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
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

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

## windows, doors and conservatories... who guarantees the guarantees?



John Ogilvie, MD of Network VEKA.

We've all heard of dodgy double-glazing firms ducking their guarantee obligations by folding the company then starting up again. An Insurance-Backed Guarantee – one that remains valid if the company goes bust – should solve that problem... but they are not all as watertight as they seem.

John Ogilvie, head of the industry standards and guarantees organisation, Network VEKA, suggests a few tricky questions to help you spot the reliable ones:

- Am I still covered if the installer doesn't actually go bust but simply chooses to cease to trade? An important one; many traders do this and you could be left without cover.
- Does it cover any deposit or staged payment that I may be asked for before the work is completed?
- Is the insurer/administrator based in the British Isles? Or in some faraway land that's had three revolutions since lunchtime!
- Are any repair costs covered to the full value of the installation?
- Can the guarantee be transferred to the

new owners if we sell the house? There may be a reasonable administration fee but it's an important sell-point for your home.

 Will it cost me anything to get the guarantee?

Windows, doors and conservatories – especially the increasingly popular orangeries – represent a significant investment in your project, both in new-build and retrofit, so the right choice of supplier/installer is vital, especially in an industry that not only has such a chequered reputation but so often deserves it.

Legislation has done much to force the industry to clean up its act but with such different levels of cover from various Insurance Backed Guarantees, the offer of such a guarantee is not on its own as reassuring as it might seem.

Many companies may only offer one kind of IBG so you might find it a deciding factor in choosing the company to carry out the work. In general, a reliable company will offer a good IBG.

It is also very well worth asking what trade bodies the companies belong to, but don't just count the logos on the back of the van. Many homeowners have found out to their cost that many offer no protection at all whereas a few, and I ask to include our own here, offer extensive reassurance on many factors.

### septic date looming

David Morgan, a partner at Higgs & Sons, says that property owners with a septic tank need to be aware that the regulations on domestic septic tanks changed in 2010, with owners of existing systems having until January 1, 2012 to register them with the Environment Agency. New systems will also be subject to registration and must be constructed and installed in accordance with current British Standards.

David explains: "If you already have a 'Consent to Discharge' then you do not need to register and the Environment Agency will automatically register the septic tank with exempt status. If it does not qualify for exempt status then the consent will convert into an Environmental Permit. The exempt status or permit could be lost if the conditions of registration are not kept.

The conditions principally deal with proper maintenance of the system."

The new rules are of particular importance if you are selling or buying a property with a septic tank. David said: "The new regime means that when you sell the property it is not necessary to notify the Environment Agency of the change of ownership provided the septic tank is operated and maintained properly. However, you must give written details to the new owner about the discharge and the conditions that must be met. Also, you must give the new owner any maintenance records."

Application for registration is relatively straightforward. It is best to do it online at www.environment-agency.gov.uk as online applications are processed more quickly.

## new ttf guide tackles "copy cat" timber verification schemes

The Timber Trade Federation (TTF) has produced a guide to what makes a credible timber verification scheme.

With a number of forestry bodies and programmes now operating worldwide, the Guide to Legality Verification offers TTF members a better understanding of scheme requirements and different compliance levels – from those that cover basic legal regulations to full certification. The guide also explains how these various "stepping stones towards certification" relate to the EU Timber Regulation, and the different elements they may assess.

Rachel Butler, Head of Sustainability for the TTF, said: "False, misleading or 'copy cat' claims about legality can damage the timber trade's credibility. With no system currently controlling the different programmes on the market, the TTF supports the establishment of a framework for legality verification.

"In the meantime, we recommend using organisations accredited for forest management certification by the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) and Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification (PEFC)." ## the principles and practicalities of sustainable building

Specifying and building new houses has never been more regulated and is expected to become even more stringent as energy efficient new builds come under the spotlight. Building a sustainable home isn't just about choosing the right materials and technologies to reduce the home's environmental impact. It's also about minimising the home's physical footprint, considering its location and how the occupiers' needs will change over time.

"A truly sustainable home will not just have low carbon emissions, but will also be constructed using products that in themselves are sustainable or are low in carbon. Many of these products are natural and so use little carbon in their

manufacturing processes, but there are also many construction products that have a smaller carbon footprint than more traditional products.

"As well as Building Regulations<sup>1</sup>, builders of new homes need to be aware of the requirements of the Code for Sustainable Homes<sup>2</sup>, of which all aspects of construction can be assessed. It is important to know what you can do to gain points to achieve the code rankings. Around half of the additional points available under the Code for Sustainable Homes are awarded for good design, not product specification. Provisions for disability, accessible private spaces and recycling areas will score well, and the inclusion of adequate waste storage in the design is a minimum requirement.

"The Code for Sustainable Homes, Secured by Design<sup>3</sup> and the Lifetime Homes Standard<sup>4</sup> are all recommended reading before you take on a self-build."

## birdwatcher's paradise



When the local council wouldn't allow Jonathan and Imelda Fisher to extend their period property any further, they decided to embark on their first self build project instead

When a quarter acre small holding at the end of their road came on the market the Fishers jumped at the opportunity to build their own house on it. "We have lived in this rural area of Surrey for the past 16 years and love it because it is very peaceful with wonderful views of the countryside and the neighbours are all very nice," says Imelda. "However, although we had extended our previous house once, we weren't allowed to do it a second time and so wanted to embark on another project in the same area".

The couple did think about converting the existing property on the small holding that came up for sale, but on closer inspection they realised it was too dilapidated

had very bad subsidence," recalls Jonathan, a retired pilot. "Plus the whole plot was very overgrown, so we decided the best thing to do was demolish it and start again."

Jonathan, who is very practical, was always keen on self building and had built the extension in their previous house himself. "Luckily, I wasn't daunted by the prospect," admits Jonathan. "However, I was very worried about having to bid for the property at auction against five other bidders!"

Imelda takes up the story, "It was very nerve-wracking indeed and as we got close to the end of the bidding, the auctioneer started to go up in fives and Jonathan put his hand up. 'That's five hundred is it Sir?' the auctioneer asked. 'No,' "The walls were cracked and it said Jonathan, 'five thousand' -

and the auctioneer smiled and said, 'I like your style sir!' And this did the trick as the other bidders, seeing how determined we were, suddenly dropped out. In fact we would have been happy to go up, even another five thousand."

With the land purchased, the Fishers found local architect Mark Cuthbert via a friend and he came up with five possible house plans for the plot.

"We quickly homed in on one we particularly liked and gradually refined it from there," recalls Jonathan. "We decided to go for a Western red cedar clad building as we thought it suited the plot, which still had a large Redwood tree planted on the land by the previous owner who had been a friend of ours. We also went to visit a similar cedar clad structure, a cricket club in Esher, to check that we liked the look, and fortunately we did."

The couple also wanted the house to be as ecological as possible so planned to have it south facing, so that it would pick up and be heated by the solar rays, and use concrete blocks which would absorb heat during the day and then give it off at night time. Architect Mark Cuthbert says, "The house was built in such a way as to pick up the sun between October and March and not to have sun from between March and October. For instance, we incorporated a balcony in the overall design at the back of the house so that in summer it would provide shade and wouldn't become too hot inside. It also uses a stack effect i.e. drawing hot air from the living room and kitchen which rises and can be drawn out of the high level windows in the atrium using natural ventilation."

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With the house design decided on, the Fishers put in planning application to the local council, but were dismayed to have to alter the plans. "They asked us to drop the roof ridge in the middle, to give the property more architectural interest," says Jonathan, "and which gave it a look rather similar to a Huf house. We were also very restricted by the council, in the size of house we could build, as it could only be 5 per cent bigger than the previous house but with the same floor area. In the end we opted for a 3 bed house with a large master bedroom and en suite rather than four small bedrooms, plus an open plan downstairs with a large central atrium area. We were happy to make the changes that the planning department suggested but were frustrated that the whole process took nearly two

years before the plans were passed!"

In 2007 the Fishers started the build using a local builder and a team that included two Slovakians, who the couple says were so excellent that they have since become personal friends with them. The builders worked on the main house whilst Jonathan, who was now retired, carried out the groundworks and built the double garage.

"Our first job was to demolish the house which was so rickety it only took a day to reduce it all to rubble," remembers Jonathan. "Once the rubble was cleared, piling up to 14 meters deep was inserted. The original foundations only went down 1 foot. We also had to clear the area of plants and tree roots as the previous property had become so overgrown you could hardly see it."

Next came the ring beams and two runs of brick and concrete block. "We used Celotex for the wall insulation, special foam which is 2 inches thick and very effective," explains Jonathan. For the roof they used Spanish slate with 5 inches of Celotex insulation, 4 inches between the joists and 1 inch under the joists, before fixing the plasterboard.

Other materials included steel girders, roof timbers and windows from Velfac which they liked because they looked nice and were well made using solid wood inside with aluminium outer sashes.

We used Celotex for the wall insulation, special foam which is 2 inches thick and very effective

Whilst the build went on Jonathan and Imelda rented a nearby cottage. It took 30 weeks for them to build the structure and they got as far as first fix electrics and plumbing, and were halfway through the cladding, when the builder went bust. "We were a bit upset as you might imagine," says Jonathan. "But in fact we decided to just continue to employ the building team and pay them on a freelance basis. They were excellent and we weren't left too much out of pocket by the demise of the builder. Our only major problem was that the builder hadn't ordered enough cladding, so we were held up a bit while we ordered some more to be specially cut. Otherwise, the build went smoothly apart from having to change the bottom tred on the open staircase, as the plans of the staircase initially didn't comply with building regulations."

For the interior the couple decided to keep everything fairly neutral. "We wanted the house to be as light as possible," explains Imelda. "So we went for 'soft linen' by Crown for walls and 'super cover white' by Albany for ceilings. We also had a simple white 'Glendevon' kitchen from Howdens installed and chose bathroom suites from the Jasper Morrison range from Ideal Standard. Our biggest extravagance was a mirrored American sized fridge from Whirlpool, which we bought to reflect the light in the kitchen."

For flooring, they chose engineered oak from Reeve Flooring because they were having Wirsbo underfloor heating, so couldn't use solid oak.

"Our main source of heating is a gas condensing boiler in the utility room and a wood burning 'Stovax' stove in the sitting room, for secondary heating, which has turned out to be very cost effective. For our first winter here the bill for the quarter only came to £160," says Jonathan.

The couple's favourite room is the open plan kitchen area where they have lovely views of the surrounding countryside and they can also keep an eye on the many birds that feed in their garden – but then there is a lovely view from almost every room in the house, so the Fishers can really take their pick. "We are very happy with the project and wouldn't change anything," says Jonathan.

With the project finished the Fishers held a big barbecue to celebrate and invited everyone involved in the project. "It really was a lovely day," recalls Imelda, "and many of the people involved are still our good friends. What more could you ask for?"

What was the high point of the project?

Moving in just before Christmas and finding the whole house perfectly lovely and warm.

The low point was: Having to wait one and a half years for the planning permission to go through.

## futuristic low energy house

### stage three – second storey

Jo Saady, BA Founding and Creative Director of Ecotecture Ltd., gives us an update on the crescent shaped house, which is gradually taking shape.

Despite terrible periods of slashing rain interspersed with sunny days, the form of this building has continued quickly in comparison with traditional brick and block construction due to

the nature of the form work. However, this type of build has lots of foibles. One in particular is that the polystyrene walls have a strong framework around them whilst they are filled with concrete; this ensures the stability, which creates essential support whilst the heavy liquid is being poured into the walls, until the cement has cured. The walls and floors have had to been poured in separate lifts allowing the concrete time to dry out and stabilise around the reinforcement in the walls, before more weight is added. The pouring is a risky business if not carried out correctly. This adds to the complicated nature of the build.

This type of construction also means all the soil drainage and pipe work has had to be laid in place before pouring, in contrast to traditional building techniques where the floors, walls and the roof structure are erected and services fitted last. Here where service voids are required they are shuttered in advance. One such service void will be used as a laundry shute off the bedroom corridors leading down to the laundry room. The clients are pretty certain the kids will make excellent use of this duct! At the present time the building is peppered with the various positions of shower trays, and pipe work sitting on the concrete floor.

Difficulties with straight steel beams supporting curved walls have been overcome by ensuring the reinforced concrete core for the wall sits centrally on the beam, installation of which has caused a few sleepless nights on the contractors

regular site meetings have been held as progress continues

part. The service void below ceilings is also formed in steel rather than wood, using a suspended steel system shot fired to the underside of the main steel structure.

#### M&E: a continuing strategy

Talks continue on the best form of heating. Because the house is so well sealed and

insulated, with MVHR, the clients are now considering a LPG boiler as their reliance on the energy use will be low, and the capital layout will be minimal compared to that of a heat pump.

The renewable heat incentive (RHI), set to come in June, is purported by many as a means to actually encourage energy use. Calculations on this job at the moment have shown that energy use for a gas boiler will be less than for an electric heat pump.

Electrics have now been agreed and first fix is underway. The electrician will be using conduit for the wiring, as the electric wires cannot sit directly in the polystyrene form work for safety reasons. A state of the art audio equipment system is being supplied by Lime Green. Speakers will sit in the ceiling service voids along with the MVHR and other services.

Measurements are currently being taken in preparation for the bespoke high specification kitchen by Bulthaup, originally from Germany. These kitchen living spaces are designed to sit quietly and respectfully in their architectural surroundings. Bulthaup do not fill the space up with chipboard and ornament, they leave the space to celebrate the proportions of the building and create a sense of openness and well-being. The proposed kitchen island, though only 2.1 m wide, will provide 9 m of storage, which shows technical perfection in design.


With Spring just around the corner this build will pick up momentum. We at Selfbuilder & Homemaker can't wait for the next installment.



Part of the move was about improving quality of life for lain, his wife and his two children; moving from a terrace house with no garden and a view onto the nearby road to a larger home with a garden, in a better area with more to offer the children.

However, the move wasn't all plain sailing. lain admits it was hard for his partner to leave her home town and, at 11 and 16 years old at the time of the move, the children had to get used to new schools, a new area and living in a caravan with their parents.

"It wasn't too bad at first, we treated it like a holiday. The caravan was liveable, with running water, but we were really lucky that my parents lived next door so we could use their kitchen for cooking."

Despite admitting that he didn't have a clue about how to build a home, it didn't stop lain from going for ambitious plans including a sloping plot, splitting the home across four storeys and a raised conservatory with a balcony.

In a bid to combat his inexperience lain threw himself into reading anything and everything about project management and self building. In particular he recommends The Housebuilder's Bible and joining forums for self builders, who provide invaluable information for novices.

lain admits that he was lucky to have a friend

in the business who helped him to start out and gave him the confidence to get quotes from lots of different building suppliers, ask for discounts and ensure he got on good terms with his building control officer.

The project didn't all go to plan and lain never imagined that he'd have to get the police involved when things went wrong with a contractor. "We had problems with the plumbers from day one; the work was not up to a great standard and the NHBC man said that he had seen better.

"As it went on the work was terrible; all the radiator pipes were set at different distances from each other, meaning no radiators were going to be the same size, the pipework was bad and basins were left hanging off the wall.

"In the end we decided to sack them, which was promptly followed by an invoice for the £3,500 that we were holding back until the work was done. We called another plumber out to complete the work. He discovered a gas leak and so we had to pull all the pipes out and redo the work."

By the time all the work was done lain had paid out more than the £3,500 owed, but telling the original plumber that he wasn't paying any more did not go down well. He received threatening calls and then texts counting down until a day when "something bad would happen".

It got down to day two before lain told his





partner about the threats. "She made me call the police and report the plumber for harassment. She also made me fasten the letterbox as she was worried that he would pour petrol through it and set it alight."

This is something that lain admits he learnt along the way. The initial lump sum of money for the build came from selling their previous two-bedroom property, which released £79,000, and some £12,000 of savings.

lain urges newcomers to claim back the VAT on the project as he got £13,000 back that gave him enough to do the garage and drive

Luckily the call to the police warned the plumber off, but lain says that he will be more wary next time when choosing contractors.

The problems didn't end there, lain had left the basement of the house until last, but when it came to the time of fitting the floating floor he discovered four inches of water. What seemed like an initially small problem became a lengthy process.

Three months after the leak was discovered the basement was dug out, a leaking drainage pipe was blocked and the plaster was left to dry. lain admits that he was lucky that it was not an area of the house that held up other work, otherwise the schedule would have been severely disrupted.

Costs is the key area for any first time self builder and anyone who has read the property magazines and watched Property Ladder knows the importance of setting a budget, allowing for a contingency and accounting for everything.

An additional mortgage gave £102,000 but after that it was a little more ad-hoc.


"All of our salaries went into the project and then we became very good at juggling 0% credit cards and moving the balance before our interest free period ran out," lain admits, adding that a loan from his parents also helped in one tight spot. His top tip for planning budgets is to think of a number and then triple it, as there are many things that can't be accounted for.

He also urges newcomers to claim back the VAT on the project, as he got £13,000 back that gave him enough to do the garage and drive, which had been left until more cash was available.

"Get the VAT reclaim forms off the internet as soon as you get planning, then use the details to make a suitable spreadsheet up. If you keep on top of invoices every week or month, number them and add the details to the spreadsheet, it will make the VAT reclaim at the end much easier." He adds that the reclaim took him about

an hour to fill in and he had the rebate back within a fortnight.

When it comes to money, lain says that self builders should have their priorities clear, adding that the cash needed for painting, decorating and buying furniture can wait until you can afford it. Paying out for good quality fixtures and fittings has paid off and made the home look a lot better. In particular he recommends Systemline audio systems, that have networked the music centre through the rooms, and a £1,000 Neff cooker hood that is "fantastic". Iain adds that the service is much better with these companies, having recently had a door handle that broke. It was replaced instantly and at no cost to him, which is testament to paying more.

Other than costs, another underestimation was how much work it takes to project manage the job. lain was in a fortunate position to work freelance and from home, meaning that he was always on site during the day.

"You cannot underestimate the time taken on the project. Trying to judge when you need to order in certain equipment or get contractors in takes a hell of a lot of time. I don't know how other people do all of the project management and work in an office based job with strict hours. It is impossible to do other work."

lain says that he ended up doing work in the evening when the builders had gone home and worked on the house during the day. In a way the house became his work, as he has written a book on the process, which he calls a complete

idiot's guide to building. He hopes to get it published to help other first-timers through the process and daily highs and lows.

Two of the big questions that anyone who knows a self builder will ask are how much money did you make and would you do it again? lain admits that he had a head start on the profit front as he bought the land off his parents, meaning that it only cost £40,000.

However, the total cost of the project, including the land, was £260,000 and while he hasn't had it officially valued yet, similar properties in the area are going for around £400,000, which "isn't bad for a year's work," he says.

As for doing it all again? "Definitely yes." You can't get much better endorsements than that.

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## how to build a timber framed stud partition wall

Whether you have the luxury of building your home from scratch or are having to re-divide a space to maximise its potential, knowing bestpractice on timber framed stud wall construction is a must.

#### 10 top tips on getting the perfect result every time:

The first thing you have to consider is Building Regulations. If you are constructing a stud wall in a bedroom then each of the new rooms created by the partition must have access to a window. If you're not sure about something, always check before starting by contacting your local building control office to see if any permission is needed. This will save pain in the long run!

From this moment onward, remember the mantra 'measure, measure and measure again' to ensure the best results!

You will need to begin by putting your sole plate in place. The sole plate is a piece of 47mm x 75mm regularised C16 (or 47mm x 100mm C16 if you are doing a very large partition) timber either untreated or treated with a preservative which is nailed into position along the floor from one wall to the other. Also available is CLS C16 (Canadian Lumber Standard timber) which is pur-posely purchased for this type of application. The common sizes of this are 50mm x 75mm and 50mm x 100mm in common lengths of 2.4m and 4.8m (please note the finished size is 38mm x 63mm and 38mm x 89mm respectively). Before fitting this sole plate, read point 4, as this could influence where you decide to put the sole plate!

Using a straight piece of timber positioned vertically on the sole plate and a spirit level, mark a line down each side of the two walls. You will now be able to fasten a piece of timber, called the head plate, along the ceiling between the two walls. A word of advice; check which way the ceiling joists run. If they run opposite to the partition, then use screws to fix the head plate in place (as this minimises damage to the plaster on the ceiling). If they are run in the same direction as the wall, you will have to fix noggins between the joists, or move the position of the partition so that the head plate is directly on a joint.

Once the sole and head plates are in position, fasten a stud between them on each wall, fixing them to the wall using dry wall screws. Before cutting these studs, remember to cut them a few millimetres longer than the exact measurement and them knock them into place with a hammer for a tight, secure fit.

Stud spacing is the next important thing to think about. A minimum thickness plasterboard of 12.5mm or 15mm is recommended at 600mm centres. If you choose to fit the sheets horizontally, you will need to stagger their joints (think 'brick wall' and that is the effect you are trying to achieve). You will also have to take into account at this point any doors you are fitting in the wall, and align the studs around these openings.

Each stud partition can then be fixed in place. Use nails or screws to do this, angled into the sole and head plates; nails tend to be quicker but if you have the time, screws are stronger.

When each stud is fitted in place, secure a noggin between each in the middle of the verticals. Consider staggering the noggins to make nailing them in easier. It is worth remembering that if you are fitting a sink or another heavy item to the wall at a later date, put in additional noggins on this area of the wall.

At this point, remember to mark the floor to show where the centre of each stud is. This will make it easier when positioning the plasterboard in place. For best results, use dry wall screws.

Finally, don't forget about insulation! It not only keeps the rooms warm, but is useful as a sound proofer as well – vital if that stud wall needs to block out teenage music!

There you have it, the easiest way to divide up your space in no time at all, and achieve results that will last for years to come.

These tips are intended as a guide only and you should consult with a professional tradesman if you are in any doubt.

# solar atter torty years

Martin Dowd from MG Renewables, says he believes the decision to install solar PV panels makes sense from both a green and an economical point of view

A retired Nottinghamshire couple are now hoping to live energy bill free after installing solar panels just eight months ago. Michael and Sue Anson, from Brinsley, now enjoy the electricity they produce and are able to make enough cash selling power back to the grid to minimise their utility bills.

The couple's interest in green energy started in the early 1970s, but at the time the technologies were too basic and prohibitively priced. After downsizing and moving in 2008 the couple decided to turn their two-bedroom bungalow into an energy-efficient home. Last year they took the plunge and invested in solar PV panels that the couple have calculated will have paid for themselves by 2016.

#### Solar PV

Solar Photovoltaic (PV) systems use cells to convert sunlight into electricity. The PV cell consists of one or two layers of a semi-conducting material, usually silicon. When light shines on the cell

it creates an electric field across the layers causing electricity to flow. The greater the intensity of the light, the greater the flow of electricity. PV cells are referred to in terms of the amount of energy they generate in full sunlight, known as kilowatt peak or kWp. PV systems produce no greenhouse gases and, with no moving parts, maintenance is kept to a minimum. A typ-

#### Feed in Tariff

After installation electricity costs will begin reducing immediately. Under the Feed In Tariff's (FITs) scheme, all units produced, regardless of whether they're used, are sold back to the grid at 41.3p per unit. Fifty per cent then receive an additional payment of 3p per unit. The scheme was launched by the government in April 2010.

During three months of last summer, Michael and Sue produced 1492 units of electricity which earned them over £600 and cut their bills dramatically.

Michael, 67, says he's pleased to finally take the plunge into sustainable energy.

He said: "I've always had a fascination with green technologies. As early as the seventies people realised resources like coal and oil couldn't last forever but alternatives were basic and expensive. Once I retired my wife and I downsized to a two-bedroom house and we used the money we'd saved to make our home as green as possible."







A self builders guide to stone flooring by Jason Cherrington, MD of stone specialist Lapicida

#### Beauty of stone

From breathtaking modern masterpieces to captivating country cottages the beauty of natural stone can take your breath away. Nowhere is this more evident than the magnificent structures around the world; Stonehenge, the pyramids, English castles and French châteaux are just a few examples. These are natural stone constructions that have stood the test of time, paying homage to all that is great about natural stone: strength, beauty, durability, authenticity, timelessness and versatility.

#### Natural beauty

Stone is a completely natural material shaped by centuries of evolution, and every single stone tile is different. In fact, with natural stone its individual nuances are its beauty.

What's more, the older stone is, the more exposure it has, the more beautiful it becomes, offering a natural charm which is hard to rival.

#### Stone facts

 Stone comes in a variety of different grades and grading is done according to colour,

- quality and markings. Lesser grade commercial cut-offs are the lowest and hand-selected stone are the highest. When buying stone don't be shy to ask for proof of origin. That way you'll get exactly what you paid for
- All stone is porous but, with the correct sealant, can last for decades
- There are lots of different types of stone and each has different qualities. Always remember this when you're looking to buy

#### Natural selection

As a self builder you're probably more aware than most of your style and taste. However, buying natural stone flooring can be a major investment so it's worth taking time and effort to research the type of stone that works best for you and your property. To give you a taster:

**Limestone:** a very beautiful type of stone with a highly distinctive appearance, hard-wearing and has been used to pave prestigious structures for centuries, for example French and Italian palaces.

Marble: renowned for it's high gloss appearance, marble is rich, distinctive and durable. Synonymous with affluence and good taste, marble is available in a range of colours. To make a really luxurious and dramatic impact on walls, ask for a book match finish.


Sandstone: a versatile natural stone, sandstone can be used both indoors and outdoors to create a formal or more informal/rustic appearance. Sandstone is very evident in English stately homes and in its reclaimed state is absolutely stunning.

**Travertine:** no two travertine tiles are the same. This is ideal if you have to replace a tile since it will enhance the look, whereas other stones have to be matched. Interesting fact: the Coliseum in Rome is built from travertine.

**Granite:** revered for its hardness, granite's strength is its benefit, however the varying colour isn't always the most appealing. It is

ideal for places in the home associated with high wear and tear, for example kitchen surfaces.

Slate: generally found in black or grey and, characteristically, has a very flat or riven surface.

Onyx: prized for its highly decorative appearance, onyx is intrinsically beautiful and makes a real statement. It is available in a wide range of jewel-colours.

#### Simple sums

Once you've established the type of stone best suited to your needs establish the dimensions of the space you're looking to tile. Then add on at least 10% to allow for setting out and cutting. It's worth remembering that diamonds ultimately govern the price of stone: the harder the stone, the more diamonds it takes to cut and finish it.

With the size in mind, it's time to calculate the budget available. It might sound obvious, but always buy the best you can afford. With natural stone, for example, the softer and consequently cheaper stone may sound appealing but is less likely to last as long, so it could be a false economy. Remember you'll need to factor in a whole range of costs including the purchase of the tiles; grout; sealants (if used); decorative tiles or mosaics; accessories and installation costs (if tiling is not your speciality).

#### Installation tips

 It may sound obvious but before you purchase any natural stone be sure the floor underneath it is

strong enough. If in any doubt strengthen it.

- 2. As outlined in 'simple sums', be sure to measure up correctly. Do a dummy run and establish exactly where the centre point is; this is where you will start to lay the stone from.
- 3. Make sure that the surface you're planning to lay the stone onto has been correctly prepared e.g. dry and clean with a level surface. If you do not prepare carefully at this stage the stone could be prone to cracking or becoming loose.
- 4. Think about what colour grout you want. You could get one that matches the colour of the stone or one that contrasts and consequently highlights it.
- 5. Remember: all natural stone is porous and therefore requires sealing to ensure it always looks its best. Sealants are used to ensure stone tiles are resistant to stains. Colour enhancers further demonstrate why stone is so versatile and various finishes include 'colour enhanced,' 'light sheen' or 'matt' looks. When you're buying ask for specialist advice on the best way to care for your stone. Some manufacturers will give guarantees of up to 15 years on sealants. It really is worth investing in the best you can afford.

# permeable drainage

Jane Campion of Brett Landscaping looks at the options for surface water management and design, and explains the theory behind the successful installation of a permeable solution

Beautiful driveways and patios add value to a property and provide a great deal of use and pleasure for homeowners. However, when planning new patios and driveways you need to consider surface water management, but that doesn't mean you must compromise on design.

We all have a duty to act responsibly and to do our bit to reduce the threat of flooding.

the surface infiltration rate is nearly 57 times the typical UK rainfall

The Environment Agency estimates that up to two-thirds of the damage caused by the disastrous 2007 floods was due to surface water run-off overloading the existing drainage system. The government estimates that 80,000 properties are at very high risk from surface water flooding causing £270 million of damage on average every year. As more homeowners and developers see the value of installing beautiful patios and drives there is a requirement now to ensure that every project considers surface water management.

Changes to regulations governing the hard landscaping of the front of domestic properties, introduced in October 2008 to help alleviate the risk of flooding and pollution of water courses, stipulates that homeowners can no longer create or replace their driveways and front patios (over 5sqm) without considering if planning permission is required. The need for planning permission can be avoided if the project is designed to avoid surface water running into the public drainage system. This is known as a sustainable drainage system.

There are two sustainable drainage system options for managing surface water. The simplest is to ensure that your design includes drainage slopes and channels to ensure water is directed towards an effective soakaway or soft landscaping area such as a raingarden. Using this technique any type of paving is suitable, both flag paving and concrete block paving, and there are many colours and textures available to ensure you are presented with a great deal of design flexibility.

However, if you do not want to compromise your design with slopes and channels, or if you do not have suitable soakaway areas, the most effective solution for ensuring you meet the regulations is permeable block paving, which not only deals with surface water, but also presents excellent design potential.

Permeable block paving works by allowing surface water to pass naturally through gaps between the paving into the ground below. Advanced permeable systems even allow you to collect and reuse the water in the home or garden.

There are three types of concrete permeable block paving system suitable for domestic situations. System A - Full Infiltration (the most popular system) allows water to filter down through sub-base layers into the subgrade. With System B - Partial Infiltration some water is collected by pipes and the remainder is allowed to filter into the subgrade. System C – Total Attenuation can be used in domestic water harvesting systems as all of the water is captured by membranes and pipes and stored for re-use or subsequent release in a controlled manner. A permeable system requires a different sub-base structure and materials to ensure it works effectively.

Simple tests need to be conducted to understand the local soil conditions before deciding on which system is suitable. Often a reputable block paving manufacturer can help provide you with details of a simple test that checks which option is best and, dependent on the result, can provide a detailed specification for soakaway or permeable sub-base system design.

Permeable paving design normally requires a deeper dig than standard paving. However, modern permeable systems feature reinforcing mesh, so you don't have to dig deep.

Permeable block paving is highly effective. The best performing blocks have been independently tested and recorded as having a surface infiltration rate which is nearly 57 times the typical UK rainfall. These products have proved very successful on larger paving projects.

Permeable block paving is available as rectangular or classic tumble style blocks and is also available in a range of colours, textures and sizes. Tumble style blocks have weathered edges and all permeable blocks have interlocking spacer ribs.

Complying with regulations when planning driveways or patios does not mean a compromise on style, thanks to the efforts of paving manufacturers which have developed a range of systems and products which deliver superior performance matched with beautiful finishes and colours. Advice and even design services will also be available from the best manufacturers.

# resurgence of shingles

Mike Hartley, Chairman and Managing Director of John Brash, explores the use of Western Red Cedar shingles in sustainable building

Timber shingles are routinely used to create buildings with a reduced carbon footprint, and to enhance the diversity of our built environment. Timber has always scored highly on both counts. In terms of sustainability it is a natural carbon store, taking carbon dioxide from the atmosphere during growth of the tree and locking it up in the fibres of the timber. Timber also has one of the lowest levels of embodied energy of any building material, making it a natural choice for a development with a reduced carbon footprint.

Western Red Cedar shingles: These are taper sawn and have a relatively smooth face and back. Three lengths are generally available: 400mm ('XXXXXX' or 5X), 450mm ('Perfections') and 600mm ('Royals').

The 400mm shingle is most often used in the UK, along with smaller quantities of 600mm shingles. The use of the premier Number One grade Blue Label Certigrade Western Red Cedar shingle in the standard XXXXX size is recommended (the lower Red and Black labels contain flat grain and sapwood that makes them unsuitable for premium roofing applications, often curling and with reduced longevity).

The Certigrade designation is the third party accreditation from the Red Cedar shingle and handsplit Shake Bureau (not all Blue Label shingles carry this designation).

Cedar shingles can be laid in straight lines



giving a clean regular appearance to the roof or wall, or with random butts giving a much more irregular aspect.

Shape and dimension: Cedar shingles are supplied in random widths varying between 75mm and 350mm. Their thickness tapers from approximately 10mm at the tail or butt edge to 3mm at the head. Cedar shingles are supplied by the bundle ready to apply, either untreated or with a timber preservative or fire retardant treatment.

**Underlay:** The use of underlay is not generally recommended in normal conditions for 'cold' roofs. However, if one is to be used, the vapour permeable type to Annex A of BS 5534:2003 is recommended.

**Battens:** Battens should be strong and stiff enough to withstand the proposed loading and to provide adequate fixing and alignment. They should comply with BS 5534: Part 1:2003. The minimum size recommended is 25mm x 38mm.

Nails: For maximum life, fixing should be made with 31mm x 1.8mm silicon bronze annular ring nails (stainless steel can be used as an alternative). As a guide 0.9kg of nails are required to fix four bundles of shingles.

Fixing Details: Shingles are normally fixed directly to battens but are suitable for other forms of construction. For example, they can be nailed directly onto plywood, or onto battens and counter battens over solid insulation. There should be two nails per shingle, 19mm in from each edge, 38mm above the butt line of the course above. There should be a 5mm gap between the edges of each shingle. Between courses, the gaps between each shingle should be offset by at least 38mm and no gap should align on adjacent courses. This is essential to maintain the weather tightness of the roof. For

XXXXX shingles the recommended gauges are:

- Roofs 14°-21° = 95mm gauge, giving a coverage of 1.73m<sup>2</sup> per bundle
- Roofs  $22^{\circ}+=125$ mm gauge, giving a coverage of 2.28m<sup>2</sup> per bundle
- Vertical = 190mm gauge, giving a coverage of 3.47m<sup>2</sup> per bundle

N.B. These are exact areas and do not allow for cutting and wastage.

dance with normal good building practice. Where lead or other metal flashings are used, care should be taken to avoid contact between the Cedar shingles and the metal. This is due to the natural properties of cedar, as it contains a level of tannic acid that can cause corrosion to unprotected metals. It is recommended that you apply a bituminous paint as an effective barrier or, alternatively, GRP valleys and flashings are suitable.

In addition, for all cases allow extra:

- Double starter course: 1 bundle for every 18 linear metres
- Valleys: 1 bundle for every 7.5 linear metres
- Hips and ridges: 1 bundle for every 7.5 linear metres (traditional method)

Shingles are normally applied in straight lines starting with a double or triple course at the eaves, depending upon the conditions of climatic exposure. This application may be varied to produce different patterns of staggered butts, double or shadow coursing, thatch weave or ocean wave. Cedar shingles can also be used over a variety of roof types; boarded roofs, metal decks and warm roof constructions. Care should be taken to follow current building regulations and individual specifications can be determined in conjunction with the insulation manufacturer. Preformed Cedar hip and ridge units can be supplied; their use saves on construction time.

Where it is not possible to use pre-formed units, hips and ridges may be formed by selecting 100-150mm wide shingles and manufacturing the cappings on site, laid horizontally along the hip or ridge using an alternate overlap.

Flashings: It is recommended that flashings are installed in accor-

With today's requirements for building performance and construction techniques, the resurgence of timber shingles as a building material is providing many self builders and developers with the ability to create modern welldesigned comfortable homes. As a material timber has lower embodied energy than clay, concrete or metal roofing materials, which translates into long-term energy savings and a reduced effect on the environment. Achieving higher sustainability ratings is no longer optional and, as we move to the 2016 zero-carbon deadline, timber is becoming an important part of achieving this goal.


