annual Service of Remembrance on the Sunday.

Some important milestones will be celebrated this year, including the 50th anniversary of the Massey Ferguson 1200. This four-wheel drive, articulated tractor mirrored models produced in North America, including the hardnosed bonnet design and cab mounted above a central pivot point, which allowed for tight headland turns. The tractor was powered by the Perkins A6.354 engine, producing 105hp (DIN).

Also celebrating a special birthday is the Field-Marshall Series II, manufactured at Gainsborough, Lincolnshire. It is also this marque that holds a special place in the heart of Ross Anderson, brother of Peter – the joint founder of The Field-Marshall Tractor Club (now known simply as The Marshall Club). Their mother bought the Series II for the brothers for £35, back in 1968.

"She was only 20 years old when we bought her, so not in that bad a state, but we still rubbed her down all by hand with a wire brush, repaired a frayed decompression cable and a broken clutch cable," remembers Ross.

"Without this tractor we could have become football hooligans or something, but instead we spent our time repairing and recycling with her."

And the very same Field-Marshall will be at the show. "It all started with this tractor – she's special and she means a lot to us," he explains.

The David Brown Cropmaster, or VAK1C, is also celebrating three quarters of a century. With several variants including the Vineyard, or narrow version, in 1949 David Brown became the first major tractor manufacturer in Britain to launch its own diesel engine.

Celebrating 70 years is the Fordson Major E1A (produced 1952-58). Launched at the Smithfield Show in December '51, the E1A replaced the old E27N model and featured a choice of three new four-cylinder, overhead-valve engines in petrol, diesel or vaporising oil form.

A fan of Fordsons is 24-year old Alex Kettlewell, from Davenham in Cheshire, who recently purchased a 1959 Fordson Power Major. Alex was bitten by the vintage bug at a young age and as a teenager saved up to buy his first tractor – a 1979 Ford 3600 – and it's the sense of achievement he enjoys. "What I feel I've achieved doing the tractors up is brilliant. I'd say don't be afraid to have a go – if you save up and buy one, it's a big daunting project, but it's also a huge learning experience."

And there's something new for the commercial fans – three new classes:

British commercials, non-UK commercials, and pre-1950 commercials. "Classic commercials play an important part in our history and are much loved by many, so we're delighted to be expanding the classes we are offering," says show organiser Elizabeth Halsall.

"Excitingly, we also have a restored No.4 threshing drum coming to the show, together with the original tractor it was used with, which has been recently rediscovered."

There will also be a wide range of other classic and vintage machinery and stationary engines on display, with a celebration of Nicholson's of Newark machinery and Ruston stationary engines from Lincoln. She added: "It's brilliant to be able to celebrate these milestones at the Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show – it's really special for everyone involved."

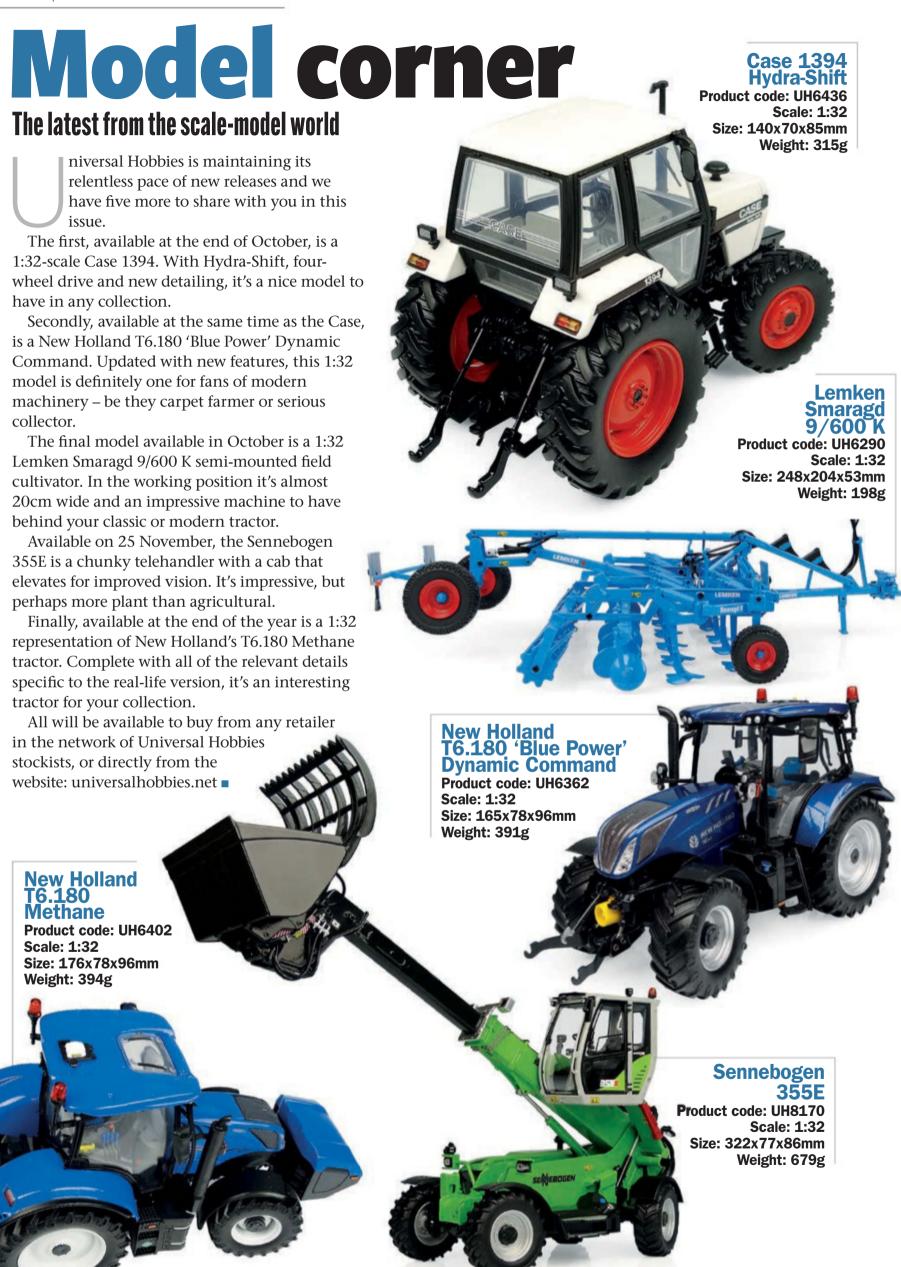

# Classic makes the cut

Two classics leaving a Cambridgeshire farming business left room for two more to take their place. Scott Lambert finds out about one of them.

eing sensible with your money is as relevant now as it ever has been and with exorbitant purchase and running costs, buying the perfect tractor for your operation is often a compromise between what you really want and what you can justify.

E P Brand (Farmers) Ltd. farms 600 acres of Cambridgeshire fenland, in two blocks separated by a few miles, and

relies upon a mixed fleet to get the work done. Regular readers will remember our look at the 1988 Ford TW-35 and 1980 Ford FW-30 that were once used by Chris Dyer and Jamie Rule, but these have since departed to make way for a 1999 Claas Challenger 45.

With the width of the FW-30 proving prohibitive on the road and not having sufficient traction to pull the farm's Köckerling cultivator, the Claas fitted highlighted that the TW-35 was being used less and less too. "With prices for classics at a decent level, it made sense to cash in on them both," said Jamie. "The two New Hollands and the Fastrac could cover any jobs not suitable for the Challenger, but there was a gap for something smaller."

Chris added: "We ended up buying a 7810 from a local farm dispersal sale, and this is a good Jack of all trades, but we felt we could go smaller still for



jobs that needed what you might call a delicate touch!

"It doesn't make sense to spend £100,000 on a new tractor when we can get what we need from a classic – plus we're buying the tractors that we've always wanted!"

"We're owner-drivers and have to look after our tackle, as well as drive it, so it makes sense to run tractors like this – ones that we can fix ourselves and not break the bank," Jamie explained. "We knew what we wanted, but had to find the right one."

The 'right one' turned out to be a 1986 Ford 7610 Force II from Oakfields at

Nuthampstead, Hertfordshire, which, although in good order, was subjected to a mechanical check and cosmetic makeover before being put to work. "It doesn't matter how old our kit is, we like it to look it's best and you've got to remember that it's an appreciating asset," Jamie said.

Those with experience of fen soils will appreciate that four-wheel drive can make all the difference, but not all jobs require immense traction and this is one of the reasons Chris and Jamie wanted a two-wheel drive tractor to their fleet.

"For top work, like fertiliser spreading and rolling, you don't always need fourwheel drive," Chris said. "The ability to tread lightly is key and with a tractor weighing around three-and-a-half tons, fitted with the right tyres, you can do pretty much everything you need to and enjoy the benefits of a tighter turning circle and improved visibility."

As die-hard fans of the blue oval, a 7610 was the obvious choice. With its roots in the Ford 7000, the first mainstream model to be fitted with a turbocharger, the 7610 Force II has a great pedigree, ample power and a fantastic cab. It's a very useable machine, whilst also being one that is popular with enthusiasts and collectors, and therefore a tractor that should retain its value.

Broughshane, Co. Antrim Tel: 028 2586 1300 Imcmaster.com and 377Nm (DIN) of torque at 1,600rpm, the tractor incorporates Ford's 'square' design – with the same bore and stroke dimensions of 112mm (4.4in). This, the company said, permitted lower rated speeds and shorter piston travel – cutting oil consumption and wear, as well as noise.

Coupled to the engine, via a 330mm (13in) clutch, is a 16-speed Dual Power transmission with floor-mounted levers. This arrangement was an improvement on the previous range, as lever travel was reduced and shifting required less effort. The gear lever nearest the seat controls the range (high, low and reverse), whilst the other enables one of four speeds to be selected from a logical 'H' pattern. Dual Power is actuated by the driver's left heel, although this switch can prove troublesome and is often converted to a dash-mounted rocker switch or gear lever-mounted arrangement.

At the rear, lift capacity at the hitch point is 2,664kg (5,874lb) as standard, or 4,255kg (9,380lb) with the optional assistor – which this tractor has. Dual

hydraulic pumps were fitted as standard to the 6610 and upwards in the Force II range, providing a capacity of 69 litres per minute (15.2gpm) at rated engine speed. Up to four double-acting spools could be specified, each with independent flow control.

A 540/1,000rpm power take-off is fitted, with 88.1hp available at the shaft at PTO speed.

Despite its modest size, the performance of the 7610 should not be underestimated. It's a lively performer with plenty of power and great hydraulic performance and, particularly in four-wheel drive form, great traction.

Although usually associated with six-cylinder tractors, a push-pull plough system was one of the 7610's party tricks. With a Ransomes two-furrow reversible on the front and a similar four-furrow reversible attached to the rear linkage, the 7610 had the performance to cover as much ground as much larger tractors – the weight of the front linkage and plough combining to provide additional traction to the ZF axle.

The cab, an updated version of the Sankey-built unit fitted to the first generation of Series 10 tractors, was dubbed the Super-Q and remains a nice place to spend the working day. It's a hands-on operating experience, which Chris and Jamie like, with a full array of levers, rocker switches and analogue instrumentation. Pendant pedals and a flat floor make for comfortable driving, for all but the very tallest of operators.

Weighing in at just 3,530kg (7,700lb), the version of the 7610 seen here is light and nimble in standard form, but this particular example retains a pair of flotation-type front tyres at all times to keep the front end up – the factory-fitted 10x16 tyres having a tendency to cut into the black, fen soil. When it's not on regular duties it is equipped with Terra tyres on the rear to enable it to leave a minimal footprint on the delicate land.

It has proved to be a great investment and the ideal machine for the farm's requirements. "It's a brilliant tractor!" Chris said. "The right machine at the right price and one that will do exactly

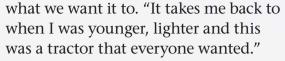

With its turbocharged four-cylinder engine producing 98hp (DIN), the 7610 has proved to be a good all-rounder.



Chris and Jamie, along with others, are proof that buying a classic to add to your working fleet is a viable alternative to buying a new or low-houred, modern

tractor, as you can maintain and repair it yourself, see a good

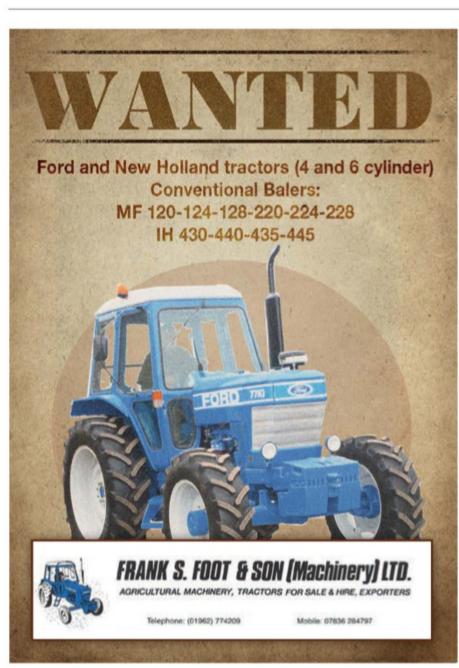
return for your money (if current trends continue) and enjoy the nostalgia!

There is also the case that what you require may not be available new. New Holland, E P Brand (Farmers) Ltd.'s favoured marque, does not offer a two-wheel drive option above the T4.75 and although this may be enough power for some, it's a significant step down from the 103hp (BS)/98hp (DIN) Ford 7610 Force II.

It seems that, for the time being, classic models will continue to have a role on this small parcel of Cambridgeshire land – one where tractors like this can contribute to feeding the nation whilst being appreciating assets.

Long live the 1980s! ■

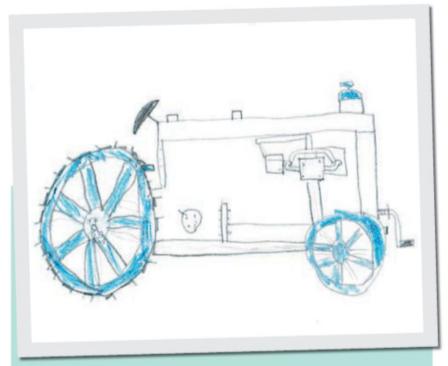

# Two of a kind

# Matt Butler and his father Grahame run a pair of original-style, classic John Deere 1120 and 1130 models. Peter Love went along to see what it's all about.

ife on a mixed farm in East
Sussex was originally made
up of a predominantly blue
fleet for Matt Butler's father
– with Ford 4000s, a 4600
and a 5600 used before a
couple of two-wheel drive 'Rubik's
cube' 6610s became the staple diet.

Some of these tractors Matt remembers, and actually drove, but it all changed when a two-wheel drive John Deere 3050 arrived. These tractors worked the beans, rape, barley and wheat that were grown, as well as tending to the suckler herd.

Showing great mechanical ability led Matt to be asked to become a John Deere-trained agricultural apprentice with Palmers of Lower Dicker, Hailsham, East Sussex. David Palmer had successfully been the Golden Cross depot manager for Penfolds of Arundel, which was a pioneering John Deere dealer of the 1950s.

Prior to that Penfolds was a steam threshing and road roller contractor,

with the last activities continuing into the early '50s, and today there are a number of steam engines and John Deere tractors from the 1960s in preservation, especially 3020 and 4020 models, that started their lives with this company in Sussex.

David Palmer bought the East Sussex branch from Penfolds and continued to build on his reputation and as the JD 40 and 50 Series gained lots of respect, so did his sales – leading to the 6000 Series with its revolutionary full-frame design helping Deere become the number one marque in the UK.

As time went on Palmers transferred its allegiance to grasscare only and Matt stayed around for a couple of years before it was time to move on. Happily, it was the start of many new avenues for Matt, who went on to work for CNH dealer Haynes at its Easons Green, East Sussex, depot. Here he worked on TSA and TM models, which he says were good tractors that were popular with customers.

He liked the green brand more and with more money on the table he moved to Burden Brothers Agri Ltd., not far from his previous employer and enjoyed more than 11 years there. He talks highly of this family-owned company which, in 2020, was taken over by P Tuckwell Ltd. They sold a few John Deere combines, lots of balers and other green machinery, but it was the 6030 Premium tractors that were the most popular – they could not get enough of them!

Today Matt works for another former Palmers apprentice that created his own company in 2010, based near Eridge, Tunbridge Wells. Ed Burridge Engineering Ltd. works on just about everything and is a hydraulic hose specialist – looking after a considerable amount of plant equipment, large and small.

The knowledge and skill these two guys have, as well as that possessed by other members of the team, has certainly helped this business. It

enjoys a great reputation, as no project is too small or large.

Some years ago, Matt and Grahame acquired a John Deere 3130 – a six-cylinder tractor known to many as an old slogger. The engine in this model was rather old fashioned, even when first introduced in Europe, but the model did Mannheim proud and the Butlers' example worked satisfactorily, but even they will admit that it was rather worn.

It was used as their ploughing match tractor, as well as on the farm, in conjunction with a Dowdeswell DP7 four-furrow reversible. Father and son very much enjoyed it before selling it on.

#### **TOO BIG**

A four-wheel drive 3050 was acquired from David Morgan and after sorting a few things out, Matt has it going well. It was this tractor that he used to become East Sussex ploughing champion and the one that he drove to his wedding at the East Sussex National golf course, near Uckfield, where he married Clare in 2015.

Although the 3050 is ideal for farm work and had been on bale-wrapping

duties in recent times, it was just too big for the local road runs they take part in, so it was time to find something smaller and, naturally, green!

Having said that, Matt has fitted a Perkins 6.354 engine from a combine into a Massey Ferguson 35. It's certainly a head turner and he has even ploughed with it.

It was 2019 when Matt came across a 1970 JD 1120 near Snetterton, Norfolk, on eBay. The vendor was as good as his word and when they saw it in person they decided it had to go back to East Sussex with them. The idea was to tidy it up, but not to repaint it – keeping it original was the goal from the outset.

The tractor started its working life with A A Kyle of Eversley, Hampshire, so it has travelled around somewhat. The hydraulics didn't work well at all, but a new pump and various other items in the system were replaced. It was fully serviced, including replacing the fan belt, but, luckily, the tyres were in excellent condition.

What is clear is that the tractor has never had a cab fitted and it looks all the better for it. Even the front steering bush, which is the Achilles heel of these tractors, shows only slight wear for its age. This should always be checked out, along with the load-sensing arm seals and shafts.

Matt was made aware of the second tractor featured here by Ed Burridge.





Aside from the styling, there are subtle differences between the 1120 and 1130.

UAL 687R is a 1977 John Deere 1130 which had been in a shed in South Wales, fitted with a loader and half a Duncan cab that had seen better days. When the tractor arrived in East Sussex the cab and Quicke loader came off and on went 'clamshell' mudguards, with original-style axle-to-mudguard spacers.

The tractor was fully serviced and a new battery went on, along with numerous small items to get it looking right. The hydraulic system was simply serviced.

So what is the difference between the 1120 and 1130? In short, not much. It's essentially styling that is the main difference, as the tractors basically have the same three-cylinder, 2.7-litre, 52hp engine and 16in front tyres and 36-inch rubber on the rear.

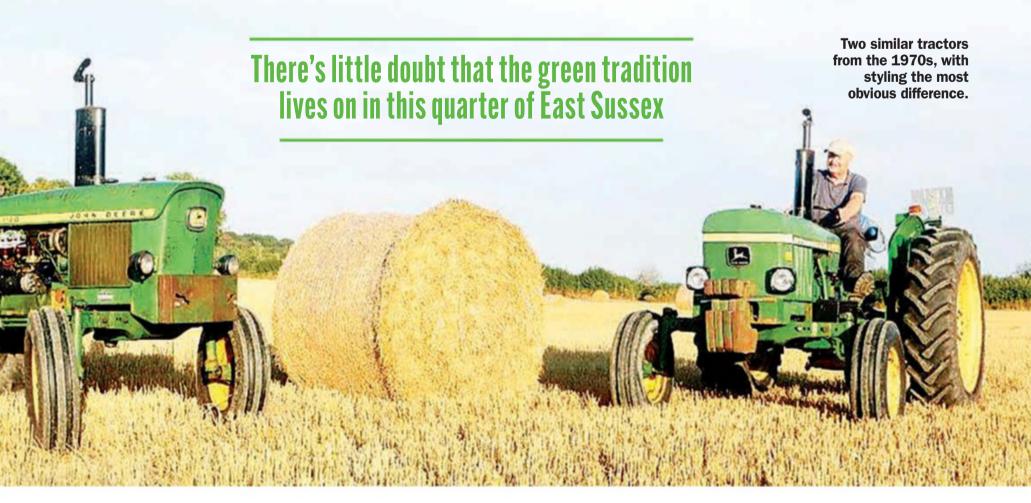
The 1120 was introduced in Europe, at Mannheim, from late 1967 and with the JD 820, 920 and 1020 gave Deere's European division a small tractor line to take on the MF 135, IH 434 and others.

The tractors in the range were not very fast on the road, but by the time the 1130 was introduced, in late 1972, along with the 59hp 1630 a year later, these tractors were all re-geared, with a very good road speed – making the 1130 a very desirable tractor in preservation circles today.

The 1120 here features the optional dual clutch and the 1130 has the power steering option, but not the dual clutch!

Grahame loves the 1130, which ceased production in late 1979 and was replaced by the 1040 and 1140. There are things that can be done to both tractors to make them cosmetically better, but for now they are all up and running – ready for this father and son to enjoy on the Six Bells Road Run on Boxing Day, which is a fixture in their events diary these days.

There's little doubt that the green tradition lives on in this quarter of East Sussex

he 50th anniversary of the Puff-in to Netley Marsh Steam & Craft Show took place on 22-24 July in good weather, writes Peter Love.

Placed on the top of the hill at Meadow Farm, where it all started all those years ago, this is an event that has been well supported from the off and this was still the case in 2022. Tractors have always been an integral part of the show, growing in number each year to the point where more than 125 were exhibited this year.

It was good to see an excellent cross section of clean original and restored machines, including a raft of classics from County, IH, Ford and John Deere, as well as Fergusons, Nuffields, Leylands, Massey Fergusons and the Fordsons that are popular in this area.

My favourite was Andrew Kitcher's John Deere 2850, which was only finished just a month before the show. He also had a 1995 Ford New Holland 8340 Powerstar SLE, in original condition, at the event too, as well as a County 1124 with wide wheels and a winch at the rear, in addition to a rather bashed Duncan cab.

# Record crowd at WELLAND

he 56th Annual Steam & Country Rally, at Woodside Farm, Welland, Upton-upon-Severn, Worcestershire, took place in dry and warm conditions on 29-31 July, says Peter Love.

Back on the scene in 2022, with a record crowd, it's always a pleasure to attend this non-stop action show, starting with the H J Pugh & Co. sale on the Friday.

In the Living History field, Ian and Pearl Davies staged what I feel is the best plant working display in the UK these days, as well as a combining demonstration and, at the bottom of the field, a road-making demonstration complete with running, narrow-gauge industrial railway.

In the other field was a heavy haulage area that was hugely popular, and near the top of the field were several tractor club displays, including a fine one from the Ferguson Club. Further down the hill was the fine stationary engine section.

In front of the stationary engines was the tractor section, which was better placed than before and run, as ever, by Graham Skittery and family. The

tractors paraded twice on the Friday, which was appreciated by all, and on the other side of the parade ring were the car and commercial vehicle displays.

With more than 200 preservation tractors in the section, Graham had his hands full. There was a fine line of veterans and a good selection of continental tractors too, including Ivan Partridge's 1924 Lanz HM8 Bulldog and James Morris' post-war Lanz Bulldog D9506 (no. 353663). Joe Keeling had his 1948, 23hp, two-stroke Bolinder-Munktell BM10 at the event – popping away and looking very original.

The line-up of Fordsons was very impressive, with Mark Pugh's early 1937 Fordson N waterwasher looking the part. It contrasted with the Crump family's E1A Diesel Major Industrials from 1958, both in original condition. Standing beside was Abigail Pugh's 1964 Fordson Super Dexta – another clean original example.

The Stokes family brought out an award-winning County 654, that looked tremendous, and another four-wheel drive conversion that caught the eye was the Rowberry family's 1969 Roadless International 634 – part of an excellent selection of IH tractors at the show.



Two 23hp Bolinder-Munktell BM10 tractors were at the show. Both looked great.

In the Allis-Chalmers section was R C Duell's rare, styled WC road roller conversion that lived in this area at one time.

Several David Browns were seen, including David Aylward's 1954 25D which makes occasional appearances at events, but it certainly stood out in the sunshine. Another catching the eye was a styled, 1940 John Deere D belonging to Geoffrey Jones, but if you like your Deeres classic Ivor Grant's 1970 JD 1020 and 1972 2120 both looked smart.

The Ferguson and Massey Ferguson display was very good indeed, with Ken Gibbard from Llanelli driving an original, 1950 Ferguson TE-D 20 Reekie vineyard conversion. Andy Maaz, from Stratford, had his well-restored, 1968 MF 135 Multi-Power on display, while Andrew Millington's MF 35X Multi-Power also looked good.

This show has had many ups and downs over the years, much to do with the weather, but it all came good in 2022. ■

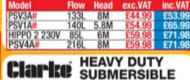

ack in June, when we began haymaking, I experienced trouble with my nephew's baler, which was due to lack of maintenance. With the first field ready for baling, I had no option but to borrow my neighbour's MF 135 and baler to get the job done.

On returning the tractor, the owner commented about the excessively stiff steering and said he'd bought the parts to fix the problem. The 135 in question is one of three similar machines, one of which has been on the farm since 1965, when new. This particular tractor was acquired more recently from a local dealer and had originated in France, as is apparent by the presence of

Continental-style lighting on the rear mudguards!

The tractor features an eight-speed gearbox and is a real pocket rocket when on the road, and apart from the stiff steering is a pleasure to drive!

#### **TOKEN OF THANKS**

As a token of thanks for borrowing the tractor and baler which, at one of their busiest times of the year, was most welcome, I offered to strip and replace the thrust bearings, as the rest of the farm staff were very busy.

#### **WORKING TRACTOR**

The tractor is used every day around the farm and, as a result, isn't one of the cleanest 135s around, but a genuine

workhorse. Before attempting to dismantle the kingpins we split the ball joints at the forward end of each drag link and operated the steering to make sure it was the thrust bearings, and not a fault with the steering box itself.

As thought, the problem was with the thrust bearings, so each front wheel was slackened before jacking the tractor clear of the ground.

#### **PINCH BOLTS**

The track arms are attached and keyed to each kingpin by a pinch bolt, both of which were removed followed by inserting a chisel into the slot of the tracks arms to expand them to ease them off the kingpins. The woodruff keys generally stay in place when

removing track arms and need a tap out of their keyways with a suitable punch or chisel.

#### WHEELS OFF

The front wheels were then removed and the tractor jacked clear of the ground, allowing the kingpins to lower from the axle housings. It was noted that there was very little noticeable wear on either of the kingpins when working on the tractor. In fact, the tractor hasn't done a lot of work during its life when taking a general overview of the machine. This is probably why the kingpins and thrust bearings were very tight in the housings.

#### **FELT RINGS**

Under each of the track arms there are felt rings to keep any dirt and unwanted debris from entering the kingpin bushes. These rings were in good order and were able to be reused, which was a bonus, as we didn't have any replacements present at the time of working.

#### **GREASE NIPPLES**

Once the kingpins were off the tractor we used a grease gun to check that each of the grease nipples was clear and admitting grease to the pins and bushes. Quite often operators attempt to grease bearings and the nipples are blocked or damaged, whereby the grease doesn't get to where it's needed and excessive wear can take place as a result.

It wasn't so in this case, as the grease flowed freely into the axle housings with the kingpins out of the way. We can only assume that the tractor has stood idle for a long period, allowing the thrust bearings to seize and result in the heavy steering experienced.

#### **NEW THRUST BEARINGS**

The replacement bearings had been bought from Agriline Products (01527 579111 or agriline products.com) and were ready to fit after cleaning up the kingpins, making sure the bearings were installed the correct way up.

Plenty of grease was applied to the area around the thrust bearings before fitting the kingpins to the housings. The pins were supported until the woodruff keys were refitted, along with the felt rings and track arms, after which the drag links were fitted along with the front wheels.

#### **HUBCAPS**

One of the results of driving along the walls of the dairy parlour is that the hubcaps get scraped against the walls and eventually lose their grease nipples. Mindful of this, the owner had already purchased a pair of new hubcaps, so we took the opportunity to replace these at the same time.

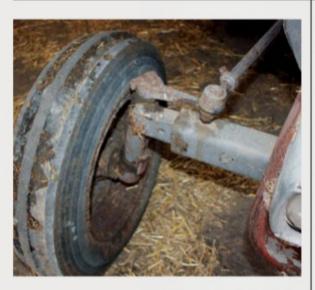
#### **GREASING**

During the job, plenty of grease was pumped into the kingpins – a job better done with the wheels clear of the ground to allow grease to enter the thrust bearings. With the front tyre pressures checked and adjusted, the tractor was then ready for work once more!



#### **Stiff steering**

The steering had got increasingly stiff and was correctly diagnosed as seized thrust bearings, which are about to be replaced with new ones.



#### **Post '69 tractor**

The presence of a straight beam axle shows the tractor to be a post-1969 model, as the axle is straight, rather than swept back as per the earlier 135s.



#### **Ready for jacking**

All the wheel nuts were slackened before lifting the tractor clear of the ground using a 12-ton hydraulic bottle jack.



#### **Pinch bolts**

Each track arm is secured by a pinch bolt, both of which were removed before attempting to remove the arms.



#### **Chisel used**

A chisel was used in each of the track arm slots to open them up to facilitate lifting and removing them.



#### Track arm removal

Each track arm was lifted upwards and clear of the kingpins. Note the felt ring under the track arm – they are there to keep dirt and debris out.



#### **Woodruff key**

The track arms are prevented from spinning on the kingpins by woodruff keys, one of which is seen here as it is being removed.



#### Very little wear

With each kingpin out of the axle housing it was noted that little wear has taken place, which reiterates the fact that it's a low-hour tractor.



#### **Seized bearing**

As expected, the thrust bearings were seized solid and had caused the stiff steering. New bearings were the only solution to the problem.



#### **Agriline Products**

The thrust bearings were supplied by Agriline Products under part number 52002, and were supplied along with...



#### **Hubcaps**

... new hubcaps to replace the ones scraped along the parlour walls, which had removed their grease nipples.



#### **Greased up**

After reassembly, both kingpins were fully greased up to ensure a long service life and easy steering.



#### Wheel holts

All the wheel bolts were tightened fully with the tractor on the ground.



#### **Hubcaps fitted**

The new hubcaps were fitted and the wheel bearings greased. No apparent wear present in the wheel bearings, so now good to go!

# 780 rescue part 20

Andrew Hall shares the latest tasks undertaken to bring the tractor nearer to completion.





espite being a low-hour tractor and one that's generally in good order mechanically, I have found the restoration of the 780 quite involved regarding the cosmetic side of things. After months of work between other tasks, the project is now very near completion, and I am looking forward to the time I'm able to run it up and drive it for the first time.

#### **REAR WHEELS**

One aspect of the restoration that has been lingering on is the renovation of the rear wheel rims. One of the rims was extremely corroded and once the tyres were removed I decided to scrap that rim, as it was too far gone to make a decent job of it.

Some time ago I acquired a pair of rear rims from a Ferguson that had been destroyed in a fire, so one of these was cleaned up as a replacement. However, the original rims were 12 inches wide and the two Ferguson rims weren't a match either, as one was a 10-inch and the other 11-inch, leaving me with a dilemma.

After some thought, and the fact that the 780 will be used for ploughing, using a 10-inch plough, I decided upon a pair of 10-inch rims to complete the tractor.

Only having one 10-inch rim meant I was on the lookout for another to match, and I had thought about buying a new one, but had second thoughts regarding the cost, which is now a serious consideration due to the rise in prices generally!

#### **IN LUCK**

A call to a local tractor dealer with a request for a rim brought little response, and after two or three phone calls I decided to visit them and struck lucky. I obtained a 10-inch wheel complete with centre, albeit with a perished tyre, for the grand sum of £20. This was brought home

and work then began to remove the tyre and prepare the rim for painting.

#### **CENTRE DISH**

I began work to remove the centre dish, which wasn't of the David Brown pattern, as it didn't feature the three holes for the wheel weights in the dish. A wire brushing of the six bolt threads, followed by some WD-40 to assist in removing the bolts, soon had all six bolts undone and the centre put aside for a future project. I was able to remove all six of the bolts without causing any damage to them, so these were also put 'in stock' for the future!



#### **Second-hand wheel rim**

A second 10-inch wheel rim has been obtained to go with the other matching rim from a burnt-out Ferguson tractor.



#### **Complete wheel**

It came complete with an old tyre and wheel centre, but both will have to come off to prepare the rim and to fit the correct DB wheel centres.



#### Wire brushed

Each of the rim-to-dish bolts was cleaned up with a rotary wire brush to ease the threads before removing the nuts.



#### All removed

Some WD-40 assisted in the removal of all the nuts, which came off very easily considering the time they've been in place.

#### **TYRE REMOVAL**

This stage wasn't as easy, as the tyre had unseated from the rim on the front side, but was stuck fast to the inner bead. I started using a telescopic bead breaker to no avail, as it merely bounced off the tyre, but I did persevere all around the circumference and it did begin to crack the seal.

Despite vigorous use of the bead breaker, I resorted to laying the wheel down and driving over it with a tractor, which usually does the trick.

Again, after attempting two or three times around the wheel, the tyre wouldn't yield, leaving me scratching my head. With my patience

stretched to the limit I decided to sacrifice the tyre and to cut it off the rim, which didn't take any time at all.

#### **CLEANING & PREPARATION**

With the rims ready for paint preparation, I removed the centre dish from the 10-inch Ferguson wheel, which had an early-pattern centre dish minus the scallops around the edge.

Each rim was treated with a rotary wire brush on the mini grinder to remove all the loose rust and debris, and some slight rim damage on the edge of the purchased rim was dressed out by careful use of a large adjustable spanner as a lever, and any rough

burrs filed off to prevent any problems later when fitting fresh tyres and tubes!

#### **VALVE HOLE**

One issue with the purchased wheel rim was that the valve hole had corroded and enlarged, and this was addressed by MIG welding a washer into place to bring the hole back to the correct size. The area around the hole was then dressed with the grinder to smooth it out and blend the repair in.

#### **PRIMING**

After preparation, each rim was primed using Teamac red oxide primer ready for further painting in Orchid White, along with the tractor tinwork. The DB centres were also treated to another prime, as they had been sitting about for a while and had got scratched.

#### **MUDGUARDS**

With the wheels prepared I moved on to the rear mudguards, which had been purchased new to replace the original corroded and damaged mudguards. The mudguards were bolted into place using the top face bolt positions to check for alignment with the side fixing hole (three each side), and the footplate holes.

To assist in aligning the side fixings, I opened up

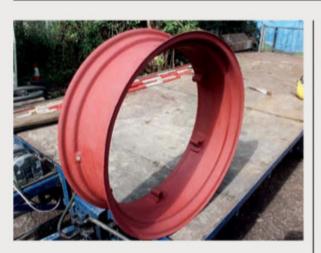
#### **Bead breaking**

After an unsuccessful attempt using a telescopic bead breaker, I tried driving over the tyre, but to no avail. It had to be cut off, as the bead wouldn't separate!



#### **Spare wheel centre & bolts**

The wheel yielded a spare centre and some usable bolts, which may be useful at a later stage on another project.



#### First rim primed

The first rim from the firedamaged Ferguson has been cleaned up and primed using Teamac red oxide primer.



#### Valve hole repair

A repair to the valve hole was necessary on the purchased rim, as corrosion had caused it to enlarge. A washer was MIG welded into place and the weld smoothed out.



#### **David Brown centres**

Both DB centres were treated to another primer coat, as they had sat about and got scratched. The DB centres have three holes for the wheel weights to attach.

the holes to allow the bolts to align, and noted a discrepancy where the mudguards meet the footplates. To overcome this I will make a pair of fishplates to bridge the gap and create a tidy fit.

The mudguards have a double skin spot welded to the main shell and three of the spot welds had broken away, so these were dealt with by drilling them out and MIG welding the panel into place. I also sealed the top edge of the join between the double skin, with filler, to prevent moisture entering and creating corrosion in the future.

#### **LIGHT FIXINGS**

My 780 has had separate front and rear side lamps fitted, similar to the narrow DB tractors in the past, and I have a set of these to fit to the rear mudguards. Each mudguard was marked out and the fixing holes drilled, along with holes for the wiring to pass through the mudguard panels.

The mudguards were then sanded off to provide a key for the primer and top coat when time and weather allows!

#### **BONNET ASSEMBLY**

The final stage of the tinwork is the bonnet assembly.

Fortunately, the bonnet wasn't dented in any way, but was very rusty with the left-hand side panel having rotted off the bonnet. This has been repaired and welded back in place, and other areas of rust dealt with, particularly the front chin panel, which was like a lace curtain.

Various repairs have been made and the bonnet is now a strong, sturdy structure once again. It is currently undergoing preparation for repainting, including a vigorous wire brushing and the removal of the old original bonnet decals. There are one or two areas that will

benefit from some filler to improve the surface prior to priming and a top coat of Orchid White.

The rear wheel rims, mudguards and the bonnet will all be painted together, which will bring all the major work to a conclusion.

#### **New rim-to-dish bolts**

I had a complete set of new rim-to-dish bolts in stock, so these will be used to reattach the centres once they're painted.



#### **Mudguards**

The new mudguards were attached, using the top fixings, to check for correct alignment. The side fixing holes were opened up to improve the alignment with the axle.



#### **Light fixings**

Holes for the side and tail lights were marked out and drilled, along with holes for the wiring to pass through each mudguard.



#### **Plough lamp**

A second-hand plough lamp will be attached in due course. It'll be cleaned up and finished to match the mudguard.



#### **Bonnet assembly**

Many of the repairs have been completed on the bonnet. Fortunately, it wasn't damaged or distorted due to impact. However, a lot of corrosion was present.



#### **Old decals**

Traces of the original decals had to be sanded off before any primer is applied to the bonnet.



#### **More holes**

There are still a few more holes to deal with, such as these on the right-hand side panel. These will be filled using the MIG welder.



#### **Repaired side panel**

This side panel had rotted completely off the bonnet and has now been repaired and refitted to the bonnet, along with the front chin panel.



#### **How not to store decals!**

The new decals were left hanging in the workshop, and will now have to be placed flat and weighted down to straighten them before they are applied to the bonnet.

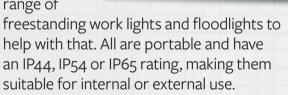

# Experts' advice

# Farmall M

Last year I bought a McCormick IH Farmall M tractor, which has been restored and is in nice, tidy condition. However, despite the tractor's good looks it is let down by its brakes. The tractor has quite a fast road speed, but I'm afraid to use it at its highest speed until something is done to improve matters.

I removed the brake covers and discovered that the lining material is worn away badly. Can you advise me of how to proceed and where I might be able to obtain some fresh linings please? **Phil Johnson, via e-mail** 

The Farmall range of tractors features contracting band brakes, rather than conventional drums.

Replacing the lining material isn't a difficult task, but if the brakes have been badly neglected, the lining material may have worn right through to the steel backing band.

If this is the case, replacement bands are available from Old 20 Parts Company (tel: 01332 792698 or old20parts.co.uk).



An alternative if the bands are unworn is to have them relined, which can be done by your local motor factor at an economical rate. The linings are riveted onto the bands, and it isn't a difficult job to replace them. You will probably need to readjust the brakes and balance them up before going to work with the tractor.

# **Horndraulic loader**

The Horndraulic loader fitted to my Fordson Major tractor has developed oil leaks from both the lift rams. I'd like to know if replacing the seals is a difficult task



and requires any specialist tools to accomplish the job.

A friend of mine has a loader of a different brand and had much difficulty in dismantling the rams to change the seals, as the rams had some kind of locking wire that was threaded through one of the oil portholes. Any advice would be most welcome.

If your Horndraulic loader has its original rams fitted, they won't present you with the same problem as your friend experienced. The oil seal caps can be unscrewed from the ram cylinders

to access the seal pack and O-rings. If each ram is removed from the tractor and secured in a large vice, the seal caps can be gripped with a suitable Stillson wrench and unscrewed.

The old seals can then be prised out of the caps, noting their positions. They can be obtained from a local bearing/ seal supplier if they can be removed undamaged, enabling them to be matched up. It is a good opportunity to inspect the ram plungers for signs of scoring whilst the rams are dismantled. Any deep scoring can be dressed out to improve the surface of the plungers, to ensure the new seals aren't damaged once reassembled!

# **Fordson Dexta**

l've owned a '59
Fordson Dexta for
some years, which I
use regularly in the summer
for paddock topping,
harrowing and rolling etc.

Recently the steering has become rather slack and the steering wheel wobbles around, and at speed on the road the front wheels occasionally wobble from left to right uncontrollably, and won't stop until I stop the tractor itself.

What can I do to rectify this problem? It has become rather dangerous of late. A Thomas, via e-mail

The symptoms you describe are quite common on well-worn Fordson Dextas. The design of the steering box is rather an Achilles heel. The steering wheel is attached to a threaded nut, which pulls the steering column either up or down according to the direction you are turning.

Quite often the lubrication is compromised at the top of the column, when the oil level drops, and this accelerates the wear and tear on the thread of both the nut and the column.

Also the ball bearings, that support the nut, wear and the accumulation of wear causes the slackness. It's probably time for a rebuild of your steering box.

To do this you need to remove the steering wheel and fuel tank to access the steering box and you'll then need to separate the ball joints at the rear ends of each drag link. The steering box can then be removed and worked on in comfort on a bench.

The ring of nuts on the top bearing housing are removed, along with any shims present and the bearing balls and ring. The nut will then unscrew from the column. Working at the lower end of the steering box you will need to remove both drop arms, which are on a spline.

The casing can then be dismantled to allow access and



removal of the cross shafts. These can be cleaned and examined for wear and the box then reassembled, noting the number of shims present.

These can be removed to reduce any play present between the cross shafts and the column, which is a bit of trial and error as the box is rebuilt until the desired amount of play is achieved without over tightening the box by removing too many shims.

New oil seals can be fitted on the cross shafts whilst the box is apart. Reassembly is a reversal of dismantling. The top bearing and nut can be replaced with new components and care taken to adjust any play by careful selection of shims.

Fresh oil can be added, ensuring that the level is above the top nut to reduce any further wear. A small oil plug is present to the right-hand side of the top bearing housing and it takes a while to get the required quantity of oil in to the box, but it is important to ensure the steering box is full before using the tractor!

# **Massey Ferguson 135**



The hydraulic pressure of my Massey Ferguson 135 has been tested and is well below the figure of

2,500psi, which it should be, and is currently about 1,200psi. I'm contemplating removing and replacing the hydraulic pump. Is this a difficult operation to undertake? I have a reasonable mechanical knowledge, but I'm not sure if any special tools are necessary. Richard Wilson, via e-mail

Removal and replacement of the 135 hydraulic pump is quite straightforward and doesn't require any special tools. You'll need to drain the oil via the two drain plugs on the lower left-hand side of the transmission housing. Remove the tractor

seat and any external service pipes present, then remove both the circular side plates from the transmission housing. The left one carries the PTO selector lever, whilst the right carries the dipstick and response control lever.

If working alone you'll need to use an engine crane to lift the top cover. A bracket can be fabricated and fitted to the seat holes to facilitate lifting. Remove the transfer plate or external selector valves, if present, from the front right-hand corner of the top cover. The oil stack pipe may come away with it, but may also stay in place.

Remove all the nuts that secure the top cover to the

transmission housing, but before lifting the cover you will need to remove the roller that is located internally on the control levers. This can be reached through the righthand circular hole and is a fiddle to remove/replace!

Once the cover is clear of the tractor, the drive tube between the gearbox and rear axle is removed by removing the split pin and sliding the tube out. The pump is secured by two dowels through each side of the housing and after removal it can be lifted out through the top of the housing.

Reassembly is the reverse of dismantling, but make sure the roller is correctly located!

# Fordson E27N revisited

Andrew Hall has made some steady progress this month, refitting the drawbar plate and adjusting the brakes.

his must be the longest restoration I have undertaken, as it began in 2015 when the brake cable snapped on one side, resulting in a complete rebuild of the gearbox and rear axle, with new bearings and oil seals.

The first stages were recorded in *Ford* & *Fordson Tractors* magazine until the project stalled. In more recent times I have resurrected the project, which has

since featured in several issues of *Tractor* & *Machinery*.

# **NEAR COMPLETION**

Much of the work is now complete, with just a few items to renovate and refit to the tractor.

The drawbar was repainted some time ago, but has languished in the yard, which has taken its toll on the paintwork, so will be refinished once again before fitting.

# **DRAWBAR PLATE**

The drawbar plate, which locates under the centre of the tractor, has been repainted and has been sitting on the rear step plate of the tractor ready for refitting. It is secured by four %6 UNC bolts, all of which were worn out. So these have been replaced with some fresh bolts. The new bolts were a little too long, so were cut to size before fitting the plate.

The plate is rather heavy in itself, so was jacked into place where it locates on a central dowel, after which some measurements were taken to ensure the cut-down bolts would fully screw into the holes. They bottomed out with about ½in to spare, so to ensure a full engagement of the threads I made four thick washers to take up the slack.

These were machined from a piece of high-quality steel, which was drilled out to clear the diameter of the bolts and parted off at the required thickness. One of the holes had stripped its thread,



so I had to go to %in UNC on this one, and after fitting the bolts the drawbar plate was once again secure.

# **BRAKE ADJUSTMENT**

Moving on from the drawbar, I decided to adjust the brakes before fitting the newly-painted footplates, as they are easier accessed. New brake cables had been fitted way back in 2016 and the tractor has sat about idle since then. The brakes had also been relined at the same time, but not fully adjusted.

To do this, each wheel in turn was jacked clear of the ground and turned until the inspection holes in the brake drums were at 12 and six o'clock. A broad screwdriver was inserted into the top hole of the right-hand side and the expander adjusted to tighten the shoes.

To do this, the screwdriver was pressed downwards a click at a time until the wheel was tight and wouldn't turn. It was then clicked back a few clicks until the wheel turned freely without binding. I wasn't happy with the position of the pedal after adjusting, as it had too much play and almost had a full travel forward. I then moved to the left-hand side and repeated the adjustment operation, this time more successfully. The pedal movement was more acceptable and the wheel locked up when fully depressed.

Still not happy with the right-hand brake I set about investigating the problem. Both cables are new and unused, so should be the same length. The only way forward was to remove the brake drum and take a look inside. The centre bolt was removed and a lever placed behind the drum whilst I tapped the drum free with a soft mallet.

The reason became apparent immediately, as the cable had become detached from the operating lever when the cable had been pushed back to release the brake at some point. To rectify this, the shoes were released from the back plate and the operating levers taken out, cleaned and lightly lubricated to free them off.

They were rather stiff and the return spring was a bit weak and had allowed the cable to become detached. A new, stronger spring soon rectified the problem and the brake was reassembled and readjusted. This time both pedals were almost in line when the brakes were applied.



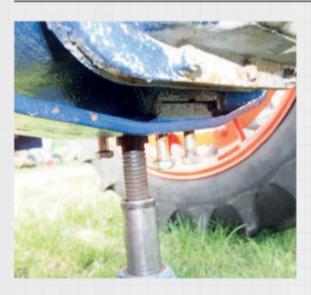
# **Near completion**

Just some painting to finish off and a few minor tasks to complete – the tractor is looking much fresher than it did prior to the restoration.



# **Drawbar plate**

The drawbar plate has been repainted and has sat on the step plate since waiting to be fitted to the underside of the tractor.



# **Jacked in place**

The plate is heavy and easier jacked up to secure it before fitting the bolts, which had to be adjusted to the desired length.



# **Thick washers**

The bolts bottomed out in their holes before tightening the drawbar plate, so four thick spacer washers were produced in the lathe.



# **Drilled & parted off**

Each washer was drilled out to clear the bolt diameters and then parted off in the lathe with this special parting-off tool.



# Ready to fit

After removing the burrs, the washers were ready to fit under the bolt heads to securely clamp the drawbar plate.

# **WORKSHOP**

A little adjustment to the left-hand cable brought the pedals together evenly and effectively, so I am now looking forward to trying them out when the tractor is running once again.

# **REMAINING TASKS**

There are a few remaining tasks to finish the tractor off, including the repair of a broken radiator grille of the earlier pattern, which replaces one of the later design. The fuel tank requires some repair and repainting and the vaporiser needs building up and fitting back onto the engine.

These tasks will be covered in the next issue of T&M, all being well.



# All done

The plate is now in place. The larger bolt used to overcome the stripped thread is visible. It is now a 5/8UNC, rather than a 9/16UNC.



# **Brake adjustment**

lt's around six years since the brakes were relined and new cables fitted. Now it's time to adjust them properly before fitting the footplates.



# **Jacked up**

The right-hand side was jacked up to enable the wheel to be rotated during the adjustment process.



# **Inspection hole**

The wheel was rotated until the drum holes were at 12/six o'clock, to enable a screwdriver to be inserted into the top hole.



# **Adjustment**

Pushing the screwdriver downwards a click at a time, until the wheel was locked up, tightened the brakes.



# **Pedal misalignment**

Despite adjusting, the brake pedal was too far down and wouldn't match the left-hand side, so some investigation was necessary.



# **Detached cable**

The problem was clear to see here, as the cable had become detached from the operating lever, stopping the brake from functioning completely.



# **Rectification**

A partial strip of the shoes and reattachment of the cable was done, and a new stronger return spring fitted to prevent a reoccurrence.

# Ivel to be sold

John and Sue Illingworth's unique collection, consisting of more than 150 vintage tractors and pieces of machinery, is to be offered by Donington Auctions at Three Springs, Western Australia, on 25 September 2022.

This collection was created by the husband-and-wife team of Sue and the late John Illingworth, both originally from the UK, and features typical Australian pre-1960 tractors from Peterbro, Fordson, IH, Howard, Case, Imperial, Bolinder Munktell, Oliver, Chamberlain, HSCS, Lanz and many others, with at least 200 lots in the sale.

The museum collection was assembled over 50 years, with the highlight being the 1904 (Ivel no. 352). This tractor is one of only eight left in existence, and is recognised as the seventh oldest Ivel. It was first found near Perth, WA, and acquired by a Perth dealer for £12-10-0 before being sold to noted WA tractor specialist Bert Gibbs for £250.

Bert initially intended to restore the Ivel, but never started the restoration.

The tractor was subsequently purchased by the late John Illingworth in May 1981 and the restoration process was truly started. John completed the restoration by Christmas that year.

No. 352 is fitted with a unique wide roller front wheel and broad rear wheels with diagonal treads, which might suggest that its intended use was on road work instead of grass land. It is possible that this example was originally ordered by a government department or a local municipality for road work use, although no records confirming such have been found.

John was originally from Clitheroe, Lancashire, and emigrated to Western Australia in 1969, where he established a sheep and wheat farm near Arrino, in the Three Springs region. On marrying his sweetheart in 1978, Sue emigrated from Yorkshire to join him.

On one occasion Sue recalled they were invited to collect a tractor out of a farmer's shed that turned out to be packed to the brim with rubbish and debris built up over years. Having removed most of the back of the shed

and chained the only part of the tractor they could reach, they were surprised to pull out an unrestored and rare Bolinder-Munktell tractor.

John and Sue's collection grew to such an extent that they constructed a new barn to house the collection on the farm, and built up a respected reputation amongst the vintage tractor community. The building also houses other curiosities, including a 1928 Dennis fire engine and even a WW2 Stuart M3 Fort Knox tank.

John took great pleasure in restoring and re-commissioning the tractors back to their former glory. He was highly motivated, and even at his passing at the age 92 still had numerous tractors ready to be restored. Sue has decided it's time for the collection to be passed onto new custodians, with the hope that the new owners will get as much enjoyment from them as they have.

I believe that bidding for the Ivel tractor outside Australia will be very difficult, owing to its rarity, as an export license will be very difficult to obtain. For further details, please e-mail the auctioneer:

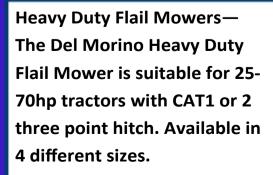

# **PART C-D**

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't the plan. Think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

# WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

# Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

# Rand 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

# Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been re-sprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

# Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

# Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

# **Band 6**

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

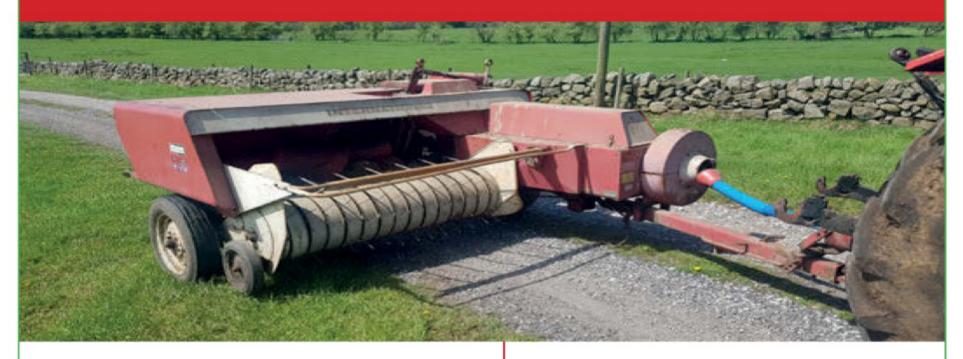

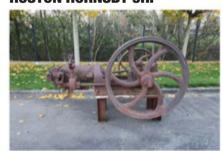

have just returned from the Great Dorset Steam Fair and I have to say that it was good to be back at this unique event. With good sunshine on the Friday I was able to head to Stuart Cotton's tractor section, where the tractors were very enjoyable. The feature this year was a selection of machines from members of the Case IH Club UK, which was good to see.

The tractor show winners were Phil Thompson's lovely 1951 Turner Yeoman of England MkII, that's been recently restored – taking the Stuart Cotton Millennium Shield, while Doug Palmer's family collected the Symington 12-25 Trophy for the former Ted Goldup 1915 Overtime R, which has been in preservation since 1961 and was on the T&M stand at the GDSF show in 2018.

The Classic Tractor Books Trophy went to Sarah Tween who puts lots of effort into her outfits and her 1963 Massey Ferguson 35. The Rob Coombs Cup went to Ben Monksummers and his lovely Persian Orange 1936 Allis-Chalmers U. The Ford award went to Andrew Isaac, from Pontyclun, and his 1954 Jubilee NAA.

Nick Jones from Westfield, East Sussex, took the Ferguson award with his St. Denis-built 1958 Ferguson FF30DS. The Stewards' award went to

Jeremy Vick, from Clanfield, and his late 1956 Landini L25. The overseas award went to Eddie Spencer, Co. Kilkenny, and his very tidy 1947 John Deere M and the John Hall Fordson

Shield went to Tom Bryne and his 1955 Roadless J17.

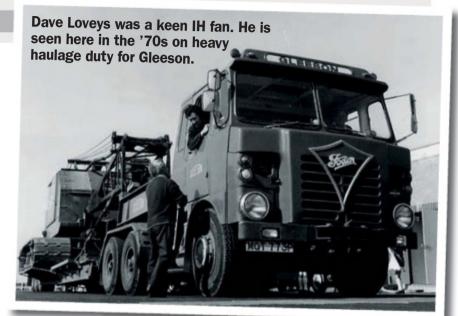
As I was taking my pictures I listened to the very professional, entertaining and informative commentary in the parade ring. Sadly, this is not always replicated at other events and, in my opinion, the standard of tractor rally commentary has rather gone downhill in the last few years.

The latest idea is to get the owners to drive around the parade ring without a commentary. The tractors are then lined up and the commentator, who often knows very little about tractors, chats to the owners – who, in some cases, know even less than he/she does!

By this point, onlookers may have walked away through boredom, which can reflect badly on the event and its organisation. In my experience the general public responds best to commentary that's interesting, casual and factual. You have to think about what you are doing, with preparation the key to the success.

> Dave was an amazing driver, particularly at the wheel of his 1947 Allard K type V8, which he rallied and hill climbed to the end.





Sadly, I have to mention the passing of T&M subscriber Dave Loveys, from Devizes. He was a tractor enthusiast and the Allard Owners Club Captain. Funnily enough, it was at the Great Dorset Steam Fair where I first met Dave, where he showed me his May 1950 Allard P1, with his brother, in 2002.

The restoration started in the 1990s and when it was finished Dave took the car just about everywhere, including on two trips to France. This included an epic journey to the Classic Monte Carlo Rally in snow, ice, hail and wind in January 2012. It was a horrific journey but he made it, without a heater, and wanted to repeat this in 2022, but it was not to be.

For me personally he was great to be with and gave you confidence. He had farming roots and loved ploughing with his International, right to the end. A lorry driver for most of his life, he was, kind, welcoming, practical, willing to accept new club members, and encouraging – something that all clubs need these days.

His funeral took place at The West Wiltshire Crematorium, Trowbridge, on 12 September. He will be a great loss to me, personally, as well as to family, friends and those involved in the Allard Owners Club.

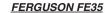
