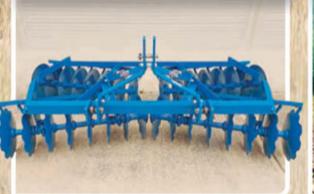

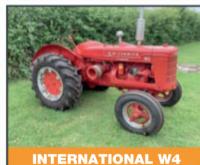

JCB unveils industry first

JCB, DEVELOPER OF THE WORLD'S FIRST working construction machines powered by hydrogen, has unveiled another world first for the industry - a mobile hydrogen refueller.

JCB is investing £100 million in a project to produce superefficient hydrogen engines and has already showcased working prototypes of a backhoe loader and Loadall telescopic handler powered by hydrogen.

On 21 October, the company announced another industry first - a mobile hydrogen refueller, providing a quick and easy way for site. This is no different to today customers to refuel their machines on site. Around 97 per cent of construction machines have fuel delivered to them while working on site. This means customers are already used to a transportable fuel, allowing

refuelling to take place in a matter of minutes.

JCB Chairman Lord Bamford, who is leading JCB's hydrogen project, said: "Since we became the first construction equipment company to unveil machines powered by hydrogen, many have asked how they can be refuelled.

"Well today we have an answer with our new mobile hydrogen refuelling system, which allows hydrogen to be taken from on-site tube trailers and distributed to machines by our refueller as they work on the job when diesel is taken in bowsers to refuel machines.

"Fossil fuels are not the future and hydrogen is the practical solution to powering our machines in the decades to come. Our British engineers are

doing a fantastic job in developing this technology and there are many more exciting developments to come."

A team of 100 engineers is working on the project. The first hydrogen-powered machine to be unveiled was a JCB backhoe loader followed, a year ago, by a Loadall telescopic handler.

JCB has manufactured engines since 2004, producing them in Derbyshire and in Delhi, India. Last year JCB celebrated a major milestone with the production of its 750,000th engine.

John was a member of The Nuffield and Leyland Tractor Club and a fountain of knowledge on the subject of these tractors, having started work at Bathgate just as production of Nuffield models concluded and Leyland tractors started to be built.

He provided information for several *Tractor & Machinery* features over the years and the team will be forever grateful for his kindness and generosity. *T&M* sends its condolences to John's family and friends at this difficult time.

A sad end in the Braid Valley

t was back in 1991 that a small number of local men from the Braid district decided to bring together some old equipment that they owned and put on a threshing demonstration in a local field, writes Brian Millar.

Although this was intended as a one-off event, the success and level of encouragement from the assembled crowd motivated the men to do it again the following year. The men decided to form a club and The Braid Valley Vintage Enthusiasts was formed.

A suitable site to hold the event was sought and the Hamill family, in the townland known as 'The Sheddings', kindly donated the use of land and facilities to hold events. Monthly club meetings were held, and Robert Kidd was elected as chairman. It was decided from the beginning that the club would direct all its efforts towards fundraising for local charities and the local communities and that policy has remained throughout its existence.

Each year members sought to bring new and different ideas to the events, concentrating on demonstrations of traditional skills and crafts, including farming techniques from a bygone era.

Over the years several special events were organised. In 2000 The Millennium Tractor Road Run was held, attracting almost 400 tractors. This is believed to be the first ever road run held in Ireland and is the forerunner to a common sight these days.

2002 saw the role of chairman move to John Andrew and the club continued to expand its ideas and events.

2004, 2005, and 2006 saw the running of the County tractor working events. This was the first time large working events on this scale were held and are still much talked about almost 20 years later.

In 2007 the club teamed up with local church groups and held a large fundraising event to raise funds for the development of a children's orphanage in war-torn Moldova. Several of the club members made several trips out to Moldova to help with the construction work and while there they sourced a new tractor and donated it to the orphanage and local villagers to help them grow their own food.

In 2010 John Crothers became club chairman and continued the tradition of

the club by running two events each year in July and September.

In 2017 the club embarked on its biggest and most ambitious event to date, which was to celebrate 100 years of Fordson, Ford and New Holland tractor production at Nutts Corner. Planning for this event started three years prior, in 2014, and it turned out to be one of the largest events of its kind to be held in Northern Ireland.

In 2019 the club held its annual gathering event in July and tractor road run in September, as usual, but the arrival of the Covid-19 pandemic put paid to future events, including the club's 30th anniversary celebrations to be held in 2021. It became clear as the pandemic developed that these celebrations were not going to take place.

Almost three years later, dwindling member numbers and with the average age of members now more than 60 years old, serious decisions had to be made about the future of the club.

After several meetings, it was agreed by the remaining members that the physical effort and the number of tasks required to run successful events was becoming too much and a decision was made that the club would not restart after the Covid-19 pandemic had ended.

Chairman John Crothers said that the decision to end the club was a very hard one to make, but the members believed that it was time to accept that eventually all things come to an end and that the club should rest on its achievements and success over the past three decades with pride.

He said: "I am very proud and pleased to have been part of it and just want to finish by adding that during the past 30 years, we as a club used our hobby as vintage enthusiasts to raise and donate just over £142,000 to benefit many people across all communities."

s an American muscle car and hot rod enthusiast, there is nothing I enjoy more than the sound of these cars and trucks firing up and listening to the burble of a V8 engine. Whether they are stock engines or ones that have been heavily worked on, nothing can beat the sound of these huge engines rumbling along on the open road.

Most engines used are of American origin, although here in the UK we had the Rover V8, which was a firm favourite amongst hot rodders. If you're wondering what this has got to do with tractors, it just so happens that Cornish farmer Tom Harris decided that his Massey Ferguson 590 needed a bit of revamping and duly decided to whack a V8 in there.

When I was first asked to write this feature, I did wonder what I would find when I got to the farm. In my head was something resembling the 1959 Massey Ferguson 35 built as a promotional tool for whisky distiller Ardbeg. This beast was powered by an 8.2-litre, producing a purported 546hp and 604lb/ft of torque.

I arrived at Tom's farm, and he proceeded to show me a field across the

road where I could take some photographs, before he promptly disappeared into the barn to fire up the tractor.

The noise that erupted was tremendous and I waited patiently to see what emerged, but what rumbled out into the fading light was, for all intents and purposes, simply a Massey Ferguson 590 fitted with a V8 engine.

In a funny way it's understated, yet purposeful, and could go under the radar if it were not for the twin, chromed exhausts, and dual air pre-cleaner arrangement, as well as the 'V8' decals! Its relative subtlety is what is appealing and although some purists will probably turn their heads in horror, I suspect that not all will.

With the tractor in position, my attention turned to Tom, and I was keen to learn about the tractor's history and how much work had gone into it. "Dad was, and still is, a farmer and there were always cars and tractors around the place. I grew up with Masseys, so I guess it was inevitable that I would own and play about with one," he said.

"Dad has always been into classic Land Rovers and knows every little variable in them. They did nothing for me, but I did have a few minis kicking about that were either restored or stripped and raced about. I've got a couple still in one of the barns now.

"I knew of the tractor being for sale locally, and decided I had to have it," he explained. "The engine had been taken out for a rebuild and never got put back in. The cab is all original and has very little, to no welding done to it."

The tractor is an example of the third incarnation of the Massey Ferguson 590 – the first having a single-door cab, the second a two-tone cab with two doors and the third like this – with a largely red, two-door cab. The 590 was built in Britain and France and effectively replaced the 188, as well as being the forerunner to the MF 690, built in France.

THE 590

First manufactured in 1976, the 75hp (DIN) Massey Ferguson 590 was the largest of the 500 Series tractors built at Banner Lane, Coventry, produced alongside the 47hp (DIN) MF 550, 60hp (DIN) MF 565 and 66hp (DIN) MF 575.

Powered by the Perkins A4.248S direct-injection, four-cylinder engine, producing 202.5lb/ft of torque at

1,400rpm, the 590 was large enough for most farmers in the UK, but for those looking for more power, the Beauvaisbuilt 595 offered 88hp (DIN) and 254lb/ft of torque at 1,300rpm, from its Perkins A4.318 engine.

The 500 Series was Massey Ferguson's answer to incoming 'Q' cab legislation and took all that was good about the 100 Series and combined it with bold styling and the new Supercab.

These tractors were said to be new from the ground up, but a closer inspection revealed many striking similarities to the '5' and '8' line tractors that had gone before!

One of the most noticeable features, aside from the cab, was the hard-nose surround protecting the front end. Removing the grille within this protective ring provided the operator with access to, amongst other elements, the battery, air filter, and headlights.

The engine was a proven unit and, like other Perkins diesels of the era, had a reputation for good starting characteristics, decent fuel economy, lugging ability and reliability. An alternator had become a standard fitment on the 500 Series, due to the increasing number of electrical components, as had a power steering pump.

Transmitting power from the engine to the transmission was a 12-inch clutch – either single on the optional, iPTO-equipped tractors, or accompanied by a 10-inch plate for standard, live PTO models – in much the same way as other manufacturers were doing.

The transmission itself was an eight-speed unit as standard, with the 12-speed Multi-Power system available as an optional extra. Both systems were controlled by two levers – range to the right, featuring a central 'Start' position for safety – and gears on the taller, left-hand lever. Where Multi-Power was specified, a dash-mounted lever enabled the operator to switch between high and low.

At the business end, a dual-speed power take-off was standard on the 590, with a maximum of 67.7hp available at the shaft. Engine revs had to be set at 1,893rpm and 1,900rpm for 540rpm and 1,000rpm PTO speeds respectively.

As for the hydraulic system, all 500 Series tractors incorporated Advanced Ferguson System Hydraulics and the same type of piston pump and single, multi-functional valve that had been used for many years. Improvements,

naturally, had been made and increased oil flow was a feature of these new tractors.

Linkage functions included Draft, Position, Pressure and Response controls and the 590 had a standard lift capacity of 2,227kg (4,900lb) at the end of the lower links. This could be increased to 2,640kg (5,818lb) with the addition of an assistor ram.

A selector valve and trailer tipping pipe were a standard fitment, but single-and double-acting spools could be specified. Oil flow to these was 25.7 litres per minute (5.7gpm), but an auxiliary hydraulic pump could be added to provide a combined flow of 61 litres per minute (13.4gpm).

With just a single step and wide, rear-hinged door to negotiate, the operator found him/herself inside the rubber-mounted Supercab.

Once seated it was clear that the cab had been designed with comfort and productivity in mind, as standard features included pendant pedals, hydrostatic power steering, oil-cooled disc brakes for reassuring stopping power, two-speed wiper and washer and a blower unit to enable fresh, filtered air to enter. A peak inside the two-door Supercab.

Taking all these features into account, Tom would have a very capable tractor on his hands, but without an engine it was simply an ornament. Naturally, the simple thing to do would be to put an A4.248S engine in and get the machine operational once more, but it seems that Tom had other ideas.

"I also knew of a Dennis Carmichael fire engine coming up for sale as well, and decided I couldn't miss this opportunity. I realised I couldn't really drive the fire engine, as anyone that knows Cornish lanes will understand, and one day, as I was looking, I began thinking – I've got a tractor with no engine, and a fire engine that I can't drive but does have an engine, and so I decided to pirate the engine out of the fire engine and put that in the tractor!"

The engine in question is a Perkins V8, largely used in early Dennis RS and SS fire appliances before Cummins engines could be specified. Both V8.540 and V8.640 engines were used for this purpose, in naturally aspirated and turbocharged forms, but the unit fitted to Tom's fire engine is the smaller, 539.1cu in (8,834cc) version.

According to Perkins' specifications, the naturally-aspirated V8.540 had a rated output of 180bhp at 2,600rpm and produced a maximum torque of 410lb/ft (556Nm) at 1,650rpm. The same engine saw use in many different applications, including the MF 860 combine and MF 1155 tractor, where it generated 184hp and 155hp (DIN) respectively.

Such an engine would, Tom concluded, prove relatively straightforward to fit to the 590, whilst not generating copious amounts of power that would play havoc with the transmission and rear axle.

"I had to cut and extend the bonnet an extra 16 inches to cover the engine," Tom explained. "I had to make a chassis to carry the engine on the front axle.
Large PAVT wheels have been fitted at
the rear, an all-new Multi-Power pack
and brakes have also been fitted.
Custom exhaust stacks were added, and
I had everything sandblasted and
re-sprayed in two-pack paint."

Eagle-eyed readers may have noticed the decals on the sides of the bonnet, now carrying 'V8' in addition to '590'. "That was done by a local signwriter, who did a really good job of matching the original," Tom told me.

What is amazing about this tractor is that it's not dissimilar to what hot rodders and customisers have been doing for many years. Transplanting engines and running gear out of one and putting into another, and then trying to make it look as though nothing has changed substantially until the bonnet is lifted.

As we finished and started to head back, I asked Tom if there was anything else he had planned. "Nope, I'm pretty happy with the tractor now, obviously I always keep my eye out for any bits that come up for sale, you know, just in case, but she drives well and I'm going to use her as and when I can – no show or trailer queen here!

"What I would really like now is a late '60s or early '70s Mustang that me, the wife, and kids can all get into comfortably and go out for a drive and go to a local show in!"

was delighted to meet Thomas Harnden and his distinctive 1967 Dutra four-wheel drive tractor, at the Three Counties Showground, earlier this year. I was even more intrigued to learn that Thomas uses his Dutra every day for tree surgery and woodland contracting, nearby in the Malvern Hills.

"I've had the Dutra D4K-B for just over two years," explained Thomas. "I first started doing tree surgery and woodland contracting with a Land Rover, after training as a tree surgeon about seven years ago. My first tractor was a Fordson Diesel Major, which I bought four years ago, and I used it for running a woodchipper and hauling a three-ton trailer.

"The Fordson Major was the first tractor I have ever driven; I had no experience with tractors and using them. My parents run an electronic engineering company and my dad has helped me rebuild and rewire the tractors, but has no experience in the tractor world, although he has recently bought a Fordson E27N P6 to help with the mowing.

"I've learnt everything from manuals, forums, and meeting lots of people with the same passion as me. The most modern machine I run is a John Deere 3200 telehandler, but even that has so many electronics that fixing it is a nightmare!

"After a year with the Diesel Major, I bought a Super Major fitted with a Ford Cargo engine. There was the potential of making the Super Major four-wheel drive, as this had more power and power steering, but then I discovered hydraulic problems and front axle issues. However, the plan for the Super Major is to run a sawmill from its belt pulley."

Thomas spotted his Dutra at a timber yard in Saltash, Plymouth, at W H Bond & Sons Ltd. Thanks to Charlie Norman of the Dutra Register, we know that the tractor was originally owned by Patrick Burke of Long Sutton, Lincolnshire. He bought the Dutra, serial no. 41057/091, new in September 1967 from Bexwell Tractors and owned it until 24 October 2015, when it was sold at auction. Patrick was an agricultural contractor, and he also owned a motocross track.

Thomas' Dutra was one of three that Patrick used. This example was purchased by an agricultural machinery company in July 2019 and entered in Stephenson's York machinery sale on 7 August 2019, and purchased by Thomas in February/March 2020. He quickly saw how the unusual design of tractor, with the engine beyond the front axle, could really develop his existing business.

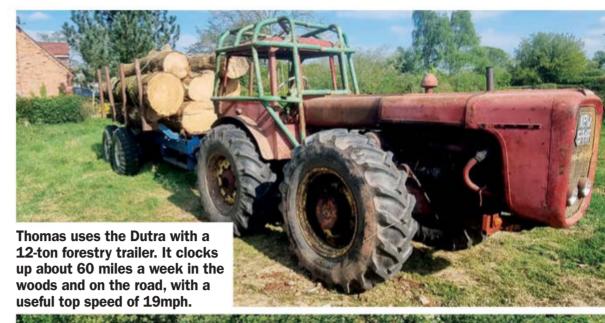
"When I first bought the Dutra, I had to weld the cab and rebuild it," continued Thomas. "I also rebuilt the air brakes, including air brakes for a trailer. I'm currently fitting an original roll cage and fitting it out with lights. It has worked non-stop for about two years now and has paid itself back.

I use it on a 5.5-ton Uniforest winch, a TP200 PTO-driven chipper and a 12-ton forestry trailer. It also helps with bale hauling and mowing and comes out on road runs. I rack up about 60 miles a week in it, both in the woods and on the road. I try and keep my jobs local, but with a road speed of 19mph it is not too slow."

The Dutra is ideal for the tasks that Thomas asks of it. With the engine beyond the front wheels it gives plenty of traction when winching, hauling trailers and mowing, especially on steep banks. Living in the Malvern Hills in Worcestershire, he is always working on banks and hills. It also has plenty of ground clearance so has no problem in woodlands. The only downside is the turning circle, which is not great, but you can't have everything! They are very simple machines to work with and he has not experienced any major problems.

"The plan is to buy another Dutra, either one with a Csepel or Steyr engine," concluded Thomas. "Then I'll put a timber crane on it and a bigger forestry winch. I am still on the hunt for a bulldozer blade for the Dutra. I'm told there maybe one in Herefordshire, but I am still digging.

"These Dutra tractors are simple, reliable and a go-anywhere vehicle. For what I want they can do anything any modern tractor can do."



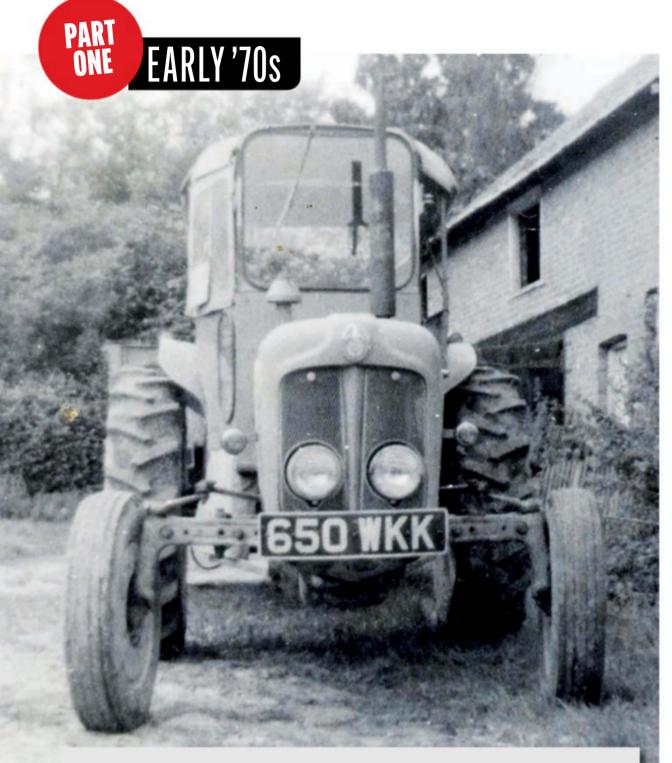

Kim Parks recalls life on the family farm during the early 1970s. Jonathan Whitlam has the story.



This second-hand Fordson Dexta, complete with Lambourn weather cab, arrived on the farm during 1971 and turned out to be the tractor that Kim would learn to drive on. "It was really good fun, driving that Dexta", says Kim. "The cab was especially nice, as I didn't get wet, and being small in stature back then, I didn't find it cramped at all. "Harrowing grass seed in was the very first job I did with it, followed by rolling on the flat ground. I couldn't do the one hilly section, as the Dexta did not have enough power to pull the heavy roll up the slope!"

The Dexta soon became 'his' tractor and he used it for a multitude of tasks, including using a Vicon Acrobat to turn and row up hay, as well as clamping silage in the pit with a Taskers hand-operated buckrake.

im Parks was born in 1957, the same year as Ford launched the Fordson Dexta and the Massey Ferguson name and red and grey colours first appeared on the new 35 and 65 models. It would be Ford tractors though, that would have the most impact on the young Kim as he grew up on his grandfather's farm, deep in the East Sussex countryside, near the village of Rotherfield.

The rolling fields and woodlands of East Sussex lent themselves to mixed farming and this was no exception for the Parks family, with Kim's grandfather being joined on the farm by his sons, Kim's dad and uncle, to help run around 170 acres of grass and cereal crops. Back then there was a milking herd as well as bullocks for rearing and pigs – a truly mixed family farm.

The first tractor on the farm was either an Ivel or an IH Mogul. It was before Kim's time, so he is not all that certain, but what he does remember are what the family called the 'old bombs' – a pair of Fordson E27N Major tractors. Before those they had run Fordson N tractors, as well as a Marshall Model M, which was usually to be found running a threshing drum – as the farm also undertook contract threshing around the local area using Foster and Tullos threshing drums. The Tullos was bought brand-new from a dealer stand at the Royal Tunbridge Wells Agricultural Show.

The first tractors Kim remembers proper were one of the aforementioned 'old bombs', in the shape of a Fordson E27N Major, plus two newer Fordson Diesel Majors. He also remembers the Massey-Harris 726 combine harvester that replaced the threshing drums and



A Massey-Harris 780 replaced the 726 in the middle of the 1960s. It was acquired used, having originally been used by the nearby Eridge Estate. It cost £100 and was used every harvest until 1971.

Kim remembers coming home from school and spending the rest of the evening on the 780 bagging off the grain, finding this job much preferable than being at school! Typical of the time, this machine was once again of the bagger type, rather than being fitted with a grain tank.

did quite a bit of contract harvesting, as it was the first combine anywhere in the local area. It had a reel with boards on, just as in America, and had an 8ft 6in wide cut with the grain being bagged off on the machine itself.

The straw would then be collected by a Diesel Major pulling a Massey-Harris 701 pick-up baler and to complete the array of Massey-Harris equipment the farm also ran a Massey-Harris drill that was fitted with steel wheels. Kim remembers a particular shed at the farm that had the 726 in the very back, the baler in front and then the drill in front of that, making this the Massey-Harris shed!

The Massey-Harris 726 completed many successful harvests in East Sussex before it finally succumbed to its internal workings collapsing and was then duly replaced by a second-hand Massey-Harris 780.

Kim finally left school in 1972 at the age of 15 and began work on the family farm. Around the same time, he also managed to get his first camera – a Kodak Instamatic 35mm that he managed to acquire from the back of a sugar packet for the high cost of £1! This started him off on his life-long love of photography.

The early 1970s brings us to the beginning of our story, using Kim's photographs to transport us back in time to how farming used to be in this part of the world, 50 years ago.

In the next instalment we will take a closer look at the farming activity and machines that Kim managed to record on his camera from the surrounding area, but first let's look at the many jobs done on the family farm in the early 1970s, when a new Ford Force 4000 formed the backbone of the machinery fleet at Rotherfield.

These pictures show Kim's dad busy giving grassland a dressing of fertiliser in the spring, with the new Ford 4000 and a Vicon Vari-spreader – a type that was so popular it was pretty much everywhere in the 1970s.

The fertiliser was delivered in 1cwt plastic sacks that had to be moved around, mostly by hand, but at least it was nowhere as expensive as it is today!

The Vicon was bought new and replaced an old Lister land-drive spreader, which in turn replaced an old full-width machine.





The baling of straw and hay was quite an operation back in the early 1970s and a lot of it involved continually moving the bales by hand. The Ford 4000 would be in charge of a New Holland 268 baler, complete with Barford sledge, and the driver would deliberately collect bales to leave in a line across the field, rather than by the number in the sled, making it a bit easier for collection duties.

Kim said: "My job was to put the bales into a stack of 'sixes', ready to be picked up by the Fordson Super Major complete with Perry Bale Slave on the end of its front loader."

Kim didn't get to do the loading, although as can be seen from one of the images, he did use the Super Major to get around the field more easily. He did, however, then get the job of stacking the bales on the trailers. Kim would then drive a trailer load back home, often a journey of a few miles from outlying fields, with the Fordson Dexta.

"I would then have to chuck the bales off the trailer to be stacked, so this meant that I had to move them for a third time! That was a lot of bales in total to have to hump around, in usually warm weather!"

Due to Kim doing a lot of moaning, the farm bought a new elevator to make the unloading at the farm and stacking much easier. The elevator was a Colman, and it came in very handy as annually there was around 100 acres of small bales to handle.



The last Diesel Major left the farm in favour of a newer Super Major, which was then equipped with a Horndraulic front loader. This made the Super Major a very versatile machine around the farm, although on jobs such as manure loading, it did do a lot of wheel spinning, as it never had any rear weights fitted. Eventually one was fashioned out of an old water tank, which was filled with concrete, and parts of the linkage mounts from the old Lister fertiliser spinner were incorporated to allow it to be fitted to the Super Major's rear linkage.

Kim's dad can be seen doing the manure spreading with the Ford 4000 and a Howard Rotaspreader 150. The farm always remained faithful to side-spreading machines and Kim still has one on his farm to this day. They had to be filled right though, or you could be in for many hours of hard work digging the manure back out with a hand fork!

With the dairy herd still on the farm at this point, a large amount of manure and slurry built up, particularly during the winter months, and it all had to be spread on the fields, providing a very useful amount of nutrients for the crops at the same time.

If you are a farmer, then you don't have to worry about all that nonsense of using a spade to dig over your vegetable garden. Kim's dad certainly didn't believe in doing it the hard way - after having ploughed the garden up, here he is negotiating between buildings and a post to gain access in and out of the garden with the 4000 and a Ransomes disc harrow, which he had used to break down the ploughed ground to a fine tilth, ready for vegetable planting!



Haymaking was always a busy time, and everyone needed to lend a hand. Here the brand-new replacement for the Super Major can be seen using a new Lely Gemini to row up the hay in front of the baler. The tractor is a Ford 3000 complete with Ford-badged Horndraulic front loader.

On the baler was the trusty 4000, now no longer the newest tractor on the farm, being driven by Kim's dad and pulling the New Holland 268 baler and Barford sledge.

"I really liked the Lely Gemini rake," says Kim. "It could be configured easily for spreading the grass or for rowing up and when doing the latter it made a beautiful job, the swath being laid out behind it like a perfectly proportioned sausage!"

The trailers used were a Warwick and a Harford, both equipped with home-made silage extensions fabricated from corrugated sheet, as was often the fashion back in the 1960s and '70s. While not using his camera, Kim would have been putting the grass in the clamp with the Fordson Dexta, although later in the 1970s the Taskers tipping buckrake was replaced by a Twose push-off buckrake, making his job somewhat easier.

As the farm did more and more contract harvesting, the New Holland 37 was traded in for a much larger New Holland 717S precision-chop machine, which needed the grass to be pre-cut and swathed before being picked up, unlike the previous single-chop and double-chop harvesters.

Kim had a rather negative take on hiring a tanker: "The idea was that the tanker arrived at the farm clean and ready to go and all that we had to do was clean it after we had finished with it, ready for it to go back. However, on one occasion I opened the rear door to clean it out only to find around six inches of gravel in the bottom! I knew it was not from us using it, as we had an enclosed concrete slurry tank! We really were not happy about this and so it finally convinced us to buy our own tanker, which ended up being a Holloway Camel."

Paul Beeton, from Cambridgeshire, decided to restore a Ransomes disc harrow earlier this year. He shared details of the project with the editor.

ansomes Sims & Jefferies
Ltd. (RSJ) is synonymous
with ploughs, particularly
conventional models, but it
produced a range of
different implements to suit
various tasks over the years, including
disc harrows.

One of the first mounted models was the HR 20 – a disc harrow designed for

tractors like the Fordson E27N and Nuffield Universal models – with a working width of 6ft 6in and weighing in at 8cwt. This model featured a guide disc in the centre of the harrow to counteract side draft forces acting on the tractor.

This type of machine would later give way to the FR range, which included the HR 31 variants – of which the

implement featured here is an example of. Five mounted models were joined in the FR disc harrow range by six trailed models with working widths from 7ft 6in to 12ft.

The mounted HR 31/86 had a working width of 8ft 6in, but it is the largest mounted model in the range, the HR 31/97 that we see here – able to cultivate to a width of 9ft 7in.

The FR range of disc harrows was produced throughout the Ford pre-Force (6X) and Force (6Y) eras.

RSJ informed would-be purchasers that its disc harrows were built to meet every discing requirement on every size of farm and that they were ideal for discing-in tall weeds and stubbles, as well as breaking down soils to create a fine seedbed.

With discs positioned 7in (17cm) apart and adjustable gang angles, the operator could use the HR 31/97 to create any type of tilth that was required, but the size and weight of the machine meant that it was best suited to tractors like the Ford

4000 and 5000, as well as models of a similar power output.

Options included a centre tine and a choice of discs – either 18 or 20in (45 or

A methodical approach was required for the components to be prepared properly.

50cm) plain or 20in (50cm) cutaway on the front. Later examples were only available with 20in (50cm) discs.

Paul Beeton farms land in the north of Cambridgeshire and is a member of the Peterborough Farm Machinery Preservation Society. During 2021 he noted that at the organisation's last working event, none of the members were using a disc harrow and so he decided to find one and restore it to its former glory.

DONOR REQUIRED

A friend found what he was looking for in the shape of a Ransomes FR HR 31/97, but Paul quickly concluded that a donor machine would be required if he were to restore the first harrow to an acceptable standard. Thankfully, an auction at Cheffins' Sutton site yielded what Paul was looking for and two would soon become one.

The process, shown below, involved complete disassembly of both implements, with shot blasting and cleaning up of the required

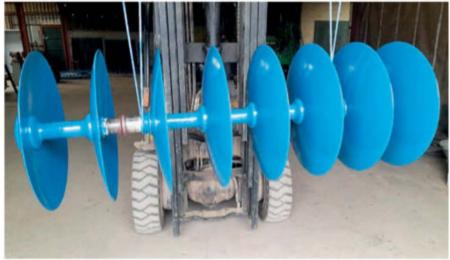
components, followed by a rust preventative and painting with Witham Supercote Empire Blue gloss, finishing off with decals supplied by Machinery Decals.

Paul says that he used metric bolts in the rebuild, but other than that the disc harrow is as it left RSJ's factory, although he is looking for a centre tine attachment, including the bracket assembly, if anyone has one. If you can help, please get in touch with the editor in the first instance: tm.ed@kelsey.co.uk

Paul intends to use the Ransomes FR HR 31/97 disc harrow at working days, in conjunction with a Massey Ferguson 165, but it may see use around the farm from time to time with his two-wheel drive John Deere 6100 – the smallest model in the 6000 Series.

Fairground 35

Joseph Lewis discovers a lockdown project and a first for a young restorer.

ne of the highlights of the 2022 Tractors & Trains event, at Yeovil Railway Centre, was a 1960 Massey Ferguson 35 owned by Sam Jarvis from Yeovil. It has an interesting history and is particularly special as it marks this young man's first foray into tractor restoration.

"I became interested in tractors through the collection of Ivor and Barry James and family, from West Dorset," Sam explained. "The James family are regular exhibitors at Somerset rallies, like Abbey Hill and Yesterday's Farming, often providing the tractor parade commentary. Their Fordson Major and Massey Ferguson 100 Series examples are noted as an inspiration to others, especially as they try and have a new restoration at the start of each season.

"My other source of encouragement was my granddad, as he has always owned a grey Ferguson. With these supporters as a foundation, the 1960 Massey Ferguson 35 was the first tractor I purchased, mainly to take to shows and because I love to build things and wanted a project."

Sam acquired the tractor in early 2020 with help from Ivor, who collected it. The first striking and unusual aspect was the Shawnee Poole loader, commonly seen on much larger tractors. This was believed to have been used at a fairground at Brighton.

Work started almost immediately to remove the loader and fix the brakes, which only half worked, the idea being to keep the paintwork as a working tractor.

"The further on we got fixing things, it became clear the steering box had been ruined by the very heavy, oil-filled loader over the front axle," continued Sam. "This meant a replacement steering box was sourced, along with a replacement grille, and the decision was made to fully restore the tractor.

"It was fully stripped down to the skid unit and all serviceable items, filters, gaskets etc., which were beyond use,

have been replaced. I then hand sanded most of the tractor before it was sprayed by Ivor. I then re-assembled and added an upright exhaust and lighting kit, with the finishing touch being a new set of Goodyear tyres.

"The upright exhaust was mainly a visual thing, but I also didn't want the diesel fumes wafting up from the downswept exhaust whilst sat in a ring parade. The lighting kit would have been an optional extra in the day and personally I think it suits the MF 35 very well."

Sam still has a couple of jobs to do, including tidying up the wiring for the lights, plus a couple of small oil leaks to sort out over the winter. "As they say, a project is never finished!" he concluded.

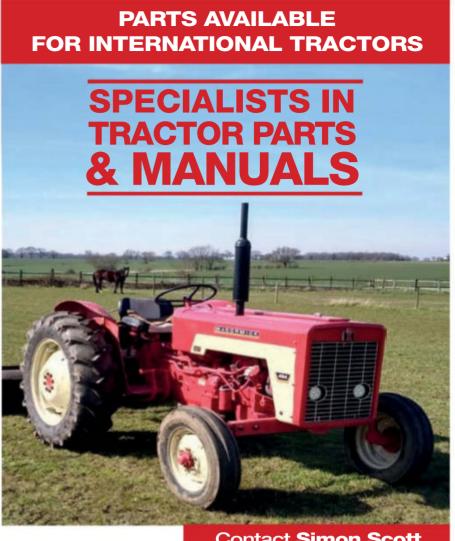

he Mackey family has been farming at Killealy since
Andrew's great-grandfather bought a 52-acre holding at the beginning of the 20th century, with early enterprises including a dairy herd, pigs, sheep, poultry, and cereals.

In 1942, Andrew's grandfather, William Mackey, bought a green Fordson N with narrow mudguards through the War Ag, which controlled the drive to increase the nation's agricultural output. This was the farm's sole tractor until the arrival of a 1959, four-cylinder Massey Ferguson 35, fitted with a loader.

The farm expanded and soon the dairy herd grew to 32 cows milked in the byre by an Alfa Laval milking plant with three bucket units. William Mackey also shared a Nuffield Universal Four with a

local lime-spreading contractor, adding more power to the tractor line-up.

On 1 July 1966, the arrival of a new Massey Ferguson 165, purchased from R A Allen in Ballymena, brought the work force right up to date, just as Andrew's father, Lyle, completed his course at Greenmount Agricultural College.

In the mid '70s the MF 35 was sold to a potato grower and the proceeds of the deal put towards the purchase of a two-year old Ford 3000. The increased profile of Eastern European tractors at agricultural shows and in local dealerships had not gone unnoticed and the Mackeys were encouraged to introduce a Belarus to the farm.

Within a year it was decided that it was time for the unreliable, Minsk-built tractor to go, but William and Lyle weren't going to tar all machinery from

behind the iron curtain with the same brush. The Belarus was replaced by a Zetor 6718, bought from Wilsons of Rathkenny and, with its simple design, rugged construction, and ample power, this proved to be a sound move.

The Mackeys considered the Zetor to be a good, simple tractor with a much better cab than other tractors of that era, offering lots of room for the dog, a constant travelling companion for Andrew's grandfather.

In 1978 a new International 784 was purchased from N A Irwin at Nutts Corner. This became the farm's main tractor, used at silage harvest, first with a New Holland 37 double-chop harvester and later with a New Holland 717S precision-chop. During this period the grass crop was cut by the Zetor and a Fahr KM22 mower then tedded



using a PZ Haybob which, since the harvester didn't have the protection of a metal detector, had a rope threaded through the eyes of the kicker tines.

It was common in this period for two family farms to share labour and machinery at harvest time, so Andrew's great-uncle Hugh and his MF 65 MkII took on carting duties, towing a Weeks or a Martin Markham trailer, both 10ft by 6ft, back to the yard where his MF 35 was waiting with the tipping buckrake to push the load of grass into the silo.

The Mackeys were using increasingly powerful tractors for their silage operations and so the limitations of the lightweight MF 35 as a suitable tractor for buckraking became apparent. They turned to International tractor salesman Mervyn Rea, who, while on a visit to the Doncaster plant, had noticed an IH 574 Hydro which was being used as a shunter around the factory complex.

ATTRACTIVE PRICE

Since the 84 Series was the new range in the dealers' catalogues, the Mackeys were able to buy the second-hand IH 574 World Wide model at an attractive price, with 500 hours recorded on the tractormeter, knowing that it hadn't endured a tough working life. The obvious advantages over the MF 35 included live hydraulic service, which could supply the hydraulic ram on a push-off buckrake, an increase of more than 30hp from the IH 239cu in (3.9-litre) engine and the convenience offered by the infinitely-variable hydrostatic transmission.

A new, six-foot Quicke push-off buckrake was attached, the roof was temporarily replaced by a sheet of tin to prevent damage to the original when working close to the silo roof trusses, and the 574 was ready for some proper farm work.

During the winter months, it was equipped with a Quicke 2000 loader and

used daily on cattle-feeding duties, while in the spring it drove a Howard Rotavator, preparing 40 acres for barley. In short, this International Harvester 574 Hydro was carrying out the tasks for which its advanced transmission was designed.

By 1984 the Hydro system was worn out and, since the conventional gearboxes were easy to find in breakers' yards, it made sense to replace the entire transmission system with an eight-speed, synchromesh IH gearbox featuring the 'lightning flash' selector lever.

The extensive surgery required to complete this transformation was carried out during the evenings in the farm workshop by local mechanic Colin Robinson and although, at one point Andrew's grandfather wondered if the tractor would ever work again, Colin's experience of IH tractors ensured steady progress.

The replacement gearbox was installed and since there was ready access to the

transmission brake, the band was replaced, curing a common fault with the IH handbrake design of that era. After the refurbishment, the 574 gave good service for a further four years until the arrival of a Ford 5610, fitted with an AP cab and floor-change gear levers.

The IH 574 was sold but it didn't travel far to its new home. Hugh's son John worked as a milking parlour fitter, as well as running a small, part-time sheepfarming enterprise, and the 574 suited his needs exactly – making hay and carrying out other light duties.

In the mid '90s, 15 years after it eventually left the Doncaster factory, John decided to sell the tractor. This gave Andrew the rare opportunity to purchase a piece of his childhood history, which, although it had worked in the mucky environment that goes along with livestock farming, was still complete but had a jaded appearance. Andrew recalled, "Like most tractors of that era there was

some rot in the tinwork, especially around the mudguards and the front section of the cab. John had replaced the roof panel, the handbrake was working, and the rear tyres still had good tread."

The restoration began by removing the cab and then dealing with the mechanical issues. He re-bushed the linkage for the range lever, which made the changes more positive, but the gear selector was still working fine, so it wasn't touched.

The World Wide series featured a saddle tank behind the cab, incorporating a fuel line which joined the two lower portions. As moisture gathered in the system, it accumulated in the steel pipe and eventually the ensuing rust led to a diesel leak, so a replacement pipe was required.

ADVANCED

The International hydraulic system has some features which were advanced for its time. The oil in the back end was used to power the hydraulic brakes and the steering, as well as the three-point linkage and the external services. This meant that a priority valve was needed to ensure that, for safe operation, the steering and brakes always had a sufficient supply of oil when the lift or spool valve were being operated.

While the cab was off the skid unit, Andrew had the perfect opportunity to replace this vital component. The torsion bar that controlled the top link sensing needed no attention, but the linkage pins were worn and needed replacing, and the levelling box was seized, so Andrew fitted a replacement. The adjusters in the drop links for the pick-up hitch were also seized, but he freed them with heat and removed the slack.

The infamous parking brake band had been replaced when the transmission was converted so, after an oil and filter change, the backend refurbishment was complete. IH tractors of this era could

be specified with either a single-speed lower PTO shaft, a single-speed upper shaft, or a dual-speed (540rpm and 1,000rpm) system. It is interesting to note that during the transmission conversion work, carried out in 1984, it was decided to change the 21-splined shaft for a six-splined shaft, so that light implements, such as a pressure washer, could be driven at lower engine speeds, reducing the noise levels, and saving on fuel costs.

Moving forward from the transmission, the clutch, which had been fitted in 1984, just needed adjustment and the safety start switch, which operates on the clutch pedal, was replaced. The D-239 engine has a reputation as a solid and reliable power unit, so it is no surprise that, with just over 2,000 hours on the clock, it needed little more than an oil change and new filters.

Having spent several years as the farm's loader tractor, Andrew was keen to investigate any wear in the front axle and steering components. "The front axle needed new bushings on the centre pivot, and we replaced one of the track rod ends, but that was all it needed," he said, illustrating the advantage of regular maintenance and a good acquaintance with the grease gun during its working life.

Not many International tractors from the World Wide range survive into

retirement without showing signs of their age, especially around the cab, and Andrew's IH 574 was no exception. "John had already fitted a new roof, but it needed a complete new front panel and mudguard top sections. Refitting the old grab rails onto the new mudguards was tricky, lining everything up and avoiding interference with the sidelight unit; it took a bit of time, but it looks right."

When it was time to prepare for the respray, the correct shade of paint had to be ascertained, so Andrew removed a panel from his International 440 baler, took it to his paint supplier and asked him to mix a colour to match the inside of the panel.

Back home he prepped the skid and the tinwork and applied the paint in his spray shed. When the paint had cured, new decals from Lotus Designs were applied and he then turned his attention to the interior.

He purchased new cladding from Tractor Cab Specialists and took the seat to a local auto upholsterer who has done a superb job, and with the original rear window fitted in a new frame, the job was complete.

Andrew is delighted to have this tractor restored and ready for whatever comes its way. It played a large part in his formative years, holds memories of time spent with his late grandfather and now it takes pride of place in the tractor shed.

Launched in 1967, the 780 was a well-quipped, small but powerful, tractor. Fitted with a robust 3 cylinder engine, an option of 6 or 12 speed transmission and the Selectamatic hydraulic system. Ploughing pairing

David Brown Selectamatic tractors were quite advanced in their day and are still sought after by enthusiasts. Les Hanmer, from Shropshire, owns an early 880 that he uses for match ploughing, writes Bob Weir.



he David Brown story
began in 1936, when the
company teamed up with
Harry Ferguson to build
the Ferguson-Brown
tractor. This machine soon
gained popularity because of its
revolutionary three-point linkage.

Although the collaboration between the two parties would end up being short lived, it spurred David Brown into making tractors to its own design. Production was put on hold during WW2, but by the late 1940s tractors like the Cropmaster were making a name for themselves.

In 1955, David Brown bought out implement manufacturer Harrison McGregor and Guest Ltd., while the factory at Meltham concentrated on tractor production. Exports boomed over the next few years, attracting the attention of American giant Tenneco Inc.

Tenneco eventually acquired the company in 1972 and decided to merge it with another famous name in the tractor world – J I Case. The alliance prospered, and in 1985 Tenneco expanded the organisation with newly acquired International Harvester to form Case IH.

The final link with the past was severed when the Meltham factory was closed in 1988, and production was switched to the IH plant in Doncaster.





Les has lived in Shropshire all his life and has been collecting tractors for many years. "When I left school, I went to work for a local farm," he recalls. "They were using an 880 Selectamatic, which accounts for my interest in David Brown tractors."

The David Brown Selectamatic range was introduced in 1965, and the first model was the three-cylinder-powered 770. The tractor was originally painted

in the then company colours of Currant Red and Primrose Yellow, and a patented, two-lever, 12-speed transmission was fitted.

'Selectamatic' referred to the hydraulic equipment on the tractor, which used a selector dial in conjunction with a traditional quadrant. Selectamatic allowed the operator to choose both 'Depth', 'Height', and 'External/TCU' for soil-engaging implements with depth wheels and external services, such as tipping a trailer.

The system proved so successful that David Brown decided to upgrade its existing tractors and by October of that year Selectamatic was a standard fitment across the range. The tractors also received a new livery in the form of Orchid White panels and wheels with a Chocolate Brown skid unit. The range was later expanded to include the three-cylinder 780 model.

Most of these tractors were equipped with a dual clutch and six-speed transmission as standard, although a few buyers opted for the optional 12 forward, four reverse gearbox.

The 880 Selectamatic proved to be extremely successful and by the time production ended in 1971, a total of 33,379 tractors had been built.

"As I recall, the 880 was a great tractor, and very reliable," said Les. "It was particularly good at ploughing. I worked on the farm for about three years, before enrolling on a course at a local agricultural college."

NEW ROLE

Les passed the course with flying colours and then took up with an agricultural contractor for six years. His career

working the land looked set, until he ran into an old acquaintance.

"One day I bumped into a former school chum, who was running his own plant hire company," he recalls. "Plant hire was big business back then and offered very good wages. One thing led to another, and I ended up working in plant hire for the next 40 years."

Les started off driving an excavator but progressed quickly through the ranks and ended up as group operations manager. The job took him all over the world, including tropical places like Jamaica and Sierra Leone.

"I enjoyed my time working in plant hire, but still retained my old love for classic tractors," he explained. "I wanted to get hold of an 880 Selectamatic and managed to acquire a suitable machine a few years ago."

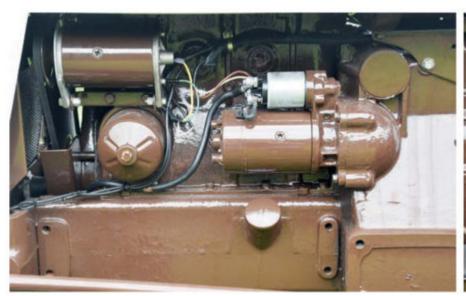
Les' tractor is one of the early models (serial no: 880A 530668), leaving the assembly line in 1965 and first registered on 7 January 1966.

"The tractor originally came from Herefordshire, although I acquired it from a local enthusiast," Les said. "The previous owner had bought a pair of tractors, including the 880. It was in poor condition and had been previously fitted with a cab. After a close inspection I realised some of the tinwork could be saved, so I sent the machine to specialist Shaune Clorley restorations at Wem, just north of Shrewsbury."

According to Les, Shaune stripped the tractor down to the bare bones before rebuilding it from the bottom up. He then finished the job with a new coat of paint.

"Looking back, I was very pleased with the outcome," said Les. "The David Brown looked as if it had just come out of the factory and is my favourite tractor to drive. I particularly enjoy taking it on road runs."

Les has recently started taking part in ploughing matches and was keen to acquire an authentic David Brown plough to go with the 880. "I bought the plough about four years ago from an enthusiast in South Wales," he explained. "I've been led to understand he was quite an accomplished ploughman. I've only started using the plough recently, as before my retirement I never really had the time."





With the adoption of Selectamatic across the range, David Brown changed its livery from Currant Red and Primrose Yellow to Orchid White and Chocolate Brown. The 880 featured a 46hp DB AD3/55 engine.

It has been many years since Les ploughed on a regular basis, but he says he is slowly getting back into the swing of things. "I am really enjoying it, and every ploughing match is a bit of a learning curve," he said. "I have started off at the bottom in the novice category and hope to work my way up. Shropshire is a rural community, so there is plenty of competition."

NOT JUST TRACTORS

Les recalls that he was working with a David Brown tractor and plough combination when he left school. "It's just like old times," he laughs. "The plough is a two-furrow conventional, like the 1970s. The actual model is a CM2 with an A21 serial number (10047),

which signifies a David Brown C type plough, with 'M' denoting a medium frame."

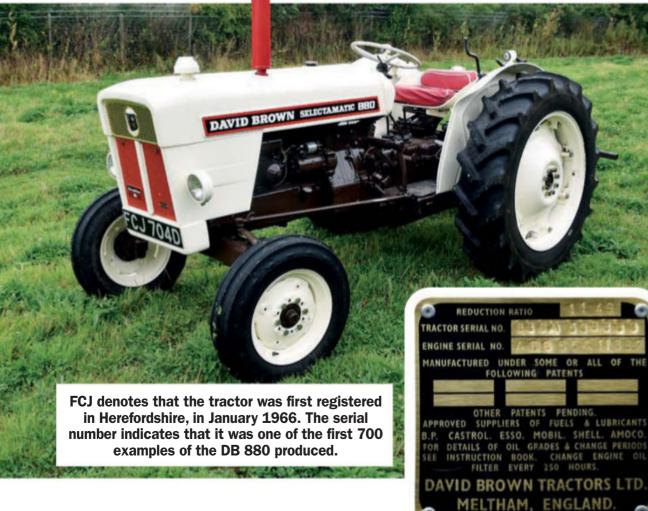
David Brown also made competition ploughs and unlike the commercial types, these were built to special order. The mouldboards were a 'blend' of 'general purpose' and 'ley', and the disc coulter units were adjustable both in angle of tilt, and fore and aft. The cross-shaft and land wheel were often longer and could be slid from side to side.

The mouldboards and frogs were adjustable to alter the pitch of the boards, and, in addition, there were two extra link pins supplied to switch from category I to category II, and different thickness 'wafer' spacers to adjust the furrow width on the legs.

"I've already made a few modifications," Les explained. "I've added a winding headstock and cross shaft so I can move the plough across to get the position the way I want it.

"I got some help from a friend of mine at Border Trailers in Oswestry, who specialise in metalwork, and we've done the alterations in such a way that the plough can be restored to factory specification without any cutting or welding."

His early apprenticeship on a farm has stood Les in good stead over the years, and he is comfortable working with tools. "It's just something you pick up over time," he explained. "I also own a Ford 3000 that reminds me of my younger days on a farm, and an Oliver 80 Standard because I was looking for something a bit different."

Storing a collection of tractors can be a challenge, but Les has the situation under control. "I have plenty of space to store the tractors, and a lot of it is under cover," he said. "I think it's important to keep the tractors out of the weather, especially during the winter months."

Now that he is enjoying a well-earned retirement, Les has become a regular on the local tractor and vintage vehicles circuit. He is currently refurbishing

another David Brown, which he hopes to use as his main ploughing tractor.

"I think the tinwork on the 880 is in too good condition for the rough and tumble of ploughing matches, so I bought a 780 that I am going to use as my dedicated ploughing tractor," he said. "Although I'm slowly getting all the mechanics up to speed, I am going to keep the bodywork in farmyard condition."

This means the 880 will be elevated to the status of number one 'show' tractor, at least for the time being. "I prefer local shows, because it cuts down on the travelling," Les explained. "I'm happy to drive the 1960s' tractors a short distance on the main road, but I use my trailer for old timers like the Oliver. I've had great fun showing and working with my tractors over the years and hope to continue for the foreseeable future."

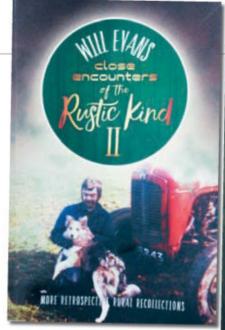

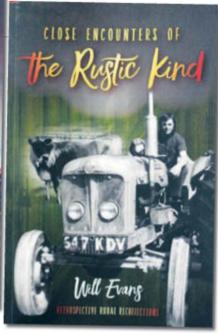
s time moves on and people grow ever older, it is tempting to look back on the past with more than a hint of rose-tinted spectacles, writes Jonathan Whitlam. Things were always so much better back then, weren't they? The truth is they often were not, and when it comes to farming in particular, the past was certainly a much harder and leaner place in which to live – for most involved at least.

For those starting off in a career in agriculture at the very bottom, as a farm labourer, the 1960s was still, in many places, largely the same as it had been decades before, with most of the work being done by hand and with only some mechanical assistance, especially if you were the 'new boy'. Those times though, are fast disappearing from people's recollections, which makes the books written by Will Evans such a treasure trove of insight.

You can tell straight away from the title of his first book, *Close Encounters of The Rustic Kind*, that the story is going to be somewhat tongue-in-cheek, and indeed the author's humour is very evident throughout both this and his second book. This makes for a very enjoyable read, as he takes us back to his early exploits as a new farm worker in deepest, darkest Devon.

He introduces us to the old characters of the farm and the local village, as well as the pub, of course. Will Evans tells





the story it as it was, warts and all, and regales the reader with the many trials and tribulations of farm life back in the 1960s, when many farms in this part of the world had hardly changed since the 1930s.

From a tractor and machinery perspective, there are plenty of interesting stories, as the author gets to grips with Fordson and Massey Ferguson tractors that often have important bits missing – such as brakes! The results end up being hilarious and at the same time we get an insight into the make-do-and-mend attitude of many farmers of those times, as well as a feel of what it was like having to use such equipment back then.

Full of characters, humour, and a feel of how life used to be much simpler, both the first volume and *Close Encounters of The Rustic Kind II* certainly bring back the old days of rural life with a bang. The second volume continues the story into the 1970s and finds Will, now a farmer and contractor in his own right, with all the extra joys and woes that come with that elevation in Devonshire society. All again told with a sense of humour very much in the vein of James Herriott, except here, it is the Devon landscape, the farmers and village folk that live in it that are brought vividly to life and with much affection too.

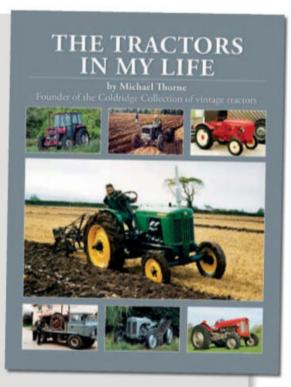
Mike lists more than 100 tractors that he bought over the years – those that were bought and subsequently sold, those

E27N hydraulic system

Andrew Hall looks at Ford's introduction of the Smith hydraulic system for the Fordson Major E27N.

y the time the Fordson E27N was introduced, in March of 1945, the Ford Motor Company had already experienced the advantages of the Ferguson System in the form of the Ford 9N and 2N tractors produced in Detroit and imported to the UK in limited numbers during WW2. By the end of hostilities, Ford in the UK had been developing what became known as the Fordson Major to replace the ageing Model N that had been in production at Dagenham since the early 1930s.

The Fordson Major was designed to pull a three-furrow plough and featured a redesigned rear end with more efficient power transmission than the old worm and worm wheel design of the Model N, despite using the same basic side-valve, petrol/TVO engine carried over from the N, due to a more up-to-date engine not being available at the time!

HYDRAULIC SYSTEM

The rear axle housing of the E27N was designed with a flat, rectangular cast cover, which was drilled and threaded to allow the fitment of a bolt-on hydraulic system. At the time of introduction however, the systems weren't readily available, and tractors were supplied as basic draft tractors until the systems became available and could be retrofitted to existing machines.

TRANSMISSION VARIATIONS

The gearbox of the E27N was basically like the old Model N, and a choice of either high top gear or low top gear models were available. The drive to the hydraulic systems was via a drive gearbox attached to the top of the tractor gearbox, and they differed according to whether the tractor was high or low top gear.

There were two types of hydraulic system available too, the more popular being the Smith lift and the other type being the Varley. These were also of differing dimensions and the Varley required a longer drive shaft from the drive gearbox to the hydraulic unit.

THREE-POINT LINKAGE

The method of attaching implements by means of three-point linkage had become accepted and the Fordson Major used larger-sized linkage ball-ends than those of the Ferguson, as the size of the tractor and the implements to be powered was larger than the Ferguson range.

The sizes were known as category I and II and became the standard we know today! There were many patents covering the features of the Ferguson System at the time, so Ford and other manufacturers were restricted to merely raising and

lowering of implements, rather than being able to incorporate draft control.

The working depth of soil-engaging implements was controlled by adjustable depth wheels and the working height of floating implements, such as mowers, set by chains to the desired height.

Although production of the Fordson Major E27N began in March of 1945, and the tractor was designed with the fitting of hydraulic lifts in mind, the reality was that the lift units, and many other accessories for the Majors, weren't immediately available. It was well into 1946 before one was able to obtain a hydraulic lift unit to retrofit to an existing tractor!



MATCHED IMPLEMENTS

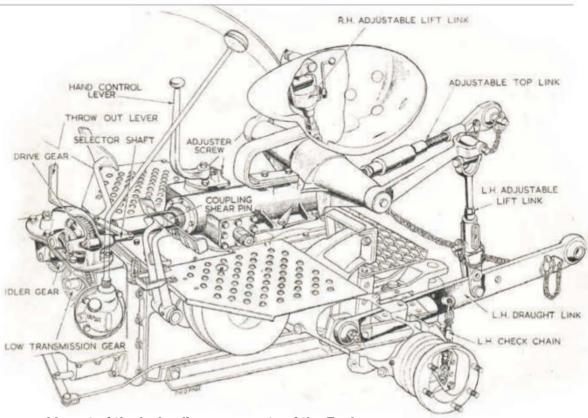
The introduction of the Ferguson TE-20 range of tractors and matched implements spurred the Ford Motor Company to promote the fitting of hydraulic lifts to its tractors, and to provide a range of matched implements to suit the Fordson Major.

Ford's Leamington factory was chosen to produce both trailed and mounted ploughs in the form of the trailed Elite plough and the PM mounted model, which was available in one-, two- or three-furrow form.

Other soil-engaging implements were built and supplied in conjunction with Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies; whilst manufacturers of other varied implements were also evaluated and added to the list of implements available.

HOW IT WORKS

The hydraulic systems were self-contained units that, as previously stated, bolted directly onto the rear axle top cover. The drive to the units was via a gearbox unit bolted to the top of the tractor main gearbox, which dispensed with the blanking plate. The drive gearbox units were like those used on the post-1936 Model N tractors where they were equipped with a PTO unit. The

drive could be engaged and disengaged as desired by the tractor driver, depending upon what was being powered by the tractor.

This brought a slight advantage over the Ferguson TE-20, as one didn't have to engage the PTO to provide drive to the hydraulic pump. Fordson Majors equipped with PTO had a separate, centrally mounted PTO shaft fitted and driven from the bottom of the main tractor gearbox and independent of the top hydraulic pump drive.

The drive shaft from the drive unit to the hydraulic unit passes centrally along the top of the transmission housing and is covered by a safety guard to prevent anything wrapping around the shaft. The Smith hydraulic units were supplied with either cast iron housings or



The Smith lift was designed as a self-contained unit, which bolted onto the rear axle top cover and allowed the use of a category two three-point linkage.



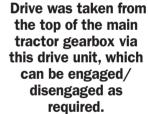
The drive shaft, minus the safety cover, showing the shear pin location (protecting the pump from overload).



An aluminium or fabricated steel lever is the main control for raising and lowering implements or operating external hydraulic services as required.

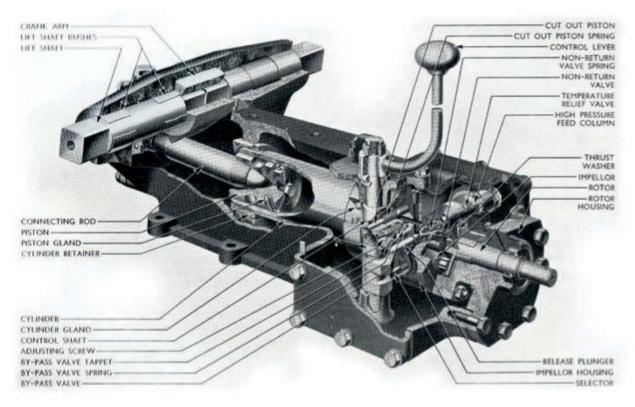


Fully anti-clockwise, the lever is in the lower position allowing implements to drop.

aluminium, with an oil capacity of two gallons with cast iron housing or $1\frac{1}{2}$ gallons with the aluminium housing.

The hydraulic pump was mounted inside the front end of the unit and took the form of a rotary impellor design. The J-shaped control lever was mounted vertically and could be either made from aluminium or fabricated steel with a separate knob.

To operate the system, drive is engaged by depressing the clutch pedal and moving the lever on the drive gearbox into gear. Once in gear, raising and lowering of an implement is performed by rotating the control lever clockwise and holding it in place until the implement reaches its height limit. At this point the lever returns anticlockwise slightly and the implement is

held in the raised position. To lower an implement the lever is rotated fully anti-clockwise and the implement drops to working position.

As the hydraulic unit is a self-contained unit, the pump, control valves, oil reservoir and lift cylinder are all within the main casting of the unit. A series of eccentric cams are mounted on the control lever shaft.

IMPLEMENT LOWERED

When the lever is in the lower (drop) position, oil from the pump is drawn from the reservoir via an internal filter, the release plunger is held inwards by a cam on the control lever shaft, and the bypass valve is held off its seat, allowing oil to return to the reservoir, and the implement remains lowered. See figure one overleaf.

IMPLEMENT BEING RAISED

When the lever is placed into the raise position, the top cam on the control lever shaft holds the bypass valve on its seat and a non-return valve allows oil to pass to the lift cylinder and raise an implement. See figure two overleaf.

IMPLEMENT RAISED

When the implement reaches its full height on the linkage and the piston of ➤





Full movement clockwise is the implement lift position. The lever is held whilst lifting. There is no intermediate height – it's either fully raised or lowered!



Once fully raised the lever moves back to the 'up' position until it is required to lower an implement.



Oil for tipping trailers or front-end loaders can be supplied via this ½-inch BSP tapping point, which is controlled by the same main control lever.



Oil is filled via this plug in the rear cover. Note the threepoint linkage has been removed to accommodate a winch.

the lift cylinder is at its limit, oil pressure rises and causes the cut-out piston to move outwards and push against the top cam and move the lever back into a neutral position. At this point the oil is locked in the lift cylinder and holds the implement in the raised position. See figure three opposite.

IMPLEMENT LOWERING

The lever is moved anti-clockwise into the lower position and the centre cam holds the release plunger fully inwards, whilst the top cam holds the bypass valve off its seat to enable oil to drain from the lift cylinder and allow the implement to drop. See figure four opposite.

RATE OF DROP

The speed that an implement descends can be adjusted by means of a screw adjuster that doubles up as a control lever stop. If this is adjusted to increase the drop of an implement, the top cam allows the bypass valve to open wider and allow a quicker passage for the oil to drain from the lift cylinder.

SAFETY VALVES

There are two forms of safety valve incorporated in the hydraulic system. If excessive pressure builds due to the lever being held too long in the raise position, the bypass valve will blow at 1,800psi, whilst a second ball valve is present in the external services line and opens if the temperature of the oil rises excessively.

EXTERNAL SERVICES

A single external services tapping is provided for front-end loaders and tipping trailers and operates in the same manner as the internal hydraulic circuits.

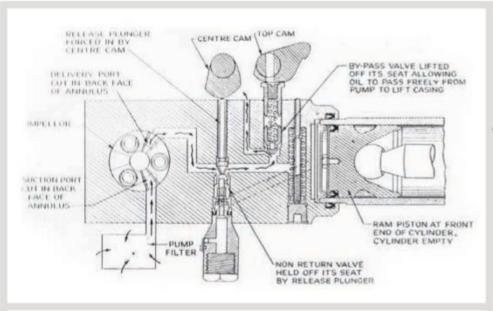

explanation).

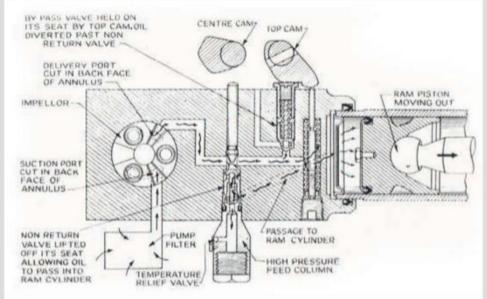

Implement is being raised with the lever fully clockwise.

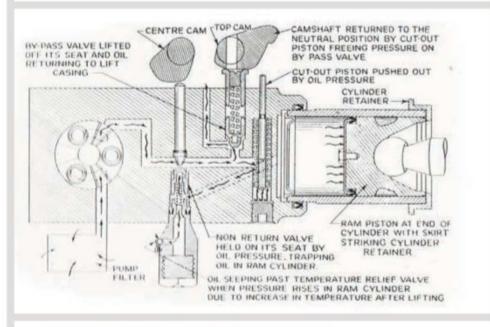

position.

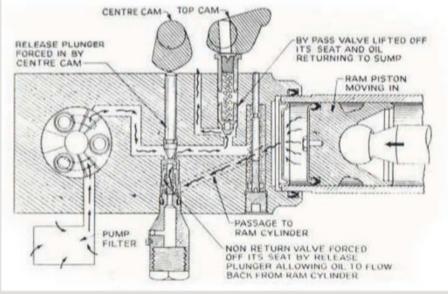


Figure 4 (implement being lowered): Lever is in the drop position and oil is flowing back into the reservoir. Illustrations taken from **The Tractor** by Ford Motor Company.

John Deere 1750

PRODUCTION

On sale from the mid 1980s to the mid '90s, John Deere's European-built 50 Series offered something for most requirements – from pint-sized three-cylinder models to turbocharged, six-cylinder prime movers.

One of the smallest tractors in the Series, and the mid-range three-cylinder model, was the 1750 and it was this that effectively replaced the 1040 – a model available in both two- and four-wheel drive forms with an OPU cab.

As a tractor with a minimal power output, the 1750 was the ideal go-to model for smallholdings and the like, as well as a popular machine with livestock farmers – where its compact dimensions were an advantage in cattle yards, and in and around low buildings.



ENGINE

Like the other three-cylinder models in the range, the 1750 was powered by Deere's 3179 engine – in this case naturally-aspirated (DL) form, rather than turbocharged (TL) guise.

With a displacement of just shy of three litres, the engine had a decent bore size but not a particularly long stroke – but maximum torque was still a decent 185Nm (at 1,300rpm) and power output a reasonable 50hp (DIN). This put it in the same bracket as the Case IH 485 and Ford 3910/4110.

The water-cooled, cross-flow engine had been in production since around 1973 and utilised replaceable wet sleeves, distributor-type fuel injection pump, dry-type air cleaner and had a 200-hour service interval. Rated speed was 2,300rpm.

It had proved itself over many years and reliability remains one of its strongest qualities today, but for those concerned about its longevity, it is worth noting that parts are plentiful from John Deere, specialists, and other aftermarket suppliers.

CLUTCH, TRANSMISSION & BRAKES

Three types of pressure-lubricated transmission were available to specify, each driven through a dry-disc clutch. An eight forward, four reverse 'Synchron' transmission was standard specification, but a 16 forward, eight reverse 'Power Synchron' could be chosen for additional versatility. This incorporated an additional lever for clutch-less shifting under load.

For those looking for a tractor to use at reduced ground speeds, a 'Synchron + Creeper' option offered 12 forward gears and eight reverse, but in all instances a logical 'H' pattern shift was employed. With speeds on one lever and range on the second, a 'shuttle' was incorporated between reverse and low ranges that permitted quicker cycle times (with reverse speeds 50 per cent faster than the equivalent low range gear).

Four-wheel drive was also available as an option, operated via a rocker switch on the dash panel. This could be engaged and disengaged under load, thanks to an oil-cooled, multiplate clutch, and with a central driveline, and 12-degree castor angle, 11.2-24 front tyres could be fitted without compromising the 50-degree steering angle.

Like the larger tractors in the range, an inboard, wet-disc braking system was utilised for efficient and effective stopping power.

In two-wheel drive form, 6.50-16 or 7.50-16 front tyres were fitted, while 12.4-32s were the norm at the rear.



HYDRAULICS&PTO

John Deere's tractors were famed for their closed-centre hydraulic systems and the 1750 was no different. Incorporating the company's lower link-sensed, 'Liquid Lightning' three-point linkage with such a system gave, Deere said, immediate and precise rockshaft response.

Such a system also provided instant pressure to where it was required, including the steering and braking systems whilst undertaking functions with remote cylinders, before the latter was returned directly to the hydraulic pump. The system was designed this way to enable many jobs to be performed at lower revs, thus saving fuel.

At the heart of this system was an eight-piston hydraulic pump, driven off the crankshaft, and with no demand from hydraulic functions the pressure inside the pump would force the pistons away from the cam drive, with the oil held at standby pressure in all the oil lines.

Once the oil was in demand, pressure was relieved inside the pump and springs would force the pistons onto the cam, thus pumping oil to where it was required. This helped prevent overheating of the oil and parasitic power loss.

Pump capacity was either 22 or 44 litres per minute (4.8 or 9.6gpm) and the

system pressure was 190 bar (2,756psi), while lift capacity was 1,274kg throughout the lift range (610mm behind the hitch points).

The power take-off was an independent system, with 540rpm shaft as standard or either an exchangeable or shiftable 540/1,000rpm system - depending on the territory and/or specification.



Depending on the market, the 1750 was available as an open station or with John Deere's 'budget' cab. Most tractors destined for Europe were fitted with the MC1 unit (which became the CC2), but some Mediterranean countries had open station tractors instead.

The MC1 was marketed as a 'first-class ride at an economy price' and offered a comfortable working environment without the standard features of the iconic SG2. There was no flat floor, no pendant pedals, and no right-hand console with integral gear-change gate.

One of the advantages that the MC1 had over the SG2 was the inclusion of two, rear-hinged doors, which were preferred by stock farmers and those that were regularly in and out of the seat. With full-length glass doors, visibility to the side was excellent, and four openable windows (including the windscreen) permitted good natural ventilation.

Four vents on the dash panel provided mechanical ventilation, but there was no option of air conditioning.

In 1990/91, the MC1 was replaced by the CC2 and aside from a change of roof colour (from yellow to green), there were no obvious differences from outside. Once the door was open, right-hand, console-mounted gear levers, an adjustable steering column within a redesigned dash binnacle, and a better seat were the obvious changes, but the mechanical ventilation had been improved too.

The list price for a two-wheel drive Synchron model, in 1989, was £12,875, while four-wheel drive added a further £3,000. Power Synchron increased the price by £672.

Good conditions at National

he rain that fell on the afternoon of Friday 7
October may have caused problems the following morning at the entrance to the site for the 71st
British National Ploughing
Championships, but it proved to be a godsend to the 244 ploughmen and women that took part, says Peter Love.

The event was held on the Chatsworth Estate at Glapwell, Derbyshire, owned by the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire, and run by the Society of Ploughmen. The condition of the ploughing fields was near perfect over the weekend, and with a decent road network around the site, the soft areas were to be a less of a hinderance to all in the end. In fact, the sun was so bright across the site that several competitors wore sunglasses to lessen the glare.

One of the most popular ploughing plots with the crowds was that of current British and European Vintage Ploughing Champion John Crowder, from Sturton by Stow in Lincolnshire. He didn't disappoint, using his diesel-powered Fordson N and his modified Ransomes RSLD plough to great effect both days. He had a particularly tricky plot on the Saturday, but went on to beat Trevor Johnstone, from Wigton in Cumbria, by 15 points. He was using a Fordson N Utility, with an E1A diesel conversion, and RSLD plough.

In third place was John Milnes, from Penistone in South Yorkshire, with his famous MF 35 and Ransomes RSLD combination. John is a previous British, European and World Vintage Ploughing Champion.

In total, 15 competitors used Fordson Ns – but just two featured the original spark-ignition engine. The most interesting tractor in this class was owned by James Cook, from Buckinghamshire, who was using a four-wheel drive Same DA30, built in 1958, with a Ransomes Motrac behind. James told me that the tractor has plenty of power and he runs it in four-wheel drive when ploughing.

Fred Hayllar, from Cumbria, was using his very tidy David Brown 30D, also with a Motrac behind, but others in this class used International B-250 and B-275 models as well as Andrew Buckley with his familiar, original-style Nuffield Universal Three with RSJ TS42A plough.

Dominating the Vintage Hydraulic Plough-Off again, to take his fourth win in five years, was Richard Ingram, from Atherstone in Warwickshire. Some 23 points behind was George Black, from Earlston in Berwickshire, and in third place was Ian Berriman, from Driffield in East Yorkshire.

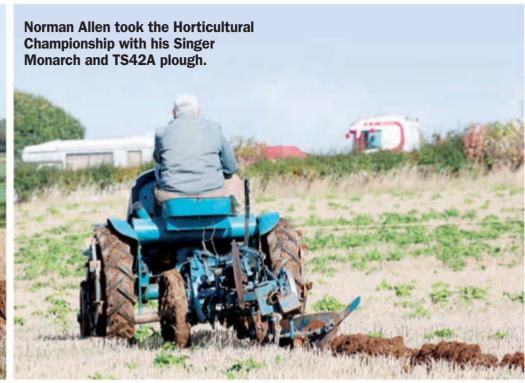
All three used MF 35 tractors with Ransomes TS54, TS59 and TS54 ploughs respectively. The MF 35 was the dominant model in this class, with 16 examples competing, with International B-275s next (five) followed by one Fordson Dexta. The oldest was Colin Hewetson's David Brown 25D.

CLASSICS

David Thomlinson, from Escrick, near York, was in fine form and took the

Classic title for the third time with his familiar Ford 3000 and Ransomes TS86 combination. He was in front of Jon Cole by two points, who was using his Nuffield 10/42 and Ransomes TS86 and accompanied by his Cocker Spaniel dog on the mudguard.

In third place, on 262 points, was Nick Morley from Lowdham in Nottinghamshire. He was using his immaculate, early Massey Ferguson 35 with TS86. Massey Ferguson was the most popular marque in this class too, but there was more variety than in the other classes – with David Pritchard's lovely Zetor 3045 and TS90 standing out.

On the Sunday, the Classic Reversible Plough-off Final took place, won by Graham Sutton, from Nuneaton in Warwickshire, with his MF 65 and Ransomes TS82. He beat Stephen Watkins from Maltby, South Yorkshire, by seven points – who was using an MF 135 and TS82. Stephen's son, George, finished third using a similar tractor up front with a TS81 on the back.

The High Cut Ploughing Champion was Derek Needham, from Kings Lynn in Norfolk, who once again used his Zetor 4511 to great effect. It is now without its cab, but the RSLD 15 plough remains. Marshall traction engine owner, and former champion, Shaun Garrod was second with his original-style Fordson Dexta and RSLD 15. Third went to Ray Alderson, of Darlington in Co. Durham, using a Ford 3000 and RSLD 9 plough.

The Horticultural Ploughing Championship was taken by Norman Allen, who was the last to start with his blue Singer Monarch and TS42A, but left







everyone behind by 30 points. Second went to Graham Brown with his Trusty and Trusty Greyhound behind, with Andrew Pomeroy third with his similar outfit. There was a better variety in this class this year, which was good to see.

SINGLE MARQUES

Edmund Mason came out top in the Ferguson class, with his TE-D 20, while John Kitching finished second from Keith Williams and his TE-F 20.

In the FFA Championship, 10 competitors took part, with John Lewis, from Meifod in Wales, winning with his Dexta and TS59. Second was Tim Easter with a Ford 2000 and TS86 and third was Roger Ingham and his pre-Force 3000 and TS86.

As for the David Brown Ploughing Championship, David White was first with his 950 and David Brown B Series plough, while second was Janet Vickers and her 950 outfit, with Edwin Hughes third with his red 770 and B Series plough.

The British Crawler Championship saw Richard Cook take the win with his Lamborghini and Motrac plough, while second was Liam Quick with an IH TD-6 and RSLD 9 and third was Les Dodds with a Caterpillar D2 and RSLD Major.

The Reversible Plough-Off Final was won by Mick Chappell from Loversall, near Doncaster, ploughing with a four-wheel drive Ford 6810 tractor and Kverneland plough. This was the third time Mick that had won the title on 330 points, ahead of former British Champions Ian Brewer, from Wadebridge in Cornwall, and Peter Alderslade from East Boldon, Tyne & Wear.

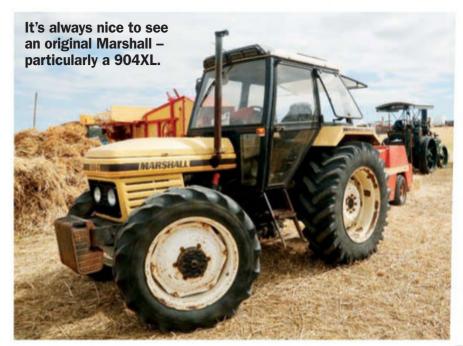

Good to be back!

t felt good to be back at The Great
Dorset Steam Fair, the largest show of
its type in the world, writes Peter Love.
The tractor section was superb and
bolstered by the various club stands
– including the Case IH Club UK, Ford
& Fordson Association, International
Harvester Club of Great Britain, and The
Nuffield Leyland Marshall stands.

Among the popular exhibits was Martin Eady's IH 434 'tandem' – taking inspiration from the Doe Dual Drive – which debuted at Tractor World Spring in May. Some were disappointed that it did not parade on the Friday, but it was good to see all the same.

Although there were many red tractors, a couple of interlopers caught my eye. Doug Palmer's 1938 Case C was being driven by a lady embracing the Women's Land Army style, while Maurice James, from Cumbria, was showcasing a 1939 Case R that he has restored from a wreck.

As is usually the case, John Deeres were sparse, but Eddie Spencer from Co. Tipperary flew the flag for the marque with his 1947 M, which went on to take the overseas award.

Continental tractors have always been part of this show, but less are entering these days. Thankfully, Mart Steinwaltx was exhibiting his lovely 1959 Fendt with 16hp single-cylinder engine, Fritzmeier cab and single-furrow plough.

Taking another award was Ben Monksummers with his 1936 Allis-Chalmers U which featured steel rim pneumatic conversions on the rear and cast conversions on the front of some size. On the Friday he was towing the very shiny, but temperamental 1941 bow-axled A-C B, belonging to S Judd.

Nuffields were a bit thin on the ground too, but James Day's 1965 4/65 looked the part, as did Andrew Rutherford's 1954 TVO-powered M4 with MIL loader, which also paraded.

One of the nicest Ford/Ford-based tractors at the event was Edward Price's 1964 County Super-4. It looked very original, and I could imagine it working in a field somewhere. There was a small, but elite, selection of Fordson Ns to see too, as well as others from the Ford family.

As for the Ferguson and Massey
Ferguson marques, there wasn't a
spectacular selection, but Sarah Tween,
from Suffolk, and her 1963 Massey

Steering box repair

When the steering on Andrew Hall's David Brown 950 failed, some prompt action was required. In the first of two parts he shows how he tackled it.

he steering of my '59 David Brown 950 has never been wonderful, and attention to the steering box has been covered to an extent before in *T&M*, when I stripped and inspected the recirculating ball mechanism and adjusted the steering column top bearing.

Those tasks had improved matters, until earlier this year when I was harrowing level some ploughed ground. One of the front wheels dropped into the open furrow and the steering was snatched to one side. However, the steering wheel stayed firmly in my hands, and when an attempt was made to straighten the steering, it would only go so far!

I immediately stopped and carefully headed home with limited steering, but found it to vary as I travelled back. Since that occasion the tractor hasn't been used, until I recently ran it up once again. A study of the steering soon showed where the problem had arisen. The spline of the cross-shaft and drop arm had worn badly and allowed the drop arm to move relative to the shaft, hence the symptoms I had experienced.

LATER STEERING BOX

My 950 has had a later steering box from a 990 Implematic fitted at some time in its past life. Evidence of this is clear; as



the flange that supports the throttle lever had been cut off to allow the original throttle lever assembly to fit, which is secured by 'U' bolts rather than the later-style flange.

I have a spare 950 that needs engine attention, and its future is currently uncertain, so I thought I'd swap the steering boxes over. The donor box has a better cross-shaft and drop arm with no slack in it, although it requires a new column top bearing, as does my original box. The idea was to swap them and fit a new top bearing to the donor box. Job done, or so I thought!

STEERING BOX REMOVAL

This was a straightforward task beginning with the steering wheel, which had to be pulled off the column using a hydraulic puller, as it was tight on its taper. With the wheel off I targeted the drop arm. The pinch bolt was slackened and knocked out of the arm, which was so loose it rattled off the cross-shaft with little resistance.

I inspected the drag link ball joints on both tractors and decided to use the drag link, complete with its ball joints, from the donor tractor, as the rubber gaiters were better, and no play was present.

DIFFICULTY

JOINT SPLITTER

The nut of the front ball joint was removed where it joins the track arm, but the joint was tight on its taper, so a screw-type joint splitter was employed to speed things up. The splitter was tightened and after a sharp tap from a hammer the drag link and ball joint were soon off the tractor.

Working on the steering box, the throttle linkage was disconnected at the ball joint and the six %-BSF setscrews were removed, followed by lifting the box clear of the tractor. On inspection, the recirculating ball mechanism appeared to be in good order, but at that stage I was still thinking of swapping the boxes until I removed the steering wheel from the donor tractor, which changed the course of action completely!

ATTACHMENT METHOD

The steering wheel was removed in the same manner as the other tractor, using



The cause

The cause of the problem was a worn spline on the cross-shaft and drop arm of the steering box, so some dismantling was ahead.

Despite having adjusted the top bearing before, there was still some up/down movement in the column, so the first task was to...



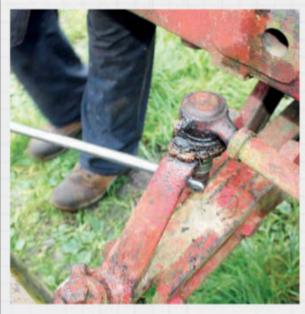
Off with the steering wheel

3 ... remove the steering wheel using a hydraulic puller, as the wheel was tight on its taper. The wheel is to be replaced with a new one during this repair.



Drop arm

Next was the removal of the drop arm, which rattled off with little resistance once the pinch bolt was removed. Note the wear on the splines!

I decided to remove the drag link and ball joint at the track arm end, as the donor tractor has better joints and gaiters.

the puller, but it features a spline, rather than the taper of the later steering box column. The top bearing housing also looks different.

A call to Peter Williams at David Brown Parts Ltd. (01989 562743 or davidbrownparts.com) confirmed that the splined steering column was fitted to the 900 and pre-Implematic DB 950s and a replacement steering wheel isn't available for that design. My intention was to treat the 950 to a new steering wheel whilst replacing the top bearing, so a straightforward swap wasn't to be!

CHANGE OF PLAN

With both steering boxes side by side, I inspected and compared them both, and then decided upon swapping the cross-shafts. They are secured to the fork inside the box by a solitary split pin, which passes through the fork and the

shaft. I turned the steering position until access to the pin was easy and removed the first one on my old box.

The cross-shaft then pulled straight out of the housing with no resistance. This was repeated with the donor box and the shafts compared. The better cross-shaft was cleaned up and fitted into my original box. In the next issue I will cover the fitting of the new top bearing and steering wheel.

Donor tractor

This is the donor tractor, featuring a single-stage clutch. It needs engine work carried out and its future is currently uncertain!

Well worn

The drop arm was well worn and wouldn't tighten enough, however tight the pinch bolt was tightened.



Box removed

After disconnecting the throttle linkage and removing the setscrews, the steering box was lifted clear. This is the lubrication well in the gearbox.



Good condition

Despite the slack in the cross-shaft, the internal parts are in good order, which was good news as they will still be needed.



Game changer

This was the game changer that brought the decision to swap just the cross-shafts. The donor box features a splined column, as opposed to a taper on the later box.



Better splines

Thankfully, the donor box has better splines on the cross-shaft, so swapping is the easiest solution in the circumstances.

mentioned in the last article that I had noticed that the brakes on Tim Edwards' Massey Ferguson 135 MkIII were seized. I assumed that it was due to the brakes not being used, which I had no reason to disbelieve.

I had discovered this when testing the movement of the brake pedal rod, which had been extended rather crudely. The flat section that had been welded in flexed more than it should do, as the brake lever was seized.

This was because the pin was stuck in the casting, so the first job was to slacken off the adjuster – which was two nuts locked together. These needed a good tap to loosen, as they were quite tight. As I began to strip this assembly down, I was unsure if I could get any parts should I need them, but I figured that I would cross that bridge when I got there.

With the adjuster nuts off I could clearly see that the problem was, as I first thought, in the pin and where it locates. Before going any further I thought that I had better drain out the oil, as the tractor features a wet braking system, and I didn't want oil pouring out where it shouldn't.

To get the assembly off, three %6 bolts held it onto the axle and these, thankfully, loosened with ease. Once the bolts were off and put safe, I had to slide the seal off the adjustment rod, which was located halfway up this rod.

The assembly was now off the axle and in my hand and so I put it in the vice to see if it would move, or whether it needed some gentle persuasion. Upon finding it wouldn't move and that it did

need more than gentle persuasion, I needed another solution. With the fear of breaking what could turn out to be a tricky part to replace, I decided to go and see a good friend of mine, Alan Braithwaite.

Not only does Alan have an oxyacetylene torch, but he is also very skilled in using it and soon had the section red hot. Now the seized pin could be tapped out with ease and the lot was gently cooled so it could be handled safely.

While we were waiting for it to cool down a bit, we discussed the part in question. Our first thoughts were that there was no grease nipple, so it couldn't be greased as part of a lubrication schedule. However, we were both of the opinion that, if needed, a grease nipple could be fitted in the

future. This would allow for it to be lubricated more regularly.

When I was back in my workshop, I gave the pin a good clean up with a wire brush and it was ready to be refitted with plenty of oil or grease.

By now I had decided that I would refit the assembly with new seals and see how the brakes worked, and if they were okay I would leave the rest of the system well alone. My biggest worry was stripping the axle apart and not being able to put it back together because the parts weren't available.

I had to find some new seals, as the old ones were split, and with nobody selling parts for a Massey Ferguson 135 MkIII vineyard, I had to look elsewhere. Reaching the conclusion that MF wouldn't make bespoke seals for this vineyard model, which would surely sell in relatively low numbers, I looked through the Agriline Products parts catalogue at other models of that era.

I soon found a picture of what looked like the same part that fitted an MF 200 Series model. I contacted Matt at Agriline and asked him to measure the part he had got and, sure enough, it was the same. I ordered a couple, as I planned to replace both while I was doing the restoration.

I made a new paper gasket to go behind the housing and I made sure both surfaces were clean. It was quite easy to fit the seals in the housing, using a big socket to drive it into place, although it was extremely tricky to get it to locate on the adjuster rod. After trying many tools, different ways, and some swearing, I found the best solution was to use a small, flat-bladed screwdriver to prise it onto the groove.

It was tricky because it was too tight to get my fingers inside the rubber to where it needed to locate, which was quite far up. When the seal was in its groove, I could bolt the assembly in place and locate the pin that had been freed off and cleaned. This time I smeared a good dollop of grease, and the job was done. I would make the final adjustments when the tractor was back up and running, as it was just two nuts to get right.



Seized pin

Whilst noting that the brake rod modifications flexed, I found that this mechanism had seized.



Lock nuts

I loosened these adjustment nuts first. There are two together to act as a lock.



Rust

The seized pin was in this section. If it was stuck all the way through there could be a lot of rust holding the pin in.



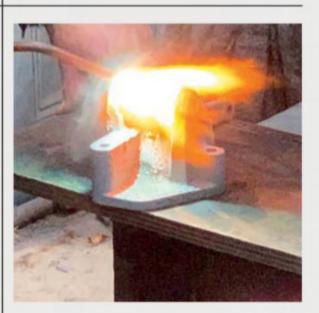
Assembly removal

It was time to get the assembly off, with three of these 9/16 bolts to remove.



Brute force

Gripping the assembly in the vice I tried to work the lever free, but it was still very stuck.



Oxy-acetylene

Because the lever wouldn't budge it was time for drastic action in the form of some heat.



Pin cleaned

Once the pin had cooled down, I gave it a good clean with the wire bush. This would be greased up before refitting.



Split seal

Before the heat was applied, I had removed the seal, as it would have melted. It was also split.



Seal measured

Measuring the seal allowed me to find one in the Agriline Products parts catalogue, which was made for a different Massey Ferguson model.



New seals

1 bought two new seals and once they arrived, I was extremely pleased that they were the same as the originals.



Socket used

I pressed the new seal in with a suitably sized socket.



Pressed home

From the back you can see the seal poking through. The whole housing had been cleaned.



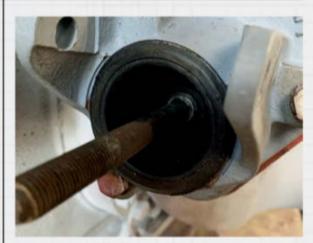
Seal location

This collar on the adjustment rod is where the seal locates.



Gasket made

There was a gasket to be made and fitted between the axle and brake assembly.



Fiddly job

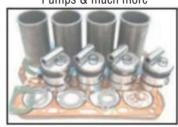

his restoration has been going on for a long time and many parts have been stored in the shed, including the air filter assembly.

In the previous issue I had pulled the air filter out from long-term storage and inspected it, having experienced oil seeping from the bowl in the past. This was due to corrosion making the base of the bowl porous, and I had attempted to repair it in the past unsuccessfully.

Now, with a completely new base welded into place, I turned my attention to the rest of the unit. This was basically in good order, just requiring the old paint to be sanded off and some fresh paint applied!

AIR PIPE

Another item needing attention was the pipe that carries the air from the air cleaner to the manifold. Observant readers may have seen the later '1950' vaporiser fitted to my tractor in previous pictures. This was fitted to the tractor soon after I acquired it in 1986, as the original early vaporiser had cracked beyond repair.

My other Fordson E27N, fitted with a rear-mounted Hesford winch, arrived with no vaporiser at all, and so the later unit was fitted to that, as the tractor is a later model anyway! When the later vaporiser was fitted to my original tractor, the air pipe had to be cut, as it was too short to link up, and a piece of rubber pipe was fitted to lengthen the pipe.

I have since acquired an early-pattern vaporiser to fit to the current restoration, so the pipe needed to be welded back together once again. I had gained a second air pipe, which was the first choice to use, but when I began to clean it up to repaint it, I found that it was peppered with rust holes, so it was easier to re-join the original pipe!

ARC WELDED

With no MIG gas or oxy-acetylene to hand, I resorted to using my arc inverter. The gauge of the steel is thin, so I knew I needed some thin rods. A search of the shed soon yielded some 1.5mm mild steel rods and using a setting of between 40 and 50 amps I re-joined the two halves of the pipe and sanded the weld smooth very easily.

WORKSHOP



Time for more paint

After sitting in the shed for ages, the air filter is about to be prepared for fresh paint. Note the bowl inverted before the new base was welded into place.



Air pipes

The original was cut in two to use on a later manifold, but a replacement is peppered with rust holes, so the original will be welded back together.



Pipe ends

There are two pipe ends, each with felt seals. These will be cleaned and repainted, along with the other parts of the air filter assembly.



Successfully welded

With no MIG gas or oxy-acetylene, I had to use arc to weld the two halves together. Thin rods of 1.5mm diameter were used with a setting of between 40 and 50 amps.



Inverter

This Sealey welding inverter has been very useful, and I have accomplished many successful jobs with it. The amperage is very easily controlled for differing rod sizes.



In their prime

Some of the parts of the air filter have been primed in red oxide. Two coats applied in short succession!

All the relevant parts were cleaned up and degreased before applying two coats of red oxide in quick succession. I took advantage of the warm autumn sunshine to quickly dry the primer, which was then over coated with two coats of E27N blue enamel.

Once the paint had hardened, I wasted no time in fitting the air filter back onto the tractor, so now less parts were kicking around the shed.

EARLY VAPORISER

Around 10 years ago I purchased an early-pattern vaporiser through a friend, and this has sat in the shed ever since. I brought it out into daylight to examine it. When stored it was covered in some sort of grease or oily substance, which has preserved it well, so some initial cleaning was required.

The vaporiser plate and float chamber had been removed and stored separately, so I needed to check whether it was still flat and will form a gastight seal when refitted. To check this the surface of the vaporiser was carefully sanded clean without gouging into the surface. The plate was treated similarly and placed onto the surface of the vaporiser and sat in place without any tendency to tip, which would indicate that it wasn't flat.

I also used a straight edge on the surface of the vaporiser to ensure it was also flat. Any light showing between the straight edge and the surface would also show up any distortion, but luckily it proved to be nicely flat.

I want the tractor to perform well once it's finished, so I have removed the carburettor from the manifold and have completely dismantled it. There is a small economy device that has a diaphragm and spring inside. Three small screws, two of which came out with no problem, secure this, but the third was seized and needed to be drilled out.

EXHAUST PIPE

I've had an exhaust pipe in stock for some time to suit the earlier vaporiser, purchased from Old 20 Parts Company (01332 792698 or old20tractorparts.com). Sadly, it doesn't have a flare to attach it to the manifold, so this will have to be addressed. I have the cast collar that bolts to the manifold, so I may be able to cut a circular plate and form it into shape without too much trouble.

The project is now nearing completion, and some of the final tasks will be covered in the next issue of *Tractor & Machinery*. ■



Main filter body

This was treated similarly. The tall stack pipe was purchased some years ago, as the original had been removed and the pre-cleaner fitted directly onto the filter when first purchased.



Top coat completed

Once again, two coats of E27N blue enamel were applied and the warm, autumn sunshine did a good job of drying the paint in a short time.

The air filter is secured by one of the cylinder head bolts and another on the dash panel. The heads of the bolts were refinished after fitting the air filter, as the paint had cracked around them.

An early-pattern vaporiser was purchased some years ago in anticipation of doing this restoration, and is about to be cleaned, inspected, and stripped down.



Checked over

The carburettor has been removed, and the surface of both the vaporiser and the plate cleaned to enable them to be checked for being flat.

A new exhaust pipe to suit the early vaporiser was purchased some years ago, but is lacking...



No tlare

... the flare to attach it to the manifold. I do, however, have the cast collar that attaches it, so a flare will be made from some suitable sheet steel in due course.

Experts' advice

Ferguson TE-A 20

I own a 1948 Ferguson TE-A 20 that has recently blown its head gasket. Upon removal I found, not one, but three head gaskets and two metal spacers. I understand this was done to make the tractor able to run on TVO. The engine block has a plate on the side saying, 'factory rebuilt 1954', but I'm not sure if this is when the conversion took place or not.

My question is, if I refit three head gaskets would the head need to be torqued down the same amount as just fitting one gasket, or would it differ, and by how much?

I did toy with the idea of just fitting one gasket but would then need shorter push rods, which are as common as hens' teeth!

Thanks for producing a great magazine. *James, via e-mail*

From what you say it sounds as if your tractor was converted to run on Tractor Vaporising Oil using one of the Ferguson conversion kits available in the 1950s. If this is so, the tractor would have had larger-diameter cylinder liners and pistons of 85mm diameter, as opposed to the original 80mm diameter of the TE-A 20 straight petrol engine.

Whilst you have your cylinder head removed you can confirm the current bore diameter. Longer push rods were supplied to compensate for the thicker gaskets and spacers used to lower the compression ratio.

To answer your question, firstly you need to choose whether you want to continue running the tractor on TVO or straight petrol. To continue with TVO you'll need to use the multiple gaskets and tighten the cylinder to the usual torque setting. To

revert to straight petrol, you can retain the larger pistons/liners and use one gasket to increase the compression ratio to suit petrol.

However, if longer push rods were employed, you'll need to obtain a set of standard-sized rods. These are no longer available to buy new, but you may be able to obtain a set from a scrap engine, enabling you to bring the tractor back to its original form.

The price differential between petrol and TVO is much closer than it was, making straight petrol a more attractive proposition once again, as there are less issues than running on TVO regarding oiling up and hot starting etc.

If you choose the petrol option you will need to remove the manifold heat shield and the separate starting fuel tank, as these won't be required!

Fordson Super Major

Could you advise me on a problem I have with my Super Major, registration number 849 MAL (24/01/62)?

I purchased this tractor new from Brooks of Newark, Nottinghamshire, and it has been on my farm ever since. It was refurbished in 2003 and has been to many vintage rallies.

Last year I renewed the king pins, along with the shims, and the steering box balls, cross shaft, and steering wheel bearings, but herein lies the problem. When I drive it forward it is very stiff to steer, but in reverse it is a little easier to turn.

If I jack up the front axle the steering is free to turn in each direction whilst sitting on the seat turning the steering wheel, and turning the wheels left to right also in a reverse direction by hand. Bob Adam, Nottinghamshire

You have overhauled the steering box and replaced the king pins and shims. I assume you mean the king pin bushes. The stiff steering could be that the bushes have not been reamed out to provide adequate clearance between the bushes and the king pins, but could also be that you didn't replace the thrust bearings that locate at the base of each king pin.

The weight of the tractor sits on the thrust bearings, and they are often mistakenly overlooked during an overhaul. When greasing the king pins of a tractor axle, one should jack the tractor clear of the ground to allow the grease to flow

freely into the thrust bearings. If this isn't done, they tend to run dry and eventually seize up, giving the symptoms you are experiencing.

As you state, the tractor is easier to steer when jacked clear, so this should eliminate the steering box and other linkages between the box and the front axle. I suggest you jack it up and thoroughly grease the king pins and see if it improves. If not a pair of replacement thrust bearings may solve the problem.



Votex topping mower

l've owned a six-foot Votex topping mower for some years and it has given me good service. However, during the early part of the season, this year, it started throwing the drive belt off the pulleys with regularity.

Despite refitting the belt, it did this repeatedly, but during the height of the summer it wasn't needed,



as the grass wasn't growing due to the drought we were experiencing.

When the rain finally arrived, the grass grew like mad, and I have needed to use it again. I could kick myself, as I had time to look over the mower during the slack time, but didn't bother, so the problem persists.

I lifted the mower up to inspect it and found the pulley on the gearbox side is loose, wobbling around and this may be the cause of the problem. I did remove the shims that adjust the belt tension, but to no avail.

What do you think the cause of the loose pulley may be? Any advice would be most welcome.

The throwing of the belt could be caused by two reasons. Firstly, it could be worn bearings in the bevel gearbox, causing the shaft to wobble and throw the belt, or it could be where the pulley attaches to the gearbox shaft.

The former is likely to be accompanied by loss of gearbox oil, which would have contaminated the drive belt, and is the least likely. The pulley is attached to the gearbox shaft by means of a castle nut, which is concealed under the blade hub. To gain access to this you'll need to lift the mower enough to remove the blade, which requires a 38mm spanner, and is a left-hand thread.

With the blade removed you will see six cap-head screws that secure the blade hub in

place. They require a 6mm Allen key to slacken them and once out a smart tap from a soft hammer will shift the hub, revealing the castle nut. It may be that the nut has become loose due to inadequate tightening, despite a split pin being present. This can cause the nut to lose its thread and thus not do its job and allow the pulley to wobble.

There are two keys that locate the pulley on the shaft. It's a good idea to replace these, along with the nut and split pin, making sure the new nut is tightened well before replacing the hub. This should remedy the problem. Also, if the belt has thrown many times, it may also require replacing and tensioning.

YOUR REGULAR ROUND-UP OF WORLDWIDE AUCTION NEWS

TRACTOR MART

t has been hectic since the end of the summer when it comes to the sales scene.

More so than usual, in fact, with several farmers retiring and giving up tenancies in addition to other auctions that have been occurring.

All of the major auction companies have been kept very busy and prices have been above average in places, particularly for relatively modern machinery. Nearly all these sales have featured one or two older machines along the way, and Cheffins hit the jackpot at the Golder Manor Farm sale in Oxfordshire, on Tuesday 27 September, when a lovely, original 1992 JD 4755 sold for £40,000 +VAT.

Despite this, prices have certainly softened for the more common vintage lines by the looks of things, but we should have further indications of what the market is doing by the time our next issue is on sale.

On the subject of buying, it has come to our attention that some readers have been left disappointed following purchases at auction, particularly online-only auctions, and the *T&M* team felt that it was worth reiterating some of the points to remember when bidding.

Firstly, do your homework! If you know what you want to bid on, use the *Tractor Mart* Price Guide to make sure you know what it's worth and, if available, check the history of the tractor – either through the auctioneer or the vendor.

Next, inspect the tractor at the viewing day and if you can't attend, send a trusted friend or a professional to look at it for you, and provide you with an honest opinion. We advise you not to rely on photographs or video, as there is no substitute for seeing something in person.

Be realistic, as although a tractor may look good, it is a used machine and may have led a hard life. There is a great deal that you can't see and although starting it, and perhaps driving it, will give you an idea of what it's like, there's no substitute for working it in the field!



Remember to set yourself a budget. The winning bid may be considerably more than the guide price or estimate and so, no matter how badly you want the tractor, don't get carried away! There are likely to be additional charges on top of the price the hammer falls at, so be clear what the final bill is going to be.

Finally, following on from the last point, check the auctioneer's small print. There will be VAT to pay on the commission (a percentage of the hammer price) and in some cases on the lot, depending on if the sale is commercial or private. There can also be an additional fee for bidding online. Payment must be received within a certain period, and you will not be able to collect your lot until payment has been made in full.

These are just basic points, and each auctioneer will have its own rules, which can differ between auctions, so do your research on the specific auction, as well as the tractor, before you bid. That way, you should have no nasty surprises!

The price the tractor achieved was about right, considering it was restricted to the Australian market. The tractor cannot leave the country, owing to a protection order, and the tractor preservation market in Australia is not as popular as it is in other parts of the world. There are not quite as many tractor restorers in Australia either, compared to stationary engine, truck,

and car collectors, which restricts the situation even more.

The veteran 1927 Peterbro, no. 92/81599, built by Peter Brotherhood of Peterborough, was knocked down at £11,367 (\$20,000) in grade 2/4 condition. Caterpillar crawlers were in vogue, with some very good prices paid.



The 1904 Ivel, no.352, reached £181,859 and is still available to an Australian buyer.

Stunning prices!

Cheffins staged the Golder Manor Farm machinery dispersal sale, for P M Peake, on Tuesday 27 September. There was lots of stock to interest us, mostly in original, working condition.

A 2004 John Deere 6920S AutoQuad with 50kph transmission started it off at £44,200. Next in our line was a 1996 John Deere 6600 PowrQuad, with just 4,998 hours on the clock, that changed hands at £21,600. Keeping with John Deere, a 1992 4755 with just 5,107 hours looked very clean and reached a record UK price of £40,000.

As for a 1983 John Deere 4240S that had been on the farm from new, with dual wheels front and rear and said to have only completed approximately 3,000 hours, it reached a staggering £15,500. Another record was set for an original-style, 1969 John Deere 4020 with mechanical front-wheel drive in full working order, at £20,000.

A R Wilson Ltd.

On Friday 7 October, part one of the A R Wilson Agricultural Ltd. auction concluded, after the tragic and unexpected death of the much-loved Robert Wilson in January. He and his late father, Alan, had amassed one of the largest collections of Caterpillar, Allis-Chalmers, and International Harvester crawlers in Europe.

There will be four sales in total, with a spares sale provisionally before Christmas, another not long after and the finale will feature the major veteran gems, I believe, in May 2023.

There were 77 tractors in this part of the sale, with many very original, and what struck me was the state of the

tracks. A large amount of these machines were in excellent order and nearly half the crawlers had come from a Californian sale near Stockton, in the heart of Holt and Best country, which merged form to Caterpillar in 1925.

Also included were Robert's father's Nuffield Universal and 10/60 six-cylinder conversions. They were not pretty, but very practical and all complete. In working times these conversions were sold to many farmers in the area.

The highest price at the end of the sale was a clean Allis-Chalmers HD-14, no.6717202, with Garwood winch at the back, showing military paint in places. It was yours at £8,600 (grade 2/3). An original, working-style 1949 Caterpillar D6 9U3148SP with electric start conversion, plough light, and excellent tracks, changed hands at £6,600 in grade 3 condition.

As for the mighty 1957 Caterpillar D9D 18A1914, with donkey engine start, it was not in the best of health and the tracks certainly needed work. It sold for just £3,700.

There was a whole line of D6 and D7 machines of various types and the one to come out best was the 1960 17A16895

with 74in tracks and turbocharged engine. It had good tracks and sold for £4,600. The 1954 Caterpillar D2 5U/13776/14122 with 50in tracks, electric start and front blade sold for £3,700, in grade 3 original condition.

The two Caterpillars I loved best were the 1929 TWENTY orchard no.L1916, in 2/4 condition, selling for £3,600. It would be a relatively easy restoration. Next door was my gem from the sale – a 1929 THIRTY, no.S7993, which was another orchard version. It sold for £3,500 and both had come from California, from what I understand.

One of the best-looking crawlers at the sale was an IH TD-14 (TBK2294D) in restored ondition, with lovely tracks. It was yours for just £2,600.

The parts section did well, and there are many more similar lots to come.

Last George Schaaf sale?

George Schaaf had been a collector since the late 1980s, after making his money in double-glazing. Based at Frankfort just outside Chicago, Illinois, he had several very skilled people restoring his collection full time over the years. Every five years or so he would hold a charity auction and restock and rebuild for his next sale.

Mecum Auctions was called in to sell his collection of 70 machines, which were driven through one of the buildings on Saturday 1 October. He also had a fine collection of memorabilia, which sold very well on 30 September-1 October. George always had a good selection of vintage and classic trucks too, and the last few were sold off this time, as were the trailers and other parts that made this a great place to visit. One feels it has finally come to an end.

The highlight was the concours, 1917 Willmar Little Oak tractor in its Massey-Harris livery. It was the third lot driven through and sold for £366,298.

Other records were achieved when a 1915 International Harvester 15hp single

sold for a resounding £160,255, in grade 6 condition.

The stunning 1913, ex-Gary Parker, Hart-Parr 30-60 sold this time at £242,673. Another record was set when the 1924 Minneapolis 35-70 prairie tractor made £247,251.

Setting yet another record was the mighty 1920 Emerson-Brantingham Big 4-20 at £164,834 – another stunner. The Allis-Chalmers 10-18 three-wheeler, said to be unique, was yours for £231,553 – the most expensive Allis-Chalmers ever sold in grade 5 condition.

A 1915 Advance-Rumely 30-60E didn't make much more than it did in 2020. It saw the hammer fall at £118,047. Perhaps all the major collectors have a model E – the best prairie tractor of its time until the Aultman-Taylor 30-60 came along! This example sold for £100,732 and was a stunner.

A few Michigan orchard tractors were offered from Parrett and a Jebez Love 1935 Tructor was sold at £14,818. This section was finished off by a 1956 Friday at £11,467 in grade 6 condition.



Aultman-Taylor 15-30 is wonderful, and this was reflected in the £132,783 paid for it.

PRICE GUIDE

PART F-I

he prices are based on tractors sold at sales, on the Internet, privately and in some overseas markets too. Naturally, prices change as time progresses and it's not always an upward trend, but you will get a good indication of what's going on with the current market by referring to our guide. Here are a few pointers on buying a tractor to help you.

If you are looking for a tractor to buy for restoration, or work, there's a vast choice. However, if you are looking for something specific, do weigh up your options first, particularly if you have a limited budget.

If it's a popular model, then it's not always to your advantage to go for the first one you see. Whatever is wrong with the tractor, make sure you have a good idea of how much it will cost to repair, and so on.

Buying a restored tractor can be the best option for some people, but do your research properly and if you are buying at a sale, talk to the vendor if you can. For example, the tractor has a shiny coat of paint, but ask him what rust prevention primer he used underneath it, was the tractor sand-blasted or wire-wheeled down? If the vendor is worth his salt he will have pictures of the restoration and be able back up the information he gives you.

Find out what you can. Take a friend or associate with you who, perhaps, has a better idea of what is what and, if there's a preview to the sale, go and try the tractor out for yourself. Make sure beforehand exactly what you will have to pay after the hammer has dropped: does the lot have VAT? What's the buyer's commission? And so on.

Buying online at a sale can save you travelling, but you really don't know what you're getting. Yes, you can see the pictures of the tractor and the live action, but you aren't properly seeing it for yourself. If you cannot attend, get a trusted friend or associate, who might be at the sale, to look at the tractor for you, then bid online.

An associate got talked into buying a Continental tractor (made in Germany) via an Internet advertisement and was told it had a transmission problem. He asked about obtaining parts and was told they were easy to get.

Well that might be true in Germany, but my associate doesn't speak German. In addition, specific items are very expensive for these tractors. He also wants to use the tractor, particularly for road runs, but he has now discovered that it's not very fast on the road (18kph) – not a very happy outcome really.

Some people love the adventure of tracking down the spares and all that it entails – the challenges, the travel involved, the people you meet along the way – it all adds to life's experiences.

For the person in question, however, that wasn't the plan. Think hard about what you are intending to purchase.

If buying an imported tractor – especially from North America – make sure you see a rear view of the machine before purchase. On a number of occasions it has come to light that the tractor featured damaged mudguards through containerisation. If the vendor does not want to send a rear picture, then there could be a good reason. This especially applies to veteran tractors.

WHAT OUR CODING SYSTEM MEANS

We have laid out the guide in six bands and a more detailed explanation of these is set out below. However, please note that in our sale review pages we sometimes use a double number code, for example 2.4. This would mean, needs work (2) and is an older restoration (4).

Band 1

A tractor that normally isn't running, but can be restored.

Band 2

A tractor that is running and needs some work.

Band 3

The critical one, it's for original-type tractors – tractors that are essentially very straight and original, have good tinwork, have in most cases not been re-sprayed during their working lives, run well and normally have low hours. There can be exceptions to the rule, but original-type tractors in most cases command higher prices and in some cases it's more than a good restored tractor.

Band 4

This represents an older restored tractor that normally runs with a little recommissioning, but perhaps hasn't been looked at for a while.

Band 5

A restored tractor that does everything it should and looks good with average paintwork.

Band 6

The ultimate. These are concours tractors that have been gone right through and are finished to perfection, but not customised.

he season has finally come to an end and the main theme has been the glorious weather we have all enjoyed through most of it.

It was too hot to rally at times in July and the first weeks of August were the same. The Great Dorset Steam Fair was certainly dry, although somewhat overcast. Sadly, as we all now know, this show will not be taking place in 2023, due to rising costs. When you are staging the largest show of its kind, it's not difficult for this situation to happen and maybe a slight change in the show's direction will be needed, to help it survive.

Although the tractor displays are excellent, there is certainly a slackening of attendees staying in this area after the late morning parade. Please put the date in your diary and come along with a vehicle if you can. You will be made very welcome.

One show that understands the value of the exhibitor is the Blakesley Show Vintage Working Weekend, near Northampton. The organisers take on board the fact that without the exhibitors there would be no show and provide them with a free Saturday evening meal, which goes down very well indeed. I have to say I thought this was very much an up-and-coming event and it's well worth attending with your machinery in 2023.

I'd like to take this opportunity to apologise to Sam Chapman, co-organiser of the excellent Roadless anniversary celebration at the aforementioned event, and a Roadless Ploughmaster 6/4

owner. I incorrectly stated that his tractor was owned by another individual and I understand the frustration this must have caused.

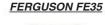
