#### Adding New **Business Niches**

omebuilders report great quarterly results, as the housing market recovers - good news for contractors of new home interiors and cabinetry.

The downturn drove firms into new areas of work, often remodeling, or any work to keep the lights on. Of 30,000 building industry businesses surveyed by Brookes Chase, most said they are still relying on remodeling and non-residential work for the biggest part of their business — even as revenue rose for 77 percent in the first half of 2012.

One custom residential cabinetry firm we visited a few weeks ago moved into remodeling, and cut 10 percent of the staff to get by. As business returned, they rehired only half of those they let go, relying on things like screen-to-machine production, and digital table saw fences guided by downloaded cutlists to pick up the slack.

An architectural millwork firm told us it moved into remodeling and medical markets, also doing more small projects. Business slowed so dramatically, only a skeleton crew was retained for two months, and they revised workflow to eliminate waste. With recovery, they restaffed, but at lower levels. Now their old CNC router is the weak link in the production chain, with a new one on the horizon.

#### Adding Woodworking Niches

The downturn transit to remodeling also brought a number of custom woodworkers and cabinetmakers into a new arena: garages and closets, for remodeling and now, for new construction.

Recognizing this transition, we're relaunching and redesigning Custom Woodworking Business. The November issue will be accompanied by a sister title, Closets. We're also remodeling our closets show: Cabinets & Closets Conference & Expo debuts Feb. 27-March 1 at the New Jersey Convention Center. (See page 20.)

## Saw Safety Law Stops



A California table saw safety law by assemblyman Das Williams passed the assembly but the senate adjourned before voting, putting it on hold. In a video Williams wore a tie as he showed SawStop flesh-sensing blade safety brakes.

"Gass [inventor of SawStop] told the Times that he was more concerned about preventing table saw-related accidents than in profiting from a table saw safety mandate. If he really meant that he wouldn't have patented everything he could. I am pleased to see this bill go no further. Maybe safety related features shouldn't be patentable. Governments aren't really interested in safety, only taxes. - Trevor, Canada

Not only is Das Williams not wearing safety glasses or goggles, he has the blade at full height which is breaking a main safety rule in that the blade should only be high enough through the material to make the cut - approximately 1/4". I am all for safety, but do not like the path that Mr. Gass has taken. It is not all about safety, it is about dollars. - Jeff, Illinois

When custom woodworker Jared Patchin delivered a project, he found he had brought enough pieces for another cabinet. Since the job was fully installed, Patchin asked, 'Who should pay?' He ate the \$280 cost.

This sort of thing doesn't happen to us much, but here is how we would handle it: First, it is important to note we do not have a published catalog we build up our prices for each and every piece on each and every job. We would acquiesce to the customer and smile gracefully, then we would assess (to ourselves) about how many orders this customer was likely to make over the next year. Next we would assess how much higher we could charge them without losing the next orders. Then we take all that information and add a small portion of the lost revenue to each of the following jobs for that customer until we had recovered the amount in full (or as much as we can- if this slight, temporary price increase is overdone, you do lose the customer and will never recover the money). We do the same thing with pricing errors our own salespeople make, too. In truth, all costs have to be recovered in some form eventually for a company to remain profitable and in business. - Carl, Washington

Be glad it was only \$280. It does not pay to argue. You may have bought yourself some good advertising by not making an issue. I would still use caution when dealing with that particular customer in the future. - Dave, Wisconsin

The two-day event will feature three comprehensive full-day conferences -Wood Finishing, Plant Productivity and **Business Development.** 



#### Hand-held CNC Router Tested

> CAMBRIDGE, MA - A hand-held CNC, this one a hand-hold model, was developed recently by MIT students. It consists of a positioning-correcting chassis that guides the router cutting head along a precise path.

Students (pictured from left) Ilan E. Moyer, Alec Rivers and Frédo Durand presented a paper on the device at Siggraph, a global technology conference in Los Angeles.



"You load the system up with a digital plan that you would like it to follow, and then you are only responsible for getting it to within a quarter-inch or so of that plan," Rivers says. "The device then adjusts the position of the cutting bit within the tool to keep it to the plan."



#### Grand Woodworking Start-up

> NEWBERG, OR — MarketCraft, a wood products firm specializing in retail signage and display has grown rapidly, reaching \$1.2 million in revenue with plans for a new 25,000-square-foot

Launched 18 months ago, MarketCraft has been running a lean operation, handling mid-volume store fixture runs for dozens of retails. President John Johnson told the Portland Business Journal his firm will double to 10 employees, and that he is looking for larger quarters.

Last year MarketCraft was featured in a Woodworking Network report on its Anderson Cojet inkjet imprinting system,



used for simulating woodgrain and other patterns on MDF and other board.

MarketCraft also operates a metal crafting shop for creating custom hardware and metal components; vinyl sign cutting and laser etching devices; a large-volume paint room drawn from an automotive industry design; and a complete woodworking shop.

## CNC Opens Doors to Museum Work

From stage and concert sets, Hamilton Scenic Specialty finds a new museum niche.

amilton Scenic Specialty got its start 12 years ago custom fabricating scenery and stage sets from wood and mixed materials. Its projects for Broadway and rock-androll road shows, and other segments of the entertainment industry, have high visibility.

To manage the intricacies of such work, Hamilton Scenic Specialty handles CAD detailing, planning, construction, finishing, installation, follow-up and long-term support for its projects, fabricating in aluminum, steel, solid woods, plywoods, laminates, plastics and veneers.

The majority of its work is creating theatrical stage scenery. Clients include Disney Theatrical for the set of its North American tour of Mary Poppins; the Blue Man Group in Orlando; and Holland America cruise ship entertainment sets.

Hamilton Scenic boasts of its pool of creative and flexible craftspeople who have a wide knowledge of design techniques, materials and equipment. The nature of projects means it also handles electrical services, such as set wiring and lighting, LED and fiber-optic installations.

#### A New Niche

All its skills have been readily transferable to a growing new segment: public art installations and museum theming throughout North America, all built and shipped from its Dundas operation.


Both museum installations and stage sets have become increasingly complex, with many more parts, and styles that emphasize unusual angles and shapes. Furniture for the sets is frequently custom designed and built to match a particular perspective, work well with stage lighting and colors, etc.

To produce these unique pieces efficiently, the decision was made in 2010 to add a CNC router.

Hamilton Scenic Specialty selected the AXYZ 4010 with an auto tool changer, specially engineered to achieve a quality look. Details on stage sets, seen from a distance,








Hamilton Scenic Specialty, which began crafting custom fabrications for stage and concert sets, found a new niche in a growing segment: public art and museum installations.

maybe more forgiving than museum installations, where audiences crowd closely to view exhibits. The 4010 can handle high volume production, repeatability in part production, and edge quality.

"It allows my crew to focus on quality and finishing touches as the machine works on tackling the quantity," says Mike Kukucska, Hamilton Scenic Specialty president. "We are shaving up to 50 percent off the fabrication time."

Now Hamilton uses its CNC to cut all kinds of materials, from plywood templates, to furniture pieces, signage, stage sets, even welding jigs.

"The machine has brought us work that we never would have had access to," says Kukucska. CWB

## Extra Capable RouterTable

Durable enough for jobsite or woodshop applications, two options for portable router tables.

uilt for "precision above all else" is how Festool describes its CMS System, a router table and accessories selection that fit its OF 1400 and OF 1010 routers. But watching it in use and checking out its compatible add-ons, it's more like a Swiss Army Knife of router tables. It also eliminates cobbling together a work area at an installation jobsite, providing a consistent, stable alternative. Resolving this headache was certainly behind the thinking in creating the CMS.

The portable CMS GE folds down for carry-in, legs snap out and secure in place with big-handled turnbuckles.

Festool says the standalone CMS-GE is rugged and durable enough to perform on a jobsite, and sturdy enough to perform dutifully as any stationary workshop equipment. The fact that you can use the identical setup in the shop or at an install means you don't have to rethink your router work practices for differing locations. You can carry on as you are used to right in your customer's kitchen.

Working onsite with it at a client's location, it's nice to have meaningful dust control. Among CMS features is a port to attach dust control hoses for capturing and containing chips and debris at the point of cut. If your vacuum system is good enough it means you won't be relegated to the client's driveway while routing.

Another version of the Festool's router table system is the CMS-VL, which attaches to the Festool MFT/3 Multifunction Table, turning it into a large, stable work surface integrated to the portable routers.

Available for either is the CMS sliding table, which glides forward and backward for precision movement. A compatible miter gauge offers control for repetitive applications, especially for end-grain routing. Its fences feature independent precision microadjustments. For the CMS-GE, an extension table is available as well. CWB











## Restored Millwork Has Lasting

A window rebuilt used current technology, classic millwork, and specialized lumber to last for decades.

astings Read is the first to admit that Oakleigh Custom Woodworks of Mobile, AL, the three-person shop he runs with wife Anne, had no business bidding the 14-window replacement project for the Dauphin Way United Methodist Church in Mobile.

Not only is the shop small, it was less than two years old at the time.

But the fact that Oakleigh not only won

the project from more established operations and also pulled off a stellar job is a testament to the dedication, skill and savvy of the shop and the materials it uses for its custom commercial and residential wood projects.

The Reads' path to becoming go-to woodworkers in Mobile isn't a typical one. The British couple had careers in finance, both in England and in the States. After retiring to Alabama, the Reads converted

Hastings' woodworking hobby into a business at the height of the recession in 2010, a decision that turned out to be less risky than one might think.

Most of Oakleigh's work centers around Mobile's famous Dauphin Street, a historic area whose old homes, businesses, restaurants and art galleries are in continuous need of authentic wood detailing. Among the Oakleigh projects were replacement windows for the Mobile Bay Lighthouse,

retail shop windows, and gates, fencing, railings, windows and doors for nearby homes.

But much of their success stems not only from custom capabilities, but also from the couple's attention to detail and old-fashioned professionalism. These skills became part of the sales strategy that helped them win the Methodist church project.

Knowing that the building's 50-year-old existing windows had rotted out, "Our approach was to look at the total lifetime cost of the new windows, rather than the first cost of acquisition," says Hastings. "The choice of materials could have a huge downstream effect on subsequent cost. We wanted to avoid a bidding war with the absolute lowest cost prevailing regardless of other benefits. A financial analysis demonstrated the significant benefit of looking beyond first cost, i.e., the initial cost of the windows."

Oakleigh's bid included insulated or low-E glass — targeting a 30 percent reduction in the building's five-figure annual energy cost - as well as an elastomeric glazing, and extremely high quality Fine Paints of Europe.

Oakleigh also specified Accsys Technologies' Accoya wood, an acetylated (or modified) radiata pine that resists swelling and rot common in Mobile's wet, humid climate. (Accoya wood reduces swelling and shrinkage by 75 percent or more, according to Accsys Technologies, which mills it.) This means coatings also last three to four times longer, therefore reducing annual maintenance costs.

#### Authentic Technique

The project's contractor was swayed by Oakleigh's plan for custom cross-lap joints, in which continuous vertical and horizontal muntins (rather than single pieces) are notched at each intersection to create a lattice for stronger joints.

"It shows how to compete for business on something other than price," Hastings says. "This is a case study in how to get the customer away from the price and focusing on the overall benefits."

With 14 windows measuring 54 inches wide by 21 feet high, the church was Oakleigh's most ambitious project to date. Replicating the historic windows they replaced, each new unit includes 56 double panes of glass, each with 1/16-inch clearance. Before starting in production, the team built a prototype window at full

width and partial height to determine a precise construction method.

The windows' 27 individual and interchangeable parts were made in advance then assembled at one time; each length was made into three subcomponents, then fingerjointed into the final window.

To create the arched panes, Hastings made blanks from four pieces of Accoya wood then cut the arches on Laguna CNC machine. All construction, including glazing and painting, was completed in house.

Oakleigh's CNC machines, including a Laguna CNC, were central to the project. Hastings says the treated pine performed similarly to other wood products. The automated machines allow his shop to provide the speed and accuracy of a larger plant, within the walls of a low-overhead small operation. The Reads' precise techniques, including laying out every cut by hand, also helped maximize the use of the raw wood pieces to bring down upfront material costs.

While the project may have seemed overly ambitious for such a small business, "In part, we wanted to prove we could do it," says Hastings. And that he did.


#### **Details on the Window Process**

A slide show online details step-by-step the recreation of the windows by Oakleigh Custom Woodworks. Among the highlights:

- The outer arch of each window was made up of four straight pieces fingerjointed and glued with epoxy. Special clamps were used to pull the joints tightly together while the glue set up.
- Arch blanks were cut, then placed on the CNC machine. A plywood spoilboard (in the rough shape of the arch) was held down with 5 vacuum pods and the arch blank was held to the spoilboard with double-sided tape.
- The CNC machine cut the half joints where the horizontal joins the vertical using a halving joint. After this process the board was ripped into individual muntins.
- Vertical muntins notched two-up, are held down side-by-side on custom vacuum pods. After the top cut, the muntins were turned over to cut the other V notch. The muntins underwent three separate operations on the CNC so accurate placement of the material was critical to making the joints.
- The final glazed window weighed some 700 pounds, and was moved by a shop made cart. "We slid dowels under the window and pivoted on the edge of the assembly table sliding over the dowels," explains Hastings. "An air-assist forklift was essential."



## What's New at IWF? A Busy Show

Our woodworker correspondents offer International Woodworking Fair snapshots, with a page of links to extensive show floor coverage.

fter four tough years, woodshop owners and craftsmen of every stripe filled the aisles of the International Woodworking Fair. The biannual Atlanta show suffered in 2010 along with the woodworking industry. Both attendance and exhibitor count were lower.

This year equipment, software and supplies manufacturers returned for a successful show. Preliminary attendance was 23,000.

For custom woodworkers, fundamentals were key. Practical offerings — software to rent instead of buy; basic floor machinery (particularly saws) — trumped whiz bang technology in capturing woodshop pros.

Attendees came for education — the Cabinet Makers Association reported more

than 400 registrations for its workshops — as well as peer fellowship. Our bloggers and correspondents reported from the show floor:

Bernie Bottens, owner, Kapellmeister Enterprises, Vancouver, WA: MD Dario exhibited an articulated bandsaw. The articulated arm allows the saw to come to the wood and make difficult, intricate cuts while the work piece holds still.

All of you folks who are cutting really bulky pieces on a band saw understand the difficulties of feeding something really heavy or bulky through the saw while trying to conduct an intricate cut. Here's a way to do that while the work piece holds still and the saw moves. The articulated arm, with its ball bearing joints keeps the saw perfectly plumb in all axes. There is also a guide on the saw that lets you follow patterns clamped to the workpiece.

The saw has a multiple workstation where the saw arm pivots around a central point to service four separate pieces, at four work stations.


#### Jared Patchin, J Alexander Fine Woodworking, Boise, ID:

booth, which has some pretty impressive equipment spread throughout its Hammer, Felder, and Format lines.

I would love to buy one of their planers and jointers with the "Silent Power" spiral cutterhead! I also saw, for the first time, a crosscut fence with a digital readout for the cut length and angle, complete with an automatic cut length adjustment depending on the angle of the cut. Consider me impressed!

Edgebanding discoveries highlighted the next part of my day. I got an in-depth demonstration of the new Brandt Ambition 1110 edgebander. Over the past three months I have been looking for quality used edgebanders. Used equipment has been perfect for my company. But after surveying the used market, and educating myself on edgebanders, I decided that I was willing to pony up the money and buy new.

Brandt's Ambition line of edgebanders is geared towards the small cabinet shop. The machine comes standard with top and bottom trim, front and end trim, and buffing, and can also include, at time of purchase, a pre-mill unit.

The pre-mill will actually removes anywhere from 0.5 to 3mm from the face of the piece, thereby ensuring the edgeband is being applied to the most perfect face of particleboard possible.

After spending my money on the Brandt edgebander, my mission was now strictly one of information gathering and education. In Hall A, which is lumber, veneer, edgebanding and supplies, here in no particular order are some of my IWF highlights:

A tour of the Blum booth changed my outlook on what is possible with hinges and slides and drawer boxes, which sounds quite nerdy, unless you make your living using that hardware. I was impressed by the BluMotion soft-close undermount slides complete with a servo-driven push-to-open mechanism; and the soft close hinges including an on/off switch on each hinge. I am also seriously looking into Blum's TandemBox, a double-walled metal drawer box with integrated BluMotion slides. I know that Grass and Salice have many of the same offerings, but the Blum demonstration was eye-opening.

#### **Woodworker as Electrician**

I will be educating myself on the Loox systems offered by Häfele, and Rev-A-Shelf's recently acquired lights source, Tresco, so I can start selling and integrating these lighting systems into our

cabinetry and furniture.

LED lighting for cabinetry has now become as easy as 1-2-3. First, plug the driver into an outlet that is hidden, like in the microwave cabinet or on top of the cabinetry. Next, plug in all the different lights that will be run off the driver (up to six ports). Lastly, plug in any of the switches, which include motion detectors, dimmers, and sensors, and you're done. The only thing you would need a professional electrician for is to hard wire the 120V outlets for the drivers

On the next leg of my IWF tour, I discovered rolls of solid wood edgebanding in 2 or 3 mil thicknesses. I will be using this stuff every time I edgeband plywood panels. (It can be layered for a super thick edgeband.)

The most serendipitous discovery was TreeFrog Veneer and its Chemetal line of metallic veneers. These sheets of metal veneer will now allow me to bid on a project in metal that I had at first refused.


Another interesting little tool I found is the ThingaMeJig: pretty much a scribing tool on steroids. The next item that caught my eye was the Systainer booth. You may have seen a Systainer container and not known it. All of the Festool tools are packaged in systainers. The design and engineering that has gone into this modular, incredibly flexible, and endlessly customizable container system is brilliant, but not cheap.

The first product that seriously made me consider opening my wallet to take advantage of a show special was the Senco Fusion F-18 cordless nail gun, especially for two features: it can shoot 18-gauge finish nails, and Senco has a gas cartridge that never needs to be replaced. A charged battery is all that the gun needs to work. The thought of not having to lug a compressor and air hose into a client's home made it very tempting.

I have always had a fondness for well engineered layout tools - squares, straightedges, levels, and the like. So no surprise the Maya Posi-Stop booth caught my eye. We have an older CTD saw we use for cutting rough lumber to smaller lengths. I want to upgrade the fence system so we can cut all our face frame and door material to final lengths on this saw, rather than cart everything to the one chop saw in the shop with an accurate fence system. A 12 fence and a Model 1 stop should do the trick. **CWB**

## Challengers 2012

Seven winners for the 2012 IWF Challengers Awards were announced Aug. 22 during IWF, drawn from 80 entrants.

Martin T75 Sliding Table Saw: The T75 tilting blade can be tilted to both sides, while still retaining the capability to reach a cutting height of 8 inches. Changing the blade size lets it score and do other functions in cutting solid wood or panels.

Frontino, Häfele America: Frontino sliding door hardware lets doors open in close spaces, where there's no room to swing open. Sliding doors sit flush, sharing the same track, but riding over each other. Frontino can be used on upper or base cabinetry or in furniture. "We've gotten a phenomenal response to it," says Häfele's Mae Holler, product marketing manager.





## Pacific Maple Big Leaf and Soft

acific Coast maple — Acer macrophyllum — goes by a variety of terms, among them big leaf maple and Oregon maple, but by any name the domestic hardwood is known as the soft maple of the Western United States and Canada. This "big leaf" maple is a wood of importance in the Pacific Northwest, second to red alder among native hardwood

The species has a wide range of uses, including as a substitute for cherry. Pacific Coast maple is used for many of the classic applications for hardwoods, such as cabinets, furniture, mouldings and flooring. It is also used for countertops, paint brush handles, picture frames, gift boxes and coat hangers. The highly figured maple is used for the manufacture of electric guitar bodies and other musical instruments.

species in abundance and commercial importance.

#### **Commercial Appeal**

The wood is one of the few commercial hardwood species on the Pacific Coast and the only commercial maple of note on the West Coast. Small compared to its conifer associates, most mature big leaf maples are 50 to 60 feet tall, although large trees can reach heights of 100 feet with diameters of 36 to 48 in. The name big leaf maple comes from the fact that its leaves are typically 12 inches across, although some can have widths of 24 inches. Big leaf maple is an excellent shade tree.

While the East Coast maples are the more predominantly used wood for maple syrup, the sap from Pacific Coast maples also can be made into syrup. Considered to be moderately long-lived, some of the Pacific Coast maples live to 300 years of age.

Most of the estimated volume of standing saw timber in the United States is found in Washington and Oregon, while in Canada, big leaf/Pacific Coast maple is predominant in British Columbia. The name "Pacific Coast" also comes from the fact that the trees often grow near the ocean and rarely more than 186 miles inland.

# Veneer Resources Return to Show

Veneer companies appear at IWF 2012.

eneer sources found at the International Woodworking Fair included more than two dozen companies, though most products target industrial, not custom, wood production.

Veneer has been facing challenges for years from decorative laminates, which have upped the ante with more photorealistic reproduction, and, more recently, textured surfaces to mimic tactile qualities of veneer.

Veneer is also a victim of design trends, bumped in the design phase if clients turn to painted surfaces, or plastic and metal laminates.

At IWF, M. Bohlke Veneer put a tree on display, symbolizing its commitment to FSC

certified sourcing and its extensive line of veneers. Bohlke notes that it has been prepared for the recent rise in popularity, offering bamboo veneer (including FSC certified) in caramel (darker) and natural (lighter), and in flat cut with a wide grain 3/4-inch pattern and quarter cut in a narrower grain of 1/4-inch.





# Fine Wood as Fine Art

Rail Yard Studios reclaims 19th century hardwood railroad ties as functional fine art.

housands of seasoned crossties of oak, hickory, walnut, cherry and other hardwoods are discarded each year, rejected as seconds during the late 19th and early 20th centuries — too warped or cracked to provide solid footing for railroad cars - or pulled out during railroad track maintenance after a century of service. They were burned or left to rot.

Any lover of fine lumber can identify with Robert Hendrick's pain at such wanton destruction. Hendrick's response: salvage the fine wood for practical use in custom furnishings that cross the line between art and craft.

Hendrick, who owns a rail line maintenance company, established Rail Yard Studios with a mission to save railroad materials with a documentable history. He creates furniture-as-art for homes and offices — desks, coffee/end tables, chairs, beds, wine/coat racks, etc.

### Art on the Floor

The railroad ties and rails date back as far as 1898. Each furniture-as-art piece is individually numbered with a scavenged railroad date nail. (Railroad crossties used to be marked with a date nail to indicate the year of production.) The Rail Yard Studios' work is seen in galleries and art competitions in Atlanta, Nashville, Chattanooga and Chicago.

"We get many questions about our timbers - their source and their safety," Hendrick explains. "We do not use creosoted ties. We use only new ties that have not yet been treated in any way."

The timbers were "culled" as seconds, marked and destined for the furnace before being intercepted by Hendrick.

"We stain some ties to give them color, and we seal all of the ties with finishes," he says. The bed shown here has walnut posts

combined with hickory for the portion running along the head of the bed. It is finished with a golden oak stain and spar urethane - both low-VOC.

"Using exterior urethane helps to smooth down some of the roughness inherent in the timbers from their being air dried, and allows us to maintain that rough characteristic," Hendrick says.

The wine rack featured on the table of contents in this issue is hickory finished in golden oak stain with spar urethane. The rack featured on the cover is a white oak timber finished with a provincial stain and spar urethane.

These ties were singled out because of excessive knots, splits, warps or other imperfections. While those features make the ties less than ideal for running 180,000 pound rail cars over, "they also add great character to our pieces," Hendrick says. "The imperfections are beautiful; they're what make the woods interesting."

Hendrick holds a masters degree in Industrial Design from The Ohio State University. After school he pursued technology and industrial entrepreneurial opportunities, never expecting to return to design, especially after acquiring a railroad contracting firm in 2001. After picking up the love of wood from his father Jim, the two launched Rail Yard Studios in 2010.

"With a demand for authenticity, we insist that only railroad materials be integrated into a design," Hendrick says. His products are branded Made in the USA, "crafted in large part by the same hands that work the railroad on a daily basis," he says. CWB
