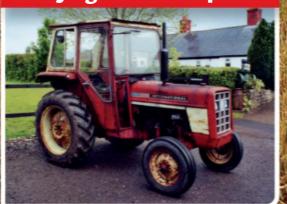

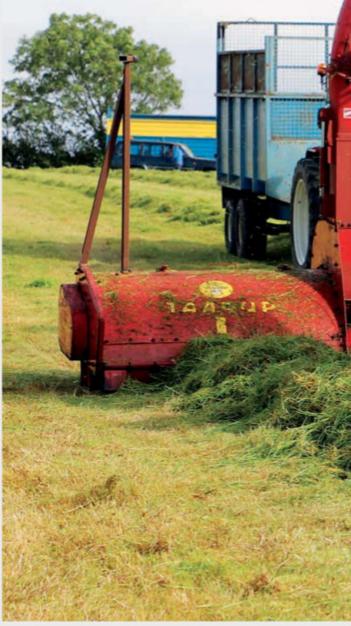

Great Dorset Steam Fair

t has been announced that the Great Dorset Steam Fair will not take place in 2023. A statement, posted on the event's Facebook page, said:

"Following a thorough review of the 2022 show, it is with great sadness and disappointment that the Great Dorset Steam Fair Ltd. Board of Directors have to announce that unfortunately we will be taking a year's break before running the next Great Dorset Steam Fair event, which will now be held over the August Bank Holiday weekend in 2024.

"This has been an extremely difficult decision for us to make. Whilst the 2022 event has been a fantastic and resounding success as a spectacle, it has been mired by significant and spiralling increases in contractor and infrastructure costs and the costs associated with meeting the necessary regulatory and statutory compliance which are commensurate with operating such a large-scale event.

"In short, as a big show we have big costs, costs which have risen disproportionately this year and, crucially, are very difficult to forecast for next year in the current economic climate.

"The event industry as a whole is still feeling the harsh financial repercussions of the Covid-19 pandemic, which together with the aftermath of Brexit and the war in Ukraine, has seen significant increases in staff, contractor, fuel, transport, material, and equipment hire prices. The likelihood is that event costs will continue to rise in 2023, compounded by the emergence of the cost-of-living crisis which will undoubtedly affect consumer confidence and spending in the event industry next year.

"With the ongoing economic situation, the rise in inflation and the cost-of-living crisis, the reality is that it would be financially challenging for us to run the event in 2023. It is not prudent or sensible to hold the show next year and in order to safeguard and preserve the future of the Great Dorset Steam Fair, we believe this to be the right decision to enable us to continue to run a high-quality event in 2024 and beyond.

"We would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued support, and we look forward to seeing you all again between 22-26 August 2024. Tickets for the 2024 event will be on sale from the Autumn of 2023."

Newark's MF milestone

ome important milestones will be celebrated at this year's Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show, which is shaping up to be one of the largest gatherings of vintage tractors, engines, machinery, commercial and military vehicles in the country. And one such milestone will include the 50th anniversary of a true workhorse – the Massey Ferguson 1200.

A treat to see in the line-up this coming November, the MF 1200 was the first articulated four-wheel tractor to be manufactured in Britain. It can be credited with changing the concept of agricultural engineering, despite some early production blips. It was launched at the Smithfield Show, in December 1971, and the first production examples left the company's Barton Dock Road in Manchester in 1972.

The tractor was powered by a Perkins six-cylinder diesel of 105hp (DIN), with its box-like body featuring a steel-nosed bonnet and integral cab – and of course, the central pivot giving it the articulation and manoeuvrability it's renowned for.

These icons of their time will be exhibited at the Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show, with one long-time collector sharing his passion for this more unusual tractor that came into his possession some 20 years ago.

"I like to see and show my tractors in what I call their working clothes," says 79-year-old Peter Tack, who keeps himself busy between his haulage company and his collection in Crowland, Peterborough. "Everyone has their own preferences; I like something different, that you might not see many of, and I choose to keep them how they look after a working life."

So how did he come across his MF 1200? "I was looking for a bigger four-wheeled tractor through a dealer," he explains. "They didn't have exactly what I was looking for, however, they asked if I would be interested in seeing a Massey Ferguson 1200.

"They didn't have much idea on its history – but liking something a bit different, I agreed to take a look. We went to the farm where it was and

walked across grassy fields, at the top of which were two trees with a thicket of blackberry brambles and stinging nettles – it was in there – so we got to work."

Not expecting much life from the long-abandoned machine, Mr Tack hooked up a battery and to his delight – and surprise – the engine came to life. "I didn't keep it running for very long for being concerned with damaging it," he explains. "I got a lorry and brought it home."

It didn't take long for his new purchase to be running and show ready, with an oil change and pumping up the tyres all that was required. "Once it was running, we did have an issue with a knocking on turning, but that was easily resolved after finding it was caused by a knuckle joint."

Today, Mr Tack enjoys sharing his classic tractor collection with fellow enthusiasts and the public at events like the Newark Vintage Tractor & Heritage Show – where this year there will be a static display.

So, what is it that Mr Tack likes about the MF 1200 and its 50-year history? "It won the accolade of Most Outstanding Silver Medal entry at the Royal Show in 1972, recognising its significance to farming and engineering.

"When cultivating, other tractors were working with one wheel in the furrow and one wheel on top. The MF 1200 kept the wheels out of the furrow, which was a great benefit.

"All in all, it has huge significance to British farming and engineering."

There will also be a wide range of other classic and vintage machinery and engines on display at the event, with a celebration of both icons and lesser-known vintage machinery treasures, says show organiser Elizabeth Halsall. "Entries are now closed, and we have 1,099 in total, so it's looking like it will be one of the largest gatherings of its kind, in the country – it's truly not to be missed."

Three British-built models were included in the 100 Series for the UK market – 135, 165 and 175 – as well as the French-built 130. Other models featured according to each market.

hen Massey

The 130 was powered by a four-cylinder engine, while the 135 had a three-cylinder Perkins unit and the 165 and 175 a four-cylinder Perkins diesel. Petrol variants were also offered, but were nowhere near as successful as the diesel versions.

Transmission wise, the standard set-up was a six-speed gearbox – the still advanced Multi-Power system also being available as an extra cost option, offering 12 speeds via a high and low splitter in each main gear ratio, with change-on-the-move ability.

Various updates and changes would be made to these initial models as the years passed by. The 130 was soon deleted, at least in Britain, while the 165 saw a MkII version arrive with more power – now having 59hp (DIN) under the bonnet for 1968. In the same year, the rather underperforming 175 was replaced by the more powerful, 72½hp 178 model, giving this member of the family a much-needed boost in power output.

Mechanical improvements were also made and the very handsome, but rather impractical in some respects, Duple-built weather cab was replaced in 1970 when UK legislation required safety cabs to be fitted to new tractors. Flat-topped mudguards soon became standard across the range to accommodate the fitting of such cabs, of which MF offered two types, both consisting of a metal safety frame complete with windscreen and roof, which was then available with either rigid cladding or canvas cladding – the latter being much cheaper and often chosen by cost-conscious farmers.

The use of 178 as a model number probably seemed a sensible one when it

was introduced in 1968, as it was an upgraded 175, but the 178 would only survive a short time because a new range of 100 Series tractors was introduced at the end of 1971 to hit farms in 1972.

'8'LINE

The whole Red Giants range was duly revamped in 1971, with all models receiving some changes, albeit often small ones. The 135 and 165 were both still present, but the 178 had now disappeared in favour of a new, Perkins A4.248-powered, 71hp (DIN) 185 model.

The name change for the 178 had become necessary as a whole new family of models was also introduced in 1971 in the shape of the new '8' line. These looked like the existing tractors but featured a longer wheelbase and were frequently advertised by Massey Ferguson as the 'deluxe' Red Giants, or the 'Super-Spec' line.

Apart from their extra length the new tractors looked pretty much identical to the originals, but the model numbers were now the 148, 168 and 188, reflecting the fact that, as well as increased power ratings, these new machines featured an eight-speed transmission option as well as the 12-speed Multi-Power.

BIG-HEARTED 148

The 135 was part of the original launch of the Red Giants, back in 1964, and was very successful in all the markets it was sold into, being built in North America, France and in Coventry, here in the UK. Despite being offered with a petrol engine, the vast majority sold in the UK were fitted with a three-cylinder Perkins diesel engine producing 45½hp. Many different versions of the 135 were produced, including narrow tractors.

From a distance, the new 148 was identical to the 135 and indeed it did share most of its components with the older model. It was built in both the Beauvais factory, in France, and in Coventry and at first glance could have been taken for a 135 with a different badge. Externally it was possible to tell that the 148 had a longer wheelbase

than the 135, but really only if the two were parked beside each other. Under the skin however, there were many differences that gave the 148 its Super-Spec moniker.

The engine used was actually the same Perkins three-cylinder AD3.152 powerplant as used in the 135, although constructed with a different cylinder head as well as different fuel injection equipment that allowed for a slightly higher power output of 49hp over the 135's 45½hp.

The big deal though was naturally the adoption of an eight-speed transmission. Multi-Power was a standard fitment, using the already proven 12-speed 'box used on the 135 and others in the original range, but the optional eight-speed gearbox gave a very good spread of gears and high and low ranges without the added complexity of Multi-Power, and this found favour with many farmers who could not see the justification for a change-on-the-move system.

Round at the back of the 148, many components were strengthened – including the whole of the rear axle, as well as linkage components themselves, so that the tractor could more comfortably and reliably cope with heavier implements. This also increased the weight of the tractor slightly and no doubt helped with tractive effort.

Despite its extra power and abilities, the 148 never caught on with farmers to anywhere near the extent of the popular 135, which is a shame as it was a very competent tractor.

MID-RANGE 168

The 165 had, like the 135, been among the best-selling tractors since its introduction in 1964 and had also undergone a few changes and upgrades by the time it was joined by the 168. Although the new 168 was the '8' line version of the 165, the new tractor was rather different than the makeover that turned the 135 into the 148.

This was because the engine chosen for the 168 was not the same as that used in its older 165 sister, instead it used the Perkins four-cylinder A4.236 engine that had originally powered the 175 – this time with a rated output of 69hp. This meant that power output was considerably more than the 62hp 165 and, as the 168 was not the largest model, the problem encountered back in 1964 with the 175 seeming underpowered in comparison with the competition, was avoided.

Two transmission options were offered. The 12-speed Multi-Power gearbox was standard, while the eight-speed unit was optional. The dual clutch was standard, as was the six-inch spacer in the transmission.

It could be said that the 168 was often overlooked by prospective purchasers, many preferring the cheaper, but less powerful 165 which, by the early 1970s, had become something of an icon in itself. Plus, where more power was

required most farmers opted for the 185, which was not a whole lot dearer than a 'fully loaded' 168.

TOP-OF-THE-RANGE 188

As the Super-Spec version of the 185, the 188 was the flagship of the 100 Series line-up. Unlike the 168, the 188 had more in common with its sister, the 185, by virtue of sharing the same four-cylinder Perkins A4.248 engine, rated at 75hp. Specification was the same as the 168 and, of course, it shared the spacer giving an additional six inches of wheelbase. However, the linkage's lift capacity had been increased by 250kg over the 185, thanks to a slightly revised hitch layout.

In France Massey Ferguson produced a four-wheel drive version of the 188, and although 100 Series models had been converted to four-wheel drive machines by different manufacturers in various countries, including Four Wheel Traction Ltd. in the UK, Massey Ferguson had

shied away from offering its own four-wheel drive versions until now.

As the flagship of the range, the 188 became the best-selling of all three of the new '8' line models, as most farmers that were willing to pay for what was seen at the time as a large machine, often went the extra mile to obtain the 'top dog' rather than the cheaper, but less glamourous, 185. I'm sure the extra features also came in handy too, of course!

FIVE YEARS LATER

The '8' line models had been moderately successful. They had sold well enough, but not in huge numbers, especially the 148 model which suffered due to the fact it ended up as not that much cheaper than the 165, which was a larger machine with much more potential. Frugal buyers then decided to forego the benefits of the 148 in favour of a standard, no-frills 165.

Taking a look at the official MF production figures for the 100 Series

proves the point. Out of the '8' line range, the 188 was by far the most popular – selling nearly double the number of units than either the 168 or 148 individually. The 168 came next in terms of numbers produced, but the 148 was not far behind.

The facts really speak for themselves though, when you compare the '8' line production figures with the older '5' line models. Now, when it comes to the 135 and 165, these models were in production for longer than the 148 and 168, so earlier models will have higher production numbers, but even taking that into account the numbers are very revealing.

The 135 sold around 241,000 units more than the 148, and the 165 sold around 160,000 units more than the 168. The 185 and 188 comparison is a fairer one, as the two tractor models were built for a similar length of time, but the trend is the same, with the 185 selling close to 19,000 more units than the 188. This shows that the '8' line range was not



the huge success that MF might have thought it was going to be, although taken together a total of 43,488 '8' line tractors rolled off production lines, which is not an inconsiderable feat.

By 1976 it was obvious that the reign of the Red Giants was coming to an end. The '8' line may have only been in production a relatively short time, but the world was moving on and the main issue facing all tractor manufacturers was the impeding quiet cab legislation that was then coming into force; Britain bringing in a noise limit in the cab during 1976. That limit was low enough that manufacturers had to either start off on the drawing board with a completely new cab design from the ground up, or buy in cabs from an outside supplier.

The old safety cab that had been fitted to the 100 Series since 1970 had done the job prior to this, and the canvas-clad variant, in particular, is seen as iconic amongst those who remember the farming scene during the 1970s and 1980s. Looking back it is amazing that a leading manufacturer could offer such a simple cab, but it did the job it was intended for, thanks to its rigid safety frame, and many older tractor drivers at the time had been used to no cab at all, so a few draughts did not cause any concerns.

The rigid clad cab was obviously a better option in terms of comfort, but was less often specified due to its extra cost and also came with the problem of excessive noise, which seemed to be much louder in these cabs than the still very noisy environment inside the canvas-clad type! However, the rigidclad cab did also come with a rear-view mirror and ear defenders!

Massey Ferguson decided to design its own cab that could be fitted to a new range of tractors to replace the Red Giants, and the prototype for these, the 595, had been about since 1974. 1976 saw the rest of the 500 Series arrive, replacing the whole Red Giants range, except for niche models such as the 135 fitted with a Quick Detach cab.

Despite the 500 Series being new in terms of aesthetics, the mechanical specification bore much more of a resemblance to the old '8' line models than anything else and can be seen as a direct evolution from the 148, 168 and 188.

50 YEARS ON

Production of the very first new '8' line tractors began in late 1971 and so it was 50 years ago, in 1972, that production proper got underway and they began arriving on farms around the world. The introduction of this additional line-up of tractors was a logical one for Massey Ferguson and it had the desired effect of making a basic, three-model line-up into a six-model offering – taking aside other members of the 'extended' family, such as the 140 and the 1080.

In the UK MF was locked in a continual battle with its main competitor, Ford, and the two were always first or second in the tractor sales leader board during the 1960s and '70s. In 1972 that meant MF could offer more models in the important 40-80hp bracket than Ford, the latter still enjoying huge success with its 1000 Series range that had evolved from the original machines introduced in 1964 at the same time as the Red Giants made their debut.

The addition of the new tractors meant that Massey Ferguson salesmen could offer much more choice to their customers with the full complement of six models compared to Ford's three in the same power bracket. This must have been a good marketing tool.

In the end though, the '8' line tractors were never as popular as their '5' line brethren and despite offering a lot more comfort, amongst other features, farmers often decided to buy the cheaper and already tried-and-tested 135 and 165. Those who did branch out and purchase a 148, 168 or 188 were certainly not left disappointed as driver reaction to these machines was always excellent and they really were the deluxe machines in the MF line-up.

It seems that those who drove an example of the '8' line always had good things to say about it and that probably stems from the extra length. With the spacer fitted to the '8' line tractors behind the gearbox casing, the increase of six



inches in length was useful – giving much better stability and also better access to and from the cab thanks to extra leg room, a feature that helped to define the range as a luxury alternative to the standard '5' line machines and justify the extra cost to some prospective purchasers.

Today the '8' line tractors from Massey Ferguson are not as easy to find as they once were. With limited production, compared to the original models, and many years of strong export sales, only a small population of these tractors remains in Britain. Most of these are now in the hands of collectors, so that means at least we get to see some of them at shows ploughing matches and working events.

To me, the memory of these machines will be forever epitomised by the flexible-clad tractors I used to see working locally back in the 1980s, and although most were 135 and 165 models, I do remember a particular 188 that even at an early age I recognised as something

a bit special. Half a decade on and it is certainly good to look back on these

tractors that were produced throughout almost the entire span of the 1970s ■

Atouch of SICASSI

n Saturday 20 August 2022 a silage event took place near Loughbrickland, Co. Down, hosted by Mark Stewart, writes James

Connolly. The weather was dull and overcast in the morning, but it brightened up with the sunshine appearing in the afternoon and by the evening the conditions for lifting silage were ideal.

It is not often you see two Ford/New Holland Series 70 tractors working alongside each other in the same field. Ian Walsh, from Ballygowan in Co. Down, brought these two tractors to the event.

He used the 8770 model to power a John Deere 3765 precision-chop forage harvester. This 1996-registered tractor, rated at 190hp, really made the harvester purr along up the swards of grass.

His second tractor, an 8670 model, pulled a 16-tonne Kane silage trailer. These large tractors, with their powershift transmissions, made easy work of lifting the silage.

Countys were also at work on the day. Ken Cooke brought along his recentlyrestored 1254 model, which was used to power a New Holland 892 harvester. County built very few of these tractors and only a handful were sold in the UK.

It was also great to see two County 1164s at work. Sydney Scott used his 1972-registered 1164 to power a 1986 Taarup double-chop harvester, which was able to lift rowed-up swards of grass. Melvin Tom was on carting in duties using his 1975 County 1164 and it was a wonderful sight to see the two tractors run side by side.

Stephen Lennon, from Loughbrickland, brought along his immaculate short-wheelbase County 1184, which he teamed up with a 10-tonne Kane classic silage trailer. Also at the event was an unrestored County 1174, which was used to pull a 16-tonne Redrock trailer.

Another impressive tractor was Mark Stewart's superb County 974 which was used to pull a New Holland 550 precision-chop harvester powered by a six-cylinder, air-cooled Deutz engine.

SELF-PROPELLED

Keith McRoberts, from Bandbridge, had his 1979 Mengele SF 400 self-propelled harvester at Loughbrickland. This German-built machine is not common in the UK, as the Mengele company was better known at the time for producing trailed machines.

The SF 400 is powered by a turbocharged, six-cylinder, air-cooled Deutz engine, whilst the harvester





itself is based on the SH 40N trailed machine.

In comparison, it was very interesting to see host Mark Stewart use his V8-powered New Holland 1890 self-propelled harvester. This machine seemed more powerful than the Mengele, but in my opinion the SF 400 was a very smooth-running harvester, with very good blowing power to fill trailers.

There were some nicely restored tractors at Loughbrickland, one of these being a 1996 New Holland 8340 SLE. Another tractor that caught the eye was a 1981 International 785 owned by Robert Thompson from Annaclone, Co. Down. It was teamed up with a twin-axle silage trailer and was on carting in duties.

It was also different to see two Ford Series 10 tractors in two-wheel drive configuration at the event – one being a Ford 7610 Generation III used for rowing up grass and the second a 7810 Generation III pulling a silage trailer.

In this sea of blue machines, another of the stand-out tractors was a Muir-Hill 141 Series III in original condition, teamed up with a 16-tonne Redrock silage trailer.

Ploughmaster pilgrimage

t was a pleasure for *Tractor & Machinery* to be invited to John Sheppard and friends' Blakesley Show Vintage Working Weekend on 10-11 September at Poplars Farm, Greens Norton, Northamptonshire, *says Peter Love*.

This was an excellent working event featuring a 1962-2022 Roadless Ploughmaster 6/4 and Ploughmaster 90 appreciation section. It was staged by Billy Wood with the help of Sam Chapman and Gary Rutter. It turned out to be a very well-organised event for these famous, pioneering four-wheel drive machines and everyone had a good time.

As a backdrop to the fine site there was an excellent and value-for-money café supplied by Blakesley School Friends Association, with bacon rolls, burgers and hot dogs all at £4. Tea and coffee was just £1 and there was a popular bar present too. All exhibitors were given a free Saturday evening meal to mark the organisers' appreciation for them attending and making the show what it was.

In other areas there was horse harrowing, Fowler steam and diesel ploughing, a fine line of interesting tractors ploughing and a harvest area, but it was the Roadless tractors that captivated many of the visitors at the event.

It was Lieutenant Colonel Phillip Henry Johnson (1877-1965) that registered Roadless Traction Ltd. in March 1919, following his work in many military transportation fields, where he realised tracks were the answer for getting across poor soil conditions. He had witnessed this in the Boer War and WW1, where he was part of the Tank Corps and was seconded to them to develop the tracks and suspension system.

Near the end of WW1 he created and developed a comparatively high-speed tank (20mph) known as the Medium Mark D. Unfortunately it was a disappointment and very unreliable.

Despite this, Johnson had many fingers in many pies and he developed his track system for many applications, such as the Rushton-Roadless tractors starting in the late '20s. This led to the Fordson Standard N conversions, as well as so many other tractor skid units being fitted with Roadless tracks, including the Ransomes MG horticultural series and Bristol crawlers.

After WW2, things changed when County Commercial Cars entered the tracked market, which caught Roadless on the back foot somewhat. The full track E model was poor, but the J17 was a much better proposition and the DG4 half-track system sold in some numbers.

Johnson stepped it up a bit, which led Roadless into the four-wheel drive tractor market with the Manuel Selene/GMC/Dodge front axle conversion for Fordson E1A tractors. It turned out to be its most successful post-war model with around 3,000 produced, plus the many aftermarket axle kits that went on tractors across the world – which Roadless and Selene supplied.

PLOUGHMASTER

The next development was the E1A-based Ploughmaster 6/4 and this is what Billy wanted to celebrate at the event. Around 200 were built between March '62 and October '64, making it a highly desirable tractor to have in one's collection.

The 53hp Ford four-cylinder engine just about powered the Roadless Super Majors along, but any four-wheel drive system saps power, especially on the land, and with the 76hp Ford 590E six-cylinder truck engine available it was a natural progression for it to be used by Roadless.

It went in an extended frame, which was beefed up along with the gearbox, clutch and rear axle. It's perhaps not the most aesthetically pleasing Roadless, with its front axle placed well back to

give equal weight distribution (which Billy tells me gives it a 75-inch wheelbase), but you may feel differently.

Not many realise that the first eight or so were painted green and yellow, which didn't wear very well and they went back to the conventional blue after that.

In 1964 it was time for change, not only with Ford and its new Basildon tractor factory, but with its line of 6X tractors – and so it was that Roadless developed a new range of tractors, with the Ploughmaster 90 the 'king' at the time, thanks to chief designer Leonard Tripp – who retired in 1966.

It would be the middle of 1965 when the first Ploughmaster 90 appeared, giving 90hp from the 590E engine. Some of the 90s suffered with differential and front axle problems, but it's even shorter wheelbase gave the tractor great traction and it was a well-liked performer. Billy said that the tractor was further upgraded as the 95 in mid '66, with the more powerful 2703E engine and beefed-up front differential, hydraulic system revamped and assistor rams as part of the package. Interestingly, the Ploughmaster 75 was more successful than both the 90 and 95, having three quarters more sales.

These underrated tractors came from all parts of the UK, including Malcom Cook Snr. and Jnr. travelling from Northern Ireland with an early green and yellow 6/4 (no. 2399) and two others – including an early, original 90.

On the Saturday, when I was at the show, some 12 of the marque were together, with many ploughing at some stage or another. On the Sunday three more joined the party, making it a grand occasion, which is hoped to be repeated in the future.

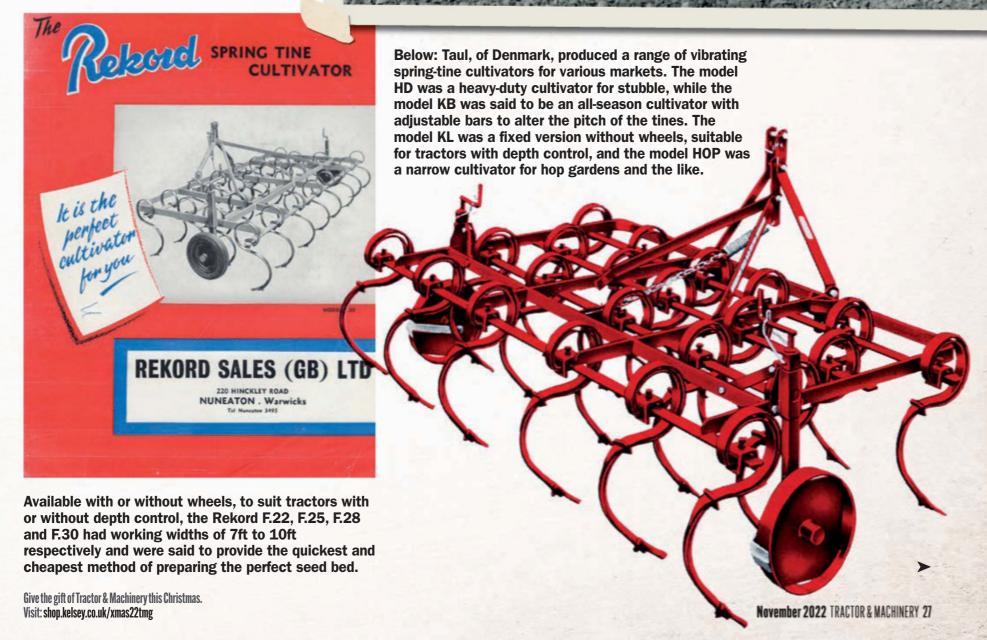
With vast acreages of stubble to ready for next season's crops, it's time to reminisce about the humble cultivator.

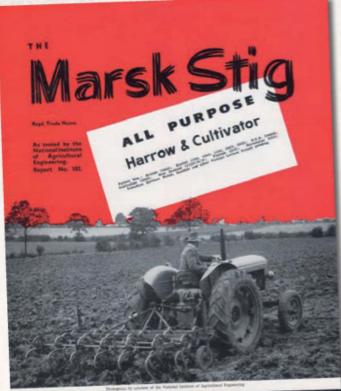
owadays, minimum tillage and direct drilling are in vogue, but once springand rigid-tine cultivators were often the first implements seen in the field following the combine harvester's departure.

These took various forms and were marketed before and after the plough, and occasionally both, and offered a simple and effective method of preparing the ground for the following operation(s).

Our pictorial guide looks at some of the models marketed in the 1960s, '70s and '80s and although many have disappeared for good, there will be others that you may still see in use on the farms of the UK and Ireland today. Arguably the most popular spring-tine cultivator of them all, the Kongskilde Triple K was also available in 'Giant' form – with 39, 45 or 53 tines. All but the smallest of these SG models was foldable to 11ft 5in and could be fitted with reversible shares, 4in row-crop shares, %in grass shares or goose foot shares. All photos from promotional literature (unless stated).







Left: Marketed in Great Britain by William Homer & Son Ltd., of Old Hill in Staffordshire, the Marsk Stig all-purpose harrow and cultivator could be specified with either three or four rows of tines and needed just 20-45hp to operate it effectively, depending on working width (4ft 10in to 9ft 1in).

Right: The Western Machinery & Equipment Co. Ltd.'s 'Giant' Triple P (triple-purpose) spring-tine cultivator used, like so many implements of a similar design, Danish tines with a one-year guarantee. It came in two widths, 16ft 2in and 18ft 10in, and could be folded for easy transportation.



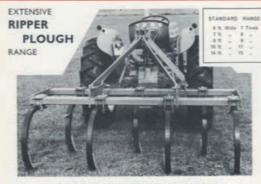

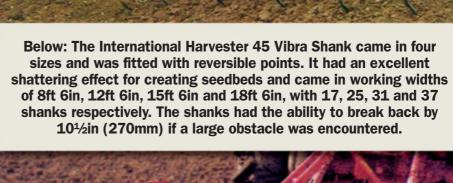

Famed for its Doe Dual Drive and subsequent incarnations, Ernest Doe & Sons Ltd. also produced a range of implements to maximise the potential of its tractors and other high-horsepower models. The Ripper Plough range was useful for a variety of jobs and could be ordered in widths from 6ft to 14ft.





Above: Famed for his Dutch harrows, John Blench also produced other implements and attachments to suit farmers' needs. The company's range of chisel ploughs was suitable for category II tractors (8ft to 12ft working width) and category II/III tractors (14ft to 20ft working width). They could be fitted with double-coil pigtail tines (pictured) or double-leaf ripper tines.

Above: Eberhardt Pflugfabrik GmbH, of the former West Germany, produced the Gazelle range of cultivators to suit tractors from 45-130hp. The example pictured features a weeder harrow and crumbler roller, but the variants could be specified with either, both, or a disc harrow follower.



Manufactured in Nenagh, Co. Tipperary, by Abbey Machinery Ltd., the Vibrating Tine Harrow Model A (pictured above) came in working widths of 6ft to 10ft and with 16 to 30 tines, depending on the width. The Model C was similar, but the pitch of the tines could be adjusted via a winding handle.

Kverneland's chisel plough was a heavy-duty implement with an automatic reset system to help counteract the panning caused by heavy machinery. It was ideally suited to sub-soiling, breaking new ground and cultivating stubble and could operate to a depth of 18in. Power requirements ranged from 75-165hp.

Cultivating Success

ne day, I might actually learn that you have to be somewhat careful about what you mention to Lincolnshire's Robbie

Thorpe, says Jonathan Whitlam. At the beginning of 2022 I mentioned that I was looking for MF tractors, particularly 35 models, to film for an upcoming DVD production, and by April he had lined up several people and their machines to set to work on a field together.

Unfortunately, the weather at the time had other ideas and it was not possible to carry on with the original plan.

Fast forward to late August 2022 and Robbie had successfully reorganised the day with the kind participation of a local farmer, who allowed a sizeable field of wheat stubble as the location for the event. Luckily, everyone was still prepared to bring their machines along and do a spot of cultivating. And so on 27 August I found myself making the two-hour trip up to near Holbeach – and I was certainly not disappointed!

With nearly 30 tractors turning up during the day, the variety was stunning and the sunny weather only further conspired to make it an event to truly remember. Even though it had been one of the driest and hottest summers on record, this area of south Lincolnshire had recently received quite a large amount of rain – enough to make the absence of dust a real change from the normal conditions found during 2022!

This allowed for the cultivators and disc harrows being used to bite into the

stubble easily and the smell of freshly turned-over soil was simply wonderful, given the otherwise all-encompassing dust bowl I was now used to back home in east Suffolk!

In the end, although not all would be working, an amazing array of tractors from the Ferguson TE-20 era up to a Massey Ferguson 3065 HV turned up at the field, giving an insight into the development of the tractor line from the 1940s up to the early 1990s. There was even an MF 1200 present although, unfortunately, a hydraulic issue prevented it from being worked.

Several Ferguson tractors were busy working, most being of the TE-F 20 variety, putting in a very good performance breaking the stubble. There was also a re-engined example, owned by Robbie, that had been fitted with a later Perkins three-cylinder diesel engine of similar spec to that used in the Massey Ferguson 135 tractors, while David Bryant had brought along his TE-D 20, as well as two MF 35s.

Meanwhile, Mervyn Wright was cultivating with his rare, at least to British eyes, French-built FF-30.





Two fine examples of the Massey Ferguson 135 working together, owned by Daniel Disdal and Paul Green.

One of the many highlights of the working event was when Robbie organised the 35 tractors into a line to work across the field, beginning with an FE 35 followed by two early MF 35 tractors – one of which was Robbie's own four-cylinder tractor – and then two 35X tractors taking the lead.

This line-up gave a good representation of the development of this model from 1956 up to 1964 when it was discontinued.

RED GIANTS

The MF 35 was replaced in 1964 by the 135 – part of the new DX range, also known as the MF 100 Series or 'Red Giants'. Mechanically speaking, the 135 was pretty much identical to the 35X it replaced, but the tinwork gave it a completely new look. The 135 has been a popular machine since its introduction and it was no surprise that four examples could be found cultivating and disc harrowing at the cultivation day, some

in their original working clothes and others in fully restored condition.

The next model up in the Red Giants range was the 165 and two superblooking examples of this iconic MF tractor were at work – one with a disc harrow and the other with a chisel plough. The 165 replaced the earlier 65 model, which had gone through two incarnations from its launch up to when the 165 replaced it in 1964, and these

machines, in turn, were examples of the second generation of 165, powered by the A4.212 engine.

In 1976 the 500 Series replaced most of the Red Giants range and two examples of this series, which was designed from the outset to include a 'Q' cab, were working at Holbeach. These were examples of the two main model types in the range, the 565 being physically smaller with a transmission hump protruding into the cab floor area, while the 590 was a higher-built machine with a flat floor cab. Both were busy with cultivators, or 'drags' as they

call these implements in Lincolnshire. Despite being an MF day, a few

'foreigners' also arrived to do a bit of stubble breaking. A very unusual sight was David Illiham with his IH 350, an American-built tractor from the Rock Island factory in Illinois, with a rated power of 41hp at the drawbar, while the familiar lines of David Marston's Fordson New Performance Super Dexta brought a different colour to the field.

Two Nuffield tractors were also present, including a 10/60 that has just been restored by owner Richard Gratton, while another fine-looking, later example of the marque was busy cultivating with a trailed cultivator of much older vintage than the tractor itself. This Nuffield 4/65 is owned by John Illiham.

With all these tractors cultivating and disc harrowing together, it still took

until early evening to finish the field and for the various participants to head off home with their tractors, after having a good chin wag first, of course! The sun had shone almost continuously throughout the day and the stubble had bent easily to the will of the various implements, with everyone enjoying themselves immensely.

I cannot thank enough Robbie Thorpe and all the people who took a day out of their busy lives to bring along their tractors to this small impromptu event and to allow me to film and photographs their tractors.

I just wish I had been able to have time to talk to everyone individually, but with so much action going on it was a very hectic day indeed, but one that I will not

PRODUCTION

The 1690 was David Brown's first six-cylinder model since the legendary 50D and the company's first tractor to produce more than 100hp – putting the West Yorkshire-based firm in a good position to take it forward into the 1980s.

Built in Meltham, the 1690 was a tractor destined for the European market, but as an affiliate of J I Case the tractor proudly displayed the badge of the American company on its nose.

Sharing the same design as its three- and four-cylinder siblings, the 1690 gave David Brown Tractors Ltd. the opportunity to market what was initially a six-model range of four-wheel drive tractors – the 58hp (DIN) 1290, 67hp (DIN) 1390, 83hp (DIN) 1490, 103hp (DIN) 1690 and two American-built tractors – the 120hp (DIN) 2090 and 139hp (DIN) 2290.

Later, the 1690 Turbo would make an appearance, offering more power to farmers – but otherwise it was very similar to the model that it replaced.



A 305mm (12in) clutch channelled power to the transmission, with a hand-operated lever for the independent PTO.

Depending on whether the 1690 to be purchased was two- or four-wheel drive dictated which transmission could be specified. Tractors without a driven front axle could be fitted with either the 12 forward, four reverse synchromesh system or the award-winning Hydra-Shift 'box – a semi-powershift transmission enabling clutch-less shifts between the four ratios in the three forward ranges and single reverse range, as well as engine braking at all times.

The four-wheel drive 1690, and subsequent 1690 Turbo, were only available with the Synchromesh transmission – where synchromesh was provided on gears two and three in each of the four, overlapping forward ranges.

Braking was via a two-pedal, oil-immersed disc system. The pedals could be operated independently for tighter headland turns or latched together for road use – with a self-balancing valve equalising the pressure applied to both brakes.

Two-wheel drive 1690s were equipped with 7.50-16 front tyres as standard, whilst the four-wheel drive 1690 and 1690 Turbo (only available as a four-wheel drive tractor) were fitted with 12.4/11-24 and 14.9/12-24 tyres respectively.

At the rear, the 1690 could be specified with 16.9/14-38, 16.9/14-34 or 13.6/12-38 tyres, while the 1690 Turbo was fitted with 16.9/14-38 as standard.

ENGINE

SPEC CHECK

The tractor was powered by a new, David Brown-designed six-cylinder engine that was built in Britain. Features included a ribbed cylinder block, sleeve-less bores, cross-flow combustion, seven-bearing crankshaft and two cylinder heads.

Generating 103hp (DIN) and maximum torque at 1,500rpm, the David Brown AD6/55 performed well and was efficient and economical to boot – but it was felt that it had more to give, which gave rise to the 1690 Turbo.

With a 100mm (3.94in) bore and 114.3mm (4.5in) stroke, the AD6/55 had a capacity of 5,392cc (329cu in) and a governed speed range of 700-2,300rpm and although David Brown made much of the fact that it was an engine designed solely for use in tractors, feedback suggested that there was more that could come from this package, but that it might not necessarily be in naturally aspirated form.

In 1983 the 1690 Turbo was released and although it only produced an additional 2hp (DIN) at the flywheel, it was at the power take-off that the difference was noticeable – with 9hp more available at the shaft.



HYDRAULICS&PTO

David Brown's Selectamatic hydraulic system, which had been employed on the company's tractors for many years, was incorporated into 90 Series models and provided the operator with single-lever control of the linkage and implements.

Four settings enabled the driver to switch between draft and position control, as well as external circuits. The fourth, '1/L', enabled a spool valve to be operated at the same time as the three-point linkage.

A selective sensing unit offered the choice of three ratings to suit light, medium and heavy-draft implements.

For those demanding greater things from their tractor's hydraulics, a dual hydraulic pump could be specified for the 1690 and 1690 Turbo. This boosted the standard delivery from the engine-driven gear pump from 41.5 litres per minute (9.2gpm) to 76 litres per minute (16.8gpm).

The three-point linkage was a category II system with quick-couple lower links and an estimated static lift capacity of 3,175kg (7,000lb) on the 1690 and 2,990kg (6,590lb) on the 1690 Turbo.

A universal drawbar, with four height positions and two length positions, as well as being adjustable for lateral movement, was a standard fixture – but a combined pick-up hitch and drawbar was available as an option.

The PTO system used a reversible shaft to provide 540/1,000rpm at 2,050 engine revolutions. The shaft was retained by four bolts and there was no loss of oil when the shaft was withdrawn. Maximum power at the shaft was 89hp (66.4kW) and 98hp (72.1kW) respectively.

CAF

The cab, built by Sekura and very similar to that used on Leyland and later Marshall tractors, was a drastic improvement on that fitted to the outgoing range of David Brown models.

It was mounted in a forward position so that the rear wheels would not impede the operator's entry and exit, with wide, rear-hinged doors to make access as straightforward as possible.

The interior, an all-black affair, featured something that David Brown called the 'DB Executive Chair'. This was a fabric-upholstered seat adjustable to suit the driver's weight and height and to suit the leg room required. The back could recline and a back rest extension was available if required, along with lift-up arm rests.

The controls fell easily to hand and the dash panel solely comprised analogue instrumentation which was both simple and easy to read. The pedals were pendant mounted to keep the floor clutter free and David Brown made much of the fact that the fuel tanks were mounted under the floor so that no unnecessary space was taken out of the cab.

On the comfort side of things, the glass was tinted and both the rear and side windows opened, as well as the roof hatch, to provide ample ventilation. Where mechanical ventilation was preferred, a blower and high-efficiency heater were incorporated – directing air at the driver's feet and body, rather than face.

STAR LETTER

An MF 135-powered Standen Cyclone

Dear T&M,

I have never had any dealings with the Tornado, but have worked on Standen Solobeet harvesters. I started my employment as a junior storeman with George Henderson Ltd., Haddington, in August 1965 which was an MF and Standen agent. Most machines were trailed, but we had two Solobeet harvesters - the older one had an MF 35X skid unit and the much younger one had an MF 135.

In early spring I was given the task of unloading new tractors and machines when they arrived, and in April or May of that year a new Standen Solobeet Harvester arrived. I helped to unloaded it and checked it over before signing for it. I put the paperwork into the sales office and got a brochure to read up on it. Then, the next day, I asked the salesman the same question.

He said that new machines were supplied without tractors and the farmer had to supply the tractor he wanted to use on the machine, because the information had to be given to Standen before the machine could be manufactured - as it had to make different mounting brackets and supply the correct size of drive chains and sprockets to suit the tractor that would be used.



I know that Standen did fit tractors to a few new machines going to local farms close to the works, that could be driven by road to the farm. This was done so that it could check that all parts were going to fit when the dealers had to assemble them.

In the winter of 1970, the farmer brothers that owned the aforementioned Solobeet harvesters got out of sugar beet because the factory, in Cupar, Fife, was closing in 1971. The machines were traded in to Geo. Henderson Ltd.

At the end of March 1971 I left Henderson's, but just before that Standen had put a farmer from the north Doncaster area in touch with them and he bought both machines. The older machine was going to be used for parts to prepare his current machine for the season ahead.

nternational Harvester's line of small, Bradford-built tractors can be found on farms, in collections and in the hands of match ploughmen and women, where their size and characteristics make them an ideal choice in the competitive arena.

Those looking for a good all-rounder that is not too heavy and won't break the bank could do a lot worse than one of these tractors and although the earlier models of the 1950s and '60s are still by far the most popular, it is those built in the 1970s that are the focus of this guide.

It was the launch of the B-250 at the 1955 Smithfield Show that started the ball rolling on what would become an extremely successful line of tractors for International Harvester. The 'Little Giant', as it was dubbed by IH's marketing team, was the first model to leave the assembly line at the ex-Jowett car and light commercial factory in Bradford and elements of its design would remain visible in all of the subsequent variants that followed.

The story of these Bradford-built tractors is a classic case of evolution, rather than revolution, and the first of the B-250's successors was built in 1958. The B-275 saw an increase in horsepower and a change to a dual-range transmission, as well as styling differences and the subtle improvements continued with the introduction of the B-414 in 1961, 434 in 1966 and 276 in 1968.

The first of the small tractors to be part of IH's brand-new, 'World Wide Series' (namely the 454 and 574), in 1970, was the 354 – a 38hp machine powered by the BD-144A four-cylinder engine. This was joined by the 444 in 1972 – a 45hp model featuring the larger BD-154A engine.

Production of these two tractors ran to 1974 and 1976 respectively, with the 374 effectively replacing them both when 444s ceased to leave the line at the Idle Works. The newcomer retained the 444's engine, but was de-tuned to produce just 37hp.

Due to the striking similarities between the 354, 444 and 374, much of

what is stated will be applicable to all three models, but any major differences will be highlighted.

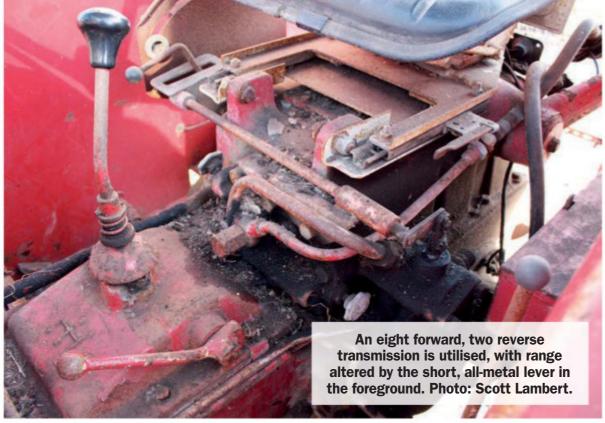
ENGINE

The four-stroke, indirect-injection engines that power these tractors have a reputation for being reliable units that are good in terms of fuel consumption and famed for their torque characteristics.

The BD-144A has a 3%in (85.7mm) bore, while the BD-154A features a 3½in (88.9mm) bore – and both have a 4in (101.6mm) stroke. They are renowned for being trouble-free engines and will last many hours before needing a rebuild but, as with any hard-working model, regular servicing and operator care are fundamental factors in engine health.

When buying any tractor it is always advisable to undertake some basic checks. Wherever possible, start the engine from cold, as failure to start satisfactorily will indicate problems – but if you do not have experience of IH engines from this





era, please do not be put off by a tractor's potentially poor start-up.

While the tractor is cold, remove the radiator cap and check the fluid inside. If the radiator contains anti-freeze you can assume (although not always safely) that the block will be in good condition and the tractor has been well looked-after, but an oily appearance can suggest the need for a new head gasket. A low coolant level can raise suspicions, so be sure to look for leaks when you do start the engine.

Be sure to check the belt tension too – this should be ¾-½in (9-13mm) – and if it is not you will need to adjust it by means of the water pump pulley flange. This can seize, making adjustment of the belt tension impossible – and although not an expensive job it can be rather onerous.

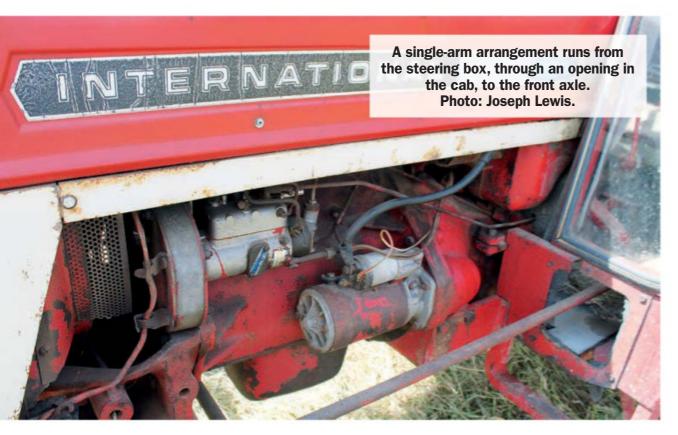
Don't forget to check the oil. This can give a good indication of the state of the engine and its service history; black oil is normal, but 'milky' oil can be an indicator of water contamination and critically – an engine overhaul. Usually, your gut reaction will tell you if the engine's rough or not – but if unsure it's worth factoring in the rebuild cost when striking a deal.

When you finally get around to engaging the starter it's worth noting that the IH four-cylinder engines from this period, namely the two featured here and the larger BD-264 and BD-281, need a decent amount of glowplug heat to start them. Be sure to hold the key in the heat position until the coil inside the 'pepperpot' on the dashboard glows bright orange (usually around 30 seconds),

Cold weather will make starting more troublesome, but even in warmer conditions these engines will cough and splutter for several seconds before running evenly. Don't be put off by this – it's normal!

With the engine running well and warm, pull down on the hand throttle to increase the revs and listen out for anything suspicious. One of the easiest things to detect is 'missing', which would suggest that the fuel pump or injectors require an overhaul. This is not cheap, but can solve a multitude of problems and make for a very nice-running engine.

Satisfied with what you've seen so far, don't forget to check the engine breather on top of the rocker cover. A little 'smoke' being emitted is not too much cause for concern, but anything more can point to more serious issues.



The BD-144A and BD-154A have few serious vices and are simple motors to maintain. If you are confident enough, they are straightforward engines on which to carry out some of the bigger jobs, such as rebuilds.

Engine parts are easy to obtain and won't cost you any more than other marques of a similar age.

TRANSMISSION

Unusually for tractors of this era, both the 354 and 444 were available with a single-plate clutch system of 10in (254mm) and 11in (280mm) diameter respectively – as well as a dual clutch. The 374 was solely available with a dual clutch comprising an 11-inch (280mm) transmission plate and a nine-inch (230mm) PTO plate. It'll be surprising to find one of these tractors with a single-plate clutch, but it is worth checking if it is important to you.

How many hours the transmission clutch will last is largely dependent on the operator and type of work undertaken – particularly if it's been used as a loader or scraper tractor – but if you're happiest with a spanner in your hand it is not an expensive job to replace the clutch plate. An 11-inch clutch plate will typically set you back around £75 +VAT. If you're thinking of undertaking a clutch plate change yourself, original and reprinted service manuals are readily available.

Other than general wear and tear, the only other problem this type of clutch is known for is sticking – particularly when not used for prolonged periods. Several, innovative solutions for avoiding this problem have been devised over the years, so don't be surprised to find a tractor with a piece of wood holding the clutch pedal down or a piece of baler twine strategically positioned!

Unlike the 434, which was available with the Speed Amplifier as an option, the 354, 444 and 374 came with the tried-and-tested eight-speed system – consisting of a short lever on the left of the transmission cover that selects either high or low range, and a long, centremounted lever that selects the four forward speeds and reverse.

It is a very reliable gearbox and so any gear selection problems can largely be attributed to a worn-out or poorly-adjusted clutch, but selector wear can prove to be a factor in high-houred tractors.

There's a well-spaced range of gears and you should be able to find one that's suitable for the task you're undertaking, but don't expect more than 16mph on

the road. The top speed achievable depends on the model and rear wheels/ tyres fitted, but you won't be setting any records!

The differential lock is located near to the operator's right heel. The pedal pivots around a bolt and at the rear of the pedal is a tapered steel block that pushes a pin through the casting, activating the diff-lock. This works well while in good order, but the steel block is susceptible to wear and once it has a groove in it, from the pin, the pedal will stick.

This problem can be resolved by removing the pedal, filling the groove with weld and then grinding it flush, before refitting the pedal and testing.

AXLES, BRAKES & STEERING

The three tractors retained the beamtype front axle used on the outgoing 434, which is adjustable from 48-76in (1.22-1.93m) in 4in (10cm) stages, as opposed to the tubular version found on the 276 and some other Bradford-built models.

It is worth checking for the usual wear and tear around the axle pivot pin, steering rod ends and in certain cases – the kingpins. These will usually be trouble-free, but pay close attention to them if you are buying a tractor that has, or has had, a loader fitted to it or front-end ballast/wheel weights attached – as wear is more likely.

Turn the steering wheel, with the tractor stationary, and look for fore and aft movement in the front axle. This is a good indication of wear in the pivot pin and/or bush, which can prove expensive, depending on the level of wear. If the bush is worn through and the pin has reached the 'tombstone' you will need to have it line-bored and re-bushed.

The rear axle was never really under strain – with the axle built to withstand the rigours of hard work. It can be the case, however, that the smallest thing can have a detrimental effect – as baler twine and similar items are known to wrap themselves around the end of the rear axle and damage the oil seals. If there are oily marks on the rear wheel rim(s), it's best to inspect the axle oil seals as excessive leakage will require an overhaul – necessitating removal of the hydraulic top cover and bull gears.

A single-arm steering box, connected to a rod running down the left side of the tractor, is the system that you will find on most examples of these models, but power-assisted steering was available as an option on the 354 and 444. This is definitely worth having!

Dry disc brakes remained part of the specification of these tractors and although adequate, do not expect the same performance as the system employed on the Doncaster-built World Wide models. Acting on the bull pinion

shafts, the 6½in (165mm)-diameter discs are enclosed, but externally mounted for ease of access and maintenance. Ensure that they are well balanced with 1¾6-1¾6in (30-40mm) of free play. If they are worn out, you can expect to pay a little more than £20 +VAT for a lining kit.

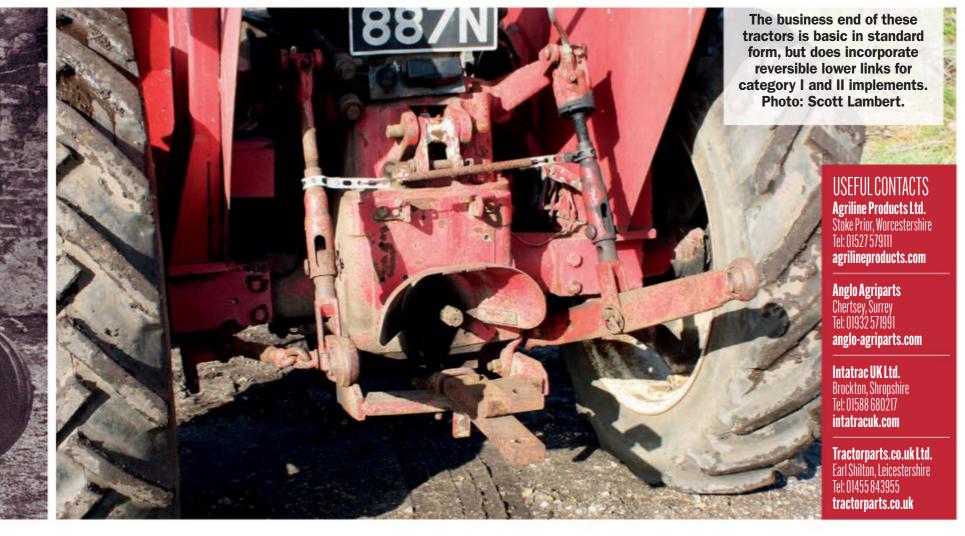
An over-centre parking brake, located to the right of the driver's seat, acts upon the service brakes. This may need some adjustment in the linkage to enable it to function satisfactorily.

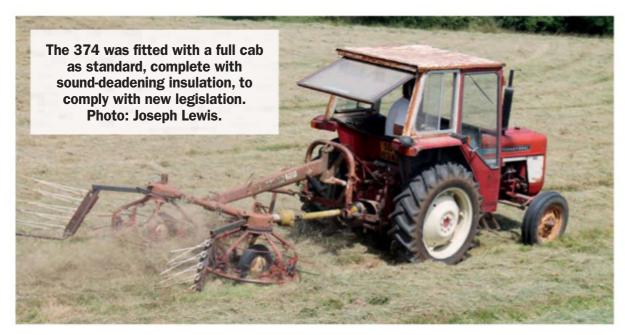
HYDRAULICS&PTO

IH's tried-and-tested, 'live' hydraulic system with draft and position control, known as Vary Touch, was fitted to the 354, 444 and 374. It can be difficult to ascertain whether it is working correctly, so it is worth getting the tractor up to working temperature and checking the hydraulics with a plough or other implement attached.

Keep the engine running and raise the implement off the ground and look for 'hiccups'. These usually point to a worn hydraulic piston or, sometimes, a scored cylinder bore.

You can also verify the system's health by raising the implement and locking off the system using the external valve in front of the operator's seat. The implement should not go down, even with the engine off, and if it does you should take note of the speed at which it does so.





If the implement falls slowly then the hydraulic piston will probably require a new O-ring, but if a rapid fall is witnessed the likelihood of the piston and/or cylinder being worn out becomes increasingly likely.

A slow lift can be down to several things – the simplest being a dirty hydraulic filter that isn't allowing oil to flow as it should. IH incorporated a slide-in suction filter at the front of the hydraulic casing and this is the first thing to check. Washing the existing one is a good place to start, but replacements are available for around £45 +VAT.

It could be the case that the enginemounted hydraulic pump is worn. It is often possible to refurbish the existing pump, but a new one will set you back around £100 +VAT.

These tractors use a top link-sensed system and can lift approximately 2,600lb (1,179kg). The lower links are reversible to enable both category I and II implements to be fitted. It's a pretty robust arrangement, but check that the levelling box is working. If not, it will probably have a broken pin inside, but a broken tooth is also a possibility. Fitting a new pin is straightforward, but a broken tooth may mean a call to a breaker.

The power take-off is controlled by a lever on the left-hand side of the transmission casing and is usually trouble free, but if you are buying a tractor with PTO work in mind it is worth knowing that various options were available for the 354 and 444, including single- and two-speed systems – not just at the usual 540rpm and 1,000rpm either. Do your homework, quiz the owner and try the tractor where possible.

The tractors were supplied with a clevis-type swinging drawbar as standard, but a pick-up hitch was available as an

option. This had the ability to lift fractionally more than the lower links' maximum capacity, at the hook.

Screw-type or breakaway-type self-sealing couplings were available as an option for operating remote cylinders. These are found in both single- or double-acting form and are well worth having.

CAB

Built by Victor, the cab on these tractors is basic – but serves a purpose. At the time of the 354 and 444 it could be specified as a frame or a full cab, but as legislation regarding noise levels changed this led to the 374 being available with a full cab only – with noise-deadening insulation on the interior.

Interior cladding aside, what you get from these tractors is the same – a fuel gauge, ammeter, oil pressure gauge and temperature gauge housed in a faux-wood panel and the hand throttle located under the right-hand side of the steering wheel along with the tachometer, and a pepperpot-style glowplug indicator to the left of the steering column, alongside a small chart that indicates speed according to gear selection.

The seat is basic, yet comfortable, and the controls fall easily to hand – with the gear levers mounted on top of the transmission and the hydraulic quadrant and parking brake to the operator's right.

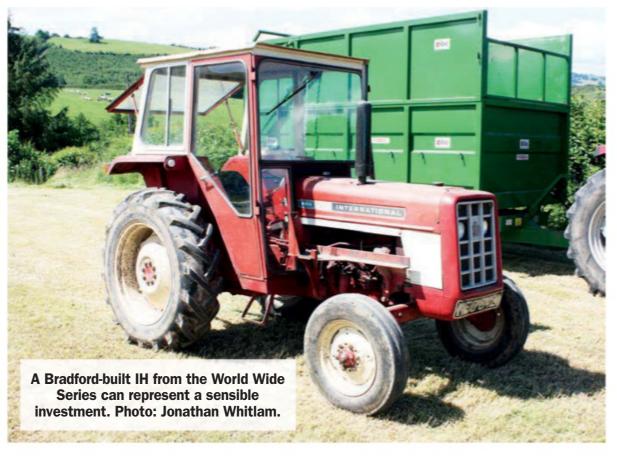
In short, the later the tractor, the more comfortable it is likely to be!

CONCLUSION

The 354, 444 and 374 are simple workhorses that are ideal for general chores, road runs and ploughing matches. They are simple to maintain, with parts generally easy to come by from all-marque suppliers and IH specialists.

An off-farm 444 will set you back around £3,000, but it is possible to pick one up for around half that if you're looking for a project. Restored examples of these models command prices around the £6,000 mark, but you can expect to pay a little more for the 354 and 374 – due to fact that less were built and they are, as a result, more desirable.

IH enthusiasts will appreciate their appeal, but these models will never have the draw that a Massey Ferguson 135 or Ford 3000/4000 has to general auction attendees or machinery dealers. Don't be put off by this – why not take the plunge?

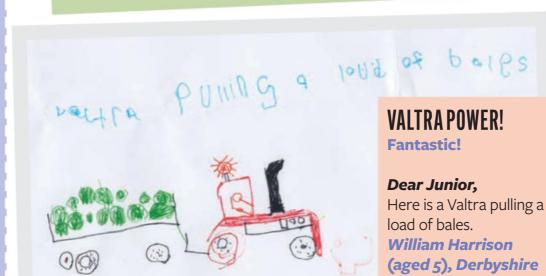

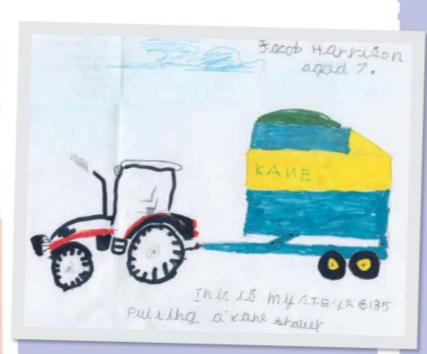

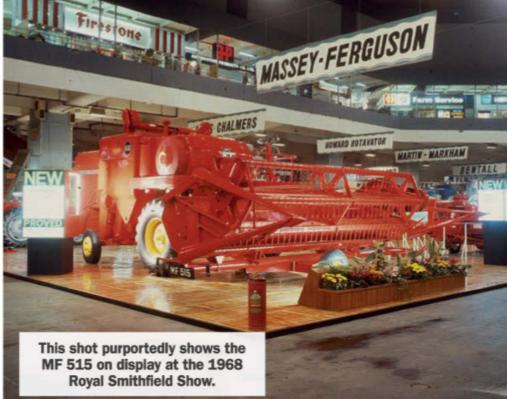

Ferguson System

In the first part of a new series on hydraulic systems, Andrew Hall discusses the principles of Ferguson tractor hydraulics and the advantages that the system brought to farmers.

ever mind electronic controls and guidance systems applied to modern farm machinery, the application of hydraulics to tractors and farm machinery has been one of the most important developments in farm machinery, and remains so, even in the 21st century!

Hydraulic control is a simple, but efficient means of conveying power to where it's required, and is very much taken for granted these days.

It hasn't always been the case though, as early tractors that replaced large, heavy steam engines and draft horses

merely towed their implements, often using former horse-drawn equipment until manufacturers designed implements specifically for tractor use.

One of the early issues with the use of relatively light tractors was that of maintaining good traction, particularly when the going got tough on heavy wet ground. The remedy was to use steel wheels with aggressive tread in the form of spade lugs and to add extra weight to reduce wheel slip.

This improved matters to a degree, but extra weight causes soil compaction and steel wheels with lugs aren't good on hard road surfaces.

FERGUSON

Harry Ferguson was born into a farming family near to Belfast in Northern Ireland and had a strong interest in things mechanical and, along with early antics with racing cars and attempts at aviation, he turned his attention to farm machinery, with ploughing particularly in mind.

He had observed early tractors and considered them inefficient in working with trailed implements and set about improving matters. Early experiments using Fordson F tractors with ploughs mounted directly on the back were undertaken utilising a mechanical form of lift to enable manoeuvrability and transport.

Tireless experiments were also made to harness the forces acting against the forward motion (draft forces) of the ploughs used to increase the traction on the rear drive wheels of the tractor, initially mechanically, but eventually using hydraulic principals to lift and harness the draft forces.

This resulted in the prototype 'Black Tractor', which was very like a smaller, lighter version of the Fordson tractors used in previous experiments. In looking for a manufacturer for the tractor, Harry Ferguson approached David Brown, the famous Yorkshire gear manufacturer that had contributed to the prototype, and between 1936 and 1939 around 1,200





tractors were produced, based upon the 'Black Tractor'.

From 1939 Harry Ferguson ended his association with David Brown, which had a desire to build a more powerful tractor itself, and indeed had created its own tractor by that time. As a result Harry Ferguson approached Henry Ford, which resulted in the 'handshake agreement' and the design and production of the Ford 9N tractor in the USA, which embodied the 'Ferguson System', as it became known!

Ford 9N and, from 1942, Ford 2N tractors were produced and some made their way to the UK in small numbers during WW2. As with David Brown, Harry Ferguson broke his ties with the Ford Motor Company and looked to the UK for a manufacturer to continue the production of Ferguson System-equipped tractors.

This resulted in an agreement with the Standard Motor Company to build tractors from 1946, and the most prolific of all Ferguson tractors, the TE-20, was born. It is this model, due to its popularity, that is the subject of this feature covering the technical details.

Built at the Banner Lane factory of The Standard Motor Company, production began in the summer of 1946, with the TE-20 powered by a USA-built Continental petrol engine until 1948, when the Standard petrol engine became available and became the TE-A 20.

From 1949 the TE-D 20 arrived, equipped to run on TVO (Tractor Vaporising Oil) and from 1951 a diesel model was produced (TE-F 20) and production of all models ran until late 1956, when the Ferguson 35 (FE 35) appeared.

TE-20 HYDRAULICS

The TE-20 range of tractors was extremely successful and, together with a comprehensive range of matched implements, took the agricultural machinery market by storm. The Ferguson System layout had been established during the Ford 9N era and consisted of two lower link arms and a centre (top) link to attach its implements.

Many patents covered the system and other manufacturers used similar three-point linkages, albeit without the Ferguson draft control – relying upon depth wheels on the implements.

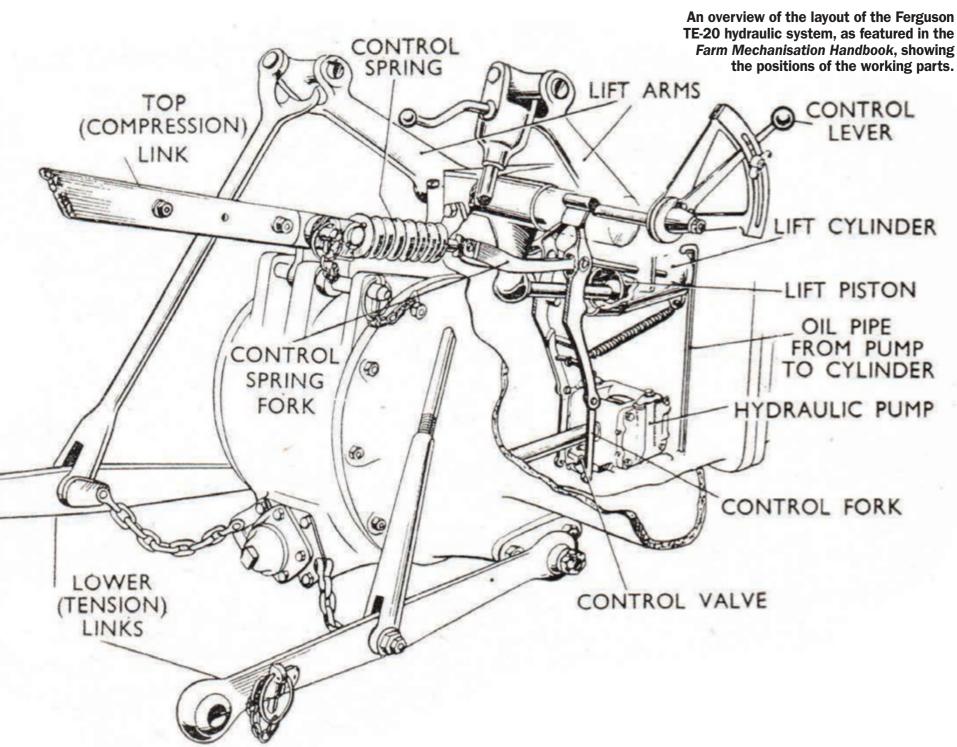
Two sizes of ball-ends were established, known as category I and II. Smaller tractors, such as the Ferguson, used category I, whilst larger tractors such as the Fordson Major used category II.







Left to right: This left-hand lower link arm shows the simple means by which implements are attached. The TE-20 range used the smaller category I ball-ends. This is a sliding top link, which was the standard equipment on the TE-20. It requires a spanner to slacken the bolts to adjust it. Turnbuckle (screw) types came later and became more popular. The right-hand drop arm features an adjustable levelling box, used to facilitate attaching implements and to adjust the level of implements in work.



The hydraulic power of the TE-20 tractors consisted of a four-cylinder hydraulic pump, driven by the power take-off drive. One of the limitations of the design was that one had to have the power take-off engaged to operate the hydraulic system, meaning that implements that

utilised both the PTO and hydraulics needed to be working when lifted, but for ploughing this wasn't an issue.

CONTROL VALVE

Hydraulic oil is admitted to the pump on the inlet side via a spool valve (control

valve). When the operator's control lever is lowered, the valve moves backwards and oil drains from the lift cylinder and the lift linkage lowers the implement. Conversely, when the lever is placed into the raise position the valve moves forward and allows oil to enter the pump and onwards to the lift cylinder.

As the piston of the lift cylinder reaches its maximum height position, the skirt of the piston presses against a linkage and moves the valve to a central (neutral) position and locks the implement hydraulically at the transport position.

TOP LINK

The top (centre) link is connected via a heavy control spring to the aforementioned linkage and the movement of the top link in and out varies according to the forces generated by the soil resistance (draft forces) of the attached implement.

When the control lever is lowered and a soil-engaging implement enters the

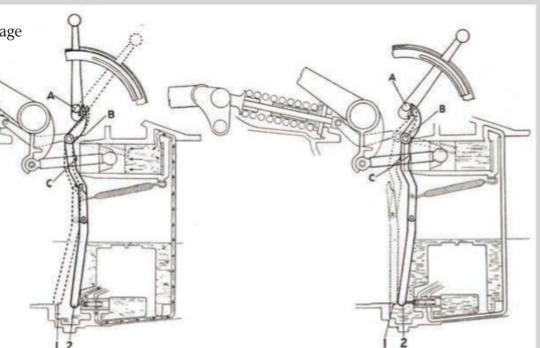

If soil resistance decreases (top link under no load) the linkage moves back and allows the implement to drop to the original depth setting.

ground, the resistance increases and a compressive force on the top link compresses the control spring and the internal linkage moves forward until the control valve is in its central position, thus locking the implement at a certain depth.

If the soil conditions become harder, the forces increase and a lifting force is applied to the implement, which increases traction until the forces balance and the implement is again locked at the selected depth. If the ground conditions are too hard, an implement can lift out of the ground completely.

The depth is varied by raising or lowering the control lever, which adjusts the sensitivity of the system to draft forces. The geometry of the lower link arms and the top link is designed to impose force just ahead of the tractor front axle to prevent the tractor rearing up if draft forces become excessive.

A safety feature is embodied into the system to prevent a tractor rearing if an immoveable object is encountered. A sudden forced exerted on the top link causes the oil to be ejected from the internal lift cylinder and results in the wheels spinning rather than the tractor rearing.

If this happens the operator reverses the tractor, lifts the implement and drops it into the ground again once the obstruction has been passed!

LOWER LINK ARMS

The lower link arms support attached implements and pivot to allow them to lift and lower. They are in tension when an implement is in work and the ball end size is the small category I size on the TE-20 range of tractors.





EXTERNAL SERVICES

The Ferguson TE-20 features two tapping points in the base of the hydraulic pump, diagonally opposed at the front right-hand and rear left-hand side for powering front loaders and tipping trailers etc.



Clockwise: The one limiting factor was that one required the PTO to be engaged in order to operate the hydraulics. There are two hydraulic tapping points, one at the front right-hand corner of the pump base for front loaders, and a second on the rear left-hand corner for fitting a trailer tipping pipe, which mounts under the rear axle housing.

A BIG success





y big complaint about Biddenden Tractorfest over the years is that there has never been enough tractors attending to give it true festival status, writes Peter Love. That changed this year when 14,000-plus visitors attended the event to see more than 200 tractors of various ages and sizes, which was wonderful to see.

Under the guidance of the Kent County Agricultural Society, the 2022 show was certainly on a different footing and was back on its original site, which was a bonus as far as I was concerned. There was a great atmosphere to complement the great tractors, which included a stunning display of Ferguson tractors – the likes of which had not been seen in this area for decades.

Many were from Lee Blackford's collection and in original condition,

but what was even nicer to see was a log sheet on each tractor that had been properly filled in, which enables visitors to know exactly what they are looking at.

John Burdfield's rare, four-wheel drive MF 188 had been well restored and looked good with Barry Leggatt's restored Ferguson TE-20. Not far away was Michael Smallbone's lovely 1989 Trantor Mk2.

The Ford & Fordson Association's stand looked good, helping it to sign up some new members, and The Friends of Ferguson Heritage stand, co-ordinated by Simon Wright, also attracted new members too. He was exhibiting his 1972 MF 1150, that has just been restored, and it was joined in the ring by Mick Blunt's 1970 example. To have two of these prairie-style models in the same ring was great and unique in 2022 to my knowledge.

Also making its debut at the show was Liam Bank's well-restored, 1960 Fordson E1A Major industrial with Holman compressor, made in Cornwall, at the rear.

One of the star tractors at the event was the Hanks family's 1963 Fordson New Performance Super Major-based Doe Dual Drive, which has been in Kent for many decades and still looks just as good as it did 20 years ago with its previous owner.

Another that stood out was Ross Douglas' 1967 Northrop 5004, based on a Ford pre-Force 5000 and said to have cost £1,980 when introduced in 1965. Although its needs some work, it was great to see.

It was a very successful event that seemed to be enjoyed by all and well put together. Congratulations to everyone involved as I feel that it was the big hit on the 2022 southern show circuit. ■

Parham Park

t was great to see a proper vehicle rally back at Parham Park in West Sussex, on 9-10 July, staged by the Sussex Steam Engine Club Ltd. and friends. This organisation has held events at the vast Wiston House site not that far away, but the move to Parham Park was an instant success, with more than 20,000 people flocking to this event, writes Peter Love.

More than 60 full-size and miniature steam engines were exhibited, as well as 75 tractors, commercials, motorcycles, and cars. There was an autojumble, trade stands and a working area to enjoy too. This isn't the first time that an event like this has taken place on this site, but it was laid out differently and with many more exhibits to those earlier events that took place in the 1980s and '90s. In fact, the ring was the only thing I could see that was in the same place.

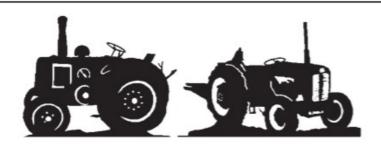
The selection of tractors included an excellent line of Ferguson and Massey Ferguson models that were part of the Friends of Ferguson Heritage display. The Goldring family's 1975 Massey Ferguson 165, purchased in 1993 from the Canterbury area, was typical of the high standard of restoration at the

event, but the star was undoubtedly Simon Wright's 1972 MF 1150 that he purchased in December 2019.

As for the rest, a genuine Nuffield Universal prototype with Perkins P6 engine stood out. It was tested on Tom Paisley's farm at Holywell, St Ives, Huntingdonshire, where it was sold to. It changed hands with a prototype P4-engined version at the farm sale in the autumn of 1980 and is now based at Washington following a Cheffins sale, I believe.

It was an excellent event that can only grow in stature, in my opinion. ■

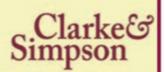

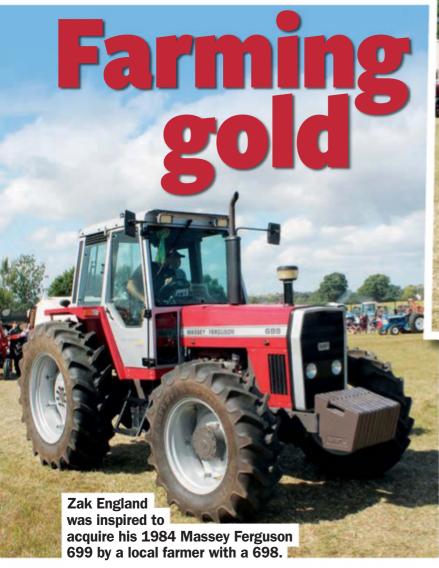

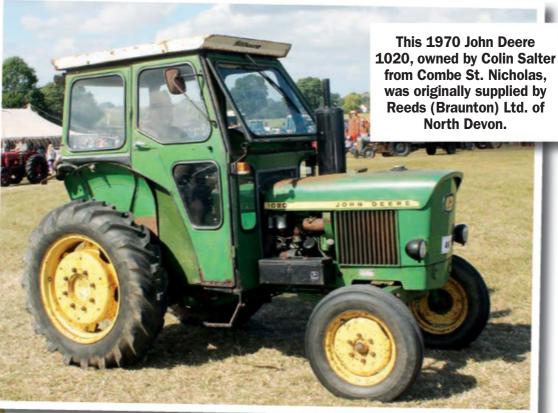

Not needing much encouragement, Andrew Hall adds another tractor to the collection and goes halves with his son, saving a 1943 Fordson N.

or some time now my son
David has shown some
interest in owning a Fordson
N and quite frequently would
show me details of those that
were available for sale. Back in
December '21 he showed me the one we
have purchased, which was for sale on
the Isle of Sheppey. A visit to see it
brought the question: "Do we buy it, or
leave it alone?"

The tractor was pretty much complete and featured a pair of period tyres,

which at the time looked to be in useable condition. The other issue was that the vendor had left water in the engine during a cold snap, which had resulted in a cracked cylinder block.

As expected, the conversation on the return journey featured the tractor highly, and the thoughts of what to offer for it, accounting for the aforementioned issue. The thoughts were that if we didn't buy it the tractor may be broken up, something we thought it was too good for, so a call to the vendor and an

acceptable offer made had us picking it up the following weekend.

BACK HOME

With the tractor back home the first thing to do was to attempt to start it. A check of the engine oil was made and found satisfactory, so some water was put into the cooling system, which inevitably leaked from the crack in the cylinder block, but not at the rate that was expected, so I temporarily ran some silicone sealant along the crack, which successfully held back the water enough to run the engine.

The points in the magneto were cleaned and resulted in a good spark, so on the strength of that some petrol was added and an attempt made to crank it up. Once the petrol came through to the engine we experienced a loud violent bang from the exhaust, which repeated itself. I suspected that the magneto had been fitted 180-degrees out of time, which was confirmed when I removed it. Once fitted correctly we soon had the engine running and were able to drive the tractor around.

IMPROVEMENTS

An oil change was necessary, but with the cracked block in mind I didn't want to fill it with fresh oil until the crack had been attended to, so the oil was drained and the sump plate removed to clean the sludge and the filter gauze. The oil was very black and overdue a change, and once the sump plate was removed I was able to set about cleaning things up. The sludge was like Marmite and took quite a bit of scraping off the plate.

FILTER GAUZE

The filter was wiped carefully, as they are rather fragile, and then soaked in some solvent to clean the mesh. Unfortunately, the mesh began to break up as it was cleaned, rendering the filter useless, but thankfully I had another filter off another tractor that had been in the shed for some years, and this was cleaned and pressed into service.

PRIMED

Whilst the sump plate was off the tractor and clean I decided to give the underside a coat of red oxide to protect it. A decision hasn't yet been made whether to keep it as it is, or to repaint it in dark green enamel, as it would have been originally.



Some silicone gasket was used when refitting the plate. In due course I will cover the repair of the cylinder block, which looks to be successful, although I haven't filled the radiator to find out yet, but I'm fairly confident it's a sound repair!

STEERING WHEEL

Another shortcoming was the condition of the steering wheel, which has lost its spokes. Originally it would have been a Bakelite rim, but we chose to fit a new rim supplied by Cotswold Tractors. The spokes were a little short, due to corrosion, but I bent a length of sheet steel to the shape of the spokes and cut four pieces off to extend the spokes to the inside of the new rim, and used the MIG welder to make the repair.

The repair is invisible, thanks to the trusty angle grinder, and the rim has temporarily been sprayed in grey primer until a top coat of paint is applied at a later date.

FRONT WHEELS

At first glance I thought the front wheel centres were manufactured by Ford, as they feature similar-shaped holes. The difference is in the hubcaps, as these have caps secured by three setscrews rather than screw-on caps of the Ford wheels.

If any of you can confirm the origin of them I'd be pleased to hear from you. There'll be more about our Fordson N in a future issue of T&M.



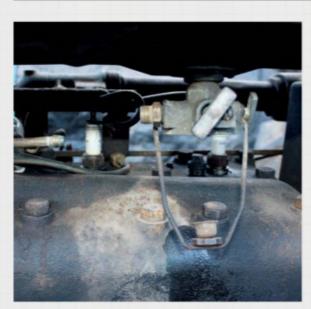
Almost complete

The tractor is more or less complete and has the original carburettor and manifold set-up, albeit with a Lucas RF4 magneto, as the original would have been a Lucas GJ4 by the time it was built.



Cracked block

Common frost damage has cracked the block, which is a reconditioned unit from the 1950s. Thankfully, the original engine number was stamped on the block, retaining some record!



Later fuel tap

It features a later AC-type fuel tap assembly, rather than the original brass type, but that may change as I have a brass one somewhere around to replace it.



Oil change

Inevitably the engine required an oil change, so the sump plate was removed to clean the filter gauze inside the sump.



Black sludge

Removal revealed a thick layer of sludge in the bottom of the sump, which is overdue for cleaning.

WORKSHOP



Like Marmite

It was like Marmite and took some scraping off the sump plate and then...



Disaster struck

... the gauze mesh broke up on the filter, rendering it useless. They are fragile at the best of times, so no surprises. A replacement filter was fitted.



All clean

Every speck of grime was removed and the replacement filter also cleaned up, ready to go back into the engine sump.



Primed

A coat of red oxide was applied, as we had a tin on the go at the time, so some form of protection has been offered to the bottom of the sump plate.



Further cleaning

More sludge was liberated from inside the lower edges of the sump before the plate was refitted.



Silicone gasket

Some silicone gasket was used to seal the joint of the sump plate, as it's likely to come off again for a future clean.



Broken steering wheel

The rim had long since departed from its spokes, so some attention was necessary here before we attempt to drive it seriously.



New rim

A replacement rim was acquired from Cotswold Tractors and has been MIG welded into place. The spokes had to be extended, as they were corroded away.



Mystery wheels

Although at a glance they look like Ford wheel centres, they have different hubcaps. Can anyone confirm their origin?

Straight & narrow



love restoring all sorts of tractors and while I do get a mixture through the workshop, I can't deny that it's Massey Ferguson models that I see more than any other marque.

Despite this I never know exactly what's going to come my way next and every so often something unusual turns up. In the case of this tractor it was unusual, yet familiar at the same time. Two of Tim Edwards' tractors had already been through the workshop when he turned up with his MF 135 MkIII Vineyard.

Tim had shown me pictures of this tractor when his Massey Ferguson 35 and Fordson Major were in receiving some attention and I could see then that it would make a great restoration. My first task was to date the tractor and armed with the information from the serial plate I hit the Internet.

After some conversations on a Facebook group I was told that it was a 1977 model. Initially there was some talk of it being from 1978 and I was hoping that was the case as it would have meant it was the same age as me!

Finding the date was trickier than usual as the tractor was made in France, but the commission plate on the dash panel had good information. Not only was the serial number displayed but the tractor model and engine number too.

Looking at the tractor from the side I could see that it was longer than a 'normal' 135 and upon closer inspection I noted that a reduction box was sandwiched between the gearbox and rear end. On it were the words 'normal' and 'crawl' and it was painted in red oxide, so probably a useful later addition when working around plants on a nursery – probably with a rotovator.

Tim's father had bought the tractor when it was either new or nearly new, Tim couldn't quite remember, but it had worked on their plant nursery for all of its working life. I could see immediately that it had been looked after, as there were hardly any dents and scrapes.

One thing that helped the front was the addition of a good, strong guard – but, ironically, the only damage to the tinwork was on the bottom chin section and to a

lesser extent the grille, which was behind this guard!

Most of the issues on the tinwork had come from the elements, but as the rot was quite clearly caused by the weather most of it would be repairable. I was pleased with this as the mudguards appeared to be bespoke and I imagine that finding hens' teeth would be easier!

CLEANING

When I started to remove the tinwork and fuel tank it exposed an extremely dirty engine, which needed a good wash off. The one part that washed up well was the bonnet, which was covered in green lichen from being stood outside.

Once this was blasted off with the pressure washer, the later-type decals could be seen. The silver strip that ran across the centre ridge of the bonnet on earlier 135s had been replaced with a much bigger decal above it – in a similar style to the 500 Series models. Also gone were the round 135 medallions, as '135' was now part of the main decal.

While the bonnet and decal were in good condition, the further I stripped this tractor down the more items I saw that needed addressing. Most notably the wiring which, looking behind the dash, revealed that it was more complicated than the British-built MF 135s I am used to, as all of the gauges are different.

Something else that became more apparent was the colour. While the tinwork was red, the skid unit was Flint Grey. This colour was first seen in the UK on the MF 35 and 65 models, but was later dropped in favour of Stoneleigh Grey. Due to the grime, the condition of the Flint Grey was good in certain areas, but not in others, so the skid unit was quite mismatched.

Having the tractor sandblasted totally transformed the look of it, from a dark, grimy look to a fresh, blank canvas. Before I sprayed the red oxide on I took a minute to have a look around the skid unit now it was clean.

As with all tractors after they have been blasted, all the numbers on the castings were more visible. Now I could see dating plates embossed in various places which had '77' in them and even under the

steering box the serial number was stamped. This was something I hadn't seen before, so either it was on the later 135 models or just the French-built examples.

CRUDE

The area that stood out the most was the brake rods. These had been crudely modified when the reduction box was fitted. Obviously, as the tractor grew in length so did the brake rods and someone had simply cut them in half and welded a flat band of metal the correct length to join them up.

The metal was thin and bent easily, as it didn't have the same strength that the rod had. It was while I was pressing the brake pedal to see how much they bent that I

noticed the one brake lever on the axle was seized, so this would need freeing off.

Other items had been lengthened a lot more neatly – such as the rods associated with the hydraulic quadrant. On this Vineyard model the quadrant is moved forwards, adjacent to the gear levers, as there is no room for it in the usual position of the standard-width models.

The first coat of paint was red oxide and was done as soon as possible after shot blasting to protect the surface. The abrasive always leaves the metal slightly rough, which is a perfect surface as it gives the paint a good key to adhere too.

As usual, I used Vapormatic red oxide, but when it came to the top coat I would have to use a different brand of paint – a

point I will touch on in a future issue.

There were very few mechanical jobs that were needed on Tim's MF 135 MkIII Vineyard. It started up and ran well, with no smoke and good oil pressure, there was also a strong mixture of anti-freeze – which was reassuring.

As with most of the Perkins AD3.152 engines that come to me, the front crank oil seal needed replacing and to be sure of a good seal I replaced the pulley too. New water and fuel lift pumps would also be bought as a precaution, as much as anything else.

* In the next issue I have a look at that seized brake lever and hope that there is nothing wrong with the oil-cooled, three-plate discs.



Creeper 'box

Having this reduction 'box, which appears to be produced by Four Wheel Traction Ltd., sandwiched between the gearbox and rear end is the reason for the tractor being longer.



Mudguards

The rear tyres are in quite good condition, as are the mudguards – which is lucky as they would be difficult to replace.



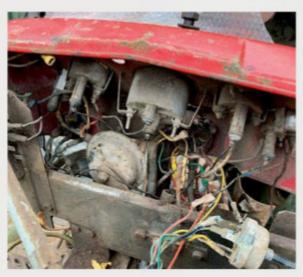
Good engine

Removing the bonnet revealed a dirty engine, but this Perkins AD3.152 starts and runs well – so no major work was required!



1977 model

The original commission plate was legible and told me the various serial numbers that date the tractor to 1977.



Spaghetti

Behind the dash it's a good deal more complicated than Britishbuilt 135s!



Trumpets

With the wheels and mudguards off I could really appreciate the shorter rear axle trumpets.



Detail

A morning spent sand blasting revealed more detail. The text on the creeper gearbox was now clearly visible.



Points to address

Once the tractor was clean I could see more things that I wanted to address to make it look better, such as the brake rods.



Serial number

Another thing that became visible was the serial number that is stamped just below the steering box.



Brake mechanism

This brake mechanism needs to be freed off as it is seized, probably from standing.



Crank seal

Even with no involved mechanical jobs to attend to, I still replaced the front crank oil seal, as it appeared that the old one was leaking.



Crank pulley

Along with the seal, I always replace the pulley. Here the new and old are compared.



Red oxide

To protect the metal, a coating of red oxide was soon applied. The surface left by blasting provided the perfect key for the paint to adhere to.



Narrow

Looking at these front axle parts you can fully appreciate the narrowness of this MF 135 MkIII Vineyard.



Outer wheel centres

Anyone familiar with the MF 65 and 165 will notice how similar these outer rear wheel centres are, although smaller in diameter.

n the last issue I covered the adjustment of the brakes, having received a pair of new brake cables some time ago and I'm now satisfied with the operation of the brakes. I just now need to clean and refinish the brake covers and fit them before refitting the footplates.

The most recent tasks have been to repair the corrosion-damaged mudguards and sort a porous oil bath air filter bowl.

Way back when I first acquired my E27N, in 1986, I went in search of a pair of replacement mudguards, as the originals were badly corroded. After a long search I settled on a pair of mudguard tops from a scrap tractor in the yard of Doug Upton, a well-known tractor dealer in East Sussex at the time.

The mudguard tops were grafted to some fresh sheet metal forming the sides of the mudguards, which in turn were fitted to the original frames. These have lasted well over the last 37 years, but being original tops are more than 70 years old and have suffered some corrosion that needed attention.

AGENT'S PLATE

One of the tops carried a brass plate fitted by the original supplier, The Alton Motor Company of Alton in Hampshire. As my tractor had no evidence of its original supplier, I chose to retain the plate, which was screwed to the rear of the right-hand mudguard top. The quality of the brass screws was evident, when I removed them in preparation for repairing and repainting the

mudguards, and these will be refitted once again when the mudguards are finished!

PREPARATION

The dead paint and rust were sanded off each mudguard before attempting any repairs, as this would highlight where any damage existed. One of the mudguard tops had begun to break away from the side where the welding hadn't been too good in the past, so this was prised away from the side and cleaned up before drilling a series of holes in the fixing flange and plug welding with the MIG welder.

Recently it has been difficult to obtain Acetylene, and I haven't yet replaced my cylinder since it has become available again, as the price has risen quite a bit!

WORKSHOP



Ready for repair

The rear mudguards have been off the tractor since 2015 and are well overdue some attention, as there is some corrosion around the tops.



Agent's plate

A brass plate, fitted to one of the mudguard tops I acquired, will be removed to carry out the necessary repairs.



Alton Motor Company

The mudguard tops came from a scrap tractor in Doug Upton's yard way back in the 1980s. This is the plate that will be refitted after repainting.



Sanding off

Each mudguard was completely sanded off in preparation for the repairs, to highlight any corrosion damage prior to welding.



MIG welding

After some preparation, any areas of corrosion damage were repaired using the MIG welder, as I currently don't have any Acetylene gas.



Large hole

A large rust hole, near to the location of the brass plate, needed cutting out and patching to make a sound repair.

HOLES

Holes had appeared near to where the brass plate is attached and required a patch to be made to repair the area, and other holes throughout the mudguards were dealt with progressively and ground back smooth ready for fresh paint.

The most difficult area to repair is where corrosion had split the rolled edge of the mudguard tops away, near to the edge. The metal was very thin when first made, and care was needed with the MIG torch not to burn through the edges of the damaged area.

Sometimes one can use a non-ferrous piece of metal as a heat sink to prevent the metal burning away, but in this instance it wasn't practical! The mudguards are now finished and ready for a good coat of primer and top coat.

AIR FILTER BOWL

Another item in need of attention has been the air filter bowl. I had noticed in the past when the tractor was in regular use that oil seemed to leak from the base of the bowl. An attempt had been made to repair it unsuccessfully, so now was an opportunity to revisit the bowl and see what I could do.

The inside of the bowl was de-greased, and the outside of the base stripped of paint to inspect the surface. The base was pitted and very sponge-like, with no obvious holes until I prodded it with a scriber. The question was, do I attempt to repair holes individually, or make a fresh bottom to fit onto the bowl?

Looking at the previous repair I decided to cut a circular piece of steel of similar gauge to the bowl and MIG

weld it to the base to form a double skin.

A circle was cut just less in diameter than the bowl to enable it to be welded around the circumference. Three 'G' clamps were used to hold the repair section flat onto the base of the bowl, and a ball-pein hammer used to tap the edge of the plate tight to the base.

A series of tacks was used whilst welding to avoid burning any holes in either the base or the repair section until the whole circumference was welded, followed by a full sanding of the base to blend the weld in around the edge. Hopefully it will now be oil-tight!

The oil bath air filter can now be painted and refitted onto the tractor. Further progress will be reported in the December issue of T&M.



Leaking oil bath air filter

The bowl of the air filter had been leaking oil for some time in the past, so required some attention to remedy this.



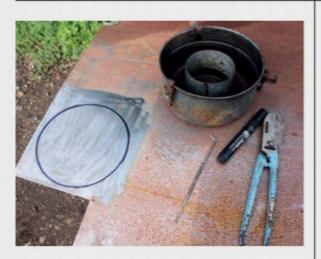
Previous repair

Evidence of a previous repair existed, but obviously wasn't adequate, so the whole base surface was...



Sanded off

... sanded off to reveal any holes. The whole surface looks porous with no obvious holes until prodded with a scriber.



Fresh metal

A circle of fresh steel of the same gauge as the bowl was marked out on some spare steel to just smaller than the bowl diameter.



Cut to shape

The repair section was cut to the required shape and size before offering it into place ready for continuously welding to the bowl.



Clamped in place

After some tidying around the edges, the plate was clamped into place for welding. The edge was then tapped down flush.



Welded up

The plate was welded with the MIG welder using o.6mm-diameter wire on a setting of four and done in a series of tacks to prevent burning through the bowl.



Smoothed off

The weld was then smoothed off with the grinder and traces of any original paint removed in preparation for refinishing in E27N blue.

Experts' advice

Ploughing with a TE-D 20

I bought a Ferguson TE-D 20 tractor last year and wish to purchase a plough to match the tractor, having seen them at working events and ploughing matches.

Prior to buying the tractor I had little experience of them, but since owning one have become quite familiar with the running and driving of it.

My intention is to gain some experience with a plough in order to enter some local ploughing matches, but could do with some advice on what to purchase and also some hints on matching the plough correctly to the tractor.

A Ferguson TE-20 and plough is a good start into match ploughing, as they are easy to drive, uncomplicated and easily transported to ploughing venues.

Regarding a suitable plough, the ideal model would be a two-furrow model equipped with general-purpose mouldboards for the best ploughing results. When considering a plough to purchase it is probably wise to buy a complete plough with both disc coulters and skimmers present, as purchasing these items separately can be expensive.

Look at the mouldboards' condition, especially at the front and rear, as they can wear very thin. Good points (or shares) are a bonus, but are the quickest part to wear on a plough and not too expensive to buy. Prices vary enormously, but aim at the best your budget can run to.

Regarding matching the plough to the tractor, if you have a two-furrow, 10-inch, general-purpose plough you need to set your tractor wheel widths (track widths) to 48 inches on both front and rear, and the plough cross-shaft needs to be adjusted to 9⁷/₈in from the left-hand side plough beam to the collar on the cross-shaft, where the left-hand lower link arm attaches.

Two types of top links are available – the standard Ferguson sliding top link or a turnbuckle (threaded) type. The standard top link should be adjusted with the notches in line for ploughing, but can be adjusted for differing soil conditions. The standard setting should allow front and rear bodies to plough to the same depth.

For more detailed information on setting a Ferguson plough, a manual is available and there's also a DVD to advise on setting one up!

Fordson Major Diesel

I own a Fordson
Major Diesel, that has been repainted and in tidy condition. In the last few weeks I have noticed oil leaking from the hubs of the rear axle on both sides, which has coated the inside of the rear wheel rims. I am worried that the oil will damage the rear tyres and hope to sort it out as soon as possible.

I have checked the dipstick near to the gear lever and the level looks very high and well above the high mark of the stick. I haven't owned the tractor very long and I am still finding my feet rather with it.

I assume somebody has previously over filled the rear axle, which has leaked from the hubs. At this stage I am seeking advice, as I may attempt to repair the tractor myself, as I do have some mechanical knowledge, having worked on my cars in the past.

This is a common problem with Majors. It's unlikely that the

rear axle's been over filled. The oil for the gearbox and rear axle are separate, and we'd recommend you check the gearbox level, as the oil has most likely leaked from there into the rear axle compartment due to a failed output shaft seal.

The level of the gearbox oil is higher than the axle and if the seal fails the oil passes into the axle area and brings the level higher than the axle shafts, hence the leaks from the hubs.

The remedy is to split the tractor between the gearbox and rear axle to access the offending seal. You'll need some firm level ground on which to work on the tractor, some means of supporting it safely and ideally a splitting rail to enable the rear half to be wheeled away from the front.

The main gear lever has to be removed from the top of the transmission housing before splitting the tractor and all the oil drained from the rear axle. The PTO shaft also has to be removed through the rear of the tractor before unbolting the flange bolts around the housing.

Once split, the seal housing can be seen on the gearbox output shaft. There is a locking



ring that secures a sleeve that has to be removed before the oil seal retainer can be removed with the seal. It is worth inspecting the sleeve for signs of a wear groove where the seal had been in contact.

It can be removed and refitted the opposite way round to present a fresh surface for the new seal, if necessary, before refitting the locking ring. Reassembly is the reverse of dismantling, and you'll need a new gasket between the gearbox and rear axle.

The chances are that the hub seals have also failed. Replacement will require the hydraulic unit to be unbolted and lifted clear to access the

inner ends of the axle half shafts. The tractor will need supporting and both rear wheels removed first. The castellated nuts need to be unscrewed from the final drive gears to allow the half shafts to come out. The gears need to be wedged in place to prevent them slipping out of line whilst the shafts are out.

At the outer ends the oil seal housings need to be unstaked from the axle casings before withdrawing the shafts. To change the seals the bearings need to be removed, and it is easier to cut and sacrifice the old seal housings, as replacements aren't too expensive.

Massey Ferguson 3635



I've recently bought a 1991 MF 3635 and I am pleased with it. However, during the recent heatwave I couldn't get the air-conditioning to work, and the cab became unbearable.

I've not owned a tractor with air-conditioning before and would appreciate some advice on what to do, as I'd like everything to be working. **B Brownlow, Staffordshire**

There are various components that could be at fault, some

you may be able to check for yourself, such as the continuity of the wiring and electrical supply to the compressor clutch, and also the state of the cab air filter. Most agricultural engineers are able to check and rectify any faults in the system.

It may be that it has developed a leak in the pipework and has lost the refrigerant. A well-equipped and knowledgeable engineer will be able to diagnose, repair and recharge the system for you at reasonable cost.

Harrogate holds up well

On 20 August, Cheffins hosted its annual collective sale at the Great Yorkshire Showground, Harrogate, which consisted of 900 lots of vintage and classic tractors, agricultural machinery, vehicles and collectors' items. The sale grossed more than £500,000 and saw crowds from across the UK and Europe.

There were more than 140 vintage and classic tractors on offer, with highlights including a 1948 Field-Marshall Series II Contractors' model, which was in immaculate condition and had

previously won 'Best in Show' at the Carrington Rally and 'Best Series II' at the Marshall Golden Jubilee event. The tractor took the highest price on the day at £17,500, against an estimate of £10,000-12,000, when it sold to a Leicestershire-based collector. Similarly, a well-restored 1956 Porsche A133 tractor sold for £9,500.

The classics also saw high prices paid, including a grade 5 1964 MF 35X, that sold for £11,500, a 1969 MF 165 at £9,800 and an extremely well-restored (grade 5.5) MF 135 achieving an

amazing £16,500. A fine, original Ferguson TE-F 20 sold for a record £8,300.

Oliver Godfrey, head of the machinery department at Cheffins commented: "The Harrogate sale provided a fantastic day out and is a key date in the vintage and classic calendar. We saw large crowds on the day, with buyers from across the northern counties and further afield all heading to the Great Yorkshire Showground to join in the fun, as well as hundreds of bidders online. The market is clearly still going strong for both vintage and classic tractors."

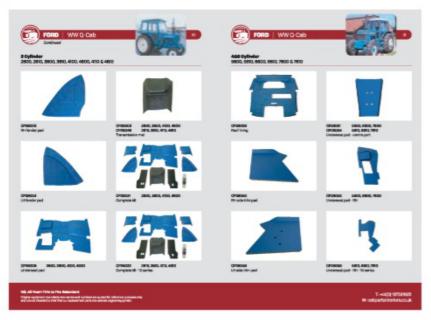

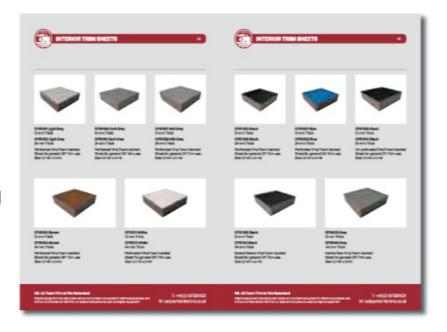

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't the plan. Think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

Rand 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been re-sprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

Band 6

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

He swept the board in atrocious conditions and won the title for Vintage Trailing Ploughing, as well as being crowned the overall European Vintage Ploughing Champion.

These days John uses a Standard Fordson N, with a non-conforming diesel engine, and as he wasn't allowed to use it for the competition he had to borrow a petrol/paraffin Model N. He still showed them how it should be done, proving that his skill and the plough were the overriding factors.

Immediately after he had been presented with the trophies in the ploughing field, John proposed to his girlfriend, Laura Dickson, and I am pleased to report that she said yes! All at *Tractor & Machinery* wish Laura and John all the best for the future.
